2016-17 MEN'S TENNIS NOTES

Georgia Tech's men's tennis team competed in an NCAA regional for the second straight year and for the 16th time in program history, defeating UC Santa Barbara in the round of 64 before falling to host Southern California in the round of 32.

Team Update

Georgia Tech (16-8, 8-4 ACC) finished the spring No. 37 in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association rankings, and posted its best Atlantic Coast Conference record since 2011. The Yellow Jackets made the NCAA Championship for the second straight year, finishing the regular season in fifth place in the Atlantic Coast Conference standings. The Yellow Jackets posted a 11-1 record at home, with the only loss to No. 1 Virginia, and went 1-1 in the ACC Championship.

Singles Update

The Yellow Jackets were led at the top of their lineup by 6-foot-7 sophomore Christopher Eubanks (Atlanta, Ga.), who finished the spring No. 8 in the ITA singles rankings with an 21-2 dual match record and an 11-1 ACC mark. Named the ACC Player of the Year and an All-American, Eubanks' only losses came to players ranked No. 20 and No. 11, both in road matches. He also received a bid to the NCAA Singles Championship for the second consecutive year. Coming into the 2016-17 season, Eubanks ranked No. 5 in ITA preseason rankings.

Junior Carlos Benito (Madrid, Spain) won 10 of his last 17 matches playing at the No. 2 position, went 7-4 in ACC competition, and finished the spring ranked No. 115 nationally after entering the national singles rankings late in the regular season. Benito received a career-high ranking in the ITA preseason poll at No. 73. Head coach Kenny Thorne shuffled players at the other four positions during the spring, elevating junior Cole Fiegel (Alachua, Fla.) to the No. 3 position and sophomore Daniel Yun (Marietta, Ga.) to No. 4 during the post-season. The Jackets were strong at the fifth and sixth positions, where senior Nathan Rakitt (Marietta, Ga.) won 12 of his last 16 decisions and went 8-2 in ACC matches, and junior Michael Kay (Alpharetta, Ga.) moved into the bottom spot for the ACC Championship.

Doubles Update

Tech won the doubles point in 18 of 24 contests, including eight of the 12 ACC matches. The Yellow Jackets' No. 1 team for most of the spring was Casey and Michael Kay, who finished the spring ranked No. 45 nationally, knocking off a pair of top-15 teams from Florida State and Notre Dame, and went 8-10 in dual matches. The team of Benito and Eubanks began the spring No. 2 but moved up late in the year and went 16-3, with a season-high national ranking of No. 36 at the end, and the third team of Rakitt and freshman Andrew Li went 13-7. The tandem of Benito and Eubanks earned the No. 14 spot in the ITA preseason rankings entering the 2016-17 season. The pair went 1-1 in the fall season, topping No. 58 from Indiana in first round of the ITA All-American Championships before falling to No. 2 from California.

Cole Fiegel and Andrew Li teamed up together in the fall season to be named the doubles champions of the Bulldog Scramble, going 4-0 in the event.

Eubanks Named ACC Player of the Year

Christopher Eubanks was named the 2016 Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Tennis Player of the Year and headlined the 2016 All-ACC Team announced April 28. Tech junior Carlos Benito was chosen third-team All-ACC.

Eubanks was the first Yellow Jacket to be voted Player of the Year since Guillermo Gomez in 2011, and the fifth overall. He joins a list that also includes Bryan Shelton in 1985, Jens Skjoedt in 1990 and Benjamin Cassaigne in 1999.

A native of Atlanta, Georgia, the sophomore compiled a 34-7 record in singles, including an 11-1 mark in ACC

play, from his No. 1 singles position. Eubanks spent the entire spring in the top 15 of the ITA Singles Rankings all season, finishing at No. 8. An All-ACC second team selection in 2015, and defeated a dozen ranked opponents. In doubles, Eubanks paired with teammate Benito to compile a 16-3 record.

Tech's NCAA History

Georgia Tech has reached the NCAA Championship each of the last two years, falling in the opening round of the 2015 regional in Oxford, Miss., and reaching the round of 16 in Los Angeles in 2016.

Those were Tech's first bids since 2011, when the Yellow Jackets hosted a regional and advanced to the round of 16 by defeating Middle Tennessee State and Mississippi State. Tech then lost to No. 2 seed Southern California in Stanford, Calif. That is the only time Tech has made it out of a regional in the current format of the championship. Tech has made the NCAA Championship field 11 times under head coach Kenny Thorne and 15 times in program history. The Jackets' deepest run in the NCAAAs came in 1994, when Tech won three matches before being eliminated. Tech is 10-16 all-time in NCAA Championship competition.

Yellow Jackets Add Two New Faces

Carlos Divar and Frederick "Zummy" Bauer signed their national letters of intent in November. Divar will join The Flats for the 2017 spring season from Vitoria, Spain. Divar currently ranks No. 1506 in the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) rankings, and he achieved a career-high ranking of No. 107 in the ITF Junior rankings. In January of 2016, Divar topped ITF Junior No. 17 Louis Wessels 7-6, 7-6 in the Czech Republic Grade 1. He also reached back-to-back semifinals of Tunisia Grade 2 tournaments in April 2016. He claimed three International Tennis Federation junior doubles titles (Tunisia Grade 2, Slovenia Grade 4, Czech Republic Grade 4).

Coach Kenny Thorne on Carlos Divar - *"Carlos is one of the premier players coming out of Spain this year. What I love is that he took time away from his busy tennis schedule to study diligently for the SAT, and he did a great job. Carlos puts his mind to something, and he gets it accomplished. This is a character trait of all successful Georgia Tech student-athletes. Carlos has beaten some of the top junior players in the world and has also had significant wins over players on the pro futures tour. He will definitely add strength to our team this coming January."*

Zummy Bauer comes the Flats from Suwanee, Ga. and will enroll in fall of 2017. Bauer ranks No. 108 in the tennisrecruiting.net rankings. He holds three ITF doubles titles (Bahamas Grade 4, Barbados Grade 4 and Puerto Rico Grade 4). In June of 2016, the Suwanee native won the International Grass Court Championships ITF event in Haverford, Penn.

