TOP STORYLINES

- One of college football's oldest rivalries is renewed on Saturday when Georgia Tech hosts No. 3/2 Clemson.
- Saturday's meeting is the 83rd in a series that dates back to 1898. Georgia Tech has only played three teams more often than it has played the Tigers (Georgia - 112 meetings, Auburn - 92, Duke - 85).
- Georgia Tech leads the all-time series with Clemson, 50-30-2, including a 44-14-2 advantage in games played in Atlanta.
- The Yellow Jackets' dominance over the Tigers at home includes wins in five of the last six matchups played at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Clemson is the highest-ranked opponent to visit Bobby Dodd Stadium since Sept. 9, 2000, when No. 2 Florida State escaped with a 26-21 victory over the Jackets.
- After two-straight games on the road, Georgia Tech returns to Bobby Dodd Stadium, where it has won nine of its last 10 games. Conversely, the Jackets have lost seven in a row away from home.
- Georgia Tech and Clemson are two of only eight teams that rank among the top 25 nationally in both total offense and total defense this season (GT - 21st in offense, 23rd in defense; Clemson - 20th in offense, 10th in defense).
- The Yellow Jackets are debuting their first adidas alternate uniform on Saturday. In a nod to Georgia Tech's 1990 national championship team, the alternate uniform features a gold helmet, blue jersey and white pants — the same combo that the '90 Jackets wore for home games, including a 21-19 victory over nationally ranked Clemson, as well as their 45-21 over Nebraska in the 1991 Florida Citrus Bowl.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

1
 Georgia Tech is ranked No. 1 nationally in rushing offense with 392.7 yards per game, 34.7 yards per game more than the next-closest team, Navy (358.0 ypg).

3
 Georgia Tech's 2018 schedule includes three opponents that were ranked in the preseason top 10 (No. 2 Clemson, No. 3/4 Georgia and No. 8 Miami) and three teams that are currently ranked among the nation's top 15 (No. 2 Clemson, No. 3 Georgia and No. 13/10 Virginia Tech). Should the Jackets wind up playing three top-10 teams, it would mark the third time in the last four seasons that they do so (the Jackets also played three top-10 teams in 2015 and 2017). Prior to 2015, GT had not faced three top-10 opponents in the same season since 1983 (which was its first season as a full-fledged member of the ACC).

 Georgia Tech, Ball State, SMU and Syracuse are the only four teams in the nation with three active players that have each rushed for 1,000 yards or more in their careers (**TaQuon Marshall** - 1,511, **KirVonte Benson** - 1,169 and **Clinton Lynch** - 1,110). *Research courtesy of Syracuse University*

5-of-6
 Georgia Tech has won five of its last six home games against Clemson. For three of the those five GT victories, Clemson was nationally ranked (GT def. No. 16/17 Clemson, 28-6, in 2014; GT def. No. 6 Clemson, 31-17, in 2011; GT def. No. 13 Clemson, 13-3, in 2007).

8
 Georgia Tech is one of eight teams that currently ranks among the nation's top 25 in both total offense (21st - 510.3 yards per game) and total defense (23rd - 302.3 ypg) this season. Joining the Yellow Jackets on the list is this week's opponent, Clemson (20th in total offense - 513.0 ypg, 10th in total defense - 268.0 ypg), as well as Louisiana Tech, Memphis, Mississippi State, North Texas, Oklahoma State and Washington State.

23
 Twenty-three of the 31 400-yard rushing games in Georgia Tech history have come in **Paul Johnson's** 10-plus seasons as the Yellow Jackets' head coach (2008-pres.). Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400 yards in a game 23 times in 132 contests (once every 5.7 games). Prior to his arrival, the Yellow Jackets had rushed for 400 yards in a game eight times in 1,138 contests (once every 142.3 games).

40,030
 Georgia Tech has rushed for 40,030 yards in **Paul Johnson's** 132 games as the Yellow Jackets' head coach (2008-pres.). The only other NCAA Division I FBS team that has rushed for at least 40,000 yards since Johnson's arrival on The Flats in 2008 is his former team, Navy (40,729). Tech's 40,030 rushing yards under Johnson are the equivalent of 22.75 miles.

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- even its records at 2-2 overall and 1-1 in ACC play;
- be its 10th win in its last 11 home games;
- be its sixth win in its last seven home games against Clemson;
- up it to 51-30-2 all-time against Clemson, including a 45-14-2 mark in Atlanta;
- be its first win over a top-three opponent since a 14-10 victory at No. 3 Miami (Fla.) on Nov. 19, 2005;
- be its fourth win over a top-three opponent all-time;
- be only its second win over a top-three opponent at home (prev.: 7-6 win over Alabama, Nov. 17, 1962).

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- drop it to 1-3 overall for first time since 2003;
- be only its second loss in its last 11 home games;
- be only its second loss in its last seven home games against Clemson;
- drop it to 3-30-2 all-time and 1-12-2 at home against top-three teams.



