### TOP STORYLINES

- Needing three wins in its final five games to become bowl eligible for the 20th time in 22 seasons, Georgia Tech opens the home stretch of its 2018 regular season on Thursday night at Virginia Tech.
- Georgia Tech is in search of its third-straight win over Virginia Tech. The Yellow Jackets topped No. 18 VT, 30-20, in 2016 in Blacksburg, Va. and followed that up with a 28-22 victory over the 17th-ranked Hokies last season in Atlanta.
- Georgia Tech has also come away victorious in each of its last two games at Virginia Tech. The Jackets are looking to become the first visiting team to win three-straight games at VT's Lane Stadium since Miami (Fla.) claimed victories in its first three trips to Blacksburg — 1967, 1982 and 1992.

• In many ways, Georgia Tech does not fit the statistical profile of a sub-.500 team. Offensively, the Jackets rank among the nation's top 30 teams this season in rushing (first - 352.4 ypg), passing yards per completion (third - 17.68), time of possession (15th - 33:06 pg) and scoring (24th - 37.4 ppg). Defensively, Tech ranks among the nation's top 15 teams in both defensive touchdowns (t-fifth - 3) and takeaways (t-14th - 16).

• It'll be a matchup of strengths when Georgia Tech's defense squares off against Virginia Tech's offense. While the Yellow Jackets' defense ranks 14th nationally in forced turnovers, the Hokies' offense is tied for the nation's fifth-fewest turnovers lost with just six giveaways in six games.

• In its three wins this season, Georgia Tech has turned the ball over a total of three times (1.0 per game - although all three came in the season-opening win over Alcorn State). In their four losses, the Yellow Jackets have turned the ball over nine times (2.25 per game).

**GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS**

**1**  
 Georgia Tech ranks No. 1 nationally in rushing offense at 352.4 yards per game, a whopping 34.1 yards per game more than the nation's No. 2-ranked rushing offense (Army West Point - 318.3 ypg).

**2**  
 Georgia Tech has two quarterbacks ranked among the top 30 nationally in rushing touchdowns (**TaQuon Marshall** - 9, t-eighth and **Tobias Oliver** - 7, t-30th) and among the top 60 nationally in rushing yards per game (Marshall - 85.4 ypg, 40th and Oliver - 74.2 ypg, 59th). Air Force is the only other team with two quarterbacks even among the top 100 nationally in rushing touchdowns and no other team has two QBs among the top 200 in rushing yards per game.

**3**  
 Georgia Tech has three defensive touchdowns through seven games this season, which are tied for the most in the ACC (Miami) and fifth nationally (Temple leads the nation with five defensive TDs).

**4**  
 Georgia Tech, Ball State, SMU and Syracuse are the only four teams in the nation with three active players that have each rushed for 1,000 yards or more in their careers (**TaQuon Marshall** - 1,816, **Clinton Lynch** - 1,211 and **KirVonte Benson** - 1,169). *Research courtesy of Syracuse University*

**5**  
 In its last two meetings with Virginia Tech (a 30-20 win in 2016 and a 28-22 win in 2017), Georgia Tech has had five offensive plays that have gained 50 yards or more (2.5 per game). In their other 29 games since the beginning of the 2016 season, the Yellow Jackets have had a total of 23 offensive plays that have gained 50 yards or more (0.8 per game).

**16**  
 Georgia Tech has forced 16 turnovers in seven games this season after finishing last season with 10 takeaways in 11 games. The Yellow Jackets are currently tied for 14th nationally in takeaways after finishing last season ranked 124th out of 128 NCAA Division I FBS teams.

**24**  
 Twenty-four of the 32 400-yard rushing games in Georgia Tech history (including three this season) have come in **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons as the Yellow Jackets' head coach (2008-pres.). Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400 yards in a game 24 times in 136 contests (once every 5.7 games). Prior to his arrival, the Yellow Jackets had rushed for 400 yards in a game eight times in 1,138 contests (once every 142.3 games).

**A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...**

- even its record at 4-4 overall and move it to 2-3 in ACC play;
- be its third-straight win over Virginia Tech (prior to last year, GT had never won consecutive games versus VT);
- make the Yellow Jackets the first team to win three-straight games at Virginia Tech since Miami (Fla.) claimed three-straight wins in Blacksburg in 1967, 1982 and 1992;
- make the Jackets only the seventh team to ever win three-straight games at VT;
- up it to 7-9 all-time versus Virginia Tech;
- be its third-straight win at Virginia Tech and even its all-time record at VT's Lane Stadium at 4-4;
- be its second primetime weeknight win of the season;
- be its second-straight road win, after it had dropped its previous seven games away from home;
- pull it within two wins of becoming bowl eligible for the 20th time in the last 22 seasons.

**A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...**

- drop it to 3-5 overall and 1-4 in ACC play;
- be its eighth loss in its last nine games away from home;
- be its first loss to Virginia Tech since a 23-21 defeat in 2015;
- be its first loss at Virginia Tech since a 20-17 overtime defeat in 2012;
- drop it to 6-10 all-time versus Virginia Tech and 3-5 at VT's Lane Stadium;
- leave it needing three wins in its last four games of the regular season to become bowl eligible for the 20th time in the last 22 seasons.



**NOTING GEORGIA TECH'S OCT. 13 LOSS TO DUKE**

• Georgia Tech fumbled on three-consecutive plays, which led to three Duke touchdowns in a span of 1:49 and turned what was a 7-7 game late in the third quarter into a 28-14 defeat on Oct. 13 at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

• Georgia Tech was driving to break the 7-7 deadlock when sophomore B-back **Jerry Howard** began the string of fumbles at Duke's 43-yard line with 2:41 remaining in the third quarter. Fifty-two seconds later, Duke scored on a 48-yard pass on third-and-12 to take a 14-7 lead.

• Duke booted the ensuing kickoff out of bounds, giving the Yellow Jackets possession at its own 40-yard line. But on the first play of the series, senior quarterback **TaQuon Marshall** lost control of the ball and the Blue Devils only needed five plays to make it 21-14.

• The Jackets didn't even run an offensive play before they turned the ball over yet again, as freshman returner **Juanyeh Thomas** put the ball on the ground on the 6-yard line while trying to make something happen on Duke's next kickoff. It took just one play for the Devils to score their second touchdown in 15 seconds and third in 1:49, giving them a commanding 28-7 lead.

• Georgia Tech, which surrendered only 21 points off turnovers over the first six-and-a-half games of the season, doubled that total in just 1:49.

• The Yellow Jackets' three-straight turnovers came after it went 234-consecutive plays (offensive snaps plus returns) without a turnover. Prior to the three-straight giveaways against Duke, Tech hadn't turned the ball over since a fumble in the first quarter versus Clemson on Sept. 22.

• The Jackets' three turnovers matched a season high (Sept. 1 vs. Alcorn State, Sept. 8 at USF).

• Georgia Tech outgained the Blue Devils, 354-304, but couldn't overcome its untimely spate of turnovers with less than three minutes to go in the third period.

• Duke's 304 total yards were the fewest allowed by Georgia Tech versus an NCAA Division I FBS opponent this season (prev.: 335 at Pitt, Sept. 15).

