TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech hits the road for the first time this season when it travels to Tampa, Fla. to take on USF.
- The Yellow Jackets opened the season with a convincing 41-0 win over Alcorn State last Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- In the debut of defensive coordinator **Nate Woody's** 3-4 scheme, Tech's defense recorded its first shutout in 57 games, dating back to a 56-0 victory over Syracuse on Oct. 19, 2013.
- The Jackets limited Alcorn State to just 146 yards of total offense, which is the fewest allowed by a GT defense since it surrendered 132 yards in a 27-0 win over Duke on Oct. 4, 2008 (head coach **Paul Johnson's** fifth game at Tech).
- Not to be outdone, Georgia Tech's offense racked up 543 total yards against Alcorn, including 439 on the ground, which marked the fifth time in the last 12 games that the Yellow Jackets have rushed for 400-plus yards. Prior to the beginning of last season, Tech had rushed for 400 yards in a game just 25 times in program history.
- Georgia Tech and USF are meeting for the first time. GT fielded its first football team in 1892 and is competing in its 126th football season. USF played its first football game in 1997 and is in its 22nd season overall and 19th at the NCAA Division I FBS level.
- While the Yellow Jackets have never faced USF, it has played at the Bulls' home stadium before. Raymond James Stadium was the site of the 2009 ACC Championship Game, which Georgia Tech won over Clemson, 39-34 (*the Yellow Jackets later vacated the victory due to NCAA sanctions*).

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

Saturday's meeting is the first between Georgia Tech and USF.

Georgia Tech's 2018 schedule includes three opponents ranked in the preseason top 10 (No. 2 Clemson, No. 3/4 Georgia and No. 8 Miami). Should the Yellow Jackets wind up playing three top-10 teams, it would mark the third time in the last four seasons that they do so (the Jackets also played three top-10 teams in 2015 and 2017). Prior to 2015, Tech had not faced three top-10 opponents in the same season since 1983 (which was its first season as a full-fledged member of the ACC).

Of the 127 NCAA Division I FBS teams that have played so far this season, Georgia Tech is one of only four that hasn't allowed a point, joining Air Force (38-0 win over Stony Brook), Georgia (45-0 win over Austin Peay) and UAB (52-0 win over Savannah State).

With 439 rushing yards against Alcorn State last Saturday, Georgia Tech eclipsed the 400-yard rushing mark for the fifth time in 12 games, dating back to the beginning of last season.

 Georgia Tech's 2018 schedule is ranked as the fifth-toughest in the nation by *Bleacher Report* and is the toughest schedule in the ACC according to *Athlon*.

 Twenty-two of the 30 400-yard rushing games in Georgia Tech history have come in **Paul Johnson's** 10-plus seasons as the Yellow Jackets' head coach (2008-pres.). Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400 yards in a game 22 times in 130 contests (once every 5.9 games). Prior to his arrival, the Yellow Jackets had rushed for 400 yards in a game eight times in 1,138 contests (once every 142.3 games).

Defenses coached by Georgia Tech defensive coordinator Nate Woody have not surrendered a point in the last 131:05 of game play. Prior to a 41-0 shutout win over Alcorn State in Woody's Georgia Tech debut last Saturday, Woody's previous team, Appalachian State, ended last season with a 34-0 win over Toledo in the Dollar General Bowl. A Woody-coached defense hasn't allowed a point since Louisiana-Lafayette scored a touchdown with 11:05 to go in App State's 63-14 victory over the Ragin' Cajuns on Dec. 2 of last season.

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- move the Yellow Jackets to 2-0 for the eighth time in Paul Johnson's 11 seasons as head coach;
- snap a six-game losing streak in games played away from home and a five-game skid in true road games;
- be its first win away from Bobby Dodd Stadium since its 33-18 victory over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31, 2016);
- be its first true road win since a 28-27 triumph at Georgia on Nov. 26, 2016;
- be its ninth-straight win over a current member of the American Athletic Conference;
- up it to 72-26-1 all-time against current members of the AAC.
- move to 1-0 all-time against USF.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- drop it to 1-1 for the second-straight year;
- extend its losing streak in games played away from home to seven and its skid in true road games to six;
- be its first loss to a current member of the American Athletic Conference since a 36-26 loss to Navy on Nov. 23, 1996, snapping an eight-game winning streak over current members of the AAC;
- drop it to 71-27-1 all-time against current members of the AAC.
- drop it to 0-1 all-time against USF.



NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN OVER ALCORN ST.

• Georgia Tech opened the 2018 season with a 41-0 shutout win over Alcorn State last Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

• The Yellow Jackets rushed for 439 yards and surrendered just 77 yards on the ground, en route to a 543-146 advantage in total yardage. The Jackets averaged 7.5 yards per play, compared to just 2.9 for Alcorn.

• The shutout was Georgia Tech's first in 57 games, dating back to a 56-0 win over Syracuse on Oct. 19, 2013.

• Alcorn State's 146 total yards were the fewest allowed by Georgia Tech since it surrendered 132 yards in a 27-0 win over Duke on Oct. 4, 2008 (which was **Paul Johnson's** fifth game as head coach at Tech).

• Georgia Tech's defense outscored Alcorn State all by itself, as the Yellow Jackets scored seven points on a 15-yard fumble return for a touchdown by inside linebacker **David Curry**.

• Offensively, the Jackets rushed for 400-plus yards for the fifth time in the last 12 games, dating back to the beginning of last season. Prior to the beginning of last season, Tech had five 400-yard rushing games in the previous three seasons combined.

• Georgia Tech's 8.1 yards per carry were its most since it averaged 9.4 yards per carry in a 31-28 loss to Pitt on Oct. 17, 2015.

• Georgia Tech had three players with 75 rushing yards or more (BB **Jordan Mason** – 85, QB **Taquon Marshall** – 77 and BB **KirVonte Benson** – 75) for the first time since last season's opener versus Tennessee (Marshall – 249, Benson – 124 and AB **Nathan Cottrell** – 79). The Jackets just missed out on having a fourth rusher with 75 yards against Alcorn State, as backup quarterback **Tobias Oliver** finished with 72 yards on 12 carries.

• Georgia Tech won its season opener for the 16th time in the last 20 seasons and the ninth time in 11 seasons under Johnson. The Yellow Jackets moved to 88-34-4 (.714) in 126 all-time season openers.

• Georgia Tech moved to 11-0 in home openers under Johnson. It was the Yellow Jackets' 12th-straight home-opening win overall and 19th victory in its last 20 home openers. The Jackets moved to 95-25-4 (.782) in 124 all-time home openers (Tech did not play any home games in 1897 or 1898).

NOTING USF

• USF is 1-0 after a season-opening 34-14 home win over Elon last Saturday.

• USF outgained Elon, 515-234, with 367 of the Bulls' 515 yards coming through the air on 29-of-46 passing.

• In his first game at USF, junior quarterback Blake Barnett completed 24-of-34 passes for 305 yards and three touchdowns.

• USF is Barnett's fourth school in four years. He began his career at Alabama, where he redshirted in 2015 and played in three games in 2016, including as the starter in the season opener against USC. He transferred to Palomar (Calif.) College before moving on to Arizona State, where he appeared in four games as a reserve in 2017. He earned a bachelor's degree from ASU last spring and enrolled at USF as a graduate transfer. He has two seasons of eligibility remaining.

• Barnett's favorite target in the opener was redshirt freshman wide receiver Randall St. Felix, who caught seven passes for 143 yards and a touchdown in his collegiate debut.

• USF is 22-4 since the beginning of the 2016 season.

• USF is one of just 15 NCAA FBS programs that won 20 or more games over the 2016-17 seasons and one of only three FBS programs that won 20 or more games and two bowl games during that two-season span.

• Head coach Charlie Strong is in his second season at USF. He is 11-2 with the Bulls and 64-39 overall in eight-plus seasons as a head coach, which includes stints at Louisville (2010-13) and Texas (2014-16).

• USF defensive coordinator Brian Jean-Mary was Georgia Tech's linebackers coach from 2004-09, which included the first two seasons of Paul Johnson's tenure as head coach. In two seasons under Johnson, Jean-Mary helped lead the Yellow Jackets to a 20-7 overall record and two ACC Coastal Division championships.

GEORGIA TECH AGAINST THE AAC

• Georgia Tech is 71-26-1 all-time against current members of the American Athletic Conference.

• Fifty of Tech's previous 98 games against current members of the AAC have come against Tulane (the Yellow Jackets are 37-13 all-time against the Green Wave).

• The Jackets have won eight-straight against current members of the AAC. Their last loss to a current AAC squad was a 36-26 defeat to Navy on Nov. 23, 1996.

