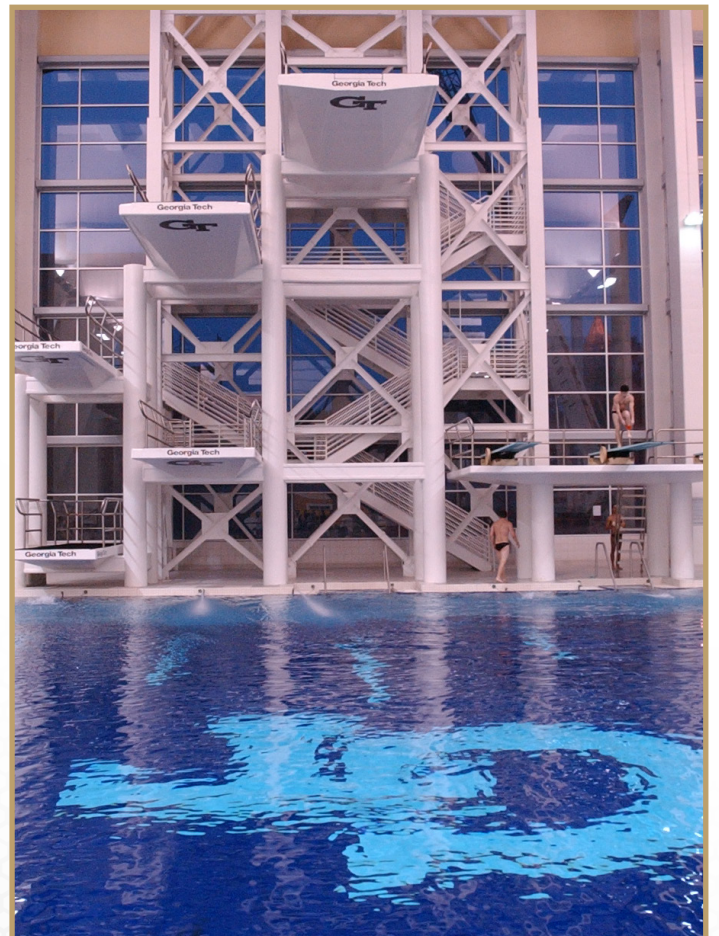
MCAULEY AQUATIC CENTER



The home of the Yellow Jacket swimming and diving program is the McAuley Aquatic Center, formerly the Georgia Tech Aquatic Center (GTAC), located on the west side of campus as the foundation of the Campus Recreation Center (CRC). The facility was the site of all swimming, diving and synchronized swimming competition as well as the swimming portion of the modern pentathlon during the Centennial Olympic Games in the summer of 1996.

The facility was officially named the McAuley Aquatic Center in 2016 to honor James Herbert "Herb" McAuley, a 1947 electrical engineering graduate and former swimming champion who devoted four decades to coaching swimmers at Tech -- both competitive swimmers and undergraduates taking the compulsory and infamous "drown-proofing" class.

In March 2016, the McAuley Aquatic Center topped the list of "The 10 Best Collegiate Competition Swimming Pools" by *College Ranker*.

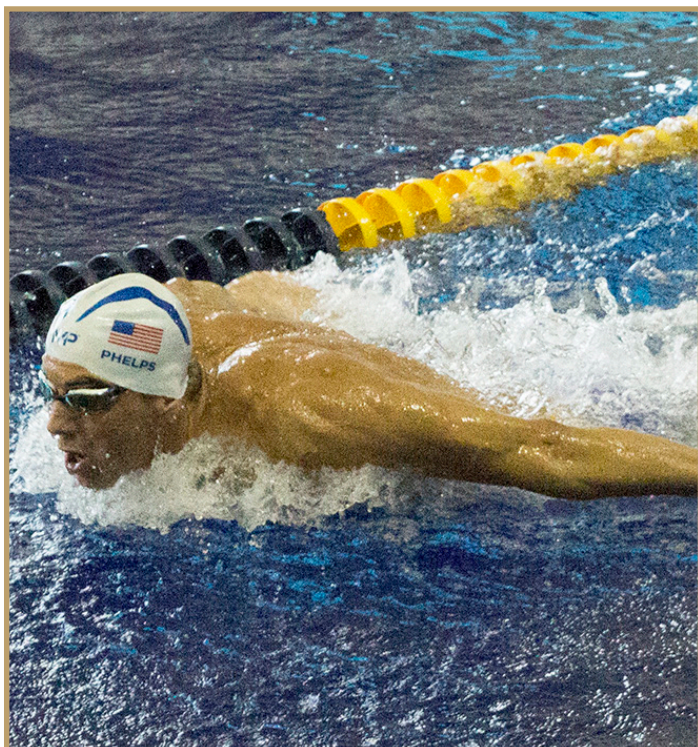


Along with hosting the '96 Olympics, the GTAC (now McAuley) played host to the 2005 Atlantic Coast Conference Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving Championships, the 2005 NCAA Zone Diving Championships, the 2006 NCAA Men's Swimming and Diving Championships, both the 2016 NCAA Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving Championships and most recently the 2017 ACC Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving Championships.

Other test events held at the facility included the Nations Bank Pan Pacific Swimming Championships, the IXth Diving World Cup and the IXth Water Polo World Cup.

The NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving Championships will return to the McAuley Aquatic Center in 2022.

The women's swimming and diving championships are set for March 16-19, 2022. The men's championships will follow from March 23-26,

2022. It will be the third time Georgia Tech has hosted the swimming and diving championships, most recently in 2016. The first time the Yellow Jackets hosted the swimming and diving championships was in 2006.

The McAuley Aquatic Center provides the Yellow Jackets with a world-class venue for aquatic sports and serves as an important element of the physical legacy of the Games, enhancing the activities Georgia Tech can offer its students for years to come.

The 1,900-seat main stadium contains a competition pool and a dive pool.

The competition pool is 50 meters by 10 lanes, with two movable bulkheads so that courses can be set up for 25 yards, 25 meters or 30 meters for water polo. It also features a movable floor which can be set from zero depth to seven feet, eight inches.

The dive pool features one- and three-meter springboards plus one-, three-, five-, seven-and-a-half- and 10-meter platforms, as well as a Spargar system that sends a mass of bubbles from the bottom of the tank to ease entry into the water.

