Dogs Aim For Second Straight 11-Win Regular Season

Since a 12th game was added to the college football season in 2002, Georgia has gone 11-1 during the regular season three times, in 2002, in 2012 and most recently in 2017. In school history, there have been 10 teams that have won a total of at least 11 games in a season. Last year's 13-2 squad tied the 13-1 2002 team for having the record for wins. The other teams that have won at least 11 games overall include the following squads: **1942** - 11-1; **1946** - 11-0; **1971** - 11-1; **1980** - 12-0; **1982** - 11-1; **2003** - 11-3; **2007** - 11-2; **2012** - 12-2; **2017** - 13-2.

Rivalry Rumbblings

● Georgia leads the series 66-39-5 and doesn't count two Georgia Tech wins during WWII (1943-44) when the Yellow Jackets utilized players from a naval officer's training program hosted on campus.

● From 1917-24, Georgia and Georgia Tech did not play each other because of a dispute caused by a Georgia parade float that ridiculed the Yellow Jackets for playing football during World War I.

● Georgia Tech's 51-48 win in overtime in 1999 on ABC was the highest-scoring game in the series and featured 1,102 total yards of offense. In overtime, Georgia blocked the Yellow Jackets' first field goal attempt on third down and the Jackets recovered it. Then, Luke Manget kicked a 38-yarder on the mulligan for the win.

● In 1978, Georgia trailed 20-0 in the second quarter when freshman Buck Belue came off the sideline and rallied the team to a 29-28 victory, the biggest comeback in school history to that point.

● Georgia closed out the 2002 regular season in Athens with a 51-7 thrashing of Georgia Tech on CBS. It was the most points ever for a Bulldog squad against the Yellow Jackets.

● Since 1995, the winner of the Georgia-Georgia Tech game has been awarded the Governor's Cup Trophy. Since then, the Bulldogs are 17-6 in that stretch.

● The Georgia-Georgia Tech series is one of the nation's oldest. There are only 15 other FBS rivalries that have been played more with Minnesota-Wisconsin at the top with 127 games. They meet Saturday in Wisconsin with the Badgers leading the series 60-59-8.

2017 Flashback: #7 Georgia 38, Tech 7

Seventh-ranked Georgia reclaimed the Governor's Cup Trophy with a 38-7 victory over Tech, tallying 471 yards of total offense on 60 plays in Atlanta. The Bulldogs carried a 17-7 lead into halftime and then added 21 points while blanking the Yellow Jackets for the final. Georgia freshman **Jake Fromm** completed 12-of-16 passes for 224 yards and two scores. Senior Sony Michel led the Bulldogs in rushing with 85 yards on 13 carries and one touchdown. Junior **Ahklil Crumpton** posted a career-long 78-yard touchdown reception to cap the day's scoring for the Bulldogs. Junior linebacker Roquan Smith led Georgia in tackles with nine stops. Tech finished the game with 226 yards of total offense on 55 plays. Georgia finished the regular season with an 11-1 mark while Tech dropped to 5-6.

Governor's Cup Began With Bullpups versus Baby Jackets

A Thanksgiving Tradition From 1933-1993; Varsity Battles Since 1995

For 60 years, Thanksgiving Day was a special day in the history of the Georgia-Georgia Tech rivalry. It was on that day that the Georgia and Georgia Tech freshmen football teams, and in later years the junior varsity teams, met at Tech's Grant Field for the Governor's Cup. The game, played from 1933 to '93, annually benefited the Scottish Rite Children's Hospital and became a nationally-recognized event. However, scholarship and roster limitations caused discontinuation of the game in 1993. But in 1994, a "Legends Game" was held to maintain the tradition of the game.

The NCAA, at the schools' request, agreed to recognize the varsity rivalry and beginning in 1995, the Children's Healthcare of Atlanta annually presents the Governor's Cup to the winning team. Additionally, for the seniors playing in their last regular season game, they receive watches, and the seniors on the winning team get a personalized replica of the Governor's Cup. In some years, the Governor of Georgia has been on hand to present the Cup to the winning team at the end of game too.

Head Football Coach



When Georgia looked for a new head coach after the 2015 season, the arrows pointed to Kirby Smart, longtime Alabama defensive coordinator and former UGA player and assistant. The 2017 *Associated Press* SEC Coach of the Year has not disappointed.

In his first year leading the Bulldogs in 2016, Georgia extended its school record to 20 consecutive bowl appearances and posted five fourth-quarter comebacks including wins over No. 8 Auburn and No. 22 North Carolina. He led UGA to an 8-5 final record, which included a

victory over TCU in the Liberty Bowl.

In 2017, Smart directed UGA to a 13-2 record, an SEC title, a win at The Rose Bowl Game during the CFP semifinal and a spot in the National Championship. He was named the **Maxwell Football Club's George Munger National Coach of the Year**. Before 2017, the Bulldogs last SEC title was 2005.

He has also made an immediate impact in recruiting, posting the nation's top-ranked class in 2018 and the third-ranked class in 2017. In addition to coaching, Smart oversees the Kirby Smart Family Foundation, which is focused on being champions in the community by supporting and giving back to needy children and families.

Smart officially came home to Georgia on Dec. 6, 2015. But he still had unfinished business at Alabama, which was chasing a national title. He juggled two jobs for a month until January 11, 2016, when the Tide won its fourth national championship in a seven-year span. Twelve hours later, he was at work in Athens.

Quick Facts

*Clinched the 2018 SEC East title with the team's second straight 6-0 mark in the division.
*2017 *Georgia Munger National Coach of the Year* finalist, leading UGA to a 13-2 record, a Rose Bowl Game victory and an appearance the CFP National Championship Game.
*The Bulldogs' No. 2 AP ranking in 2017 was the team's top AP ranking since week three of the 2008 season when Georgia was No. 2.
*Bulldogs captured the SEC East by going 7-1 in 2017, including 6-0 in the division for the first time since the league split into divisions in 1992.
*Seven fourth-quarter comebacks, including wins over #8 AU (2016), #22 UNC in Atlanta (2016), @ #24 Notre Dame (2017), vs. #2 Oklahoma in 2018 Rose Bowl Game.
*Led UGA to its first win over a ranked team in a season opener away from Sanford Stadium in school history, posting a 33-24 win over #22 UNC during the 2016 Chick-Fil-A Kickoff Classic.

High Octane Offense

* Georgia is on pace to have one of the best scoring averages in UGA history this season. The Bulldogs have scored 40+ points in six games this year and are averaging 39.6, which is second in the SEC. The 2014 team owns the school record at 41.3.

* In the most recent win over UMass, Georgia tallied 701 total yards, which ranks second in school history. The Bulldogs' tallied 426 yards rushing against the Minutemen, which ranks seventh in UGA history and is the most for the team since 1987.

* The Bulldog offense has scored 51 touchdowns in 2018 while the defense and special teams have each chipped in two scores.

* Georgia piled up 516 yards of total offense in the 27-10 victory over #24 Auburn. This was the most yards the Tigers had given up since Oklahoma had 524 in the 2016 Sugar Bowl.

* The Bulldogs did not trail in a game until Vanderbilt took a 3-0 lead in game six this year. The Bulldogs responded 15 seconds later with a touchdown pass from sophomore QB **Jake Fromm** to senior WR **Terry Godwin** with 10:15 left in the opening period. Georgia trailed the entire game at #11 LSU.