• Last season, Georgia Tech rushed for 307.4 yards per game, good for tops in the ACC and fifth nationally. The Yellow Jackets have led the ACC and finished among the top 10 nationally in rushing offense in each of Johnson's 10 seasons as head coach.

• Georgia Tech's 439-yard rushing performance in the season opener against Alcorn State marked the fifth time in 12 games since the beginning of last season that the Yellow Jackets have rushed for at least 400 yards in a game (once every 2.4 games).

• The Jackets set a school record with four 400-yard rushing games last season (535 vs. Tennessee on Sept. 4, 436 vs. Pitt on Sept. 23, 403 vs. North Carolina on Sept. 30 and 427 vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 21). Making the feat even more impressive is that it came in just 11 games, Tech's fewest games in a season since 1996. The previous GT record of

three 400-yard rushing games in a season occurred three times, all under Johnson (2008, 2009 and 2014).

• In Johnson's 10-plus seasons at the helm, Georgia Tech has produced 17 rushers that have eclipsed the 1,000-yard plateau for their careers. That is over one-third percent of the 49 Yellow Jackets that have amassed 1,000 career rushing yards in the 126-season history of Georgia Tech football.

• Georgia Tech has had multiple 100-yard rushers five times in its last 16 games overall. In addition to Marshall and Benson accomplishing the feat four times last season, QB Matthew Jordan (121 yards) and BB Marcus Marshall (143) both surpassed the century mark in a 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech on Nov. 12, 2016.

• Prior to having two 100-yard rushers five times in the last 16 games, Georgia Tech had two different players gain 100 yards on the ground in the same game only 29 times in school history.

• Georgia Tech's 41-point, 543-yard performance against Alcorn State last Saturday would have likely been even more impressive if it weren't for three turnovers. The three turnovers were the Jackets' most in a game since they lost four fumbles in a 35-17 win over Pitt on Sept. 23 of last season.

• After turning the ball over eight times in its first 284 offensive plays of last season (one turnover every 35.5 snaps), Georgia Tech committed only six turnovers in its last 467 plays of the campaign (one turnover every 77.8 snaps).

• The Yellow Jackets went 160 offensive plays and 26 offensive possessions without a turnover from Sept. 30-Oct. 28 of last season. The 160-play streak without a turnover spanned from a fumble in the third quarter of the Jackets' 33-7 win over North Carolina on Sept. 30 to a fumble on the opening drive of their 24-10 loss at No. 7 Clemson on Oct. 28.

• Georgia Tech has played 261-consecutive games without being shut out, good for the seventh-longest active streak in NCAA Division I FBS.

• The Yellow Jackets have not been held scoreless since a 38-0 loss at No. 3 Florida State on Oct. 18, 1997.

• Even more impressively, Georgia Tech has not been blanked at home since a 7-0 loss to Georgia on Nov. 30, 1957 — good for a streak of 376-straight games played at Bobby Dodd Stadium without being shut out.

- Marshall's six 100-yard rushing games in 2017 were the most ever by a Georgia Tech quarterback and tied for eighth in GT single-season history, regardless of position.

- Marshall is on the official watch list for the 2018 Maxwell Award, presented to "America's College Player of the Year." He is joined on the list by Georgia Tech B-back **KirVonte Benson**.

- Georgia Tech's backup signal-caller, redshirt freshman **Tobias Oliver**, impressed in his first collegiate appearance last Saturday versus Alcorn State. He rushed 12 times for 72 yards (6.0 avg.) and led the Yellow Jackets on a 17-play, 91-yard drive that saw him come up just short of a touchdown on fourth-and-goal.

- Benson opened the 2018 season by rushing for 75 yards on 10 carries (7.5 avg.) and matching a career-high with two touchdowns (five and eight yards) in last Saturday's 41-0 win over Alcorn State.

- Benson, who did not have a collegiate carry prior to last season, rushed for 1,053 yards and six touchdowns as a sophomore in 2017.

- Benson ranked fifth in the ACC and 35th nationally with 95.7 rushing yards per game last season.

- Benson became only the third B-back in **Paul Johnson's** 10 seasons as head coach to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, joining Jonathan Dwyer (2008 and 2009) and Anthony Allen (2010).

