About Saturday's Game

Georgia Tech finishes a stretch of three games in six days Saturday afternoon when it hosts state rival Georgia for a noon contest at McCamish Pavilion.

Tech (6-4), in its third season under head coach Josh Pastner, is 5-1 at home this season, dropping its most recent game at McCamish Pavilion, 79-69, on Monday following an eight-day break for exams. But the Yellow Jackets rebounded by winning its first road game of the year, 69-65 over Arkansas, Wednesday night. Tech had lost at No. 5 Tennessee and Northwestern, as well as a neutral court game to St. John's.

Georgia (6-4), in its first season under head coach Tom Crean, lost its only other true road game, an 81-77 decision at Temple in the Bulldogs' second game of the season. Georgia's wins have come against Savannah State, Sam Houston State, Illinois State, Kennesaw State, Texas Southern and Oakland.

Saturday's game will be televised live on ESPNU, and streamed live through the ESPN app. Radio coverage is provided on the Georgia Tech IMG Sports Network, airing in Atlanta on 680 AM and 93.7 FM the Fan. The Tech broadcast is available on satellite radio (XM ch. 382, internet ch. 973).

- Three games in six days Georgia Tech is finishing a stretch of three games in six days this week after playing only once in the 15 days prior. The Jackets do not have another such stretch the rest of the season, even during ACC play.
- Three vs. the SEC Georgia is the last of three opponents from the Southeastern Conference that Georgia Tech faces during its non-conference schedule. The Yellow Jackets lost at No. 5 Tennessee, 66-53, in the second game of the season, and won, 69-65 at Arkansas Wednesday night.
- Home for the holidays Tech is in the midst of seven home games in a stretch of eight games. It began Dec. 9 with a 73-40 victory over Florida A&M and carries the Yellow Jackets through the pre-conference schedule and ends with ACC games against Wake Forest (Jan. 5) and Virginia Tech (Jan. 9). Tech's only road game in that span was at Arkansas.
- Frequent visitor points for Crean First-year Georgia head coach Tom Crean is visiting McCamish Pavilion for the third straight season. He brought his final Indiana team to Atlanta for an opening round game in the 2017 National Invitation Tournament, and served as an ESPN color analyst for Tech's home court loss to Tennessee just eight months later.
- Tech-UGA connections Georgia assistant coaches Amir Abdur-Rahim and Chad Dollar both were members of Georgia Tech's basketball staff under former Yellow Jackets head coach Brian Gregory. Dollar was Gregory's assistant coach for all five of his years at Tech, while Abdur-Rahim was Gregory's director of player development for his first season (2011-12) on The Flats
- Tough slate Eight opponents on Georgia Tech's schedule were ranked in the top 25 of the preseason AP and coaches polls, including Tennessee and ACC foes Duke, Virginia, North Carolina, Virginia Tech, Syracuse, Florida State and Clemson. Five ACC teams are currently in the top 25 of both polls, and two others are receiving votes.
- Defending well Georgia Tech ranks third in the ACC in scoring defense (No. 15 nationally), field goal percentage defense (No. 23 nationally) and three-point percentage defense (8th nationally). The Jackets are also third in blocked shots and in second in steals.
- Longer bench Tech has deployed at least eight players for significant minutes in each of its 10 games so far, sometimes as many as 10. Tech's bench has played 33.5 percent of available minutes, 99th in the nation according to KenPom.com (national average is 30.8 pct.). Tech reserves are outscoring its opponents 25.8 to 14.5 per game).
- That's a triple Georgia Tech has averaged 5.9 threepoint field goals, 59 total threes made by six different players. Tech averaged just 4.9 made threes last season, last in the ACC.
- Creating offense with defense Georgia Tech has forced an average of 15.4 turnovers per game, about two per game more than last season (ranks 6th in ACC, 71st in NCAA). Tech has turned those into 17.1 points per game (24.4 percent of total points).
- Picking up the pace Through 10 games, Tech is averaging 69.6 possessions per game to rank No. 192 in the nation, according to KenPom.com. The Jackets averaged 66.1 possessions last year (277th).
- 642 Career points for Brandon Alston, the most of any current Tech player. Jose Alvarado is next with 445, followed by Shembari Phillips with 401, and Abdoulaye Gueye with 249. Georgia Tech finished last season with a trio of 1,000-point career scorers on its roster for the first time since 1989.

Tech-UGA Game Moves to November Next Two Seasons

The Georgia Tech and Georgia basketball teams have signed an agreement to play the next two games of the series the week before Thanksgiving, giving both teams an opportunity to play the game at home in front of their student bodies before the fall semester ends.

The teams will face off next season on Thursday, Nov. 20, at Stegeman Coliseum in Athens, and the following season on Wednesday, Nov. 19, at McCamish Pavilion in Atlanta.

In the 194-game history of the series, Tech and Georgia have played their game before Thanksgiving only twice, on Nov. 15, 2013 in Athens and Nov. 14. 2014 in Atlanta. The Yellow Jackets won both games and lead the all-time series, 105-89.

As Southeastern Conference foes from 1932-64, the games were played in January, February and March. After Tech left the ACC, most of the games remained in January and February until the rivalry became a late December fixture at the Omni arena in downtown Atlanta from 1981-94. The series has been played on the two campuses every year since then, mostly in December.