Efficient Signal Callers

* **Jake Fromm**, a 2018 Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist, is hovering around the school record for Completion Percentage in 2018. He is ranked second in the SEC and 10th nationally at 68.2 percent. Georgia's school record is 67.9 by Hutson Mason in 2014. The SEC record is 72.3 percent held by Tim Couch (UK, 1998).

* Fromm is 22-3 as a starter, including 8-3 versus Top 25 teams.

* The Warner Robins, Ga., native is ranked third nationally on the active list in Passing Efficiency at 165.9.

* His three TD passes versus #9 Florida all came on third downs covering 12, 16 and 24 yards. He was named *SEC Offensive Player of the Week* after going 17-for-24 for 240 yards and three TDs.

* Georgia also has freshman QB **Justin Fields**, who was one of the nation's top recruits. After enrolling in January, he has seen action in 10 of 11 games and is 25-for-35 with 341 yards and four scores and four rushing TDs. Fields also has 250 yards on 36 carries and is averaging 6.9 yards a carry.

* Fields became the first Bulldog QB to have 100 yards rushing versus UMass since Quincy Carter tallied 107 against UK in 1998. Fields, who was 5-for-8 for 121 yards and two touchdowns against UMass, also became the first Georgia QB to lead his team in rushing since D.J. Shockley in 2005 against Boise State (85 yards).

* In his career, Fromm has led his team to two comebacks when trailing at the half. One of Georgia's signature wins came with his 2018 Rose Bowl Game performance after the Bulldogs trailed #2 Oklahoma 31-17 at the half and rallied to a 54-48 win in double overtime. Georgia trailed 45-38 with 3:22 remaining in the game before Fromm directed a game-tying drive.

* Fromm's first career start came last year at #24 Notre Dame. Trailing 19-17 with 6:47 left in the contest, Fromm directed a nine play, 63-yard drive to set up the go-ahead field goal. He was 3-for-4 for 45 yards during the drive.

Sharing The Load In The Ground Game

* This year, Georgia is primarily utilizing a pair of backs to share the load between junior **Elijah Holyfield** and sophomore **D'Andre Swift**. For more on the *Dynamic Duo*, check pg. 5.

* Against #24 Auburn, the Bulldogs went over 300 yards on the ground and had a 100-yard rusher for the third straight game. In the SEC East clinching road win over #9 Kentucky, both tailbacks went over 100 yards as the Bulldogs tallied 331 yards on the ground with three scores on 50 attempts.

* Swift registered a career-high 186 yards and a score on 17 carries (10.9 avg) and had four catches for 43 yards against AU and was named the *SEC Offensive Player of the Week*.

* Swift went for 156 and two scores and was named the *SEC Offensive Player of the Week* while Holyfield registered a career-high 115 and one touchdown versus the Wildcats.

Next Man Up On The Line

* Georgia leads the SEC in Rushing Offense at 257.5 yards/game and also leads in SEC only games at 232.8. Sophomore LT **Andrew Thomas** was named the league's *Offensive Lineman of the Week* after the Dogs finished with 331 rushing yards at UK.

* Georgia has started four different alignments on the OL. The starting line has featured Thomas/freshman **Cade Mays** (LT), redshirt sophomore **Solomon Kindley** (LG), senior **Lamont Gaillard** (C), redshirt sophomore **Ben Cleveland**/Mays/freshman **Trey Hill** (RG) and redshirt freshman **Isaiah Wilson** (RT). Wilson is the only lineman from the aforementioned group who has not missed a snap due to injury.

* The Bulldogs have rotated a number of players on the line due to injuries. Mays has started at a pair of spots and played at three different positions. Cleveland and Mays did not play against UMass and Hill got the start at RG. Senior **Kendall Baker** has also played a significant reserve role. However, Baker did not dress out versus UMass due to injury.

Spreading The Wealth Each Saturday

* Junior **Riley Ridley** leads the wideouts with 32 catches for 441 yards and six touchdowns. Junior **Mecole Hardman** checks in with 31 receptions for 475 yards and five scores.

* Versus AU, junior WR **Tyler Simmons** caught his first career TD pass to give Georgia a 13-10 edge during the 27-10 win. Simmons followed that performance up with a 49-yard touchdown run and a career-long 87-yard scoring catch against UMass.

* Hardman had a career day at #24 South Carolina, hauling in six catches for 103 yards, including a 34-yard touchdown. This was Georgia's first 100-yard receiver since the 2016 Liberty Bowl versus TCU (Isaiah McKenzie, 4-103). He had a 70-yard PR for a TD versus MTSU.

* Sophomore **Jeremiah Holloman** has emerged into another target for the Bulldogs. He has 19 catches for 321 yards and four scores, including a pair that came in the win over the Gators.

Bulldogs Setting The Tone On Defense

* Georgia is fifth in the SEC and 12th nationally in Scoring Defense, allowing just 16.8 points/game.

* Georgia held #24 Auburn to just 10 points and 274 yards, including only 102 on the ground, and kept the Tigers to a 3-for-11 mark on third downs. Like the Austin Peay and MTSU games, the Bulldogs shut out AU in the second half.

* With the SEC East title on the line, the Bulldogs built a 14-3 halftime lead over #9 Kentucky as Georgia forced a pair of punts, a fumble and a field goal on the Wildcats' first four possessions.

* Georgia kept #9 Florida to a season-low 275 total yards in their 36-17 victory over the Gators in Jacksonville. UGA forced UF into turnovers on its first two possessions.

* In the first half of the win at Missouri, the Tigers ran 38 plays for 159 yards and were held to a touchdown. Missouri entered the contest averaging 43.7 pts. In the second half, the Tigers tallied 22 points and finished with 393 total yards on 85 plays.

* In the Bulldogs' 41-13 win over Vanderbilt, the Commodores were held to a pair of field goals until they scored their first touchdown with :02 left.

Walker Making An Impact

* Senior OLB **D'Andre Walker** has emerged as the leader on the outside. At #13 LSU, Walker had his team-leading fifth sack (currently at 5.5). He recorded four tackles, including two sacks, and forced two fumbles in the win at Missouri.

* Walker also has a team-leading three forced fumbles to go along with 33 total tackles and 8.0 of those are TFLs.

* Georgia has senior **Juwan Taylor**, sophomore **Monty Rice**, junior **Tae Crowder** and senior **Natrez Patrick** splitting time at ILB. Rice is second with 59 stops in only nine games while Taylor is sixth with 39 tackles.

* Crowder intercepted his second ball of the season during the victory over UMass. He highlighted the Missouri game with a 43-yard INT return, marking the first pick of his career. Crowder is tied with **Deandre Baker** for the team lead with 2 INTs.

* Rice posted a team-high eight tackles, including his first career sack, during the win at #9 Kentucky. In fact, UGA had a season-high four sacks against the Wildcats.

* In the victory over #9 Florida, Rice established a career high 11 stops and forced a fumble while Crowder recovered a fumble on the Gator 1-yard line.

* Taylor recovered his second fumble versus Tennessee, which is tied for the team lead. At South Carolina, he was credited with a TD after Baker dropped the ball at the 1 yard line following a 55-yard INT return.

