TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech makes its 45th all-time bowl appearance when it travels to Detroit, Mich. to take on Minnesota in the 2018 Quick Lane Bowl on Wednesday, Dec. 26.
- After a 1-3 start, Georgia Tech earned a bowl berth by winning six of its final eight regular-season games.
- Georgia Tech's 45 bowl appearances rank 13th in college football history, while its 25 bowl victories are tied for the 10th-most all-time.
- The Quick Lane Bowl will serve as **Paul Johnson's** final game as the head coach at Georgia Tech. Johnson announced on Nov. 28 that he was stepping down after 40 years of coaching, including the last 11 as the Yellow Jackets' head coach.
- Johnson ranks fourth in Georgia Tech history in both wins (82) and winning percentage (.582). The only coaches that have won more games at Tech than Johnson are all in the College Football Hall of Fame (John Heisman, William Alexander and Bobby Dodd) and only Dodd won more games in 11 seasons (91) than Johnson.
- A win over Minnesota would give Georgia Tech its sixth eight-win season in 11 years under Johnson. Prior to Johnson's arrival on The Flats, the Yellow Jackets had won eight games in a season just nine times in the previous 41 campaigns.
- Georgia Tech is making its first-ever appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl and is playing in the state of Michigan for only the third time in Tech's 126-season football history (prev.: 9-2 loss at Michigan in 1934, 21-16 win at Michigan State in 1972).
- The Yellow Jackets and Minnesota have never met on the gridiron.
- Georgia Tech is playing a Big Ten opponent for the first time since it faced Iowa in the FedEx Orange Bowl at the conclusion of the 2009 season (L, 24-14 on Jan. 5, 2010).

Georgia Tech is making its 45th all-time bowl appearance. Its 45 bowl appearances rank 13th in college football history.

Georgia Tech is playing in the state of Michigan for the first time in 46 years, dating back to a 21-16 win at Michigan State on Sept. 23, 1972. The Yellow Jackets' Quick Lane Bowl appearance marks only the third time that they have ever played in Michigan, with the win at MSU in 1972 and a 9-2 loss at Michigan on Oct. 20, 1934 being the others.

428

Georgia Tech needs 428 rushing yards against Minnesota to break the school record for most rushing yards per game in a season. The current record of 342.07 was set in 2014.

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- give it a final record of 8-5, good for its sixth eight-win season in the last 11 years;
- be its seventh win in the last nine games;
- be its third-straight bowl victory, giving the Yellow Jackets their longest winning streak in bowl games since they won five in a row from 1985-98;
- be its 26th all-time bowl victory, which would move it into a tie with Nebraska for ninth all-time;
- make it 1-0 all-time versus Minnesota;
- up it to 4-3 all-time against Big Ten opponents;
- even its record against Big Ten opponents in bowl games at 2-2;
- be its first win over a Big Ten opponent since a 17-14 victory over Michigan State in the 1985 All-American Bowl;
- up it to 2-1 all-time in games played in the state of Michigan;
- send **Paul Johnson** out with a victory in his final game as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, giving him an 83-59 record (.585) in 11 seasons at Georgia Tech and a 190-98 record (.660) in 22 seasons as a head coach.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- give it a final record of 7-6;
- be only its third loss in its last nine games;
- snap its two-game winning streak in bowl games and be its first bowl defeat since a 23-15 loss to Ole Miss in the 2013 Music City Bowl;
- drop it to 0-1 versus Minnesota, 3-4 against Big Ten opponents, 1-3 against Big Ten opponents in bowl games and 1-2 in games played in the state of Michigan all-time.

NOTING MINNESOTA

• Despite wrapping up their 126th and 135th seasons of football, respectively, Georgia Tech and Minnesota have never met on the football field.

• Minnesota is making its sixth bowl appearance in the last seven years but its first under second-year head coach P.J. Fleck.

• The Golden Gophers finished the 2018 regular season with a 6-6 overall record. They finished 3-6 in Big Ten play, good for a tie for fifth place in the Big Ten West Division standings.

• The Gophers opened the season with three-straight non-conference wins, including an impressive 21-14 victory over Fresno State on Sept. 8. FSU went on to win 11 of its next 12 games, including Mountain West Conference championship game (19-16 at Boise State), finish ranked No. 21 in the final College Football Playoff rankings and defeated Arizona State, 31-20, in the Las Vegas Bowl.

• After the 3-0 start, Minnesota dropped four in a row and six of its next eight games.

• Needing a win to become bowl eligible, the Gophers turned in perhaps their finest performance of the year in the regular-season finale, a 37-15 rout at archrival Wisconsin. The Golden Gophers jumped out to a 17-0 lead in the second quarter and led by as many as 30 points in the win, which snapped its 14-year losing skid against the Badgers.

• Minnesota ranks among the bottom half of NCAA Division I FBS in total offense (85th - 378.6 ypg), total defense (65th - 394.3 ypg), scoring offense (67th - 28.5 ppg) and scoring defense (75th - 27.9 ppg).

• Georgia Tech, which boasts the nation's No. 1 rushing offense (334.9 ypg) will look to take advantage of a Minnesota defense that ranks 118th nationally in yards allowed per carry (5.22 avg.). The Yellow Jackets faced three teams that allowed more yards per carry this season — Virginia Tech (5.33), Bowling Green (5.88) and Louisville (6.02). The Jackets averaged 7.18 yards per carry, 459.7 rushing yards and 59.3 points in those three games (all wins). *Tip of the hat to the Voice of the Yellow Jackets Andy Demetra for initial research on this note.*

• The Quick Lane Bowl matchup features two of the nation's youngest teams. According to research compiled by the University of Colorado, both Georgia Tech and Minnesota rank among the top 15 FBS teams in terms of percentage of underclassmen on their rosters. The Yellow Jackets have 80 underclassmen (56 freshmen, 24 sophomores) and the Golden Gophers have 79 (60 freshmen, 19 sophomores).

GEORGIA TECH vs. THE BIG TEN

• Georgia Tech's matchup versus Minnesota marks only the seventh time in Tech's 126 seasons of football that it will face an opponent from the Big Ten Conference.

• The Yellow Jackets are 3-3 in their previous six matchups against Big Ten opponents.

• Georgia Tech is 23-13 all-time against all current members of the Big Ten, but its games against Maryland (15-6), Nebraska (1-0), Penn State (3-4) and Rutgers (1-0) all came before those respective programs joined the Big Ten.

GEORGIA TECH IN MICHIGAN

• Georgia Tech is playing in the state of Michigan for only the third time in its 126-season football history and for the first time in 46 years.

• The Yellow Jackets most recent trip to Michigan was a 21-16 win over No. 18 Michigan State on Sept. 23, 1972 in East Lansing. The victory came on the back end of a home-and-home series between the Yellow Jackets and Spartans. In the first game, the Jackets knocked off the Spartans, 10-0, at Grant Field in Atlanta. MSU was ranked No. 18 nationally and Tech was unranked for both defeats.

• Georgia Tech's first trip to Michigan was a 9-2 loss to Michigan on Oct. 20, 1934 in Ann Arbor. The victory was the Wolverines' lone win in a 1-7 season. Tech finished 1-9.

JOHNSON COACHING FINAL GAME AT GEORGIA TECH; WILL STEP DOWN AFTER 11 YEARS AT TECH, 40 YEARS AS A COACH

Paul Johnson, a three-time Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year and Georgia Tech's winningest football coach in more than five decades, has elected to step down as the Yellow Jackets' head coach, he announced on Nov. 28.

"After 40 years of coaching, it's time to take a break," Johnson said. "My family has sacrificed a lot over the years. I want to watch my daughter [Kaitlyn, a professional opera singer] perform and do some things with my wife [Susan] that we've never had a chance to do. It's been a great run for the last 11 years here on The Flats. I'm proud of what we've accomplished and am looking forward to having the chance to coach this team one last time at our bowl game next month."

