TECH GOLF NOTEBOOK

Georgia Tech's No. 7-ranked golf team, which earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Men's Golf Championship by winning the ACC Championship three weeks ago, advanced to the NCAA Championship through the Pullman Regional, where the Yellow Jackets finished fourth with a 22-under-par score of 818.

Tech is in the finals for the first time since 2015 after not making it through regional qualifiers for three straight years, including sixth-place finishes by one stroke in 2017 and 2018.

This will be the Yellow Jackets' 28th all-time appearance in the Championship finals, and the 17th appearance under head coach Bruce Heppler.

The Yellow Jackets are one of six Atlantic Coast Conference teams to advance, joining Clemson, Duke, Louisville, North Carolina and Wake Forest.

Team Update

The Yellow Jackets stand No. 7 in the nation in the Golfstat, and No. 4 in the Golfweek/Sagarin rankings and No. 4 in the most recent Bushnell Coaches Poll. Tech has won six tournaments this year, one shy of the all-time high of seven won by the 2001-02 and 2013-14 teams and more than any other team in Division I golf except top-ranked Oklahoma State. (Golfstat rankings are used to seed the teams in the NCAA Championship and the regional qualifying tournaments.)

Tech advanced to the NCAA Championship by finishing fourth in the NCAA regional held in Pullman, Wash., behind Texas A&M, Brigham Young and Oklahoma.

This spring, Tech won a share of the Puerto Rico Classic title, took an 11-stroke victory at the Clemson Invitational and a 15-shot win at the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship this spring. Tech finished sixth at the Southern Highlands Collegiate after holding the 36-hole lead, and was 12th in the Valspar Collegiate Invitational, both against extremely strong fields, prior to winning the Clemson event the first weekend of April.

In the fall, the Jackets won the Maui Jim Intercollegiate and were co-champions at the Carpet Capital Collegiate and the Jack Nicklaus Invitational, a match play event.

Tech is 31-25-1 against current top-25 teams this year, 58-28-2 vs. top-50 teams, and 83-28-3 vs. top-100 teams, and its schedule is rated the seventh-most difficult in the nation according to the Golfweek/Sagarin Index.

Statistically, Tech ranks No. 4 in the nation in average individual score (70.80), No. 2 in comparison to par (-0.87), No. 1 in first-round average (70.18) and No. 2 in par-4 scoring (4.01). The Yellow Jackets also rank in the top 10 in scoring on par 3s and par 5s, are No. 5 in total birdies and No. 3 in average drop score (74.88).

Tech Lineup

Head coach Bruce Heppler is sending out the same starting five that competed in the Yellow Jackets' last six events, beginning with the Puerto Rico Classic in mid-February — juniors Luke Schniederjans (Powder Springs, Ga.), Andy Ogletree (Little Rock, Miss.), Tyler Strafaci (Davie, Fla.), sophomore Noah Norton (Chico, Calif.) and freshman Connor Howe (Ogden, Utah).

Four Yellow Jackets playing in the NCAA regional, each of whom have played all 11 team events this year, were selected to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference team and are ranked 81st or higher in the national Golfstat rankings. Ogletree (No. 18), who has been the Yellow Jackets' top finisher in six of Tech's seven spring events and has four top-10 finishes, including a runner-up performance at the ACC Championship, is the team's highest ranked player, followed by Schniederjans (No. 26), Norton (No. 74) and Strafaci (No. 81).

They have combined for 16 top-10 finishes (Schniederjans has five, Ogletree and Strafaci each have four, Norton has three). They are separated by just over a stroke in stroke average, with Ogletree and Schniederjans leading the way at 69.71.

Ogletree tied for 12th place at the NCAA Pullman Regional to lead the Jackets, while Schniederjans tied for 17th.

Howe, with a 71.18 stroke average in 27 rounds, is playing

in his seventh straight event as a counting member of the travel team, having tied for 14th place at the ACC Championship and 17th at the Pullman Regional.

Tech's NCAA Championship History

Georgia Tech has reached the NCAA Championship finals 28 times since 1985 (29 times in program history), which is tied for fifth most in that time period behind Oklahoma State (34), Arizona State (32), Florida (31) and Texas (31). Tech has posted nine top-8 finishes in the last 14 tries.

