

Randolph Childress scored 19 points while Wake Forest's defense smothered the Jackets into 29.7-percent shooting, and hobbling Techsters James Forrest and Drew Barry, both returning from injuries, could do little to affect the outcome as Tech played itself out of an NCAA Tournament bid. Fortest made only three of 12 field goal attempts, and Tech's guards could connect on only five of 21 three-pointers.
