TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech baseball will play its final pre-conference weekend series when it hosts Northwestern on March 1-3 at Russ Chandler Stadium.
- The Yellow Jackets and the Wildcats haven't played each other on the diamond since 1985, marking the third time this season that Tech has renewed a matchup 20 years old or older -- UCLA and West Virginia (20 years).
- Tech is coming off a midweek sweep of in-state foe Georgia State, where its bats finally came alive and combined for 17 runs on 23 hits.
- Bright spots at the plate continue to be **Michael Guldberg**, who has embraced the designated hitter position and is batting .474 on the year with three RBI, and **Kyle McCann**, who has 10 hits (.333), one double and three home runs.
- Oscar Serratos and Tristin English both may have broken their cold streak at the plate on Wednesday when they launched no-doubt home runs against Georgia State.
- On the flipside defensively, the Jackets allowed just 12 hits, 3 runs, two walks while striking out 16 in 18 innings.
- During the week, Tech showed their depth by throwing both **Cort Roedig** and **Amos Willingham** for starts in the Tuesday-Wednesday.
- Roedig went four allowing just a run and three hits before **Keyton Gibson** got his first win of the year in relief, throwing 3.0 hitless innings.
- Willingham tossed 6.0 shutout innings, punching out five and issuing zero walks. **Luke Bartnicki** and **Joseph Mannely** closed the door on the shutout in relief.
- This weekend will see Tech throw **Xzavion Curry**, **Connor Thomas** and **Brant Hurter** to start, after they held their own against then-No. 3 UCLA last week.
- Curry tossed 5.0 innings with just one earned run allowed on Friday, while **Hurter** went 5.0 on Sunday, fanning seven hitters without a walk and allowing one earned run. Thomas had a tough-luck outing, allowing six runs.

• Despite a tough-luck last outing for Saturday starter Thomas, he's still fifth in the ACC with 15 K's.

• In relief, **Tristin English** dealt three full shutout innings, including extras, to finish the 11-inning thriller on Friday, striking out two. **Jonathan Hughes** has also been invaluable in relief, making two appearances this weekend (5.0 IP), with a line of 0 ER and 4 K's.

• English will look to carry forward his momentum from being a Cape Cod All-Star last summer. The redshirt-junior is a two-time 2019 preseason all-American entering this weekend, as he's expected to be one of the country's top two-way players.

• Preseason expectations have been at an all-time high as the Yellow Jackets have built themselves into one of the oldest teams in the country, returning seven of nine starters and losing zero starting pitchers from a season ago.

• However, the Jackets will have to contend with the loss of Joey Bart and Wade Bailey to the MLB Draft, but **Kyle McCann** and **Luke Waddell** have looked primed and ready to take over at catcher and second base, respectively.

• Waddell went down in the Friday night UCLA game with a knee injury and is listed as day-to-day.

FAMILY TIES

• Despite being located more than 730 miles apart, Northwestern and Georgia Tech share a familiar tie in their ranks.

• On Northwestern's 2019 roster are redshirt freshman David Dunn and senior Jack Dunn, both from Alpharetta, Ga. and having attended Blessed Trinity high school.

• Brothers, the two are the son of former Yellow Jacket Chuck Dunn, who lettered at Georgia Tech from 1981-84.

STRENGTH-OF-SCHEDULE

• Head coach **Danny Hall** has talked frequently about how the 2019 slate for Georgia Tech is the hardest its ever scheduled.

• Georgia Tech currently sports the highest strength of schedule in the ACC, ranked eighth-toughest overall. The next highest conference team is Clemson at 15 before a steep drop off to North Carolina (43) and Duke (47).

• The Yellow Jackets welcome five top-25 teams to Russ Chandler Stadium this spring, including No. 3 UCLA, No. 6 North Carolina, No. 9 Georgia (*D1Baseball*), No. 17 Clemson and No. 22 Auburn (NCBWA).

• Tech also has to go on the road to play Louisville, who ranks as high as No. 4 in the country.

NEW FACES ON STAFF

• Georgia Tech baseball fans will notice new faces coaching the base-runners at first and third this season.

• The Yellow Jackets added two new coaches to its staff this offseason in **James Ramsey** and **Dan Jaffe**.

