2017-18 MEN'S TENNIS NOTES

Georgia Tech's men's tennis team competed in an NCAA regional for the third straight year and for the 17th time in program history, defeating Minnesota in the round of 64 before falling to Florida in the round of 32.

Team Update

Georgia Tech (18-8, 8-4 ACC) finished the spring No. 19 in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association rankings, and posted its best record since 2011. The Yellow Jackets made the NCAA Championship for the third straight year, finishing the regular season in fourth place in the Atlantic Coast Conference standings. The Yellow Jackets posted a 10-3 record at home, and went 1-1 in the ACC Championship, falling to No. 1 Wake Forest in the semifinals.

Singles Update

The Yellow Jackets were led at the top of their lineup by 6-foot-7 junior Christopher Eubanks (Atlanta, Ga.), who finished the spring No. 7 in the ITA singles rankings with an 18-2 dual match record and an 11-1 ACC mark. Named the ACC Player of the Year fot the second-straight season and an All-American, he also received a bid to the NCAA Singles Championship for the second consecutive year. Eubanks advanced to the quarterfinals of the singles championship, a first for the Yellow Jackets since Bryan Shelton in 1988. Eubanks finished the 2016-17 season ranked No. 8 in the ITA rankings.

Sophomore Andrew Li (Hong Kong) held down the No. 2 spot for the Yellow Jackets. He entered the national rankings at No. 61 following the Fall 2016 season (Nov. 28). The sophomore reached as high as No. 52 (Feb. 6). He clinched the regular season win for the Jackets against Duke before repeating the performance against the Blue Devils in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals. Senior Carlos Benito (Madrid, Spain) took control of the No. 3 position in the lineup, clinching the 4-3 victory at Auburn early in the season. He also clinched the win voer NC State at the last home match of the regular season for the Jackets. Freshman Carlos Divar (Vitoria, Spain) jumped right into the lineup upon his January 2017 arrival on The Flats, posting a 13-8 record in the dual match season. Senior Cole Fiegel (Alachua, Fla.), junior Daniel Yun (Marietta, Ga.) and freshman Chris Yun (Marietta, Ga.) shuffled through the bottom three spots of the lineup during the season.

Doubles Update

Tech took the doubles point in 12 matches this season, dropping it in 13. The Jackets struggled with some combinations. Carlos Benito and Carlos Divar teamed up for the first half of the season before Benito returned to playing with CHristopher Eubanks at the one position. Divar moved back from the two and one positions to lay ath the three with Daniel Yun. Andrew Li and Cole Fiegel remained steady throughout the season, posting an 11-3 record in the dual match season

Eubanks and Thorne Take ACC Honors

Head coach Kenny Thorne was named the 2017 Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Tennis Coach of the Year. Thorne earned the accoloade for the second time in his career, the first coming in 1999. He led the team to its most successful season since 2011, going 10 games over .500, boasting an 18-8 overall record and going 8-4 in ACCC play for the second-straight season.

Christopher Eubanks was named the 2017 Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Tennis Player of the Year for the second-straight year, becoming just the fifth player in league history to win twice, while also headlining the 2017 All-ACC Team. Tech sophomore Andrew Li was named All-ACC Third Team.

Eubanks was the first Yellow Jacket to be voted Player of the Year twice and the first to receive the honor in back-toback seasons. He is only the ffth athlete in ACC history to take home the award in consecutive seasons. Eubanks finished the season with a 31-6 record and an 18-2 mark in dual match play.

Eubanks Turns Professional

Christopher Eubanks announed on Oct. 23, 2016 that he would turn professional immediately, forgoing his final year of collegiate eligibility at Georgia Tech.

By forgoing his final season, Eubanks finishes his impressive three-year career as one of the best to ever don the White and Gold. With a career singles mark of 90-33 (37-17 in tournaments) and a 53-42 overall doubles record, the Atlanta native refused the drop a home contest in his final two years. Eubanks finishes as the first Yellow Jacket and just the fifth player in conference history to earn two ACC Player of the Year awards while also being the fifth student-athlete in program history to be named a two-time all-American. A three-time all-ACC honoree, Eubanks was also the recipient of the USTA/ITA Sportsmanship Award in 2016 and received the 2017 ITA Arthur Ashe, Jr. Leadership and Sportsmanship Award.

In the program record books, Eubanks finishes tied-fifth in all-time career wins while finishing 10th in career win percentage (.732). He also finishes tied-second in season wins (34 - 2015-16) and tied-fourth in season wins in dual matches (21 - 2015-16). His 21 doubles dual match victories in 2015-16 also rank him third all-time at Georgia Tech.

Eubanks on Turning Pro

""I can't possibly put into words how thankful I am for my time at Georgia Tech. I can truly say that I've been extremely blessed to have had the opportunity to play at an institute such as this. It has been a great three years and I've made friendships and relationships that will last a lifetime. I'm incredibly excited for what's ahead and ready to embark on this new journey in my life."

Kenny Thorne on Eubanks

"At Georgia Tech we know and believe you can be an outstanding athlete, an incredible student and also be a person of high integrity. Chris embodied all three of these values. We always focus on the process of getting better every day and that was what Chris did during his time at Georgia Tech. We are extremely grateful for the way he represented Georgia Tech and for the recognition he brought to our program. But I'm most proud of him for the high character he displayed on our team and that is not just nice words for a press release... I mean that. He is now pursuing a professional dream that became more of a reality with the success he had over the summer. Chris will always be part of our Georgia Tech family and we wish him the best. We will be cheering for him many years to come."

Tech's NCAA History

Georgia Tech has reached the NCAA Championship each of the last three years, falling in the opening round of the 2015 regional in Oxford, Miss., and falling in the second round in both 2016 and 2017.

