2018 BGSU FOOTBALL

SETTING THE SCENE

- Bowling Green and Georgia Tech are set to meet on the gridiron for the first time in both programs' history. Kickoff is set for 12 p.m. on the ACC Regional Sports Network.
- Bowling Green is 3-7 against current Atlantic Coast Conference schools. BGSU is 2-0 against Syracuse, earning wins in 1973 and 1976. The Falcons also defeated Pittsburgh to open up the 2008 season.
- Bowling Green's last meeting against a current member from the ACC took place at the 2013 Little Caesars Bowl, when Aaron Donald and James Connor led Pittsburgh to a narrow 30-27 victory.

NEW FACES

- Bowling Green has had multiple first-time starters in each of the first four games of the 2018 season.
- On offense, redshirt sophomore Bryson Denley got the start at Oregon as one of two running backs, while junior RB Marlow, a transfer from College of the Canyons CC, started as an outside receiver. On defense, redshirt sophomore Roland Walder and true sophomore Josh Croslen started for the first times on the defensive line. True sophomore linebacker Kholbe Coleman also earned a starting nod.
- Against Maryland, the Falcons came out with five wide receivers, meaning both sophomore Quintin Morris and redshirt senior Justin Sawmiller earned their first career starts.
- Versus Eastern Kentucky, with receiver Scott Miller out, true freshman Noah Massey earned the first start of his BGSU career. Karl Brooks, another true freshman, picked up a start on the defensive line.
- In last weekend's MAC opener against Miami, redshirt freshman Derek Downs (offensive line) and redshirt senior Dorian Hendrix (tight end) were first-time starters for the Orange and Brown.

CAREER DAYS FOR BGSU PASS CATCHERS

- Through the first four weeks of the 2018 season, Bowling Green receivers, both veterans and newcomers, have had career days catching the football.
- In week one at Oregon, senior Scott Miller posted a career-high 13 catches for 166 yards and two touchdowns. Although Miller's 166 yards and two touchdowns were not career highs, the senior entered that contest with 10 catches for 86 yards and no touchdowns against Power Five conference competition.
- Miller had played in three games against Power Five schools prior to the 2018 season. In the first two games of the 2018 season, both against Power Five institutions, Miller racked up 16 catches for 177 yards and three touchdowns.
- Quintin Morris and Deric Phouthavong had big games in week two versus Maryland, but the pair of receivers had unquestionably the best games of their Falcon careers versus Eastern Kentucky.
- Morris, a sophomore, set career highs in catches (8), yards (93) and touchdowns (2) against ECU, while Phouthavong, a senior, did the same. On top of making a couple highlight-reel, one-handed catches, Phouthavong registered seven catches for 82 yards and two scores – all career highs.
- Over the last two weeks, junior RB Marlow and redshirt senior Justin Sawmiller have had career days. Marlow has racked up a career-high seven catches in each of the last two games, while last time out against Miami, he added career highs in yards (60) and touchdowns (1). Sawmiller registered a career-best two catches for a career-high 52 yards and his first-career touchdown versus Miami.

RECEIVING DEPTH

- While 50 teams have at least one receiver with 20 or more catches in 2018, BGSU is one of only eight schools with two receivers to surpass 20 catches this year.
- Bowling Green joins Texas, USC, Minnesota, Texas Tech, Washington State, Hawaii and Colorado State as the only schools with two 20-catch receivers.
- BG's depth goes even deeper than that though. While Scott Miller and Quintin Morris each have 21 catches, Deric Phouthavong is just shy with 18. RB Marlow has added 15 catches and running back Andrew Clair has caught 11 passes out of the backfield.
- BGSU quarterbacks have thrown touchdowns to six different receivers. Along with Miller,

Morris, Phouthavong, Marlow and Clair, Justin Sawmiller caught a touchdown pass Saturday against Miami on the final play of the game.

TURN THEM OVER!

