### TOP STORYLINES

- The 126th season of Georgia Tech football kicks off on Saturday when the Yellow Jackets host Alcorn State for the 2018 season opener at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Georgia Tech is coming off a disappointing and frustrating 5-6 season in 2017. The Yellow Jackets were literally three plays away from an 8-3 campaign and two plays away from a fifth ACC Championship Game appearance, as they saw three opponents (Tennessee, Miami and Virginia) score the go-ahead points in the final 82 seconds of regulation or overtime last season. The Jackets also held leads of at least 13 points in four of their six defeats (Tennessee, Miami, Virginia and Duke).
- If history is any indication, last year's 5-6 season will lead to a bounce-back campaign for Georgia Tech in 2018. Following each of the previous three sub-.500 seasons of **Paul Johnson's** head-coaching career, his teams have rebounded to win at least eight games the following year.
- Georgia Tech returns 15 starters from last year's squad — eight on offense, five on defense and two specialists.
- On offense, the Yellow Jackets bring back 100 percent of their passing yardage from a year ago, 90.4 percent of their rushing yardage and a total of six offensive linemen that have combined to make 75 career starts.
- Headlining the Yellow Jackets' returners are senior quarterback **TaQuon Marshall** and junior B-back **KirVonte Benson**. Last season, Marshall and Benson became only the second duo in Tech history to both rush for 1,000 yards in the same season (Marshall — 1,146 rushing yards, Benson — 1,053 rushing yards).

**GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS**

**2**  
 For the second time in school history, Georgia Tech had two 1,000-yard rushers last season in QB **TaQuon Marshall** (1,146 yards) and BB **KirVonte Benson** (1,053 yards). The only other time that a Tech tandem both surpassed the 1,000-yard rushing mark in the same season came in 2009 with BB Jonathan Dwyer (1,395 yards) and QB Joshua Nesbitt (1,037 yards).

**3**  
 Georgia Tech's 2018 schedule includes three opponents ranked in the preseason top 10 (No. 2 Clemson, No. 3/4 Georgia and No. 8 Miami). Should the Yellow Jackets wind up playing three top-10 teams, it would mark the third time in the last four seasons that they do so (the Jackets also played three top-10 teams in 2015 and 2017). Prior to 2015, Tech had not faced three top-10 opponents in the same season since 1983 (which was its first season as a full-fledged member of the ACC).

 Georgia Tech's 2018 schedule is ranked as the fifth-toughest in the nation by *Bleacher Report* and is the toughest schedule in the ACC according to *Athlon*.

 Under head coach **Paul Johnson**, Georgia Tech is 8-0 in season openers played on any day but Labor Day (but 0-2 in openers played on Labor Day).

**10**  
 Georgia Tech has won each of its 10 home openers under Johnson.

 Georgia Tech returns 15 starters in 2018 (eight on offense, five on defense and two specialists).

- be its ninth win in its last 10 home games;
- up it to 9-2 all-time against opponents from the state of Mississippi;

**A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...**

- be its first loss in a home opener since a 14-10 defeat at the hands of No. 2 Notre Dame in 2006;
- drop it to 94-26-4 all-time in home openers;
- be its first loss to an NCAA Division I FCS/I-AA opponent since a 17-14 defeat at the hands of Furman in 1983;
- give it consecutive home defeats for the first time since it lost to No. 5/3 Clemson and No. 14 Miami (Fla.) in back-to-back weeks in 2016 (Sept. 22 and Oct. 1).

• Under Johnson, Tech is 8-0 in season openers played on any day but Labor Day.

• The Yellow Jackets only season-opening defeats under Johnson have both come at the hands of nationally ranked opponents in overtime on Labor Day — a 20-17 overtime loss at No. 16 Virginia Tech in 2012 and a 42-41 double-overtime loss to No. 25 Tennessee last season.

• Georgia Tech is opening the season against Alcorn State for the second time in four years. The Jackets began the 2015 campaign with a convincing 69-6 victory over the Braves.

• The last time that Georgia Tech opened with the same opponent twice in a span of four seasons came in 2008 and 2009 (Johnson's first two seasons at Tech), when the Jackets began both seasons with home wins over Jacksonville State (41-14 in 2008 and 37-17 in 2009).