Those were Tech's first bids since 2011, when the Yellow Jackets hosted a regional and advanced to the round of 16 by defeating Middle Tennessee State and Mississippi State. Tech then lost to No. 2 seed Southern California in Stanford, Calif. That is the only time Tech has made it out of a regional in the current format of the championship. Tech has made the NCAA Championship field 12 times under head coach Kenny Thorne and 17 times in program history. The Jackets' deepest run in the NCAAs came in 1994, when Tech won three matches before being eliminated. Tech is 11-15 all-time in NCAA Championship competition.

Yellow Jackets Add Two New Faces

Frederick "Zummy" Bauer and Brandon Freestone signed their national letters of intent to join the Jackets' roster in the Fall of 2017. Zummy Bauer comes the Flats from Suwanee, Ga. and will enroll in fall of 2017. Bauer ranks No. 108 in the tennisrecruiting.net rankings. He holds three ITF doubles titles (Bahamas Grade 4, Barbados Grade 4 and Puerto Rico Grade 4). In June of 2016, the Suwanee native won the International Grass Court Championships ITF event in Haverford, Penn.

Coach Kenny Thorne on Zummy Bauer - "We are excited to be signing another local Georgia player of Zummy's caliber. He has been very successful in junior tennis in Georgia and understands the benefits of a Georgia Tech degree as well as the high level of our tennis program. He won a national doubles title earlier this year and plays a good aggressive game style. Zummy can help us in doubles immediately, which is extremely important in reaching our high goals of becoming one of the best teams in the nation. He is a hard worker and will fit in great with our team."

Brandon Freestone comes to The Flats from Roswell, Ga. He is ranked No. 93 nationally among seniors and seventh in Georgia among seniors according to tennisrecruiting.net. Freestone took second place in the Grade 5 International Tennis Federation tournament in Honduras in September 2016. In November 2016, he competed at the South Africa ITF Futures. In 2017, Freestone has notched wins over the No. 36-ranked senio, and the No. 22-ranked junior.

Coach Kenny Thorne on Brandon Freestone - "We are excited about Brandon joining our team this fall. His game is technically sound and he will develop well in our environment. He wants to excel in school as well as on the court and Georgia Tech is the best place to do it. We have had a lot of success with our in-state players developing and helping us tremendously. We look forward to working with Brandon as well as Zummy Bauer this fall."

Tech's ACC Championship History

Georgia Tech has never won an Atlantic Coast Conference championship in men's tennis, though several Yellow Jackets have individual titles to their credit from an era when individual championships were crowned.

Tech has reached the finals four times, two of those under head coach Kenny Thorne in 1999 and 2002. The Jackets also reached the championship match in Thorne's senior year of 1988 and again in 1994. The Jackets earned the fourth seed in the ACC Tournament in 2017, reaching the semifinals.

KEN BYERS TENNIS COMPLEX

A lot of history was made in the Bill Moore Tennis Center. Some of the greatest players in Georgia Tech history took to those courts and improved their games to the point they could reach the pro tour.

Current Georgia Tech men's tennis head coach Kenny Thorne is one of those. He played and coached there in his four decorated years on the Flats (1985-89).

In January of 2013, Thorne witnessed the opening of the Ken Byers Tennis Complex, as the women's tennis team opened the facility with a match against Syracuse and men's team opened a day later against Old Dominion. In a way, it was deja vu for Thorne, who was a freshman the year the Moore Center opened.

"It's just a very unique thing. It's an honor to be coaching here at this time, and it's an honor for all of our student-athletes to have opened a new facility," said the 1989 graduate and 1995 Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame inductee. "That doesn't happen too often in any sport. It's very exciting."

Women's head coach Rodney Harmon, whose team played the first matches on the brand new six-court facility, who was beginning his first season on the Flats, has been around the sport long enough to know something special when he sees it. He's seen it with the Byers Complex.

Ground was broken for the facility on June 15, 2012 and was made possible by a generous gift from alumnus Ken Byers (class of '66) and his wife, Trish.

"It's going to be beautiful and it's going to help both our men's and women's programs stay a factor with the other schools, in our very, very tough conference," said Harmon, who has been in tennis player development for more than 25 years and, as a pro, reached the quarterfinals at the 1982 U.S. Open. "It has a great feeling, which I think will help us set up a home-court advantage because a lot of our fans tend to be very vocal and really support our team."

As advantageous to the team is the amount of space. Off the court, Byers has bigger locker rooms, a lounge, a training facility and more office space for the coaching staffs. The number of available courts for play inside doubled from three to six.

"I think it's going to be big for us," Harmon said. "It allows us to compete year-round, and when the weather gets inclement, both teams have a place to play. We've always had to play outside, and it can get pretty cold sometimes. Now we're going to be able to play indoors and really get prepared for the indoor season, which starts in February."

The doubling of the court space was a key factor in building the new complex.

"You need space and you need quality space and if that means new or renovations then so be it," said former associate athletic director Paul Griffin. "Now, we have an efficient way of running our indoor matches, and because of the weather you wind up playing almost half of your matches indoors be it for wet or for cold."

Thorne and Harmon agree that the opening of the Byers Complex signals the start of big things ahead. Thorne compares the anticipation of the facility's opening to the buzz surrounding the opening of McCarnish Pavilion and expects Tech tennis fans to be as energized as basketball fans.

"It's such a big change and ours is a total change," said Thorne. "It's a whole brand-new complex. There are some really exciting things happening. So hopefully it's going to draw a lot more people out. They come see the facility as well as some great tennis."

Harmon expects the facility to also draw some big-name recruits.

"It's going to give us an opportunity to recruit top-level athletes because now a lot of the top schools have new facilities around the country, whether it's Alabama or Florida State or South Carolina, Texas is getting a new facility built," he said. "So now we have a new facility. It's something that to our recruits that makes us a lot stronger."

The Byers Complex, built on the same footprint where the Moore Center stood, is light years ahead of its predecessor and was overdue as far as keeping Tech's programs current. The



ingenuity in building a facility that could fit so much more into the same space as its predecessor made this project design uniquely Tech.

