TECH GOLF NOTEBOOK

Georgia Tech's golf team made its 28th all-time appearance in the NCAA Championship finals, finishing ninth in the stroke-play portion of the championship at The Concession Golf Club in Bradenton, Fla.

The Yellow Jackets, the No. 10 seed in the championship, posted a team total of 23-over-par 1175, leaving it three shots shy of the top-8 for match play after 72 holes at. Tied for eighth place with UCLA at the beginning of the round, the Jackets were unable to keep up with the Bruins after a 59-minute rain delay about midway through the round, finishing with a 9-over-par round of 297. UCLA held on for the eighth spot by shooting 6-over 294 and finished the tournament at 20-over 1172.

Thus, Tech missed match play for only the second time in its six NCAA finals appearances since the stroke-play/match-play format has been in use.

Sophomore Vincent Whaley was Tech's highest finisher individually, tying for 33rd place at 6-over-par 294 in which he shot 71-68 in his middle two rounds. All-America and ACC Player of the Year Ollie Schniederjans tied for 49th place at 10-over-par 298, followed by freshman Chris Petefish in 53rd (+11), freshman James Clark tied for 54th (+12) and All-America senior Anders Albertson tied for 67th (+15).

Yellow Jackets Update

Georgia Tech finished the spring ranked ninth in both the Golfstat rankings and the Golfweek/Sagarin Index, the eighth time in the last 11 years the Yellow Jackets finished in the top 10 in both polls, and the 11th straight year they have finished in the top 10 of at least one of them.

Tech advanced to the NCAA Championship by finishing third in the NCAA San Diego Regional, posting a 5-over-par score of 869 as the No. 3 seed. Third-seeded Oklahoma won the regional at 21-under-par, followed by top-seeded Arizona State at 1-under-par. Georgia and Virginia also qualified.

The Yellow Jackets earned automatic qualification into the regional by winning the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship, their second consecutive victory this spring, coming against a field that included nine teams in the nation's top 50. Tech also won the Robert Kepler Intercollegiate at Columbus, Ohio by 16 strokes over No. 28 SMU, and tied No. 25 Alabama for second place the week before at the Mason Rudolph Championship in Nashville, Tenn. This spring, Tech had two wins, two runner-up finishes, one third-place finish, one fourth-place and one 10th-place showing. Seven of Tech's regular-season spring tournaments have featured at least eight teams which were ranked among the top 50 in the nation, against whom the Jackets had an 82-36-3 record this year. Tech's schedule was ranked the ninth-most difficult in the nation according to the Golfweek/Sagarin Index.

Yellow Jackets' Lineup

Senior All-Americans Ollie Schniederjans (Powder Springs, Ga.) and Anders Albertson (Woodstock, Ga.) anchored the Tech travel squad for all three post-season (ACC and NCAA) events. The four-year teammates won the last three ACC individual crowns and had nine career collegiate titles between them. Both were named to the All-ACC team, with Schniederjans earned ACC Player of the Year honors for the second straight year.

Albertson played particularly strong in the spring, with victories at the ACC Championship and Robert Kepler Intercollegiate in Tech's two events

just prior to the San Diego Regional, where he tied for 14th. He had three other top-10 finishes and two 11th-place ties in his last eight events dating back to Tech's last fall event in Hawai'i. Albertson matched or broke par in 20 of the 28 rounds and averaged 71.48 for the year. Schniederjans, a six-time winner in the last two years, rebounded from a poor finish at the Valspar Collegiate to tie for sixth place at the Mason Rudolph, tie for third at the Robert Kepler, one shot behind co-medalists and teammates Albertson and Vincent Whaley, finish fourth at the ACC Championship and tie for seventh at the San Diego Regional. Schniederjans remained Tech's scoring average leader for the year at an even 70.51.

Whaley (McKinney, Texas), who played in 10 events, earned a share of the victory at the Kepler with 5-under-par 208, one week after tying for 11th with scores of 69-73-73, both performances coming on difficult golf courses. He ranked seventh on Tech's team with a 73.10 stroke average and was the team's highest finisher in the NCAA Championship.