• Ramsey, a former first-round MLB Draft pick, All-American and ACC Player of the Year at Florida State, will handle coaching duties for the outfield and hitters.

• Jaffe, the new volunteer assistant coach who worked extensively with the country's top catchers in Cape Cod, will work with Tech's catching corps.

PITCHING DEPTH

• Not losing a single starter from its bullpen this offseason, Georgia Tech returns one of the top bullpens in the nation this season with **Xzavion Curry**, **Connor Thomas** and **Brant Hurter** -- all three projected high draft picks this summer.

• In addition to **Tristin English**, the Jackets have also added the top left-handed hurler in the state of Georgia in **Luke Bartnicki** this offseason. Bartnicki was selected in the MLB Draft after high school, but opted to remain committed to Georgia Tech.

• Bartnicki entered the West Virginia game last week with runners on second and third and two outs in the top of the 11th and struck the batter out to end the inning and give Tech the ability to walk it off in the bottom half.

• Tech has also added JUCO transfer junior **Amos Willingham**. Willingham adds instant experience in a tall 6-4 frame after spending two years at Sneed St. Community College.

• Add in freshman Cort Roedig, and what Tech has developed, in addition to arm support, is deep midweek artillery.

• The pitching staff this week, led by Roedig and Willingham, allowed just 12 hits, three runs and two walks while fanning 16 in 18 innings.

HOME SWEET HOME

• The Yellow Jackets also enjoy a distinct home-field advantage, finishing last season 25-10 overall and 11-4 in the ACC at Russ Chandler Stadium.

• Tech recorded 45 home runs at home in 2018 and outscored its opponents 237-160 overall.

• En route to leading the ACC through the regular season last year in hitting, Tech's offense hit .323 at home last year, while the pitching staff held its foes to a .258 average and struck out 322 batters compared to just 101 walks over 317.0 innings of work at home.

ROAD STRUGGLES

• However, Georgia Tech will have to bounce back from a 2018 season that had them struggle on the road.

• The Yellow Jackets finished 6-17 last season away from Russ Chandler Stadium, including 0-3 in neutral-site games.

• In true road games last season, Tech hit just .255, reaching base 34.8 percent. They averaged 9.2 hits/game, 1.1 homers and struck out 9.5 times compared to .323 hitting and .405 on-base percentage, and 11.3 hits/gm, 1.3 homers and only 7.6 strikeouts.

LAST TIME OUT

• Georgia Tech is coming off back-to-back wins against Georgia State, winning handily 7-3 and 10-0.

• Tech's bats finally came alive as it combined for 17 runs and 23 hits and two home runs.

• The pitching staff, led by Roedig and Willingham, allowed just 12 hits, three runs and two walks while fanning 16 in 18 innings.

• Prior to that, Tech is coming off a tough weekend series against the third-ranked UCLA Bruins at Russ Chandler Stadium that saw the Yellow Jackets drop two of three on the weekend.

• The Yellow Jackets won in thrilling fashion on Friday when they took down UCLA in 11 innings with a walk-off homer by Kyle McCann.

• Unfortunately, Tech's offense would stumble from there as the bats went cold and would be held to just eight hits and two runs over the next two days.

• It's lone consistent hitters on the weekend were **Austin Wilhite** and McCann. Both finished with three hits on the weekend.

• Where the Jackets did show their prowess was on the mound. **Xzavion Curry** and **Brant Hurter** combined for 10.0 innings and just two earned runs over Games 1 and 3.

• Tech also saw **Tristin English** and **Jonathan Hughes** continue to give valuable bullpen innings, including English's final 3.0 of the 11-inning victory of Friday.

NOTING NORTHWESTERN

• Northwestern is embarking on its second-straight weekend against an ACC foe, having just lost two of three at Duke Feb. 22-24.

• They opened the season at BYU in Mesa, Arizona where they dropped two of three before downing California (also in Arizona).

• The Wildcats are one of the few teams in the country with a tougher strength-of-schedule than Georgia Tech as they currently sit ranked sixth.

• Leading Northwestern early at the plate thus far has been David and Jack Dunn, who are hitting .479 and .414, respectively. Jack has a team-high five RBI through seven games.

