GEORGIA TECH (14-17, 6-12 ACC) vs. NOTRE DAME (13-18, 3-13 ACC) GAME 32 • March 12, 2019 • 2 p.m. • ACC Tournament • Opening Round

About Tuesday's Game

Georgia Tech and Notre Dame will meet in the New York Life Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament for the first time ever, facing off in the opening round of the 66th Tournament at 2 p.m. Tuesday at the Spectrum Center in Charlotte, N.C.

Tech (14-17, 6-12 ACC), in its third season under head coach Josh Pastner, earned the No. 10 seed for the tournament, its highest since 2016, by defeating Boston College (81-78 in overtime at home) and NC State (63-61 on the road) in its final two regular season games. The Yellow Jackets enter the tournament having won three of their last five games, going back to a Feb. 20 win over Pittsburgh.

Notre Dame (13-18, 3-15 ACC), in its 19th season under head coach Mike Brey, fell to the No. 15 seed after dropping a 56-53 decision on the road to Pittsburgh Saturday. It was the seventh straight loss for the Fighting Irish, whose last win came over the Yellow Jackets on Feb. 10 in South Bend. Only one of those losses have come by more than eight points.

Tuesday's game will be broadcast live on the ACC's Raycom Sports Network (Peachtree TV in Atlanta) in ACC markets, as well as on ESPN nationally outside of the ACC footprint. The broadcast also will be streamed live through the ESPN app. Radio coverage is provided through Learfield IMG College, airing in Atlanta on 680 AM and 93.7 FM the Fan. The Tech broadcast is available on satellite radio (Sirius ch. 81, XM ch. 81, internet ch. 81 and 371).

Starting Lineup

• **Rise above** - The Yellow Jackets finished the season 10th in the ACC after being projected to finish no higher than 13th in the preseason. It is Tech's highest finish since tying for ninth in 2013.

• **No. 10** - Georgia Tech begins the ACC Tournament with its highest seed (10th) since 2016, the last time it was the 10th seed in Washington, D.C. Georgia Tech has a 1-1 record as the 10th seed in the ACC Tournament, having defeated Clemson before losing to Virginia that year.

• **Fond memories** - Charlotte is the city where Georgia Tech won its last ACC Tournament, in 1993 at the old Charlotte Coliseum. Tech is 8-7 in ACC Tournament games in Charlotte, including a 1-1 mark at the Spectrum Center (2008).

• **Tuesday's child** - Georgia Tech has played in the opening round of the ACC Tournament every year since the most recent expansion to 15 teams, winning its first game twice in that stretch. Tech's last ACC Tournament win came in 2016 with an 88-85 overtime victory over Clemson in Washington, D.C.

• **Party on the quad** - Georgia Tech has three quadrant 1 wins this season, according to the NCAA's NET rankings, and all of them occurred on the road (Arkansas, Syracuse, NC State).

• **Outpost** - In an attempt to invigorate its offense, Georgia Tech returned to a one-post starting alignment for its last seven games, with James Banks III starting in the middle with four perimeter players. It has helped produce the Yellow Jackets' four highest point totals since Jan. 12 and three of its best shooting efforts since Jan. 22. Tech has averaged 64.0 points, hit 43.7 percent of hits field goals and 34.3 percent of its three-point shots in its last seven games, compared to 53.9 points, 38.2 percent from the floor and 23.8 percent on threes in the previous eight games.

• **Guard your yard** - Georgia Tech has ranked as high as 11th this season in defensive efficiency according to KenPom.com. Tech's decision to alter the lineup for extra offense has led to a decline in that efficiency, but the Jackets still rank 29th in efficiency, No. 12 in effective field goal percentage defense and No. 6 in three-point defense.

• **Below average** - Georgia Tech has faced three of the nation's top 10 teams in offensive efficiency as ranked by KenPom.com - Tennessee (3), Duke (6) and Virginia Tech (8) - and held them to an average of 61.3 points. Each posted their lowest efficiency rating of the season against the Jackets. North Carolina is No. 7, and the Jackets held the Tar Heels to their fourth-lowest rating of the season. Tech held Florida State (36th) to two of its three lowest efficiency ratings of the season, and NC State (29th) to its lowest of the season outside of its 24-point game against Virginia Tech.

• **50 (per) Cent** - Tech has shot 50 percent or better in nine games this season, four during conference play, after connecting on 50.8 percent against Boston College and 58.1 percent at NC State. The Jackets shot 50 percent in six games last season (three ACC games), and five times (once in ACC play) in 2016-17.

• **Hola again** - Jose Alvarado has scored 110 points in Tech's last six games (18.3 ppg), including a career-high 29 against Pittsburgh. In those six games, he has hit 37-of-75 from the floor, 12-of-40 from three-point range, and he has a 24/8 assist-turnover ratio.

• **I'll be there for you** - Jose Alvarado has played the full 40 minutes four times in Tech's last eight games (Notre Dame, Pittsburgh, Miami, NC State). The sophomore has logged 13 complete games in his career, five this season. He played 44:17 of a possible 45 minutes in Tech's OT win over Boston College.

• **Wholly Moses** - Moses Wright arrives at the ACC Tournament playing the best basketball of his career. He has reached double figures in three of his last four games (19 vs. Miami, 10 vs. Boston College, 18 at NC State), averaging 13.3 points (24-of-40 FG) and 6.0 rebounds over that stretch.

• **Crack that whip** - Michael Devoe is 28-for-60 from three-point range in Tech's last 14 games. He had gone 12-for-43 in the first 17 games of the season. He has averaged 12.0

This Season vs. Notre Dame

Georgia Tech 63, Notre Dame 61

Jan. 22, 2019 • McCamish Pavilion

Keyed by a 17-5 second-half run, Georgia Tech downed Notre Dame, 63-61, snapping a two-game skid.

For much of the evening, Tuesday's game was a back-and-forth affair, featuring eight ties and 12 lead changes in the first 29 minutes of the contest. Trailing 42-41 with less than 12 minutes to go, Georgia Tech (11-8, 3-3 ACC) scored 17 of the next 22 points to take its largest lead at 58-47 with 5:08 remaining.

Notre Dame (11-8, 1-5 ACC) pulled within two points on three occasions late in the ballgame but the Yellow Jackets held on for their fourth-straight home win over the Fighting Irish. A follow dunk by Abdoulaye Gueye with 52 seconds to go and a pair of free throws by Jose Alvarado with 8.2 seconds left on the clock proved crucial to the Jackets keeping the Irish at bay.

James Banks and Alvarado led four Jackets in double-figures with 16 points apiece. Gueye added 13 points and Michael Devoe chipped in with 11 to round out Tech's four double-figure scorers. Alvarado's 16-point performance came in his first game back after missing last Saturday's game versus Louisville due to injury while Gueye returned to the lineup for the first time since missing the last two contests due to a medical condition.

Notre Dame 69, Georgia Tech 59

Michael Devoe scored a career-high 18 points and Abdoulaye Gueye added 12 for the Yellow Jackets, but Notre Dame took advantage of 20 offensive rebounds and pulled away from Georgia Tech in the second half Sunday night for a 69-59 Atlantic Coast Conference victory at the Purcell Pavilion.

Tech lost for the fifth straight time despite holding the Fighting Irish to 32.8-percent shooting from the floor and 22.2 percent from three-point range. Notre Dame scored 20 points on second chances, which enabled the Fighting Irish (13-11, 3-8 ACC) to overcome a one-point halftime deficit and outscore the Jackets, 45-34, after intermission.

T.J. Gibbs led four Notre Dame players in double figures with 20 points, including eight from the foul line. D.J. Harvey scored 18 for the Fighting Irish, with Prentiss Hubb adding 13 and John Mooney notching another double-double with 11 points and 14 boards.

James Banks scored nine points and grabbed 12 rebounds for the Yellow Jackets. Devoe added a season-best eight rebounds and six assists.

points and 3.8 assists in his last four games.

• **The Bank is open** - James Banks comes into the ACC Tournament with three straight games in double digits (11 with seven rebounds at Virginia, 18/9 vs. Boston College, 19/9 at NC State). He has averaged 16 points and 8.3 rebounds in that stretch, hitting 20-of-26 shots from the floor. He went 8-for-8 in the regular-season finale at NC State, including the game-winning slam dunk.

• **Tech tribunal** - Alvarado, Devoe and Banks have each scored in double figures in the same game six times this season, and Tech has won four of those games. They combined for 45 of 69 points at Arkansas, 49 of 92 against Wake Forest, 43 of 63 in the first meeting against Notre Dame, and 59 of 81 against Boston College.

• **Three's the charm** - Tech has averaged 6.3 threes and shot 33.1 percent from beyond the arc in its last eight games. In the five games before that, the Jackets shot 14-for-96 (14.6 pct.) from bonus range.

• **Youts are served** - Georgia Tech's seven freshmen and sophomores have played 68.2 percent of the minutes for Tech in ACC games.

• **Going deep** - Georgia Tech has deployed 12 different starting lineups this season. Eleven players have started three or more games, and 10 have started at least one ACC game.

• **Longer bench** - Tech's reserves have played 33.8 percent of available minutes, No. 90 in the nation according to KenPom.com (national average is 30.5 pct.). However, in Tech's most recent two games, Tech's bench saw just 50 of a possible 425 minutes (11.7 pct.).

• **Premature ending again** - For the second straight year, Curtis Haywood II has seen his season cut short by injury. The sophomore guard injured his left ankle against Boston College and is sidelined indefinitely. Freshman Khalid Moore replaced him in the starting lineup at NC State.