Freshmen James Clark (Columbus, Ga.) and Chris Petefish (Danville, Calif.), who each had one top-10 finish this year, rounded out the Tech lineup. Petefish was the most consistent of Tech's four-man rookie class, averaging 72.38 to rank third on the team in stroke average. He tied for ninth at the Seminole Intercollegiate and did not finish lower than 29th in a tournament until the NCAA Championship, including a tie for 14th at the San Diego Regional. Clark also tied for ninth at the Seminole, with four other finishes between 23rd and 37th.

Tee Shots

- Ollie Schniederjans was named a first-team All-American for the second time by the Golf Coaches Association of America. Anders Albertson earned honorable mention honors by both organizations.

- Schniederjans was named the ACC Player of the Year for the second straight year, and made the All-ACC team for the third time. Anders Albertson, who won his second ACC individual title, made the All-ACC team for the fourth time, one of only 16 players in conference history to do that.

- For the third time in four years, every member of the Tech starting five for the post-season was named to the ACC All-Academic golf team. Albertson and Schniederjans were named for the fourth time in their four years at Tech.

- Georgia Tech's victory at the 2015 ACC Championship was the 82nd tournament win in program history and 47th for the team under head coach Bruce Heppler. The Yellow Jackets have also won the Carpet Capital Collegiate, the DICK'S Sporting Goods Challenge Cup and the Robert Kepler this year.

- Tech won 14 tournaments, including three ACC titles, during the four-year careers of Anders Albertson and Ollie Schniederjans.

- Tech won the 2014 ACC Championship with three seniors and two juniors in its lineup. This year's lineup has two seniors, a sophomore and two freshmen.

- Tech's five players in this year's NCAA Championship collectively played 475 collegiate rounds in their careers, 294 by Ollie Schniederjans and Anders Albertson. Last year's team collectively played 537 career rounds, had 10 victories, 34 top-5 finishes and 61 top-10s. Four members of last year's team had more than 100 career rounds

each, while a fifth had played 95.

- According to the Golfweek/Sagarin ratings, Tech faced the ninth-most difficult schedule in Division I - Tech was 34-30-2 vs. the nation's top 25 teams, 82-36-3 vs. the top 50, 120-36-3 vs. the top 100.

- Tech finished fourth or higher in nine of its 13 events, including four victories.

- Tech's team scoring average for the year was 284.90, two strokes and change higher than last year's 282.2.

- Only Schniederjans and Albertson had played in the NCAA regional or finals prior to this year. None of the other three starters had logged a post-season round beyond this year's ACC Championship and NCAA regional.

- All five starters in Tech's lineup last spring ranked in the top 125 of the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index. Four members of this year's lineup finished in the top 150 - Schniederjans at No. 8, Albertson at No. 37, Petefish as 114 and Whaley at No. 143.

- Tech's average drop score this year was 76.67, 14th-best in Division I.

- Tech's best score of the year was 809 (-55) at the Warrior Princeville Makai Invitational, which was the second-lowest 54-hole total in Tech history (808 at the 2005 Waikoloa Intercollegiate).

- Georgia Tech has played in the NCAA Championship finals 28 times, and 27 times since 1985.

- Schniederjans career stroke average of 70.96 and Anders Albertson's 71.49 currently rank No. 2 and 3 behind Bryce Molder's 70.69 from 1998-01.

- In four ACC Championships, Albertson had a T2, a T4 and two titles, averaging 67.92 in 12 tournament rounds. In all post-season events, Albertson compiled six top-10 finishes.

- Ollie Schniederjans has a T7, a T10, a 4th and a championship in his four tries in the ACC Championship, averaging 69.58 in 12 rounds. In nine ACC and NCAA events, Schniederjans has eight top-10s and two top-20 finishes.

Albertson, Schniederjans Help U.S. Team to Palmer Cup Win

Georgia Tech seniors Ollie Schniederjans and Anders Albertson joined forces with their Georgia Tech coach, Bruce Heppler, to lift the United States to an 18-12 victory over Europe in the 2015 Palmer Cup, the annual Ryder Cup-style collegiate competition that was played June 12-14 at Rich Harvest Farms outside Sugar Grove, Ill.

