GEORGIA TECH SEASON REVIEW

Final Record: 14-18 overall, 6-12 ACC (10th place)

In a Nutshell

Georgia Tech (14-18, 6-12 ACC) completed its third season under head coach Josh Pastner by earning the No. 10 seed for ACC Tournament, its highest since 2016, by defeating Boston College (81-78 in overtime at home) and NC State (63-61 on the road) in its final two regular season games. The Yellow Jackets were eliminated in the opening round by Notre Dame,

Starting Lineup

- Rise above The Yellow Jackets finished the season 10th in the ACC after being projected to finish no higher than 13th in the preseason. It is Tech's highest finish since tying for ninth in 2013.
- NCAA bound Eight teams that Georgia Tech played during the 2018-19 season received bids to the NCAA Tournament - Duke, Florida State, Louisville, North Carolina, Syracuse, Tennessee, Virginia and Virginia Tech.
- NIT/other post-season Four other Tech opponents in 2018-19 received post-season bids - Arkansas, Clemson and NC State to the NIT, and UT Rio Grande Valley to the CIT.
- Tuesday's child Georgia Tech has played in the opening round of the ACC Tournament every year since the most recent expansion to 15 teams, winning its first game twice in that stretch. Tech's last ACC Tournament win came in 2016 with an 88-85 overtime victory over Clemson in Washington, D.C.

- Party on the quad Georgia Tech had three quadrant 1 wins this season, according to the NCAA's NET rankings, and all of them occurred on the road (Arkansas, Syracuse, NC State).
- Core group returns Georgia Tech returns all five players who started its final two games of the season, and eight players who started a total of 123 games.
- By the numbers Those eight players accounted for 73.1 percent of Tech's scoring, 66.4 percent of its rebounds and 73.8 percent of the minutes played.
- Outpost In an attempt to invigorate its offense, Georgia Tech returned to a one-post starting alignment for its last eight games (seven regular-season games plus ACC Tournament), with James Banks III starting in the middle with four perimeter players. It helped produce four of the Yellow Jackets' six highest point totals and four of its six highest field goal percentage games in ACC competition. Tech's scoring average rose six points per game over the last eight (64.9) compared to the first 11 ACC games. Its field goal percentage was 44.7 over that span compared to 42.0 before, and its three-point rate was 34.4 percent compared to 27.6 before.
- Guard your yard Georgia Tech ranked as high as 11th this season in defensive efficiency according to KenPom. com. Tech's decision to alter the lineup for extra offense led to a decline in that efficiency, and the Jackets finished 43rd in efficiency, No. 15 in effective field goal percentage defense and No. 12 in three-point defense.
- 50 (per) Cent Tech shot 50 percent or better in 10 games this season, five times against ACC teams, after connecting on better than 50 percent or better in succession against Boston College, NC State and Notre Dame to end the season. The Jackets shot 50 percent in 11 games combined (four vs. ACC teams) in Josh Pastner's first two seasons at Tech.
- Hola again Jose Alvarado scored 110 points in Tech's last six regular-season games (18.3 ppg), including a career-high 29 against Pittsburgh. In those six games, he hit 37-of-75 from the floor, 12-of-40 from three-point range, and he recorded a 24/8 assist-turnover ratio.
- I'll be there for you Jose Alvarado played the full 40 minutes four times in Tech's last nine games (Notre Dame, Pittsburgh, Miami, NC State). The sophomore has logged 13 complete games in his career five this season.
- Wholly Moses Moses Wright finished the season playing the best basketball of his career. He reached double figures in four of his last five games, including a career-high 25 vs. Notre dame in the ACC Tournament, 19 at Miami and 18 at NC State). He averaged 15.6 points (36-of-58 FG) and 6.2 rebounds over that stretch.
- Crack that whip Michael Devoe went 32-for-68 from three-point range (47.1 pct.) in Tech's last 15 games. He had gone 12-for-43 in the first 17 games of the season. He has averaged 11.6 points and 3.2 assists in his last five games.
- The Bank is open James Banks finished the season with four straight games in double digits (11 with seven rebounds at Virginia, 18/9 vs. Boston College, 19/9 at NC State, 12/11 vs. Notre Dame). He averaged 15 points and 9.0 rebounds in that stretch, hitting 26-of-35 shots from the floor. He went 8-for-8 in the regular-season finale at NC State, including the gamewinning slam dunk.
- Tech tribunal Alvarado, Devoe and Banks each scored in double figures in the same game six times, and Tech won four of those games. They combined for 45 of 69 points at Arkansas, 49 of 92 against Wake Forest, 43 of 63 in the first meeting against Notre Dame, and 59 of 81 against Boston College.
- Three's the charm Tech averaged 6.8 threes and shot 34.4 percent from beyond the arc in its last eight games. In the seven games before that, the Jackets shot 25-for-111 (22.5 pct.) from bonus range.
- Youts are served Georgia Tech's seven freshmen and sophomores played 68.2 percent of the minutes for Tech in ACC games.

ACC Tournament MVPs: 3 ACC All-Freshman Team: 15 starting lineups this season. Eleven players started three or more games, and 10 started at least one ACC game.

- Longer bench Tech's reserves played 33.5 percent of available minutes, No. 90 in the nation according to KenPom. com (national average was 30.4 pct.). However, in Tech's final three games, Tech's bench saw just 68 of a possible 625 minutes (10.9 pct.).
- Premature ending again For the second straight year, Curtis Haywood II saw his season cut short by injury. The sophomore guard injured his left ankle against Boston College and is sidelined indefinitely. Freshman Khalid Moore replaced him in the starting lineup at NC State.

Three Seniors' Careers Close

Three Georgia Tech seniors - Brandon Alston, Abdoulaye Gueye and Sylvester Ogbonda - closed out their careers in 2018-19.

Alston, a 6-5 guard from Vienna, Va., is finishing his second season as a graduate transfer after three years at Lehigh, and has played in 57 games as a Yellow Jackets, starting 24 while averaging 6.3 points per game. He is finishing his master's degree in ecnomics this semester.

