Jason Floyd scored a career-high 31 points and Alvin Jones barely missed a triple double with 18 points, 12 rebounds and nine blocked shots as Georgia Tech opened the season with a 103-63 victory over Charleston Southern. Freshman point guard Tony Akins had 20 points and nine assists in his debut. Tech scored the game's first 18 points and then scored 34 straight points from the 6:42 mark of the first half until 16:58 of the second half to build a 64-16 lead. The Yellow Jackets shot nearly 60 percent from the field but managed to make only 25 of 52 attempts from the free throw line.

Jason Floyd completed a three-point play with 13 seconds left in overtime and then added a free throw eight seconds later to give Georgia Tech a 65-62 victory over New Orleans in the first round of the Big Island Invitational. Freshman Tony Akins sank a pair of free throws with 31 seconds left in regulation to tie the game at 58 to force the overtime. Alvin Jones, who finished with nine points and 15 rebounds, scored the first three points of the extra session and then made the key play of the game when he tipped a rebound to Floyd for the three-point play. Floyd led the Jackets with 22 points.

Tony Akins scored 28 points including the game-winning three-pointer in overtime to give Georgia Tech a 74-72 victory over Appalachian State. Playing without starters Jon Babul (injured), Alvin Jones (fouled out) and Jason Floyd (fouled out), Tech trailed by three in the overtime when Darryl LaBarrie hit a short jumper to bring Tech within 72-71 with 1:14 left, and then Akins buried a trey with 21 seconds left to give the Jackets the victory. The freshman also scored the tying basket at the end of regulation as he drove the lane

and pulled up for a short jumper with just 16 seconds left. Tech led 9-27 at half and maintained its lead for most of the second half until Jones, who had 17 points and 13 rebounds, fouled out with 2:31 left in regulation and the resulting free throw put the Mountaineers up by one.

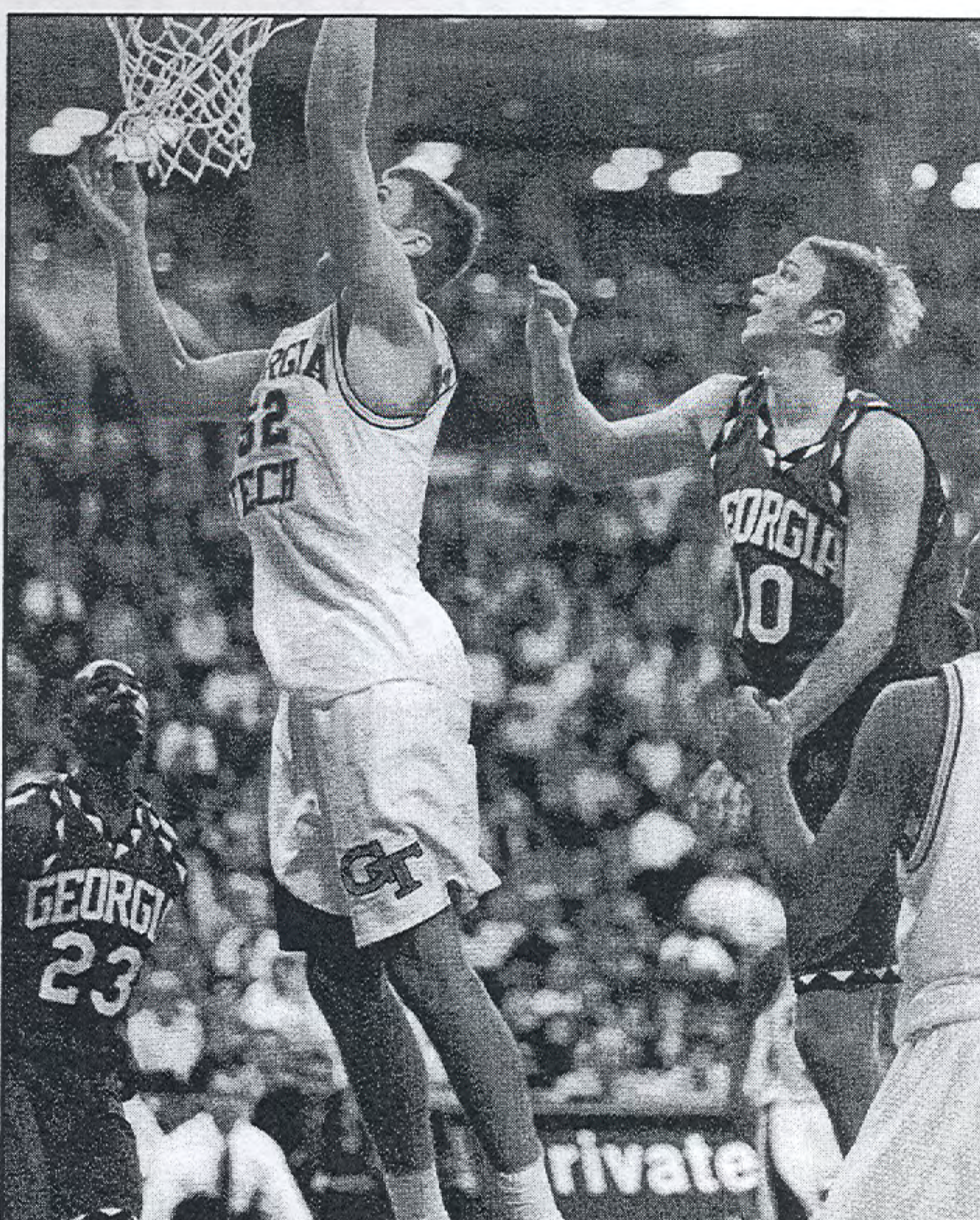

GEORGIA TECH 84, GEORGIA 79 (OT)

12-13-98 • Alexander Memorial Coliseum

In his first game in a Georgia Tech uniform, Jason Collier had 22 points, 11 rebounds and five blocked shots as the Yellow Jackets rallied from a 15-point second-half deficit for an 84-79 overtime victory over arch-rival Georgia. Tony Akins led Tech with 24 points, including two free throws that tied the game at the end of regulation and six of Tech's 12 points in the overtime.

