Tech overcame a sluggish first half in which they shot 38.7 percent from the field and trailed by six at the intermission. In the second half, Marbury scored seven points in the first four minutes, erasing Michigan's

advantage and giving Tech a four-point lead. A Gary Saunders' layup with 7:38 remaining in the game ignited a 16-6 Tech run, extending its lead to 16-points. For the Jackets, Matt Harpring had 14 points and nine rebounds and Drew Barry added 10 points and six assists.

Katu Davis, with 27 points, and Shannon Anderson, with 19, led a balanced scoring attack as Georgia handed Georgia Tech its worst loss of the season, 94-70, at Georgia Coliseum, the first time the game had been played away from Atlanta's Omni since 1981. The victory was the Bulldogs first over the Yellow Jackets since a 66-65 win on Dec. 18, 1991, and was the largest margin of victory in the series history. Limiting Tech to 39.4 percent shooting from the field, the Bulldogs jumped out to a nine-point halftime lead, quickly extending its lead to 20-points in the second half. Matt Harpring paced the Jackets with 24 points and eight rebounds.

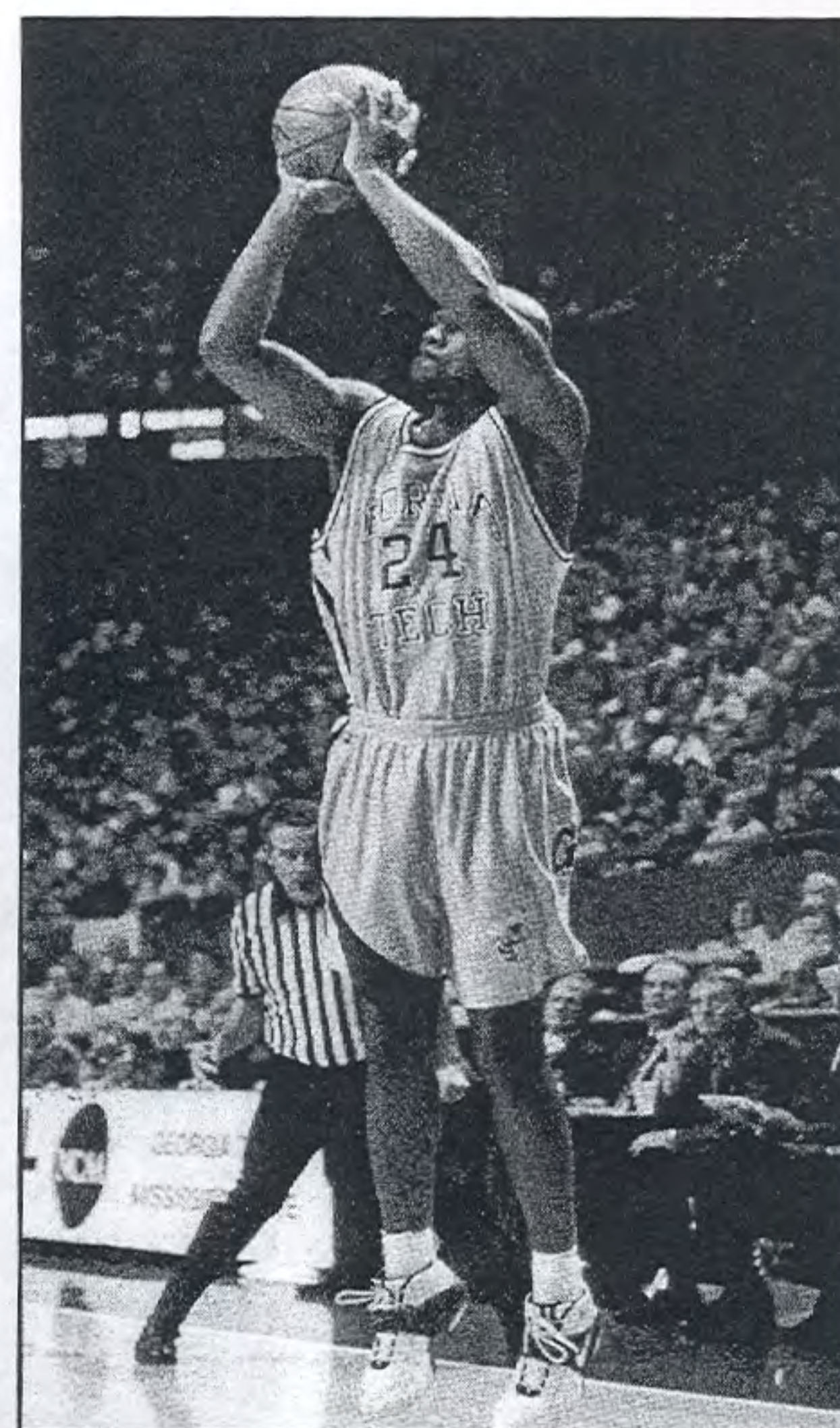
