Trailing by three points with 0:11 remaining and given life when Vanderbilt's Billy McCaffrey missed a pair of free throws, Fred Vinson hit a three-pointer from the corner to tie the game at 72. Led by Ivano Newbill's four overtime points, the Jackets outscored the 24th-ranked Commodores 14-5 in the extra period and kept intact Tech's undefeated record in the Kuppenheimer Classic (12-0).

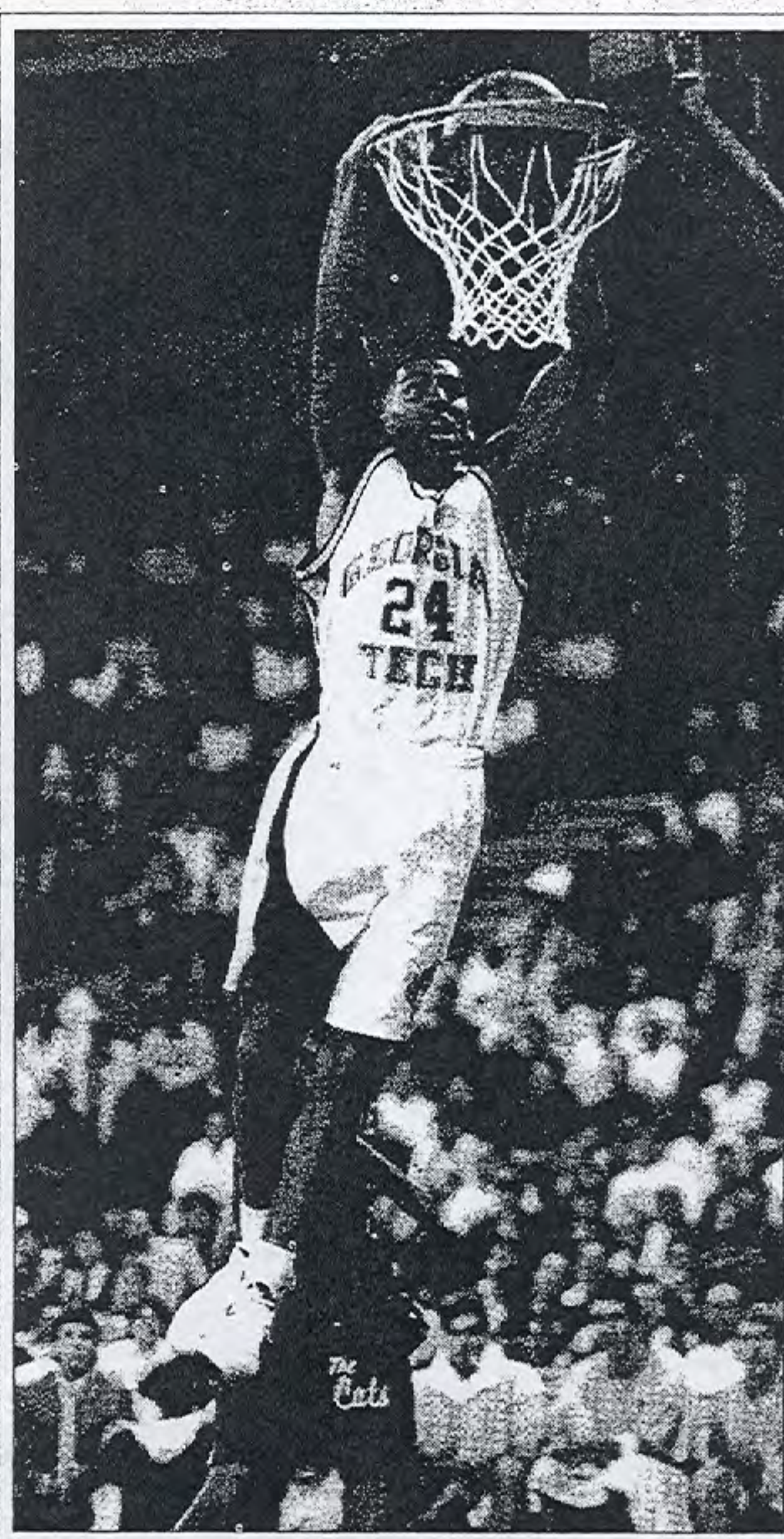