Starting Up Front

* Veterans **Jonathan Ledbetter** and **Tyler Clark** anchor the line. Ledbetter is fifth on the team with 40 tackles, four tackle for loss and a sack, while Clark has 23 stops, including 4.0 TFL and a sack. Against #9 Kentucky, Ledbetter forced a fumble that Clark recovered. Ledbetter posted a career-high 10 stops at #13 LSU.

* True freshman **Jordan Davis** has started three games versus #9 Florida, at #9 Kentucky and against #24 Auburn. In the contest at #13 LSU, Davis recorded seven tackles.

* Junior **Julian Rochester** is also rotating with junior **Michael Barnett** and sophomore **Devonte Wyatt** on the DL.

* Georgia held Missouri QB Drew Lock to no TD passes in their trip to Columbia. Lock has 23 TD passes in 10 games in 2018.

Baker, Reed Leading Defensive Backfield

* Senior DB **Deandre Baker**, a midseason All-American and semifinalist for the Bednarik and Thorpe awards, has 36 tackles on the year and is tied with ILB **Tae Crowder** with a team-best two picks. Baker also has nine pass break-ups and is tied for fifth in the SEC in passes defended with 11.

* He had six stops, two pass breakups and the team's first in-

terception in 2018 (along with a 55-yard return) at #24 South Carolina. Baker was named the *Athlon National Defensive Player of the Week* following the contest. He followed that performance up with another pick and a fumble recovery in the win over MTSU.

* Junior **J.R. Reed** ranks third on the team with 47 stops. Reed's lone pick for 2018 came in the end zone at South Carolina.

* Sophomore **Richard LeCounte** has started every game but the Auburn contest this year and leads the team with 63 tackles. He has been the leading tackler three times this year, including six stops and a forced fumble versus Vanderbilt. LeCounte had seven tackles and a 32-yard fumble return in the win over #9 Florida.

* Freshman **Tyson Campbell** posted a career-high 11 tackles in the loss at #13 LSU, including eight solo stops.

* Campbell and redshirt freshman **Eric Stokes** had career highlights in the win at Missouri. Campbell started the game by forcing a fumble, recovering it and scampering 64 yards for a touchdown. Stokes blocked a punt and returned it eight yards for another of the Dogs' scores.

With AU leading 7-6, he had a key pass breakup on a 3rd-and-goal from the 4-yard line to force the Tigers to a field goal. Stokes started his first career game versus UMass on Nov. 17.

Blankenship One Of The Best

* All-American candidate PK **Rodrigo Blankenship** enters the game with 106 points on the year (18 FGs, 52 PATs). He is a Lou Groza Award semifinalist for the second straight year and was named the *SEC Special Teams Player of the Week* following the 41-17 rout at #24 USC.

* Second in the SEC for scoring for PK (9.6 ppg).

* Honored as one of 11 players nationwide named to the **2018 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team**.

* Has connected on a school record 141 consecutive PATs, topping Blair Walsh's record of 119 (2008-11). His 141 ranks fourth in SEC history for consecutive PATs.

* Second in NCAA with 69 touchbacks out of 81 KO's in 2018. This tops his own school record of 67 from last season.

* Set a Rose Bowl Game record by drilling a career-long 55-yard field goal during the 2OT win over #2 Oklahoma. His performance included a 38-yard FG in overtime.

Another SEC Championship Game Appearance

* With the 34-17 victory over Kentucky in Lexington on Nov. 3, Georgia clinched the Eastern Division. The Bulldogs will face top-ranked Alabama (11-0, 7-0 SEC) in the 2018 SEC Championship Game (SECCG) on Dec. 1 at 4 p.m. in Atlanta in the Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

* The teams met in that venue in last season's College Football Playoff National Championship as the No. 4 Crimson Tide won 26-23 in overtime over the No. 3 Bulldogs.

* Georgia and Alabama last squared off for an SEC title in 2012, and then No. 2 Crimson Tide held on for a 32-28 decision over No. 3 Georgia. That game also was decided on the last play as Georgia ran out of time at the Alabama 5-yard line. The 2012 SEC Championship Game was the only time the Bulldogs have faced the Crimson Tide in an SECCG.

* The Bulldogs will be making their seventh appearance in the game, and they are 3-3 including winning the 2017 title over Auburn in 2017. The Bulldogs have won or shared the SEC Eastern Division title nine times (1992, 2002, '03, '05, '07, '11, '12, '17, '18).

* In 1992, UF won the tiebreaker over UGA to represent the East in the SECCG and the same went for UT in 2007.

N.O.T. Just Scoring On Offense

* The Bulldogs' 55 touchdowns this season have included 51 by the offense, two by the defense and two by special teams.

* The last N.O.T.s (*Non-Offensive Touchdowns*) came in the 43-29 road win over Missouri. Georgia had a 20-7 lead at halftime and the offense did not have a touchdown. The Bulldogs' first score came on a forced fumble/64-yard return for a touchdown by freshman **Tyson Campbell**.

In the second quarter, redshirt freshman **Eric Stokes** blocked his first career punt and returned it eight yards for a score. This marked the 10th defensive/special teams score in the **Kirby Smart** era. In fact, Georgia's first TD in both of the first two SEC games this year were scored by the defense.

* Also, it was the first time since 2015 at Tennessee that Georgia had registered a special teams touchdown and a defensive score in the same game. That year, current Chicago Bears linebacker Leonard Floyd had a 96-yard fumble return and Reggie Davis had a 70-yard punt return.

Record Watch

* The Bulldogs are now 11 games into their 2018 slate and junior PK **Rodrigo Blankenship** has set two all-time school career records and has two more on the horizon.

* He now has 141 consecutive PATs, which topped Blair Walsh's 119 from 2008-10. Blankenship has 52 PATs on the year and is closing in on Marshall Morgan's 67 in 2014.

* The next record to keep an eye on is career touchbacks. The record is held by Kevin Butler (1981-94) who had 169 during his career. Currently, Blankenship has 157.

* Last year, Blankenship set the season touchback record with 67 breaking the mark held by Butler who had 51. This past week versus UMass, Blankenship topped his own record with 69, which is the nation's second-most touchbacks this year.

No. 7 Georgia 38, Georgia Tech 7

Nov. 25, 2017 • Bobby Dodd Stadium - Atlanta, Ga.

ATHENS, Ga. - The seventh-ranked Georgia Bulldogs overmatched the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets 38-7 in the battle for the Governor's Cup Trophy Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

After forcing a Yellow Jacket punt on the game's opening possession, the Bulldogs coordinated a 12-play, 61-yard touchdown drive. Chubb scored from one yard out, while Michel compiled 25 yards on the drive including a critical 3rd down pickup where he shed two tackles.

Georgia Tech put together a 12-play, 56-yard drive that started in the first quarter and spilled into the second quarter, but boiled over with a failed fourth-down attempt. The Bulldogs turned it into a touchdown quickly with six-straight run plays for 44 yards and then a 21-yard pass from Fromm to Wims for the score.

The Yellow Jackets got on the scoreboard in the final minute of the first half on a 10-yard touchdown pass from TaQuan Marshall to Ricky Jeune. The Bulldogs offense moved efficiently with 42 seconds left setting up a Rodrigo Blankenship 37-yard field goal to head into the half with a 17-7 lead.

At the half, Fromm was 8-for-10 for 91 yards, while Wims had four catches for 61 yards and his team-leading 6th receiving touchdown of the year. Michel tallied 67 yards on the ground on eight carries to move up to third all-time in rushing yards behind Chubb.

