Earned a crucial win over Erica Susi in Georgia Tech's 4-3 victory at No. 12 Virginia ... Did not compete after the April 27 match against No. 2 North Carolina, the team's last regular-season match ... Paired in doubles with Megan Kurey, Alexis Prokopuik and Natasha Prokhnevska. **Fall -** Finished the fall season with a 5-4 singles record and went 3-3 in doubles, playing alongside Megan Kurey and Alexis Prokopuik ... Picked up two singles wins in the Miami Fall Invite and advanced to the round of 34 at the USTA/ITA Southeast Regionals .. Also won two singles matches at the Roberta Alison Fall Invite in doubles with Prokopuik.

2016 (Sophomore): Spring - Had a 19-8 singles record and a 21-5 doubles record during the spring ... Along with partner Kendal Woodard, won 15 doubles matches in a row and peaked at No. 10 after entering the spring ranked 35th ... Reached the Round of 32 at the NCAA singles competition, defeating No. 20 Andie Dikosavljevic of Auburn by a score of 6-2, 6-0 in the first round ... Finished the season ranked 38th in the ITA singles rankings after being unranked in the Jan. 5 rankings Ended the season ranked 13th in doubles along with Kendal Woodard. Fall - In the fall tournament season, went 3-5 in singles and 4-4 in doubles ... Was tabbed as the number seven doubles team in the ITA preseason rankings alongside Kendal Woodard and picked as the #35 singles player ... Was selected to the main draw of the Riviera/ ITA All-American Tournament in doubles with Woodard as the No. 6 seed and was selected to the gualifying singles draw ... The doubles pair advanced to the guarterfinals after winning their round of 32 match but lost to the over No. 2 seed in the guarterfinals ... Went 1-2 in singles at All-Americans after falling in the qualifying singles draw and winning and losing a match in the qualifying back draw ... Also advanced to the main draw round of 34 in the UTA/ITA Southeast Regionals in singles and the main draw quarterfinals in doubles.

2015 (Freshman): Spring - Recorded a 25-12 overall singles record and a 25-7 overall doubles record in her first season ... Her 25 wins in both singles and doubles were team-bests ... In dual match season, went 18-2 in doubles and 16-7 in singles ... Earned at-large bids to the NCAA Singles Championship and NCAA Doubles Championship alongside Kendal Woodard ... Finished the season ranked at #52 in singles and #24 in doubles in the ITA Rankings ... Appeared in the singles rankings every week since the first week of the season, with #48 being her career-best ranking (May 1) ... Was named to the All-ACC Second Team ... Played mostly at the number two singles spot, going 14-5, and played on court one for four matches, going 2-2 ... Won a team-high six matches against ranked opponents, including #25 Erin Routliffe from Alabama and #38 Ester Goldfeld from Duke ... Clinched five matches for the Jackets, including a 4-3 upset of #3-seed Duke in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament ... Fell in her first round match at the NCAA Singles Championship to the overall-two seed Carol Zhao of Stanford ... Played alongside Kendal Woodard in doubles, going 16-4 in the spring and recording an 8-1 record in conference play ... During dual match play, went 16-2 ... The tandem defeated six ranked doubles teams... Doubles team was featured in the ITA rankings every week after debuting on Feb. 24, reaching a season-best ranking of #13 on April 14 ... The duo fell to #5 Zsofi Susanyi and Klara Favikova of California in the round of 32 of the NCAA Doubles Championship ... Fall -Recorded a 7-3 singles record and went 6-2 in doubles besides Rasheeda McAdoo during the fall tournament season ... Advanced to the main draw singles semifinals at the Bulldog Classic, registering three wins at Georgia ... SMU, 1983 FIFTH SEASON AT GEORGIA TECH

Georgia Tech hired Rodney Harmon July 3, 2012, as the seventh head women's tennis coach in school history.

Harmon has gone 65-39 over the past four seasons as the head coach of the Yellow Jackets. Last season, Harmon took the Yellow Jackets to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament as Tech made its 16th appearance in the NCAAs. The Jackets upended Princeton and South Carolina in the regionals to advance to the Round of 16 in Tulsa, Okla. where they dropped a 4-2 decision to Ohio State. Tech finished the season 19-9 overall and 11-3 in ACC play to earn the No. 3 seed in the ACC Tournament. Harmon was named the ACC Coach of the Year in 2016, marking the second Tech coach in program history to earn the honor. Additionally, Harmon tutored Johnnise Renaud to a First Team All-ACC honor and Paige Hourigan to Third Team All-ACC.

During his third season on the Flats, Harmon led his team to a 17-10 overall record and a 9-5 mark in ACC play. The Yellow Jackets made their 16th consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the second round, and finished the season ranked #20 in the ITA Rankings. During the ACC Tournament, the Jackets advanced to their fifth ACC Championship Title Match before falling to Virginia. Georgia Tech finished the ACC season in sixth and both freshmen Johnnise Renaud and Paige Hourigan were named to the AII-ACC Second Team.