The former three-court indoor tennis facility was replaced with a state-of-the-art six-court indoor facility. The new steel indoor facility is located next to Tenth Street, just behind the magnolias. It features an entrance lobby, men's and women's coaches offices, men's and women's locker rooms and a team lounge. The indoor facility retains the Bill Moore name and provides seating a little more than 200 spectators.

The outdoor part of the complex consists of six competition courts on the south end of the site and four practice courts located between the indoor facility and the competition courts. A landscaped courtyard area was added between the practice courts and Fowler Street. Outdoor seating, situated between the Griffin Track and the completion courts, provides a view of both competition on the track and action on the tennis courts and includes plenty of space for wheelchair seating. Additionally, an East-West Connector provides a lighted walkway for pedestrians along the track-side of the site to facilitate movement between the North Campus Parking Deck and the McCamish Pavilion.

"Thirty years is a long time," said Griffin. "It's not a matter of different inclusions. It's a matter of improved space. It's a tight footprint. The real estate didn't change, so we had to make some compromises on that and one of the other things was to relocate the indoor facility to the 10th street side of the real estate because it will serve as a buffer from the noise and street from 10th street for the outdoor courts that wasn't there before. So there are a lot of those kinds of features that are now a benefit for the program."

"It has a bunch of other features that are assets to the Institute and to athletics in other ways than just tennis," he added. "There's a seating area for track, a pathway from the parking lot to McCamish Pavilion (Tech's basketball arena across Fowler Street), a parking lot on Atlantic to McCamish, improved sidewalks and streetscapes. So it's a very comprehensive project."

For the school, it's the latest improvement to the campus' Fowler Street entrance, which also includes Mewborn Softball Field and the Brock Indoor Football Facility.

That exciting plan will continue to evolve in years to come. The tennis teams are thrilled to be part of it and are eager to do their part to stir up excitement around campus as they begin spring play. "It is a tremendous commitment." said Harmon. "That whole side of campus, with the new basketball arena, with the tennis facility, with the track and the indoor football complex and baseball and softball, it's now a great corner of campus."

GEORGIA TECH, 1988 19TH YEAR AT TECH 13 NCAA TOURNAMENTS 253-204 RECORD

Kenny Thorne recorded one of the most successful tennis careers by a player from the state of Georgia, winning seven pro titles and defeating four of the world's top-10 players in the 1990's. Some of Thorne's notable victories include wins over Richard Krajicek, Wayne Ferreira, Mark Philippoussis and Todd Martin. As a pro, he achieved his highest singles ranking of No. 121 and a doubles ranking of No. 67. Thorne brings his love of tennis and impressive professional playing experience to his alma mater, Georgia Tech.

Charged with building the Georgia Tech tennis program back to the level it was when he was a player, Thorne was named to the newly-created position of Director of Tennis on June 30, 1998, becoming the ninth head coach in Tech men's tennis history.

Thorne took over the reins of the Tech program after spending one season as the team's assistant coach and wasted little time in taking steps toward his ultimate goal of turning the Yellow Jackets into contenders.

The Yellow Jackets have reached the NCAA Championship 13 times in his 19 years at the helm, and seven of those have advanced past the opening round. Tech made it back for the third straight year in 2017 with its best record since 2011 (18-8, 8-4 ACC). After a two-year absence, the 2010 and 2011 teams reached the second and third rounds of the tournament, respectively, finished fourth in the Atlantic Coast Conference each time (15-7 record), while posting a combined 39-14 dual match record.

During the 2016 season, Thorne surpassed the legendary Tech coach Earle Bortell 228-108-2) for most career coaching victories in the Yellow Jackets' program history. Thorne now has 235 victories over 18 seasons against 195 losses. In 2017 he was named the ACC Coach of the Year after coaching Tech to the fourth seed in the ACC Championships and bringing the team to a season-high ranking of No. 12.

Over the last eight years, Thorne has developed two of the best singles players in Tech history, Guillermo Gomez (2008-11) and current junior Christopher Eubanks, both of whom earned ACC Player of the Year honors. Eubanks advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2017 NCAA Singles Chmapionship and took back-to-back ACC Player of the Year honrs. He has also developed two of the best doubles players in Tech history, Juan Spir, who advanced to the NCAA Doubles Championship semifinals in 2012 and quarterfinals in 2013 with different partners. Spir and Kevin King, Spir's doubles partner for 75 of his Tech-record 103 victories, played in the NCAA Singles Championship as well.

Under Thorne's guidance, Tech had at least one ITA All-American every year from 2009-13, and has had at least one All-Atlantic Coast Conference honoree each year since 2008.

Tech's 2011 team finished the year ranked 13th in the nation and reached the round of 16 at the NCAA Championship, both high-water marks for Tech tennis under Thorne. Tech's 21 wins in 2011 were the most for the Jackets under Thorne and the second most in the history of the program.

As a result, the Tech alum was named the ITA National Coach of the Year, becoming only the fourth Georgia Tech head coach ever to receive such an honor.

Thorne built those Tech squads around four-time All-ACC honoree Gomez, who was named the ACC Player of the Year in 2011 and earned ITA All-American honors three times, and broke Thorne's record for career singles victories. He also recruited another pair of ITA All-Americans in King and Spir, who formed one of the top 10 doubles teams nationally and developed into top-of-the-lineup players in singles, both earning NCAA bids in 2012.

Tech's last three teams in 2015, 2016 and 2017 have been built around Eubanks, a five-star junior player from Atlanta who has helped the Jackets earn NCAA Championship appearances each year and a 49-29 overall record, while Eubanks himself rose to No. 4 in the ITA singles rankings.


Thirteen of Thorne's Tech teams have finished the spring ranked among the top 50 in the ITA team rankings, and eight of them have finished in the top half of the perennially powerful Atlantic Coast Conference.