Tech's ACC Tournament History

Georgia Tech has played in 39 ACC Tournaments, and has a 26-36 all-time record in the event. The Yellow Jackets have won three championships, in 1985 (Atlanta), 1990 (Charlotte) and 1993 (Charlotte).

Tech has been a runner-up four times (1986, 1996, 2005, 2010). The 1986, 1996 and 2010 runs to the finals occurred in Greensboro. Tech also made the finals in 2005 at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C.

Tech was 0-2 in the ACC Tournament under coach Dwane Morrison, 15-16 under Bobby Cremins (including all three titles), 9-11 under Paul Hewitt (runner-up in 2005 and 2010), 2-5 under Brian Gregory, and 0-2 under Josh Pastner.

Series Notes vs. Notre Dame

• Tuesday's game, the first meeting between the two teams in the ACC Tournament, will be the third meeting of the season. Each team won on its home floor - Tech by 63-61 on Jan. 22 in Atlanta and Notre Dame by 69-59 on Feb. 10 in South Bend. The Fighting Irish are one of the yellow Jackets' two permanent home-and-away opponents (along with Clemson).

• Georgia Tech holds a 11-9 lead in the all-time series with Notre Dame that began in the 1940-41 season. Tech and Notre Dame split their three meetings the last three seasons, each team winning at home.

• The Yellow Jackets are 5-7 against Notre Dame since the Fighting Irish joined the ACC, with the 12 meetings decided by a total of 61 points. Notre Dame's 69-59 win in South Bend on Feb. 10, 2019 is the widest margin.

• At McCamish Pavilion, Tech is 5-1 against the Irish, and the games have been decided by a total of 20 points. Tech won the teams' first meeting there this season, 63-61.

• Notre Dame has won all six meetings at South Bend since the Fighting Irish became a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference, including a 69-59 decision last Feb. 10.

• The Yellow Jackets won five straight meetings between

the two teams from 1972 through Tech's 74-69 victory in McCamish Pavilion on Jan. 11, 2014, the team's first meeting as ACC foes.

• All but one game in the series has been played on the two campuses, the exception being a 2007 meeting in the third-place game of the Paradise Jam. The Yellow Jackets erased a 9-point deficit in the final 5:11 and won the game on a three-point basket by Matt Causey with two seconds remaining.

• Tech is 2-8 in games played in South Bend, and 1-7 in Purcell Pavilion, including an 88-80 overtime win on Feb. 24, 1990, with the Jackets headed toward an ACC title and Final Four berth later that season.

• That game and a 90-80 Tech victory in Atlanta a year earlier were the only two face-offs ever between legendary coaches Bobby Cremins and Digger Phelps.

• Tech is 8-1 all-time against Notre Dame in Atlanta, three of those wins at Alexander Memorial Coliseum and five at McCamish Pavilion.

• Four of the five meetings before that were played with Whack Hyder as Tech's head coach, and the Jackets won three of those, including an 82-62 win in 1972 at Alexander Memorial Coliseum in Phelps' first season as the Fighting Irish head coach.

Tech Finishes Strong at NC State

James Banks III scored the game-winning basket on a dunk off a feed from Jose Alvarado with 1.4 seconds remaining, giving Georgia Tech a 63-61 victory over NC State in its final regular season game last Wednesday at PNC Arena.

It was the final bucket in an 8-for-8 night for Tech's junior center, who was fouled on the play and made the free throw to finish with a game-high 19 points. The winning play gave the Yellow Jackets their second ACC road win this season in their final regular season game.

Tech led by as many as eight points in the second half, 52-44 with 8:07 left, but the Wolfpack rallied by draining four three-point baskets and hitting five free throws in the final eight minutes. Torin Dorn hit the last three with 6.1 seconds left for a 61-60 NC State lead.

Head coach Josh Pastner called timeout and drew up the winning play, in which Alvarado took the inbounds pass and

raced up the court. He penetrated the lane, dished to Banks cutting in from the left side, and Banks slammed home the winner.

Banks reached double figures for the third straight game, adding five blocked shots and three assists in 36 minutes. Sophomore forward Moses Wright, playing in his hometown for the first time in a Yellow Jacket uniform, hit 7-of-11 shots from the floor to score 18 points while grabbing eight rebounds in the first full 40-minute game of his career. Alvarado also reached double digits with 12 points, and added six rebounds and four assists while also playing 40 minutes.

The Jackets shot 58.1 percent from the floor, getting most of its baskets from close range and getting only one three-point basket in the game. They also turned the ball over just four times in the second half.

Tech started the game hot, making eight of its first 10 shots from the floor to lead by as many as eight points (18-10) in the first half. But the Wolfpack ratcheted up their pressure, forcing 12 turnovers while finishing the half on a 10-4 spurt to take a 33-28 lead into the locker room. The Jackets outscored the Wolfpack 14-7 over the first eight minutes of the second half to regain the lead.

Following the Trends

- Tech has won multiple ACC road games (Syracuse, NC State) for the first time since the 2015-16 season, when the Yellow Jackets won three (NC State, Florida State, Boston College).

- Like last season, Tech won its final two regular-season games to finish 6-12 in the ACC.

- For the last six games, Georgia Tech has started out in a 4-out, 1-in alignment, starting guards Jose Alvarado and Michael Devoe with two wings and post man James Banks III. The two wing forwards have rotated, but Moses Wright has occupied one of those for the past six games, and freshman Khalid Moore started against NC State, his first start since Jan. 9 against Virginia Tech. That lineup has started seven games this season and posted a record of 4-2.

- Moore made his seventh start this season and first since Feb. 13 at Virginia Tech, while Wright started for the 19th time this season. Devoe, a freshman, has started Tech's last 21 games, Banks has started the last 24 games in the post, and Alvarado has started 28 games.

- Georgia Tech has used 12 different starting lineups this season. No Yellow Jacket has started every game this season, and 10 different players have started three or more games.

- Tech has utilized its shortest playing rotation of the season — seven players — in its wins over Boston College and NC State. Tech's bench played only 10 minutes at NC State, and only one minute in the second half. At least eight Yellow Jackets, and often nine of 10, had played in every previous ACC game.

- Tech has shot 50 percent or better in nine games this

season, four during conference play, after connecting on 58.1 percent at NC State and 50.8 against Boston College. The Jackets shot 50 percent in six games last season (three ACC games), and five times (once in ACC play) in 2016-17.

- Tech scored 44 points in the paint in each game against Boston College and NC State

- Tech's two best shooting games this season came in its two ACC road wins — 59.5 percent at Syracuse and 58.1 percent at NC State — and in those games attempted just 17 three-point shots and went 43-for-68 inside the arc.

- Tech has managed to win three road games this season despite high turnover counts — 20 at Arkansas, 22 at Syracuse and 16 at NC State.

- Tech's one three-point field goal at NC State was its fewest since going 1-for-10 on Jan. 19 vs. Louisville. The Jackets had averaged 7.6 threes and shot 34.2 percent from beyond the arc in its previous seven games. In the five games before that, the Jackets shot 14-for-96 (14.6 pct.) from bonus range.

- Tech has held 18 opponents this season, and nine ACC opponents, under 40 percent from the floor (NC State shot 31.9 percent). The Jackets have limited 16 opponents, nine in the ACC, to 30 percent or less from three-point range.

- Tech committed a season-low nine fouls at NC State, and the Wolfpack's 11 free throw attempts matched a season-low by an ACC opponent.

- Tech has won its last two games despite giving up 36 second-chance points (16 to Boston College, 20 to NC State).

- Tech's largest deficit overcome to win this season: 10 points against Prairie View A&M. In ACC play, it was eight points to Boston College.

- Two fouls in the first half? No problem. Tech ranks No. 1 in the nation, according to KenPom.com, in percentage of first-half minutes that Jackets are on the floor with two fouls (64.1 percent). The national average is 21.4 percent.

Personnel Highlights

- Jose Alvarado has scored in double digits in six straight games, averaging 18.3 points over that stretch and leading the Jackets in scoring five times. He has hit 37-of-75 shots from the floor (49.3 percent), 12-for-30 from three-point range (40 percent). The 6-foot sophomore scored 17 against Florida State, 29 vs. Pittsburgh, 20 at Miami, 12 at Virginia, 21 against Boston College and 11 at NC State. Alvarado had scored a total of 25 points, attempting just two free throws, in the six games prior.

- Alvarado has scored (37) or assisted (24) on 61 of Tech's 123 field goals in the last six games. In those six games, he also has 29 rebounds and 12 steals.

- Alvarado has hit 24-for-32 from the free throw line (75 percent) in his last six games after going five straight games without attempting one.

- Alvarado has just eight turnovers over his last eight games (310 total minutes).

- Alvarado has played all but six minutes in Tech's last six games, playing the full 40 minutes against Pittsburgh, Miami and NC State and 44 of 45 in Tech's overtime win over Boston College. The sophomore has 13 complete games in his career, five this season.

- Moses Wright has reached double figures in three of his last four games (19 vs. Miami, 10 vs. Boston College, 18 at NC State), averaged 13.3 points and 6.0 rebounds and hit 24-of-40 shots from the floor (60 pct.). Over his last six games, the 6-9 sophomore has averaged 11.5 points and 5.3 rebounds, while hitting 30-of-62 field goals (48.3 pct.). He had scored just six points in the five games prior to that and was barely above 40 percent from the floor.