Georgia scored on three of its five possessions in the second half to seal the victory. The only non-score drives consisted of a punt and the final possession in which Georgia controlled the ball for 7:19 leaving GT the ball with only seven seconds left.

Michel tallied the first touchdown on a four-yard run after a 39-yard catch by sophomore receiver Mecole Hardman set it up. In the subsequent drive, Georgia marched down the field 67 yards, all but five yards on the ground. Swift highlighted the last two plays with a 31-yard run on a 3rd-and-9 and an over-the-top 2-yard score.

The final score came on three plays as Fromm connected with junior college transfer receiver Ahkil Crumpton for a 78-yard touchdown strike, Georgia's longest of the season.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"They've got a good football team. It's a very hard offense to prepare for. Our kids took the challenge head-on and did a good job preparing for it. Thought we controlled the ball offensively in the second half. Our kids have played really hard. They've gotten better throughout the year. They've bought into what we're trying to do as a program. We're really excited about where we are, and we've got a challenge next week."



Freshman Jake Fromm (11) completed 12 of 16 passes with 2 touchdowns against Georgia Tech. The true freshman also collected 20 yards on the ground.

Worth Noting...

- With today's 38-7 victory, seventh-ranked Georgia completes the regular season with a 11-1 record, marking the 10th team in school history to win at least 11 games in a season and the first since 2012. The seniors improves their record to 39-12. Also, Georgia has reclaimed the Governor's Cup Trophy and extended its advantage in the series to 66-39-5. Georgia's 38 points was the most against Tech since 2013 (41-34 OT win).
- The Bulldogs came in ranked fourth nationally in Soring Defense, allowing only 14.4 points a game and holding Tech's option attack to just seven points and 226 total yards (188 rushing). Tech was averaging 30.2 points/game and 319.3 rushing yards a game.
- Georgia tallied 38 points and 471 yards of total offense (247-rushing, 224-passing) on 60 plays. The Bulldogs came in today averaging 35.3 points a game including leading the nation in Red Zone Offense, going 40-for-41 with 30 touchdowns. Against Tech, Georgia went 4-for-4 in the Red Zone (3 TDs, 1 FG).
- Senior Sony Michel tallied 85 rushing yards on 13 attempts to move up to third place in school history for career rushing yards with 3,314, trailing only Herschel Walker (5,259) and Chubb (4,522). Michel had a four-yard TD to make it 24-7 with 9:08 left in the third to cap a six play, 77-yard drive.
- With his first touchback on the opening kickoff, redshirt sophomore Rodrigo Blankenship set a school record for touchbacks in a season as that was his 52nd, passing the mark of Hall of Famer Kevin Butler who had 51 during the 1981 season. Blankenship had six kickoffs with four touchbacks against Tech.

No. 5 Georgia 66, UMASS 27

Nov. 17, 2018 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

ATHENS, Ga. - The No. 5 Georgia Bulldogs accumulated season highs of 701 yards of offense and 66 points on Saturday, downing the University of Massachusetts Minutemen 66-27 in front of a crowd of 92,746 at Sanford Stadium and an SEC Network national television audience.

The Bulldogs improved to 10-1 overall with one game left in the regular season, while Massachusetts concluded its season at 4-8.

Georgia starting sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm produced a 5-5 clip with 106 yards and a touchdown before freshman Justin Fields entered the contest to accumulate 100 yards on the ground and 121 through the air with three touchdowns.

Five other members of the Bulldog backfield joined Fields on the ground with nearly 50-plus yards apiece and five combined touchdowns.

Junior receiver Tyler Simmons opened the contest with a 49-yard touchdown run off a jet sweep, followed soon thereafter by a 5-yard touchdown scamper by Elijah Holyfield for a 14-0 lead. Massachusetts answered with a 5-yard run by Marquis Young in the first quarter.

Fields stole the show in the second quarter by initiating three touchdowns, the first an 11-yard strike to unior wide receiver Riley Ridley. Fromm entered on the ensuing drive and found Simmons up the sideline for a 71-yard catch and run to extend the Georgia lead to 28-7.

With a 28-10 lead after a UMASS field goal, Fields quickly drove the Bulldogs down the field 72 yards in three plays, capped off by a three-yard run with a spin move into the end zone. He then returned to complete a 57-yard bomb to junior wide receiver Mecole Hardman for a 42-10 margin.

Freshman running back James Cook joined the party in the second half, rattling off runs of 26 and 27 for touchdowns as the Bulldogs cruised to a 66-27 final.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"I'm proud of the guys. We challenged them to play hard, to start fast, to play fast and not mosey around. We got things rolling and did some big things. I was really proud of the focus. ... We've gotten a little better offensively and we'll keep working on it. We need to get the playmakers the ball and peak at the right time. ... We out-manned those guys. They played hard and competed, but we know it won't be that way the rest of the season."

No. 6 Georgia 34, No. 11 Kentucky 17

Nov. 3, 2018 • Kroger Field - Lexington, Ky.

LEXINGTON, Ky. - Georgia's 34-17 victory over Kentucky featured a season-high 331 yards on the ground for the Bulldogs who limited the Wildcats to just 84 yards on the ground.

Finishing with a career-high 156 rushing yards on 16 carries and two touchdowns was sophomore running back D'Andre Swift, who tallied 99 all-purpose yards in the second half for 174 total. Junior Elijah Holyfield finished with a personal-best 115 yards on 18 carries and one touchdown.

In the passing game, sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm went 14-of-20 for 113 yards and a touchdown. Jeremiah Holloman finished with four catches for 39 yards, while true freshman quarterback Justin Fields added four rushing first downs. Defensively, sophomore linebacker Monty Rice amassed team-high eight tackles with a sack.

Georgia led 14-3 at the half. Junior Mecole Hardman returned a Kentucky punt for 65 yards to the 25-yard line. On offense, Fromm found junior tight end Isaac Nauta to complete a four-yard pass and only first quarter points.

In the opening possession of the second half, Georgia ran for a touchdown to take a 21-3 lead. Holyfield sealed the nine-play, 78-yard drive with a four-yard touchdown.

When the Bulldogs forced a three-and-out for a Kentucky punt, Swift ran for 83 yards— the longest run by a Bulldog since Nick Chubb in 2015 – to give Georgia the 28-3 advantage.

Kentucky's Benny Snell capped a 75-yard drive a touchdown run to make the score 28-10. Snell entered the game leading the SEC in rushing, averaging 116.9 yards a game, but Georgia kept him to 73 yards on 20 carries. Blankenship capped the game with a 38-yard field goal for the 34-17 win.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"[Winning another SEC East title is] huge. It hasn't been easy, and it's never easy. Sometimes I think people get spoiled when you win, and these are good programs and teams. I give our kids a lot of credit because their backs were against the wall two weeks in a row, and they came out fighting, scratching and crawling. I thought that the play by Mecole Hardman to start the punt return was a huge momentum play in the game and set the tone for the rest of the game."

Worth Noting...

