## MEDIA CREDENTIALS FOR HOME GAMES

-Media credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Working space is limited, and children, spouses and other non-workers will not be granted credentials or access to media areas.
-Media seating and workspace at McCamish Pavilion is in the upper level, section 211, and the media entrance to the arena is through the west entrance off of Fowler Street. Media will call is located at the ticket booth by the west entrance.
-Requests for credentials should be made in writing via email at least 24 hours in advance of each game to Liz Ryan Credentials will not be mailed. They can be picked up the night of the game at the media entrance.
-Photo credentials are granted to still photographers and videographers on assignment for a media agency only. Admission to courtside is by FLOOR or PHOTO pass only, and photographer positions are at the discretion of the basketball game officials and the media relations staff.

## DIRECTIONS TO McCAMISH PAVILION AND THE ZELNAK CENTER

-Going South on I-75: Take exit 250 (16th/14th/10th Streets) and follow through light at 14th Street. Stay to the right and follow to 10th Street, where McCamish Pavilion is straight ahead. Turn right to access the parking areas other than the main lot.
-Going South on I-85: Take exit 84 (17th/14th/10th Streets). You will stay to the left immediately upon exiting the interstate, but will need to move to the right after 16th Street. Follow until you reach 10th Street where McCamish Pavilion will be in front of you. Take a right on 10th Street and an immediate left on Fowler Street and access the main arena parking lot off of 8th Street.
-Going North on I-75/85: Take the 10th Street exit (250). Turn left on 10th Street and after you cross the bridge, McCamish Pavilion will be on your left. Just past the arena, turn left at Fowler Street (first traffic light). Take first left at 8th Street and follow to main arena parking lot.

## NCAA INFRACTIONS

In July of 2011, the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division I Committee on Infractions found the Georgia Institute of Technology men's basketball and football programs responsible for committing violations of NCAA legislation.

The Institute was cited for a lack of cooperation during the investigation, a failure to meet the conditions and obligations of membership, and preferential treatment violations. Also cited were additional violations in the men's basketball program related to the conduct of a nonscholastic men's basketball tournament on campus. The NCAA public report further details all of the findings.
Penalties Included:

- Public reprimand and censure.
- Four years of probation from July 14, 2011 through July 13, 2015.
- A \$100,000 financial penalty.
- A reduction of two men's basketball recruiting days during the 2011 summer evaluation period (self-imposed by the Institute).
- A limit of 10 official visits for the men's basketball program for the 2011-12 and 2012-13 academic years, respectively.
- Vacation of contests won by the football team during the 2009 season after November 24 , which is when the university was alerted to potential eligibility issues.
Additionally, in September of 2014 the NCAA Division I Committee on Infractions cited the Institute for a failure to monitor recruiting activities, and the football, men's basketball, and women's basketball programs were cited for recruiting violations surrounding impermissible telephone calls and text messages sent to prospective student-athletes. The NCAA accepted the Institute's self-imposed penalties. The NCAA public report further details all of the findings.
Penalties Included:
- Public reprimand and censure.
- Two additional years of probation, extending through July 13, 2017.
- Recruiting restrictions during the 2012-13 academic year, including telephone call restrictions and a reduction in off-campus recruiting opportunities (self-imposed by the Institute).
As a result of the exhaustive investigation and review process and because of Georgia Tech's steadfast commitment to compliance, the Institute completely revamped and enhanced its athletics compliance operation and staffing. A robust monitoring system was implemented and a more frequent and meaningful rules education program was established across all sports. The Institute remains committed to operating all of its athletics programs within the letter and spirit of NCAA, ACC, and Institute rules and regulations.

## KATARINAVUCKOVIC

## QUICK HITS

- Katarina Vuckovic is the lone returning senior on this year's squad and is the team's leading returning scorer and rebounder from last season.
- She has helped the Yellow Jackets reach postseason play all three seasons since arriving on campus in 2013. Tech has participated in the NCAA Tournament and two WNITs since Vuckovic arrived.
- She was one of five NCAA Division I women's basketball student-athletes named to the 2016 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team. After arriving on campus in 2013, Vuckovic has volunteered with several organizations including Urban Platform, Safe House, Ronald McDonald House and the Boys and Girls Club in addition to several events. Vuckovic was the second Yellow Jacket in three years to be named to the team.
- Two summers ago, Vuckovic spent the summer with fellow Yellow Jackets in the Dominican Republic for a service trip. Additionally, Vuckovic has volunteered with Girls on the Run and ran "Shoot for Shoes" during Earth Day at Tech.
- Vuckovic led the team in blocks last season with 17 overall, including three against ACC opponents last season.
- A consistent player, during conference play, Vuckovic hit 90.9 percent from the free throw line and hit 78.4 percent for the season.
- She recorded her second career double-double last season against Boston College after leading Tech in both scoring (18 pts) and rebounding (10 rbs).
- Vuckovic has missed only five games in her career having played in 94 games. The five games missed were as a freshman.

14TH SEASON AT GEORGIA TECH

MaChelle Joseph has taken the Georgia Tech women's basketball program to new heights after compiling a 252-162 overall record. Joseph is the winningest coach in Georgia Tech women's basketball history and has the highest overall and ACC winning percentage of any Tech coach in program history. She completed her 13th season at the helm of the Yellow Jackets in 2015-16.

When she was named head coach on May 19, 2003, Joseph said that it was her goal to make the Yellow Jackets a national power in women's basketball.

