About Saturday's Game

Embarking on a four-game stretch run that included just one home game, Georgia Tech travels to Coral Gable, Fla., Saturday for a 2 p.m. Atlantic Coast Conference basketball game against Miami at the Watsco Center.

Tech (12-15, 4-10 ACC), in its third season under head coach Josh Pastner, snapped a seven-game losing streak Wednesday night with a 73-65 victory over Pittsburgh at McCamish Pavilion. The Yellow Jackets, 2-7 on the road this season with wins at Arkansas and Syracuse, sit alone in 11th place in the ACC standings, a half-game behind Boston College, whom Tech will host on March 3 in its only remaining home game.

Miami (11-14, 3-10 ACC), in its eighth season under head coach Jim Larranaga, began conference play 1-8, but is 2-2 in its last four, having beaten Notre Dame and Clemson and falling to No. 8 North Carolina in overtime on the road. The Hurricanes, in a three-way tie for 12th place with Notre Dame and Wake Forest, are coming off a midweek bye following a 64-57 loss at Boston College last Sunday.

Saturday's game will be broadcast live on the ACC's Regional Sports Network, and will be streamed live on ACC Network Extra, available through the ESPN app. Radio coverage is provided on the Georgia Tech IMG Sports Network, airing in Atlanta on 680 AM and 93.7 FM the Fan. The Tech broadcast is available on satellite radio (XM ch. 384, internet ch. 975).

Starting Lineup

• **Close to You** - Only two games separate the bottom six teams in the ACC standings, and Georgia Tech's final five games include three of those teams (Pittsburgh, Miami, Boston College), meaning the Jackets can gain a tiebreaker advantage for the ACC Tournament with wins against those teams. Tech defeated Pittsburgh (2-12) Wednesday night, and have yet to play Miami (3-10) and Boston College (4-9). The Jackets defeated Wake Forest (3-10) in their ACC opener and split with Notre Dame (also 3-10). Tech also has Virginia and NC State upcoming, and a victory against either would also help in tiebreaker scenarios.

• **Outta here** - The Yellow Jackets close out their schedule with three games out of four on the road (Miami, Virginia, NC State). Boston College is Tech's only remaining home game (March 3).

• **Buzz saw** - Georgia Tech's recent seven-game losing streak included five opponents ranked in the AP top 25 and five that ranked in the top 20 nationally in defensive efficiency according to KenPom.com.

• **Stacked** - Eight ACC teams rank among the top 30 in KenPom.com's offensive efficiency rankings, and six ACC teams rank among the top 30 in defensive efficiency. Four of those teams are ranked in the top 20 of both categories.

• **Outpost** - In an attempt to invigorate its offense, Georgia Tech returned to a one-post starting alignment for its last three games, with James Banks III starting in the middle with four perimeter players. It has helped produce the Yellow Jackets' two highest point totals since Jan. 12 and two of its best shooting efforts since Jan. 22. Tech has averaged 62.7 points and hit on 37.7 percent of its three-point shots in its last three games, scoring 68 at Virginia Tech and 73 vs. Pittsburgh, compared to 53.9 points and 23.8 percent on threes in the previous eight games.

• **The Bank is open** - In 26 games at Georgia Tech, James Banks III has exceeded his 46-game totals at Texas in every offensive category, as well as blocked shots and steals. Banks has six double-doubles this season for the Jackets, fourth most in the ACC.

• **Hola again** - Jose Alvarado has scored 46 points in Tech's last two games (Florida State and Pittsburgh), including a career-high 29 against the Panthers Wednesday night. In those two games, he has hit 15-of-24 from the floor, 5-of-12 from three-point range, 11-of-12 from the free throw line. He also had 11 rebounds, eight assists and four steals.

• **Sjo-time** - Freshman forward Kristian Sjolund (pronounced SHO-lund) has scored 39 points and played 87 minutes in Tech's last four games. He played in just 13 of Tech's first 23 games, scoring a total of nine points in 62 minutes.

• **Crack that whip** - Michael Devoe is 19-for-37 from three-point range in Tech's last 10 games. He had gone 12-for-43 in the first 17 games of the season.

• **Three's the charm** - Tech has averaged 7.4 three-point field goals and connected on 35.6 percent of its attempts in its last five games, and is 26-of-69 (37.7 pct.) in its last three games.

• **Guard your yard** - Georgia Tech ranks No. 7 in the ACC in scoring defense (67.7 ppg), No. 3 in field goal percentage defense (39.7 pct.) and No. 2 in three-point percentage defense (30 pct.) against conference opponents. The Jackets rank No. 5 in steals (7.0 pg) and No. 2 in blocked shots (5.5 pg).

• **Below average** - Georgia Tech has faced three of the nation's top 10 teams in offensive efficiency as ranked by KenPom.com - Tennessee (2), Duke (3) and Virginia Tech (9) - and held them to an average of 61.3 points. Each posted their lowest efficiency rating of the season against the Jackets. North Carolina is No. 7, and the Jackets held the Tar Heels to their fourth-lowest rating of the season. Tech held Florida State (28th) to two of its three lowest efficiency ratings of the season.

• **Youts are served** - Georgia Tech's seven freshmen and sophomores have played 66.5 percent of the minutes for Tech in ACC games.

- **Going deep** - Georgia Tech has deployed 11 different starting lineups this season, and 11 Yellow Jackets have started at least one game. Nine have started five or more games, and 10 have started at least one ACC game.

- **Longer bench** - Tech has utilized at least eight players in all of its ACC games to date. Tech's reserves have played 34.2 percent of available minutes, No. 82 in the nation according to KenPom.com (national average is 30.7 pct.). Tech's bench is outscoring that of its opponents 20.8 to 17.0 per game.

Series vs. Miami

- Tech snapped a two-game losing streak in the series with a 64-54 win in Atlanta on Jan. 3, 2018, the teams' only meeting. Still, Georgia Tech has dropped 12 of the last 17 after winning the first two meetings with Miami after the Hurricanes became members of the ACC.

- Miami has an 13-9 lead in the all-time series which dates back to 1953, and is 13-7 against the Yellow Jackets since joining the ACC.

- Tech has won two of its last three games against Miami in Coral Gables, including a 71-69 victory over 6th-ranked Miami on March 6, 2013. It was Tech's first win at the Watsco Center since Feb. 26, 2005. The Jackets also captured a 70-50 win against No. 23 Miami on Jan. 28, 2015.