Coach Kenny Thorne on Zummy Bauer - *"We are excited to be signing another local Georgia player of Zummy's caliber. He has been very successful in junior tennis in Georgia and understands the benefits of a Georgia Tech degree as well as the high level of our tennis program. He won a national doubles title earlier this year and plays a good aggressive game style. Zummy can help us in doubles immediately, which is extremely important in reaching our high goals of becoming one of the best teams in the nation. He is a hard worker and will fit in great with our team."*

Eubanks' Busy Summer

Georgia Tech's Christopher Eubanks earned wild card entry in to the doubles main draw for the BB&T Atlanta Open. He competed with high school teammate Zack Kennedy (Georgia State) and the pair made it to the quarterfinals of the tournament. Eubanks played his way through the Atlanta Open Wild Card Challenge to earn a spot in the qualifying round of the singles draw. The All-American topped two more opponents to snag his spot in the singles main draw.

His performance at the Atlanta Open earned Eubanks wild card entry into the qualifiers for the singles main draw of the U.S. Open in August. He competed again at the Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in September at the American Collegiate Invitational.

Tech's ACC Championship History

Georgia Tech has never won an Atlantic Coast Conference championship in men's tennis, though several Yellow Jackets have individual titles to their credit from an era when individual championships were crowned.

Tech has reached the finals four times, two of those under head coach Kenny Thorne in 1999 and 2002. The Jackets also reached the championship match in Thorne's senior year of 1988 and again in 1994.

Eubanks at Master 'U BNP Paribas

Christopher Eubanks was selected among five other collegiate athletes to represent the United States at the Master 'U BNP Paribas in December 2016. Team USA claimed its sixth consecutive title in the tournament. Eubanks played in singles and doubles. He finished the tournament 1-1 in doubles and 2-0 in singles, including winning in the No. 1 boys spot during the finals against Russia.

KEN BYERS TENNIS COMPLEX

A lot of history was made in the Bill Moore Tennis Center. Some of the greatest players in Georgia Tech history took to those courts and improved their games to the point they could reach the pro tour.

Current Georgia Tech men's tennis head coach Kenny Thorne is one of those. He played and coached there in his four decorated years on the Flats (1985-89).

In January of 2013, Thorne witnessed the opening of the Ken Byers Tennis Complex, as the women's tennis team opened the facility with a match against Syracuse and men's team opened a day later against Old Dominion. In a way, it was déjà vu for Thorne, who was a freshman the year the Moore Center opened.

"It's just a very unique thing. It's an honor to be coaching here at this time, and it's an honor for all of our student-athletes to have opened a new facility," said the 1989 graduate and 1995 Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame inductee. "That doesn't happen too often in any sport. It's very exciting."

Women's head coach Rodney Harmon, whose team played the first matches on the brand new six-court facility, who was beginning his first season on the Flats, has been around the sport long enough to know something special when he sees it. He's seen it with the Byers Complex.

Ground was broken for the facility on June 15, 2012 and was made possible by a generous gift from alumnus Ken Byers (class of '66) and his wife, Trish.

"It's going to be beautiful and it's going to help both our men's and women's programs stay a factor with the other schools, in our very, very tough conference," said Harmon, who has been in tennis player development for more than 25 years and, as a pro, reached the quarterfinals at the 1982 U.S. Open. "It has a great feeling, which I think will help us set up a home-court advantage because a lot of our fans tend to be very vocal and really support our team."

As advantageous to the team is the amount of space. Off the court, Byers has bigger locker rooms, a lounge, a training facility and more office space for the coaching staffs. The number of available courts for play inside doubled from three to six.

"I think it's going to be big for us," Harmon said. "It allows us to compete year-round, and when the weather gets inclement, both teams have a place to play. We've always had to play outside, and it can get pretty cold sometimes. Now we're going to be able to play indoors and really get prepared for the indoor season, which starts in February."

The doubling of the court space was a key factor in building the new complex.

"You need space and you need quality space and if that means new or renovations then so be it," said former associate athletic director Paul Griffin. "Now, we have an efficient way of running our indoor matches, and because of the weather you wind up playing almost half of your matches indoors be it for wet or for cold."

Thorne and Harmon agree that the opening of the Byers Complex signals the start of big things ahead. Thorne compares the anticipation of the facility's opening to the buzz surrounding the opening of McCamish Pavilion and expects Tech tennis fans to be as energized as basketball fans.

"It's such a big change and ours is a total change," said Thorne. "It's a whole brand-new complex. There are some really exciting things happening. So hopefully it's going to draw a lot more people out. They come see the facility as well as some great tennis."

Harmon expects the facility to also draw some big-name recruits.

"It's going to give us an opportunity to recruit top-level athletes because now a lot of the top schools have new facilities around the country, whether it's Alabama or Florida State or South Carolina, Texas is getting a new facility built," he said. "So now we have a new facility. It's something that to our recruits that makes us a lot stronger."

The Byers Complex, built on the same footprint where the Moore Center stood, is light years ahead of its predecessor and was overdue as far as keeping Tech's programs current. The



ingenuity in building a facility that could fit so much more into the same space as its predecessor made this project design uniquely Tech.

The former three-court indoor tennis facility was replaced with a state-of-the-art six-court indoor facility. The new steel indoor facility is located next to Tenth Street, just behind the magnolias. It features an entrance lobby, men's and women's coaches offices, men's and women's locker rooms and a team lounge. The indoor facility retains the Bill Moore name and provides seating a little more than 200 spectators.

The outdoor part of the complex consists of six competition courts on the south end of the site and four practice courts located between the indoor facility and the competition courts. A landscaped courtyard area was added between the practice courts and Fowler Street. Outdoor seating, situated between the Griffin Track and the competition courts, provides a view of both competition on the track and action on the tennis courts and includes plenty of space for wheelchair seating. Additionally, an East-West Connector provides a lighted walkway for pedestrians along the track-side of the site to facilitate movement between the North Campus Parking Deck and the McCamish Pavilion.

"Thirty years is a long time," said Griffin. "It's not a matter of different inclusions. It's a matter of improved space. It's a tight footprint. The real estate didn't change, so we had to make some compromises on that and one of the other things was to relocate the indoor facility to the 10th street side of the real estate because it will serve as a buffer from the noise and street from 10th street for the outdoor courts that wasn't there before. So there are a lot of those kinds of features that are now a benefit for the program."