- Last season, the Bowling Green defense forced 24 turnovers, which ranked the Falcons tied for 29th in the country. Under first-year defensive coordinator Carl Pelini, the BGSU defense continues to create turnovers in bunches.
- In Bowling Green's win over Eastern Kentucky, Bowling Green recovered three fumbles – two on defense and one on special teams. The Falcons turned those three fumble recoveries into 21 points.
- Redshirt junior Melvin Jackson recovered a fumble on a muffed punt, while other fumble recoveries went to Jerry McBride and Kholbe Coleman. Coleman forced his own recovery, while McBride recovered a fumble forced by Jonah Harper and returned it 50 yards. McBride, who has posted 14 tackles apiece in each of the last two contests, also registered a fumble recovery in the season opener at Oregon.
- Against Oregon, senior Marcus Milton posted his sixth-career interception. Fred Garth earned his second-career interception. In BGSU's home opener versus Maryland, junior Kyle Junior picked up his second career fumble recovery.
- On the season, Bowling Green ranks tied for ninth in the country in fumbles recovered (5),

tied for 37th in turnovers gained (7), and tied for 52nd in turnover margin (+1).

DOEGE DICES DEFENSES

- Last season, quarterback Jarret Doege became the first true freshman quarterback to start a game for Bowling Green since Rich Dackin in 1986. He enters this week with a string of eight consecutive games being responsible for multiple touchdowns.
- In those eight games, Doege has been responsible for three touchdowns or more six times, peaking with five touchdowns against Eastern Kentucky (four passing and one rushing). Across the current eight-game stretch, Doege has posted 23 total touchdowns compared to just six interceptions.
- In each of the last two games, Doege has set career highs for completions. In the 42-35 win over Eastern Kentucky, the sophomore went 28-for-39. He followed that game up with a 30-for-45 effort in the MAC opener against Miami.
- In just 10 career starts, the Texan has finished with a completion percentage of 65 percent or higher six times.
- With his rushing touchdown against ECU, Doege has now passed and rushed for a touchdown in three separate games in his career.
- Doege is tied for 10th nationally with 11 touchdown passes through four weeks. That total is second in the MAC.
- In mid-August, Doege was named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List, presented annually to the top offensive player in Division I football who exhibits the characteristics that define Earl Campbell. Candidates must also have been born in Texas and/or graduated from a Texas High School and/or played at a Texas-based junior college or four-year college.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

- Bowling Green scored 28 points in the second quarter of a 42-35 win over Eastern Kentucky.
- It was the first time Bowling Green scored 28 in a quarter since scoring four touchdowns in the fourth quarter of a 48-27 win over Maryland on Sept. 12, 2015.

- The only other time the Falcons posted a 28-point quarter in this decade came in a win over Morgan State on Sept. 10, 2011.
- The 28-point first half was BGSU's highest scoring half since scoring 28 in the second half at Toledo on Oct. 25, 2016.

FALCON FOOTBALL ON ESPN+

- With the recent launch of ESPN+, Falcon fans should expect BGSU Athletics to have a large presence on the platform, including a number of football games.
- Last week's game against Miami streamed live on ESPN+.
- Additionally, BGSU's games against Toledo (Oct. 6), Western Michigan (Oct. 13) and Central Michigan (Nov. 10) will be broadcasted on ESPN+.
- ESPN+ provides HD-quality video of thousands of live events for \$4.99/month or \$49.99/year with access through the ESPN App.
- Fans can watch ESPN+ anywhere – Mobile, Desktop, TV-connected devices such as Apple TV, Roku, Fire TV, Android TV, and Chromecast.

PROVIDING CLAIR-ITY

- Last Saturday, sophomore running back Andrew Clair became the 39th player in school history to go over 1,000 career rushing yards. Clair currently has rushed for 1,009 yards in just

- Clair ranks third in the MAC at 71.0 yards per game in 2018. He is less than five yards shy per game of catching Ball State's James Gilbert (75.5) for second.
- In the 2018 season opener at Oregon, Clair posted his fifth career 100-yard rushing game with 113 yards on 25 carries. He ran for 100+ yards in four consecutive games during one stretch of the 2017 season.

DOEGE STREAKING

Jarret Doege enters the Georgia Tech game coming off of eight straight games accounting for multiple touchdowns. He has thrown at least two touchdowns in each of those contests. The breakdown:

2018 BGSU FOOTBALL

- Clair had two receptions for 15 yards as well and found the end zone on a nine-yard reception on a third and goal with just six seconds left in the first half.
- Clair averaged 6.8 yards per carry last season to break a school record that stood since 1951, when Fred Durig averaged 6.7 yards per touch. Willie Geter tied Durig's mark in 2008.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Clair averaged 4.5 yards after contact a year ago, the fifth-best average in the country among returning running backs.
- The St. Louis native finished the 2017 season with a team-best 1,184 all-purpose yards, ranking fifth in the country among true freshmen with 107.6 all-purpose yards per game.
- In late July, Clair was named to the Paul Hornung Award Watch List. The award is given annually to the most versatile player in major college football.