The Yellow Jackets tied for 10th in 2009, the first-year of the stroke-play/match-play format, but qualified for match play each of the next four times they advanced to the NCAA Championship (third in 2010, second in 2011, second in 2013, fifth in 2014). Tech did not advance out of its regional in 2012, 2016, 2017 or 2018.

Tech lost to the eventual champion three times in its four forays into match play - Augusta State by the score of 3-2 in the quarterfinals in 2010 and 2011 and to Alabama (3-0-2) in 2013.

Tech has been the runner-up in the NCAA Championship four times (1993, 2000, 2002 and 2005, all before the advent of match play), more than any team in the history of the championship except Houston, Michigan, Texas and Wake Forest, who also have four, and Oklahoma State, which has five. In 1993 and 2002, the Yellow Jackets led after 54 holes, but finished second by one shot to Florida in 1993, and by four shots to Minnesota in 2002.

In 2000, the Yellow Jackets rallied to tie Oklahoma State after 72 holes, but lost to the Cowboys on the first hole of a playoff. Tech and OSU matched the lowest 72-hole team score in NCAA Championship history (36-under-par 1,116) at the Grand National Lake Course in Opelika, Ala. In 2005, Tech finished 11 shots behind Georgia, and seven shots ahead of third-place Washington.

Since Bruce Heppler became Tech's coach, the Jackets have finished in the top eight 11 times.

Three Tech players have won national collegiate championships. Troy Matteson did it most recently in 2002 at Ohio State. Watts Gunn (1927) and Charlie Yates (1934) won national titles under a match play format before the NCAA took sponsorship of the championship in 1939.

Tech and NCAA Match Play

The 2009 NCAA Championship featured a new twist with the team champion determined via match play. The top eight teams after 54 holes of stroke play advance to a match play tournament format.

The NCAA added a fourth round of stroke play in 2016 for the top 15 teams and nine individuals not on those teams, after which the national individual champion and the top eight teams for match play will be determined.

Match play a format that Bruce Heppler has supported vigorously. Under Heppler, Georgia Tech finished in the top eight of the NCAA Finals seven times in 10 tries under the 72-hole, stroke-play format. Tech is one of only two teams (Oklahoma State is the other) to have advanced to match play four times in the six years the current format has been in effect.

In the stroke-play/match play era, the Yellow Jackets have finished 10th, third, second, second and fifth, respectively, in the stroke-play portion the NCAA Championship in five tries (Tech did not advance out of its regional in 2012 or 2016). Tech lost to the eventual national champion three of the four times has qualified for match play (Augusta State in the 2010 and 2011 quarterfinals, Alabama in the 2013 semifinals).

Tech has had success in other match-play events in recent years, reaching the finals of the Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championship four times in six appearances.

Tech Captures 18th ACC Golf Championship

Georgia Tech defended its Atlantic Coast Conference Championship in record fashion at the Old North State Club, and captured its 18th all-time conference title in men's golf.

When the Yellow Jackets won their first ACC Championship in 1985, Wake Forest had already won 18. Tech pulled even with the Demon Deacons on Sunday with 18 championships, won for the 13th time under head coach Bruce Heppler and for the 12th time at the Old North State Club. Heppler's 13 titles alone would rank second among schools, and he ranks No. 2 among coaches behind Wake's Jesse Haddock, who coached 15 of the Deacons' 18 championships.

In the process, Tech broke its own tournament scoring record by posting a 37-under-par total of 827, eclipsing the 33-under-par 831 by the 2011 Jackets' team.

With a comfortable 17-shot lead to start the final round, Georgia Tech played even-par around the front nine as high winds made scoring difficult. Virginia and No. 3 Wake Forest, playing in the groups ahead of the Yellow Jackets, crept within 10 strokes with strong starts. But Tech came home in 7-under-par 281, while its playing partners, No. 9 Duke and No. 29 Florida State closed out with 1-over-par rounds of 289.

Schniederjans, a junior from Powder Springs, Ga., played a steady round with five birdies and one bogey, and finished the championship sixth individually with an 8-under-par total of 208. Norton eagled the first hole to open his round and added five birdies, helping the sophomore from Chico, Calif., overcome a double bogey and a bogey on consecutive holes on the back nine. He finished in a tie for 27th at even-par 216.