He has coached 10 different players to All-ACC honors 21 times, and three of his players have been named ACC Player of the Year. Nine different players have earned ITA All-America honors.

Also under Thorne's watch, 13 players have earned bids to the NCAA Singles Championship and eight have made the NCAA Doubles Championship field.

Other highlights include:

 During the 2003 campaign, Georgia Tech earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament and climbed into the 14th spot in the national rankings midway through the year. The Jackets also boasted their first All-America honorees since 1988, as the doubles team of Roger Anderson and Scott Schnugg earned the honor after finishing the year as the country's 10th-ranked tandem. The duo also earned All-ACC honors after winning the league's Flight One Doubles title. Tech finished with a 12-10 record and notched seven wins over ranked opponents, including a 4-2 victory over ninth-ranked Texas on

 In 2002, Tech defeated eight ranked teams and reached the finals of the ACC Championship, en route to a 15-11 dual-match record, while also reaching the NCAA Tournament for the third time in four years under Thorne. In the ACC Tournament, the Jackets upset top-seeded and 14th-ranked Duke in the semifinals by a 4-0 score and ended the Blue Devils four-year reign as ACC Champions. On an individual level, Roger Anderson earned All-ACC honors for the second time and earned his first berth in the NCAA Individual Championship, becoming the first Tech player to do so since 1999.

• During the 2000-01 season, Thorne made great strides toward achieving his goal. When the Yellow Jackets climbed to No. 20 in the national rankings on April 11, they claimed their highest ranking since 1988, when Thorne was an All-American and team captain.

 Thorne led the 2001 Yellow Jackets to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Roger Anderson earned All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors and three Tech players earned ACC Flight championships in singles or doubles.

 Under Thorne's guidance in 2000, Anderson became the first Tech player to earn ACC Rookie of the Year honors after leading the Yellow Jackets with a 24-8 singles record, including a 15-5 mark in dual matches.

 In his first year as head coach in 1999, Thorne earned ACC Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Yellow Jackets to a second-place tie in the regular-season conference standings, a runner-up finish at the ACC Tournament, an NCAA Regional berth and a final national ranking of 32 by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA). Senior Benjamin Cassaigne was named the ACC Player of the Year, earned all-conference honors and captured the ACC Flight Championship at No. 1 singles.

• With Tech's 1999 NCAA Regional berth, Thorne became the first person in ACC history and just the second nationally, joining LSU's Jeff Brown, to lead the same school to post-season competition as a player, assistant coach and head coach since the current NCAA team dual-match format was instituted in 1977. (Prior to 1977, team finishes were determined by an accumulation of points based on individual play.) Thorne helped Tech to NCAA play as a senior in 1988, as an assistant coach in 1998 and as head coach in 1999.

Thome earned an Industrial Engineering degree from Tech in 1989 and during his four seasons as a player from 1985-88, the Jackets posted a 70-38 dual-match record and a 20-7 ACC mark, including wins over nationally-ranked foes such as Georgia and Clemson in 1988, his final season. Tech climbed as high as 10th in the ITA national rankings during Thorne's senior season before the Jackets ended the year ranked 12th nationally.

He qualified for the NCAA singles tournament in 1986 and 1988 and advanced to the second round on both occasions. Thorne also competed in the 1988 NCAA doubles tourney with partner Bryan Shelton. After turning professional in 1989, Thorne spent eight years on the tour, achieving his highest singles ranking of 121 and doubles ranking of 67 in the world. He was also a six-time participant at Wimbledon, the U.S. Open, French Open and Australian Open.

Thorne's best career wins were over 1996 Wimbledon champion Richard Krajicek, ATP No. 11 Wayne Ferreira, Australia's Mark Philippoussis and Todd Martin of the United States. He posted two career ATP doubles titles, one career Challenger singles title and four career Challenger doubles titles.

An All-American in 1988, Thorne finished his Georgia Tech playing career as a four-time All-ACC honoree and the career leader in singles victories with 112. He was also a two-time captain and an Academic All-ACC honoree. Thorne was inducted into the Georgia Tech Athletic Hall of Fame in 1995.

Thorne married former Yellow Jacket cross country standout and Tech Hall of Fame inductee, Bridget Koster, in 1990. The couple has two daughters, Rachel and Kenedy, and two sons, Zachary and Daniel. Rachel was a distance runner on the Tech track team.

JEREMY EFFERDING

ASSISTANT COACH TEXAS A&M, 2017 1ST YEAR AT TECH

eremy Efferding, a former ITA All-American at Texas A&M and ATP professional player, was announced as the assistant coach on the Georgia Tech men's tennis staff on Aug. 9, 2017.

"Derek Schwandt did an incredible job at Georgia Tech and we are happy for him that he got rewarded with a good head coaching job after last season," Thorne said. "I have been looking for the best coach I could find on and off the court to train and mentor our student-athletes. Jeremy is one of the best up-and-coming coaches out there and he is a first class person. He understands what it takes to succeed on the court and in the classroom."

Thorne continued, "He is a great analytical thinker and understands the game very well. I've enjoyed spending time with him talking about developing players for the highest level of the game. Jeremy also plays very well so I wish he still had some eligibility left. He played at the highest level in college and went on the pro tour before sustaining an injury. He and his wife, Mayers, are two incredible people who I am happy to welcome to our Georgia Tech team."

Since wrapping up his All-American playing career at Texas A&M in 2015, Efferding has played professional tennis on the ATP Tour as well as worked as the student assistant coach on the Texas A&M women's tennis staff and, most recently, as a fellow in the United States Tennis Association (USTA) Player Development program.

While in the USTA Player Development program, Efferding was able to work alongside the top national coaches and junior players in the country, receiving training in coaching, mental and physical strength and conditioning, and film review when traveling and coaching at professional events. During his time, he worked under 2005 Wimbledon doubles champion Stephen Huss and USTA national coach and former SEC Head Coach of the Year Sylvain Guichard. Currently working at the USTA Boys 18 National Championships in Kalamazoo, Mich., Efferding is working with the top American players in their junior career.

