- Georgia Tech looks to become bowl eligible for the 20th time in the last 22 seasons and keep its Atlantic Coast Conference Coastal Division championship hopes alive when it hosts Miami (Fla.) for a key ACC game on Saturday night.
- Georgia Tech (5-4, 3-3 ACC) has won four of its last five games to rebound from a 1-3 start and remain in contention for its fifth ACC Coastal Division title in 11 seasons under head coach Paul Johnson.
- The Yellow Jackets continue to put up historic numbers in their rushing game. Tech is ranked No. 1 nationally in rushing offense with 377.0 yards on the ground per game, a whopping 70.4 yards per game more than the nation's No. 2-ranked rushing offense. Army West Point (306.6 vpg).
- Georgia Tech is on pace to finish with the most rushing yards per game of any NCAA Division I FBS team since Army averaged 378.6 rushing yards per game in 2012. It would also be the most rushing yards per game by a Power Five conference team since Nebraska averaged 399.8 yards per game on the ground in 1995.
- Defensively, Georgia Tech has climbed to No. 8 nationally with 20 forced turnovers this season. That is double the number of takeaways that the Jackets had all of last season, when they finished 124th out of 128 teams nationally in turnovers gained.
- Saturday's contest is Georgia Tech's annual Whiteout game at Bobby Dodd Stadium. The tradition began with a nationally televised primetime win over tonight's opponent, Miami (Fla.), in 2008. The Yellow Jackets have won three of the last four Whiteout games, including a 28-17 win over Miami in 2014 and the "Miracle on Techwood Drive" triumph over No. 9 Florida State in 2015, both of which were played under the lights at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

The Yellow Jackets continue to put up unprecedented numbers in their rushing game. Tech comes into today's game ranked No. 1 nationally in rushing offense with 377.0 yards on the ground per game, a whopping 70.4 yards per game more than the nation's No. 2-ranked rushing offense, Army West Point (306.6 ypg). To put the gap between No. 1 Georgia Tech and No. 2 Army in perspective, the 70.4-yards-per-game gap between the Yellow Jackets and the Black Knights is larger than the gap between Army and No. 15 Ohio (236.3 ypg).

Georgia Tech has two quarterbacks ranked among the top 25 nationally in rushing touchdowns (Tobias Oliver - 12, tseventh **TaQuon Marshall** - 9, t-24th) and among the top 50 nationally in rushing yards per game (Oliver - 97.5 ypg, 26th and Marshall - 82.4 ypg, 45th). Only one other NCAA Division I FBS team has two guarterbacks even ranked among the top 100 nationally in rushing touchdowns (Air Force) and no other FBS team has two QBs among the top 200 in rushing yards per game.

Georgia Tech has three defensive touchdowns through nine games this season, which is tied for the most in the ACC (with Miami and Wake Forest) and seventh nationally (Fresno State and Temple lead the nation with five defensive TDs apiece).

Georgia Tech has already set a new school record with five 400-yard rushing games this season, breaking the previous record of four set just last season.

Georgia Tech has forced 20 turnovers in eight games this season after finishing last season with 10 takeaways in 11 games. The Yellow Jackets are currently tied for eighth nationally in takeaways after finishing last season ranked 124th out of 128 NCAA Division I FBS teams.

Twenty-six of the 34 400-yard rushing games in Georgia Tech history (including five this season) have come in Paul Johnson's 11 seasons as the Yellow Jackets' head coach (2008-pres.). Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400 yards in a game 26 times in 138 contests (once every 5.3 games). Prior to his arrival, the Yellow Jackets had rushed for 400 yards in a game eight times in 1,138 contests (once every 142.3 games). Johnson's previous team, Navy, is the only NCAA Division I FBS team that has more 400-yard rushing games since 2008 (33). The second-most 400-yard rushing games by a Power 5 conference team since '08 is 12 by Oregon.

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- move it to 6-4 overall and even its record in ACC play at
- make the Yellow Jackets bowl-eligible for the 20th time in 22 seasons;
- ensure a .500 or better finish in ACC play for the 23rd time in the last 24 seasons;
- be its third-straight victory, which would be its longest winning streak since it won four games in a row to close the 2016 season;
- be its 11th win in its last 14 home games;
- snap a three-game losing streak versus Miami (Fla.) and be its second win in the last 10 meetings with the Hurricanes:
- · even its all-time record against Miami at 12-12;
- . be its fourth win in its last five Whiteout games at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ..

- drop it to 5-5 overall and 3-4 in ACC play;
- · leave it needing a win in one of its last two games (vs. Virginia, at Georgia) to become bowl-eligible for the 20th time in the last 22 seasons;
- leave it needing a win vs. Virginia to avoid finishing below .500 in ACC play for only the second time in the last 24
- be its fourth-straight and ninth in its last 10 games vs. Miami (Fla.);
- · give it back-to-back home defeats for the first time since it dropped consecutive home games to No. 5 Clemson and No. 14 Miami on Sept. 22 and Oct. 1, 2016.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S WIN AT NORTH CAROLINA

- A pair of timely interceptions led to Georgia Tech scoring 10 points in the final three minutes of a 38-28 win at North Carolina last Saturday.
- Georgia Tech led 28-10 midway through the third quarter but North Carolina scored the game's next 18 points to pull even at 28-28 early in the fourth period.
- The score remained 28-28 until Fr. SS **Tariq Carpenter** intercepted a pass to give the Yellow Jackets the ball at the North Carolina 41-yard line with 8:07 to go in the game. Nine plays later, r-Fr. QB **Tobias Oliver** scored his second touchdown of the day from a yard out and the Jackets regained a 35-28 lead.
- On the first play of the ensuing drive, Sr. DE Anree Saint-Amour dropped into coverage and picked off another pass
 Georgia Tech's third interception of the game to give the Yellow Jackets the ball back at the UNC 19. Fr. Wesley Wells nailed a 22-yard field goal with 46 seconds to go to seal the victory.
- Georgia Tech intercepted three passes on the day (r-Fr. CB **Tre Swilling** had GT's first INT of the day in the first quarter), which were the Yellow Jackets' most interceptions in a game since it also picked off three passes in a 31-17 win over Virginia on Nov. 19, 2016. Georgia Tech intercepted three passes in a road game for the first time since Sept. 20, 2014 at Virginia Tech.
- Georgia Tech outgained the Tar Heels, 565-374, including a 461-166 edge in rushing yards.
- The 400-yard rushing game was the Yellow Jackets' fifth of the season, breaking the school record of four set just last season.
- With its fourth win in the last five games, Georgia Tech upped its record to 5-4 on the season and moved above .500 for the first time since it opened the season at 1-0.
- The Jackets climbed to .500 in ACC play (3-3) for the first time this season.
- Georgia Tech won its third-straight road game (Oct. 5 at Louisville, Oct. 25 at Virginia Tech, last Saturday at North Carolina). Prior to the win at Louisville, the Yellow Jackets had lost seven-straight games away from home.
- Georgia Tech's 86-yard touchdown pass from Oliver to Sr. AB **Qua Searcy** in the second quarter was the sixth-longest pass play in school history and the Yellow Jackets' longest since an 87-yard touchdown pass from Joshua Nesbitt to Embry Peebles vs. Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.
- Oliver, who entered the game at the beginning of Georgia Tech's fourth offensive possession of the game, rushed for 120 yards, his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the season.
- Oliver's 104 passing yards were a career high (prev.: 34 vs. Duke, Oct. 13).
- So. BB **Jerry Howard** had a career-high 90 rushing yards (prev.: 82 at Pitt, Sept. 15).
- Jr. AB **Nathan Cottrell** had a career-high 90 rushing yards (prev.: 83 vs. Virginia Tech, Nov. 11, 2017)
- Swilling's interception was the first of his career.
- Sr. ILB **Brant Mitchell's** nine tackles were a season high (prev.: eight vs. Bowling Green, Sept. 29).