More on Series vs. Georgia

- · Georgia Tech leads the overall series 105-89 and has played the Bulldogs more than any other opponent in its haskethall history.
- The series has been played alternately on the respective schools' campuses since the 1995-96 season. Georgia holds a 13-10 lead over that period.
- In the 23 on-campus meetings since 1995, Georgia has won three times in Atlanta, and Tech has won twice in
- Before that December, 1995 meeting in Athens, the teams played 14 straight years at the Omni in downtown Atlanta, which was located on the site of the current Philips Arena. Tech went 8-6 against the Bulldogs in the facility, including eight of the last 10 before the neutral series ended. The teams have played on neutral sites other than the SEC or Southern Intercollegiate Championships only one other time, that coming at the 1960 Gator Bowl Tournament in Jacksonville, Fla.
- · Georgia has won the last three games in the series, two of those in Athens, including an 80-59 win last December. The Bulldogs also won the last meeting in McCamish Pavilion, 60-43, in December of 2016.
- Prior to that, Georgia Tech had won four consecutive games over Georgia for the first time since winning 10 in a row over the Bulldogs, the longest for either team in the series, from December of 1958 to February of 1961.
- Tech snapped a 13-game losing streak in games played at Stegeman Coliseum with a 68-56 win over Georgia on Dec. 7, 2011. It was Tech's first win in Athens since Nov. 26, 1976, a stretch that spanned three Tech coaches - Dwane Morrison (0-for-his-last-4), Bobby Cremins (0-4) and Paul
- With Tech's 80-71 win in the Nov. 15, 2013 contest in Athens, the Yellow Jackets won back-to-back in Athens for the first time since winning three in a row from 1959-61
- Tech was 4-5 against Georgia teams coached by Mark Fox, who won his first two encounters against the Jackets.
- · Tech won its only previous encounter with first-year Georgia coach Tom Crean, capturing a 75-63 win over his final Indiana team in the opening round of the 2017 National
- Tech and Georgia were both charter members of the Southeastern Conference, and the Yellow Jackets went 55-29 against the Bulldogs in the SEC before leaving the conference after the 1963-64 season.
 - Tech is 35-33 against Georgia since leaving the SEC.

Last Meeting

Georgia 80, Georgia Tech 59 Dec. 19, 2017 • Athens, Ga.

Despite 21 points from Josh Okogie in just his second game of the season, Georgia Tech was unable to overcome hot-shooting Georgia as it fell 80-59 at Stegeman Coliseum.

Okogie's 10th-career game with 20 or more points paced the Yellow Jackets (5-5), just slightly ahead of Tadric Jackson's 17 points - 13 of which came in the first half. Freshman Jose Alvarado rounded out Tech's double-digit scorers with 12, while Ben Lammers led all rebounders with eight total.

The Bulldogs (8-2) were led by Yante Maten, who finished with 24 points and six rebounds.

Georgia Tech actually outshot UGA slightly in the first half, shooting 50 percent to their 48.3, but still faced a two-point deficit after committing eight costly first-half turnovers. The Bulldogs then jumped out of the halftime gates in the second half, hitting eight of their first nine shots to extend the lead.

The Yellow Jackets would try to make a late run, forcing four turnovers in just a two-and-a-half minute span, but a 10-0 Georgia run and Tech's cold 1-of-7 finish from the field put away the game.

Last Game: Jackets Get Big Road Win

Jose Alvarado scored a game-high 20 points to lead for Georgia Tech players in double figures, and the Yellow Jackets outscored Arkansas 10-5 over the final 1:47 to capture a 69-65 victory over the Razorbacks Wednesday night at Bud Walton Arena

James Banks III scored 14 points and grabbed 14 rebounds for his fourth double-double in five games for Tech (6-4), which rebounded from a disappointing home loss to Gardner-Webb Monday night. Freshmen Michael Devoe and Khalid Moore, each making their first collegiate starts for the Jackets, added 11 and 10 points, respectively.

Tech coach Josh Pastner inserted the two freshmen in the starting lineup hoping Tech could shake its recent slow starts. The ploy worked as the Yellow Jackets started the game on a 15-4 run, each scoring one basket while Alvarado scored his first three baskets of the night.

The homestanding Razorbacks recovered, connecting on six three-point field goals, three from Mason Jones, to take a 32-31 lead into intermission.

The lead went back and forth for most of the second half, with Arkansas taking their final lead at 60-59 on a three from Isaiah Ine

Tech got the lead back for good on a pair of free throws from Banks, and the Jackets made it 65-60 on a fast break layup from Alvarado and a pair of free throws from Devoe. Moore beloed seal the win with four free throws in the final 36 seconds

Following the Trends

- Freshmen Michael Devoe and Khalid Moore made their first collegiate starts against Arkansas, and Georgia Tech started its fourth different lineup this season. Transfer James Banks III made his fourth straight start in the post, and Moses Wright his eighth of the season at the big forward spot. Sophomore Curtis Haywood II, the only Tech player who had started each of the first eight Tech games, did not start for the first time this season. Jose Alvarado has started eight of the nine Tech games.
- Tech has deployed at least eight players for significant minutes in each of its 10 games so far, sometimes as many as 10 when Evan Cole has been healthy and available. Tech used eight players at Arkansas, Cole did not play.
- Tech has held every opponent this season under its season scoring average breakdown by game: Lamar 81.0 (69), Tennessee 82.8 (66), East Carolina 72.7 (54), UTRGV 70.2 (44), Prairie View A&M 69.2 (54), Northwestern 76.0 (67), St. John's 83.0 (76), Florida A&M 63.2 (40), Gardner-Webb 82.2 (79), Arkansas 85.2 (69).
- Tech has outrebounded its opponent six times in the last seven games after not doing so in its first three games of the season. Tech forged its largest rebound margin of the season at Arkansas (43-31) and has outrebounded its last seven foes by 3.5 per game.
- Arkansas went 10-of-32 from three-point range, the most threes made and attempted against the Yellow Jackets this season. Tech had yielded just 40 three-point field goals in its first nine games (4.4 per game, 26.7 percent). The Jackets entered the night No. 1 in the ACC in lowest three-point percentage yield and has given up just 27.5 percent for the season. The Jackets allowed an average of 7.1 per game and a success rate of 37.9 percent last season.
- Tech limited Arkansas to 38.1-percent shooting from the floor, the eighth time in 10 games this season the Jackets have held an opponent under 40 percent. Tech ranks third in the ACC in field goal percentage yield at 38.1 percent.
- Arkansas came into the game hitting 47.3 percent from the floor and 36.2 percent from three-point range.
- Defensively, Tech is forcing 15.4 turnovers and taking 8.3 steals per game, figures which rank third and second in the ACC, respectively. Only St. John's (5 turnovers) and Gardner-Webb (9) have managed to keep their turnover total under 10 this season against Tech. Tech forced 16 turnovers from

Arkansas and converted them into 13 points, and is averaging 17.1 points from turnovers this season. The Jackets forced an average of 12.6 turnovers per game last season and took 6.9 steals per game.