• Georgia Tech forced three turnovers for the third-straight game and fourth time in seven games this season. The Yellow Jackets have 16 takeaways in seven games this season after forcing just 10 turnovers in 11 games last season.

• The loss was only Georgia Tech's third in its last 13 home games overall and its second in its last 12 home games versus Duke.

• The loss snapped Georgia Tech's nine-game home winning streak versus unranked opponents.

• Senior DE **Anree Saint-Amour** matched a career high with two sacks, forced his third fumble in the last two games and was credited with a quarterback hurry. The QB hurry led directly to a Duke interception with 1:42 to go in the second quarter – two plays later, Georgia Tech scored its first points of the game on a 32-yard touchdown pass from senior QB **TaQuon Marshall** to freshman WR **Malachi Carter**.

• Carter's touchdown was the first of his career. It came on only the third reception of his career.

• Georgia Tech's interception with 1:42 to go in the second quarter was registered by senior CB **Lamont Simmons**. It was the first INT of his career.

• Redshirt-freshman **Tre Swilling** recorded the first sack, tackle for loss and forced fumble of his career when he stripped Duke QB Daniel Jones at the GT 25-yard line late in the first quarter.

**NOTING VIRGINIA TECH**

• Virginia Tech is 4-2 overall this season and leads the ACC Coastal Division with a 3-0 record in conference play.

• The Hokies are the only team in the Coastal Division without a conference loss.

• Its last time out (Oct. 13), Virginia Tech scored a touchdown with 19 seconds left to claim a 22-19 win at North Carolina. The game-winning 3-yard touchdown pass from QB Ryan Willis to TE Dalton Keene capped an 18-play, 98-yard drive.

• Virginia Tech also owns ACC wins at Florida State (24-3 on Sept. 3) and at Duke (31-14 on Sept. 29).

• Thursday's game is Virginia Tech's first ACC home game of the season. After opening ACC play with three-straight road games, VT plays four of its final five games at home.

• The Hokies' offense is ranked third in the ACC and 31st nationally (455.7 ypg) but their defense is 13th in the ACC and 95th nationally (418.7 ypg).

• Virginia Tech excels in the red zone and turnover battle. The Hokies are ranked 11th nationally in red-zone offense (.952), 12th in red-zone defense (.727) and 18th nationally in turnover margin (plus-5).

• QB Ryan Willis has led VT to a 2-1 record as a starter since sophomore co-captain Josh Jackson suffered a broken leg at Old Dominion on Sept. 22. Willis, a fourth-year junior, ranks fourth in the ACC in passing yards per game (211.4) and is second in the league in yards per completion (13.05).

• Defensively, sophomore MLB Ryashard Ashby leads Virginia Tech and ranks third in the ACC with 51 total tackles (8.5 per game).

**GEORGIA TECH-VIRGINIA TECH SERIES HISTORY**

• Thursday's meeting is the 16th all-time between Virginia Tech and Georgia Tech. VT leads the all-time series, 9-6, including a 4-3 advantage in games played in Blacksburg, Va.

• Georgia Tech has won the last two meetings (30-20 in 2016 and 28-22 last season), marking the first time that it has ever won consecutive games over Virginia Tech.

• The Yellow Jackets have also won each of their last two games at Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium (27-24 in 2014 and 30-20 in 2016). The Jackets and Clemson (2011, 2017) are the only teams that currently own consecutive wins at VT.

• With a win on Thursday night, Georgia Tech would become only the seventh program to ever win three-straight games at VT and the first since Miami (Fla.) claimed wins in each of its first three trips to Blacksburg — 1967, 1982 and 1992.

• Nailbiters have been a staple of the Georgia Tech-Virginia Tech series during **Paul Johnson's** tenure as the Yellow Jackets' head coach. Each of the 10 matchups since Johnson's arrival in 2008 have been decided by 11 points or less, eight of the 10 have been decided by seven points or less and three of the last six have been decided by three points or less.

• Last year, GT WR Ricky Jeune hauled in an 80-yard touchdown pass from **TaQuon Marshall** with 6:30 to go to provide the Yellow Jackets with what proved to be the game-winning points in a 28-22 win over the No. 17 Hokies at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

• In 2016 at VT, Georgia Tech jumped out to a 20-0 halftime lead and cruised to a 30-20 victory over the 18th-ranked Hokies. The Yellow Jackets' 10-point triumph was the second-largest margin of victory for either team in the series since 2007 (behind only VT's 37-26 win in 2011).

• Thursday's game marks the eighth time that Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech are matching up in a nationally televised weeknight slot. The Yellow Jackets are 0-7 all-time against the Hokies on weeknights.

• Under Johnson, the Jackets are 4-1 against VT on Saturdays and 0-5 on weeknights.

• At 4-6, Virginia Tech is one of only three ACC opponents that Johnson has a sub-.500 record against at Georgia Tech (Clemson - 4-7, Miami - 2-8).

• This marks the 15th-straight year that Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech have met on the gridiron since VT joined the ACC in 2004.

• In 13 seasons since the ACC began divisional play in 2005, either Virginia Tech or Georgia Tech has won the Coastal Division 10 times.

**NOTING LAST YEAR'S WIN OVER VIRGINIA TECH**

• An 80-yard touchdown pass from **TaQuon Marshall** to Ricky Jeune with 6:30 to go in the game and a pass breakup in the end zone by redshirt freshman **Ajani Kerr** with just 1:03 left on the clock lifted Georgia Tech to a 28-22 win over No. 17 Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, 2017 at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

• Georgia Tech jumped out to leads of 14-3 in the second quarter and 21-9 in the third before Virginia Tech scored a pair of touchdowns in a 7:33 span to take a 22-21 lead with 7:27 to go in the game.

• Just two plays after the Hokies took the lead, GT regained the advantage on Marshall's 80-yard bomb to Jeune.

• Virginia Tech marched all the way to Georgia Tech's 32 yard line on its final drive, converting two fourth downs along the way, but Kerr batted away a pass attended for VT wide receiver Cam Phillips in the end zone on fourth-and-one to seal the victory for the Yellow Jackets with 1:03 remaining.

• Georgia Tech averaged a school-record 70 yards per completion in the win, with its only completions coming on a 60-yard touchdown pass from Marshall to **Brad Stewart** in the third quarter and the 80-yard connection with Jeune in the final period. The Yellow Jackets' previous record for yards per completion was 51, ironically coming in their last home win over VT, a 28-23 victory on Oct. 17, 2009.

• Georgia Tech has 92 wins in 271 all-time matchups versus teams ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25.

• The Yellow Jackets officially own 12 wins over ranked teams in 10 seasons under head coach Paul Johnson. A 13th victory, a 39-34 triumph over No. 25 Clemson in the 2009 ACC Championship Game, was later vacated due to NCAA sanctions.

• Georgia Tech's offense has been markedly more efficient on the road this season, as the Yellow Jackets are averaging 7.1 yards per play and .569 points per play in its three road games and 5.3 yards per play and .478 points per play in its four home contests.

• In its three wins this season, Georgia Tech has turned the ball over a total of three times (1.0 per game - although all three came in the season-opening win over Alcorn State). In their four losses, the Yellow Jackets have turned the ball over nine times (2.25 per game).