Ogbonda, a 6-10 center from Port Harcourt, Nigeria, attended National Christian Academy in Washington, D.C., before coming to Tech, where he is a fourth-year junior in terms of athletic eligibility. After a redshirt year in 2015-16, he has played in 42 games as a backup in the post, and is completing course work this semester for his bachelor's degree in business administration.

Gueye, a 6-9 forward from Dakar, Senegal, is a fifth-year senior who has played in 88 games and started 39 during his career. He attended Central Park Christian School in Birmingham, Ala., before coming to Tech. He took a redshirt year in 2015-16 and has been a part-time starter in the last two seasons. He is finishing his degree requirements in business administration this semester

Banks Named to ACC All-Defensive Team

Georgia Tech's James Banks III was named to the ACC's All-Defensive team, the Yellow Jackets' fifth All-Defensive team honoree in the last seven years, joining centers Daniel Miller (2013, 2014) and Ben Lammers (2017, 2018), and the fourth different Tech center to make the team since its establishment in 2000.

The 6-9 junior from Decatur, Ga., led the ACC in blocked shots this season (2.52 in ACC games, 2.52 in all games) and anchored a Tech defense that has ranked as high as 11th nationally in defensive efficiency according to KenPom.com. The pivotman also ranked in the ACC's top 10 in rebound average (7.7) and has scored 10.5 points per game.

Alston on ACC All-Academic Team

Brandon Alston, a graduate student-athlete on Georgia Tech's basketball team, been named to the annual All-Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Men's Basketball team. It is the second time Alston has been recognized.

The Vienna, Va., native, who is a senior in terms of athletic eligibility, has played in 25 games, starting five, for the Yellow Jackets this season. He has been Tech's fourth-leading scorer at 7.3 points per game while shooting 46.5 percent from the floor and a team-leading 38.9 percent from three-point range. The 6-5 guard also leads the jackets in free throw shooting at 83.7 percent, having made his last 12 in a row and 22 of his last 23.

He is completing his coursework for a Master's degree in economics this semester. He earned a bachelor's degree in economics at Lehigh in 2017.

Haywood II, Jester Elect to Transfer

to another school at the end of the spring semester. He has two years of eligibility remaining.

Haywood played in every game for Tech in 2018-19, starting 19, until suffering a left ankle injury in the Yellow Jacket's final home game against Boston College, sidelining the 6-5 guard for the season's final two games. He averaged 5.6 points and 2.7 rebounds, and was third on the team in assists with 59.

The native of Oklahoma City, Okla., missed 17 games during his freshman season due to injury, including the final 11 with a stress reaction in his right leg. He averaged 5.3 points and shot 37 percent from three-point range in 15 games.

Non-scholarship forward Evan Jester, a rising sophomore who played in five games over two seasons, also exercised his option to transfer after spring semester.

Asanti Price signs in the Spring

Asanti Price, a 6-5, 175-pound guard from Columbia, S.C., and W.J. Keenan High School, signed a national letter-of-intent during the spring signing period.

Rated a three-star prospect and ranked No. 74 among shooting guards nationally in the 247Sports composite rankings, Price led W.J. Keenan High school with 17.9 points per game and was considered one of the top shooters in the area during the 2018-19 season. Price had more than 20 points in the Raiders' final two playoff games including 22 in the state championship game victory over Ridgeland-Hardeeville, a game in which he went 8-of-12 in the second half. He was a Class 3A all-state selection and also selected to play in the Carolinas Classin

Price played his senior year at Keenan for coach Zach Norris and helped lead the Raiders to a 30-1 record after previously attending Eau Claire High School, where he averaged 16 points per game as a junior.

USC Transfer Usher Joins Jackets

Jordan Usher, a 6-7, 225-poind forward, transferred from Southern California and enrolled at Tech for the spring semester.

Usher arrived Tech after playing a season and a half for the Trojans, departing from USC after the fall 2018 semester. He must complete a year of residency at Georgia Tech and will become eligible to play for the Yellow Jackets following the conclusion of the fall 2019 term. He will be eligible for the remainder of the 2019-20 season and all of the 2020-21 season.

A native of Canton, Ga., Usher played in all 36 games with two starts for the Trojans as a freshman in 2017-18, averaging 4.8 points and 2.0 rebounds per game while connecting on 40.9 percent of his three-point field goal attempts. In 2018-19, Usher played in 12 games and made two starts, averaging 8.6 points and 3.7 rebounds. A 4-star prospect ranked No. 104 in the nation by 247Sports, Usher played his senior season (2016-17) at Wheeler High School in Marietta, Ga., and prior to that, he attended Sequoyah High School in Canton.

Didenko Signs in the Fall

David Didenko, a 6-8, 230-pound forward from Boca Raton, Fla., who attends Palm Beach State College, signed a national letter-of-intent with Georgia Tech during the early signing period in November.

Didenko attended Boca Raton Community High School before enrolling this year at Palm Beach State, a junior college in Boca Raton. A full academic qualifier in high school, Didenko will enroll at Tech in the summer and have three years of eligibility with the Yellow Jackets.

Born in Russia, Didenko moved to New York in August, 2010, at the age of 10, and is a United States citizen. Prior to his enrollment at Boca Raton Community High School, Didenko attended Northeast High School as a junior, and Montverde Academy for his ninth- and 10th-grade years.

Jackets Eliminated from ACC Tournament by Notre Dame

Moses Wright scored a career-high 25 points, and Georgia Tech rallied from a 20-point halftime deficit to within three, but the Yellow Jackets came up short in a 78-71 loss to Notre Dame in the opening round of the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament at the Spectrum Center.

The Fighting Irish (14-18) came out hot and burned the Yellow Jackets' zone defense to the tune of 58 percent from the floor and 7-of-11 from the three-point line in taking a 52-32 lead into the halftime locker room. It was a season high for points given up in a half for Tech.

The Jackets (14-18) switched to a man-to-man coming out of halftime, holding the Fighting Irish to 34.6 percent shooting and half their first-half point total, and went on the attack offensively to hit 60 percent of their own shots. Wright scored Tech's first eight points after intermission and collected 18 in the half, hitting 9-of-12 shots from the floor, while freshman Khalid Moore helped the cause with 10 of his 11 points in the frame.