Harmon's second season at the helm of the Yellow Jackets started off with a bang after sophomores Megan Kurey and Kendal Woodard won the USTA/ITA National Indoor Intercollegiate Championships doubles title. The duo also captured the USTA/ITA Southeast Regional Doubles title during the fall. Kurey and Woodard were ranked as the number one doubles team in the country on February 11, 2014 and received the #6 seed in the 2014 NCAA doubles championships. Woodard garnered conference honors for the second season in a row after being named to the All-ACC First Team while Kurey was named to the All-ACC Second Team.

The Yellow Jackets went 14-10 overall and 9-5 in the ACC during Harmon's second year at the helm of the Jackets. Tech closed out the 2014 regular season with an exciting 4-3 win against No. 1 Duke. The win against the top-ranked team in the country was the first of Harmon's career and fourth in the history of the Yellow Jackets. The Jackets received the six seed in the 2014 ACC Tournament and advanced to the quarter finals before falling to Virginia.

In 2014, Tech received its 15th straight berth in the NCAA Tournament. The Yellow Jackets defeated Purdue in the first round, 4-0, before falling to overall nine seed Vanderbilt, 4-2, in the second round.

Harmon had quite the successful first season on the Flats, leading his team to a 15-10 record and a 7-4 mark in the ACC. The Jackets reached its highest ranking of the season in the ITA rankings at #19 during the week of April 9th. Tech defeated nine ranked teams, including four that were ranked in the top-25.

Freshman Kendal Woodard was honored on the 2013 All-ACC Women's Tennis Team while Elizabeth Kilborn, Megan Kurey and Elizabeth Kurey were all named to the All-ACC Academic team during Harmon's first year.

Harmon brings 25 years of player development to the Yellow Jackets with prior experience in both junior and college tennis. Most recently he served as the director of tennis at the Deerwood Country Club in Jacksonville, Fla.

"We are very excited to announce Rodney Harmon as the head women's tennis coach," former Director of Athletics Dan Radakovich said. "I am confident those who support Georgia Tech will agree Rodney is the ideal candidate for this position. Rodney joins us with a wealth of tennis knowledge, a commitment to academics and he is a family man with strong integrity. The future is exciting for Georgia Tech women's tennis."

Harmon was the men's tennis head coach at the University of Miami from 1995 until 1997 where he brought in the No. 1 recruiting class in 1996, led by No. 1 recruit Michael Russell. Harmon was the 1996 and 1997 Big East Conference Coach of the Year during his time with the Hurricanes.

"I am extremely excited to join the Georgia Tech staff," Harmon said. "Georgia Tech is

an outstanding institution with its strong academic profile and rich athletic tradition. The Yellow Jackets have a history of great teams, especially the 2007 team which won the national title. My goal is to continue to build on the ground work Bryan Shelton built and for our team to excel both in the classroom and on the court.

"I want to thank Dan Radakovich and Theresa Wenzel for the opportunity to join Georgia Tech," Harmon added. "This is one of the best jobs in the country. With the addition of the Ken Byers Tennis Complex and the support of the administration and the fans, we will continue to have a team to be proud of."

The Ken Byers Tennis Complex will have six state-of-the-art indoor courts, replacing the three indoor courts in the old facility. The indoor facility will be located on 10th Street, will house men's and women's coaches' offices, men's and women's locker rooms and a team lounge. Six competition courts will go in near Griffin Track and four practice courts will be constructed between the indoor facility and the competition courts.

Harmon left the Hurricanes to re-join the United States Tennis Association training center headquarters in Boca Raton, Fla., where he advanced to director of men's tennis. During his tenure at the USTA, Harmon served as the head coach of the U.S. men's tennis team at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China.

Before joining Miami, Harmon spent four years as the USTA national coach where he coached future pros including Todd Martin, MaliVai Washington and Alex O'Brien. During his first stint with the USTA, Harmon served as the U.S. men's tennis head coach at the 1993 World University Games in Buffalo, N.Y.

Harmon began his collegiate career at the University of Tennessee before transferring to Southern Methodist University where he graduated from with a Bachelor of Arts in Broadcast/Film in May, 1983. He was the 1980 NCAA Doubles champion at Tennessee with Mel Purcell and advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA Singles Championship. Harmon and Purcell were the 1980 ITA Doubles Team of the Year and Harmon won the SEC No. 2 singles title.

After transferring to SMU, Harmon won the 1982 and 1983 Southwest Conference No. 1 singles title. He was inducted into the ITA Collegiate Tennis Hall of Fame in 2010.

While still a student-athlete at SMU, Harmon advanced to the quarterfinals at the 1982 U.S. Open with a win over 1980 Australian Open Champion Brian Teacher before falling to eventual champion Jimmy Connors. Following his successful collegiate career, Harmon played professionally where he reached a career-high ranking of No. 56 and made the third round at Wimbledon in 1983.

GEORGIA TECH, 2009 THIRD SEASON AT GEORGIA TECH

Former Yellow Jacket standout Christy Lynch begins her third season as the assistant women's tennis coach in 2016-17.

