

The 2006 NCAA Championships

Round of 16: No. 6 Seed Georgia Tech (23-5) vs. No. 11 Seed Northwestern (23-4)

May 18, 2006 • 9 a.m. Pacific • Taube Tennis Center • Stanford, Calif.

Georgia Tech's women's tennis team, ranked sixth in the nation in the latest Fila/Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) poll with an overall record of 23-5, begins the Round of 16 of the 2006 NCAA Championships as the No. 6 national seed, which is the second time that the Yellow Jackets have ever been seeded entering the postseason tournament. The only other time that the Jackets were seeded was in 2005, when Tech first advanced to the Round of 16. They will face 11th-seeded Northwestern in the Round of 16 on Thursday, May 18th at 9 a.m. Pacific.

PROBABLE STARTING LINEUP

- The Jackets plan on keeping the same lineup that they have used on two previous occasions this season. Overall, Georgia Tech is 1-1 in 2006 using this lineup.

TECH TIDBITS

- After never advancing past the second round of the NCAA Championships prior to the 2005 season, the Yellow Jacket women's tennis team has now advanced to the NCAA Round of 16 in back-to-back seasons. The Jackets defeated Southeastern Louisiana, 4-0, in the first round of the NCAA Championships in the Atlanta Regional, and stopped Penn, 4-0, in the second-round match.

- After never winning a second-round match in the ACC Women's Tennis Championships prior to last season, the Yellow Jackets are back-to-back ACC Champions for the first time in school history, as the 2005 and 2006 women's tennis teams, under the direction of seventh-year head coach Bryan Shelton, are the only tennis teams--men's or women's--to earn a conference championship at Georgia Tech. This season, the Yellow Jackets finished in a three-way tie with Duke and Miami at the end of the regular season, but earned the No. 1 seed in the 2006 ACC Championships courtesy of a blind draw. The Jackets won the title with a 4-0 victory over NC State in the quarterfinals, and 4-1 wins against Clemson in the semifinals and Miami in the finals.

- Georgia Tech has recorded 20 wins over ranked opponents this season, including eight wins against top-25 teams. All five of the Jackets' losses have come to teams that were ranked in the top-15 in the nation.

- Speaking of Tech's 2006 schedule, there were only five teams on this season's schedule, three of which were ACC opponents, that did NOT make the 2006 NCAA Field. Tech's only two non-conference opponents that were left out of the postseason tournament were Wisconsin, who Tech played at the ITA National Indoor Championships, and Auburn.

- The Jackets' top player is sophomore All-American Kristi Miller, and she is the nation's top-ranked singles player and combines with senior Lyndsay Shosho to form the country's 10th-ranked doubles team. Tech also has four other players that appear in the singles rankings, including Lyndsay Shosho (63rd), Alison Silverio (65th), Tarryn Rudman (96th) and Kelly Anderson (110th).

- Kristi Miller, the nation's top-ranked singles player in each of the last five polls, which spans the last two months, has earned the No. 2 seed in the 2006 NCAA Singles Championships, thus giving her All-America honors for the second time in her career. As a freshman in 2005, the Marysville, Michigan native became the first All-American in the program's history. Lyndsay Shosho and Alison Silverio were also named to the alternates list, should one of the 64 players chosen for the championships not be able to compete. Miller and Shosho were also named to the 2006 Doubles Championships field, becoming just the second duo in the program's history to earn such an honor.