Joseph's 13th season on The Flats resulted in Tech's eighth 20-win season under her leadership and the Yellow Jackets' ninth postseason trip in 10 years. Led by All-American guard Aaliyah Whiteside, the Jackets finished 20-13 and advanced to the second round of the WNIT.
The 2014-15 season saw the Yellow Jackets make their eighth trip to the postseason in the past nine years after receiving a bid to the WNIT. Georgia Tech finished the season at 19-15 with a 7-9 record in the ACC which tied them for ninth in the final conference standings.

Following a victory against Clemson on January 4, 2015, Joseph hit another career milestone, capturing her 224th career win and becoming the all-time winningest coach in Georgia Tech history. The Jackets also hit another huge milestone during the season, breaking a 37-game losing streak to Duke by upsetting the No. 16 Blue Devils, 71-62, on February 26, 2015.

Sophomore Kaela Davis was named All-ACC First Team and the Georgia College Player of the Year during the 2015 season. She became the fastest player in Georgia Tech history to score 1,000 career points and broke the single-season scoring record with 652 points. Davis was also named to the 2015 Preseason All-ACC team.

On April 25, 2015, Joseph was inducted into her home state of Indiana's Basketball Hall of Fame.

During the 2013-14 season, the Yellow Jackets completed their seventh 20 -win season in the past eight years under Coach Joseph. The Jackets also received their seventh at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament under Coach Joseph. Tech finished the season at 20-12 and seventh in the ACC with a 9-7 conference record.
Prior to the 2013-14 season, Joseph signed high school All-American and the number one recruit in the country, Kaela Davis. Davis, along with senior Tyaunna Marshall, helped the Jackets average 79.7 points per game in 2013-14 - the highest scoring average for a team under Coach Joseph. Marshall became the all-time leading scorer in school history and the first Jacket to score 2,000 points. She finished her career with 2,109 points and was named to the All-ACC First Team, ACC All-Defensive Team and the Georgia College Women's Player of the Year by the Atlanta Tipoff Club for the second consecutive year.

Davis was honored on the All-ACC Second Team and ACC All-Freshman Team. Davis was the fourth-straight All-ACC Freshman Team honoree and sixth overall under Coach Joseph.
The 2012-13 season had some growing pains as Tech finished 14-16, but a number of the young Jackets earned valuable experience that will significantly help in the coming seasons.
Tyaunna Marshall was the brightest star on the Yellow Jackets all season as the junior earned All-ACC First Team, ACC All-Defensive Team, Associated Press honorable mention All-America and WBCA honorable mention All-America honors. Sophomore Sydney Wallace continued to show flashes of scoring brilliance, while freshmen Roddreka Rogers and Aaliyah Whiteside stepped into the starting lineup and were significant contributors in their first year on the Flats.

The 2011-12 season was just the latest step in taking the Jackets to new heights as Tech won a school-record 26 games, played in just the second ACC Championship Game in school history and advanced to the program's first NCAA Sweet 16.

The 2011-12 season marked Tech's sixth consecutive season and ninth overall with at least 20 wins. The 2012 season culminated in the Jackets' sixth straight NCAA Tournament berth, the eighth in program history.


The 2012 senior class not only finished their careers with the most wins of any class, 95, and with the most ACC wins of any class, 37 , but all five graduated in four years from Georgia Tech.
Sasha Goodlett became the second WNBA First Round draft pick and seventh overall draftee Joseph has coached when she was selected by the Indiana Fever with the 11th overall pick of the 2012 WNBA Draft.
The 2010-11 season saw the Yellow Jackets top a number of school records. Georgia Tech won a program-best 24 games and Joseph led her squad to a school-record 13-game winning streak, including a 71-70 win over No. 8 North Carolina in Atlanta in which the Jackets rallied from down seven with 1:06 to play. Tech again returned to the NCAA Tournament, earning a No. 5 seed, the school's highest ever. The Jackets defeated Bowling Green in the first round, only the third NCAA Tournament win ever, before falling to Ohio State in a second round game played in Columbus.
Alex Montgomery earned Second Team All-ACC and ACC All-Defensive accolades, while Tyaunna Marshall was named Third Team All-ACC, ACC All-Freshman Team and Third Team Freshman All-America by the Full Court Press.

Joseph earned her 150th career victory on Feb. 24, 2011 with a 64-57 win at No. 13 North Carolina, marking the first time Georgia Tech swept the Tar Heels since the 1990-91 season, and becoming the fastest coach in school history to win 150 games.
Following the season, Montgomery was selected No. 10 overall by the New York Liberty

in the 2011 WNBA Draft, the first ACC player drafted in 2011 and became Tech's highest drafted player and first first round draft pick. Montgomery is the fifth Yellow Jacket to be selected in the WNBA draft. During her eight seasons on the Flats, Joseph has coached 18 All-ACC honorees, three ACC All-Freshman team members, five ACC All-Defensive team selections, three ACC All-Academic team members and the 2010 ACC Sixth Player of the Year.

Joseph helped her 2009-10 team to a record-setting season in her seventh on the Flats. She led her squad to a 23-10 mark, tying the most wins in program history and most since joining the ACC prior to the 1979-80 season. Her team reached its fourth straight NCAA Tournament. The year was marked by the development of Brigitte Ardossi, who registered one of the best senior seasons in program history. She earned All-ACC second team honors and become just the fifth Yellow Jacket to be drafted when the Atlanta Dream selected her in the second round. Montgomery earned her second straight All-ACC third team nod and was selected the ACC Sixth Player of the Year.