With an 82-59 record in 11 seasons at Georgia Tech, Johnson is the fourth-winningest coach in school history in terms of both victories and winning percentage (.582). The only coaches that have ever won more games at Georgia Tech — John Heisman, William Alexander and Bobby Dodd — are all inducted to the College Football Hall of Fame and only Dodd won more games (91) than Johnson in his first 11 seasons on The Flats.

In addition to the 82 victories, Johnson has led Georgia Tech to nine bowl appearances (2008-14, 2016 and 2018) and three ACC Championship Games (2009, 2012 and 2014), as well as seven first- or second-place finishes in the ACC Coastal Division in his 11 seasons with the Yellow Jackets. Since his arrival at Tech in 2008, only Clemson (9), Florida State (7) and Virginia Tech (7) have had as many first- or second-place finishes in ACC divisional play.

He was named ACC Coach of the Year in 2008, 2009 and 2014 and was named National Coach of the Year by CBS Sportsline in 2008, marking the second time in his career that he received a National Coach of the Year award (Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year — 2004, Navy).

Johnson's long list of accomplishments at Georgia Tech also includes:

- winning at least seven regular-season games seven times in 11 seasons — Tech won seven regular-season games 15 times in the 41 seasons from Dodd's retirement in 1966 until Johnson's arrival in 2008;
- four nine-win seasons — Tech had just seven nine-win seasons in the 51 years immediately preceding Johnson's arrival (1957-2007);
- two of the nine 10-win seasons in program history (2009 and 2014);
- one of the five 11-win seasons in program history (2014);
- leading the ACC and ranking among the top 10 nationally in rushing every season;
- leading the nation in rushing offense twice — 2010 (323.3 ypg) and 2014 (342.1 ypg) — and being on pace to do so again in 2018 (334.9 ypg);
- a current NCAA Graduation Success Rate of 86 percent, the highest in Georgia Tech history — prior to Johnson's arrival at Tech, the football program's GSR had dipped as low as 48 percent.

Johnson's 22-year career as a head coach also included ultra-successful stints at Georgia Southern (1997-2001) and the U.S. Naval Academy (2002-07). In five seasons at Georgia Southern, he led the Eagles to a gaudy 62-10 overall record, two NCAA Division I-AA national championships (1999 and 2000) and five-straight Southern Conference titles. In six years at Navy, he led the Midshipmen to five eight-win seasons, five Commander-in-Chief's trophies and five bowl appearances, turning around a program that had won just one game in the two seasons prior to his arrival (1-20).

With a career record of 189-98 (.659), Johnson is the fourth-winningest NCAA Division I FBS head coach that was active in 2018, behind only Notre Dame's Brian Kelly — 252 wins, Alabama's Nick Saban — 230 and Kansas State's Bill Snyder — 215.

His coaching career also includes stints as an assistant at Avery County (N.C.) H.S. (1979-80), Lees-McRae College (1981-82), Georgia Southern (1983-86), Hawai'i (1987-94) and Navy (1995-96).

GEORGIA TECH'S 20TH HEAD COACH — GEOFF COLLINS

Geoff Collins, an Atlanta area native and a former Georgia Tech football staff member who has led Temple to two bowl games in two seasons as the Owls' head coach, has been named the 20th football head coach in Georgia Tech history, director of athletics Todd Stansbury announced on Friday.

Collins compiled a 15-10 record in his two seasons at Temple, including an 8-4 record and 7-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference this season, when the Owls' only conference loss came at No. 8-ranked and undefeated UCF. His 15 victories at Temple are the most ever by a head coach in his first two seasons at the school.

Last season, Collins' Owls won the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl with a 28-3 victory over Florida International, good for Temple's first bowl win since 2011. This year, the Owls earned a berth in the 2018 Independence Bowl, where they will face Duke.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida (2015-16), Mississippi State (2013-14, co-DC: 2011-12), FIU (2010) and his alma mater, Western Carolina (2002-05). He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools (FIU – 2010, Mississippi State – 2014 and Florida – 2015).

Collins' 26-year career also includes a pair of stints at Georgia Tech, as a graduate assistant under head coach George O'Leary from 1999-2001 and as recruiting coordinator under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006. During his three-season stint as a G.A. at Georgia Tech, the Yellow Jackets were 25-12 with three-consecutive bowl appearances. In his final season (2001), he was promoted to tight ends coach for the Jackets' 24-14 victory over Stanford in the 2001 Seattle Bowl.

Collins' coaching career also includes stops at Western Carolina (student assistant – 1993-94), Franklin (N.C.) H.S. (assistant coach – 1995), Fordham (linebackers coach – 1996), Albright (defensive coordinator – 1997-98), Alabama (director of player personnel – 2007) and UCF (linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator – 2007).

As a recruiter, he helped Georgia Tech land the highest-rated recruiting class in program history in 2006-07 and in 2007-08 helped Alabama sign the No. 1 class in the nation, which included running back Mark Ingram, who went on to become the first Heisman Trophy winner in Crimson Tide history in 2009.

As a student-athlete, Collins totaled 194 career tackles as an outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina (1989-92). He had 68 tackles and six tackles for loss as a junior and helped lead WCU to a 7-4 record with 62 stops, including five behind the line of scrimmage, as a senior.

Originally from Conyers, Ga. in the Atlanta metro area, Collins, 47, is married to the former Jennifer Haynes. They have a daughter, Astrid (2).

• Using advanced analytics, Georgia Tech also ranks among the top 25 nationally in fewest yards needed per point (t-sixth - 11.6), points per possession (15th - 2.98), points per play (15th - .509), possessions that result in touchdowns (15th - 39.0 pct.), offensive touchdowns per game (22nd - 4.2).

• According to *FootballOutsiders.com*'s Fremeau Efficiency Index (FEI), the Yellow Jackets have the nation's 17th-most efficient offense with a 2.91 offensive FEI (*offensive FEI is the value generated per drive by a team's offense adjusted for starting field position and for the strength of opponent defenses faced*). The Jackets' offensive FEI ranks third in the ACC (behind No. 9 Clemson and No. 13 NC State).

• Thanks to its prolific offense, the Yellow Jackets have the second-fewest total punts (31) and the second-fewest punts per offensive play (.04) in the nation this season (behind only Oklahoma — 29 punts and .03 punts per offensive play).

• Over their last 31 games (dating back to the sixth game of the 2016 season), the Yellow Jackets have punted only 105 times (3.39 per game) and have come away with points on 152 of their 358 offensive possessions (42.5 percent).

• Georgia Tech's offense has been markedly more efficient on the road this season, as the Yellow Jackets are averaging 6.4 yards per play and .531 points per play in its six road games and 5.3 yards per play and .480 points per play in its six home contests.

• A by-product of Georgia Tech's prolific rushing game has been an ultra-efficient, albeit infrequently utilized, passing attack. The Yellow Jackets officially rank second nationally in yards per completion (19.8) but against NCAA Division I FBS competition only, it ranks first nationally in yards per completion (21.6) and sixth in yards per attempt (9.5).

• In its first two games of November (Nov. 3 at North Carolina and Nov. 10 vs. Miami), Georgia Tech completed 5-of-6 passes for 177 yards and two touchdowns, good for 29.5 yards per pass attempt, 35.4 yards per completion and a 441.13 passing efficiency rating.

• The Jackets' 86-yard touchdown pass from r-Fr. QB **Tobias Oliver** to Sr. AB **Qua Searcy** in the second quarter at North Carolina (Nov. 3) was the sixth-longest pass play in school history and Tech's longest since an 87-yard touchdown pass from Joshua Nesbitt to Embry Peebles vs. Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.

• Georgia Tech also put together impressive back-to-back offensive performances against Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and Louisville (Oct. 5).

• Georgia Tech racked up 129 points, 1,086 yards of total offense and 914 rushing yards in the wins over Bowling Green (63-17 on Sept. 29) and Louisville (66-31 on Oct. 5).

• At one point this season, senior QB **TaQuon Marshall** led Georgia Tech to points on 14-straight offensive series that he quarterbacked — his final series vs. Clemson on Sept. 22 (TD), all six series vs. BG on Sept. 29 (6 TD) and all seven series at Louisville on Oct. 5 (6 TD, 1 FG).