With Efferding on staff at Texas A&M, the women's tennis team finished No. 16 in the nation, downing six nationally ranked programs – including then-No. 5 Auburn, No. 10 Duke and No. 11 Kentucky – en route to an 18-13 overall record. The Aggies advanced to the NCAA Championship round of 16, where they fell to then-No. 1 seed and eventual national champion Florida.

Beginning his professional career in the summer of 2015, Efferding competed on the circuit overseas in Greece and Portugal as well as in events in the United States. The 24-year-old has amassed 18 career singles victories and four doubles wins.

Efferding was an all-American (2015), three-time all-SEC selection (2013, '14, and '15) and two-time all-SEC Tournament selection (2013, '15) as a 6-foot-2, right-handed singles and doubles player at Texas A&M from 2011-15. A multi-year starter, Efferding cemented his place in the lineup as a sophomore when he defeated the then-No. 1 ranked and eventual 2013 national champion, Alex Domijan of Virginia. He would go on to lead the Aggies to an SEC Tournament Championship in 2015, earning Tournament MVP honors to finish his collegiate career. One of the all-time A&M greats, he currently ranks 20th all-time in the Aggie record books with 58 dual singles victories and 16th in doubles dual wins (59).

VOLUNTEER COACH GEORGIA TECH, 2012 3RD YEAR AT TECH

ormer Georgia Tech All-American tennis player Kevin King joined the Yellow Jackets' men's tennis program as a volunteer assistant coach in January of 2015.

King, who starred for Tech from 2008-12 and graduated with honors in mechanical engineering in 2012, is taking time off from professional tennis to recover from injuries to both his hips and is replacing Brad Horton, who served as volunteer coach the last four years.

The highest-ranked American recruit ever to enroll in Tech's men's tennis program, King left as one of its best-ever doubles players, earning ITA All-American honors in 2011 and All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in 2010, 2011 and 2012. He played near the top of Tech's singles lineup (ranked as high as No. 7 in the nation as a senior) and teamed with Juan Spir to form one of the nation's best doubles teams (ranked as high as No. 2 during the 2011-12 year), and the best ever to play at Tech. The Peachtree City, Ga., resident finished his career with 87 doubles wins (87-39 record), breaking the previous mark of 82 set by Sergio Aquirre. He teamed with Spir for 66 of those wins (66-22 career, in dual matches, 19-8 vs. ACC), and also compiled an 80-41 career singles record, 25-15 in ACC matches.

"I'm excited to be back at Tech and help Kenny and Derek (Schwandt, assistant coach) any way they need me," said King, who has undergone surgery on one hip and will do the same on his other hip later in the spring. "It's good to have another set of eyes on what our players are doing and help them with the perspective of a guy who's ben on tour. I love tennis, love playing and love being around it. I like the guys here a lot. They're hard workers, and they have a lot of talent. Kenny and Derek are great coaches."

He has played professionally on the ITF Pro Circuit and ATP Tour since his graduation in 2012, and has earned berths in the Wimbledon championships and the BB&T Atlanta Open. He has won three ATP Challenger doubles titles playing with his former Tech teammate Spir, two of them on clay-court surfaces and one on hard-court. His high-water marks in the ATP rankings have been No. 202 in singles (Nov. 6, 2017) and No. 114 in doubles (July 28, 2014). He is currently ranked No. 202 in singles and No. 285 in doubles.

A Boca Raton, Fla. native, Efferding graduated from Texas A&M in May 2017 with a bachelor's degree in university studies, health and kinesiology, making the SEC honor roll from 2013-15. He joins the Yellow Jacket family with his wife, Mayers Efferding, with a start date of August 14.








G.P. "BUD" PETERSON



INSTITUTE PRESIDENT KANSAS STATE, 1975

G.P. "Bud" Peterson was appointed as the 11th president of Georgia Tech on April 1, 2009. Under his leadership, Georgia Tech has developed and begun the implementation of a 25-year strategic plan, exceeded the \$1.5 billion goal for Campaign Georgia Tech by 20 percent, grown innovative collaborations and strategic partnerships, expanded the campus infrastructure, attracted startups and established companies to Tech Square, and increased national and global visibility. Notably in that time, applications have tripled, and enrollment has increased by 23 percent.

Peterson came to Georgia Tech from the University of Colorado at Boulder, where he served as chancellor. Prior to that, he served as provost at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in New York, and for 19 years on the faculty and in leadership positions at Texas A&M University. He has worked for NASA and the National Science Foundation (NSF).

Throughout his career, Peterson has played an active role in helping establish the national education and research agendas, serving on many industry, government, and academic task forces and committees. He has served on a number of national accreditation agencies, with a focus on improving and assessing outcomes for higher education. He also has served on congressional task forces, research councils, and advisory boards, including the Office of Naval Research, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, the Department of Energy, the National Research Council, and the National Academy of Engineering.

A distinguished scientist, he was appointed in 2008 by President George W. Bush, and again in 2014 by President Barack Obama, as a member of the National Science Board, which oversees the NSF and advises the U.S. president and Congress on national policy related to science and engineering research and education. In 2010, he was named by U.S. Secretary of Commerce Gary Locke as a member of the National Advisory Council on Innovation and Entrepreneurship. President Obama appointed him to the Advanced Manufacturing Partnership (AMP) steering committee in 2011, and to the AMP 2.0 steering committee in 2013. He is a member of the board of directors of the Association of American Universities. In August 2016, he became chair of the NCAA Board of Governors, the NCAA's highest governing body.

Peterson, a fellow of both the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) and the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA), received the AIAA Distinguished Service Award in 2011. His research has focused on phase change heat transfer in both the cooling of electronic devices and spacecraft thermal control. He is widely published, authoring or co-authoring 16 books or book chapters, 210 refereed journal articles, and more than 170 conference publications. He also holds a total of 13 patents, with one pending.

