TOP STORYLINES

- Riding the momentum of consecutive blowout wins, Georgia Tech returns home for a pivotal Atlantic Coast Conference Coastal Division showdown versus Duke.
- Georgia Tech has routed Bowling Green (63-17) and Louisville (66-31) the past two weekends, marking only the fourth time in ACC history that a team has put 60 points on the scoreboard in back-to-back games (Florida State - 1992, Georgia Tech - 2015, Louisville - 2016, Georgia Tech - 2018).
- In last Friday's romp at Louisville, the Yellow Jackets rushed for 542 yards, the third-highest rushing output in Georgia Tech history and the Jackets' most rushing yards ever in a conference game.
- Georgia Tech's 66 points at Louisville were the second-most that the Jackets have ever scored in an ACC contest and tied for the third-most ever scored by a road team in ACC history, behind only Tech's 70 points at Navy in 2001 and its 68 points at North Carolina in 2012.
- TaQuon Marshall** has led Georgia Tech to scores on the last 14 offensive possessions that he has quarterbacked (13 touchdowns and one field goal) — his final series vs. Clemson on Sept. 22 (TD), all six series that he played vs. Bowling Green on Sept. 29 (six TD) and all seven series that he played last Friday at Louisville (six TD, one FG).
- It's the 70th homecoming game in Georgia Tech history. The Yellow Jackets are an impressive 53-15-1 in 69 previous homecoming games and have won five-straight, eight of their last nine and 20 of their last 22 homecoming contests.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

1

Georgia Tech ranks No. 1 nationally in rushing offense at 373.0 yards per game, a whopping 62.6 yards per game more than the nation's No. 2-ranked rushing offense (Navy - 310.4 ypg). To put the gap between Georgia Tech and Navy in perspective, the next 13 teams that follow Navy in the national rushing offense rankings are all within 62.6 yards per game of the Midshipmen.

Georgia Tech has three defensive touchdowns through six games this season, which are tied for the most in the ACC (Miami) and fifth nationally (Temple leads the nation with five defensive TDs).

Georgia Tech, Ball State, SMU and Syracuse are the only four teams in the nation with three active players that have each rushed for 1,000 yards or more in their careers (**TaQuon Marshall** - 1,775, **Clinton Lynch** - 1,179 and **KirVonte Benson** - 1,169). *Research courtesy of Syracuse University*

Georgia Tech has forced 13 turnovers in six games this season after finishing last season with 10 takeaways in 11 games. The Yellow Jackets are currently tied for seventh nationally in takeaways after finishing last season ranked 124th out of 128 NCAA Division I FBS teams.

With 542 rushing yards last Friday at Louisville, 24 of the 32 400-yard rushing games in Georgia Tech history have come in **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons as the Yellow Jackets' head coach (2008-pres.). Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400 yards in a game 24 times in 135 contests (once every 5.6 games). Prior to his arrival, the Yellow Jackets had rushed for 400 yards in a game eight times in 1,138 contests (once every 142.3 games).

Georgia Tech has topped the 60-point plateau in each of its last two games (63 vs. Bowling Green on Sept. 29, 66 vs. Louisville on Oct. 5), marking only the fourth time in ACC history that a team has scored 60 or more points in consecutive games — Florida State (1992), Georgia Tech (2015), Louisville (2016) and Georgia Tech (2018).

542

Last Friday's 542-yard rushing performance at Louisville was the third-highest single-game rushing total in Georgia Tech history and the most rushing yards ever amassed by the Yellow Jackets in a conference game.

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- move it to 4-3 overall and even its ACC record at 2-2;
- be its 11th win in its last 13 home games;
- be its 10th-straight win over an unranked opponent at home;
- up it to 52-33-1 overall and 30-13-1 at home all-time versus Duke;
- be its 11th win in its last 12 home games against Duke;
- up it to 8-3 against Duke under head coach **Paul Johnson**;
- up its all-time homecoming record to 54-15-1;
- give the Yellow Jackets wins in six-straight, nine of the last 10 and 21 of their last 23 homecoming contests.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- drop it to 3-4 overall and 1-3 in ACC play;
- be only its third loss in its last 13 home games;
- snap its nine-game winning streak versus unranked opponents at home;
- drop it to 51-34-1 overall and 29-14-1 at home all-time versus Duke;
- be only its second loss in its last 12 home games against Duke;
- snap its five-game GT homecoming winning streak and be its first homecoming loss since a 41-17 defeat at the hands of BYU on Oct. 27, 2012.



NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN OVER LOUISVILLE

• Georgia Tech turned in one of the most dominant offensive performances in school history in a nationally televised 66-31 rout at Louisville last Friday night.

• Georgia Tech's 66 points tied for the sixth-most in modern school history (AP poll era - 1936-pres.) and were the second-most that it has ever scored in a conference game (record: 68 at North Carolina, Nov. 10, 2012).

• The Yellow Jackets' 66 points are tied for the 12th-most scored by an NCAA Division I FBS team this season (most: 79 - Fresno State vs. Idaho, Sept. 1) and the second-most scored against a Power Five conference opponent this season (most: 77 - Ohio State vs. Oregon State, Sept. 1).

• The Jackets' 66 points tied for the third-most ever scored by an ACC team on the road, behind only Georgia Tech's 70 points at Navy on Sept. 8, 2001 and the Yellow Jackets' 68 points at North Carolina on Nov. 10, 2012.

• Georgia Tech's 21 points in the first and fourth quarters and 31 and 35 points in the first and second half, respectively, were the most that it has scored in any quarter or half against an ACC opponent since it scored 21 points in the second quarter and 35 points in the first half of a 56-23 win over NC State on Nov. 8, 2014.

• Georgia Tech rushed for 542 yards, the third-highest total in modern school history and the most that it has ever amassed on the ground in a conference game (prev.: 479 at NC State, Nov. 8, 2014).

• Georgia Tech's 542 rushing yards were the most in a game by an NCAA Division I FBS team this season (prev.: 503 - Texas A&M vs. Northwestern State, Aug. 30).

• The Yellow Jackets' 542 yards on the ground were the most by an FBS team since Navy ran for 559 yards at SMU on Nov. 11 of last season and were the most by and against a Power Five conference team since Auburn ran for 543 yards at Arkansas on Oct. 22, 2016.