• Georgia Tech scored touchdowns on each of its four offensive possessions in the first half against Bowling Green, marking the first time under Johnson that it scored touchdowns on every offensive possession of any half.

• As impressive as the offensive output was against Bowling Green, it paled in comparison to what the Jackets accomplished against Louisville.

• GT's 542 rushing yards against Louisville remain the most in a game by an NCAA Division I FBS team this season (No. 2: 503 - Texas A&M vs. Northwestern State, Aug. 30).

• The Yellow Jackets' 542 yards on the ground against Louisville were the most by an FBS team since Navy ran for 559 yards at SMU on Nov. 11 of last season and were the most by and against a Power Five conference team since Auburn ran for 543 yards at Arkansas on Oct. 22, 2016.

• In its seven wins this season, Georgia Tech has turned the ball over a total of seven times (1.0 per game - although six of the seven came against Alcorn State-3 and North Carolina-3). In their five losses, the Yellow Jackets have turned the ball over nine times (1.8 per game).

• After committing nine turnovers through the first 13 quarters of this season (first three games plus first quarter of Game 4 vs. Clemson), Georgia Tech went 234-consecutive plays (offensive snaps plus returns) without a turnover over the next 13 quarters (final three quarters vs. Clemson, full games vs. Bowling Green and Louisville and first two quarters vs. Duke).

• However, that streak came to emphatic halt when the Yellow Jackets lost fumbles on three-straight plays late in the third quarter of its 28-14 loss to Duke on Oct. 13. Those fumbles (by BB **Jerry Howard**, QB **TaQuon Marshall** and KR **Juanyeh Thomas**) led directly to Duke scoring 21

points in the final 1:49 of the third period, turning what was a 7-7 ballgame into a 28-14 defeat.

- In all, after committing nine turnovers in its first four games of the season (one turnover every 31.3 plays), Georgia Tech has committed only seven turnovers in the last eight games (one every 59.1 plays).

- Despite having only one turnover against No. 3/2 Clemson on Sept. 22, Georgia Tech fumbled eight times in the loss. The eight fumbles are tied for the second-most in school history (record: 9 at Miami, Nov. 21, 2015). The Yellow Jackets' eight fumbles marked only the third time in the past 46 seasons (dating back to 1973) that they have fumbled as many as seven times in a contest.

- Georgia Tech has played 273-consecutive games without being shut out, good for the seventh-longest active streak in NCAA Division I FBS.

- The Yellow Jackets have not been held scoreless since a 38-0 loss at No. 3 Florida State on Oct. 18, 1997.

- Even more impressively, Georgia Tech has not been blanked at home since a 7-0 loss to Georgia on Nov. 30, 1957 — good for a streak of 378-straight games played at Bobby Dodd Stadium without being shut out.

- After missing significant time during due to injury during the middle portion of the season (including not playing in the Yellow Jackets' 49-28 victory at Virginia Tech on Oct. 25), Marshall took the majority of the snaps in the final three games of the regular season — vs. Miami (Nov. 10), vs. Virginia (Nov. 17) and at No. 5 Georgia (Nov. 24). In those three games, he has responsible for 417 yards (238 rushing, 179 passing) and four touchdowns (two rushing, two passing) while leading the Yellow Jackets to a 2-1 record.

- Prior to sustaining an upper-body injury vs. Duke on Oct. 13, Marshall put together perhaps the finest two-game stretch of his career in wins over Bowling Green (63-17 on Sept. 29) and Louisville (66-31 on Oct. 5). He rushed 36 times for 217 yards (6.0 avg.) and four touchdowns while completing 6-of-8 passes for 172 yards (75.0 comp. pct., 21.5 yds./att., 28.7 yds./comp.) to lead the Yellow Jackets to the blowout wins.

- Marshall led the Jackets to points in 14-straight offensive series that he quarterbacked — his final series vs. Clemson on Sept. 22 (TD), all six series vs. BG on Sept. 29 (6 TD) and all seven series at Louisville on Oct. 5 (6 TD, 1 FG).

- On Oct. 5 at Louisville, Marshall rushed for 175 yards on 23 carries (7.6 avg.). The 175 yards on the ground were a season-high and the second-highest rushing total of his career (behind only his Georgia Tech quarterback-record 249 yards in the 2017 season opener versus Tennessee).

- Marshall was named ACC Quarterback of the Week following his impressive performances against Louisville. The ACC award is the second of his career. He was named ACC Offensive Back of the Week following his record-breaking performance in last season's opener versus Tennessee.

• Marshall has 10 100-yard rushing games in 22 career starts. He is the only quarterback and the ninth player overall in Georgia Tech history with 10 100-yard rushing games in a career.

• Marshall's six 100-yard rushing games last season were the most ever by a Georgia Tech quarterback and tied for eighth in GT single-season history, regardless of position.

• Despite missing significant time in the second half on Sept. 8 at USF due to a lower-body injury, Marshall passed for a career-high 183 yards (prev.: 179 at Virginia, Nov. 4, 2017) and ran for 113 more. It marked the third time in his career that he rushed and passed for at least 100 yards in the same game and the seventh time that he has rushed and passed for a touchdown.

• Marshall also had the longest completion of his career at USF, an 81-yard touchdown strike to senior **AB Clinton Lynch** (prev.: 80 to Ricky Jeune vs. Virginia Tech, Nov. 11, 2017).

• While his 183 passing yards at USF remain a season and career high, Marshall's most efficient passing performance came against Miami (Nov. 10), when he completed 3-of-4 passes for 73 yards and a touchdown.

• Marshall's 310.80 pass-efficiency rating versus Miami was the second-highest of his career (career high: 347.26 vs. Jacksonville State, Sept. 9, 2017) and his highest of the season (prev.: 307.33 vs. Bowling Green, Sept. 29).

• Marshall has compiled two of the six best seasons in Georgia Tech history in terms of rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.

• Despite being Marshall's backup for all but one game, redshirt freshman **Tobias Oliver** has also burst onto the national scene this season, particularly following his performances at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25) and North Carolina (Nov. 3).

• Making his first-career start in place of Marshall, who sustained an upper-body injury in the previous game against Duke (Oct. 13), Oliver rushed for 215 yards on 40 carries (both career highs) and scored three touchdowns (matching

a career high) to lead Georgia Tech to a 49-28 victory at VT.

• Oliver's 215 rushing yards against Virginia Tech were the second-most by a quarterback and seventh-most overall in Georgia Tech single-game history (see previous column for list of top rushing performances by GT QBs).

• Oliver's 40 carries against VT were the second-most in GT single-game history (behind only Marshall's 44 vs. Tennessee, Sept. 4, 2017).

• Oliver's 215 rushing yards against VT remain the second-most by an NCAA Division I FBS quarterback, the most by an FBS QB against an FBS opponent and the 24th-most by any FBS player, regardless of position, this season.

• Oliver's 215 rushing yards against VT are the sixth-most by an ACC player this season.

• On Nov. 3 at North Carolina, Oliver replaced Marshall at quarterback before the Yellow Jackets' fourth offensive series and remained under center for the duration of the 38-28 victory (the score was tied, 7-7, when Oliver entered the game).

• Oliver accounted for 224 yards (120 rushing, 104 passing) and three touchdowns (two rushing, one passing) in the 38-28 win at UNC. He ran 28 times and completed 2-of-2 passes.

• Oliver's 2-for-2, 104-yard passing effort against UNC included an 86-yard touchdown pass to Sr. **AB Qua Searcy**. The touchdown pass was the sixth-longest pass play in Georgia Tech history and the Yellow Jackets' longest since Joshua Nesbitt threw an 87-yard TD pass to Embry Peeples at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.

• Oliver was named ACC Rookie of the Week following the VT and UNC games, becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn the honor in back-to-back weeks since WR Calvin Johnson in 2004 (Nov. 15 vs. Connecticut and Nov. 22 vs. Virginia).