• After committing nine turnovers through the first 13 quarters of this season (first three games plus first quarter of Game 4 vs. Clemson), Georgia Tech went 234-consecutive plays (offensive snaps plus returns) without a turnover over the next 13 quarters (final three quarters vs. Clemson, full games vs. Bowling Green and Louisville and first two quarters vs. Duke).

• However, that streak came to emphatic halt when the Yellow Jackets lost fumbles on three-straight plays in the third quarter of its 28-14 loss to Duke on Oct. 13. Those fumbles (by BB **Jerry Howard**, QB **TaQuon Marshall** and KR **Juanyeh Thomas**) led directly to Duke scoring 21 points in a 1:49 span, turning what was a 7-7 ballgame into a 28-14 defeat.

• Georgia Tech's 12 turnovers are tied for the 32nd-most in the nation this season and its eight fumbles lost are tied for the 11th-most nationally.

• Last season, GT committed eight turnovers in its first four games of the season (one turnover every 37.8 plays) but had only six turnovers over the final seven games of the campaign (one turnover every 74.8 plays).

• Despite having only one turnover against No. 3/2 Clemson on Sept. 22, Georgia Tech fumbled eight times in the loss. The eight fumbles are tied for the second-most in school history (record: 9 at Miami, Nov. 21, 2015). The Yellow Jackets' eight fumbles marked only the third time in the past

46 seasons (dating back to 1973) that they have fumbled as many as seven times in a contest.

• Georgia Tech continues to rank No. 1 nationally in rushing offense at 352.4 yards per game, 34.1 yards per game more than the nation's No. 2-ranked rushing offense (Army West Point - 318.3 ypg).

• By rushing for at least 400 yards in three of their first seven games this season, the Yellow Jackets have eclipsed the 400-yard rushing plateau seven times in their last 18 contests, dating back to the beginning of last season (once every 2.6 games).

• During **Paul Johnson's** 10-plus seasons as Georgia Tech's head coach (2008-pres.), the Yellow Jackets have rushed for at least 400 yards in a game 24 times in 136 total contests (once every 5.7 games).

• Prior to Johnson's arrival on The Flats in 2008, Tech had rushed for at least 400 yards in a game just eight times in 1,138 games (once every 142.3 games).

• The Jackets set a school record with four 400-yard rushing games last season (535 vs. Tennessee on Sept. 4, 436 vs. Pitt on Sept. 23, 403 vs. North Carolina on Sept. 30 and 427 vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 21). Making the feat even more impressive is that it came in just 11 games, Tech's fewest games in a season since 1996. The previous GT record of three 400-yard rushing games in a season occurred three times, all under Johnson (2008, 2009 and 2014).

• Georgia Tech three 400-yard rushing games already this season (439 vs. Alcorn State on Sept. 1, 419 at USF on Sept. 8 and 542 at Louisville on Oct. 5), marking the fifth time in Johnson's 11 seasons on The Flats that the Yellow Jackets have rushed for 400 yards in a game at least three times. Only Navy (7) has more seasons with three or more 400-yard rushing games since 2008.

• The running game is the backbone of Johnson's high-powered spread option offense. Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats in 2008, only one team has rushed for more yards than Georgia Tech's 41,319 — Johnson's former team, Navy, which has run for 41,821 yards since '08.

• The Yellow Jackets have led the ACC and finished among the top 10 nationally in rushing offense in each of Johnson's first 10 seasons as head coach.

• In Johnson's 10-plus seasons as head coach of the Yellow Jackets, Tech has been outgained on the ground just 19 times in 136 games.

• Under Johnson, Georgia Tech has produced 17 rushers that have eclipsed the 1,000-yard plateau for their careers. That is over one-third of the 49 Yellow Jackets that have amassed 1,000 career rushing yards in the 126-season history of Georgia Tech football.

• The Jackets have three players on their current roster that have already eclipsed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for their careers in senior AB **Clinton Lynch**, senior QB **TaQuon Marshall** and junior BB **KirVonte Benson**.

• Georgia Tech put together perhaps the most impressive back-to-back offensive performances in Johnson's 11-season tenure on The Flats versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and Louisville (Oct. 5).

• Georgia Tech racked up 129 points, 1,086 yards of total offense and 914 rushing yards in wins over Bowling Green (63-17 on Sept. 29) and Louisville (66-31 on Oct. 5).

• In all, Georgia Tech scored on 17-of-20 offensive possessions during the two-game stretch (16 TD, 1 FG) — 8-of-10 versus Bowling Green (8 TD) and 9-of-10 at Louisville (8 TD, 1 FG). Of the three possessions that the Yellow Jackets didn't score, two came as they ran out the clock at the end of each game.

• The final possession of each game notwithstanding, the only offensive series during the two-game stretch that didn't result in points for Georgia Tech came when it punted in the fourth quarter of the 63-17 win over BG on Sept. 29.

• Georgia Tech scored touchdowns on each of its four offensive possessions in the first half against Bowling Green, marking the first time under Johnson that it scored touchdowns on every offensive possession of any half.

• As impressive as the offensive output was against Bowling Green, it paled in comparison to what the Jackets accomplished against Louisville.

• The Yellow Jackets' 66 points against Louisville are tied for the 12th-most scored by an NCAA Division I FBS team this season (most: 79 - Fresno State vs. Idaho, Sept. 1) and the second-most scored against a Power Five conference opponent this season (most: 77 - Ohio State vs. Oregon State, Sept. 1).

• The Yellow Jackets' 66 points against Louisville are tied for the third-most ever scored by an ACC team on the road, behind only Georgia Tech's 70 points at Navy on Sept. 8, 2001 and Tech's 68 points at North Carolina on Nov. 10, 2012.

• Georgia Tech rushed for 542 yards against Louisville, the third-highest total in modern school history and the most that it has ever amassed on the ground in a conference game (prev.: 479 at NC State, Nov. 8, 2014).

• The 500-yard rushing game was the sixth in modern Georgia Tech history.

• Georgia Tech's 542 rushing yards against Louisville are the most in a game by an NCAA Division I FBS team this season (prev.: 503 - Texas A&M vs. Northwestern State, Aug. 30).

• The Yellow Jackets' 542 yards on the ground against Louisville were the most by an FBS team since Navy ran for 559 yards at SMU on Nov. 11 of last season and were the most by and against a Power Five conference team since Auburn ran for 543 yards at Arkansas on Oct. 22, 2016.

• Over their last 26 games, the Yellow Jackets have punted only 92 times (3.53 per game) and have come away with points on 126 of their 305 offensive possessions (41.3 percent).

• Georgia Tech has scored at least 24 points in 16 of its last 22 games.

• The Yellow Jackets had a streak of 10-consecutive games that ran from Nov. 12, 2016 (at Virginia Tech) through Oct. 21, 2017 (vs. Wake Forest). At the time, it was the fifth-longest active streak in the nation and the second-longest active streak in the ACC. It was also tied for the fourth-longest string of games with 24 points or more in Georgia Tech history.