In her second season, Tech posted a 19-9 overall record to go along with an 11-3 ACC mark that earned the Yellow Jackets the No. 3 seed in the ACC Tournament. The Jackets fell in the ACC Semifinals to Miami, but rebounded in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Round of 16. In the NCAA Regionals, Tech defeated Princeton and South Carolina to head to Tulsa, Okla. and face Ohio State, eventually falling 4-2.

During her first season, the Yellow Jackets went 17-10 overall record and had a 9-5 mark in ACC play. The Yellow Jackets made their 16th consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the second round, and finished the season ranked #20 in the ITA Rankings. During the ACC Tournament, the Jackets advanced to their fifth ACC Championship Title Match before falling to Virginia.

Lynch, whose maiden name is Striplin, played for the Yellow Jackets from 2005-09 and was a part of one of the most memorable Georgia Tech teams in the history of the program. During her time on the court for the Jackets, Tech won the 2007 NCAA National Championship, four ACC titles and two team National Indoor titles. Lynch helped the Yellow Jackets win the 2007 National Championship by winning all six of her singles matches in the NCAA Championship.

Lynch's name can be seen throughout the Georgia Tech record book. The Birmingham, Alabama native's 117 career singles matches is second all-time at Georgia Tech and her 68 doubles victories ranks 11th on the career list. Lynch recorded 35 singles wins on the way to the 2007 National Championship, which is the sixth-highest seasonal mark in Tech history. As a senior in 2008-09, she aided the Yellow Jackets' fifth straight NCAA round of 16 appearance, and finished off the year with a 30-14 singles record along with a No. 42 national ranking.

Lynch graduated from Georgia Tech in 2009 with a bachelor's degree in management. Following graduation, Lynch competed as a professional on the Women's Tennis Association (WTA) Tour for a year. Lynch returned to the Flats in 2012, serving as a volunteer assistant coach during Harmon's first season at the helm of the Jackets. Lynch was then hired as the assistant coach of the Emory women's tennis team in August 2013.

During the 2013-14 season, the Emory Eagles won the 2014 NCAA Division III Championship while setting a school record for wins in a year with a 28-2 record. Lynch helped coach the NCAA D-III National Singles Champion, three Division III ITA All-Americans, the ITA Division III Atlantic South Regional Player of the Year, the ITA Division III Senior Player of the Year and the UAA MVP and Rookie of the Year. Both Lynch and Emory head coach Amy Bryant were named the UAA Coaching Staff of the Year. Seven Eagles were also named to the All-UAA First Team this past season.

ATHLETICS DIRECTOR GEORGIA TECH, 1984 FIRST YEAR AT GEORGIA TECH

Georgia Institute of Technology introduced former Tech football player Todd Stansbury as the Institute's ninth director of athletics on Sept. 22, 2016.

Stansbury has served as Oregon State's athletic director since June 2015 following a nine-year stint as the university's executive associate athletic director from 2003-2012. During his time at Oregon State, Stansbury was part of a senior management team that raised \$150 million for a football stadium expansion, in addition to fundraising for the construction of a sports performing center. He also was part of a team that established several career development initiatives for student-athletes.

"Todd Stansbury is committed to athletes' success both on and off the field," Peterson said. "His global perspective and leadership experience in athletics and development, combined with a lifelong passion for Georgia Tech, make him the ideal candidate. I believe this is one of those rare golden moments in life where opportunity meets ambition. We welcome him home."

Stansbury's resume also includes roles as athletic director at the University of Central Florida (2012-2015) and East Tennessee State University (2000-2003). He was Georgia Tech's assistant athletic director for academics from 1988-1995 under Homer Rice. Now he returns to campus to guide a department that features 15 teams in 17 NCAA Division I varsity sports.

"I am honored and humbled to have the opportunity to return to Georgia Tech, a place that has played such a large role in my life and the place responsible for opening up a world to me that I didn't even know existed," Stansbury said. "I am thankful to President Peterson and the selection committee for providing me this opportunity."

Stansbury grew up in Canada. When he was 10 years old and on vacation with his family in Florida, he befriended several Georgia Tech football players staying at the same hotel. During the drive back home to Ontario, his family stopped on campus to see a practice. That's when Stansbury knew he wanted to play football on The Flats. He earned varsity letters while at Georgia Tech from 1980-1984 as a middle linebacker and on special teams for head coach Bill Curry. He was a third-round draft pick of the Canadian Football League's Saskatchewan Roughriders in 1984.

As the ninth director of athletics in Georgia Tech history, he follows in the footsteps of storied names such as Rice, John Heisman and Bobby Dodd. He was hired following a national search that began in August 2016 when Mike Bobinski accepted the athletics director position at Purdue University. A nine-member search committee led by Georgia Tech Foundation President AI Trujillo identified candidates. The search process was assisted by Turnkey Search.

"I want to thank AI and the search committee for their outstanding guidance in evaluating candidates," Peterson said. "I'm also personally grateful for the leadership and (interim A.D.) Paul (Griffin), who interrupted his retirement to return to campus to lead our Athletics Association. He will continue to be a great asset during the transition period for the remainder of 2016."

