2001 Georgia Tech Men's Tennis Season Highlights

- The Yellow Jackets are making their fourth NCAA Tournament appearance in the last five years and their sixth overall. Georgia Tech is 4-5 overall in NCAA Tournament play
- After beginning the spring ranked 73rd in the nation, the Yellow Jackets have been ranked in the nation's top 30 for the last nine weeks.
- Georgia Tech's No. 20 ranking on April 11 was its highest since 1988.
- The Yellow Jackets won seven consecutive matches from March 7-March 21 and 11 of 12 from March 7-April 8
- Three of Tech's losses this season have been to teams currently ranked in the top five nationally.
- Roger Anderson and David Wright, the Yellow Jackets' No. 1 doubles team, is ranked 45th nationally and has been ranked as high as 24th during the year.
- Anderson and Wright defeated No. 2 Matias Boeker and Travis Parrott of Georgia on March 3.

Charged with building the Georgia Tech tennis program back to the level it was when he was a player, former Yellow Jacket standout Kenny Thorne was named to the newly-created position of Director of Tennis at his alma mater on June 30, 1998, becoming the ninth head coach in Tech men's tennis history.

Thorne took over the reigns of the Tech program after spending one season as the team's assistant coach and wasted little time in taking steps toward his ultimate goal of turning the Yellow Jackets into a perennial top-10 contender.

During the 2000-01 season, Thorne has made great strides toward achieving his goal. When the Yellow Jackets climbed to No. 20 in the national rankings on April 11, they claimed their highest ranking since 1988, when Thorne was an All-American and team captain.

After earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year honors in his inaugural campaign, Thorne boasted another solid year in 2000.

Under Thorne's guidance in 2000, freshman Roger Anderson became the first Tech player to earn ACC Rookie of the Year honors after leading the Yellow Jackets with a 24-8 singles record, including a 15-5 mark in dual matches.

In his first year as head coach in 1999, Thorne earned ACC Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Yellow Jackets to a second-place tie in the regular-season conference standings, a runner-up finish at the ACC Tournament, an NCAA Regional berth and a final national ranking of 32 by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA).

Senior Benjamin Cassaigne was named the ACC Player of the Year, earned all-conference honors and captured the ACC Flight Championship at No. 1 singles under Thorne's guidance. Fellow senior Matt Cozad was also named all-ACC and won the ACC Flight Championship at No. 2 singles. Cozad and sophomore Sergio Aguirre also won the ACC Flight title at No. 3 doubles.

With Tech's 1999 NCAA Regional berth, Thorne became the first person in ACC history and just the second nationally to lead the same school to post-season competition as a player, assistant coach and head coach since the current NCAA team dual-match format was instituted in 1977. (Prior to 1977, team finishes were determined by an accumulation of points based on individual play.) Thorne helped Tech to NCAA play as a senior in 1988, as an assistant coach in 1998 and as head coach in 1999. He joined LSU's Jeff Brown as the only other collegiate men's coach to guide the same school to NCAA competition as a player, assistant and head coach under the current format.

Thorne earned an Industrial Engineer-

ing degree from Tech in 1989 and during his four seasons as a player from 1985-88, the Jackets posted a 70-38 dual-match record and a 20-7 ACC mark, including wins over nationally-ranked foes such as Georgia and Clemson in 1988, his final season. Tech climbed as high as 10th in the ITA national rankings during Thorne's senior season before the Jackets ended the year ranked 12th nationally.

Thorne qualified for the NCAA singles tournament in 1986 and 1988 and advanced to the second round on both occasions. Thorne also competed in the 1988 NCAA doubles tourney with partner Bryan Shelton.

After turning professional in 1989, Thorne spent eight years on the tour, achieving his highest singles ranking of 121 and doubles ranking of 67 in the world. He was also a six-time participant at Wimbledon, the U.S. Open, French Open and Australian Open.

Thorne's best career wins were over 1996 Wimbledon champion Richard Krajicek, ATP No. 11 Wayne Ferreira, Spain's Javier Sanchez and Australian Mark Philippoussis.

He posted two career ATP doubles titles, one career Challenger singles title and four career Challenger doubles titles.

An All-American in 1988, Thorne finished his Georgia Tech playing career as a four-time All-ACC honoree and the career leader in singles victories with 112.

He was also a two-time captain and an Academic All-ACC honoree. Thorne was inducted into the Georgia Tech Athletic Hall of Fame in 1995.

Thorne married former Yellow Jacket cross country standout and Tech Hall of Fame inductee, Bridget Koster, in 1990.

The couple has two daughters, Rachel, 5, and Kenedy, 1, and one son, Zachary, 3.

John Thompson, the newest member of the Yellow Jacket family, was named assistant men's tennis coach in August 2000.

A native of Buchanan, Mich., Thompson came to Tech from Myrtle Beach, S.C., where he was the owner and director of SET Academy. Thompson organized and directed elite junior programs including tournament travel, junior camps and private coaching.

The 1997 South Carolina Tennis Association Tennis Professional of the Year, Thompson coached several national players, including the fifth-ranked player in U.S. Girls 14 and Under.

Thompson previously served as Director of Tennis at Dunes Golf and Beach Club in Myrtle Beach for four years, where he was responsible for organizing adult and youth programs. While at

Dunes Club, Thompson coached 20 state, sectional and national level junior players and developed a well-known and respected junior program.

Thompson began his career in tennis as a student at Appalachian State University in 1988. While not in class, Thompson worked as a tennis professional at Yonahlossee Resort in Boone, N.C., where he was responsible for the entire junior program.

A finance major, Thompson also played collegiate tennis for one year at Appalachian State. He earned a bachelor of science degree in business administration in December 1993.

Thompson began playing tennis at age 15 and immediately realized that it would become his career. He played junior tennis in the Western Section before walking onto the Appalachian State team.

Ellis Ferreira

Volunteer Coach, 2000 Australian Open Doubles Champion



Currently one of the ATP Tour's top doubles players, Atlanta resident Ellis Ferreira works with the Tech tennis program on a volunteer basis.

Ferreira assists the Yellow Jackets with technical aspects of their games with a special emphasis on

doubles play.

In his career, Ferreira has captured 13 doubles titles and has won more than \$1 million in prize money. He consistently ranks among the top-15 doubles players in the world, and has been ranked as high as second in the world. He recently advanced to the finals of the U.S. Open in doubles play.

In January, Ferreira and his partner, Rick Leach, won the 2000 Australian Open Doubles

Championship.

He won his first career ATP Tour title in Vienna and has tour wins in Sydney and at the Mercedes Super 9 in Monte Carlo to his credit. In 1998, Ferreira captured the doubles title at the AT&T Challenge in his hometown of Atlanta.

A standout collegiate player at Alabama, Ferreira competed four years for the Crimson Tide from 1988-91. He earned All-America honors in doubles for three years and won the Southeastern Conference doubles title in 1989 along with his brother Clinton.

A native of South Africa, Ferreira has also played on his country's Davis Cup team and Olympic squad.

Ferreira and his wife, Ashley, now reside in Atlanta with their three-year-old daughter, Camden.