- Miami had won five straight meetings in Atlanta and was 3-0 at McCamish Pavilion before Tech's 2018 win. Miami also won the only regular-season meeting between the two teams in 2011-12, as well as their ACC Tournament meeting, both games at Philips Arena.

- Miami was the opponent for Tech in its last game at Alexander Memorial Coliseum, a game the Yellow Jackets won 66-57 to close out the 2010-11 regular season. Tech won four of six games against the Hurricanes in the building.

- Fourteen of the 22 meetings have been decided by 10 points or less.

- Tech is 3-6 against Miami teams coached by Jim Larranaga, but 4-6 against Larranaga, including a 70-62 win over his George Mason team on Nov. 20, 2009 in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

- Tech coach Josh Pastner is 3-1 against Miami (1-1 while at Tech), including a pair of victories during his term as head coach at Memphis.

- The last meeting between the two schools prior to Miami's joining the ACC occurred in December of 1997 as part of the Orange Bowl Classic doubleheader at Miami Arena, the Hurricanes' home court until the team moved into the on-campus Convocation Center. The Yellow Jackets, led that year by senior forward Matt Harpring, won that game, 69-61, over a Hurricanes' team coached by Leonard Hamilton.

- Tech played Miami twice over former head coach Whack Hyder, losing the first-ever meeting in the series by 22 points in 1953, then taking a six-point homecourt victory in 1967. That was the only pre-ACC visit by the Hurricanes to Alexander Memorial Coliseum, and the 90-84 Tech win has been the highest scoring game in the short series.

Last Game - Tech Topples Pitt

Led by a career-high 29 points from by resurgent point guard Jose Alvarado, Georgia Tech men's basketball pulled away late for a 73-65 victory over Pittsburgh on Wednesday night at McCamish Pavilion.

Georgia Tech (12-15, 4-10 ACC) trailed for only 20 seconds early in the first half and led by as many as 18 points en route to snapping a seven-game losing streak. Pitt (12-15, 2-12 ACC) pulled within a point in the second half but buoyed by making 50 percent of its shots from the field for the game (24-of-48 — its highest field-goal percentage in 11 contests), the Yellow Jackets pulled away for the victory.

After scoring in single-digits and shooting less than 30 percent from the field in each of the previous six games, Alvarado has scored 46 points on 62.5-percent shooting (15-

Last Meeting vs. Miami

Georgia Tech 64, Miami 54

Jan. 3, 2018 • McCamish Pavilion

Led by Josh Okogie's 30 points, Georgia Tech opened 2018 with its biggest win of the season, a 64-54 triumph over No. 15 Miami.

Tech trailed by eight points midway through the first half but pulled even at halftime (28-28) and never trailed after the break. The Yellow Jackets extended their lead to as large as 12 points in the second half.

Okogie's season-high 30 points came on 10-of-23 shooting from the field and 9-of-12 at the free-throw line. In addition to the season-best effort offensively, the sophomore also recorded a season high on the glass, grabbing nine rebounds. Freshman point guard Jose Alvarado added 12 points on 5-of-9 shooting.

The win over 15th-ranked Miami marked the fourth time that the Jackets have beaten a top-15 team in 20 ACC games under head coach Josh Pastner.

Dewan Huell, with 13 points, was the only player to score in double figures for Miami. Anthony Lawrence and Bruce Brown each had nine points as the Hurricanes snapped a two-game winning streak.

The Hurricanes contested nearly every pass and shot throughout the game, but Georgia Tech never trailed in the second half after Ben Lammers stole the ball from Lonnie Walker IV and hit a 14-footer to make it 36-32.

A 14-2 run by the Jackets made it 46-34 as Miami began the second half missing 11 of its first 13 shots. The Hurricanes nearly recovered, pulling within two on Chris Lykes' two free throws with 3:47 remaining, but that was a close as they got.

of-24) over the past two contests. He made 9-of-13 field goals and 9-of-10 free throws to account for Wednesday's career-best 29 points.

Defensively, Georgia Tech recorded a season-high 11 blocked shots while limiting Pitt to 34.5-percent shooting from the field.

Following the Trends

- For the last two games, Georgia Tech has started out in a 4-out, 1-in alignment, starting Moses Wright and freshman Kristian Sjolund at the forward spots along with guards Jose Alvarado and Michael Devoe and post man James Banks III.

- Sjolund made his second start, while Wright started for the 16th time this season. Devoe, a freshman, has started Tech's last 18 games, having made his first collegiate start at Arkansas. Banks has started the last 21 games in the post, and Alvarado has started 25 games.

- Tech has used 11 different starting lineups this season. No Yellow Jacket has started every game this season, and 10 different players have started three or more games.

- Tech has all of its players healthy, on the bench and in uniform for the first time since Feb. 6 against Clemson. The Jackets have been shorthanded in 11 of their ACC games because of injury, illness or other absence.

- Tech used nine players in the game, seven of them for double-digit minutes, and eight players scored.

- Tech has shot 50 percent or better seven times this season, three times in ACC play — 55.8 percent against Wake Forest, 59.5 percent at Syracuse, and an even 50 percent Wednesday night against Pittsburgh. The Jackets connected on 57.9 percent of their field goal tries in the second half.

- Tech continued an upward turn in its three-point shooting, connecting on 7-of-19 against Pittsburgh. The Jackets have averaged 8.5 threes and shot 37 percent from beyond the arc in their last four games. In the five games before that, the Jackets shot 14-for-96 (14.6 pct.) from bonus range. (Alvarado is 5-for-12 in his last two games, and Curtis Haywood II hit 2-of-4 against Pittsburgh after going 2-for-32 in the eight games before that. Devoe 14-for-27 in his last six games. Sjolund is 10-for-24 in Tech's last four games.)

- Tech put together its most efficient offensive game (110.2 points per 100 possessions, according to KenPom.com) since its ACC opener against Wake Forest (121.4, when the Jackets scored 92 points and shot 55.8 percent). It was Tech's fourth-most efficient game of the season.

- Tech has made 75 percent of its free throws over its last seven games; however, the Yellow Jackets have averaged scoring just 11.1 points from the charity stripe. Tech went 18-for-24 against Pittsburgh, its most attempts since Louisville on Jan. 19, and its most free throws made since Wake Forest on Jan. 5.