"It has a bunch of other features that are assets to the Institute and to athletics in other ways than just tennis," he added. "There's a seating area for track, a pathway from the parking lot to McCamish Pavilion (Tech's basketball arena across Fowler Street), a parking lot on Atlantic to McCamish, improved sidewalks and streetscapes. So it's a very comprehensive project."

For the school, it's the latest improvement to the campus' Fowler Street entrance, which also includes Mewborn Softball Field and the Brock Indoor Football Facility.

That exciting plan will continue to evolve in years to come. The tennis teams are thrilled to be part of it and are eager to do their part to stir up excitement around campus as they begin spring play.

"It is a tremendous commitment," said Harmon. "That whole side of campus, with the new basketball arena, with the tennis facility, with the track and the indoor football complex and baseball and softball, it's now a great corner of campus."

Kenny Thorne recorded one of the most successful tennis careers by a player from the state of Georgia, winning seven pro titles and defeating four of the world's top-10 players in the 1990's. Some of Thorne's notable victories include wins over Richard Krajicek, Wayne Ferreira, Mark Philippoussis and Todd Martin. As a pro, he achieved his highest singles ranking of No. 121 and a doubles ranking of No. 67. Thorne brings his love of tennis and impressive professional playing experience to his alma mater, Georgia Tech.

Charged with building the Georgia Tech tennis program back to the level it was when he was a player, Thorne was named to the newly-created position of Director of Tennis on June 30, 1998, becoming the ninth head coach in Tech men's tennis history.

Thorne took over the reins of the Tech program after spending one season as the team's assistant coach and wasted little time in taking steps toward his ultimate goal of turning the Yellow Jackets into contenders.

The Yellow Jackets have reached the NCAA Championship 12 times in his 18 years at the helm, and six of those have advanced past the opening round. Tech made it back for the second straight year in 2016 with its best record since 2011 (17-9, 8-4 ACC). After a two-year absence, the 2010 and 2011 teams reached the second and third rounds of the tournament, respectively, finished fourth in the Atlantic Coast Conference each time (15-7 record), while posting a combined 39-14 dual match record.

This past spring, Thorne surpassed the legendary Tech coach Earle Bortell (228-108-2) for most career coaching victories in the Yellow Jackets' program history. Thorne now has 235 victories over 18 seasons against 195 losses.

Over the last eight years, Thorne has developed two of the best singles players in Tech history, Guillermo Gomez (2008-11) and current junior Christopher Eubanks, both of whom earned ACC Player of the Year honors. He has also developed two of the best doubles players in Tech history, Juan Spir, who advanced to the NCAA Doubles Championship semifinals in 2012 and quarterfinals in 2013 with different partners. Spir and Kevin King, Spir's doubles partner for 75 of his Tech-record 103 victories, played in the NCAA Singles Championship as well.

Under Thorne's guidance, Tech had at least one ITA All-American every year from 2009-13, and has had at least one All-Atlantic Coast Conference honoree each year since 2008.

Tech's 2011 team finished the year ranked 13th in the nation and reached the round of 16 at the NCAA Championship, both high-water marks for Tech tennis under Thorne. Tech's 21 wins in 2011 were the most for the Jackets under Thorne and the second most in the history of the program.

As a result, the Tech alum was named the ITA National Coach of the Year, becoming only the fourth Georgia Tech head coach ever to receive such an honor.

Thorne built those Tech squads around four-time All-ACC honoree Gomez, who was named the ACC Player of the Year in 2011 and earned ITA All-American honors three times, and broke Thorne's record for career singles victories. He also recruited another pair of ITA All-Americans in King and Spir, who formed one of the top 10 doubles teams nationally and developed into top-of-the-lineup players in singles, both earning NCAA bids in 2012.

Tech's last two teams in 2015 and 2016 have been built around Eubanks, a five-star junior player from Atlanta who has helped the Jackets earn NCAA Championship appearances each year and a 31-21 overall record, while Eubanks himself rose to No. 5 in the ITA singles rankings.

Thirteen of Thorne's Tech teams have finished the spring ranked among the top 50 in the ITA team rankings, and eight of them have finished in the top half of the perennially powerful Atlantic Coast Conference.

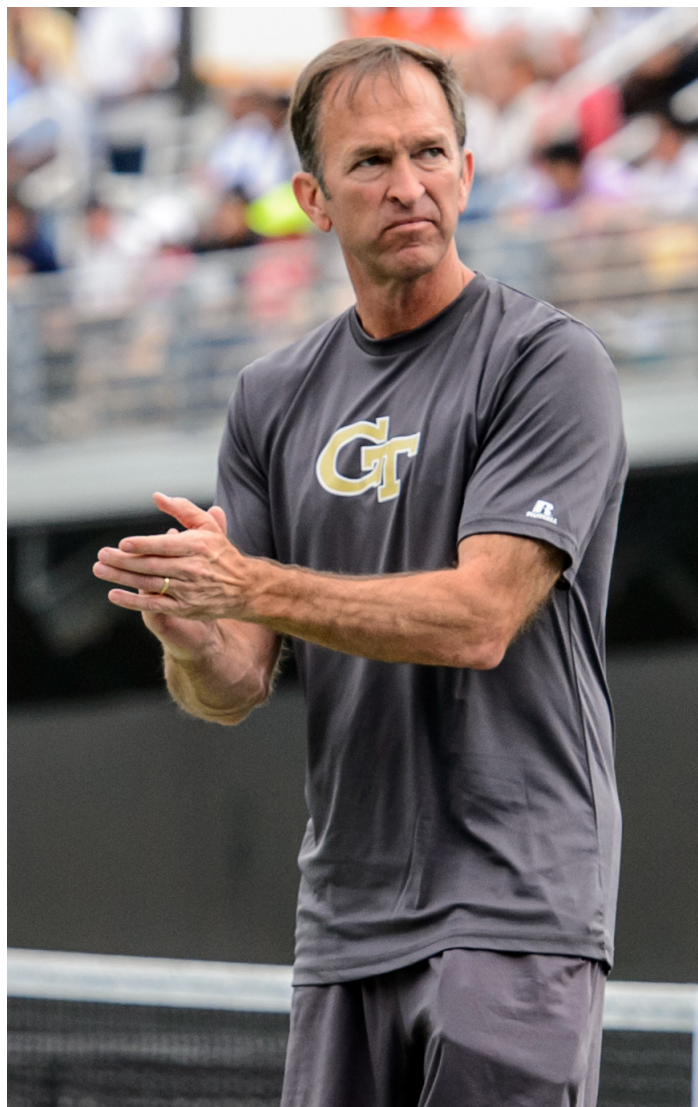
He has coached 10 different players to All-ACC honors 21 times, and three of his players have been named ACC Player of the Year. Nine different players have earned ITA All-America honors.