Georgia Tech has achieved a school-record Graduation Success Rate (84 percent according to the most recent NCAA figures from November 2015) in each of the past three years. The Institute also recorded outstanding scores in the Academic Progress Rate (APR), which provides a real-time NCAA metric to measure the success of institutions in moving student-athletes toward graduation. The latest APR statistics, released in April, reported that 13 of Georgia Tech's 15 teams scored 980 or better out of a possible 1,000 points.



JOELEEN AKIN ASSOCIATE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR/SENIOR WOMEN'S ADMINISTRATOR KANSAS STATE, 1991

FIRST YEAR AT GEORGIA TECH

Joeleen Akin, a former Georgia Tech athletics staff member with more than 20 years of experience in college athletics, returned to Georgia Tech in August 2016 as associate athletics director for student-athlete development and senior woman administrator.

Akin rejoins the Georgia Tech athletics administration after 13 years at nearby Agnes Scott College. She served as Agnes Scott's athletics director and physical education chair for 12 years (2003-15) before being promoted to associate dean for athletics and student activities in February 2015.

Prior to her 13-year tenure at Agnes Scott, she spent seven years at Georgia Tech as director of women's basketball operations (1996-98), marketing/operations manager (1998-99) and director of marketing (1999-2003).

During her 12 years as athletics director at Agnes Scott, an NCAA Division III institution in Decatur, Ga., Akin oversaw a program that produced eight NCAA Tournament teams and a coaching staff that earned 12 different coach-of-the-year recognitions. Under her direction, Agnes Scott student-athletes maintained a 3.0 cumulative grade point average and participated extensively in on- and off-campus service projects.

Akin's tenure at Agnes Scott was marked by innovation and vision. She created and implemented numerous student-athlete development and engagement initiatives at ASC, including a new student-athlete orientation program, Safe Zone training for student-athletes, coaches and staff and coordination of campus-wide academic resources for student-athletes.

Administratively, she developed a unique revenue-generation model that resulted in a 200-percent increase in the school's athletics budget and partnered with a national franchise Snap Fitness to bring a state-of-the-art fitness facility to campus at no cost to the college. She also coordinated with the school's communications department to create the now-trademarked tagline "Smart Women Sweat" to promote the Scotties' athletics programs.

In addition to her duties as athletics director and physical education chair, Akin was Agnes Scott's women's basketball coach from 2003-07 and was named the Great South Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 2006. She also served as commissioner of the Great South Athletic Conference from 2011-16 and was a member of the NCAA Division III women's basketball committee and NCAA volleyball regional advisory committee from 2014-16.

Prior to her arrival at Georgia Tech in 1996, Akin also served as a sports marketing assistant at Auburn and NC State and as a member of the women's basketball staffs at UNC Wilmington and Kansas State.

A Kansas native, Akin earned bachelor's (1991) and master's (1993) degrees from Kansas State.

She and her husband, Charles, have two children: Bobbie and Ryan.

G.P. "Bud" Peterson was appointed as the 11th president of Georgia Tech on April 1, 2009. Prior to his appointment, he served as chancellor at the University of Colorado at Boulder (2006-2009), provost at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York (2000-2006), and program director at the National Science Foundation for the Thermal Transport and Thermal Processing Program (1993-1994). He has held various positions at Texas A&M University, beginning in 1981 as an assistant professor of engineering technology and Halliburton Professor of Mechanical Engineering (1990), the College of Engineering's Tenneco Professor, head of the Department of Mechanical Engineering (1993-1996), executive associate dean of engineering (1996-2000), and associate vice chancellor for engineering for the Texas A&M University System (1996-2000). Prior to his service at Texas A&M, he was a visiting research scientist at NASA-Johnson Space Center in Houston, Texas (1981-1982), associate professor and head of the General Engineering Technology Department at Kansas Technical Institute in Salina, Kan. (1979-1981), and taught mathematics, physics and chemistry at Shawnee Mission South High School in Overland Park, Kan. (1978-1979), and Wabaunsee County High School in Alma, Kan, (1977-1978),

Throughout his career, Peterson has played an active role in helping to establish the national education and research agendas, serving on numerous industry, government, and academic task forces and committees. He has served as a member of a number of congressional task forces, research councils, and advisory boards, including the Office of Naval Research (ONR), the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), the Department of Energy (DOE), the National Research Council (NRC), and the National Academy of Engineering (NAE). In addition, he has served as a member of the Board of Directors and vice president for education for the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA) and is currently serving as a member of the National Science Board (NSB), co-chair of the Government Relations Committee of the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU), as a member of the U.S. Council on Competitiveness, and was recently appointed by Secretary Gary Locke as a member of the National Advisory Council on Innovation and Entrepreneurship (NACIE).

