TOP STORYLINES

- White-hot Georgia Tech travels to archrival Georgia on Saturday for the 113th edition of "Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate,"
- Georgia Tech (7-5, 4-3 ACC) enters the annual rivalry game the winner of fourstraight and six of its last seven contests. The four-game winning streak is the Yellow Jackets' longest since they won their final four games of the 2016 campaign, which included a 28-27 win at Georgia. A win on Saturday would give the Jackets their longest winning streak since they won their final five games of the 2014 regular season, which also included a 30-24 overtime win at UGA.
- The Jackets have come away victorious in each of their last two trips to Athens, with the overtime win in 2014 and the one-point triumph in '16. A win on Saturday would give Tech three-straight victories at Georgia for the first time since it won four in a row at Sanford Stadium in 1950, 1952, 1954 and 1956.
- A victory on Saturday would be Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson's fourth win over Georgia, which would put him alone as Tech's winningest coach against UGA since Bobby Dodd beat the Bulldogs 12 times in 22 games from 1945-66.
- All three of Johnson's wins over Georgia have come on the road (2008, 2014 and 2016). He already stands as Georgia Tech's second-winningest coach ever in Athens (behind only Dodd, who won at UGA five times).
- Like Georgia Tech, No. 5 Georgia (10-1, 7-1 SEC) has won four-straight games since its lone defeat of the season to date, a 36-16 loss at LSU on Oct. 13. The teams' four-game winning streaks are tied for the 11th-longest current winning streaks in the nation.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

Georgia Tech continues to put up unprecedented numbers in its rushing game. The Yellow Jackets are ranked No. 1 nationally in rushing offense with 353.7 yards on the ground per game, a whopping 49.6 yards per game more than the nation's No. 2-ranked rushing offense, Navy (304.1 ypg). To put the gap between No. 1 Georgia Tech and No. 2 Navy in perspective, the 49.6-yards-per-game gap between the Yellow Jackets and the Midshipmen is larger than the gap between Navy and the nation's No. 10-ranked rushing offense, which ironically belongs to Tech's opponent this week, Georgia (257.5 ypg).

Georgia Tech has won in each of its last two visits to Georgia (30-24 in overtime in 2014, 28-27 in 2016), which marks the first time since 1998 (21-19) and 2000 (27-15) that the Yellow Jackets have won back-to-back games at Sanford Stadium. The Jackets haven't won three-straight in Athens since 1952 (23-9), 1954 (7-3) and 1956 (35-0).

Paul Johnson is 3-2 at Georgia as Georgia Tech's head coach with wins in 2008, 2014 and 2016. He joins Bobby Dodd as the only Georgia Tech coaches with as many as three wins at Georgia (Dodd won five times in Athens).

Georgia Tech's current four-game winning streak is its longest since it won four-straight games to close the 2016 season and is tied for the 11th-longest current win streak in NCAA Division I FBS.

Georgia Tech has already set a new school record with five 400-yard rushing games this season, breaking the previous record of four set just last season.

Georgia Tech has forced 24 turnovers this season after finishing last season with 10 takeaways. The Yellow Jackets are currently tied for ninth nationally in takeaways after finishing last season ranked 124th out of 128 NCAA Division I FBS teams.

Twenty-six of the 34 400-yard rushing games in Georgia Tech history (including five this season) have come in Johnson's 11 seasons as the Yellow Jackets' head coach (2008-pres.). Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400 yards in a game 26 times in 140 contests (once every 5.4 games). Prior to his arrival, the Yellow Jackets had rushed for 400 yards in a game eight times in 1,138 contests (once every 142.3 games). Johnson's previous team, Navy, is the only NCAA Division I FBS team that has more 400-yard rushing games since 2008 (33). The second-most 400-yard rushing games by a Power 5 conference team since '08 is 12 by Oregon.

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- extend its winning streak to five games, which would be its longest win streak since it claimed five-straight victories to close the 2014 regular season;
- give it a final regular-season record of 8-4, which would mark the fifth time in 11 seasons under head coach Paul **Johnson** that the Yellow Jackets won eight regular-season games (in the 41 seasons prior to Johnson's arrival, the Jackets won eight regular-season games only eight times);
- give it three-straight wins over Georgia in Athens for the first time since it won four in a row at Sanford Stadium in 1950, 1952, 1954 and 1956;
- make the Yellow Jackets 4-2 at Georgia under Johnson;
- up it to 42-66-5 all-time against Georgia and 16-30-1 all-time in Athens:
- be its first win ever over a Georgia team ranked in the top five nationally (0-10 previously);
- be its first win over a top-five team since a 28-23 victory over No. 4 Virginia Tech in 2009;
- be its first road win over a top-five team since a 14-10 win at No. 3 Miami (Fla.) in 2005.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- give it a final regular-season record of 7-5;
- be its first lost at Georgia since 2012;
- · even its record at Sanford Stadium under head coach **Paul Johnson** at 3-3;
- drop it to 0-11 all-time against Georgia when the Bulldogs are ranked in the top five nationally;
- drop it to 41-67-5 all-time against Georgia and 15-31-1 in Athens.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN OVER VIRGINIA

- True freshman Wesley Wells kicked four field goals to help elevate the Yellow Jackets to a 30-27 overtime win over Virginia last Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Wells connected on all four of his field-goal attempts, including a 48-yarder with 1:04 to go in regulation that gave Georgia Tech a short-lived 27-24 lead and a 40-yarder in overtime that wound up being the game-winning points when Virginia's Brian Delaney missed wide left to end the thriller.
- The wild game featured eight lead changes and two ties.
- Georgia Tech scored in all three phases of the game, including a safety caused by Sr. LB Brant Mitchell's sack of Virginia quarterback Bryce Perkins in the end zone in the first quarter and a 77-yard touchdown return by true freshman Juanyeh Thomas on the ensuing free kick.
- Wells became only the eighth player in Georgia Tech history to make as many as four field goals in a game and the first since Harrison Butker made four in the Yellow Jackets' 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31, 2016). Wells is the first Georgia Tech freshman to ever kick four field goals in a game.
- With a 38-yard run on the fourth offensive play of the game, Sr. QB **TaQuon Marshall** became the 16th player in Georgia Tech history with 2,000 career rushing yards. He finished the game with 104 rushing yards to raise his career total to 2,078, good for 14th all-time at Georgia Tech.
- Marshall's 100-yard rushing game was his 10th in 21 career starts. He is the only quarterback and ninth player overall in Georgia Tech history with 10 100-yard rushing games.
- With his 77-yard return of a free kick for a touchdown in the first quarter, Thomas became the only the second true freshman in Georgia Tech history to return a kickoff for a touchdown, joining Dez White (1997).
- Mitchell's safety was Georgia Tech's first since a 65-10 win over Tulane on Sept. 12, 2015.
- So. SS **Tariq Carpenter's** 10 tackles were a career-high (prev.: 8 vs. Clemson, Sept. 22).
- For the third-straight game, Sr. OLB **Jalen Johnson** matched a career high with nine tackles.

NOTING GEORGIA

- No. 5 Georgia is 10-1 on the season and finished 7-1 in Southeastern Conference play.
- The Bulldogs won the SEC East Division title and will face No. 1 Alabama in the SEC Championship game on Dec. 1 in Atlanta's Mercedes-Benz Stadium.
- Georgia has won 24-of-27 games overall and is 12-0 at home since Georgia Tech beat the Bulldogs, 28-27, on Nov. 26, 2016 at Sanford Stadium.
- Like Georgia Tech, Georgia rides a four-game winning streak into the final game of the regular season. The Bulldogs suffered their lone loss of the campaign on Oct. 13 at LSU (36-16).
- Georgia is ranked No. 13 nationally in both total offense (483.9 ypg) and total defense (311.2 ypg) this season. The Bulldogs are 15th nationally in scoring offense (39.6 ppg) and 12th nationally in scoring defense (16.8 ppg).

- Much like last year, when Georgia had a pair of top-35 NFL draft picks at running back in Sony Michel and Nick Chubb, the Bulldogs' offense this season features RBs D'Andre Swift (857 rushing yards) and Elijah Holyfield (817 yds.).
- So. QB Jake Fromm has thrown for 2,061 yards, 20 touchdowns and just five interceptions. His top targets are Mecole Hardman (31 receptions for 475 yards) and Riley Ridley (32 rec., 441 yds.).
- Defensively, UGA is led by DB Richard LeCounte (63 tackles, two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and three pass breakups) and LB D'Andre Walker (5.5 sacks, 8.0 tackles for loss, 11 QB hurries, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one pass breakup).