Tech still trailed by 15 as the clock wound under eight minutes before the Jackets made their biggest push, trimming the margin to 72-69 on Moore's three-pointer from the right corner with just over a minute remaining. But John Mooney, who had 20 points and 10 rebounds in the game, answered with a jumper to restore the Notre Dame lead to five, and the Irish iced the game at the free throw line.

James Banks III finished the game with 12 points and 11 rebounds, his seventh double-double this season, and Michael Devoe added 10 for the Jackets.

Following the Trends

- For the last eight games of the season, Georgia Tech started out in a 4-out, 1-in alignment, starting guards Jose Alvarado and Michael Devoe with two wings and post man James Banks III. The two wing forwards have rotated, but Moses Wright occupied one of those for the past seven games, and freshman Khalid Moore started the last two. That lineup has started eight games during the season and posted a record of 5-3.

started for the 21st time. Devoe, a freshman, started Tech's last 23 games, Banks started the last 26 games in the post, and Alvarado started 30 games.

- Georgia Tech used 12 different starting lineups in 2018-19. No Yellow Jacket started every game this season, and 10 different players started three or more games.
- Tech utilized its shortest playing rotation of the season seven players - in its final two regular season games, expanding to eight in the ACC Tournament loss to Notre Dame. Tech's bench logged just 68 minutes in the last three games. At least eight Yellow Jackets, and often nine of 10, had played in every previous ACC game.
- Georgia Tech has lost its opening game in the ACC Tournament four straight years, The Jackets last won an ACC Tournament game in 2016 in Washington, D.C.
- Tech shot 50 percent or better in 10 games this season, one fewer than in the last two seasons combined. The Jackets hit 50 percent or better five times during conference play and the ACC Tournament, one more than in the last two seasons combined. The Jackets shot 50 percent in six games in 2017-18 (three ACC games), and five times (once in ACC play)
- Tech finished the season shooting better than 50 percent in three straight games (53 percent combined) - 50.8 vs. Boston College, 58.1 vs. NC State and 51.7 vs. Notre Dame.
- Tech scored 40 or more points in the paint in each of its final three games - 44 each against Boston College and NC State, 40 against Notre Dame. The Jackets averaged 32.1 points in the paint per game for the year.
- Tech's two best shooting games this season came in its two ACC road wins - 59.5 percent at Syracuse and 58.1 percent at NC State - and in those games attempted just 17 three-point shots and went 43-for-68 inside the arc.
- Tech matched a low for turnovers under Josh Pastner (6) against Notre Dame in the ACC Tournament and committed fewer than 10 in three of its last four games. Conversely, the Jackets managed to win three road games this season despite high turnover counts $-\,20$ at Arkansas, 22 at Syracuse and 16 at NC State.
- Tech (7-for-20 vs. Notre Dame) averaged 6.8 threes and shot 34.4 percent from beyond the arc in its eight games (Devoe 46.7 pct., Sjolund 38.2 pct. in that stretch). For the season, Tech averaged 5.5 threes and connected on 30.7
- Tech held 18 opponents this season, and nine ACC opponents, under 40 percent from the floor. The Jackets limited 16 opponents, nine in the ACC, to 30 percent or less from threepoint range.
- Tech's largest deficit overcome to win this season: 10 points against Prairie View A&M. In ACC play, it was eight points to Boston College.
- Two fouls in the first half? No problem. The Yellow Jackets led the nation, according to KenPom.com, in highest

percentage of first-half minutes played by players with two fouls (64.8 pct.). The national average was 21.5 percent.

Personnel Highlights

- · Jose Alvarado scored in double digits in six of Tech's last seven games, averaged 16.1 points over that stretch and leading the Jackets in scoring five times. He hit 38-of-83 shots from the floor (45.7 percent), 13-for-36 from three-point range (36.1 percent). The 6-foot sophomore scored 17 against Florida State, 29 vs. Pittsburgh, 20 at Miami, 12 at Virginia, 21 against Boston College and 11 at NC State. Alvarado had scored a total of 25 points, attempting just two free throws, in the six games prior.
- · Alvarado scored (38) or assisted (29) on 67 of Tech's 154 field goals in the last seven games. In those six games, he also had 32 rebounds and 13 steals.
- · Alvarado committed just nine turnovers over his last nine games (349 total minutes).
- · Alvarado played all but seven minutes in Tech's last seven games, playing the full 40 minutes against Pittsburgh, Miami and NC State and 44 of 45 in Tech's overtime win over Boston College. The sophomore has 13 complete games in his career, five in 2018-19.
- . Moses Wright reached double figures in four of his last five games, tallying more than a third of his season total over that stretch (19 vs. Miami, 10 vs. Boston College, 18 at NC State, career-best 25 against Notre Dame in the ACC Tournament). He averaged 15.6 points and 6.2 rebounds and hit 36-of-58 shots from the floor (62.1 pct.) in those games. Prior to that, Wright had averaged
- Going back further, Wright averaged 26 minutes over the final eight games of the season, averaging 11.8 points and 5.1 rebounds, while hitting 42-of-80 field goals (52.5 pct.). Prior to that, Wright had averaged 11.9 minutes, 3.1 points and 2.6 rebounds in the Jackets' first 11 conference games.
- James Banks III rebounded from his first scoreless game as a Yellow Jacket (Feb. 23 at Miami) to finish the season with four straight double-figure games, 11 points and seven rebounds at Virginia followed by 18 and 9 against Boston College, 19 and 9 at NC State, and 12 and 11 against Notre Dame (that's 15.0 ppg and 9.0 rpg). Devoe hit a team-best 43.8 percent of his three-point tries in regular-season ACC play, leading the Jackets with 32 threes. Devoe was 25-of-54 from three-point land (46.3 pct.) in his last 10 games.

· Devoe played all but one minute in Tech's last three games, playing every minute of Tech's overtime win against Boston College and all 40 against Notre Dame in the ACC Tournament. He finished the season with four complete games and ranks seventh among all freshmen in power conferences in minutes played.