• Oliver's 5.64 yards per rush ranks eighth among all freshmen nationally (regardless of position) and his 73.4 rushing yards per game rank 10th among FBS freshmen.

• Oliver's 27.67 yards per completion would lead the nation but he falls short of the 15 passes per game needed to qualify for the official national/conference rankings (Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa tops the official rankings with 16.85 yards per completion).

• Oliver has led the Yellow Jackets to scores on 21 of the 34 full possessions that he's led this year (19 touchdowns, two field goals), not including abbreviated series at the end of halves (he has also closed out two touchdown drives that he wasn't on the field for the start of).

• Oliver was impressive in relief of Marshall in the Yellow Jackets' wins vs. Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and at Louisville (Oct. 5). He was on the field for a total of just five series in those two games (not including abbreviated series to run out the clock at the end of each game) and led the Yellow Jackets to four touchdowns while running for more than 100 yards in each game (115 vs. BG, 103 at Louisville) and averaging a whopping 14.5 yards per carry (218 yards on 15 attempts).

• On Sept. 8 at USF, Oliver replaced Marshall on the third play of the second half and engineered the Jackets' next three drives. GT scored touchdowns on all three series, with Oliver capping each drive with a touchdown (five, one and one yards).

• Of the 23 plays that Oliver was on the field for at USF, he carried the ball himself 18 times and accounted for 97 of the 189 yards that the Yellow Jackets gained while he was in the game.

• Oliver finished with 97 yards on 18 carries (5.4 avg.) and three touchdowns, all on the ground, against USF.

• Despite only playing for a little more than a quarter, Oliver's three touchdowns at USF marked the 48th time in school history that an individual has rushed for three TDs in a game.

• In the win over Louisville (Oct. 5), Marshall and Oliver became the first quarterback tandem in Georgia Tech history to both rush for 100 yards in the same game (Marshall - 175, Oliver - 103).

• Marshall and Oliver both rank among the top 30 nationally in rushing touchdowns (Oliver - 12, t-17th and Marshall - 11, t-29th) and among the top 75 nationally in rushing yards per game (Marshall - 81.5 ypg, 53rd and Oliver - 73.4 ypg, 75th). No other NCAA Division I FBS team has two quarterbacks even ranked among the top 100 nationally in rushing touchdowns or among the top 200 in rushing yards per game.

• With a season-ending foot injury sustained by presumed backup quarterback **Lucas Johnson** during preseason camp, Marshall is the only active quarterback on Georgia Tech's roster that came into the 2018 season with any collegiate playing experience.

RUNNING BACKS

• Head coach **Paul Johnson** said prior to the season that the deepest position on Georgia Tech's roster was likely B-back. That depth has been tested and proven through nine games this season.

OFFENSE

• The biggest test of Georgia Tech's depth at the B-back position has been a season-ending knee injury sustained by junior **KirVonte Benson** during the first quarter of Georgia Tech's second game of the season at USF (Sept. 8).

• Benson, who ran for 1,053 yards as a sophomore in 2017, had 116 rushing yards and two touchdowns in less than three quarters of action this season before sustaining the season-ending injury at USF.

• Sharing the workload at B-back in Benson's absence have been redshirt freshman **Jordan Mason** and sophomore **Jerry Howard**.

• Mason ranks third on the team (first among non-quarterbacks) with 640 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns.

• Mason's 6.2 yards-per-rush average ranks third on the squad (min. 20 carries).

• Mason's 6.2 yards per carry rank sixth among all freshmen nationally and ranks 130th in the nation overall.

• Mason's 53.3 rushing yards per game rank 22nd nationally among freshmen.

• Benson opened the 2018 season by rushing for 75 yards on 10 carries (7.5 avg.) and matching a career-high with two touchdowns (five and eight yards) in a 41-0 win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. He played just two quarters in the opener, after sitting out the first quarter due to a minor violation of team rules and the fourth quarter when most of GT's regulars were removed from the game.

• On Sept. 8 at USF, Benson ran for 41 yards on just five carries (8.2 avg.) before sustaining the season-ending injury on Georgia Tech's second offensive series of the game.

• Benson, who did not have a collegiate carry prior to last season, rushed for 1,053 yards and six touchdowns as a sophomore in 2017. He ranked fifth in the ACC and 35th nationally with 95.7 rushing yards per game last season.

• Benson became only the third B-back in **Paul Johnson's** 10 seasons as head coach to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, joining Jonathan Dwyer (2008 and 2009) and Anthony Allen (2010).

• For their careers, Georgia Tech's veteran A-back trio of fifth-year seniors **Clinton Lynch** and **Qua Searcy** and Cottrell, a junior, has combined to rush for 2,801 yards and 18 touchdowns on 358 carries (7.8 avg.) and catch 65 passes for 1,581 yards (24.3 avg.) and 14 touchdowns. As a group, they are averaging 10.4 yards per touch from scrimmage for their careers.

• Between them, Lynch, Searcy and Cottrell have combined for 1,294 all-purpose yards through the first 12 games of this season — 877 rushing yards on 116 carries (7.6 avg.) and 417 receiving yards on 18 receptions (23.2 avg.). Georgia Tech is averaging 9.7 yards per play every time one of them touches the ball in 2018.

• Cottrell (11-yard run), Searcy (86-yard reception) and Lynch (4-yard run) all scored touchdowns at North Carolina (Nov. 3), marking the first time that each member of the A-back trio has ever scored in the same game.

• With a 41-yard reception in the second quarter versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29), Lynch became the first student-athlete in Georgia Tech history with 1,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in a career.

• Since the beginning of 2016, 27 of Lynch's 124 touches have gone for 20 yards or more (12 rushes, 15 receptions — 21.8 percent) and 10 of his 124 touches have gone for 40 yards or more (three rushes, seven receptions — 8.1 percent).

• On Sept. 8 at USF, Lynch hauled in an 81-yard touchdown reception from quarterback **TaQuon Marshall**. The play was the second-longest reception of Lynch's career (long: 83 from Justin Thomas vs. North Carolina, Nov. 5, 2016) and the longest completion of Marshall's career.

• Lynch is one of only two student-athletes in Georgia Tech history with two receptions of 80 yards or longer in his career, joining Dez White (1997-99).

• Searcy's 86-yard touchdown reception from r-Fr. QB **Tobias Oliver** at North Carolina (Nov. 3) was the sixth-longest pass play in school history and the Yellow Jackets' longest reception since Embry Peeples' 87-yard catch from Joshua Nesbitt at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.

• Searcy ran for two touchdowns (two and one yards) for the first time in his career at Louisville (Oct. 5). The two-TD game was the second of his career — he ran for a touchdown and caught another as a redshirt freshman vs. Tulane on Sept. 12, 2015.

• Searcy's 91 rushing yards against Mercer on Sept. 10, 2016 remain the most by a Georgia Tech A-back since Robert Godhigh ran for 126 yards in a 55-31 defeat at Clemson on Nov. 14, 2013.

• After not finding the end zone in any of the first 25 games of his career, Cottrell has scored touchdowns in three of the last nine contests — a 2-yarder against No. 3/2 Clemson (Sept. 22), a 4-yarder versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and an 11-yarder at North Carolina (Nov. 3).

• Cottrell rushed for 90 yards on nine carries (both career highs) in Georgia Tech's 38-28 win at UNC (Nov. 3).