• Georgia Tech scored on nine of its 10 offensive possessions, including nine-straight to open the game (eight touchdowns and one field goal). The only time it had the ball and didn't score was when it knelt on the only play of its final possession to run out the clock at the end of the game.

• Georgia Tech snapped a seven-game losing streak in games played away from home and a six-game skid in true road games. The win was its first away from home since a 33-18 victory over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31, 2016) and its first in a true road game since a 28-27 win at Georgia on Nov. 26, 2016.

• The meeting was the first-ever between Georgia Tech and Louisville.

• Georgia Tech moved to 7-4 in the regular season and 10-6 overall in games played on Friday. The Friday matchup was the Yellow Jackets' first overall since a 28-14 loss to LSU in the 2000 Peach Bowl (Dec. 29, 2000) and its first in the regular season since a 48-10 loss at Georgia on Nov. 25, 1994.

• Georgia Tech moved to 15-1 under head coach **Paul Johnson** (2008-pres.) in games against rotating opponents from the ACC Atlantic Division.

• Georgia Tech moved to 8-0 away from home and 7-0 in true road games against rotating opponents from the Atlantic Division under Johnson.

• Georgia Tech senior quarterback **TaQuon Marshall** rushed for a season-high 175 yards (prev.: 113 at USF, Sept. 8). It was the second-highest rushing total of his career, behind only his GT quarterback-record 249 yards in his first-career start against Tennessee on Sept. 4, 2017.

• Georgia Tech redshirt freshman quarterback **Tobias Oliver** ran for 103 yards on eight carries (12.9 avg.) and scored two touchdowns after replacing Marshall in the third quarter. It marked the second-straight game that Oliver came off the bench in the third quarter to rush for 100 yards (he ran for a career-high 115 yards against Bowling Green on Sept. 29).

• Marshall and Oliver became the first quarterback duo in Tech history to both rush for 100 yards in the same game.

• Marshall and junior left guard **Parker Braun** (15 knockdowns) became Georgia Tech's first ACC weekly award winners of the season, being named ACC Quarterback of the Week and ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week, respectively.

• Georgia Tech senior defensive end **Anree Saint-Amour** matched a single-game school record with two forced fumbles, becoming only the 10th Yellow Jacket to ever accomplish the feat and the first since D.J. White versus Ole Miss in the 2013 Music City Bowl (Dec. 30, 2013).

• Making his first career start, true freshman outside linebacker **Charlie Thomas** recovered both of the fumbles that Saint-Amour forced to also tie a single-game school record. Thomas is the 18th Yellow Jacket to recover two fumbles in a game and the first since Quayshawn Nealy at Pittsburgh on Oct. 25, 2014.

• True freshman defensive back **Juanyeh Thomas** closed the scoring for Georgia Tech by returning an interception 95 yards for a touchdown with 2:18 to go in the ballgame. Thomas' 95-yard INT return was the longest by a Yellow Jacket since Tyler Marcordes' 95-yard return versus Elon on Aug. 31, 2013, tied for Georgia Tech's longest ever in an ACC game (Ken Swilling vs. NC State, Sept. 9, 1989) and tied for the fifth-longest overall in school history.

• Georgia Tech true freshman place kicker **Wesley Wells** made the first field-goal attempt of his career, a 41-yarder in the second quarter that gave the Yellow Jackets a 24-7 lead. The 41-yard field goal was Georgia Tech's longest since **Brenton King** made a 42-yarder vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 21, 2017.

NOTING DUKE

• Duke enters Saturday's game with a 4-1 overall record.

• The Blue Devils are 4-1 after five games for the fifth time in the last seven seasons.

• Last year, Duke opened 4-0 before losing the next six games, then rebounding to win their final three, including a 36-14 victory over Northern Illinois in the Quick Lane Bowl, to finish 7-6.

• Duke's ledger this year includes an impressive season-opening victory over Army West Point (34-14 on Aug. 31) and road triumphs at Northwestern (21-7 on Sept. 8) and Baylor (40-27 on Sept. 15).

• After a 4-0 start, the Blue Devils opened ACC play with a 31-14 loss to Virginia Tech on Sept. 29.

• Virginia Tech's 31 points snapped Duke's streak of 11-consecutive games without surrendering 30 points, dating back to a 31-6 loss to Miami (Fla.) on Sept. 29 of last season.

• One of the nation's most disciplined teams, Duke leads the ACC and is tied for third nationally in fewest turnovers lost with just three. The Blue Devils also have the third-fewest penalties (19) and penalty yards (162) in the nation.

• Duke is led offensively by junior quarterback Daniel Jones. Despite missing two games due to a broken clavicle, Jones leads the Blue Devils with 615 yards on 52-of-74 passing (70.3 pct.). He has thrown five touchdowns versus just one interception.

• Defensively, the Devils are paced by leading tackler Dylan Singleton, a junior safety. Singleton has two forced fumbles to go along with his team-leading 41 tackles.

• Duke head coach David Cutcliffe is in his 11th season with the Blue Devils and is tied with Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** as the longest-tenured head coaches in the ACC. Johnson was officially hired at Georgia Tech on Dec. 7, 2014 and Cutcliffe was officially hired at Duke on Dec. 14, 2007.

GEORGIA TECH-DUKE SERIES HISTORY

• Saturday's game is the 86th all-time between Georgia Tech and Duke.

• The Yellow Jackets and Blue Devils first met on the gridiron in 1933 and have played every year since.

• Duke is Georgia Tech's third-most common opponent all-time.

• Georgia Tech holds a commanding 51-31-1 advantage in the all-time series.

• The Yellow Jackets have been especially dominant against the Blue Devils at home, holding a 29-13-1 edge in games played in Atlanta.

• Georgia Tech is 23-5 overall against Duke since 1990. However, after the Jackets came out on top 18 times in a 19-year stretch from 1995-2013, the Blue Devils have won three of the last four games in the series (2014, 2015 and 2017).

• The Georgia Tech-Duke series is not exactly known for down-to-the-wire finishes. Of the 57 meetings since 1961, only 10 have been decided by seven points or less. Since 2000, the only GT-Duke games decided by less than seven points were Duke's 31-25 win at Bobby Dodd Stadium in 2014 and Georgia Tech's 38-35 home win in 2016.

• Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** is 11-4 against Duke as a head coach — 7-3 at Georgia Tech (2008-pres.) and 4-1 at Navy (2002-07).

NOTING LAST YEAR'S LOSS TO DUKE

• Duke scored on 8-of-10 possessions, including each of its first seven, in a 43-20 win over Georgia Tech on Nov. 18, 2017.

• Georgia Tech scored touchdowns on three of its first four possessions and led 14-3 and 20-13 in the first half but couldn't keep up with Duke, which led 36-20 before the Yellow Jackets finally got their first defensive stop in the fourth quarter.

• Georgia Tech didn't score in the second half, marking the first time that it didn't score in the second half of a game since a 24-7 loss at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 22, 2011 (*the Yellow Jackets wound up also not scoring in the second half of their next game, a 33-7 loss to Georgia, on Nov. 25, 2017.*)

• The Jackets surrendered a season-high 500 yards, including 319 on the ground. The 319 rushing yards were the most surrendered by Georgia Tech since Georgia ran for 339 yards against the Yellow Jackets on Nov. 28, 2009.

• Bright spots for the Jackets included quarterback **TaQuon Marshall** rushing for 140 yards and B-back **KirVonte Benson** adding 79 yards on the ground. Both surpassed 1,000 yards for the season, marking only the second time in Georgia Tech history that two teammates both rushed for 1,000 yards in a season, joining BB Jonathan Dwyer, who rushed for 1,395, and QB Joshua Nesbitt, who added 1,037, in 2009.

• Georgia Tech scored touchdowns on each of its four offensive possessions in the first half against Bowling Green, marking the first time under Johnson that it scored touchdowns on every offensive possession of any half.

• As impressive as the offensive output was against Bowling Green, it paled in comparison to what the Jackets accomplished against Louisville.

• Georgia Tech's 542 rushing yards against Louisville were the most in a game by an NCAA Division I FBS team this season (prev.: 503 - Texas A&M vs. Northwestern State, Aug. 30).

• The Yellow Jackets' 542 yards on the ground against Louisville were the most by an FBS team since Navy ran for 559 yards at SMU on Nov. 11 of last season and were the most by and against a Power Five conference team since Auburn ran for 543 yards at Arkansas on Oct. 22, 2016.

• During **Paul Johnson's** 10-plus seasons as Georgia Tech's head coach (2008-pres.), the Yellow Jackets have rushed for at least 400 yards in a game 24 times in 135 total contests (once every 5.8 games).

• Prior to Johnson's arrival on The Flats in 2008, Tech had rushed for at least 400 yards in a game just eight times in 1,138 games (once every 142.3 games).

• The Jackets set a school record with four 400-yard rushing games last season (535 vs. Tennessee on Sept. 4, 436 vs. Pitt on Sept. 23, 403 vs. North Carolina on Sept. 30 and 427 vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 21). Making the feat even more impressive is that it came in just 11 games, Tech's fewest games in a season since 1996. The previous GT record of three 400-yard rushing games in a season occurred three times, all under Johnson (2008, 2009 and 2014).

• Georgia Tech three 400-yard rushing games already this season (439 vs. Alcorn State on Sept. 1, 419 at USF on Sept. 8 and 542 at Louisville on Oct. 5), marking the fifth time in Johnson's 11 seasons on The Flats that the Yellow Jackets have rushed for 400 yards in a game at least three times. Only Navy (7) has more seasons with three or more 400-yard rushing games since 2008.

• The Yellow Jackets have led the ACC and finished among the top 10 nationally in rushing offense in each of Johnson's first 10 seasons as head coach.

• In Johnson's 10-plus seasons as head coach of the Yellow Jackets, Tech has been outgained on the ground just 19 times in 135 games.

• Under Johnson, Georgia Tech has produced 17 rushers that have eclipsed the 1,000-yard plateau for their careers. That is over one-third of the 49 Yellow Jackets that have amassed 1,000 career rushing yards in the 126-season history of Georgia Tech football.

• The Jackets have three players on their current roster that have already eclipsed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for their careers in senior AB **Clinton Lynch**, senior QB **TaQuon Marshall** and junior BB **KirVonte Benson**.

• Staying true to a trend from last season, Georgia Tech has not committed any turnovers over its past two games (the fifth and sixth games of the season).

• Georgia Tech committed nine turnovers through the first four games this season (2.3 per game) before clean slates against Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and Louisville (Oct. 5).

• Last season, GT committed eight turnovers in its first four games of the season (one turnover every 37.8 plays) but had only six turnovers over the final seven games of the campaign (one turnover every 74.8 plays).

• Despite having only one turnover against No. 3/2 Clemson on Sept. 22, Georgia Tech fumbled eight times in the loss. The eight fumbles are tied for the second-most in school history (record: 9 at Miami, Nov. 21, 2015). The Yellow Jackets' eight fumbles marked only the third time in the past 46 seasons (dating back to 1973) that they have fumbled as many as seven times in a contest.

• Georgia Tech has played 267-consecutive games without being shut out, good for the seventh-longest active streak in NCAA Division I FBS.

• The Yellow Jackets have not been held scoreless since a 38-0 loss at No. 3 Florida State on Oct. 18, 1997.

• Even more impressively, Georgia Tech has not been blanked at home since a 7-0 loss to Georgia on Nov. 30, 1957 — good for a streak of 377-straight games played at Bobby Dodd Stadium without being shut out.

• Over their last 25 games, the Yellow Jackets have punted only 88 times (3.52 per game) and have come away with points on 124 of their 294 offensive possessions (42.2 percent).

• Georgia Tech has scored at least 24 points in 16 of its last 21 games.

• The Yellow Jackets had a streak of 10-consecutive games that ran from Nov. 12, 2016 (at Virginia Tech) through Oct. 21, 2017 (vs. Wake Forest). At the time, it was the fifth-longest active streak in the nation and the second-longest active streak in the ACC. It was also tied for the fourth-longest string of games with 24 points or more in Georgia Tech history.

• Georgia Tech returned eight offensive starters this season, which represented a large portion of its offensive production from a season ago, including:

- 100 percent of their passing yardage
- 90.4 percent of their rushing yardage

• Georgia Tech's senior signal-caller is in the midst of perhaps the finest all-around stretch of his career. Over the past two games (a 63-17 win over Bowling Green on Sept. 29 and last Friday's 66-31 win at Louisville), Marshall has rushed 36 times for 217 yards (6.0 avg.) and four touchdowns while completing 6-of-8 passes for 172 yards (75.0 comp. pct., 21.5 yds./att., 28.7 yds./comp.).