- Tech defeated Arkansas despite committing a seasonhigh 20 turnovers (none in the final six minutes), the most for the Jackets since recording 20 at Louisville in a 77-54 loss. Tech last won a game committing 20 turnovers on Dec. 7, 2016 at VCU (76-73 in overtime).
- Tech has connected on 48 percent of its field goals at home, and 35 percent of its three-point attempts, but just 66.9 percent of its free throw attempts (as opposed to 78.7 percent on the road).
- Tech has attempted 192 threes (19.2 per game) and made 59 (5.9 per game), compared to averages of 15.3 attempts and 4.9 made per game in 2017-18. Four different Yellow Jackets have made at least seven three-point field goals so far this season. Tech has hit 30.7 percent of its threes for the season, below last season's 31.8-percent clip.
- Tech's bench has been outscored the last two games by 34-18 after having held a 30-to-13.9 per game advantage over its first eight games. For the season, Tech reserves have averaged 25.8 points per game to 14.5 for the opponents.
- Tech has averaged committing 15 fouls over its last three games after averaging 22.1 over its first seven games. The Jackets rank among the top 50 teams in the nation in most fouls committed.

Personnel Notes

- Jose Alvarado posted his sixth double-figure game in the last seven with a game-high 20 points (9-15 FG) against Arkansas. He has seven this season and 23 for his career.
 Alvarado, 17-of-31 from the floor in his last two games, has scored 20 or more six times in his career.
- Alvarado played the full 40 minutes against Arkansas, the first time this season and the ninth time in his career he has posted a complete game. The 6-foot sophomore played all but 33 seconds of the Gardner-Webb game, and might have played all 40 if not for picking up his fourth foul with 2:17 remaining, forcing Tech to remove him on defensive possessions.

• James Banks reached posted his fourth double-double in Tech's last games, scoring 14 points (5-7 FG, 4-4 FT) and with a season-best 14 rebounds. The 6-9 junior has averaged 13.6 points, hit 27 of 38 shots from the floor and averaged 12.6 per game) in his last five games.

- · Banks, with a career-best five blocked shots at Arkansas, has had at least one blocked shot in each of the nine games he has played, averaging 2.67 for the season (second in the ACC).
- · Freshman Michael Devoe, continuing to get his legs under him after missing most of pre-season practice with a big toe injury, made his first collegiate start at Arkansas and scored 11 points, hitting 3-of-10 from the floor and 4-of-5 from the free throw line. He added three rebounds, two assists and two steals in a season-high 33 minutes. He has three double-digit scoring games this season, is tied for the team lead in steals (18), and has converted 82.1 percent of his free throw tries.
- Freshman Khalid Moore also earned his first collegiate start after putting together four consecutive solid games off the bench since a DNP Nov. 23 against Prairie View A&M. The 6-7 forward posted his second double-figure game of the season at Arkansas with 10 points (3-7 FG, 4-6 FT), sealing the victory for Tech by going 4-for-4 at the line in the final 36 seconds. Moore, who played a career-best 34 minutes, has averaged 7.6 points over his last five games (12-of-19 FG, 12-of-14 FT) with nine assists and five steals. For the season he has connected on 53.8 percent of his field goal tries and 80 percent (16-of-20) from the foul line.
- · Curtis Haywood II has connected on 6-of-13 threepoint attempts in Tech's last two games. Haywood, who went 4-for-8 from behind the arc against Gardner-Webb, had been 3-for-14 from behind the arc over the previous four games.
- · Moses Wright started his eighth straight game for Georgia Tech, scoring four points with four rebounds in 17 minutes against Arkansas. Wright has two double-digit games (11 vs. UTRGV, 12 vs. St. John's) in that stretch.
- Brandon Alston was shut out (0-for-1 vs. Arkansas) from the three-point line for the second straight game and for the fourth time this season. The 6-5 senior has hit 12-of-25 (48 percent) from long range this season, 47.2 percent overall.

Pastner's Key Metrics

- Assists to made field goals: Tech assisted on 14 of 25 made field goals (56.0 percent) against Arkansas, missing its nightly goal of 60 percent for the eighth time this season. The Jackets are at 55 percent for the season, above the nation's average of just over 50 percent.
- Free throws made to opponents' attempts: Tech connected on 14-of-20 free throw attempts to Arkansas' 7-of-9 (nightly goal of making more than opponent tries accomplished). Tech is 35-11 under Josh Pastner when attempting more free throws than the opponent.
 - Turnovers: Tech has forced 15.4 turnovers per game

(6th in ACC) and taken 8.3 steals per game. The Jackets forced an average of 12.6 turnovers per game last season and took 6.9 steals per game. Tech ranks No. 2 in the ACC in steals.

· Guard rebounding: Tech's guards combined for 15 of Tech's 28 defensive rebounds against Arkansas. The group of Alvarado, Alston, Devoe, Haywood, Moore and Phillips has combined to take 127 of Tech's 267 defensive rebounds this season (47.6 percent).