The original \$21 million facility was funded entirely by the Atlanta Committee for the Olympic Games (ACOG). Construction on the facility began in July 1994 and was completed in time to host the VIIth Synchronized Swimming World Cup in August 1995. The newly-renovated enclosure of the GTAC is part of an over \$45 million expansion to the CRC.

NINTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH AT GEORGIA TECH
(11TH SEASON OVERALL AT GEORGIA TECH)

Courtney Shealy Hart, a Georgia Tech assistant coach for two years, was named head coach of the Yellow Jackets' swimming and diving programs on April 30, 2009.

Hart is the eighth head coach in the history of the program.

Thanks in part to deep recruiting classes and the development of talent, Hart has steadily built Georgia Tech into a program that can compete in the nationally recognized Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC). Since taking over the reins of the program, both the men's and women's team have consistently increased its points total at the ACC Swimming & Diving Championships each year.

Hart has presided over a fantastic stretch for the Tech program that has seen multiple men's swimmers compete in seven NCAA Championships since taking over the program before the start of the 2009-10 season. Since 2009, a total of 20 program records have been established multiple times on the men's team and a total of 18 program records in both swimming and diving for the women's team.

The success has extended beyond the pool as the Yellow Jackets have annually been one of the nation's top academic swimming & diving programs. The men's swimming & diving team has earned APR Public Recognition Awards from the NCAA in 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2015-16, while both the men's and women's programs annually earn CSCAA scholar all-America honors.

Hart spent one season (2006-07) as an assistant coach at North Florida prior to arriving on The Flats where she served as an assistant coach from 2007-09.

She helped guide North Florida to a fifth-place finish at the Pacific Coast Swimming Conference Championships and led nine individuals to top-16 finishes at the meet. She also guided one student-athlete to a top-eight finish in the conference championship meet.

Before heading into the coaching scene, Hart participated in the 2000 Summer Olympic Games for the United States. She took home a pair of gold medals in Sydney, Australia, in the 400 meter medley relay and 400 meter freestyle relay.

Hart also competed on the international scene in the Pan-American Games (1999, 2003), Pan Pacific (2002) and the United States World Cup Teams (2000-04).



At the University of Georgia, Hart led the Bulldogs to back-to-back NCAA team championships in 1999 and 2000. She was named the 2000 NCAA Female Swimmer of the Year after capturing individual national titles in the 50 free, 100 free and 100 back. She also captured NCAA titles as a member of the 400 free relay and 400 medley relay teams. She finished her NCAA career with 26 all-America honors, the most in UGA history, plus two more honorable mention citations.

Hart won nine individual Southeastern Conference (SEC) titles, 10 SEC relay crowns and set five conference records. She was named the SEC Female Swimmer of the Year in 2000.

After graduating from Georgia in 2001 cum laude with a degree in sports studies/communications, Hart worked as a motivational speaker for the NCAA, Coca-Cola, Healthsouth and Arby's, and served as the director of the Golden West Swim Lessons Program in Huntington Beach, Calif., before heading to North Florida.

In the summer of 2013, Hart was inducted into the Georgia Aquatic Hall of Fame, signifying both her achievements as a collegiate all-American and National Swimmer of the Year at the University of Georgia and as a two-time Olympic Gold Medalist.

Hart, who earned her master's degree in sports administration from Georgia in 2005, was inducted into the Irmo High School Hall of Fame in September 2017.

Hart and her husband, Justin, have two children - Jackson and Mara.

17TH SEASON AT GEORGIA TECH

John Ames, who has become a staple of the Georgia Tech program, enters his 17th year overall as the diving coach for the Yellow Jackets' swimming & diving program in 2017-18. He came to The Flats in August 2001.

Under Ames' guidance, Tech divers continue to excel at the national level while rewriting the program record books.

Since coming to Tech in 2001, Ames has coached five NCAA All-Americans in Evan Stowers (2006, 2007), Hannah Krimm (2008), Stephanie England (2008) and Brad Hozma (2016).

He has also sent a total of six different Yellow Jackets to eight NCAA Championships in Stowers (2006, 2007), England (2008), Krimm (2008), Brandon Makinson (2011), Lumbra (2015) and Hozma (2015, 2016) since 2001.

A total of seven divers have earned a combined 10 all-ACC honors in Paul McCarty (2002), Tony Burkhardt (2005), Stowers (2006), England (2008), Krimm (2008), Makinson (2011, 2012) and Hozma (2016), with Stowers taking home the ACC Championship Title in the 3-meter dive in 2006 and Hozma being crowned the ACC Champion in the platform dive in 2016.

Off the boards and in the classroom, over 30 divers have been recognized as CSCAA Scholar all-Americans, while over 20 Yellow Jacket divers have earned a spot on the all-ACC academic team since Ames arrival in 2001.

In 2015-16, Homza qualified for the NCAA Swimming & Diving Championships for the second straight season where he earned all-America honorable mention honors with his 11th-place finish in the 1-meter dive and a 14th-place finish in the platform diving event. Homza also earned a gold medal for his first-place finish in the platform at the 2016 ACC Men's Swimming & Diving Championships, the lone ACC all-conference performer for the Jackets on the year.

In 2014-15, Lumbra and Homza each qualified for the NCAA National Championships to mark the first time in school history that divers were in both the men's and women's championships in the same year.

Ames also coached arguable swimming & diving team's most decorated female athlete, Hannah Krimm. Krimm's distinctions consisted of NCAA all-America honors on the 3-meter springboard, NCAA honorable mention all-America and all-ACC Honors on the 1-meter, and was a four-time CSCAA scholar all-America honoree. Krimm made the finals in six of eight springboard events at the ACC Championships during her career and was the highest individual point scorer for the



women's program in each of her last two seasons at Tech.

The first female diving all-American in school history, Krimm finished seventh on the 3-meter springboard in 2007-08. Krimm was also recognized as an honorable mention all-American on the 1-meter board, while England was an honorable mention all-American in both the 3-meter and platform events. The Tech divers accounted for all 21 of the Jackets' total points at the 2008 NCAA Swimming & Diving Championships to lead them to a 30th-place finish -- the highest in program history.

Under Ames' tutelage, Stowers became the first Tech diver to qualify for the NCAA Championships in 2006. At the then-Georgia Tech Aquatic Center, Stowers again made history by finishing seventh on the men's platform, becoming the first Tech diver to garner all-America honors. In 2007, Stowers returned to the NCAA Championships, earning all-America honors for the second consecutive season.

