GAME DAY VS GEORGIA TECH

The Bulls and Yellow Jackets will meet for the first time as USF looks for its fourth straight win vs. a Power Five opponent. The Bulls are 5-1 vs. P5 teams in their last six meetings, including a pair of bowl victories. The lone loss came to No. 13 Florida State (55-35) in 2016 in Raymond James Stadium. The Bulls are 7-10 all-time vs. ACC opponents, but have won two of the last three meetings, downing Syracuse twice.

■ **POWER RUN GAMES:** USF and Georgia Tech are among just four teams nationally to rank in the Top 10 in rushing in each of the past three seasons. USF ranked 8th (264.1 ypg) in 2017 while Tech was 5th (307.4). Tech returns its top two rushers (both over 1,000 yards) and 90.4 percent of its 3,381 rushing yards from 2017, while USF is replacing its top three rushers and 92 percent of its 3,169 rushing yards from 2017.

■ **TECH TIES:** USF Assistant Head Coach/Defensive Coordinator Brian Jean-Mary served as linebackers coach at Georgia Tech from 2004-09. He was a part of current Georgia Tech Head Coach Paul Johnson's first staff at Tech and helped the Yellow Jackets to the 2009 ACC Championship game played in Tampa (Tech's last trip to Raymond James Stadium) and the 2009 FedEx Orange Bowl.

■ **ON A ROLL:** USF has gone 22-4 since the start of 2016, including 9-1 in out-of-conference games (two bowl wins) with the only loss coming to No. 13 Florida State in 2016. The Bulls have posted a 17-3 record in Raymond James Stadium over the past four seasons and are in the midst of the most successful run in program history (30-9 (76.9) since 2015) that includes a 29-6 mark in the last 35 games, which ranks among the top six in the nation over that time.

THE PROGRAM

In its 22nd season and 19th at the FBS level, USF Football has made nine bowl appearances, including a current string of three straight and every season between 2005-10 (6 straight). USF has won six bowl games and has produced 14 All-America selections, 30 NFL Draft picks and reached the No. 2 ranking in the Associated Press Poll in 2007.

LAST TIME OUT

BARNETT SHINES IN DEBUT AS BULLS WIN FIFTH STRAIGHT OPENER

Blake Barnett turned in the top scoring debut by a USF quarterback, throwing for three touchdowns and 305 yards and finding the end zone once with his feet in the Bulls' 34-14 win over Elon in the season opener. Barnett threw all three TD passes in the first half, finishing 24 of 34 through the air in less than three quarters of action. USF led 24-0 at the half and took a 31-0 lead before Elon broke the shutout.

- USF posted 515 yards of offense, its third straight game with 500-plus yards and the seventh game accomplishing the feat in the past 13 outings under coordinator Sterlin Gilbert.
- Randall St. Felix put together USF's top receiving debut by a freshman with seven catches for 143 yards, including a 40-yard touchdown to open the scoring.
- Vincent Jackson and Mike Hampton intercepted passes while the Bulls racked up 12 tackles for loss and limited Elon to 42 passing yards. Seniors Jaymon Thomas and Khalid McGee both set new career highs with 11 tackles apiece. Redshirt freshman safety Bentlee Sanders started and finished with 10 tackles.
- USF improved to 17-5 all-time in season openers and won its fifth straight season opener. The Bulls are now 15-1 in season openers played at home.

QUICKLY SPEAKING

USF TEAM

- USF is 22-4 in the last three seasons and has won 29 of its last 35 games (29-6; 82.8%), a mark that ranks among the top six in the nation over that span.
- The winningest era of USF football includes a program-record run of 20 straight weeks ranked in the Top 25, three straight bowl game appearances and two straight bowl victories over Power 5 opponents.
- USF is 19-5 in American Athletic Conference games over the last three seasons, the best record of any team over that span. The Bulls are 13-2 against the East Division opponents in the last three years and 16-6 over the first five years of the conference.
- USF's 20 all-conference selections in the last two seasons are the most in The American during that span.
- USF finished 2017 ranked in the top 25 nationally in seven offensive and nine defensive statistical categories, including total offense (6th), scoring offense (10th), rushing offense (8th), rushing defense (21st), interceptions (2nd), tackles for loss (5th) and sacks (11th).
- For the first time since 2011, USF returns all the members of its primary coaching staff, including returning its offensive coordinator (Sterlin Gilbert) for the first time in six seasons and defensive coordinator (Brian Jean-Mary) for the first time in four seasons.

OFFENSE

- USF ranked 10th nationally, averaging 38.3 ppg last season, scoring 57 offensive TD. USF has posted the highest TD totals in program history in the last three seasons, scoring 54 in 2015, 77 in 2016 and 57 last year.
- USF ranked 6th nationally averaging 513.0 ypg in 2017 in Sterlin Gilbert's first season as OC. USF has eclipsed 6,000 yards in the last two seasons and the last three rank as the highest yardage totals in program history.
- USF eclipsed 600 yards three times in 2017, posting 680 yards vs. Illinois - its most ever vs. an FBS opponent - 606 at UConn and 653 at UCF. The Bulls have posted 400+ yards in 11 straight games.
- USF's rushing game has ranked in the top 10 nationally in each of the past three seasons. The Bulls ranked 8th in 2017 running for 264.1 ypg. USF has run for more than 3,100 yards in each of the last three seasons. USF ran for 300+ yards in 5 games and 200 or more in 9 in 2017.
- RS FR WR **Randall St. Felix** posted the best receiving yards debut in program history grabbing seven receptions for 143 yards and a touchdown vs. Elon. The mark is tied for the ninth-best in program history.
- TE **Mitchell Wilcox** is a Mackey Award candidate for the second straight year. He had a career-best 4 catches gaining 45 yards and a TD in the opener vs. Elon.
- WR **Tyre McCants** led the team in touchdowns and ranked second in yards and receptions in 2017, posting 36 catches for 686 yards and 7 TD. His 14 career receiving TD are tied for third most all-time at USF, while his

1,260 career yards are just 34 shy of 10th place. He set the USF game record with 227 yards on nine catches at UCF in 2017.