Freshman Connor Howe (Ogden, Utah) posted a closing even-par 72 Sunday, tying for 14th place at 4-under-par 212 in his first ACC Championship. Tyler Strafaci (Jr., Davie, Fla.) added a 1-over-par 73 for the Jackets Sunday, as did Andy Ogletree (Jr., Little Rock, Miss.). Ogletree, who began the day with the individual lead, surrendered it with a double-bogey at the sixth hole, but battled to the last hole and finished second by a stroke at 12-under-par 204.

As it did during Thursday's 36-hole day, Tech commanded the par-5 holes, playing them in 11-under-par. The Jackets finished the tournament 36-under-par on the par 5s, nine shots better than any other team, and piled up 63 birdies, eight more than any other team.

Four Jackets Make All-ACC Team

Georgia Tech's Noah Norton, Andy Ogletree, Luke Schniederjans and Tyler Strafaci have been named to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Golf Team, giving Tech four honorees for the second year in a row and for the fourth time in program history.

Schniederjans made the team for the third time in his three years on The Flats, while Norton and Strafaci are second-time honorees. Ogletree, the Yellow Jackets' highest-ranked player nationally, is on the team for the first time.

Ogletree (ranked No. 15 in Golfstat and No. 14 in the Golfweek/Sagarin ratings, Schniederjans (No. 19 Golfstat, No. 16 Sagarin) and Strafaci (No. 50 Golfweek, No. 45 Sagarin) each made the team automatically. Norton, ranked No. 66 in Golfstat and No. 64 in Golfweek/Sagarin, earned his way onto the team via a vote of the ACC's 12 coaches.

The trio of juniors has been the core of the Yellow Jackets' success the last three years, including a nation-leading six tournament victories in 2018-19. Ogletree (junior, Little Rock, Miss.), with four top-10 finishes in spring tournaments, leads the Yellow Jackets in stroke average at 69.96, less than 2/1,000th of a stroke ahead of Schniederjans (junior, Powder Springs, Ga.), whose five top-10 finishes leads the team. Strafaci (junior, Davie, Fla.), averaging 70.67 strokes, has four top-10 finishes this year, and Norton (sophomore (Chico, Calif.), averaging 70.93, has three top-10s.

Heppler ACC Coach of the Year 10 times

Georgia Tech Bruce Heppler has been named ACC Coach of the Year for the 10th time in his 24-year tenure on The Flats. That is the most for one coach in conference history.

Tech won the Atlantic Coast Championship in April for the 18th time, matching Wake Forest for the most in conference history. The Yellow Jackets have won six tournaments altogether, more than any other Division I team in 2018-19, bringing to 59 the total number of titles earned by the Jackets under Heppler. He has coached Tech to 13 of its 18 ACC titles.

Ogletree, Schniederjans Semifinalists for Nicklaus Award

Andy Ogletree and Luke Schniederjans are among 30 semifinalists for the Jack Nicklaus Player of the Year Award, announced May 13 by the Golf Coaches Association of America.

Nicklaus Award recipients will be announced May 30 with the honor presented by Jack Nicklaus at a ceremony during the final round of the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide at Muirfield Village Golf Club. In addition to receiving the Jack Nicklaus National Player of the Year Award, the five recipients will compete in the Barbasol Shootout for an exemption into the PGA TOUR's Barbasol Championship, held July 18-21, at the Champions at Keene Trace in Lexington, Ky. The Barbasol Shootout will be held Saturday, June 1 at The Ohio State University Golf Club's Scarlet Course in Columbus, Ohio - the same club where Jack Nicklaus played collegiate golf for the Buckeyes.

Both Tech student-athletes were honored on the All-Atlantic Coast Conference team last week, Schniederjans for the third time in his three years on The Flats, and Ogletree for the first time. Ogletree is ranked No. 14 nationally in Golfstat, Schniederjans No. 19.

Tee Shots

• Georgia Tech has won six tournaments this year, more than any team in the nation except top-ranked Oklahoma State, one shy of the all-time high of seven won by the 2001-02 and 2013-14 teams and more than any other team in Division I golf.

