SERIES HISTORY

- Coming off perhaps its most impressive victory of the season, Georgia Tech looks to move within one game of bowl eligibility and remain alive in the wide-open race for the Atlantic Coast Conference Coastal Division title when it travels to North Carolina on Saturday.
- Georgia Tech (4-4, 2-3 ACC) is fresh off handing Virginia Tech its first ACC loss of the season with a 49-28 romp in Blacksburg, Va.
- Behind 215 yards from redshirt freshman guarterback **Tobias Oliver**, who was making his first-career start, the Yellow Jackets rushed for 465 yards in the win at VT. The 465-yard rushing effort marked the fourth time this season and 25th time in head coach **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons at Georgia Tech that the Jackets rushed for at least 400 yards in a game.
- Making last week's dominance on the ground even more impressive is the fact that the Yellow Jackets didn't complete a pass in the 21-point victory. The Jackets were 0-for-1 in pass attempts, marking the first time since a 16-7 win over Georgia in 1977 that Tech did not complete a pass in a game. It was the 18th time since 2002 that an NCAA Division I FBS team did not complete a pass in a game (teams that haven't completed a pass are 14-4 during that stretch).
- Georgia Tech is in search of its second-straight win over North Carolina, following last season's 33-7 rout in Atlanta (Sept. 30). The GT-UNC series has been a streaky one since Johnson's arrival on The Flats in 2008. After North Carolina won in '08, the Yellow Jackets won five in a row from 2009-13, followed by three-straight Tar Heel victories from 2014-16 before Tech got back in the win column last season.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

Georgia Tech did not complete a pass in last week's 49-28 victory at Virginia Tech (0-for-1), marking the first time since a 16-7 win over Georgia on Nov. 26, 1977 that the Jackets had zero completions in a game and the 18th time since 2002 that an NCAA Division I FBS team did not complete a pass (the teams with zero completions won in 14 of those 18 instances).

Georgia Tech ranks No. 1 nationally in rushing offense at 366.5 yards per game, a whopping 48.2 yards per game more than the nation's No. 2-ranked rushing offense (Army West Point - 318.3 ypg).

Georgia Tech has two quarterbacks ranked among the top 20 nationally in rushing touchdowns (Tobias Oliver - 10, t-eighth **TaQuon Marshall** - 9, t-16) and among the top 50 nationally in rushing yards per game (Oliver - 94.3 ypg, 29th and Marshall - 85.4 ypg, 44th). No other NCAA Division I FBS team has two quarterbacks even ranked among the top 100 nationally in rushing touchdowns or has two QBs among the top 200 in rushing yards per game.

Georgia Tech has three defensive touchdowns through eight games this season, which is tied for the most in the ACC (with Miami and Wake Forest) and sixth nationally (Fresno State and Temple lead the nation with five defensive TDs apiece).

Georgia Tech, Ball State, SMU and Syracuse are the only four teams in the nation with three active players that have each rushed for 1,000 yards or more in their careers (TaQuon Marshall - 1,816, Clinton Lynch - 1,214 and KirVonte Benson - 1,169). Research courtesy of Syracuse University

Georgia Tech has forced 17 turnovers in eight games this season after finishing last season with 10 takeaways in 11 games. The Yellow Jackets are currently tied for 13th nationally in takeaways after finishing last season ranked 124th out of 128 NCAA Division I FBS teams.

Twenty-five of the 33 400-yard rushing games in Georgia Tech history (including three this season) have come in Paul Johnson's 11 seasons as the Yellow Jackets' head coach (2008-pres.). Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400 yards in a game 25 times in 137 contests (once every 5.5 games). Prior to his arrival, the Yellow Jackets had rushed for 400 yards in a game eight times in 1,138 contests (once every 142.3 games). Johnson's previous team, Navy, is the only NCAA Division I FBS team that has more 400-yard rushing games since 2008 (33). The second-most 400-yard rushing games by a Power 5 conference team since '08 is 12 by Oregon.

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- move it to 5-4 overall and even its record in ACC play at
- push it above .500 for the first time since it started 1-0 this season;
- pull it within one win of becoming bowl eligible for the 20th time in the last 22 seasons;
- be its third-straight road win, after it had dropped its previous seven games away from home;
- give it three-straight true road wins for the first time since it won at Pittsburgh, at NC State and at Georgia in its final three road games of the 2014 regular season;
- be its second-straight over North Carolina;
- be its first at North Carolina since a 68-50 victory in 2012;
- be its first win in head coach Paul Johnson's native state since a 58-23 triumph at NC State in 2014;
- up it to 30-21-3 all-time, 11-13-3 on the road and 7-4 under Johnson against North Carolina.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- drop it to 4-5 overall and 2-4 in ACC play;
- snap a two-game road winning streak and be its eighth loss in its last 10 games played away from home;
- be its fourth loss in the last five meetings with North Carolina;
- drop it to 29-22-3 all-time, 10-14-3 on the road and 6-5 under head coach Paul Johnson against North Carolina;
- leave it needing two wins in its last three games of the regular season to become bowl eligible for the 20th time in the last 22 seasons.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN AT VIRGINIA TECH

- Led by 215 yards from redshirt freshman quarterback **Tobias Oliver**, Georgia Tech rushed for 465 yards in a 49-28 rout at Virginia Tech on Thursday, Oct. 25.
- Filling in for injured senior QB TaQuon Marshall, Oliver ran for 215 yards on 40 carries (both career highs) and scored three touchdowns (matching a career high) in the
- Oliver's 215 rushing yards were the second-most ever by a Georgia Tech quarterback and his 40 carries were the second-most in school history, regardless of position (behind Marshall's 249 yards on 44 carries in his first-career start vs. Tennessee on Sept. 4, 2017).
- Georgia Tech rushed for at least 400 yards for the fourth time this season, tving last season's school record for the most 400-yard rushing games in a single season.
- For the first time ever in an Atlantic Coast Conference game, Georgia Tech did not complete a pass (0-for-1). The last time the Yellow Jackets did not complete a pass in a game was in a 16-7 win over Georgia on Nov. 26, 1977.
- Georgia Tech became the first ACC team to not complete a pass in a game since Wake Forest in a 15-12 loss to Virginia on Nov. 18, 1972.
- The Yellow Jackets traded touchdowns with the Hokies on the game's first five possessions of the game, but momentum shifted when VT muffed the first punt of the game and was recovered by GT's Jalen Johnson at the 12-yard line.
- From there, Georgia Tech rattled off 35-consecutive points to turn a 21-14 deficit early in the second quarter into a commanding 49-21 lead late in the final period.
- After surrendering 216 yards and 21 points on Virginia Tech's first three possessions of the game, Georgia Tech's defense limited VT to 37 yards and zero points over its next five possessions before the Hokies drove for an inconsequential touchdown on their final offensive series.

