GEORGIA 70, GEORGIA TECH 68

The officials sided with Georgia this time, counting a basket by Shon Coleman with 1.9 seconds left to give the Bulldogs a thrilling 70-68 victory over Georgia Tech. Eleven days after a controversial call in the Yellow Jackets football victory over Georgia, the men in stripes figured in game between the state rivals.

Georgia Tech trailed throughout the game until Jason Collier finished a barrage of three-pointers, hitting from outside the arc with 37.7 seconds remaining to even the score at 68. Georgia set up for a final shot, working the ball inside to Anthony Evans, whose first attempt was blocked by Jon Babul. Evans got his own rebound and put up another shot that missed. Coleman quickly grabbed the loose ball and flipped it through the hoop.

But the officials waived off the basket, apparently thinking the 35-second shot clock had run out before the shot left Coleman's hands. Since the controversy involved a timing play, the officials were look at a replay of the sequence. For more than six minutes, cials asked the television crew to rewind the play over and over. Finally, when convinced that 2.9 seconds were left when the Coleman got the ball away, the officials ruled that Coleman got the shot away 0.2 seconds before the shot clock ran out.

Tech had one last chance, throwing a length-of-the-court pass to Shaun Fein, whose desperation three-pointer failed to hit iron.

Collier scored 26 points for the Yellow Jackets, who shot only 38 percent (27-of-71) and trailed by as many as 13 points in the second half. Tech got back in the game by hitting four straight three-pointers but still trailed 66-58 when D.A. Layne hit a couple of free throws for the Bulldogs. But T.J. Vines hit a trey with 1:21 left and Collier's final three evened the score for the first time since it was 0-0. Overall, Tech hit 10-of-34 outside the arc.

Layne scored 19 points to lead Georgia. Evans added 16, while Coleman and Adrian Jones had 13 apiece.

Tech, which has not won in Athens since 1976, failed to duplicate its stirring comeback a year earlier, when the Jackets rallied from 15 points down in the final 10 minutes to beat Georgia 84-79 in overtime.

On Tech's next possession, Akins missed a drive in the lane and Keith Bogans got the rebound to Prince, who again made one of two free throws. Desmond Allison added two more free throws and Prince had a final dunk on an alley-oop from Bogans with four seconds left.

Jason Collier led Georgia Tech with 21 points and added eight rebounds. Jones had nine rebounds.

The Wildcats made 30 of a season-high 73 shots (41.1 percent). and finished with a 49-34 rebounding edge, including a 20-9 advantage on the offensive boards. Tech shot 28-of-66 from the field (42.4 percent), including 12-of-34 from three-point range.

Shane Battier shook off a poor shooting first half to score 19 points as No. 6 Duke used a late run for an 82-57 win over Georgia Tech, which lost for the seventh straight time to Duke and for the 23rd time in its last 27 games in Cameron Indoor Stadium. Battier was 1-for-7 from the field in the opening half, but scored 10 points during a 16-4 Duke run that turned an eight-point lead into a 70-50 score with 4:38 left.

The 6-foot-8 junior closed the run with a pair of three-pointers as Duke outscored Georgia Tech 26-11 over the final 9:17.

Alvin Jones led the Yellow Jackets with 19 points and 13 rebounds. Jason Collier, second in the ACC in points and rebounds, added 13 points and 13 rebounds.

Duke pushed a four-point lead early in the second half to 11 as Tech managed just two baskets in a seven-minute span. But the Blue Devils struggled to put the Yellow Jackets away until Battier caught fire late. Duke had scored 100 or more points in four of its last six games, but the Yellow Jackets held the score down this time with solid interior defense from the 7-foot Collier and 6-11 Jones.

Tech also benefited from Duke's cold outside shooting early. The Blue Devils were only 4-for-12 from beyond the arc in the opening 20 minutes before heating up in the second half. Neither team led by more than four points in a close first half before Jason Williams hit a three-pointer and a 12-footer, and Battier sank a long-range shot for a 36-29 lead before the Jackets closed to 38-33 at intermission.

Jason Collier led the Yellow Jackets with 21 points, but Tech shot just 34.5 percent from the field, including just 4-for-19 from three-point range.