- The Yellow Jackets' 4-3 victory at fifth-ranked Miami on March 31, 2006 marked just the third time in the program's history that Tech has defeated a top-10 opponent. The only other two wins the Jackets had against teams ranked in the top-10 occurred last season, when Tech downed No. 2 Georgia on March 16th and No. 9 Miami on April 10th. Tech earned its fourth victory against a team ranked in the top-10 when the Jackets defeated the ninth-ranked Miami Hurricanes, 4-1, in the 2006 ACC Championship match.
- The Yellow Jackets have had a strong season thus far in 2006, setting single-season marks for highest ranking by the team (3rd), highest individual ranking (Kristi Miller, 1st) most doubles victories in a season by an individual (Lyndsay Shosho, 33) and most team victories in a season (23) while tying the season-high marks for most conference victories (9) and highest conference finish (T-1st). YELLOW JACKETS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Georgia Tech is making its seventh NCAA Tournament appearance, receiving its second automatic bid in history after capturing the 2006 ACC Championship.
- All seven postseason appearances have come under current head coach Bryan Shelton.
- Georgia Tech entered the regional as one of the 16 national seeds for just the second time in history, with the other coming a year ago. The Jackets earned the No. 6 national seed as the sixth-ranked team in the nation in 2006.
- After winning the 2006 NCAA Atlanta Regional, the Yellow Jackets are 8-6 in NCAA Championship play, having advanced past the first round in six of seven tournaments, including their best showing in the championships last season and this season, with back-to-back Round of 16 appearances. Last season was the Jackets' first Sweet-16 appearance in the NCAA Championships.
- Five of Tech's six NCAA Tournament losses have come to teams ranked higher than the Jackets in the rankings, with the only lower-ranked team being Texas in last year's Sweet-16 match. Of Tech's eight victories, two were against teams ranked higher than the Jackets.
- Georgia Tech has never faced Northwestern in the NCAA Tournament.
- *Miscellaneous Note:* Tech has been eliminated by a team from California in three of the six appearances in the postseason tournament (ninth-ranked UCLA in 2000, No. 30 UCLA in 2001 and fifth-ranked Southern Cal in 2003).

GEORGIA TECH vs. THE NCAA FIELD

- Georgia Tech has five wins over teams that earned one of the 16 national seeds this season, including No. 7 Miami, No. 12 Vanderbilt and No. 15 Clemson
- Entering the tournament, the Yellow Jackets were 16-5 this season against the 63 teams in the 2006 NCAA Championships field, including two wins apiece against Miami, Fla., Clemson and NC State.
- Tech is 4-4 on the year against the other 15 teams that have advanced to the Round of 16 in the 2006 NCAA Championships. The following is the series record, Tech's overall record under Bryan Shelton and this season's mark against the seven different teams on Tech's 2006 schedule that have advanced to the Round of 16.

- Georgia Tech has never met Florida, Fresno State, Notre Dame or Stanford before in history.
- After the Jackets' two wins in the regional, Georgia Tech is 125-206 all-time against teams in the 2006 NCAA Championship field, but 69-50 against the 63 other teams under Bryan Shelton. The Yellow Jackets have now played matches against 41 of the 63 teams in the 2006 field, including 34 of the teams under Shelton.
- Georgia Tech is 16-72 all-time against teams in the 2006 NCAA Round of 16 field, but have a 10-27 mark against those teams since Bryan Shelton took over as head coach in 2000.

Specifically, TECH vs. NORTHWESTERN

- The Yellow Jackets and Wildcats have met two previous times in history, including the most recent meeting coming this season.
- In that match, Northwestern defeated Georgia Tech, 4-3, in a match that came down to the No. 6 singles court. The Jackets were ranked No. 3 in the nation prior to the match (which marked the highest ranking in the history of women's sports on the Flats), while Northwestern held the No. 6 ranking.
- ***To Recap this year's match:*** Northwestern began the match by taking a 1-0 lead after winning on courts two and three in doubles. Jamie Peisel and Nazlie Ghazal defeated Tech's Alison Silverio and Kacie Anson, 8-2, before Tech's 11th-ranked duo of Lyndsay Shosho and Kristi Miller stopped third-ranked Cristelle Grier and Alexis Prousis, 8-3, at the top of the doubles lineup, which set up the No. 2 slot to clinch the doubles point. Georgia Rose and Ferial Esseghir then downed the Jackets' 55th-ranked Whitney McCray and Kelly Anderson to finish out doubles play.

McCray then recorded a quick 6-4, 6-1 victory over Essegir at the No. 5 singles position to tie the match at 1-1 before Silverio gave the Jackets a one-point edge with a 6-3, 6-2 win over 15th-ranked Prousis at the No. 3 singles slot. Northwestern then tied the match at 2-2 when Peisel downed Tech's 60th-ranked Anderson, 6-4, 6-4. The remaining singles matches all went three sets, with sixth-ranked Kristi Miller earning the next point in the match with a 7-6 (6), 3-6, 6-4 win over Northwestern's 10th-ranked Grier at the top singles slot, but the Wildcats again tied the match when Rose, ranked 36th in the nation, downed 74th-ranked Shosho, 4-6, 7-5, 6-2.