Schniederjans, taking his second turn on the

American team, won three of his four matches, including both singles matches, to improve to 6-2 career. He defeated Jon Rahm, the world's No. 1-ranked amateur, in Saturday's singles. Albertson went 2-2, splitting his tandem matches on Friday and his two singles matches, both of which were played against Clement Sordet of France, who was ranked No. 21 in the world. Heppler was serving as the U.S. head coach for the second time.

Albertson became the 11th Georgia Tech player to be a part of a United States team for the Palmer Cup, and Schniederjans becomes the fourth Yellow Jacket to compete in at least two Palmer Cups. They join James White (2012), Cameron Tringale (2009), Chesson Hadley (2008), Roberto Castro (2005, 2006), Kevin Larsen (2006), Bryce Molder (1998, 1999, 2001) and Matt Kuchar (1998, 1999). Heppler served as coach of the U.S. team in 2003, and former assistant coach Christian Newton was an assistant coach for the 2012 USA team.

Albertson Receives Byron Nelson Award

Anders Albertson of Georgia Tech was named recipient of the 2015 Byron Nelson Award presented by Cleveland Golf/Srixon, in cooperation with the Four Seasons Resort and Club Las Colinas, the Salesmanship Club of Dallas and the Golf Coaches Association of America.

Candidates for the Nelson Award must be a graduating senior and the selection committee considers equally a nominee's entire collegiate academic and golf career as well as his character and integrity while in college. Particular consideration is given to a nominee's good citizen-ship, as portrayed by Mr. Byron Nelson over the course of his life and golf career.

Albertson never missed a tournament for the Yellow Jackets. He was a three-time All-America selection and earned All-ACC honors four times. Albertson's career stroke-average of 71.49 over 140 rounds is third best in school history. He won three tournaments, including the 2013 and 2015 ACC Championship and the 2015 Robert Kepler Invitational.

He was a four-time selection to the ACC Academic Honor Roll, was named a Cleveland Golf/Srixon All-America Scholar and to the ACC All-Academic team in 2014, and this year was a recipient of the ACC Scholar-Athlete Honorary Award.

Albertson has served as the golf representative to the Georgia Tech student-athlete advisory board since his sophomore year. He has been active in recruiting his teammates to volunteer for Georgia Tech Athletic Association community service projects and ensured they stayed plugged into department events. Albertson was the golf team liaison for the Alexander-Tharpe Fund "Thank-a-Thon" project and implementation of the Annual Michael Isenhour Toy Drive. He has also volunteered with the Georgia Special Olympics Winter Games, Children's Miracle Network's Dance Marathon and Kid on Campus, an organization that brings children to Georgia Tech's campus who have battled or been affected by cancer. Albertson has also been active in Campus Christian Fellowship, including the Campus Christian Fellowship Homeless Outreach Program.

He joins a strong group of former Tech stars to win the Nelson Award, including Troy Matteson (2003), Roberto Castro (2007) and James White (2012).

Tech Signs Two in Class of 2015

Georgia Tech added two more highly-ranked players from the state of Georgia in the November recruiting period with the signing of Tyler Joiner of Leesburg and Tye Waller of Griffin to letters-of-intent.

Joiner is the No. 2-ranked player in the state, No. 23 in the class of 2015 and No. 31 overall according to the Junior Golf Scoreboard. He will join his brother, Jacob, who is a freshman on the current Tech team. Joiner, who is home schooled, earned five top-10 finishes in seven national junior events in 2014, and has won four state or regional junior events in the last five years.

Waller, who attends Spalding High School, is ranked No. 6 in Georgia, No. 55 in his class and No. 93 overall by the Junior Golf Scoreboard. He has posted three top-5 finishes in seven events in 2014, and has won seven state or regional junior events in the last four years.

Tech's NCAA Championship History

Georgia Tech has reached the NCAA Championship finals 27 times since 1985 (28th time in program history), which is tied for fourth most in that time period behind Oklahoma State (30), Florida (29) and Arizona State (28). All three of those teams were in this year's field. Tech has posted nine top-8 finishes in the last 14 tries. (*Tech played in NCAA regionals in 2008 and 2012 but did not advance.*)

The Yellow Jackets tied for 10th in 2009, the first-year of the stroke-play/match-play format, but qualified for match play each of the last four times they have advanced to the NCAA Championship (third in 2010, second in 2011, second in 2013, fifth in 2014). Tech did not advance out of its regional in 2012.