In her sixth season, Joseph once again led her team to a 22-10 record and led it to the program's third straight NCAA Tournament appearance despite listing 10 freshmen and sophomores on the roster. Tech found itself in the national rankings for five consecutive weeks during the season. The team registered wins over three ranked opponents during the regular season, including a $66-62$ win over No. $2 / 3$ North Carolina, the highest ranked opponent ever defeated by a Yellow Jacket team. The Jackets also earned the program's second NCAA Tournament victory when they defeated lowa in the first round of the tournament, 76-62.

The 2007-08 campaign was another successful season with Joseph at the helm. The Jackets finished with a 22-10 record, registering the most wins in program history since joining the ACC before the 1979-80 season. Tech also made its second straight NCAA

a national ranking of No. 23 in both the AP and ESPN/ Coaches Polls during the week of Jan. 21, 2008, the team's first national ranking in 14 years. Two Jackets earned All-ACC honors and senior Chioma Nnamaka became the highest-ever Yellow Jacket taken in the WNBA draft, when she was selected 21st overall.
In her fourth year at Tech, Joseph again took the program to new heights. She coached the Jackets to a 21-12 finish, the best in school history, and the program's first NCAA Tournament win, a 55-54 thriller over DePaul. The Jackets also earned their first-ever winning record in ACC play, including wins over defending national champions and fourth-ranked Maryland and Sweet 16 participant NC State. Tech's 9-5 ACC record was seven wins better than the previous season and was the second-best turnaround in conference history.

Once again, Joseph proved to be one of the best recruiting coaches in the nation when she brought in the eighth-ranked recruiting class, featuring forwards Alex Montgomery and lasia Hemingway, guards Deja Foster, Shaday Woolcock and Simone Trice. Montgomery became the then-highest-ranked recruit to ever sign a letter of intent when the 15thranked player chose Tech during the early signing period.

Joseph's third season at the helm of the program proved to be one of her most successful, both on and off the court. While the Jackets again finished just one game shy of postseason qualification, Georgia Tech earned its first ACC Tournament victory under Joseph and came within five points of recording a quarterfinal victory in the conference tournament against the eventual national champion Maryland. Joseph had two players earn their degrees the following May, and another to be selected in the WNBA draft.

In 2005, Joseph guided a young Yellow Jacket team to a 13-14 record, with the top victory of the season coming against Georgia Tech's arch rival, Georgia, by a score of 5549 at Alexander Memorial Coliseum. It marked the first time since the 1998-99 season that the Yellow Jackets had defeated a team ranked in the top-10, and the highest ranked team Tech had recorded a victory against since the 1991-92 season, as the Bulldogs were ranked sixth in the nation entering the contest.

Joseph's first recruiting class as the head coach at the Institute, the 2004-05 freshman class, was ranked the No. 5 recruiting class in the nation by the All Star Girls Report in USA Today in November, 2003. Included in that group were high school All-Americans Jill Ingram, Daphne Mitchell and Janie Mitchell, with Giuliett Ancora, Shantrell Moss and Chioma Nnamaka rounding out her first recruiting class.

Joseph acquired a program that she helped take to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in a decade and just the second time in school history when she was named the Yellow Jackets' head coach prior to the 2003-04 season. During her first season, Joseph tied the records for most overall and conference victories by a first-year head coach, tying her predecessor, Agnus Berenato, who left the Flats to become head coach at Pittsburgh after 15 seasons in the same post at Georgia Tech.
Joseph's skill as a recruiter translated into immediate results at Georgia Tech, where she assembled the then highest-rated freshman class in school history. Tech's 2002 recruiting class, which included McDonald's and WBCA prep All-American Kasha Terry, as well as Ashley Guerrant, Megan Harpring, April Johnson, Jessica Williams and Mallorie Winn, was

rated among the top-15 in the nation by a number of recruiting services and media outlets, including No. 11 by the All-Star Girls Report as the second-highest in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Following two years as an assistant coach under Berenato, during which the Yellow Jackets averaged 18 wins a season, Joseph was named the fifth head coach in the history of the Georgia Tech program by former Institute President Dr. G. Wayne Clough and thenDirector of Athletics Dave Braine.
"I felt like I won the lottery when I took this job," said Joseph. "This is one of the best jobs in the country and there is no reason why we can't challenge for an ACC and national championship in the years to come. We have all of the resources, the support of our administration and everything that it takes to be a top-10 program, and that is my goal for Georgia Tech."

Braine said that rewarding Joseph with her first head coaching position was a logical choice.
"MaChelle has proven herself to be an outstanding coach and recruiter in her 11 years as an assistant coach, and in particular in her two years at Georgia Tech," Braine said at the time of her promotion.

Tech's former athletic director, Dan Radakovich, showed support in Joseph's vision and awarded her with a contract extension that will keep her at Georgia Tech through the 2014-15 season.
"MaChelle has certainly ratcheted up the program in a number of ways," Radakovich said. "She and her staff have worked extremely hard in recruiting, coaching and in gaining awareness in the city of Atlanta. This is definitely a program on the rise."

Prior to her hiring as an assistant before the 2001-02 season, the Yellow Jackets hadn't won 20 games in the same season since the 1992 WNIT Championship season, and hadn't finished at . 500 or above in conference play since 1993.

In her two years as Tech's top assistant coach, Joseph applied her skills as an instructor and recruiter along with her all-star playing credentials to help the program enjoy two of the best seasons in its history.