- With today's 34-17 victory, defending SEC Champion Georgia (8-1, 6-1 SEC) has clinched another trip to Atlanta for the SEC Championship Game (SECG). The Bulldogs will be making their 7th appearance in the game, and they are 3-3 including winning the 2017 SEC title over Auburn last year. The Bulldogs now have won or shared the SEC Eastern Division crown nine times (1992, 2002, '03, '05, '07, '11, '12, '17 and '18).
- For the second straight season, Georgia has gone 6-0 against the SEC East. Last year marked the first time the Bulldogs had done that since the league split into divisions in 1992. Georgia now leads the series with UK 58-12-2, including winning the last nine meetings.
- Going in, Georgia ranked 13th nationally in scoring defense (16.3 points per game), while the Wildcats ranked No. 1 nationally, allowing only 13.0 points per game and had not allowed more than 20 points in a game. Georgia held UK to 17 points as the Wildcats ran 64 plays for 310 total yards.
- Sophomore D'Andre Swift had a career-high 156 yards on 16 carries and two TDs, one of which was the longest rushing Georgia TD since Nick Chubb went 83 yards for a score against Alabama in 2015. Sophomore Elijah Holyfield added a career-high 115 yards on 18 carries. The duo averaged 6.1 yards a carry, tallying 1,025 yards on 168 carries with nine TDs. Georgia finished with a season-high in rushing yards, the most since 381 on 44 attempts versus UK last year.

No. 6/7 Georgia 36, No. 9/11 Florida 17

Oct. 27, 2018 • TIAA Bank Stadium - Jacksonville, Fla.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - The No. 6/7 Georgia Bulldogs dominated a top-10 matchup with the No. 9/11 Florida Gators on Saturday 36-17 in front of a crowd of 84,463 at TIAA Bank Stadium, a CBS national television audience and with ESPN College Gameday and SEC Nation in attendance.

The Bulldogs improved to 7-1 overall and 5-1 in Southeastern Conference play with the victory against UF, which drops to 6-2 overall and 4-2 in league competition.

Sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm connected on three touchdown passes (all on third down), with a 17-24 passing clip for 240 yards, two of those going to sophomore wide receiver Jeremiah Holloman for 12 and 16 yards, respectively.

The Georgia run game controlled the first drive for the Bulldog offense, split between junior Elijah Holyfield and sophomore D'Andre Swift. Through 12 plays and 71 yards, the pair of tailbacks marched the Bulldogs to the Florida 4-yard line, where junior place kicker Rodrigo Blankenship drilled a 21-yard field goal.

Three plays later, sophomore linebacker Monty Rice instigated a fumble that found sophomore defensive back Richard LeCounte, who ran for 32 yards. Set up in the red zone, the Bulldog offense produced a 16-yard touchdown from Fromm to sophomore wide receiver Jeremiah Holloman. The Blankenship PAT secured the 10-0 lead headed into the second quarter.

The Bulldogs utilized junior tight end Isaac Nauta on four-straight completions from Fromm on the right side. Blankenship sent the Bulldogs into the break with a 13-7 lead.

The Gators opened the half with a 36-yard touchdown pass, but Georgia countered by way off Fromm's second touchdown completion to Holloman, a 12-yard back-shoulder throw for a 20-14 lead. Shortly after, junior defensive back Tyrique McGhee forced a fumble recovered by junior linebacker Tae Crowder at the UF 1-yard-line, leading to another Blankenship kick from 18 yards out.

Florida made it a one-possession game with a 42-yard field goal from Evan McPherson, but the Bulldog offense kicked into gear with a 24-yard strike from Fromm to senior wide receiver Terry Godwin with 8:39 left and capped off by a 33-yard Swift run towards a 36-17 final.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"The difference was we got kids with character. Everybody questioned these kids because we didn't play our best game (two weeks ago vs. LSU), and all we did was work. Everybody questioned and questioned it. They are tough, physical kids. We still have a long way to go. But we got better today...They played their heart out. I'm so proud of the way they played. I'm proud for the University of Georgia."

- Georgia's 36-17 win over No. 9 Florida gave the Bulldogs their second straight win in the series and fifth victory in the last seven contests. The Bulldogs, currently ranked No. 5/6, now lead the all-time series 52-43-2.
- Sophomore QB Jake Fromm finished 17-for-24 for 240 yards and 3 TDs. In the first half, he went 8-for-11 for 97 yards as Georgia built a 13-7 edge. No. 2 Georgia 16, No. 12 LSU 36

Oct. 13, 2018 • Tiger Stadium - Baton Rouge, La.

BATON ROUGE, La. - The second-ranked Georgia Bulldogs faltered in Death Valley, suffering a 36-16 upset loss to No. 12 LSU in front of a crowd of 102,321 at Tiger Stadium and a nationally-televised CBS audience.

Georgia forced a three-and-out on the game's opening drive, but the momentum didn't matriculate to the rest of the half. The Bulldogs' most successful first half drive came on its second possession, which spanned 12 plays for 59 yards – all on the ground – however a failed fake field goal attempt halted the Bulldogs.

Georgia trailed 16-0 at intermission, putting the Bulldogs in a hole that they didn't overcome. Jake Fromm was 5 for 16 for just 47 passing yards, while most of the production occurred on the ground with D'Andre Swift tallying 47 yards on seven carries and Elijah Holyfield mustering 33 yards on five attempts.

The Bulldogs took the opening possession of the third quarter 52 yards on 12 plays, setting up a 40-yard Rodrigo Blankenship field goal to make it 16-3. After a Fromm interception gave the Tigers a short field, the Bulldogs defense held LSU to its fourth field goal inside Georgia's 25-yard line.

Holyfield finished off a seven-play 75-yard drive on the ensuing possession with a 10-yard touchdown run to make it a 19-9 game due to the failed two-point try. Two plays earlier on a 3rd-and-6, a scrambling Fromm found Swift for an eight-yard pickup. Holyfield followed with a 13-yard run that was aided by a pushing offensive line, which set up the touchdown on the next play.

After each team traded punts to start the fourth quarter, LSU capitalized with a touchdown to move ahead 26-9. The Tigers tacked on another field goal off a Georgia special teams turnover, which put LSU well ahead and able to control the clock until the final whistle.

With today's 36-16 loss to LSU, the Tigers take a 17-13-1 edge in the series history that dates back to 1928. This was the 11th meeting where both teams were ranked in the top 25 and LSU now leads that 6-5.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"We didn't play our best game. You have to give LSU credit. They are a great football team. We didn't do well against their hurry up offense, which caused us to not be able to play as many guys as we normally do. They did a great job of mixing up their play calls with run and pass. Offensively, we had a drought and they capitalized. We didn't come out physical today. We just have to execute better and get better overall."

- Defensively, Georgia gave up a season-high 475 total yards and 36 points, however the Bulldogs forced five LSU field goals inside the Georgia 25-yard line and were on the field for a season-high 33 minutes and 41 seconds. Freshman cornerback Tyson Campbell had a team-high and career-high 11 tackles, while senior defensive end Jonathan Ledbetter tallied 10 tackles – also a career high.
- For the first time since the 2016 Auburn game on Nov. 12, Georgia was shut out in the first half. Auburn led 7-0 at the half that day, and the Bulldogs rallied back for a 13-7 victory. The Bulldogs came in today averaging 42.8 points a game.
- Georgia's leading tacklers with career-highs were freshman DB Tyson Campbell with 11 and senior DE Jonathan Ledbetter had 10. The Bulldogs had three sacks in the first half as D'Andre Walkergot his team-leading fifth while Tyler Clark and Keyon Richardson split a sack and freshman OLB Robert Beal, Jr., registered his first.