- · Georgia Tech's 35 first downs and 31 first downs rushing were both school records.
- · Georgia Tech's 35 first downs were the most ever allowed by Virginia Tech.
- · Georgia Tech's 465 rushing yards were the most allowed by Virginia Tech since 1973. The Yellow Jackets' seven rushing touchdowns were the most surrendered by the Hokies since 1974.
- Oliver's 215 rushing yards were temporarily the most by an ACC player this season (Wake Forest's Matt Colburn surpassed Oliver's total with 243 rushing yards against Louisville on Saturday).
- Oliver's 215 rushing vards remain the second-most by an NCAA Division I FBS quarterback, the most by an FBS QB against an FBS opponent and the 13th-most by any FBS player, regardless of position, this season.
- Georgia Tech freshman B-back **Jordan Mason** also ran for a career-high three touchdowns.
- True freshman outside linebacker Charlie Thomas led Georgia Tech with a career-high nine tackles.
- Senior defensive end Anree Saint-Amour had two tackles for loss, giving him five TFL over the last three games.
- Oliver was named the ACC's Co-Rookie of the Week while junior left guard Parker Braun (25 knockdowns) was named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week.

NOTING NORTH CAROLINA

- North Carolina is 1-6 overall (1-4 ACC) this season.
- The Tar Heels have lost four-straight, all in ACC play (at Miami, vs. Virginia Tech, at Syracuse, at Virginia).
- Three of UNC's six losses, including two of its four conference defeats, have come by seven points or less.
- The Tar Heels have suffered a pair of narrow defeats at the hands of two of the ACC's leading teams — Virginia Tech (a 22-19 loss on Oct. 13 when VT scored the go-ahead TD with 19 seconds to go) and Syracuse (a 40-37 doubleovertime loss on Oct. 20 when SU scored the tying TD with 1:39 left in regulation).
- Turnovers have been perhaps UNC's biggest downfall in 2018. The Tar Heels rank 124th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams in turnover margin (minus-1.14 per game). They are 104th nationally in turnovers lost (16) and 111th nationally in turnovers gaines (8).
- Led by senior defensive end Malik Carnev's 5.5 sacks and 7.5 tackles for loss, North Carolina ranks seventh nationally in team sacks (3.29 per game) and 31st in team tackles for loss (7.0 per game).
- Offensively, the Tar Heels have lost two quarterbacks to injury this season — freshman Chase Fortin, who threw for 112 yards in two games and junior Chazz Surratt, who completed just four passes for 10 yards in just one contest before being lost for the season with a wrist injury.
- Junior QB Nathan Elliott has appeared in all seven games for UNC and has completed 60.7 percent of his passes for 1,512 yards, eight touchdowns and just four interceptions.
- Since starting 8-3 in 2016, North Carolina has lost 17 of its last 21 games overall and 13 of its last 15 ACC contests.



- In a series that began in 1915, Georgia Tech and North Carolina are meeting for the 54th time on the gridiron.
- The Yellow Jackets and Tar Heels are also squaring off for the 39th-straight season, dating back to 1980.
- · Georgia Tech leads the all-time series between the longtime rivals. 29-21-3.
- The GT-UNC series has been a streaky one since North Carolina native **Paul Johnson** took over as Georgia Tech's head coach in 2008. After North Carolina won in '08, the Yellow Jackets won five in a row from 2009-13, followed by three-straight Tar Heel victories from 2014-16 before Tech got back in the win column with a 33-7 rout last season. Johnson is 6-4 overall against UNC.
- · Georgia Tech is just 10-13-3 all-time at North Carolina, including a 2-3 record at Kenan Stadium under Johnson. The Yellow Jackets are in search of their first win at UNC since a wild 68-50 triumph on Nov. 10, 2012.

NOTING LAST YEAR'S WIN OVER UNC

- Georgia Tech outgained North Carolina, 456-247, in a convincing 33-7 win over the Tar Heels on Sept. 30, 2017 at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Georgia Tech raced out to a 27-0 lead before the Tar Heels scored their only points of the game with 5:05 to go in the contest.
- Georgia Tech had scoring drives of 18 (touchdown) and 17 (field goal) plays in the first half, marking the only time in Paul Johnson's 11 seasons as head coach that the Yellow Jackets have put together multiple scoring drives of 17 plays or more.
- Georgia Tech's 18-play touchdown drive in the first quarter is tied for the ninth-longest scoring drive in school history in terms of plays and was the longest drive by the Yellow Jackets in terms of plays since an 18-yard series resulted in a touchdown in a 42-24 win over Duke on Nov. 17, 2012.
- Georgia Tech BB **KirVonte Benson** (130) and QB **Ta-Quon Marshall** (137) led Georgia Tech's 403-yard rushing attack by each eclipsing the 100-yard plateau.
- Center **Kenny Cooper** was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after taking 10 defenders to the ground and helping Georgia Tech rush for 403 yards in the victory.
- Safety A.J. Gray, now a student assistant coach for the Yellow Jackets, picked off two passes in the win, en route to being named ACC Defensive Back of the Week.

GEORGIA TECH vs. NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

- Georgia Tech has 92 wins in 271 all-time matchups versus teams ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25.
- The Yellow Jackets officially own 12 wins over ranked teams in 10 seasons under head coach Paul Johnson. A 13th victory, a 39-34 triumph over No. 25 Clemson in the 2009 ACC Championship Game, was later vacated due to NCAA sanctions.