Joseph arrived on the Flats after serving as an assistant coach and the recruiting coordinator on Joe Ciampi's staff at Auburn from 1997-2001. She helped guide the Tigers to a combined 97-50 record in five seasons and the second round of the NCAA Tournament on three occasions. Each of the last four recruiting classes she helped attract to Auburn were ranked in the top-10 nationally by the All Star Girls Report, including the Tigers' 2001 class that was ranked the nation's second-best.

Before joining the Auburn staff, Joseph coached at her alma mater, Purdue, from 1994-96 under Lin Dunn and helped the Boilermakers post a sterling 73-24 (.753) record in three seasons. Purdue advanced to the Final Four in 1994 and followed that performance with a trip to the NCAA Elite Eight in 1995. Joseph also served one year (1993) as an assistant at Illinois.

Overall, Joseph's career as an assistant coach spanned 11 years in three of the nation's top women's basketball conferences, with successful stops at Auburn of the Southeastern Conference, as well as Purdue and Illinois of the Big Ten preceding her Atlantic Coast Conference stint. In 15 seasons as a collegiate player and assistant coach, Joseph was a part of programs that produced winning records in every year but one, and reached the NCAA Tournament 11 times.

A four-year starter for the Boilermakers from 1989-1992, Joseph is one of the most decorated players in Purdue and Big Ten Conference history as she garnered numerous
conference and national accolades. After earning Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors as well as second-team all-conference accolades in 1989, Joseph was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 1990, 1991 and 1992 and was named the Big Ten Player of the Year as a senior. She also earned Kodak All-America honors in 1992, when she was tabbed the Women's Basketball News' College Player of the Year.

Georgia Tech women's basketball head coach MaChelle Joseph announced the addition of Kevin Morrison, an eight-year division one coaching veteran and well known recruiter, to the staff as an assistant coach, on May 22, 2015.
"Kevin Morrison is a huge addition to a great staff," Joseph said. "He has had tremendous experiences at two very successful programs. His ability to recruit and coach at the highest level is proven. I am very excited about the future of our program and Kevin will be an integral part of our success."
Morrison brings a west-coast flavor to the Yellow Jackets after coaching at both Washington and California for the past eight years.
"I want to first off thank Coach Joseph for this opportunity," Morrison said. "I am extremely excited to join the Georgia Tech women's basketball staff and to have the chance to work with these student-athletes. Georgia Tech and the city of Atlanta are very special and I'm looking forward to joining the Yellow Jacket family."
Morrison spent the past four seasons at Washington, starting off as an assistant coach prior to the 2011-12 season and then being promoted to associate head coach in April of 2013. As the associate head coach, Morrison worked with on-court coaching, skill development and advancing scouting and recruiting for the Huskies.

Morrison aided Washington to a 23-10 record in 2015 which was the most wins in a season since 2002-03. The Huskies were selected to the NCAA Tournament in 2015 for the first time since 2007. He was instrumental in the development of the post players, including Talia Walton who was named to the Pac-12 All-Freshman Team and Aminah Williams who finished second all-time at UW for single-season rebounding and as the school's all-time rebounding leader. A notable recruiter, Washington signed three McDonald's All-Americans over his four seasons and signed three top 25 recruiting classes, including a top-10 class in 2013.

Morrison got his start in collegiate women's basketball at California. For four years, the La Verne, Calif, native served as an assistant coach at California under coach Joanne Boyle, where he assisted with recruiting and contributed in the Golden Bears ability to continually bring in highly ranked classes.

While at California, Morrison was a part of a successful Golden Bears program that reached the postseason in each of his four seasons, including advancing to the Sweet Sixteen in 2009 and won the WNIT Championship in 2010. During the 2007-08, and then later in 2008-09, the Golden Bears set a school record for wins with 27. Overall, Cal signed three recruiting classes that were ranked in the Top-10 by ESPN Hoopgurlz, Blue Star, and All-Star Girls Report(\#1 in 2009, \#9 in 2010, \#7 in 2011)

Prior to joining the college ranks, Morrison was the president and head coach of the West Coast Elite AAU program, where he helped 74 players sign with Division I teams, including 19 McDonald's All-Americans and six Gatorade State Players of the Year and one Gatorade National Player of the Year.

Morrison is a 1994 graduate of Cal Poly Pomona with a degree in social work. He spent over nine years as a social worker and high school guidance counselor as well as a varsity girls' basketball coach. Kevin and his wife Heather have four children: sons Jayce, Jaylen, Myles and daughter Mya.

A fourteen-year veteran of Division I college basketball, Rob Norris joined the Georgia Tech women's basketball staff as an assistant coach on April 15, 2015.
"I am very excited to add someone to our Georgia Tech women's basketball staff with Rob's level of experience," head coach MaChelle Joseph said. "He has been in college basketball for over 14 years on both the men's and women's side. He will oversee our scouting and will be in charge of player development. I look forward to working with Rob and welcome him and his family to Atlanta."