MILLER TIME

- Entering the 2018 season, senior wide receiver Scott Miller had already entrenched himself as one of the all-time Falcon greats. And then he went out and had arguably the greatest game of his career at Oregon in week one.
- Miller caught 13 passes for 166 yards and two touchdowns against Oregon, setting a new-career-high for receptions, the second-most in the nation this year in a single game.
- While Miller was more effectively bottled up against Maryland, he still had a receiving touchdown, his third of the year. It gives him 17 career receiving touchdowns, 10th-most in program history.
- The senior receiver has been the model for consistency, as he's now caught at least one pass in 28 straight games played.
- His seven career 100-yard receiving games are tied for ninth-most in school history and his 165 receptions leave him needing nine more to move into the top 10 in school history. He also has 1,961 receiving yards, putting him on pace to become the 17th Falcon to post 2,000 career yards on pass catches.
- Miller led the Falcons in receptions and receiving yards as a junior in 2017, posting 63 catches for 722 yards. He earned third team All-MAC honors in the process.
- Miller has earned All-MAC status in each of his last two seasons as a Falcon. In 2016, he was a first team All-MAC selection, as he caught 74 passes for 968 yards and 10 touchdowns.

- In July, Miller was named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List for the third time in his career. The award is given to the most outstanding FBS receiver in college football.

POSSESSING THE BALL

- Bowling Green ranks third in the MAC with 31:18 in time of possession through the first four weeks of the season.
- A year ago, BGSU's time of possession was just 27:13 and the Falcons have not averaged at least 30:00 in TOP across a single season since averaging 34:03 in 2013.
- Bowling Green held the ball for 38:03 against Oregon, including 11:02 of the first quarter as the Falcons led 10-7 after one period. That was the team's largest time of possession advantage for both a quarter and a game since posting a time of 40:30 in a Nov. 15, 2016 42-7 win over Kent State that included 11:44 of TOP in the second quarter.
- In Bowling Green's win over Eastern Kentucky, BGSU held a time of possession edge at 30:59. The Falcons' best period was the first with 8:31 of offense.

METHODICAL MEN

- Bowling Green's solid 31:18 time of possession per game has been bolstered by long scoring drives.
- Bowling Green has eight scoring drives that have totaled 10 plays or longer. Six of those drives ended in touchdowns and the other two have ended with a made field goal. The eight extended scoring drives are tied for the fourth-most in the country this year.
- The Falcons had a season-high three 10-play drives against Oregon and the team's longest drive came in the first quarter against Maryland,

a 14-play, 89-yard jaunt that covered 6:41.

- Bowling Green had identical 12-play, 75-yard drives in the first half of the win over Eastern Kentucky. The first of those drives spanned the first and second quarter break to get the Falcons on the board. The second drive concluded with just 45 seconds left in the half to put BGSU ahead 28-21.
- This past week against Miami, the Falcons had a pair of 11-play scoring drives – one that resulted in a touchdown, and another that ended with a field goal.
- The Falcons have an active streak of 13 consecutive games with at least one 10-play scoring drive. The last time Bowling Green did not have at least one extended drive came at Northwestern on Sept. 16, 2017.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Bowling Green was one of the better special teams units in the country a year ago. The Falcons, however, graduated their punter and kicker, while special teams coach Matt Brock moved to Washington State. Seth Doege takes over for Brock in 2018.
- BGSU was third in the country in kick return average allowed, giving up just 16.7 yards per kick return. In 2018, the Falcons are allowing 20.2 yards per kick return allowed.
- The Falcons also ranked 19th in the nation, allowing 4.27 yards per punt return. BGSU is even better this year as opponents have lost 0.14 yards per return, fifth-best nationally.
- New kicker Nate Needham is 12-for-13 on kicks this year. Needham is 2-for-3 on field goal attempts, and a perfect 10-for-10 on extra point attempts.
- Bowling Green hasn't had a punt blocked since 2012, a streak of 337 successful punts.

RED MEANS GO

- Bowling Green has been highly efficient in the red zone this scoring, scoring on 10-of-11 red zone trips in 2018.
- Bowling Green's perfection inside the red zone ended this past week versus Miami, when Nate Needham missed a 30-yard field goal. He'd go on to drill a 43-yard kick in his next attempt.
- Bowling Green is averaging 5.9 points when entering the red zone (seven points for a touchdown and three for a field goal).