• Georgia Tech has been ranked as high as No. 2 this year in Golfstat (Oct. 31, Nov. 15, Dec. 31) on the heels of winning the Carpet Capital Collegiate, the Maui Jim Intercollegiate and the Jack Nicklaus Invitational in the fall season.

• According to the Golfweek/Sagarin ratings, Tech has faced the seventh-most difficult schedule in Division I -- Tech has gone 31-25-1 vs. the nation's top 25 teams, 58-28-2 vs. the top 50, 83-28-3-3 vs. the top 100.

• Tech is 4-8 head-to-head against the seven teams ahead of the Jackets in the Golfstat rankings.

• Tech is one seven schools (Arizona State, BYU, Georgia, Illinois, Louisville, SMU) not expected to have a senior in its opening round lineup at the NCAA Championship.

• Tech ranks fourth in the nation in lowest average drop score (74.99), according to Golfstat. Only seven individuals have finished outside the top 50 in any event this year.

• Collectively, Tech's team has compiled 16 individual top-10 finishes, five by Luke Schniederjans, four each by Andy Ogletree and Tyler Strafaci, three by Noah Norton. That group has been involved in 10 team victories over the past two years.

• Tech's top four players rank No. 81 or higher in the Golfstat rankings and in the Golfweek/Sagarin Index.

• Tech's top four players all have stroke averages under 71, ranging from 69.72 to 70.87, all of which would rank among the top 10 season stroke averages in program history. They all rank in the top 15 of the ACC scoring rankings. No. 5 player Connor Howe, a freshman, has a 71.87 average.

• Georgia Tech's collective average team score of 279.03 ranks fourth in the nation and is more than four strokes better than last year's 283.15.

• The Yellow Jackets are an aggregate 209-under-par across all of their events in 2018-19, and 141-under-par over the six spring events.

• Tech has scored an aggregate 111-under-par in its last three events (52-under-par at the Clemson Invitational, 37-under-par at the ACC Championship, 22-under-par at the NCAA Pullman Regional) and won the first two of those events by a combined 26 strokes.

• According to Golfstat national statistical rankings, Tech is No. 4 in average individual score (70.80), No. 2 in comparison to par (-0.87), No. 5 in birdies (567) and No. 1 in first-round scoring average (70.18).

• Broken down, the Yellow Jackets are No. 2 in par-4 scoring, No. 4 in par-5 scoring, and No. 11 in par-3 scoring.

Tech Signs One in Class of 2019

Andy Mao, a highly-regarded junior golfer from Johns Creek, Ga., signed a letter-of-intent in the November signing period and is the Yellow Jackets' only signee for the class of 2019. Tech graduates only one member of the current team, fifth-year senior James Clark.

Mao is ranked No. 5 in the state of Georgia by the Golfweek/Sagarin boys rankings, No. 63 in the class of 2019 and No. 174 overall. He is ranked No. 80 in the class of 2019 and No. 138 overall by the Junior Golf Scoreboard.

A senior at Johns Creek High School, Mao enjoyed an excellent 2018 in junior golf, finishing as the runner-up in the Amino VITAL Junior Championship, fourth at AJGA Junior at RiverWatch, fourth at Georgia Junior Championship, 11th at AJGA Championship presented by Stuart Francis and 18th at Callaway Golf-Ollie Schniederjans Junior Classic at Country Club of the South. He qualified for the U.S. Junior Amateur by finishing second at the UGA Golf Course.

Mao has won the Region 7AAAAAA individual title four years in a row and helped his Johns Creek team win the state team title in 2016.

TECH GOLF NOTEBOOK

Tech Golf APR Perfect for 14 Straight Years

Bruce Heppler's golf program again earned a perfect four-year APR score of 1000 for the four-year period ending in the 2017-18 academic year in the NCAA's survey announced May 8. The Yellow Jackets have earned a perfect four-year score every year since its inception in 2006, and has also received an APR Public Recognition Award every year. Georgia Tech golf is one of only 73 programs nationally that has earned all 14 Public Recognition Awards. Among Power 5 conferences, it is one of two men's golf teams and 16 programs overall that have achieved the feat.

APR is an annual scorecard of academic achievement calculated for all Division I sports teams. It measures eligibility, graduation and retention each semester or academic term and provides a clear picture of the academic performance for each team in every sport.