As chancellor of the University of Colorado, Peterson led the development of a new university wide strategic plan, Flagship 2030, which defined a vision for the university for the next 20 years. In his nearly three years as chancellor, freshman applications increased by 35 percent, the number of under-represented minorities in the freshmen class increased by 38 percent, sponsored research increased by more than 18 percent, and private philanthropy for the university increased by nearly 80 percent.

As provost at Rensselaer, he played a key role in the institutional transformation and the dramatic improvement in the quality, size, and diversity of the faculty – overseeing the hiring of nearly 40 percent of the faculty, increasing the total number of tenured and tenure-track faculty by 20 percent, and improving the diversity of the tenured/tenure-track faculty by more than doubling the number of under-represented minorities and increasing the number of women by 40 percent. In addition, during his tenure as provost, the quality, size, and diversity of the student body increased, with the number of full-time PhD students increasing by 25%.

Peterson's research interests have focused on the fundamental aspects of phase change heat transfer, including the heat transfer in reduced gravity environments, boiling from enhanced surfaces, and some of the earliest work in the area of flow and phase change heat transfer in microchannels. Early investigations focused on applications involving the thermal control of manned and unmanned spacecraft and progressed through applications of phase change heat transfer to the thermal control of electronic components and devices. More recently, investigations have included fundamental applications of phase change heat transfer to the field of biotechnology, including the insitu treatment of cancerous tissue using hypo and hyperthermia to arrest epileptic seizures through the rapid cooling of localized brain tissue, which required highly efficient heat dissipation devices capable of dissipating thermal energy to surrounding tissue.

A Fellow of both the American Society of Mechanical Engineers and the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics, Peterson is the author or co-author of 14 books or book chapters, 180 refereed journal articles, more than 150 conference publications, and holds eight patents with two others pending. He is a member of several professional organizations and the recipient of numerous national and international honors and awards for both teaching and research.



REGINALD DESROCHES

FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE CALIFORNIA, 1990

Reginald DesRoches is the Karen and John Huff School Chair and Professor of Civil and Environmental Engineering at the Georgia Institute of Technology. DesRoches took over as FAR on July 1, 2014, after Professor Sue Ann Bidstrip stepped down following a five-year stint as FAR.

As Chair of the School of Civil & Environmental Engineering, he provides leadership to a top-ranked program with 100 faculty and staff and 1,100 students. His primary research interests are in design of resilient infrastructure systems under extreme loads. He has published more than 300 articles in the general area of resilience and seismic risk assessment, and he has given more than 100 presentations in over 35 different countries.

A fellow of the American Society of Civil Engineers and the society's Structural Engineering Institute, Dr. DesRoches has served as the key technical leader in the United States' response to the Haiti earthquake and led a team of 28 engineers, architects, city planners, and social scientists to study the impact of the earthquake. He has also participated in numerous congressional briefings to underscore the critical role that university research must play in addressing the country's infrastructure crisis and resilience to natural hazards. Dr. DesRoches has served as thesis advisor to 29 Doctoral and 17 Master's thesis students.

Dr. DesRoches serves on the National Academy of Sciences Resilience Roundtable and the Academy's Board on Army Science and Technology as well as on the National Science Foundation's Advisory Committee for Engineering, the Global Earthquake Modeling Scientific Board, and the advisory board for the Natural Disasters, Coastal Infrastructure and Emergency Management Research Center. He has chaired the American Society of Civil Engineers' Seismic Effects Committee as well as the executive committee of the Technical Council on Lifeline Earthquake Engineering.

In recent years, Dr. DesRoches has testified before U.S. House and Senate subcommittees on earthquake resilience and science and participated in Washington, D.C., roundtables on topics ranging from disaster preparedness to challenges for African-American men in STEM fields. National media outlets frequently contact him for expert analysis following earthquake events, including CNN, CNN International, LiveScience, National Geographic, and Asia Times online. He also is frequently called on as a champion of the critical role that university research must play in addressing the country's infrastructure crisis and resilience to natural hazards.

Dr. DesRoches has received the Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers (PECASE) in 2002 — the highest honor bestowed upon scientists and engineers in the early stages of their careers. Most recently, he was a recipient of the 2007 ASCE Walter L. Huber Civil Engineering Research Prize, the 2015 ASCE Charles Martin Duke Lifeline Earthquake Engineering Award, the Georgia Tech Outstanding Doctoral Thesis Advisor Award (2010), and the Georgia Tech ANAK Award (2008). The ANAK award is the highest honor the undergraduate student body can bestow on a Georgia Tech faculty member.

DesRoches was born in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, and grew up in Queens, New York. He earned his Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering, Master of Science in Civil Engineering, and Ph.D. in Structural Engineering at the University of California, Berkeley, where he was recently elected to the civil engineering department's Academy of Distinguished Alumni.

GEORGIA TECH WINS NCAA WOMEN'S TENNIS TITLE

Jackets Defeat UCLA 4-2 in Championship Match

Athens, Ga. -- Kristi Miller, Amanda McDowell and Christy Striplin won singles matches and then senior Alison Silverio provided the clinching victory at No. 2 singles to give Georgia Tech a 4-2 victory over UCLA in the NCAA championship match Tuesday at Henry Feild Stadium. The championship is the first NCAA title in any sport for Georgia Tech, which has also won four national championships in football via wire service polls.