• Alex Erro is the other Wildcat to hit above .300 through two weeks, currently at .313 with 10 hits, a double and a homer. He's also recorded three RBI.

• Expected to start for the Wildcats on Friday is Hank Christie, who fanned a career-high 10 batters over 6.0 innings against Duke on Feb. 23.

• Their Saturday starter has appeared in just 7.0 innings, one start, and has a 9.00 ERA. He's allowed seven runs and 12 hits while issuing four walks with a .375 opponent batting average.

• On Sunday, Northwestern is expected to throw Quinn Lavelle, a left-handed pitcher who's allowed just one earned run over 9.1 innings of work and two starts. A strike-thrower, Lavelle has allowed eight hits but also struck out eight batters, while only issuing three walks.

OFFENSE

• Georgia Tech baseball started the season with cold bats but may have de-iced the metal in back-to-back midweek wins against Georgia State this week.

• In the Tuesday-Wednesday games, the Jackets exploded for a combined 17 runs, 23 hits and two home runs.

• Shining early was the designated hitter for most of the weekend, **Michael Guldberg**. He batted .500 during opening weekend and is second on the team at a blistering .474 through eight.

• Leading the team thus far is **Austin Wilhite**, who has eight hits, two extra-base hits and a .296 average to start things off this season.

• A. Wilhite has had a hit six of the first eight games of the season with two multi-hit outings.

• The firepower of the lineup has come from **Kyle McCann**, who's tied for second in the ACC with three home runs. His best one was easily the 11th-inning walk-off against No. 3 UCLA on Friday.

• Tech is coming of another stellar offensive season in which it led the Atlantic Coast Conference in hitting (.296) and hits (585) for the regular season.

• En route to leading the ACC, the Yellow Jackets touted the top-3 best hitters in the ACC in Joey Bart (.359), Wade Bailey (.339) and Murray (.343).

• Tech will have to replace Bart and Bailey after losing them to the MLB Draft, but return three other .300 hitters from a season ago.

• In addition to Murray, **Oscar Serratos** (.311) and McCann (.300) both hit above the mark last season.

TRISTIN ENGLISH

• Also returning is two-time 2019 preseason all-American **Tristin English**.

• Despite having struggled early with a .167 average through eight games, thanks largely to an 0-for-12 Week 2.

• He came alive against Georgia State with two hits, two RBI and a monster home run.

• English is currently ranked nationally in an odd offensive categories -- hit by pitches. He currently ranks tied for ninth in the country with five HBP this season.

• English is, however, still expected to be a big bat in the lineup after leading the team with 60 RBI in 2018 and also hitting .279 for 63 hits and 13 doubles, went on to be a Cape Cod All-Star this past summer.

• His 60 runs driven in ranked tied for sixth in the ACC, thanks largely to logging two RBI or more in 16 games last season.

• English's best was last season was six RBIs in the win over Virginia Tech on March 16.

• Last year, English was named a mid-season first-team all-American by *Perfect Game*/Rawlings and a mid-season all-American by D1Baseball.

OFFENSE

• During the annual intrasquad White vs. Gold scrimmage, English showed his return to power as well, hitting three home runs on consecutive at-bats and not one of them was even close.

• While in the Cape Cod league, he batted .300 overall, driving home 19 RBI and blasting five home runs. On the mound, English tossed nearly 70 combined innings – his first summer pitching action since undergoing successful Tommy John surgery in January 2017.

KYLE MCCANN

• While the loss of Joey Bart from the order and behind the dish may have some worried, GT skipper Danny Hall has been adamant in his confidence in catcher **Kyle McCann** on both fronts.

• McCann has stepped up and has had at least a hit in seven of the team's first eight games. During the midweek series against Georgia State, he finished with three hits and two RBI.

• McCann has provided the power at the plate early, currently ranked tied for second in the ACC with three home runs through eight games.

• He's got a team-high 10 hits in 30 at-bats for a .333 average. His four extra-base hits are by far the top of the team's leaderboard as he's raking a .667 slugging and .459 on-base percentage.

