Jackets No. 19 in RPI Rankings

Georgia Tech heads into the NCAA Tournament with a RPI ranking of 19, according to www.WarrenNolan.com. The Yellow Jackets are the third highest ranked ACC team, behind No. 15 North Carolina, ACC Tournament and regular season champion NC State comes in at No. 16, No. 19 Tech, No. 27 Florida State and No. 28 Virginia Tech, all of whom made the NCAA Tournament. No. 67 Maryland, No. 71 Virginia and No. 87 Boston College round out the ACC.

The ACC stands third best as a conference behind No. 1 Pac-10, No. 2 SEC. Following the ACC is No. 4 Big XII and No. 5 Big Ten rounds out the top five.

Haller Shouts Out

Whitney Haller is in the midst of one of the greatest freshman seasons in ACC and Georgia Tech history. Haller, a native of Marietta, Ga., broke ACC and Tech single-season records in home runs (23), RBI (70), total bases (162) and saves (6). She currently holds the ACC's top batting average (.393) and slugging percentage (.806).

The ACC Freshman of the Year ranks second in the nation in total runs batted in and third in home runs. Haller earned first team All-ACC honors to become just the second freshman to accomplish that feat (Laura Williams-1994).

Not only does Haller shine at the plate, but the freshman also excels in the circle for the Jackets. Haller (2-1) leads the

ACC and set a new single-season school record with six saves, placing her second in the country. She has struck out 22 in 45.0 innings pitched, and carries a 1.20 ERA in conference games only.

Power Surge

After being in the basement of the ACC most of last season in home runs, Tech has swung away in 2006. The Jackets surpassed last season's total of 25 with 71 dingers, breaking the school record of 37 in 2002. Haller leads the ACC with 23, sophomore Savannah Brown ranks third with 11, senior Amy Hosier has nine, while junior Caitlin Lever also has nine. Senior Christine Sheridan has four home runs, while sophomore Kristina Hull has three.

Tech has homered in 23 of its last 26 games and has used the long ball in each of its last five contests. The Jackets rank seventh in the country in home runs per game, hitting 1.08 per game.

What Can Brown Do For You?

That's a simple answer for Yellow Jacket softball fans; hit .294 with a career-high 11 home runs, fifth in the ACC. The super sophomore ranks second on the team with 46 runs batted in, sixth in the league. Brown has improved her batting average from her freshman season by 24 points, increased her home run total by five and RBI total by 12.

Patience

Amy Hosier has walked her way into the Tech record books this season, earning 51 base on balls to break the single-season school record set by Tara Knudsen in 2004 (39). The senior outfielder is sixth in the nation in that category and leads the ACC, 13 shy of the single-season record held by Virginia's Heather Field (64-2004). She stands third all-time in Yellow Jacket history with 109 career walks, 10 behind school record holder Tara Knudsen (119).

Hosier also leads the league with a .522 on base percentage and ranks fourth in the ACC with a .377 batting average. She has driven in a career-high 46 runs for Tech, standing sixth in the conference in that category.

With 16 doubles, Hosier leads the Jackets and has 40 in her career at Tech, placing her fourth all-time in school history.

The Lakewood, Colo., native was named to the All-ACC first team for the second consecutive season.

Back to Form

Shortstop Christine Sheridan led the ACC with a .380 batting average a season ago, hitting .400 for most of the season. After hovering around .300 most of the 2006 season, Sheridan has gotten hot when it matters most for the Yellow Jackets, pushing her batting average to .337 after being forced

to the leadoff spot in Tech's lineup midway through the year. The Pasadena, Md., native was selected to the ACC All-Tournament team after hitting .500 in five games.

She ranks second in the ACC in walks (35) and runs scored (54), fourth in on base percentage (.431) and eighth in RBI (542).

Lever Shines for Jackets

Junior Caitlin Lever has been steady for the Yellow Jackets all season long. Lever, a native of Amherst, N.Y., ranks third on the Tech squad with a .343 batting average (9th in the ACC) and third on the team with nine home runs, a career high. She has 13 stolen bases and ranks sixth in ACC games only with four bombs.

Lever was named to the All-ACC second team and earned ACC All-Tournament honors after ranking second in the tourney with six runs batted in and smashing two home runs.