Tech in NCAA Regional Competition

Georgia Tech has advanced through an NCAA regional 24 times in 29 tries, and all but four times since the NCAA went to a six-regional qualifying format in 2009. Head coach Bruce Heppler's teams have won five regional tournaments outright, most recently in 2014, and tied for one other.

The NCAA began using regional qualifying tournaments in 1989, first with the 81 teams split among three sites (27 teams each), then among six sites with either 13 or 14 teams each beginning in 2009. Since the NCAA went to six regional sites in 2009, Tech has finished third (Bowling Green, Ky.), third (Milton, Ga.), tied for third (Radford, Va.), sixth/did not advance (Norman, Okla.), fourth (Tallahassee, Fla.), first (Raleigh, N.C.), third (San Diego) and tied for seventh/did not advance (Tucson).

Tech's first four victories all occurred in 27-team regionals in 1991 (New Haven, Conn.), 1998 (Daufuskie Island, S.C.), 1999 (Providence, R.I.) and 2002 (Roswell, Ga., tied with Clemson). Only the 2014 win occurred in a 13-team field.

Tech's ACC Championship History

With its 15-stroke victory in the 2019 ACC Championship, Georgia Tech won its 18th title in program history, putting the Yellow Jackets in a tie with Wake Forest for the most titles in conference history. Tech's titles have all come from 1985 to the present. Wake Forest's 18 titles all came before the Yellow Jackets won their first.

Tech has won the ACC Championship 10 times in the last 14 years, including the last two in a row. The Yellow Jackets won the 2019 championship with a tournament record score of 827 (37-under-par), breaking the previous mark of 831 (-33) set by the Jackets in 2011.

Tech has won 13 of its conference titles under current head coach Bruce Heppler, 11 of those outright (1999, 2001, 2002, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2018, 2019) and two shared (2006, 2007). The Yellow Jackets won five championships (1985, 1991, 1992, 1993, 1994) under previous head coach Puggy Blackmon.

Twelve of Tech's ACC titles have been won at the Old North State Club in New London, N.C., site of the event 22 of the last 25 years. The first occurred in 1999 by 10 strokes over North Carolina and Duke. Tech won its 2018 crown without an individual finishing higher than 12th place.

Anders Albertson won his second title in 2015, sharing medalist honors with Louisville's Robin Scot-Siegrist and Virginia Tech's Trevor Cone with a score of 11-under-par 205. He also won the championship in 2013 with a record score of 15-under 201. He is one of five players to win two ACC titles, and one of two Tech players to do so, joining David Duval in 1991 and 1993.

Albertson is one of 10 ACC individual champions from Tech, joining Bob McDonnell (1985), David Duval (1991, 1993), Mikko Rantanen (1994), Bryce Molder (2000), Cameron Tringale (2006), Chesson Hadley (2010), Paul Haley (2011), Albertson (2013, 2015) and Ollie Schniederjans (2014).

NCAA Championship Timeline

The national collegiate championships were conducted by the United States Golf Association through 1938, and consisted of a medal competition and a match play bracket similar to today's U.S. Amateur.

The NCAA began conducting the championship in 1939, using a match play format through 1965, when it became a 72-hole, stroke-play event.

The NCAA instituted a 54-hole cut from 1979-88. A 36-hole cut was used in 1989, and again from 1992-2001. No cuts were made in 1990, 1991 or 2002.

Regional qualifying tournaments were instituted in 1989, expanding the championship field to 81 teams, 27 in each of three regionals, with 30 teams advancing to the 72-hole finals. In 2009, the format was changed to include a total of six regional tournaments (13 teams in three, 14 teams in the other three). Thirty teams (five from each regional) advanced to the finals.

The finals structure changed again in 2009, with 30 teams playing 54 holes of stroke play. The individual national champion was crowned after 54 holes, and the top eight teams advanced to a match play bracket to decide the team champion. In 2015, the NCAA added a fourth 18-hole round to the stroke-play portion, cutting the field to the top 15 teams and nine individuals not on those teams for the final round.

If a consistently high level of success over a long period of time is the measure of a great program, then Georgia Tech's golf program under Bruce Heppler would certainly meet the standard. His peers recognized this in 2013 when they inducted him into the Golf Coaches Association of America Hall of Fame.

