LEADING OFF FOR THE CATAMOUNTS:

>> Western Carolina opens the month of May amidst a stretch where eight-straight games will be played away from home including seven true road games and one neutral field game ... WCU is 6-8 (.429) on the road – 8-10 (.444) away from home;

>> WCU has played 13, one-run games this season posting a 6-7 record ... the Catamounts have also played four extra-inning games, losing three-straight (1-4);

>> The Catamounts endured a season-long SEVEN-game winless drought in mid-to-late March ... WCU's most consecutive victories this year are FIVE in mid-March that included Power Five conference wins over Michigan State, Ohio State, and Notre Dame;

>> After struggling through an uncharacteristic 2018 season that didn't see WCU reach double-digit seasonal victories until May at the Southern Conference Tournament, the 2019 Catamounts won 10 through their first 15 games this spring ... Finishing with a program-low 11 wins last spring, WCU didn't get win No. 10 until beating ETSU in the SoCon Tournament in game No. 56 in 2018 ... WCU eclipsed its win total from a year ago by taking two of three at UNCG, scoring its 12th victory in its 24th seasonal contest this year;

>> Western Carolina sophomore infielder **JUSTICE BIGBIE** and redshirt senior outfielder **MATTHEW KOEHLER** were named to the 2019 preseason All-Southern Conference second team ... the preseason accolades are the first for both Koehler and Bigbie after WCU did not have a preseason all-conference selection a season ago;

>> The Catamounts were pegged SIXTH and SEVENTH, respectively, in preseason polling of the league's head coaches and voting media ... WCU's sixth and seventh-place predictions are the lowest for the squad since 2013 with WCU was again tagged sixth in the preseason polling – the Catamounts went on to a 39-win season in 2013, winning the regular season title and making a push for an at-large bid into the NCAA postseason;

>> SIX of WCU's seasonal opponents remain inside the Top 100 RPI nationally: East Carolina (5), Indiana State (34), Wright State (69), Elon (88), UNCG (90), and Notre Dame (98) ... Four additional opponents rank inside the Top 150 – Utah (117), St. John's (127), ETSU (131), Ohio State (137) ... WCU plays two, top 100 RPI teams in its next two, three-game series – at Georgia Tech (7) and at Samford (93) ... WCU has played the nation's 127th toughest schedule, third in the SoCon (*thru games May 1*).

#CATAMOUNTCOUNTRY

TOP OF THE FIRST – CATAMOUNT BASEBALL NOTES:

• Western Carolina enters the week having dropped seven of its last nine games on the season ... the Catamounts have lost six of their last seven nonconference games;

• Western Carolina has recorded double-digit hits in 21 of its 40 games (52.5%) this spring, TWICE eclipsing the 20-hit plateau – 21 at UNC Asheville and 22 at UNCG ... WCU has 10-or-more base hits in four of its last five games, raising its team batting average to a SoCon-leading .303;

• Extra base hits have been key for WCU in the 2019 season ... the Catamounts **LEAD** the SoCon with 150 combined extra base hits in their 40 games, averaging 3.8 EBHs per game ... WCU is tied for first in the SoCon with 15 triples, 2nd with 94 doubles, and 4th with 41 homers ... WCU leads the SoCon with a .475 slugging % – 20th in NCAA;

• Western Carolina enters the week ranked **TIED FOR 8TH** nationally with a SoCon-best 45 total double plays turned through 40 games ... the Catamounts rank **THIRD** nationally with an average of 1.13 double-plays turned per game (**ADDITIONAL NCAA RANKINGS ON PAGE 11**);

• Western Carolina has won two SoCon series this year – both coming by winning 2-of-3 with BOTH coming on the road – at UNCG and at Mercer ... WCU has TWO remaining SoCon series – at Samford (May 10-12) and against The Citadel (May 16-18) at home.

WESTERN CAROLINA VS. GEORGIA TECH – THE SERIES:

• Western Carolina trails Georgia Tech in the overall series, 16-22, with all but TWO meetings coming in Atlanta ... the Catamounts won the **ONLY** meeting played in Cullowhee, upsetting then 4th-ranked Georgia Tech, 10-9, at Childress Field / Hennon Stadium in 2009 to split the seasonal series

• WCU has lost **FOUR**-straight in the head-to-head series, most recently swept by the 13th-ranked Yellow Jackets in 2016 in Atlanta despite two, one-run games;

• WCU is 6-10 against Georgia Tech when the Yellow Jackets are nationally-ranked ... Four of WCU's wins against Tech came when the Yellow Jackets were inside the Top 10;

• Western Carolina and Georgia Tech have played 10, one-run games and seven, two-run games in series history ... WCU is 3-7 in one-run contests, 2-5 in two-run games.