NOTING LAST WEEK'S LOSS AT PITT

• Pitt's 21 unanswered points to start the game were too much for Georgia Tech to overcome in a 24-19 loss last Saturday at Heinz Field.

• After falling into a 21-0 halftime hole, Georgia Tech outscored Pitt, 19-3, and outgained the Panthers, 231-120, in the second half but two turnovers in their final four possessions thwarted any hopes of a comeback victory.

• For the game, the Yellow Jackets outgained the Panthers, 386-335, marking the third time in three games this season that Tech has outgained its opponent.

• Georgia Tech was held scoreless in the opening half of a game for the first time since it didn't score in the first half of a 26-7 loss to Clemson on Sept. 22, 2016.

• GT fell to 8-3 in ACC openers under head coach **Paul Johnson** and 20-16 in conference openers since joining the ACC in 1983.

• The loss was Georgia Tech's seventh-straight away from Bobby Dodd Stadium and sixth-straight in true road games.

• Georgia Tech quarterback **TaQuon Marshall** ran for 103 yards, good for his eighth 100-yard rushing game in 14 career starts.

• Marshall also ran for two touchdowns, giving him 22 rushing TDs for his career. The 22 rushing touchdowns are tied with his predecessor as Georgia Tech's starting signal-caller, Justin Thomas, for third-most by a quarterback in program history.

• For the third time in as many games this season, three different Yellow Jackets rushed for at least 75 yards — Marshall (103), BB **Jordan Mason** (94) and BB **Jerry Howard** (82).

• Defensively, Georgia Tech's lone takeaway came on free safety **Malik Rivera's** first interception as a Yellow Jacket. Rivera had one interceptions in three seasons at Wofford before arriving at Tech as a graduate transfer prior to this season.

NOTING CLEMSON

• Clemson (3-0) is ranked No. 3 in this week's *Associated Press* poll and No. 2 in this week's Amway Coaches Poll.

• Clemson has won 46 of its last 50 games overall and 25 of its last 27 ACC games and 14 of its last 15 ACC road games.

• The Tigers have won three-straight ACC championships and is attempting to become the first ACC team to ever win four-consecutive outright conference titles (Florida State won or shared nine-straight ACC championships from 1992-2000 but never won more than three outright titles in a row).

• Clemson has earned three-straight berths in the College Football Playoff, including back-to-back championship game appearances following the 2015 and 2016 seasons. The Tigers won their second-ever national championship in 2016 (prev.: 1981).

• This season, Clemson is one of only eight teams that rank among the nation's top 25 in both total offense (20th - 513.0 ypg) and total defense (268.0 ypg). Georgia Tech is also one of the eight schools that rank among the nation's top 25 in both total offense and total defense (21st in total offense - 510.3 ypg, 23rd in total defense - 302.3 ypg).

• Clemson is led offensively by the two-headed quarterback monster of senior Kelly Bryant (405 passing yards, 125 rushing yards, four total TD) and true freshman Trevor Lawrence (424 passing yards, five TD passes).

• Sophomore running back Travis Etienne ranks eighth in the ACC and 36th nationally with 269 rushing yards this season.

• Headlining an outstanding defensive line that features four likely first-round picks in next year's NFL Draft is junior DE Clelin Ferrell, who leads the nation with five sacks in three games this season.

NOTING LAST YEAR'S LOSS AT CLEMSON

• In a driving rainstorm, Georgia Tech dropped a hard-fought 24-10 decision at No. 7-ranked and eventual ACC champion and College Football Playoff participant Clemson on Oct. 28 of last season.

• Georgia Tech trailed 7-3 late in the first quarter but Clemson scored the game's next 17 points to pull away.

• After trailing 21-3 at halftime, the Yellow Jackets limited the Tigers to just three points after the break and outscored Clemson, 7-3, in the second half.

• Georgia Tech's 198 rushing yards and 230 total yards were both its second-lowest totals of the season (GT had 188 rushing yards and 226 total yards in its season-ending loss to Georgia).

• Georgia Tech BB **KirVonte Benson** rushed for a game-high 129 yards on 16 carries (8.1 avg.). He was the only player to rush for 100 yards (first since Louisville's Lamar Jackson in 2016) or average eight yards per carry (first since Florida State's Dalvin Cook in 2016) in a game against Clemson last season.

• In fact, only five other *teams* rushed for as many yards against Clemson last season as Benson did alone (Syracuse - 162, The Citadel - 155, NC State - 153, Alabama - 141 and Wake Forest - 133).

• Georgia Tech true freshman P **Pressley Harvin III** punted nine times for 422 yards (46.9 avg.). The 422 punting yards were the ninth-most in Georgia Tech history and the most by a Yellow Jacket since Durant Brooks had 453 yards on 10 punts in a 24-10 loss at Boston College on Sept. 15, 2007.

GEORGIA TECH-CLEMSON SERIES HISTORY

• Georgia Tech and Clemson are meeting for the 84th time in a series that dates back to 1898.