OFFENSE

WIDE RECEIVERS

- After catching just four passes as a junior last season, senior wide receiver **Brad Stewart** has a team-high 15 receptions this season.
- Stewart also leads the Yellow Jackets with 268 receiving yards and a career-high three touchdown receptions.
- The senior may be playing the best football of his career, as 122 of his 268 yards and two of his three touchdowns this season came in the final three games of the regular season — vs. Miami (Nov. 10), vs. Virginia (Nov. 17) and at No. 5 Georgia (Nov. 24).
- Stewart's third touchdown catch of the season came in the regular-season finale, a 28-yarder at UGA.
- The previous week versus Virginia, Stewart made perhaps his biggest reception of the season — a 37-yard catch on third-and-6 that prolonged the Yellow Jackets' final drive of regulation, which led to a field goal that proved crucial in the Jackets' 30-27 overtime win.
- Stewart's 37-yard reception against Virginia was his longest of the season (prev.: 31 vs. Miami, Nov. 10).
- Stewart's 31-yard catch against Miami was his second second touchdown of the season. The 31-yard, third-quarter TD reception proved to be the winning points in Georgia Tech's 27-21 triumph over Miami.
- Stewart set a career high four catches against Alcorn State on Sept. 1, surpassing his previous career-high of three, which he achieved three times (twice as a sophomore in 2016, once as a freshman in 2015).
- Stewart's four catches against Alcorn State included the second touchdown reception of his career when quarterback **TaQuon Marshall** found him wide open in the corner of the end zone for a 24-yard scoring strike.
- After going the first 33 games of his career without a touchdown catch, Stewart has four TDs in the last 15 games.
- Stewart has been consistently praised by head coach **Paul Johnson** throughout the season for the role that his blocking has played in Georgia Tech's rushing offense, which leads the nation with 334.9 yards per game.
- Stewart was limited to just one reception for 12 yards against Louisville on Oct. 5 (albeit a big catch, as it gave Georgia Tech a first down that set up a touchdown with less than a minute to go in the first half) but was named one of the Yellow Jackets' players of the week by the coaching staff. He was recognized not only for his reception but for the role that his blocking played in Georgia Tech's 542-yard rushing performance and being the holder on all 10 of the Jackets' successful place kicks (nine PAT and a FG).
- Stewart leads all current Yellow Jackets with 39-consecutive starts (the next-longest streak on the team belongs to junior OL **Parker Braun**, who has made 31-straight starts).
- Stewart has also played in all 48 of Georgia Tech's games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He is the only student-athlete on the Yellow Jackets' current roster that has played all 48 games since the beginning of '15.
- The starter opposite Stewart is sophomore wideout **Jalen Camp**. Camp, who had only one reception as a redshirt freshman in 2017, has eight catches in 11 games this season.

- Camp matched a career high with two receptions Miami (Nov. 10). His second catch of the game was perhaps the biggest of his career to date, a 22-yard pickup on third-and-6 that kept Georgia Tech's final drive going and allowed the Yellow Jackets to run out the clock in the 27-21 victory.
- Camp had a career-high 70 receiving yards on two receptions (33 and 37 yards) versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29).
- The only true freshman who has seen significant action on offense for Georgia Tech this season is wide receiver **Mala-chi Carter**. Carter has served as the third wideout behind Stewart and Camp in the Yellow Jackets' rotation.
- With Camp out due to an upper-body injury, Carter hauled in a 32-yard touchdown (the first of his career) versus Duke (Oct. 13).

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Eight different offensive linemen boast starting experience for Georgia Tech. Those eight have combined for a total of 135 starts over 246 career games played.

- The leader of the offensive front is first-team all-ACC honoree **Parker Braun**. Braun, a junior left guard, leads the unit and ranks second overall on the team with 31-consecutive starts.
- Braun turned in perhaps the finest performance of his already illustrious career at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25), when he took a whopping 25 defenders to the ground in just 72 plays (one every 2.9 plays) to help pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 465 yards in a 49-28 win.
- In recognition of the dominating effort against VT, Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time this season and fourth time in his career.
- Braun is only the third Yellow Jacket to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week as many as four times in a career, joining current New England Patriot Shaq Mason (5 — 2012-15) and former NFL standout Andrew Gardner (4 — 2005-08).
- Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the first time this season and third time in his career after taking 15 defenders to the ground and helping pave the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 542 yards at Louisville (Oct. 5).
- Braun was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time of his career following Georgia Tech's 35-17 win over Pitt on Sept. 23, 2016. He took 22 Pitt defenders to the ground and helped Georgia Tech run for 436 yards en route to the honor.
- In 2016, Braun became the first Georgia Tech freshman to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after compiling 10 knockdowns and helping Tech rush for 309 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech (Nov. 12).

- Led by Braun, Georgia Tech's offensive line has helped pave the way for the Yellow Jackets rank first nationally in rushing offense (334.9 ypg) and 19th in fewest sacks allowed (1.25/gm).
- Behind its offensive line, Georgia Tech has rushed for 400-plus yards in nine of its last 23 games, dating back to the beginning of last season.
- The Yellow Jackets' offensive line continues to get a boost from the return of junior **Kenny Cooper**, who missed all of fall camp and the first two games of the season due to a lower-body injury sustained during spring practice.
- Cooper, who started all 11 games at center in 2017, made his first start of 2018 against Duke (Oct. 13).
- Before getting back into the starting lineup, Cooper made his 2018 debut against Pitt (Sept. 15) and saw action as a reserve at center and right guard for four contests as he worked himself back into game shape.
- Last season, Cooper was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after taking 10 defenders to the ground and helping Georgia Tech run for 403 yards in its 33-7 win over North Carolina (Sept. 30). The award came in Cooper's fifth-career start.

DEFENSE

• Coming into the season, one of the stated goals of new defensive coordinator **Nate Woody's** defense was to create turnovers. The Yellow Jackets were much improved in that area during the regular season.

• Georgia Tech has forced 25 turnovers this season. The Yellow Jackets forced 10 turnovers in 2017.

• Georgia Tech has 13 fumble recoveries this season. The Yellow Jackets recovered two fumbles in 2017.

• Georgia Tech's has 12 interceptions this season. The Yellow Jackets intercepted eight passes in 2017.

• Georgia Tech's 25 takeaways are ranked 11th nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 124th out of 128 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 10 takeaways.

• Georgia Tech's 13 fumble recoveries are tied for third nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 120th nationally with four fumble recoveries.

• Georgia Tech's 12 interceptions are tied for 22nd nationally. Last year, the Yellow Jackets finished 110th nationally with six interceptions.

• The Yellow Jackets have forced a season-high three turnovers in six of their 12 games this season — Alcorn State (Sept. 1), Bowling Green (Sept. 29), Louisville (Oct. 5), Duke (Oct. 13), North Carolina (Nov. 3) and Miami (Nov. 10).

• Georgia Tech is one of only eight teams nationally that has forced at least one turnover in every game this season.

• Georgia Tech has recorded three defensive touchdowns this season (**David Curry** fumble return vs. Alcorn State - Sept. 1; **Anree Saint-Amour** interception return vs. Bowling Green - Sept. 29; **Juanyeh Thomas** interception return - Oct. 5), which is tied for first in the ACC and 11th nationally.

• Georgia Tech's defense contributed two more points on Nov. 17 against Virginia when Sr. LB **Brant Mitchell** sacked UVA QB Bryce Perkins for a crucial safety in the first quarter of the Yellow Jackets' eventual 30-27 overtime win. The safety was GT's first since a 65-10 win over Tulane on Sept. 12, 2015.

• The Jackets' No. 80 national rank in scoring defense is a bit misleading, as 28 of the 347 points scored against GT this season have been scored on special teams (two kickoff returns at USF on Sept. 8) or by the opponent's defense (fumble returns vs. Clemson on Sept. 22 and North Carolina on Nov. 3). Without the non-offensive scores, Georgia Tech would be tied for 60th nationally in scoring defense at 26.6 points allowed per game.

• Woody's 3-4 defense recorded Georgia Tech's first shutout in 57 games in the Yellow Jackets' 41-0 victory over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The shutout was the Yellow Jackets' first since they blanked Syracuse, 56-0, on Oct. 19, 2013.

• Georgia Tech's defense also limited Alcorn State to just 146 yards of total offense, which is the second-lowest yardage total allowed by the Yellow Jackets in head coach **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons at the helm. The only time that the Jackets surrendered fewer yards during Johnson's tenure came in his fifth game at Tech, when they allowed just 132 yards in a 27-0 win over Duke on Oct. 4, 2008.