- In its four wins this season, Georgia Tech has turned the ball over a total of three times (0.75 per game although all three came in the season-opening win over Alcorn State). In their four losses, the Yellow Jackets have turned the ball over nine times (2.25 per game).
- After committing nine turnovers through the first 13 quarters of this season (first three games plus first quarter of Game 4 vs. Clemson), Georgia Tech went 234-consecutive plays (offensive snaps plus returns) without a turnover over the next 13 quarters (final three quarters vs. Clemson, full games vs. Bowling Green and Louisville and first two quarters vs. Duke).
- However, that streak came to emphatic halt when the Yellow Jackets lost fumbles on three-straight plays late in the third quarter of its 28-14 loss to Duke on Oct. 13. Those fumbles (by BB **Jerry Howard**, QB **TaQuon Marshall** and KR **Juanyeh Thomas**) led directly to Duke scoring 21 points in the final 1:49 of the third period, turning what was a 7-7 ballgame into a 28-14 defeat.
- The Yellow Jackets got back on track by not committing any turnovers in last Thursday's 49-28 win at Virginia Tech.
- In all, after committing nine turnovers in its first four games of the season (one turnover every 31.3 plays), Georgia Tech has committed only three turnovers in the last four games (one every 93.3 plays).
- Last season, GT committed eight turnovers in its first four games of the season (one turnover every 37.8 plays) but had only six turnovers over the final seven games of the campaign (one turnover every 74.8 plays).
- Despite having only one turnover against No. 3/2 Clemson on Sept. 22, Georgia Tech fumbled eight times in the loss.
 The eight fumbles are tied for the second-most in school history (record: 9 at Miami, Nov. 21, 2015). The Yellow Jackets' eight fumbles marked only the third time in the past 46 seasons (dating back to 1973) that they have fumbled as many as seven times in a contest.
- Over their last 27 games, the Yellow Jackets have punted only 94 times (3.48 per game) and have come away with points on 133 of their 316 offensive possessions (42.1 percent).
- Georgia Tech has scored at least 24 points in 17 of its last 23 games.



- The Yellow Jackets had a streak of 10-consecutive games that ran from Nov. 12, 2016 (at Virginia Tech) through Oct. 21, 2017 (vs. Wake Forest). At the time, it was the fifth-longest active streak in the nation and the second-longest active streak in the ACC. It was also tied for the fourth-longest string of games with 24 points or more in Georgia Tech history.
- Georgia Tech returned eight offensive starters this season, which represented a large portion of its offensive production from a season ago, including:
 - 100 percent of their passing yardage
 - 90.4 percent of their rushing yardage
 - six offensive linemen that came into the season having combined to make 75 career starts

QUARTERBACKS

 Despite only having 18 career starts under his belt, senior TaQuon Marshall has emerged as one of college football's most dyamic quarterbacks.

- Georgia Tech's senior signal-caller put together perhaps the finest two-game stretch of his career in wins over Bowling Green (63-17 on Sept. 29) and Louisville (66-31 on Oct. 5). He rushed 36 times for 217 yards (6.0 avg.) and four touchdowns while completing 6-of-8 passes for 172 yards (75.0 comp. pct., 21.5 yds./att., 28.7 yds./comp.) to lead the Yellow Jackets to the blowout wins.
- Marshall led the Jackets to points in 14-straight offensive series that he quarterbacked his final series vs. Clemson on Sept. 22 (TD), all six series vs. BG on Sept. 29 (6 TD) and all seven series at Louisville on Oct. 5 (6 TD, 1 FG).
- On Oct. 5 at Louisville, Marshall rushed for 175 yards on 23 carries (7.6 avg.). The 175 yards on the ground were a season-high and the second-highest rushing total of his career (behind only his Georgia Tech quarterback-record 249 yards in the 2017 season opener versus Tennessee).
- Marshall was named ACC Quarterback of the Week following his impressive performances against Louisville. The ACC award is the second of his career. He was named ACC Offensive Back of the Week following his record-breaking performance in last season's opener versus Tennessee.
- Marshall has registered six of the 13 highest single-game rushing totals by a guarterback in Georgia Tech history.

- Marshall's six 100-yard rushing games in 2017 were the most ever by a Georgia Tech quarterback and tied for eighth in GT single-season history, regardless of position.
- Despite missing significant time in the second half on Sept. 8 at USF due to a lower-body injury, Marshall passed for a career-high 183 yards (prev.: 179 at Virginia, Nov. 4, 2017) and ran for 113 more. It marked the third time in his career that he rushed and passed for at least 100 yards in the same game and the seventh time that he has rushed and passed for a touchdown.
- Marshall also had the longest completion of his career at USF, an 81-yard touchdown strike to senior AB **Clinton Lynch** (prev.: 80 to Ricky Jeune vs. Virginia Tech, Nov. 11, 2017).
- While his 183 passing yards at USF remain a season and career high, Marshall turned in his most efficient passing performance of the season against Bowling Green on Sept. 29, when he completed 5-of-6 passes for 160 yards. Four of his five completions went for at least 33 yards.
- Marshall's 307.33 pass-efficiency rating versus Bowling Green was the second-highest of his career (career high: 347.26 vs. Jacksonville State, Sept. 9, 2017) and easily his highest of the season (prev.: 131.51 at USF, Sept. 8).
- Marshall's 17 rushing touchdowns last season were the third-most by a quarterback in Georgia Tech single-season history.

- With 104.2 rushing yards per game last season, Marshall became the first quarterback and only the third Yellow Jacket overall to average 100 rushing yards per game in a single season in 10 seasons under head coach **Paul Johnson**, joining Jonathan Dwyer (107.3 ypg 2008) and Anthony Allen (101.2 ypg 2010).
- Marshall burst on to the national stage with a recordsetting performance versus Tennessee in last year's season opener. Making the first start of his career, Marshall set three school records and one ACC record against the Vols.

• Marshall's 249 rushing yards against Tennessee were also the third-most in Georgia Tech history, regardless of position (behind only 356 by Eddie Lee Ivery vs. Air Force - Nov. 11, 1978 and 307 by P.J. Daniels vs. Tulsa, Humanitarian Bowl - Jan. 4, 2004).



- Marshall's 249 rushing yards against Tennessee were the fifth-most by an FBS quarterback and tied for the 15th-most by any FBS student-athlete in a game last season.
- Marshall's five rushing touchdowns against UT were tied for the most in the nation by any student-athlete in a single game last season.
- Marshall is on the official watch list for the 2018 Maxwell Award, presented to "America's College Player of the Year."
 He is joined on the list by Georgia Tech B-back KirVonte Benson.
- After serving as Marshall's backup for the first seven games of the season, redshirt freshman **Tobias Oliver** burst onto the national scene with his performance in his first-career start last Thursday at Virginia Tech.
- Making the start for Marshall, who sustained an upperbody injury in the previous game against Duke (Oct. 13), Oliver rushed for 215 yards on 40 carries (both career highs) and scored three touchdowns (matching a career high) to lead the Yellow Jackets to a 49-28 victory at VT.
- Oliver's 215 rushing yards against Virginia Tech were the second-most by a quarterback and seventh-most overall in Georgia Tech single-game history (see p. 7 for list of top rushing performances by GT QBs).
- Oliver's 40 carries against VT were the second-most in GT single-game history (behind only Marshall's 44 vs. Tennessee, Sept. 4, 2017).
- Oliver's 215 rushing yards against VT were temporarily the most by an ACC player this season (Wake Forest's Matt Colburn surpassed Oliver's total with 243 rushing yards against Louisville on Saturday).
- Oliver's 215 rushing yards against VT remain the secondmost by an NCAA Division I FBS quarterback, the most by an FBS QB against an FBS opponent and the 13th-most by any FBS player, regardless of position, this season.