■ USF returns three starters on the offensive line, including senior tackle **Eric Mayes** and junior tackle **Marcus Norman** (2nd team all-conference in 2017) and junior guard **William Atterbury**. Norman is the most experienced returning offensive player with 22 career starts.

DEFENSE

- USF returns 5 starters, including 3 seniors in the secondary. The Bulls lost the program's all-time leading tackler, three starting defensive lineman currently on NFL rosters and a pair of all-conference defensive backs.
- USF had the top defense in The American in 2017, leading the conference in total defense (359.8 ypg), scoring defense (23.5 ppg), rushing defense (126.9 ypg), pass efficiency defense (110.53), interceptions (20), sacks (3.0) and tackles for loss (8.4).
- USF ranked 2nd nationally in interceptions (20) and 15th in turnover margin (.83) in 2017. USF got 2 INT in the opener and was +2 in turnovers.
- USF ranked 5th in the nation in TFL (8.4 tpg) and 11th in sacks (3.0 spg) in 2017.
- RS FR S **Bentlee Sanders** posted 10 tackles and 0.5 TFL in his first career start and game vs. Elon.
- Senior LB **Khalid McGee** has transitioned from safety to linebacker, a process he began late in 2017 by posting 25 tackles as an LB in the last three games (8.3 tpg). He posted a career-best 11 tackles to lead the team in his first start at LB vs. Elon.
- Junior DE **Greg Reaves**, a former walk-on, led USF with 14.0 TFL in 2017 and added 4.0 sacks while starting all 12 games.
- LB **Nico Sawtelle** is the Bulls' top returning tackler, having posted 54 tackles in 2017 to rank 4th on the team while starting all 12 games.
- USF returns three senior starters in the secondary in **Ronnie Hoggins**, **Jaymon Thomas** and **Mazzi Wilkins**. Hoggins is the Bulls most experienced returner with 29 career starts.
- S **Jaymon Thomas** had a career-best 11 tackles and 1.5 TFL vs. Elon.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- USF is replacing 2017 starting punter Jonathan Hernandez, who was a Ray Guy Award candidate and ranked 2nd in the AAC averaging 43.4 ypp in 2017. **Trent Schneider**, a 28-year-old Australian who transferred to USF in the spring, takes over punting duties.
- USF is replacing 2017 first team all-conference place-kicker Emilio Nadelman, who set a USF record with 21 field goals while hitting 84% in 2017. **Jake Vivonetto** went 2-of-2 on FG and 4-of-4 on PAT in his debut vs. Elon.

OPPONENT PREVIEW: GEORGIA TECH: FIRST MEETING

Georgia Tech opened the 2018 season with a 41-0 shutout win over Alcorn State in Atlanta. The Yellow Jackets used their triple option attack to rush for 439 yards and surrendered just 77 yards on the ground, en route to a 543-146 advantage in total yardage. The Jackets averaged 7.5 yards per play and gave up just 2.9 ypp to Alcorn State (0-1).

QB TaQuon Marshall accounted for two touchdowns (one rushing, one passing) and B-back KirVonte Benson came off the bench to run for two scores. Junior linebacker David Curry ran a fumble back 15 yards for a touchdown.

■ Tech rushed for 439 yards, surpassing the 400-yard mark for the fifth time in its last 12 games, and had three players with 75 rushing yards or more (QB TaQuon Marshall – 77; BB KirVonte Benson – 75; BB Jordan Mason – 75)

■ QB TaQuon Marshall (1,146) and BB KirVonte Benson (1,053 yards) both ran for 1,000 yards in 2017 as Tech ranked 5th in the nation running for 307.4 ypg. Tech was 127th in the nation passing for 84.3 ypg.

■ Tech returns 15 starters (8 offense, 5 defense, 2 specialists) from a team that went 5-6 in 2017, with three losses by four points or less.

BARNETT SHINES IN USF DEBUT

Blake Barnett (6-5, 217), an Arizona State graduate transfer, was impressive in his USF debut taking the reins as the Bulls' first new starting QB since 2015 in the opener vs. Elon. It marked Barnett's first start since he was Alabama's opening game starter vs. USC to begin the 2016 season.

■ Barnett accounted for four TD vs. Elon (3 passing, 1 rushing), the most ever for a USF QB in their debut. His 305 yards passing were just six yards shy of the debut record of 311 set by Mike White at Houston (2013), while his three passing TD equaled the debut mark set by Glen Gauntt vs. Cumberland (1998). Barnett accounted for 336 total yards, rushing for 31 on eight carries.