• The Yellow Jackets officially hold a commanding 50-30-2 advantage in the all-time series*.

• In 35 matchups since the Yellow Jackets joined the Tigers in the ACC in 1983, Clemson officially holds a slim 19-16 advantage*.

• Georgia Tech head coach **Paul Johnson** is officially 4-6 against Clemson*, while Clemson's Dabo Swinney is 6-5 against the Yellow Jackets.

• After playing their first two games at neutral sites (Augusta, Ga. in 1898, Greenville, S.C. in 1899), the schools' next 41 gridiron matchups between 1902-1973 were all held at Georgia Tech.

• Georgia Tech has won five of the last six meetings at Bobby Dodd Stadium and is 44-14-2 all-time against the Tigers in Atlanta.

• Clemson is Georgia Tech's fourth-most common all-time opponent.

- Despite ranking 21st nationally in total offense, the Yellow Jackets are just 63rd nationally in scoring offense (32.7 ppg). The disparity can be largely attributed to missed opportunities and mistakes — namely, the Jackets rank 114th out of 129 FBS teams in red-zone offense (.714) and 121st nationally in turnovers lost (eight).

- After amassing 572.5 yards and 39.5 points per game over the first two contests of the season, Georgia Tech's offense cooled down a bit last Saturday at Pitt, as it totaled 386 yards in the 24-19 loss.

- In addition to leading the nation in rushing offense (392.7 ypg), Georgia Tech is one of only three FBS teams to eclipse 1,000 rushing yards so far this season with 1,178 yards on the ground through three games. Navy (1,074) and UNLV (1,040) are the only other FBS teams with 1,000 rushing yards this season.

- By rushing for at least 400 yards in two of their first three games this season, the Yellow Jackets have eclipsed the 400-yard rushing plateau six times in their last 14 contests, dating back to the beginning of last season (once every 2.3 games).

- During **Paul Johnson's** 10-plus seasons as Georgia Tech's head coach (2008-pres.), the Yellow Jackets have rushed for at least 400 yards in a game 23 times in 132 total contests (once every 5.7 games).

- Prior to Johnson's arrival on The Flats in 2008, Tech had rushed for at least 400 yards in a game just eight times in 1,138 games (once every 142.3 games).

- The Jackets set a school record with four 400-yard rushing games last season (535 vs. Tennessee on Sept. 4, 436 vs. Pitt on Sept. 23, 403 vs. North Carolina on Sept. 30 and 427 vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 21). Making the feat even more impressive is that it came in just 11 games, Tech's fewest games in a season since 1996. The previous GT record of three 400-yard rushing games in a season occurred three times, all under Johnson (2008, 2009 and 2014).

- The running game is the backbone of Johnson's high-powered spread option offense. Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats in 2008, only one team has rushed for more yards than Georgia Tech's 40,030 — Johnson's former team, Navy, which has run for 40,729 yards since '08.

- The Yellow Jackets have led the ACC and finished among the top 10 nationally in rushing offense in each of Johnson's first 10 seasons as head coach.

- In Johnson's 10-plus seasons at the helm, Georgia Tech has produced 17 rushers that have eclipsed the 1,000-yard plateau for their careers. That is over one-third of the 49 Yellow Jackets that have amassed 1,000 career rushing yards in the 126-season history of Georgia Tech football.

- The Jackets have three players on their current roster that have already eclipsed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for their careers in senior AB **Clinton Lynch**, senior QB **TaQuon Marshall** and junior BB **KirVonte Benson**.

- Georgia Tech has had multiple 100-yard rushers five times in its last 18 games overall. In addition to Marshall and Benson accomplishing the feat four times last season, QB Matthew Jordan (121 yards) and BB Marcus Marshall (143) both surpassed the century mark in a 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech on Nov. 12, 2016.

- Prior to having two 100-yard rushers five times in the last 18 games, Georgia Tech had two different players gain 100 yards on the ground in the same game only 29 times in school history.

- On Sept. 8 at USF, Georgia Tech fell just eight yards shy of the ultra-rare feat of having three players rush for 100 yards in the same game. Marshall led the way with 113 yards on the ground, followed by backup QB **Tobias Oliver** (97 yds.) and B-back **Jordan Mason** (95). Tech has only had three 100-yard rushers in the same game once in program history — Oct. 26, 2013 vs. Virginia (Zach Laskey - 133, Robert Godhigh - 111 and David Sims - 107).

- Had Oliver gotten just three more yards against USF, it would have also marked the first time in Georgia Tech history that two quarterbacks rushed for 100 yards in the same game.

- In Johnson's 10-plus seasons as head coach of the Yellow Jackets, Tech has been outgained on the ground just 18 times in 132 games.

- Georgia Tech has committed eight turnovers through just three games this season (2.7 per game).

- Last season, GT committed eight turnovers in its first four games of the season (one turnover every 37.8 plays) but had only six turnovers over the final seven games of the campaign (one turnover every 74.8 plays).

- Georgia Tech has played 264-consecutive games without being shut out, good for the seventh-longest active streak in NCAA Division I FBS.