NOTING MIAMI

- After 5-1 start, Miami (Fla.) has lost three-straight games coming into Saturday's game at Georgia Tech.
- The Hurricanes' three-game skid includes losses at Virginia (16-13 on Oct. 13), at Boston College (27-14 on Oct. 26) and vs. Duke (20-12 last Saturday).
- Prior to the three-game losing streak, Miami had won five in a row and climed to as high as No. 15 in the national rankings.
- The Hurricanes' were ranked No. 8 nationally in the preseason but fell in the polls after a 33-17 season-opening loss to LSU.
- Since starting last season 10-0, Miami is just 5-7 in its last 12 games.
- Miami is defined by its defense, which is ranked No. 2 nationally in total defense (264.7 ypg).
- On the flip side, the Hurricanes are 77th nationally in total offense (390.2 ypg).
- The Hurricanes' veteran defense features nine upperclassmen (four seniors and five juniors) among its 11 listed starters.
- Miami has brought out its famed "turnover chain" 19 times this season (one fewer than Georgia Tech's 20 takeaways).
- Former Georgia head coach Mark Richt is in his third season at Miami. He is facing Georgia Tech for the 18th-straight season, which included a 15-year stint as the head coach at UGA (2001-15).

GEORGIA TECH-MIAMI SERIES HISTORY

- In a series that dates back to 1955, Georgia Tech and Miami are meeting for the 24th time overall and 15th time as Atlantic Coast Conference foes.
- Miami holds a slim 12-11 advantage in the all-time series.
 Georgia Tech won 10 of the first 14 games in the series but
 Miami has won eight of the last nine.
- The home team has won 15 of the 23 games in series history.
- Georgia Tech is just 2-8 against Miami under head coach **Paul Johnson**. The Hurricanes are one of only three ACC teams that Johnson has a sub-.500 record against in his 11 seasons with the Yellow Jackets (5-6 vs. Virginia Tech, 4-7 vs. Clemson).

NOTING LAST YEAR'S LOSS AT MIAMI

- A miraculous catch on fourth-and-10 with less than a minute to play lifted No. 11/10 Miami (Fla.) to a 25-24 win over Georgia Tech last Saturday in Miami Gardens, Fla.
- Facing fourth-and-10 from Georgia Tech's 43-yard line with 42 seconds left on the clock, Miami's Malik Rosier tossed a desperation pass down the right sideline to Darrell Langham, who was blanketed by Tech reserve cornerback **Lamont Simmons** on the right sideline. Simmons deflected the ball, which then hit Langham's helmet and somehow fell into the lap of the Miami receiver as he fell to the ground. Langham held on for a 28-yard gain.
- Two plays later, kicker Michael Badgely made his fourth field goal of the game from 24 yards out to give Miami a 25-24 lead with four seconds to go in the ballgame.
- In all, the Yellow Jackets trailed for only 3:47 in the ballgame, including just the final four seconds of the second half.
- After falling behind 3-0, Georgia Tech jumped out to leads of 14-3 and 24-13 before Miami rallied for the victory.
- Tech rushed for 226 yards but only 54 came in the second half, which featured a heavy rainstorm that turned the Hard Rock Stadium turf into a mud pit.
- The Yellow Jackets lost three starters to injury in the second half of the defeat—BB **KirVonte Benson**, LB **Brant Mitchell** and PK **Shawn Davis**.
- AB J.J. Green led the Jackets offensively with two touchdowns (five-yard run, three-yard reception) in the first half.
- Georgia Tech's only other touchdown came on the opening kickoff of the second half when Simmons returned a flubbed onside-kick attempt 42 yards for a score.
- Junior AB **Clinton Lynch** led Georgia Tech with 71 rushing yards on just five carries (14.2 avg.).



GEORGIA TECH vs. NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

- Georgia Tech has 92 wins in 271 all-time matchups versus teams ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25.
- The Yellow Jackets officially own 12 wins over ranked teams in 10 seasons under head coach Paul Johnson. A 13th victory, a 39-34 triumph over No. 25 Clemson in the 2009 ACC Championship Game, was later vacated due to NCAA sanctions.

- The Yellow Jackets' 542 yards on the ground against Louisville were the most by an FBS team since Navy ran for 559 yards at SMU on Nov. 11 of last season and were the most by and against a Power Five conference team since Auburn ran for 543 yards at Arkansas on Oct. 22, 2016.
- In its five wins this season, Georgia Tech has turned the ball over a total of six times (1.2 per game - although all six have come against Alcorn State-3 and North Carolina-3). In their four losses, the Yellow Jackets have turned the ball over nine times (2.25 per game).
- After committing nine turnovers through the first 13 quarters of this season (first three games plus first quarter of Game 4 vs. Clemson), Georgia Tech went 234-consecutive plays (offensive snaps plus returns) without a turnover over the next 13 quarters (final three quarters vs. Clemson, full games vs. Bowling Green and Louisville and first two quarters vs. Duke).
- However, that streak came to emphatic halt when the Yellow Jackets lost fumbles on three-straight plays late in the third quarter of its 28-14 loss to Duke on Oct. 13. Those fumbles (by BB **Jerry Howard**, QB **TaQuon Marshall** and KR Juanyeh Thomas) led directly to Duke scoring 21 points in the final 1:49 of the third period, turning what was a 7-7 ballgame into a 28-14 defeat.
- The Yellow Jackets got back on track by not committing any turnovers in their 49-28 win at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25).
- However, the turnover bug returned in big way last Saturday, as the Jackets had to overcome three lost fumbles in their 38-28 victory at North Carolina
- In all, after committing nine turnovers in its first four games of the season (one turnover every 31.3 plays), Georgia Tech has committed only six turnovers in the last five games (one every 59.3 plays).
- Last season, GT committed eight turnovers in its first four games of the season (one turnover every 37.8 plays) but had only six turnovers over the final seven games of the campaign (one turnover every 74.8 plays).