• Oliver's 6.35 yards per rush ranks third among all freshmen nationally (regardless of position) and his 94.3 rushing yards per game rank second among FBS freshmen.

- Oliver has led the Yellow Jackets to touchdowns on 15 of the 23 full possessions that he's led this year, not including abbreviated series at the end of halves (he has also closed out two touchdown drives that he wasn't on the field for the start of).
- Oliver was impressive in relief of Marshall in the Yellow Jackets' wins vs. Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and at Louisville (Oct. 5). He was on the field for a total of just five series in those two games (not including abbreviated series to run out the clock at the end of each game) and led the Yellow Jackets to four touchdowns while running for more than 100 yards in each game (115 vs. BG, 103 at Louisville) and averging a whopping 14.5 yards per carry (218 yards on 15 attempts).
- On Sept. 8 at USF, Oliver replaced Marshall on the third play of the second half and engineered the Jackets' next three drives. GT scored touchdowns on all three series, with Oliver capping each drive with a touchdown (five, one and one yards).
- Of the 23 plays that Oliver was on the field for at USF, he carried the ball himself 18 times and accounted for 97 of the 189 yards that the Yellow Jackets gained while he was in the game.
- Oliver finished with 97 yards on 18 carries (5.4 avg.) and three touchdowns, all on the ground, against USF.
- Despite only playing for a little more than a quarter, Oliver's three touchdowns at USF marked the 48th time in school history that an individual has rushed for three TDs in a game.
- In the win over Louisville (Oct. 5), Marshall and Oliver became the first quarterback tandem in Georgia Tech history to both rush for 100 yards in the same game (Marshall -175, Oliver - 103).
- Marshall and Oliver are both ranked among the top 20 nationally in rushing touchdowns (Oliver 10, t-eighth and Marshall 9, t-16) and among the top 50 nationally in rushing yards per game (Oliver 94.3 ypg, 29th and Marshall 85.4 ypg). No other NCAA Division I FBS team has two quarterbacks even ranked among the top 100 nationally in rushing touchdowns or has two QBs among the top 200 in rushing yards per game.
- With a season-ending foot injury sustained by presumed backup quarterback **Lucas Johnson** during preseason camp, Marshall is the only active quarterback on Georgia Tech's roster that came into the 2018 season with any collegiate playing experience.

RUNNING BACKS

- Head coach **Paul Johnson** said prior to the season that the deepest position on Georgia Tech's roster was likely Bback. That depth has been tetsted and proven through seven games this season.
- The biggest test of Georgia Tech's depth at the B-back position has been a season-ending knee injury sustained by junior **KirVonte Benson** during the first quarter of Georgia Tech's second game of the season at USF (Sept. 8).
- Benson, who ran for 1,053 yards as a sophomore in 2017, had 116 rushing yards and two touchdowns in less than three quarters of action this season before sustaining the season-ending injury at USF.

- Sharing the workload at B-back in Benson's absence have been redshirt freshman **Jordan Mason** and sophomore **Jerry Howard**.
- Mason ranks third on the team (first among nonquarterbacks) with 564 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns.
- Mason's 6.88 yards-per-rush average ranks second on the squad (min. 20 carries).
- Mason's 6.88 yards per carry leads all freshmen nationally and ranks eighth in the nation overall.
- Mason's 70.5 rushing yards per game rank ninth nationally among freshmen and 73rd overall.

- Last Thursday at Virginia Tech, Mason set a career high with three rushing touchdowns (five, 14 and one yards).
- Mason has scored six touchdowns over the last four games (two vs. Bowling Green, one at Louisville, three at VT).
- Howard ranks fourth on the team (second among non-QBs) with 333 rushing yards and four rushing touchdowns this season.
- In his first extensive action of the year, Howard ran for a season-high 82 yards on just eight carries (10.2 avg.) on Sept. 15 at Pitt.
- Howard has scored a touchdown in each of the last three games — on a 5-yard run versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29), a 2-yard plunge at Louisville (Oct. 5), a 2-yard run versus Duke (Oct. 13) and an 8-yard run at Virginia Tech (last Thursday).
- Serving as Benson's top backup last season, Howard's 7.6 yards per carry ranked second on the team last season, behind only A-back **Nathan Cottrell** (8.2 avg.).
- Benson finished his 2018 season with just 15 carries, averging 7.7 yards per rush.

- Benson opened the 2018 season by rushing for 75 yards on 10 carries (7.5 avg.) and matching a career-high with two touchdowns (five and eight yards) in a 41-0 win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. He played just two quarters in the opener, after sitting out the first quarter due to a minor violation of team rules and the fourth quarter when most of GT's regulars were removed from the game.
- On Sept. 8 at USF, Benson ran for 41 yards on just five carries (8.2 avg.) before sustaining the season-ending injury on Georgia Tech's second offensive series of the game.
- Benson, who did not have a collegiate carry prior to last season, rushed for 1,053 yards and six touchdowns as a sophomore in 2017. He ranked fifth in the ACC and 35th nationally with 95.7 rushing yards per game last season.
- Benson became only the third B-back in Paul Johnson's 10 seasons as head coach to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, joining Jonathan Dwyer (2008 and 2009) and Anthony Allen (2010).
- Georgia Tech is loaded with experience at the A-back position, where it boasts three upperclassmen with extensive playing experience — fifth-year seniors Clinton Lynch and Qua Searcy and Cottrell, a junior.
- For their careers, the A-back trio has combined to rush for 2,464 yards and 16 touchdowns on 308 carries (8.0 avg.) and catch 63 passes for 1,495 yards (23.7 avg.) and 13 touchdowns. As a group, they are averaging 10.7 yards per touch from scrimmage for their careers.
- Between them, Lynch, Searcy and Cottrell have combined for 871 all-purpose yards through the first seven games of this season — 540 rushing yards on 66 carries (8.2 avg.) and 331 receiving yards on 16 receptions (20.7 avg.). They are averaging 10.6 yards every time they touch the ball in 2018.

