#### Yellow Jackets Return To NCAA Tournament

• For the first time since 2004, the Georgia Tech Volleyball team is headed to the NCAA Tournament. The Yellow Jackets are the No. 3 seed in the Los Angeles sub-regional and will face No. 2 Baylor (22-9) in the first round on Friday at 8:30 p.m. ET. No. 8 national seed UCLA (23-8) and Long Beach State (22-8) will play the other first round match at Pauley Pavilion at 11:00 p.m. ET.

• The two winners from Friday night will then square off Saturday at 10 p.m. ET with a trip to the Sweet 16 on the line.

· The winner of the Los Angeles sub-re-

gional will face the winner of the Columbus, Ohio sub-regional in Gainesville, Fla. next weekend. Ohio State, No. 9 California, Lipscomb and Cincinnati are in that sub-regional.

• Free live video and stats will be available for all three matches this weekend. Visit the tournament central link on www.RamlinWreck.com for links.

• Under first-year head coach Tonya Johnson, Georgia Tech compiled a 21-9 overall record and went 15-5 in ACC play to finish third. Tech earned one of four at-large bids from the ACC joining Duke, Clemson and Miami. Regular season champion Florida State, which earned a No. 3 national seed, gave the league a record five teams in this year's field.

#### It's Been A While

• The Jackets are making their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2004, but have had some success in eight prior trips. Tech is 9-8 (.529) all-time in the NCAA Tournament (see box on left for complete results) and has won at least one match all but two times. Georgia Tech has advanced to the Sweet 16 twice (2004) as well as the Elite Eight in its last appearance back in 2004.

#### Scouting The Field

• The Yellow Jackets have a very limited history against the other three teams in L.A. Tech has never faced Baylor and is 0-2 against both UCLA and Long Beach State.

• The last time the Yellow Jackets faced UCLA, the third-ranked Bruins beat them in the second round of

the 1994 NCAA Tournament, also in L.A. • The Jackets' last match against Long Beach State was a five-set loss on Nov. 28, 2003 in the Baden Thanksgiving Tournament.

• Baylor (22-9) earned an at-large bid out of the Big 12 Conference after finishing tied for fourth in league play with an 11-9 mark. The Bears will be playing in the tournament for the first time since 2001 and just the third time in program history with the only other appearance in 1999. Baylor is 1-2 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.

• No. 8 national seed UCLA finished the regular season with a 23-8 overall record and in a tie for second in the Pacific-10

• At one point this season, Hunter had a string of 19 straight matches with at least 10 kills.

• In Georgia Tech's regular season finale at Clemson (Nov. 27), Hunter recorded her first career double-double. She posted career-highs of 20 kills and 11 digs helping the Jackets to a five-set win on the road. • Hunter is hitting .235 on the season and also averages 0.78 digs per set and 0.30 blocks per set.

• Coming into this season, Hunter's careerhigh for kills was 13. In 2009, she has topped that on 14 different occasions.

#### Mead Makes Bid For ACC Freshman Of The Year

• Freshman Monique Mead has lived up to the hype surrounding her coming out of high school. Tabbed the 2009 Gatorade Player of the Year for Georgia and a second-team high school All-American, the Newnan, Ga., native began her career in style. Playing in front of a sell-out crowd at O'Keefe Gym against in-state rival Georgia, Mead recorded a double-double with 20 kills and 10 digs as the Jackets knocked off the Bulldogs in five sets. • Mead also posted a double-double the next day against Austin Peay (11 kills, 10 digs) en route to ACC Player of the Week honors.

• Mead is second on the team and seventh in the ACC averaging 3.04 kills per set this year. She has reached double-figures in 21 of Tech's 30 matches. Mead has tallied at least 15 kills in five matches, including a career-high 21 against Miami on Nov. 13.

• Mead is also averaging 1.94 digs per set and 0.77 blocks.

#### Mash Is Dishing It Out

• Junior Mary Ashley Tippins is another one of several Yellow Jackets taking advantage of increased playing time. "Mash" is starting every match for the first time in her career and has led the Tech offense to some impressive numbers.

• The setter from Atlanta is first in the ACC and 18th nationally dishing out 11.28 assists per set.

• Despite playing in just 40 matches over her first two seasons, Tippins ranks sixth in Tech history averaging 10.25 assists per set and is eighth with 2,302 career helpers.

• Tippins recorded her first career double-double Oct. 4 at Miami with 60 assists and 10 digs and now has four in the last two months.

• Tippins is sixth in the ACC with 0.32 service aces per set and is chipping in with 1.92 digs per set as well.

#### Stawicka Is A Blocking Machine

• Sophomore Asia Stawicka has been doing it for the Jackets both offensively and defensively this season. She ranks seventh in the ACC with a .330 hitting percentage and is also fifth with a team-high 1.08 blocks per set.

The Warsaw, Poland native has 122 total blocks this season, including a career-high 10 against Mississippi Sept. 12 which is tied for the fifth-most in the ACC this season.
Stawicka ranks eighth in Tech history with 1.08 blocks per set.

#### Seniors Get Back To Tourney

• On a team which features nine underclassmen, seniors Chrissy DeMichelis and Brittany Roderick get to end their Tech careers in style with what they hope is a long run in the NCAA Tournament.

• DeMichelis and Roderick have led this young team which features seven freshmen and the results are evident on the floor.

• DeMichelis is 10th in school history in kills per set (3.06) and also sixth in solo blocks (74). • This season, the Aurora, Colo. native is 10th in the ACC in kills (2.94) and third on the team in total blocks (63) while registering at least 10 kills in all but six matches. She has over 1,000 kills in her career and set the Tech single-match record with six solo blocks against Virginia Tech in 2007.