- Despite having only one turnover against No. 3/2 Clemson on Sept. 22, Georgia Tech fumbled eight times in the loss. The eight fumbles are tied for the second-most in school history (record: 9 at Miami, Nov. 21, 2015). The Yellow Jackets' eight fumbles marked only the third time in the past 46 seasons (dating back to 1973) that they have fumbled as many as seven times in a contest.
- Over their last 28 games, the Yellow Jackets have punted only 95 times (3.39 per game) and have come away with points on 139 of their 328 offensive possessions (42.4 percent).
- . Georgia Tech has scored at least 24 points in 18 of its last 24 games.
- The Yellow Jackets had a streak of 10-consecutive 24-point games that ran from Nov. 12, 2016 (at Virginia Tech) through Oct. 21, 2017 (vs. Wake Forest). At the time, it was the fifth-longest active streak in the nation and the second-longest active streak in the ACC. It was also tied for the fourth-longest string of games with 24 points or more in Georgia Tech history.
- · Georgia Tech has played 270-consecutive games without being shut out, good for the seventh-longest active streak in NCAA Division LFBS.
- The Yellow Jackets have not been held scoreless since a 38-0 loss at No. 3 Florida State on Oct. 18, 1997.
- Even more impressively, Georgia Tech has not been blanked at home since a 7-0 loss to Georgia on Nov. 30, 1957 — good for a streak of 377-straight games played at Bobby Dodd Stadium without being shut out.

- Georgia Tech's senior signal-caller put together perhaps the finest two-game stretch of his career in wins over Bowling Green (63-17 on Sept. 29) and Louisville (66-31 on Oct. 5). He rushed 36 times for 217 yards (6.0 avg.) and four touchdowns while completing 6-of-8 passes for 172 yards (75.0 comp. pct., 21.5 yds./att., 28.7 yds./comp.) to lead the Yellow Jackets to the blowout wins.
- Marshall led the Jackets to points in 14-straight offensive series that he guarterbacked — his final series vs. Clemson on Sept. 22 (TD), all six series vs. BG on Sept. 29 (6 TD) and all seven series at Louisville on Oct. 5 (6 TD, 1 FG).
- On Oct. 5 at Louisville, Marshall rushed for 175 yards on 23 carries (7.6 avg.). The 175 yards on the ground were a season-high and the second-highest rushing total of his career (behind only his Georgia Tech quarterback-record 249 yards in the 2017 season opener versus Tennessee).
- Marshall was named ACC Quarterback of the Week following his impressive performances against Louisville. The ACC award is the second of his career. He was named ACC Offensive Back of the Week following his record-breaking performance in last season's opener versus Tennessee.
- Marshall has registered six of the 13 highest single-game rushing totals by a guarterback in Georgia Tech history.

- Marshall's six 100-yard rushing games in 2017 were the most ever by a Georgia Tech quarterback and tied for eighth in GT single-season history, regardless of position.
- Despite missing significant time in the second half on Sept. 8 at USF due to a lower-body injury, Marshall passed for a career-high 183 yards (prev.: 179 at Virginia, Nov. 4, 2017) and ran for 113 more. It marked the third time in his career that he rushed and passed for at least 100 yards in the same game and the seventh time that he has rushed and passed for a touchdown.



OFFENSE

- Marshall also had the longest completion of his career at USF, an 81-yard touchdown strike to senior AB **Clinton Lynch** (prev.: 80 to Ricky Jeune vs. Virginia Tech, Nov. 11, 2017).
- While his 183 passing yards at USF remain a season and career high, Marshall turned in his most efficient passing performance of the season against Bowling Green on Sept. 29, when he completed 5-of-6 passes for 160 yards. Four of his five completions went for at least 33 yards.
- Marshall's 307.33 pass-efficiency rating versus Bowling Green was the second-highest of his career (career high: 347.26 vs. Jacksonville State, Sept. 9, 2017) and easily his highest of the season (prev.: 131.51 at USF, Sept. 8).
- Marshall's 17 rushing touchdowns last season were the third-most by a quarterback in Georgia Tech single-season history.

- With 104.2 rushing yards per game last season, Marshall became the first quarterback and only the third Yellow Jacket overall to average 100 rushing yards per game in a single season in 10 seasons under head coach **Paul Johnson**, joining Jonathan Dwyer (107.3 ypg 2008) and Anthony Allen (101.2 ypg 2010).
- Marshall burst on to the national stage with a recordsetting performance versus Tennessee in last year's season opener. Making the first start of his career, Marshall set three school records and one ACC record against the Vols.

- Marshall's 249 rushing yards against Tennessee were also the third-most in Georgia Tech history, regardless of position (behind only 356 by Eddie Lee Ivery vs. Air Force - Nov. 11, 1978 and 307 by P.J. Daniels vs. Tulsa, Humanitarian Bowl - Jan. 4, 2004).
- Marshall's 249 rushing yards against Tennessee were the fifth-most by an FBS quarterback and tied for the 15th-most by any FBS student-athlete in a game last season.
- Marshall's five rushing touchdowns against UT were tied for the most in the nation by any student-athlete in a single game last season.
- Marshall is on the official watch list for the 2018 Maxwell Award, presented to "America's College Player of the Year."
 He is joined on the list by Georgia Tech B-back KirVonte Benson.

- Despite being Marshall's backup for all but one game, redshirt freshman **Tobias Oliver** has also burst onto the national scene this season, particularly following his performances in the last two games versus Virginia Tech (Oct. 25) and North Carolina (last Saturday).
- Making his first-career start in place of Marshall, who sustained an upper-body injury in the previous game against Duke (Oct. 13), Oliver rushed for 215 yards on 40 carries (both career highs) and scored three touchdowns (matching a career high) to lead Georgia Tech to a 49-28 victory at VT.
- Oliver's 215 rushing yards against Virginia Tech were the second-most by a quarterback and seventh-most overall in Georgia Tech single-game history (see p. 7 for list of top rushing performances by GT QBs).
- Oliver's 40 carries against VT were the second-most in GT single-game history (behind only Marshall's 44 vs. Tennessee, Sept. 4, 2017).
- Oliver's 215 rushing yards against VT were temporarily the most by an ACC player this season (Wake Forest's Matt Colburn surpassed Oliver's total with 243 rushing yards against Louisville on Oct. 27).
- Oliver's 215 rushing yards against VT remain the secondmost by an NCAA Division I FBS quarterback, the most by an FBS QB against an FBS opponent and the 14th-most by any FBS player, regardless of position, this season.
- Last Saturday at North Carolina, Oliver replaced Marshall at quarterback before the Yellow Jackets' fourth offensive series and remained under center for the duration of the 38-28 victory (the score was tied, 7-7, when Oliver entered the game).
- Oliver accounted for 224 yards (120 rushing, 104 passing) and three touchdowns (two rushing, one passing) in the 38-28 win at UNC. He ran 28 times and completed 2-of-2 passes.
- Oliver's 2-for-2, 104-yard passing effort against UNC included an 86-yard touchdown pass to Sr. AB Qua Searcy.
 The touchdown pass was the sixth-longest pass play in Georgia Tech history and the Yellow Jackets' longest since Joshua Nesbitt threw an 87-yard TD pass to Embry Peeples at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.
- Oliver has been named ACC Rookie of the Week following each of the last two games, becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn the honor in back-to-back weeks since WR Calvin Johnson in 2004 (Nov. 15 vs. Connecticut and Nov. 22 vs. Virginia).