• Just a year ago, McCann was second in home runs only to Bart, as the sophomore, finishing with 15 to Bart's 16 as he tied for eighth in the ACC. The power hitter's .600 slugging percentage ranked him fifth in the conference, while his 45 RBI was good for second on the team.

• McCann also hit three grand slams last season, which tied for the most among NCAA DI players in the 2018 regular season.

• In Tech's 16-8 win at Mercer on April 10, McCann hit a grand slam in the top of the fifth to erase a four-run deficit.

• Two games later at Pitt on April 13, he hit another grand slam in the top of the ninth to lead Tech to a 7-3 road win.

• In the home win over Kennesaw State on April 18, McCann hit a grand slam to right center field in the second inning.

• McCann's three career grand slams are the most among active Jackets, as Tristin English currently has one for his career.

• He fell just shy of the school-record four grand slams in a single season, as two players, Tyler Green (2005) and Brad Feltes (2008), remained on top the annals.

• McCann is just 28 RBI shy of 100 for his career in just two years at the plate.

• Based on weighted runs created+, McCann ranks third among returning catchers in Division I with 164, behind only Oregon State's Adley Rutschman (196) and Jacksonville State's Nic Gaddis (166).
- *Weighted Runs Created (wRC) attempts to quantify a player's total offensive value and measure it by runs. + then compares it with league average after considering park effects.*

• McCann is also working toward 100 hits for his career, sitting nine shy at 91.

CHASE MURRAY

• Junior **Chase Murray** exploded last year after finally being healthy.

• He started 2019 by blasting a two-run RBI tank to right center against UIC, the second home run of the inning and the first of back-to-back.

• Since then, he's fallen somewhat back to Earth with a .189 average through eight games, having six hits.

• Murray had two hits against Georgia State in the midweeks.

• The standout outfielder finished 2018 ranked second on the team and fifth in the ACC in hitting with a .343 average.

• He also finished ranked tied for sixth in the league for sacrifice flies, having an unheralded skill for driving home runs in key situations.

• His six sac flies last season gave him 11 for his career, bringing him into the top 10 for most in program history since 1998.

• Murray also knocked home 39 RBI and finished with 72 hits last season to rank third on the team in both.

• Murray accomplished all this despite missing four games in April 2018 with an upper-body injury.

• Murray is also looking to hit 100 career RBI this season, currently sitting at 65.

INFIELDERS

• Georgia Tech baseball will get the remaining hitting from the infielders in third baseman **Oscar Serratos**, second-baseman **Luke Waddell** and shortstop **Austin Wilhite**.

• Serratos has struggled some at the plate in the opening weeks, but hit one of the three home runs in the third inning against Illinois-Chicago to show his power. He also hit a home run against Georgia State during the midweek.

• Serratos survived his first season of collegiate baseball on The Flats admirably, putting together large chunks of quality at-bats at the plate last season.

• On the year overall, Serratos finished .311 -- fourth on the team -- with 37 hits, 14 RBI and eight extra-base hits, despite having only 119 at-bats.

• Playing third was also an adjustment for the young Serratos, who had spent large amounts of his career at shortstop. After a year and an offseason at the position, however, the sophomore looks primed and ready to take over the position full time.

• Where Serratos especially shined last season was in ACC play. Once he found his footing, the frosh third baseman turned into an offensive juggernaut at the plate, leading the team in hitting at a hefty .367 clip.

• In 60 at-bats during conference play, Serratos turned in 22 hits, five extra-base hits and eight RBI to reach a .433 on-base percentage. He also stole four bases during the 22-game stretch.

• His final slugging percentage for 2018 ACC play was .500.

• One of Georgia Tech's biggest losses was veteran senior Wade Bailey who ranked among the top of several hitting categories in program history, while also being a stalwart second baseman. That void will now be filled by Waddell.

• Waddell has settled fully into second base this offseason and performed extremely well in the fall scrimmages against South Carolina and Chatt Valley Community College.

• To start the regular season, however, Waddell's bat has been cold as he's gone 1-for-13 from the plate.

• Waddell seemed to make a breakthrough with a solo home run against third-ranked UCLA on Feb. 22 before sustaining an untimely knee injury. He remains day-to-day.