- Tech has held 17 opponents this season, and eight ACC opponents, under 40 percent from the floor (Pittsburgh shot 33.3 percent). The Jackets have limited 15 opponents, eight in the ACC, to 30 percent or less from three-point range.

- Tech blocked 12 Pittsburgh shots, its fourth highest number ever against an ACC opponent and its most since rejecting 15 against Clemson on March 6, 2008 (Tech's record against an ACC opponent).

- Wake Forest (74.4 ppg, scored 79), Clemson (71.4 ppg, scored 72 in the first meeting) and Virginia Tech (75.6, 76 in second meeting) remain the only Georgia Tech opponents to exceed their season scoring averages this season against the Yellow Jackets. Tech had held every other opponent this season under its season scoring average — breakdown by game: Lamar 81.8 (69), Tennessee 85.5 (66), East Carolina 71.1 (54), UTRGV 70.2 (44), Prairie View A&M 69.2 (54), Northwestern 73.5 (67), St. John's 83.5 (76), Florida A&M 63.2 (40), Gardner-Webb 82.9 (79), Arkansas 81.8 (69), Georgia 79.2 (70), Kennesaw State 62.5 (57), USC Upstate 70.9 (63), Virginia Tech 81.1 (52), Syracuse 70.9 (59), Louisville 79.9 (79), Notre Dame 74.7 (61), Duke 88.6 (66), North Carolina

88.1 (77), Florida State 77.8 (59), Clemson 71.2 (65 in second meeting), Notre Dame 71.7 (69 in second meeting), Florida State 77.5 (69 in second meeting), Pittsburgh 67.7 (65).

- Tech won despite playing the final 2:01 of the Pitt game without Michael Devoe and James Banks, who both fouled out. Devoe committed his fifth with 2:50 left. It was Banks' fourth DQ of the season, Devoe's second.

- Two fouls in the first half? No problem. Tech ranks No. 1 in the nation, according to KenPom.com, in percentage of first-half minutes that Jackets are on the floor with two fouls (64.8 percent). The national average is 21.4 percent.

Personnel Highlights

- Jose Alvarado scored a career-high 29 points, matching his career best for field goals made (9-of-13) and establishing a personal high for free throws made (9-of-10). The 6-foot-sophomore guard has scored 46 points in Tech's last two games after scoring a total of 25 points in the six games prior.

- Alvarado recorded his eighth career 20-plus game against the Panthers, fourth this season. His previous career high was 24 at Northwestern on Nov. 28 of this season.

- Alvarado has played the full 40 minutes in a game three times this season (at Arkansas, at Notre Dame, Pittsburgh), and 11 times in his career.

- Alvarado added five assists, six rebounds, two steals and one turnovers against Pittsburgh.

- James Banks III has three double-digit rebound games in his last four — 12 at Notre Dame, 10 vs. Florida State, 10 vs. Pittsburgh. He has averaged 9.6 boards over his last five games.

- Banks has averaged 4.0 blocks over his last five games — 7 vs. Clemson, 4 vs. Notre Dame, 2 each vs. Virginia Tech and Florida State, 5 vs. Pittsburgh. Banks is averaging 2.71 blocks per ACC game, which leads the conference.

- Moses Wright, who made his second straight start and 16th this season, had his most productive ACC game this season with seven points, seven rebounds and four blocked shots against Pittsburgh. Wright fell one shy of his career high of eight rebounds (Bethune-Cookman, Virginia Tech last season), and had only blocked one shot in a game previously (seven

times). He went 3-of-4 from the foul line, including two critical makes with 1:41 on the clock and Tech leading 64-61.

- Freshman Kristian Sjolund has seen his most extensive action of the season in the Yellow Jackets' last four games, averaging 9.8 points and 21.8 minutes per game (8 points in 9 minutes at Notre Dame, 11 in 26 minutes at Virginia Tech, 11 more in 28 minutes against Florida State, and 9 in 25 minutes against Pitt). The 6-7 forward has hit 12-of-28 from the floor and 10-of-24 threes in these four games. His season high for minutes had been 11 against East Carolina, and he had gone 2-for-11 from three-point range on the season prior to the last four games.

- With Tech opting for a 4-out, 1-in approach at Virginia Tech, Abdoulaye Gueye has not started the last three games. He played just four minutes at Virginia Tech, but played 17 against Florida State (5 points, 6 rebounds) and 16 against Pittsburgh (8 points, 3 rebounds, 2 blocks). Gueye had averaged 12.0 points and 5.1 rebound over his previous eight games, and had scored in double digits in seven of those. The 6-9 senior connected on 52.6 percent of his shots from the floor (41-of-78) in the same stretch. In Tech's last two games, he is 5-of-11 from the floor.

- Freshman Michael Devoe averaging 10.0 points (No. 3 on the team), 4.3 rebounds and 2.5 assists in ACC games, and he has hit 46 percent of his three-point tries (23-of-50) against conference opponents. Devoe is 14-of-27 from three-point land (51.9 pct.) in his last six games.

- Banks is Tech's No. 2 scorer (11.3 ppg) and leading rebounder (7.0 rpg) leader in ACC games, and he is hitting 50.8 percent of his field goals and 69.4 percent of his free throws against conference foes.

Pastner's Key Metrics

- **Assists to made field goals:** The Jackets have 219 assists on 359 field goals (61 percent) in its last 14 games. The Jackets are at 58 percent for the season (38th in the nation) and 56.9 percent in ACC games. Tech assisted on 13 of 24 made field goals (54.2 percent) against Pittsburgh, missing its nightly goal of 60 percent.

- **Free throws made to opponents' attempts:** Tech is 37-17 under Josh Pastner when attempting more free throws than the opponent. Tech connected on 18-of-24 free throw attempts to Pittsburgh's 20-of-38 (nightly goal of making more than opponent tries not accomplished).

- **Turnovers:** Tech has averaged 15.0 turnovers per game this season, 15.4 in ACC games to date (3.4 more per game than opponents). Target each night is 11 or fewer, which Tech has met twice this season (both wins). More telling for Tech under Josh Pastner is that when Tech has committed fewer turnovers than its opponent, it is 22-13. When it has committed more, it is 21-29.

- **Guard rebounding:** The group of Alvarado, Alston, Devoe, Haywood, Moore and Phillips has combined to take 321

of Tech's 700 defensive rebounds this season (45.9 percent). Tech's guards combined for 11 of the Jackets' 29 defensive rebounds against Pittsburgh.