- Oliver's 5.91 yards per rush ranks fifth among all freshmen nationally (regardless of position) and his 97.5 rushing yards per game rank second among FBS freshmen.
- Oliver's 27.67 yards per completion would lead the nation but he falls short of the 15 passes per game needed to qualify for the official national/conference rankings (Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa tops the official rankings with 17.89 yards per completion).
- Oliver has led the Yellow Jackets to scores on 20 of the 32 full possessions that he's led this year (19 touchdowns, one field goal), not including abbreviated series at the end of halves (he has also closed out two touchdown drives that he wasn't on the field for the start of).
- Oliver was impressive in relief of Marshall in the Yellow Jackets' wins vs. Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and at Louisville (Oct. 5). He was on the field for a total of just five series in those two games (not including abbreviated series to run out the clock at the end of each game) and led the Yellow Jackets to four touchdowns while running for more than 100 yards in each game (115 vs. BG, 103 at Louisville) and averging a whopping 14.5 yards per carry (218 yards on 15 attempts).
- On Sept. 8 at USF, Oliver replaced Marshall on the third play of the second half and engineered the Jackets' next three drives. GT scored touchdowns on all three series, with Oliver capping each drive with a touchdown (five, one and one yards).
- Of the 23 plays that Oliver was on the field for at USF, he carried the ball himself 18 times and accounted for 97 of the 189 yards that the Yellow Jackets gained while he was in the game.
- Oliver finished with 97 yards on 18 carries (5.4 avg.) and three touchdowns, all on the ground, against USF.
- Despite only playing for a little more than a quarter, Oliver's three touchdowns at USF marked the 48th time in school history that an individual has rushed for three TDs in a game.
- In the win over Louisville (Oct. 5), Marshall and Oliver became the first quarterback tandem in Georgia Tech history to both rush for 100 yards in the same game (Marshall -175, Oliver - 103).
- Marshall and Oliver are both ranked among the top 20 nationally in rushing touchdowns (Oliver 10, t-eighth and Marshall 9, t-16) and among the top 50 nationally in rushing yards per game (Oliver 94.3 ypg, 29th and Marshall 85.4 ypg). No other NCAA Division I FBS team has two quarterbacks even ranked among the top 100 nationally in rushing touchdowns or has two QBs among the top 200 in rushing yards per game.
- With a season-ending foot injury sustained by presumed backup quarterback **Lucas Johnson** during preseason camp, Marshall is the only active quarterback on Georgia Tech's roster that came into the 2018 season with any collegiate playing experience.

OFFENSE

RUNNING BACKS

- Head coach **Paul Johnson** said prior to the season that the deepest position on Georgia Tech's roster was likely B-back. That depth has been tetsted and proven through nine games this season.
- The biggest test of Georgia Tech's depth at the B-back position has been a season-ending knee injury sustained by junior **KirVonte Benson** during the first quarter of Georgia Tech's second game of the season at USF (Sept. 8).
- Benson, who ran for 1,053 yards as a sophomore in 2017, had 116 rushing yards and two touchdowns in less than three quarters of action this season before sustaining the season-ending injury at USF.
- Sharing the workload at B-back in Benson's absence have been redshirt freshman **Jordan Mason** and sophomore **Jerry Howard**.
- Mason ranks third on the team (first among nonquarterbacks) with 604 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns.
- Mason's 6.43 yards-per-rush average ranks second on the squad (min. 20 carries).
- Mason's 6.43 yards per carry leads all freshmen nationally and ranks 16th in the nation overall.
- Mason's 67.1 rushing yards per game rank eighth nationally among freshmen and 90th overall.

- In Georgia Tech's 49-28 win at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25),
 Mason set a career high with three rushing touchdowns (5, 14 and 1 yards).
- Mason has scored six touchdowns over the last five games (two vs. Bowling Green on Sept. 29, one at Louisville on Oct. 5, three at VT).
- Howard ranks fourth on the team (second among non-QBs) with 433 rushing yards and four rushing touchdowns this season.
- Howard rushed for a career-high 90 yards on just 10 carries (9.0 avg.) in last Saturday's 38-28 win at North Carolina.
- Howard also hauled in his second reception of the season (and third of his career) at UNC, an 18-yarder.
- Howard has scored a touchdown in each of the last three games — on a 5-yard run versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29), a 2-yard plunge at Louisville (Oct. 5), a 2-yard run versus Duke (Oct. 13) and an 8-yard run at Virginia Tech (last Thursday).
- In his first extensive action of the year, Howard ran for 82 yards on just eight carries (10.2 avg.) at Pitt (Sept. 15).

• Serving as Benson's top backup last season, Howard's 7.6 yards per carry ranked second on the team last season, behind only A-back **Nathan Cottrell** (8.2 avg.).

- Benson opened the 2018 season by rushing for 75 yards on 10 carries (7.5 avg.) and matching a career-high with two touchdowns (five and eight yards) in a 41-0 win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. He played just two quarters in the opener, after sitting out the first quarter due to a minor violation of team rules and the fourth quarter when most of GT's regulars were removed from the game.
- On Sept. 8 at USF, Benson ran for 41 yards on just five carries (8.2 avg.) before sustaining the season-ending injury on Georgia Tech's second offensive series of the game.
- Benson, who did not have a collegiate carry prior to last season, rushed for 1,053 yards and six touchdowns as a sophomore in 2017. He ranked fifth in the ACC and 35th nationally with 95.7 rushing yards per game last season.
- Benson became only the third B-back in Paul Johnson's 10 seasons as head coach to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, joining Jonathan Dwyer (2008 and 2009) and Anthony Allen (2010).

- Georgia Tech is loaded with experience at the A-back position, where it boasts three upperclassmen with extensive playing experience — fifth-year seniors Clinton Lynch and Qua Searcy and Cottrell, a junior.
- For their careers, the A-back trio has combined to rush for 2,614 yards and 18 touchdowns on 324 carries (8.1 avg.) and catch 64 passes for 1,581 yards (24.7 avg.) and 14 touchdowns. As a group, they are averaging 10.8 yards per touch from scrimmage for their careers.
- Between them, Lynch, Searcy and Cottrell have combined for 1,107 all-purpose yards through the first nine games of this season — 690 rushing yards on 82 carries (8.4 avg.) and 417 receiving yards on 17 receptions (24.5 avg.). Georgia Tech is averaging 11.2 yards per play every time one of them touches the ball in 2018.

 Cottrell (11-yard run), Searcy (86-yard reception) and Lynch (4-yard run) all scored touchdowns last Saturday at North Carolina, marking the first time that each member of

the A-back trio has ever scored in the same game.