- Over the final eight games of last season, with Georgia Tech facing four of the nation's top 13 and five of the top 40 defenses in terms of tackles for loss (Miami - third; Clemson - 12th; Wake Forest - seventh; Virginia Tech - 13th; Duke - t-40th), Benson has had just seven negative carries (for minus-14 yards total) in 120 attempts.

- Benson was one of the Yellow Jackets' few bright spots in a 24-10 loss at No. 7 Clemson on Oct. 28 of last season, as he ran for a game-high 129 yards on just 16 carries (8.1 avg.). He was the only player to rush for 100 yards (first since Louisville's Lamar Jackson in 2016) or average eight yards per carry (first since Florida State's Dalvin Cook in 2016) in a game against Clemson last season.

- In fact, only five other *teams* rushed for as many yards against Clemson last season as Benson did alone (Syracuse - 162, The Citadel - 155, NC State - 153, Alabama - 141 and Wake Forest - 133).

- Benson's 196 rushing yards against Pitt on Sept. 23 of last season are tied for the 16th-most in Georgia Tech single-game history and are the most by a B-back in Johnson's 10 seasons as Tech's head coach (prev.: 195 - Anthony Allen vs. Virginia, Oct. 9, 2010).

- Benson is on the official watch list for the 2018 Maxwell Award, presented to "America's College Player of the Year." He is joined on the list by Georgia Tech quarterback **TaQuon Marshall**.

- Making the start at B-back for last week's season opener was redshirt freshman **Jordan Mason**. Mason got the start over Benson due to Benson being suspended for the first quarter of the game due to a minor violation of team rules.

- Mason made the most of the opportunity, rushing for a game-high 85 yards on 11 carries (7.7 avg.). He also scored the first touchdown of his career — and Georgia Tech's first touchdown of the season — on a 28-yard run just 2:55 into the game.

- Making the B-back position even deeper is sophomore **Jerry Howard**. Serving as Benson's top backup last season, Howard's 7.6 yards per carry ranked second on the team last season, behind only A-back **Nathan Cottrell** (8.2 avg.).

- Howard ran for 82 yards on just six carries (13.7 avg.) in his collegiate debut against Jacksonville State on Sept. 9 of last season, including a 65-yard touchdown run. The 65-yard TD run, which came on the second carry of his career, was the longest by a Georgia Tech true freshman since Jonathan Dwyer also had a 65-yard touchdown run vs. Samford on Sept. 8, 2007.

- Georgia Tech is loaded with experience at the A-back position, where it boasts three upperclassmen with extensive playing experience — fifth-year seniors **Clinton Lynch** and **Qua Searcy** and Cottrell, a junior.

- For their careers, the A-back trio has combined to rush for 2,032 yards and 11 touchdowns on 246 carries (8.3 avg.) and catch 49 passes for 1,146 yards (24.1 avg.) and 11 touchdowns.

- Between them, Lynch, Searcy and Cottrell combined to rush for 108 yards on just four carries (27.0 avg.) last Saturday against Alcorn State. Searcy led the way with a 56-yard rush, Lynch had 27 yards on two carries and Cottrell added a 25-yard run.

- Searcy also had two catches for 36 yards in last Saturday's season opener, giving him 92 yards on just three touches (30.7 avg.).

- Last season, the A-back trio of Lynch, Searcy and Cottrell combined for 697 yards on just 97 carries (7.2 avg.) and caught seven passes for 173 yards (24.7 avg.).

- Lynch is one of three players on the Yellow Jackets' current roster with 1,000 career rushing yards (joining **TaQuon Marshall** and **KirVonte Benson**). Lynch has 1,108 yards and seven touchdowns on 115 career carries (9.6 career avg.).

- Lynch has also caught 30 passes for 806 yards (26.9 career avg.) and nine touchdowns as a Yellow Jacket.

- All told, Lynch is averaging 13.2 yards per touch for his career (1,914 all-purpose yards on 145 touches) to go along with his 16 touchdowns.

- Since the beginning of 2016, 22 of Lynch's 86 touches have gone for 20 yards or more (12 rushes, 10 receptions — 25.6 percent) and eight of his 86 touches have gone for 40 yards or more (three rushes, five receptions — 9.3 percent).

- Lynch led the ACC in both yards per rush (11.2) and yards of total offense per play (11.2) as a sophomore in 2016.