The No. 6 singles slot would prove to be the deciding match, with Christy Striplin battling Ghazal in a close third set. Ghazal had taken the first set in a tiebreaker, but Striplin fought back for a 6-3 win in the second set. After falling behind in the third set, Ghazal broke Striplin at 4-3 and followed by holding her own serve to go up 5-4 in the set. On the deciding point of that ninth game, Striplin collapsed with leg cramps and was forced to serve after receiving an injury timeout. After playing out one point before suffering cramps again, Striplin battled through one more point before being forced to retire. It was Striplin's first loss of the spring, and the rookie from Birmingham, Alabama has lost just three times in 22 matches all spring.

THE ACC in THE NCAA's

- The Atlantic Coast Conference was well-represented at the year's championships, with a record-high nine of 12 teams making postseason play.
- Sixth-ranked Georgia Tech was one of five ACC teams to earn national seeds in the 2006 NCAA Championships, as the Yellow Jackets are the No. 6 seed. Seventh-ranked Miami earned the No. 7 seed, Duke captured the No. 8 seed, North Carolina received the No. 9 seed, and Clemson was named the No. 15 seed.
- Miami, Duke, UNC and Clemson also joined Georgia Tech as one of the 16 regional hosts for this year's tournament.
- Rounding out the ACC teams in the championship field were 21st-ranked Wake Forest (at the UNC Regional), 26th-ranked Virginia (at the Duke Regional), 33rd-ranked Maryland (at the Florida Regional) and 37th-ranked NC State (at the VCU Regional).
- Four of the nine teams advanced to the Round of 16, including Miami, Duke and UNC along with Georgia Tech.
- The conference currently has 28 ranked singles players and nine doubles teams in the top-50. Georgia Tech's Kristi Miller and Miami's Audra Cohen are again the country's top two singles players, while Duke's Daniela Bercek appears at No. 4. The Jackets' top duo of Miller and Shosho stand in the top-10 in the doubles rankings this week, with a pair of other ACC tandems. Miami's Cohen and Melissa Applebaum are the nation's second-ranked doubles team, while UNC's Sara Anundsen and Jenna Long stand at No. 6. Overall, six of the top-25 doubles teams in the nation are from the Atlantic Coast Conference, as are three of the top five singles players.
- The Yellow Jackets are not slated to face an ACC team in the Round of 16 and wouldn't face another conference team unless both Georgia Tech and Miami win in the Round of 16 and the Round of Eight to advance to the Final Four.

2006 HONORS, AWARDS, and RECORDS

- Georgia Tech's No. 3 ranking on January 31st, and again on February 28th, was the highest ranking any Georgia Tech tennis team--men's or women's--had ever earned. The Yellow Jackets held each ranking for one week before falling out of the top-10. Following the ACC Championship victory, the Jackets moved back up to No. 6, and maintained that ranking in the latest Fila Poll.
- On May 25, 2006, Georgia Tech head coach Bryan Shelton earned his 100th career coaching victory when the Yellow Jackets recorded a 7-0 win over Maryland. The Jackets have earned 44 of his 110 career coaching victories over the last two years, including setting a season-high with 21 wins in 2005, and breaking that mark with 23 in 2006.
- This past summer, Kristi Miller became the first active Georgia Tech tennis player--men's or women's--to compete in a Grand Slam event when she was invited to play doubles with former University of Miami standout Megan Bradley in the 2005 U.S. Open. The duo won their first round match but were unable to overcome the strong eighth-seeded team of Patty Schnyder and Corina Morariu in the second round.
- Kristi Miller, the nation's top-ranked singles player in each of the last five polls, which spans the last two months, has earned the No. 2 seed in the 2006 NCAA Singles Championships, thus giving her All-America honors for the second time in her career. As a freshman in 2005, the Marysville, Michigan native became the first All-American in the program's history. Lyndsay Shosho and Alison Silverio were also named to the alternates list, should one of the 64 players chosen for the championships not be able to compete. Miller and Shosho were also named to the 2006 Doubles Championships field, becoming just the second duo in the program's history to earn such an honor.
- Tech had three people earn ITA South Region Honors again this season, and all three are eligible for the national award in their respective categories, which will be announced during the NCAA Championships. Head coach Bryan Shelton was named the ITA South Region Coach of the Year for the second-consecutive season after leading Tech to back-to-back ACC Championships, while sophomore Kristi Miller, who was the 2005 ITA South Region Rookie of the Year, has earned the 2006 ITA South

Region Player to Watch Award. Rounding out the honorees for the Jackets is junior Alison Silverio, who earned the ITA South Region Cissie Leary Award for Sportsmanship, which honors a player that has demonstrated "inspiring commitment and dedication to her team, which has enhanced her team's performance and exemplified the spirit of college tennis."