• On Sept. 15 at Pitt, the Yellow Jackets' defense allowed 21 points and 215 yards in the opening half but buckled down in the second half, surrendering just three points and 120 yards after the break to allow the Jackets to nearly come back from a 21-0 deficit in an eventual 24-19 defeat.

• Over its final six possessions of the game, Pitt managed just three points and 114 yards of offense. Georgia Tech's defense forced three punts (two three-and-outs) and recorded an interception over those final six series.

• At Virginia Tech (Oct. 25), Georgia Tech's defense surrendered 216 yards and 21 points on Virginia Tech's first three possessions of the game, but limited VT to 37 yards and zero points over its next five possessions before the Hokies drove for an inconsequential touchdown on their final offensive series.

• Against Miami (Nov. 10), the Yellow Jackets limited the Hurricanes to 299 yards of total offense, 91 yards less than their season averaging going into the game (390.2 ypg). The Jackets were particularly stout against Miami's run game, surrendering just 134 yards on the ground, 63 less than the Hurricanes' season average going into the game (197.0 ypg).

• Miami's 299 yards were the fewest that Georgia Tech has allowed since Virginia Tech managed just 258 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 28-22 win over the No. 17 Hokies on Nov. 11, 2017.

• Georgia Tech has featured eight first-time starters on defense this season — Jr. NT **Brandon Adams**, Sr. OLB **Jalen Johnson**, So. SS **Tariq Carpenter**, Sr. FS **Malik Rivera***, So. CB **Jaytlin Askew**, redshirt Fr. CB **Tre Swilling**, So. CB **Ajani Kerr** and Fr. OLB **Charlie Thomas**.

* Rivera started 18 games in three seasons at Wofford before transferring to Georgia Tech as a graduate student for this season.

• Tech has also played a whopping nine true freshmen on defense this season — DL **T.K. Chimedza**, DL **Justice Dingle**, LB **Jordan Domineck**, DL **Quon Griffin**, LB **Quez Jackson**, DB **Jaylon King**, LB **Charlie Thomas**, DB **Juanyeh Thomas** and CB **Zamari Walton**.

• Woody came to The Flats from Appalachian State, where he served as defensive coordinator from 2013-17. Over his last three seasons at App State (2015-17 — the program's first three campaigns as full-fledged members of FBS), the Mountaineers' 3-4 scheme had average national rankings of 15th in scoring defense, 19th in total defense, 28th in rushing defense and 28th in passing defense.

• Appalachian also averaged 24 takeaways, 19 interceptions and 35 sacks per season over the last three campaigns, all areas where Georgia Tech ranked among the bottom 20 teams nationally in 2017.

DEFENSIVE LINE

• Georgia Tech's three starting defensive linemen — seniors **Desmond Branch**, **Kyle Cerge-Henderson** and **Anree Saint-Amour** — have combined to play in 116 games and make 64 starts for the Yellow Jackets.

• Saint-Amour has arguably been Georgia Tech's best defensive player with 45 tackles, 11.0 tackles for loss, four sacks, three forced fumbles, two interceptions and nine quarterback hurries this season. He leads the Yellow Jackets in TFL, sacks, forced fumbles and QB hurries and is tied for the team lead in interceptions.

• Saint-Amour's two interceptions are tied for the national lead among defensive linemen. He is one of only four defensive linemen with two interceptions (joining Maryland's Byron Cowart, Purdue's Kai Higgins and Toledo's Jamal Hines). His two INTs are tied for 10th in the ACC, regardless of position.

• Saint-Amour is tied for 30th nationally with .25 forced fumbles per game.

• Saint-Amour is 22nd in the ACC with .36 sacks per game.

• Saint-Amour has been especially impressive over the final two-thirds of his senior season, recording 36 tackles, nine tackles for loss, four sacks, three forced fumbles, seven quarterback hurries and two interceptions in the last eight contests (Sept. 29 vs. Bowling Green, Oct. 5 at Louisville, Oct. 13 vs. Duke, Oct. 25 at Virginia Tech, Nov. 3 at North Carolina, Nov. 10 vs. Miami, Nov. 17 vs. Virginia and Nov. 24 at Georgia).

• Saint-Amour had a career day at North Carolina (Nov. 3), tallying nine tackles (career high), three quarterback hurries (career high), a tackle for loss, a pass breakup and an interception in the Yellow Jackets' 38-28 win.

• Saint-Amour's interception with less than two minutes to play thwarted a potential game-tying drive for UNC and set up a 22-yard field goal that sealed the Jackets' victory.

• In recognition of his performance against the Tar Heels, Saint-Amour was named the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for the first time in his career. He became the first Yellow Jacket to be named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week since KeShun Freeman earned the honor following the Yellow Jackets' 35-10 win over Virginia on Nov. 1, 2014.

• Saint-Amour also had a big day at Louisville (Oct. 5) with a team-high-tying six tackles, including a sack, a quarterback hurry and two forced fumbles. Both forced fumbles led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.

• Saint-Amour's two forced fumbles versus Louisville matched a single-game school record. He is the 10th student-athlete in Georgia Tech history to ever force two fumbles in a single game.

• Saint-Amour followed up his dominant performance against Louisville with another one against Duke (Oct. 13), finishing with two sacks, a forced fumble and a quarterback

hurry that caused an interception and led directly to Georgia Tech's first touchdown of the game.

- At Virginia Tech (Oct. 25), Saint-Amour tallied two more tackles for loss, marking the third time in a four-game stretch that he recorded multiple stops behind the line of scrimmage.
- Saint-Amour's interception return for a touchdown against Bowling Green was the first by a Georgia Tech defensive lineman since current Cincinnati Bengal and 2018 GT Sports Hall of Fame inductee Michael Johnson returned an INT 26 yards for a score during a 41-23 win at No. 23 Miami (Fla.) on Nov. 20, 2008.
- Branch has also recorded an interception this season (vs. Clemson on Sept. 22), marking the only time in **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons as Georgia Tech's head coach that two different defensive linemen have had interceptions in the same season.

LINEBACKERS

- The heart and soul of Georgia Tech's defense is senior co-captain and inside linebacker **Brant Mitchell**. Mitchell ranks third on the team with 59 tackles this season.
- After a slow start to his senior campaign (just 14 tackles through four games), Mitchell has notched 45 stops over the past eight contests, including a season-high nine against North Carolina (Nov. 5) and a team-high-tying eight against Miami (Nov. 10).
- Mitchell made one of the Yellow Jackets' biggest defensive plays of the season in the home finale versus Virginia (Nov. 17) when he sacked UVA QB Bryce Perkins for a first-quarter safety. The safety, Georgia Tech's first since a 65-10 win over Tulane on Sept. 12, 2015, was crucial to the Jackets' 30-27 overtime win over UVA.
- Making Mitchell's safety even more significant was the fact that freshman **Juaneyh Thomas** returned the ensuing free kick 77 yards for a touchdown. The Jackets added a two-point conversion, giving them 10 points in 11 seconds without taking an offensive snap.
- As the Yellow Jackets' middle linebacker last season, Mitchell ranked fourth on the team with 51 tackles despite playing in only seven full games and parts of two others due to a lower-body injury. His 5.7 tackles per game led the team.

- In his first full game after returning to the lineup against No. 17 Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, Mitchell recorded a team-high nine tackles, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss, and was named ACC Co-Linebacker of the Week.

- In all, Georgia Tech went just 1-3 in the four games that Mitchell missed all or part of last season.

- After missing the entire 2017 season due to a foot injury, junior inside linebacker **David Curry** ranks seventh on the team with 41 tackles this season.

- Curry, whose career high for tackles coming into the season was three, recorded four (Sept. 1 vs. Alcorn State) and six (Sept. 8 vs. USF) tackles in Georgia Tech's first two games this season.

- The tally against USF likely would've been higher but he was ejected for a targeting call in the fourth quarter of the tough-luck loss on Sept. 8. Due to the ejection, Curry also had to sit out the first half of ACC opener at Pitt on Sept. 15.