• Georgia Tech returned eight offensive starters this season, which represented a large portion of its offensive production from a season ago, including:

- 100 percent of their passing yardage
- 90.4 percent of their rushing yardage
- six offensive linemen that came into the season having combined to make 75 career starts

• Georgia Tech's senior signal-caller put together perhaps the finest two-game stretch of his career in wins over Bowling Green (63-17 on Sept. 29) and Louisville (66-31 on Oct. 5). He rushed 36 times for 217 yards (6.0 avg.) and four touchdowns while completing 6-of-8 passes for 172 yards (75.0 comp. pct., 21.5 yds./att., 28.7 yds./comp.) to lead the Yellow Jackets to the blowout wins.

• Marshall led Georgia Tech to points in 14-straight-ofensive series that he quarterbacked — his final series vs. Clemson on Sept. 22 (TD), all six series vs. BG on Sept. 29 (6 TD) and all seven series at Louisville on Oct. 5 (6 TD, 1 FG).

• On Oct. 5 at Louisville, Marshall rushed for 175 yards on 23 carries (7.6 avg.). The 175 yards on the ground were a season-high and the second-highest rushing total of his career (behind only his Georgia Tech quarterback-record 249 yards in the 2017 season opener versus Tennessee).

• Marshall was named ACC Quarterback of the Week following his impressive performances against Louisville. The ACC award is the second of his career. He was named ACC Offensive Back of the Week following his record-breaking performance in last season's opener versus Tennessee.

• Marshall has now registered five of the 10 highest single-game rushing totals by a quarterback in Georgia Tech history.

• Marshall's six 100-yard rushing games in 2017 were the most ever by a Georgia Tech quarterback and tied for eighth in GT single-season history, regardless of position.

• Despite missing significant time in the second half on Sept. 8 at USF due to a lower-body injury, Marshall passed for a career-high 183 yards (prev.: 179 at Virginia, Nov. 4, 2017) and ran for 113 more. It marked the third time in his career that he rushed and passed for at least 100 yards in the same game and the seventh time that he has rushed and passed for a touchdown.

• Marshall also had the longest completion of his career at USF, an 81-yard touchdown strike to senior AB **Clinton Lynch** (prev.: 80 to Ricky Jeune vs. Virginia Tech, Nov. 11, 2017).

• While his 183 passing yards at USF remain a season and career high, Marshall turned in his most efficient passing performance of the season against Bowling Green on Sept. 29, when he completed 5-of-6 passes for 160 yards. Four of his five completions went for at least 33 yards.

• Marshall's 307.33 pass-efficiency rating versus Bowling Green was the second-highest of his career (career high: 347.26 vs. Jacksonville State, Sept. 9, 2017) and easily his highest of the season (prev.: 131.51 at USF, Sept. 8).

• Marshall's 17 rushing touchdowns last season were the third-most by a quarterback in Georgia Tech single-season history.

• With 104.2 rushing yards per game last season, Marshall became the first quarterback and only the third Yellow Jacket overall to average 100 rushing yards per game in a single season in 10 seasons under head coach **Paul Johnson**, joining Jonathan Dwyer (107.3 ypg - 2008) and Anthony Allen (101.2 ypg - 2010).

• Marshall burst on to the national stage with a record-setting performance versus Tennessee in last year's season opener. Making the first start of his career, Marshall set three school records and one ACC record against the Vols.

• Marshall's 249 rushing yards against Tennessee were also the third-most in Georgia Tech history, regardless of position (behind only 356 by Eddie Lee Ivery vs. Air Force - Nov. 11, 1978 and 307 by P.J. Daniels vs. Tulsa, Humanitarian Bowl - Jan. 4, 2004).

• Marshall's 249 rushing yards against Tennessee were the fifth-most by an FBS quarterback and tied for the 15th-most by any FBS student-athlete in a game last season.

• Marshall's five rushing touchdowns against UT were tied for the most in the nation by any student-athlete in a single game last season.

• Marshall is on the official watch list for the 2018 Maxwell Award, presented to "America's College Player of the Year." He is joined on the list by Georgia Tech B-back **KirVonte Benson**.

• Georgia Tech's backup signal-caller, redshirt freshman **Tobias Oliver**, has been impressive in the first game action of his career.

• Despite being on the field for just 17 full series this season, Oliver ranks among the top 15 nationally in seven different statistical categories, highlighted by rushing the second-most yards per carry (6.95) among all QBs nationally.

• Oliver's 6.95 yards per rush ranks second among all freshmen nationally (regardless of position) and his 74.2 rushing yards per game rank sixth among FBS freshmen.

• Oliver has led the Yellow Jackets to touchdowns on eight of the 17 drives that he's led this year (he has also closed out two touchdown drives that he wasn't on the field for the start of). His touchdown rate actually jumps to over 50 percent when considering that three of the 17 series that he's quarterbacked have seen the Jackets run the clock out at the end of wins over Alcorn State, Bowling Green and Louisville.

• Oliver was particularly impressive in relief of Marshall in the Yellow Jackets' wins vs. Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and at Louisville (Oct. 5). He was on the field for a total of just five series in those two games (not including abbreviated series to run out the clock at the end of each game) and led the Yellow Jackets to four touchdowns while running for more than 100 yards in each game (115 vs. BG, 103 at Louisville) and averaging a whopping 14.5 yards per carry (218 yards on 15 attempts).

• On Sept. 8 at USF, Oliver replaced Marshall on the third play of the second half and engineered the Jackets' next three drives. GT scored touchdowns on all three series, with Oliver capping each drive with a touchdown (five, one and one yards).

• Of the 23 plays that Oliver was on the field for at USF, he carried the ball himself 18 times and accounted for 97 of the 189 yards that the Yellow Jackets gained while he was in the game.

• Oliver finished with 97 yards on 18 carries (5.4 avg.) and three touchdowns, all on the ground, against USF.

• Despite only playing for a little more than a quarter, Oliver's three touchdowns at USF marked the 48th time in school history that an individual has rushed for three TDs in a game.

**OFFENSE**

• In the win over Louisville (Oct. 5), Marshall and Oliver became the first quarterback tandem in Georgia Tech history to both rush for 100 yards in the same game (Marshall - 175, Oliver - 103).

• Marshall and Oliver are both ranked among the top 30 nationally in rushing touchdowns (Marshall - 9, t-eighth; Oliver - 7, t-30th) and among the top 60 nationally in rushing yards per game (Marshall - 85.4 ypg, 40th; Oliver - 74.2 ypg, 59th). Air Force is the only other team with two quarterbacks even among the top 100 nationally in rushing touchdowns and no other team has two QBs among the top 200 in rushing yards per game.

• With a season-ending foot injury sustained by presumed backup quarterback **Lucas Johnson** during preseason camp, Marshall is the only active quarterback on Georgia Tech's roster that came into the 2018 season with any collegiate playing experience.

**RUNNING BACKS**

• Head coach **Paul Johnson** said prior to the season that the deepest position on Georgia Tech's roster was likely B-back. That depth has been tested and proven through seven games this season.

• The biggest test of Georgia Tech's depth at the B-back position has been a season-ending knee injury sustained by junior **KirVonte Benson** during the first quarter of Georgia Tech's second game of the season at USF (Sept. 8).

• Benson, who ran for 1,053 yards as a sophomore in 2017, had 116 rushing yards and two touchdowns in less than three quarters of action this season before sustaining the season-ending injury at USF.