• Marshall has led Georgia Tech to points in each of the last 14 offensive series that he has quarterbacked — his final series vs. Clemson on Sept. 22 (TD), all six series vs. BG on Sept. 29 (6 TD) and all seven series at Louisville on Oct. 5 (6 TD, 1 FG).

• Last Friday at Louisville, Marshall rushed for 175 yards on 23 carries (7.6 avg.). The 175 yards on the ground were a season-high and the second-highest rushing total of his career (behind only his Georgia Tech quarterback-record 249 yards in the 2017 season opener versus Tennessee).



OFFENSE

• Marshall was named ACC Quarterback of the Week following his impressive performances against Louisville. The ACC award is the second of his career. He was named ACC Offensive Back of the Week following his record-breaking performance in last season's opener versus Tennessee.

• Marshall has now registered five of the 10 highest single-game rushing totals by a quarterback in Georgia Tech history.

• Marshall's six 100-yard rushing games in 2017 were the most ever by a Georgia Tech quarterback and tied for eighth in GT single-season history, regardless of position.

• Despite missing significant time in the second half on Sept. 8 at USF due to a lower-body injury, Marshall passed for a career-high 183 yards (prev.: 179 at Virginia, Nov. 4, 2017) and ran for 113 more. It marked the third time in his career that he rushed and passed for at least 100 yards in the same game and the seventh time that he has rushed and passed for a touchdown.

• Marshall also had the longest completion of his career at USF, an 81-yard touchdown strike to senior **AB Clinton Lynch** (prev.: 80 to Ricky Jeune vs. Virginia Tech, Nov. 11, 2017).

• While his 183 passing yards at USF remain a season and career high, Marshall turned in his most efficient passing performance of the season against Bowling Green on Sept. 29, when he completed 5-of-6 passes for 160 yards. Four of his five completions went for at least 33 yards.

• Marshall's 307.33 pass-efficiency rating versus Bowling Green was the second-highest of his career (career high: 347.26 vs. Jacksonville State, Sept. 9, 2017) and easily his highest of the season (prev.: 131.51 at USF, Sept. 8).

• Marshall's 17 rushing touchdowns last season were the third-most by a quarterback in Georgia Tech single-season history.

• With 104.2 rushing yards per game last season, Marshall became the first quarterback and only the third Yellow Jacket overall to average 100 rushing yards per game in a single season in 10 seasons under head coach **Paul Johnson**, joining Jonathan Dwyer (107.3 ypg - 2008) and Anthony Allen (101.2 ypg - 2010).

• Marshall burst on to the national stage with a record-setting performance versus Tennessee in last year's season opener. Making the first start of his career, Marshall set three school records and one ACC record against the Vols.

• Marshall's 249 rushing yards against Tennessee were also the third-most in Georgia Tech history, regardless of position (behind only 356 by Eddie Lee Ivery vs. Air Force - Nov. 11, 1978 and 307 by P.J. Daniels vs. Tulsa, Humanitarian Bowl - Jan. 4, 2004).

• Marshall's 249 rushing yards against Tennessee were the fifth-most by an FBS quarterback and tied for the 15th-most by any FBS student-athlete in a game last season.

• Marshall's five rushing touchdowns against UT were tied for the most in the nation by any student-athlete in a single game last season.

• Marshall is on the official watch list for the 2018 Maxwell Award, presented to "America's College Player of the Year." He is joined on the list by Georgia Tech B-back **KirVonte Benson**.

• Georgia Tech's backup signal-caller, redshirt freshman **Tobias Oliver**, has been impressive in the first game action of his career.

• Oliver has led the Yellow Jackets to touchdowns on eight of the 16 drives that he's led this year. His touchdown rate actually jumps to well over 50 percent when considering that three of the 16 series that he's quarterbacked have seen the Jackets run the clock out at the end of wins over Alcorn State, Bowling Green and Louisville.

• Oliver has been particularly impressive in relief of Marshall in the Yellow Jackets' last two wins vs. Bowling Green (Sept.

29) and at Louisville (last Friday). He has been on the field for a total of just five series in those two games (not including abbreviated series to run out the clock at the end of each game) and has led the Yellow Jackets to four touchdowns while running for more than 100 yards in each game (115 vs. BG, 103 at Louisville) and averaging a whopping 14.5 yards per carry (218 yards on 15 attempts).

• On Sept. 8 at USF, Oliver replaced Marshall on the third play of the second half and engineered the Jackets' next three drives. GT scored touchdowns on all three series, with Oliver capping each drive with a touchdown (five, one and one yards).

• Of the 23 plays that Oliver was on the field for at USF, he carried the ball himself 18 times and accounted for 97 of the 189 yards that the Yellow Jackets gained while he was in the game.

• Oliver finished with 97 yards on 18 carries (5.4 avg.) and three touchdowns, all on the ground, against USF.

• Despite only playing for a little more than a quarter, Oliver's three touchdowns at USF marked the 48th time in school history that an individual has rushed for three TDs in a game.

• With a season-ending foot injury sustained by presumed backup quarterback **Lucas Johnson** during preseason camp, Marshall is the only active quarterback on Georgia Tech's roster that came into the 2018 season with any collegiate playing experience.

RUNNING BACKS

• Head coach **Paul Johnson** said prior to the season that the deepest position on Georgia Tech's roster was likely B-back. That depth has been tested and proven through six games this season.

• The biggest test of Georgia Tech's depth at the B-back position has been a season-ending knee injury sustained by junior **KirVonte Benson** during the first quarter of Georgia Tech's second game of the season at USF (Sept. 8).

• Benson, who ran for 1,053 yards as a sophomore in 2017, had 116 rushing yards and two touchdowns in less than three quarters of action this season before sustaining the season-ending injury at USF.

• Sharing the workload at B-back in Benson's absence have been redshirt freshman **Jordan Mason** and sophomore **Jerry Howard**.

• Mason ranks second on the team with 443 rushing yards and a 7.6 yards-per-rush average (min. 20 carries) and is third on the squad with four touchdowns.