Build the Wall

Due to its ability to play both zone and man-to-man and keep opponents off-balance, Georgia Tech has been able to rely on its mixture of defenses to win games over Josh Pastner's first two-plus seasons at Georgia Tech.

This Yellow Jacket team has played it well enough to rank No. 22 in adjusted defensive efficiency (92.7 ppg/100 possessions), and is No. 5 in the ACC and 33rd in the NCAA in scoring defense at 67.7 points per game. Tech has ranked as high as No. 11 this season.

- Tech's effective field goal percentage defense (44.5 pct., taking into account three-point field goals) ranks No. 8 nationally, according to KenPom.com, and the Jackets are No. 13 in the NCAA rankings in field goal percentage defense (39.2 pct.). Tech ranks 26th in KenPom in effective two-point percentage (45.3) defense.

- The Jackets have also defended the three-point shot better, allowing just 28.9-percent accuracy to rank No. 2 in the ACC and No. 6 nationally. Tech is No. 6 in effective 3-point defense according to KenPom.com.

- Tech has improved markedly in another area - takeaways. The Jackets are No. 6 in the ACC and rank No. 72 nationally in steals (7.3 per game) and are No. 2 and 12, respectively, in blocked shots (5.4 per game).

- **Said Florida State coach Leonard Hamilton:** "Georgia Tech utilizes a defensive scheme that is probably the best match-up zone defensive scheme that I've seen in my coaching career. They do an outstanding job of taking away so many different spots on the floor that you normally are accustomed to operating in."

- Said Notre Dame coach Mike Brey: "They are really hard to score on. There's a reason why their stats play out as one of the best, if not the best, defensive team in our league. They are just really hard to deal with. They're long, they're athletic, they're in passing lanes and if you do beat them, they've got shot blocker in the back."

- **Said Pittsburgh coach Jeff Capel:** "Their defense is difficult. Their defense is different. It's unique. They have length around the basket and they understand how to move in their defense and their zone."

- Tech's NIT finals team from 2017 ranked No. 6 in adjusted offensive efficiency (91.0 points allowed per 100 possessions) according to KenPom.com. That group ranked fourth in the ACC in scoring defense (66.8 ppg) and No. 1 in FG percentage defense (39.8 pct.).

his Yellow Jackets on ball and player movement and hard cutting from the first time he got his team on the practice court. His primary measuring stick on how well the Jackets perform offensively is their ratio of assists to made field goals, and the Jackets' struggle to score this season is not for lack of ball movement.

Tech is No. 38 so far in 2018-19 at 58 percent (56.9 pct. in ACC games), and remains well above the national average (52.1 pct.) in that category. The Jackets did not perform as well in that department in 2017-18, assisting on 54.6 of its made field goals overall, 53.9 against ACC teams, and missing Pastner's 60-percent bar 14 times.

In Pastner's first season, the Yellow Jackets ranked 13th nationally, according to KenPom.com, in highest percentage of assists to made field goals at 62.6 percent, the team's highest rate since the 2000-01 season. Tech's number was 63.2 percent in ACC games. Pastner's nightly goal is 60 percent.

Devoe Getting Comfortable

Freshman guard Michael Devoe, the highest-rated high school prospect Georgia Tech has recruited under Josh Pastner, has steadily improved for the Yellow Jackets since the season began.

The Orlando, Fla., native suffered a setback by missing six weeks of preseason practice with a toe injury and began the season slowly, but has steadily played more minutes and improved his production.

He entered the Tech starting lineup at Arkansas on Dec. 19, a game Tech won, 69-65, and he scored 11 points. He has connected on 46 percent of his three-point tries in ACC games (would lead the ACC with enough 3PM) and averaged 34.5 minutes (14th-most).

Devoe scored 16 points in his ACC debut against Wake Forest, and has five double-digit scoring games in his last nine. He has hit 19-for-37 three-point tries in that stretch.

Banking Hours

The most significant development in the direction of this year's Georgia Tech team may have occurred Nov. 13, when the NCAA granted James Banks III immediate eligibility after his transfer from Texas.

Tech received that news while conducting its shootaround for its second game of the season, at Tennessee. Arrangements were made to get Banks to Knoxville (transfers to not travel with the team), where he contributed five points and seven rebounds in a 66-53 loss.

The personable 6-9 post player has progressed rapidly since that modest start. He posted his first double-double four games later at Northwestern (12 pts/12 rebs), and made his first start the game after that against St. John's (14 pts/12 rebs).

Since ACC play began, Banks has been Tech's No. 2 scorer (11.3 ppg) and top rebounder (7.0 rpg), hitting 50.8 percent of his shots from the floor and 69.4 percent of his free throws, while leading the conference in blocked shots (2.71 pg).

Defensively, he's No. 2 in the conference in all games and ranks 13th nationally in blocked shots (2.58 per game), and has anchored one of the nation's top defensive teams (No. 22 nationally in defensive efficiency according to KenPom.com).

He has added two more double-doubles, 24/11 against Louisville and 16/10 against Notre Dame, and has six for the season.

In 26 games at Tech, Banks has exceeded his 46-game totals at Texas in every offensive category, plus blocks and steals.

Jose Can You See

Point guard Jose Alvarado, recruited to Georgia Tech primarily for his winning attitude and determination, was given

the green light by head coach Josh Pastner to handle the position, sink or swim, before his freshman season came to an abrupt end Feb. 11 against Duke. He dislocated his left elbow in a fall, and missed the rest of the season.

The Brooklyn native, the first Tech player from the New York area in nearly 20 years, has developed into the Yellow Jackets' engine on the floor in his sophomore season, leading the Jackets in scoring (12.3 ppg, 11.4 vs. the ACC), assists (3.2 pg, 3.5 vs. the ACC) and steals (1.8 pg, 1.8 vs. the ACC). He also has hit 82.2 percent from the free throw line while taking 3.8 rebounds on average in ACC games to date.

He ranks among the ACC's top 10 in free throw percentage, assists and steals.

Alvarado's freshman season was full of promise until it came to an abrupt halt on Feb. 11, when he dislocated his left elbow on a hard fall to the floor trying to contest a breakaway shot from Duke's Javin Delaurier. Until then, he had averaged 12.6 points per game to rank second on the team, 3.9 rebounds and 3.3 assists with an assist/turnover ratio of 77/56. He also shot the ball well, making 45 percent of his shots from the floor, 37.4 percent from three-point distance, and 80.2 percent from the foul line on 80 attempts.