- Lynch's 83-yard touchdown reception at North Carolina on Nov. 5 of last season remains Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since a 95-yard touchdown run by Orwin Smith vs. Kansas on Sept. 17, 2011, the sixth-longest reception in Georgia Tech history and the longest reception by a Yellow Jacket since Embry Peoples' 87-yard catch from Joshua Nesbitt at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.

- Searcy's 91 rushing yards against Mercer on Sept. 10, 2016 remain the most by a Georgia Tech A-back since Robert Godhigh ran for 126 yards in a 55-31 defeat at Clemson on Nov. 14, 2013.

- Cottrell's 69-yard run against Virginia Tech on Nov. 11 last season was the Yellow Jackets' second-longest rush of the year (behind only **TaQuon Marshall's** 78-yard touchdown run at Virginia on Nov. 4).

WIDE RECEIVERS

- After catching just four passes as a junior last season, senior wide receiver **Brad Stewart** matched his entire receptions total from 2017 with a career-high four receptions last Saturday against Alcorn State.

- Stewart's career-high four catches against Alcorn State surpassed his previous career-high of three, which he achieved three times (twice as a sophomore in 2016, once

as a freshman in 2015).

- Stewart’s four catches last Saturday included the second touchdown reception of his career when quarterback TaQuon Marshall found him wide open in the corner of the end zone for a 24-yard scoring strike.
- After going the first 33 games of his career with out a touchdown catch, Stewart now has two in the last four games. On Nov. 11 of last season, Stewart hauled in a 60-yard touchdown pass in the Jackets’ 28-22 win over No. 17 Virginia Tech.
- Stewart leads all current Yellow Jackets with 28-consecutive starts (the next-longest streak on the team belongs to junior OL **Parker Braun**, who has made 20-straight starts).
- Stewart has also played in all 37 of Georgia Tech’s games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He is one of only two student-athletes on the Yellow Jackets’ current roster that has played all 37 games since the beginning of ‘15, joining senior LB **Victor Alexander**.
- Making his first-career start, sophomore wideout **Jalen Camp** also set a career high with two receptions against Alcorn State. The only other catch of his career came on a 49-yarder at Virginia on Nov. 4 of last season.
- The only true freshman to see action on offense for Georgia Tech in the season opener against Alcorn State was wide receiver **Malachi Carter**. Carter served as the third wideout behind Stewart and Camp in the Yellow Jackets’ rotation last Saturday.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Seven different offensive linemen boast starting experience for Georgia Tech. Those seven have combined for a total of 80 starts over 140 career games played.

- Behind its offensive line, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400-plus yards in five of its last 12 games, dating back to the beginning of last season.
- Last season, both left guard **Parker Braun** (Sept. 23 vs. Pittsburgh) and center **Kenny Cooper** (Sept. 30 vs. North Carolina) were named ACC Offensive Linemen of the Week.
- Braun took 22 Pitt defenders to the ground and was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time in his first 11 career starts. Braun helped pave the way for the Yellow Jackets to run for 436 yards in the 35-17 win over Pitt, its most in an ACC game since it amassed 479 yards on the ground in a 56-23 win over NC State on Oct. 18, 2014.
- Cooper was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week one week after Braun claimed the award by taking 10 defenders to the ground and helping Georgia Tech run for 403 yards in its 33-7 win over North Carolina (Sept. 30). The award came in Cooper’s fifth-career start.

- In 2016, Braun became the first Georgia Tech freshman to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after compiling 10 knockdowns and paving the way for Tech’s 309 rushing yards in the Yellow Jackets’ 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech (Nov. 12).
- Both Braun and Cooper represent Tech on official watch lists for national awards — Braun is a candidate for the Outland Trophy, presented to college football’s top interior lineman, while Cooper is on the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, which is awarded to college football’s top center.
- Additionally, Braun is a candidate for the 2018 Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, which is presented to the top offensive student-athlete in NCAA Division I football who was born in, played high-school football in or plays college football in the state of Texas.