**GEORGIA TECH IN HOME OPENERS**

• Georgia Tech is 94-25-4 (.780) in 123 home openers all-time (Tech did not play any home games in 1897 or 1898).

• The Yellow Jackets have won each of their 11 home openers (including all 10 under head coach **Paul Johnson**) and 19 of their last 20 home openers overall. Their only loss in a home opener since 1999 was a 14-10 defeat at the hands of No. 2 Notre Dame on Sept. 1, 2006.

**NOTING ALCORN STATE**

• Alcorn State is the four four-time defending Southwestern Athletic Conference East Division champion.

• The Braves have won the SWAC's East Division every year since 2014 and are 31-18 overall (.633) and 24-10 in conference play (.706) during that span, including a 7-5 (5-2 SWAC) record last season.

• Alcorn is the first team to ever play in four-straight SWAC Championship Games.

• In this year's SWAC preseason poll, Alcorn was picked to win the East Division once again. The league's coaches and

sports information directors predicted that the Braves (95 points) would easily out-distance Alabama State (72 points) for their fifth-straight East Division crown.

• The Braves are also ranked third in the preseason HBCU (Historically Black Colleges and Universities) poll and are receiving votes in the preseason STATS/NCAA Division I FCS poll.

• Alcorn had 11 representatives on the SWAC's preseason all-conference team, highlighted by preseason SWAC Player of the Year P.J. Simmons. A senior running back, Simmons rushed for 687 yards and seven touchdowns in 11 games last season.

• The Braves have won two-straight season openers (21-18 over Alabama State in 2016 and 50-21 over Miles last season). Their last loss in a season opener was a 69-6 defeat to Georgia Tech at Bobby Dodd Stadium on Sept. 3, 2015.

• Alcorn State is coached by Fred McNair, the brother of Alcorn legend and 2003 NFL co-MVP Steve McNair.

• Steve McNair threw for 14,496 yards and 119 touchdowns and ran for 2,327 yards and 33 touchdowns as Alcorn's starting quarterback from 1991-94. He was a four-time SWAC Player of the Year, winner of the 1994 Walter Payton Award (NCAA Division I-AA Player of the Year) and finished third in balloting for the 1994 Heisman Trophy. He went on to be a three-time Pro Bowler and 2003 NFL co-MVP with the Tennessee Titans.

**GEORGIA TECH RANKED NO. 31 IN ESPN FPI**

• Georgia Tech is ranked No. 31 nationally in ESPN's preseason Football Power Index with an FPI of 8.9.

• According to ESPN, The Football Power Index (FPI) is a measure of team strength that is meant to be the best predictor of a team's performance going forward for the rest of the season. FPI represents how many points above or below average a team is.

• The Yellow Jackets finished No. 33 in the FPI last season. Four of their 2017 opponents ranked among the top 18 nationally in the FPI (No. 3 Georgia, No. 5 Clemson, No. 17 Miami and No. 18 Virginia Tech).

- Georgia Tech returns eight offensive starters in 2018.
- The Yellow Jackets' returners represent a large portion of their offensive production from a season ago, including:
  - 100 percent of their passing yardage
  - 90.4 percent of their rushing yardage
  - six offensive linemen that have combined to make 75 career starts
- Tech finished the 2017 campaign ranked among the nation's top 30 in seven different statistical categories on offense.

- Georgia Tech ranked 23rd nationally in offensive efficiency with a 69.1 efficiency rating in 2017, according to ESPN (ESPN's efficiency ratings are based on the point contributions of the unit to the team's scoring margin, on a per-play basis. The values are adjusted for strength of schedule and down-weighted for "garbage time." The scale goes from 0 to 100; the average is roughly 50).
- Once again, Georgia Tech's explosive offense ranked among the ACC and national leaders in big plays last season. The Jackets ranked second in the conference and tied for 10th nationally with nine plays from scrimmage that gained 60 yards or more in 2017. The prior season (2016), the Yellow Jackets ranked second in the ACC and tied for 13th nationally with eight plays from scrimmage of 60 yards or longer.

- The running game is always the backbone of Johnson's high-powered spread option offense. Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats in 2008, only one team has rushed for more yards than Georgia Tech's 38,852 — Johnson's former team, Navy, which has run for 39,655 yards over the last 10 seasons.