Norris comes to the Flats after serving as an assistant coach for the VCU women's basketball team for the 2014-15 season. He was also an assistant coach at Eastern Michigan and coached for nine years in men's college basketball.
"I am very grateful to be joining Coach Joseph's staff," Norris said. "It's an exciting time for Georgia Tech women's basketball and I am excited to be a part of it."
Norris was the lead assistant for the VCU women's basketball team for the 2014-15 season. At VCU, he worked with the guards and wings and helped guide the Rams to a 16-14 overall record.
Before coaching at VCU, Norris was an assistant coach at Eastern Michigan, serving as the team's defensive coordinator and focusing on the guards. In 2012-13, Eastern Michigan limited its opponents to 63.8 points per game and in 2013-14, improved its record by 10 wins to 18-14
Prior to Eastern Michigan, Norris worked in men's basketball for 11 years. From 2006-09, Norris was the assistant coach at Canisius College and in 2009, he was promoted to the associate head coach where he served in that capacity until 2012. While at Canisius, Norris was mainly responsible for the team's scheduling and worked closely with the head coach in game-planning, opponent scouting and daily practice planning. He recruited former MAAC Co-Rookie of the Year, Frank Turner. Turner finished out his career ranked among the school's top-10 in 12 different statistical categories.
Norris spent two years at Towson University as an assistant coach (2004-06) where he worked under head coach Pat Kennedy. At Towson, Norris worked closely with future NBA standout Gary Neal who currently plays for the Minnesota Timberwolves. Norris also had worked with Kennedy, serving as his director of men's basketball operations from 2002-04 at the University of Montana and as his film coordinator at DePaul from 2001-02.
A native of Rochester, N.Y., Norris attended Fairleigh Dickinson University for two years before transferring to Indiana University of Pennsylvania for his junior and senior years. A four-year starter at guard, Norris earned a spot on the Northeast Conference's 1995-96 All-Newcomers Team after averaging 11.0 points per game for FDU as a freshman.

In his senior year, he was named captain at IUP and helped direct the Indians to a 22-5 record, the third-best in school history. He closed out his collegiate career with over 1,000 points, 300 assists and 300 rebounds.

A graduate of Rochester's McQuaid Jesuit High School, Norris was a four-year varsity player and a McDonald's All-American nominee. A two-time all-state and All-City Catholic League selection and a first-team All-Greater Rochester choice in his senior year, he led McQuaid to a pair of Section V championships.

Norris and his wife Ann Marie have three children, two daughters, Haden (9), Keely (5) and a son, Holt (1).

Georgia Tech head women's basketball coach MaChelle Joseph announced the hiring of M.L. Willis as an assistant coach for the Yellow Jackets May 2, 2013.

Willis comes to Georgia Tech after four years at West Virginia and brings 13 years of coaching experience to the Yellow Jacket staff. She completed her third season as the assistant coach of the Jackets in 2014-15.
"I am extremely excited to join the Georgia Tech program," Willis said. "I'm looking forward to coaching and competing in the Atlantic Coast Conference, which is arguably the best women's basketball conference in the country. With the facilities Georgia Tech has, the prestige of the Institute and the fantastic home that is Atlanta, the program has every opportunity to be successful and I want to help build on what Coach Joseph has already achieved here."

During her time with the Mountaineers, Willis helped lead WVU to four NCAA Tournament appearances. West Virginia won at least 20 games in three of her four years, including a program-best 29 victories in 2009-10. In only her second year, Willis and the Mountaineers posted the best start ever for a WVU team as the Mountaineers began the 2010-11 season 19-0 and had the No. 1 ranked scoring defense nationally for five weeks. WVU won three straight games over top-25 opponents for the first time in school history during the 2011-12 season.

Willis drew on her expertise with posts and forwards at West Virginia to help develop Asya Bussie into a 2009-10 All-Big East Freshman Team unanimous selection. Bussie went on to earn first team All-Big East as a junior in 2011-12. Willis also coached All-Big East selections Liz Repella, Sarah Miles and Korrine Campbell while at WVU. In 2012-13, forward Jess Harlee was selected to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team.
"I am very excited to add someone of Malikah's caliber to our coaching staff," Joseph said. "She has tremendous experience as both a player and a coach, which will be a great asset to our players. Malikah is one of the top up-and-coming post coaches and recruiting coordinators in the game, and I am looking forward to the opportunity to work with her."

Willis arrived in Morgantown after two years as an assistant coach at Norfolk State. During her three previous seasons at Elizabeth City State, Willis coached post player Celeste Trahan, who became the first player in Division II history to score 2,000 points and grab 1,500 rebounds in a career. Willis also held assistant coach positions at the University of Illinois-Chicago, Chicago State and Cheyney University.

A native of Queens, N.Y., Willis played at Christ the King High for three years and spent her senior season at Trinity High in Cleveland, Ohio. Christ the King was the No. 1 nationally ranked prep squad and won the national title in 1993. During her senior season, Willis helped Trinity High gain similar recognition as her team was ranked No. 2 after winning the national title and she was named a Parade All-American.

Willis was recruited to the University of lowa by Hall of Fame head coach C. Vivian Stringer where she was a part of the No. 1 ranked recruiting class. The Hawkeyes won the 1995 Big Ten regular season title and consecutive Big Ten Tournament titles in 1995 and 1996.

A four-year letterwinner at lowa, Willis earned bachelor's degrees in media studies and African-American studies in 1998. She played professionally for Color Cap Tybnik of Poland and Tapiola Honka of Finland in 1999, and Brazil's Santa Maria Club in 2000.

In 2011, Willis was inducted into the Ohio Basketball Hall of Fame and Museum. In addition, she was selected to attend the prestigious Villa 7 Consortium in 2013, which brings together university athletic directors and elite assistant basketball coaches in an effort to prepare the next generation of college basketball leaders.

Catherine Greene begins her fifth season as a member of the Georgia Tech women's basketball staff in 2016-17 and her fourth as Director of Basketball Operations.