#TEAM100

- The 2018 season is the 100th season of football at Bowling Green.
- The program will celebrate 100 years of BG football in 2019 when the 100th anniversary of the first game in Bowling Green history takes place (A 6-0 loss to Toledo on Oct. 3, 1919).
- BG's first win was a 7-0 victory at Kent State on Nov. 6, 1920.
- In 99 years, BGSU is 540-385-52 (.579) all-time and 282-179-11 (.609) in Mid-American Conference play. The Falcons have a winning record against every team in the MAC except for Miami and Toledo. BGSU and Toledo are tied all-time at 39-39-4.

NOT ONE, BUT TWO NEW HELMETS

- On Aug. 14, BGSU Football unveiled two new helmets for the 2018 season. The Falcons released their annual Military Appreciation helmet (which was worn last week against Maryland) as well as a new lightning orange helmet.
- This year's Military Appreciation helmet is white. On each side of the helmet, the BGSU logo is overlaid with the colors of the United States of America.
- For the third-straight year, the Military Appreciation helmet will feature the number "111" on the back of the helmet, which is to honor the 111 students from Bowling Green State University who have died in the line of service. Down the center of the helmet is an orange stripe that includes the names of the 111 students.
- Two years ago, Bowling Green State University Athletics partnered with David Ridenour of the BGSU Army ROTC Alumni Society and a 1970 Bowling Green graduate to compile the list of names. Ridenour served in Vietnam from 1971-72.

GRADUATING CHAMPIONS

- This season, Bowling Green will have six graduate student-athletes on the 2018 roster.
- Defensive back Fred Garth, defensive back Ben Hale, tight end/running back Dorian Hendrix, offensive lineman John Kurtz, defensive lineman Brian Sanders and wide receiver/linebacker Jack Walz have all earned their undergraduate degrees for BGSU.
- Four of those Falcons -- Hale, Hendrix, Sanders and Walz -- were members of the 2015 MAC Champions.

BLOOD IS THICKER THAN WATER

- Many teams claim that they are a family, but for Bowling Green, that rings truer than most.
- Sophomore quarterback Jarret Doege is the younger brother of special teams coordinator Seth Doege. Seth was an All-Big 12 quarterback at Texas Tech, completing his eligibility in 2012.
- True freshmen Brad and Jake Papez are twins, though Brad is a 6-6, 260-pound offensive lineman and Jake is a 6-4, 228-pound tight end.

- Redshirt junior Coleman Dennis, who is sitting out this season due to transfer rules, is the son of football strength coach Chad Dennis.
- Redshirt sophomore defensive back Ty Redding is the younger brother of former Falcon wide receiver Teo Redding. Teo completed his eligibility a year ago and took part in the Detroit Lions' preseason camp, appearing in all four preseason games.

#MACTION PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

- In conjunction with the league's annual football media day, the Mid-American Conference released the 2018 MAC Football Media Preseason Poll, as determined by vote of the conference's media members, on July 24.
- Bowling Green was picked to finish fifth in the East Division, ahead of Kent State, Ohio, Buffalo, Miami and Akron – in that order – round out the predicted top 4 in the East Division.
- Northern Illinois was selected to win the West Division, followed by Toledo, Western Michigan, Eastern Michigan, Central Michigan and Ball State.
- Ohio was also predicted to win the MAC Championship Game, which will take place Friday, Nov. 30 at Ford Field in Detroit.

KAMAR THE STAR

- Kamar Jorden, who ranks 14th in career receiving yards at BGSU despite playing just two seasons, has become a Canadian Football League (CFL) superstar.
- Jorden played for the Falcons in 2010 and 2011 (redshirting in 2009 after transferring) and had 2,213 yards receiving the Falcons, the second-most by a two-year player in program history (behind only Roger Lewis).
- Jorden broke the Calgary Stampeders' franchise record with 249 receiving yards on Aug. 25. He has a career-high 944 receiving yards (as of Sept. 16), ranking fourth in the CFL in that category. His 55 catches are sixth, as is his six touchdown receptions.