DEFENSE

- **Nate Woody's** debut as Georgia Tech's defensive coordinator couldn't have gone much better last Saturday against Alcorn State.
- Woody's 3-4 defense recorded Georgia Tech's first shutout in 57 games in the 41-0 victory. The shutout was the Yellow Jackets' first since they blanked Syracuse, 56-0, on Oct. 19, 2013.
- Georgia Tech's defense also limited Alcorn State to just 146 yards of total offense, which is the second-lowest yardage total allowed by the Yellow Jackets in head coach Paul Johnson's 10-plus seasons at the helm. The only time that the Jackets surrendered fewer yards during Johnson's tenure came in his fifth game at Tech, when they allowed just 132 yards in a 27-0 win over Duke on Oct. 4, 2008.
- Of the 127 NCAA Division I FBS teams that have played so far this season, Georgia Tech is one of only four that hasn't allowed a point, joining Air Force (38-0 win over Stony Brook), Georgia (45-0 win over Austin Peay) and UAB (52-0 win over Savannah State).
- Through one game, Georgia Tech's defense also ranks among the national leaders in total defense (fourth - 146. ypg), fumbles recovered (fifth - 2), first downs allowed (sixth - 9), pass defense (10th - 69 ypg), third-down conversion defense (11th - .182), takeaways (14th - 3) and rushing defense (21st - 77 ypg).
- While Georgia Tech's offense put 34 points on the board against Alcorn, the Yellow Jackets' defense didn't need any of them, as it alone outscored the Braves, 7-0. Inside linebacker **David Curry** provided the defensive points when he scooped up a fumble caused by nose tackle **Brandon Adams** and returned it 15 yards for a touchdown.
- The fumble return for a touchdown was Georgia Tech's first since P.J. Davis returned a fumble 38 yards for a score during the Yellow Jackets' 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl.
- In all, Georgia Tech forced three turnovers in the season opener against Alcorn State, which marked only the second time in the past 14 games that the Yellow Jackets had three takeaways in a contest (GT also forced three turnovers against Jacksonville State on Sept. 9 of last season).
- The Jackets did not record a single takeaway over the final three games of last season.
- Georgia Tech's defense had six first-time starters against Alcorn State — Adams, Sr. OLB **Jalen Johnson**, So. SS **Tariq Carpenter**, Sr. FS **Malik Rivera***, So. CB **Jaytlin Askew** and redshirt Fr. CB **Tre Swilling**.
* Rivera started 18 games in three seasons at Wofford before transferring to Georgia Tech as a graduate student for this season.
- Georgia Tech also played a whopping nine true freshmen on defense in the season opener — DL **T.K. Chimedza**, DL **Justice Dingle**, LB **Jordan Domineck**, DL **Quon Griffin**, LB **Quez Jackson**, DB **Jaylon King**, LB **Charlie Thomas**, DB **Juanyeh Thomas** and CB **Zamari Walton**.
- Woody comes to The Flats from Appalachian State, where he served as defensive coordinator from 2013-17. Over his last three seasons at App State (2015-17 — the program's first three campaigns as full-fledged members of FBS), the Mountaineers' 3-4 scheme had average national rankings of 15th in scoring defense, 19th in total defense, 28th in rushing defense and 28th in passing defense.

• Appalachian also averaged 24 takeaways, 19 interceptions and 35 sacks per season over the last three campaigns, all areas where Georgia Tech ranked among the bottom 20 teams nationally in 2017.

• With last Saturday's shutout win over Alcorn State, defenses coached by Woody have not surrendered a point in the last 131:05 of game play. Under Woody's tutelage, Appalachian State ended last season with a 34-0 win over Toledo in the Dollar General Bowl. A Woody-coached defense hasn't allowed a point since Louisiana-Lafayette scored a touchdown with 11:05 to go in App State's 63-14 victory over the Ragin' Cajuns on Dec. 2 of last season.

DEFENSIVE LINE

• Georgia Tech's three starting defensive linemen — seniors **Desmond Branch**, **Kyle Cerge-Henderson** and **Anree Saint-Amour** — have combined to play in 83 games and make 31 starts for the Yellow Jackets.

• This season marks the first time that Georgia Tech's entire starting defensive line is comprised of seniors since 1989, when seniors Willie Burks (DT), Jeff Mathis (NG) and Sean Smith (DT) were the starting linemen for the Jackets' 7-4 squad under head coach Bobby Ross (one season before Tech won its fourth national championship).

LINEBACKERS

• Making his first appearance since 2016 and only the second start of his career, junior inside linebacker **David Curry** turned in a career-best performance in last Saturday's season-opener against Alcorn State.

• Curry recorded a team-high-tying and career-high four tackles in the 41-0 win over ASU.