- The Yellow Jackets have not been held scoreless since a 38-0 loss at No. 3 Florida State on Oct. 18, 1997.

- Even more impressively, Georgia Tech has not been blanked at home since a 7-0 loss to Georgia on Nov. 30, 1957 — good for a streak of 376-straight games played at Bobby Dodd Stadium without being shut out.

• Over their last 22 games, the Yellow Jackets have punted only 81 times (3.68 per game) and have come away with points on 104 of their 261 offensive possessions (39.8 percent).

• Georgia Tech has scored at least 24 points in 14 of its last 18 games.

• The Yellow Jackets had a streak of 10-consecutive games that ran from Nov. 12, 2016 (at Virginia Tech) through Oct. 21, 2017 (vs. Wake Forest). At the time, it was the fifth-longest active streak in the nation and the second-longest active streak in the ACC. It was also tied for the fourth-longest string of games with 24 points or more in Georgia Tech history.

• Marshall registered four of the 10 highest single-game rushing totals by a quarterback in Georgia Tech history last season.

• Marshall's six 100-yard rushing games in 2017 were the most ever by a Georgia Tech quarterback and tied for eighth in GT single-season history, regardless of position.

• Marshall is on the official watch list for the 2018 Maxwell Award, presented to "America's College Player of the Year." He is joined on the list by Georgia Tech B-back **KirVonte Benson**.

• Georgia Tech's backup signal-caller, redshirt freshman **Tobias Oliver**, has been ultra-impressive in the first two appearances of his career.

• On Sept. 8 at USF, Oliver replaced Marshall on the third play of the second half and engineered the Jackets' next three drives. GT scored touchdowns on all three series, with Oliver capping each drive with a touchdown (five, one and one yards).

• Of the 23 plays that Oliver was on the field for at USF, he carried the ball himself 18 times and accounted for 97 of the 189 yards that the Yellow Jackets gained while he was in the game.

OFFENSE

• Facing a critical third-and-nine play with less than 12 minutes to go in the game, Marshall re-entered the game in place of Oliver.

• Oliver finished with 97 yards on 18 carries (5.4 avg.) and three touchdowns, all on the ground, against USF.

• Despite only playing for a little more than a quarter, Oliver's three touchdowns marked the 48th time in school history that an individual has rushed for three TDs in a game.

• Oliver also impressed in his first collegiate appearance versus Alcorn State on Sept. 1. He rushed 12 times for 72 yards (6.0 avg.) and led the Yellow Jackets on a 17-play, 91-yard drive that saw him come up just short of a touchdown on fourth-and-goal.

• Despite playing for approximately just two full quarters this season, Oliver ranks 49th nationally and ninth in the ACC with 84.5 rushing yards per game this season (169 total rushing yards). He ranks seventh nationally and third in the ACC in rushing yards per game by quarterbacks.

• Oliver's three rushing touchdowns this season are tied for 40th nationally and seventh in the ACC (tied for 11th nationally and tied for third in the ACC among QBs).

• With a season-ending foot injury sustained by presumed backup quarterback **Lucas Johnson** during preseason camp, Marshall is the only active quarterback on Georgia Tech's roster that came into the 2018 season with any collegiate playing experience.

RUNNING BACKS

• Head coach **Paul Johnson** said prior to the season that the deepest position on Georgia Tech's roster was likely B-back. That depth has been tested and proven through three games this season.

• The biggest test of Georgia Tech's depth at the B-back position has been a season-ending knee injury sustained by junior **KirVonte Benson** during the first quarter of Georgia Tech's second game of the season at USF (Sept. 8).

• Benson, who ran for 1,053 yards as a sophomore in 2017, had 116 rushing yards and two touchdowns in less than three quarters of action this season before sustaining the season-ending injury at USF.

• Getting the majority of the carries at B-back in Benson's absence has been redshirt freshman **Jordan Mason**.

• Despite having only three collegiate games under his belt, Mason leads the ACC and ranks eighth nationally with 8.06 yards per carry this season.

• Mason also ranks seventh in the ACC and 34th in the nation with 274 total rushing yards.

• Mason leads all freshmen nationally with 8.06 yards per carry while his 274 rushing yards rank fourth among all FBS freshmen.

• Mason has run for at least 85 yards and averaged no less than 7.3 yards per carry in each of his first three collegiate games.

• Mason scored the first touchdown of his career — and Georgia Tech's first touchdown of the year — on a 28-yard run just 2:55 into the season opener against Alcorn State (Sept. 1).

• Making the B-back position even deeper is sophomore **Jerry Howard**. Howard has rushed for 90 yards on just 12 carries this season (7.5 avg.).

• In his first extensive action of the season, Howard ran for 82 yards on just eight carries (10.2 avg.) last Saturday at Pitt.

• Serving as Benson's top backup last season, Howard's 7.6 yards per carry ranked second on the team last season, behind only A-back **Nathan Cottrell** (8.2 avg.).