• Mason's 443 rushing yards rank fifth nationally among freshmen and 47th overall.

• If Mason didn't fall just two carries short of the minimum of 10 carries per game needed to qualify for the official national/conference statistical rankings, he would rank seventh nationally with 7.64 yards per carry.

- Mason notched the first two-touchdown game of his career with scoring runs of nine and 33 yards versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29).
- Howard ranks fifth on the team with 195 rushing yards his season.
- In his first extensive action of the season, Howard ran for 82 yards on just eight carries (10.2 avg.) on Sept. 15 at Pitt.
- Howard scored his first two touchdowns of the season over the last two games with a five-yard run versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and a two-yard plunge at Louisville (Oct. 5).

- Benson opened the 2018 season by rushing for 75 yards on 10 carries (7.5 avg.) and matching a career-high with two touchdowns (five and eight yards) in a 41-0 win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. He played just two quarters in the opener, after sitting out the first quarter due to a minor violation of team rules and the fourth quarter when most of GT's regulars were removed from the game.
- On Sept. 8 at USF, Benson ran for 41 yards on just five carries (8.2 avg.) before sustaining the season-ending injury on Georgia Tech's second offensive series of the game.
- Benson, who did not have a collegiate carry prior to last season, rushed for 1,053 yards and six touchdowns as a sophomore in 2017. He ranked fifth in the ACC and 35th nationally with 95.7 rushing yards per game last season.
- Benson became only the third B-back in **Paul Johnson's** 10 seasons as head coach to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, joining Jonathan Dwyer (2008 and 2009) and Anthony Allen (2010).
- Georgia Tech is loaded with experience at the A-back position, where it boasts three upperclassmen with extensive playing experience — fifth-year seniors **Clinton Lynch** and **Qua Searcy** and Cottrell, a junior.
- For their careers, the A-back trio has combined to rush for 2,366 yards and 14 touchdowns on 291 carries (8.1 avg.) and catch 60 passes for 1,464 yards (24.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns. As a group, they are averaging 10.9 yards per touch from scrimmage for their careers.

- Between them, Lynch, Searcy and Cottrell have combined for 742 all-purpose yards through the first four games of this season — 442 rushing yards on 49 carries (9.0 avg.) and 300 receiving yards on 11 receptions (23.1 avg.). They are averaging 12.4 yards every time they touch the ball in 2018.

- With a 41-yard reception in the second quarter versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29), Lynch became the first student-athlete in Georgia Tech history with 1,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in a career.
- Since the beginning of 2016, 27 of Lynch's 104 touches have gone for 20 yards or more (12 rushes, 15 receptions — 26.0 percent) and 10 of his 104 touches have gone for 40 yards or more (three rushes, seven receptions — 10.4 percent).
- On Sept. 8 at USF, Lynch hauled in an 81-yard touchdown reception from quarterback **TaQuon Marshall**. The play was the second-longest reception of Lynch's career (long: 83 from Justin Thomas vs. North Carolina, Nov. 5, 2016), the longest completion of Marshall's career and Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since Lynch's 83-yard TD at UNC in 2016.
- Lynch's 83-yard touchdown reception at North Carolina on Nov. 5, 2016 remains Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since a 95-yard touchdown run by Orwin Smith vs. Kansas on Sept. 17, 2011, the sixth-longest reception in Georgia Tech history and the longest reception by a Yellow Jacket since Embry Peebles' 87-yard catch from Joshua Nesbitt at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.
- Lynch is one of only two student-athletes in Georgia Tech history with two receptions of 80 yards or longer in his career, joining Dez White (1997-99).
- Searcy ran for two touchdowns (two and one yards) for the first time in his career last Friday at Louisville. The two-TD game was the second of his career — he ran for a touchdown and caught another as a redshirt freshman vs. Tulane on Sept. 12, 2015.
- Searcy's 91 rushing yards against Mercer on Sept. 10, 2016 remain the most by a Georgia Tech A-back since Robert Godhigh ran for 126 yards in a 55-31 defeat at Clemson on Nov. 14, 2013.
- After not finding the end zone in any of the first 25 games of his career, Cottrell had touchdown runs in two-straight games last month — a two-yarder against No. 3/2 Clemson (Sept. 22) and a four-yarder versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29).

WIDE RECEIVERS

- After catching just four passes as a junior last season, senior wide receiver **Brad Stewart** already has nine receptions through just six games this season.
- Stewart set a career high four catches against Alcorn State on Sept. 1, surpassing his previous career-high of three, which he achieved three times (twice as a sophomore in 2016, once as a freshman in 2015).
- Stewart's four catches against Alcorn State included the second touchdown reception of his career when quarterback **TaQuon Marshall** found him wide open in the corner of the end zone for a 24-yard scoring strike.
- After going the first 33 games of his career without a touchdown catch, Stewart now has two in the last nine games. On Nov. 11 of last season, Stewart hauled in a 60-yard touchdown pass in the Jackets' 28-22 win over No. 17 Virginia Tech.
- Despite not making a catch versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29), head coach **Paul Johnson** singled out Stewart for perhaps having the best game of any Georgia Tech wide receiver against the Falcons, due in large part to the role that his blocking played the Yellow Jackets racking up 372 yards on the ground.
- Stewart was limited to just one reception for 12 yards last Friday against Louisville (albeit a big catch, as it gave Georgia Tech a first down that set up a touchdown with less than a minute to go in the first half) but was named one of the Yellow Jackets' players of the week by the coaching staff. He was recognized not only for his reception but for the role that his blocking played in Georgia Tech's 542-yard rushing performance and being the holder on all 10 of the Jackets' successful place kicks (nine PAT and a FG).
- Stewart leads all current Yellow Jackets with 33-consecutive starts (the next-longest streak on the team belongs to junior OL **Parker Braun**, who has made 25-straight starts).
- Stewart has also played in all 42 of Georgia Tech's games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He is one of only two student-athletes on the Yellow Jackets' current roster that has played all 41 games since the beginning of '15, joining senior LB **Victor Alexander**.
- The starter opposite Stewart is sophomore wideout **Jalen Camp**. Camp, who had only one reception as a redshirt freshman in 2017, has six catches through six games this season.
- Camp posted a career-high with 70 yards on two receptions (33 and 37 yards) versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29).
- The only true freshman who has seen action on offense for Georgia Tech this season is wide receiver **Malachi Carter**. Carter has served as the third wideout behind Stewart and Camp in the Yellow Jackets' rotation.