At the 2006 ACC Championships, Stowers became just the second diver, first under Ames, to win an ACC championship as he captured the men's 3-meter springboard. He also became the first diver to earn all-ACC honors on both springboards.

In 2005, the women's diving program took its first steps towards being a force at the ACC Championships, as junior Laurissa Prystaj and England both reached the finals on the 3-meter board, making it the highest scoring event for Tech in women's diving history. The duo of England and Krimm trumped that performance when both Yellow Jacket divers qualified for the finals in all events in 2007. The duo then took another step forward when they combined to garner all-ACC honors in every diving event at the 2008 conference championship meet and followed that up with all-American honors.

Along with his coaching duties at Tech, Ames also mentors the Atlanta Diving Association, which has quickly become the top United States Diving program in the state of Georgia.

Hired in August 2001, Ames came to Tech from George Washington University and the Montgomery Dive Club, one of the largest diving programs in the nation. Prior to his stint with Montgomery and George Washington, Ames served as an assistant coach with the Northern Virginia Dive Club. He also worked as a graduate assistant and diving coach at Western Illinois University.

Ames graduated from Ohio University in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in psychology after completing his collegiate diving career with the Bobcats. He earned a Master of Science degree in sport administration while at Western Illinois.

Bill Koppelman was promoted to associate head coach for the Georgia Tech men's and women's swimming program in June 2017 after working the previous five years as an assistant coach. He joined the Yellow Jackets' staff in July 2012 following six years as an assistant coach at Texas Christian University (TCU).

Koppelman's new role will expand his coaching, recruiting and administrative responsibilities with both the men's and women's swimming teams. He will continue to serve as the recruiting coordinator and also work with the middle distance swimmers for both the men's and women's rosters.

He has guided a Tech swimmer to the NCAA Swimming & Diving Championships all five years that he has been on The Flats with Nico van Duijn (2013, 2014 and 2015), Alex Kimpel (2016) and Rodrigo Correia (2017).

Since coming to GT in the summer of 2012, a number of middle distance performers have set school records and career marks each season, while both the men's and women's team have consistently increased its points total at the ACC Swimming & Diving Championships each year.

As the recruiting coordinator, Koppelman has helped bring in a number of strong recruiting classes over the last six years, including current record holders Iris Wang, Maddie Paschal, Chiara Ruii, Laura Branton, Kira de Bruyn, Morgan Lyons, Emily Ilgenfritz, Correia, Colt Williamson, Alex Goerzen, Moises Loschi, van Duijn, Youssef Hammoud, Mats Westregren, Noah Harasz and Ben Southern among others.

While at TCU, the Horned Frogs skyrocketed in the national rankings, and their recruiting classes consistently gained recognition from around the country. Koppelman was an integral part of TCU's climb to the top of the Mountain West Conference in 2009-10 when the men's team stormed through its schedule to an 8-0 overall record and 5-0 record in the league. It was the first MWC team crown for TCU.

Though he served as the men's recruiting coordinator, Koppelman tutored both the men's and women's breaststroke and butterfly swimmers and saw all of those women's school records fall under his guidance, along with 14 of 19 men's swimming records.

Koppelman, who has been involved with coaching since before he graduated college, helped two-time Olympian Edgar Crespo



claim the 2010 Mountain West Conference title in the 100 breaststroke and Sabine Rasch win the 100 freestyle conference crown in 2011.

Koppelman joined the TCU staff in the fall of 2006 after spending the previous year as head coach of Cyprus High School in Magna, Utah, as well as serving as head coach of the Pirate Swim Club, a USA Swimming Club team.

Prior to his stint at Cyprus High School, Koppelman worked as a graduate assistant with the University of Utah swim team and was a volunteer assistant coach at the University of Wyoming as an undergraduate.

During his time at Utah, Koppelman worked with 11 U.S. National swimmers, one Canadian National finalist, 17 all-Mountain West Conference swimmers and two NCAA qualifiers.

Koppelman and his wife, RheaAnn, have two kids - Adelyn and Knox.

Neil Versfeld joined the Georgia Tech swimming & diving coaching staff as an assistant coach in July 2015. He works primarily with the team's distance swimmers and also serves as the program's academic liaison.

A former University of Georgia swimmer, Versfeld is an NCAA Champion, an NCAA record-holder in the 200 breast, and a two-time SEC champion.

In his two years with the Jackets, Versfeld has had a number of Tech swimmers set new school records in Colt Williamson (500 free), Ben Southern (100 fly, 200 fly), Moises Loschi (200 breast), Chiara Ruiu (100 breast, 200 breast, 200 IM) and Kira de Bruyn (400 IM).

He has also sent a Jacket swimmer to the NCAA Swimming & Diving Championships in each of his two years on The Flats, as both Loschi and Southern qualified and competed at the 2017 NCAA Championships, while Loschi also qualified for the national championship meet in 2015-16.

Versfeld has also had a number of swimmers set personal best marks in the pool under his tutelage in each of the last two seasons.

In 2016-17, Loschi set new personal-best times in the 100 and 200 breast events, as well as in the 200 and 400 IM events, while Williamson posted new career-best times in the 500 free, 1000 free, 1650 free, 200 back, 200 and 400 IM events. Loschi, who holds the 200 breaststroke record, ranks second all-time in the 100 breast and third in Tech history in both the 1000 and 1650 free events. Williamson, who holds the school record in the 500 free, also posted the fourth-fastest time in school history in the 1000 free and the fifth-best mark in the 1650 free.

Southern closed out his career with career-best times in both the 100 and 200 fly events, both of which are school records, while newcomers Tim Slanschek and Brennan Day each posted a number of top 10 times in their respective events on the season. At the 2017 ACC Championships, Slanschek recorded the third-fastest time in school history in the 200 fly.

Headlined by Ruiu, who set new personal-best times in both the 200 and 400 IM events, as well as in the 100 and 200 breaststroke events, the women's team also set the bar high in 2016-17. Senior Camille Felix wrapped up her career at Tech with new career-best marks in the 200 free, 200 fly and 200 IM events in 2016-17, while de Bruyn registered personal-best times in the 100 fly, 200 back and both the 200 and 400 IM events.

A trio of freshmen in Emily Ilgenfritz, Tamir Gonen and Sara al Khatib also had strong seasons in their rookie campaigns in 2016-17, as all



three had top 10 times on the season, while Ilgenfritz etched her name in the Tech record books with the second-fastest time in school history in both the 500 and 1000 free events and the third-best time in GT history in the 1650 free.