GEORGIA TECH-GEORGIA SERIES HISTORY

- Saturday's game marks the 113th edition of the Georgia Tech-Georgia football series — a rivalry dubbed "Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate."
- The series dates back to 1893, Georgia Tech's second season of football. Tech won the first meeting, 28-6, in Athens.
- After a three-year break in the series from 1894-96, the teams have met annually since 1897 with the exception of 1901, 1908 and an eight-year gap from 1917-24.
- The Georgia Tech-Georgia series is one of major college football's oldest and most-played rivalries. Only 12 NCAA Division I FBS rivalries began before Georgia Tech and Georgia played for the first time in 1893 and only 17 FBS rivalries have been played more often than the 112 previous editions of "Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate."

- Georgia leads the all-time series, 66-41-5, including a 30-15-1 advantage in games played in Athens.
- Georgia Tech has come away victorious in its last two visits to Sanford Stadium, a 30-24 overtime win in 2014 and a 28-27 triumph in 2016.



- A win on Saturday would give Georgia Tech three-straight victories at Georgia for the first time since it won four in a rown n Athens in 1950 (7-0), 1952 (23-9), 1954 (7-3) and 1956 (35-0).
- Georgia Tech head coach **Paul Johnson** has won three times against Georgia since taking the helm of the Yellow Jackets in 2008 (2008, 2014 and 2016). With a win on Saturday, Johnson would stand alone as the Yellow Jackets' winningest coach against UGA since Bobby Dodd beat the Bulldogs 12 times in 22 seasons (1945-66).

- All three of Johnson's wins over Georgia (2008, 2014 and 2016) have come in Athens. He is one of only two coaches in Georgia Tech history with as many as three wins at Georgia, joining Dodd, who won at UGA five times.
- Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats in '08, seven of the nine Georgia Tech-Georgia games have been decided by eight points or less. Since 2004, 10-of-14 GT-UGA matchups have been decided by eight points or less.
- Since 1995, the winner of the Georgia Tech-Georgia football game has been awarded the Governor's Cup. Georgia Governor Nathan Deal will present the trophy to the winning team following Saturday's game. Georgia has won the Governor's Cup 17 times in 23 matchups since the trophy's inception in 1995.

The Grant Field victory that started "The Drought," Bobby Dodd's eight-year mastery of Georgia.

NOTING LAST YEAR'S LOSS TO GEORGIA

- Georgia Tech pulled within 14-7 with less than a minute to go in the first half but No. 7 Georgia scored the final 24 points of the game to beat the Yellow Jackets, 38-7, on Nov. 25 of last season at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Georgia jumped out to a 14-0 lead midway through the second quarter but Georgia Tech responded with a 12-play, 75-yard drive and cut the deficit to 14-7 on **TaQuon Mar-shall's** 10-yard touchdown pass to Ricky Jeune with just 48 seconds remaining before halftime.
- However, UGA extended the lead to 17-7 with a field goal as time expired in the first half and outscored the Yellow Jackets 21-0 in the second half.
- Georgia outrushed Georgia Tech, 247-188, and outgained the Yellow Jackets, 471-226. It marked one of only 19 times in **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons as the Yellow Jackets' head coach that they have been outrushed.
- Georgia RBs Sony Michel (85 yards) and Nick Chubb (53) combined for 118 rushing yards.
- UGA QB Jake Fromm completed 12-of-16 passes for 224 yards and two touchdowns.
- Georgia Tech was held without a rushing touchdown for the first time since a 13-7 loss to Georgia in 2015.
- The win was Georgia's ninth-straight at Georgia Tech.

- Using advanced analytics, Georgia Tech ranks among the national leaders fewest yards needed per point (ninth 11.7), points per possession (11th 3.10), points per play (12th .525), possessions that result in touchdowns (t-12th 38.17 pct.), offensive touchdowns per game (16th 4.4) and yards per play (24th 6.1).
- According to FootballOutsiders.com's Fremeau Efficiency Index (FEI), the Yellow Jackets have the nation's 12th-most efficient offense with a 3.02 offensive FEI (offensive FEI is the value generated per drive by a team's offense adjusted for starting field position and for the strength of opponent defenses faced). The Jackets' offensive FEI ranks second in the ACC (behind No. 11 NC State).
- Thanks to its prolific offense, the Yellow Jackets have the second-fewest total punts (27) and the second-fewest punts per offensive play (.04) in the nation this season (behind only Oklahoma in both categories 26 punts and .04 punts per offensive play).
- Over their last 30 games (dating back to the sixth game of the 2016 season), the Yellow Jackets have punted only 101 times (3.37 per game) and have come away with points on 149 of their 348 offensive possessions (42.8 percent).
- Georgia Tech's offense has been markedly more efficient on the road this season, as the Yellow Jackets are averaging 6.9 yards per play and .565 points per play in its five road games and 5.3 yards per play and .480 points per play in its six home contests.

OFFENSE

- A by-product of Georgia Tech's prolific rushing game has been an ultra-efficient, albeit infrequently utilized, passing attack. The Yellow Jackets officially rank second nationally in yards per completion (20.0) but against NCAA Division I FBS competition only, it ranks first nationally in yards per completion (22.1) and fifth in yards per attempt (10.0).
- In its first two wins of this month (Nov. 3 at North Carolina and Nov. 10 vs. Miami), Georgia Tech completed 5-of-6 passes for 177 yards and two touchdowns, good for 29.5 yards per pass attempt, 35.4 yards per completion and a 441.13 passing efficiency rating.
- The Jackets' 86-yard touchdown pass from r-Fr. QB **Tobias Oliver** to Sr. AB **Qua Searcy** in the second quarter at North Carolina (Nov. 3) was the sixth-longest pass play in school history and Tech's longest since an 87-yard touchdown pass from Joshua Nesbitt to Embry Peebles vs. Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.

- In its back-to-back road wins at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25) and North Carolina (Nov. 3), Georgia Tech amassed 1,030 yards of total offense on 152 rushing attempts and just three passes.
- At UNC, the Yellow Jackets compiled 565 yards of offense
 461 yards on 74 carries (6.2 avg.) and 104 yards on
 2-of-2 passing (52.0 avg.).
- Georgia Tech rushed on 78 of its 79 plays at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25), compiling 465 rushing yards and zero passing yards in a 49-28 win.
- The Yellow Jackets' win at Virginia Tech marked the first time since a 16-7 win over Georgia in 1977 that GT did not complete a pass in a game.
- The Jackets' 465 rushing yards against Virginia Tech were the most allowed by VT since 1973.
- All seven of Georgia Tech's touchdowns against Virginia Tech came on the ground, which was tied for the fifth-most rushing touchdowns in GT history and were the most allowed by VT since 1974.

- Georgia Tech also put together impressive back-to-back offensive performances against Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and Louisville (Oct. 5).
- Georgia Tech racked up 129 points, 1,086 yards of total offense and 914 rushing yards in the wins over Bowling Green (63-17 on Sept. 29) and Louisville (66-31 on Oct. 5).
- In all, Tech scored on 17-of-20 offensive possessions during the two-game stretch (16 TD, 1 FG) 8-of-10 versus Bowling Green (8 TD) and 9-of-10 at Louisville (8 TD, 1 FG). Of the three possessions that the Jackets didn't score, two came as they ran out the clock at the end of each game.
- The final possession of each game notwithstanding, the only offensive series during the two-game stretch that didn't result in points for Georgia Tech came when it punted in the fourth quarter of the 63-17 win over BG on Sept. 29.

- Senior QB **TaQuon Marshall** led Georgia Tech to points on 14-straight offensive series that he quarterbacked his final series vs. Clemson on Sept. 22 (TD), all six series vs. BG on Sept. 29 (6 TD) and all seven series at Louisville on Oct. 5 (6 TD, 1 FG).
- Georgia Tech scored touchdowns on each of its four offensive possessions in the first half against Bowling Green, marking the first time under Johnson that it scored touchdowns on every offensive possession of any half.
- As impressive as the offensive output was against Bowling Green, it paled in comparison to what the Jackets accomplished against Louisville.
- Georgia Tech's 66 points against Louisville tied for the sixth-most in modern school history (AP poll era 1936-pres.) and were the second-most that it has ever scored in a conference game (record: 68 at North Carolina, Nov. 10, 2012).