- The Yellow Jackets had two players named to the all-ACC team this season, as sophomore Kristi Miller and senior Lyndsay Shosho have both earned the honor for the second time in their careers. Miller was named to the 2005 all-ACC team, while Shosho was a 2004 all-ACC honoree. Miller also captured the 2006 ACC Tournament MVP award after posting a 3-0 singles and 1-0 doubles record in the championships. The sophomore downed second-ranked Audra Cohen in straight sets in the championship match to finish her singles sweep for the tournament. She joins junior Alison Silverio as the only Georgia Tech tennis athletes to earn ACC Tournament MVP honors.

- In mid-April, senior Kelly Anderson earned the prestigious Peach of an Athlete Award, which is presented by the Boy Scouts of America to a student-athlete that either attends school in, or is originally from, the state of Georgia. The Peach of an Athlete Role Model Award honors student-athletes that have outstanding achievements in and out of their sports that exemplify the qualities of a great role model, and Kelly Anderson was named the Female Amateur Athlete Honoree for 2006.

- Georgia Tech has had several individual season and career records set this season. The following are the top ten lists for singles and doubles wins in a season, dual-match wins in a season and the singles and doubles single-season winning percentage:

- Although the Yellow Jackets currently have three players in the top-10 for most singles wins in a season, there is one more player on the 2006 squad that could make that list before the season is finished, as Whitney McCray currently has 24 singles wins in her sophomore campaign.

- Rookie Kristi Miller's No. 1 ranking on March 21st, and every week since, is the first time that any Georgia Tech tennis player has earned the No. 1 ranking during a season. Her No. 5 ranking with Alison Silverio in the preseason rankings is the highest that any doubles team has been ranked. She is currently ranked 10th in the nation in doubles, teaming with senior Lyndsay Shosho.

BRYAN SHELTON UPDATE

- Two-time ACC Coach of the Year (2002, '05) Bryan Shelton led his team into the ACC Championships as the No. 1 seed for the second-straight season in 2006, and coincidentally, the team won its second ACC Championship in as many seasons. Under his tutelage, there have been two All-Americans (Kristi Miller, 2005, '06), 10 all-ACC recipients and two ACC Rookie of the Year honorees from Georgia Tech, including this year's all-conference honorees, Kristi Miller and Lyndsay Shosho. Prior to his arrival, the Yellow Jackets had just six players to earn all-ACC honors in the 14 years that Georgia Tech had been participating in conference matches.

- On May 25, 2006, Shelton earned his 100th career coaching victory when the Yellow Jackets recorded a 7-0 win over Maryland. The Jackets have earned 44 of his 110 career coaching victories over the last two years, including setting a season-high with 21 wins in 2005, and breaking that mark with 23 in 2006.

- Shelton's .659 winning percentage is tops among all Georgia Tech women's tennis coaches, and his 38 ACC victories are more than any other Yellow Jacket coach in women's tennis history. He also has the top ACC record in history at 38-23 in seven years, after the Yellow Jackets recorded just 21 league victories in the 23 years prior to his arrival (14 seasons in which the Yellow Jackets were a part of the Atlantic Coast Conference). The Jackets are 18-3 in conference play over the last two seasons.
- Shelton is Georgia Tech's all-time winningest women's tennis coach, and the only women's tennis coach to have earned 100 victories in his career.
- Shelton was named the 2006 ITA South Region Coach of the Year for the second-consecutive season after leading Tech to back-to-back ACC Championships.
- The Yellow Jackets have advanced to the NCAA Regionals for the seventh time in seven years under Shelton. Prior to his arrival, Georgia Tech had never played in the postseason tournament, but since he returned to Tech, the Jackets are 8-6 in NCAA play.