Guard Your Yard

Due to its ability to play different schemes and keep opponents off balance, Georgia Tech has been able to rely on its defense to win games over Josh Pastner's first two-plus seasons at Georgia Tech.

This Yellow Jacket team has shown signs of returning to the lockdown group from the 2016-17 NIT finals team that ranked No. 6 in adjusted offensive efficiency (91.0 points allowed per 100 possessions) according to KenPom.com. That group ranked fourth in the ACC in scoring defense (66.8 ppg) and No. 1 in FG percentage defense (39.8 pct.).

Through 10 games, Tech ranks No. 16 in adjusted defensive efficiency (92.6 ppg/100 possessions), and is No. 3 in the ACC in scoring defense at 61.4 points per game.

- Tech's effective field goal percentage defense (42.7 pct.) ranks No. 9 nationally, according to KenPom.com, and the Jackets are No. 23 in the NCAA rankings in field goal percentage defense. Tech ranks 20th in KenPom in effective two-point percentage (43.4) defense.
- The Jackets have also defended the three-point shot better, allowing just 27.5 percent accuracy to lead the ACC and rank No. 8 nationally. Tech is No. 19 in effective 3-point defense according to KenPom.com.
- · Tech has improved markedly in one other area takeaways. The Jackets are No. 2 the ACC and rank 42nd nationally in steals (8.3 per game) and are No. 3 and 26, respectively, in blocked shots (5.3 per game).

Assisted Living

Georgia Tech coach Josh Pastner preached and prodded his Yellow Jackets on ball and player movement and hard cutting from the first time he got his team on the practice court. His primary measuring stick on how well the Jackets perform offensively is their ratio of assists to made field goals.

In Pastner's first season, the Yellow Jackets ranked 13th nationally, according to KenPom.com, in highest percentage of assists to made field goals at 62.6 percent, the team's highest rate since the 2000-01 season. Tech's number was 63.2 percent in ACC games. Pastner's nightly goal is 60 percent.

Tech did not perform as well in that department in 2017-18, assisting on 54.6 of its made field goals overall, 53.9 against ACC teams, and missing Pastner's 60-percent bar 14 times. Tech is 105th so far in 2018-19 at 55 percent, and remains well above the national average (52.1 pct.) in that

Storylines for 2018-19

- 104th season Georgia Tech is playing its 104th season of basketball and has an all-time record of 1,367-
- Unlucky 13 Tech was picked to finish 13th in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season in a vote of the ACC media, ahead of Pittsburgh and Wake Forest. The Yellow Jackets finished 13th last season.
- Seven Number of freshmen and sophomores expected to play significant roles for the Yellow Jackets this
- The upward progress of the program is evident in the development of its 2017-18 freshman class, each of whom received significant playing time last season and made significant contributions on the ACC level. Though not highlyrated in terms of rankings, the four-man class has a wide range of skills and is ripe for development into consistent conferencelevel performers over the next couple of years.
 - a. Point guard Jose Alvarado started every game last season and showed durability and toughness by averaging more than 38 minutes in ACC games until suffering a dislocated elbow Feb. 11.
 - b. Off-guard Curtis Haywood II was developing into a significant shooting threat and excellent defender before suffering stress reaction in his shin and missing the final month of the 2017-18 season.
 - c. Forwards Evan Cole and Moses Wright, both under-theradar signees, exceeded expectations for their first year when forced into action due to injuries over the final month of the season. With added strength and development this off-season, can be counted on to be in the frontcourt rotation and make significant contributions at both ends of the floor.
- Coach Pastner, his staff and the student-athletes in the program have carried over a solid, sustainable culture of accountability and dependability from the previous coaching staff which enabled the team to overcome a number of key injuries last season and continue to work hard and remain focused on the court and in the weight room.
- Pastner replaced two assistant coaches Tavaras Hardy and Darryl LaBarrie - over the last year. Hardy was named head coach at Loyola of Maryland in late March, while LaBarrie resigned during the season. Anthony Wilkins, an Atlanta native, joined the staff after five seasons at Tulane, and Julian Swartz was elevtaed from his position as director of recruiting and compliance.
- Tech has added a three-man recruiting class ranked No. 46 in the country according to 247Sports, including consensus four-star guard Michael Devoe and three-star forwards Khalid Moore and Kristian Sjolund, and true to staff's objectives, the class has varied skill sets and are expected to develop into significant contributors next season and beyond (building through multiple quality recruiting classes)
- Another addition to the roster this season 6-3 guard Shembari Phillips, a high-major conference player who sat out the 2017-18 season as a transfer from Tennessee. Has the size and varied skill set necessary to compete in the ACC (6.2 ppg, 3.1 rpg, 37.5 pct. 3s in 2016-17). He has two years of eligibility.
- Tech also accepted transfer James Banks, a 6-9. 243-pound frontcourt player from Decatur, Ga., ranked as high as No. 49 among high school seniors in the class of 2016. After two years at Texas, he enrolled at Tech for the summer term and was granted immediate eligibility by the NCAA on Nov. 13. He has two seasons of eligibility at Tech.
- · Tech returned six players who received significant playing time in 2017-18 - 15 or more minutes per ACC game