Peterson earned a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering, a second bachelor's degree in mathematics, and a master's degree in engineering, all from Kansas State University. While at Kansas State, he lettered three years as a tight end/wide receiver for the Wildcats. He earned a Ph.D. in mechanical engineering from Texas A&M University. He and his wife, Val, have four adult children, two of whom are Georgia Tech alumni.



CHARLES ISBELL FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE GEORGIA TECH, 1990

Charles Isbell, senior associate dean and professor in the College of Computing, was named faculty athletics representative (FAR) to the Georgia Tech Athletic Association on June 6, 2017.

The FAR serves as the liaison between the Institute and the Athletic Association on issues regarding rules compliance, developments at the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), and activities related to Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) membership.

"Charles is an engaged leader and innovator at Georgia Tech in numerous areas, and we are very fortunate that he has agreed to add the role as the Institute's new faculty athletics representative to his responsibilities," said Peterson. "On behalf of all of Georgia Tech, I would also like to thank Reggie DesRoches for serving us so well as our FAR for the past three years."

Isbell has been a faculty member at Georgia Tech since 2002, but first came to Tech as a student to earn his bachelor's degree in computer science. He also holds a Ph.D. in computer science from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

His first institutional service role at Tech was with the Institute Undergraduate Curriculum Committee, where he worked with student-athletes returning to finish their degrees.

"Since the very beginning of being here as a faculty member, I've been interested in the way student-athletes interact with the rest of the institution," he said.

Isbell hopes to continue events that DesRoches organized to facilitate faculty and student-athlete interaction. He also hopes to serve as a bridge for faculty members to pursue more research endeavors with the Athletic Association.

"I can't tell you the number of conversations I've had with faculty members who have been interested in working with athletics, but weren't sure how to go about doing it," he said. "I'm going to put energy into making those connections."

For Isbell, understanding the experience of student-athletes is paramount to success in higher education. Athletic achievements can elevate a university's profile to prospective students, and student-athletes' relationship to the university is one that can be used as a model for the broader campus community.

"Anyone interested in higher education and how it has to grow and change has to understand how Division I athletics works at a university," he said. "As higher education changes, we have to think of ourselves more as a community and consider what lets people build connections and keep coming back. It's going to have to happen with all students, faculty, and staff, and athletics can be an example of how to do that well."

While lsbell is a fan and frequent attendee of Georgia Tech athletic events, his support for student-athletes extends beyond the stands.

"I want the student-athletes to know I am here for them, and I intend to talk with them and be a resource for them," he said. "I want them to know that and believe it, and know that I take it very seriously."

Isbell's research focuses on statistical machine learning and interactive artificial intelligence. He teaches several courses both to on-campus students and to students around the world in Tech's Online Master of Science in Computer Science program. His three-year term as FAR began on July 1, 2017.

TODD STANSBURY

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS GEORGIA TECH, 1984

Georgia Institute of Technology introduced former Tech football player Todd Stansbury as the Institute's ninth director of athletics on Sept. 22, 2016.

Since officially arriving back on The Flats on Nov. 28, 2016, Stansbury has identified four strategic priorities for Georgia Tech athletics:

- define the GT athletics brand:
- establish the internal culture: •
- align the internal structure; ٠
- generate new revenue.

To assist in achieving his strategic goals, Stansbury established two new offices within the athletics department — the office of brand and ideation, which works to identify and tell the story of the Yellow Jackets' brand, and the office of innovation, which oversees Georgia Tech's efforts to build on its status as college athletics' leader in innovation, particularly through collaboration and partnerships within the Institute and innovation hubs throughout Atlanta.

He has also enlisted the help of prominent former Georgia Tech student-athletes that are now leaders in their fields. Examples include Stansbury's former teammate Sam Bracken, a New York Times best-selling author and renowned executive coach that has worked with Stansbury and the athletics department to establish a strong internal culture and identify strategic priorities, and volleyball alum Jaime Weston, the National Football League's senior vice president for marketing, creative and branding who is assisting with the Jackets' brand-identification efforts.

Prior to his return to Georgia Tech in 2016, Stansbury served as Oregon State's athletic director since June 2015, which followed a nine-year stint as the university's executive associate athletic director (2003-12). During his time at Oregon State, Stansbury was part of a senior management team that raised \$150 million for a football stadium expansion, in addition to fundraising for the construction of a sports performing center. He also was part of a team that established several career development initiatives for student-athletes.

Stansbury's resume also includes roles as athletic director at the University of Central Florida (2012-15) and East Tennessee State University (2000-03). He was Georgia Tech's assistant athletic director for academics from 1988-1995 under legendary A.D. Homer Rice.

Stansbury grew up in Canada. When he was 10 years old and on vacation with his family in Florida, he befriended several Georgia Tech football players staying at the same hotel. During the drive back home to Ontario, his family stopped on campus to see a practice. That's when Stansbury knew he wanted to play football on The Flats.

The dream came true and he earned varsity letters while at Georgia Tech from 1980-84 as a middle linebacker and on special teams for head coach Bill Curry. He was selected in the third round of the Canadian Football League draft by the Saskatchewan Roughriders in 1984.

As the ninth director of athletics in Georgia Tech history, he follows in the footsteps of storied names such as Rice, John Heisman and Bobby Dodd. He was hired following a national search that began in August 2016 when Mike Bobinski accepted the athletics director position at Purdue University. A nine-member search committee led by Georgia Tech Foundation President Al Trujillo identified candidates. The search process was assisted by Turnkey Search.

"Todd Stansburv is committed to athletes' success both on and off the field." Georgia Tech president Dr. G.P. "Bud" Peterson said at the time of Stansbury's hire. "His global perspective and leadership experience in athletics and development, combined with a lifelong passion for Georgia Tech, make him the ideal candidate. I believe this is one of those rare golden moments in life where opportunity meets ambition. We welcome him home."

