Five North Carolina players scored in double figures, led by Ed Cota with 14 points and nine assists, as the third-seeded Tar Heels eliminated sixth-seeded Georgia Tech, 78-49, in the quarterfinals of the 46th annual Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament in Charlotte, N.C. Tech trailed just 41-40 after a Jason Collier three-pointer with 12:52 left, but the Jackets could manage only nine points the rest of the way. Behind 33-26 at the half, Tech pulled within one point as Tony Akins opened the second half with three three-pointers, followed by Collier's trey. But UNC answered quickly with six straight points from backup center Brian Bersticker, who finished with 12 points, to begin a 38-9 run over the final 12:30. The Tar Heels shot 54 percent from the field, including 18 -for- 27 ( 67 percent) in the second half, while Tech managed to hit just 30 percent and did not score a twopoint field in the second half. Collier led Tech with 17 points.