Alvarado has posted 32 double-figure scoring games in his career, eight times scoring 20 or more. And the 6-foot playmaker has averaged nearly 34 minutes per game, with 11 complete 40-minute games.

• **Said Pittsburgh coach Jeff Capel:** "[Jose] Alvarado is a big-time competitor. We told our guys coming into this game, I know that kid and I know his spirit. With his team struggling, I knew that he would try to take it upon himself to be aggressive and have a great game. He was sensational."

Out of Africa

Georgia Tech got a big lift from an unlikely source once ACC play began last season, junior forward Abdoulaye Gueye (pronounced "AB-doo-lee GAY"). During the month of January and into February, the Yellow Jackets saw the 6-9 native of Senegal (by way of Birmingham, Ala.) become a legitimate offensive force, and not just a disruptor on defense and on the boards.

Known as "A.D." to his teammates and coaches, the likeable Gueye took advantage of a much-improved jump hook shot to average 6.5 points (50 percent from the floor) and 4.5 rebounds in in ACC games.

Gueye has made a similar jump from non-conference to ACC play this season as well, averaging 9.3 points and 4.3 rebounds while hitting 51.1 percent shots from the floor. He scored in double figures in six consecutive games, the first time he has done that in his career, and in seven ACC games.

Building Depth

Georgia Tech has deployed 11 different starting lineups this season, and 10 Yellow Jackets have started three or more games.

Tech has deployed at least eight players for significant minutes in all of its games so far, including as many as nine in its ACC games. Tech's bench has played 34.2 percent of available minutes, No. 82 in the nation according to KenPom.com (national average is 30.7 pct.). *Last season, Tech ranked No. 210 with 30.1 minutes played by reserves.*

In conference play this season, head coach Josh Pastner has relied on a core group for longer durations - Jose Alvarado and Michael Devoe rank among the conference top 15 in average minutes, yet still has utilized eight or nine players altogether.

Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech there, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

Other Storylines for 2018-19

• **104th season** - Georgia Tech is playing its 104th season of basketball and has an all-time record of 1,374-1,241.

• **Unlucky 13** - Tech was picked to finish 13th in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season in a vote of the ACC media, ahead of Pittsburgh and Wake Forest. The Yellow Jackets finished 13th last season.

• **Seven** - Number of freshmen and sophomores playing significant roles for the Yellow Jackets this season. They have played 66.5 percent of the minutes for Tech in ACC games.

• **1.26 years** - Average experience of the players on Georgia Tech's current roster, which ranks No. 298 in the nation (No. 1 is the oldest), according to KenPom.com. The national average is 1.67 years.

• **Above average** - Georgia Tech ranks No. 80, according to Kenpom.com, in average height (77.5 inches) among the nation's Division I teams. The national average is 76.8.

• The upward progress of the program is evident in the development of its 2017-18 freshman class, each of whom received significant playing time last season and made significant contributions on the ACC level. Though not highly-rated in terms of rankings, the four-man class has a wide range of skills and is ripe for development into consistent conference-level performers over the next couple of years.

a. Point guard Jose Alvarado started every game last season and showed durability and toughness by averaging more than 38 minutes in ACC games until suffering a dislocated elbow Feb. 11.

b. Off-guard Curtis Haywood II was developing into a significant shooting threat and excellent defender before suffering stress reaction in his shin and missing the final month of the 2017-18 season.

c. Forwards Evan Cole and Moses Wright, both under-the-radar signees, exceeded expectations for their first year when forced into action due to injuries over the final month of the season. With added strength and development this off-season, can be counted on to be in the frontcourt rotation and make significant contributions at both ends of the floor.

• Coach Pastner, his staff and the student-athletes in the program have carried over a solid, sustainable culture of accountability and dependability from the previous coaching staff which enabled the team to overcome a number of key injuries last season and continue to work hard and remain focused on the court and in the weight room.

• Pastner replaced two assistant coaches - Tavaras Hardy and Darryl LaBarrie - over the last year. Hardy was named head coach at Loyola of Maryland in late March, while LaBarrie resigned during the season. Anthony Wilkins, an Atlanta native, joined the staff after five seasons at Tulane, and Julian Swartz was elevated from his position as director of recruiting and compliance.

• Tech added a three-man recruiting class ranked No. 46 in the country according to 247Sports, including consensus four-star guard Michael Devoe and three-star forwards Khalid Moore and Kristian Sjolund, and true to staff's objectives, the class has varied skill sets and are expected to develop into significant contributors next season and beyond (building through multiple quality recruiting classes)

• Another addition to the roster this season - 6-3 guard Shembari Phillips, a high-major conference player who sat out the 2017-18 season as a transfer from Tennessee. He has the size and varied skill set necessary to compete in the ACC (6.2 ppg, 3.1 rpg, 37.5 pct. 3s in 2016-17). He has two years of eligibility.

• Tech also accepted transfer James Banks, a 6-9, 243-pound frontcourt player from Decatur, Ga., ranked as high as No. 49 among high school seniors in the class of 2016. After two years at Texas, he enrolled at Tech for the summer term and was granted immediate eligibility by the NCAA on Nov. 13. He has two seasons of eligibility at Tech.

Thin Gold Line

Some of Georgia Tech's most successful teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference era have had thin benches and a trio of players who averaged more than 35 minutes per game in ACC play, beginning with the Yellow Jackets' first ACC Championship team in 1985, dubbed the "Thin Gold Line."

• Tech returned six players who received significant playing time in 2017-18 - 15 or more minutes per ACC game - and combined to start 91 games overall. They accounted for more than 53 percent of total minutes played and 43 percent of Tech's scoring. Five of those players have two or more years of eligibility remaining.

• Tech has a young roster - three freshmen, four sophomores, three juniors and two seniors among scholarship players returning or incoming - but the process of getting old and staying old and building a sustainable winning program is ongoing.

• Player development successes over the past two seasons include Josh Okogie, Ben Lammers and Tadic Jackson, who maximized their skill sets under the current coaching staff, doubling their scoring and rebounding averages over their first two seasons. Okogie went from being ranked the 11th in the state as a HS senior to a first-round NBA draft pick. Last season, 6-9 forward Abdoulaye Gueye developed into an ACC-level contributor, making a similar leap from the non-conference season to conference play. Graduate transfer Brandon Alston, who has a year of eligibility remaining, had similar statistical numbers on the ACC level this season as he compiled in two seasons at Lehigh and was fundamentally sound in his ballhandling and defense.