■ Barnett led the Bulls on a 5-play, 70-yard TD drive in their opening possession and scoring drives in five of his first six possessions (4 TD, 1 FG), including a 16-play, 86-yard TD drive to open the second half. He started 11-of-14 for 202 yards and 3TD.

First Time USF QB starters record: 9-6

■ Barnett became the 15th starting QB in program history on Sept. 1 and the first, first-time starter to take the field since Quinton Flowers started as a freshman at SMU on Nov. 15, 2014. He was the first new starting QB to start a season since Flowers began the 2015 season.

■ Barnett joined the Bulls in the summer and won the QB the competition in fall camp.

■ Barnett was a consensus five-star prospect and MVP of the 2014 Elite 11 Quarterback Competition. He had seen action in seven collegiate games prior to arriving at USF, completing 14-of-24 passes for 259 yards at previous stops at Alabama and ASU.

■ USF entered 2018 with a new starting quarterback for the first time since the start of the 2015 season, when Quinton Flowers won the job. Flowers started the next 38 games straight while leading USF to a 29-9 record and setting 42 USF records while accounting for 11,802 yards and 112 touchdowns on his career

OFFENSE CONTINUES ROLLING

■ In 13 games under OC Sterlin Gilbert, USF has posted more offensive yards than every opponent it has faced, going 11-2 in those games while averaging 513.15 yards per game.

■ With 515 yards in the opener, USF has posted 500+ yards of offense in three straight games, dating to 2017, and in 4 of its last 5. Under Sterlin Gilbert USF has posted 8 games with 500+ yards and three with 600+.

■ USF passed for 367 yards in the opener, and has passed for 300+ yards in three straight games, dating to 2017, and in 5 of its last 6. The Bulls have posted six 300+ yard passing games under OC Sterlin Gilbert.

■ USF has scored 30 points or more in 27 of its last 29 games dating to the 2015 season.

TOP 10 GROUND GAME

USF has ranked among the top 10 programs nationally in rushing in each of the past three seasons, averaging more than 240 yards per game on the ground and surpassing 3,100 yards rushing in each season.

■ USF is joined by Air Force, Georgia Tech and Navy in ranking in the top 10 in rushing in each of the last three seasons.

■ The Bulls will look to replace their top three rushers and 92 percent (2,925 of 3,169) of their rushing yards from 2017.

■ USF's 148 yards rushing in the 2018 season opener marked the second lowest total under OC Sterlin Gilbert and just the fourth game under 200 yards rushing under Gilbert. USF was without projected starting RB Jordan Cronkrite and RS-Freshman RB Duran Bell, Jr. in the game.

■ **300+ YARDS:** USF has reached 300+ yards rushing in 10 of its last 20 games. USF ran for 300+ yards 5 games in 2017, including 390 at ECU and 378 at Tulane.

■ **200+ YARDS:** USF has run for 200+ yards in 26 of its last 31 games.

■ **150+ YARDS:** USF has run for 150+ yards in 29 of its last 31 games, having a then nation-leading string of 25 straight games snapped in a 2017 loss to Houston (Oct. 28, 2017).

PROGRAM ON A ROLL

The USF Football program rode a wave of unprecedented success into the 2018 season.

■ **21-4 Record:** The Bulls were one of just 15 programs in the nation to have won 20 or more games in the previous two seasons and one of just THREE to have won 20 or more games and a pair of bowl games during that span.

■ **20 Straight Polls:** Ending with the 2018 preseason polls, USF posted a program-record smashing string of 20 straight appearances in the top 25 polls dating back to Week 14 of the 2016 season.

■ **No. 21 Ranking:** USF finished the 2017 season ranked No. 21 in the final AP and Coaches Polls, marking the second straight season USF finished a season ranked (USF was No. 19 at the conclusion of 2016) and just the second time in program history. The Bulls reached the No. 13 ranking in the Coaches Poll in Week 8 of 2017, the program's highest ranking since appearing at No. 10 in both polls in Week 5 of the 2008 season.

■ **Poll Position:** 2017 was the first time USF spent an entire season in the Top 25 rankings.

■ **Three Straight Bowl Games:** USF has made three straight bowl game appearances, the second-longest streak in program history behind six straight appearances from 2005 to 2010.

■ **Back-to-Back Bowl Wins:** USF has downed the SEC's South Carolina and the Big 12's Texas Tech to post consecutive wins in bowl games for the second time in program history. The Bulls won three straight bowl games from 2008 to 2010.

■ **All-Conference:** USF's 20 all-conference selections in the last two years are the most in The American over that span.

■ **Offensive Juggernaut:** USF's offense ranked No. 6 in total offense (513.0 ypg) and No. 10 in scoring offense (38.3 ppg) in 2017, marking the second straight year the Bulls ranked in the top 11 nationally in scoring and total offense. The Bulls ranked No. 8 nationally in rushing offense (264.1 ypg) in 2017, marking the third straight season USF has ranked in the top 10 in the nation in rushing.

■ **Home Field:** USF has gone 16-2 overall at home since an Oct. 10, 2015 victory over Syracuse, falling only to No. 13 Florida State (2016) and Houston (2017) in that span.

■ **Record Win Streak:** Posted a school-record 12-game win streak between 2016-2017, shattering the previous mark of eight, and best-ever 7-0 start to a season in 2017.

■ **NCAA Record 30-point Game Streak:** USF posted a run of 24 straight games scoring at least 30 points, the longest in the AP POLL ERA (1936), between Nov. 14, 2015 and Oct. 28, 2017.