• Curry also scored Georgia Tech's first defensive touchdown of the season when he scooped up a fumble forced by nose tackle **Brandon Adams** and returned it 15 yards for a score early in the third quarter of the shutout win over Alcorn State. The fumble return for a touchdown was the Yellow Jackets' first since P.J. Davis returned a fumble 38 yards for a score during the Jackets' 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl.

• Curry's return to action came following a series of injuries that kept him out of action last season (foot) and cost him time this past spring (thumb).

• The heart and soul of Georgia Tech's defense is senior co-captain **Brant Mitchell**, who starts at the other inside-linebacker position beside Curry. Mitchell had three tackles in last Saturday's opener against Alcorn State.

• As the Yellow Jackets' middle linebacker last season, Mitchell ranked fourth on the team with 51 tackles despite playing in only seven full games and parts of two others due to a lower-body injury. His 5.7 tackles per game led the team.

• In his first full game after returning to the lineup against No. 17 Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, Mitchell recorded a team-high nine tackles, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss, and was named ACC Co-Linebacker of the Week.

• In all, Georgia Tech went just 1-3 in the four games that Mitchell missed all or part of last season.

• The other senior among Georgia Tech's starting linebackers, OLB **Victor Alexander**, led the Yellow Jackets with 60 tackles in his first season as a starter last year.

• Despite cracking the starting lineup for the first time as a junior last season, Alexander has played in all 37 of Georgia Tech's games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He is one of only two student-athletes on the Yellow Jackets' current roster that has played all 37 games since '15, joining senior WR **Brad Stewart**.

• Georgia Tech's fourth linebacker position — the "stinger" OLB — is manned largely by a trio of individuals that were tabbed for the secondary prior to Woody's arrival on The Flats — senior **Jalen Johnson**, junior **Christian Campbell** and true freshman **Charlie Thomas**.

• Despite previously being limited to the defensive backfield and special teams, Johnson and Campbell have combined for 43 career tackles and three tackles for loss.

• In last Saturday's opener against Alcorn State, Johnson, Campbell and Thomas combined for six tackles, a forced fumble (Thomas) and a sack (Campbell - the first of his career).

DEFENSIVE BACKS

• Last season, Georgia Tech's starting secondary was comprised of five veterans that combined to make 127 starts and play in 218 games.

• However, none of the five members of last year's starting secondary returned in 2018. **Lawrence Austin**, **Lance Austin**, **Step Durham** and **Corey Griffin** all graduated while **A.J. Gray** had to step away from football due to a heart condition.

• In their wake, the defensive backs listed on Georgia Tech's two-deep combined for zero starts and just 27 games played prior to this season.

• Of the nine DBs listed on Tech's two-deep, three are sophomores (CB **Jaytlin Askew**, SS **Tariq Carpenter** and CB **Ajani Kerr**), two are redshirt freshmen (CB **Tre Swilling** and SS **Kaleb Oliver**) and three are true freshmen (CB **Jaylon King**, FS **Juanyeh Thomas** and CB **Zamari Walton**).

• The lone upperclassman in the group made his NCAA Division I FBS debut against Alcorn State. Graduate student **Malik Rivera** earned the starting nod at strong safety after transferring to Georgia Tech from Wofford, where he had 131 tackles over the past three seasons.

• Rivera's position coach at Wofford the last two seasons (and defensive coordinator in 2017) was **Shiel Wood**, who now serves as Georgia Tech's safeties coach.

• An incredible student, Rivera graduated from Wofford in May as a triple-major in mathematics, finance and computer science. He is pursuing a master's degree in quantitative and computational finance at Georgia Tech.

SPECIAL TEAMS

• Georgia Tech's 19 blocked kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season are the fourth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• Georgia Tech boasts one of the nation's top punters in sophomore **Pressley Harvin III**.

• In his lone punt of last Saturday's season opener versus Alcorn State, Harvin III boomed a 48-yard punt with no return.

• Last season, Harvin III led all NCAA Division I FBS true freshmen, ranked 16th overall nationally and was second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with a 44.1-yard punting average last season.

• Harvin's 44.1-yard average was also a Georgia Tech freshman record and ranked fifth overall in single-season program history.

• Of Harvin's 50 punts last season, 13 traveled 50-plus yards (26 percent), 16 were downed inside the 20 yard line (32 pct.), 15 were fair-caught (30 pct.) and 29 were not returned (58 pct.).