- James Banks III rebounded from his first scoreless game as a Yellow Jacket (Feb. 23 at Miami) with three straight double-figure games, 11 points and seven rebounds at Virginia followed by 18 and nine rebounds against Boston College and 19 points and nine boards at NC State (that's 16.0 ppg and 8.3 rpg). He hit 20-of-26 shots from the floor and 8-of-10 from the foul line in the three games.

- Banks was a perfect 8-for-8 from the floor at NC State, punctuating his night with a slam dunk with 1.4 seconds remaining for Tech's winning points in the 63-61 victory. The 6-9 junior also blocked five shots and had three assists.

- Michael Devoe recorded a season-high seven assists in the win at NC State, offsetting a poor shooting night (1-for-6, 5 points). The 6-4 freshman averages 10.4 points (No. 3 on the team), 3.7 rebounds and 2.8 assists in ACC games, and he has hit a team-best 43.8 percent of his three-point tries, leading the Jackets with 32 threes in conference play. Devoe is 28-of-60 from three-point land (46.7 pct.) in his last 14 games.

- Devoe has played all but one minute in Tech's last two games, while Devoe has played all but four in Tech's last five games.

- Alvarado, Devoe and Banks have each scored in double figures in the same game six times this season, and Tech has won four of those games. They combined for 45 of 69 points at Arkansas, 49 of 92 against Wake Forest, 43 of 63 in the first meeting against Notre Dame, and 59 of 81 against Boston College. The other two games were Georgia (36 of 59) and Virginia (33 of 51).

- With Tech opting for a 4-out, 1-in approach at Virginia Tech in an effort to inject extra shooting into the lineup, Abdoulaye Gueye has not started the last seven games. He has averaged 4.4 points (14-27 FG) and 2.7 rebounds in 12.8 minutes. In ACC games, Gueye has averaged 8.1 points and 3.9 rebounds, while hitting a career-high 51.9 percent of his field goal tries.

- Freshman Khalid Moore started for the ninth time this season and first time since Jan. 19 against Louisville. He played a personal high of 38 minutes against NC State, surpassing his previous high of 34 back on Dec. 19 at Arkansas, and matched his scoring high in an ACC game with eight points (3-5 FG).

Pastner's Key Metrics

- **Assists to made field goals:** The Jackets are at 57.6 percent for the season (46th in the nation) and 56.4 percent in ACC games. Tech assisted on 17 of 25 made field goals against NC State and 19 of 31 against Boston College, making its nightly goal of 60 percent in each game.

- **Free throws made to opponents' attempts:** Tech is 39-17 under Josh Pastner when attempting more free throws than the opponent. Tech connected on 12-of-20 free throw attempts to NC State's 9-of-11 (nightly goal of making more than opponent tries accomplished).

- **Turnovers:** Tech has averaged 14.6 turnovers per game in ACC play, and only forced 11.3. Target each night is to commit 11 or fewer, which Tech has met only in its last two games. More telling for Tech under Josh Pastner is that when Tech has committed fewer turnovers than its opponent, it is 22-14. When it has committed more, it is 23-30.

- **Guard rebounding:** The group of Alvarado, Alston, Devoe, Haywood, Moore and Phillips has combined to take 356 of Tech's 789 defensive rebounds this season (46 percent). Tech's guards combined for 11 of Tech's 32 defensive rebounds against NC State.

Build the Wall

Due to its ability to play both zone and man-to-man and keep opponents off-balance, Georgia Tech has been able to rely on its mixture of defenses to win games over Josh Pastner's first three seasons at Georgia Tech.

This Yellow Jacket team has played it well enough to rank No. 29 in adjusted defensive efficiency (94.8 ppg/100 possessions). Tech has ranked as high as 11th this season before adjusting its lineup in an effort to boost its offensive output. and is No. 5 in the ACC and No. 51 in the NCAA in scoring defense at 66.2 points per game.

Tech is most effective at shutting down the three, ranking in the top 10 nationally, and rim protection with center James Banks III leading the ACC and No. 9 nationally in blocked shots.

Tech has faced three of the nation's top 10 teams in offensive efficiency as ranked by KenPom.com - Tennessee (3), Duke (7) and Virginia Tech (9) - and held them to an average of 61.3 points. Each posted their lowest efficiency rating of the season against the Jackets. North Carolina is No. 7, and the Jackets held the Tar Heels to their fourth-lowest rating of the season. Tech held Florida State (36th) to two of its three lowest efficiency ratings of the season, and NC State (29th) to its lowest of the season outside of its 24-point game against Virginia Tech.

Tech's NIT finals team from 2017 ranked No. 6 in adjusted offensive efficiency (91.0 points allowed per 100 possessions) according to KenPom.com. That group ranked fourth in the ACC in scoring defense (66.8 ppg) and No. 1 in FG percentage defense (39.8 pct.).

- **Said Florida State coach Leonard Hamilton:** "Georgia Tech utilizes a defensive scheme that is probably the best match-up zone defensive scheme that I've seen in my coaching career. They do an outstanding job of taking away so many different spots on the floor that you normally are accustomed to operating in."

- **Said Notre Dame coach Mike Brey:** "They are really hard to score on. There's a reason why their stats play out as one of the best, if not the best, defensive team in our league. They are just really hard to deal with. They're long, they're athletic, they're in passing lanes and if you do beat them, they've got shot blocker in the back."

- **Said Pittsburgh coach Jeff Capel:** "Their defense is difficult. Their defense is different. It's unique. They have length around the basket and they understand how to move in their defense and their zone."

Assisted Living

Georgia Tech coach Josh Pastner preached and prodded his Yellow Jackets on ball and player movement and hard cutting from the first time he got his team on the practice court. His primary measuring stick on how well the Jackets perform offensively is their ratio of assists to made field goals, and the Jackets' struggle to score this season is not for lack of ball movement.

Tech is No. 46 in 2018-19 at 57.6 percent (56.4 pct. in ACC games), and remains well above the national average (52.1 pct.) in that category.

The Jackets did not perform as well in that department in 2017-18, assisting on 54.6 of its made field goals overall, 53.9 against ACC teams, and missing Pastner's 60-percent bar 14 times.

In Pastner's first season, the Yellow Jackets ranked 13th nationally, according to KenPom.com, in highest percentage of assists to made field goals at 62.6 percent, the team's highest rate since the 2000-01 season. Tech's number was 63.2 percent in ACC games. Pastner's nightly goal is 60 percent.

Jose Can You See

Point guard Jose Alvarado, recruited to Georgia Tech primarily for his winning attitude and determination, was given the green light by head coach Josh Pastner to handle the position, sink or swim.

The Brooklyn native, the first Tech player from the New York area in nearly 20 years, has developed into the Yellow Jackets' engine on the floor in his sophomore season, leading the Jackets in scoring (12.5 ppg), assists (3.6 apg), steals (1.8 pg) and free throw percentage (76.9 pct.) in ACC games. He also has taken 3.9 rebounds on average in ACC games to date, tied for second most on the squad.

Alvarado's freshman season was full of promise until it came to an abrupt halt on Feb. 11, when he dislocated his left elbow on a hard fall to the floor trying to contest a breakaway shot from Duke's Javin Delaurier. Until then, he had averaged 12.6 points per game to rank second on the team, 3.9 rebounds and 3.3 assists. He also shot the ball well, making 45 percent of his shots from the floor, 37.4 percent from three-point distance, and 80.2 percent from the foul line on 80 attempts.

Alvarado has posted 36 double-figure scoring games in his career, 10 times scoring 20 or more. And the 6-foot playmaker has averaged more than 34 minutes per game, with 13 complete 40-minute games.

• **Said Pittsburgh coach Jeff Capel:** "[Jose] Alvarado is a big-time competitor. We told our guys coming into this game, I know that kid and I know his spirit. With his team struggling, I knew that he would try to take it upon himself to be aggressive and have a great game. He was sensational."

Devoe Getting Comfortable

Freshman guard Michael Devoe, the highest-rated high school prospect Georgia Tech has recruited under Josh Pastner, has steadily improved for the Yellow Jackets since the season began.

The Orlando, Fla., native suffered a setback by missing six weeks of preseason practice with a toe injury and began the season slowly, but has steadily played more minutes and improved his production.

He entered the Tech starting lineup at Arkansas on Dec. 19, a game Tech won, 69-65, and he scored 11 points. He has connected on 43.8 percent of his three-point tries in ACC games (would rank No. 3 in the ACC with enough 3PM) and averaged 35.4 minutes (10th-most).

Devoe scored 16 points in his ACC debut against Wake Forest, and has eight double-digit scoring games in his last 13.

Thin Gold Line

Some of Georgia Tech's most successful teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference era have had thin benches and a trio of players who averaged more than 35 minutes per game in ACC play, beginning with the Yellow Jackets' first ACC Championship team in 1985, dubbed the "Thin Gold Line."

Banking Hours

The most significant development in the direction of this year's Georgia Tech team may have occurred Nov. 13, when the NCAA granted James Banks III immediate eligibility after his transfer from Texas.

Tech received that news while conducting its shootaround for its second game of the season, at Tennessee. Arrangements were made to get Banks to Knoxville (transfers do not travel with the team), where he contributed five points and seven rebounds in a 66-53 loss.

The personable 6-9 post player has progressed rapidly since that modest start. He posted his first double-double four games later at Northwestern (12 pts/12 rebs), and made his first start the game after that against St. John's (14 pts/12 rebs).

In ACC play, Banks has been Tech's No. 2 scorer (11.4 ppg) and top rebounder (7.1 rpg), hitting 55 percent of his shots from the floor and 71.2 percent of his free throws, while leading the conference in blocked shots (2.52 pg).