• Sharing the workload at B-back in Benson's absence have been redshirt freshman **Jordan Mason** and sophomore **Jerry Howard**.

• Mason ranks second on the team with 482 rushing yards and third on the squad with a 6.9 yards-per-rush average (min. 20 carries) and four touchdowns.

• Mason's 68.9 rushing yards per game rank 10th nationally among freshmen and 74th overall.

• Mason also ranks third nationally among freshmen and 12th overall with 6.89 yards per carry.

• Mason notched the first two-touchdown game of his career with scoring runs of nine and 33 yards versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29).

• Howard ranks fourth on the team with 257 rushing yards and three rushing touchdowns this season.

• In his first extensive action of the year, Howard ran for a season-high 82 yards on just eight carries (10.2 avg.) on Sept. 15 at Pitt.

• Howard scored a touchdown in each of the last three games — on a five-yard run versus Bowling Green

(Sept. 29), a two-yard plunge at Louisville (Oct. 5) and a two-yard run versus Duke (Oct. 13).

• Serving as Benson's top backup last season, Howard's 7.6 yards per carry ranked second on the team last season, behind only A-back **Nathan Cottrell** (8.2 avg.).

• Benson finished his 2018 season with just 15 carries, averaging 7.7 yards per rush.

• Benson opened the 2018 season by rushing for 75 yards on 10 carries (7.5 avg.) and matching a career-high with two touchdowns (five and eight yards) in a 41-0 win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. He played just two quarters in the opener, after sitting out the first quarter due to a minor violation of team rules and the fourth quarter when most of GT's regulars were removed from the game.

• On Sept. 8 at USF, Benson ran for 41 yards on just five carries (8.2 avg.) before sustaining the season-ending injury on Georgia Tech's second offensive series of the game.

• Benson, who did not have a collegiate carry prior to last season, rushed for 1,053 yards and six touchdowns as a sophomore in 2017. He ranked fifth in the ACC and 35th nationally with 95.7 rushing yards per game last season.

• Benson became only the third B-back in **Paul Johnson's** 10 seasons as head coach to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, joining Jonathan Dwyer (2008 and 2009) and Anthony Allen (2010).

• Georgia Tech is loaded with experience at the A-back position, where it boasts three upperclassmen with extensive playing experience — fifth-year seniors **Clinton Lynch** and **Qua Searcy** and Cottrell, a junior.

• For their careers, the A-back trio has combined to rush for 2,425 yards and 16 touchdowns on 301 carries (8.1 avg.) and catch 63 passes for 1,495 yards (23.7 avg.) and 13 touchdowns. As a group, they are averaging 10.8 yards per touch from scrimmage for their careers.

• Between them, Lynch, Searcy and Cottrell have combined for 832 all-purpose yards through the first seven games of this season — 501 rushing yards on 59 carries (8.5 avg.) and 331 receiving yards on 16 receptions (20.7 avg.). They are averaging 11.1 yards every time they touch the ball in 2018.

• With a 41-yard reception in the second quarter versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29), Lynch became the first student-athlete in Georgia Tech history with 1,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in a career.

• Since the beginning of 2016, 27 of Lynch's 104 touches have gone for 20 yards or more (12 rushes, 15 receptions — 26.0 percent) and 10 of his 104 touches have gone for 40 yards or more (three rushes, seven receptions — 10.4 percent).

• On Sept. 8 at USF, Lynch hauled in an 81-yard touchdown reception from quarterback **TaQuon Marshall**. The play was the second-longest reception of Lynch's career (long: 83 from Justin Thomas vs. North Carolina, Nov. 5, 2016), the longest completion of Marshall's career and Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since Lynch's 83-yard TD at UNC in 2016.

• Lynch's 83-yard touchdown reception at North Carolina on Nov. 5, 2016 remains Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since a 95-yard touchdown run by Orwin Smith vs. Kansas on Sept. 17, 2011, the sixth-longest reception in Georgia Tech history and the longest reception by a Yellow Jacket since Embry Peeples' 87-yard catch from Joshua Nesbitt at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.

• Lynch is one of only two student-athletes in Georgia Tech history with two receptions of 80 yards or longer in his career, joining Dez White (1997-99).

• Searcy ran for two touchdowns (two and one yards) for the first time in his career at Louisville (Oct. 5). The two-TD game was the second of his career — he ran for a touchdown and caught another as a redshirt freshman vs. Tulane on Sept. 12, 2015.

• Searcy's 91 rushing yards against Mercer on Sept. 10, 2016 remain the most by a Georgia Tech A-back since Robert Godhigh ran for 126 yards in a 55-31 defeat at Clemson on Nov. 14, 2013.

• After not finding the end zone in any of the first 25 games of his career, Cottrell had touchdown runs in two-straight games last month — a two-yarder against No. 3/2 Clemson (Sept. 22) and a four-yarder versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29).



## OFFENSE

### WIDE RECEIVERS

- After catching just four passes as a junior last season, senior wide receiver **Brad Stewart** already has 11 receptions through just seven games this season.
- Stewart set a career high four catches against Alcorn State on Sept. 1, surpassing his previous career-high of three, which he achieved three times (twice as a sophomore in 2016, once as a freshman in 2015).
- Stewart's four catches against Alcorn State included the second touchdown reception of his career when quarterback **TaQuon Marshall** found him wide open in the corner of the end zone for a 24-yard scoring strike.
- After going the first 33 games of his career without a touchdown catch, Stewart now has two in the last 10 games. On Nov. 11 of last season, Stewart hauled in a 60-yard touchdown pass in the Jackets' 28-22 win over No. 17 Virginia Tech.
- Despite not making a catch versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29), head coach **Paul Johnson** singled out Stewart for perhaps having the best game of any Georgia Tech wide receiver against the Falcons, due in large part to the role that his blocking played the Yellow Jackets racking up 372 yards on the ground.
- Stewart was limited to just one reception for 12 yards against Louisville on Oct. 5 (albeit a big catch, as it gave Georgia Tech a first down that set up a touchdown with less than a minute to go in the first half) but was named one of the Yellow Jackets' players of the week by the coaching staff. He was recognized not only for his reception but for the role that his blocking played in Georgia Tech's 542-yard rushing performance and being the holder on all 10 of the Jackets' successful place kicks (nine PAT and a FG).
- Stewart leads all current Yellow Jackets with 34-consecutive starts (the next-longest streak on the team belongs to junior OL **Parker Braun**, who has made 26-straight starts).
- Stewart has also played in all 43 of Georgia Tech's games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He is one of only two student-athletes on the Yellow Jackets' current roster that has played all 43 games since the beginning of '15, joining senior LB **Victor Alexander**.
- The starter opposite Stewart is sophomore wideout **Jalen Camp**. Camp, who had only one reception as a redshirt freshman in 2017, has six catches through seven games this season.
- Camp posted a career-high with 70 yards on two receptions (33 and 37 yards) versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29).
- The only true freshman who has seen action on offense for Georgia Tech this season is wide receiver **Malachi Carter**. Carter has served as the third wideout behind Stewart and Camp in the Yellow Jackets' rotation.
- With Camp out due to an upper-body injury, Carter hauled in a 32-yard touchdown (the first of his career) versus Duke (Oct. 13).