FAMILIAR FACES IN OPPOSING DUGOUTS:

• Western Carolina head coach Bobby Moranda spent six seasons as the associate head and pitching coach for Georgia Tech alongside longtime GT skipper, Danny Hall;

• During his time in Atlanta, the Yellow Jackets finished ranked in the top 10 four times, winning three ACC titles and made two appearances in the College World Series;

• Prior to his stint with the Yellow Jackets, he spent six years in a similar role at Wake Forest (1996-2001) and was an assistant coach at both Virginia (1990-95) giving him nearly 20 years of coaching experience in the ACC.

WCU VS. CURRENT MEMBERS OF THE ACC:

• Western Carolina is 62-154 (.287) all-time record against teams currently in the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) ... WCU has faced every team currently in the league except Boston College, Pittsburgh, Notre Dame and Syracuse;

• WCU will face its **SECOND** team from the ACC this season – the Catamounts hosted Notre Dame (1-0) in mid-March;

• The Catamounts and Clemson Tigers have met a total of 81 times to represent the most head-to-head meetings between WCU and an ACC foe, followed by Georgia Tech (38) and North Carolina State (33);

ABOUT THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE:

• Founded in 1921 and in its 98th season of competition, the Southern Conference gave rise to two of the premier conferences in America – the Southeastern (SEC, founded in 1932) and the Atlantic Coast (ACC, founded in 1952);

• The SoCon is the nation's **fifth-oldest** NCAA Div. I collegiate athletic association ... Only the Big Ten (1896), the Missouri Valley (1907), the Pac-12 (1915) and the SWAC (1920) conferences are older in terms of origination;

• Nine of the current 15 teams in the ACC (minus Boston College, Florida State, Miami, Notre Dame, Pittsburgh and Syracuse) were member schools of the SoCon early in the league's existence ... **SIX** of those nine ACC schools were founding members in 1921 – (Clemson, Georgia Tech, North Carolina, N.C. State, Virginia, and Virginia Tech – with Duke joining in 1928 and Wake Forest in 1936);

• The SoCon is just 2-22 against the ACC this season on the baseball diamond with Western Carolina and UNC Greensboro securing the two victories:

• The Catamounts have legged out 94 doubles, second in the SoCon and tied for 25th nationally – but rank **SEVENTH** nationally with an average of 2.35 doubles per game ... Sophomore transfer **DAYLAN NANNY** ranks **SECOND** in the SoCon with a team-best 17 doubles this season;

• Redshirt sophomore **RHP CHASE WALTER** has fanned 47 over his last four starts – an average of 11.75 strikeouts per start ... Walter struck out seven against Wofford (4/6), 13 at Mercer (4/13), a career-high 17 against Furman (4/20), and 10 most recently against VMI (4/27).

WCU BASEBALL VS. RANKED, POWER FIVE OPPONENTS:

• Western Carolina has secured seasonal victories against Power Five competition in 11 head coach Bobby Moranda's 12 seasons in Cullowhee – WCU did not score a Power Five victory during the 2018 season ... All told, Moranda has 34 wins over Power Five schools since 2008;

• WCU has **FIVE** Power Five conference opponents on its schedule this year for a total of seven games ... To date, WCU is 3-1 in those games (W, vs. Notre Dame; W, vs. Michigan State; W, vs. Ohio State) with three games this week;

• Under head coach Bobby Moranda, Western Carolina has a 12-38 (.240) record against nationally-ranked opponents ... • Robinson (2019) joins a list of recent WCU catchers to grace the watch list: Spencer Holcomb (2018), Danny Bermudez (2016, 2015), Adam Martin (2014, 2013); Blake Murphy (2008, 2007); Jared Greenwood (2005);

• A combined 79 catchers were nominated for the 2019 Buster Posey Award and appear on the initial watch list ... Of those 79, WCU will play – or has already played – eight catchers that appeared on the list ... Making his first appearance on the list, Robinson is joined by Bryce Leasure of The Citadel and Anthony Mulrine of Samford.