Greene works closely with Joseph in overseeing all aspects of the program's day-to-day operations. Greene oversees the Yellow Jackets' team travel, promotional and fundraising efforts, community service initiatives and community relations. During her undergraduate career, Greene served as a manager for the Tar Heels' women's basketball team and was the head manager for three years. While she was with UNC, the Tar Heels won four ACC championships and advanced to the 2006 and 2007 Final Fours. As a graduate student, Greene was a graduate student assistant for the women's team for one season before serving as the graduate intern for the Dean E. Smith Center. Greene helped start and run several youth basketball clinics in North Carolina.

Greene was born in Gastonia, N.C., and played high school basketball with former Yellow Jacket Tiffany Blackmon.

Brock Berenato joined the Yellow Jackets' staff as the director of video and player personnel prior to the 2015 season. Berenato, who is distantly related to former head coach Agnus Berenato, comes to the Flats from VCU where he was hired as the video coordinator for women's basketball in June 2015.

He was no stranger to the Rams after serving as the graduate manager from during the 2014-15 season, where he assisted with film. Berenato received a M. Ed. Degree in sport leadership in 2015 from VCU. He was awarded the Center for Sport Leadership at VCU "Student of the Year" which honors one full-time student who demonstrated enthusiastic commitment, leadership qualities, and academic excellence.

Berenato attended Bradley University in Peoria, III., and graduated with a B.A. in sports communication in 2014. Berenato was also involved with women's basketball as an undergrad, assisting the team as an undergraduate manager from 2012-14. He was a seven time Dean's list member at Bradley.

Georgia Tech's former standout point guard Metra Walthour was named the assistant director of women's basketball operations on May 29, 2015
Walthour is no stranger to the Georgia Tech program, having played for Georgia Tech from 2008-2012 and she was Tech's graduate student manager from 2013-15.
Walthour finished her Georgia Tech career in 2012 after helping the Jackets to four 20 -win seasons and four NCAA Tournament appearances, including Georgia Tech's first Sweet 16 trip in 2012. The Hinesville, Ga., native finished her illustrious career as part of the winningest class in Tech history as she was a part of 95 Yellow Jacket victories
Wathour finished her career ranked in the top 10 of several Georgia Tech career lists. She ranked fifth in career assists (398), third in games played (128), seventh in 3-point field goals made (125), seventh in 3-point field goals attempted (389), 10th in assist average $(3,0)$ and fifth in minutes played $(3,532)$.
As a senior, Walthour played an integral role as Tech broke several records. The Yellow Jackets finished the 2012 season with a school-record 26 wins, a programbest 12 ACC victories, a school-high tie for third place in the ACC regular season and a school-record 10 road wins. Tech reached only the second ACC championship game in program history, earned its highest seed in the NCAA Tournament, 4, advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time and finished ranked No. 10 in the coaches' poll.

Following her stellar career for the Jackets, Wathour graduated with a degree in Science, Technology and Culture in May of 2012 and went on to be the WBCA's "So You Want to be a Coach" intern for the 2013-14 year.

In 2014, Waltour returned to the Flats as a graduate manager for the Jackets. As a graduate manager, Watthour had a variety of responsibilities including coordinating team meals, helping to organize the team's student managers, overseeing the recruiting mailing system, assisting with live game breakdown of film and aiding in community service initiatives.

# TODD STANSBURY 

## ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

GEORGIA TECH, 1984
FIRST YEAR AT GEORGIA TECH

Georgia Institute of Technology introduced former Tech football player Todd Stansbury as the Institute's ninth director of athletics on Sept. 22, 2016.

Stansbury has served as Oregon State's athletic director since June 2015 following a nine-year stint as the university's executive associate athletic director from 2003-2012. During his time at Oregon State, Stansbury was part of a senior management team that raised $\$ 150$ million for a football stadium expansion, in addition to fundraising for the construction of a sports performing center. He also was part of a team that established several career development initiatives for student-athletes.
"Todd Stansbury is committed to athletes' success both on and off the field," Peterson said. "His global perspective and leadership experience in athletics and development, combined with a lifelong passion for Georgia Tech, make him the ideal candidate. I believe this is one of those rare golden moments in life where opportunity meets ambition. We welcome him home."

Stansbury's resume also includes roles as athletic director at the University of Central Florida (2012-2015) and East Tennessee State University (2000-2003). He was Georgia Tech's assistant athletic director for academics from 1988-1995 under Homer Rice. Now he returns to campus to guide a department that features 15 teams in 17 NCAA Division I varsity sports.
"I am honored and humbled to have the opportunity to return to Georgia Tech, a place that has played such a large role in my life and the place responsible for opening up a world to me that I didn't even know existed," Stansbury said. "I am thankful to President Peterson and the selection committee for providing me this opportunity."

Stansbury grew up in Canada. When he was 10 years old and on vacation with his family in Florida, he befriended several Georgia Tech football players staying at the same hotel. During the drive back home to Ontario, his family stopped on campus to see a practice. That's when Stansbury knew he wanted to play football on The Flats. He earned varsity letters while at Georgia Tech from 1980-1984 as a middle linebacker and on special teams for head coach Bill Curry. He was a third-round draft pick of the Canadian Football League's Saskatchewan Roughriders in 1984.