- and combined to start 91 games overall. They accounted for more than 53 percent of total minutes played and 43 percent of Tech's scoring. Five of those players have two or more years of eligibility remaining.
- Tech has a young roster this season three freshmen, four sophomores, three juniors and two seniors among scholarship players returning or incoming - but the process of getting old and staying old and building a sustainable winning program is ongoing.
- · Player development successes over the past two seasons include Josh Okogie, Ben Lammers and Tadric Jackson, who maximized their skill sets under the current coaching staff, doubling their scoring and rebounding averages over their first two seasons. Okogie went from being ranked the 11th in the state as a HS senior to a first-round NBA draft pick. Last season, 6-9 forward Abdoulaye Gueye developed into an ACC-level contributor, making a similar leap from the non-conference season to conference play. Graduate transfer Brandon Alston, who has a year of eligibility remaining, had similar statistical numbers on the ACC level this season as he compiled in two seasons at Lehigh and was fundamentally sound in his ballhandling and defense.
- With the addition of Phillips and the arrival of Devoe and Moore, as well as the return of Alston and sophomores Alvarado and Haywood, Tech is deep and talented across the perimeter and wings. Tech has Gueye, rising junior Sylvester Ogbonda and Banks to rotate through the post, with Cole and Wright rotating in the big forward position. This gives Pastner the option of playing a bigger lineup when necessary.
- Tech has won 34 games overall and 14 ACC games in Josh Paatner's first two seasons, on par or better than the first two years of each of Josh Pastner's predecessors in the ACC era. For comparison, Buzz Williams won 12 ACC games in his first two years at Virginia Tech, same with Tony Bennett at Virginia. Leonard Hamilton and Mike Krzyzewski each won 10. Pastner has won 14.
- Head coach Josh Pastner's Georgia Tech teams are 5-12 against top-25 teams (5-4 at home). The Jackets knocked off No. 15 Miami and No. 25 Notre Dame last January as part of a 3-1 ACC start.
- Tech has sold out eight games at McCamish Pavilion over the past two seasons, including a facility-record five games in 2017-18. Tech's 29 homecourt wins over the past two seasons are more than any two-year period in the Jackets' ACC era except the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons combined (31). That's 43 home wins over the past three seasons, more than 14 per season.

Jackets' Signing Class Ranked No. 46

Georgia Tech's 2018 signing class was ranked No. 46 in the nation in a composite ranking published by 247Sports.

Tech signed a trio of high school prospects - 6-3 guard Michael Devoe of Orlando, Fla., 6-7 forward Khalid Moore of New York, N.Y., and 6-9 forward Kristian Sjolund of Kongsberg, Norway by way of Katy, Texas - to national letters-of-intent during the November signing period.

All three prospects are highly regarded for their talent level, versatility and upside as head coach Josh Pastner continued to build the Yellow Jackets' program.

Devoe, a four-star prospect, was ranked No. 62 in the Rivals 150, and No. 56 in the ESPN 100 (No. 15 point guard in the nation. He led Oak Ridge High School in Orlando, Fla., to a berth in the state quarterfinals as a junior before enrolling at Montverde Academy for his senior year, helping them to a national championship.

Moore was rated a 3-star prospect in the composite 247Sports ranking (No. 51 small forward, No. 5 in New York), as well as a 4-star prospect by ESPN (No. 42 small forward, No. 3 in New York. He attended the same high school that sent All-American Kenny Anderson to Georgia Tech in 1989, and he was a teammate of current Tech sophomore Jose Alvarado on the New York Rens AAU team.

Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech there, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

Sjolund was rated a 3-star prospect in the composite 247Sports ranking (No. 56 small forward, No. 18 in Texas), as well as a 4-star by ESPN (No. 36 small forward, No. 17 in Texas). He was born in the state of Washington but grew up in Norway, and has lived in the United States since 2014. He played for the Shooting Stars Red AAU team. Sjolund played with Norway in the 2015 FIBA u16 European Championships, averaging 18.7 points and 5.9 rebounds a game. Then in 2017 he played in the U18 Nordic Championship and scored 7.2 points a game.

Tech's class rank doesn't account for transfers Shembari Phillips, a 6-3 guard, and James Banks, a 6-9 center.

Tip-Ins on 2017-18 Season

- Georgia Tech posted a 13-19 overall record in its second season under head coach Josh Pastner, and finished 13th in the ACC standings at 6-12.
- Sophomore guard Josh Okogie was voted to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference third team, while senior center Ben Lammers made the ACC All-Defensive team for the second straight year.
- Okogie entered the NBA Draft following the season and was selected 20th overall by the Minnesota Timberwolves. The 6-4 guard became Tech's 19th first-round selection.
- Tech played the last seven games without freshman point guard Jose Alvarado, who dislocated his elbow during the first half of the Yellow Jackets loss to Duke on Feb. 11, and the last 11 games without freshman guard Curtis Haywood II, who was diagnosed with a stress reaction in his right leg following the Jackets' Jan. 31 game against Syracuse. Haywood had also missed six games earlier in the season with a shin injury.
- Okogie's 18.2 points-per-game average was the highest for a Tech player since the 1997-98 season, when Matt Harpring averaged 21.6, and the highest for a Tech sophomore since Harpring averaged 18.6 in 1995-96.
- Okogie became the sixth player in Tech history to reach 1,000 career points during his sophomore season. He finished the year with 1,033 points, fifth-most for a Tech player through his sophomore season.
- Tech finished the season with three 1,000-point scorers on its roster at the same time - Tadric Jackson (1,136), Ben Lammers (1,055), Josh Okogie (1,033) - for the first time since 1989 (Tom Hammonds, Brian Oliver, Dennis Scott) and for the third time in its ACC history (Bruce Dalrymple, Mark Price, John Salley in 1986).
- Tech improved to 7-10 all-time in the ACC-Big Ten Challenge when the Jackets defeated pre-season top-25 Northwestern at home in November.
- Twelve of the teams on Georgia Tech's 2017-18 schedule made the NCAA Tournament field, and 15 earned a spot in a post-season tournament.
- Tech has sold out eight games over the past two seasons, including a McCamish Pavilion record five games in 2017-18. Tech's 29 homecourt wins over the past two seasons is more than any two-year period in the Jackets' ACC era except the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons combined (31). That's 43 home wins over the past three seasons.
- Tech had its full roster to practice only for seven games last season. Injuries or other absences have forced Tech players to miss 46 games cumulatively this season. Freshman Jose Alvarado and Curtis Haywood II both suffered season-ending injuries, Alvarado on Feb. 11 early in Tech's game against Duke, and Haywood prior to the Jackets' Jan. 31 game against Syracuse. Tech used eight different starting lineups last season.
- Tech's playing rotation featured four freshmen and a first-year graduate transfer who combined to start 68 games and log 43 percent of the Yellow Jackets' total minutes.