- Curry scored Georgia Tech's first defensive touchdown of the season when he scooped up a fumble forced by nose tackle **Brandon Adams** and returned it 15 yards for a score early in the third quarter of the shutout win over Alcorn State on Sept. 1. The fumble return for a touchdown was the Yellow Jackets' first since P.J. Davis returned a fumble 38 yards for a score during the Jackets' 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl.

- Curry's return to action this season came following a series of injuries that kept him out of action last season (foot) and cost him time this past spring (thumb).

- Sophomore **Bruce Jordan-Swilling**, who has seen increased action as of late at inside linebacker, led Georgia Tech with a season-high eight tackles against Duke (Oct. 13).

- True freshman **Charlie Thomas** moved into the starting lineup at the "jack" outside linebacker position against Louisville on Oct. 5. In his first seven career starts, he has tallied 37 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, three fumble recoveries, four quarterback hurries and a pass breakup.

- Thomas' three fumble recoveries this season are the most by a Yellow Jacket since Quayshawn Nealy in 2014 (3).

- Thomas is only the fourth Yellow Jacket in head coach **Paul Johnson's** 11 seasons as Georgia Tech's head coach with as many as three fumble recoveries in a season (Derrick Morgan – 4, 2008; Jerrard Terrant – 3, 2010; Nealy – 3, 2014).

- Thomas tied a single-game school record by recovering two fumbles in the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville. He is the 18th Yellow Jacket to recover two fumbles in a game. Both fumble recoveries led directly to Georgia Tech touchdowns.

- Thomas led Georgia Tech with a career-high nine tackles and his first-career sack at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25).

- Despite appearing in only 11 games with just seven starts, Thomas is fifth on the team with 48 tackles and ranks second on the squad with five quarterback hurries this season.

- Senior OLB **Victor Alexander**, who made the first five starts of the year at "jack," has played in all 47-of-48 games since he arrived on campus in 2015. He saw a string of 43-consecutive games played snapped when he did not appear in the Yellow Jackets' 49-28 victory at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25).

- Alexander returned to the starting lineup for the home finale against Virginia (Nov. 17) and made one of the biggest plays of the game on special teams when he recovered a muffed punt in the third quarter that set up Georgia Tech's second touchdown of the day in what proved to be a 30-27 overtime victory.

- Alexander turned in his finest statistical performance of the season against No. 3/2 Clemson on Sept. 22, finishing with a season-high seven tackles.

- Georgia Tech's fourth linebacker position — the "stinger" OLB — is manned largely by two student-athletes that were tabbed for the secondary prior to Woody's arrival on The Flats — senior **Jalen Johnson** and junior **Christian Campbell**.

- Johnson has been perhaps Georgia Tech's best defensive players over the last four games, totaling 36 tackles and 5.5 tackles for loss in Georgia Tech's wins over North Carolina (Nov. 3), Miami (Nov. 10) and Virginia (Nov. 17) and the regular-season-ending loss at No. 5 Georgia (Nov. 24). He has matched a career high with nine tackles in all four contests.

- In addition to his nine tackles against Virginia (Nov. 17), Johnson picked up his first-career sack in the Yellow Jackets' 30-27 overtime win.

- Johnson was named ACC Linebacker of the Week after tallying nine tackles and a career-high 3.0 tackles for loss in the win over Miami (Nov. 10).

- Making Johnson's numbers against Miami even more impressive is the fact that Georgia Tech limited the Hurricanes to just 53 offensive plays.

- Johnson also had a career day at North Carolina (Nov. 3), recording nine tackles for the first time in his career (prev. career high: six at USF, Sept. 8) and a then-career-high 1.5 tackles for loss (prev. career high: 1.0, twice - last at USF, Sept. 8).

- Despite being limited to the defensive backfield and special teams prior to this season, Johnson and Campbell have combined for 119 career tackles and 11.0 tackles for loss, including 79 stops and 9.0 TFL through 12 games this season.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

- In 2017, Georgia Tech's starting secondary was comprised of five veterans that combined to make 127 starts and play in 218 games.

- However, none of the five members of last year's starting secondary returned in 2018. **Lawrence Austin**, **Lance Austin**, **Step Durham** and **Corey Griffin** all graduated while **A.J. Gray** had to step away from football due to a heart condition.

- In their wake, the defensive backs listed on Georgia Tech's two-deep combined for zero starts and just 27 games played prior to this season.

- Of the eight DBs listed on Tech's two-deep, three are sophomores (CB **Jaylin Askew**, SS **Tariq Carpenter** and CB **Ajani Kerr**), two are redshirt freshmen (CB **Tre Swilling** and SS **Kaleb Oliver**) and one is a true freshman (FS **Juaneyh Thomas**).

- One of only two upperclassmen in the secondary's two-deep (and the only full-time starter), graduate student **Malik Rivera** leads Georgia Tech in tackles (61) and is tied for first in interceptions (two) this season with Carpenter and Sr. DE **Anree Saint-Amour**.

- Rivera's team-high 61 tackles include 10 stops at North Carolina (Nov. 3), which were his most as a Yellow Jacket.

DEFENSE

- Rivera came to The Flats as a graduate transfer from Wofford, where he recorded 131 tackles but totaled just one interception over the past three seasons.

- Rivera's position coach at Wofford the last two seasons (and defensive coordinator in 2017) was **Shiel Wood**, who now serves as Georgia Tech's safeties coach.

- A spectacular student, Rivera graduated from Wofford in May as a triple-major in mathematics, finance and computer science. He is pursuing a master's degree in quantitative and computational finance at Georgia Tech.

- Rivera's two INTs came in the Yellow Jackets' first two ACC games of the season (Sept. 15 at Pitt and Sept. 22 vs. Clemson).

- Carpenter's two INTs came at USF (Sept. 8) and at North Carolina (Nov. 3). Carpenter's fourth-quarter INT at UNC set up a 41-yard touchdown drive that saw Georgia Tech take a 35-28 lead with three minutes to go in the ballgame.

- Seven of Georgia Tech's 12 interceptions this season belong to safeties — Oliver (vs. Alcorn State), Carpenter (at USF, at UNC), Rivera (at Pitt, vs. Clemson) and Thomas (at Louisville).

- Thomas capped the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville (Oct. 5) by returning his first-career interception 95 yards for a touchdown.

- Thomas' 95-yard interception return is tied for the fifth-longest in school history and the longest by a Yellow Jacket in an ACC game (tied with Ken Swilling - 95 yds. vs. NC State, Sept. 9, 1989). It's also the longest INT return by a Jacket since Tyler Marcordes had a 95-yarder against Elon on Aug. 31, 2013.

- Fifth-year senior cornerback **Lamont Simmons** registered the first interception and fumble recovery of his collegiate career versus Duke (Oct. 13).

- The Yellow Jackets' other starting cornerback across from Simmons, redshirt freshman **Tre Swilling**, recorded his first-career interception at North Carolina (Nov. 3) and had a career-high two pass breakups vs. Miami (Nov. 10).

SPECIALISTS

• Two of Georgia Tech's three postseason honorees earned the recognition on special teams — So. P **Pressley Harvin III** and Fr. KR **Juanyeh Thomas**.

• Harvin was named second-team all-ACC while Thomas was named a true freshman all-American by *247Sports*.

• Georgia Tech boasts one of the nation's top punters in Harvin but, due to the Yellow Jackets' offensive proficiency, he has only been called upon to punt 31 times through nine games this season. He is averaging 44.3 yards per punt.

• Nine of Harvin III's 31 punts this season (including nine of his last 24) have traveled 50-plus yards while 15 of his 31 kicks (including 13 of his last 17) have been downed inside the 20-yard line.

• Harvin III does not qualify for official NCAA/ACC statistical rankings because he is far short of the minimum 3.6 attempts per game. However, if he did qualify, his 44.3-yard average would lead the ACC and rank 16th nationally.

• As a team, Georgia Tech leads the ACC and ranks 11th nationally in net punting average (41.0 avg.).