As the ninth director of athletics in Georgia Tech history, he follows in the footsteps of storied names such as Rice, John Heisman and Bobby Dodd. He was hired following a national search that began in August 2016 when Mike Bobinski accepted the athletics director position at Purdue University. A nine-member search committee led by Georgia Tech Foundation President AI Trujillo identified candidates. The search process was assisted by Turnkey Search.
"I want to thank Al and the search committee for their outstanding guidance in evaluating candidates," Peterson said. "IIm also personally grateful for the leadership and (interim A.D.) Paul (Grifin), who interrupted his retirement to return to campus to lead our Athletics Association. He will continue to be a great asset during the transition period for the remainder of 2016."

Georgia Tech has achieved a school-record Graduation Success Rate (84 percent according to the most recent NCAA figures from November 2015) in each of the past three years. The Institute also recorded outstanding scores in the Academic Progress Rate (APR), which provides a real-time NCAA metric to measure the success of institutions in moving student-athletes toward graduation. The latest APR statistics, released in April, reported that 13 of Georgia Tech's 15 teams scored 980 or better out of a possible 1,000 points.


# JOELEEN AKIN

$\mathbf{J}_{0}$ oeeen Akin, a former Georgia Tech athletics staff member with more than 20 years of experience in college athletics, returned to Georgia Tech in August 2016 as associate athletics director for student-athlete development and senior woman administrator.

Akin rejoins the Georgia Tech athletics administration after 13 years at nearby Agnes Scott College. She served as Agnes Scott's athletics director and physical education chair for 12 years (2003-15) before being promoted to associate dean for athletics and student activities in February 2015.

Prior to her 13-year tenure at Agnes Scott, she spent seven years at Georgia Tech as director of women's basketball operations (1996-98), marketing/operations manager (1998-99) and director of marketing (1999-2003).

During her 12 years as athletics director at Agnes Scott, an NCAA Division III institution in Decatur, Ga., Akin oversaw a program that produced eight NCAA Tournament teams and a coaching staff that earned 12 different coach-of-the-year recognitions. Under her direction, Agnes Scott student-athletes maintained a 3.0 cumulative grade point average and participated extensively in on- and off-campus service projects.

Akin's tenure at Agnes Scott was marked by innovation and vision. She created and implemented numerous student-athlete development and engagement initiatives at ASC, including a new student-athlete orientation program, Safe Zone training for studentathletes, coaches and staff and coordination of campus-wide academic resources for student-athletes.

Administratively, she developed a unique revenue-generation model that resulted in a 200-percent increase in the school's athletics budget and partnered with a national franchise Snap Fitness to bring a state-of-the-art fitness facility to campus at no cost to the college. She also coordinated with the school's communications department to create the now-trademarked tagline "Smart Women Sweat" to promote the Scotties' athletics programs.

In addition to her duties as athletics director and physical education chair, Akin was Agnes Scott's women's basketball coach from 2003-07 and was named the Great South Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 2006. She also served as commissioner of the Great South Athletic Conference from 2011-16 and was a member of the NCAA Division III women's basketball committee and NCAA volleyball regional advisory committee from 2014-16.

Prior to her arrival at Georgia Tech in 1996, Akin also served as a sports marketing assistant at Auburn and NC State and as a member of the women's basketball staffs at UNC Wilmington and Kansas State.
A Kansas native, Akin earned bachelor's (1991) and master's (1993) degrees from Kansas State.

She and her husband, Charles, have two children: Bobbie and Ryan.

## G.P. "BUD" PETERSON  <br> KANSAS STATE, 1975

G. P. "Bud" Peterson was appointed as the 11th president of Georgia Tech on April 1, 2009. Prior to his appointment, he served as chancellor at the University of Colorado at Boulder (2006-2009), provost at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York (2000-2006), and program director at the National Science Foundation for the Thermal Transport and Thermal Processing Program (1993-1994). He has held various positions at Texas A\&M University, beginning in 1981 as an assistant professor of engineering technology and Halliburton Professor of Mechanical Engineering (1990), the College of Engineering's Tenneco Professor, head of the Department of Mechanical Engineering (1993-1996), executive associate dean of engineering (1996-2000), and associate vice chancellor for engineering for the Texas A\&M University System (1996-2000). Prior to his service at Texas A\&M, he was a visiting research scientist at NASA-Johnson Space Center in Houston, Texas (1981-1982), associate professor and head of the General Engineering Technology Department at Kansas Technical Institute in Salina, Kan. (19791981), and taught mathematics, physics and chemistry at Shawnee Mission South High School in Overland Park, Kan. (1978-1979), and Wabaunsee County High School in Alma, Kan. (1977-1978).

Throughout his career, Peterson has played an active role in helping to establish the national education and research agendas, serving on numerous industry, government, and academic task forces and committees. He has served as a member of a number of congressional task forces, research councils, and advisory boards, including the Office of Naval Research (ONR), the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), the Department of Energy (DOE), the National Research Council (NRC), and the National Academy of Engineering (NAE). In addition, he has served as a member of the Board of Directors and vice president for education for the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA) and is currently serving as a member of the National Science Board (NSB), co-chair of the Government Relations Committee of the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU), as a member of the U.S. Council on Competitiveness, and was recently appointed by Secretary Gary Locke as a member of the National Advisory Council on Innovation and Entrepreneurship (NACIE).

As chancellor of the University of Colorado, Peterson led the development of a new university wide strategic plan, Flagship 2030, which defined a vision for the university for the next 20 years. In his nearly three years as chancellor, freshman applications increased by 35 percent, the number of under-represented minorities in the freshmen class increased by 38 percent, sponsored research increased by more than 18 percent, and private philanthropy for the university increased by nearly 80 percent.