• Last year, Waddell was sixth on the team in hitting at .283, getting 34 hits in just 120 at-bats.

• Waddell has been injured since Game 1 vs. UCLA with a knee injury and is day-to-day.

• In his stead, transfer Jackson Webb has performed admirably. He's hit .273 since starting and has a 1.000 fielding percentage at second base.

• Waddell has teamed up to form the Yellow Jackets' middle infielders with Austin Wilhite.

• A. Wilhite has been by far the most consistent hitter for the Yellow Jackets in 2019.

• En route to an early .292 average, he has seven hits, two for extra bases and two RBI. He's racked up a .417 slugging percentage and a .400 on-base percentage.

• A. Wilhite hit extremely well to start the year, bating .400 with an RBI and a monster triple to deep right field to set up a run during opening weekend.

• Last season, A. Wilhite hit .249 to be a reliable bat in the lineup for most of the season. One of just six Jackets to reach double-digit doubles on the season, A. Wilhite also tallied 30 RBI on the year.

• Defensively, A. Wilhite let the team with 151 assists, fielding at a .951 clip. He finished second on the team -- to Bailey -- with 29 double plays turned in 2018.

PITCHING

• Despite the hitting woes early, the Yellow Jacket's pitching has lived up to the early preseason hype of having highly regarded prospects and the depth the back them up on the mound.

• Tech currently features three pitchers with at least 6.0 innings of work with a sub-3.00 ERA.

• The staff ranks third in least number of walks given, with only 21 free passes dealt in eight games.

• Relief pitcher Keyton Gibson currently ranks tied for first in the ACC with a .000 opponent's batting average.

• Last season, Georgia Tech began putting the pitching pieces in place last season when its 1-2 punch of **Xzavion Curry** and **Connor Thomas** led the staff toward the top of the charts.

• Georgia Tech pitching led the ACC in walks per nine innings (3.13) and ranked 24th nationally.

• Georgia Tech pitching also led the ACC in strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.82) to rank 12th in the country.

• Tech also ranked third in the ACC in shutouts, turning in five clean sheets on the year.

• Thomas (106 strikeouts) and Curry (101 K's) became the first Yellow Jacket tandem to strike out 100 batters each in the same season since 2011 when Jed Bradley and Buck Farmer fanned 106 apiece.

• It's only the third time under head coach Danny Hall that a duo has accomplished the feat. No duo has done it together back-to-back years.

• The pair separately will also look to become the first Georgia Tech pitchers to punch out 100 batters in back-to-back seasons since Farmer accomplished the feat in 2012 (115) and 2013 (122).

• The pair started off 2019 on track, finishing second and third in the conference with 10 strikeouts (Thomas) and nine strikeouts (Curry) during Opening Weekend.

• The Yellow Jackets accomplished much of their pitching success despite being the youngest staff among Power 5 conference.

• Tech started a freshmen or sophomore in 45 of its 58 games thus far this season in Curry (15), Thomas (15), **Brant Hurter** (11), **Hugh Chapman** (3) and **Will Shirah** (1). The other 13 starts have come by **Tristin English** (9), **Jake Lee** (2), **Jonathan Hughes** (1) and **Keyton Gibson** (1).

• Last season, Georgia Tech posted five shutouts this season with wins over Dartmouth (10-0), Arkansas-Pine Bluff (8-0, UIC (5-0), Wake Forest (7-0) and Radford (4-0).

• The five shutout victories were the most for GT in a season since the Jackets tallied six in 2014.

• The Yellow Jackets posted back-to-back shutout wins over Arkansas-Pine Bluff (Feb. 27) and UIC (Mar. 2) for the first time since shutting out Duke in two-straight games back on March 31, 2012.

• Both Thomas (No. 1) and Curry (No. 10) ranked among *D1Baseball's* most draft eligible pitchers to start 2019.

XZAVION CURRY

• After a sterling sophomore campaign, **Xzavion Curry** has once again showed his prowess on the mound, pithing to a 1-0 record and 2.70 ERA in 10.0 innings of work.

• Through 10.0, he's allowed 10 hits, three earned runs and just three free passes while fanning 13.