Pastner's Key Metrics

- Assists to made field goals: The Jackets finished at 57.4 percent for the season (49th in the nation) and 56.4 percent in ACC games. Tech, whose nightly goal is 60 percent, averaged 17.3 assists in its final three games and assisted on 59.8 percent of its field goals.
- Free throws made to opponents' attempts: Tech is 39-17 under Josh Pastner when attempting more free throws than the opponent. Tech made more free throws than its opponent (a nightly goal for the team) just six times during the season, and was outscored from the free throw line 13.4-11.4 per game in conference play, 13.8-12.7 per game overall.
- Turnovers: Tech averaged 14.3 turnovers per game in ACC play, and only forced 11.3. Target each night is to commit 11 or fewer, which Tech met only three times all season (all in the last four games). More telling for Tech under Josh Pastner is that when Tech has committed fewer turnovers than its opponent, it is 22-15. When it has committed more, it is 23-30.
- Guard rebounding: The group of Alvarado, Alston, Devoe, Haywood, Moore and Phillips combined to take 364 of Tech's 809 defensive rebounds (56 percent)

Assisted Living

Georgia Tech coach Josh Pastner preached and prodded his Yellow Jackets on ball and player movement and hard cutting from the first time he got his team on the practice court. His primary measuring stick on how well the Jackets perform offensively is their ratio of assists to made field goals, and the Jackets' struggle to score this season is not for lack of ball movement.

Tech finished No. 49 in 2018-19 at 57.6 percent (56.4 pct. in ACC games), well above the national average (52.1 pct.) in that category.

The Jackets did not perform as well in that department in 2017-18, assisting on 54.6 of its made field goals overall, 53.9 against ACC teams, and missing Pastner's 60-percent bar

In Pastner's first season, the Yellow Jackets ranked 13th nationally, according to KenPom.com, in highest percentage of assists to made field goals at 62.6 percent, the team's highest rate since the 2000-01 season. Tech's number was 63.2 percent in ACC games. Pastner's nightly goal is 60 percent.

Build the Wall

Due to its ability to play both zone and man-to-man and keep opponents off-balance, Georgia Tech has been able to rely on its mixture of defenses to win games over Josh Pastner's first three seasons at Georgia Tech.

This Yellow Jacket team played it well enough to rank No. 43 in adjusted defensive efficiency (96.6 ppg/100 possessions). Tech ranked as high as 11th during the season before adjusting its lineup in an effort to boost its offensive output. and was No. 5

in the ACC and No. 53 in the NCAA in scoring defense at 66.6 points per game.

Tech was most effective at shutting down the three, ranking 13th nationally, and rim protection with center James Banks III leading the ACC and No. 11 nationally in blocked shots.

Tech faced three of the nation's top 15 teams in offensive efficiency as ranked by KenPom.com - Tennessee (3), Duke (6) and Virginia Tech (12) - and held them to an average of 61.3 points. Each posted their lowest efficiency rating of the season against the Jackets. North Carolina was No. 7, and the Jackets held the Tar Heels to their fourth-lowest rating of the season. Tech held Florida State (36th) to two of its three lowest efficiency ratings of the season, and NC State (29th) to its lowest of the season outside of its 24-point game against Virginia Tech.

Tech's NIT finals team from 2017 ranked No. 6 in adjusted offensive efficiency (91.0 points allowed per 100 possessions) according to KenPom.com. That group ranked fourth in the ACC in scoring defense (66.8 ppg) and No. 1 in FG percentage defense (39.8 pct.).

- Said Florida State coach Leonard Hamilton: "Georgia Tech utilizes a defensive scheme that is probably the best match-up zone defensive scheme that I've seen in my coaching career. They do an outstanding job of taking away so many different spots on the floor that you normally are accustomed to operating in."
- Said Notre Dame coach Mike Brey: "They are really hard to score on. There's a reason why their stats play out as one of the best, if not the best, defensive team in our league. They are just really hard to deal with. They're long, they're athletic, they're in passing lanes and if you do beat them, they've got shot blocker in the back."
- Said Pittsburgh coach Jeff Capel: "Their defense is difficult. Their defense is different. It's unique. They have length around the basket and they understand how to move in their defense and their zone."

Jose Can You See

Point guard Jose Alvarado, recruited to Georgia Tech primarily for his winning attitude and determination, was given the green light by head coach Josh Pastner to handle the position, sink or swim.

The Brooklyn native, the first Tech player from the New York area in nearly 20 years, has developed into the Yellow Jackets' engine on the floor in his sophomore season, leading the Jackets in scoring (12.5 ppg), assists (3.6 apg), steals (1.8 pg) and free throw percentage (76.9 pct.) in ACC games. He also took 3.9 rebounds on average in ACC games to date, tied for second most on the squad.

Alvarado's freshman season was full of promise until it came to an abrupt halt on Feb. 11, when he dislocated his left elbow on a hard fall to the floor trying to contest a breakaway shot

For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

from Duke's Javin Delaurier. Until then, he had averaged 12.6 points per game to rank second on the team, 3.9 rebounds and 3.3 assists. He also shot the ball well, making 45 percent of his shots from the floor, 37.4 percent from three-point distance, and 80.2 percent from the foul line on 80 attempts.

Alvarado has posted 36 double-figure scoring games in his career, 10 times scoring 20 or more. And the 6-foot playmaker has averaged more than 34 minutes per game, with 13 complete 40-minute games.

• Said Pittsburgh coach Jeff Capel: "[Jose] Alvarado is a big-time competitor. We told our guys coming into this game, I know that kid and I know his spirit. With his team struggling, I knew that he would try to take it upon himself to be aggressive and have a great game. He was sensational."

Devoe Steadily Grows

Freshman guard Michael Devoe, the highest-rated high school prospect Georgia Tech has recruited under Josh Pastner, steadily improved for the Yellow Jackets since the season began.

The Orlando, Fla., native suffered a setback by missing six weeks of preseason practice with a toe injury and began the season slowly, but steadily played more minutes and improved his production.