On the men's side in 2015-16, Loschi, Williamson and Edwin Zhao all set personal-best times in the 1000 free and the 1650 free events. Loschi also etched his name in the Tech record books in both events with the third best time in the 1650 free and the fourth best time in Tech history in the 1000 free. Senior Yuval Safra capped off his Tech career with a career-best time in the 1000 free, which was also the third-best time in Tech history for the event.

For the women, five different distance swimmers set personal bests times on the year in Lila Best (1000 free), Felix (1000 and 1650 free), Frederique Lefebvre (1000 free), Ruiu (1000 free) and Carly Sweeney (1000 free).

Out of the water and in the classroom, the Yellow Jackets have had a total of 30 swimmers and divers receive CSCAA scholar all-American recognition over the last two years since Versfeld joined the program, headlined by Brad Homza's first-team selection in 2015-16. Georgia Tech also had four Jackets in Homza, Noah Harasz, Safra and Iris Wang named to the 2015-16 all-ACC academic team, while six Jackets in Andrea Demick, Maddie Paschal, Robert Borowicz, Omar Eteiba, Brian Woodbury and Harasz earned all-academic conference honors in 2016-17.

In 2016-17, Borowicz capped off his four years on The Flats with College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) academic all-America men's at large third team and all-district 4 honors.

Coming to Georgia Tech from Swim Atlanta, Versfeld served as the program's head age-group and masters coach for two years from 2013-15 for the program. Prior to that, he spent one year in Durban, South Africa as an assistant coach for the Seals Swimming Club.

Versfeld represented his native country of South Africa at the 2008 Beijing Summer Olympic Games where he was a semifinalist in the 200 meter breaststroke event. His international career was also highlighted by a fourth-place finish at the 2010 World Championships in Dubai, and semifinalist showings at both the 2009 World Championships in Rome and the 2011 World Championships in Shanghai.

He holds a Bachelor of Science degree from UGA, graduating in 2010 after a standout swimming career. Versfeld was a three-time member of the CSCAA academic all-American honor roll and the SEC honor roll.

A veteran in the swimming world with more than 20 years of experience, Andy Robins joined the Georgia Tech swimming & diving staff as an assistant coach in May 2015. He coaches the sprinters.

A former Florida State assistant coach that spent 19 years with the Seminoles, Robins came to The Flats with an impressive resume of coaching some of the best sprinters in ACC history.

In a career that spans two decades, Robins has directed the training of 43 ACC champions, 47 NCAA qualifiers and 26 all-Americans. He began his career at FSU in 1995 and was promoted to associate head in 2002.

In 2016-17, sophomore Iris Wang picked up where she left off from her record setting freshman year in 2015-16, by rewriting the Tech record books in the 50, 100 and 200 free events, while senior Maddie Paschal closed out her career on The Flats by setting a new school record in the 100 back at the 2017 ACC Championships.

Wang set career best marks in all three sprint events in 2016-17, while Paschal set new personal-best times in the 50 free and both the 100 and 200 back events on the year. Junior transfer Kaitlin Kitchens made an immediate impact for the Jackets in her first year at Tech, turning in the second-fastest time in school history in the 50 free, as well as the fourth-best mark in Tech history in the 100 free.

Not to be outdone, Morgan Lyons set personal best marks in the 50 free and the 100 back on the season, while her 50 free time ranks as the sixth-fastest time in school history. Sara Gilbert posted the sixth-fastest time in GT history in the 100 back in 2016-17, while also turning in personal best times in the 100 free and both the 100 and 200 back events.

For the men, the Jackets' Noah Harasz recorded the seventh-fastest time in Tech history in the 100 free, while Robert Borowicz posted the ninth-best time in school history in the 100 back in 2016-17. Harasz was also the final leg of the 400 medley relay along with Rodrigo Correia, Moises Loschi, and Ben Southern that recorded a third-place finish at the 2017 ACC Championships.

Returners Borowicz (100 back), Dan Cohen Solal (200 free, 100 fly) and Kevin Smith (50 free, 100 free) all set new personal record times in 2016-17, while a handful of freshmen newcomers in Aidan Pastel, Stefan Kranenburg, Quentin Talley and Oskar Zimowski all made huge strides throughout their first season at Georgia Tech.

In his first year at Tech in 2015-16, Wang set school records in both the 100 free (48.97) and the 200 free (1:46.94). Wang also

set the second-best mark in Tech history with a time of 22.09 in the 50 free, while fellow teammates Lyons (23.29) and Alex Rieger (23.30) ranked fourth and fifth, respectively, in the top-10 times for the 50 free as well.

On the men's side, Robins guided Youssef Hammoud all the way to the 2016 NCAA Swimming & Diving Championships where he competed in the 50 free, 100 free and 100 fly events. Hammoud had a team-best 50 free time of 19.85 and a 100 free time of 42.92 on the season, the latter ranking second all-time in Tech history.

Robins also tutored Corriea who as a freshman etched his name in the top-five of Tech's record books with the third-fastest times overall in both the 100 free (43.32) and the 200 free (1:34.85).

In Robins' last season at Florida State, Paul Murray set a new ACC record in the 50 free of 19.04 while capturing gold in 2014. That same year, Tiffany Oliver became the first Seminole in history to defend her ACC sprinting titles. Murray went on to place seventh in the event to garner all-America honors at the NCAA Championships. Under Robins, Oliver became the first FSU female to break the 49-second mark in the 100 free as she turned in a time of 48.93 en route to an NCAA appearance.

Robins graduated from the College of William & Mary in 1983 with a degree in psychology and received a master's degree in science education from Florida State in 1987. While in college, Robins swam both the backstroke and distance freestyle events. His swimming accomplishments at William & Mary include setting the school record in the 1650 freestyle while also serving as co-captain.

His association with swimming in the Tallahassee-area began in 1985 when he took a position with the Area Tallahassee Aquatic Club. Robins took over the head coaching duties for ATAC in 1993 and led the squad to a top-10 finish at the 1996 Junior National Championships.

He also served as the head coach at Leon High School in Tallahassee from 1986-91. After only his second year on the job he was named the High School Coach of the Year by the Tallahassee Democrat.

Robins and his wife Karen have three daughters and one son, Beth, Kurt, Jenna, and Annemarie.

Qu came to Georgia Tech after five years as the associate head men's and women's swimming coach at SUNY-Binghamton. Her previous coaching stints include Iowa State for two seasons and Ithaca College for one.