WILDER DUBBED SoCon PLAYER OF THE WEEK (3/11):

• Sophomore OF Immanuel Wilder was named the SoCon Baseball Player of the Week for games played March 4 through March 10 ... It was WCU's second-consecutive SoCon honor ... Finished the week second on the team in overall batting average at .556 (5-for-9) including a team-best three doubles – one in each game – and five RBI;

• All told, Wilder recorded two multiple-hit games and a pair of multi-RBI outings ... the Madison, Ala., product added a pair of walks to his tally, boasting an on-base percentage of .636 for the week in collecting his first career honor.

NANNY NAMED SoCon PLAYER OF THE WEEK (3/3):

• Sophomore OF Daylan Nanny was named the SoCon Baseball Player of the Week for games played Feb. 26 through March 3 ... Nanny started all five games for the Catamounts between either the outfield or at first base;

• Nanny led WCU with a .429 (9-for-21) batting average with five of his nine hits going for extra bases including three doubles and two home runs resulting in a .857 slug-

ging percentage ... Drove in a team-best six runs while also scoring three times in the two home games against Indiana State and three games at the Keith LeClair Classic ... Added a walk and a HBP for a team-high .478 OB%;

• The weekly award is the first of Nanny's WCU career and the first for a Catamount this season ... His selection continues WCU's active streak of having at least one weekly award winner in every season dating back to 1991.

KOEHLER, PURUS NAMED 2019 TEAM CAPTAINS:

• Redshirt seniors OF **MATTHEW KOEHLER** and LHP **TAYLOR PURUS** were elected team captains by their teammates and coaching staff, announced prior to the start of 2019;

• Koehler, a fifth-year senior who missed the 2016 season with a knee injury, was a preseason All-SoCon selection for WCU from the league's head coaches while Purus enters the season riding the high of earning SoCon All-Tournament team plaudits after recording a win and a save in the 2018 run through the conference tournament.

LUKE ROBINSON NAMED 2019 LEGGETT NO. 7 LEGACY:

• Head coach Bobby Moranda and his coaching staff named the 2019 "Leggett No. 7 Legacy" recipient in junior C **LUKE ROBINSON** ... the junior is the NINTH player to wear the No. 7 jersey which was made famous at WCU by former coaching great – and WCU Hall of Famer – Jack Leggett;

• A 2001 WCU Athletics Hall of Fame inductee, Leggett also helped shape the future of WCU baseball by recruiting and coaching his three successors in **KEITH LECLAIR** (1992-97), **RODNEY HENNON** (1998-99) and **TODD RALEIGH** (2000-07). Leggett's three protégés combined to win 567 games and a combined eight SoCon titles in 15 seasons, while also capturing five SoCon Coach of the Year honors;

• Robinson entered his third season a career .257 hitter, batting a career-best .281 a season ago with 39 hits including seven for extra bases and 20 RBI giving him 37 for his career. Last spring, the McLeansville, N.C., product was sidelined for nearly a month with a hand injury stemming from a HBP suffered in mid-April. He returned to the lineup in the SoCon Tournament, tallying six hits and a RBI in WCU's late run;

• Robinson joins a select list of players to previously have the honor bestowed upon them ... He is the third catcher to earn the honor – and just the second junior joining **DANNY BERMUDEZ** in 2015:

CATAMOUNT BASEBALL HISTORY & TRADITION:

• Western Carolina is one of the most dominant baseball programs in the Southern Conference ... Between WCU and The Citadel, the two programs are the league standard bearers, combining for 45 SoCon regular season and tournament championships – WCU with a league-best 23 and The Citadel with 22 ... The Citadel has 13 regular season championships and eight tournament titles while WCU's 23 titles includes winning the regular season 13 times with 10 tourney crowns;

• In 2013 & 2014, WCU claimed back-to-back regular season championships for the first time since the late 1980s – a span of four-straight from 1986-89 ... the Catamounts accomplished the back-to-back feat for the first time in the SoCon since Elon won back-to-back titles in 2008–2009;

• Western Carolina has only missed one SoCon tournament since the event's inception in 1984, missing the 2000 tournament under then first-year head coach Todd Raleigh;

• The Catamounts finished the 2016 season with 31 victories, recording the program's 27th 30-win season since 1984 (27, 30-win seasons over the past 34 years).