- With a 41-yard reception in the second quarter versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29), Lynch became the first studentathlete in Georgia Tech history with 1,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in a career.
- Since the beginning of 2016, 27 of Lynch's 106 touches have gone for 20 yards or more (12 rushes, 15 receptions 25.5 percent) and 10 of his 106 touches have gone for 40 yards or more (three rushes, seven receptions 9.4 percent).
- On Sept. 8 at USF, Lynch hauled in an 81-yard touchdown reception from quarterback **TaQuon Marshall**. The play was the second-longest reception of Lynch's career (long: 83 from Justin Thomas vs. North Carolina, Nov. 5, 2016), the longest completion of Marshall's career and Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since Lynch's 83-yard TD at UNC in 2016.

- Lynch's 83-yard touchdown reception at North Carolina on Nov. 5, 2016 remains Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since a 95-yard touchdown run by Orwin Smith vs. Kansas on Sept. 17, 2011, the sixth-longest reception in Georgia Tech history and the longest reception by a Yellow Jacket since Embry Peeples' 87-yard catch from Joshua Nesbitt at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.
- Lynch is one of only two student-athletes in Georgia Tech history with two receptions of 80 yards or longer in his career, joining Dez White (1997-99).
- Searcy ran for two touchdowns (two and one yards) for the first time in his career at Louisville (Oct. 5). The two-TD game was the second of his career he ran for a touchdown and caught another as a redshirt freshman vs. Tulane on Sept. 12, 2015.
- Searcy's 91 rushing yards against Mercer on Sept. 10, 2016 remain the most by a Georgia Tech A-back since Robert Godhigh ran for 126 yards in a 55-31 defeat at Clemson on Nov. 14, 2013.
- After not finding the end zone in any of the first 25 games of his career, Cottrell had touchdown runs in two-straight games last month — a two-yarder against No. 3/2 Clemson (Sept. 22) and a four-yarder versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29).

WIDE RECEIVERS

- After catching just four passes as a junior last season, senior wide receiver **Brad Stewart** already has 11 receptions through eight games this season.
- Stewart set a career high four catches against Alcorn State on Sept. 1, surpassing his previous career-high of three, which he achieved three times (twice as a sophomore in 2016, once as a freshman in 2015).
- Stewart's four catches against Alcorn State included the second touchdown reception of his career when quarterback TaQuon Marshall found him wide open in the corner of the end zone for a 24-yard scoring strike.
- After going the first 33 games of his career without a touchdown catch, Stewart now has two in the last 11 games. On Nov. 11 of last season, Stewart hauled in a 60yard touchdown pass in the Jackets' 28-22 win over No. 17 Virginia Tech.
- Despite not making a catch versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29), head coach **Paul Johnson** singled out Stewart for perhaps having the best game of any Georgia Tech wide receiver against the Falcons, due in large part to the role that his blocking played the Yellow Jackets racking up 372 yards on the ground.
- Stewart was limited to just one reception for 12 yards against Louisville on Oct. 5 (albeit a big catch, as it gave Georgia Tech a first down that set up a touchdown with less than a minuted to go in the first half) but was named one of the Yellow Jackets' players of the week by the coaching staff. He was recognized not only for his reception but for the role that his blocking played in Georgia Tech's 542-yard rushing performance and being the holder on all 10 of the Jackets' successful place kicks (nine PAT and a FG).
- Stewart leads all current Yellow Jackets with 35-consecutive starts (the next-longest streak on the team belongs to junior OL **Parker Braun**, who has made 27-straight starts).
- Stewart has also played in all 44 of Georgia Tech's games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He is the only student-

- athlete on the Yellow Jackets' current roster that has played all 44 games since the beginning of '15.
- The starter opposite Stewart is sophomore wideout **Jalen** Camp. Camp, who had only one reception as a redshirt freshman in 2017, has six catches through eight games this season.
- Camp posted a career-high with 70 yards on two receptions (33 and 37 yards) versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29).
- The only true freshman who has seen action on offense for Georgia Tech this season is wide receiver **Malachi Carter**.
 Carter has served as the third wideout behind Stewart and Camp in the Yellow Jackets' rotation.
- With Camp out due to an upper-body injury, Carter hauled in a 32-yard touchdown (the first of his career) versus Duke (Oct. 13).

• Eight different offensive linemen boast starting experience for Georgia Tech. Those eight have combined for a total of 115 starts over 218 career games played.

- The leader of the offensive front is all-ACC and all-America candidate Parker Braun. Braun, a junior left guard, leads the unit and ranks second overall on the team with 27-consecutive starts.
- Braun turned in perhaps the finest performance of his already illustrious career last Thursday at Virginia Tech, as he took a whopping 25 defenders to the ground in just 72 plays (one every 2.9 plays) to help pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 465 yards in a 49-28 win.
- In recognition of the dominating effort against VT, Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time this season and fourth time in his career.
- Braun is only the third Yellow Jacket to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week as many as four times in a career, joining current New England Patriot Shaq Mason (5 – 2012-15) and former NFL standout Andrew Gardner (4 – 2005-08).
- Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the first time this season and third time in his career after taking 15 defenders to the ground and helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 542 yards at Louisville (Oct. 5).
- Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time of his career following Georgia Tech's 35-17 win over Pitt on Sept. 23, 2016. He took 22 Pitt defenders to the ground and helped Georgia Tech run for 436 yards en route to the honor.



- In 2016, Braun became the first Georgia Tech freshman to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after compiling 10 knockdowns and helping Tech rush for 309 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech (Nov. 12).
- Led by Braun, Georgia Tech's offensive line has helped pave the way for the Yellow Jackets rank first nationally in rushing offense (366.5 ypg) and 29th in fewest sacks allowed (1.38/gm).
- Behind its offensive line, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400plus yards in seven of its last 18 games, dating back to the beginning of last season.
- The Yellow Jackets' offensive line continues to get a boost from the return of junior **Kenny Cooper**, who missed all of fall camp and the first two games of the season due to a lower-body injury sustained during spring practice.
- Cooper, who started all 11 games at center in 2017, made his first start of 2018 against Duke (Oct. 13).
- Before getting back into the starting lineup, Cooper made his 2018 debut against Pitt (Sept. 15) and saw action as a reserve at center and right guard for four contests as he worked himself back into game shape.
- Last season, Cooper was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after taking 10 defenders to the ground and helping Georgia Tech run for 403 yards in its 33-7 win over North Carolina (Sept. 30). The award came in Cooper's fifth-career start.
- Both Braun and Cooper represent Tech on official watch lists for national awards Braun is a candidate for the Outland Trophy, presented to college football's top interior lineman, while Cooper is on the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, which is awarded to college football's top center.
- Additionally, Braun is a candidate for the 2018 Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, which is presented to the top offensive student-athlete in NCAA Division I football who was born in, played high-school football in or plays college football in the state of Texas.