• Benson finished his 2018 season with just 15 carries, averaging 7.7 yards per rush.

• Benson opened the 2018 season by rushing for 75 yards on 10 carries (7.5 avg.) and matching a career-high with two touchdowns (five and eight yards) in a 41-0 win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. He played just two quarters in the opener, after sitting out the first quarter due to a minor violation of team rules and the fourth quarter when most of GT's regulars were removed from the game.

• On Sept. 8 at USF, Benson ran for 41 yards on just five carries (8.2 avg.) before sustaining the season-ending injury on Georgia Tech's second offensive series of the game.

• Benson, who did not have a collegiate carry prior to last season, rushed for 1,053 yards and six touchdowns as a sophomore in 2017. He ranked fifth in the ACC and 35th nationally with 95.7 rushing yards per game last season.

• Benson became only the third B-back in **Paul Johnson's** 10 seasons as head coach to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, joining Jonathan Dwyer (2008 and 2009) and Anthony Allen (2010).

• Georgia Tech is loaded with experience at the A-back position, where it boasts three upperclassmen with extensive playing experience — fifth-year seniors **Clinton Lynch** and **Qua Searcy** and Cottrell, a junior.

• For their careers, the A-back trio has combined to rush for 2,144 yards and 12 touchdowns on 261 carries (8.2 avg.) and catch 55 passes for 1,302 yards (23.7 avg.) and 12 touchdowns. As a group, they are averaging 10.9 yards per touch from scrimmage for their careers.

• Between them, Lynch, Searcy and Cottrell have combined for 412 all-purpose yards through the first three games of

this season — 220 rushing yards on 22 carries (10.0 avg.) and 192 receiving yards on eight receptions (24.0 avg.). They are averaging 13.7 yards every time they touch the ball in 2018.

• Since the beginning of 2016, 24 of Lynch's 92 touches have gone for 20 yards or more (12 rushes, 12 receptions — 26.1 percent) and nine of his 92 touches have gone for 40 yards or more (three rushes, six receptions — 9.8 percent).

• On Sept. 8 at USF, Lynch hauled in an 81-yard touchdown reception from quarterback **TaQuon Marshall**. The play was the second-longest reception of Lynch's career (long: 83 from Justin Thomas vs. North Carolina, Nov. 5, 2016), the longest completion of Marshall's career and Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since Lynch's 83-yard TD at UNC in 2016.

• Lynch's 83-yard touchdown reception at North Carolina on Nov. 5, 2016 remains Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since a 95-yard touchdown run by Orwin Smith vs. Kansas on Sept. 17, 2011, the sixth-longest reception in Georgia Tech history and the longest reception by a Yellow Jacket since Embry Peeples' 87-yard catch from Joshua Nesbitt at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.

• Searcy's 91 rushing yards against Mercer on Sept. 10, 2016 remain the most by a Georgia Tech A-back since Robert Godhigh ran for 126 yards in a 55-31 defeat at Clemson on Nov. 14, 2013.

• Cottrell's 69-yard run against Virginia Tech on Nov. 11 last season was the Yellow Jackets' second-longest rush of the year (behind only Marshall's 78-yard touchdown run at Virginia on Nov. 4).

WIDE RECEIVERS

• After catching just four passes as a junior last season, senior wide receiver **Brad Stewart** already has eight receptions through just three games this season.

• Stewart set a career high four catches against Alcorn State on Sept. 1, surpassing his previous career-high of three, which he achieved three times (twice as a sophomore in 2016, once as a freshman in 2015).

• Stewart's four catches against Alcorn State included the second touchdown reception of his career when quarterback **TaQuon Marshall** found him wide open in the corner of the end zone for a 24-yard scoring strike.

• After going the first 33 games of his career without a touchdown catch, Stewart now has two in the last six games. On Nov. 11 of last season, Stewart hauled in a 60-yard touchdown pass in the Jackets' 28-22 win over No. 17 Virginia Tech.

OFFENSE

- Stewart leads all current Yellow Jackets with 30-consecutive starts (the next-longest streak on the team belongs to junior OL **Parker Braun**, who has made 22-straight starts).
- Stewart has also played in all 39 of Georgia Tech's games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He is one of only two student-athletes on the Yellow Jackets' current roster that has played all 39 games since the beginning of '15, joining senior LB **Victor Alexander**.
- The starter opposite Stewart is sophomore wideout **Jalen Camp**. Camp, who had only one reception as a redshirt freshman in 2017, has four catches through three games this season, including a career-high two against Alcorn State (Sept. 1).
- The only true freshman who has seen action on offense for Georgia Tech this season is wide receiver **Malachi Carter**. Carter has served as the third wideout behind Stewart and Camp in the Yellow Jackets' rotation.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Eight different offensive linemen boast starting experience for Georgia Tech. Those eight have combined for a total of 90 starts over 152 career games played.