### OFFENSIVE LINE

- Eight different offensive linemen boast starting experience for Georgia Tech. Those eight have combined for a total of 110 starts over 209 career games played.

- The leader of the offensive front is junior LG **Parker Braun**. Braun leads the unit and ranks second overall on the team with 26-consecutive starts.
- For the third time in his already illustrious career, Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after taking 15 defenders to the ground and helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 542 yards at Louisville (Oct. 5).
- Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time of his career following Georgia Tech's 35-17 win over Pitt on Sept. 23, 2016. He took 22 Pitt defenders to the ground and helped Georgia Tech run for 436 yards en route to the honor.
- In 2016, Braun became the first Georgia Tech freshman to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after compiling 10 knockdowns and helping Tech rush for 309 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech (Nov. 12).
- Braun is only the fourth Yellow Jacket to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week as many as three times, joining current New England Patriot Shaq Mason (five), former NFL standout Andrew Gardner (four) and current Georgia Tech IMG Sports Network radio analyst Sean Bedford (three).
- Led by Braun, Georgia Tech's offensive line has helped pave the way for the Yellow Jackets rank first nationally in rushing offense (352.4 ypg) and 28th in fewest sacks allowed (1.43/gm).
- Behind its offensive line, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400-plus yards in seven of its last 18 games, dating back to the beginning of last season.
- The Yellow Jackets' offensive line continues to get a boost from the return of junior **Kenny Cooper**, who missed all of fall camp and the first two games of the season due to a lower-body injury sustained during spring practice.
- Cooper, who started all 11 games at center in 2017, made his first start of 2018 against Duke (Oct. 13).
- Before getting back into the starting lineup, Cooper made his 2018 debut against Pitt (Sept. 15) and saw action as a reserve at center and right guard for four contests as he worked himself back into game shape.
- Last season, Cooper was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after taking 10 defenders to the ground and helping Georgia Tech run for 403 yards in its 33-7 win over North Carolina (Sept. 30). The award came in Cooper's fifth-career start.

- Both Braun and Cooper represent Tech on official watch lists for national awards — Braun is a candidate for the Outland Trophy, presented to college football's top interior lineman, while Cooper is on the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, which is awarded to college football's top center.

- Additionally, Braun is a candidate for the 2018 Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, which is presented to the top offensive student-athlete in NCAA Division I football who was born in, played high-school football in or plays college football in the state of Texas.

## DEFENSE

- Coming into the season, one of the stated goals of new defensive coordinator **Nate Woody's** defense was to create turnovers. Through seven games, the Yellow Jackets are much improved in that area.
- Through seven games, Georgia Tech has already forced 16 turnovers. The Yellow Jackets forced 10 turnovers for the entire 2017 season (11 games).
- Additionally, through seven games, Georgia Tech's defense has nine interceptions. The Yellow Jackets intercepted eight passes for the entire 2017 season.
- Georgia Tech's 16 takeaways are tied for 14th nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 124th out of 128 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 10 takeaways.
- Georgia Tech's nine interceptions are tied for 15th nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 110th nationally with six interceptions.
- Georgia Tech's seven fumble recoveries are tied for 19th nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 120th nationally with four fumble recoveries.
- Georgia Tech has recorded three defensive touchdowns this season (**David Curry** fumble return vs. Alcorn State - Sept. 1; **Anree Saint-Amour** interception return vs. Bowling Green - Sept. 29; **Juanyeh Thomas** interception return - Oct. 5), which is tied for first in the ACC and fifth nationally.
- The Jackets' No. 75 national rank in scoring defense is a bit misleading, as 21 of the 198 points scored against GT this season have been scored on special teams (two kickoff returns at USF on Sept. 8) or by the opponent's defense (fumble recovery in the end zone vs. Clemson on Sept. 22). Without the non-offensive scores, Georgia Tech would be tied for 55th nationally in scoring defense at 24.4 points allowed per game.
- Woody's 3-4 defense recorded Georgia Tech's first shutout in 57 games in the Yellow Jackets' 41-0 victory over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The shutout was the Yellow Jackets' first since they blanked Syracuse, 56-0, on Oct. 19, 2013.
- Georgia Tech's defense also limited Alcorn State to just 146 yards of total offense, which is the second-lowest yardage total allowed by the Yellow Jackets in head coach **Paul Johnson's** 10-plus seasons at the helm. The only time that the Jackets surrendered fewer yards during Johnson's tenure came in his fifth game at Tech, when they allowed just 132 yards in a 27-0 win over Duke on Oct. 4, 2008.
- On Sept. 15 at Pitt, the Yellow Jackets' defense allowed 21 points and 215 yards in the opening half but buckled down in the second half, surrendering just three points and 120 yards after the break to allow the Jackets to nearly come back from a 21-0 deficit in an eventual 24-19 defeat.
- Over its final six possessions of the game, Pitt managed just three points and 114 yards of offense. Georgia Tech's defense forced three punts (two three-and-outs) and recorded an interception over those final six series.
- Its last time out (Oct. 13), Georgia Tech limited Duke to just 304 yards of total offense, which is the fewest yards that Tech has surrendered to an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since Virginia Tech managed just 258 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 28-22 win over the No. 17 Hokies on Nov. 11 of last season.

- Georgia Tech has featured eight first-time starters on defense this season — Jr. NT **Brandon Adams**, Sr. OLB **Jalen Johnson**, So. SS **Tariq Carpenter**, Sr. FS **Malik Rivera\***, So. CB **Jaytlin Askew**, redshirt Fr. CB **Tre Swilling**, So. CB **Ajani Kerr** and Fr. OLB **Charlie Thomas**.  
*\* Rivera started 18 games in three seasons at Wofford before transferring to Georgia Tech as a graduate student for this season.*
- Tech has also played a whopping nine true freshmen on defense this season — DL **T.K. Chimedza**, DL **Justice Dingle**, LB **Jordan Domineck**, DL **Quon Griffin**, LB **Quez Jackson**, DB **Jaylon King**, LB **Charlie Thomas**, DB **Juanyeh Thomas** and CB **Zamari Waiton**.

• Woody came to The Flats from Appalachian State, where he served as defensive coordinator from 2013-17. Over his last three seasons at App State (2015-17 — the program's first three campaigns as full-fledged members of FBS), the Mountaineers' 3-4 scheme had average national rankings of 15th in scoring defense, 19th in total defense, 28th in rushing defense and 28th in passing defense.

• Appalachian also averaged 24 takeaways, 19 interceptions and 35 sacks per season over the last three campaigns, all areas where Georgia Tech ranked among the bottom 20 teams nationally in 2017.

### DEFENSIVE LINE

- Georgia Tech's three starting defensive linemen — seniors **Desmond Branch**, **Kyle Cerge-Henderson** and **Anree Saint-Amour** — have combined to play in 101 games and make 49 starts for the Yellow Jackets.