• Opening Day has become Zay Day over the last two years, as Curry has taken the mound for the Jackets on this occasion in both 2017 and 2018. Curry was victorious in both, taking a 5-3 win over BYU in 2017 and then earning a 3-2 win vs. Minnesota this year.

• Curry is the first Yellow Jacket in the modern era (1973-present) to win three-straight Opening Days starts and only the second Tech pitcher to start three-straight Opening Days since 1973 - Chris Wilson (1995-97).

• Curry's third-straight Opening Day victory last Friday consisted of 5.0 innings, five hits, two runs and nine strikeouts to the tune of a 3.60 ERA.

• As a starter last year, the then-sophomore finished with a team-high eight wins to the tune of a 8-4 record, finishing tied for third in the ACC.

• Curry posted a 4.18 ERA over 92.2 innings of work last season, allowing just 43 earned runs, while striking out 101 and walking just 23.

• He also pitched a complete game on April 27 to join teammate **Connor Thomas** in becoming the first Jackets to record back-to-back complete games since 2011 when Matt Lorenzo and Steve Kelly threw two-straight CG's on Feb. 28 and March 2.

• Then-sophomore Curry was 8-4 last season, which was a team-high in wins.

• Curry posted a 4.18 ERA over 92.2 innings pitched this season, and has allowed just 43 earned runs on 79 hits while striking out 101 batters and walking just 23.

• Curry was also among the ACC's best in striking out batters looking, ranking tied for fifth in the league with 32 hitters left looking.

• With his 32 looking strikeouts last season and three in 2019, Curry now has 66 for his career to move into tied for fourth in program history since 2002.

• Curry's best game carving up a lineup last season was his March 30 contest versus Miami where he struck out a career-high 12 batters.

• Curry's 12 Ks were the most strikeouts at the time by a Georgia Tech pitcher since Buck Farmer fanned 14 batters in the Opening Day win over Akron on Feb. 15, 2013.

• With his 12 punch outs, Curry became just the third pitcher since 2000 to strike out 12 batters or more in an ACC game, joining Jason Neighborgall (12 at Duke on March 4, 2005) and Cory Vance (14 vs. No. 2 UNC on March 17, 2000).

• After a 288-game streak without a pitcher recording double-digit strikeouts for Tech, the Yellow Jackets had a pitcher post 10 strikeouts or more four times over a seven game stretch this year (Curry - 11 at NC State (3/23), Hurter - 10 vs. Georgia Southern (3/27), Curry - 12 vs. Miami (3/30) and Thomas - 10 vs. Miami (3/3) and seven overall.

• He then followed that performance up with his complete-game shutout victory against Wake Forest on April 27.

• Curry's complete-game shutout was the first by a Tech starting pitcher since Josh Heddingner went the distance for a two-hit shutout of the nation's No. 2 overall seed Vanderbilt, 5-0, in the 2013 Nashville Regional.

• Curry was only the ninth Tech pitcher since 2002 to record a shutout. Only Kyle Bakker (2) and Mark Pope (4) have had multiple shutouts in the last 17 years.

CONNOR THOMAS

• The second-half of the Yellow Jackets' "Shake and Bake" starter combo was sophomore Connor Thomas who, now as a junior, seems to have not missed a beat.

• In his Saturday evening start versus 2018 Big 12 semifinalist West Virginia, Thomas went 7.0 innings -- tied for the longest in the ACC last weekend -- and fanned 10 hitters, allowing no earned runs, two walks and just five hits.

• Despite being robbed of a decision victory by untimely errors, Thomas would finish Opening Weekend with the best ACC line for any pitcher versus a Power 5 opponent.

• Unfortunately, Thomas drew a tough-luck outing against No. 3 UCLA on Feb. 23, giving up six earned runs and nine hits in five innings.

PITCHING

• Last season, Thomas led Georgia Tech with a 3.34 ERA and an impressive 106 strikeouts. He allowed just 36 earned runs in 97.0 innings of work, holding opponents to a .241 average.

• By far the most impressive stat in Thomas' sophomore campaign was his strikeout-to-walk ratio that ranked among the best in the nation.

• Fanning 106 hitters and walking just 10, Thomas finished with a 10.6 ratio.