- The Yellow Jackets' offensive front got a boost last week with the return of junior **Kenny Cooper**, who missed all of fall camp and the first two games of the season due to a lower-body injury sustained during spring practice.
- Cooper, who started all 11 games at center in 2017, saw action at right guard in his return to the lineup last Saturday at Pitt.
- Behind its offensive line, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400-plus yards in six of its last 14 games, dating back to the beginning of last season.
- Last season, both left guard **Parker Braun** (Sept. 23 vs. Pittsburgh) and Cooper (Sept. 30 vs. North Carolina) were named ACC Offensive Linemen of the Week.
- Braun took 22 Pitt defenders to the ground and was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time in his first 11 career starts. Braun helped pave the way for the Yellow Jackets to run for 436 yards in the 35-17 win over Pitt, its most in an ACC game since it amassed 479 yards on the ground in a 56-23 win over NC State on Oct. 18, 2014.
- Cooper was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week one week after Braun claimed the award by taking 10 defenders to the ground and helping Georgia Tech run for 403 yards in its 33-7 win over North Carolina (Sept. 30). The award came in Cooper's fifth-career start.
- In 2016, Braun became the first Georgia Tech freshman to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after compiling 10 knockdowns and paving the way for Tech's 309 rushing yards in the Yellow Jackets' 30-20 win at No.

18 Virginia Tech (Nov. 12).

- Both Braun and Cooper represent Tech on official watch lists for national awards — Braun is a candidate for the Outland Trophy, presented to college football's top interior lineman, while Cooper is on the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, which is awarded to college football's top center.
- Additionally, Braun is a candidate for the 2018 Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, which is presented to the top offensive student-athlete in NCAA Division I football who was born in, played high-school football in or plays college football in the state of Texas.

DEFENSE

• In its first season under new defensive coordinator **Nate Woody**, Georgia Tech's defense ranks among the national leaders in total defense (302.3 ypg - 23rd), passing defense (156.0 ypg - 17th) and interceptions (three - 33rd).

• Last Saturday at Pitt, the Yellow Jackets' defense allowed 21 points and 215 yards in the opening half but buckled down in the second half, surrendering just three points and 120 yards after the break to allow the Jackets to nearly come back from a 21-0 deficit in an eventual 24-19 defeat.

• Over its final six possessions of the game, Pitt managed just three points and 114 yards of offense. Georgia Tech's defense forced three punts (two three-and-outs) and recorded an interception over those final six series.

• Woody's 3-4 defense recorded Georgia Tech's first shutout in 57 games in the Yellow Jackets' 41-0 victory over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The shutout was the Yellow Jackets' first since they blanked Syracuse, 56-0, on Oct. 19, 2013.

• Georgia Tech's defense also limited Alcorn State to just 146 yards of total offense, which is the second-lowest yardage total allowed by the Yellow Jackets in head coach **Paul Johnson's** 10-plus seasons at the helm. The only time that the Jackets surrendered fewer yards during Johnson's tenure came in his fifth game at Tech, when they allowed just 132 yards in a 27-0 win over Duke on Oct. 4, 2008.

• While Georgia Tech's offense put 34 points on the board against Alcorn, the Yellow Jackets' defense didn't need any of them, as it alone outscored the Braves, 7-0. Inside linebacker **David Curry** provided the defensive points when he scooped up a fumble caused by nose tackle **Brandon Adams** and returned it 15 yards for a touchdown.

• The fumble return for a touchdown was Georgia Tech's first since P.J. Davis returned a fumble 38 yards for a score during the Yellow Jackets' 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl.

• In all, Georgia Tech forced three turnovers in the season opener against Alcorn State, which marks one of only two times in the past 16 games that the Yellow Jackets had three takeaways in a contest (GT also forced three turnovers against Jacksonville State on Sept. 9 of last season).

• Georgia Tech has forced five turnovers through three games this season after not recording a single takeaway over the final three games of last season.

• Georgia Tech has featured six first time starters — Adams, Sr. OLB **Jalen Johnson**, So. SS **Tariq Carpenter**, Sr. FS **Malik Rivera***, So. CB **Jaytlin Askew** and redshirt Fr. CB **Tre Swilling** — and played a whopping nine true freshmen — DL **T.K. Chimedza**, DL **Justice Dingle**, LB **Jordan Domineck**, DL **Quon Griffin**, LB **Quez Jackson**, DB **Jaylon King**, LB **Charlie Thomas**, DB **Juanyeh Thomas** and CB **Zamari Walton** — on defense this season.

* Rivera started 18 games in three seasons at Wofford before transferring to Georgia Tech as a graduate student for this season.

• Woody came to The Flats from Appalachian State, where he served as defensive coordinator from 2013-17. Over his last three seasons at App State (2015-17 — the program's first three campaigns as full-fledged members of FBS), the Mountaineers' 3-4 scheme had average national rankings of 15th in scoring defense, 19th in total defense, 28th in rushing defense and 28th in passing defense.

• Appalachian also averaged 24 takeaways, 19 interceptions and 35 sacks per season over the last three campaigns,

all areas where Georgia Tech ranked among the bottom 20 teams nationally in 2017.