- This season marks the first time that Georgia Tech's entire starting defensive line is comprised of seniors since 1989, when seniors Willie Burks (DT), Jeff Mathis (NG) and Sean Smith (DT) were the starting linemen for the Jackets' 7-4 squad under head coach Bobby Ross (one season before Tech won its fourth national championship).
- Saint-Amour has arguably been Georgia Tech's best defensive player this season. He has 22 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, four sacks, three forced fumbles and five quarterback hurries this season. He leads the Yellow Jackets in TFL, sacks, forced fumbles and QB hurries.
- Saint-Amour is tied for sixth nationally with .43 forced fumbles per game.
- Saint-Amour has been especially impressive of late, with 10 tackles, three tackles for loss, three sacks, three forced fumbles and two quarterback hurries over the last two games (Oct. 5 at Louisville, Oct. 13 vs. Duke).
- Saint-Amour had a career day at Louisville (Oct. 5) with a team-high-tying six tackles, including a sack, a quarterback hurry and two forced fumbles. Both forced fumbles led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.
- Saint-Amour's two forced fumbles versus Louisville matched a single-game school record. He is the 10th student-athlete in Georgia Tech history to ever force two fumbles in a single game.

- Saint-Amour followed up his dominant performance against Louisville with another one against Duke (Oct. 13), finishing with two sacks, a forced fumble and a quarterback hurry that caused an interception and led directly to Georgia Tech's first touchdown of the game.
  - On Sept. 29 vs. Bowling Green, Saint-Amour returned his first-career interception three yards for his first-career touchdown. The interception came on a ball that was batted into the air at the line of scrimmage by Branch.
  - Saint-Amour's interception return for a touchdown was the first by a Georgia Tech defensive lineman since current Cincinnati Bengal and 2018 GT Sports Hall of Fame inductee Michael Johnson returned an INT 26 yards for a score during a 41-23 win at No. 23 Miami (Fla.) on Nov. 20, 2008.
  - Branch has also recorded an interception this season (vs. Clemson on Sept. 22), marking the first time in **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons as Georgia Tech's head coach that two different defensive linemen have had interceptions in the same season.
- ### LINEBACKERS
- The heart and soul of Georgia Tech's defense is senior co-captain and inside linebacker **Brant Mitchell**. Mitchell ranks second on the team with 30 tackles this season.
  - After tallying 14 tackles over the first four games of the season, Mitchell has notched 16 stops over the past three contests, including a season-high eight against Bowling Green (Sept. 29).
  - As the Yellow Jackets' middle linebacker last season, Mitchell ranked fourth on the team with 51 tackles despite playing in only seven full games and parts of two others due to a lower-body injury. His 5.7 tackles per game led the team.
  - In his first full game after returning to the lineup against No. 17 Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, Mitchell recorded a team-high nine tackles, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss, and was named ACC Co-Linebacker of the Week.
  - In all, Georgia Tech went just 1-3 in the four games that Mitchell missed all or part of last season.
  - After missing the entire 2017 season due to a foot injury, junior inside linebacker **David Curry** ranks fifth on the team with 23 tackles this season.
  - Curry, whose career high for tackles coming into the season was three, recorded four (Sept. 1 vs. Alcorn State) and six (Sept. 8 vs. USF) tackles in Georgia Tech's first two games this season.
  - The tally against USF likely would've been higher but he was ejected for a targeting call in the fourth quarter of the tough-luck loss on Sept. 8. Due to the ejection, Curry also had to sit out the first half of ACC opener at Pitt on Sept. 15.

**DEFENSE**

- Curry scored Georgia Tech's first defensive touchdown of the season when he scooped up a fumble forced by nose tackle **Brandon Adams** and returned it 15 yards for a score early in the third quarter of the shutout win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The fumble return for a touchdown was the Yellow Jackets' first since P.J. Davis returned a fumble 38 yards for a score during the Jackets' 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Curry's return to action this season came following a series of injuries that kept him out of action last season (foot) and cost him time this past spring (thumb).
- Sophomore Bruce Jordan-Swilling, who has seen increased action as of late at inside linebacker, led Georgia Tech with a season-high eight tackles against Duke (Oct. 13).
- True freshman **Charlie Thomas** moved into the starting lineup at the "jack" outside linebacker position against Louisville on Oct. 5. In his first two career starts, he has tallied eight tackles, two fumble recoveries, two quarterback hurries and a pass breakup.
- Thomas tied a single-game school record by recovering two fumbles in the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville. He is the 18th Yellow Jacket to recover two fumbles in a game. Both fumble recoveries led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.

- Despite appearing in only five games with just two starts, Thomas ranks ninth on the team with 19 tackles this season.
- Senior OLB **Victor Alexander**, who made the first five starts of the year at "jack," has played in all 43 of Georgia Tech's games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He is one of only two student-athletes on the Yellow Jackets' current roster that has played all 43 games since '15, joining senior WR **Brad Stewart**.
- Alexander turned in his finest statistical performance of the season against No. 3/2 Clemson on Sept. 22, finishing with a season-high seven tackles.
- Georgia Tech's fourth linebacker position — the "stinger" OLB — is manned largely by two student-athletes that were tabbed for the secondary prior to Woody's arrival on The Flats — senior **Jalen Johnson** and junior **Christian Campbell**.
- Despite previously being limited to the defensive backfield and special teams, Johnson and Campbell have combined for 74 career tackles and five tackles for loss, including 34 stops and three TFL through seven games this season.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS**

- Last season, Georgia Tech's starting secondary was comprised of five veterans that combined to make 127 starts and play in 218 games.
- However, none of the five members of last year's starting secondary returned in 2018. **Lawrence Austin, Lance Austin, Step Durham** and **Corey Griffin** all graduated while **A.J. Gray** had to step away from football due to a heart condition.
- In their wake, the defensive backs listed on Georgia Tech's two-deep combined for zero starts and just 27 games played prior to this season.
- Of the eight DBs listed on Tech's two-deep, three are sophomores (CB **Jaytlin Askew**, SS **Tariq Carpenter** and CB **Ajani Kerr**), two are redshirt freshmen (CB **Tre Swilling** and SS **Kaleb Oliver**) and one is a true freshmen (FS **Juanyeh Thomas**).
- One of only two upperclassmen in the secondary's two-deep (and the only full-time starter), graduate student **Malik Rivera** leads Georgia Tech in both tackles (32) and interceptions (2) through seven games this season.
- Rivera's two interceptions are tied for 62nd nationally and ninth in the ACC this season. The two INTs came in the Yellow Jackets' first two ACC games of the season (Sept. 15 at Pitt and Sept. 22 vs. Clemson).

• Rivera came to The Flats as a graduate transfer from Wofford, where he recorded 131 tackles but totaled just one interception over the past three seasons.

• Rivera's position coach at Wofford the last two seasons (and defensive coordinator in 2017) was **Shiel Wood**, who now serves as Georgia Tech's safeties coach.

• A spectacular student, Rivera graduated from Wofford in May as a triple-major in mathematics, finance and computer science. He is pursuing a master's degree in quantitative and computational finance at Georgia Tech.

• Five of Georgia Tech's nine interceptions this season belong to safeties — Oliver (vs. Alcorn State), Carpenter (at USF), Rivera (at Pitt, vs. Clemson) and Thomas (at Louisville).

• Thomas capped the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville (Oct. 5) by returning his first-career interception 95 yards for a touchdown.

• Thomas' 95-yard interception return is tied for the fifth-longest in school history and the longest by a Yellow Jacket in an ACC game (tied with Ken Swilling - 95 yds. vs. NC State, Sept. 9, 1989). It's also the longest INT return by a Jacket since Tyler Marcordes had a 95-yarder against Elon on Aug. 31, 2013.