He entered the Tech starting lineup at Arkansas on Dec. 19, a game Tech won, 69-65, and he scored 11 points. He has connected on 43.8 percent of his three-point tries in ACC games (would rank No. 3 in the ACC with enough 3PM) and averaged 35.4 minutes (10th-most).

Devoe scored 16 points in his ACC debut against Wake Forest, and had nine double-sigit scoring games in his last 14. He hit 32-of-68 (47.1 pct.) three-point tries in his last 15 games.

Banking Hours

The most significant development in the direction of this year's Georgia Tech team may have occured Nov. 13, when the NCAA granted James Banks III immediate eligibility after his transfer from Texas.

Tech received that news while conducting its shootaround for its second game of the season, at Tennesee. Arrangements were made to get Banks to Knoxville (transfers do not travel with the team), where he contributed five points and seven rebounds in a 66-53 loss.

The personable 6-9 post player progressed rapidly since that modest start. He posted his first double-double four games later at Northwestern (12 pts/12 rebs), and made his first start the game after that against St. John's (14 pts/12 rebs).

In ACC play, Banks was Tech's No. 2 scorer (11.4 ppg) and top rebounder (7.1 rpg), hitting 55 percent of his shots from the floor and 71.2 percent of his free throws, while leading the conference in blocked shots (2.52 pg).

Defensively, he led the conference in all games and ranks No. 11 nationally in blocked shots (2.52 per game), and anchored one of the nation's top defensive teams (No. 37 nationally in defensive efficiency according to Kenpom.com).

He added three more double-doubles, 24/11 against Louisville, 16/10 and 12/11 in two meetings against Notre Dame, and had six for the season.

It took Banks 23 games at Tech to exceed his 46-game totals at Texas in every offensive category, plus blocks and steals.

Getting it Wright

Part of Georgia Tech's improvement at the end of the year can be attributed to the emergence of sophomore forward Moses Wright.

The 6-9 Raleigh, N.C., native started the Yellow Jackets' last seven games and blossomed in the last four, averaging 15.6 points and 6.2 rebounds while connecting on 36-of-58 shots form the floor.

Wright came out of William G. Enloe High School in Raleigh with no recruiting rating, but played well in his senior

Thin Gold Line

Some of Georgia Tech's most successful teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference era have had thin benches and a trio of players who averaged more than 35 minutes per game in ACC play, beginning with the Yellow Jackets' first ACC Championship team in 1985, dubbed the "Thin Gold Line."

year of varsity basketball and in AAU ball and drew the attnetion of Tech's coaching staff for his athletic ability and his basketball

He is most effective running the floor, attacking the basket to score and rebound, and using his athletic ability and length to be disruptive on defense. Before taking up basketball seriously just a few years ago, he played tennis and swam.

Wright started 14 games early in the year but was inconsistent, posting three double-figure scoring games, but also going scoreless five times.

He began playing more extensively again Feb. 13 at Virginia Tech (24.7 mpg), and scored 19 points at Miami on Feb. 23. In his first trip back to Raleigh in a Tech uniform, he scored 18 points with eight rebounds in a career-high 39 minutes in the Jackets' win at NC State. He finished off the season with a career-high 25 points (12-of-18 FG) in the ACC Tournament against Notre Dame.

Out of Africa

Georgia Tech got a big lift from an unlikely source once ACC play began last season, junior forward Abdoulaye Gueye (pronounced "AB-doo-lie GAY). During the month of January and into February, the Yellow Jackets saw the 6-9 native of Senegal (by way of Birmingham, Ala.) become a legimate offensive force, and not just a disruptor on defense and on the boards.

Known as "A.D." to his teammates and coaches, the likeable Gueye took advantage of a much-improved jump hook shot to average 6.5 points (50 percent from the floor) and 4.5 rebounds in in ACC games.

The fifth-year has made a similar jump from non-conference to ACC play this season as well, averaging 8.1 points and 3.9 rebounds while hitting 51.9 percent shots from the floor. He scored in double figures in seven ACC games.

His role shifted from starting big forward to backup center

Building Depth

Georgia Tech deployed 12 different starting lineups in 2018-19, and 10 Yellow Jackets started three or more games.

Tech deployed at least eight players for significant minutes in most of its games, including as many as nine or 10 in its ACC games, until the last three, when coach Josh Pastner went with a seven-man rotation, and Tech's bench played just 68 minutes (10.9 percent) in those games.

Tech's bench played 33.5 percent of available minutes, No. 90 in the nation according to KenPom.com (national average is 30.4 pct.). Last season, Tech ranked No. 210 with 30.1 minutes played by reserves.

In conference play this season, head coach Josh Pastner relied on a core group for longer durations - Jose Alvarado and Michael Devoe rank among the conference top 10 in average minutes, yet still has utilized eight or nine players altogether.

Other Storylines for 2018-19

- 104th season Georgia Tech completed its 104th season of basketball and has an all-time record of 1,376-1,244
- Unlucky 13 Tech was picked to finish 13th in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season in a vote of the ACC media, ahead of Pittsburgh and Wake Forest. The Yellow Jackets finished 10th.
- Seven Number of freshmen and sophomores playing significant roles for the Yellow Jackets this season. They played 68.1 percent of the minutes for Tech in ACC games.
- 1.22 years Average experience of the players on Georgia Tech's current roster, which ranked No. 306 in the nation (No. 1 is the oldest), according to KenPom.com. The national average is 1.67 years.
- Above average Georgia Tech ranked No. 79, according to Kenpom.com, in average height (77.5 inches) among the nation's Division I teams. The national average is 76.8.
- Georgia Tech will return its top three scorers, and six of its top eight, from the 2018-19 roster. Next year's team will include two seniors, four juniors and three sophomores among its scholarship players.
- For the first time in 2919-20, Georgia Tech's roster will be entirely composed of student-athlete recruited by head coach Josh Pastner and his staff.
- Tech has a young roster three freshmen, four sophomores, three juniors and two seniors among scholarship players returning or incoming — but the process of getting old and staying old and building a sustainable winning program is ongoing.
- Player development successes over the past three seasons include Josh Okogie, Ben Lammers, Tadric Jackson, Abdoulaye Gueye, James Banks III and Moses Wright, who maximized their skill sets and their production under the current coaching staff. Okogie went from being ranked the 11th in the state as a HS senior to a first-round NBA draft pick. In the last two seasons, Gueye, a 6-9 forward, developed from a project player into an ACC-level contributor. Banks, a 6-9 center, exceeded his two-year totals at Texas in just 23 games and led the ACC in blocked shots. Graduate transfer Brandon Alston had similar statistical numbers on the ACC level as he compiled in two seasons at Lehigh. Wright blossomed at the end of the 2018-19 season and averaged more than 15 points and six rebounds, tripling his season scoring average and doubling his