ROLLING AT RAY JAY

■ USF has won 17 of its last 20 home games, with 15 wins coming by two touchdowns or more and an averaging winning margin of 18.7 ppg.

■ USF has outscored opponents, 818-444, during that span, for an average margin of 40.9-22.2 (+18.7).

■ USF is averaging more than 40 points and 496.5 yards per game over its last 20 home games.

■ USF went 6-1 at home in 2016 and 5-1 at home in 2015 and 2017. USF's current 17-3 home record over the last four seasons is the Bulls' best home stretch since going 19-0 at home across three seasons in 2000-02.

2017 MARKED BY CLOSE LOSSES

USF went 10-2, won its second straight bowl game and finished ranked No. 21 in the nation, but 2017 was literally seconds and a couple of plays from being much more.

■ USF's two losses on the year both came on opponent scoring plays that occurred with less than 1:30 to play in the game. A combined total of 1:39 remained on the clock when Houston and UCF scored game winning touchdowns that sent the Bulls to their two losses.

■ Houston converted a fourth-and-24 with 1:07 to play on a scrambling D'Eriq King pass play to keep the Cougars' final drive alive. That drive culminated with a King to Caden Novikoff touchdown pass with :11 to play to give Houston a 28-24 victory in Raymond James Stadium.

■ After USF tied an epic War on I-4 in Orlando at 42-42 on a Quinton Flowers' 83-yard TD pass to Darnell Salomon with 1:41 to play, the Knights' Mike Hughes returned the ensuing kickoff 95 yards for the game-winning TD with 1:28 remaining. USF moved to its own 45 on the following possession when Mitch Wilcox fumbled while trying to gain yards after a reception ending the Bulls' comeback with 49 seconds.

SCORE FAST!

■ USF had three scoring drives under 2:00 in the season opener and just one of its six scoring drives was over 3:00.

■ The Bulls had 33 scoring drives (25 TD) under 2:00 last year and 17 (15 TD) of 1:00 or less.

PLAY FAST!

USF's offense under Sterlin Gilbert has moved at a rapid fire pace as the Bulls no-huddle attack ranked among the nation's most prolific in yards and plays in 2017.

■ USF ranked second in the nation in 2017 averaging 85.1 plays per game, standing only behind Syracuse (87.8). The Bulls ran faster at home, averaging 87.6 plays per game. The 2017 average was an increase of 13 plays per game over the Bulls 72.6 plays per game average in 2016.

■ The Bulls set a program record, reeling off 101 plays in their 2017 debut under Gilbert at San Jose State.

■ USF ran 84 plays in its 2018 season opener.

DEFENSE MAKES HUGE LEAP UNDER JEAN-MARY

Defensive coordinator Brian Jean-Mary returns to lead a defense that saw dramatic improvement in 2017. USF ranked in the Top 25 nationally in six defensive categories in 2017 and led The American in scoring and total defense. The Bulls left from 120th in total (482.0 ypg) and 92nd in scoring (31.6 ppg) defense in 2016 to 37th in total (359.8 ypg) and 41st in scoring (23.5 ppg) in 2017. Jean-Mary's aggressive defense ranked second nationally in interceptions (20), fifth in tackles for loss (8.4 tpg), 11th in sacks (3.0 spg), 21st in rushing defense (126.9 ypg) and 29th in turnovers gained (24) in 2017. USF returns five starters on defense, including team leader in TFL, Greg Reaves (14.0 TFL).

YOUNG BULLS MAKE IMPACT;

ST. FELIX & SANDERS SHINE IN DEBUT

The Bulls' recruiting strength under Charlie Strong and young talent is already shining in 2018 with several redshirt freshmen from his first class figuring into prominent roles as well as several true freshman from the most recent class.

■ Redshirt freshman WR **Randall St. Felix** posted the best debut by a wide receiver in program history grabbing seven receptions for 143 yards and a touchdown vs. Elon. The mark is tied for the ninth-best in program history. St. Felix's first career reception was a 40-yard TD pass from Blake Barnett on the opening drive of 2018.

■ Redshirt freshman S **Bentlee Sanders** posted 10 tackles and 0.5 TFL in his first career start and game vs. Elon.

■ A combined 19 redshirt (7) and true freshmen (12) (8 offense; 11 defense) figured into the Bulls' 2018 opening depth chart and look to see action. (See Depth Chart)

■ Several other redshirt freshmen are positioned to make an impact in 2018. Tight end Frederick Lloyd, Jr. and running back Duran Bell, Jr. both had strong camps. On defense, Mekhi LaPointe emerged at the top of the depth chart at strong safety before suffering an injury toward the end of camp.

■ Charlie Strong's first full-cycle recruiting class in 2018 was ranked No. 2 in The American and was particularly strong along the lines. Four true freshmen have earned a position as a back-up at their position along the offensive line. Two true freshmen have seen action in the defensive line rotation and a third is in the depth chart, while eight total, including a pair of linebackers and three defensive backs, are in the defensive depth chart.

■ USF gained at least one turnover in 12 of the last 13 games and gained at least 2 in 8, including two in the 2018 opener.

■ USF has collected at least one interception in 11 of last 13 games and ranked No. 2 in the nation in interceptions in 2017. The Bulls grabbed two interceptions vs. Elon in the 2018 opener, both were career firsts for Mike Hampton and Vincent Jackson. Ten players have recorded an interception in the last 13 games, collecting 22 total.