• Making Harvin's freshman campaign even more impressive was that two of his best performances have come in less-than-ideal conditions for punting – he recorded career-bests with a 62-yard punt and four kicks downed inside the 20 yard line at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 and had five punts that traveled 50 yards or more and three downed inside the 20 at Clemson on Oct. 28. The majority of both games were played during heavy rain storms.

• Following his incredible rookie campaign, Harvin III was named freshman all-America by the Football Writers Association of America, true freshman all-America by ESPN and was a third-team all-ACC honoree.

• Harvin III is on the official watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to college football's top punter. He was first added to the list midway through his prolific freshman campaign last fall.

• Harvin became only the third FWAAs freshman all-American in school history (joining OL Will Jackson, 2010, and PK Travis Bell, 2004) and the first Georgia Tech freshman to earn all-ACC recognition since Calvin Johnson (first-team WR) and Bell (second-team PK) in '04.

• True freshman Juanyeh Thomas earned the job as Georgia Tech's primary punt and kick returner prior to last week's season opener versus Alcorn State.

• Thomas' 25-yard punt return in the second quarter against Alcorn was Georgia Tech's longest punt return since Brad Stewart's 26-yarder versus Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 1, 2016.

MISCELLANEOUS

• Bobby Dodd Stadium has been home sweet home for Georgia Tech of late, as it has won nine of its last 10 home games, dating back to midway through the 2016 season.

• However, on the flip side, Georgia Tech has struggled in games played away from its Midtown Atlanta home as of late. The Yellow Jackets lost all five games played away from Bobby Dodd Stadium last season and are in search of their first win away from home since their 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31, 2016) and their first true road win since their 28-27 triumph at Georgia on Nov. 26, 2016.

• As has become the norm over the past several seasons, Georgia Tech has started the 2018 campaign ranked among the nation's least-penalized teams.

• The Yellow Jackets were flagged for just three penalties in last Saturday's season opener against Alcorn State. The Jackets' three penalties are the fewest in the ACC and the fourth-fewest nationally. Their 30 penalty yards are tied for the second-fewest in the ACC and 16th-fewest nationally.

• In 2017, Georgia Tech ranked fourth nationally in fewest penalty yards (35.82) and fifth nationally in fewest penalties (4.00) per game.

• Tech was also one of the nation's least-penalized teams in 2016, finishing 11th nationally in both fewest penalties per game (4.38) and fewest penalty yards per game (38.62).

• Perhaps with the NCAA's new redshirt rule in mind, Georgia Tech played 11 true freshmen in last Saturday's season opener versus Alcorn State — WR **Malachi Carter**, DL **T.K. Chimedza**, DL **Justice Dingle**, LB **Jordan Domineck**, DL **Quon Griffin**, LB **Quez Jackson**, DB **Jaylon King**, LB **Charlie Thomas**, DB **Juanyeh Thomas**, CB **Zamari Walton** and PK **Wesley Wells**.

• A new NCAA rule introduced during the offseason allows student-athletes who haven't redshirted previously to play in up to four games and still maintain a full year of eligibility.

• In 2017, just nine true freshmen saw the field for the Yellow Jackets all season.

• Georgia Tech has finished in first or second place in the ACC's Coastal Division six times in **Paul Johnson's** 10 seasons as head coach and seven times in 13 seasons since the ACC split into divisions in 2005.

• The only other ACC teams that have finished first or second in their division as many as six times in the last 10 seasons are Clemson (8), Florida State (7) and Virginia Tech (7).

• Of the teams widely considered to be Georgia Tech's closest academic peers at the Power 5 level — Duke, Notre Dame, Northwestern, Purdue, Stanford and Vanderbilt — only Stanford (9) has played in more bowl games over the last 10 seasons than the Yellow Jackets (8).

• With a 4-4 record in ACC play last season, Georgia Tech has finished with at least a .500 conference record for the 22nd time in the last 23 seasons.

• Since 1995, the only time that Georgia Tech hasn't finished at least .500 in ACC play was 2015, when the injury-ravaged Yellow Jackets were 1-7 in conference action.

• In 35 seasons since officially joining the ACC in 1983, the Jackets have finished .500 or better 30 times.

• Three of the Yellow Jackets' five defeats last season — Sept. 4 vs. Tennessee, Oct. 11 at Miami (Fla.) and Nov. 4 at Virginia — came by a total of just six points.

• In each of those three defeats, Georgia Tech's opponent scored the winning points in the final 82 seconds of regulation or in overtime.