- The Yellow Jackets' 66 points against Louisville are tied for the 15th-most scored by an NCAA Division I FBS team this season (most: 79 Fresno State vs. Idaho, Sept. 1) and the third-most scored against a Power Five conference opponent this season (most: 77 Ohio State vs. Oregon State, Sept. 1 and Clemson vs. Louisville, Nov. 3).
- The Yellow Jackets' 66 points against Louisville are tied for the third-most ever scored by an ACC team on the road, behind only Georgia Tech's 70 points at Navy on Sept 8, 2001 and Tech's 68 points at North Carolina on Nov. 10, 2012.

- GT's 542 rushing yards against Louisville remain the most in a game by an NCAA Division I FBS team this season (No. 2: 503 Texas A&M vs. Northwestern State, Aug. 30).
- The Yellow Jackets' 542 yards on the ground against Louisville were the most by an FBS team since Navy ran for 559 yards at SMU on Nov. 11 of last season and were the most by and against a Power Five conference team since Auburn ran for 543 yards at Arkansas on Oct. 22, 2016.
- In its seven wins this season, Georgia Tech has turned the ball over a total of seven times (1.0 per game although six of the seven came against Alcorn State-3 and North Carolina-3). In their four losses, the Yellow Jackets have turned the ball over nine times (2.25 per game).
- After committing nine turnovers through the first 13 quarters of this season (first three games plus first quarter of Game 4 vs. Clemson), Georgia Tech went 234-consecutive plays (offensive snaps plus returns) without a turnover over the next 13 quarters (final three quarters vs. Clemson, full games vs. Bowling Green and Louisville and first two quarters vs. Duke).
- However, that streak came to emphatic halt when the Yellow Jackets lost fumbles on three-straight plays late in the third quarter of its 28-14 loss to Duke on Oct. 13. Those fumbles (by BB **Jerry Howard**, QB **TaQuon Marshall** and KR **Juanyeh Thomas**) led directly to Duke scoring 21 points in the final 1:49 of the third period, turning what was a 7-7 ballgame into a 28-14 defeat.



OFFENSE

- In all, after committing nine turnovers in its first four games of the season (one turnover every 31.3 plays), Georgia Tech has committed only seven turnovers in the last seven games (one every 59.0 plays).
- Last season, GT committed eight turnovers in its first four games of the season (one turnover every 37.8 plays) but had only six turnovers over the final seven games of the campaign (one turnover every 74.8 plays).
- Despite having only one turnover against No. 3/2 Clemson on Sept. 22, Georgia Tech fumbled eight times in the loss. The eight fumbles are tied for the second-most in school history (record: 9 at Miami, Nov. 21, 2015). The Yellow Jackets' eight fumbles marked only the third time in the past 46 seasons (dating back to 1973) that they have fumbled as many as seven times in a contest.
- Georgia Tech has scored at least 24 points in 20 of its last 26 games.
- The Yellow Jackets had a streak of 10-consecutive 24-point games that ran from Nov. 12, 2016 (at Virginia Tech) through Oct. 21, 2017 (vs. Wake Forest). At the time, it was the fifth-longest active streak in the nation and the second-longest active streak in the ACC. It was also tied for the fourth-longest string of games with 24 points or more in Georgia Tech history.
- Georgia Tech has played 272-consecutive games without being shut out, good for the seventh-longest active streak in NCAA Division I FBS.
- The Yellow Jackets have not been held scoreless since a 38-0 loss at No. 3 Florida State on Oct. 18, 1997.
- Even more impressively, Georgia Tech has not been blanked at home since a 7-0 loss to Georgia on Nov. 30, 1957 — good for a streak of 378-straight games played at Bobby Dodd Stadium without being shut out.

• Taking the majority of Georgia Tech's snaps at QB for the first time since sustaining the upper-body injury vs. Duke on Oct. 13, Marshall has been responsible for 309 yards (199 rushing, 110 passing) and three touchdowns (two rushing, one passing) over the past two games — a 27-21 win over Miami (Nov. 10) and a 30-27 overtime victory over Virginia (last Saturday).



OFFENSE

- Prior to injury vs. Duke, Marshall put together perhaps the finest two-game stretch of his career in wins over Bowling Green (63-17 on Sept. 29) and Louisville (66-31 on Oct. 5). He rushed 36 times for 217 yards (6.0 avg.) and four touchdowns while completing 6-of-8 passes for 172 yards (75.0 comp. pct., 21.5 yds./att., 28.7 yds./comp.) to lead the Yellow Jackets to the blowout wins.
- Marshall led the Jackets to points in 14-straight offensive series that he quarterbacked his final series vs. Clemson on Sept. 22 (TD), all six series vs. BG on Sept. 29 (6 TD) and all seven series at Louisville on Oct. 5 (6 TD, 1 FG).
- On Oct. 5 at Louisville, Marshall rushed for 175 yards on 23 carries (7.6 avg.). The 175 yards on the ground were a season-high and the second-highest rushing total of his career (behind only his Georgia Tech quarterback-record 249 yards in the 2017 season opener versus Tennessee).
- Marshall was named ACC Quarterback of the Week following his impressive performances against Louisville. The ACC award is the second of his career. He was named ACC Offensive Back of the Week following his record-breaking performance in last season's opener versus Tennessee.
- Marshall has registered six of the 13 highest single-game rushing totals by a quarterback in Georgia Tech history.

- With 107 yards on the ground against Virginia last Saturday, Marshall now has 10 100-yard rushing games in his 10th in 21 career starts. He is the only quarterback and the ninth player overall in Georgia Tech history with 10 100-yard rushing games in a career.
- Marshall's six 100-yard rushing games last season were the most ever by a Georgia Tech quarterback and tied for eighth in GT single-season history, regardless of position.
- Despite missing significant time in the second half on Sept. 8 at USF due to a lower-body injury, Marshall passed for a career-high 183 yards (prev.: 179 at Virginia, Nov. 4, 2017) and ran for 113 more. It marked the third time in his career that he rushed and passed for at least 100 yards in the same game and the seventh time that he has rushed and passed for a touchdown.
- Marshall also had the longest completion of his career at USF, an 81-yard touchdown strike to senior AB **Clinton Lynch** (prev.: 80 to Ricky Jeune vs. Virginia Tech, Nov. 11, 2017).
- While his 183 passing yards at USF remain a season and career high, Marshall's most efficient passing performance came against Miami (Nov. 10), when he completed 3-of-4 passes for 73 yards and a touchdown.
- Marshall's 310.80 pass-efficiency rating versus Miami was the second-highest of his career (career high: 347.26

- vs. Jacksonville State, Sept. 9, 2017) and his highest of the season (prev.: 307.33 vs. Bowling Green, Sept. 29).
- Marshall's 17 rushing touchdowns last season were the third-most by a quarterback in Georgia Tech single-season history.

- With 104.2 rushing yards per game last season, Marshall became the first quarterback and only the third Yellow Jacket overall to average 100 rushing yards per game in a single season in 10 seasons under head coach **Paul Johnson**, joining Jonathan Dwyer (107.3 ypg 2008) and Anthony Allen (101.2 ypg 2010).
- Marshall burst on to the national stage with a recordsetting performance versus Tennessee in last year's season opener. Making the first start of his career, Marshall set three school records and one ACC record against the Vols.

- Marshall's 249 rushing yards against Tennessee were also the third-most in Georgia Tech history, regardless of position (behind only 356 by Eddie Lee Ivery vs. Air Force - Nov. 11, 1978 and 307 by P.J. Daniels vs. Tulsa, Humanitarian Bowl - Jan. 4, 2004).
- Marshall's 249 rushing yards against Tennessee were the fifth-most by an FBS quarterback and tied for the 15th-most by any FBS student-athlete in a game last season.
- Marshall's five rushing touchdowns against UT were tied for the most in the nation by any student-athlete in a single game last season.
- Marshall is on the official watch list for the 2018 Maxwell Award, presented to "America's College Player of the Year." He is joined on the list by Georgia Tech B-back **KirVonte Benson**.
- Despite being Marshall's backup for all but one game, redshirt freshman **Tobias Oliver** has also burst onto the national scene this season, particularly following his performances at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25) and North Carolina (Nov. 3).
- Making his first-career start in place of Marshall, who sustained an upper-body injury in the previous game against Duke (Oct. 13), Oliver rushed for 215 yards on 40 carries (both career highs) and scored three touchdowns (matching a career high) to lead Georgia Tech to a 49-28 victory at VT.