rehound norm

- Tech won 48 games overall and 20 ACC games in Josh Pastner's first three seasons, on par or better than the first three years of each of Josh Pastner's predecessors in the ACC era. For comparison, Tony Bennett won 21 ACC games (53 overall) in his first three years at Virginia, Leonard Hamilton won 14 at Florida State (45 overall) and Mike Krzyzewski won 13 (38 overall).
- Tech has sold out 12 games at McCamish Pavilion over the past three seasons, including a facility-record five games in 2017-18 and four last year. Tech's 40 homecourt wins over Pastner's first three seasons are more than any three-year period for Tech in its ACC era except the 2004-05 through 2006-07 seasons (also 40).

Wire-to-Wire

Though he has expanded his playing rotation this year to reflect the growing level of talent within the program, head coach Josh Pastner remains committed to a tight playing rotation, reminiscent of the way Bobby Cremins coached the Yellow Jackets over his 19 seasons.

Tech utilized its bench for an average of 47.6 minutes (23.6 percent of available minutes) in its regular-season ACC games after averaging 78 minutes in non-conference play.

Jose Alvarado, who had played 96.7 percent of possible ACC minutes prior to his Feb. 11 injury last season, is averaging 36.2 minutes in ACC games this season and has played 35 or more minutes 18 times this season.

Freshman Michael Devoe averaged 35.4 minutes in ACC games, and James Banks III averaged 32.8. Alvarado and Devoe, who both rank among the ACC's top 10, each played the full 40 minutes at Notre Dame on Feb. 10. Alvarado also did so against Pittsburgh, Miami and NC State, and Devoe went all 45 minutes in overtime against Boston College and played the full 40 in the ACC Tournament against Notre Dame.

Last season, Alvarado had ranked fifth among freshmen nationally in percentage of minutes played and minutes per game before he was injured. He has posted 13 complete, 40-minute games in his career.

Tech players had 20 complete games combined in 2017-18, and had at least one player play the full 40 in 12 of 19 ACC games (regular season plus tournament). This season, Alvarado had five and Devoe three.

NOTE: Between the Cremins era and the arrival of Pastner, only one Georgia Tech player played every minute of a game, regulation or overtime, and that was Marcus Georges-Hunt on Feb. 20, 2016, in a win over Notre Dame at home. In the final 15 seasons of Cremins' tenure (1985-86 through 1999-2000), a total of 196 players logged a 40-minute game.

20-Game ACC Schedule Rotation Announced

The Atlantic Coast Conference announced the future matchups of the league's 20-game men's basketball schedule, which begins with the 2019-20 season. The 20-game matrix is in effect for three years through the 2021-22 season.

Each team will play its two primary rivals every season both home and away (four games, Clemson and Notre Dame remain Georgia Tech's primary home-and-away opponents) and four repeat opponents both home and away (eight games). The remaining eight opponents will be single games, four at home and four on the road. The full cycle of repeat opponents will be complete following the third year.

Under the former 18-game schedule, each team played four opponents both home and away each season, four at home and four away.

In 2019-20, Georgia Tech will play Louisville, NC State, Pittsburgh and Syracuse both home and away in addition to Clemson and Notre Dame, with Duke, Miami, Virginia and Virginia Tech visiting McCamish Pavilion.

In 2020-21, Tech's home-and-away opponents will be

Media Guidelines

Georgia Tech's practices are closed to the public and the media, but coaches and tudent-athletes are made available prior to each game before one of the team's practices. Notices will be distributed weekly to confirm the schedule.

TV stations are allowed to shoot B-roll during the first 10 minutes of those practices.

Media are asked to notify Mike Stamus *the day before* of their need to attend and to make specific student-athlete requests.

Interview requests with student-athletes that need to be conducted at other times must be arranged through the Georgia Tech communications office at least 24 hours in advance. These interviews will be conducted at a time and place convenient to the student-athletes' availability and class schedule.

Media are asked not to contact student-athletes directly either by phone, e-mail, text or social media. They are instructed not to respond. Every effort will be made to make them available.

Interviewing Coach Pastner

Each head coach will hold a post-game press conference in the designated interview room (Shah Media Room at McCamish Pavilion).

Student-athletes requested by the media will be brought to the interview room following the coaches press conferences, when the team is at home, outside the team's locker room when the team is on the road.

Josh Pastner Radio Show

Head coach Josh Pastner's weekly radio show airs each Monday from 7-8 p.m. on "680 the Fan" and 93.7 FM, beginning Dec. 3.

ACC Coaches Weekly Teleconference

The 15 ACC head basketball coaches will be featured on nine Monday teleconferences during the 2018-19 season, beginning on Monday, January 7, and continuing through March 4. Each coach will have 10 minutes to make an opening statement and answer questions. There will be an instant replay of each teleconference on the Conference's internet site TheACC.com each Monday afternoon.

Georgia Tech head coach Josh Pastner will be on the teleconference at 10:50 a.m. each week.

Coaches that play on Monday in January and February are not required to participate in that day's call. Coach Pastner will be on every Monday at the same time. The teleconference schedule for each Monday will differ for the other 14 head coaches, depending on what teams play that Monday night.

In 2021-22, the Yellow Jackets play Clemson, Notre Dame, Boston College, Miami, North Carolina and Virginia Tech both home and on the road, and will host Florida State, Louisville, NC State and Wake Forest.