PLAYER UPDATES

- Kelly Anderson - Stands third in the Tech record books for most singles wins in a season (32 this year) and tied for second with 28 doubles victories in 2006...Is the Jackets' active career singles victories leader, as she stands third in the Tech annals with 92 singles wins in her career...Stands tied for second in career doubles victories, with 81 in her four years...Appears in the top-10 for career singles and doubles winning percentage as well...Led the Jackets with 17 wins in the fall and is second on the team with 32 singles wins this season...Has appeared in the singles rankings every week this season, reaching as high as No. 35 in the pre-spring rankings, while she currently stands 110th in the nation...Also reached as high as 42nd in the doubles rankings this year...Is 5-3 against ranked singles players this season, with her top victory coming against 27th-ranked Catrina Thompson of Notre Dame during the fall...Is 4-1 in singles tiebreakers in her 22 dual matches this spring...Went 8-4 in singles against ACC opponents this season, and 9-5 in doubles play...Posted a 18-9 mark in dual-matches with Whitney McCray at the No.2 doubles slot...Has an overall record of 26-12 with McCray while going 28-14 overall on the season in doubles play...Teamed with McCray to go 3-3 against ranked opponents this season...Has come on strong of late, recording two singles and three doubles victories in the ACC Championships.
- Kacie Anson - Stands ninth in the Tech career annals with a .605 winning percentage in doubles play (46-30)...Went 6-6 in singles play this year, with all 12 matches coming in the fall...Has made her greatest contributions in doubles play, where she has competed at the No.3 position in each of the last 24 matches...Teams with Alison Silverio in doubles play, and the two have gone 7-4 in their last 11 matches against their opponents, after posting a seven-match win streak, which began March 11 against Virginia Tech...The duo is a combined 16-7 at the No.3 doubles position and went 8-3 in conference play this season.
- Whitney McCray - Stands sixth in the Tech annals for most doubles wins in a season on the Flats, as she has recorded 26 in 2006...Stands 10th in the Tech career annals with a .604 winning percentage in singles play...Has played primarily in the No.5 singles and No.2 doubles slots...Went 10-2 at No.5 singles and is 16-6 in dual matches this season...Posted a 7-3 mark against conference opponents in singles play...Has won her last two matches, and six of her last seven in singles play...Has teamed with Kelly Anderson for the entire doubles campaign...The duo reached as high as No.42 in the rankings earlier in the season...Has won 18 doubles matches this spring, including nine against conference opponents...Won three-straight doubles matches in the ACC Championships and have won their last seven matches...Teamed with Anderson to go 3-3 vs.ranked opponents this season.
- Kristi Miller - Named the top singles player in the nation according to the latest Fila/ITA Rankings...Has been ranked the No. 1 singles player in the last five polls, dating back to March 21...Is also ranked 10th in the nation in doubles, teaming with Lyndsay Shosho...Earned All-America honors for the second-straight season (and is still the only player in the program's history to have earned the honor) when she was selected as one of the top-16 seeds in the 2006 NCAA Singles Championships...Was named the No.2 seed for the postseason tournament...Will also be competing in the NCAA Doubles Championship for the second-straight season, teaming with Lyndsay Shosho...Was named the ITA South Region Player to Watch for her play this season...Earned all-ACC honors for the second-straight year after being named all-ACC and ACC Rookie of the Year honors in 2005...Also captured the 2006 ACC Tournament MVP honor...Holds the top two records in school history for most singles wins in a season...After shattering the previous record (30) with 42 singles wins in 2005, she stands second this year with 38 singles victories...Her overall singles record of 38-6 this season is currently the record for highest singles winning percentage in a season on the Flats...Stands third in the Tech single-season annals with a .758 winning percentage in doubles play, and tied for seventh with 25 doubles victories in 2006...Already stands sixth in the Yellow Jacket career record books with 80 singles wins in her two years on the Flats...Holds the career records for both singles (.825) and doubles (.729) winning percentage at Georgia Tech...Currently stands tied for first in the single-season record books with a team-high 24 dual-match wins this spring...Has gone 24-4 at the top singles slot, with 14 of her 24 dual-match wins coming against ranked opponents...Owns a 23-6 mark against ranked opponents this season...Top singles wins came against Diana Srebrovic of Florida to capture the ITA Region Championship in the fall, vs. 10th-ranked Cristelle Grier of Northwestern in the regular season and against second-ranked Audra Cohen in the championship match of the ACC Tournament...Is currently riding a 10-match win streak and has won 12 of her last 13 matches, with the only loss coming to the nation's second-ranked player, Audra Cohen of Miami during the regular season...Went 13-1 in singles against conference opponents, and won nine matches in doubles against ACC foes...Together with Shosho, leads the team with 19 doubles wins this spring, boasting a 19-7 mark in dual matches, playing atop the doubles lineup...The duo has won seven of their last eight doubles matches...The tandem has eight wins over ranked opponents this spring, and nine victories overall this season...Three of their nine victories have come against doubles teams that are ranked in the top-10.