Tech's recent run of Atlantic Coast Conference championships and NCAA Championship finals performances are unprecedented in school history - 10 Atlantic Coast Conference titles in the last 14 years and four trips to match play at the NCAA Championship.

Heppler has guided the Yellow Jackets to an NCAA regional every year since 1998, while 16 of those teams advanced to the NCAA Finals, and 11 finished in the top eight, including three runner-up showings.

During his tenure, Tech has won or shared 13 Atlantic Coast Conference titles. Only two ACC coaches have led their teams to more ACC titles than has Heppler. The Yellow Jackets have captured or shared 59 team titles overall.

He was named ACC Coach of the Year in 2019 for the 10th time, more than any ACC coach in conference history.

Since 2000, the Yellow Jackets have finished in the top 10 of the final Golfstat rankings 11 times, and in the final Golfweek/Sagarin top 10 a total of 13 times. Tech did not finish lower than 14th in either ranking in any year from 2000 to 2015.

In a July, 2015 poll of his coaching peers conducted by Golfweek magazine, Heppler ranked No. 3. His program was ranked No. 2 among College Factual's ranking of the best colleges to play golf, taking into account both the quality of the golf team, as well as the academic success of the players and the quality of the school.

Heppler has recruited and developed his share of star players as well. The Yellow Jackets have had at least a pair of All-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees in 19 of the last 21 years, and landed four members of the team on the squad four times (2005, 2011, 2018, 2019). Tech has had at least two players earn All-America honors 14 of the last 17 years, and Ollie Schniederjans became the program's 20th and 21st first-team selection in his junior and senior years. Three of his players, Matt Kuchar, Bryce Molder and Troy Matteson, have been named national player of the year.

Twelve of Heppler's players are currently active members of either the PGA Tour or the Web.com Tour, with several other recent graduates climbing their way up through the other professional tours.

Heppler has been named to coach the United States team in the Palmer Cup twice, in 2003 and 2015, and eight of his players have also represented the USA in that annual event.

Kuchar, Molder, Nicholas Thompson and Cameron Tringale have represented the United States in the Walker Cup matches. Twice, in 1998 and 2013, five or more of the Heppler's active Tech players have qualified to play in the U.S. Amateur. Six of Tech's seven returning players in 2013 competed in that year's U.S. Amateur in Brookline, Mass., an unprecedented feat.

On the conference level since 1985, when the Yellow Jackets won their first ACC Championship, Tech has earned more NCAA Championship berths than any team except Clemson. The Jackets have earned more top-10, more top-5 and more top-2 finishes in NCAA Championship competition than any other ACC team. Tech also has had more All-America selections (63) than any other ACC team during the same period except the Tigers.

His players have been just as successful in the classroom. Tech's golf program has been recognized with a perfect Academic Progress Report score of 1000 for 14 straight years, and every senior has graduated.

Twenty-one different players under Heppler have been named All-America Scholars (a total of 36 times) by the Golf Coaches Association of America, which requires a minimum 3.2 GPA and participation in at least 75 percent of a team's events. Two, All-Americans Bryce Molder and Roberto Castro, received the NCAA's Top VIII Award, an honor given to eight student-athletes from all sports each year and recognizes those who excel in their sport and in the classroom, and exhibit high character, leadership and service to others.

It didn't take long for Heppler to restore the glory to Tech's golf program following a couple of lean years in the mid-1990s. After recruiting future All-Americans Kuchar and Molder, Heppler had the Yellow Jackets back in the NCAA Tournament in his third season, where they finished third, just four shots off the lead. Tech also was ranked No. 1 in the nation during the course of the year and won the NCAA East Regional.

Even better things were to come as Tech captured the first of its ACC titles under Heppler in 1999. In 2000 the Yellow Jackets came the closest to an NCAA Championship in their history, tying for first after 72 holes with Oklahoma State before losing a one-hole playoff. On the year, Tech captured four team titles and finished in the top four in each event it entered.

During the 2001 campaign, the Jackets won their second ACC crown in three years, the second under Heppler, captured a school-record-tying five tournament wins during the year and finished fourth in the NCAA Championship. For his efforts, Heppler was named ACC Coach of the



Year and guided three All-Americans in Molder, who was also the consensus National Player of the Year, Matteson and Kris Mikkelsen.