"I am honored and humbled to have the opportunity to return to Georgia Tech, a place that has played such a large role in my life and the place responsible for opening up a world to me that I didn't even know existed," Stansbury said. "I am thankful to President Peterson and the selection committee for providing me this opportunity."

Stansbury and his wife, Karen, who were married inside Georgia Tech's Arthur B. Edge Intercollegiate Athletics Center, reside in Atlanta. After they were married in 1995, the couple traveled the world for 18 months before returning to the United States.

Mark Rountree, a former football student-athlete at Louisiana Tech and experienced athletics administrator who most recently served as the director of athletics at Portland State University, joined the Georgia Tech athletics staff as a deputy athletics director on Nov. 30, 2016. In his role, he serves as the sport administrator for Georgia Tech football.

Rountree was director of athletics at Portland State for 23 months, beginning on Jan. 2, 2015. In less than two years as A.D., he instituted fundraising and oversaw groundbreaking for the Viking Pavilion Project, a \$50 million renovation of PSU's main athletics facility, which will include a 3,000-seat arena and 15,000 square feet dedicated to student-athletes' academic pursuits when construction is completed in 2018. Also under Rountree's direction, Portland State set fundraising records during its annual Wine and Roses events in both 2015 and 2016.

He hired new women's basketball, softball and track and field head coaches at Portland State and signed football head coach Bruce Barnum to a five-year contract. Barnum went on to lead PSU to a 9-3 record and NCAA Division I FCS playoff appearance in his first full season at the helm in 2015. In addition to posting its best record as a Division I program, Portland State football also recorded its highest home attendance in seven seasons in `15.

Prior to his arrival at Portland State, Rountree served as deputy athletics director at Miami (Ohio) from 2013-14. At Miami, he oversaw the daily operation of the athletics department, served as sport administrator for football and men's basketball and supervised academics, business operations, compliance, equipment and strength and conditioning. He was also the department's chief financial officer and was responsible for strategic planning.

Rountree's administrative experience also includes stints at Georgetown (senior associate A.D./internal operations -- 2008-13), Oregon State (associate A.D./compliance -- 2004-08), Towson (assistant A.D./compliance -- 2000-04), Maryland (compliance coordinator -- 1997-2000), Texas Pan-American (assistant A.D./1994-97) and Louisiana Tech (director of academic support -- 1991-94). It was during his five years at Oregon State that he worked with Stansbury, who was OSU's executive associate A.D. at the time.

A native of West Monroe, La., Rountree was a four-year letterwinner as a running back/wide receiver at Louisiana Tech from 1987-90. He graduated from Louisiana Tech with a bachelor's degree in history in 1991.

He and his wife, Jennie, live in Atlanta.

1915—Coached by J.R. Crenshaw, Tech tennis team competes in first dual matches, 2-0.

1918—Tech wins the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association championship.

1922-Tech wins the first of its two Southern Conference championships.

1926—Yellow Jackets win their second Southern Conference title in five years.

1929–Longtime coach J.R. Crenshaw coaches his final season, compiling an overall record of 32-12-2 in 13 seasons.

1934–Legendary Earle Bortell takes over as the Tech head coach, embarking on a career that would span 28 years and 215 victories.

1938—Russell Bobbitt, the conference champ at number one singles, led Georgia Tech to its first Southeastern Conference team title. The team was captained by GT Hall of Fame member Bill Moore and coached by Earle Bortell.

1945-Howard McCall reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA singles championship while Niles Millsap goes three rounds in singles and teams with Frank Willett who reach the semis in doubles.

1946—The team won its second Southeastern Conference team championship, led by T.W. Fowler, who won the conference title at two singles, and Howard McCall and Niles Milsap, who were co-champions at number one doubles.

May 12-14, 1960–Tech dominated the SEC Tennis Championships at Knoxville, Tenn., beating Tulane and Florida to win the team title. Ned Neely won the conference singles championship and teamed with Harry Thompson to win the number two singles championship. Thompson won the number two singles title, while Paul Metz was the number five singles champion and Dave Peake and Dave Pearsall won the number three doubles crown.

1960—Tech team posts a fourth-place finish at the NCAA championships, the best finish in school history, as Ned Neely and Harry Thompson reach the semifinals in doubles.

1966—All-American Walter Johnson advanced to the quarterfinals to lead Tech to a fifth-place NCAA finish.

1970—Led by All-American Larry Turville, who reached the fourth round, Tech ties for 10th place at the NCAAs, as four players entered in singles and two in doubles teams.

March 11, 1982-First ACC win vs. Maryland, 6-3.

April 20, 1985–Freshman Bryan Shelton wins the ACC title at number one singles, the first individual ACC title in school history.

May 18, 1985—Bryan Shelton loses to Dan Goldie, 7-6, 4-6, 6-1, in first round of NCAA Singles Championships in the first NCAA appearance by a Tech player since 1971.

Jan. 23-24, 1988–Tech hosts nationally-ranked teams Stanford (No. 1), Tennessee (No. 10) and California (No. 13) to christen the Bill Moore Tennis Center; Jackets beat 13th-ranked Golden Bears but fall to top-ranked Cardinal. Jean Desdunes named head coach.

April 5, 1988–Defeated Georgia, 5-4, in Athens, for Tech's first win over the Bulldogs since 1966.

April 7, 1988–Defeated Clemson, 5-4, to finish first in the ACC regular season with a 7-0 record.

April 23, 1988-Lost to Clemson in finals of ACC Tournament, 5-4.

May 21, 1988–Lost to Michigan, 5-4, in first appearance in NCAA Team Championships.

May 26, 1988–Bryan Shelton reaches quarterfinals of NCAA Singles Championship before losing to eventual champion, Robbie Weiss of Pepperdine.