2018 GAME SUMMARIES

No. 2 Georgia 41, Vanderbilt 13

Oct. 6, 2018 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

Athens, Ga. - In the opening period, Vanderbilt became the first team to lead against the Bulldogs this season, capping a 50-yard scoring drive with a 25-yard field goal.

Following a Rodrigo Blankenship touchback, Fromm found Godwin for a 75-yard touchdown. A Blankenship PAT ensured a 7-3 margin.

The Bulldog defense provided two forced fumbles from junior inside line-backer Tae Crowder and LeCounte. Georgia's defense halted a 12-play, 81-yard Vanderbilt drive at the Georgia 14-yard line on a failed fourth-down attempt.

On offense, Holyfield settled an 8-play, 86-yard drive with an airborne, horizontal dive into the end zone for a 24-yard touchdown run for Georgia's 14-3 lead.

Before the half, junior tight end Isaac Nauta and junior wide receivers, Mecole Hardman and Ridley, marched to the Vanderbilt 10-yard line. Ridley reined in a 10-yard touchdown, keeping one foot in, to send Georgia into halftime with a 21-6 advantage.

In the second half, Georgia opened the frame with an 8-play, 75-yard trudge to the Vanderbilt end zone, finalized by a 35-yard D'Andre Swift explosion for the touchdown and 28-6 score.

A Blankenship 53-yarder made the game 31-6, before Herrien fought for the touchdown after dropping and recovering the ball for the 38-6 clip, complete with a Blankenship extra point.

Blankenship's second field goal of the day added insurance before Vanderbilt produced a final touchdown in the final seven seconds of the game.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"We played sloppy and I was disappointed with the way we played. It's sad when you have undisciplined penalties. We're trying to teach our team a lesson - you don't beat good football teams having those errors. We did a few good things, too, and I don't want to overshadow that. We ran the ball against a team that said, 'You're not going to run on us.' But we've got to continue to improve. It starts with discipline... with tying your shoes before practice, being on time for practice... following the rules and regulations. When you do those things, you don't have penalties."

Worth Noting...

- Georgia posted a 41-13 win to run its record to 6-0 (4-0 SEC). It marks the 12th time in school history that Georgia has raced out to a 6-0 start, and it's the first time the Bulldogs have done it in back-to-back seasons.
- Junior PK Rodrigo Blankenship connected on five extra points to make him 32-for-32 on the year and to give him 121 straight. This topped Blair Walsh's school record of 119. Blankenship also had touchbacks on seven of eight kickoffs, giving him 44 on the year and 132 in his career.
- Georgia now leads the all-time series with Vanderbilt 57-20-2 including 21-4 when it's Homecoming. Overall, Georgia is 77-18-2 in Homecoming contests.
- Georgia's defense held Vanderbilt scoreless on their second trip to the Red Zone. The Bulldogs stalled a drive that started on Vanderbilt's 5-yard line by stopping the Commodores on the Georgia 14-yard line during a 4th-and-1 situation. This was Georgia's third Red Zone stop of the year.
- Following a touchback on the ensuing kickoff, Fromm connected with senior WR Terry Godwin for a 75-yard touchdown on the first play of the drive, which marked the longest passing play of the 2018 season thus far. This was a career-long catch for Godwin and the longest for the Bulldogs since Fromm connected with Mecole Hardman for an 80-yard score in the 2018 CFP National Championship versus Alabama.

2018 GAME SUMMARIES

No. 2 Georgia 38, Tennessee 12

Sept. 29, 2018 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

ATHENS, Ga. - The No. 2 Georgia Bulldogs fended off the Tennessee Volunteers Saturday afternoon 38-12 in front of a crowd of 92,746 at Sanford Stadium and a CBS national television audience.

The Bulldogs improved to 5-0 overall and 3-0 in Southeastern Conference play with the victory against UT, which drops to 2-3 overall and 0-2 in league competition.

With the Volunteers entering the contest averaging 205 yards on the ground each game this season, Georgia limited Tennessee to 66 rushing yards while producing five rushing touchdowns on offense.

The rushing attack featured the first multi-touchdown outings on the ground for sophomore D'Andre Swift and freshman quarterback Justin Fields. Swift found the end zone on a 1-yard pitch in the second quarter, and later returned with a 14-yard score in the final period. Fields, who rushed five times for 45 yards, scored on a 12-yard scamper in the third quarter and followed with a 15-yard touchdown run to cement the 38-12 win.

On 3rd-and-9 in the first quarter, Tennessee redshirt junior linebacker Darrell Taylor forced the ball out of Fromm's hands, but the fumble found junior tight end Isaac Nauta, who ran for a 31-yard touchdown.

After Rodrigo Blankenship booted a 43-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter, Fields jumpstarted the scoring drive to end the half, contributing a 13-yard run. Fromm continued it, connecting with senior wide receiver Riley Ridley and sophomore wide receiver Jeremiah Holloman for 12 yards apiece. Swift finalized the 17-0 halftime margin with his first touchdown run pitched by Fromm and sealed by a Blankenship PAT.

Back from intermission, Georgia resumed on offense with a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped off by Fields' touchdown with an elevated horizontal dive into the end zone. The Volunteers then connected on passing touchdowns of 37 and 35 yards, respectively, to cut the lead to 24-12 (Georgia denied both two-point conversions).

Nevertheless, the Bulldogs drove 75 yards in 7:39, finished by Swift's second TD, for a 31-12 lead. On the ensuing Tennessee drive, senior OLB D'Andre Walker forced a fumble recovered by senior ILB Juwan Taylor, and Fields sealed a 38-12 decision with his 15-yard score.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"We struggled at times. We didn't hit some of the plays we thought we could have. We must execute at a higher level to be successful. There were times when we didn't have much movement up front. But when we had to play well in the second half, we challenged them and they did so. It's big when you answer a challenge, but it shouldn't have to come to that. We preach good habits, competitiveness, physicality."

Worth Noting...

- The Bulldogs scored 38 in their latest win over Tennessee to improve to 5-0 overall, 3-0 in the SEC. Georgia has tallied 216 points for the year, for an average of 43.2. Georgia's point total through five games is the most since 2014 (225 and that squad was 4-1).
- Georgia's first points came in an unorthodox fashion. Junior TE Isaac Nauta scooped up a Jake Fromm fumble and ran it 31 yards for a touchdown on a fumble advance to give Georgia a 7-0 edge at the 8:52 mark in the first period. This marks the third consecutive SEC game that the Bulldogs have scored their first touchdown on a return following a fumble.
- Sophomore QB Jake Fromm completed the game 16-for-22 for 185 yards and got his 19th consecutive start at QB. Freshman QB Justin Fields also took some snaps and finished 1-for-2 for 5 yards and ran the ball five times for 45 yards, including scoring runs of 12 and 15 yards.
- Senior OLB D'Andre Walker had five stops, including a sack and forced fumble. Walker has 13 tackles on the year with five tackles for loss and four sacks.
- Junior DB Tyrique McGhee made his third career start and first since the 2017 Tennessee game. Freshman Cade Mays started at RG in place of the injured Ben Cleveland.

No. 2 Georgia 43, Missouri 29

Sept. 22, 2018 • Memorial Stadium - Columbia, Mo.

COLUMBIA, Mo. - A defensive first half and offensive onslaught in the second half pushed the second-ranked Georgia Bulldogs past the Missouri Tigers, 43-29, Saturday afternoon at Faurot Field at Memorial Stadium in front of a nationally televised ESPN audience.