Thin Gold Line

Some of Georgia Tech's most successful teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference era have had thin benches and a trio of players who averaged more than 35 minutes per game in ACC play, beginning with the Yellow Jackets' first ACC Championship team in 1985, dubbed the "Thin Gold Line."

Okogie Drafted 20th by Minnesota

Georgia Tech sophomore Josh Okogie became the first Yellow Jacket in seven years to be selected in the first round of the National Basketball Association Draft when the Minnesota Timberwolves tabbed him with the No. 20 overall pick.

The 6-4 guard was the Yellow Jackets' 19th first-round draft pick all-time and their first since Iman Shumpert was selected 17th overall by the New York Knicks in 2011.

Okogie earned third-team all-Atlantic Coast Conference honors as a sophomore in 2017-18 after ranking fourth in the conference in scoring with 18.2 points per game. He was a member of the ACC's all-freshman team in 2016-17 and finished his two-year collegiate career with a 16.9-point scoring average. He scored 1,033 points in 61 games at Tech, becoming one of only eight Yellow Jackets to ever surpass the 1,000-point mark in just two seasons.

He was Georgia Tech's 12th all-time early entry in the NBA Draft and cemented his status as a likely first-round pick with an outstanding performance at the NBA Combine in May.

Okogie, Lammers Capture ACC Honors

Ben Lammers and Josh Okogie both captured Atlantic Coast Conference honors during Josh Pastner's tenure as Georgia Tech head coach.

Josh Okogie, a 6-4 guard, was named to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference third team last season, and 6-10 senior center Ben Lammers earned a spot on the ACC's All-Defensive team for the second straight year in voting announced Sunday by the conference office.

Lammers was the ACC's Defensive Player of the Year in 2017 and made the All-ACC second team, while Okogie earned a spot on the All-Freshman team.

Josh Pastner Radio Show

Head coach Josh Pastner's weekly radio show airs each Monday from 7-8 p.m. on "680 the Fan" and 93.7 FM, beginning Dec. 3.

ACC Coaches Weekly Teleconference

The 15 ACC head basketball coaches will be featured on nine Monday teleconferences during the 2018-19 season, beginning on Monday, January 7, and continuing through March 4. Each coach will have 10 minutes to make an opening statement and answer questions. There will be an instant replay of each teleconference on the Conference's internet site TheACC.com each Monday afternoon

Georgia Tech head coach Josh Pastner will be on the teleconference at 10:50 a.m. each week.

Wire-to-Wire

Though he has adjusted his playing rotation this year to reflect the growing level of talent within the program, head coach Josh Pastner is not shy about his philosophy of playing a short bench, reminiscent of the way Bobby Cremins coached the Yellow Jackets over his 19 seasons.

Josh Okogie played 92.3 percent of possible minutes in ACC games last season, while Ben Lammers played 90.2 percent. Jose Alvarado had played 96.7 percent of possible ACC minutes prior to his Feb. 11 injury.

Lammers ranked No. 1 among centers nationally in minutes per game. Alvarado had ranked fifth among freshmen nationally in percentage of minutes played and minutes per game before he was injured.

The threesome had 20 complete games combined in 2017-18 (eight for for Alvarado, six for Lammers, five for Okogie), and Tadric Jackson joined the group by playing 40 minutes at Clemson. Tech had at least one player play the full 40 in 12 of 19 ACC games (regular season plus tournament).

NOTE: Between the Cremins era and the arrival of Pastner, only one Georgia Tech player played every minute of a game, regulation or overtime, and that was Marcus Georges-Hunt on Feb. 20, 2016, in a win over Notre Dame at home. In the final 15 seasons of Cremins' tenure (1985-86 through 1999-2000), a total of 196 players logged a 40-minute game.

A.D. is No Lie

Georgia Tech got a big lift from an unlikely source once ACC play began last season, junior forward Abdoulaye Gueye (pronounced "AB-doo-lie GAY). During the month of January and into February, the Yellow Jackets saw the 6-9 junior become a legimate offensive force, and not just a disruptor on defense and on the boards.

Known as "A.D." to his teammates and coaches, the likeable Gueye took advantage of a much-improved hook shot to average 6.5 points (50 percent from the floor) and 4.5 rebounds in in ACC games. He has come off the bench in Tech's last four games in favor of freshman Moses Wright after starting 15 straight games.

He scored in double figures in seven games in conference play, something completely unforeseen during the non-conference season. In the first 39 games of his career, covering two-plus seasons through the holiday break this year, Gueye had scored a total of 70 points, only once scoring more than six points in a game (13 vs. UT-Rio Grande Valley in November).

"We couldn't stop him at the beginning of the game. Probably were a little surprised at how good he was and how much they went to him, but he was very effective." - Clemson coach Brad Brownell after Gueye scored 14 points with eight boards against the Tigers

Tech's BFFs (Big Freshman Forwards)

Georgia Tech's four-man freshman class in 2017-18 was not highly rated in terms of stars, but head coach Josh Pastner viewed the group of Jose Alvarado, Curtis Haywood II, Evan Cole and Moses Wright as a solid foundation on which to build the Yellow Jackets' program.