"I just couldn't be happier," said Tech head coach Bryan Shelton, whose team won its 21st straight match to finish the season at 29-4. "We fought our tails off. For Ali (Silverio) to come through in the clutch one more time for us in the final match of her career is just unbelievable."

Tech fell behind by losing the doubles point and then trailed 2-1 before Miller and Striplin put the Jackets back on top 3-2 with Silverio just beginning her third set. Tech trailed in the remaining match on court six when Silverio finished off 40th-ranked Tracy Lin with a dominating 6-1 win in the third. Silverio had won the first 7-5 but dropped the second, also 7-5. Silverio, who also clinched the Jackets' quarterfinal win over Fresno State, was named the Most Valuable Player of the NCAA Tournament.

McDowell earned Tech's first singles win with a 6-1, 6-0 blitzing of Ashley Joelson at No. 4 singles. The freshman from Atlanta won her 10th straight match and her team-leading 39th of the season. She was undefeated in the NCAA matches to earn a spot on the all-tournament team.

One day after clinching Tech's semifinal win over California, Striplin again provided a key victory as she rallied for a three-set win over Alex McGoodwin at No. 5 singles. After losing the first set, Striplin won 12 of the final 14 games for a 4-6, 6-1, 6-2 victory and was also named to the all-tournament team.

Miller, ranked sixth in the nation, defeated No. 15 Riza Zalameda at No. 1 singles, 6-3, 7-6.

UCLA dominated in doubles winning 8-3 at both No. 1 and No. 2, although the Jackets led on court three when doubles ended. Zalameda and Yasmin Schnack defeated Tech's third-raked duo of Miller and Whitney McCray, and Joelson and Goodwin downed Silverio and Amanda Craddock.

The Bruins earned a singles win from Schnack, who defeated Craddock at No. 3, and Lumpkin was leading for UCLA at No. 6.

CARY, N.C. - Tournament MVP Alison Silverio came back after dropping her first set to win at No. 4 singles and lift sixth-ranked Georgia Tech to a 4-3 victory over No. 12 Miami in the finals of the ACC Championship.

It marks the first ACC Championship in Georgia Tech tennis history.

"I think it's so hard to win an ACC title and it's hard enough to get into the finals, much less complete the task by winning the tournament," said head coach Bryan Shelton. "In 1988, we [the men's team] came so close, just one match away from winning. Kenny [Thome, head coach for Georgia Tech men's tennis] and I were out there in the end and couldn't quite get it done, so it has been a long time coming to have this opportunity again. It doesn't feel much different, being a coach or player, as it is just as satisfying to win now as a coach. The girls on the court are the ones that got it done though, they deserve all of the credit."

In the tournament, the Yellow Jackets went 11-4 in singles matches, including a perfect 3-0 mark by Silverio. She also teamed with Kristi Miller to clinch the doubles point against the Hurricanes earlier in the day.

The Yellow Jackets carried a 1-0 lead into singles play by earning wins at the No. 1 and 3 doubles positions. After the Hurricane duo of Megan Bradley and Staci Stevens defeated Lyndsay Shosho and Dasha Potapova, 8-5, at the No. 2 slot, the Yellow Jacket duo of Whitney McCray and Kelly Anderson downed Patricia Starzyk and Caren Seenauth, 8-5 at No. 3, setting up the top doubles slot for the clinching point.

No. 18 Miller and Silverio then stopped a comeback by Audrey Banada and Melissa Applebaum to clinch the doubles point for the Yellow Jackets with a 9-7 score at the No. 1 position.

Banada tied the match at 1-1 when she defeated Shosho, 6-1, 6-1, at the No. 5 singles position, and Miami took a 2-1 lead in the match when No. 99 Emily Mowery downed Tech's Kacie Anson, 6-2, 6-0, at the No. 6 position.

After Miami went up 3-1 with a 6-3, 6-4 win by the nation's top-ranked Bradley at No. 1 singles, the Yellow Jackets battled back with wins at the Nos. 2 and 3 positions.

At No. 2, Potapova battled the Hurricane's Stevens, winning 6-2, 7-5, and the Jackets' Anderson came back after winning a tiebreaker in the first set to defeat Apolebaum, 7-6 (6), 6-1.

Silverio then came back to win her second set 6-4 after dropping the first by a 5-7 mark and then breezed through the final set, 6-2 against Starzyk, to give the Yellow Jackets their first ACC Championship.

CARY, N.C. - With singles wins by Kelly Anderson, Kristi Miller and Christy Striplin, the 10th-ranked Georgia. Tech women's tennis team captured its second ACC Championship in as many years with a 4-1 victory over No. 9 Miami Sunday afternoon at the Cary Tennis Center in Cary, NC.

With the win, the Yellow Jackets tied their previous season-high with their 21st win, moving to 21-5 on the season, while Miami dropped to 19-6.