Chopping down the Opposition

Left-handed pitcher Sarah Wood has been carving up opposing hitters as of late. Wood, a junior from Marietta, Ga., blanked then-No. 20 North Carolina in eight innings for her second complete-game shutout of the season on April 22, and followed that performance up with another shutout against Georgia Southern on April 26. Wood picked up her second save of the season in the opener against the Eagles as well, pushing her consecutive scoreless innings pitched streak to 17.1.

She only allowed one earned run in 13.2 innings of work against No. 25 Virginia Tech, going 1-1 in the series. She has won six of her last eight decisions in the circle and ranks fifth in the ACC with 19 wins on the season.

On your mark, get set, GO!

The Jackets led the nation a season ago with 159 stolen bases, averaging 2.45 per game (2nd in NCAA). This season, the Jackets again lead the nation with 133 thefts and their 2.02 steals per contest ranks second in the NCAA, behind Cleve-

land State (2.02).

Morales leads the way with 29 this season (28th in the NCAA) after setting a new single-season Tech record as a freshman with 44, finishing third in the NCAA.

Let's Turn 2

The Yellow Jackets rank second in the nation in double plays per game (0.55) and broke the school record of 29 with 36 thus far, tops in the ACC. The combo of shortstop Christine Sheridan and second baseman Aileen Morales have turned 25 of the 36 this season up the middle.

Tech's Haller Named ACC Softball Freshman of the Year

Georgia Tech softball standout Whitney Haller was named Atlantic Coast Conference Softball Freshman of the Year, announced by the league office on Wednesday night. Joining Haller on the All-ACC first team was senior Amy Hosier, while junior Caitlin Lever earned second team all-conference honors for the Yellow Jackets.

Haller, a native of Marietta, Ga., becomes the second consecutive Jacket to earn Freshman of the Year honors (Aileen Morales-2005). She broke ACC single-season records in home runs (22), RBI (69), total bases (156) and saves (6), ranking in the top-10 in the nation in all four categories. She also led the ACC in batting average (.409) and slugging percentage (.839). For her efforts, she was named to the All-ACC first team.

Hosier, a native of Lakewood, Colo., finished third in the league with a .371 batting average and led the conference with a .524 on base percentage and 49 walks to garner first team all-conference honors for the second consecutive season. She set a new Tech single-season record in walks and set a career-high with 44 runs batted in and eight home runs.

Lever, a native of Amherst, N.Y., set a career-high with seven home runs and is batting .338 for the Jackets, earning All-ACC honors for the second straight season. She was selected to the second team, after garnering first team honors in 2005.

Virginia Tech's Angela Tincher edged Haller out for ACC Player of the Year and was tabbed ACC Pitcher of the Year, after setting a new league record in strikeouts with 444. She went 24-6 and carried a 0.76 earned run average.

NC State's Lisa Navas earned ACC Coach of the Year honors after leading the Wolfpack to an ACC regular-season championship in just their third year of existence. The Pack are the top seed in the tourney with a conference record of 14-6.

Haller Named as Top 25 Finalist for USA Softball Player of the Year

Georgia Tech's Whitney Haller was named as one of the 25 finalists for the 5th Annual USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award, announced by the Amateur Softball Association, the governing body of softball in the United States, on Friday.

"It's a tremendous honor," said Haller. "Never in my wildest dreams could I have imagined that I would have this kind of season as a freshman. I'm just out there competing as hard as I can, and to be mentioned with some of these great players, is amazing."

Haller, a freshman from Marietta, Ga., set a new single-season record in the Atlantic Coast Conference with 21 home runs and 66 runs batted in. She leads the ACC with a .897 slugging percentage, 55 runs scored, 71 hits, 148 total bases and has a league best .430 batting average.

"The coaching staff is very happy for Whitney," said head coach Ehren Earleywine. "To be one of two freshmen on the list speaks volumes to the type of season she is having. It's great to get some recognition, not just for her, but for our program."

The first baseman/pitcher is one of two freshmen that made the top 25, Arizona State's Kaitlin Cochran being the other. Haller also leads the ACC with six saves in the circle.

On May 10, just days before the start of post-season play, a list of 10 finalists will be named. On May 31 the list will be cut to three and those final three players will travel to Oklahoma City for the announcement of the winner at the 2006 NCAA Women's

College World Series.