- With a 41-yard reception in the second quarter versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29), Lynch became the first studentathlete in Georgia Tech history with 1,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in a career.
- Since the beginning of 2016, 27 of Lynch's 111 touches have gone for 20 yards or more (12 rushes, 15 receptions 24.3 percent) and 10 of his 111 touches have gone for 40 yards or more (three rushes, seven receptions).
- On Sept. 8 at USF, Lynch hauled in an 81-yard touchdown reception from quarterback **TaQuon Marshall**. The play was the second-longest reception of Lynch's career (long: 83 from Justin Thomas vs. North Carolina, Nov. 5, 2016) and the longest completion of Marshall's career.
- Lynch is one of only two student-athletes in Georgia Tech history with two receptions of 80 yards or longer in his career, joining Dez White (1997-99).
- Searcy's 86-yard touchdown reception from r-Fr. QB
 Tobias Oliver last Saturday at North Carolina was the sixthlongest pass play in school history and the Yellow Jackets'
 longest reception since Embry Peeples' 87-yard catch from
 Joshua Nesbitt at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.
- Searcy ran for two touchdowns (two and one yards) for the first time in his career at Louisville (Oct. 5). The two-TD game was the second of his career he ran for a touchdown and caught another as a redshirt freshman vs. Tulane on Sept. 12, 2015.
- Searcy's 91 rushing yards against Mercer on Sept. 10, 2016 remain the most by a Georgia Tech A-back since



OFFENSE

Robert Godhigh ran for 126 yards in a 55-31 defeat at Clemson on Nov. 14, 2013.

- After not finding the end zone in any of the first 25 games
 of his career, Cottrell has scored touchdowns in three of the
 last six games a two-yarder against No. 3/2 Clemson
 (Sept. 22), a four-yarder versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29)
 and an 11-yarder last Saturday at North Carolina.
- Cottrell rushed for 90 yards on nine carries (both career highs) in last Saturday's 38-28 win at UNC.

WIDE RECEIVERS

- After catching just four passes as a junior last season, senior wide receiver **Brad Stewart** already has 11 receptions through nine games this season.
- Stewart set a career high four catches against Alcorn State on Sept. 1, surpassing his previous career-high of three, which he achieved three times (twice as a sophomore in 2016, once as a freshman in 2015).
- Stewart's four catches against Alcorn State included the second touchdown reception of his career when quarterback TaQuon Marshall found him wide open in the corner of the end zone for a 24-yard scoring strike.
- After going the first 33 games of his career without a touchdown catch, Stewart has two TDs in the last 12 games.
 On Nov. 11 of last season, Stewart hauled in a 60-yard touchdown pass in the Jackets' 28-22 win over No. 17
 Virginia Tech.
- Stewart has been consistently praised by head coach **Paul Johnson** throughout the season for the role that his blocking has played in Georgia Tech's rushing offense, which leads the nation with 377.0 yards per game.
- Stewart was limited to just one reception for 12 yards against Louisville on Oct. 5 (albeit a big catch, as it gave Georgia Tech a first down that set up a touchdown with less than a minuted to go in the first half) but was named one of the Yellow Jackets' players of the week by the coaching staff. He was recognized not only for his reception but for the role that his blocking played in Georgia Tech's 542-yard rushing performance and being the holder on all 10 of the Jackets' successful place kicks (nine PAT and a FG).
- Stewart leads all current Yellow Jackets with 36-consecutive starts (the next-longest streak on the team belongs to junior OL **Parker Braun**, who has made 28-straight starts).
- Stewart has also played in all 45 of Georgia Tech's games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He is the only student-athlete on the Yellow Jackets' current roster that has played all 45 games since the beginning of '15.
- The starter opposite Stewart is sophomore wideout **Jalen Camp**. Camp, who had only one reception as a redshirt freshman in 2017, has six catches through nine games this season.
- Camp posted a career-high with 70 yards on two receptions (33 and 37 yards) versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29).
- The only true freshman who has seen action on offense for Georgia Tech this season is wide receiver **Malachi Carter**.
 Carter has served as the third wideout behind Stewart and Camp in the Yellow Jackets' rotation.
- With Camp out due to an upper-body injury, Carter hauled in a 32-yard touchdown (the first of his career) versus Duke (Oct. 13).

• Eight different offensive linemen boast starting experience for Georgia Tech. Those eight have combined for a total of 120 starts over 225 career games played.

- The leader of the offensive front is all-ACC and all-America candidate Parker Braun. Braun, a junior left guard, leads the unit and ranks second overall on the team with 28-consecutive starts.
- Braun turned in perhaps the finest performance of his already illustrious career at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25), when he took a whopping 25 defenders to the ground in just 72 plays (one every 2.9 plays) to help pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 465 yards in a 49-28 win.
- In recognition of the dominating effort against VT, Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time this season and fourth time in his career.
- Braun is only the third Yellow Jacket to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week as many as four times in a career, joining current New England Patriot Shaq Mason (5 – 2012-15) and former NFL standout Andrew Gardner (4 – 2005-08).
- Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the first time this season and third time in his career after taking 15 defenders to the ground and helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 542 yards at Louisville (Oct. 5).
- Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time of his career following Georgia Tech's 35-17 win over Pitt on Sept. 23, 2016. He took 22 Pitt defenders to the ground and helped Georgia Tech run for 436 yards en route to the honor.
- In 2016, Braun became the first Georgia Tech freshman to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after compiling 10 knockdowns and helping Tech rush for 309 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech (Nov. 12).
- Led by Braun, Georgia Tech's offensive line has helped pave the way for the Yellow Jackets rank first nationally in rushing offense (377.0 ypg) and tied-20th in fewest sacks allowed (1.13/gm).
- Behind its offensive line, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400-plus yards in nine of its last 20 games, dating back to the beginning of last season.
- The Yellow Jackets' offensive line continues to get a boost from the return of junior **Kenny Cooper**, who missed all of fall camp and the first two games of the season due to a lower-body injury sustained during spring practice.
- Cooper, who started all 11 games at center in 2017, made his first start of 2018 against Duke (Oct. 13).

- Before getting back into the starting lineup, Cooper made his 2018 debut against Pitt (Sept. 15) and saw action as a reserve at center and right guard for four contests as he worked himself back into game shape.
- Last season, Cooper was named ACC Offensive Lineman
 of the Week after taking 10 defenders to the ground and
 helping Georgia Tech run for 403 yards in its 33-7 win over
 North Carolina (Sept. 30). The award came in Cooper's
 fifth-career start.
- Both Braun and Cooper represent Tech on official watch lists for national awards Braun is a candidate for the Outland Trophy, presented to college football's top interior lineman, while Cooper is on the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, which is awarded to college football's top center.
- Additionally, Braun is a candidate for the 2018 Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, which is presented to the top offensive student-athlete in NCAA Division I football who was born in, played high-school football in or plays college football in the state of Texas.