Also under Thorne's watch, 13 players have earned bids to the NCAA Singles Championship and eight have made the NCAA Doubles Championship field.

Other highlights include:

- During the 2003 campaign, Georgia Tech earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament and climbed into the 14th spot in the national rankings midway through the year. The Jackets also boasted their first All-America honorees since 1988, as the doubles team of Roger Anderson and Scott Schnugg earned the honor after finishing the year as the country's 10th-ranked tandem. The duo also earned All-ACC honors after winning the league's Flight One Doubles title. Tech finished with a 12-10 record and notched seven wins over ranked opponents, including a 4-2 victory over ninth-ranked Texas on February 16.

- In 2002, Tech defeated eight ranked teams and reached the finals of the ACC Championship, en route to a 15-11 dual-match record, while also reaching the NCAA Tournament for the third time

in four years under Thorne. In the ACC Tournament, the Jackets upset top-seeded and 14th-ranked Duke in the semifinals by a 4-0 score and ended the Blue Devils four-year reign as ACC Champions. On an individual level, Roger Anderson earned All-ACC honors for the second time and earned his first berth in the NCAA Individual Championship, becoming the first Tech player to do so since 1999.

- During the 2000-01 season, Thorne made great strides toward achieving his goal. When the Yellow Jackets climbed to No. 20 in the national rankings on April 11, they claimed their highest ranking since 1988, when Thorne was an All-American and team captain.

- Thorne led the 2001 Yellow Jackets to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Roger Anderson earned All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors and three Tech players earned ACC Flight championships in singles or doubles.

- Under Thorne's guidance in 2000, Anderson became the first Tech player to earn ACC Rookie of the Year honors after leading the Yellow Jackets with a 24-8 singles record, including a 15-5 mark in dual matches.

- In his first year as head coach in 1999, Thorne earned ACC Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Yellow Jackets to a second-place tie in the regular-season conference standings, a runner-up finish at the ACC Tournament, an NCAA Regional berth and a final national ranking of 32 by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA). Senior Benjamin Cassaigne was named the ACC Player of the Year, earned all-conference honors and captured the ACC Flight Championship at No. 1 singles.

- With Tech's 1999 NCAA Regional berth, Thorne became the first person in ACC history and just the second nationally, joining LSU's Jeff Brown, to lead the same school to post-season competition as a player, assistant coach and head coach since the current NCAA team dual-match format was instituted in 1977. (Prior to 1977, team finishes were determined by an accumulation of points based on individual play.) Thorne helped Tech to NCAA play as a senior in 1988, as an assistant coach in 1998 and as head coach in 1999.

Thorne earned an Industrial Engineering degree from Tech in 1989 and during his four seasons as a player from 1985-88, the Jackets posted a 70-38 dual-match record and a 20-7 ACC mark, including wins over nationally-ranked foes such as Georgia and Clemson in 1988, his final season. Tech climbed as high as 10th in the ITA national rankings during Thorne's senior season before the Jackets ended the year ranked 12th nationally.

He qualified for the NCAA singles tournament in 1986 and 1988 and advanced to the second round on both occasions. Thorne also competed in the 1988 NCAA doubles tourney with partner Bryan Shelton. After turning professional in 1989, Thorne spent eight years on the tour, achieving his highest singles ranking of 121 and doubles ranking of 67 in the world. He was also a six-time participant at Wimbledon, the U.S. Open, French Open and Australian Open.

Thorne's best career wins were over 1996 Wimbledon champion Richard Krajicek, ATP No. 11 Wayne Ferreira, Australia's Mark Philippoussis and Todd Martin of the United States. He posted two career ATP doubles titles, one career Challenger singles title and four career Challenger doubles titles.

An All-American in 1988, Thorne finished his Georgia Tech playing career as a four-time All-ACC honoree and the career leader in singles victories with 112. He was also a two-time captain and an Academic All-ACC honoree. Thorne was inducted into the Georgia Tech Athletic Hall of Fame in 1995.

Thorne married former Yellow Jacket cross country standout and Tech Hall of Fame inductee, Bridget Koster, in 1990. The couple has two daughters, Rachel and Kenedy, and two sons, Zachary and Daniel. Rachel is a distance runner on the Tech track team.

A former assistant coach for the men's tennis program at Fresno State and Virginia, Derek Schwandt joined the Georgia Tech men's tennis program in July of 2012.

In his first three years at Tech, he has helped the Yellow Jackets secure two recruiting classes ranked among the top 15 in the nation according to the Tennis Recruiting Network. Tech's 2013 class was ranked 11th, and the 2014 incoming class was ranked 14th. He also has helped guide the Yellow Jackets to two straight NCAA Team Championship berths following a three-year absence and produce a bona fide All-American in Christopher Eubanks, who is ranked No. 7 in the nation.

In addition, Schwandt has been recognized for his efforts at Tech by being named to the coaching staff for the USTA Collegiate National Team for the summer of 2014 and 2015. In his two years at Fresno State, Schwandt helped the Bulldogs win two straight Western Athletic Conference regular season and tournament championships and rise to No. 14 in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association rankings in 2012.

"It's an honor to have the opportunity to work with Kenny Thorne at one of the best institutions and athletic programs in the country," said Schwandt. "This is something that I've been working towards, and a lot of people have helped me get to this point in my coaching career. I'm very excited about our team's potential at Georgia Tech, and I'm looking forward to training hard and competing in the ACC and NCAA."

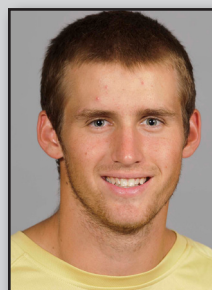
Schwandt was heavily involved in all aspects of the Fresno State program, from coaching to recruiting, travel, budgeting, conditioning and directing ITA events. The Bulldogs' team grade-point average exceeded 3.3 during each of his two years, and five members of the team made the All-WAC Academic team.