- Oliver's 215 rushing yards against Virginia Tech were the second-most by a quarterback and seventh-most overall in Georgia Tech single-game history (see previous column for list of top rushing performances by GT QBs).
- Oliver's 40 carries against VT were the second-most in GT single-game history (behind only Marshall's 44 vs. Tennessee, Sept. 4, 2017).
- Oliver's 215 rushing yards against VT were temporarily the most by an ACC player this season (Wake Forest's Matt Colburn surpassed Oliver's total with 243 rushing yards against Louisville on Oct. 27).
- Oliver's 215 rushing yards against VT remain the secondmost by an NCAA Division I FBS quarterback, the most by an FBS QB against an FBS opponent and the 16th-most by any FBS player, regardless of position, this season.
- On Nov. 3 at North Carolina, Oliver replaced Marshall at quarterback before the Yellow Jackets' fourth offensive series and remained under center for the duration of the 38-28 victory (the score was tied, 7-7, when Oliver entered the game).
- Oliver accounted for 224 yards (120 rushing, 104 passing) and three touchdowns (two rushing, one passing) in the 38-28 win at UNC. He ran 28 times and completed 2-of-2 passes.
- Oliver's 2-for-2, 104-yard passing effort against UNC included an 86-yard touchdown pass to Sr. AB **Qua Searcy**.
 The touchdown pass was the sixth-longest pass play in Georgia Tech history and the Yellow Jackets' longest since Joshua Nesbitt threw an 87-yard TD pass to Embry Peeples at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.
- Oliver was named ACC Rookie of the Week following the VT and UNC games, becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn the honor in back-to-back weeks since WR Calvin Johnson in 2004 (Nov. 15 vs. Connecticut and Nov. 22 vs. Virginia).

OFFENSI

- Oliver's 5.69 yards per rush ranks seventh among all freshmen nationally (regardless of position) and his 80.8 rushing yards per game rank sixth among FBS freshmen.
- Oliver's 27.67 yards per completion would lead the nation but he falls short of the 15 passes per game needed to qualify for the official national/conference rankings (Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa tops the official rankings with 17.47 yards per completion).
- Oliver has led the Yellow Jackets to scores on 21 of the 33 full possessions that he's led this year (19 touchdowns, two field goals), not including abbreviated series at the end of halves (he has also closed out two touchdown drives that he wasn't on the field for the start of).
- Oliver was impressive in relief of Marshall in the Yellow Jackets' wins vs. Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and at Louisville (Oct. 5). He was on the field for a total of just five series in those two games (not including abbreviated series to run out the clock at the end of each game) and led the Yellow Jackets to four touchdowns while running for more than 100 yards in each game (115 vs. BG, 103 at Louisville) and averging a whopping 14.5 yards per carry (218 yards on 15 attempts).
- On Sept. 8 at USF, Oliver replaced Marshall on the third play of the second half and engineered the Jackets' next three drives. GT scored touchdowns on all three series, with Oliver capping each drive with a touchdown (five, one and one yards).
- Of the 23 plays that Oliver was on the field for at USF, he carried the ball himself 18 times and accounted for 97 of the 189 yards that the Yellow Jackets gained while he was in the game.
- Oliver finished with 97 yards on 18 carries (5.4 avg.) and three touchdowns, all on the ground, against USF.
- Despite only playing for a little more than a quarter, Oliver's three touchdowns at USF marked the 48th time in school history that an individual has rushed for three TDs in a game.
- In the win over Louisville (Oct. 5), Marshall and Oliver became the first quarterback tandem in Georgia Tech history to both rush for 100 yards in the same game (Marshall 175, Oliver 103).
- Marshall and Oliver both rank among the top 30 nationally in rushing touchdowns (Oliver 12, t-17th and Marshall 11, t-29th) and among the top 55 nationally in rushing yards per game (Marshall 85.7 ypg, 46th and Oliver 80.8 ypg, t-53rd). Only one other NCAA Division I FBS team has two quarterbacks even ranked among the top 100 nationally in rushing touchdowns (Navy) or no other team has two QBs even ranked among the top 200 in rushing yards per game.
- With a season-ending foot injury sustained by presumed backup quarterback **Lucas Johnson** during preseason camp, Marshall is the only active quarterback on Georgia Tech's roster that came into the 2018 season with any collegiate playing experience.

RUNNING BACKS

- Head coach **Paul Johnson** said prior to the season that the deepest position on Georgia Tech's roster was likely Bback. That depth has been tetsted and proven through nine games this season.
- The biggest test of Georgia Tech's depth at the B-back position has been a season-ending knee injury sustained by

- junior **KirVonte Benson** during the first quarter of Georgia Tech's second game of the season at USF (Sept. 8).
- Benson, who ran for 1,053 yards as a sophomore in 2017, had 116 rushing yards and two touchdowns in less than three quarters of action this season before sustaining the season-ending injury at USF.
- Sharing the workload at B-back in Benson's absence have been redshirt freshman **Jordan Mason** and sophomore **Jerry Howard**.
- Mason ranks third on the team (first among nonquarterbacks) with 637 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns.
- Mason's 6.2 yards-per-rush average ranks third on the squad (min. 20 carries).
- Mason's 6.2 yards per carry rank fourth among all freshmen nationally and ranks 26th in the nation overall.
- Mason's 57.9 rushing yards per game rank 16th nationally among freshmen.

- In Georgia Tech's 49-28 win at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25),
 Mason set a career high with three rushing touchdowns (5, 14 and 1 yards).
- Mason has scored six touchdowns over the last seven games (two vs. Bowling Green on Sept. 29, one at Louisville on Oct. 5, three at VT).
- Howard ranks fourth on the team (second among non-QBs) with 522 rushing yards and five rushing touchdowns this season.
- Howard has scored a touchdown in five of the last seven games — 5 yards versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29), 2 yards at Louisville (Oct. 5), 2 yards versus Duke (Oct. 13), 8 yards at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25) and three yards versus Virginia (last Saturday).
- Howard rushed for a career-high 90 yards on just 10 carries (9.0 avg.) at North Carolina (Nov. 3).
- Howard also hauled in his second reception of the season (and third of his career) at UNC, an 18-yarder, to put him over 100 all-purpose yards for the first time in his career.
- In his first extensive action of the year, Howard ran for 82 yards on just eight carries (10.2 avg.) at Pitt (Sept. 15).
- Serving as Benson's top backup last season, Howard's 7.6 yards per carry ranked second on the team last season, behind only A-back **Nathan Cottrell** (8.2 avg.).

- Benson opened the 2018 season by rushing for 75 yards on 10 carries (7.5 avg.) and matching a career-high with two touchdowns (five and eight yards) in a 41-0 win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. He played just two quarters in the opener, after sitting out the first quarter due to a minor violation of team rules and the fourth quarter when most of GT's regulars were removed from the game.
- On Sept. 8 at USF, Benson ran for 41 yards on just five carries (8.2 avg.) before sustaining the season-ending injury on Georgia Tech's second offensive series of the game.
- Benson, who did not have a collegiate carry prior to last season, rushed for 1,053 yards and six touchdowns as a sophomore in 2017. He ranked fifth in the ACC and 35th nationally with 95.7 rushing yards per game last season.
- Benson became only the third B-back in Paul Johnson's 10 seasons as head coach to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, joining Jonathan Dwyer (2008 and 2009) and Anthony Allen (2010).



OFFENSE

- For their careers, Georgia Tech's veteran A-back trio of fifth-year seniors **Clinton Lynch** and **Qua Searcy** and Cottrell, a junior, has combined to rush for 2,751 yards and 18 touchdowns on 348 carries (7.9 avg.) and catch 64 passes for 1,581 yards (24.7 avg.) and 14 touchdowns. As a group, they are averaging 10.5 yards per touch from scrimmage for their careers.
- Between them, Lynch, Searcy and Cottrell have combined for 1,244 all-purpose yards through the first 10 games of this season — 827 rushing yards on 106 carries (7.8 avg.) and 417 receiving yards on 17 receptions (24.5 avg.). Georgia Tech is averaging 10.1 yards per play every time one of them touches the ball in 2018.