FUTURE SCHEDULES

- Bowling Green football has its full non-conference schedule for the next three seasons (2019-21) posted at BGSUFalcons.com.
- In 2019, the Falcons are scheduled to play home games against Morgan State and Louisiana Tech, with road games scheduled at Kansas State and Notre Dame.
- The 2020 season features road games at Ohio and Illinois of the Big Ten. Home games are set to be played against Robert Morris and Liberty.
- In 2021, the Falcons will host South Alabama and Murray State, and play road contests at Tennessee and Minnesota.
- Additionally, at least one non-conference game per season has been scheduled from seasons 2022-26. All future schedules for BGSU football are subject to change. Check BGSUFalcons.com for additional updates.

LEADING THE CHARGE AGAINST THE POWER 5

- Bowling Green opened the 2018 season at Oregon (Sept. 1), before hosting Maryland (Sept. 8) last week, and then wrapping up non-conference play at Georgia Tech (Sept. 29).
- All 12 Mid-American Conference schools will take on at least one school from a Power 5 conference (ACC, Big 12, Big 10, SEC, PAC-12) during the non-conference portion of the 2018 college football season.
- In total, the 12 schools within the MAC will combine to play 22 games against Power 5 competition. Bowling Green, Kent State and Northern Illinois will lead the charge, as all four schools are scheduled to play against three Power 5 schools in 2018. Akron had three games scheduled but its contest at Nebraska was cancelled for weather.
- Over half of the league is set to play multiple games against the Power 5. Ball State, Central Michigan and Western Michigan will battle against two Power 5 institutions apiece this season.
- According to Phil Steele's 2018 College Football Preview, the Falcons have the toughest schedule within the MAC East, and the second-toughest schedule in the entire conference. BGSU's schedule is ranked the 86th-toughest in the country.

Mike Jinks begins his third season as the head coach at Bowling Green in 2018. The 19th head coach in program history, Jinks was previously the associate head coach and running backs coach at Texas Tech.

In year two at Bowling Green, Jinks relied on youth to build the foundation for future success. True freshman quarterback Jarret Doege took over the starting role over the final half of the season and completed 64 percent of his passes with 12 touchdowns to only three interceptions. True freshman running back Andrew Clair averaged 6.8 yards per carry and finished with more than 700 yards on the ground. Jinks turned to underclassmen throughout the lineup on both offense and defense.

In his first year at BGSU, Jinks led the Falcons to a 4-8 record that included three straight victories to close the regular season. Bowling Green outscored its three divisional opponents 107-54 during that stretch and rushed for an average of 328 yards during the winning streak. BGSU had eight 100-yard rushing performances over the final three games of the season.

Jinks' players have excelled individually both on the field and in the classroom. In two years, 14 players were named MAC Distinguished Scholar-Athletes, leading the conference in both 2016 and 2017. Five were presented as members of the Hampshire Honor Society in 2016. Twenty-three Falcons have been named Academic All-MAC in two seasons and 13 were named All-MAC, including first teamers Scott Miller and Joseph Davidson (twice).

In 2016, Davidson was also first team Academic All-American, fourth team All-American by Phil Steele, and a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, presented to the top punter in college football. In 2017, he was once again a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award and a second-team Academic All-American.

Jinks, who came to BGSU after spending the 2015 season as Associate Head Coach, coached the Red Raiders' running backs for three seasons. Prior to his time at Texas Tech, he was a National Coach of the Year finalist while winning the 2010 Texas State Championship and compiling a record of 43-4 in his final three seasons at San Antonio powerhouse, Steele High School.

Known for their prolific offense, Texas Tech saw great success with Jinks. The Red Raiders owned the second-best offense in the country in 2015, totaling 7,134 yards in 12 games (594.5 yards per game). TTU also had the second-best passing offense.

Much like the final three games of Bowling Green's 2016 season, Texas Tech saw incredible success in the running game under Jinks. In just his second season, he tutored DeAndre Washington, who became the first Red Raiders' running back since Ricky Williams in 1998 to surpass 1,000 yards rushing in a single season. Washington finished the season with 1,103 rushing yards and was named second team All-Big 12.

Jinks joined the Texas Tech program after a highly successful tenure at Steele High School in Cibolo, Texas – a suburb of San Antonio. Jinks was the first head coach at Steele when the school opened its doors in 2005, and it didn't take long for him to mold the program into a state powerhouse. While at Steele, Jinks compiled a 76-18 record overall, including an impressive 43-4 mark in his final three seasons. He led the Knights to the 2010 Class 5A Division II State Championship and to the state finals again in 2011.

Jinks is a graduate of Angelo State University where he earned his degree in kinesiology. He and his wife Meredith have three children – Jaden, Madison and Tristan.