• The leader of the offensive front is junior LG **Parker Braun**. Braun leads the unit and ranks second overall on the team with 25-consecutive starts.

• For the third time in his already illustrious career, Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after taking 15 defenders to the ground and helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 542 yards last Friday at Louisville.

• Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time of his career following Georgia Tech's 35-17 win over Pitt on Sept. 23, 2016. He took 22 Pitt defenders to the ground and helped Georgia Tech run for 436 yards en route to the honor.

• In 2016, Braun became the first Georgia Tech freshman to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after compiling 10 knockdowns and helping Tech rush for 309 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech (Nov. 12).

• Braun is only the fourth Yellow Jacket to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week as many as three times, joining current New England Patriot Shaq Mason (five), former NFL standout Andrew Gardner (four) and current Georgia Tech IMG Sports Network radio analyst Sean Bedford (three).

• Led by Braun, Georgia Tech's offensive line has helped the Yellow Jackets rank first nationally in rushing offense (373.0 ypg), 22nd in fewest tackles for loss allowed (4.5/gm) and 23rd in fewest sacks allowed (1.17/gm).

• Behind its offensive line, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400-plus yards in seven of its last 17 games, dating back to the beginning of last season.

• The Yellow Jackets' offensive line continues to get a boost from the return of junior **Kenny Cooper**, who missed all of fall camp and the first two games of the season due to a lower-body injury sustained during spring practice.

• Cooper, who started all 11 games at center in 2017, has seen action as a reserve at center and right guard over the past four contests as he works himself back into game shape.

• Last season, Cooper was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after taking 10 defenders to the ground and helping Georgia Tech run for 403 yards in its 33-7 win over North Carolina (Sept. 30). The award came in Cooper's fifth-career start.

• Both Braun and Cooper represent Tech on official watch lists for national awards — Braun is a candidate for the Outland Trophy, presented to college football's top interior lineman, while Cooper is on the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, which is awarded to college football's top center.

• Additionally, Braun is a candidate for the 2018 Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, which is presented to the top offensive student-athlete in NCAA Division I football who was born in, played high-school football in or plays college football in the state of Texas.

DEFENSE

• Coming into the season, one of the stated goals of new defensive coordinator **Nate Woody's** defense was to create turnovers. Through six games, the Yellow Jackets are much improved in that area.

• Through six games, Georgia Tech has already forced 13 turnovers. The Yellow Jackets forced 10 turnovers for the entire 2017 season (11 games).

• Additionally, through six games, Georgia Tech's defense has eight interceptions. The Yellow Jackets intercepted eight passes for the entire 2017 season.

• Georgia Tech's 13 takeaways are tied for seventh nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 124th out of 128 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 10 takeaways.

• Georgia Tech's eight interceptions are tied for 12th nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 110th nationally with six interceptions.

• Georgia Tech's five fumble recoveries are tied for 30th nationally.

• Georgia Tech has recorded three defensive touchdowns this season (**David Curry** fumble return vs. Alcorn State - Sept. 1; **Anree Saint-Amour** interception return vs. Bowling Green - Sept. 29; **Juanyeh Thomas** interception return - Oct. 5), which is tied for first in the ACC and fifth nationally.

• The Jackets' No. 81 national rank in scoring defense is a bit misleading, as 21 of the 170 points scored against GT this season have been scored on special teams (two kickoff returns at USF on Sept. 8) or by the opponent's defense (fumble recovery in the end zone vs. Clemson on Sept. 22).

• Woody's 3-4 defense recorded Georgia Tech's first shutout in 57 games in the Yellow Jackets' 41-0 victory over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The shutout was the Yellow Jackets' first since they blanked Syracuse, 56-0, on Oct. 19, 2013.

• Georgia Tech's defense also limited Alcorn State to just 146 yards of total offense, which is the second-lowest yardage total allowed by the Yellow Jackets in head coach **Paul Johnson's** 10-plus seasons at the helm. The only time that the Jackets surrendered fewer yards during Johnson's tenure came in his fifth game at Tech, when they allowed just 132 yards in a 27-0 win over Duke on Oct. 4, 2008.

• On Sept. 15 at Pitt, the Yellow Jackets' defense allowed 21 points and 215 yards in the opening half but buckled down in the second half, surrendering just three points and 120 yards after the break to allow the Jackets to nearly come back from a 21-0 deficit in an eventual 24-19 defeat.

• Over its final six possessions of the game, Pitt managed just three points and 114 yards of offense. Georgia Tech's defense forced three punts (two three-and-outs) and recorded an interception over those final six series.

• Georgia Tech has featured eight first-time starters on defense this season — Jr. NT **Brandon Adams**, Sr. OLB **Jalen Johnson**, So. SS **Tariq Carpenter**, Sr. FS **Malik Rivera***, So. CB **Jaytiin Askew**, redshirt Fr. CB **Tre Swilling**, So. CB **Ajani Kerr** and Fr. OLB **Charlie Thomas**.

* Rivera started 18 games in three seasons at Wofford before transferring to Georgia Tech as a graduate student for this season.

• Tech has also played a whopping nine true freshmen on defense this season — DL **T.K. Chimedza**, DL **Justice Dingle**, LB **Jordan Domineck**, DL **Quon Griffin**, LB **Quez Jackson**, DB **Jaylon King**, LB **Charlie Thomas**, DB **Juanyeh Thomas** and CB **Zamari Walton**.

• Woody came to The Flats from Appalachian State, where he served as defensive coordinator from 2013-17. Over his last three seasons at App State (2015-17 — the program's first three campaigns as full-fledged members of FBS), the Mountaineers' 3-4 scheme had average national rankings of 15th in scoring defense, 19th in total defense, 28th in rushing defense and 28th in passing defense.

• Appalachian also averaged 24 takeaways, 19 interceptions and 35 sacks per season over the last three campaigns, all areas where Georgia Tech ranked among the bottom 20 teams nationally in 2017.

DEFENSIVE LINE

• Georgia Tech's three starting defensive linemen — seniors **Desmond Branch**, **Kyle Cerge-Henderson** and **Anree Saint-Amour** — have combined to play in 98 games and make 46 starts for the Yellow Jackets.