■ USF's defense was ball-hawking and the Bulls' offense took care of the ball in 2017. The Bulls finished the year +10 in turnovers gained to lost and ranked 15th in the nation in turnover margin at 0.83. The Bulls ranked 2nd nationally in interceptions gained and 8th in interceptions thrown with just six.

■ The 2018 Bulls' roster features 36 players from the Bay Area, representing 33 percent of the roster. The Miami/Ft. Lauderdale area is next closest with 20 Bulls hailing from the area.

■ Among the Bay Area standouts on the Bulls' roster are 19 players in the depth chart, including Mackey Award candidate Mitchell Wilcox, right tackle Eric Mayes, right guard William Atterbury, center Michael Wiggs, cornerback Mike Hampton, defensive end Greg Reaves, safeties Mekhi LaPointe and Bentlee Sanders, and cornerback Mazzi Wilkins.

USF UNVEILS PLANS FOR 160,000-SQUARE FOOT USF FOOTBALL CENTER

On Nov. 9, 2017, USF unveiled plans for a 160,000-square foot USF Football Center to be located on campus adjacent to the Lee Roy Selmon Athletics Center. The USF Football Center, which is estimated to cost \$40 million and will be a donor-driven project, will expand upon the Morsani Football Practice Complex and feature an 83,000-square foot indoor practice facility housing a 100-yard turf field. The Center will also feature a more than 80,000-square foot, two-level building providing a state-of-the-art home for the entire football program.

USF received a \$5 million gift toward the facility from Pam & Les Muma on Nov. 11, 2017 and has approximately \$11 million in commitments toward the facility to date.

Among the highlights in the initial plans by the global design firm HOK:

- A stunning entry lobby and multi-purpose space for recruiting
- Indoor practice facility with a 100-yard turf field
- More than 12,000-square foot football strength and conditioning center
- Nearly 10,000-square foot football locker room
- Players' lounge and adjacent social patio
- Team auditorium with tiered seating
- Sports medicine and rehabilitation facility
- Nutrition center
- More than 12,000 square feet of team and position meeting spaces
- Coaches and staff offices



OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR GILBERT LEADS USF OFFENSE IN SECOND SEASON

Sterlin Gilbert returns to direct the Bulls' offense in his second season as offensive coordinator, marking the first time USF has had the same offensive coordinator in consecutive seasons in six seasons AND the first time Gilbert has returned to direct the offense for the same program since 2013. Prior to this season, Gilbert had served as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at five different programs in the last five seasons.

■ USF ranked 6th nationally in total offense, 8th in rushing and 10th in scoring in Gilbert's first season in 2017.

■ In his six seasons as an offensive coordinator, Gilbert directed offenses have ranked nationally (including FCS rankings while at E. Illinois):

Top 20 in Total Offense: 5 of 6 times

Top 25 in Scoring: 4 times (3 in Top 10)

Top 20 in Rushing: 3 times

Top 15 in Passing: 3 times

■ 5-of-6 offenses Gilbert has directed have averaged more than 470 yards per game, while 4-of-6 have scored more than 36 points per game.

■ The last time Gilbert returned to direct the offense for the same program was in 2013 at Eastern Illinois, he went on to be named FCS Coordinator of the Year. He led the Panther offense to the No. 1 ranking in FCS in scoring (48.2 ypg) and total offense (589.5 ypg), while ranking second in passing (372.4) and 20th in rushing (217.1). Gilbert guided quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo, who went on to win the Walter Payton Award (the FCS Heisman), as he passed for 5,050 yards and 53 TD.

USF averaged 38.3 ppg in 2017 and eclipsed 40 points in 5 games in 2017, and 17 of its last 30 overall.

■ USF is 57-1 all-time when scoring 40+ points, including 18-1 since 2015, the loss coming 49-42 at No. 13 UCF in 2017.

AGGRESSIVE BULLS D AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN SACKS AND TFL IN 2017

The USF defense has posted seven or more tackles for loss in 9 of its last 10 games and in 10 games total under DC Brian Jean-Mary.

The Bulls posted three or more sacks in eight games.

■ USF opened 2018 with 12.0 TFL and 3.0 sacks in a victory over Elon, as nine players posted a TFL.

■ USF finished 2017 ranked 5th nationally in tackles for loss, posting 8.4 per game. Junior Greg Reaves returns after leading USF with 14.0 TFL in 2017, but the Bulls must replace four of their top five leaders from 2017.

■ USF finished 2017 ranked 11th nationally in sacks, posting 3.0 per game. Greg Reaves (4.0) and Juwan Brown (3.0) are the top returning sack leaders as the Bulls must replace the top three leaders from 2017 that accounted for 18.5 sacks. Each of those players (Bruce Hector (7.0); Deadrin Senat (6.0) & Mike Love (5.5)) is currently on an NFL roster.

CALL HIM MAJOR

Senior cornerback Ronnie Hoggins has assumed the vocal leadership role on the defense vacated by the graduation of four-year starting linebacker Auggie Sanchez (now a GA at Florida State). Hoggins was given the nickname "Major" by defensive backs coach Blue Adams during 2018 fall camp due to his enthusiastic embracing of the leadership role.