DEFENSE

- Coming into the season, one of the stated goals of new defensive coordinator **Nate Woody's** defense was to create turnovers. Through nine games, the Yellow Jackets are much improved in that area.
- Through nine games, Georgia Tech has already forced 20 turnovers. The Yellow Jackets forced 10 turnovers for the entire 2017 season (11 games).
- Additionally, through nine games, Georgia Tech's defense has 12 interceptions. The Yellow Jackets intercepted eight passes for the entire 2017 season.
- Georgia Tech's 20 takeaways are tied for eighth nationally.
 Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 124th out of 128
 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 10 takeaways.
- Georgia Tech's 12 interceptions are tied for 14th nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 110th nationally with six interceptions.
- Georgia Tech's eight fumble recoveries are tied for 26th nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 120th nationally with four fumble recoveries.
- The Yellow Jackets have forced a season-high three turnovers in five different games this season Alcorn State (Sept. 1), Bowling Green (Sept. 29), Louisville (Oct. 5), Duke (Oct. 13) and North Carolina (Nov. 3).
- Georgia Tech has recorded three defensive touchdowns this season (**David Curry** fumble return vs. Alcorn State Sept. 1; **Anree Saint-Amour** interception return vs. Bowling Green Sept. 29; **Juanyeh Thomas** interception return Oct. 5), which is tied for first in the ACC and sixth nationally.
- The Jackets' No. 78 national rank in scoring defense is a bit misleading, as 28 of the 254 points scored against GT this season have been scored on special teams (two kickoff returns at USF on Sept. 8) or by the opponent's defense (fumble returns vs. Clemson on Sept. 22 and North Carolina on Nov. 3). Without the non-offensive scores, Georgia Tech would be tied for 55th nationally in scoring defense at 25.1 points allowed per game.
- Woody's 3-4 defense recorded Georgia Tech's first shutout in 57 games in the Yellow Jackets' 41-0 victory over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The shutout was the Yellow Jackets' first since they blanked Syracuse, 56-0, on Oct. 19, 2013.
- Georgia Tech's defense also limited Alcorn State to just 146 yards of total offense, which is the second-lowest yardage total allowed by the Yellow Jackets in head coach **Paul Johnson's** 10-plus seasons at the helm. The only time that the Jackets surrendered fewer yards during Johnson's tenure came in his fifth game at Tech, when they allowed just 132 yards in a 27-0 win over Duke on Oct. 4, 2008.
- On Sept. 15 at Pitt, the Yellow Jackets' defense allowed 21 points and 215 yards in the opening half but buckled down in the second half, surrendering just three points and 120 yards after the break to allow the Jackets to nearly come back from a 21-0 deficit in an eventual 24-19 defeat.
- Over its final six possessions of the game, Pitt managed just three points and 114 yards of offense. Georgia Tech's defense forced three punts (two three-and-outs) and recorded an interception over those final six series.
- Georgia Tech limited Duke (Oct. 13) to just 304 yards of total offense, which is the fewest yards that Tech has surrendered to an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since Virginia

- Tech managed just 258 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 28-22 win over the No. 17 Hokies on Nov. 11 of last season.
- At Virginia Tech (Oct. 25), Georgia Tech's defense surrendered 216 yards and 21 points on Virginia Tech's first three possessions of the game, but limited VT to 37 yards and zero points over its next five possessions before the Hokies drove for an inconsequential touchdown on their final offensive series.
- Georgia Tech has featured eight first-time starters on defense this season Jr. NT **Brandon Adams**, Sr. OLB **Jalen Johnson**, So. SS **Tariq Carpenter**, Sr. FS **Malik Rivera***, So. CB **Jaytlin Askew**, redshirt Fr. CB **Tre Swilling**, So. CB **Ajani Kerr** and Fr. OLB **Charlie Thomas**.

 * Rivera started 18 games in three seasons at Wofford before transferring to Georgia Tech as a graduate student for this season.
- Tech has also played a whopping nine true freshmen on defense this season — DL T.K. Chimedza, DL Justice Dingle, LB Jordan Domineck, DL Quon Griffin, LB Quez Jackson, DB Jaylon King, LB Charlie Thomas, DB Juanyeh Thomas and CB Zamari Walton.
- Woody came to The Flats from Appalachian State, where he served as defensive coordinator from 2013-17. Over his last three seasons at App State (2015-17 — the program's first three campaigns as full-fledged members of FBS), the Mountaineers' 3-4 scheme had average national rankings of 15th in scoring defense, 19th in total defense, 28th in rushing defense and 28th in passing defense.
- Appalachian also averaged 24 takeaways, 19 interceptions and 35 sacks per season over the last three campaigns, all areas where Georgia Tech ranked among the bottom 20 teams nationally in 2017.

 Saint-Amour — have combined to play in 107 games and make 55 starts for the Yellow Jackets.

- This season marks the first time that Georgia Tech's entire starting defensive line is comprised of seniors since 1989, when seniors Willie Burks (DT), Jeff Mathis (NG) and Sean Smith (DT) were the starting linemen for the Jackets' 7-4 squad under head coach Bobby Ross (one season before Tech won its fourth national championship).
- Saint-Amour has arguably been Georgia Tech's best defensive player with 35 tackles, 10.5 tackles for loss, four sacks, three forced fumbles, two interceptions and eight quarterback hurries this season. He leads the Yellow Jackets in TFL, sacks, forced fumbles and QB hurries and is tied for the team lead in interceptions.
- Saint-Amour's two interceptions are tied for the national lead among defensive linemen. He is one of only four defensive linemen with two interceptions (joining Maryland's Byron Cowart, Purdue's Kai Higgns and Toledo's Jamal Hines. His two INTs are tied for seventh in the ACC and 65th nationally, regardless of position.
- Saint-Amour is tied for 11th nationally with .33 forced fumbles per game.

- Saint-Amour is tied for 14th in the ACC with .44 sacks per game.
- Saint-Amour has been especially impressive of late, with 26 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss, four sacks, three forced fumbles, six quarerback hurries and two interceptions over the last five games (Sept. 29 vs. Bowling Green, Oct. 5 at Louisville, Oct. 13 vs. Duke, Oct. 25 at Virginia Tech, Nov. 3 at North Carolina).
- Saint-Amour had a career day last Saturday at North Carolina, tallying nine tackles (career high), three quarterback hurries (career high), a tackle for loss, a pass breakup and an interception in the Yellow Jackets' 38-28 win.
- Saint-Amour's interception with less than two minutes to play thwarted a potential game-tying drive for UNC and set up a 22-yard field goal that sealed the Jackets' victory.
- In recognition of his performance against the Tar Heels, Saint-Amour was named the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for the first time in his career. He is the first Yellow Jacket to be named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week since KeShun Freeman earned the honor following the Yellow Jackets' 35-10 win over Virginia on Nov. 1, 2014.
- Saint-Amour also had a big day at Louisville (Oct. 5) with a team-high-tying six tackles, including a sack, a quarterback hurry and two forced fumbles. Both forced fumbles led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.
- Saint-Amour's two forced fumbles versus Louisville matched a single-game school record. He is the 10th student-athlete in Georgia Tech history to ever force two fumbles in a single game.

- Saint-Amour followed up his dominant performance against Louisville with another one against Duke (Oct. 13), finishing with two sacks, a forced fumble and a quarterback hurry that caused an interception and led directly to Georgia Tech's first touchdown of the game.
- Last Thursday at Virginia Tech, Saint-Amour tallied two more tackles for loss, marking the third time in the last four games that he's recorded multiple stops behind the line of scrimmage.
- Saint-Amour's interception return for a touchdown was the first by a Georgia Tech defensive lineman since current Cincinnati Bengal and 2018 GT Sports Hall of Fame inductee Michael Johnson returned an INT 26 yards for a score during a 41-23 win at No. 23 Miami (Fla.) on Nov. 20, 2008.
- Branch has also recorded an interception this season (vs. Clemson on Sept. 22), marking the first time in **Paul**Johnson's 11 seasons as Georgia Tech's head coach that two different defensive linemen have had interceptions in the same season.