• With the addition of Phillips and the arrival of Devoe and Moore, as well as the return of Alston and sophomores Alvarado and Haywood, Tech is deep and talented across the perimeter and wings. Tech has Gueye, rising junior Sylvester Ogbonda and Banks to rotate through the post, with Cole and Wright rotating in the big forward position. This gives Pastner the option of playing a bigger lineup when necessary.

• Tech won 34 games overall and 14 ACC games in Josh Pastner's first two seasons, on par or better than the first two years of each of Josh Pastner's predecessors in the ACC era. For comparison, Buzz Williams won 12 ACC games in his first two years at Virginia Tech, same with Tony Bennett at

Media Guidelines

Georgia Tech's practices are closed to the public and the media, but coaches and student-athletes are made available prior to each game before one of the team's practices. Notices will be distributed weekly to confirm the schedule.

TV stations are allowed to shoot B-roll during the first 10 minutes of those practices.

Media are asked to notify Mike Stamus *the day before* of their need to attend and to make specific student-athlete requests.

Interview requests with student-athletes that need to be conducted at other times must be arranged through the Georgia Tech communications office at least 24 hours in advance. These interviews will be conducted at a time and place convenient to the student-athletes' availability and class schedule.

Media are asked not to contact student-athletes directly either by phone, e-mail, text or social media. They are instructed not to respond. Every effort will be made to make them available.

Interviewing Coach Pastner

Media wishing to speak with Coach Pastner at times other than scheduled media availabilities must notify Mike Stamus in the communications office in advance to make or confirm arrangements. He also is available each Monday on the ACC Teleconference (10:50 a.m.) beginning January 7.

Post-Game Protocol

Each head coach will hold a post-game press conference in the designated interview room (Shah Media Room at McCamish Pavilion).

Student-athletes requested by the media will be brought to the interview room following the coaches press conferences, when the team is at home, outside the team's locker room when the team is on the road.

Josh Pastner Radio Show

Head coach Josh Pastner's weekly radio show airs each Monday from 7-8 p.m. on "680 the Fan" and 93.7 FM, beginning Dec. 3.

ACC Coaches Weekly Teleconference

The 15 ACC head basketball coaches will be featured on nine Monday teleconferences during the 2018-19 season, beginning on Monday, January 7, and continuing through March 4. Each coach will have 10 minutes to make an opening statement and answer questions. There will be an instant replay of each teleconference on the Conference's internet site TheACC.com each Monday afternoon.

Georgia Tech head coach Josh Pastner will be on the teleconference at 10:50 a.m. each week.

Coaches that play on Monday in January and February are not required to participate in that day's call. Coach Pastner will be on every Monday at the same time. The teleconference schedule for each Monday will differ for the other 14 head coaches, depending on what teams play that Monday night.

- Head coach Josh Pastner's Georgia Tech teams were 5-14 against top-25 teams (5-5 at home) in his first two-plus seasons.

- Tech has sold out 12 games at McCamish Pavilion over the past three seasons, including a facility-record five games in 2017-18. Tech's 28 homecourt wins over Pastner's first two seasons were more than any two-year period in the Jackets' ACC era except the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons combined (31). That's 43 home wins over the past three seasons, more than 14 per season.

Jackets Add Didenko, Usher

David Didenko, a 6-8, 230-pound forward from Boca Raton, Fla., who attends Palm Beach State College, signed a national letter-of-intent with Georgia Tech during the early signing period in November, while Jordan Usher, a 6-7, 225-pound forward, has transferred from Southern California and enrolled at Tech for the spring semester.

Didenko attended Boca Raton Community High School before enrolling this year at Palm Beach State, a junior college in Boca Raton. A full academic qualifier in high school, Didenko will enroll at Tech in the summer and have three years of eligibility with the Yellow Jackets.

Born in Russia, Didenko moved to New York in August, 2010, at the age of 10, and is a United States citizen. Prior to his enrollment at Boca Raton Community High School, Didenko attended Northeast High School as a junior, and Montverde Academy for his ninth- and 10th-grade years.

Usher comes to Tech after playing a season and a half for the Trojans, departing from USC after the recently completed fall semester and enrolling for the spring semester. He must complete a year of residency at Georgia Tech and will become eligible to play for the Yellow Jackets following the conclusion of the fall, 2019 term. He will be eligible for the remainder of the 2019-20 season and all of the 2020-21 season.

A native of Canton, Ga., Usher played in all 36 games with two starts for the Trojans as a freshman in 2017-18, averaging 4.8 points and 2.0 rebounds per game while connecting on 40.9 percent of his three-point field goal attempts. In 2018-19, Usher played in 12 games and made two starts, averaging 8.6 points and 3.7 rebounds. A 4-star prospect ranked No. 104 in the nation by 247Sports, Usher played his senior season (2016-17) at Wheeler High School in Marietta, Ga., and prior to that, he attended Sequoyah High School in Canton.

Wire-to-Wire

Though he has expanded his playing rotation this year to reflect the growing level of talent within the program, head coach Josh Pastner remains committed to a tight playing rotation, reminiscent of the way Bobby Cremins coached the Yellow Jackets over his 19 seasons.

Tech has utilized its bench for an average of 50.7 minutes (25.4 percent of available minutes) in its ACC games thus far after averaging 78 minutes in non-conference play.

Jose Alvarado, who had played 96.7 percent of possible ACC minutes prior to his Feb. 11 injury last season, is averaging 34.6 minutes in ACC games this season and has played 35 or more minutes 13 times this season.

Freshman Michael Devoe has averaged 34.5 minutes in ACC games, and James Banks III has averaged 32.6. Alvarado and Devoe, who both rank among the ACC's top 15, each played the full 40 minutes at Notre Dame on Feb. 10, and Alvarado did so against Pittsburgh.

Last season, Alvarado had ranked fifth among freshmen nationally in percentage of minutes played and minutes per game before he was injured. He has posted 10 complete, 40-minute games in his career.

Tech players had 20 complete games combined in 2017-18, and had at least one player play the full 40 in 12 of

19 ACC games (regular season plus tournament). This season, Alvarado has two and Devoe one.

NOTE: Between the Cremins era and the arrival of Pastner, only one Georgia Tech player played every minute of a game, regulation or overtime, and that was Marcus Georges-Hunt on Feb. 20, 2016, in a win over Notre Dame at home. In the final 15 seasons of Cremins' tenure (1985-86 through 1999-2000), a total of 196 players logged a 40-minute game.