■ Hoggins is the most experienced returning Bull having started 29 career games.

■ He ranked 5th on the team with 53 tackles and logged 10 passes defended and 2 INT in 2017.

MAZZI IS PRETTY JAZZY

Senior cornerback Mazzi (sounds like Jazzy) Wilkins looks to build on a breakout season in 2017.

■ He ranked second on the Bulls with 12 passes defended and second with three interceptions in 2017.

■ The local Tampa product (Plant HS), in his fifth season with the program, played mostly special teams during his first two years on the field and totaled 30 tackles, one pass break-up and no interceptions. He logged 32 tackles in 2017.

■ He missed 14 of 15 spring practices in 2017 with a hamstring injury, but, after being challenged by DB Coach Blue Adams and dedicating himself in the offseason (working very hard on his flexibility), he emerged almost immediately as an impact player.

McCANTS CHASING RECEIVING TD RECORD; LOOKS TO BUILD ON STRONG FINISH TO 2017

Senior wide receiver Tyre McCants entered his senior season as the Bulls' top returning target (36 rec., 686 yds, 7 TD in 2017) and looking to build on a strong finish to 2017. He led USF with 7 TD and a 19.1 yards per catch average in 2017

■ **McCants** has scored a TD in each of his last four games (dating to 2017), including a 16-yard TD in the 2018 opener, and totaled 5 TD during that span, including two in a Birmingham Bowl victory over Texas Tech. McCants' 26-yard TD catch with 16 seconds to play sealed the Bulls' comeback victory in the bowl game.

■ **McCants** set a USF game record with 227 yards on nine receptions and a touchdown in an epic War on I-4 battle at UCF. His touchdown came on a 47-yard reception in which he dragged a UCF defender clinging to his jersey tail the last 10 yards into the endzone. That play is currently highlighted on a pair of billboards on I-275 just north of downtown Tampa.

■ **McCants** is a stout 5-11, 240, yet still possess break-away speed. He regularly uses his size to spring Bull runners downfield with punishing blocks.

REAVES EARNS SCHOLLY & DELIVERS!!

Junior defensive end Greg Reaves, a Bay Area native from Manatee HS in Bradenton, walked onto the team in 2015. He promptly earned the team's "Scout Team Award" on defense that season and then got on the field in 2016 making seven tackles on special teams.

■ The former three-sport HS athlete (football, basketball, track) earned a starting job at defensive end during 2017 fall camp and was awarded a scholarship by Charlie Strong during the last week of camp.

■ In 2017 he led the team in TFL (14.0), ranked 6th in tackles (51) and was third in sacks (4.0) while starting all 12 games.

■ Reaves previously attended Air Force Academy Prep School following his Manatee High graduation in 2014. He played safety and middle linebacker in high school.

AUSSIE

First-year Bulls punter Trent Schneider has been tagged with the nickname "Aussie" by coach Charlie Strong for obvious reasons.

■ The 28-year-old Schneider hails from Sydney, Australia where he worked as an apprentice in the construction business for eight years following completion of senior secondary school. He did work in brick laying, tiling, framing, deck building and renovations.

■ Schneider, a former soccer goal keeper with a strong leg launching the ball from his own goal box, posted a video on Facebook that spurred interest from colleges.

■ Schneider's parents and two sisters reside in Australia.

■ He earned CCCAA All-State Region 4 honors, averaging 38.6 ypp at Santa Barbara City College.

■ Schneider will handle punting and kickoff duties for the Bulls.

■ Charlie Strong has had previous experience with Australian kickers recruiting Michael Dickson, also from Sydney, to Texas. The current Seattle Seahawks punter earned the Ray Guy Award and All-America honors at Texas.

BULLS WILL PLAY ANYONE

USF has built a strong non-conference schedule and an opportunity to put its talent on display in the coming years as head coach Charlie Strong is willing to play anyone who will schedule the Bulls.

■ USF has added non-conference series vs. Florida (2022, 2023, 2025), Louisville (2022, 2024, 2026), and N.C. State (2021, 2024) under Strong.

■ The Bulls will take on Georgia Tech (Sept. 8) in Tampa and travel to play Illinois (Sept. 15) in Chicago in 2018.

■ Future non-conference opponents through 2026 also include Texas (2020, 2022, 2024), Wisconsin (2019) and BYU (2019 & 2021).

A PREEMINENT UNIVERSITY

USF was designated a "Preeminent State Research University" by the Florida board of governors in 2018, placing it in elite company with the University of Florida and Florida State University as the only three state universities to earn the designation.

■ The USF System's total enrollment surpassed 50,000 students for the first time in the fall of 2017, now with 50,577 students currently enrolled across the three separately accredited institutions: USF Tampa, USF St. Petersburg and USF Sarasota-Manatee. Serving 43,542 undergraduate and graduate students USF Tampa has seen a rise in the average high school GPA of the 2017-18 first time in college (FTIC) class, from 4.08 to 4.12 this year.

■ INNOVATIVE: USF is the nation's fifth leading public university in generating new United States utility patents and ranks 12th among universities worldwide.

■ USF is home to students from all 67 Florida counties, all 50 states and more than 145 countries, the USF System continues to admit a very diverse student body.



THE USF FOOTBALL PROGRAM

- The Bulls have had four head coaches in 22 seasons.
- USF was ranked for a program record 20 straight weeks during the 2016 & 2017 seasons.