DEFENSIVE LINE

• Georgia Tech's three starting defensive linemen — seniors **Desmond Branch**, **Kyle Cerge-Henderson** and **Anree Saint-Amour** — have combined to play in 89 games and make 35 starts for the Yellow Jackets.

• This season marks the first time that Georgia Tech's entire starting defensive line is comprised of seniors since 1989, when seniors Willie Burks (DT), Jeff Mathis (NG) and Sean Smith (DT) were the starting linemen for the Jackets' 7-4 squad under head coach Bobby Ross (one season before Tech won its fourth national championship).

• Cerge-Henderson has recorded two sacks from his nose tackle position, which is good for a tie for eighth in the ACC and 59th nationally.

LINEBACKERS

• After missing the entire 2017 season due to a foot injury, junior inside linebacker **David Curry** is tied for Georgia Tech's team lead with 12 tackles on the young season.

• Curry, whose career high for tackles coming into the season was three, recorded four (Alcorn State) and six (USF) tackles in Georgia Tech's first two games this season.

• The tally against USF likely would've been higher but he was ejected for a targeting call in the fourth quarter of the tough-luck loss on Sept. 8. Due to the ejection, Curry also had to sit out the first half of last Saturday's ACC opener at Pitt.

• Curry scored Georgia Tech's first defensive touchdown of the season when he scooped up a fumble forced by nose tackle **Brandon Adams** and returned it 15 yards for a score early in the third quarter of the shutout win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The fumble return for a touchdown was the Yellow Jackets' first since P.J. Davis returned a fumble 38 yards for a score during the Jackets' 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl.

• Curry's return to action this season came following a series of injuries that kept him out of action last season (foot) and cost him time this past spring (thumb).

• The heart and soul of Georgia Tech's defense is senior co-captain **Brant Mitchell**, who starts at the other inside-linebacker position beside Curry. Mitchell has 11 tackles through three games this season.

• As the Yellow Jackets' middle linebacker last season, Mitchell ranked fourth on the team with 51 tackles despite playing in only seven full games and parts of two others due to a lower-body injury. His 5.7 tackles per game led the team.

• In his first full game after returning to the lineup against No. 17 Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, Mitchell recorded a team-high nine tackles, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss, and was named ACC Co-Linebacker of the Week.

• In all, Georgia Tech went just 1-3 in the four games that Mitchell missed all or part of last season.

• The other senior among Georgia Tech's starting linebackers, OLB **Victor Alexander**, led the Yellow Jackets with 60 tackles in his first season as a starter last year.

• Despite cracking the starting lineup for the first time as a junior last season, Alexander has played in all 39 of Georgia Tech's games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He is one of only two student-athletes on the Yellow Jackets' current roster that has played all 39 games since '15, joining senior WR **Brad Stewart**.

• Georgia Tech's fourth linebacker position — the "stinger" OLB — is manned largely by a trio of individuals that were tabbed for the secondary prior to Woody's arrival on The Flats — senior **Jalen Johnson**, junior **Christian Campbell** and true freshman **Charlie Thomas**.

• Despite previously being limited to the defensive backfield and special teams, Johnson and Campbell have combined for 57 career tackles and four tackles for loss, including 15 stops and two TFL through three games this season.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

• Last season, Georgia Tech's starting secondary was comprised of five veterans that combined to make 127 starts and play in 218 games.

• However, none of the five members of last year's starting secondary returned in 2018. **Lawrence Austin**, **Lance Austin**, **Step Durham** and **Corey Griffin** all graduated while **A.J. Gray** had to step away from football due to a heart condition.

• In their wake, the defensive backs listed on Georgia Tech's two-deep combined for zero starts and just 27 games played prior to this season.

• Of the nine DBs listed on Tech's two-deep, three are sophomores (CB **Jaytlin Askew**, SS **Tariq Carpenter** and CB **Ajani Kerr**), two are redshirt freshmen (CB **Tre Swilling** and SS **Kaleb Oliver**) and three are true freshmen (CB **Jaylon King**, FS **Juanyeh Thomas** and CB **Zamari Walton**).

• The lone upperclassman in the group made his NCAA Division I FBS debut against Alcorn State. Graduate student **Malik Rivera** earned the starting nod at strong safety after transferring to Georgia Tech from Wofford, where he had 131 tackles over the past three seasons.

• Rivera's position coach at Wofford the last two seasons (and defensive coordinator in 2017) was **Shiel Wood**, who now serves as Georgia Tech's safeties coach.

• An incredible student, Rivera graduated from Wofford in May as a triple-major in mathematics, finance and computer science. He is pursuing a master's degree in quantitative and computational finance at Georgia Tech.

• Georgia Tech's three interceptions this season all belong to safeties — Rivera (vs. Pitt), Carpenter (vs. USF) and Oliver (vs. Alcorn State).

SPECIAL TEAMS

• Georgia Tech's 19 blocked kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season are the fourth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• Georgia Tech boasts one of the nation's top punters in sophomore **Pressley Harvin III**.