• Ranking third in the country last season, Thomas is one of only two pitchers in all of Division I with a double-digit ratio to return from 2018.

• Thomas' best game fanning hitters was April 28 when he struck out 17 batters against Wake Forest.

• The 17 strikeouts were the most by a Tech pitcher in a single game since current Detroit Tigers' pitcher and former Jacket Buck Farmer struck out 14 batters versus Akron on Feb. 15, 2013.

• His 17 strikeouts were only two shy of the school record of 19 punch outs set by Jerry Bass versus Earlham in 1975.

• The 17 strikeouts were the most by a pitcher in a single game in the ACC this season.

• After a 288-game streak without a pitcher recording double-digit strikeouts for Tech, the Yellow Jackets had a pitcher post 10 strikeouts or more four times over a seven game stretch this year (Curry - 11 at NC State (3/23), Hurter - 10 vs. Georgia Southern (3/27), Curry - 12 vs. Miami (3/30) and Thomas - 10 vs. Miami (3/3) and seven overall.

STARTERS

• Who will take over the other starting spots is still to-be-determined as the Yellow Jackets have one of the strongest bullpens in the country.

• Brant Hurter was a reliable midweek starter for Georgia Tech last season, finishing 5-4 overall in 14 appearances and working to a 6.04 ERA. In 53.2 innings of work, Hurter

struck out 56 batters while only allowing 36 earned runs.

• Hurter had a terrific debut start in 2019, going five innings against No. 3 UCLA, striking out seven with no walks. He allowed just one earned run and six hits overall.

• After Tech had struggled to get out of innings the previous day, Hurter fanned five hitters and allowed one hit with two outs in an inning on Feb. 24.

• Tristin English returned to the mound after recovering from Tommy John Surgery his freshman year. He proved to be a dependable relief pitcher, throwing 57 innings

• English followed up his sophomore campaign with an uber-successful summer in the Cape, earning all-star honors after tossing nearly 70 combined innings.

• English made two appearances during Opening Weekend on the mound for Tech. His first was entering the ninth with a three-run lead over UIC on Friday. It took him nine pitches to end the game and earn the save.

• He also appeared against West Virginia in the eighth inning going 2.0 and allowing one home run, but keeping the game alive, striking out four.

• He then continued to be an impressive closer against No. 3 UCLA on Feb. 22. Heading into extra innings, English pitched a shutout final three innings of the game, striking out two and allowing just two hits to help Tech secure the win.

• English will spend a majority of time at first base to keep his bat in the lineup and replace teammate Kyle McCann, who moved to catch, but may see time as a relief pitcher or starter throughout the season.

• Two big additions to the Tech pitching staff is Amos Willingham, Luke Bartnicki and Cort Roedig.

• Willingham is a JUCO transfer who enters as a junior in eligibility. A tall strike thrower with day-one experience could mean a versatile starter on weekdays.

• Willingham's first appearance was a tough-luck outing that saw five runs scored in 3.1 innings.

• In his first start on Wednesday, Feb. 27 against Georgia State, he then went 6.0 innings of shutout work, allowing just three hits, no runs and no walks while striking out five.

• He threw just 76 pitches in 6.0 innings.

• Roedig, a power righty who is projected to be the Saturday starter Opening Weekend, was ranked the No. 17 RHP in the state of Georgia by Perfect Game. He sports a fastball well over 90 already and a good breaking ball as well. His fall and early spring has earned him an opportunity.

• After being a bona fide strike-thrower in the fall and spring, Tech gave Roedig the start against Richmond on Saturday.

• The freshman went just 1.1 innings, walking three and allowing a run. Coach Hall noted afterward that the moment simply got to him, making his first-career start in front of a big crowd.

PITCHING

• Roedig finally showed his stuff in a midweek game against Georgia State on Feb. 26, allowing just one run and three hits in 4.0 innings of work.

• Bartnicki, who enters his freshman campaign after being ranked as the top-rated lefty out of the state of Georgia by *Perfect Game*. One of the most elite lefties in the country that won a regional championships, he's run it up to 94-95 in the preseason.

• Bartnicki's first collegiate appearance couldn't have been more dramatic, coming into the game in extra innings versus West Virginia in a 1-0 count with runners at second and third and two outs.