She attended Shenzhen University in Shenzhen, China for two years and then enrolled at SUNY-Binghamton where she graduated summa cum laude in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in human development. Qu received her master's degree in exercise science from Ithaca in 2006.

G.P. "Bud" Peterson was appointed as the 11th president of Georgia Tech on April 1, 2009. Under his leadership, Georgia Tech has developed and begun the implementation of a 25-year strategic plan, exceeded the \$1.5 billion goal for Campaign Georgia Tech by 20 percent, grown innovative collaborations and strategic partnerships, expanded the campus infrastructure, attracted startups and established companies to Tech Square, and increased national and global visibility. Notably in that time, applications have tripled, and enrollment has increased by 23 percent.

Peterson came to Georgia Tech from the University of Colorado at Boulder, where he served as chancellor. Prior to that, he served as provost at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in New York, and for 19 years on the faculty and in leadership positions at Texas A&M University. He has worked for NASA and the National Science Foundation (NSF).

Throughout his career, Peterson has played an active role in helping establish the national education and research agendas, serving on many industry, government, and academic task forces and committees. He has served on a number of national accreditation agencies, with a focus on improving and assessing outcomes for higher education. He also has served on congressional task forces, research councils, and advisory boards, including the Office of Naval Research, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, the Department of Energy, the National Research Council, and the National Academy of Engineering.

A distinguished scientist, he was appointed in 2008 by President George W. Bush, and again in 2014 by President Barack Obama, as a member of the National Science Board, which oversees the NSF and advises the U.S. president and Congress on national policy related to science and engineering research and education. In 2010, he was named by U.S. Secretary of Commerce Gary Locke as a member of the National Advisory Council on Innovation and Entrepreneurship. President Obama appointed him to the Advanced Manufacturing Partnership (AMP) steering committee in 2011, and to the AMP 2.0 steering committee in 2013. He is a member of the board of directors of the Association of American Universities. In August 2016, he became chair of the NCAA Board of Governors, the NCAA's highest governing body.

Peterson, a fellow of both the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) and the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA), received the AIAA Distinguished Service Award in 2011. His research has focused on phase change heat transfer in both the cooling of electronic devices and spacecraft thermal control. He is widely published, authoring or co-authoring 16 books or book chapters, 210 refereed journal articles, and more than 170 conference publications. He also holds a total of 13 patents, with one pending.

Peterson earned a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering, a second bachelor's degree in mathematics, and a master's degree in engineering, all from Kansas State University. While at Kansas State, he lettered three years as a tight end/wide receiver for the Wildcats. He earned a Ph.D. in mechanical engineering from Texas A&M University. He and his wife, Val, have four adult children, two of whom are Georgia Tech alumni.

Charles Isbell, senior associate dean and professor in the College of Computing, was named faculty athletics representative (FAR) to the Georgia Tech Athletic Association on June 6, 2017.

The FAR serves as the liaison between the Institute and the Athletic Association on issues regarding rules compliance, developments at the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), and activities related to Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) membership.

"Charles is an engaged leader and innovator at Georgia Tech in numerous areas, and we are very fortunate that he has agreed to add the role as the Institute's new faculty athletics representative to his responsibilities," said Peterson. "On behalf of all of Georgia Tech, I would also like to thank Reggie DesRoches for serving us so well as our FAR for the past three years."

Isbell has been a faculty member at Georgia Tech since 2002, but first came to Tech as a student to earn his bachelor's degree in computer science. He also holds a Ph.D. in computer science from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

His first institutional service role at Tech was with the Institute Undergraduate Curriculum Committee, where he worked with student-athletes returning to finish their degrees.

"Since the very beginning of being here as a faculty member, I've been interested in the way student-athletes interact with the rest of the institution," he said.

Isbell hopes to continue events that DesRoches organized to facilitate faculty and student-athlete interaction. He also hopes to serve as a bridge for faculty members to pursue more research endeavors with the Athletic Association.

"I can't tell you the number of conversations I've had with faculty members who have been interested in working with athletics, but weren't sure how to go about doing it," he said. "I'm going to put energy into making those connections."

For Isbell, understanding the experience of student-athletes is paramount to success in higher education. Athletic achievements can elevate a university's profile to prospective students, and student-athletes' relationship to the university is one that can be used as a model for the broader campus community.

"Anyone interested in higher education and how it has to grow and change has to understand how Division I athletics works at a university," he said. "As higher education changes, we have to think of ourselves more as a community and consider what lets people build connections and keep coming back. It's going to have to happen with all students, faculty, and staff, and athletics can be an example of how to do that well."

While Isbell is a fan and frequent attendee of Georgia Tech athletic events, his support for student-athletes extends beyond the stands.

"I want the student-athletes to know I am here for them, and I intend to talk with them and be a resource for them," he said. "I want them to know that and believe it, and know that I take it very seriously."

Isbell's research focuses on statistical machine learning and interactive artificial intelligence. He teaches several courses both to on-campus students and to students around the world in Tech's Online Master of Science in Computer Science program. His three-year term as FAR began on July 1, 2017.

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Georgia Institute of Technology introduced former Tech football player Todd Stansbury as the Institute's ninth director of athletics on Sept. 22, 2016.

Since officially arriving back on The Flats on Nov. 28, 2016, Stansbury has identified four strategic priorities for Georgia Tech athletics:

- define the GT athletics brand;
- establish the internal culture;
- align the internal structure;
- generate new revenue.

To assist in achieving his strategic goals, Stansbury established two new offices within the athletics department — the office of brand and ideation, which works to identify and tell the story of the Yellow Jackets' brand, and the office of innovation, which oversees Georgia Tech's efforts to build on its status as college athletics' leader in innovation, particularly through collaboration and partnerships within the Institute and innovation hubs throughout Atlanta.

He has also enlisted the help of prominent former Georgia Tech student-athletes that are now leaders in their fields. Examples include Stansbury's former teammate Sam Bracken, a *New York Times* best-selling author and renowned executive coach that has worked with Stansbury and the athletics department to establish a strong internal culture and identify strategic priorities, and volleyball alum Jaime Weston, the National Football League's senior vice president for marketing, creative and branding who is assisting with the Jackets' brand-identification efforts.

Prior to his return to Georgia Tech in 2016, Stansbury served as Oregon State's athletic director since June 2015, which followed a nine-year stint as the university's executive associate athletic director (2003-12). During his time at Oregon State, Stansbury was part of a senior management team that raised \$150 million for a football stadium expansion, in addition to fundraising for the construction of a sports performing center. He also was part of a team that established several career development initiatives for student-athletes.