- Last season, Georgia Tech rushed for 307.4 yards per game, good for tops in the ACC and fifth nationally. The Yellow Jackets have led the ACC and finished among the top 10 nationally in rushing offense in each of Johnson's 10 seasons as head coach.
- The Jackets set a school record with four 400-yard rushing games last season (535 vs. Tennessee on Sept. 4, 436 vs. Pitt on Sept. 23, 403 vs. North Carolina on Sept. 30 and 427 vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 21). Making the feat even more impressive is that it came in just 11 games, Tech's fewest games in a season since 1996. The previous GT record of three 400-yard rushing games in a season occurred three times, all under Johnson (2008, 2009 and 2014).

- In Johnson's 10 seasons as head coach of the Yellow Jackets, Tech has been outgained on the ground just 18 times.
- In Johnson's 10 seasons at the helm, Georgia Tech has produced 17 rushers that have eclipsed the 1,000-yard pla-

teau for their careers. That is over one-third percent of the 49 Yellow Jackets that have amassed 1,000 career rushing yards in the 125-season history of Georgia Tech football.

- The Jackets have three players on their current roster that eclipsed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for their careers in senior AB **Clinton Lynch**, senior QB **TaQuon Marshall** and junior BB **KirVonte Benson**.

- Georgia Tech has had multiple 100-yard rushers five times in its last 15 games overall. In addition to Marshall and Benson accomplishing the feat four times last season, QB Matthew Jordan (121 yards) and BB Marcus Marshall (143) both surpassed the century mark in a 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech on Nov. 12, 2016.
- Prior to having two 100-yard rushers five times in the last 15 games, Georgia Tech had two different players gain 100 yards on the ground in the same game only 29 times in school history.
- After turning the ball over eight times in its first 284 offensive plays of last season (one turnover every 35.5 snaps), Georgia Tech committed only six turnovers in its last 467 plays of the campaign (one turnover every 77.8 snaps).

- The Yellow Jackets went 160 offensive plays and 26 offensive possessions without a turnover from Sept. 30-Oct. 28 of last season. The 160-play streak without a turnover spanned from a fumble in the third quarter of the Jackets' 33-7 win over North Carolina on Sept. 30 to a fumble on the opening drive of their 24-10 loss at No. 7 Clemson on Oct. 28.

• Georgia Tech has played 261-consecutive games without being shut out, good for the seventh-longest active streak in NCAA Division I FBS.

• The Yellow Jackets have not been held scoreless since a 38-0 loss at No. 3 Florida State on Oct. 18, 1997.

• Even more impressively, Georgia Tech has not been blanked at home since a 7-0 loss to Georgia on Nov. 30, 1957 — good for a streak of 375-straight games played at Bobby Dodd Stadium without being shut out.

• Benson ranked fifth in the ACC and 35th nationally with 95.7 rushing yards per game.

• Benson became only the third B-back in **Paul Johnson's** 10 seasons as head coach to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, joining Jonathan Dwyer (2008 and 2009) and Anthony Allen (2010).

• Over the final eight games of last season, with Georgia Tech facing four of the nation's top 13 and five of the top 40 defenses in terms of tackles for loss (Miami - third; Clemson - 12th; Wake Forest - seventh; Virginia Tech - 13th; Duke - 14th), Benson has had just seven negative carries (for minus-14 yards total) in 120 attempts.

• Benson was one of the Yellow Jackets' few bright spots in a 24-10 loss at No. 7 Clemson on Oct. 28 of last season, as he ran for a game-high 129 yards on just 16 carries (8.1 avg.). He was the only player to rush for 100 yards (first since Louisville's Lamar Jackson in 2016) or average eight yards per carry (first since Florida State's Dalvin Cook in 2016) in a game against Clemson last season.

• In fact, only five other *teams* rushed for as many yards against Clemson last season as Benson did alone (Syracuse - 162, The Citadel - 155, NC State - 153, Alabama - 141 and Wake Forest - 133).

• Benson's 196 rushing yards against Pitt on Sept. 23 of last season are tied for the 16th-most in Georgia Tech single-game history and are the most by a B-back in Johnson's 10 seasons as Tech's head coach (prev.: 195 - Anthony Allen vs. Virginia, Oct. 9, 2010).

• Benson is on the official watch list for the 2018 Maxwell Award, presented to "America's College Player of the Year." He is joined on the list by Georgia Tech quarterback **TaQuon Marshall**.