- Cottrell (11-yard run), Searcy (86-yard reception) and Lynch (4-yard run) all scored touchdowns at North Carolina (Nov. 3), marking the first time that each member of the A-back trio has ever scored in the same game.
- With a 41-yard reception in the second quarter versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29), Lynch became the first studentathlete in Georgia Tech history with 1,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in a career.
- Since the beginning of 2016, 27 of Lynch's 120 touches have gone for 20 yards or more (12 rushes, 15 receptions 22.5 percent) and 10 of his 120 touches have gone for 40 yards or more (three rushes, seven receptions 8.3 percent).
- On Sept. 8 at USF, Lynch hauled in an 81-yard touchdown reception from quarterback **TaQuon Marshall**. The play was the second-longest reception of Lynch's career (long: 83 from Justin Thomas vs. North Carolina, Nov. 5, 2016) and the longest completion of Marshall's career.
- Lynch is one of only two student-athletes in Georgia Tech history with two receptions of 80 yards or longer in his career, joining Dez White (1997-99).
- Searcy's 86-yard touchdown reception from r-Fr. QB To-bias Oliver at North Carolina (Nov. 3) was the sixth-longest pass play in school history and the Yellow Jackets' longest reception since Embry Peeples' 87-yard catch from Joshua Nesbitt at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.
- Searcy ran for two touchdowns (two and one yards) for the first time in his career at Louisville (Oct. 5). The two-TD game was the second of his career — he ran for a touchdown and caught another as a redshirt freshman vs. Tulane on Sept. 12, 2015.
- Searcy's 91 rushing yards against Mercer on Sept. 10, 2016 remain the most by a Georgia Tech A-back since Robert Godhigh ran for 126 yards in a 55-31 defeat at Clemson on Nov. 14, 2013.

- After not finding the end zone in any of the first 25 games of his career, Cottrell has scored touchdowns in three of the last eight contests a two-yarder against No. 3/2 Clemson (Sept. 22), a four-yarder versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and an 11-yarder at North Carolina (Nov. 3).
- Cottrell rushed for 90 yards on nine carries (both career highs) in Georgia Tech's 38-28 win at UNC (Nov. 3).

WIDE RECEIVERS

- After catching just four passes as a junior last season, senior wide receiver **Brad Stewart** has 13 receptions through 11 games this season.
- Stewart hauled in Georgia Tech's only reception last Saturday versus Virginia last Saturday but it was a big one a 37-yard catch on third-and-6 that prolonged the Yellow Jackets' final drive of regulation, which led to a field goal that proved crucial in the Jackets' 30-27 overtime win.
- Stewart's 37-yard reception against Virginia was his longest of the season (prev.: 31 vs. Miami, Nov. 10).
- Stewart's 31-yard catch against Miami was his second second touchdown of the season and third of his career. The 31-yard, third-quarter TD reception proved to be the winning points in Georgia Tech's 27-21 triumph over Miami.
- Stewart set a career high four catches against Alcorn State on Sept. 1, surpassing his previous career-high of three, which he achieved three times (twice as a sophomore in 2016, once as a freshman in 2015).
- Stewart's four catches against Alcorn State included the second touchdown reception of his career when quarterback **TaQuon Marshall** found him wide open in the corner of the end zone for a 24-yard scoring strike.
- After going the first 33 games of his career without a touchdown catch, Stewart has three TDs in the last 14 games. On Nov. 11 of last season, Stewart hauled in a 60yard touchdown pass in the Jackets' 28-22 win over No. 17 Virginia Tech.
- Stewart has been consistently praised by head coach
 Paul Johnson throughout the season for the role that his blocking has played in Georgia Tech's rushing offense, which leads the nation with 353.7 yards per game.
- Stewart was limited to just one reception for 12 yards against Louisville on Oct. 5 (albeit a big catch, as it gave Georgia Tech a first down that set up a touchdown with less than a minuted to go in the first half) but was named one of the Yellow Jackets' players of the week by the coaching staff. He was recognized not only for his reception but for the role that his blocking played in Georgia Tech's 542-yard rushing performance and being the holder on all 10 of the Jackets' successful place kicks (nine PAT and a FG).
- Stewart leads all current Yellow Jackets with 38-consecutive starts (the next-longest streak on the team belongs to junior OL **Parker Braun**, who has made 30-straight starts).
- Stewart has also played in all 47 of Georgia Tech's games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He is the only student-athlete on the Yellow Jackets' current roster that has played all 47 games since the beginning of '15.
- The starter opposite Stewart is sophomore wideout Jalen Camp. Camp, who had only one reception as a redshirt freshman in 2017, has eight catches in 10 games this season.

- Camp matched a career high with two receptions Miami (Nov. 10). His second catch of the game was perhaps the biggest of his career to date, a 22-yard pickup on third-and-6 that kept Georgia Tech's final drive going and allowed the Yellow Jackets to run out the clock in the 27-21 victory.
- Camp had a career-high 70 receiving yards on two receptions (33 and 37 yards) versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29).
- The only true freshman who has seen significant action on offense for Georgia Tech this season is wide receiver **Malachi Carter**. Carter has served as the third wideout behind Stewart and Camp in the Yellow Jackets' rotation.
- With Camp out due to an upper-body injury, Carter hauled in a 32-yard touchdown (the first of his career) versus Duke (Oct. 13).

- The leader of the offensive front is all-ACC and all-America candidate Parker Braun. Braun, a junior left guard, leads the unit and ranks second overall on the team with 30-consecutive starts.
- Braun turned in perhaps the finest performance of his already illustrious career at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25), when he took a whopping 25 defenders to the ground in just 72 plays (one every 2.9 plays) to help pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 465 yards in a 49-28 win.
- In recognition of the dominating effort against VT, Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time this season and fourth time in his career.
- Braun is only the third Yellow Jacket to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week as many as four times in a career, joining current New England Patriot Shaq Mason (5 – 2012-15) and former NFL standout Andrew Gardner (4 – 2005-08).
- Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the first time this season and third time in his career after taking 15 defenders to the ground and helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 542 yards at Louisville (Oct. 5).
- Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time of his career following Georgia Tech's 35-17 win over Pitt on Sept. 23, 2016. He took 22 Pitt defenders to the ground and helped Georgia Tech run for 436 yards en route to the honor.
- In 2016, Braun became the first Georgia Tech freshman to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after compiling 10 knockdowns and helping Tech rush for 309 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech (Nov. 12).

OFFENSE

- Led by Braun, Georgia Tech's offensive line has helped pave the way for the Yellow Jackets rank first nationally in rushing offense (353.7 ypg) and 12th in fewest sacks allowed (1.09/gm).
- Behind its offensive line, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400-plus yards in nine of its last 22 games, dating back to the beginning of last season.
- The Yellow Jackets' offensive line continues to get a boost from the return of junior **Kenny Cooper**, who missed all of fall camp and the first two games of the season due to a lower-body injury sustained during spring practice.
- Cooper, who started all 11 games at center in 2017, made his first start of 2018 against Duke (Oct. 13).
- Before getting back into the starting lineup, Cooper made his 2018 debut against Pitt (Sept. 15) and saw action as a reserve at center and right guard for four contests as he worked himself back into game shape.
- Last season, Cooper was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after taking 10 defenders to the ground and helping Georgia Tech run for 403 yards in its 33-7 win over North Carolina (Sept. 30). The award came in Cooper's fifth-career start.
- Both Braun and Cooper represent Tech on official watch lists for national awards Braun is a candidate for the Outland Trophy, presented to college football's top interior lineman, while Cooper is on the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, which is awarded to college football's top center.
- Additionally, Braun is a candidate for the 2018 Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, which is presented to the top offensive student-athlete in NCAA Division I football who was born in, played high-school football in or plays college football in the state of Texas.



DEFENSE

- Coming into the season, one of the stated goals of new defensive coordinator **Nate Woody's** defense was to create turnovers. Through 11 games, the Yellow Jackets are much improved in that area.
- Through 11 games, Georgia Tech has forced 24 turnovers.
 The Yellow Jackets forced 10 turnovers for the entire 2017 season.
- Additionally, through 11 games, Georgia Tech's defense has 12 interceptions. The Yellow Jackets intercepted eight passes for the entire 2017 season.
- Georgia Tech's 24 takeaways are tied for ninth nationally.
 Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 124th out of 128
 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 10 takeaways.
- Georgia Tech's 12 interceptions are tied for 22nd nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 110th nationally with six interceptions.
- Georgia Tech's 12 fumble recoveries are tied for fifth nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 120th nationally with four fumble recoveries.
- The Yellow Jackets have forced a season-high three turnovers in six different games this season Alcorn State (Sept. 1), Bowling Green (Sept. 29), Louisville (Oct. 5), Duke (Oct. 13), North Carolina (Nov. 3) and Miami (Nov. 10).
- Georgia Tech is one of only 10 teams nationally that has forced at least one turnover in every game this season.