• A lefty-lefty matchup, Bartnicki didn't need many pitches to strike out the hitter, end the inning and give Tech one more at-bat in the bottom of the 11th -- where it would walk the game off.

RELIEVERS

• One of Georgia Tech's keys this season will be the development of their bullpen. With no shortage of bodies, where everyone ultimately fits into the rotation comes conference action and postseason is still to-be-determined.

• The Jackets will be without their top reliever in **Andy Archer** for the 2019 season, after he underwent successful UCL repair with an internal brace. His recovery is expected to take 6-8 months and he should return to the team in the fall.

• In his stead, alongside those starters who don't find a day in the rotation, **Jonathan Hughes** and **Keyton Gibson** will be looked upon for stretches.

• Hughes has had a fantastic start to 2019, currently sporting a 1.29 ERA through three appearances and 7.0 combined innings of work. He's allowed just six hits and one earned run, holding a 5:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio early.

• Hughes finished last year with 13 appearances, a 5.94 ERA and a save while Gibson had the same ERA with 12 appearances.

• Gibson has also looked impressive early. In two important, clutch appearances, he's yet to allow a hit in 2.1 combined innings, fanning four batters in the process.

• Gibson then went on to get his first win of the season vs. Georgia State when he tossed 3.0 no-hit innings, fanning four, to get the win.

• Senior **Jake Lee** will again make his mark in short-inning stretches. He finished last season with a 9.68 ERA on 17.2 innings of work.

WHAT'S IN A QUALITY START?

• A starting pitcher records a quality start when he pitches at least six innings and allows three earned runs or fewer.

• Tech is 1-0 through Week 1 with a quality start -- **Connor Thomas** vs. West Virginia on Feb. 16.

• Georgia Tech was 15-5 last season when its starter makes a quality start.

• Tech has won 34 consecutive home quality starts. The last loss Tech endured after a quality start at home came back on March 20, 2015.

• Thomas' quality start at Georgia Southern in 2018 was the first quality start on the road for GT since April 8, 2016 (excluding Curry's neutral site quality start vs. Wake Forest at the 2017 ACC Tournament).

• Thomas has also made eight quality starts - at Georgia Southern (Feb. 20), at Clemson (March 10) vs. Florida State (April 7), at Pitt (April 14), at North Carolina (April 21), vs. Wake Forest (April 28), against Radford (May 5) and at Virginia (May 12).

• **Xzavion Curry** had seven quality starts this season - vs. Dartmouth (Feb. 23), vs. UIC (March 2), at NC State (March 23), vs. Miami (March 30), at Pitt (April 13), vs. Wake Forest (April 27) and against Radford (May 4).

• **Brant Hurter** made three quality starts - vs. Georgia Southern (March 27), at Georgia (April 3) and versus Radford (May 6).

• **Tristin English** also made two quality starts - vs. Miami (April 4) and vs. Florida State (April 8).

• Georgia Tech Friday night starter **Xzavion Curry** looks climbs toward his milestone of 200 strikeouts in his second year being starter, currently at 188 for his career.

- **Danny Hall** is in his 26th season at Georgia Tech and his 32nd overall as a head coach in 2019. He is the winningest baseball coach in Tech history with 1,019 wins.
- Hall, who won his 1,200th career game on February 24 versus Dartmouth and his 1,000th win at Georgia Tech on March 20, versus nationally ranked Auburn, stands seventh among active Division I coaches in career victories entering the 2018 season.
- In his 40 years of college baseball – both as an assistant and head coach – Hall has been part of over 1,600 victories and seven trips to the College World Series.
- Hall has led Tech to the NCAA Tournament on 20 occasions and guided the Yellow Jackets to the NCAA College World Series in 1994, 2002 and 2006 -- the program's only three berths.

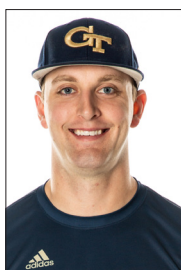

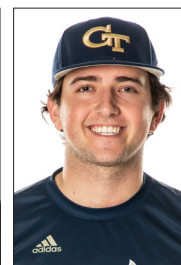