• Additionally, three of Harvin's booming punts were muffed over the final five games of the regular season, which led directly to a touchdown at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25), a field goal vs. Miami (Nov. 10) and a touchdown vs. Virginia (Nov. 17).

• Harvin was one of only two non-true freshmen on the Yellow Jackets' travel roster to not see action during Georgia Tech's 66-31 rout at Louisville (Oct. 5). The other was senior long snapper **Zach Roberts**, who like Pressley, only goes on the field when the Jackets are forced to punt.

• In fact, Harvin III was called upon only once over a two-game stretch versus Bowling Green (Sept. 29) and Louisville. His lone punt versus BG traveled 53 yards and was downed at the 9-yard line.

• Harvin III is on pace for each of his first two seasons to rank among the top six campaigns by a punter in Georgia Tech history, as his current average of 44.26 yards per punt ranks fifth in single-season school history, one slot ahead of his 44.10-yard average as a freshman in 2017.

• Harvin III's 44.1-yard average last season was a Georgia Tech freshman record.

• Thomas earned true freshman all-America recognition on the strength of returning two kickoffs for touchdowns this season, with both coming in the final two games of the regular season — a 77-yard return vs. Virginia (Nov. 17) and a 100-yarder at No. 5 Georgia (Nov. 24).

• With his two kickoff returns for touchdowns this season, Thomas has set or matched five school records.

JUANYEH THOMAS SCHOOL RECORDS

1) His 100-yard kickoff return vs. Georgia is tied for the longest in school history. Thomas became the fourth Yellow Jacket to achieve the feat, joining Drew Hill (vs. Georgia, 1978) Dez White (vs. Maryland, 1998) and Jamal Golden (vs. North Carolina, 2012).

2) He is the third player in school history with two kickoff returns for touchdowns in a single season, joining Hill (1978) and Golden (2012).

3) He is the first Georgia Tech freshman with two kickoff returns for touchdowns and one of only two Tech freshmen with even one kickoff return for a TD (joining White, 1997).

4) He is the fifth player in school history with two kickoff returns for touchdowns in a career, joining Hill (1975-78), Gary Lee (1983-86), White (1997-99) and Golden (2011-15).

5) He is the only player in school history to return kickoffs for touchdowns in consecutive games.

• Georgia Tech's special teams played a huge role in the Yellow Jackets' 30-27 overtime win versus Virginia (Nov. 17).

• Most notably, true Fr. PK **Wesley Wells** made four field goals (28, 28, 48 and 40 yards) in the win. He became the eighth individual and first true freshman in Georgia Tech history to make four field goals in a single game.

• Wells' career-long 48-yarder gave Georgia Tech a 27-24 lead with 1:04 to go in regulation and his 40-yarder in overtime proved to be the winning points in the Yellow Jackets' 30-27 triumph.

• Wells was named ACC Specialist of the Week in recognition of his four made field goals against Virginia. He is the first Yellow Jacket to be named ACC Specialist of the Week since Lance Austin earned the honor following his game-winning 78-yard return of a blocked field goal in the Yellow Jackets' "Miracle on Techwood Drive" victory over No. 9 Florida State in 2015 and is only the seventh different Yellow Jacket to be named ACC Specialist of the Week since the award was introduced in 2004.

• Wells took over the place-kicking duties after winning an in-practice competition for the job in the week leading up to the Bowling Green game (Sept. 29). Since then, he has made the first 46 kicks of his career — 8-of-8 field goals and 38-of-38 PATs.

• Wells' first-career field goal was a 41-yarder at Louisville. It was the longest made FG by a Yellow Jacket since **Brenton King**, also a true freshman at the time, made a 42-yarder vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 21, 2017.

• The second field goal of Wells' career was a crucial one, a 22-yarder with 46 seconds remaining that sealed the Yellow Jackets' 38-28 victory at North Carolina (Nov. 3).

• Wells kicked multiple field goals in a game for the first time in his career when he nailed pivotal 38- and 23-yarders in a 27-21 win over Miami (Nov. 10).

• Also against Virginia, Thomas returned a free kick (after a GT safety) 77 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter of the 30-27 OT win.

• Officially considered a kickoff return for statistical purposes, Thomas' first kickoff return for a touchdown of his collegiate career was Georgia Tech's first since **Lamont Simmons'** 42-yard return of an onside-kick attempt in a 25-24 loss at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14, 2017.

• Thomas also made a huge special-teams play in punt coverage the previous week versus Miami (Nov. 3), when he raced downfield and needed just one arm to shove UM returner Jeff Thomas out of the way and recover a muffed punt at the Miami 10 yard line. The fumble recovery set up a pivotal third-quarter field goal in Georgia Tech's 27-21 win over the Hurricanes.

• Thomas' 25-yard punt return in the second quarter of the Sept. 1 season opener against Alcorn State was Georgia Tech's longest punt return since **Brad Stewart's** 26-yarder versus Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 1, 2016.

• Georgia Tech got two huge plays on punts in the win over Virginia. In the first quarter, So. P **Pressley Harvin III** boomed a 57-yard punt that was downed at the 1-yard line. Two plays later, Sr. LB **Brant Mitchell** sacked UVA QB Bryce Perkins for a safety, which immediately preceeded Thomas' free-kick return for a TD. In the third quarter, a 37-yard punt by Harvin bounced off UVA's Darrius Bratton and was recovered by Sr. LB **Victor Alexander**. The fumble recovery led to a touchdown drive that gave GT a 24-21 lead early in the fourth quarter of the eventual 30-27 overtime win.

• Georgia Tech has blocked 19 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the seventh-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• Georgia Tech has blocked 19 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the seventh-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• USF's 266 yards on kickoff returns on Sept. 8 — which included 98- and 97-yard returns for touchdowns by Terrence Horne in the first quarter — were the second-most yards that Georgia Tech has ever allowed on kickoff returns in a single game (second only to North Carolina's 267 yards in a 68-50 GT win on Nov. 10, 2012).

• The two touchdowns allowed on kickoff returns against USF tied an NCAA Division I FBS single-game record.

• In the Yellow Jackets' 65 kickoffs since Horne's back-to-back touchdowns at USF (not including an onside kick attempt versus Duke on Oct. 13), Georgia Tech has pinned the opponent at or inside its 25-yard line 39 times (with one of the exceptions being on a squib kick on the first kickoff following the two TD returns at USF). • Of the teams widely considered to be Georgia Tech's closest academic peers at the Power 5 level — Duke, Notre Dame, Northwestern, Purdue, Stanford and Vanderbilt — only Stanford (9) has played in more bowl games over the last 10 seasons than the Yellow Jackets (8).

• Bobby Dodd Stadium has been home sweet home for Georgia Tech of late, as it is 12-3 in its last 15 home games, dating back to midway through the 2016 season. The only three home losses during that span have been at the hands of Georgia (Nov. 25, 2017), Clemson (Sept. 22, 2018) and Duke (Oct. 13, 2018).

• The Yellow Jackets' 28-14 loss to Duke snapped their nine-game winning streak versus unranked opponents at home.

• On the flip side, Georgia Tech has struggled in games played away from its Midtown Atlanta home over the past two seasons. The Yellow Jackets are just 3-8 in games played away from Bobby Dodd Stadium since the beginning of the 2017 season.

• However, the Jackets emphatically snapped a seven-game away-from-home skid with impressive wins in three road games this season — a 66-31 romp at Louisville (Oct. 5), a 49-28 rout at Virginia Tech (Oct. 25) and a 38-28 triumph at North Carolina (Nov. 3).

• Georgia Tech won three-straight games away from home since the first time since it won at Virginia Tech (Nov. 12), at Georgia (Nov. 26) and vs. Kentucky at the TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31) to close the 2016 season.

• Georgia Tech won three-straight true road games for the first time since it won at Pittsburgh (Oct. 25), NC State (Nov. 8) and Georgia (Nov. 29) in 2014.

• Georgia Tech won three-straight ACC road games for the first time since it won at Duke (Nov. 14, 2009), North Carolina (Sept. 18, 2010) and Wake Forest (Oct. 2, 2010).