With Alvarado and Haywood, the more highly-rated of the group, out with injuries for the last month of the season, the other two members of the class received an opportunity to grow. After Tech's Jan. 24 loss at Florida State, Pastner put Cole and Wright in a "red-shirt" program than entailed extra strength and conditioning sessions and extra skill work on the court in addition to the team's regular practices. It paid off for them and for the

Jackets

On Feb. 11 against Duke, when Pastner was unhappy with the performance of Tech seniors Tadric Jackson and Ben Lammers, he put Cole and Wright in the game for their first extended minutes of the ACC season, and they didn't disappoint.

In the second half of that game, the duo combined for 19 points, 12 rebounds, four assists and three blocks in 41 minutes as Tech pared a 26-point second-half deficit down to 11 in an 80-69 loss. As a result, Cole has started Tech's last five games, and Wright the last three.

"Very good basketball player, can score the basketball inside and out, athletic, runs the floor," NC State coach Kevin Keatts said of Cole. "He's going to be a very good basketball player in the ACC, and that means a lot because you're talking about a kid who was originally signed in the (Colonial Athletic Association)."

"He's a live body, long," Clemson coach Brad Brownell said of Wright. "As he continues to get stronger and grow into his body, he's going to be a good player. He's got some perimeter skills where he can put it on the ground once or twice and get to a place and make a play. He's not a great 3-point shooter yet, but he can make one, and that's obviously going to get better."

Winning Starts at Home

Georgia Tech and head coach Josh Pastner have made a priority of making McCamish Pavilion a real homecourt advantage for the program, and the Yellow Jackets made a good start on that by setting a program record for wins at home (17) in 2017-18, which included a 7-2 ACC record and two NIT victories.

Tech is 12-6 against ACC teams at home under Pastner, and that includes a 5-3 mark against ranked opponents.

The Jackets' 60-53 win over No. 25 Notre Dame on Jan. 10 was just the latest triumph in a list that includes eventual NCAA champion North Carolina (No. 9 at the time), No. 6 Florida State and No. 15 Notre Dame last season, as well as a 64-54 win over No. 15 Miami on Jan. 3 this season. Tech's only losses came to No. 9 Louisville last January and to No. 2 Virginia and No. 18 Clemson this season.

Alvarado Freshman Season Cut Short

Freshman point guard Jose Alvarado, recruited to Georgia Tech primarily for his winning attitude, toughness and grit, was given the green light by head coach Josh Pastner to handle the position, sink or swim, before his freshman season came to an abrupt end Feb. 11 against Duke. He dislocated his left elbow in a fall, and missed the rest of the season.

The Brooklyn native, the first Tech player from the New York area in nearly 20 years, was up to the task prior to his injury, averaging 12.6 points per game to rank second on the team, 3.9 rebounds and 3.3 assists with an assist/turnover ratio of 77/56. He also shot the ball well, making 45 percent of his shots from the floor, 37.4 percent from three-point distance, and 80.2 percent from the foul line on 80 attempts, second most on the team behind Josh Okogie, who led the ACC in that category.

Among ACC freshmen, he ranked fifth in scoring, fourth in assists, and was No. 4 overall in steals at the time of his injury.

Alvarado posted 16 double-figure scoring games, four times scoring 20 or more. And the 6-foot playmaker averaged

Four Tech Alumni on NBA Rosters

Since 1982, Georgia Tech has produced 19 first-round NBA draft picks and 44 draft picks overall. A total of 38 Georgia Tech alumni have played in the NBA.

Four former Georgia Tech basketball stars were on NBA rosters at the start of the 2018-19 season, including guard **Josh Okogie**, who was drafted 20th overall by for the Minnesota Timberwolves.

Iman Shumpert, a seven-year NBA veteran, played his third full season in Cleveland after helping the Cavaliers win the NBA championship in 2016, and was traded before the deadline to Sacramento.

Thaddeus Young, an 11-year NBA veteran, is now in his third season with the Indiana Pacers after playing seven seasons in Philadelphia, one in Minnesota and two in Brooklyn.

Derrick Favors has emerged as a key figure in his eighth season in Utah and re-signed with the team after becoming a free agent.

Arts and Letters

Beginning with Moe Miller and Lance Storrs in the summer of 2011, every four-year senior in the Georgia Tech program has graduated with the exception of the Yellow Jackets' 2018 two seniors. Tadric Jackson and Ben Lammers, were both on track to compete their degree requirements in the spring (Jackson) and fall (Lammers) semesters, but both received offers to play overseas.

Derek Craig and Nick Foreman received their Tech degrees in 2012, as did the 2013 senior class of Mfon Udofia, who finished his business administation degree work in the summer, and Pierre Jordan, who completed his Masters degree requirements in building construction in the spring. Brandon Reed graduated in the summer with his management degree before transferring back to Arkansas State to play his final year of basketball.

All three of Tech's four-year seniors in 2013-14 - Kammeon Holsey, Daniel Miller and Jason Morris - graduated that spring. Robert Sampson, the Jackets' only undergraduate scholarship senior in 2014-15, graduated in the spring.

From the 2015-16 squad, Marcus Georges-Hunt walked the stage at commencement in May, accomplishing the rare feat of graduating in four years. Point guard Travis Jorgenson, who elected not to use his final year of eligiblity, received his degree in December of 2017.

From the 2016-17 team, Josh Heath, Corey Heyward (fifth-year because of an injury redshirt in 2012-13) and Quinton Stephens all graduated in May of 2017, while Rand Rowland

finished his requirements and received his degree in December of 2016. Both graduate transfers, Kellen McCormick (summer of 2017) and Jodan Price (fall of 2017), received their Masters degrees.

Georges-Hunt and current senior Tadric Jackson have made the Academic All-ACC team twice, and the Yellow Jackets have had at least one player named to that team since it was instituted for the 2010-11 season.

Tech's men's basketball team has recorded the highest Academic Progress Report scores the last five years since the NCAA began tracking academic performance in 2004-05. The Jackets scored a perfect team single year APR score of 1000 three straight years from 2011-13.