"Derek is one of the hardest workers I have been around, which fits in well with our expectations for staff and team," said Thorne. "He brings a great deal of knowledge and experience from his years coaching at UVA and at Fresno State. He has also worked at the Philadelphia USTA regional training center with some great coaches. He did a great job recruiting at Fresno State, so he will be instrumental in bringing in the best student-athletes that are champions on and off the court. Most importantly, Derek is a person with great integrity. Our program stands for and demands integrity on and off court. Derek represents Georgia Tech well in all areas."

In 2012, Fresno State defeated No. 9 Stanford for the first time in program history, catapulting the team to No. 14 in the country. After winning a second consecutive WAC Tournament title, the Bulldogs went to their second straight NCAA Tournament and fell to No. 27 San Diego in the first round.

Under Schwandt's leadership, Remi Boutillier and Francis Alcantara received bids to play in the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships in 2012. There, No. 27 Boutillier advanced to the second round while No. 43 Alcantara fell in the first round. As a doubles team, they fell to Georgia Tech's Kevin King and Juan Spir in the first round.

In 2011, he helped lead the Bulldogs to their first WAC Tournament title since 1999 and a No. 37 national team ranking. In the 2011 NCAA Tournament, Fresno State defeated No. 19 Minnesota in the first round before falling 4-3 to No. 14 Cal.

2ND YEAR AT TECH**

Former Georgia Tech All-American tennis player Kevin King joined the Yellow Jackets' men's tennis program as a volunteer assistant coach in January of 2015.

King, who starred for Tech from 2008-12 and graduated with honors in mechanical engineering in 2012, is taking time off from professional tennis to recover from injuries to both his hips and is replacing Brad Horton, who served as volunteer coach the last four years.

"When Kevin decided to play for Georgia Tech in 2008, I said he was the perfect Georgia Tech student-athlete fit," said Thorne. "Eight years later, I am still saying he is the perfect Georgia Tech fit. He excelled in the classroom and on the court. We are honored to have him on our coaching staff this year. He will bring the highest level of college experience as well as the highest level of current pro experience to our staff."

The highest-ranked American recruit ever to enroll in Tech's men's tennis program, King left as one of its best-ever doubles players, earning ITA All-American honors in 2011 and All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in 2010, 2011 and 2012. He played near the top of Tech's singles lineup (ranked as high as No. 7 in the nation as a senior) and teamed with Juan Spir to form one of the nation's best doubles teams (ranked as high as No. 2 during the 2011-12 year), and the best ever to play at Tech. The Peachtree City, Ga., resident finished his career with 87 doubles wins (87-39 record), breaking the previous mark of 82 set by Sergio Aquirre. He teamed with Spir for 66 of those wins (66-22 career, in dual matches, 19-8 vs. ACC), and also compiled an 80-41 career singles record, 25-15 in ACC matches.

He has played professionally on the ITF Pro Circuit and ATP Tour since his graduation in 2012, and has earned berths in the Wimbledon championships and the BB&T Atlanta Open. He has won three ATP Challenger doubles titles playing with his former Tech teammate Spir, two of them on clay-court surfaces and one on hard-court. His high-water marks in the ATP rankings have been No. 287 in singles (Apr. 27, 2015) and No. 114 in doubles (July 28, 2014). He is currently ranked No. 294 in singles and No. 126 in doubles.

From 2008-2010, Schwandt was the volunteer assistant coach for top ranked Virginia. There, he received full-time experience in running practice sessions, coaching in dual-matches, recruiting, administration and directing ITA fall tournaments.

During Schwandt's time at UVA, the Cavaliers won the 2009 and 2010 ITA national team indoor championship, the 2009 and 2010 ACC championship and the 2009 and 2010 NCAA doubles title. They also reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championship in 2009, and the semi-finals in 2010. He coached under Brian Boland, the 2008 ITA National Coach of the Year, and Tony Bresky, the 2005 ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year.

From 2005 to 2008, Schwandt played ITF futures and ATP challengers all over the world, including tournaments in South America, Mexico, Canada, Central America and India. He earned an ATP world ranking in singles and doubles. His best win was over Marcus Fugate (500 ATP) 6-7, 7-6, 7-6 in the 2008 Binghamton challenger.

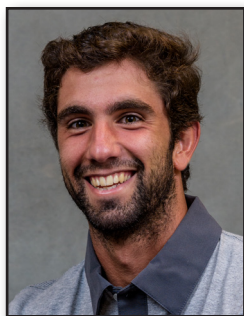
Schwandt completed his master's degree in sport psychology, with a 4.0 grade-point average, at Fresno State in May of 2012. His book review on John Wooden was published in the June 2012 issue of The Sport Psychologist.

Schwandt graduated from the University of Richmond in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in business administration, concentrating in economics. At Richmond, he was part of three Atlantic 10 conference championships (2002, 2004, 2005) and three NCAA team tournament appearances. He was named to the All-Atlantic 10 team in 2004 and 2005.

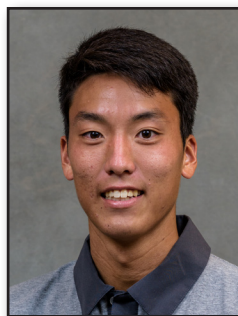

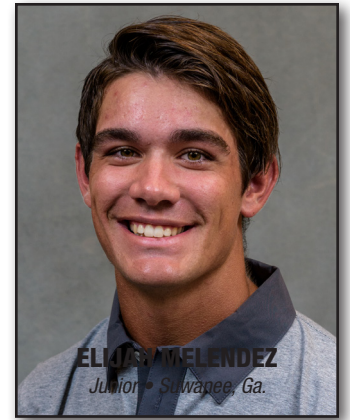
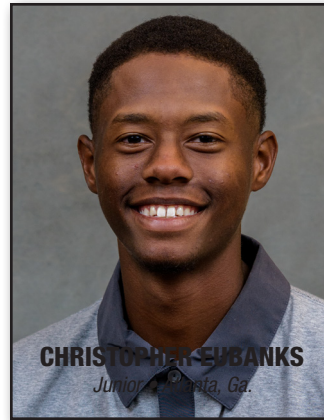