DEFENSE

- Coming into the season, one of the stated goals of new defensive coordinator **Nate Woody's** defense was to create turnovers. Through eight games, the Yellow Jackets are much improved in that area.
- Through eight games, Georgia Tech has already forced 17 turnovers. The Yellow Jackets forced 10 turnovers for the entire 2017 season (11 games).
- Additionally, through eight games, Georgia Tech's defense has nine interceptions. The Yellow Jackets intercepted eight passes for the entire 2017 season.
- Georgia Tech's 17 takeaways are tied for 13th nationally.
 Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 124th out of 128
 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 10 takeaways.
- Georgia Tech's nine interceptions are tied for 26th nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 110th nationally with six interceptions.
- Georgia Tech's eight fumble recoveries are tied for 18th nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 120th nationally with four fumble recoveries.
- Georgia Tech has recorded three defensive touchdowns this season (**David Curry** fumble return vs. Alcorn State Sept. 1; **Anree Saint-Amour** interception return vs. Bowling Green Sept. 29; **Juanyeh Thomas** interception return Oct. 5), which is tied for first in the ACC and sixth nationally.
- The Jackets' No. 72 national rank in scoring defense is a bit misleading, as 21 of the 226 points scored against GT this season have been scored on special teams (two kickoff returns at USF on Sept. 8) or by the opponent's defense (fumble recovery in the end zone vs. Clemson on Sept. 22). Without the non-offensive scores, Georgia Tech would be tied for 62nd nationally in scoring defense at 25.6 points allowed per game.
- Woody's 3-4 defense recorded Georgia Tech's first shutout in 57 games in the Yellow Jackets' 41-0 victory over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The shutout was the Yellow Jackets' first since they blanked Syracuse, 56-0, on Oct. 19, 2013.
- Georgia Tech's defense also limited Alcorn State to just 146 yards of total offense, which is the second-lowest yardage total allowed by the Yellow Jackets in head coach **Paul Johnson's** 10-plus seasons at the helm. The only time that the Jackets surrendered fewer yards during Johnson's tenure came in his fifth game at Tech, when they allowed just 132 yards in a 27-0 win over Duke on Oct. 4, 2008.
- On Sept. 15 at Pitt, the Yellow Jackets' defense allowed 21 points and 215 yards in the opening half but buckled down in the second half, surrendering just three points and 120 yards after the break to allow the Jackets to nearly come back from a 21-0 deficit in an eventual 24-19 defeat.
- Over its final six possessions of the game, Pitt managed just three points and 114 yards of offense. Georgia Tech's defense forced three punts (two three-and-outs) and recorded an interception over those final six series.
- Georgia Tech limited Duke (Oct. 13) to just 304 yards of total offense, which is the fewest yards that Tech has surrendered to an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since Virginia Tech managed just 258 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 28-22 win over the No. 17 Hokies on Nov. 11 of last season.
- Its last time out (last Thursday at Virginia Tech), Georgia Tech's defense surrendered 216 yards and 21 points on Vir-

- ginia Tech's first three possessions of the game, but limited VT to 37 yards and zero points over its next five possessions before the Hokies drove for an inconsequential touchdown on their final offensive series.
- Georgia Tech has featured eight first-time starters on defense this season Jr. NT **Brandon Adams**, Sr. OLB **Jalen Johnson**, So. SS **Tariq Carpenter**, Sr. FS **Malik Rivera***, So. CB **Jaytlin Askew**, redshirt Fr. CB **Tre Swilling**, So. CB **Ajani Kerr** and Fr. OLB **Charlie Thomas**.

 * Rivera started 18 games in three seasons at Wofford before transferring to Georgia Tech as a graduate student for this season.
- Tech has also played a whopping nine true freshmen on defense this season — DL T.K. Chimedza, DL Justice Dingle, LB Jordan Domineck, DL Quon Griffin, LB Quez Jackson, DB Jaylon King, LB Charlie Thomas, DB Juanyeh Thomas and CB Zamari Walton.
- Woody came to The Flats from Appalachian State, where he served as defensive coordinator from 2013-17. Over his last three seasons at App State (2015-17 — the program's first three campaigns as full-fledged members of FBS), the Mountaineers' 3-4 scheme had average national rankings of 15th in scoring defense, 19th in total defense, 28th in rushing defense and 28th in passing defense.
- Appalachian also averaged 24 takeaways, 19 interceptions and 35 sacks per season over the last three campaigns, all areas where Georgia Tech ranked among the bottom 20 teams nationally in 2017.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Georgia Tech's three starting defensive linemen — seniors
 Desmond Branch, Kyle Cerge-Henderson and Anree
 Saint-Amour — have combined to play in 104 games and make 52 starts for the Yellow Jackets.

- This season marks the first time that Georgia Tech's entire starting defensive line is comprised of seniors since 1989, when seniors Willie Burks (DT), Jeff Mathis (NG) and Sean Smith (DT) were the starting linemen for the Jackets' 7-4 squad under head coach Bobby Ross (one season before Tech won its fourth national championship).
- Saint-Amour has arguably been Georgia Tech's best defensive player this season. He has 26 tackles, 9.5 tackles for loss, four sacks, three forced fumbles and five quarterback hurries this season. He leads the Yellow Jackets in TFL, sacks, forced fumbles and QB hurries.
- Saint-Amour is tied for eighth nationally with .38 forced fumbles per game.
- Saint-Amour has been especially impressive of late, with 17 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, four sacks, three forced fumbles, three quarerback hurries and an interception return for a touchdown over the last four games (Sept. 29 vs. Bowling Green, Oct. 5 at Louisville, Oct. 13 vs. Duke, Oct. 25 at Virginia Tech).
- On Sept. 29 vs. Bowling Green, Saint-Amour returned his first-career interception three yards for his first-career touchdown. The interception came on a ball that was batted into the air at the line of scrimmage by Branch.

- Saint-Amour had a career day at Louisville (Oct. 5) with a team-high-tying six tackles, including a sack, a quarterback hurry and two forced fumbles. Both forced fumbles led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.
- Saint-Amour's two forced fumbles versus Louisville matched a single-game school record. He is the 10th student-athlete in Georgia Tech history to ever force two fumbles in a single game.