stands No. 96 in the nation in singles play, competing primarily at the No. 4 singles position...Had a key win in the No. 4 slot in the quarterfinal match of the ACC Tournament...Won a pair of matches earlier in the season at the No. 2 slot...Was a perfect 4-0 in doubles before getting hurt, and has not returned to the doubles lineup...Has an overall doubles record of 10-2 on the season.

- **Lyndsay Shosho** - Owns the record for most doubles wins in a season, as she has recorded 33 thusfar this year...Was selected to the 2006 NCAA Doubles Championships with teammate Kristi Miller...Stands tied for seventh with 28 singles wins in 2006 and is sixth with a .733 doubles winning percentage...Is currently ranked No. 63 in the nation in singles and 10th with teammate Kristi Miller in doubles play...Is Georgia Tech's active career doubles leader with Kelly Anderson, with 81 in their careers...Is just one doubles win shy of tying the record for most doubles wins on the Flats...Currently stands ninth in the Tech career annals in singles winning percentage (.609) and is fifth with 84 career singles wins...After beginning the season at the No. 3 singles slot, has played the last 25 matches at the No. 2 position, where she has gone 16-7...Is 18-8 this spring and has posted an overall record of 28-14 in singles play...Has earned nine victories over ranked opponents this season, including four in the spring...Top singles wins have come against 14th-ranked Suzie Babos of California in the fall and 19th-ranked Taka Bertrand of Vanderbilt in the spring...Went 9-4 in singles matches against ACC opponents, and won nine doubles matches against conference foes...Together with Miller, leads the team with 19 doubles wins this spring, boasting an 19-7 mark in dual matches, playing atop the doubles lineup...The duo has won seven of their last eight...The tandem has seven wins over eight ranked opponents this spring, and nine victories overall this season...Three of their eight victories have come against doubles teams that are ranked in the top-10.

- **Alison Silverio** - Was named the ITA South Region Cissie Leary Award for Sportsmanship, which honors a player that has demonstrated "inspiring commitment and dedication to her team, which has enhanced her team's performance and exemplified the spirit of college tennis" ...One of the top all-around athletes on the team, as she stands tied for second in the Tech record books for doubles wins in a season (28), fourth in doubles winning percentage (.757) and seventh with a .771 singles winning percentage this season...Also stands second in singles winning percentage in a career on the Flats (.712), only to Kristi Miller...Appears at No. 4 on the career doubles winning percentage list (.649) and fifth in doubles wins in a career, with 72...Is one of four active players that appear on the career singles wins list, as she stands seventh with 79 victories in her three years at Georgia Tech...Is currently ranked No. 65 in the nation in singles play...Has gone 20-5 in the spring after sitting out most of the fall with an injury...Was a stellar 10-2 against conference opponents this season, playing primarily in the No. 3 singles slot behind all-conference honorees Kristi Miller and Lyndsay Shosho...is 15-4 at No. 3 singles and a perfect 4-0 at the No. 4 slot...Also won seven matches in the fall...Has gone 6-1 against ranked opponents this spring after recording just one win vs. ranked foes in the fall...Top win of the season came against 15th-ranked Alexis Prousis of Northwestern in the early spring...Has posted a 16-7 record in doubles play with Kacie Anson...Played the entire season at the No. 3 slot...Had a 4-0 record in doubles with Tarryn Rudman prior to her injury...Has a 28-9 record in doubles play this year.