DR. G.P. "BUD" PETERSON

PRESIDENT

G.P. "Bud" Peterson was appointed as the 11th president of Georgia Tech on April 1, 2009. Prior to this appointment, he served as chancellor at the University of Colorado at Boulder (2006-2009), provost at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York (2000-2006), and program director at the National Science Foundation for the Thermal Transport and Thermal Processing Program (1993-1994). He has held various positions at Texas A&M University, beginning in 1981 as an assistant professor of engineering technology and Halliburton Professor of Mechanical Engineering (1990), the College of Engineering's Tenneco Professor, head of the Department of Mechanical Engineering (1993-1996), executive associate dean of engineering (1996-2000), and associate vice chancellor for engineering for the Texas A&M University System (1996-2000). Prior to his service at Texas A&M, he was a visiting research scientist at NASA-Johnson Space Center in Houston, Texas (1981-1982), associate professor and head of the General Engineering Technology Department at Kansas Technical Institute in Salina, Kan. (1979-1981), and taught mathematics, physics and chemistry at Shawnee Mission South High School in Overland Park, Kan. (1978-1979), and Wabauunsee County High School in Alma, Kan. (1977-1978).

Throughout his career, Peterson has played an active role in helping to establish the national education and research agendas, serving on numerous industry, government, and academic task forces and committees. He has served as a member of a number of congressional task forces, research councils, and advisory boards, including the Office of Naval Research (ONR), the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), the Department of Energy (DOE), the National Research Council (NRC), and the National Academy of Engineering (NAE). In addition, he has served as a member of the Board of Directors and vice president for education for the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA) and is currently serving as a member of the National Science Board (NSB), co-chair of the Government Relations Committee of the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU), as a member of the U.S. Council on Competitiveness, and was recently appointed by Secretary Gary Locke as a member of the National Advisory Council on Innovation and Entrepreneurship (NACIE).

As chancellor of the University of Colorado, Peterson led the development of a new university wide strategic plan, Flagship 2030, which defined a vision for the university for the next 20 years. In his nearly three years as chancellor, freshman applications increased by 35 percent, the number of under-represented minorities in the freshmen class increased by 38 percent, sponsored research increased by more than 18 percent, and private philanthropy for the university increased by nearly 80 percent.

As provost at Rensselaer, he played a key role in the institutional transformation and the dramatic improvement in the quality, size, and diversity of the faculty — overseeing the hiring of nearly 40 percent of the faculty, increasing the total number of tenured and tenure-track faculty by 20 percent, and improving the diversity of the tenured/tenure-track faculty by more than doubling the number of under-represented minorities and increasing the number of women by 40 percent. In addition, during his tenure as provost, the quality, size, and diversity of the student body increased, with the number of full-time PhD students increasing by 25%.

Peterson's research interests have focused on the fundamental aspects of phase change heat transfer, including the heat transfer in reduced gravity environments, boiling from enhanced surfaces, and some of the earliest work in the area of flow and phase change heat transfer in microchannels. Early investigations focused on applications involving the thermal control of manned and unmanned spacecraft and progressed through applications of phase change heat transfer to the thermal control of electronic components and devices. More recently, investigations have included fundamental applications of phase change heat transfer to the field of biotechnology, including the in situ treatment of cancerous tissue using hypo and hyperthermia to arrest epileptic seizures through the rapid cooling of localized brain tissue, which required highly efficient heat dissipation devices capable of dissipating thermal energy to surrounding tissue.

A Fellow of both the American Society of Mechanical Engineers and the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics, Peterson is the author or co-author of 14 books or book chapters, 180 refereed journal articles, more than 150 conference publications, and holds eight patents with two others pending. He is a member of several professional organizations and the recipient of numerous national and international honors and awards for both teaching and research.



REGINALD DESROCHES

FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE

Reginald DesRoches is the Karen and John Huff School Chair and Professor of Civil and Environmental Engineering at the Georgia Institute of Technology. DesRoches took over as FAR on July 1, 2014, after Professor Sue Ann Bidstrup stepped down following a five-year stint as FAR.

As Chair of the School of Civil & Environmental Engineering, he provides leadership to a top-ranked program with 100 faculty and staff and 1,100 students. His primary research interests are in design of resilient infrastructure systems under extreme loads. He has published more than 300 articles in the general area of resilience and seismic risk assessment, and he has given more than 100 presentations in over 35 different countries.

A fellow of the American Society of Civil Engineers and the society's Structural Engineering Institute, Dr. DesRoches has served as the key technical leader in the United States' response to the Haiti earthquake and led a team of 28 engineers, architects, city planners, and social scientists to study the impact of the earthquake. He has also participated in numerous congressional briefings to underscore the critical role that university research must play in addressing the country's infrastructure crisis and resilience to natural hazards. Dr. DesRoches has served as thesis advisor to 29 Doctoral and 17 Master's thesis students.

Dr. DesRoches serves on the National Academy of Sciences Resilience Roundtable and the Academy's Board on Army Science and Technology as well as on the National Science Foundation's Advisory Committee for Engineering, the Global Earthquake Modeling Scientific Board, and the advisory board for the Natural Disasters, Coastal Infrastructure and Emergency Management Research Center. He has chaired the American Society of Civil Engineers' Seismic Effects Committee as well as the executive committee of the Technical Council on Lifeline Earthquake Engineering.

In recent years, Dr. DesRoches has testified before U.S. House and Senate subcommittees on earthquake resilience and science and participated in Washington, D.C., roundtables on topics ranging from disaster preparedness to challenges for African-American men in STEM fields. National media outlets frequently contact him for expert analysis following earthquake events, including CNN, CNN International, LiveScience, National Geographic, and Asia Times online. He also is frequently called on as a champion of the critical role that university research must play in addressing the country's infrastructure crisis and resilience to natural hazards.

Dr. DesRoches has received the Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers (PECASE) in 2002 — the highest honor bestowed upon scientists and engineers in the early stages of their careers. Most recently, he was a recipient of the 2007 ASCE Walter L. Huber Civil Engineering Research Prize, the 2015 ASCE Charles Martin Duke Lifeline Earthquake Engineering Award, the Georgia Tech Outstanding Doctoral Thesis Advisor Award (2010), and the Georgia Tech ANAK Award (2008). The ANAK award is the highest honor the undergraduate student body can bestow on a Georgia Tech faculty member.