DEFENSE

LINEBACKERS

- The heart and soul of Georgia Tech's defense is senior co-captain and inside linebacker **Brant Mitchell**. Mitchell ranks second on the team with 40 tackles this season.
- Mitchell has notched 26 stops over the past five games, including a season-high nine against North Carolina last Saturday.
- As the Yellow Jackets' middle linebacker last season, Mitchell ranked fourth on the team with 51 tackles despite playing in only seven full games and parts of two others due to a lower-body injury. His 5.7 tackles per game led the team
- In his first full game after returning to the lineup against No. 17 Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, Mitchell recorded a teamhigh nine tackles, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss, and was named ACC Co-Linebacker of the Week.
- In all, Georgia Tech went just 1-3 in the four games that Mitchell missed all or part of last season.
- After missing the entire 2017 season due to a foot injury, junior inside linebacker **David Curry** is tied for fifth on the team with 33 tackles this season.
- Curry, whose career high for tackles coming into the season was three, recorded four (Sept. 1 vs. Alcorn State) and six (Sept. 8 vs. USF) tackles in Georgia Tech's first two games this season.
- The tally against USF likely would've been higher but he was ejected for a targeting call in the fourth quarter of the tough-luck loss on Sept. 8. Due to the ejection, Curry also had to sit out the first half of ACC opener at Pitt on Sept. 15.
- Curry scored Georgia Tech's first defensive touchdown of the season when he scooped up a fumble forced by nose tackle **Brandon Adams** and returned it 15 yards for a score early in the third quarter of the shutout win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The fumble return for a touchdown was the Yellow Jackets' first since P.J. Davis returned a fumble 38 yards for a score during the Jackets' 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Curry's return to action this season came following a series of injuries that kept him out of action last season (foot) and cost him time this past spring (thumb).
- Sophomore **Bruce Jordan-Swilling**, who has seen increased action as of late at inside linebacker, led Georgia Tech with a season-high eight tackles against Duke (Oct. 13)
- True freshman **Charlie Thomas** moved into the starting lineup at the "jack" outside linebacker position against Louisville on Oct. 5. In his first four career starts, he has tallied 24 tackles, two fumble recoveries, four quarterback hurries and a pass breakup.
- Thomas tied a single-game school record by recovering two fumbles in the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville. He is the 18th Yellow Jacket to recover two fumbles in a game. Both fumble recoveries led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.

- Thomas led Georgia Tech with a career-high nine tackles and his first-career sack at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25).
- Despite appearing in only seven games with just four starts, Thomas ranks tied for third on the team with 35 tackles and is second on the squad with five quarterback hurries this season.
- Senior OLB **Victor Alexander**, who made the first five starts of the year at "jack," has played in all 44-of-45 games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He saw a string of 43-consecutive games played snapped when he did not appear in the Yellow Jackets' 49-28 victory at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25).
- Alexander turned in his finest statistical performance of the season against No. 3/2 Clemson on Sept. 22, finishing with a season-high seven tackles.
- Georgia Tech's fourth linebacker position the "stinger" OLB — is manned largely by two student-athletes that were tabbed for the secondary prior to Woody's arrival on The Flats — senior **Jalen Johnson** and junior **Christian Campbell**.
- Despite previously being limited to the defensive backfield and special teams, Johnson and Campbell have combined for 88 career tackles and 6.5 tackles for loss, including 48 stops and 4.5 TFL through nine games this season.
- Johnson had a career day at North Carolina last Saturday, recording career highs with nine tackles (prev. career high: six at USF, Sept. 8) and 1.5 tackles for loss (prev. career high: 1.0, twice - last at USF, Sept. 8).

DEFENSIVE BACKS

- Last season, Georgia Tech's starting secondary was comprised of five veterans that combined to make 127 starts and play in 218 games.
- However, none of the five members of last year's starting secondary returned in 2018. Lawrence Austin, Lance Austin, Step Durham and Corey Griffin all graduated while A.J. Gray had to step away from football due to a heart condition.
- In their wake, the defensive backs listed on Georgia Tech's two-deep combined for zero starts and just 27 games played prior to this season.
- Of the eight DBs listed on Tech's two-deep, three are sophomores (CB Jaytlin Askew, SS Tariq Carpenter and CB Ajani Kerr), two are redshirt freshmen (CB Tre Swilling and SS Kaleb Oliver) and one is a true freshmen (FS Juanyeh Thomas).
- One of only two upperclassmen in the secondary's twodeep (and the only full-time starter), graduate student **Malik Rivera** leads Georgia Tech in tackles (45) and is tied for first

- in interceptions (two) through nine games this season with Carpenter and Sr. DE **Anree Saint-Amour**.
- Rivera's team-high 45 tackles include 10 stops last Saturday at North Carolina, his most as a Yellow Jacket.
- Rivera came to The Flats as a graduate transfer from Wofford, where he recorded 131 tackles but totaled just one interception over the past three seasons.
- Rivera's position coach at Wofford the last two seasons (and defensive coordinator in 2017) was **Shiel Wood**, who now serves as Georgia Tech's safeties coach.
- A spectacular student, Rivera graduated from Wofford in May as a triple-major in mathematics, finance and computer science. He is pursuing a master's degree in quantitative and computational finance at Georgia Tech.
- Rivera and Carpenter are tied for seventh in the ACC and 65th nationally with two interceptions this season.
- Rivera's two INTs came in the Yellow Jackets' first two ACC games of the season (Sept. 15 at Pitt and Sept. 22 vs. Clemson).
- Carpenter's two INTs came at USF (Sept. 8) and last Saturday at North Carolina. Carpenter's fourth-quarter INT at UNC set up a 41-yard touchdown drive that saw Georgia Tech take a 35-28 lead with three minutes to go in the ballgame.
- Seven of Georgia Tech's 12 interceptions this season belong to safeties — Oliver (vs. Alcorn State), Carpenter (at USF, at UNC), Rivera (at Pitt, vs. Clemson) and Thomas (at Louisville).
- Thomas capped the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville (Oct. 5) by returning his first-career interception 95 yards for a touchdown.
- Thomas' 95-yard interception return is tied for the fifthlongest in school history and the longest by a Yellow Jacket in an ACC game (tied with Ken Swilling - 95 yds. vs. NC State, Sept. 9, 1989). It's also the longest INT return by a Jacket since Tyler Marcordes had a 95-yarder against Elon on Aug. 31, 2013.