Texas' Cat Osterman became the first two-time winner of the National Player of the Year Award in 2005 after leading her Longhorns to the Big 12 title and a berth into the NCAA Women's College World Series. Past winners of the award include Stacey Nuveman (UCLA-2002), Osterman (Texas-2003) and Jessica Van der Linden (Florida State-2004).

Freshmen Shining for Jackets

With only two seniors on the roster, the Yellow Jackets knew that they would have to rely on the incoming freshman to make contributions. That has not been a problem. Haller, Lacey Richardson and Blair Shimandle have all been in the starting lineup for the Yellow Jackets and produced.

Haller ranks second in the NCAA with 23 home runs and with 70 runs batted in. Her .806 slugging percentage, 59 runs scored and .393 batting average are tops in the ACC.

Richardson, a native of Sharpsburg, Ga., is 7-5 on the season and carries a 3.75 earned run average. She tossed her first collegiate no-hitter against Eastern Kentucky on Feb. 19 and has 59 strikeouts in 104.2 innings pitched. She is tied for ninth in the NCAA with four saves in the circle for the Jackets.

Shimandle has been solid for Tech, playing center field, right field and third base. She is batting .309, with 10 doubles, three triples, three home runs, and has driven in 29 runs for Tech. The utility player is 17-for-19 in stolen bases, second on the team.

Florida State Ends ACC Tournament Run for Jackets, 7-4

Florida State's Brittany Osmon hit a three-run home run in the first inning and Tiffany McDonald (28-16) tossed a complete game to lead No. 5 seed Florida State (41-26) past No. 4 seed Georgia Tech (46-20), 7-4, in the semifinals of the Atlantic Coast Conference Softball Tournament on Saturday night.



With the win, FSU advances to the ACC Championship game, while the Yellow Jackets will wait and see if they receive an at-large bid from the NCAA Softball Committee for the fifth consecutive season. The Softball Selection Show will air on ESPNNews at 3:30 p.m. ET. The tournament field consists of 64 teams, with 36 at-large bids and 28 automatic bids handed out. The four-team NCAA Regional will be on campus sites, to be announced.

Tech ended the tournament with ACC records in RBI (25), home runs (10) and most runs in one inning, seven against Virginia on Friday.

Sophomore Savannah Brown went 1-for-4, with a home run (11) and two runs batted in, while sophomore Kristina Hull went 2-for-3. Senior Christine Sheridan and junior Caitlin Lever finished the game 2-for-4 at the plate to lead the Jackets offensively.

Freshman Lacey Richardson (7-5) started for the Jackets, working 1.0 inning and allowing four hits and four runs. Sophomore Sarah Wood tossed 5.2 innings, allowing six hits, three runs and struck out three.

The Seminoles took an early 1-0 lead in the top of the first inning as Yuruby Alicart grounded out to shortstop which allowed Whitney Buckmon to score as she hit a double and advanced to third base on a passed ball to give FSU a 1-0 lead. Osmon then connected on a three-run home run to right-center field with two outs to increase the Seminoles lead to four.

The Jackets responded with two runs in the bottom half of the first inning as Lever drove in senior Amy Hosier who doubled and sophomore Aileen Morales drove in Lever to cut FSU's lead down to two, 4-2.

In the bottom of the second inning, Hull and Sheridan

singled and Hosier walked to load the bases with one out. Tech was unable to plate a run as freshman Whitney Haller grounded to the pitcher for an out at the plate and Lever grounded out to first base as the Jackets trailed 4-2.

Alicart led off the top of the third inning for the Seminoles with a base hit, advanced to second on a ground out and third on a wild pitch. Melissa Wood then hit a soft ground ball towards first base that Tech did not make a play on and allowed Alicart to score as the Jackets went down by three, 5-2.

FSU's Alicart reached on a leadoff base hit in the top of the fifth inning, advanced to second on a bunt single, headed to third on a double play and scored on a wild pitch to advance the Seminoles' lead to four, 6-2.

Brown smashed a solo home run to center field, her 11th of the season, with two outs in the bottom of the fifth inning to bring the deficit to three, 6-3.

The Jackets managed a run in the bottom of the seventh inning on a RBI by Brown as Tech fell by a final score of 7-4.