Tech has lost to the eventual champion three times in its first three forays into match play - Augusta State by the score of 3-2 in the quarterfinals in 2010 and 2011 and to Alabama (3-0-2) in 2013.

Tech has been the runner-up in the NCAA Championship four times (1993, 2000, 2002 and 2005), more than any team in the history of the championship except Houston, Michigan, Texas and Wake Forest, who also have four, and Oklahoma State, which has five.

In 1993 and 2002, the Yellow Jackets led after 54 holes, but finished second by one shot to Florida in 1993, and by four shots to Minnesota in 2002.

In 2000, the Yellow Jackets rallied to tie Oklahoma State after 72 holes, but lost to the Cowboys on the first hole of a playoff. Tech and OSU matched the lowest 72-hole team score in NCAA Championship history (36-under-par 1,116) at the Grand National Lake Course in Opelika, Ala. In 2005, Tech finished 11 shots behind Georgia, and seven shots ahead of third-place Washington.

Since Bruce Heppler became Tech's coach, the Jackets have finished in the top 8 11 times, with one 10th-place and one 11th-place finish.

Three Tech players have won national collegiate championships. Troy Matteson did it most recently in 2002 at Ohio State. Watts Gunn (1927) and Charlie Yates (1934) won national titles under a match play format before the NCAA took sponsorship of the championship in 1939.

Other top-10 finishers for Tech include David Duval (runner-up in 1991 and 1993, T-8 in 1990), Bill McDonald (T-2 in 1988), Bunky Henry (2nd in 1967), Roberto Castro (3rd in 2005), Nacho Gervas (T-3 in 1986), Paul Haley (T9 in 2010),

Kris Mikkelsen (T-4 in 2001), Stewart Cink (T-5 in 1994), Bryce Molder (6th in 1998), Matt Weibring (6th in 2000), James White (T8 in 2011) and Ollie Schniederjans (T8 in 2013 and 2nd in 2015).

Tech and NCAA Match Play

The 2009 NCAA Championship featured a new twist with the team champion determined via match play. The top eight teams after 54 holes of stroke play advance to a match play tournament format.

This year's format has added a fourth round of stroke play for the top 15 teams and nine individuals not on those teams, after which the national individual champion and the top eight teams for match play will be determined.

It is a format that Bruce Heppler has supported vigorously. Under Heppler, Georgia Tech finished in the top eight of the NCAA Finals seven times in 10 tries under the 72-hole, stroke-play format. Tech is one of only two teams (Oklahoma State is the other) to have advanced to match play four times in the six years the current format has been in effect.

In the stroke-play/match play era, the Yellow Jackets have finished 10th, third, second, second and fifth, respectively, in the stroke-play portion of the NCAA Championship in five tries (Tech did not advance out of its regional in 2012). Tech has lost to the eventual national champion three of the four times has qualified for match play (Augusta State in the 2010 and 2011 quarterfinals, Alabama in the 2013 semifinals).

Tech has had success in other match-play events in recent years, reaching the finals of the Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championship four times in six appearances.

Georgia Tech Match Play History

While match play in college golf may be infrequent, Georgia Tech is no stranger to it, having participated in six regular season match play events since 2001, as well as three times in the five years the NCAA has utilized match play to determine its champion. Here is a history of Tech's participation.

Tech in NCAA Regional Competition

Georgia Tech has failed to advance through an NCAA regional only twice in 25 tries, and only once since the NCAA went to a six-regional qualifying format in 2009. Heppler's teams have won five regional tournaments outright and tied for one title, most recently winning the Raleigh Regional in 2014.

The NCAA began using regional qualifying tournaments in 1989, first with the 81 teams split among three sites (27 teams each), then with six sites with either 13 or 14 teams each beginning in 2009.

Since the NCAA went to six regional sites in 2009, Tech has finished third (Bowling Green, Ky.), third (Milton, Ga.), tied for third (Radford, Va.), sixth/did not advance (Norman, Okla.), fourth (Tallahassee, Fla.), first (Raleigh, N.C.) and third (Rancho Santa Fe, Calif.).