The Bulldogs headed into the half with a 20-7 lead after defense and special teams dominated the pace of the game. On third-and-nine, Campbell stripped Missouri's Albert Okwuegbunam and scoop-scored for a 64-yard fumble return to put the first points on the board.

After the Tigers evened the score, junior place kicker Rodrigo Blankenship connected on a 44-yard field goal to move Georgia back in front 10-7. On the ensuing drive, the Georgia defense produced another turnover – this time a 43-yard interception return by linebacker Tae Crowder. The takeaway turned into another Blankenship try, a 21-yard field goal, for the 13-7 lead early in the second quarter.

Special teams then made its splash later in the second to put the Bulldogs up 20-7. Georgia bombarded Mizzou punter Corey Fatony with Eric Stokes blocking the kick and scooping the football for an 8-yard touchdown.

A back-and-forth third quarter saw both teams trade touchdowns. First, Georgia with a 33-yard touchdown pass from Fromm to Ridley capped the five-play, 59-yard drive. Mizzou responded with a long drive and score, but the Bulldogs struck on their second play from scrimmage. Fromm threw a jump ball to sophomore receiver Jeremiah Holloman who eluded the sideline to run free for a 61-yard touchdown.

The Tigers got the last touchdown in the third to put the score at 33-22, and the scoring commenced immediately in the fourth quarter. On the first play, Fromm connected with a wide-open Mecole Hardman for a 54-yard touchdown pass to finish the Bulldogs' longest drive of the game that spanned 77 yards in just five plays.

Missouri quarterback Drew Lock pulled the game to a 40-29 margin on an 11-yard run with 10:47 left in the game, but the Bulldogs ate nearly five minutes off the clock before Mizzou blocked a field goal, but the Georgia defense forced a turnover on downs to mitigate the loss. Another drive taking up 3:17 ended with a 40-yard Blankenship field goal, putting the game at 43-29 with less than two minutes remaining.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"The flow of the game was about what I thought it would be, there was a lot of emotional big plays. I didn't see us having the big plays in the turnover game with the fumble recovery and blocked punt, but they were really big plays. We struggled some to stop the run today, which is not indicative of defense we want to have, and we struggled to run the ball. When you have that combination then you are going struggle some and we did. Give Missouri credit, they have a good football team. We knew that coming in. I've always respected them. They've won nine of the last 10 games and you don't do that by accident."

Worth Noting...

- For the fourth straight game this year, Georgia (4-0, 2-0 SEC) scored at least 40 points for the first time since the 2012 season. In 2012, Georgia opened the year with five straight games of scoring at least 40 apiece. This season, Georgia now is averaging 44.5 points a game. The school record is 37.8, set in 2012.
- Missouri ran a total of 85 plays, which is four more than No. 2 Oklahoma ran in the Rose Bowl double-overtime game, the previous high against a Kirby Smart team.
- Eric Stokes' blocked punt with a TD marked the first since CJ Byrd in 2006 against UAB. Alongside Tyson Campbell's 68-yard fumble return, it was the first time since the 2015 road game at Tennessee that Georgia has scored a defensive TD and special teams TD in the same game. That year, Leonard Floyd had a 96-yard fumble return and Reggie Davis had a 70-yard punt return.
- The Georgia defense held senior quarterback Drew Lock without a touchdown in the air. Senior outside linebacker D'Andre Walker had two forced fumbles and two sacks of Lock. The Bulldogs had one sack coming in to the game, which also belonged to Walker.
- After a 6-for-14 first half, sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm went 7-for-9 for 194 yards and three touchdowns in the second.

2018 GAME SUMMARIES

No. 3 Georgia 49, Middle Tennessee 7

Sept. 15, 2018 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

ATHENS, Ga. - Forty-nine Bulldog points and a definitive Georgia defense backed a resounding 49-7 victory against the Middle Tennessee Blue Raiders at Sanford Stadium.

The Bulldog offense completed the contest with 484 total yards, including 382 in the first half. Averaging 45.3 points per game this season, the Bulldogs have scored 40-plus points through three consecutive matchups.

Junior tailback Elijah Holyfield led the Bulldog run game, becoming the first Georgia running back to record a 100-yard game this season, reaching the mark in the first half.

He was joined by sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm, who threw for an efficient 10-for-12 clip with three touchdowns and 128 yards. Sophomore wide receiver Jeremiah Holloman paced the pass game with 90 yards on three catches, becoming the third different Bulldog receiver to do so in as many games.

The Bulldogs opened the contest with a seven-play, 87-yard drive, highlighted by Holyfield's career-long 66-yard rush. Three plays later, tight end Charlie Woerner provided a block to set up the Fromm-Hardman five-yard connection. Junior wide receiver Mecole Hardman leads the receivers with three touchdowns this season.

Senior defensive back Deandre Baker snagged his second interception of the season, which he returned for 26 yards. Holloman cemented the 14-0 lead with his first career touchdown.

To usher in the second quarter, junior wide receiver Tyler Simmons broke free for a career-long 56-yard rushing touchdown, the first of his career. Hardman widened the Georgia lead to 28 on a 70-yard punt return, the first since Isaiah McKenzie in 2016.

Senior wide receiver Riley Ridley capped a 4-play, 74-yard drive with a 12-yard touchdown on a pass from Fromm for the 35-7 advantage. Freshman quarterback Justin Fields sent the Bulldogs into intermission with his first rushing touchdown of his career.

Georgia tacked on another career-first touchdown with a nine-yard pass from Fromm to senior wide receiver Jayson Stanley in the middle of the end zone.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"Every player who goes in needs to perform like a starter. There's no room for error because we're one play away from those guys... I like the toughness we show during the week. We've created a standard the last couple of years, and now we're owning it with players holding other players accountable."

Worth Noting...

- The 49-7 victory over Middle Tennessee gives Georgia its third consecutive win with at least 40 points. The Bulldogs last did that when they started the 2012 season with five straight 40+ point games.

- Junior TB Elijah Holyfield had a career-long 66-yard run on the Bulldogs' first possession to set up a touchdown three plays later. Holyfield completed the half with eight carries for a career-high 100 yards. The last back to hit the century mark was Sony Michel (181) and Nick Chubb (145) in the Rose Bowl Game win over Oklahoma last year.

- Junior WR Tyler Simmons took a handoff at the beginning of the second quarter a career long 56 yards for his first career touchdown of any kind. This capped a season-long scoring drive of 94 yards, which was six plays and lasted 2:40, and was Georgia's longest scoring drive since the Bulldogs went 98 yards on 11 plays in 6:34 versus Auburn in 2014.

- Mecole Hardman, junior WR who led the SEC in punt returns/yards/avg. last year, returned a punt 70 yards in the second quarter for his first career PR for a touchdown to give the Bulldogs a 28-0 edge. Isaiah McKenzie was the last Georgia player to return a punt for a score after he went 82 yards versus UL-Lafayette in 2016.

No. 3 Georgia 41, No. 24 South Carolina 17

Sept. 8, 2018 • Williams-Brice Stadium - Columbia, S.C.

Columbia, S.C. - The No. 3 Georgia Bulldogs routed the 24th-ranked South Carolina Gamecocks Saturday afternoon 41-17 in front of a crowd of 83,140 at Williams-Brice Stadium and a CBS national audience.