NOTING WCU HEAD COACH, BOBBY MORANDA:

• Head coach Bobby Moranda is in his 12th season in Cullowhee – he is currently the SECOND-longest tenured baseball coach in WCU history, just behind Bill Haywood (13 yrs);

• Moranda became WCU's all-time winningest head coach, scoring his 303rd career victory in game three against VMI in 2017 ... Moranda by-passed WCU's all-time leader, Jack Leggett (302, 1983-91) ... With 169 career SoCon wins, Moranda is WCU's winningest head coach in SoCon history;

• Moranda eclipsed the 200-win mark for his career, reaching the milestone in 2014 with a win over La Salle ... Moranda (300) is the fifth WCU head coach to win 200-or-more games in Cullowhee – Jack Leggett (302, 1983-91), Todd Raleigh (257, 2000-07), Keith McClair (229, 1992-97), Bill Haywood (215, 1969-81);

• Bobby Moranda has moved into **11TH** in the SoCon's record books for wins at a SoCon school – He is among 15 coaches to win 300-or-more games at a league school:

WESTERN CAROLINA ENTERING THE 2018 SEASON:

• Western Carolina returns 16 veteran players including just THREE seniors while a good chunk of its 31-man, season-opening roster played elsewhere a year ago ... the Catamount baseball roster includes six true freshmen with a returning redshirt freshman and four redshirt juniors, three that played elsewhere last season... Seven of WCU's newcomers are transfers carrying either sophomore or junior status entering the 2019 season.

RECAPING THE 2018 SEASON:

• Western Carolina struggled through an 11-47 season overall before winning four of its final six games in making a run through the SoCon tournament ... WCU thundered through the single-elimination play-in game and continued to make noise into the weekend, picking up a third of its 11 seasonal victories at Fluor Field in Greenville, S.C. ... the ninth-seeded Catamounts upset the top-seed UNCG, 10-2, marking the first No. 9 over a No. 1 since 2007 ... WCU later became the first nine-seed to defeat a No. 1 twice in the same tournament with Saturday's, 8-4, win; ... the Catamounts batted .325 – over 50 points higher than its regular season mark of .269 – and slugged 21 extra base hits including 14 doubles and six home runs in advancing to Saturday from Tuesday's curtain-opener;

• WCU endured two, 14-game losing skids last season ... the two, 14-game slides represent the longest winless streaks in program history ... the two 14-game winless droughts usurp the previous program long of eight-straight defeats that spanned Feb. 27–March 10 of the 2000 season, then first under former head coach Todd Raleigh;

• Senior catcher **SPENCER HOLCOMB** was named to the second team All-SoCon by both the league's nine head coaches and the voting media ... Holcomb was joined by three teammates on the coaches' All-Freshman team as **OF JUSTICE BIGBIE**, **INF WILL PRATER**, and **RHP CHASE WALTER** each collected postseason honors for first-year players ... WCU's three all-freshman selections were the most by any team in the league and mark a third-straight year that a WCU rookie has been honored – and the seventh time since 2011.

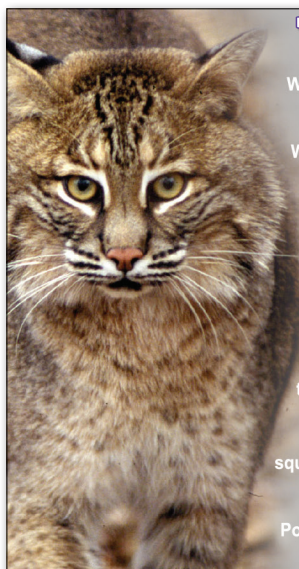

WHAT IS A CATAMOUNT?

Western Carolina University's unique mascot and nickname for its athletics teams seem to always bring about the same question when WCU plays on the road ... "What is a Catamount?" Webster's Dictionary defines "catamount" as "any of various wild cats, such as a cougar or lynx." Cats of the catamount variety, including the bobcat, roam the southern Appalachian Mountains where Western Carolina University is located.

The nickname evolved from a contest that was held on the Cullowhee campus in 1933. The school was called Western Carolina Teachers College at that time and its teams were known as "the Teachers."

Everyone on campus was invited to participate, and the usual names were suggested — Bears, Indians, Panthers. However, the college wanted an unusual name; a name that few others had and that everyone would not copy.

The contest came down to Mountain Boomers, a small ground squirrel that scampers about the woods and is extremely difficult to catch, and Catamounts. Catamounts was the favorite of Head Football Coach C.C. Poindexter and was the nickname chosen. Poindexter wanted his players to be Catamounts with "fierce spirit, savage attacks, and lightning quick moves."

Western Carolina University is the only football-playing school in the nation using the nickname, "Catamounts," with the University of Vermont in Burlington, VT, being the only other school playing under that moniker.