- Georgia Tech has recorded three defensive touchdowns
 this season (David Curry fumble return vs. Alcorn State
 Sept. 1; Anree Saint-Amour interception return vs.
 Bowling Green Sept. 29; Juanyeh Thomas interception
 return Oct. 5), which is tied for first in the ACC and 11th
 nationally.
- Georgia Tech's defense contributed two more points last Saturday against Virginia when Sr. LB Brant Mitchell sacked UVA QB Bryce Perkins for a crucial safety in the first quarter of the Yellow Jackets' eventual 30-27 overtime win. The safety was GT's first since a 65-10 win over Tulane on Sept. 12, 2015.
- The Jackets' No. 70 national rank in scoring defense is a bit misleading, as 28 of the 302 points scored against GT this season have been scored on special teams (two kickoff returns at USF on Sept. 8) or by the opponent's defense (fumble returns vs. Clemson on Sept. 22 and North Carolina on Nov. 3). Without the non-offensive scores, Georgia Tech would be tied for 53rd nationally in scoring defense at 24.9 points allowed per game.
- Woody's 3-4 defense recorded Georgia Tech's first shutout in 57 games in the Yellow Jackets' 41-0 victory over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The shutout was the Yellow Jackets' first since they blanked Syracuse, 56-0, on Oct. 19, 2013.

- Georgia Tech's defense also limited Alcorn State to just 146 yards of total offense, which is the second-lowest yardage total allowed by the Yellow Jackets in head coach **Paul Johnson's** 10-plus seasons at the helm. The only time that the Jackets surrendered fewer yards during Johnson's tenure came in his fifth game at Tech, when they allowed just 132 yards in a 27-0 win over Duke on Oct. 4, 2008.
- On Sept. 15 at Pitt, the Yellow Jackets' defense allowed 21 points and 215 yards in the opening half but buckled down in the second half, surrendering just three points and 120 yards after the break to allow the Jackets to nearly come back from a 21-0 deficit in an eventual 24-19 defeat.
- Over its final six possessions of the game, Pitt managed just three points and 114 yards of offense. Georgia Tech's defense forced three punts (two three-and-outs) and recorded an interception over those final six series.
- Georgia Tech limited Duke (Oct. 13) to just 304 yards of total offense, which is the fewest yards that Tech has surrendered to an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since Virginia Tech managed just 258 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 28-22 win over the No. 17 Hokies on Nov. 11 of last season.
- At Virginia Tech (Oct. 25), Georgia Tech's defense surrendered 216 yards and 21 points on Virginia Tech's first three possessions of the game, but limited VT to 37 yards and zero points over its next five possessions before the Hokies drove for an inconsequential touchdown on their final offensive series.
- Against Miami (Nov. 10), the Yellow Jackets limited the Hurricanes to 299 yards of total offense, 91 yards less than their season averaging going into the game (390.2 ypg). The Jackets were particularly stout against Miami's run game, surrendering just 134 yards on the ground, 63 less than the Hurricanes' season average going into the game (197.0 ypg).
- Georgia Tech has featured eight first-time starters on defense this season Jr. NT Brandon Adams, Sr. OLB Jalen Johnson, So. SS Tariq Carpenter, Sr. FS Malik Rivera*, So. CB Jaytlin Askew, redshirt Fr. CB Tre Swilling, So. CB Ajani Kerr and Fr. OLB Charlie Thomas.

 * Rivera started 18 games in three seasons at Wofford before transferring to Georgia Tech as a graduate student for this season.
- Tech has also played a whopping nine true freshmen on defense this season — DL T.K. Chimedza, DL Justice Dingle, LB Jordan Domineck, DL Quon Griffin, LB Quez Jackson, DB Jaylon King, LB Charlie Thomas, DB Juanyeh Thomas and CB Zamari Walton.
- Woody came to The Flats from Appalachian State, where he served as defensive coordinator from 2013-17. Over his last three seasons at App State (2015-17 the program's first three campaigns as full-fledged members of FBS), the Mountaineers' 3-4 scheme had average national rankings of 15th in scoring defense, 19th in total defense, 28th in rushing defense and 28th in passing defense.
- Appalachian also averaged 24 takeaways, 19 interceptions and 35 sacks per season over the last three campaigns, all areas where Georgia Tech ranked among the bottom 20 teams nationally in 2017.

- Saint-Amour has arguably been Georgia Tech's best defensive player with 42 tackles, 10.5 tackles for loss, four sacks, three forced fumbles, two interceptions and nine quarterback hurries this season. He leads the Yellow Jackets in TFL, sacks, forced fumbles and QB hurries and is tied for the team lead in interceptions.
- Saint-Amour's two interceptions are tied for the national lead among defensive linemen. He is one of only four defensive linemen with two interceptions (joining Maryland's Byron Cowart, Purdue's Kai Higgns and Toledo's Jamal Hines). His two INTs are tied for ninth in the ACC, regardless of position.
- Saint-Amour is tied for 24th nationally with .27 forced fumbles per game.
- Saint-Amour is tied for 22nd in the ACC with .36 sacks per game.
- Saint-Amour has been especially impressive over the past seven games, recording 33 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss, four sacks, three forced fumbles, seven quarerback hurries and two interceptions in the last seven contests (Sept. 29 vs. Bowling Green, Oct. 5 at Louisville, Oct. 13 vs. Duke, Oct. 25 at Virginia Tech, Nov. 3 at North Carolina, Nov. 10 vs. Miami and Nov. 17 vs. Virginia).
- Saint-Amour had a career day at North Carolina (Nov. 3), tallying nine tackles (career high), three quarterback hurries (career high), a tackle for loss, a pass breakup and an interception in the Yellow Jackets' 38-28 win.
- Saint-Amour's interception with less than two minutes to play thwarted a potential game-tying drive for UNC and set up a 22-yard field goal that sealed the Jackets' victory.
- In recognition of his performance against the Tar Heels, Saint-Amour was named the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for the first time in his career. He became the first Yellow Jacket to be named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week since KeShun Freeman earned the honor following the Yellow Jackets' 35-10 win over Virginia on Nov. 1, 2014.
- Saint-Amour also had a big day at Louisville (Oct. 5) with a team-high-tying six tackles, including a sack, a quarterback hurry and two forced fumbles. Both forced fumbles led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.
- Saint-Amour's two forced fumbles versus Louisville matched a single-game school record. He is the 10th student-athlete in Georgia Tech history to ever force two fumbles in a single game.

hurry that caused an interception and led directly to Georgia Tech's first touchdown of the game.

- At Virginia Tech (Oct. 25), Saint-Amour tallied two more tackles for loss, marking the third time in a four-game stretch that he recorded multiple stops behind the line of scrimmage.
- Saint-Amour's interception return for a touchdown against Bowling Green was the first by a Georgia Tech defensive lineman since current Cincinnati Bengal and 2018 GT Sports Hall of Fame inductee Michael Johnson returned an INT 26 yards for a score during a 41-23 win at No. 23 Miami (Fla.) on Nov. 20, 2008.
- Branch has also recorded an interception this season (vs. Clemson on Sept. 22), marking the first time in **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons as Georgia Tech's head coach that two different defensive linemen have had interceptions in the same season.

LINEBACKERS

- The heart and soul of Georgia Tech's defense is senior co-captain and inside linebacker Brant Mitchell. Mitchell ranks tied for second on the team with 51 tackles this season.
- After a slow start to his senior campaign (just 14 tackles through four games), Mitchell has notched 37 stops over the past seven contests, including a season-high nine against North Carolina (Nov. 5) and a team-high-tying eight against Miami (Nov. 10).
- Mitchell made one of the Yellow Jackets' biggest defensive plays of the season last Saturday versus Virginia when he sacked UVA QB Bryce Perkins for a first-quarter safety. The safety, Georgia Tech's first since a 65-10 win over Tulane on Sept. 12, 2015, was crucial to the Jackets' 30-27 overtime win over LIVA
- Making Mitchell's safety even more significant was the fact that freshman Juanyeh Thomas returned the ensuing free kick 77 yards for a touchdown. The Jackets added a two-point conversion, giving them 10 points in 11 seconds without taking an offensive snap.
- As the Yellow Jackets' middle linebacker last season,
 Mitchell ranked fourth on the team with 51 tackles despite playing in only seven full games and parts of two others due to a lower-body injury. His 5.7 tackles per game led the team
- In his first full game after returning to the lineup against
 No. 17 Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, Mitchell recorded a teamhigh nine tackles, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss, and was named ACC Co-Linebacker of the Week.
- In all, Georgia Tech went just 1-3 in the four games that Mitchell missed all or part of last season.
- After missing the entire 2017 season due to a foot injury, junior inside linebacker **David Curry** ranks seventh on the team with 37 tackles this season.
- Curry, whose career high for tackles coming into the season was three, recorded four (Sept. 1 vs. Alcorn State) and six (Sept. 8 vs. USF) tackles in Georgia Tech's first two games this season.
- The tally against USF likely would've been higher but he was ejected for a targeting call in the fourth quarter of the tough-luck loss on Sept. 8. Due to the ejection, Curry also had to sit out the first half of ACC opener at Pitt on Sept. 15.