• Behind Benson on the depth chart at B-back are redshirt freshman **Jordan Mason** and sophomore **Jerry Howard**.

• Howard finished second on the team with 175 rushing yards as a true freshman last season.

• Howard's 7.6 yards per carry ranked second on the team last season, behind only A-back **Nathan Cottrell** (8.2 avg.).

• Howard ran for 82 yards on just six carries (13.7 avg.) in his collegiate debut against Jacksonville State on Sept. 9 of last season, including a 65-yard touchdown run. The

65-yard TD run, which came on the second carry of his career, was the longest by a Georgia Tech true freshman since Jonathan Dwyer also had a 65-yard touchdown run vs. Samford on Sept. 8, 2007.

• Georgia Tech is loaded with experience at the A-back position, where it returns three upperclassmen with extensive playing experience — fifth-year seniors **Clinton Lynch** and **Qua Searcy** and Cottrell, a junior.

• Between them, Lynch, Searcy and Cottrell combined to rush for 697 yards on just 97 carries (7.2 avg.) and catch seven passes for 173 yards (24.7 avg.) in 2017.

• For their careers, the A-back trio has combined to rush for 1,924 yards and 11 touchdowns on 242 carries (8.0 avg.) and catch 47 passes for 1,146 yards (24.4 avg.) and 11 touchdowns.

• Lynch is one of three players on the Yellow Jackets' current roster with 1,000 career rushing yards (joining **TaQuon Marshall** and **KirVonte Benson**). Lynch has 1,081 yards and seven touchdowns on 113 career carries (9.6 career avg.).

• Lynch has also caught 30 passes for 806 yards (26.9 career avg.) and nine touchdowns as a Yellow Jacket.

• All told, Lynch is averaging 13.2 yards per touch for his career (1,887 all-purpose yards on 143 touches) to go along with his 16 touchdowns.

• Since the beginning of 2016, 21 of Lynch's 84 touches have gone for 20 yards or more (11 rushes, 10 receptions — 25.0 percent) and eight of his 84 touches have gone for 40 yards or more (three rushes, five receptions — 9.5 percent).

• Lynch led the ACC in both yards per rush (11.2) and yards of total offense per play (11.2) as a sophomore in 2016.

• Lynch's 83-yard touchdown reception at North Carolina on Nov. 5 of last season remains Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since a 95-yard touchdown run by Orwin Smith vs. Kansas on Sept. 17, 2011, the sixth-longest reception in Georgia Tech history and the longest reception by a Yellow Jacket since Embry Peeples' 87-yard catch from Joshua Nesbitt at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.

• Searcy's 91 rushing yards against Mercer on Sept. 10, 2016 remain the most by a Georgia Tech A-back since Robert Godhigh ran for 126 yards in a 55-31 defeat at Clemson on Nov. 14, 2013.

• Cottrell's 69-yard run against Virginia Tech on Nov. 11 last season was the Yellow Jackets' second-longest rush of the year (behind only **TaQuon Marshall's** 78-yard touchdown run at Virginia on Nov. 4).

**WIDE RECEIVERS**

• Due mainly to the departure of Ricky Jeune (now a member of the Dallas Cowboys), Georgia Tech returns just 16.7 percent of the receptions and 21.3 percent of the receiving yardage produced by its wide receivers last season.

• Senior **Brad Stewart** is Tech's leading returning receiver after catching four passes for 99 yards as a junior last season.

• Two of Stewart's four receptions in 2017 came in the season opener against Tennessee.

• On Nov. 11 of last season, Stewart hauled in a 60-yard

touchdown pass in the Jackets' 28-22 win over No. 17 Virginia Tech. The TD was the first of Stewart's career and came in his 34th game as a Yellow Jacket.

• Stewart leads the Yellow Jackets' 2018 roster with 27-consecutive starts (the next-longest streak on the team belongs to junior OL **Parker Braun**, who has made 19-straight starts).

• Stewart has also played in all 36 of Georgia Tech's games since he arrived on campus three years ago. He is one of only two student-athletes on the Yellow Jackets' current roster that has played all 36 games over the past three seasons, joining senior LB **Victor Alexander**.