OAKLAND – CULLOWHEE – FEB. 15-16:

• Western Carolina scored a three-game series sweep over Oakland University to start the 2019 campaign, winning the first three meetings ever between the Catamounts and Golden Grizzlies on the baseball diamond ... It was the first time since 2012 that WCU opened the year with a three-game series sweep;

• WCU's three-game series sweep is its first since taking all three games against VMI in Cullowhee in late April of 2017 ... It also marked WCU's first sweep of a nonconference foe since taking all three at Kansas State in late March of the 2016 season;

• A combined 20 of WCU's 34 hits (59-percent) went for extra bases in the three-game weekend series including 11 doubles, three triples, and six home runs ... the six home runs were spread between three different players with two – Luke Robinson (3) and Justice Bigbie (2) homering multiple times in the season-opening series with Robinson belting the walk-off game-winner in game two of the series ... Newcomer Daylan Nanny had the biggest swing of the series with a grand slam home run, his first round-tripper with the Catamounts ... WCU did not hit its sixth homer a season ago until the seventh game of the year;

• Justice Bigbie led the Catamounts in the three-game season-opening series sweep with a .545 batting average, collecting six hits including three for extra bases with a double and two home runs and five RBI – two coming with two outs ... He had two multi-hit games with two hits in the opener and three in game two against Oakland while amassing an impressive .688 on-base percentage and a 1.182 slugging percentage, drawing four walks and one HBP in addition to his six hits;

• All three of WCU's decisions on the mound came out of the bullpen on opening-weekend ... WCU's starters combined to toss 14 of the 27 innings with the winning pitchers tossing 2.1-or-more innings ... All seven pitchers that toed the rubber recorded strikeouts including six apiece by starter Taylor Purus and reliever Zach Franklin.

ST. JOHN'S – CULLOWHEE – FEB. 24:

• Western Carolina weathered the St. John's Red Storm, splitting a Sunday doubleheader with the preseason favorite out of the Big East Conference after rain and unfavorable playing conditions postponed and cancelled play both Friday and Saturday ... St. John's took game one, 5-2, breaking a 2-2 tie with a three-run top of the fifth inning before the Catamounts won the night cap, 13-4, breaking open a one-run, 5-4, game with an eight-run eighth inning;

• Offensively, Justice Bigbie led the Catamounts in Sunday's doubleheader, going 4-for-8 with a two-run home run and a run-scoring single in a 3-for-4 showing in the back-end of the twin bill;

INDIANA STATE – CULLOWHEE – FEB. 26-27:

• WCU split a two-game, midweek series with Indiana State falling in the opener, 8-4, before dropping the Sycamores from the ranks of the nation's unbeaten, rallying from a six-run deficit before holding on for a 10-9 victory;

• Matthew Koehler drove in his second run of the game on a single through the right side to give Western Carolina a 3-2 lead in the home half of the fourth inning ... However, Indiana State used a two-run sixth and a four-run seventh to remain perfect on the season, handing the Catamounts an 8-4 setback;

• Jalen Jones and Daylan Nanny combined for six of WCU's nine hits including five for extra bases in game two of the series ... RHP Blake Therrian scored the win out of the bullpen after tossing two innings of scoreless, two-hit relief.

KEITH LECLAIR CLASSIC – GREENVILLE, NC – MARCH 1-3:

• Western Carolina struggled in dropping all three games of the Keith LeClair Classic including a tight, 5-3 loss to Wright State in the opener ... Utah pulled away with a nine-run home half of the eighth in a 14-0 victory ... and WCU dropped its finale to host ECU, 12-6;

• Daylan Nanny belted a three-run home run to pull Western Carolina back to within a run, 7-6, in the top of the sixth inning, but the ninth-ranked East Carolina Pirates plated five unanswered runs over their final two plate appearances to close the 2019 Keith LeClair Classic with a 12-6 win.

at UNC ASHEVILLE – ASHEVILLE, NC – MARCH 6:

• Luke Robinson blasted a grand slam home run in the top of the first inning as a part of a career-high six RBI performance while Justice Bigbie plated five including a two-run inside the part home run as Western Carolina powered past mountain-rival UNC Asheville, 16-4, on a frigid Wednesday afternoon at Greenwood Field;

• Western Carolina scored all 16 runs in the first six innings, out hitting the Bulldogs 21-to-7 in halting a five-game drought in the head-to-head series with UNCA ... WCU's 21 hits were scattered between nine players with six Catamounts collecting multi-hit games ... Seven of the hits went for extra bases including five doubles and two HRs;

• Matthew Koehler had a career day by reaching base five times on four hits including a double, scoring five of WCU's runs in the win. The Raleigh, N.C., native tallied three singles, a double, was hit by a pitch in the fifth inning and drew a walk in the sixth before being retired in his final trip on a long fly ball to center that chased the fielder to the warning track.