- Saint-Amour followed up his dominant performance against Louisville with another one against Duke (Oct. 13), finishing with two sacks, a forced fumble and a quarterback hurry that caused an interception and led directly to Georgia Tech's first touchdown of the game.
- Last Thursday at Virginia Tech, Saint-Amour tallied two more tackles for loss, marking the third time in the last four games that he's recorded multiple stops behind the line of scrimmage.
- Saint-Amour's interception return for a touchdown was the first by a Georgia Tech defensive lineman since current Cincinnati Bengal and 2018 GT Sports Hall of Fame inductee Michael Johnson returned an INT 26 yards for a score during a 41-23 win at No. 23 Miami (Fla.) on Nov. 20, 2008.
- Branch has also recorded an interception this season (vs. Clemson on Sept. 22), marking the first time in **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons as Georgia Tech's head coach that two different defensive linemen have had interceptions in the same season.

LINEBACKERS

- The heart and soul of Georgia Tech's defense is senior co-captain and inside linebacker **Brant Mitchell**. Mitchell ranks second on the team with 31 tackles this season.
- Mitchell has notched 17 stops over the past four games, including a season-high eight against Bowling Green (Sept. 29).
- As the Yellow Jackets' middle linebacker last season,
 Mitchell ranked fourth on the team with 51 tackles despite playing in only seven full games and parts of two others due to a lower-body injury. His 5.7 tackles per game led the team.
- In his first full game after returning to the lineup against
 No. 17 Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, Mitchell recorded a teamhigh nine tackles, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss, and was named ACC Co-Linebacker of the Week.
- In all, Georgia Tech went just 1-3 in the four games that Mitchell missed all or part of last season.
- After missing the entire 2017 season due to a foot injury, junior inside linebacker **David Curry** is tied for fifth on the team with 26 tackles this season.



DEFENSE

- Curry, whose career high for tackles coming into the season was three, recorded four (Sept. 1 vs. Alcorn State) and six (Sept. 8 vs. USF) tackles in Georgia Tech's first two games this season.
- The tally against USF likely would've been higher but he
 was ejected for a targeting call in the fourth quarter of the
 tough-luck loss on Sept. 8. Due to the ejection, Curry also
 had to sit out the first half of ACC opener at Pitt on Sept. 15.
- Curry scored Georgia Tech's first defensive touchdown of the season when he scooped up a fumble forced by nose tackle **Brandon Adams** and returned it 15 yards for a score early in the third quarter of the shutout win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The fumble return for a touchdown was the Yellow Jackets' first since P.J. Davis returned a fumble 38 yards for a score during the Jackets' 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Curry's return to action this season came following a series of injuries that kept him out of action last season (foot) and cost him time this past spring (thumb).
- Sophomore **Bruce Jordan-Swilling**, who has seen increased action as of late at inside linebacker, led Georgia Tech with a season-high eight tackles against Duke (Oct. 13)
- True freshman **Charlie Thomas** moved into the starting lineup at the "jack" outside linebacker position against Louisville on Oct. 5. In his first three career starts, he has tallied 17 tackles, two fumble recoveries, three quarterback hurries and a pass breakup.
- Thomas tied a single-game school record by recovering two fumbles in the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville. He is the 18th Yellow Jacket to recover two fumbles in a game. Both fumble recoveries led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.

- Thomas led Georgia Tech with a career-high nine tackles and his first-career sack in last Thursday's win at Virginia Tech.
- Despite appearing in only six games with just three starts, Thomas ranks fourth on the team with 28 tackles and is second on the squad with four quarterback hurries this season.
- Senior OLB **Victor Alexander**, who made the first five starts of the year at "jack," has played in all 43-of-44 games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He saw a string of 43-consecutive games played snapped when he did not appear in the Yellow Jackets' 49-28 victory at Virginia Tech last Thursday.
- Alexander turned in his finest statistical performance of the season against No. 3/2 Clemson on Sept. 22, finishing with a season-high seven tackles.

- Georgia Tech's fourth linebacker position the "stinger"
 OLB is manned largely by two student-athletes that
 were tabbed for the secondary prior to Woody's arrival on
 The Flats senior Jalen Johnson and junior Christian
 Campbell.
- Despite previously being limited to the defensive backfield and special teams, Johnson and Campbell have combined for 79 career tackles and five tackles for loss, including 39 stops and three TFL through eight games this season.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

- Last season, Georgia Tech's starting secondary was comprised of five veterans that combined to make 127 starts and play in 218 games.
- However, none of the five members of last year's starting secondary returned in 2018. Lawrence Austin, Lance Austin, Step Durham and Corey Griffin all graduated while A.J. Gray had to step away from football due to a heart condition.
- In their wake, the defensive backs listed on Georgia Tech's two-deep combined for zero starts and just 27 games played prior to this season.
- Of the eight DBs listed on Tech's two-deep, three are sophomores (CB Jaytlin Askew, SS Tariq Carpenter and CB Ajani Kerr), two are redshirt freshmen (CB Tre Swilling and SS Kaleb Oliver) and one is a true freshmen (FS Juanyeh Thomas).
- One of only two upperclassmen in the secondary's two-deep (and the only full-time starter), graduate student **Malik Rivera** leads Georgia Tech in both tackles (35) and interceptions (2) through eight games this season.
- Rivera's two interceptions are tied for ninth in the ACC this season. The two INTs came in the Yellow Jackets' first two ACC games of the season (Sept. 15 at Pitt and Sept. 22 vs. Clemson).
- Rivera came to The Flats as a graduate transfer from Wofford, where he recorded 131 tackles but totaled just one interception over the past three seasons.
- Rivera's position coach at Wofford the last two seasons (and defensive coordinator in 2017) was **Shiel Wood**, who now serves as Georgia Tech's safeties coach.
- A spectacular student, Rivera graduated from Wofford in May as a triple-major in mathematics, finance and computer science. He is pursuing a master's degree in quantitative and computational finance at Georgia Tech.
- Five of Georgia Tech's nine interceptions this season belong to safeties — Oliver (vs. Alcorn State), Carpenter (at USF), Rivera (at Pitt, vs. Clemson) and Thomas (at Louisville).
- Thomas capped the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville (Oct. 5) by returning his first-career interception 95 yards for a touchdown.
- Thomas' 95-yard interception return is tied for the fifthlongest in school history and the longest by a Yellow Jacket in an ACC game (tied with Ken Swilling - 95 yds. vs. NC State, Sept. 9, 1989). It's also the longest INT return by a Jacket since Tyler Marcordes had a 95-yarder against Elon on Aug. 31, 2013.