• This season marks the first time that Georgia Tech's entire starting defensive line is comprised of seniors since 1989, when seniors Willie Burks (DT), Jeff Mathis (NG) and Sean Smith (DT) were the starting linemen for the Jackets' 7-4 squad under head coach Bobby Ross (one season before Tech won its fourth national championship).

• Saint-Amour had a career day last Friday at Louisville with a team-high-tying six tackles, including a sack, a quarterback hurry and two forced fumbles. Both forced fumbles led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.

• Saint-Amour's two forced fumbles versus Louisville matched a single-game school record. He is the 10th student-athlete in Georgia Tech history to ever force two fumbles in a single game.

• In the previous game (Sept. 29 vs. Bowling Green), Saint-Amour returned his first-career interception three yards for his first-career touchdown. The interception came on a ball that was batted into the air at the line of scrimmage by Branch.

• Saint-Amour's interception return for a touchdown was the first by a Georgia Tech defensive lineman since current Cincinnati Bengal and 2018 GT Sports Hall of Fame inductee Michael Johnson returned an INT 26 yards for a score during a 41-23 win at No. 23 Miami (Fla.) on Nov. 20, 2008.

• Branch has also recorded an interception this season (vs. Clemson on Sept. 22), marking the first time in **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons as Georgia Tech's head coach that

two different defensive linemen have had interceptions in the same season.

LINEBACKERS

• The heart and soul of Georgia Tech's defense is senior co-captain and inside linebacker **Brant Mitchell**. Mitchell is tied for the team lead with 26 tackles this season.

• After tallying 14 tackles over the first four games of the season, Mitchell has notched 12 stops over the past two games, including a season-high eight against Bowling Green (Sept. 29).

• As the Yellow Jackets' middle linebacker last season, Mitchell ranked fourth on the team with 51 tackles despite playing in only seven full games and parts of two others due to a lower-body injury. His 5.7 tackles per game led the team.

• In his first full game after returning to the lineup against No. 17 Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, Mitchell recorded a team-high nine tackles, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss, and was named ACC Co-Linebacker of the Week.

• In all, Georgia Tech went just 1-3 in the four games that Mitchell missed all or part of last season.

• After missing the entire 2017 season due to a foot injury, junior inside linebacker **David Curry** ranks fifth on the team with 22 tackles this season.

• Curry, whose career high for tackles coming into the season was three, recorded four (Sept. 1 vs. Alcorn State) and six (Sept. 8 vs. USF) tackles in Georgia Tech's first two games this season.

• The tally against USF likely would've been higher but he was ejected for a targeting call in the fourth quarter of the tough-luck loss on Sept. 8. Due to the ejection, Curry also had to sit out the first half of ACC opener at Pitt on Sept. 15.

• Curry scored Georgia Tech's first defensive touchdown of the season when he scooped up a fumble forced by nose tackle **Brandon Adams** and returned it 15 yards for a score early in the third quarter of the shutout win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The fumble return for a touchdown was the Yellow Jackets' first since P.J. Davis returned a fumble 38 yards for a score during the Jackets' 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl.

• Curry's return to action this season came following a series of injuries that kept him out of action last season (foot) and cost him time this past spring (thumb).

• Making his first-career start at the "jack" outside linebacker position last Friday at Louisville, true freshman **Charlie Thomas** tied a single-game school record by recovering two fumbles in the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win. He is the 18th Yellow Jacket to recover two fumbles in a game. Both fumble recoveries led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.

DEFENSE

- Senior OLB **Victor Alexander**, who made the first five starts of the season at “jack” has played in all 42 of Georgia Tech’s games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He is one of only two student-athletes on the Yellow Jackets’ current roster that has played all 42 games since ‘15, joining senior WR **Brad Stewart**.

- Alexander turned in his finest statistical performance of the season against No. 3/2 Clemson on Sept. 22, finishing with a season-high seven tackles.

- Georgia Tech’s fourth linebacker position — the “stinger” OLB — is manned largely by two student-athletes that were tabbed for the secondary prior to Woody’s arrival on The Flats — senior **Jalen Johnson** and junior **Christian Campbell**.

- Despite previously being limited to the defensive backfield and special teams, Johnson and Campbell have combined for 70 career tackles and five tackles for loss, including 30 stops and three TFL through six games this season.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

- Last season, Georgia Tech’s starting secondary was comprised of five veterans that combined to make 127 starts and play in 218 games.

- However, none of the five members of last year’s starting secondary returned in 2018. **Lawrence Austin**, **Lance Austin**, **Step Durham** and **Corey Griffin** all graduated while **A.J. Gray** had to step away from football due to a heart condition.

- In their wake, the defensive backs listed on Georgia Tech’s two-deep combined for zero starts and just 27 games played prior to this season.

- Of the eight DBs listed on Tech’s two-deep, three are sophomores (CB **Jaytlin Askew**, SS **Tariq Carpenter** and CB **Ajani Kerr**), two are redshirt freshmen (CB **Tre Swilling** and SS **Kaleb Oliver**) and one is a true freshmen (FS **Juanyeh Thomas**).

- The lone upperclassman, graduate student **Malik Rivera**, leads Georgia Tech in both tackles (26 - tied for team lead with ILB **Brant Mitchell**) and interceptions (2) through six games this season.

- Rivera’s two interceptions are tied for 25th nationally and third in the ACC this season. His two INTs came in the Yellow Jackets’ first two ACC games of the season (Sept. 15 at Pitt and Sept. 22 vs. Clemson).

- Rivera came to The Flats as a graduate transfer from Wofford, where he recorded 131 tackles but totaled just one interception over the past three seasons.

- Rivera’s position coach at Wofford the last two seasons (and defensive coordinator in 2017) was **Shiel Wood**, who now serves as Georgia Tech’s safeties coach.

- An incredible student, Rivera graduated from Wofford in May as a triple-major in mathematics, finance and computer science. He is pursuing a master’s degree in quantitative and computational finance at Georgia Tech.

- Five of Georgia Tech’s eight interceptions this season belong to safeties — Oliver (vs. Alcorn State), Carpenter (at USF), Rivera (at Pitt, vs. Clemson) and Thomas (at Louisville).