Earleywine Surpasses 100

Yellow Jacket Head Coach Ehren Earleywine has made one of the most impressive runs in collegiate softball. Earleywine took over the Georgia Tech softball program in 2004 and led Tech to 47 wins and a third-place finish in the NCAA Athens Regional [8 teams]. Last season, Tech eclipsed the 50-win plateau for just the second time in school history, finishing with 51 en route to setting a new school record .785 winning percentage.

Earleywine reached the 100-win plateau on Feb. 15, 2006, in a 7-2 victory over Chattanooga. He accomplished that feat in 135 games, fifth fastest in Division I fastpitch history. Here is a list of coaches who have reached that plateau faster:

Over the last five seasons, the Yellow Jackets have experienced a tremendous amount of success at Glenn Field. Tech has gone 80-17 over that time period (.825 winning percentage) and has only dropped 11 of the last 60 contests played at home over the last three seasons.

Brown Named ACC Co-Player of the Week (Feb. 21)

Georgia Tech's Savannah Brown and Virginia Tech's Angela Tincer were named Atlantic Coast Conference Co-Players of the Week, announced by the league office on Monday.

Brown led the Yellow Jackets to the Lady Panther Invitational Championship last weekend and a 5-1 record. Brown, a sophomore catcher from Ej Cajon, Calif., hit safely in all six games and ended the week with a .647 average, one home run, seven runs batted in, two doubles, four walks and one stolen base.

In a doubleheader against Chattanooga, Brown went 5-for-7, with a home run and two RBIs. Over the weekend, Brown finished four games 6-for-11 (.545), with one double, three walks and drove in five runs. She currently has a six-game hitting streak going for the Jackets and has at least one RBI in five of Tech's last six games.

Tincer had an impressive week in the circle, striking out 25 batters in just 10 innings of work at Charlotte's Holiday Inn Green & White Tournament. The sophomore from Eagle Rock,

Va., struck out 19 of the 26 batters she faced in seven innings of work against UNC Greensboro, leading the Hokies to the 3-0 win. Tincer allowed just two hits and a walk in the game, which began on Saturday, but had to be completed on Sunday due to poor weather in the Charlotte area.

Tincer came on in relief against the Spartans later Sunday afternoon, and earned her first save of the season with three hitless innings in the 9-1 Virginia Tech win. Tincer struck out six batters and allowed just two walks as the Hokies claimed the tournament crown. Tincer was named the tournament's MVP.

On the week, Tincer posted a perfect 0.00 ERA, allowing just two hits and three walks in two appearances.

Tech Tabbed Second in ACC Preseason Poll

Despite being the defending ACC regular season and tournament champions, and returning seven starters and two starting pitchers, preseason No. 24 Georgia Tech was picked to finish second in the 2006 Preseason ACC Softball Poll, as voted on by the league's eight head coaches. The Yellow Jackets earned three first place votes, but were five points shy of top pick Florida State who had one first place vote.

The Georgia Tech softball program signed Carrie Jones and Kory Keaton to national letters-of-intent during the early signing period.

"Both of these young ladies are tremendous players and student-athletes," said Earleywine. "We welcome them and their families into our program."

Jones, a native of Columbus, Ga., is a catcher/third baseman and hit .451 during her senior season at Shaw High School. She was named Gatorade Rookie of the Year in 2002, Gatorade Player of the Year in '04 and voted as the team's Most Dedicated Athlete from 2002-04. Jones earned all-region first team honors in '04 and was selected to the All-Bi-City team in three consecutive seasons (2002-04).

"Carrie catches and plays third base," said Earleywine. "Her strengths are her ability to hit and do so with power. She also has an outstanding arm and could turn out to be a very good catcher. Since we lost three catchers this fall, we needed to regain some ground at that spot."

Keaton, a native of Portland, Ore., played shortstop at Lincoln High School. She posted a .444 batting average during her junior season. Keaton also was one of the team leaders in stolen bases, runs batted in and triples. She attended Beaverton High School during her freshman and sophomore seasons and helped guide her team to a No. 1 ranking in the state, 18th in the nation. Keaton also lettered in cross country.

"Kory plays shortstop and will compete for the vacancy left behind by our graduating senior shortstop Christine Sheridan," said Earleywine. "Her strength is hitting. She is a left-handed hitter who reminds the coaching staff of Amy Hosier. She isn't very big, but has gap power and can hit the occasional home run."