In 2002, Heppler led the Yellow Jackets to arguably the best season in school history, as Tech captured seven team titles and finished second at the NCAA Championship. In the process, Heppler earned National and ACC Coach of the Year honors. During the year, the Jackets won the school's eighth ACC title, while placing all five starters on GCAA All-America teams. Under Heppler's tutelage, Matteson became the third Tech player to win the national individual title.

Tech has dominated the Atlantic Coast Conference in recent years, winning nine of the last 13 titles. The Yellow Jackets have been to the NCAA Tournament every year since 1998, and only five times in that period failed to advance out of a regional. In the nine years the NCAA has conducted the current medal/match play format for the championship, Tech has advanced to match play four times.

A 58-year-old native of St. George, Utah, Heppler has demonstrated his strength as a recruiter by attracting both National Players of the Year during 1997-98 and the ACC Players of the Year for 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2001. His first recruit at Tech was Kuchar, who won the 1997 U.S. Amateur Championship and was named the ACC Player of the Year and the Fred Haskins National Player of the Year in 1998. Molder was the Jack Nicklaus Player of the Year in 1998 and in 2001, along with being named the ACC Player of the Year in 1999, 2000 and 2001.

Heppler, a dean's list student at Brigham Young, earned his bachelor's degree in accounting from BYU in 1985, and later received his master's degree in sport management from Massachusetts in 1988. He played golf for one year at Dixie Junior College in St. George before transferring to Brigham Young.

He became a certified public accountant in 1985 and spent one year in the firm of Huber and Associates in Salt Lake City, then began his collegiate coaching career in 1987 as the men and women's golf coach at Amherst. He then spent two years as an administrative assistant at UNLV, becoming the assistant men's golf coach at UNLV in 1989. He spent two years in that role before moving to Oklahoma State in 1991.

"Georgia Tech is a great fit for me," said Heppler. "This is one of the five or six best programs right now if you look around at college golf's successful teams since the '90s. We have a lot of alumni on the PGA Tour, which is great for the school. Young people can see they have a chance to be player of the year or win a national championship here. It's a great school academically, which is a real draw with the general pool of talent out there interested in playing college golf."

Heppler is married to the former Traci Schull of Southbury, Conn., and they have a son, Zakary, and a daughter, Moriah. Heppler is actively involved with Atlanta Alliance for Children and is a member of the Golf Coaches Association of America.

McGee, 28, assists head coach Bruce Heppler in the areas of operations, scheduling, recruiting, academics and fundraising.

"We're excited for Drew to be part of our program," said Heppler. "Drew was involved in every aspect of the New Mexico program and was successful in their recruiting efforts. He came highly recommended and is highly-regarded by many of the coaches on the West Coast."

During his two years at New Mexico, McGee helped guide the Lobos to three tournament victories, two NCAA regional tournament appearances and a second-place finish in the Mountain West Conference Championship in 2016. Four Lobos won individual tournament titles, while five members of the team made the all-MWC team, and one was named Mountain West Player of the Year. McGee also served as co-director of the Lobo Junior Golf Camps.

"I am very excited to be with Coach Heppler and the Georgia Tech golf program," said McGee. "I am also grateful for my time at New Mexico and the chance to work with Coach (Glen) Millican. I believe that my experience there has prepared me well for this tremendous opportunity. Coach Heppler has created a tradition of success both on the course and in the classroom, and I look forward to working with him and the players to build on that success. Georgia Tech is definitely a special place and I am thankful to be here."

Prior to accepting an assistant's position at New Mexico, McGee was head coach of the men's and women's teams at NAIA Northwood College in Cedar Hill, Texas, for the spring of 2014. Northwood's teams broke two scoring records under McGee during his tenure, and the women's team finished 10th in the 2014 NAIA Championships in Lincoln, Neb. That spring, he received the NAIA's Champion of Character Award.

McGee began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant in 2013 at McNeese State.

McGee is a 2012 graduate of Baylor University with a bachelor's degree in business administration and was a three-year letter winner for coach Greg Priest. McGee was a member of the Big XII Commissioner's honor roll.