Stansbury's resume also includes roles as athletic director at the University of Central Florida (2012-15) and East Tennessee State University (2000-03). He was Georgia Tech's assistant athletic director for academics from 1988-1995 under legendary A.D. Homer Rice.

Stansbury grew up in Canada. When he was 10 years old and on vacation with his family in Florida, he befriended several Georgia Tech football players staying at the same hotel. During the drive back home to Ontario, his family stopped on campus to see a practice. That's when Stansbury knew he wanted to play football on The Flats.

The dream came true and he earned varsity letters while at Georgia Tech from 1980-84 as a middle linebacker and on special teams for head coach Bill Curry. He was selected in the third round of the Canadian Football League draft by the Saskatchewan Roughriders in 1984.

As the ninth director of athletics in Georgia Tech history, he follows in the footsteps of storied names such as Rice, John Heisman and Bobby Dodd. He was hired following a national search that began in August 2016 when Mike Bobinski accepted the athletics director position at Purdue University. A nine-member search committee led by Georgia Tech Foundation President Al Trujillo identified candidates. The search process was assisted by Turnkey Search.

"Todd Stansbury is committed to athletes' success both on and off the field," Georgia Tech president Dr. G.P. "Bud" Peterson said at the time of Stansbury's hire. "His global perspective and leadership experience in athletics and development, combined with a lifelong passion for Georgia Tech, make him the ideal candidate. I believe this is one of those rare golden moments in life where opportunity meets ambition. We welcome him home."

Stansbury and his wife, Karen, who were married inside Georgia Tech's Arthur B. Edge Intercollegiate Athletics Center, reside in Atlanta. After they were married in 1995, the couple traveled the world for 18 months before returning to the United States.

Joeleen Akin, a former Georgia Tech athletics staff member with more than 20 years of experience in college athletics, returned to Georgia Tech as associate athletics director for student-athlete development and senior woman administrator in July 2016.

Akin is a member of the Georgia Tech Athletic Association's executive leadership team, serves as the administrator for the Yellow Jackets' volleyball and softball programs and oversees Tech's renowned Total Person Program.

In her first year back on The Flats, she helped enhance Georgia Tech's student-athlete development initiatives through the implementation of several new programs, including the first-ever Jackets Without Borders service trip to Costa Rica in August 2017. She has also spearheaded the student-athlete two day orientation program which is the Leadership Academy and Jump Start Jackets that are offered to Tech student-athletes.

She serves on the Institutes Executive Advisory Committee and is a member of the Leading Women at Georgia Tech program. She also chairs the student-athlete welfare committee (CARE Team) and is the vice chair for the WBCA Diversity and Inclusion Committee.

Akin rejoined the Georgia Tech athletics administration after 13 years at nearby Agnes Scott College. She served as Agnes Scott's athletics director and physical education chair for 12 years (2003-15) before being promoted to associate dean for athletics and student activities in February 2015.

Prior to her 13-year tenure at Agnes Scott, she spent seven years at Georgia Tech as director of women's basketball operations (1996-98), marketing/operations manager (1998-99) and director of marketing (1999-2003).

During her 12 years as athletics director at Agnes Scott, an NCAA Division III institution in Decatur, Ga., Akin oversaw a program that produced eight NCAA Tournament teams and a coaching staff that earned 12 different coach-of-the-year recognitions. Under her direction, Agnes Scott student-athletes maintained a 3.0 cumulative grade point average and participated extensively in on- and off-campus service projects.

Akin's tenure at Agnes Scott was marked by innovation and vision. She created and implemented numerous student-athlete development and engagement initiatives at ASC, including a new student-athlete orientation program, Safe Zone training for student-athletes, coaches and staff, and coordination of campus-wide academic resources for student-athletes.

Administratively, she developed a unique revenue-generation model that resulted in a 200-percent increase in the school's athletics budget and partnered with a national franchise Snap Fitness to bring a state-of-the-art fitness facility to campus at no cost to the college. She also coordinated with the school's communications department to create the now-trademarked tagline "Smart Women Sweat" to promote the Scotties' athletics programs.

In addition to her duties as athletics director and physical education chair, Akin was Agnes Scott's women's basketball coach from 2003-07 and was named the Great South Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 2006. She also served as commissioner of the Great South Athletic Conference from 2011-16 and was a member of the NCAA Division III women's basketball committee and NCAA volleyball regional advisory committee from 2014-16.

Prior to her arrival at Georgia Tech in 1996, Akin also served as a sports marketing assistant at Auburn and NC State and as a member of the women's basketball staffs at UNC Wilmington and Kansas State.

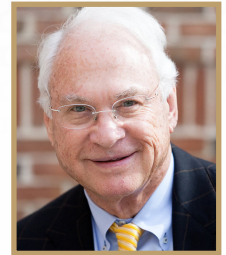

GEORGIA TECH SWIMMING & DIVING PROGRAM HISTORY

THE EARLY YEARS

Georgia Tech first fielded a swim team in 1918-19, when the first tryout was held at the city Y.M.C.A and about 50 men came out. According to the Blueprint, the fledgling squad featured "some of the fastest water splashers that the South has ever turned out and one that would make any Eastern college hustle to beat." The team was captained by G.R. Fraser, described as the best swimmer in the South and holder of the Southern record in both the 220 yard swim and the 50 yard swim.

Tech's first swim meet was on the road against the Clemson Tigers. In addition to Fraser, the first Tech team included Weiss, Scott, Carson, Evans and Owns, who returned with a 50 -19 victory. Fraser swam the 220 yards in the 2:50.00, cutting four seconds off his own Southern record.

The program enjoyed success against Southern competition throughout the 1920s. In 1927, Tech defeated all Southern opposition and made a good showing against two strong eastern teams.

The Jackets broke into prominence by forcing the famous Brooklyn Y team to the limit, but fell 46-16. Two days later, Yale handed the Jackets the short end of a 46-16 score.

EARLY CHAMPIONS

The Yellow Jacket 'tankmen', despite the lack of an on-campus facility, won 10 straight unofficial South championships from 1926-35.

In 1927, Dave Young tied the national intercollegiate record in the 150 yard backstroke in 1:43.20.