The Bulldogs improved to 2-0 overall and earned their first Southeastern Conference win over USC (1-1, 0-1). The victory marks Georgia's seventh ranked win in 30 games under head coach Kirby Smart.

With an efficient 15-for-18 clip, 194 yards and a touchdown, sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm guided Georgia (2-0, 1-0 SEC) to its highest point production in Columbia, dating back to 1894.

Five more Bulldogs joined Fromm with trips to the end zone: senior linebacker Juwan Taylor, running backs D'Andre Swift, Elijah Holyfield, Brian Herrien and wide receiver Mecole Hardman, who also led the receiving group with six completions for 103 yards – both career bests.

The Georgia defense produced a 7-0 Bulldog lead within the game's first minute. A deflected pass from Jake Bentley intended for running back Rico Dowdle found the hands of senior defensive back Deandre Baker, who returned it for 55 yards but fumbled inches before the end zone. Taylor trailed it and completed the touchdown.

Following a South Carolina three-and-out, a 30-yard Fromm-Hardman completion and a 15-yard Gamecock penalty positioned Georgia in the red zone. The next play, Swift sealed the two-touchdown lead with an untouched 17-yard rush. Place kicker Rodrigo Blankenship soon followed with a 45-yard strike for a 17-0 lead.

South Carolina answered back with 10 points on a halfback pass play from Deebo Samuel to Bryan Edwards and a Parker White 26-yard kick, but Blankenship boomed a second 45-yard field goal for the 20-10 lead at the halftime buzzer.

Back from the locker room, the Bulldogs directed a 6-play, 75-yard possession, capped by a 34-yard pass from Fromm to Hardman for the 27-10 advantage. Holyfield and Herrien each added trips to the end zone in the third quarter, and Georgia cruised from there to a 41-17 final.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"At the end of the day, they (South Carolina) just wore down ... You could just see the air coming out of them a little bit as they wore down physically. The big stop of the game to me was either the first or second drive in the second half. We had third-and-2 or third-and-3 and stopped them. They had to punt it right back to us. The defense was right back out there. That takes its toll. I think our conditioning showed through. A lot of credit goes to coach (Scott) Sinclair and the strength staff. They worked those kids hard all summer, so they could prepare for second halves like that.

Worth Noting...

- Georgia carried a 20-10 advantage to halftime and posted a 41-17 win, marking the most points it has ever scored in Columbia in the series that dates back to 1894. The 24-point margin of victory was the most in Columbia since 1971. Georgia improved to 2-0 (1-0 SEC) on the year and has won four in a row over USC.

- Junior WR Mecole Hardman established a career-high for receiving yards with 103 on six catches. Hardman was the first Bulldog receiver to have a 100-yard game since Isaiah McKenzie (103) vs. TCU in the 2016 Liberty Bowl win.

- Senior DB Deandre Baker made his first interception of the year and the sixth of his career in the first quarter, returning it 55 yards before dropping it before crossing the goal line. Senior ILB Juwan Taylor scooped up the fumble and scored to put Georgia up 7-0. Taylor's touchdown marked Georgia's first INT returned for a TD since Maurice Smith took one 35 yards vs. Auburn in 2016.

- Junior PK Rodrigo Blankenship gave the Bulldogs a 17-7 lead late in the opening period on a 45-yard field goal and then made a 44-yarder as the first half expired. He is now 3-for-3 on the year and 12-for-18 in his career from 40+. He logged six more touchbacks on kickoffs today, improving to 14-14 on the season.

- Sophomores DB Richard LeCounte and ILB Monty Rice led the team with career highs in tackles: 10 and 8, respectively.

2018 GAME SUMMARIES

Georgia 45, Austin Peay 0

Sept. 1, 2018 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

ATHENS, Ga. - A stout defensive effort coupled with an explosive Georgia offense lifted the Bulldogs to a 45-0 victory against the Austin Peay Governors in the season opener at Sanford Stadium on Saturday afternoon in front of a capacity crowd of 92,746 and an ESPN national televised audience.

As the Georgia defense held the Governors scoreless in the first half, every offensive possession from the Red and Black resulted in a Georgia score. The first of the 2018-19 season, a Rodrigo Blankenship 34-yard field goal capped a 10-play, 41-yard offensive drive directed by Fromm.

Following the first of many stands from the Bulldog defense, the Georgia offense conducted an 11-play, 80-yard march, featuring 46 total yards from Swift. Junior Riley Ridley claimed the first touchdown of the season and a 10-0 lead with a 10-yard connection with Fromm.

Thirty-nine seconds later, senior outside linebacker D'Andre Walker placed the ball back into the hands of the Bulldog offense, recovering a fumble from Austin Peay quarterback Jeremiah Oatsvall. The next play, Swift ran for an 8-yard touchdown, sending Blankenship to the field to secure the extra point and the 17-0 margin.

The Bulldog debuts continued into the second quarter: Fields entered the game and placed the ball in the hands of junior wide receiver Demetris Robertson. With a pair of blocks from the tight end tandem of Isaac Nauta and Charlie Woerner, the open field presented itself for the Cal transfer, cementing his first Georgia score on a career-high 72-yard run to set up the 24-0 lead.

After a three-and-out from Austin Peay, a 9-play, 69-yard drive was finalized with a handoff to Holyfield, who eluded multiple Governor defenders on his way to the end zone with a 17-yard touchdown. Junior Mecole Hardman closed out the half for the Bulldogs, using his speed to out-run the Austin Peay secondary to a 38-0 advantage with the help of a Blankenship extra point.

In the second half, a 36-yard run from Cook positioned the Bulldogs in Austin Peay territory, set up for a Fields-Nauta 12-yard touchdown. Blankenship sealed the final at 45-0.

Cochair Kirby Smart said...

"We're happy to get the win. It was a good way to start. The kids played hard. But there are a lot of things we can improve on. We knew we couldn't get better until we played a game. We'll learn from this one, learn from our mistakes. We'll get some things ironed out."

Worth Noting...

- The shutout marked the first in a season opener since 2003 against Clemson. Before Austin Peay, the most recent shutout for the Bulldogs came against Tennessee in 2017 (41-0), and the most recent team to be held scoreless for two quarters was Alabama in the College Football Playoff National Championship Game.
- The Bulldog defense held the Governors to 152 total yards and seven first downs on 50 plays. In the first half alone, Georgia limited Austin Peay to 81 yards with one trip to the Red Zone.
- Offensive production was spread between 11 receivers from three different quarterbacks: sophomore Jake Fromm and freshmen Justin Fields and Matthew Downing.
- D'Andre Swift paced the backfield with eight carries and a career-high four completions. The Philadelphia, Penn. native primarily shared responsibilities with juniors Brian Herrien and Elijah Holyfield and freshman James Cook.
- Demetris Robertson's lone carry brought a 72-yard career high touchdown, the longest run by a Bulldog since Sony Michel went 75 yards in the Rose Bowl against Oklahoma.
- Georgia had six first-time starters on offense and defense, including one true freshman, as well as true freshman punter Jake Camarda: redshirt freshman OT Isaiah Wilson, junior WR Tyler Simmons, senior WR (and team captain for Austin Peay) Ahkil Crumpton, senior OLB D'Andre Walker, freshman DB Tyson Campbell and sophomore OLB Walter Grant.