Tech to Open 2018-19 Season at NC State

Georgia Techwill open its 2019-20 season Tuesday, Nov. 5, with an ACC game at NC State as part of the opening slate of conference games. The two-day opening schedule will broadcast games on ACC Network (ACCN), ESPN2 and ESPNU. In all, the ACC will open up with seven conference games to start the season.

ESPN announced four games will be broadcast on the ACC Network, the new 24/7 national platform that will launch on August 22, 2019. The exclusive early-season basketball broadcasts include: Louisville at Miami and Georgia Tech at NC State (Tuesday, Nov. 5); Notre Dame at North Carolina and Virginia at Syracuse (Wednesday, Nov. 6).

Three additional conference games will be aired on ESPN2 or ESPNU including Virginia Tech at Clemson (Nov. 5), Wake Forest at Boston College (Nov. 6), and Florida State at Pitt (Nov. 6). Duke is set to compete in the State Farm Champions Classic (November 5), which will be aired on ESPN.

Tech to Take Summer Tour to Spain

Georgia Tech's men's basketball team will take its first summer tour out of the United State since 2015 when the Yellow Jackets take an eight-day tour of Spain in August.

The tour will take place from August 8-16, coinciding with the break between summer and fall academic terms. The Yellow Jackets will spend the first three days (Aug. 9-11) in Barcelona, then take a high-speed train to Madrid, where they will stay from Aug. 12-16. Tech will play four games, two in each city, against teams to be determined by the Spanish Basketball Federation.

Along with the basketball competition, the Yellow Jackets will have the opportunity for sight-seeing tours of the U.S. Embassy in Barcelona and the Royal Palace in Madrid, visit the professional soccer facilities of FC Barcelona and Real Madrid, and other activities still to be determined.

Per NCAA rules, the Yellow Jackets will be allowed 10 practices to prepare for the tour along in addition to the currently allowable off-season training and skill development.

Tech has made summer international tours twice previously, most recently to The Bahamas in 2015. The Jackets traveled to France in August of 1991.

Tech to Play in 2019 Diamond Head Classic

Georgia Tech will make the fifth trip to the state of Hawai'i in program history next December when it will compete in the 2019 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic in Honolulu,

The field for the 2019 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic features Ball State (Mid-American), Boise State (Mountain West), Georgia Tech (ACC), tournament host school Hawai'i (Big West), Houston (AAC), Portland (WCC), UTEP (Conference USA), and Washington (Pac-12). The 11th annual event will be played at the Stan Sheriff Center on the campus of the University of Hawai'i.

Three teams in the 2019 field were a part of the postseason last season – Boise State (NIT), Houston (NCAA) and Washington (NIT). Meanwhile, five teams will make their first-ever appearance in the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic.

Tech has a 10-5 record all time in four previous tournament events in Hawai'i, including a 6-3 mark in three appearances in the Rainbow Classic – 1984 champions, 1988, 1994 – which also were held at the University of Hawai'i. The Yellow Jackets also played in the 1998 Big Island Classic in Hilo, and the 2006 Maui Invitational.

Tech-UGA Game Moves to November Next Two Seasons

The Georgia Tech and Georgia basketball teams have signed an agreement to play the next two games of the series the week before Thanksgiving, giving both teams an opportunity to play the game at home in front of their student bodies before the fall semester ends.

The teams will face off next season on Wednesday, Nov. 20, at Stegeman Coliseum in Athens, and the following season on Thursday, Nov. 19, at McCamish Pavilion in Atlanta.

In the 194-game history of the series, Tech and Georgia have played their game before Thanksgiving only twice, on Nov. 15, 2013 in Athens and Nov. 14. 2014 in Atlanta. The Yellow Jackets won both games and lead the all-time series, 105-89.

As Southeastern Conference foes from 1932-64, the games were played in January, February and March. After Tech left the ACC, most of the games remained in January and February until the rivalry became a late December fixture at the Omni arena in downtown Atlanta from 1981-94. The series has been played on the two campuses every year since then, mostly in December.

Four Tech Alumni on NBA Rosters

Since 1982, Georgia Tech has produced 19 first-round NBA draft picks and 44 draft picks overall. A total of 38 Georgia Tech alumni have played in the NBA.

Four former Georgia Tech basketball stars were on NBA rosters at the start of the 2018-19 season, including guard **Josh Okogie**, who was drafted 20th overall by for the Minnesota Timberwolves.

Iman Shumpert, a seven-year NBA veteran, played his third full season in Cleveland after helping the Cavaliers win the NBA championship in 2016, and was traded before the deadline to Sacramento last season, and was traded to Houston this season.

Thaddeus Young, an 11-year NBA veteran, is now in his third season with the Indiana Pacers after playing seven seasons in Philadelphia, one in Minnesota and two in Brooklyn.

Derrick Favors has emerged as a key figure in his eighth season in Utah and re-signed with the team after becoming a free agent.

Winning Starts at Home

Georgia Tech and head coach Josh Pastner have made a priority of making McCamish Pavilion a real homecourt advantage for the program, and the Yellow Jackets made a good start on that by setting a program record for wins at home (17) in 2017-18, which included a 7-2 ACC record and two NIT victories.

Tech is 20-16 against ACC teams at home under Pastner, and that includes a 5-8 mark against ranked opponents. Among the victories over ranked teams include Pastner's first ACC game, a victory over No. 9 and eventual national champion North Carolina and a 22-point win over No. 6 Florida State during the 2016-17 season.

Tech is 40-18 at McCamish Pavilion under Pastner.

Arts and Letters

Beginning with Moe Miller and Lance Storrs in the summer of 2011, every four-year senior in the Georgia Tech program has graduated, with the exception of the Yellow Jackets' 2018 two seniors, who are both expected to return and complete their degrees this summer after a year of pro ball overseas.

Graduate student Brandon Alston (economics), fifth-year senior Abdoulaye Gueye (business administration) and fourth-year junior Sylvester Ogbonda (business administration) all will complete their course work this semester and receive their degrees in May.