• Sophomore **Jalen Camp** is the only other wideout on the Yellow Jackets' roster that has caught a pass as a collegiate player (a 49-yarder at Virginia on Nov. 4 of last season).

**OFFENSIVE LINE**

• Six different offensive linemen boast starting experience for Georgia Tech. Those six returners have combined for a total of 75 starts over 134 career games played.

• Behind its offensive line, Georgia Tech led the ACC and ranked fifth nationally in rushing offense last season (307.4 ypg).

• Last season, both left guard **Parker Braun** (Sept. 23 vs. Pittsburgh) and center **Kenny Cooper** (Sept. 30 vs. North Carolina) were named ACC Offensive Linemen of the Week.

• Braun took 22 Pitt defenders to the ground and was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time in his first 11 career starts. Braun helped pave the way for the Yellow Jackets to run for 436 yards in the 35-17 win over Pitt, its most in an ACC game since it amassed 479 yards on the ground in a 56-23 win over NC State on Oct. 18, 2014.

• Cooper was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week one week after Braun claimed the award by taking 10 defenders to the ground and helping Georgia Tech run for 403 yards in its 33-7 win over North Carolina (Sept. 30). The award came in Cooper's fifth-career start.

• In 2016, Braun became the first Georgia Tech freshman to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after compiling 10 knockdowns and paving the way for Tech's 309 rushing yards in the Yellow Jackets' 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech (Nov. 12).

• Both Braun and Cooper represent Tech on official watch lists for national awards — Braun is a candidate for the Outland Trophy, presented to college football's top interior lineman, while Cooper is on the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, which is awarded to college football's top center.

• Additionally, Braun is a candidate for the 2018 Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, which is presented to the top offensive student-athlete in NCAA Division I football who was born in, played high-school football in or plays college football in the state of Texas.

**DEFENSE**

- Georgia Tech's defense played well in spurts last season but was plagued by inconsistency throughout the year.
- In four of its five wins in 2017, the Yellow Jackets' defense was especially stout as it settled into the game.
  - **Sept. 9 vs. Jacksonville State:** Jacksonville State registered 90 yards over its first two possessions but recorded just 99 yards the rest of the game. Jacksonville State's 189 yards on Sept. 9 were the fewest surrendered by Georgia Tech in a game since it limited North Carolina to just 154 yards in a 24-7 victory on Sept. 26, 2009 and 73 passing yards were the fewest that Tech has allowed since Clemson threw for just 59 yards in the Jackets' 28-6 victory on Nov. 15, 2014.
  - **Sept. 23 vs. Pittsburgh:** Pitt drove 78 yards for a touchdown on its opening series but managed just 157 yards the rest of the game. The Panthers' 235 total yards on Sept. 23 were the fewest allowed by Georgia Tech in an ACC game since Clemson managed just 190 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 28-6 victory on Nov. 15, 2014 and Pitt's 37 rushing yards were the fewest surrendered by Tech in any game since Virginia ran for only 22 yards in the Jackets' 35-10 triumph on Nov. 1, 2014.
  - **Sept. 30 vs. North Carolina:** UNC managed just 38 yards and committed two turnovers over its first five possessions of the second half.
  - **Oct. 21 vs. Wake Forest:** After rushing for 93 yards and scoring touchdowns on its final three possessions of the first half, Wake managed just 17 rushing yards and three points after the break.
- Conversely, Tech's defense started red-hot against Tennessee on Sept. 4, Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 and Virginia on Nov. 4, but struggled down the stretch of each defeat.

- However, the following week at Duke (Nov. 18), the Jackets were torched for a season-high 500 yards in a 43-20 defeat.

- In 2018, Georgia Tech's defense is under the tutelage of a new defensive coordinator, **Nate Woody**.

- Woody comes to The Flats from Appalachian State, where he served as defensive coordinator from 2013-17. Over his last three seasons at App State (2015-17 — the program's first three campaigns as full-fledged members of FBS), the Mountaineers' 3-4 scheme had average national rankings of 15th in scoring defense, 19th in total defense, 28th in rushing defense and 28th in passing defense.

- Appalachian also averaged 24 takeaways, 19 interceptions and 35 sacks per season over the last three campaigns, all areas where Georgia Tech ranked among the bottom 20 teams in 2017.