- Georgia Tech boasts one of the nation's top punters in sophomore **Pressley Harvin III**.
- Due to the Yellow Jackets' offensive proficiency, Harvin has only been called upon to punt 20 times through eight games this season. He is averaging 45.0 yards per punt.
- Seven of Harvin III's 20 punts this season (including six of his last 13) have traveled 50-plus yards while seven of his 18 kicks (including five of his last seven) have been downed inside the 20-yard line.
- Harvin III does not qualify for official NCAA/ACC statistical rankings because he is far short of the minimum 3.6 attempts per game. However, if he did qualify, his 45.0-yard average would lead the ACC and rank 14th nationally.
- Harvin was one of only two non-true freshmen on the Yellow Jackets' travel roster to not see action during Georgia Tech's 66-31 rout at Louisville (Oct. 5). The other was senior long snapper **Zach Roberts**, who like Pressley, only goes on the field when the Jackets are forced to punt.
- In fact, Harvin III was called upon only once over a twogame stretch versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and Louisville. His lone punt versus BG traveled 53 yards and was downed at the 9-yard line.
- Last season, Harvin III led all NCAA Division I FBS true freshmen, ranked 16th overall nationally and was second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with a 44.1-yard punting average last season.
- Harvin's 44.1-yard average was also a Georgia Tech freshman record and ranked fifth overall in single-season program history.

- Of Harvin's 50 punts last season, 13 traveled 50-plus yards (26 percent), 16 were downed inside the 20 yard line (32 pct.), 15 were fair-caught (30 pct.) and 29 were not returned (58 pct.).
- Making Harvin's freshman campaign even more impressive was that two of his best performances came in less-than-ideal conditions for punting he recorded career-bests with a 62-yard punt and four kicks downed inside the 20 yard line at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 and had five punts that traveled 50 yards or more and three downed inside the 20 at Clemson on Oct. 28. The majority of both games were played during heavy rain storms.
- Following his incredible rookie campaign, Harvin III was named freshman all-America by the Football Writers Association of America, true freshman all-America by ESPN and was a third-team all-ACC honoree.
- Harvin III is on the official watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to college football's top punter.
 He was first added to the list midway through his prolific freshman campaign last fall.
- Harvin became only the third FWAA freshman all-American in school history (joining OL Will Jackson, 2010, and PK Travis Bell, 2004) and the first Georgia Tech freshman to earn all-ACC recognition since Calvin Johnson (first-team WR) and Bell (second-team PK) in '04.
- Replicating Harvin III's magic as a true freshman specialist this season is walk-on place kicker **Wesley Wells**. Wells took over the place-kicking duties after winning an inpractice competition for the job in the week leading up to the Bowling Green game (Sept. 29). Since then, he has made the first 28 kicks of his career 27 PATs and a 41-yard field goal that split the uprights midway through the second quarter of Georgia Tech's 66-31 win at Louisville (Oct. 5).
- Wells' 41-yard field goal at Louisville was the longest made FG by a Yellow Jacket since **Brenton King**, also a true freshman at the time, made a 42-yarder vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 21, 2017.
- Another true freshman, Juanyeh Thomas, earned the job as Georgia Tech's primary punt and kickoff returner during fall camp.
- Thomas' 25-yard punt return in the second quarter of the Sept. 1 season opener against Alcorn was Georgia Tech's longest punt return since **Brad Stewart's** 26-yarder versus Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 1, 2016.
- Thomas' 38-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter at USF (Sept. 8) was the longest by a Yellow Jacket since **Lamont Simmons** scooped up an onside kick attempt and returned it 42 yards for a touchdown at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 of last season.
- USF's 266 yards on kickoff returns on Sept. 8 which included 98- and 97-yard returns for touchdowns by Terrence Horne in the first quarter were the second-most yards that Georgia Tech has ever allowed on kickoff returns in a single game (second only to North Carolina's 267 yards in a 68-50 GT win on Nov. 10, 2012).
- The two touchdowns allowed on kickoff returns against USF tied an NCAA Division I FBS single-game record.

- In Yellow Jackets' 42 kickoffs since Horne's back-to-back touchdowns at USF (not including an onside kick attempt versus Duke on Oct. 13), Georgia Tech junior kicker **Shawn Davis** has pinned the opponent at or inside its 25-yard line 26 times (with one of the exceptions being on a squib kick on the first kickoff following the two TD returns at USF).
- Despite Thomas' and Davis' high points, Georgia Tech continues to rank among the nation's bottom 25 teams in both kickoff-return average (18.18 ypr - 105th nationally) and kickoff-return defense (27.77 ypr - 126th).



MISCELLANEOUS

 Georgia Tech, which will have extra rest for the secondstraight week following last Thursday's game at North Carolina, is 14-11 in 11 seasons under head coach **Paul Johnson** when it has more than the usual six days between games, including a 7-6 mark following open weeks.

- Bobby Dodd Stadium has been home sweet home for Georgia Tech of late, as it has won 10 of its last 13 home games, dating back to midway through the 2016 season.
 The only three home losses during that span have been at the hands of Georgia (Nov. 25, 2017), Clemson (Sept. 22, 2018) and Duke (Oct. 13).
- The Yellow Jackets' 28-14 loss to Duke snapped their nine-game winning streak versus unranked opponents at home.
- However, on the flip side, Georgia Tech has struggled in games played away from its Midtown Atlanta home over the past two seasons. The Yellow Jackets are just 2-7 in games played away from Bobby Dodd Stadium since the beginning of the 2017 season.
- However, the Jackets have emphatically snapped a sevengame away-from-home skid with impressive wins in each of their last two road games — a 66-31 romp at Louisville (Oct. 5) and a 49-28 rout at Virginia Tech (last Thursday).

- Three of the Yellow Jackets' five defeats last season Sept. 4 vs. Tennessee, Oct. 11 at Miami (Fla.) and Nov. 4 at Virginia came by a total of just six points.
- In each of those three defeats, Georgia Tech's opponent scored the winning points in the final 82 seconds of regulation or in overtime.

- Over the course of their first five games of last season, the Yellow Jackets only trailed for 20:43 of total playing time and just four seconds after halftime — the final four seconds of their 25-24 loss at No. 11/10 Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 — but went just 3-2 in those five games.
- With underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores) representing 68.4 percent of its roster, Georgia Tech has the 14th-youngest team in all of NCAA Division I FBS and thirdyoungest team in the ACC this year.

- The only other ACC teams that have finished first or second in their division as many as six times in the last 10 seasons are Clemson (8), Florida State (7) and Virginia Tech (7).
- Of the teams widely considered to be Georgia Tech's closest academic peers at the Power 5 level – Duke, Notre Dame, Northwestern, Purdue, Stanford and Vanderbilt – only Stanford (9) has played in more bowl games over the last 10 seasons than the Yellow Jackets (8).