Winning Starts at Home

Georgia Tech and head coach Josh Pastner have made a priority of making McCamish Pavilion a real homecourt advantage for the program, and the Yellow Jackets made a good start on that by setting a program record for wins at home (17) in 2017-18, which included a 7-2 ACC record and two NIT victories.

Tech is 15-11 against ACC teams at home under Pastner, and that includes a 5-5 mark against ranked opponents.

The Jackets' 60-53 win over No. 25 Notre Dame on Jan. 10 was the latest triumph in a list that includes eventual NCAA champion North Carolina (No. 9 at the time), No. 6 Florida State and No. 15 Notre Dame last season, as well as a 64-54 win over No. 15 Miami on Jan. 3 this season. Tech's only losses came to No. 9 Louisville last January and to No. 2 Virginia and No. 18 Clemson this season.

Tech is 39-18 at McCamish Pavilion under Pastner.

Tech to Take Summer Tour to Spain

Georgia Tech's men's basketball team will take its first summer tour out of the United States since 2015 when the Yellow Jackets take an eight-day tour of Spain in August.

The tour will take place from August 8-16, coinciding with the break between summer and fall academic terms. The Yellow Jackets will spend the first three days (Aug. 9-11) in Barcelona, then take a high-speed train to Madrid, where they will stay from Aug. 12-16. Tech will play four games, two in each city, against teams to be determined by the Spanish Basketball Federation.

Along with the basketball competition, the Yellow Jackets will have the opportunity for sight-seeing tours of the U.S. Embassy in Barcelona and the Royal Palace in Madrid, visit the professional soccer facilities of FC Barcelona and Real Madrid, and other activities still to be determined.

Per NCAA rules, the Yellow Jackets will be allowed 10 practices to prepare for the tour along in addition to the currently allowable off-season training and skill development.

Tech has made summer international tours twice previously, most recently to The Bahamas in 2015. The Jackets traveled to France in August of 1991.

Tech-UGA Game Moves to November Next Two Seasons

The Georgia Tech and Georgia basketball teams have signed an agreement to play the next two games of the series the week before Thanksgiving, giving both teams an opportunity to play the game at home in front of their student bodies before the fall semester ends.

The teams will face off next season on Wednesday, Nov. 20, at Stegeman Coliseum in Athens, and the following season on Thursday, Nov. 19, at McCamish Pavilion in Atlanta.

In the 194-game history of the series, Tech and Georgia have played their game before Thanksgiving only twice, on Nov. 15, 2013 in Athens and Nov. 14, 2014 in Atlanta. The Yellow Jackets won both games and lead the all-time series, 105-89.

As Southeastern Conference foes from 1932-64, the games were played in January, February and March. After Tech left the ACC, most of the games remained in January and February until the rivalry became a late December fixture at the Omni arena in downtown Atlanta from 1981-94. The series has been played on the two campuses every year since then, mostly in December.

Tech to Play in 2019 Diamond Head Classic

Georgia Tech will make the fifth trip to the state of Hawai'i in program history next December when it will compete in the 2019 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic in Honolulu, Hawai'i.

The field for the 2019 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic features Ball State (Mid-American), Boise State (Mountain West), Georgia Tech (ACC), tournament host school Hawai'i (Big West), Houston (AAC), Portland (WCC), UTEP (Conference USA), and Washington (Pac-12). The 11th annual event will be played at the Stan Sheriff Center on the campus of the University of Hawai'i.

Three teams in the 2019 field were a part of the postseason last season – Boise State (NIT), Houston (NCAA) and Washington (NIT). Meanwhile, five teams will make their first-ever appearance in the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic.

Tech has a 10-5 record all time in four previous tournament events in Hawai'i, including a 6-3 mark in three appearances in the Rainbow Classic – 1984 champions, 1988, 1994 – which also were held at the University of Hawai'i. The Yellow Jackets also played in the 1998 Big Island Classic in Hilo, and the 2006 Maui Invitational.

20-Game ACC Schedule Rotation Announced

The Atlantic Coast Conference announced the future matchups of the league's 20-game men's basketball schedule, which begins with the 2019-20 season. The 20-game matrix is in effect for three years through the 2021-22 season.

Each team will play its two primary rivals every season both home and away (four games, Clemson and Notre Dame remain Georgia Tech's primary home-and-away opponents) and four repeat opponents both home and away (eight games). The remaining eight opponents will be single games, four at home and four on the road. The full cycle of repeat opponents will be complete following the third year.

Under the former 18-game schedule, each team played four opponents both home and away each season, four at home and four away.

In 2019-20, Georgia Tech will play Louisville, NC State, Pittsburgh and Syracuse both home and away in addition to Clemson and Notre Dame, with Duke, Miami, Virginia and Virginia Tech visiting McCamish Pavilion.

In 2020-21, Tech's home-and-away opponents will be Clemson, Notre Dame, Duke, Florida State, Virginia and Wake Forest, with home games against Boston, North Carolina, Pittsburgh and Syracuse.

In 2021-22, the Yellow Jackets play Clemson, Notre Dame, Boston College, Miami, North Carolina and Virginia Tech both home and on the road, and will host Florida State, Louisville, NC State and Wake Forest.

Four Tech Alumni on NBA Rosters

Since 1982, Georgia Tech has produced 19 first-round NBA draft picks and 44 draft picks overall. A total of 38 Georgia Tech alumni have played in the NBA.

Four former Georgia Tech basketball stars were on NBA rosters at the start of the 2018-19 season, including guard **Josh Okogie**, who was drafted 20th overall by for the Minnesota Timberwolves.

Iman Shumpert, a seven-year NBA veteran, played his third full season in Cleveland after helping the Cavaliers win the NBA championship in 2016, and was traded before the deadline to Sacramento last season, and was traded to Houston this season.

Thaddeus Young, an 11-year NBA veteran, is now in his third season with the Indiana Pacers after playing seven seasons in Philadelphia, one in Minnesota and two in Brooklyn.

Derrick Favors has emerged as a key figure in his eighth season in Utah and re-signed with the team after becoming a free agent.