**DEFENSIVE LINE**

- Georgia Tech's three starting defensive linemen — seniors **Desmond Branch**, **Kyle Cerge-Henderson** and **Anree Saint-Amour** — have combined to play in 80 games and make 29 starts for the Yellow Jackets.

- This season marks the first time that Georgia Tech's entire starting defensive line is comprised of seniors since 1989, when seniors Willie Burks (DT), Jeff Mathis (NG) and Sean Smith (DT) were the starting linemen for the Jackets' 7-4 squad under head coach Bobby Ross (one season before Tech won its fourth national championship).

**LINEBACKERS**

- The heart and soul of Georgia Tech's defense is senior co-captain **Brant Mitchell**.

- As the Yellow Jackets' middle linebacker last season, Mitchell ranked fourth on the team with 51 tackles despite playing in only nine games due to a lower-body injury. His 5.7 tackles per game led the team.

- Mitchell sustained a lower-body injury in the first half at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14, missed the next week's game versus Wake Forest, started but played in just one series at Clemson on Oct. 28 and was unable to play at Virginia on Nov. 4.

- In his first full game after returning to the lineup against No. 17 Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, he recorded a team-high nine tackles, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss, and was named ACC Co-Linebacker of the Week.

- In all, Georgia Tech went just 1-3 in the four games that Mitchell missed all or part of last season.

- The Yellow Jackets' other senior among Georgia Tech's starting linebackers, OLB **Victor Alexander**, led Georgia Tech with 60 tackles in his first season as a starter last year.

- Despite cracking the starting lineup for the first time as a junior last season, Alexander has played in all 36 of Georgia Tech's games since he arrived on campus three years ago. He is one of only two student-athletes on the Yellow Jackets' current roster that has played all 36 games over the past three seasons, joining senior WR **Brad Stewart**.

- Junior **David Curry** has claimed the other starting ILB spot alongside Mitchell. Curry has bounced back from a series of injuries that kept him out of action last season

(foot) and cost him time this past spring (thumb).

- **Bruce Jordan-Swilling** put together one of the most impressive single-game stat lines of the season for Georgia Tech as a true freshman last fall. Making his first-career start in place of Mitchell at Virginia on Nov. 4, Jordan-Swilling stuffed the stat sheet with a career-high and team-high-tying 11 tackles while achieving the "superfecta" of turnovers with the first forced fumble, fumble recovery, interception and defensive touchdown of his career.

- With an interception and touchdown in his first-career start, Jordan-Swilling earned bragging rights in his own home. His father, College Football Hall of Famer Pat Swilling, did not record an interception or a touchdown during his prolific four-year career at Georgia Tech from 1982-85.

- Georgia Tech's fourth linebacker position — the "stinger" OLB — is expected to be manned by a trio of individuals that were tabbed for the secondary prior to Woody's arrival on The Flats — senior **Jalen Johnson**, junior **Christian Campbell** and true freshman **Charlie Thomas**.

- Despite previously being limited to the defensive backfield and special teams, Johnson and Campbell have combined for 40 career tackles and two tackles for loss.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS**

- Last season, Georgia Tech's starting secondary was comprised of five veterans that combined to make 127 starts and play in 218 games.

- However, none of the five members of last year's starting secondary return in 2018. **Lawrence Austin**, **Lance Austin**, **Step Durham** and **Corey Griffin** all graduated while **A.J. Gray** had to step away from football due to a heart condition.

- In their wake, the defensive backs listed on this week's two-deep have combined for zero starts and just 27 games played.

- Of the nine DBs on this week's two-deep, three are sophomores (CB **Jaytlin Askew**, SS **Tariq Carpenter** and CB **Ajani Kerr**), two are redshirt freshmen (CB **Tre Swilling** and SS **Kaleb Oliver**) and three are true freshmen (CB **Jaylon King**, FS **Juanyeh Thomas** and CB **Zamari Walton**).

- The lone upperclassman in the group will make his NCAA Division I FBS debut on Saturday. Graduate student **Malik Rivera** has earned the starting nod at strong safety after transferring to Georgia Tech from Wofford, where he had 131 tackles over the past three seasons.

- Rivera's position coach at Wofford the last two seasons (and defensive coordinator in 2017) was **Shiel Wood**, who now serves as Georgia Tech's safeties coach.