"Our goal from the first day of practice in the fall was to come back and win the ACC Championship," said Georgia Tech head coach Bryan Shelton. "The girls have kept that goal in front of them all year, and for them to come out and keep that against a great Miami team is just a credit to the heart and discipline that they show every day."

Tech improved to 5-3 against the Hurricanes, and are a perfect 5-0 against Miami since Shelton began coaching on the Flats in 2000. After earning the first ACC Tennis Championship in school history a year ago, the Jackets are now back-to-back champions for the first time in history.

The Jackets took a 1-0 lead in the match with quick victories at the Nos. 2 and 3 doubles slots. The Tech duo of Kacie Anson and Alison Silverio dropped Caren Seenauth and Patricia Starzyk, 8-3, on court three before Anderson and Whitney McCray captured the deciding point with an 8-4 victory over Monika Dancevic and Audrey Banada at the No. 2 position.

"I think that our team stepped up in so many spots today," said Shelton. "It started with our best doubles effort of the year, and it culminated with players stepping up in singles."

Anderson, ranked No. 111 in singles, gave the Jackets a 2-0 edge with a 6-0, 6-3 victory over Starzyk on court five before No. 83 Melissa Applebaum pulled the 'Canes within one point with a 6-2, 6-4 win over No. 60 Lyndsay Shosho at No. 2 singles.

ACC Tournament MVP Kristi Miller, the top-ranked singles player in the nation, then pushed the score to 3-0 with a hard-fought 6-4, 6-3 victory over the nation's No. 2 singles player, ACC Player of the Year Audra Cohen, before Striplin clinched the championship for the Jackets with a 6-1, 7-5 win against Seenauth at the No. 6 slot in the lineup. "Up and down the lineup, I saw quality tennis all day long," added Shelton, "and at the end of the day, we were

holding the trophy. I'm just really proud of this group of players."

CARY, N.C. - Christy Striplin won 12 of her last 13 games en route to a 2-6, 6-0, 6-1 victory at No. 5 singles to clinch match point as the fifth-ranked Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets (23-4) captured their third-straight ACC Women's Tennis Championship with a 4-1 win over No. 11 Miami in the title match Sunday afternoon at the Cary Tennis Complex. "It never gets old," said an elated Bryan Shelton, head coach of the three-time ACC Champion women's tennis

team.

For the third-straight day, the Yellow Jackets were led by freshman Amanda Craddock, who ended the tournament with a 3-0 record in singles and a 2-0 mark in doubles to earn MVP honors. Craddock posted a 6-3, 6-2 win over Miami's 50th-ranked Audrey Banada to tie the match at 1-1 after the Hurricanes won the doubles point to start the day.

"A.C. is well deserving (of MVP honors) after her play this weekend," said Shelton. "Not only did she win, but she won convincingly in all of her matches. She was the catalyst for this team all weekend, and the honor is just a tribute to what she's done all season. She has gotten better and better as the season has gone on."

Freshman Amanda McDowell gave the Yellow Jackets a 2-1 lead with a 6-1, 6-1 victory over Romy Farah at the No. 4 singles spot before Tech's eighth-ranked Kristi Miller stunned top-ranked Audra Cohen, 7-5, 6-2, at the top singles spot to push the score to 3-1. It was the second time in as many ACC Championship matches that Miller has bested Cohen.

"Kristi's win was huge," said Shelton. "Last year she got over the hump, beating Audra at ACC's, and she made shockwaves throughout the rankings. I think the same happened again today. She fell behind early (to Cohen), but got gritty and stuck in there. Once (Miller) got on top, she didn't relinquish the lead. I'm so proud of her effort, especially after losing doubles. She came back strong to lead this team to victory."

Miami began singles play with a 1-0 lead after winning at the Nos. 1 and 3 doubles positions. Banada and Gina Sabatino stopped the Yellow Jacket tandem of Tarryn Rudman and Kirsten Flower, 8-3, at the third doubles spot before Tech's 51st-ranked duo of Alison Silverio and Craddock handed Caren Seenauth and Farah an 8-6 loss at the second doubles position, setting up the top doubles line as the deciding match.

Miami's 33rd-ranked Cohen and Laura Vallverdu then outlasted Miller and Whitney McCray, the nation's thirdranked doubles team, 8-6, to give the Hurricanes the first point of the match.

CARY, N.C. - Sophomore Irina Falconi pulled off a dramatic three-set victory to clinch seventh-seeded Georgia Tech team's 4-3 win over top-seeded and No. 1 ranked North Carolina in the finals of the 2010 ACC Tournament at the Cary Tennis Center.

. The Yellow Jackets captured their fourth ACC Tournament title under head Bryan Shelton and first since 2007. "What an incredible weekend," Shelton said. "It is certainly one of the biggest highlights in our program's history.

It was a really special weekend to be able to see our players believe and execute the game plans. We fought through a lot of adversity this weekend physically but just remained so mentally tough."

Falconi, the tournament MVP, split the first two sets with No. 22 Sanaz Marand before winning the match in the third set, 6-1, 3-6, 6-4.