Welcome to The Hank

Georgia Tech is playing its seventh season in McCamish Pavilion, which was for all intents and purposes, brand new when it opened for the 2012-13 season. The only physical elements of McCamish Pavilion that remain from the venerable Alexander Memorial Coliseum are the roof, which was re-covered, and the 32 steel ribs that support it.

The capacity of McCamish Pavilion is 8,600, including 1,665 seats in the new balcony level and 6,935 seats in the lower seating bowl. There are no suites, but there is a premium club area that seats 500. Alexander Memorial Coliseum seated 9,191 spectators in its final configuration.

The most impressive features of McCamish Pavilion are its grand entrance, which fronts 10th and Fowler Streets, the ability for patrons to view the court from the main concourse all the way around, and the theatrical lighting system, which concentrates light on the court while leaving the seating areas dark, modeled after the Staples Center in Los Angeles and Madison Square Garden in New York.

Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion on Jan. 5, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

Tech's NCAA Tournament History

Georgia Tech played in the NCAA Tournament five times in 11 seasons under head coach Paul Hewitt and has played in the event 16 times in its history. Fifteen of those appearances have occurred from 1985 to the present.

Tech has a record of 23-16 in NCAA Tournament play, highlighted by its 2004 trip to the NCAA title game as well as a Final Four berth in 1990. The Yellow Jackets have reached the NCAA Sweet 16 seven times (1960, 1985, 1986, 1990, 1992, 1996, 2004).

The 2004 and 2005 appearances were the Yellow Jackets' first back-to-back appearances since Bobby Cremins led the Institute to the Big Dance nine straight years from 1985-93

Georgia Tech has won at least one game in 11 of its 16 NCAA Tournament appearances.

Tech's ACC Tournament History

Georgia Tech has played in 39 ACC Tournaments, and has a 26-36 all-time record in the event. The Yellow Jackets have won three championships, in 1985 (Atlanta), 1990 (Charlotte) and 1993 (Charlotte).

Tech has been a runner-up four times (1986, 1996, 2005, 2010). The 1986, 1996 and 2010 runs to the finals occurred in Greensboro. Tech also made the finals in 2005 at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C.

Tech was 0-2 in the ACC Tournament under coach Dwane Morrison, 15-16 under Bobby Cremins (including all three titles), 9-11 under Paul Hewitt (runner-up in 2005 and 2010), 2-5 under Brian Gregory. and 0-2 under Josh Pastner.

Head Coach Josh Pastner • 3rd season

osh Pastner, who guided Memphis to five post-season berths in seven seasons as the Tigers' head coach, was introduced as Georgia Tech's 14th head basketball coach on April 8, 2016, and wasted no time in getting the Yellow Jackets back to the post-season.

While coaching Tech to 34 wins and building the Jackets' talent base for the future, Pastner has tirelessly promoted the program on campus and throughout the city of Atlanta in an effort to re-create the major homecourt atmosphere that surrounded the Yellow Jackets throughout the 1980s, 1990s and into the middle of the 2000s. The result has been 29 wins and eight sellouts in two seasons at McCamish Pavilion, including a program-record 17 home wins in his first year.

In his first season at the helm, his Yellow Jacket team defied all pre-season expectations by winning 21 games, including four in the National Invitation Tournament. Tech posted an 8-10 ACC record, which included victories over No. 9 North Carolina, No. 6 Florida State and No. 14 Notre Dame, who all finished among the top four in the ACC regular season. He was named Coach of the Year in the ACC and in NABC District 2.

Implementing a high-energy style of play and creative offensive and defensive schemes, Pastner and his staff guided the Yellow Jackets all the way to the finals of the NIT for the first time in 46 years. Two of his players earned all-Atlantic Coast Conference honors; junior center Ben Lammers was named second-team All-ACC and ACC Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman guard Josh Okogie was named to the ACC All-Freshman team.

Though hampered by several significant injuries and other issues in 2017-18, Tech still was able to knock off a pair of top-25 teams while Lammers and Okogie again earned conference honors, and Okogie developed into an NBA first-round draft choice.

Pastner, who turned 41 in the fall, compiled a 167-73 record over seven seasons as the head coach at Memphis, where the Tigers earned bids to the NCAA Tournament four times. He tied for the 10th most wins for a head coach in his first seven seasons in Division I basketball history, and is the second winningest active coach under the age of 40 in NCAA Division I.

Despite his young age, Pastner has been involved in basketball at the Division I level for 21 years, as a player and an assistant coach at Arizona, and as an assistant coach and the head coach at Memphis. He has been a part of teams that have won 524 games, played in 17 NCAA Tournaments and 19 total post-season events. Teams he has been involved with have won 12 conference tournament or regular-season championships, advanced to seven Sweet Sixteens, five Elite Eights, two Final Fours and two NCAA championship games.

As an NCAA head or assistant coach and an AAU head coach, he has coached nearly 25 NBA draft selections.

Pastner's Memphis teams averaged 23.9 wins per season and compiled a conference regular-season record of 82-36, including a conference winning streak of 28 games. The Tigers went 11-4 in Conference USA and American Athletic Conference tournaments, including three championships.

He guided Memphis to five post-season berths, the NIT in 2010 and the NCAA Tournament in 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. Pastner twice won Conference USA Coach of the Year honors (2010, 2013) by various organizations and news media.

Pastner was born in Glen Dale, W.Va., and grew up in Kingwood, Texas. He earned his bachelor's degree in family studies in December of 1998, in just two and a half years, from Arizona and his master's degree in teaching and teacher education from Arizona in December of 1999, all while lettering four years in basketball under head coach Lute Olson.

He married the former Kerri Lamas of Sierra Vista, Ariz., in 2009. He has a stepson (Ethan) and three daughters, Payten, Kamryn and Harper.