Defensively, he leads the conference in all games and ranks No. 9 nationally in blocked shots (2.50 per game), and has anchored one of the nation's top defensive teams (No. 29 nationally in defensive efficiency according to Kenpom.com).

He added two more double-doubles, 24/11 against Louisville and 16/10 against Notre Dame, and has six for the season.

It took Banks 23 games at Tech to exceed his 46-game totals at Texas in every offensive category, plus blocks and steals.

Getting it Wright

Part of Georgia Tech's improvement at the end of the year can be attributed to the emergence of sophomore forward Moses Wright.

Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech there, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

The 6-9 Raleigh, N.C., native has started the Yellow Jackets' last six games and blossomed in the last four, averaging 13.3 points and 6.0 rebounds while connecting on 24-of-40 shots from the floor.

Wright came out of William G. Enloe High School in Raleigh with no recruiting rating, but played well in his senior year of varsity basketball and in AAU ball and drew the attention of Tech's coaching staff for his athletic ability and his basketball IQ.

He is most effective running the floor, attacking the basket to score and rebound, and using his athletic ability and length to be disruptive on defense. Before taking up basketball seriously just a few years ago, he played tennis and swim.

Wright started 14 games early in the year but was inconsistent, posting three double-figure scoring games, but also going scoreless five times.

He began playing more extensively again Feb. 13 at Virginia Tech (24.7 mpg), and scored a career-high 19 points at Miami on Feb. 23. Last Wednesday, in his first trip back to Raleigh in a Tech uniform, he scored 18 points with eight rebounds in a career-high 39 minutes in the Jackets' win at NC State.

Out of Africa

Georgia Tech got a big lift from an unlikely source once ACC play began last season, junior forward Abdoulaye Gueye (pronounced "AB-doo-lie GAY"). During the month of January and into February, the Yellow Jackets saw the 6-9 native of Senegal (by way of Birmingham, Ala.) become a legitimate offensive force, and not just a disruptor on defense and on the boards.

Known as "A.D." to his teammates and coaches, the likeable Gueye took advantage of a much-improved jump hook shot to average 6.5 points (50 percent from the floor) and 4.5 rebounds in in ACC games.

The fifth-year has made a similar jump from non-conference to ACC play this season as well, averaging 8.1 points and 3.9 rebounds while hitting 51.9 percent shots from the floor. He scored in double figures in seven ACC games.

His role has shifted from starting big forward to backup center as the Jackets have gone 4-out, 1-in on the court in an effort to boost its offense.

Alston on ACC All-Academic Team

Brandon Alston, a graduate student-athlete on Georgia Tech's basketball team, been named to the annual All-Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Men's Basketball team. It is the second time Alston has been recognized.

The Vienna, Va., native, who is a senior in terms of athletic eligibility, has played in 25 games, starting five, for the Yellow Jackets this season. He has been Tech's fourth-leading scorer at 7.3 points per game while shooting 46.5 percent from the floor and a team-leading 38.9 percent from three-point range. The 6-5 guard also leads the jackets in free throw shooting at 83.7 percent, having made his last 12 in a row and 22 of his last 23.

He is completing his coursework for a Master's degree in economics this semester. He earned a bachelor's degree in economics at Lehigh in 2017.

Building Depth

Georgia Tech has deployed 12 different starting lineups this season, and 11 Yellow Jackets have started three or more games.

Tech deployed at least eight players for significant

minutes in all of its games, including as many as nine or 10 in its ACC games, until the last two, when coach Josh Pastner went with a seven-man rotation in its victory over Boston College, and Tech's bench played just 10 minutes in its win at NC State.

Tech's bench has played 33.8 percent of available minutes, No. 90 in the nation according to KenPom.com (national average is 30.7 pct.). *Last season, Tech ranked No. 210 with 30.1 minutes played by reserves.*

In conference play this season, head coach Josh Pastner has relied on a core group for longer durations - Jose Alvarado and Michael Devoe rank among the conference top 10 in average minutes, yet still has utilized eight or nine players altogether.

Three Seniors' Careers Closing

Three Georgia Tech seniors - Brandon Alston, Abdoulaye Gueye and Sylvester Ogbonda - are closing out their careers.

Alston, a 6-5 guard from Vienna, Va., is finishing his second season as a graduate transfer after three years at Lehigh, and has played in 57 games as a Yellow Jackets, starting 24 while averaging 6.3 points per game. He is finishing his master's degree in economics this semester.

Ogbonda, a 6-10 center from Port Harcourt, Nigeria, attended National Christian Academy in Washington, D.C., before coming to Tech, where he is a fourth-year junior in terms of athletic eligibility. After a redshirt year in 2015-16, he has played in 42 games as a backup in the post, and is completing course work this semester for his bachelor's degree in business administration.

Gueye, a 6-9 forward from Dakar, Senegal, is a fifth-year senior who has played in 88 games and started 39 during his career. He attended Central Park Christian School in Birmingham, Ala., before coming to Tech. He took a redshirt year in 2015-16 and has been a part-time starter in the last two seasons. He is finishing his degree requirements in business administration this semester.

Other Storylines for 2018-19

• **104th season** - Georgia Tech is playing its 104th season of basketball and has an all-time record of 1,376-1,243.

• **Unlucky 13** - Tech was picked to finish 13th in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season in a vote of the ACC media, ahead of Pittsburgh and Wake Forest. The Yellow Jackets finished 13th last season.

• **Seven** - Number of freshmen and sophomores playing significant roles for the Yellow Jackets this season. They have played 68.1 percent of the minutes for Tech in ACC games.

• **1.23 years** - Average experience of the players on Georgia Tech's current roster, which ranks No. 305 in the nation (No. 1 is the oldest), according to KenPom.com. The national average is 1.67 years.

• **Above average** - Georgia Tech ranks No. 79, according to Kenpom.com, in average height (77.5 inches) among the nation's Division I teams. The national average is 76.8.

• The upward progress of the program is evident in the development of its 2017-18 freshman class, each of whom received significant playing time last season and made significant contributions on the ACC level. Though not highly-rated in terms of rankings, the four-man class has a wide range of skills and is ripe for development into consistent conference-level performers over the next couple of years.

a. Point guard Jose Alvarado started every game last season and showed durability and toughness by averaging more than 38 minutes in ACC games until suffering a dislocated elbow Feb. 11.

b. Off-guard Curtis Haywood II was developing into a significant shooting threat and excellent defender before suffering stress reaction in his shin and missing the final month of the 2017-18 season.

c. Forwards Evan Cole and Moses Wright, both under-the-radar signees, exceeded expectations for their first year when forced into action due to injuries over the final month of the season. With added strength and development this off-season, can be counted on to be in the frontcourt rotation and make significant contributions at both ends of the floor.

• Coach Pastner, his staff and the student-athletes in the program have carried over a solid, sustainable culture of accountability and dependability from the previous coaching staff which enabled the team to overcome a number of key injuries last season and continue to work hard and remain focused on the court and in the weight room.

• Pastner replaced two assistant coaches - Tavaras Hardy and Darryl LaBarrie - over the last year. Hardy was named head coach at Loyola of Maryland in late March, while LaBarrie resigned during the season. Anthony Wilkins, an Atlanta native, joined the staff after five seasons at Tulane, and Julian Swartz was elevated from his position as director of recruiting and compliance.

• Tech added a three-man recruiting class ranked No. 46 in the country according to 247Sports, including consensus four-star guard Michael Devoe and three-star forwards Khalid Moore and Kristian Sjolund, and true to staff's objectives, the class has varied skill sets and are expected to develop into significant contributors next season and beyond (building through multiple quality recruiting classes)

• Another addition to the roster this season - 6-3 guard Shembari Phillips, a high-major conference player who sat out the 2017-18 season as a transfer from Tennessee. He has the size and varied skill set necessary to compete in the ACC (6.2 ppg, 3.1 rpg, 37.5 pct. 3s in 2016-17). He has two years of eligibility.

• Tech also accepted transfer James Banks, a 6-9, 243-pound frontcourt player from Decatur, Ga., ranked as high as No. 49 among high school seniors in the class of 2016. After two years at Texas, he enrolled at Tech for the summer term and was granted immediate eligibility by the NCAA on Nov. 13. He has two seasons of eligibility at Tech.

• Tech returned six players who received significant playing time in 2017-18 - 15 or more minutes per ACC game - and combined to start 91 games overall. They accounted for more than 53 percent of total minutes played and 43 percent of Tech's scoring. Five of those players have two or more years of eligibility remaining.

• Tech has a young roster - three freshmen, four sophomores, three juniors and two seniors among scholarship players returning or incoming - but the process of getting old and staying old and building a sustainable winning program is ongoing.

• Player development successes over the past two seasons include Josh Okogie, Ben Lammers and Tadic Jackson, who maximized their skill sets under the current coaching staff, doubling their scoring and rebounding averages over their first two seasons. Okogie went from being ranked the 11th in the state as a HS senior to a first-round NBA draft pick. Last season, 6-9 forward Abdoulaye Gueye developed into an ACC-level contributor, making a similar leap from the non-conference season to conference play. Graduate transfer Brandon Alston, who has a year of eligibility remaining, had similar statistical numbers on the ACC level this season as he compiled in two seasons at Lehigh and was fundamentally sound in his ballhandling and defense.