Georges-Hunt and Jackson made the Academic All-ACC team twice, and the Yellow Jackets have had at least one player

named to that team since it was instituted for the 2010-11 season.

Tech's men's basketball team has recorded the highest Academic Progress Report scores the last five years since the NCAA began tracking academic performance in 2004-05. The Jackets scored a perfect team single year APR score of 1000 three straight years from 2011-13.

Welcome to The Hank

Georgia Tech has played seven seasons in McCamish Pavilion, which was for all intents and purposes, brand new when it opened for the 2012-13 season. The only physical elements of McCamish Pavilion that remain from the venerable Alexander Memorial Coliseum are the roof, which was re-covered, and the 32 steel ribs that support it.

The capacity of McCamish Pavilion is 8,600, including 1,665 seats in the new balcony level and 6,935 seats in the lower seating bowl. There are no suites, but there is a premium club area that seats 500. Alexander Memorial Coliseum seated 9,191 spectators in its final configuration.

The most impressive features of McCamish Pavilion are its grand entrance, which fronts 10th and Fowler Streets, the ability for patrons to view the court from the main concourse all the way around, and the theatrical lighting system, which concentrates light on the court while leaving the seating areas dark, modeled after the Staples Center in Los Angeles and Madison Square Garden in New York.

Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion on Jan. 5, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

Tech's NCAA Tournament History

Georgia Tech has played in the NCAA Tournament 16 times in its history. Fifteen of those appearances have occurred from 1985 to the present, 10 under head coach Bobby Cremins and five under Paul Hewitt.

Tech has a record of 23-16 in NCAA Tournament play, highlighted by its 2004 trip to the NCAA title game as well as a Final Four berth in 1990. The Yellow Jackets have reached the NCAA Sweet 16 seven times (1960, 1985, 1986, 1990, 1992, 1996, 2004).

The 2004 and 2005 appearances were the Yellow Jackets' first back-to-back appearances since Bobby Cremins led the Institute to the Big Dance nine straight years from 1985-

Georgia Tech has won at least one game in 11 of its 16 NCAA Tournament appearances.

Tech's ACC Tournament History

Georgia Tech has played in 40 ACC Tournaments, and has a 26-37 all-time record in the event. The Yellow Jackets have won three championships, in 1985 (Atlanta), 1990 (Charlotte) and 1993 (Charlotte).

Tech has been a runner-up four times (1986, 1996, 2005, 2010). The 1986, 1996 and 2010 runs to the finals occurred in Greensboro. Tech also made the finals in 2005 at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C.

Tech was 0-2 in the ACC Tournament under coach Dwane Morrison, 15-16 under Bobby Cremins (including all three titles), 9-11 under Paul Hewitt (runner-up in 2005 and 2010), 2-5 under Brian Gregory. and 0-3 under Josh Pastner.

osh Pastner, who guided Memphis to five post-season berths in seven seasons as the Tigers' head coach, was introduced as Georgia Tech's 14th head basketball coach on April 8, 2016, and wasted no time in getting the Yellow Jackets back to the post-season.

While coaching Tech to 48 wins and building the Jackets' talent base for the future, Pastner has tirelessly promoted the program on campus and throughout the city of Atlanta in an effort to re-create the major homecourt atmosphere that surrounded the Yellow Jackets throughout the 1980s, 1990s and into the middle of the 2000s. The result has been 40 wins and 12 sellouts in three seasons at McCamish Pavilion, including a program-record 17 home wins in his first year.

In his first season at the helm, his Yellow Jacket team defied all pre-season expectations by winning 21 games, including four in the National Invitation Tournament. Tech posted an 8-10 ACC record, which included victories over No. 9 North Carolina, No. 6 Florida State and No. 14 Notre Dame, who all finished among the top four in the ACC regular season. He was named Coach of the Year in the ACC and in NABC District 2.

Implementing a high-energy style of play and creative offensive and defensive schemes, Pastner and his staff guided the Yellow Jackets all the way to the finals of the NIT for the first time in 46 years. Two of his players earned all-Atlantic Coast Conference honors; junior center Ben Lammers was named second-team All-ACC and ACC Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman guard Josh Okogie was named to the ACC All-Freshman team.

Tech knocked off a pair of top-25 teams in 2017-18 while Lammers and Okogie again earned conference honors, and Okogie developed into an NBA first-round draft choice. Last season, the Jackets scored significant road wins at Arkansas, Syracuse and NC State while improving to 10th place in the ACC.

Pastner, 41, compiled a 167-73 record over seven seasons as the head coach at Memphis, where the Tigers earned bids to the NCAA Tournament four times. He tied for the 10th most wins for a head coach in his first seven seasons in Division I basketball history, and is the second winningest active coach under the age of 40 in NCAA Division I.

Despite his young age, Pastner has been involved in basketball at the Division I level for 21 years, as a player and an assistant coach at Arizona, and as an assistant coach and the head coach at Memphis. He has been a part of teams that have won 524 games, played in 17 NCAA Tournaments and 19 total post-season events. Teams he has been involved with have won 12 conference tournament or regular-season championships, advanced to seven Sweet Sixteens, five Elite Eights, two Final Fours and two NCAA championship games.

As an NCAA head or assistant coach and an AAU head coach, he has coached nearly 25 NBA draft selections.

Pastner's Memphis teams averaged 23.9 wins per season and compiled a conference regular-season record of 82-36, including a conference winning streak of 28 games. The Tigers went 11-4 in Conference USA and American Athletic Conference tournaments, including three championships.

He guided Memphis to five post-season berths, the NIT in 2010 and the NCAA Tournament in 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. Pastner twice won Conference USA Coach of the Year honors (2010, 2013) by various organizations and news media.

Pastner was born in Glen Dale, W.Va., and grew up in Kingwood, Texas. He earned his bachelor's degree in family studies in December of 1998, in just two and a half years, from Arizona and his master's degree in teaching and teacher education from Arizona in December of 1999, all while lettering four years in basketball under head coach Lute Olson.

He married the former Kerri Lamas of Sierra Vista, Ariz., in 2009. He has a stepson (Ethan) and three daughters, Payten, Kamryn and Harper.