Tech's first four victories all occurred in 27-team regionals in 1991 (New Haven, Conn.), 1998 (Daufuskie Island, S.C.), 1999 (Providence, R.I.) and 2002 (Roswell, Ga., tied with Clemson). Only the 2014 win occurred in a 13-team field.

ACC Championship History

Georgia Tech has won the last two Atlantic Coast Conference championships, six of the last seven and eight of the last 10.

The last three individual champions also have come from Georgia Tech. Anders Albertson won his second title in 2015, sharing medallist honors with Louisville's Robin Sciote-Siegrist and Virginia Tech's Trevor Cone with a score of 11-under-par 205. He also won the championship in 2013 with a record score of 15-under 201. He is the fifth player to win two ACC titles, and the second Tech player to do so, joining David Duval in 1991 and 1993.

Albertson became Tech's 10th ACC individual champion, joining Bob McDonnell (1985), David Duval (1991, 1993), Mikko Rantanen (1994), Bryce Molder (2000), Cameron Tringale (2006), Chesson Hadley (2010), Paul Haley (2011), Albertson (2013, 2015) and Schniederjans (2014).

Tech's 16 ACC men's golf titles in history ranks second among conference schools behind Wake Forest (18). Tech has won 11 of its conference titles under current head coach Bruce Heppler, nine of those outright (1999, 2001, 2002, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015) and two shared (2006, 2007). The Yellow Jackets won five championships (1985, 1991, 1992, 1993, 1994) under previous head coach Puggy Blackmon.

Ten of Tech's ACC titles have occurred at the Old North State Club, the first occurring in 1999 by 10 strokes over North Carolina and Duke. Tech won the 2011 crown with a tournament record score of 831 (-33) and by a record 20 strokes. Tech shared the 2006 title with North Carolina, and the 2007 crown with Virginia Tech.

If a consistently high level of success over a long period of time is the measure of a great program, then Georgia Tech's golf program under Bruce Heppler would certainly meet the standard. His peers recognized this in 2013 when they inducted him into the Golf Coaches Association of America Hall of Fame.

Tech is currently on a run unprecedented in school history and perhaps unmatched by any other in Division I - eight Atlantic Coast Conference titles in the last 10 years and four trips to match play at the NCAA Championship in the last six.

Heppler has guided the Yellow Jackets to the NCAA Championship every year since 1998, and helped author 11 top-8 finishes in the Finals, including three runner-up showings.

Tech has advanced to match play at the NCAA Championship for the four times in the seven years the format has been used, and is one of only two programs that have advanced to match play four times.

During his tenure, Tech has won or shared 11 Atlantic Coast Conference titles. Only two ACC coaches have led their teams to more ACC titles than has Heppler. The Yellow Jackets have captured or shared 46 team titles overall.

He was named ACC Coach of the Year in 2014 for the eighth time, more than any coach in ACC history except one, and was a finalist for the GCAA's Dave Williams national coach of the year award.

Since 2000, the Yellow Jackets have finished in the top 10 of the final Golfstat rankings 11 times, and in the final Golfweek/Sagarin top 10 13 times. Tech has not finished lower than 14th in either ranking in any year.

Heppler has recruited and developed his share of star players as well. The Yellow Jackets have had at least a pair of All-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees in 16 of the last 17 years, and landed four members of the team on the squad twice (2005, 2011). Tech has had at least two players earn All-America honors 14 of the last 16 years, and Ollie Schniederjans became the Jackets' 20th first-team selection in 2014. Three of his players, Matt Kuchar, Bryce Molder and Troy Matteson, have been named national players of the year.

Seven of his Tech players are members of the PGA Tour, including Roberto Castro, Chesson Hadley, Matt Kuchar, Troy Matteson, Bryce Molder, Nicholas Thompson and Cameron Tringale, while Paul Haley and Matt Weibring, have status on the Web.com Tour. Several others are playing professionally either in the United States, Canada or abroad.

Heppler has been named to coach the United States team in the Palmer Cup this summer, the second time he has earned that honor. Kuchar, Molder, Castro, Hadley, Tringale, White and Ollie Schniederjans have all played for the USA in Palmer Cup competition, with Schniederjans taking a second turn this summer along with teammate Anders Albertson.