- Curry scored Georgia Tech's first defensive touchdown of the season when he scooped up a fumble forced by nose tackle **Brandon Adams** and returned it 15 yards for a score early in the third quarter of the shutout win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The fumble return for a touchdown was the Yellow Jackets' first since P.J. Davis returned a fumble 38 yards for a score during the Jackets' 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Curry's return to action this season came following a series of injuries that kept him out of action last season (foot) and cost him time this past spring (thumb).
- Sophomore Bruce Jordan-Swilling, who has seen increased action as of late at inside linebacker, led Georgia Tech with a season-high eight tackles against Duke (Oct. 13).
- True freshman **Charlie Thomas** moved into the starting lineup at the "jack" outside linebacker position against Louisville on Oct. 5. In his first six career starts, he has tallied 29 tackles, three fumble recoveries, four quarterback hurries and a pass breakup.
- Thomas' three fumble recoveries this season are the most by a Yellow Jacket since Quayshawn Nealy in 2014 (3).
- Thomas is only the fourth Yellow Jacket in head coach **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons as Georgia Tech's head coach with as many as three fumble recoveries in a season (Derrick Morgan 4, 2008; Jerrard Terrant 3, 2010; Nealy 3, 2014).
- Thomas tied a single-game school record by recovering two fumbles in the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville. He is the 18th Yellow Jacket to recover two fumbles in a game. Both fumble recoveries led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.

- Thomas led Georgia Tech with a career-high nine tackles and his first-career sack at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25).
- Despite appearing in only nine games with just five starts, Thomas is sixth on the team with 40 tackles and ranks second on the squad with five quarterback hurries this season.
- Senior OLB **Victor Alexander**, who made the first five starts of the year at "jack," has played in all 46-of-47 games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He saw a string of 43-consecutive games played snapped when he did not appear in the Yellow Jackets' 49-28 victory at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25).
- Alexander returned to the starting lineup last Saturday against Virginia but made one of the biggest plays of the game on special teams when he recovered a muffed punt in the third quarter that set up Georgia Tech's second touchdown of the day in what proved to be a 30-27 overtime victory.

- Alexander turned in his finest statistical performance of the season against No. 3/2 Clemson on Sept. 22, finishing with a season-high seven tackles.
- Georgia Tech's fourth linebacker position the "stinger" OLB — is manned largely by two student-athletes that were tabbed for the secondary prior to Woody's arrival on The Flats — senior **Jalen Johnson** and junior **Christian Campbell**.
- Johnson has been one of Georgia Tech's best defensive players over the last three games, totaling 27 tackles and 5.5 tackles for loss in Georgia Tech's wins over North Carolina (Nov. 3), Miami (Nov. 10) and Virginia (last Saturday). He has matched a career high with nine tackles in all three contests
- In addition to his nine tackles last Saturday against Virginia, Johnson picked up his first-career sack in the Yellow Jackets' 30-27 overtime win.
- Johnson was named ACC Linebacker of the Week after tallying nine tackles and a career-high 3.0 tackles for loss in the win over Miami (Nov. 10).
- Making Johnson's numbers against Miami even more impressive is the fact that Georgia Tech limited the Hurricanes to just 53 offensive plays.
- Johnson also had a career day at North Carolina (Nov. 3), recording nine tackles for the first time in his career (prev. career high: six at USF, Sept. 8) and a then-career-high 1.5 tackles for loss (prev. career high: 1.0, twice - last at USF, Sept. 8).
- Despite being limited to the defensive backfield and special teams prior to this season, Johnson and Campbell have combined for 107 career tackles and 10.5 tackles for loss, including 67 stops and 8.5 TFL through 11 games this season.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

- Last season, Georgia Tech's starting secondary was comprised of five veterans that combined to make 127 starts and play in 218 games.
- However, none of the five members of last year's starting secondary returned in 2018. Lawrence Austin, Lance Austin, Step Durham and Corey Griffin all graduated while A.J. Gray had to step away from football due to a heart condition
- In their wake, the defensive backs listed on Georgia Tech's two-deep combined for zero starts and just 27 games played prior to this season.
- Of the eight DBs listed on Tech's two-deep, three are sophomores (CB Jaytlin Askew, SS Tariq Carpenter and CB Ajani Kerr), two are redshirt freshmen (CB Tre Swilling and SS Kaleb Oliver) and one is a true freshmen (FS Juanyeh Thomas).
- One of only two upperclassmen in the secondary's twodeep (and the only full-time starter), graduate student Malik Rivera leads Georgia Tech in tackles (58) and is tied for first in interceptions (two) through 11 games this season with Carpenter and Sr. DE Anree Saint-Amour.
- Rivera's team-high 58 tackles include 10 stops at North Carolina (Nov. 3), which were his most as a Yellow Jacket.

DEFENSE

- Rivera came to The Flats as a graduate transfer from Wofford, where he recorded 131 tackles but totaled just one interception over the past three seasons.
- Rivera's position coach at Wofford the last two seasons (and defensive coordinator in 2017) was **Shiel Wood**, who now serves as Georgia Tech's safeties coach.
- A spectacular student, Rivera graduated from Wofford in May as a triple-major in mathematics, finance and computer science. He is pursuing a master's degree in quantitative and computational finance at Georgia Tech.
- Rivera and Carpenter are tied for ninth in the ACC with two interceptions this season.
- Rivera's two INTs came in the Yellow Jackets' first two ACC games of the season (Sept. 15 at Pitt and Sept. 22 vs. Clemson).
- Carpenter's two INTs came at USF (Sept. 8) and at North Carolina (Nov. 3). Carpenter's fourth-quarter INT at UNC set up a 41-yard touchdown drive that saw Georgia Tech take a 35-28 lead with three minutes to go in the ballgame.
- Seven of Georgia Tech's 12 interceptions this season belong to safeties — Oliver (vs. Alcorn State), Carpenter (at USF, at UNC), Rivera (at Pitt, vs. Clemson) and Thomas (at Louisville).
- Thomas capped the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville (Oct. 5) by returning his first-career interception 95 yards for a touchdown.
- Thomas' 95-yard interception return is tied for the fifthlongest in school history and the longest by a Yellow Jacket in an ACC game (tied with Ken Swilling - 95 yds. vs. NC State, Sept. 9, 1989). It's also the longest INT return by a Jacket since Tyler Marcordes had a 95-yarder against Elon on Aug. 31, 2013.

- Fifth-year senior cornerback **Lamont Simmons** registered the first interception and fumble recovery of his collegiate career versus Duke (Oct. 13).
- The Yellow Jackets' other starting cornerback across from Simmons, redshirt freshman **Tre Swilling**, recorded his first-career interception at North Carolina (Nov. 3) and had a career-high two pass breakups vs. Miami (Nov. 10).



SPECIALISTS

- Georgia Tech's special teams played a huge role in last Saturday's 30-27 overtime win over Virginia.
- Most notably, true Fr. PK **Wesley Wells** made four field goals (28, 28, 48 and 40 yards) in the win. He became the eighth individual and first true freshman in Georgia Tech history to make four field goals in a single game.