- Georgia Tech boasts one of the nation's top punters in sophomore **Pressley Harvin III**.
- Due to the Yellow Jackets' offensive proficiency, Harvin has only been called upon to punt 21 times through nine games this season. He is averaging 45.0 yards per punt.
- Seven of Harvin III's 21 punts this season (including six of his last 14) have traveled 50-plus yards while eight of his 21 kicks (including six of his last eight) have been downed inside the 20-yard line.
- Harvin III does not qualify for official NCAA/ACC statistical rankings because he is far short of the minimum 3.6 attempts per game. However, if he did qualify, his 45.0-yard average would lead the ACC and rank 13th nationally.
- As a team, Georgia Tech leads the ACC and ranks 11th nationally in net punting average (41.24 avg.).
- Harvin was one of only two non-true freshmen on the Yellow Jackets' travel roster to not see action during Georgia Tech's 66-31 rout at Louisville (Oct. 5). The other was senior long snapper **Zach Roberts**, who like Pressley, only goes on the field when the Jackets are forced to punt.
- In fact, Harvin III was called upon only once over a twogame stretch versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and Louisville. His lone punt versus BG traveled 53 yards and was downed at the 9-yard line.
- Last season, Harvin III led all NCAA Division I FBS true freshmen, ranked 16th overall nationally and was second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with a 44.1-yard punting average last season.
- Harvin's 44.1-yard average was also a Georgia Tech freshman record and ranked fifth overall in single-season program history.

- Of Harvin's 50 punts last season, 13 traveled 50-plus yards (26 percent), 16 were downed inside the 20 yard line (32 pct.), 15 were fair-caught (30 pct.) and 29 were not returned (58 pct.).
- Making Harvin's freshman campaign even more impressive was that two of his best performances came in less-than-ideal conditions for punting he recorded career-bests with a 62-yard punt and four kicks downed inside the 20 yard line at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 and had five punts that traveled 50 yards or more and three downed inside the 20 at Clemson on Oct. 28. The majority of both games were played during heavy rain storms.
- Following his incredible rookie campaign, Harvin III was named freshman all-America by the Football Writers Association of America, true freshman all-America by ESPN and was a third-team all-ACC honoree.
- Harvin III is on the official watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to college football's top punter. He was first added to the list midway through his prolific freshman campaign last fall.
- Harvin became only the third FWAA freshman all-American in school history (joining OL Will Jackson, 2010, and PK Travis Bell, 2004) and the first Georgia Tech freshman to earn all-ACC recognition since Calvin Johnson (first-team WR) and Bell (second-team PK) in '04.
- Replicating Harvin III's magic as a true freshman specialist this season is walk-on place kicker **Wesley Wells**. Wells took over the place-kicking duties after winning an in-practice competition for the job in the week leading up to the Bowling Green game (Sept. 29). Since then, he has made the first 34 kicks of his career 32-of-32 PATs and 2-of-2 field goals.
- Wells made the second field goal of his career last Saturday at North Carolina — a 22-yarder with 46 seconds remaining that sealed the Yellow Jackets' 38-28 victory.
- Wells' first field goal was a 41-yarder at Louisville. It was the longest made FG by a Yellow Jacket since **Brenton King**, also a true freshman at the time, made a 42-yarder vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 21, 2017.
- Another true freshman, Juanyeh Thomas, earned the job as Georgia Tech's primary punt and kickoff returner during fall camp.
- Thomas' 25-yard punt return in the second quarter of the Sept. 1 season opener against Alcorn was Georgia Tech's longest punt return since **Brad Stewart's** 26-yarder versus Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 1, 2016.
- Thomas' 38-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter at USF (Sept. 8) was the longest by a Yellow Jacket since **Lamont Simmons** scooped up an onside kick attempt and returned it 42 yards for a touchdown at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 of last season.
- USF's 266 yards on kickoff returns on Sept. 8 which included 98- and 97-yard returns for touchdowns by Terrence Horne in the first quarter — were the second-most yards that Georgia Tech has ever allowed on kickoff returns in a single game (second only to North Carolina's 267 yards in a 68-50 GT win on Nov. 10, 2012).
- The two touchdowns allowed on kickoff returns against USF tied an NCAA Division I FBS single-game record.

- In the Yellow Jackets' 49 kickoffs since Horne's back-to-back touchdowns at USF (not including an onside kick attempt versus Duke on Oct. 13), Georgia Tech junior kicker **Shawn Davis** has pinned the opponent at or inside its 25-yard line 31 times (with one of the exceptions being on a squib kick on the first kickoff following the two TD returns at USF).
- Despite Thomas' and Davis' high points, Georgia Tech continues to rank among the nation's bottom 30 teams in both kickoff-return average (18.5 ypr - 102nd nationally) and kickoff-return defense (27.19 ypr - 127th).



WISCELLANEOUS

- Bobby Dodd Stadium has been home sweet home for Georgia Tech of late, as it is 10-3 in its last 13 home games, dating back to midway through the 2016 season. The only three home losses during that span have been at the hands of Georgia (Nov. 25, 2017), Clemson (Sept. 22, 2018) and Duke (Oct. 13, 2018).
- The Yellow Jackets' 28-14 loss to Duke snapped their nine-game winning streak versus unranked opponents at home.
- On the flip side, Georgia Tech has struggled in games played away from its Midtown Atlanta home over the past two seasons. The Yellow Jackets are just 3-7 in games played away from Bobby Dodd Stadium since the beginning of the 2017 season.
- However, the Jackets have emphatically snapped a sevengame away-from-home skid with impressive wins in each of their last three road games — a 66-31 romp at Louisville (Oct. 5), a 49-28 rout at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25) and last Saturday's 38-28 triumph at North Carolina.
- Georgia Tech has won three-straight games away from home since the first time since it won at Virginia Tech (Nov. 12), at Georgia (Nov. 26) and vs. Kentucky at the TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31) to close the 2016 season.
- Georgia Tech has won three-straight true road games for the first time since it won at Pittsburgh (Oct. 25), NC State (Nov. 8) and Georgia (Nov. 29) in 2014.
- · Georgia Tech has won three-straight ACC road games for the first time since it won at Duke (Nov. 14, 2009), North Carolina (Sept. 18, 2010) and Wake Forest (Oct. 2, 2010).
- Georgia Tech won three-straight ACC games in a single season for the first time since it won at Florida State (Oct. 10), Virginia (Oct. 24) and Duke (Nov. 14) in 2009.

- Over the course of the seven-game losing streak in games played away from Bobby Dodd Stadium that spanned from Sept. 4, 2017-Sept. 15, 2018, Georgia Tech squandered double-digit leads in five of the seven defeats.
- Last year, Georgia Tech became only the 10th team in ACC history with two one-point losses in the same season (a 42-41 double-overtime loss to No. 25 Tennessee on Sept. 4 and a 25-24 loss at No. 11 Miami on Oct. 14).

- Three of the Yellow Jackets' five defeats last season Sept. 4 vs. Tennessee, Oct. 11 at Miami (Fla.) and Nov. 4 at Virginia — came by a total of just six points.
- In each of those three defeats, Georgia Tech's opponent scored the winning points in the final 82 seconds of regulation or in overtime.

- · Over the course of their first five games of last season, the Yellow Jackets only trailed for 20:43 of total playing time and just four seconds after halftime — the final four seconds of their 25-24 loss at No. 11/10 Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 — but went just 3-2 in those five games.
- With underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores) representing 68.4 percent of its roster, Georgia Tech has the 14th-youngest team in all of NCAA Division I FBS and thirdyoungest team in the ACC this year.

- The only other ACC teams that have finished first or second in their division as many as six times in the last 10 seasons are Clemson (8), Florida State (7) and Virginia Tech