Kuchar, Molder, Thompson and Tringale have represented the United States in the Walker Cup matches. Twice, in 1998 and 2013, five or more of the Heppler's active Tech players have qualified to play in the U.S. Amateur. Six of Tech's seven returning players this year competed in the 2013 Amateur in Brookline, Mass., an unprecedented feat.

On the conference level since 1985, when the Yellow Jackets won their first ACC Championship, Tech has earned more NCAA Championship berths than any team except Clemson. The Jackets have earned more top-10, more top-5 and more top-2 finishes in NCAA Championship competition than any other ACC team. Tech also has had more All-America selections (61) than any other ACC team during the same period except the Tigers.

His players have been just as successful in the classroom. Tech's golf program has been recognized with a perfect Academic Progress Report score of 1000 for 10 straight years, and every senior has graduated.

Twelve different players under Heppler have been named All-America Scholars by the Golf Coaches Association of America, which requires a minimum 3.2 GPA and participation in at least 75 percent of a team's events. Two, All-Americans Bryce Molder and Roberto Castro, have received the NCAA's Top VIII Award, an honor given to eight student-athletes from all sports each year and recognizes those who excel in their sport and in the classroom, and exhibit high character, leadership and service to others.

It didn't take long for Heppler to restore the glory to Tech's golf program following a couple of lean years in the mid-1990s. After recruiting future All-

Americans Kuchar and Molder, Heppler had the Yellow Jackets back in the NCAA Tournament in his third season, where they finished third, just four shots off the lead. Tech also was ranked No. 1 in the nation during the course of the year and won the NCAA East Regional.

Even better things were to come as Tech captured the first of its ACC titles under Heppler in 1999. In 2000 the Yellow Jackets came the closest to an NCAA Championship in their history, tying for first after 72 holes with Oklahoma State before losing a one-hole playoff. On the year, Tech captured four team titles and finished in the top four in each event it entered.

During the 2001 campaign, the Jackets won their second ACC crown in three years, the second under Heppler, captured a school-record-tying five tournament wins during the year and finished fourth in the NCAA Championship. For his efforts, Heppler was named ACC Coach of the Year and guided three All-Americans in Molder, who was also the consensus National Player of the Year, Matteson and Kris Mikkelsen.

In 2002, Heppler led the Yellow Jackets to arguably the best season in school history, as Tech captured seven team titles and finished second at the NCAA Championship. In the process, Heppler earned National and ACC Coach of the Year honors. During the year, the Jackets won the school's eighth ACC title, while placing all five starters on GCAA All-America teams. Under Heppler's tutelage, Matteson became the third Tech player to win the national individual title.

Tech has dominated the Atlantic Coast Conference in recent years, winning eight of the last 10 titles and six of the last seven. The Yellow Jackets have been to the NCAA Tournament every year since 1998, and only twice in that time failed to advance out of a regional. In the seven years the NCAA has conducted the current medal/match play format for the championship, Tech has advanced to match play four times.

A 55-year-old native of St. George, Utah, Heppler has demonstrated his strength as a recruiter by attracting both National Players of the Year during 1997-98 and the ACC Players of the Year for 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2001. His first recruit at Tech was Kuchar, who won the 1997 U.S. Amateur Championship and was named the ACC Player of the Year and the Fred Haskins National Player of the Year in 1998. Molder was the Jack Nicklaus Player of the Year in 1998 and in 2001, along with being named the ACC Player of the Year in 1999, 2000 and 2001.

Heppler, a dean's list student at Brigham Young, earned his bachelor's degree in accounting from BYU in 1985, and later received his master's degree in sport management from Massachusetts in 1988. He played golf for one year at Dixie Junior College in St. George before transferring to Brigham Young.

He became a certified public accountant in 1985 and spent one year in the firm of Huber and Associates in Salt Lake City, then began his collegiate coaching career in 1987 as the men and women's golf coach at Amherst. He then spent two years as an administrative assistant at UNLV, becoming the assistant men's golf coach at UNLV in 1989. He spent two years in that role before moving to Oklahoma State in 1991.