Representing Tech in the national intercollegiate, Young set a new record of 1:46.10 and in the finals established a new record of 1:44.00, finishing four seconds ahead of Spindle of Michigan to win Tech's only national championship in swimming. He also earned all-American honors with a second-place finish in the 220 yard free style.



KENNETH THRASH, SR.

1932-35

After playing football at Tech, Kenneth Thrash, Sr., took over the swimming reigns and led the Jackets to four-straight Southern Conference Championships from 1932-35.

Almost as impressive as five consecutive conference titles, Thrash only tasted defeat once in dual meets, finishing with an astounding record of 24-1. His winning percentage of 0.960 is the best all-time in school history.

As a former football player for Georgia Tech (1926-28), Thrash helped the Yellow Jackets win two conference titles (1927-28) and a national championship in 1928.



FRED LANOUE

1936-65

Fred Lanoue, a graduate of Springfield College and former New England diving champion, began working with the Tech swimmers in 1936 and became the Yellow Jackets' full time head coach in 1938 when the Tech pool was completed.

Under Lanoue's guidance, Tech won four Southeastern Conference championships in nine years, the first in 1942 and then three in a row in 1948, 1949 and 1950. Lanoue coached the Jackets for 27 years before his passing in the spring of 1965.

Lanoue was inducted posthumous into the Georgia Aquatic Hall of Fame in 2017.



HERB MCAULEY

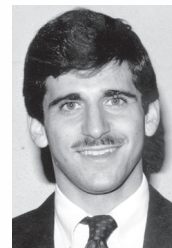
1965-87

The star of the 1942 SEC championship squad was Herb McAuley, who won the SEC 220 and 440 freestyle championships that year.

McAuley had his schooling interrupted by World War II, serving in the Army Signal Corps before graduating from Tech with a degree in electrical engineering in 1947. Upon graduation, he joined the Yellow Jacket staff as assistant coach under Lanoue, a position he held for 17 years.

McAuley succeeded Lanoue as head coach for the 1965-66 season. He coached the Jackets for 23 seasons, compiling a record of 169-144-1. He was inducted into the Georgia Tech Hall of Fame in 1982 and later the Georgia Aquatic Hall of Fame in 2012.

Tech competed in its first ACC Championships meet in 1980. The program took a one-year hiatus upon McAuley's retirement in 1987, which signaled the end of a 40-year stint on the Tech coaching staff.



BRAD LEHMAN

1988-91

The swimming program resumed under Brad Legman in 1988-89. In Lehman's first year, senior Tim Halligan earned all-Atlantic Coast Conference honors following his second-place finish in the 200 butterfly. Halligan qualified for the NCAA Championships in the event, finishing 21st.

Legman coached the team for three seasons, amassing an overall record of 19-13.

BILL HUMBER

1991-97

Bill Humber took over the Tech program in 1991-92. In 1993, he guided the Jackets to their then-best showing at the ACC Championships with the sixth-place finish and a then school-record point total of 198.

In 1994, diver Brandon Lumm won the first ACC Championship in the program's history with his victory in the 3-meter event. He earned all-ACC recognition that year and Bill Humber tallied a dual meet record of 38-45 during his six-year tenure at Georgia Tech.



SETH BARON

1997-2005

In August 1997, Tech hired Seth Baron to take the helm of the men's swimming and diving program. The Jackets' women's program debuted in 2001-02, and Baron took on the combined program. Baron, formerly an assistant coach at South Carolina and Auburn, also previously worked with the U.S. National Swim Team and was the head coach for the U.S. squad at the 1997 and 2001 World Maccabiah Games in Tel Aviv, Israel.

Under Baron's direction, the Tech men finished in the top five at the ACC Championships in five consecutive seasons, including a third-place finish in his final season as head coach in 2005. Tech finished 32nd at the 2005 NCAA Championships, cracking the Top 35 for the fifth straight year.

In just four seasons of existence, the women's program tallied a 33rd-place finish at the 2004 NCAA Championships and crowned its first all-American in Vesna Stojanovska. The Jackets posted three consecutive sixth-place finishes at the ACC meet, tallying a program-best 285.6 points in 2008-09. The Jackets also qualified two swimmers for the 2005 NCAA Championships for the first time in program history; Stojanovska and freshman Elizabeth Stowe. Junior Sam Morgan qualified for his third consecutive NCAA meet after winning his first ACC title in the mile at the 2006 ACC meet, hosted in the Georgia Tech Aquatic Center. Morgan Garnered his second straight all-American

honors, finishing 14th in the mile.

Stojanovska advanced to her second straight NCAA meet in 2005, after becoming the first women's athlete to win an ACC title, doing so in the 200 fly. Stowe garnered all-ACC honors in the mile, making her and Stojanovska the first all-conference tandem at the conference championship.

Along with collegiate accomplishments, the Tech combined program witnessed its first two Olympians in 2004 as Stojanovska (Macedonia) and incoming freshman Onur Uras (Turkey) competed at the Summer Olympics in Athens, Greece. Joining them in Athens were former men's swimming standouts Leo Salinas (Mexico) and volunteer coach Jorge Oliver (Puerto Rico).

Tech recorded its most successful season to date in 2001-02. Tech's men tallied 580.5 points to finish a program-best second at the ACC Championship, as a record five Jackets earned all-ACC honors. Tech also placed 27th at the NCAA Championships, led by Shilo Ayalon's eighth-place finish in the 1650 free. He earned all-American accolades for the second consecutive season.

In 2000-01, the Yellow Jackets placed third at the ACC Championships, scoring 434.50 points. Four swimmers earned all-ACC accolades: Shilo Ayalon, David Laitala, Scott Lenyk and Tomonori Tsuki.

Tech also scored its first points in NCAA competition in 2001. Ayalon placed 11th in the 1650 free, while Tsuki finished 13th in the 200 breast to become the program's first all-Americans.

The Jackets went 11-3 in dual-meet competition, and 16 school records were established, led by Ayalon's four marks.

In 2000, Baron and the Yellow Jackets finished the regular season with a 5-6 dual-meet record. Laitala became the first Yellow Jacket swimmer in 11 years to earn all-ACC recognition, placing second in the 100 butterfly at the ACC Championships. In his first season at Tech, Baron guided the team to a 4-7 dual-meet record and a seventh-place finish in the ACC Championships.

As an athlete, Baron also competed for the U.S. National Team, winning 10 gold medals in international competitions, including the 1985 World Maccabiah Games and the 1983 Pan Am Maccabiah Games in Sao Paulo, Brazil. He participated in the U.S. Olympic Trials in 1984 and qualified for the 1988 Trials.