• With the addition of Phillips and the arrival of Devoe and Moore, as well as the return of Alston and sophomores Alvarado and Haywood, Tech is deep and talented across the perimeter and wings. Tech has Gueye, rising junior Sylvester Ogbonda and Banks to rotate through the post, with Cole and Wright rotating in the big forward position. This gives Pastner the option of playing a bigger lineup when necessary.

• Tech won 34 games overall and 14 ACC games in Josh Pastner's first two seasons, on par or better than the first two years of each of Josh Pastner's predecessors in the ACC

era. For comparison, Buzz Williams won 12 ACC games in his first two years at Virginia Tech, same with Tony Bennett at Virginia. Leonard Hamilton and Mike Krzyzewski each won 10. Pastner has won 14.

• Head coach Josh Pastner's Georgia Tech teams were 5-14 against top-25 teams (5-5 at home) in his first two-plus seasons.

• Tech has sold out 12 games at McCamish Pavilion over the past three seasons, including a facility-record five games in 2017-18. Tech's 28 homecourt wins over Pastner's first two seasons were more than any two-year period in the Jackets' ACC era except the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons combined (31). That's 43 home wins over the past three seasons, more than 14 per season.

Jackets Add Didenko, Usher

David Didenko, a 6-8, 230-pound forward from Boca Raton, Fla., who attends Palm Beach State College, signed a national letter-of-intent with Georgia Tech during the early signing period in November, while **Jordan Usher**, a 6-7, 225-pound forward, has transferred from Southern California and enrolled at Tech for the spring semester.

Didenko attended Boca Raton Community High School before enrolling this year at Palm Beach State, a junior college in Boca Raton. A full academic qualifier in high school, Didenko will enroll at Tech in the summer and have three years of eligibility with the Yellow Jackets.

Born in Russia, Didenko moved to New York in August, 2010, at the age of 10, and is a United States citizen. Prior to his enrollment at Boca Raton Community High School, Didenko attended Northeast High School as a junior, and Montverde Academy for his ninth- and 10th-grade years.

Usher comes to Tech after playing a season and a half for the Trojans, departing from USC after the recently completed fall semester and enrolling for the spring semester. He must complete a year of residency at Georgia Tech and will become eligible to play for the Yellow Jackets following the conclusion of the fall, 2019 term. He will be eligible for the remainder of the 2019-20 season and all of the 2020-21 season.

A native of Canton, Ga., Usher played in all 36 games with two starts for the Trojans as a freshman in 2017-18, averaging 4.8 points and 2.0 rebounds per game while connecting on 40.9 percent of his three-point field goal attempts. In 2018-19, Usher played in 12 games and made two starts, averaging 8.6 points and 3.7 rebounds. A 4-star prospect ranked No. 104 in the nation by 247Sports, Usher played his senior season (2016-17) at Wheeler High School in Marietta, Ga., and prior to that, he attended Sequoyah High School in Canton.

Wire-to-Wire

Though he has expanded his playing rotation this year to reflect the growing level of talent within the program, head coach Josh Pastner remains committed to a tight playing rotation, reminiscent of the way Bobby Cremins coached the Yellow Jackets over his 19 seasons.

Tech has utilized its bench for an average of 47.6 minutes (23.6 percent of available minutes) in its ACC games thus far after averaging 78 minutes in non-conference play.

Jose Alvarado, who had played 96.7 percent of possible ACC minutes prior to his Feb. 11 injury last season, is averaging 36.2 minutes in ACC games this season and has played 35 or more minutes 18 times this season.

Freshman Michael Devoe has averaged 35.4 minutes in ACC games, and James Banks III has averaged 32.8. Alvarado and Devoe, who both rank among the ACC's top 10, each played the full 40 minutes at Notre Dame on Feb. 10. Alvarado also did so against Pittsburgh, Miami and NC State, and Devoe went all 45 minutes in overtime against Boston College.

Last season, Alvarado had ranked fifth among freshmen nationally in percentage of minutes played and minutes per game before he was injured. He has posted 13 complete,

Media Guidelines

Georgia Tech's practices are closed to the public and the media, but coaches and student-athletes are made available prior to each game before one of the team's practices. Notices will be distributed weekly to confirm the schedule.

TV stations are allowed to shoot B-roll during the first 10 minutes of those practices.

Media are asked to notify Mike Stamus *the day before* of their need to attend and to make specific student-athlete requests.

Interview requests with student-athletes that need to be conducted at other times must be arranged through the Georgia Tech communications office at least 24 hours in advance. These interviews will be conducted at a time and place convenient to the student-athletes' availability and class schedule.

Media are asked not to contact student-athletes directly either by phone, e-mail, text or social media. They are instructed not to respond. Every effort will be made to make them available.

Interviewing Coach Pastner

Media wishing to speak with Coach Pastner at times other than scheduled media availabilities must notify Mike Stamus in the communications office in advance to make or confirm arrangements. He also is available each Monday on the ACC Teleconference (10:50 a.m.) beginning January 7.

Post-Game Protocol

Each head coach will hold a post-game press conference in the designated interview room (Shah Media Room at McCamish Pavilion).

Student-athletes requested by the media will be brought to the interview room following the coaches press conferences, when the team is at home, outside the team's locker room when the team is on the road.

Josh Pastner Radio Show

Head coach Josh Pastner's weekly radio show airs each Monday from 7-8 p.m. on "680 the Fan" and 93.7 FM, beginning Dec. 3.

ACC Coaches Weekly Teleconference

The 15 ACC head basketball coaches will be featured on nine Monday teleconferences during the 2018-19 season, beginning on Monday, January 7, and continuing through March 4. Each coach will have 10 minutes to make an opening statement and answer questions. There will be an instant replay of each teleconference on the Conference's internet site TheACC.com each Monday afternoon.

Georgia Tech head coach Josh Pastner will be on the teleconference at 10:50 a.m. each week.

Coaches that play on Monday in January and February are not required to participate in that day's call. Coach Pastner will be on every Monday at the same time. The teleconference schedule for each Monday will differ for the other 14 head coaches, depending on what teams play that Monday night.

40-minute games in his career.

Tech players had 20 complete games combined in 2017-18, and had at least one player play the full 40 in 12 of 19 ACC games (regular season plus tournament). This season, Alvarado has five and Devoe two.

NOTE: Between the Cremins era and the arrival of Pastner, only one Georgia Tech player played every minute of a game, regulation or overtime, and that was Marcus Georges-Hunt on Feb. 20, 2016, in a win over Notre Dame at home. In the final 15 seasons of Cremins' tenure (1985-86 through 1999-2000), a total of 196 players logged a 40-minute game.

Winning Starts at Home

Georgia Tech and head coach Josh Pastner have made a priority of making McCamish Pavilion a real homecourt advantage for the program, and the Yellow Jackets made a good start on that by setting a program record for wins at home (17) in 2017-18, which included a 7-2 ACC record and two NIT victories.

Tech is 16-11 against ACC teams at home under Pastner, and that includes a 5-5 mark against ranked opponents.

The Jackets' 60-53 win over No. 25 Notre Dame on Jan. 10 was the latest triumph in a list that includes eventual NCAA champion North Carolina (No. 9 at the time), No. 6 Florida State and No. 15 Notre Dame last season, as well as a 64-54 win over No. 15 Miami on Jan. 3 this season. Tech's only losses came to No. 9 Louisville last January and to No. 2 Virginia and No. 18 Clemson this season.

Tech is 40-18 at McCamish Pavilion under Pastner.

20-Game ACC Schedule Rotation Announced

The Atlantic Coast Conference announced the future matchups of the league's 20-game men's basketball schedule, which begins with the 2019-20 season. The 20-game matrix is in effect for three years through the 2021-22 season.

Each team will play its two primary rivals every season both home and away (four games, Clemson and Notre Dame remain Georgia Tech's primary home-and-away opponents) and four repeat opponents both home and away (eight games). The remaining eight opponents will be single games, four at home and four on the road. The full cycle of repeat opponents will be complete following the third year.

Under the former 18-game schedule, each team played four opponents both home and away each season, four at home and four away.

In 2019-20, Georgia Tech will play Louisville, NC State, Pittsburgh and Syracuse both home and away in addition to Clemson and Notre Dame, with Duke, Miami, Virginia and Virginia Tech visiting McCamish Pavilion.

In 2020-21, Tech's home-and-away opponents will be Clemson, Notre Dame, Duke, Florida State, Virginia and Wake Forest, with home games against Boston, North Carolina, Pittsburgh and Syracuse.

In 2021-22, the Yellow Jackets play Clemson, Notre Dame, Boston College, Miami, North Carolina and Virginia Tech both home and on the road, and will host Florida State, Louisville, NC State and Wake Forest.

Tech to Take Summer Tour to Spain

Georgia Tech's men's basketball team will take its first summer tour out of the United States since 2015 when the Yellow Jackets take an eight-day tour of Spain in August.

The tour will take place from August 8-16, coinciding with the break between summer and fall academic terms. The Yellow Jackets will spend the first three days (Aug. 9-11) in Barcelona, then take a high-speed train to Madrid, where they will stay from Aug. 12-16. Tech will play four games, two in each city, against teams to be determined by the Spanish Basketball Federation.

Along with the basketball competition, the Yellow Jackets will have the opportunity for sight-seeing tours of the U.S.

Embassy in Barcelona and the Royal Palace in Madrid, visit the professional soccer facilities of FC Barcelona and Real Madrid, and other activities still to be determined.

Per NCAA rules, the Yellow Jackets will be allowed 10 practices to prepare for the tour along in addition to the currently allowable off-season training and skill development.

Tech has made summer international tours twice previously, most recently to The Bahamas in 2015. The Jackets traveled to France in August of 1991.