DesRoches was born in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, and grew up in Queens, New York. He earned his Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering, Master of Science in Civil Engineering, and Ph.D. in Structural Engineering at the University of California, Berkeley, where he was recently elected to the civil engineering department's Academy of Distinguished Alumni.

TODD STANSBURY

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Georgia Institute of Technology introduced former Tech football player Todd Stansbury as the Institute's ninth director of athletics on Sept. 22, 2016.

Stansbury has served as Oregon State's athletic director since June 2015 following a nine-year stint as the university's executive associate athletic director from 2003-2012. During his time at Oregon State, Stansbury was part of a senior management team that raised \$150 million for a football stadium expansion, in addition to fundraising for the construction of a sports performing center. He also was part of a team that established several career development initiatives for student-athletes.

"Todd Stansbury is committed to athletes' success both on and off the field," Peterson said. "His global perspective and leadership experience in athletics and development, combined with a lifelong passion for Georgia Tech, make him the ideal candidate. I believe this is one of those rare golden moments in life where opportunity meets ambition. We welcome him home."

Stansbury's resume also includes roles as athletic director at the University of Central Florida (2012-2015) and East Tennessee State University (2000-2003). He was Georgia Tech's assistant athletic director for academics from 1988-1995 under Homer Rice. Now he returns to campus to guide a department that features 15 teams in 17 NCAA Division I varsity sports.

"I am honored and humbled to have the opportunity to return to Georgia Tech, a place that has played such a large role in my life and the place responsible for opening up a world to me that I didn't even know existed," Stansbury said. "I am thankful to President Peterson and the selection committee for providing me this opportunity."

Stansbury grew up in Canada. When he was 10 years old and on vacation with his family in Florida, he befriended several Georgia Tech football players staying at the same hotel. During the drive back home to Ontario, his family stopped on campus to see a practice. That's when Stansbury knew he wanted to play football on The Flats. He earned varsity letters while at Georgia Tech from 1980-1984 as a middle linebacker and on special teams for head coach Bill Curry. He was a third-round draft pick of the Canadian Football League's Saskatchewan Roughriders in 1984.

As the ninth director of athletics in Georgia Tech history, he follows in the footsteps of storied names such as Rice, John Heisman and Bobby Dodd. He was hired following a national search that began in August 2016 when Mike Bobinski accepted the athletics director position at Purdue University. A nine-member search committee led by Georgia Tech Foundation President Al Trujillo identified candidates. The search process was assisted by Turnkey Search.

"I want to thank Al and the search committee for their outstanding guidance in evaluating candidates," Peterson said. "I'm also personally grateful for the leadership and (interim A.D.) Paul (Griffin), who interrupted his retirement to return to campus to lead our Athletics Association. He will continue to be a great asset during the transition period for the remainder of 2016."

Georgia Tech has achieved a school-record Graduation Success Rate (84 percent according to the most recent NCAA figures from November 2015) in each of the past three years. The Institute also recorded outstanding scores in the Academic Progress Rate (APR), which provides a real-time NCAA metric to measure the success of institutions in moving student-athletes toward graduation. The latest APR statistics, released in April, reported that 13 of Georgia Tech's 15 teams scored 980 or better out of a possible 1,000 points.



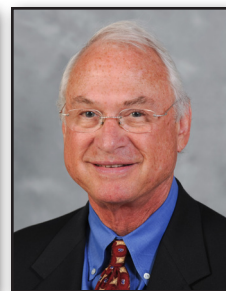

TECH TENNIS TIMELINE

1908—First Tech tennis team, with individuals competing in tournaments.

1915—Coached by J.R. Crenshaw, Tech tennis team competes in first dual matches, 2-0.

1918—Tech wins the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association championship.

1922—Tech wins the first of its two Southern Conference championships.

1926—Yellow Jackets win their second Southern Conference title in five years.

1929—Longtime coach J.R. Crenshaw coaches his final season, compiling an overall record of 32-12-2 in 13 seasons.

1934—Legendary Earle Bortell takes over as the Tech head coach, embarking on a career that would span 28 years and 215 victories.

1938—Russell Bobbitt, the conference champ at number one singles, led Georgia Tech to its first Southeastern Conference team title. The team was captained by GT Hall of Fame member Bill Moore and coached by Earle Bortell.

1945—Howard McCall reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA singles championship while Niles Millsap goes three rounds in singles and teams with Frank Willett who reach the semis in doubles.

1946—The team won its second Southeastern Conference team championship, led by T.W. Fowler, who won the conference title at two singles, and Howard McCall and Niles Milsap, who were co-champions at number one doubles.

May 12-14, 1960—Tech dominated the SEC Tennis Championships at Knoxville, Tenn., beating Tulane and Florida to win the team title. Ned Neely won the conference singles championship and teamed with Harry Thompson to win the number two singles championship. Thompson won the number two singles title, while Paul Metz was the number five singles champion and Dave Peake and Dave Pearsall won the number three doubles crown.

1960—Tech team posts a fourth-place finish at the NCAA championships, the best finish in school history, as Ned Neely and Harry Thompson reach the semifinals in doubles.

1966—All-American Walter Johnson advanced to the quarterfinals to lead Tech to a fifth-place NCAA finish.

1970—Led by All-American Larry Turville, who reached the fourth round, Tech ties for 10th place at the NAAs, as four players entered in singles and two in doubles teams.

March 11, 1982—First ACC win vs. Maryland, 6-3.

April 20, 1985—Freshman Bryan Shelton wins the ACC title at number one singles, the first individual ACC title in school history.

May 18, 1985—Bryan Shelton loses to Dan Goldie, 7-6, 4-6, 6-1, in first round of NCAA Singles Championships in the first NCAA appearance by a Tech player since 1971.

May 1987—Mark Avedikian and Richey Gilbert earn berths in NCAA doubles championship.

Jan. 23-24, 1988—Tech hosts nationally-ranked teams Stanford (No. 1), Tennessee (No. 10) and California (No. 13) to christen the Bill Moore Tennis Center; Jackets beat 13th-ranked Golden Bears but fall to top-ranked Cardinal. Jean Desdunes named head coach.

April 5, 1988—Defeated Georgia, 5-4, in Athens, for Tech's first win over the Bulldogs since 1966.

April 7, 1988—Defeated Clemson, 5-4, to finish first in the ACC regular season with a 7-0 record.

April 23, 1988—Lost to Clemson in finals of ACC Tournament, 5-4.