Senior Khalid McGee, a safety for his first three seasons, made the move to linebacker late in the 2017 season and has been racking up tackles ever since.

■ In his last four games, all playing at linebacker, McGee has registered 36 tackles, an average of 9.0 tackles per game.

■ In his first start at linebacker in the 2018 season opener vs. Elon, McGee posted a career-best 11 tackles.

■ In the final three games of 2017, McGee posted 25 tackles, including leading the team with 10 tackles at No. 12 UCF.

■ McGee started 11 games at safety in 2016 and posted 51 tackles, 4.0 TFL, 1 INT, 2 FR, 1 FF.

■ McGee added 20 pounds to his frame from 2017 fall camp to 2018 and came into the 2018 season at 213 pounds.

■ McGee lost his father, Kevin, to gang violence when he was 3 years old. McGee grew up in the same rough Liberty City neighborhood of Miami as former standout Bulls QB Quinton Flowers. Like Flowers, he wants to become a firefighter when his playing career ends.

2018 SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN

■ **Power 6:** The Bulls will take on two Power 6 opponents in the non-conference season, a first-ever meeting with Georgia Tech in Tampa and a trip to Chicago to face Illinois at Soldier Field in the return game of a series that began in 2017 with a 47-23 USF victory in Tampa.

■ **The American:** USF will open the conference season at home vs. ECU, a team that went 3-9 last year and the Bulls defeated, 61-31, in Greenville. The Bulls will not face 2017 West Division winner Memphis, Navy or SMU. USF will face its first conference road test at Tulsa on Oct. 12, in game No. 6.

■ **Cool Finish:** USF will play two of its last three games on the road, including November dates above the Mason-Dixon Line at Cincinnati (Nov. 10) and at Temple (Nov. 17). The Bulls' last game that far north in November was a 31-6 loss at Rutgers on Dec. 7, 2013.

BULLS ADD 26 IN 2018 CLASS

USF added 26 players (11 offense, 14 defense, 1 special teams) in the class of 2018, including 24 in the early signing period which ranked as the second-most nationally. The Bulls' first full cycle recruiting class under Charlie Strong was ranked No. 2 in The American by Rivals and 247Sports.

Joining Strong on the list are Dino Babers (Syracuse), Herm Edwards (Arizona St.), James Franklin (Penn State), Mike Jinks (Bowling Green), Derek Mason (Vanderbilt), Scottie Montgomery (East Carolina), David Shaw (Stanford), Lovie Smith (Illinois), Kevin Sumlin (Arizona), Willie Taggart (Florida State), Frank Wilson (UTSA) and Everett Withers (Texas State).

STRONG TAKES OVER BULLS

A strong recruiter and one of the best defensive minds in college football, Charlie Strong was named the fourth head coach in USF football program history on Dec. 11, 2016. A two-time Big East Coach of the Year while at Louisville, Strong was also a vital part of two national championships as defensive coordinator at the University of Florida. He also had head coaching stints at the University of Texas (2014-16) and the University of Louisville (2010-13). Strong's appointment at USF returned him to the state of Florida, where he has spent 17 of his 36 seasons as a collegiate coach.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

SIGNIFICANT DEFENSIVE RETURNERS

■ Junior defensive end **Greg Reaves** led the Bulls with 14.0 tackles for loss and added 4.0 sacks, 7 quarterback hurries and 51 tackles in 2017, his first year with significant playing time on defense.

■ Three starters in the secondary – **Ronnie Hoggins**, **Jaymon Thomas** and **Mazzi Wilkins** – all of which will be seniors in 2018. Wilkins ranked second on the team with 12 passes defended and three interceptions in 2017. Hoggins ranked fifth with 53 tackles and added two interceptions and 10 passes defended.

■ Junior linebacker **Nico Sawtelle** started all 12 games and ranked fourth on the team with 54 tackles in 2017.

SIGNIFICANT DEFENSIVE LOSSES

■ All-time USF leading tackler **Auggie Sanchez**, who made 50 straight starts at middle linebacker, led USF in tackles in each of the last three seasons, earning all-conference honors each season (1st team in 2017) and recorded a USF record 388 career tackles.

■ Three of four starters on the defensive line, including all-conference tackles **Deadrin Senat** (1st team) and **Bruce Hector** (2nd team). Senat finished second on the team with 66 tackles while adding 10.5 tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks. Hector led USF for the third straight season with 7.0 sacks and added 13.0 tackles for loss and 38 tackles.

■ All-conference defensive backs **Deatrick Nichols** (a three-time selection) and **Devin Abraham** (2017). Abraham led USF with five interceptions in 2017 and had nine on his career while Nichols led USF with 15 passes defended, ranked third with 56 tackles and added three interceptions in 2017 – finishing with 11 interceptions on his career.

POSITION MOVEMENT

Several players have shifted positions entering 2018. Senior **Khalid McGee** moved from safety to linebacker. He has 11 starts and 36 games played at safety, but saw action at linebacker in USF's last four games of 2017, including posting 10 tackles at UCF. Senior **Ronnie Hoggins**, who has 28 starts at cornerback (including 11 in 2017), has moved to nickel following a successful similar move made by all-conference defensive back Deatrick Nichols last year. Sophomore **Naytron Culpepper**, who started the final two games of 2017 at cornerback, has moved to safety. Junior **Marlon Gonzalez**, who missed 2017 with an injury, has moved from defensive tackle to offensive guard. Senior **Chris Barr**, who appeared in 13 games as a slot receiver as a true freshman and has 29 catches for 259 yards on his career, moved to cornerback in the spring and played well. Junior **Deangelo Antoine** moved from receiver to safety in fall camp.