Tech to Play in 2019 Diamond Head Classic

Georgia Tech will make the fifth trip to the state of Hawai'i in program history next December when it will compete in the 2019 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic in Honolulu, Hawai'i.

The field for the 2019 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic features Ball State (Mid-American), Boise State (Mountain West), Georgia Tech (ACC), tournament host school Hawai'i (Big West), Houston (AAC), Portland (WCC), UTEP (Conference USA), and Washington (Pac-12). The 11th annual event will be played at the Stan Sheriff Center on the campus of the University of Hawai'i.

Three teams in the 2019 field were a part of the postseason last season — Boise State (NIT), Houston (NCAA) and Washington (NIT). Meanwhile, five teams will make their first-ever appearance in the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic.

Tech has a 10-5 record all time in four previous tournament events in Hawai'i, including a 6-3 mark in three appearances in the Rainbow Classic — 1984 champions, 1988, 1994 — which also were held at the University of Hawai'i. The Yellow Jackets also played in the 1998 Big Island Classic in Hilo, and the 2006 Maui Invitational.

Tech-UGA Game Moves to November Next Two Seasons

The Georgia Tech and Georgia basketball teams have signed an agreement to play the next two games of the series the week before Thanksgiving, giving both teams an opportunity to play the game at home in front of their student bodies before the fall semester ends.

The teams will face off next season on Wednesday, Nov. 20, at Stegeman Coliseum in Athens, and the following season on Thursday, Nov. 19, at McCamish Pavilion in Atlanta.

In the 194-game history of the series, Tech and Georgia have played their game before Thanksgiving only twice, on Nov. 15, 2013 in Athens and Nov. 14, 2014 in Atlanta. The Yellow Jackets won both games and lead the all-time series, 105-89.

As Southeastern Conference foes from 1932-64, the games were played in January, February and March. After Tech left the ACC, most of the games remained in January and February until the rivalry became a late December fixture at the Omni arena in downtown Atlanta from 1981-94. The series has been played on the two campuses every year since then, mostly in December.

Four Tech Alumni on NBA Rosters

Since 1982, Georgia Tech has produced 19 first-round NBA draft picks and 44 draft picks overall. A total of 38 Georgia Tech alumni have played in the NBA.

Four former Georgia Tech basketball stars were on NBA rosters at the start of the 2018-19 season, including guard **Josh Okogie**, who was drafted 20th overall by for the Minnesota Timberwolves.

Iman Shumpert, a seven-year NBA veteran, played his third full season in Cleveland after helping the Cavaliers win the NBA championship in 2016, and was traded before the deadline to Sacramento last season, and was traded to Houston this season.

Thaddeus Young, an 11-year NBA veteran, is now in his third season with the Indiana Pacers after playing seven seasons in Philadelphia, one in Minnesota and two in Brooklyn.

Derrick Favors has emerged as a key figure in his eighth season in Utah and re-signed with the team after becoming a free agent.

Arts and Letters

Beginning with Moe Miller and Lance Storrs in the summer of 2011, every four-year senior in the Georgia Tech program has graduated, with the exception of the Yellow Jackets' 2018 two seniors, who are both expected to return and complete their degrees this summer after a year of pro ball overseas.

Graduate student Brandon Alston (economics), fifth-year senior Abdoulaye Gueye (business administration) and fourth-year junior Sylvester Ogbonda (business administration) all will complete their course work this semester and receive their degrees in May.

Georges-Hunt and Jackson made the Academic All-ACC team twice, and the Yellow Jackets have had at least one player named to that team since it was instituted for the 2010-11 season.

Tech's men's basketball team has recorded the highest Academic Progress Report scores the last five years since the NCAA began tracking academic performance in 2004-05. The Jackets scored a perfect team single year APR score of 1000 three straight years from 2011-13.

Welcome to The Hank

Georgia Tech is playing its seventh season in McCamish Pavilion, which was for all intents and purposes, brand new when it opened for the 2012-13 season. The only physical elements of McCamish Pavilion that remain from the venerable Alexander Memorial Coliseum are the roof, which was re-covered, and the 32 steel ribs that support it.

The capacity of McCamish Pavilion is 8,600, including 1,665 seats in the new balcony level and 6,935 seats in the lower seating bowl. There are no suites, but there is a premium club area that seats 500. Alexander Memorial Coliseum seated 9,191 spectators in its final configuration.

The most impressive features of McCamish Pavilion are its grand entrance, which fronts 10th and Fowler Streets, the ability for patrons to view the court from the main concourse all the way around, and the theatrical lighting system, which concentrates light on the court while leaving the seating areas dark, modeled after the Staples Center in Los Angeles and Madison Square Garden in New York.

Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion on Jan. 5, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

Tech's NCAA Tournament History

Georgia Tech has played in the NCAA Tournament 16 times in its history. Fifteen of those appearances have occurred from 1985 to the present, 10 under head coach Bobby Cremins and five under Paul Hewitt.

Tech has a record of 23-16 in NCAA Tournament play, highlighted by its 2004 trip to the NCAA title game as well as

a Final Four berth in 1990. The Yellow Jackets have reached the NCAA Sweet 16 seven times (1960, 1985, 1986, 1990, 1992, 1996, 2004).

The 2004 and 2005 appearances were the Yellow Jackets' first back-to-back appearances since Bobby Cremins led the Institute to the Big Dance nine straight years from 1985-93.

Georgia Tech has won at least one game in 11 of its 16 NCAA Tournament appearances.

BIO UPDATES

Head Coach Josh Pastner • 3rd season

Josh Pastner, who guided Memphis to five post-season berths in seven seasons as the Tigers' head coach, was introduced as Georgia Tech's 14th head basketball coach on April 8, 2016, and wasted no time in getting the Yellow Jackets back to the post-season.

While coaching Tech to 34 wins and building the Jackets' talent base for the future, Pastner has tirelessly promoted the program on campus and throughout the city of Atlanta in an effort to re-create the major homecourt atmosphere that surrounded the Yellow Jackets throughout the 1980s, 1990s and into the middle of the 2000s. The result has been 29 wins and eight sellouts in two seasons at McCamish Pavilion, including a program-record 17 home wins in his first year.

In his first season at the helm, his Yellow Jacket team defied all pre-season expectations by winning 21 games, including four in the National Invitation Tournament. Tech posted an 8-10 ACC record, which included victories over No. 9 North Carolina, No. 6 Florida State and No. 14 Notre Dame, who all finished among the top four in the ACC regular season. He was named Coach of the Year in the ACC and in NABC District 2.

Implementing a high-energy style of play and creative offensive and defensive schemes, Pastner and his staff guided the Yellow Jackets all the way to the finals of the NIT for the first time in 46 years. Two of his players earned all-Atlantic Coast Conference honors; junior center Ben Lammers was named second-team All-ACC and ACC Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman guard Josh Okogie was named to the ACC All-Freshman team.

Though hampered by several significant injuries and other issues in 2017-18, Tech still was able to knock off a pair of top-25 teams while Lammers and Okogie again earned conference honors, and Okogie developed into an NBA first-round draft choice.

Pastner, who turned 41 in the fall, compiled a 167-73 record over seven seasons as the head coach at Memphis, where the Tigers earned bids to the NCAA Tournament four times. He tied for the 10th most wins for a head coach in his first seven seasons in Division I basketball history, and is the second winningest active coach under the age of 40 in NCAA Division I.

Despite his young age, Pastner has been involved in basketball at the Division I level for 21 years, as a player and an assistant coach at Arizona, and as an assistant coach and the head coach at Memphis. He has been a part of teams that have won 524 games, played in 17 NCAA Tournaments and 19 total post-season events. Teams he has been involved with have won 12 conference tournament or regular-season championships, advanced to seven Sweet Sixteens, five Elite Eights, two Final Fours and two NCAA championship games.

As an NCAA head coach and an AAU head coach, he has coached nearly 25 NBA draft selections.

Pastner's Memphis teams averaged 23.9 wins per season and compiled a conference regular-season record of 82-36, including a conference winning streak of 28 games. The Tigers went 11-4 in Conference USA and American Athletic Conference tournaments, including three championships.

He guided Memphis to five post-season berths, the NIT in 2010 and the NCAA Tournament in 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. Pastner twice won Conference USA Coach of the Year honors (2010, 2013) by various organizations and news media.

Pastner was born in Glen Dale, W.Va., and grew up in Kingwood, Texas. He earned his bachelor's degree in family studies in December of 1998, in just two and a half years, from Arizona and his master's degree in teaching and teacher education from Arizona in December of 1999, all while lettering four years in basketball under head coach Lute Olson.

He married the former Kerri Lamas of Sierra Vista, Ariz., in 2009. He has a stepson (Ethan) and three daughters, Payten, Kamryn and Harper.

Senior Brandon Alston scored a team-high 16 points to lead Georgia Tech for the second straight game, but the Yellow Jackets struggled to gain traction offensively against a strong Tennessee defense, and fell to the No. 5-ranked Volunteers, 66-53, in a defensive battle at Thompson-Boling Arena.

Alston, who went 8-for-8 at the free throw line and 4-for-8 from the floor, was the only double-figure scorer for the Yellow Jackets (1-1), who shot 27.6 percent from the floor and hit just 3-of-19 from three-point range. The Volunteers (3-0) managed to hit just 39.6 percent from the floor, but took advantage of Tech's foul trouble to go 24-for-38 from the charity stripe.