• Roderick, meanwhile, broke out for a career-high in kills this season (2.08) and is averaging nearly two per set over the last two years for the Yellow Jackets. The Orlando, Fla., native has registered 16 matches of 10 or more kills over the past two years while playing in every set. In her senior year, she ranks ninth in the ACC in hitting percentage (.323) and is among the team leaders in blocks (62).

#### Getting It Done At O'Keefe

• With a 13-3 record at home this season, the Yellow Jackets have posted a stellar 170-48 (.780) record at O'Keefe Gymnasium since the volleyball team began playing matches there in 1995.

• Georgia Tech has won at least 10 matches at O'Keefe Gym in each of the last eight seasons and is consistantly among the nation's leaders in attendance.

• Tech's success at home is partially due to the remarkable crowd support that the Yellow Jackets receive each and every match.

• The Yellow Jacket's 2009 season opening win over Georgia was played in front of the third-ever sell-out crowd (2,000) at O'Keefe.

#### Johnson Proving The Projections Wrong

• With a new coach and just six returning players, Georgia Tech was picked to finish eighth in the ACC preseason poll and had just one preseason All-ACC selection. • All first-year head coach Tonya Johnson has done is prove them wrong. Johnson, a former assistant coach at national powers Texas and LSU, quickly won the Tech fans over by beating in-state rival Georgia in her first career match. In her first season, she has led the Jackets to a thirdplace finish in the ACC, 21 wins and the program's first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 2004.

NCAA Tournament teams in school history. The 2004 Yellow Jackets were the last ACC team to go undefeated in conference play (16-0) and if not for the 2009 Jackets, Florida State would have accomplished the feat this season.

• Tech upset then-No. 17 Florida State 3-2 on Oct. 2 in Tallahassee and that would be the Seminole's only loss in ACC play. In fact, it was one of only two losses all year for Florida State, the No. 3 national seed in this year's field of 64. FSU's only other loss came at the hands of then-No. 5 Florida 3-2 in Gainesville.

The win for the Yellow Jackets in Tallahassee was the program's first win against a ranked opponent on the road since upsetting No. 5 Nebraska 3-2 on Sept. 14, 2003.
All three of Tech's set wins that October night came in extra points as it battled from behind for most of the match.

#### Tech Picks Up Two Tournament Wins

• Georgia Tech won each of its home tournaments this season, the 12th time in history it has won at least two regular season tourney's.

• The Jackets beat Georgia, Austin Peay and Mercer to win the season-opening Regency Suites Invitational (Aug. 28-29) and then knocked off Clemson, Southeast Missouri and Ole Miss en route to the Courtyard by Marriott Classic (Sept. 11-12) title a couple of weeks later.




Tonya Johnson, a six-year assistant and associate head coach at Texas, was named the seventh head volleyball coach in Georgia Tech history on January 9, 2009.

Johnson wasted no time in winning over the Tech fans as her first career match was a thrilling 3-2 win over arch-rival Georgia (Aug. 28, 2009) in front of a sellout crowd at O'Keefe Gym. Picked to finish eighth in the ACC, Johnson has led the Yellow Jackets back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004. She compiled a 21-9 (.700) record in the regular season and earned a thirdplace finish in ACC play with a 15-5 mark.

Johnson was an assistant coach under Jerritt Elliott at Texas for five years before being promoted to associate head coach in 2008. She helped guide the Longhorns to the 2008 NCAA Final Four following back-to-back Regional Final appearances in 2006 and 2007. The Longhorns concluded last season with a 31-3 record after recording more than 20 victories in each of the four seasons prior.

An excellent recruiter on the national level, Johnson helped Elliott land the nation's second-ranked recruiting classes in each of the last three seasons (2006-08).

#### 1st Season As Head Coach At Georgia Tech 21-9 (.700)

Texas' 2009 recruiting class is also expected to be among the country's best, with the signing of the nation's top- and fifth-ranked prep players. A Longhorn has earned the Big 12's Conference Freshman of the Year honor each of the last three seasons, one of whom has also been named the National Freshman of the Year.

In addition to serving as the recruiting coordinator, Johnson worked with the Longhorns' outside hitters, three of whom received All-America accolades over her last three seasons at Texas. Juliann Faucette, the National Freshman of the Year in 2007, was tabbed a firstteam AVCA All-American in 2007 after receiving first team Big 12 honors as a freshman. Ashley Engle, a right-side hitter that earned Big 12 Freshman of the Year honors in 2006, was named a firstteam AVCA All-American in 2008 after being tabbed to the AVCA All-America second team in 2006, and Destinee Hooker received first-team AVCA All-America honors in 2008 after earning second-team accolades in 2007 and honorable mention recognition in 2006.

Prior to her arrival at Texas in 2003, Johnson served as the top volleyball assistant at LSU from 1998-2003 under Fran Flory, where she was responsible for the majority of the Tigers' recruiting efforts. Johnson began her collegiate coaching career as an assistant under Flory at Kentucky in 1995.

Johnson was a four-year letterwinner at LSU from 1987-90, helping the Tigers to Southeastern Conference titles in 1989 and 1990. She led her Tiger team to the NCAA Final Four her senior year after LSU advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1989.

Prior to joining the collegiate coaching ranks, Johnson taught at Wellington Landings Middle School in Boca Raton, Fla., while serving as an assistant coach at Olympic Heights High School and coaching the Florida Gold Coast club team.