VETERAN SECONDARY

The returners in the USF secondary brought 41 career starts into the 2018 season, led by cornerback **Ronnie Hoggins** whose 28 career starts led all returning Bulls. USF returned three seniors in the secondary that started at least nine games in 2017 and sophomore **Naytron Culpepper** played in 10 games with two starts as a true freshman. Senior **Jaymon Thomas** brought 12 career starts (9 in 2017) and 106 career tackles into his final campaign. Senior **Mazzi Wilkins** posted three interceptions, 32 tackles and 12 passes defended in 2017 while starting 10 games. He had played in 35 games entering 2018. Hoggins posted 53 tackles, two interceptions and 10 passes defended in 2017 and brought 132 tackles and six interceptions into his final season. He will move to the nickel from his cornerback position, mirroring the move made by three-time all-conference defensive back Deatrick Nichols last year.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

SIGNIFICANT OFFENSIVE RETURNERS

■ Three of five starters on the offensive line, all of which started at least 10 games in 2017. Right tackle **Marcus Norman** was a second team all-conference selection and has started 21 straight games.

■ Three of the top four receivers from 2017, including senior **Tyre McCants**, who set a USF record with 227 yards at UCF, and junior **Darnell Salomon**, who posted 139 yards at UCF and had TD catches in each of the final three games. Returners accounted for 114 receptions for 1,701 yards and 15 touchdowns in 2017.

■ Junior tight end **Mitchell Wilcox**, a two-year starter and 2016 all-conference selection that has 29 career receptions for 436 yards and 4 TD.

SIGNIFICANT OFFENSIVE LOSSES

■ Three-year starting quarterback **Quinton Flowers**, owner of 42 school records, including career total offense (11,802), career rushing (3,672) and total TD responsible for (112).

■ The top three rushers from 2017, which all ran for 750 or more yards and combined for 2,817 yards and 29 touchdowns on the ground.

■ Leading receiver **Marquez Valdes-Scantling**, who set a program record with 879 receiving yards on 53 receptions in 2017 with 6 TD.

BULLS TO UTILIZE BIG AIR CORPS

The Bulls return four of their top six receivers from 2017 and 15 of their 25 TD receptions. Four wideouts in the depth chart check in at 6-2, 205 or larger and 5-11, 240-pound Tyre McCants is one of the most physical receivers in the nation.

■ Senior **Tyre McCants** posted a career best year in 2017, logging 36 receptions for 686 yards to finish second on the team while posting a team-high 7 TD. The 5-11, 248-pounder is one of the strongest receivers in the nation and set a USF record with 227 yards at UCF last year. That game was part of a closing stretch in which he posted 15 receptions for 315 yards and three TD in the final two games of 2017.

■ Junior **Darnell Salomon** closed 2017 by making a TD catch in three straight games and had a career-best five catches for 139 yards and a TD at UCF, which included an 83-yard TD grab. He finished third on the team with 32 catches for 512 yards and five TD.

■ Junior tight end **Mitchell Wilcox** earned all-conference honors in his first season on the field in 2016 and entered 2017 as a Mackey Award candidate. He made 17 catches for 158 yards and two TD in 2017 and returns for 2018 with 17 career starts under his belt.

■ Senior **Ryeshe Bronson** returns after missing 2017 with a shoulder injury. He has 30 receptions for 531 yards and three touchdowns on his career, playing in 34 games.

■ Granted a sixth year of eligibility in the spring, **Stanley Clerveaux** enters 2018 as a junior in his fifth season with the program. He had a strong spring again, showing the potential that has been derailed by two seasons of injuries.

■ Redshirt freshman **Randall St. Felix** had a very strong spring, showing good speed and, at 6-2, 205, a physical presence to go get the ball in traffic.

TAMPA - Blake Barnett turned in the top scoring debut by a USF quarterback, throwing for three touchdowns and 305 yards and finding the end zone once with his feet in the Bulls' 34-14 win over Elon in Saturday's season opener.

Barnett threw all three of his TD passes in the first half, finishing 24 of 34 through the air in less than three quarters of action in front of a crowd of 31,217 at Raymond James Stadium. USF posted 515 yards of offense, its third straight game with 500-plus yards and the seventh game accomplishing the feat in the past 13 outings under coordinator Sterlin Gilbert. Barnett started the second half with a 2-yard touchdown run on fourth-and-goal to post his fourth score, a new USF record for a QB in his debut, as the Bulls rolled to a 31-0 advantage.

Defensively, Tampa's own Vincent Jackson and Mike Hampton intercepted passes while the Bulls racked up 12 tackles for loss and limited Elon to 42 passing yards. Seniors Jaymon Thomas and Khalid McGee (Miami) both set new career highs with 11 tackles apiece. Redshirt freshman safety Bentlee Sanders (Tampa) started and finished with 10 tackles.

KEY NOTES

- USF improved to 17-5 all-time in season openers and won its fifth straight season opener. The Bulls are now 15-1 in season openers played at home.
- USF added to its most successful run in program history (30-9 since 2015). The Bulls are 29-6 in the past 35 games.