Grant Williams led the Vols with 22 points, going 10-of-16 from the foul line, while Jordan Bone scored 15 points and Kyle Alexander added 12.

All 12 scholarship players for the Yellow Jackets played in the game, most notably 6-8 junior post player James Banks, who transferred from Texas after last season. The Decatur, Ga., native learned early in the afternoon that he had been granted immediately eligibility by the NCAA and was able to travel to Knoxville and suit up for action. He scored five points with seven rebounds and a blocked shot in 16 minutes before fouling out.

Jose Alvarado scored a career-high 24 points, helping Georgia Tech rally from a 28-point second-half deficit to just five late in the game, but the Yellow Jackets came up on the short end of a 67-61 decision to Northwestern in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge at Welsh-Ryan Arena.

James Banks notched his first double-double in a Georgia Tech uniform with 12 points and 12 rebounds in just over 26 minutes before fouling out late in the game. Ryan Taylor led Northwestern with 20 points, including four three-point field goals, while Vic Law added 14 and Dererk Pardon 12 points and 10 rebounds.

Tech (4-2), which fell to 7-11 all-time in the annual series between the two conferences, shot just 25 percent in the first half, while the Wildcats (6-1) connected on 48 percent with five three-point field goals and went into intermission ahead 40-20.

Northwestern continued its surge early in the second half, getting a pair of threes from Taylor in a 10-2 run to open a 50-22 lead.

Alvarado scored 19 of his points from there, hitting 6-of-10 shots from the floor, including two triples, and 5-of-6 from the foul line. Freshman Khalid Moore gave the Jackets 15 quality minutes and help squelch the Wildcats' Taylor defensively, allowing Tech to gradually pare down Northwestern's lead.

Tech connected on 48 percent from the floor after intermission and sliced the deficit to just seven (62-55) on a pair of Alvarado free throws at the 1:51 mark, as close as the Jackets would get until his three with two seconds left brought them within five at 66-61.

Jose Alvarado scored 17 points to lead four Georgia Tech players in double figures, but the Yellow Jackets could not overcome a 37-point performance by St. John's guard Shamorie Ponds as the Red Storm rallied in the second half to defeat the Yellow Jackets, 76-73, in the Hoophall Miami Invitational at American Airlines Arena.

The Yellow Jackets (4-3), who dropped their second straight game, used a 14-0 first-half run and 48-percent shooting rally from a 7-point deficit to lead 38-29 at intermission. The Tech run was broken at the horn when Ponds sank a half-court shot for three points.

Undeterred, the Yellow Jackets scored nine of the first 11 points in the second half to open a 47-31 lead, and led by the same margin as late as 15:06 on Curtis Haywood's layup before the Red Storm (7-0) began to chip away.

Ponds scored 21 points over the final 15:06, and he completed the St. John's comeback with a pair of free throws at 3:31 to put the Red Storm up, 67-66. St. John's would build its lead to as much as seven at 73-66 with 26 seconds remaining before the Jackets made a final push.

James Banks III, making his first collegiate start, posted his second straight double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds. Brandon Alston, also back in the starting lineup for the second time this season, scored 14 points with three 3-point field goals, and Moses Wright added 12 for the Yellow Jackets.

Justin Simon and L.J. Figueroa each chipped in 13 points for the Red Storm.

Michael Devoe finished with a team-high 14 points to match his career-high and lead three Yellow Jackets in double figures, but Georgia Tech dropped a 70-59 decision to Georgia.

Shooting struggles plagued both teams in the early going as both teams were shooting under 30 percent through the third media timeout. After Georgia pulled out with a 12-5 edge, Abdoulaye Gueye connected on a hook shot and Jose Alvarado went coast-to-coast on a steal to pull the Jackets within one possession, 12-9, with 9:02 to play in the half. The Bulldogs capitalized on a 13-0 run to pull away with a 25-9 lead and carried a 29-19 advantage into halftime.

Georgia Tech opened the second half with a 13-5 run that pulled the Yellow Jackets within two, 34-32, and just over a minute later, Curtis Haywood II hit Tech's first three-pointer of the contest, setting up a 40-36 tally with 13:19 to play. Despite UGA rebuilding a 10-point advantage, the Jackets crawled back within a possession on an old-fashioned three-point play from Brandon Alston. Trailing by nine with 2:17 to play, the Jackets made a late push, closing within four points, but couldn't get any closer.

Georgia Tech shot 32.3 percent (21-65) from the field, while Georgia finished with a 45.5 percent (25-55) clip

Abdoulaye Gueye scored a career-high 16 points off the bench, and five Georgia Tech players scored in double figures as the Yellow Jackets cruised past Kennesaw State, 87-57.

The Yellow Jackets (7-5) bounced back from a poor offensive performance against Georgia in their last game before Christmas by hitting a season-high 56.5 percent from the floor, including a 60-percent effort in the first half as Tech opened a 49-23 advantage against the Owls (3-11). After freshman Michael Devoe missed a jumper on the Jackets' opening possession, Tech sank eight straight shots from the floor, three each from Jose Alvarado and James Banks III, to open a 19-3 lead and never looked back.

Gueye scored three straight baskets of his own in relief of Banks to help the Jackets extend their lead to 46-21 just before halftime, and finished the game 7-for-7 from the floor.

Alvarado, who suffered through a 3-for-20 shooting day against Georgia, went 4-for-7 against the Owls and scored 10 points in just 23:35. Evan Cole scored 11 points of the bench in 13:16, his longest stint since returning from an ankle injury suffered Nov. 13 at Tennessee. Moses Wright and Brandon Alston added 10 points each for the Jackets.

Tyler Hooker led Kennesaw State with 17 points, with Bobby Parker adding 14 and Danny Lewis chipping in with 10. The Owls shot 41.2 percent from the floor and hit six three-point field goals.

Georgia Tech shot a season-best 58.0 percent from the field and closed the non-conference portion of its 2018-19 regular-season schedule with a 79-63 win over visiting USC Upstate.

The strong shooting performance was Georgia Tech's second-straight, as its 58.0-percent field-goal percentage came on the heels of it shooting a then-season-best 56.5 percent from the field in its last outing, an 87-57 win over Kennesaw State last Friday. After making just 32.3 percent of their shots in their loss to Georgia on Dec. 22, the Yellow Jackets are shooting 57.1 percent (64-for-112) over their past two games.

Tech shot especially well in the second half of Wednesday's win, making 60.7 percent of its attempts (17-of-28) to turn an eight-point halftime lead into as large as a 19-point advantage late in the ballgame.

Sophomore Evan Cole led the way for Georgia Tech with a career-high 16 points. Freshman Michael Devoe also matched a career high with 14 points while senior Brandon Alston and sophomore Curtis Haywood II rounded out four Jackets in double-figures with 10 points apiece.

GAME 14

Georgia Tech 92, Wake Forest 79

Jan. 5, 2019 • McCamish Pavilion

James Banks torched Wake Forest for 20 points on 9-of-11 shooting to lead Georgia Tech to a 92-79 win over the Demon Deacons in the Atlantic Coast Conference opener for both teams.

Georgia Tech's 92 points were the most that it has scored in a non-overtime ACC game since it beat Virginia, 94-76, in the opening round of the 2008 ACC Tournament and the Yellow Jackets' most in a non-overtime ACC regular-season game since it topped UVA, 92-69, in 2005.

For the third straight game, Georgia Tech (9-5, 1-0 ACC) shot better than 55 percent from the field, as the Yellow Jackets made 55.8 percent of their shots (29-of-52) in the win. The Jackets are shooting 56.7 percent as a team over the past three games (93-of-164).

Defensively, the Yellow Jackets limited Wake Forest (7-6, 0-1 ACC) to 39.7-percent shooting (27-of-68), which marks the third-straight game that Georgia Tech's opponent has made less than 42 percent of its field-goal attempts.

Banks led four Tech scorers in double-figures with his 20 points. The junior's 20-point output was just two shy of his career high of 22, set last month against Gardner-Webb.

Freshman Michael Devoe, senior Brandon Alston and sophomore Jose Alvarado rounded out the four Yellow Jackets in double-figures with 16, 14 and 13 points, respectively. Devoe's 16 points were a career high, surpassing the 14 he scored on Wednesday night against USC Upstate.

Jose Alvarado and Curtis Haywood combined for six three-point field goals and 34 points, while Georgia Tech shot 68.2 percent from the floor in the second half and pulled away for a 73-59 victory over Syracuse at the Carrier Dome.

The Yellow Jackets (10-6, 2-1 ACC) bounced back from a heart-breaking loss and a defensive struggle Wednesday night with Virginia Tech, outscoring the Orange (11-5, 2-1) 47-33 after intermission. Alvarado and Haywood supplied 28 of those points to stave off two Syracuse rallies and cancel out 22 Tech turnovers.

Alvarado hit 5-of-6 shots from the floor and all three of his three-point attempts, plus a 6-of-7 clip from the free throw line, while Haywood went 6-of-10 from the floor, 3-of-6 from three-point range, and had seven assists.

Tech put itself in position to win with a solid defensive first half, taking a 27-26 lead into the locker room by repeatedly going inside to post players James Banks III and Abdoulaye Gueye, who scored 20 of the Jackets' points. Banks finished with 16 points (6-of-10 FG) and seven rebounds, while Gueye scored 10 in his first start since Nov. 28.

Jose Alvarado and Curtis Haywood II helped the Jackets find their footing, each hitting a pair of three-point baskets and scoring eight points each while Tech rallied to within 35-30 at the half.