NC State led by as many as 13 points midway through the second half before missing six straight shots and turning it over twice as the Jackets closed to 61-56 on a Shaun Fein three-pointer with 2:08 left. Freshman Clarence Moore had 15 points and 10 rebounds and Alvin Jones blocked seven shots as Georgia Tech snapped a four-game losing streak in the Atlantic Coast Conference, routing Virginia, 68-47, at Alexander Memorial Coliseum. Tech took control with an 18-0 run in the first half, limiting Virginia to its lowest output of the season

Moore, making his second start since coach Bobby Cremins changed the lineup, also had, five steals. The 6-foot-11 Jones took advantage of a Virginia team with no starter taller than 6-7, scoring 14 points. Jones' seven blocks were a career high for a conference game, though it was four short of his overall best. The Yellow Jackers won despite a subpar game by Jason Collier, who got into foul trouble and managed just seven points.

Virginia made only 27.6 percent from the field (16-of-58), finishing 15 points below its previous low-scoring game of the season. The Cavs, the ACC's third-best shooting team (47 percent), made just 2-of-19 outside the three-point arc. Donald Hand, Virginia's leading scorer at 16 points per game, fouled out with 3:52 remaining and just two points on the scoresheet, his worst performance of the season.

In holding Virginia to 47 points, Tech allowed its fewest points in an ACC game since a 48-43 win over Maryland on Feb. 19, 1985, while the 21-point win was Tech's largest margin of victory against a conference team since defeating Florida State by 21 on Jan. 27, 1996. Virginia's 27.6 percent shooting from the field was the Jackets' best defensive performance against an ACC team since limited Virginia to 24.7 percent in a 68-56 victory in the 1982 ACC Tournament

Virginia led 15-11 after Roger Mason's short jumper with 10:31 remaining in the first half. The Cavaliers didn't score again for more than seven minutes as Tech reeled off 18 consecutive points. During that span, Virginia missed 13 shots from the field and all four of their free-throw attempts. After making six of their first 10 shots, the Cavs went 2-for-20 the rest of the half.

The Jackets took control without Collier, their leading scorer and rebounder who picked up his third foul with 12:38 remaining in the half and sat out the rest of the period. He finally scored his first basket on a three-pointer with 9:26 remaining. He added another trey with 5:24 to go, helping Tech pull away after Virginia cut the lead to 51-42.

Third-ranked Duke started a new streak in the Atlantic Coast Conference as the Blue Devils recovered from a home loss to Maryland—ending its 31-game ACC winning streak—with an 84-65 victory over Georgia Tech.

Six Blue Devils scored in double figures, including Chris Carrawell and Nate James with 15 points apiece, to lead Duke, which committed only seven turnovers. By comparison, the Yellow Jackets gave the ball away 21 times, leading to 38 points for the Blue Devils.

Duke took control right away, racing to a 25-10 lead just over eight minutes into the game and maintaining a double-digit margin the rest of the way. The Blue Devils pushed the margin to as many 19 points before settling for a 45-31 margin at halftime on Mike Dunleavy Ir.'s spinning, twisting shot in the lane just before the buzzer. Tech got no closer than 48-35 and trailed by as many as 27 points.

Georgia Tech was coming off its largest ACC victory in more than four years, a 68-47 rout of Virginia. The Jackets used a zone defense to limit the Cavaliers to 27.6 percent shooting, but Duke shot nearly 50 percent (29-of-60), busting the zone with eight three-pointers. Shaun Fein led Tech with 15 points and Jason Collier added 14.

Ron Hale scored 21 points, including a pair of free throws with 7.1 seconds left that proved to the game winners as seventh-seeded Florida State defeated eighth-seeded Georgia Tech, 63-62, in the first round of the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament. The game was the final contest for Tech head coach Bobby Cremins after compiling a 354-237 record in 19 seasons.

Tech had a chance to tie the game with 17 seconds left, but Collier's baseline hook shot bounced off the rim. Antwaun Dixon and Hale each made two free throws as Tech lost its fifth straight ACC tourney game. Collier led the Jackets, who shot missed 12 of 18 free throws, with 19 points.

The Jackets trailed by two at the half, but fell behind by as many as nine midway through the second period before going on a 7-0 run to close to 53-52 with 3:26 left on a slam dunk by Alvin Jones. But Hale sank a 3-pointer 23 seconds later, and after a hook shot by Collier, Delvon Arrington made a pair of free throws to push the Florida State lead to four.

Neither team led by more than seven points in a lackluster first half. Tech started 2-for-15 from the field, including a stretch of nine straight misses from three-point range. Meanwhile, the Seminoles began 5-for-20 and went almost nine minutes during one portion of the half with just one field goal. Tech missed 11 of 16 free throws in the opening 20 minutes to trail 25-23 at the half.