May 21, 1988—Lost to Michigan, 5-4, in first appearance in NCAA Team Championships.

May 26, 1988—Bryan Shelton reaches quarterfinals of NCAA Singles Championship before losing to eventual champion, Robbie Weiss of Pepperdine.

May 1988—Bryan Shelton and Kenny Thorne garner All-America honors, the first Yellow Jackets to earn the recognition since 1970.

May 19, 1993—Rob Givone competes in the NCAA singles tournament, becoming Tech's first NCAA entrant in five years.

April 22-24, 1994—Tech defeats Wake and Virginia to reach the finals of the ACC Tournament before falling to seventh-ranked Duke.

May 13-15, 1994—After defeating Florida State and VCU in the first two rounds, the third-seeded Tech score a heart-stopping 4-3 victory over NC to win the Region II title and advance to the NCAA Team Championships for the second time in school history. With Tech tied 3-3 against the Tar Heels, senior Scott Cotton was on the verge of defeat but rallied at number two singles to clinch the title.

May 21, 1994—Tech falls to third-ranked TCU in the first round of the NCAA Championships, to finish the season at 17-11 and ranked 28th in the final poll.

May 25, 1994—Rob Givone returns to the NCAA individual tourney, competing in singles and doubles with partner Scott Cotton.

March 29, 1995—Tech defeats Georgia Southern for head coach Jean Desdunes' 100th victory.

May 9, 1997—The team returns to NCAA Tournament play, falling to Duke in their NCAA Region II Championships opener.

May 15, 1998—Tech makes its second straight NCAA appearance, falling to Virginia Commonwealth at the NCAA Region II Championships in Richmond, Va.

June 30, 1998—Jean Desdunes resigns as head coach, stepping down with the second-highest win total in school history with 139. Assistant coach and former Tech All-American Kenny Thorne is named head coach at his alma mater.

April 30, 1999—Thorne is named ACC Coach of the Year after guiding the Jackets to a regular-season tie for second place in the ACC and the finals of the conference tournament. Thorne's No. 1 player, Benjamin Cassaigne, is named ACC Player of the Year.

May 14-15, 1999—The Yellow Jackets qualify for NCAA Regional play for the third-straight year, downing Boise State in their opening match before falling to defending national champion Stanford in round two at Palo Alto, Calif.

April 30, 2000—Roger Anderson is named ACC Rookie of the Year, the first Yellow Jacket to earn the honor.

March 7, 2001—Tech defeats 20th-ranked Miami. Tech's first win over a Top-20 opponent since 1998.

May 12-13, 2001—Tech competes in the NCAA Regional for the fourth time in the last five years. Tech tops Arizona, 4-2, in the first round before falling to eventual national champion Georgia in the second round in Athens, Ga.

October 28, 2001—Junior Roger Anderson becomes the first Yellow Jacket to win the Omni Hotels South Atlantic Region Championship when he defeats 43rd-ranked David Loewenthal

of Wake Forest in straight sets, 6-1, 7-5.

May 2, 2003—Senior Roger Anderson and junior Scott Schnugg become the first Tech players to earn All-America honors since 1988 after finishing the year ranked 10th nationally in doubles.

May 28, 2005—Freshman David North and junior Marko Rajevac participate in the NCAA Doubles Championship as alternates and advance to the quarterfinals to earn All-American honors, before falling to eventual national champions John Isner and Antonio Ruiz from Georgia.

May, 2008—Freshman Guillermo Gomez became just the second Yellow Jacket to be named ACC Freshman of the Year and ITA Mideast Region Rookie of the Year.

Feb. 19, 2009—Sophomore Guillermo Gomez ranked No. 7 nationally in singles by ITA -- the highest-ever ranking in for a Tech player in history.

Feb. 19, 2010—Junior Guillermo Gomez ranked No. 3 nationally in singles by ITA, the highest-ever ranking in Tech history. Gomez had surpassed his previous high in the first spring rankings (No. 5).

October 24, 2010—Kevin King and Juan Spir win the doubles title at the USTA/ITA Southeast Regional in Gainesville, Fla., beating teammates Eliot Potvin and Ryan Smith in the finals.

May, 2011—Senior Guillermo Gomez captures All-ACC honors for the fourth time, All-America honors for the third time, and finishes his career with a school record 119 singles victories. Juan Spir and Kevin King are named All-Americans in doubles.

June 8, 2011—Kenny Thorne named Wilson/ITA Division I National Coach of the Year after leading Georgia Tech to a 21-6 record and the Yellow Jackets advanced to the NCAA Round of 16 for the first time since 1994. Tech's 8-3 ACC mark was a program high for conference wins, and its final ITA ranking of No. 13 also was a program best.

October 24, 2011—Kevin King captures singles title at USTA/ITA Southeast Regional in Athens, beating three players ranked ahead of him and losing only one set in the tournament.

June 7, 2012—Kevin King and Juan Spir are named ITA All-Americans in doubles for the second time. King finishes his career with a Tech record 87 victories in doubles.

October 22, 2012—Juan Spir and Vikram Hundal win the doubles title at the USTA/ITA Southeast Regional in Tallahassee, Fla. The title was Spir's second in the event, this time with a different partner.

January 3, 2013—Juan Spir and Vikram Hundal open the spring ranked No. 3 by the ITA in doubles, the highest ranking ever attained by a Tech duo. They would stay there through the end of February when Hundal was injured.

January 18, 2013—Georgia Tech opens the new Ken Byers Tennis Complex by winning two matches over Old Dominion (5-2) and Lipscomb (4-3).

April 19, 2015—Georgia Tech stuns 8th-ranked Duke, 4-3, at the Ken Byers Tennis Complex, the highest-ranked team the Yellow Jackets had defeated under head coach Kenny Thorne (1998-present).

May 8, 2015—Georgia Tech returns to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in three years, earning a bid by defeating No. 8 Duke to close the regular season, then No. 35 Notre Dame and No. 14 Virginia Tech in the ACC Tournament.

2016—Georgia Tech returns to the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year behind Christopher Eubanks, who became the third Tech player to be named ACC Player of the Year. Eubanks also is named an ITA All-American.

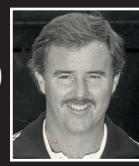

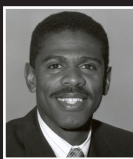