- An incredible student, Rivera graduated from Wofford in May as a triple-major in mathematics, finance and computer science. He is pursuing a master's degree in quantitative and computational finance at Georgia Tech.

• Georgia Tech's 19 blocked kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season are the fourth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• Georgia Tech returns one of the nation's top punters in sophomore **Pressley Harvin III**.

• Last season, Harvin III led all NCAA Division I FBS true freshmen, ranked 16th overall nationally and was second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with a 44.1-yard punting average last season.

• Harvin's 44.1-yard average was also a Georgia Tech freshman record and ranked fifth overall in single-season program history.

• Of Harvin's 50 punts last season, 13 traveled 50-plus yards (26 percent), 16 were downed inside the 20 yard line (32 pct.), 15 were fair-caught (30 pct.) and 29 were not returned (58 pct.).

• Making Harvin's freshman campaign even more impressive was that two of his best performances have come in less-than-ideal conditions for punting – he recorded career-bests with a 62-yard punt and four kicks downed inside the 20 yard line at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 and had five punts that traveled 50 yards or more and three downed inside the 20 at Clemson on Oct. 28. The majority of both games were played during heavy rain storms.

• Harvin boomed a 56-yard punt on his first collegiate kick versus Tennessee on Sept. 4.

• Following his incredible rookie campaign, Harvin III was named freshman all-America by the Football Writers Association of America, true freshman all-America by ESPN and was a third-team all-ACC honoree.

• Harvin III is on the official watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to college football's top punter. He was first added to the list midway through his prolific freshman campaign last fall.

• Harvin became only the third FWAAs freshman all-American in school history (joining OL Will Jackson, 2010, and PK Travis Bell, 2004) and the first Georgia Tech freshman to earn all-ACC recognition since Calvin Johnson (first-team WR) and Bell (second-team PK) in '04.

• Junior **Shawn Davis**, who missed the final six games of last season after sustaining a season-ending knee injury while covering a kickoff at Miami (Fla.), is expected to regain his role as the Yellow Jackets' place kicker in 2018.

• Davis rebounded from a pair of misses in last year's season-opening double-overtime loss to Tennessee to split the uprights on the last two attempts of his injury-shortened campaign — a 34-yarder versus Jacksonville State (Sept. 9) and a 21-yarder against North Carolina (Sept. 30).

• Georgia Tech has finished in first or second place in the ACC's Coastal Division six times in **Paul Johnson's** 10 seasons as head coach and seven times in 13 seasons since the ACC split into divisions in 2005.

• The only other ACC teams that have finished first or second in their division as many as six times in the last 10 seasons are Clemson (8), Florida State (7) and Virginia Tech (7).

• Of the teams widely considered to be Georgia Tech's closest academic peers at the Power 5 level – Duke, Notre Dame, Northwestern, Purdue, Stanford and Vanderbilt – only Stanford (9) has played in more bowl games over the last 10 seasons than the Yellow Jackets (8).

• With a 4-4 record in ACC play last season, Georgia Tech has finished with at least a .500 conference record for the 22nd time in the last 23 seasons.

• Since 1995, the only time that Georgia Tech hasn't finished at least .500 in ACC play was 2015, when the injury-ravaged Yellow Jackets were 1-7 in conference action.

• In 35 seasons since officially joining the ACC in 1983, the Jackets have finished .500 or better 30 times.

• Over the course of their first five games last season, the Yellow Jackets only trailed for 20:43 of total playing time and just four seconds after halftime — the final four seconds of their 25-24 loss at No. 11/10 Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 — but went just 3-2 in those five games.

• Georgia Tech ranks fifth nationally in fewest penalty yards (35.40) and eighth nationally in fewest penalties (4.10) per game this season.

• Tech was also one of the nation's least-penalized teams in 2016, finishing 11th nationally in both fewest penalties per game (4.38) and fewest penalty yards per game (38.62).

• Georgia Tech's 2018 schedule includes three opponents ranked in the preseason top 10 (No. 2 Clemson, No. 3/4 Georgia and No. 8 Miami). Should the Yellow Jackets wind up playing three top-10 teams, it would mark the third time in the last four seasons that they do so (the Jackets also played three top-10 teams in 2015 and 2017). Prior to 2015, Tech had not faced three top-10 opponents in the same season since 1983 (which was its first season as a full-fledged member of the ACC).