Ahead most of the game, Georgia built a 65-50 advantage on a Michael Chadwick basket with 10:33 left in the second half, but that was the Bulldogs' last field goal of regulation. Tech still trailed 72-65 when Collier hit a three-pointer to cut the deficit to four points with 1:40 to play. Then Akins stole the ball and fed Collier for a layup that made the score 72-70. On Tech's next possession, Akins pounced on a loose ball and was fouled, and his free throws tied the game with 34.6 seconds left. Georgia had a shot to tie, but G.G. Smith's final shot was blocked by Collier.

Collier scored the first basket of the overtime to give the Jackets their first lead since 9-7. Akins added a driving layup and Darryl LaBarrie came off the bench to hit a crucial field goal. After Georgia took the lead to one, Akins sank a pair of free throws with 20.3 seconds left, and then sealed the win with two more charity tosses. Tech hit 12 of its last 14 shots from the field, including all four in overtime.

Jason Floyd and Jason Collier scored 22 points apiece and Alvin Jones grabbed 18 rebounds as Georgia Tech defeated Wofford, 76-63. Tony Akins had 10 points and eight assists, and Darryl LaBarrie added 11 points off the bench. The Jackets led by just two points, 37-35, at the half and managed only a four-point advantage at 58-54 with seven minutes left, but Tech pulled away with rebounding, evidenced by a 45-33 advantage on the boards, and defense, holding the Terriers to 29 percent shooting in the second half.

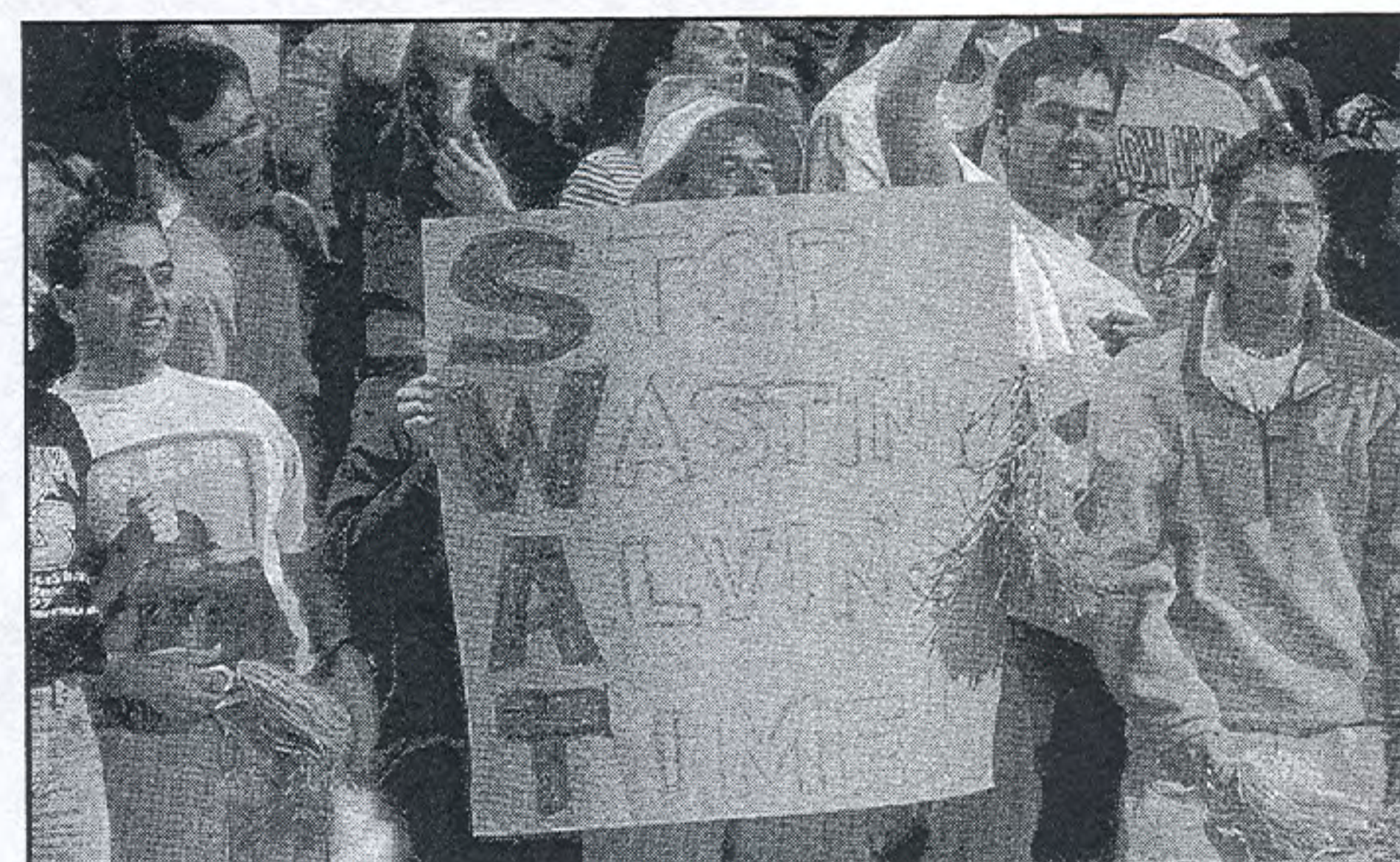