• Harvin has only been called upon to punt seven times through three games this season and is averaging 40.7 yards per kick (he does not qualify for official NCAA rankings because he is short of the minimum 3.6 attempts per game).

• Among his seven punts this year, Harvin III has boomed a 47-yarder (at Pitt), a 48-yarder (vs. Alcorn State) and a 62-yarder (at USF).

• Last season, Harvin III led all NCAA Division I FBS true freshmen, ranked 16th overall nationally and was second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with a 44.1-yard punting average last season.

• Harvin's 44.1-yard average was also a Georgia Tech freshman record and ranked fifth overall in single-season program history.

• Of Harvin's 50 punts last season, 13 traveled 50-plus yards (26 percent), 16 were downed inside the 20 yard line (32 pct.), 15 were fair-caught (30 pct.) and 29 were not returned (58 pct.).

• Making Harvin's freshman campaign even more impressive was that two of his best performances have come in less-than-ideal conditions for punting — he recorded career-bests with a 62-yard punt and four kicks downed inside the 20 yard line at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 and had five punts that traveled 50 yards or more and three downed inside the 20 at Clemson on Oct. 28. The majority of both games were played during heavy rain storms.

• Following his incredible rookie campaign, Harvin III was named freshman all-America by the Football Writers Association of America, true freshman all-America by ESPN and was a third-team all-ACC honoree.

• Harvin III is on the official watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to college football's top punter. He was first added to the list midway through his prolific freshman campaign last fall.

• Harvin became only the third FWAA freshman all-American in school history (joining OL Will Jackson, 2010, and PK Travis Bell, 2004) and the first Georgia Tech freshman to earn all-ACC recognition since Calvin Johnson (first-team WR) and Bell (second-team PK) in '04.

• True freshman **Juanyeh Thomas** earned the job as Georgia Tech's primary punt and kickoff returner during fall camp.

• Thomas' 25-yard punt return in the second quarter of the Sept. 1 season opener against Alcorn was Georgia Tech's longest punt return since **Brad Stewart's** 26-yarder versus Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 1, 2016.

• Thomas' 38-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter at USF (Sept. 8) was the longest by a Yellow Jacket since **Lamont Simmons** scooped up an onside kick attempt and returned it 42 yards for a touchdown at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 of last season.

• USF's 266 yards on kickoff returns on Sept. 8 — which included 98- and 97-yard returns for touchdowns by Terrence Horne in the first quarter — were the second-most yards that Georgia Tech has ever allowed on kickoff returns in a single game (second only to North Carolina's 267 yards in a 68-50 GT win on Nov. 10, 2012).

• The two touchdowns allowed on kickoff returns against USF tied an NCAA Division I FBS single-game record.

• In Georgia Tech's seven kickoffs since Horne's back-to-back touchdowns at USF, the Yellow Jackets have pinned the opponent inside its 25 yard line six times (the only exception being on a squib kick).

• Last Saturday at Pitt, junior place kicker **Shawn Davis** sent all three kickoffs into the end zone for touchbacks.



MISCELLANEOUS

• Georgia Tech is one of eight teams that currently ranks among the nation's top 25 in both total offense (21st - 510.3 yards per game) and total defense (23rd - 302.3 ypg) this season. Joining the Yellow Jackets on the list is this week's opponent, Clemson (20th in total offense - 513.0 ypg, 10th in total defense - 268.0 ypg), as well as Louisiana Tech, Memphis, Mississippi State, North Texas, Oklahoma State and Washington State.

• Bobby Dodd Stadium has been home sweet home for Georgia Tech of late, as it has won nine of its last 10 home games, dating back to midway through the 2016 season.

• However, on the flip side, Georgia Tech has struggled in games played away from its Midtown Atlanta home as of late. The Yellow Jackets have lost all seven games played away from Bobby Dodd Stadium dating back to the beginning of last season and are in search of their first win away from home since their 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31, 2016) and their first true road win since their 28-27 triumph at Georgia on Nov. 26, 2016.

• Over the course of its seven-game losing streak in games played away from Bobby Dodd Stadium, Georgia Tech has squandered double-digit leads in five of the seven defeats.

• Last year, Georgia Tech became only the 10th team in ACC history with two one-point losses in the same season (a 42-41 double-overtime loss to No. 25 Tennessee on Sept. 4 and a 25-24 loss at No. 11 Miami on Oct. 14).

• Three of the Yellow Jackets' five defeats last season — Sept. 4 vs. Tennessee, Oct. 11 at Miami (Fla.) and Nov. 4 at Virginia — came by a total of just six points.

• In each of those three defeats, Georgia Tech's opponent scored the winning points in the final 82 seconds of regulation or in overtime.

• Over the course of their first five games last season, the Yellow Jackets only trailed for 20:43 of total playing time and just four seconds after halftime — the final four seconds of their 25-24 loss at No. 11/10 Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 — but went just 3-2 in those five games.