May 1988–Bryan Shelton and Kenny Thorne garner All-America honors, the first Yellow Jackets to earn the recognition since 1970.

May 19, 1993–Rob Givone competes in the NCAA singles tournament, becoming Tech's first NCAA entrant in five years.

April 22-24, 1994—Tech defeats Wake and Virginia to reach the finals of the ACC Tournament before falling to seventh-ranked Duke.

May 13-15, 1994—After defeating Florida State and VCU in the first two rounds, the third-seeded Tech score a heart-stopping 4-3 victory over NC to win the Region II title and advance to the NCAA Team Championships for the second time in school history. With Tech tied 3-3 against the Tar Heels, senior Scott Cotton was on the verge of defeat but rallied at number two singles to clinch the title.

May 21, 1994—Tech falls to third-ranked TCU in the first round of the NCAA Championships, to finish the season at 17-11 and ranked 28th in the final poll.

May 25, 1994–Rob Givone returns to the NCAA individual tourney, competing in singles and doubles with partner Scott Cotton.

March 29, 1995–Tech defeats Georgia Southern for head coach Jean Desdunes' 100th victory.

May 9, 1997–The team returns to NCAA Tournament play, falling to Duke in their NCAA Region II Championships opener.

May 15, 1998—Tech makes its second straight NCAA appearance, falling to Virginia Commonwealth at the NCAA Region II Championships in Richmond, Va.

June 30, 1998—Jean Desdunes resigns as head coach, stepping down with the second-highest win total in school history with 139. Assistant coach and former Tech All-American Kenny Thorne is named head coach at his alma mater.

April 30, 1999—Thorne is named ACC Coach of the Year after guiding the Jackets to a regular-season tie for second place in the ACC and the finals of the conference tournament. Thorne's No. 1 player, Benjamin Cassaigne, is named ACC Player of the Year.

May 14-15, 1999—The Yellow Jackets qualify for NCAA Regional play for the third-straight year, downing Boise State in their opening match before falling to defending national champion Stanford in round two at Palo Alto, Calif.

April 30, 2000–Roger Anderson is named ACC Rookie of the Year, the first Yellow Jacket to earn the honor.

March 7, 2001–Tech defeats 20th-ranked Miami. Tech's first win over a Top-20 opponent since 1998.

May 12-13, 2001—Tech competes in the NCAA Regional for the fourth time in the last five years. Tech tops Arizona, 4-2, in the first round before falling to eventual national champion Georgia in the second round in Athens, Ga.

October 28, 2001–Junior Roger Anderson becomes the first Yellow Jacket to win the Omni Hotels South Atlantic Region Championship when he defeats 43rd-ranked David Loewenthal

of Wake Forest in straight sets, 6-1, 7-5.

May 2, 2003—Senior Roger Anderson and junior Scott Schnugg become the first Tech players to earn All-America honors since 1988 after finishing the year ranked 10th nationally in doubles.

May 28, 2005–Freshman David North and junior Marko Rajevac particpate in the NCAA Doubles Championship as alternates and advance to the quarterfinals to earn All-American honors, before falling to eventual national champions John Isner and Antonio Ruiz from Georgia.

May, 2008–Freshman Guillermo Gomez became just the second Yellow Jacket to be named ACC Freshman of the Year and ITA Mideast Region Rookie of the Year.

Feb. 19, 2009-Sophomore Guillermo Gomez ranked No. 7 nationally in singles by ITA -- the highest-ever ranking in for a Tech player in history.

Feb. 19, 2010-Junior Guillermo Gomez ranked No. 3 nationally in singles by ITA, the highest-ever ranking in Tech history. Gomez had surpassed his previous high in the first spring rankings (No. 5).

October 24, 2010-Kevin King and Juan Spir win the doubles title at the USTA/ITA Southeast Regional in Gainesville, Fla., beating teammates Eliot Potvin and Ryan Smith in the finals.

May, 2011-Senior Guillermo Gomez captures All-ACC honors for the fourth time, All-America honors for the third time, and finishes his career with a school record 119 singles victories. Juan Spir and Kevin King are named All-Americans in doubles.

June 8, 2011-Kenny Thorne named Wilson/ITA Division I National Coach of the Year after leading Georgia Tech to a 21-6 record and the Yellow Jackets advanced to the NCAA Round of 16 for the first time since 1994. Tech's 8-3 ACC mark was a program high for conference wins, and its final ITA ranking of No. 13 also was a program best.

October 24, 2011 - Kevin King captures singles title at USTA/ITA Southeast Regional in Athens, beating three players ranked ahead of him and losing only one set in the tournament.

June 7, 2012-Kevin King and Juan Spir are named ITA All-Americans in doubles for the second time. King finishes his career with a Tech record 87 victories in doubles.

October 22, 2012-Juan Spir and Vikram Hundal win the doubles title at the USTA/ITA Southeast Regional in Tallahassee, Fla. The title was Spir's second in the event, this time with a different partner.

January 3, 2013-Juan Spir and Vikram Hundal open the spring ranked No. 3 by the ITA in doubles, the highest ranking ever attained by a Tech duo. They would stay there through the end of February when Hundal was injured.

January 18, 2013-Georgia Tech opens the new Ken Byers Tennis Complex by winning two matches over Old Dominion (5-2) and Lipscomb (4-3).

April 19, 2015-Georgia Tech stuns 8th-ranked Duke, 4-3, at the Ken Byers Tennis Complex, the highest-ranked team the Yellow Jackets had defeated under head coach Kenny Thorne (1998-present).

May 8, 2015-Georgia Tech returns to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in three years, earning a bid by defeating No. 8 Duke to close the regular season, then No. 35 Notre Dame and No. 14 Virginia Tech in the ACC Tournament.

2016-Georgia Tech returns to the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year behind Christopher Eubanks, who became the third Tech player to be named ACC Player of the Year. Eubanks also is named an ITA All-American.