- Thomas capped the scoring for the Yellow Jackets last Friday at Louisville when he returned his first-career interception 95 yards for a touchdown.

- Thomas’ 95-yard interception return is tied for the fifth-longest in school history and the longest by a Yellow Jacket in an ACC game (tied with Ken Swilling - 95 yds. vs. NC State, Sept. 9, 1989). It’s also the longest INT return by a Jacket since Tyler Marcordes had a 95-yarder against Elon on Aug. 31, 2013.

• Georgia Tech boasts one of the nation's top punters in sophomore **Pressley Harvin III**.

• Due to the Yellow Jackets' offensive proficiency, Harvin has only been called upon to punt 14 times through six games this season, including just once over the past two games. He is averaging 44.9 yards per kick

• Harvin III does not qualify for official NCAA/ACC statistical rankings because he is far short of the minimum 3.6 attempts per game. However, if he did qualify, his 44.9-yard average would rank second in the ACC and 18th nationally.

• Harvin was one of only two non-true freshmen on the Yellow Jackets' travel roster to not see action during last Friday's 66-31 rout at Louisville. The other was senior long snapper **Zach Roberts**, who like Pressley, only goes on the field when the Jackets are forced to punt.

• Four of Harvin III's last seven punts have traveled 50-plus yards (51, 53, 53 and 58 yards).

• On Sept. 8 at USF, Harvin boomed a season-long 62-yarder.

• Last season, Harvin III led all NCAA Division I FBS true freshmen, ranked 16th overall nationally and was second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with a 44.1-yard punting average last season.

• Harvin's 44.1-yard average was also a Georgia Tech freshman record and ranked fifth overall in single-season program history.

• Of Harvin's 50 punts last season, 13 traveled 50-plus yards (26 percent), 16 were downed inside the 20 yard line (32 pct.), 15 were fair-caught (30 pct.) and 29 were not returned (58 pct.).

• Making Harvin's freshman campaign even more impressive was that two of his best performances have come in less-than-ideal conditions for punting — he recorded career-bests with a 62-yard punt and four kicks downed inside the 20 yard line at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 and had five punts that traveled 50 yards or more and three downed inside the 20 at Clemson on Oct. 28. The majority of both games were played during heavy rain storms.

• Following his incredible rookie campaign, Harvin III was named freshman all-America by the Football Writers Association of America, true freshman all-America by ESPN and was a third-team all-ACC honoree.

• Harvin III is on the official watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to college football's top punter. He was first added to the list midway through his prolific freshman campaign last fall.

• Harvin became only the third FWA freshman all-American in school history (joining OL Will Jackson, 2010, and PK Travis Bell, 2004) and the first Georgia Tech freshman to earn all-ACC recognition since Calvin Johnson (first-team WR) and Bell (second-team PK) in '04.

• Replicating Harvin III's magic as a true freshman specialist this season is walk-on place kicker **Wesley Wells**. Wells took over the place-kicking duties after winning an in-practice competition for the job in the week leading up to the Bowling Green game (Sept. 29). Since then, he has made the first 19 kicks of his career — 18 PATs and a 41-yard field goal that split the uprights midway through the second quarter of last Friday's win at Louisville.

• Wells' 41-yard field goal was the longest made FG by a Yellow Jacket since **Brenton King**, also a true freshman at the time, made a 42-yarder vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 21, 2017.

• Another true freshman **Juanyeh Thomas** earned the job as Georgia Tech's primary punt and kickoff returner during fall camp.

• Thomas' 25-yard punt return in the second quarter of the Sept. 1 season opener against Alcorn was Georgia Tech's longest punt return since **Brad Stewart's** 26-yarder versus Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 1, 2016.

• Thomas' 38-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter at USF (Sept. 8) was the longest by a Yellow Jacket since **Lamont Simmons** scooped up an onside kick attempt and returned it 42 yards for a touchdown at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 of last season.

• USF's 266 yards on kickoff returns on Sept. 8 — which included 98- and 97-yard returns for touchdowns by Terrence Horne in the first quarter — were the second-most yards that Georgia Tech has ever allowed on kickoff returns in a single game (second only to North Carolina's 267 yards in a 68-50 GT win on Nov. 10, 2012).

• The two touchdowns allowed on kickoff returns against USF tied an NCAA Division I FBS single-game record.

• In Yellow Jackets' 32 kickoffs since Horne's back-to-back touchdowns at USF, Georgia Tech junior kicker **Shawn Davis** has pinned the opponent at or inside its 25 yard line 24 times (with one of the exceptions being on a squib kick on the first kickoff following the two TD returns at USF).



MISCELLANEOUS

• Bobby Dodd Stadium has been home sweet home for Georgia Tech of late, as it has won 10 of its last 12 home games, dating back to midway through the 2016 season. The only two home losses during that span have been at the hands of Georgia (Nov. 25, 2017) and Clemson (Sept. 22, 2018).

• However, on the flip side, Georgia Tech has struggled in games played away from its Midtown Atlanta home as of late. The Yellow Jackets are just 1-7 in games played away from Bobby Dodd Stadium since the beginning of the 2017 season, with last Friday's 66-31 romp at Louisville snapping a seven-game away-from-home skid.

• Over the course of the seven-game losing streak in games played away from Bobby Dodd Stadium that spanned from Sept. 4, 2017-Sept. 15, 2018, Georgia Tech squandered double-digit leads in five of the seven defeats.

• Last year, Georgia Tech became only the 10th team in ACC history with two one-point losses in the same season (a 42-41 double-overtime loss to No. 25 Tennessee on Sept. 4 and a 25-24 loss at No. 11 Miami on Oct. 14).

• Three of the Yellow Jackets' five defeats last season — Sept. 4 vs. Tennessee, Oct. 11 at Miami (Fla.) and Nov. 4 at Virginia — came by a total of just six points.

• In each of those three defeats, Georgia Tech's opponent scored the winning points in the final 82 seconds of regulation or in overtime.

• Over the course of their first five games last season, the Yellow Jackets only trailed for 20:43 of total playing time and just four seconds after halftime — the final four seconds of their 25-24 loss at No. 11/10 Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 — but went just 3-2 in those five games.

• With underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores) representing 68.4 percent of its roster, Georgia Tech has the 14th-youngest team in all of NCAA Division I FBS and third-youngest team in the ACC this year.