• Georgia Tech boasts one of the nation's top punters in sophomore **Pressley Harvin III**.

• Due to the Yellow Jackets' offensive proficiency, Harvin has only been called upon to punt 18 times through seven games this season. He is averaging 45.2 yards per punt.

• Seven of Harvin III's 18 punts this season (including six of his last 11) have traveled 50-plus yards while six of his 18 kicks (including four of his last five) have been downed inside the 20-yard line.

• Harvin III does not qualify for official NCAA/ACC statistical rankings because he is far short of the minimum 3.6 attempts per game. However, if he did qualify, his 45.2-yard average would lead the ACC and rank 13th nationally.

• Harvin was one of only two non-true freshmen on the Yellow Jackets' travel roster to not see action during Georgia Tech's 66-31 rout at Louisville (Oct. 5). The other was senior long snapper **Zach Roberts**, who like Pressley, only goes on the field when the Jackets are forced to punt.

• In fact, Harvin III was called upon only once over a two-game stretch versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and Louisville. His lone punt versus BG traveled 53 yards and was downed at the 9-yard line.

• Last season, Harvin III led all NCAA Division I FBS true freshmen, ranked 16th overall nationally and was second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with a 44.1-yard punting average last season.

• Harvin's 44.1-yard average was also a Georgia Tech freshman record and ranked fifth overall in single-season program history.

• Of Harvin's 50 punts last season, 13 traveled 50-plus yards (26 percent), 16 were downed inside the 20 yard line (32 pct.), 15 were fair-caught (30 pct.) and 29 were not returned (58 pct.).

• Making Harvin's freshman campaign even more impressive was that two of his best performances came in less-than-ideal conditions for punting — he recorded career-bests with a 62-yard punt and four kicks downed inside the 20 yard line at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 and had five punts that traveled 50 yards or more and three downed inside the 20 at Clemson on Oct. 28. The majority of both games were played during heavy rain storms.

• Following his incredible rookie campaign, Harvin III was named freshman all-America by the Football Writers Association of America, true freshman all-America by ESPN and was a third-team all-ACC honoree.

• Harvin III is on the official watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to college football's top punter. He was first added to the list midway through his prolific freshman campaign last fall.

• Harvin became only the third FWA freshman all-American in school history (joining OL Will Jackson, 2010, and PK Travis Bell, 2004) and the first Georgia Tech freshman to earn all-ACC recognition since Calvin Johnson (first-team WR) and Bell (second-team PK) in '04.

• Replicating Harvin III's magic as a true freshman specialist this season is walk-on place kicker **Wesley Wells**. Wells took over the place-kicking duties after winning an in-practice competition for the job in the week leading up to the Bowling Green game (Sept. 29). Since then, he has made the first 21 kicks of his career — 20 PATs and a 41-yard field goal that split the uprights midway through the second quarter of Georgia Tech's 66-31 win at Louisville (Oct. 5).

• Wells' 41-yard field goal at Louisville was the longest made FG by a Yellow Jacket since **Brenton King**, also a true freshman at the time, made a 42-yarder vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 21, 2017.

• Another true freshman **Juanyeh Thomas** earned the job as Georgia Tech's primary punt and kickoff returner during fall camp.

• Thomas' 25-yard punt return in the second quarter of the Sept. 1 season opener against Alcorn was Georgia Tech's longest punt return since **Brad Stewart's** 26-yarder versus Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 1, 2016.

• Thomas' 38-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter at USF (Sept. 8) was the longest by a Yellow Jacket since **Lamont Simmons** scooped up an onside kick attempt and returned it 42 yards for a touchdown at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 of last season.

• USF's 266 yards on kickoff returns on Sept. 8 — which included 98- and 97-yard returns for touchdowns by Terrence Horne in the first quarter — were the second-most yards that Georgia Tech has ever allowed on kickoff returns in a single game (second only to North Carolina's 267 yards in a 68-50 GT win on Nov. 10, 2012).

• The two touchdowns allowed on kickoff returns against USF tied an NCAA Division I FBS single-game record.

• In Yellow Jackets' 34 kickoffs since Horne's back-to-back touchdowns at USF (not including an onside kick attempt versus Duke on Oct. 13), Georgia Tech junior kicker **Shawn Davis** has pinned the opponent at or inside its 25-yard line 24 times (with one of the exceptions being on a squib kick on the first kickoff following the two TD returns at USF).

• Despite Thomas' and Davis' high points, Georgia Tech continues to rank among the nation's bottom 25 teams in both kickoff-return average (18.18 ypr - 106th nationally) and kickoff-return defense (28.96 ypr - 128th).

• Georgia Tech, which had an open date last week, is 13-11 in 11 seasons under head coach **Paul Johnson** when it has more than the usual six days between games, including a 6-6 mark following open weeks.

• Bobby Dodd Stadium has been home sweet home for Georgia Tech of late, as it has won 10 of its last 13 home games, dating back to midway through the 2016 season. The only three home losses during that span have been at the hands of Georgia (Nov. 25, 2017), Clemson (Sept. 22, 2018) and Duke (Oct. 13).

• The Yellow Jackets' 28-14 loss to Duke snapped their nine-game winning streak versus unranked opponents at home.

• However, on the flip side, Georgia Tech has struggled in games played away from its Midtown Atlanta home over the past two seasons. The Yellow Jackets are just 1-7 in games played away from Bobby Dodd Stadium since the beginning of the 2017 season, with their 66-31 romp at Louisville (Oct. 5) snapping a seven-game away-from-home skid.

• Over the course of the seven-game losing streak in games played away from Bobby Dodd Stadium that spanned from Sept. 4, 2017-Sept. 15, 2018, Georgia Tech squandered double-digit leads in five of the seven defeats.

• Last year, Georgia Tech became only the 10th team in ACC history with two one-point losses in the same season (a 42-41 double-overtime loss to No. 25 Tennessee on Sept. 4 and a 25-24 loss at No. 11 Miami on Oct. 14).

• Three of the Yellow Jackets' five defeats last season — Sept. 4 vs. Tennessee, Oct. 11 at Miami (Fla.) and Nov. 4 at Virginia — came by a total of just six points.

• In each of those three defeats, Georgia Tech's opponent scored the winning points in the final 82 seconds of regulation or in overtime.

• Over the course of their first five games last season, the Yellow Jackets only trailed for 20:43 of total playing time and just four seconds after halftime — the final four seconds of their 25-24 loss at No. 11/10 Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 — but went just 3-2 in those five games.

• With underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores) representing 68.4 percent of its roster, Georgia Tech has the 14th-youngest team in all of NCAA Division I FBS and third-youngest team in the ACC this year.

• The only other ACC teams that have finished first or second in their division as many as six times in the last 10 seasons are Clemson (8), Florida State (7) and Virginia Tech (7).

• Of the teams widely considered to be Georgia Tech's closest academic peers at the Power 5 level — Duke, Notre Dame, Northwestern, Purdue, Stanford and Vanderbilt — only Stanford (9) has played in more bowl games over the last 10 seasons than the Yellow Jackets (8).