STU WILSON

2005-09

Stu Wilson was named men's and women's swimming and diving head coach on June 8, 2005.

In his seven years with the Tech program, Wilson guided seven different swimmers to the NCAA Championships and tutored three Atlantic Coast Conference champions.

In 2008-09, Wilson led the women's team to its highest finish at the NCAA Championship in school history and both the men's and women's teams combined to break 19 school records throughout the course of the season. Seven Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC honors in 2007-08, while seven student-athletes were named to the ACC all-academic team. Junior Mickey Malul was an ACC champion in the 100 breast as the men's team finished fourth at the ACC Championships. Three swimmers and two divers went to the NCAA Championships in Columbus, Ohio and senior Elizabeth Stowe placed 28th in the mile as the Jackets finished 30th in the nation. Agatha Kwasnik and Noah Copeland also represented Tech along with divers Stephanie England and Hannah Krimm.

Sam Morgan ended his career as a two-time all-American in the 1650 yard freestyle and became the first Yellow Jacket to qualify for the NCAA Championship meet in four consecutive seasons under Wilson's guidance.

In his first season as head coach in 2005-06, Wilson led the Jackets to their fourth straight top-five finish in the ACC, tallying a fourth-place finish at the 2006 ACC Championships, in College Park, MD. Tech boasted one ACC champion and Morgan garnered all-conference honors in the mile for the second straight season.

Wilson helped the Yellow Jacket men to four consecutive top-35 finishes at the NCAA Championships, posting a 33rd-place finish at the 2006 Men's NCAA Championships, hosted by Georgia Tech.

Tech sent four swimmers to the 2005 NCAA Championships, the second most in school history, and five of the second all-American honors earned by Yellow Jackets came during Wilson's tenure.

Former Tech standout Shilo Ayalon and Morgan both garnered all-American honors under Wilson's tutelage. Ayalon holds four school records and was named ACC Most Valuable Performer that the 2003 ACC Championships.

In 2006, Rob Miller, Morgan and Elizabeth Stowe all qualified for the NCAA Championships under Wilson's guidance. Morgan won his first ACC title in the men's 1650 yard freestyle and Miller finished fifth. Stowe posted a third-place finish in the women's 1650 free to earn all-ACC honors. All three clocked lifetime-best times

in their respective events for Yellow Jackets.

Prior to joining the Yellow Jacket staff in 2002, Wilson spent 11 years with nationally-prominent club team Swim Atlanta from 1990-2001, serving as the team's Head Senior Coach for his last four seasons there.

In this position, he planned and implemented strength and conditioning programs for swimmers age 12-and-over. He also handled administrative duties, including fundraising, travel arrangements, public relations and record-keeping. He worked as a head age group coach with Swim Atlanta from 1990-98.

Wilson coached several successful swimmers at Swim Atlanta, including 2004 U.S. Olympian Amanda Weir, who set national age-group records (11-12 and 13-14) in the 50 free. Additionally, he mentored swimmers that posted more than 50 national top-16 age-group performances.

As an athlete, Wilson competed at the University of Georgia from 1984-88, reaching the finals of the SEC Championships in the 200 and 500 free in each of his last three seasons. He was an NCAA qualified in the 400 free relay and held the school record in the 200 free at one time. Wilson also qualified for U.S. Nationals in his final six seasons of competitive swimming.



COURTNEY SHEALY HART

2009-PRESENT

Courtney Shealy Hart, a Georgia Tech assistant coach for two years, was named head coach of the Yellow Jackets' swimming and diving programs on April 30, 2009.

Hart is the eighth head coach in the history of the program.

Thanks in part to deep recruiting classes and the development of talent, Hart has steadily built Georgia Tech into a program that can compete in the nationally recognized Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC). Since taking over the reins of the program, both the men's and women's team have consistently increased its points total at the ACC Swimming & Diving Championships each year.

Hart has presided over a fantastic stretch for the Tech program that has seen multiple men's swimmers compete in seven NCAA Championships since taking over the program before the start of the 2009-10 season. Since 2009, a total of 20 program records have been established multiple times on the men's team and a total of 18 program records in both swimming and diving for the women's team.

The success has extended beyond the pool as the Yellow Jackets have annually been one of the nation's top academic swimming & diving programs. The men's swimming & diving team has earned APR

Public Recognition Awards from the NCAA in 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2015-16, while both the men's and women's programs annually earn CSCAA scholar all-America honors.

Hart spent one season (2006-07) as an assistant coach at North Florida prior to arriving on The Flats where she served as an assistant coach from 2007-09.

She helped guide North Florida to a fifth-place finish at the Pacific Coast Swimming Conference Championships and led nine individuals to top-16 finishes at the meet. She also guided one student-athlete to a top-eight finish in the conference championship meet.

Before heading into the coaching scene, Hart participated in the 2000 Summer Olympic Games for the United States. She took home a pair of gold medals in Sydney, Australia, in the 400 meter medley relay and 400 meter freestyle relay.

Hart also competed on the international scene in the Pan-American Games (1999, 2003), Pan Pacific (2002) and the United States World Cup Teams (2000-04).

At the University of Georgia, Hart led the Bulldogs to back-to-back NCAA team championships in 1999 and 2000. She was named the 2000 NCAA Female Swimmer of the Year after capturing individual national titles in the 50 free, 100 free and 100 back. She also captured NCAA titles as a member of the 400 free relay and 400 medley relay teams. She finished her NCAA career with 26 all-America honors, the most in UGA history, plus two more honorable mention citations.

Hart won nine individual Southeastern Conference (SEC) titles, 10 SEC relay crowns and set five conference records. She was named the SEC Female Swimmer of the Year in 2000.

After graduating from Georgia in 2001 cum laude with a degree in sports studies/communications, Hart worked as a motivational speaker for the NCAA, Coca-Cola, Healthsouth and Arby's, and served as the director of the Golden West Swim Lessons Program in Huntington Beach, Calif., before heading to North Florida.

In the summer of 2013, Hart was inducted into the Georgia Aquatic Hall of Fame, signifying both her achievements as a collegiate all-American and National Swimmer of the Year at the University of Georgia and as a two-time Olympic Gold Medalist.

Hart, who earned her master's degree in sports administration from Georgia in 2005, was inducted into the Irmo High School Hall of Fame in September 2017.