As provost at Rensselaer, he played a key role in the institutional transformation and the dramatic improvement in the quality, size, and diversity of the faculty - overseeing the hiring of nearly 40 percent of the faculty, increasing the total number of tenured and tenure-track faculty by 20 percent, and improving the diversity of the tenured/tenure-track faculty by more than doubling the number of under-represented minorities and increasing the number of women by 40 percent. In addition, during his tenure as provost, the quality, size, and diversity of the student body increased, with the number of full--ime PhD students increasing by $25 \%$.

Peterson's research interests have focused on the fundamental aspects of phase change heat transfer, including the heat transfer in reduced gravity environments, boiling from enhanced surfaces, and some of the earliest work in the area of flow and phase change heat transfer in microchannels. Early investigations focused on applications involving the thermal control of manned and unmanned spacecraft and progressed through applications of phase change heat transfer to the thermal control of electronic components and devices. More recently, investigations have included fundamental applications of phase change heat transfer to the field of biotechnology, including the insitu treatment of cancerous tissue using hypo and hyperthermia to arrest epileptic seizures through the rapid cooling of localized brain tissue, which required highly efficient heat dissipation devices capable of dissipating thermal energy to surrounding tissue. A Fellow of both the American Society of Mechanical Engineers and the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics, Peterson is the author or co-author of 14 books or book chapters, 180 refereed journal articles, more than 150 conference publications, and holds eight patents with two others pending. He is a member of several professional organizations and the recipient of numerous national and international honors and awards for both teaching and research.


# REGINALD DesROCHES 

FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE
CALIFORNIA, 1990

Reginald DesRoches is the Karen and John Huff School Chair and Professor of Civil and Environmental Engineering at the Georgia Institute of Technology. DesRoches took over as FAR on July 1, 2014, after Professor Sue Ann Bidstrip stepped down following a five-year stint as FAR.
As Chair of the School of Civil \& Environmental Engineering, he provides leadership to a top-ranked program with 100 faculty and staff and 1,100 students. His primary research interests are in design of resilient infrastructure systems under extreme loads. He has published more than 300 articles in the general area of resilience and seismic risk assessment, and he has given more than 100 presentations in over 35 different countries.

A fellow of the American Society of Civil Engineers and the society's Structural Engineering Institute, Dr. DesRoches has served as the key technical leader in the United States' response to the Haiti earthquake and led a team of 28 engineers, architects, city planners, and social scientists to study the impact of the earthquake. He has also participated in numerous congressional briefings to underscore the critical role that university research must play in addressing the country's infrastructure crisis and resilience to natural hazards. Dr. DesRoches has served as thesis advisor to 29 Doctoral and 17 Master's thesis students.

Dr. DesRoches serves on the National Academy of Sciences Resilience Roundtable and the Academy's Board on Army Science and Technology as well as on the National Science Foundation's Advisory Committee for Engineering, the Global Earthquake Modeling Scientific Board, and the advisory board for the Natural Disasters, Coastal Infrastructure and Emergency Management Research Center. He has chaired the American Society of Civil Engineers' Seismic Effects Committee as well as the executive committee of the Technical Council on Lifeline Earthquake Engineering.

In recent years, Dr. DesRoches has testified before U.S. House and Senate subcommittees on earthquake resilience and science and participated in Washington, D.C., roundtables on topics ranging from disaster preparedness to challenges for African-American men in STEM fields. National media outlets frequently contact him for expert analysis following earthquake events, including CNN, CNN International, LiveScience, National Geographic, and Asia Times online. He also is frequently called on as a champion of the critical role that university research must play in addressing the country's infrastructure crisis and resilience to natural hazards.

Dr. DesRoches has received the Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers (PECASE) in 2002 - the highest honor bestowed upon scientists and engineers in the early stages of their careers. Most recently, he was a recipient of the 2007 ASCE Walter L. Huber Civil Engineering Research Prize, the 2015 ASCE Charles Martin Duke Lifeline Earthquake Engineering Award, the Georgia Tech Outstanding Doctoral Thesis Advisor Award (2010), and the Georgia Tech ANAK Award (2008). The ANAK award is the highest honor the undergraduate student body can bestow on a Georgia Tech faculty member.

DesRoches was born in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, and grew up in Queens, New York. He earned his Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering, Master of Science in Civil Engineering, and Ph.D. in Structural Engineering at the University of California, Berkeley, where he was recently elected to the civil engineering department's Academy of Distinguished Alumni.

## ACC Tournament Fact

Georgia Tech became the lowest seeded team in ACC
Tournament history to qualify for the championship game in 1992 when the seventh-seeded Jackets scored a pair of one-point victories over nationally-ranked Maryland and Clemson to reach the final. Tech topped the second-seeded and fourthranked Terrapins, 68-67, in the first round and edged the thirdseeded and 18th-ranked Tigers, 74-73, in the semifinals. In the championship game, Tech battled top-seeded and top-ranked Virginia tough, before falling by a one-point margin, 70-69.

In the first postseason appearance in school history, Georgia Tech's women's basketball team captured the 1992 National Women's Invitational Tournament in Amarillo, Texas. En route to the title, the Jackets defeated Wisconsin-Green Bay, 78-77, in the first round, Nebraska, 73-68, in the semifinals, and Hawaii, 9072, in the championship game. The 1992 NWIT not only marked Tech's first postseason appearance, but it also marked the first NWIT title for an ACC school. In 1998, the NWIT switched names to the WNIT.