- Wells' career-long 48-yarder gave Georgia Tech a 27-24 lead with 1:04 to go in regulation and his 40-yarder in overtime proved to be the winning points in the Yellow Jackets' 30-27 triumph.
- Wells was named ACC Specialist of the Week in recognition of his four made field goals against Virginia. He is the first Yellow Jacket to be named ACC Specialist of the Week since Lance Austin earned the honor following his gamewinning 78-yard return of a blocked field goal in the Yellow Jackets' "Miracle on Techwood Drive" victory over No. 9
 Florida State in 2015 and is only the seventh different Yellow Jacket to be named ACC Specialist of the Week since the award was introduced in 2004.
- Wells took over the place-kicking duties after winning an in-practice competition for the job in the week leading up to the Bowling Green game (Sept. 29). Since then, he has made the first 43 kicks of his career — 8-of-8 field goals and 35-of-35 PATs.
- Wells' first-career field goal was a 41-yarder at Louisville. It was the longest made FG by a Yellow Jacket since **Brenton King**, also a true freshman at the time, made a 42-yarder vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 21, 2017.
- The second field goal of Wells' career was a crucial one, a 22-yarder with 46 seconds remaining that sealed the Yellow Jackets' 38-28 victory at North Carolina (Nov. 3).
- Wells kicked multiple field goals in a game for the first time in his career when he nailed pivotal 38- and 23-yarders in a 27-21 win over Miami (Nov. 10).
- Also against Virginia, true freshman **Juanyeh Thomas** returned a free kick (after a GT safety) 77 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter of the 30-27 OT win.
- Officially considered a kickoff return for statistical purposes, Thomas' 77-yard return was Georgia Tech's first kickoff return for a TD since **Lamont Simmons'** 42-yard return of an onside-kick attempt in a 25-24 loss at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14, 2017.
- Thomas became the only the second true freshman in Georgia Tech history to return a kickoff for a touchdown, joining Dez White (1997).
- Thomas also made a huge special-teams play in punt coverage the previous week versus Miami (Nov. 3), when he raced downfield and needed just one arm to shove UM returner Jeff Thomas out of the way and recover a muffed punt at the Miami 10 yard line. The fumble recovery set up a pivotal third-quarter field goal in Georgia Tech's 27-21 win over the Hurricanes.

- Thomas' 25-yard punt return in the second quarter of the Sept. 1 season opener against Alcorn State was Georgia Tech's longest punt return since **Brad Stewart's** 26-yarder versus Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 1, 2016.
- Georgia Tech also got two huge plays on punts in last Saturday's win over Virginia. In the first quarter, So. P **Pressley Harvin III** boomed a 57-yard punt that was downed at the 1-yard line. Two plays later, Sr. LB **Brant Mitchell** sacked UVA QB Bryce Perkins for a safety, which immediately preceeded Thomas' free-kick return for a TD. In the third quarter, a 37-yard punt by Harvin bounced off UVA's Darrius Bratton and was recovered by Sr. LB **Victor Alexander**. The fumble recovery led to a touchdown drive that gave GT a 24-21 lead early in the fourth quarter of the eventual 30-27 overtime win.
- Georgia Tech boasts one of the nation's top punters in Harvin but, due to the Yellow Jackets' offensive proficiency, he has only been called upon to punt 27 times through nine games this season. He is averaging 45.4 yards per punt.
- Nine of Harvin III's 27 punts this season (including nine of his last 20) have traveled 50-plus yards while 12 of his 27 kicks (including 10 of his last 13) have been downed inside the 20-yard line.
- Harvin III does not qualify for official NCAA/ACC statistical rankings because he is far short of the minimum 3.6 attempts per game. However, if he did qualify, his 45.4-yard average would lead the ACC and rank 10th nationally.
- As a team, Georgia Tech leads the ACC and ranks fourth nationally in net punting average (42.7 avg.).
- Additionally, three of Harvin's booming punts have been muffed over the last four games, which led directly to a touchdown at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25), a field goal vs. Miami (Nov. 10) and a touchdown vs. Virginia (last Saturday).
- Harvin was one of only two non-true freshmen on the Yellow Jackets' travel roster to not see action during Georgia Tech's 66-31 rout at Louisville (Oct. 5). The other was senior long snapper **Zach Roberts**, who like Pressley, only goes on the field when the Jackets are forced to punt.
- In fact, Harvin III was called upon only once over a twogame stretch versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and Louisville. His lone punt versus BG traveled 53 yards and was downed at the 9-yard line.
- Last season, Harvin III led all NCAA Division I FBS true freshmen, ranked 16th overall nationally and was second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with a 44.1-yard punting average last season.
- Harvin's 44.1-yard average was also a Georgia Tech freshman record and ranked fifth overall in single-season program history.

- Of Harvin's 50 punts last season, 13 traveled 50-plus yards (26 percent), 16 were downed inside the 20 yard line (32 pct.), 15 were fair-caught (30 pct.) and 29 were not returned (58 pct.).
- Making Harvin's freshman campaign even more impressive was that two of his best performances came in less-than-ideal conditions for punting he recorded career-bests with a 62-yard punt and four kicks downed inside the 20 yard line at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 and had five punts that traveled 50 yards or more and three downed inside the 20 at Clemson on Oct. 28. The majority of both games were played during heavy rain storms.
- Following his incredible rookie campaign, Harvin III was named freshman all-America by the Football Writers Association of America, true freshman all-America by ESPN and was a third-team all-ACC honoree.
- Harvin III is on the official watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to college football's top punter.
 He was first added to the list midway through his prolific freshman campaign last fall.
- Harvin became only the third FWAA freshman all-American in school history (joining OL Will Jackson, 2010, and PK Travis Bell, 2004) and the first Georgia Tech freshman to earn all-ACC recognition since Calvin Johnson (first-team WR) and Bell (second-team PK) in '04.
- Georgia Tech has blocked 19 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the seventh-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

- USF's 266 yards on kickoff returns on Sept. 8 which included 98- and 97-yard returns for touchdowns by Terrence Horne in the first quarter were the second-most yards that Georgia Tech has ever allowed on kickoff returns in a single game (second only to North Carolina's 267 yards in a 68-50 GT win on Nov. 10, 2012).
- \bullet The two touchdowns allowed on kickoff returns against USF tied an NCAA Division I FBS single-game record.
- In the Yellow Jackets' 61 kickoffs since Horne's back-to-back touchdowns at USF (not including an onside kick attempt versus Duke on Oct. 13), Georgia Tech has pinned the opponent at or inside its 25-yard line 37 times (with one of the exceptions being on a squib kick on the first kickoff following the two TD returns at USF). Junior **Shawn Davis** has taken 59 of those 61 kickoffs (Wells took two kickoffs vs. Miami on Nov. 10).

• At 5-3 in Atlantic Coast Conference play, Georgia Tech is guaranteed to finish no worse than tied for second in the ACC Coastal Division standings for the seventh time in head coach **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons as head coach and the eighth time in 14 seasons since the ACC split into divisions in 2005.

- In the 11 seasons since Johnson's arrival at Georgia Tech in 2008, the only other ACC teams that have finished first or second in their division as many times as Georgia Tech (7) are Clemson (9), Florida State (7) and Virginia Tech (7).
- Georgia Tech finshed no worse than .500 in ACC play for the 23rd time in the last 24 seasons. Since 1995, the only time that Georgia Tech hasn't finished at least .500 in ACC play was 2015, when the injury-ravaged Yellow Jackets were 1-7 in conference action.
- In 35 seasons since officially joining the ACC in 1983, the Jackets have finished .500 or better 30 times.

- Of the teams widely considered to be Georgia Tech's closest academic peers at the Power 5 level Duke, Notre Dame, Northwestern, Purdue, Stanford and Vanderbilt only Stanford (9) has played in more bowl games over the last 10 seasons than the Yellow Jackets (8).
- Bobby Dodd Stadium has been home sweet home for Georgia Tech of late, as it is 12-3 in its last 15 home games, dating back to midway through the 2016 season. The only three home losses during that span have been at the hands of Georgia (Nov. 25, 2017), Clemson (Sept. 22, 2018) and Duke (Oct. 13, 2018).
- The Yellow Jackets' 28-14 loss to Duke snapped their nine-game winning streak versus unranked opponents at home.
- On the flip side, Georgia Tech has struggled in games played away from its Midtown Atlanta home over the past two seasons. The Yellow Jackets are just 3-7 in games played away from Bobby Dodd Stadium since the beginning of the 2017 season.
- However, the Jackets have emphatically snapped a sevengame away-from-home skid with impressive wins in each of their last three road games — a 66-31 romp at Louisville

(Oct. 5), a 49-28 rout at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25) and a 38-28 triumph at North Carolina (Nov. 3).

- Georgia Tech has won three-straight games away from home since the first time since it won at Virginia Tech (Nov. 12), at Georgia (Nov. 26) and vs. Kentucky at the TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31) to close the 2016 season.
- Georgia Tech has won three-straight true road games for the first time since it won at Pittsburgh (Oct. 25), NC State (Nov. 8) and Georgia (Nov. 29) in 2014.
- Georgia Tech has won three-straight ACC road games for the first time since it won at Duke (Nov. 14, 2009), North Carolina (Sept. 18, 2010) and Wake Forest (Oct. 2, 2010).
- Georgia Tech won three-straight ACC games in a single season for the first time since it won at Florida State (Oct. 10), Virginia (Oct. 24) and Duke (Nov. 14) in 2009.
