



## GEORGIA TECH 74, WOFFORD 49

1-22-96 • Alexander Memorial Coliseum

Matt Harpring scored 28 points, pulled down 13 rebounds and handed out assists to lead Georgia Tech to a season-opening 74-49 victory over Wofford. Jackets led by just three points, 34-31, at halftime despite shooting nearly 60 percent from the field as Wofford nailed seven three-pointers and took advantage of 10 Tech turnovers. But after the intermission, Tech held the Terriers to just 18 points—the lowest second half point total for a Rambling Wreck opponent since Maryland Eastern Shore scored 18 in 1985—on just 29 percent shooting from the floor.

Tech freshman point guard Kevin Morris turned in a strong effort in his debut with 17 points, six assists, seven rebounds and three steals.

## GEORGIA TECH 74, MORGAN STATE 58

11-26-96 • Alexander Memorial Coliseum

Matt Harpring notched a double-double with 21 points and 14 rebounds as Georgia Tech defeated Morgan State, 74-58, at Alexander Memorial Coliseum at McDonald's Center, giving Tech head coach Bobby Cremins his 300th victory at Tech and 400th overall. Tech's frontcourt combined for 55 of the Jackets' 74 points as Michael Maddox had 12 points and Eddie Elisma 10, while freshman Pablo Machado contributed 12 points off the bench. The Jackets shot just 39 percent from the field and committed 25 turnovers, but Tech forced 24 Morgan State miscues and outrebounded the Grizzly Bears 53-32.

Matt Harpring scored 29 points and grabbed nine rebounds to lead Georgia Tech over Radford, 91-60, at Alexander Memorial Coliseum at McDonald's Center. The 31-point win was Tech's largest margin of victory since a 112-56 triumph over Florida A&M on Nov. 26, 1994.

## GEORGIA TECH 62, GEORGIA 61

### 12-3-96 • Alexander Memorial Coliseum

A three-pointer by Matt Harpring, followed by two more treys by Michael Maddox ignited a 14-point spurt by Georgia Tech as the Yellow Jackets (4-0) rallied from 11 points down in the final four minutes for a 62-61 victory over Georgia in the Bulldogs' first visit to Alexander Memorial Coliseum since 1980.

After the Yellow Jackets led by as many as 10 points in the first half, Georgia took a 59-48 lead on a Ray Harrison steal and layup with 4:51 left. Tech began its run with a steal by Jon Babul and a hard foul on Kevin Morris by Georgia's Derrick Dukes on the ensuing fast break, inciting the crowd. Trailing 59-49, Morris hit both free throws to pull Tech within eight with four minutes to go.

Harpring nailed his trey at 3:41. Back-to-back three-pointers by Maddox followed, the second of which put Tech ahead, 60-59, with 2:27 to play. Maddox, who tied his career high with 18 points, then knocked away a pass by Georgia's Jon Nordin, leading to a pair of Harpring free throws and a three-point advantage with 2:05 left.

Georgia guard G.G. Smith hit two free throws to cut Tech's lead to one, and then after a turnover by Eddie Elisma, the Bulldogs had the ball back with just over a minute to play. A series of loose balls and a kick allowed Georgia to maintain possession, but the Bulldogs never managed a to get a shot off.

Matt Harpring had 22 points and 10 rebounds to lead Georgia Tech to a 65-40 victory over UNC Greensboro. Michael Maddox contributed 11 points and 11 rebounds for the Jackets, while Eddie Elisma added eight points, 11 boards and four blocked shots. Tech overcame 25 turnovers as the Spartans managed to shoot just 25.4 percent from the field and were outrebounded 49-36.

Tech led 23-12 after a sloppy first half, marking the second-lowest score output in half by a Tech opponent. Only the University of the South, with 10 points in the first half of a 45-42 Tech win on Dec. 2, 1980, scored fewer points in a half. The Spartans' 40 points for the game was the lowest point total against a Rambling Wreck opponent since Jan. 3, 1985, when the Jackets defeated Mary Eastern Shore, 93-40. UNC's field goal percentage was the sixth lowest ever by a Tech opponent and the lowest since Virginia shot just 24.7 percent against the Jackets in 1992.

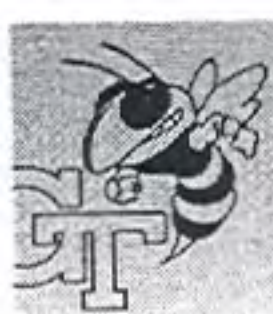