But Elijah Thomas dunked to begin a 7-0 Tiger spurt to start the second half, putting Clemson up 42-30, and the Yellow Jackets would get no closer than eight points (68-60 with 1:20 left) the rest of the game.

Banks hit 6-of-11 shots from the floor and blocked four shots for Tech, while Alvarado finished the game with 10 points. Moses Wright scored nine points of the bench, and Michael Devoe added eight for the Jackets, who shot 47.7 percent from the floor.

Thomas scored 11 points with nine rebounds, and David Skara added 10 for the Tigers, who connected on 50.9 percent from the floor and hit seven three-point field goals.

For much of the evening, Tuesday's game was a back-and-forth affair, featuring eight ties and 12 lead changes in the first 29 minutes of the contest. Trailing 42-41 with less than 12 minutes to go, Georgia Tech (11-8, 3-3 ACC) scored 17 of the next 22 points to take its largest lead at 58-47 with 5:08 remaining.

Notre Dame (11-8, 1-5 ACC) pulled within two points on three occasions late in the ballgame but the Yellow Jackets held on for their fourth-straight home win over the Fighting Irish. A follow dunk by Abdoulaye Gueye with 52 seconds to go and a pair of free throws by Jose Alvarado with 8.2 seconds left on the clock proved crucial to the Jackets keeping the Irish at bay.

James Banks and Alvarado led four Jackets in double-figures with 16 points apiece. Gueye added 13 points and Michael Devoe chipped in with 11 to round out Tech's four double-figure scorers. Alvarado's 16-point performance came in his first game back after missing last Saturday's game versus Louisville due to injury while Gueye returned to the lineup for the first time since missing the last two contests due to a medical condition.

Abdoulaye Gueye scored 14 points, Michael Devoe added 11 and Georgia Tech put up a stout defensive effort, but No. 2 Duke rallied from an eight-point deficit early in the second half to outlast the Yellow Jackets, 66-53, at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Tech (11-9, 3-4 ACC) limited the ACC's highest scoring team to its lowest point total of the season, holding Duke to 27 first-half points and 29.6-percent shooting from the floor. The Jackets extended their 29-27 halftime lead to 38-31 on a Gueye layup with under 15 minutes to go in the game before Duke charged back with a 13-0 run to take control of the game.

Ultimately, Tech's second-half mistakes — 11 of its 19 turnovers came from that point — proved costly as the Blue Devils array of freshman talent got on track. R.J. Barrett led Duke with 24 points and 11 rebounds, and Zion Williamson scored 22 points with seven boards as the Blue Devils converted 51.6 percent of their field goals after intermission.

But Tech remained successful limiting Duke's three-point shooting as the Blue Devils managed to hit only two of 21 attempts.

Jose Alvarado finished the game with seven points, eight rebounds and six assists, while Evan Cole gave the Jackets 23 good minutes off the bench with seven points and three rebounds. James Banks III picked up three fouls in the first 10 minutes of the game, and eventually fouled out after scoring just four points with two rebounds in 20 minutes.

That was a close at Tech could get, however, failing to score another point while FSU converted four free throws in the final minutes.

Devoe matched his season best with four, while Kristian Sjolund hit three. Brandon Alston, Curtis Haywood II, Moses Wright and Khalid Moore each had one.

Down 27-16, the Yellow Jackets reeled off 14 straight points to take a 30-27 lead into intermission as Virginia Tech (18-5, 8-4 ACC) missed four straight shots and turned the ball over twice in the final 4:44. Wright scored twice in the run, while Sjolund and Moore each hit threes.

After a Devoe three to start the second half, the Hokies roared back with a 16-4 run to build a 47-37 lead at the 13:36 mark. The Jackets made another run, closing the gap to 49-48 on another Devoe three with 8:56 to go, but that was as close as they would get after Kerry Blackshear, Jr., answered with a layup. Blackshear finished the game with 16 points and eight assists, expertly finding open shooters for the Hokies against the Yellow Jacket zone.

The Hokies, who swept the season series from the Yellow Jackets and have won the last six games in the series, shot 59.3 percent from the floor and connected on 8-of-16 three-pointers in the second half. They scored 17 points off of Georgia Tech turnovers in the game.

Both teams were red-hot coming out of the gates, as Georgia Tech made five of its first six shots and Virginia Tech started 5-of-8. Georgia Tech's Tadrir Jackson keyed the Yellow Jackets' early spurt with four buckets in the first four minutes of the game (including three three-pointers), which helped stake the Jackets to a 14-8 lead.

However, it was all Virginia Tech from that point on. The Hokies closed the first half on an 18-6 run to take a 43-29 halftime lead and opened the second period with a 30-9 spurt that saw their lead balloon to as large as 35 points. VT, which was shooting 66.7 percent from the field with less than 10 minutes to go in the game, made 28-of-53 shots for the contest and scored 24 points on fast breaks.

Playing in front of three busloads of fans from his hometown of Tifton, Ga., Jackson led Georgia Tech (11-16, 4-10 ACC) with 13 points. Jackson's brother, Tyrie, is a redshirt-freshman guard for Virginia Tech. The younger Jackson scored six points in 16 minutes of action.

Justin Robinson led Virginia Tech (19-8, 8-6 ACC) with 18 points.

The game was essentially decided in the first 20 minutes. Virginia Tech, ranked fifth nationally in field-goal percentage, assisted on 14 of 16 baskets before halftime and buried Georgia Tech's offense after it jumped out to a six-point lead in the first four minutes.

Jose Alvarado scored 20 points, and Moses Wright matched his career high with 19 Saturday, but Miami had a hot shooting hand early in the game and cruised to an 80-65 victory at the Watsco Center.

The Hurricanes (12-14, 4-10 ACC) made 12 of their first 19 shots from the floor in opening a 30-13 lead by the 8:09 mark of the first half. The Yellow Jackets (12-16, 4-11 ACC) limited the Hurricanes to one field goal the rest of the half, and opened the second stanza by making 10 of their first 12 shots from the floor, but 11 points (51-40 with 14:01 left in the game) was as close as they could get.

Tech shot 51.6 percent in the second half to Miami's 43.6, and hit 5-of-10 shots from three-point range in outscoring the Hurricanes, 42-41, after intermission. Miami finished the game with nine threes and shot 46.6 percent overall.

Miami center Ebuka Izundu was Tech's primary offensive force in the first half and finished the game with 18 points on 8-of-9 shooting from the floor. D.J. Vasiljevic hit four of his five threes and scored 16 of his game-high 21 points in the second half for the Hurricanes to keep the Jackets at bay. Anthony Lawrence scored 16 points, and Chris Lykes added 11 for Miami.

Alvarado played all 40 minutes and hit 6-of-14 shots from the floor, including 6-of-9 from the foul line and a pair of threes. He also had seven rebounds and four assists. Wright, whose previous career high in an ACC game was nine points, hit 9-of-13 shots and grabbed nine rebounds. Michael Devoe added 13 points for the Jackets.

Jose Alvarado led Georgia Tech in scoring for the fourth straight game with 12 points, while James Banks III and Michael Devoe each scored in double figures, but the Yellow Jackets succumbed to No. 2 Virginia, 81-51, at John Paul Jones Arena.

The Jackets lost for the ninth time in 10 games despite a season-low seven turnovers, while the Cavaliers held onto first-place in the ACC with their fifth consecutive victory.

Tech hung around early and led 11-10 with 14:39 left in the first half, but Virginia ran off eight straight points and 22 of the next 26 to build a 32-15 lead in the latter stages of the first half and 41-22 at intermission on the strength of 53.3-percent shooting. Sophomore Jose Alvarado and freshman Michael Devoe combined to score 41 points, including eight of Georgia Tech's 11 in overtime, to lead the Yellow Jackets to a 81-78 overtime win over Boston College in its home finale at McCamish Pavilion.

Alvarado led all scorers with 21 points while Devoe added 20 in the overtime triumph. James Banks (18 points) and Moses Wright (10) rounded out four scorers in double-figures for the Yellow Jackets. The foursome combined to make 27-of-49 field-goal attempts (55.1 percent), and Tech shot over 50 percent for the eighth time this season, and third time against an ACC team.

Georgia Tech 63, NC State 61

James Banks III scored the game-winning basket on a dunk off a feed from Jose Alvarado with 1.4 seconds remaining, giving Georgia Tech a 63-61 victory over NC State on the road.

It was the final bucket in an 8-for-8 night for Tech's junior center, who was fouled on the play and made the free throw to finish with a game-high 19 points. The winning play gave the Yellow Jackets their second ACC road win this season in their final regular season game.

Tech led by as many as eight points in the second half, 52-44 with 8:07 left, but the Wolfpack rallied by draining four three-point baskets and hitting five free throws in the final eight minutes. Torin Dorn hit the last three with 6.1 seconds left for a 61-60 NC State lead.

Head coach Josh Pastner called timeout and drew up the winning play, in which Alvarado took the inbounds pass and raced up the court. He penetrated the lane, dished to Banks cutting in from the left side, and Banks slammed home the winner.

Banks reached double figures for the third straight game, adding five blocked shots and three assists in 36 minutes. Sophomore forward Moses Wright, playing in his hometown for the first time in a Yellow Jacket uniform, hit 7-of-11 shots from the floor to score 18 points while grabbing eight rebounds in the first full 40-minute game of his career. Alvarado also reached double digits with 12 points, and added six rebounds and four assists while also playing 40 minutes.

The Jackets shot 58.1 percent from the floor, getting most of its baskets from close range and getting only one three-point basket in the game. They also turned the ball over just four times in the second half.