Arts and Letters

Beginning with Moe Miller and Lance Storrs in the summer of 2011, every four-year senior in the Georgia Tech program has graduated with the exception of the Yellow Jackets' 2018 two seniors. Tadic Jackson and Ben Lammers, were both on track to compete their degree requirements in the spring (Jackson) and fall (Lammers) semesters, but both received offers to play overseas.

Derek Craig and Nick Foreman received their Tech degrees in 2012, as did the 2013 senior class of Mfon Udofia, who finished his business administration degree work in the summer, and Pierre Jordan, who completed his Masters degree requirements in building construction in the spring. Brandon Reed graduated in the summer with his management degree before transferring back to Arkansas State to play his final year of basketball.

All three of Tech's four-year seniors in 2013-14 - Kammeon Holsey, Daniel Miller and Jason Morris - graduated that spring. Robert Sampson, the Jackets' only undergraduate scholarship senior in 2014-15, graduated in the spring.

From the 2015-16 squad, Marcus Georges-Hunt walked the stage at commencement in May, accomplishing the rare feat of graduating in four years. Point guard Travis Jorgenson, who elected not to use his final year of eligibility, received his degree in December of 2017.

From the 2016-17 team, Josh Heath, Corey Heyward (fifth-year because of an injury redshirt in 2012-13) and Quinton Stephens all graduated in May of 2017, while Rand Rowland finished his requirements and received his degree in December of 2016. Both graduate transfers, Kellen McCormick (summer of 2017) and Jordan Price (fall of 2017), received their Masters degrees.

Georges-Hunt and current senior Tadic Jackson have made the Academic All-ACC team twice, and the Yellow Jackets have had at least one player named to that team since it was instituted for the 2010-11 season.

Tech's men's basketball team has recorded the highest Academic Progress Report scores the last five years since the NCAA began tracking academic performance in 2004-05. The Jackets scored a perfect team single year APR score of 1000 three straight years from 2011-13.

Welcome to The Hank

Georgia Tech is playing its seventh season in McCamish Pavilion, which was for all intents and purposes, brand new when it opened for the 2012-13 season. The only physical elements of McCamish Pavilion that remain from the venerable Alexander Memorial Coliseum are the roof, which was re-covered, and the 32 steel ribs that support it.

The capacity of McCamish Pavilion is 8,600, including 1,665 seats in the new balcony level and 6,935 seats in the lower seating bowl. There are no suites, but there is a premium club area that seats 500. Alexander Memorial Coliseum seated 9,191 spectators in its final configuration.

The most impressive features of McCamish Pavilion are its grand entrance, which fronts 10th and Fowler Streets, the ability for patrons to view the court from the main concourse all the way around, and the theatrical lighting system, which concentrates light on the court while leaving the seating areas dark, modeled after the Staples Center in Los Angeles and Madison Square Garden in New York.

Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion on Jan. 5, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

BIO UPDATES

Head Coach Josh Pastner • 3rd season

Josh Pastner, who guided Memphis to five post-season berths in seven seasons as the Tigers' head coach, was introduced as Georgia Tech's 14th head basketball coach on April 8, 2016, and wasted no time in getting the Yellow Jackets back to the post-season.

While coaching Tech to 34 wins and building the Jackets' talent base for the future, Pastner has tirelessly promoted the program on campus and throughout the city of Atlanta in an effort to re-create the major homecourt atmosphere that surrounded the Yellow Jackets throughout the 1980s, 1990s and into the middle of the 2000s. The result has been 29 wins and eight sellouts in two seasons at McCamish Pavilion, including a program-record 17 home wins in his first year.

In his first season at the helm, his Yellow Jacket team defied all pre-season expectations by winning 21 games, including four in the National Invitation Tournament. Tech posted an 8-10 ACC record, which included victories over No. 9 North Carolina, No. 6 Florida State and No. 14 Notre Dame, who all finished among the top four in the ACC regular season. He was named Coach of the Year in the ACC and in NABC District 2.

Implementing a high-energy style of play and creative offensive and defensive schemes, Pastner and his staff guided the Yellow Jackets all the way to the finals of the NIT for the first time in 46 years. Two of his players earned all-Atlantic Coast Conference honors; junior center Ben Lammers was named second-team All-ACC and ACC Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman guard Josh Okogie was named to the ACC All-Freshman team.

Though hampered by several significant injuries and other issues in 2017-18, Tech still was able to knock off a pair of top-25 teams while Lammers and Okogie again earned conference honors, and Okogie developed into an NBA first-round draft choice.

Pastner, who turned 41 in the fall, compiled a 167-73 record over seven seasons as the head coach at Memphis, where the Tigers earned bids to the NCAA Tournament four times. He tied for the 10th most wins for a head coach in his first seven seasons in Division I basketball history, and is the second winningest active coach under the age of 40 in NCAA Division I.

Despite his young age, Pastner has been involved in basketball at the Division I level for 21 years, as a player and an assistant coach at Arizona, and as an assistant coach and the head coach at Memphis. He has been a part of teams that have won 524 games, played in 17 NCAA Tournaments and 19 total post-season events. Teams he has been involved with have won 12 conference tournament or regular-season championships, advanced to seven Sweet Sixteens, five Elite Eights, two Final Fours and two NCAA championship games.

As an NCAA head or assistant coach and an AAU head coach, he has coached nearly 25 NBA draft selections.

Pastner's Memphis teams averaged 23.9 wins per season and compiled a conference regular-season record of 82-36, including a conference winning streak of 28 games. The Tigers went 11-4 in Conference USA and American Athletic Conference tournaments, including three championships.

He guided Memphis to five post-season berths, the NIT in 2010 and the NCAA Tournament in 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. Pastner twice won Conference USA Coach of the Year honors (2010, 2013) by various organizations and news media.

Pastner was born in Glen Dale, W.Va., and grew up in Kingwood, Texas. He earned his bachelor's degree in family studies in December of 1998, in just two and a half years, from Arizona and his master's degree in teaching and teacher education from Arizona in December of 1999, all while lettering four years in basketball under head coach Lute Olson.

He married the former Kerri Lamas of Sierra Vista, Ariz., in 2009. He has a stepson (Ethan) and three daughters, Payten, Kamryn and Harper.

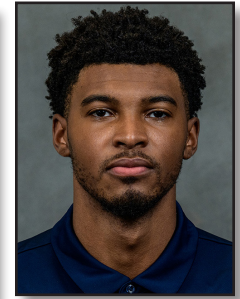