"Georgia Tech is a great fit for me," said Heppler. "This is one of the five or six best programs right now if you look around at college golf's successful teams since the '90s. We have a lot of alumni on the PGA Tour, which is great for the school. Young people can see they have a chance to be player of the year or win a national championship here. It's a great school academically, which is a real draw with the general pool of talent out there interested in playing college golf."

Heppler is married to the former Traci Schull of Southbury, Conn., and they have a son, Zakary, and a daughter, Moriah. Heppler is actively involved with Atlanta Alliance for Children and is a member of the Golf Coaches Association of America.

BRENNAN WEBB

After a year and a half as assistant coach at one of the nation's fastest-growing collegiate golf programs, Brennan Webb joined the Georgia Tech staff as assistant coach in December of 2012, and he was promoted to associate head coach during the summer of 2014.

He has helped guide Tech to the ACC Championship in 2014 and 2015 and to the match play bracket of the NCAA Championship twice in three years with the Yellow Jackets, and to nine tournament victories altogether. The Jackets have finished among the nation's top 10 teams all three of his years on the Flats.

Webb has helped mentor two of the greatest players in Tech history in Ollie Schniederjans, who has been a first-team All-American and ACC Player of the Year twice, and Anders Albertson, who has made the All-ACC team three times and won the Byron Nelson Award as a senior. He has also helped recruit six of the nation's top 50 junior players over the past two years.

Webb came to Tech from the University of South Florida, whose men's golf program posted seven top-10 finishes, including three in the top 5, during the 2011-12 season. He also helped mentor Trey Valentine, who was named BIG EAST Freshman of the Year and this year led the Bulls to a spot in NCAA match play. He also assisted with fund-raising efforts, recruiting and scheduling, helped manage the team facility and directed the USF Invitational Tournament.

During his time with the Bulls, he signed two of the top five players in Florida for the program in his first recruiting class, and helped USF rise to a national ranking of No. 51 from one that had been 191st in the pre-season.

"In a sport where you have only two coaches, it's imperative that you have someone who can assist in all aspects of the program, which includes fund-raising, recruiting, player development and managing the team day-to-day," said Heppler, who has been at the helm of the Tech program since 1995. "His skill set from day one was exceptional in all these areas, which has led him to have a significant impact on this program and its success. We certainly realize that opportunities are going to come his way, and this is our way of demonstrating to him our appreciation for what he brings each day, and that he plays a critical role in our success. This will ensure continuity in our recruiting and the development of our current players."

Webb took the assistant coaching position at USF after playing several years on various professional circuits and in 11 different countries. He was a fully exempt member on the PGA Web.com Tour in 2009, logging three top 25 finishes. In 2010, he competed in the Zurich Classic on the PGA Tour. He reached the second stage of the PGA Tour Qualifying School eight times in nine attempts. His wins as a pro include the 2010 Coors Light Open in Fort Myers, as well as victories on the Hooters Tour and in Canada.

"I am very honored to be involved with what I believe is the best golf program in the country," said Webb. "The last two seasons working with and learning from Coach Heppler has been an invaluable experience, and I look forward to many more. Getting to be around the finest student athletes in the country, day in a day out, is the most rewarding experience a coach can hope for. I feel beyond fortunate that I get to continue to do that at Georgia Tech for the foreseeable future."

A native of Ontario, Webb represented Canada in several international amateur tournaments, including appearances in the U.S., British, Canadian and Western amateur championships. He also represented Canada in the World Junior Championship.

Additionally, Webb has been a part-time PGA Tour caddy for Garrett Willis, John Huston and Robert Damron between 2002-11, and was owner-operator of DSP Golf Academy at the South Muskoka Golf and Country Club in his hometown of Bracebridge, Ontario from 1998-2001.

Webb played collegiately at East Tennessee State, whose team was ranked No. 1 in the nation and finished third in the NCAA Championship during his junior year and won three Southern Conference titles. He earned his bachelor's degree in finance from East Tennessee State in December of 1997.

Webb and his wife, Carrie, have two daughters, Nalla and Skye.

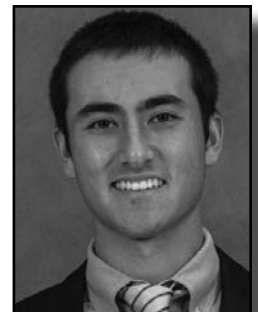