"That was one of the gutsiest performances that I have seen," said Shelton about Falconi. "For her to be able to steady herself and get to the net on two of the biggest points of the match to clinch it for us was incredible for us."

The Yellow Jackets opened the day by taking two of three doubles matches to open up an early 1-0 lead over the Tar Heels. After Elizabeth Kilborn and Viet Ha Ngo fell on court three, the Jackets tandem of Hillary Davis and Lynn Blau picked up their teammates with an 8-6 victory over Sophie Grabinski and Jelena Durisic. With the point on the line, Tech's No. 1 duo of Falconi and Sasha Krupina came through with an 8-5 win over Marand and Katrina Tsang.

North Carolina pulled even with the Jackets when Jelena Durisic upended Krupina, 6-3, 6-2, at No. 3 singles. The Tar Heels Shinann Featherston followed with a 6-0, 6-2 win over Davis at the sixth position in the lineup to open a 2-1 advantage on Tech.

Kilborn evened the score at 2-2 with a 6-2, 7-5 victory over Grabinski on court five but the Tar Heels would answer right back when No. 51 Tsang finished off Ngo, 6-2, 6-4 at No. 2 singles.

Down 3-2, the Jackets Lynn Blau came from behind to win a huge 1-6, 6-3, 6-3 win over Gina Suarez-Malaguti on court four.

The match came down to Falconi, the nation's top-ranked player, and she did not disappoint. Falconi captured her school-record 26th dual-match victory of the season and has now won 20 straight matches to lead Tech to the title.

"We could not have done this without everyone on the team contributing," Shelton said. "This was truly a team effort this weekend. We got a lift from everyone on the team and it led us to this win."

Kristi Miller became Georgia Tech's first women's tennis All-American when she earned All-American honors in singles as a freshman. The Marysville, Mich., native went on to become the most decorated student-athlete in school history, as she own's Tech's career marks in singles victories (152) and doubles wins (110). A six-time All-American (four-times singles, two-times doubles), Miller has also earned the prestigious Honda Award for Women's Tennis (2006) and is a four-time all-Atlantic Coast Conference honoree. Miller's accolades include being named the 2008 ACC Player of the Year, the ITA National Player to Watch and ACC Tournament MVP in 2006 and the ACC Rookie of the Year in 2005. Miller is a three-time CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American and finished her four-year degree with a perfect 4.0 grade point average at Georgia Tech.

LYNDSAY SHOSHO 2006 - DOUBLES



Lyndsay Shosho became the Yellow Jackets' second women's tennis All-American when she teamed with Kristi Miller to advance to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championships in her senior season (2006). The same year, Shosho set the then school record for singles wins in a season with 35 while breaking the mark for doubles victories at Tech. She currently stands fourth in Tech's record books with 83 career doubles wins and eight with 84 career singles wins. In addition to earning All-America honors, Shosho was twice named All-Atlantic Coast Conference and helped lead Tech to its first two Atlantic Coast Conference Championships.

WHITNEY MCCRAY 2007 - Doubles



Whitney McCray earned All-American accolades in doubles during the 2007 season when she teamed with Kristi Miller to earn the No. 3 seed in the NCAA Doubles Championships. The Yellow Jacket duo, which reached as high as No. 3 before finishing the season at No. 7 in the national rankings, were ranked in the top-10 for the last three months of the season. McCray ranks second all-time in the Yellow Jacket record books with 101 career doubles wins. She was part of all three ACC Championships and was a key member of Tech's NCAA Championship team in 2007.

AMANDA MCDOWELL 2008 - SINGLES



Amanda McDowell became the first Georgia Tech women's tennis player to win an individual national title when she captured the 2008 NCAA Singles Championship. Only the second Yellow Jacket to earn All-America accolades in singles, McDowell finished her sophomore season with a school record 45 singles wins. She was named the 2008 ITA National Player of the Year and was the 2008 Honda Award recipient for women's tennis.

IRINA FALCONIA 2009 - SINGLES 2010 - SINGLES



Irina Falconi became the fifth Yellow Jacket women to earn All-America honors and just the second freshman to be nationally recognized. Falconi won 30 matches including 18 over nationally-ranked players. She closed out her rookie campaign ranked No. 12 in the nation. In her sophomore, and final campaign on The Flats, by setting a school record for dual match wins, finishing 26-1. She posted a 40-3 overall singles mark, good for fourth all-time in the Tech annals. She posted a 30-3 mark against ranked foes and her .930 winning percentage is by far the best in school history. Falconi was the No. 1 seed in the 2010 NCAA Singles Tournament and advanced to the quarterfinals.

Jillian O'Neill became the sixth Jacket to earn All-America honors when she finished the season ranked No. 12 in the ITA rankings. The Montreal, Quebec, native finished the year with a team-best 30 singles wins and a 17-9 mark from the No. 1 spot in Tech's dual lineup. O'Neill claimed 16 wins over ranked foes. She advanced to the NCAA Singles Championship for the second time in 2012 and finished her two-year Tech career with a 54-29 singles record.