FIRST PITCH INVITATIONAL – GREENVILLE, SC – MARCH 9-10:

• Western Carolina took two from a pair of BIG Ten foes, rallying past Michigan State, 6-4, in 10 innings before defeating Ohio State, 8-5 at Fluor Field;

• Including winning four of its six games at last spring's Southern Conference Baseball Championship, WCU has now won six of its last eight games played at Fluor Field at the West End in Greenville, S.C., site of its most recent conference championship title;

• WCU batted .357 in the two games in tournament play, led by Immanuel Wilder with a .667 (4-for-6) showing ... Matthew Koehler homered and Will Prater tripled on the weekend.

NOTRE DAME – CULLOWHEE – MARCH 13:

• Western Carolina erupted for nine runs over the first three frames but needed a big eighth-inning rally to fend off the Notre Dame Fighting Irish, winning its fourth-straight game with a 16-9 nonconference victory;

• Including a five-run first and two runs in both the second and third innings, WCU raced out to a 9-0 advantage over the visiting ACC-foe. Notre Dame's Niko Kavadas belted a grand slam home run as a part of a six-run top of the eighth inning as the Irish fought back to tie the game through seven and a half ... But, the Catamounts responded with their first runs since the third inning with a seven-run, one-out rally in the home half of the eighth to push the game out of reach in the first-ever meeting between the two schools on the baseball diamond;

• Matthew Koehler and Will Prater paced four Catamounts with multi-hit games, both collecting three hits including a double in 3-for-5 outings at the plate. Koehler drove in three and scored twice while Prater scored three times, both adding a stolen base in the winning effort. Sophomore transfer Daylan Nanny doubled as a part of a 2-for-4, two walk performance while Justin Sparks finished 2-for-5 with three runs driven in.

ELON – CULLOWHEE – MARCH 15-17:

• Western Carolina dropped 2-of-3 to the preseason favorite out of the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), Elon ... the Catamounts claimed Friday's opener, 5-2, to win its fifth-straight game before falling in 10 innings, 12-11, on Saturday and the offense was shut down in a 6-2 Sunday loss in the series finale;

• Chase Walter struck out eight in a six-inning relief appearance, suffering a loss, while Zach Franklin fanned six in seven innings in scoring a victory;

• Justice Bigbie led the team with a .417 batting average, collecting five hits including his second inside-the-park home run.

GARDNER-WEBB – CULLOWHEE – MARCH 20:

• Western Carolina rallied from a four-run, first-inning deficit to tie the game at four in the home half of the fifth inning – but, Gardner-Webb's Justin Kunz belted a two-out, solo home run in the top of the sixth and the Runnin' Bulldogs bullpen shut the door the final four frames in a 5-4 loss for the Catamounts at home;

• RHP Ryan Mitschelle had a very solid, 5.0 relief appearance, striking out three but was saddled with the loss with just one run allowed on the Kunz homer ... True freshman Eric Wallington recorded his first two outs including his first career strikeout in his first collegiate start, but issued four walks in the four-run opening frame;

• OF Matthew Koehler tripled in a 2-for-3 outing at the plate while Justice Bigbie delivered a game-tying, two-RBI single in the home half of the fifth inning in a 1-for-4 showing.

at ETSU – JOHNSON CITY, TENN. – MARCH 22-24:

• Western Carolina was swept in its SoCon-opening series for the first-time since 2011, falling in a pair of one-run ball games as ETSU rallied for a 10-9 win on Friday before holding off WCU in the ninth for a 5-4 victory on Saturday ... In the finale, the Bucs completed the sweep by dominating WCU, 10-3, stranding 16 Catamount base runners ... It's the second-straight year that ETSU has swept WCU in the regular season meetings;

• Western Carolina out-hit ETSU, 36-to-25 but the Bucs had three more extra base hits (14-to-11) and managed to out score the Catamounts, 25-16 in the three-game set;

• 3B Justice Bigbie batted .545 (6-for-11) on the weekend with a team-best four RBI ... Added four freebies including three walks and a HBP for a .667 on-base percentage ... Sophomore OF Immanuel Wilder hit his first career home run in Friday's loss;

• Both RHP Zach Franklin (5.2 IP) and LHP Taylor Purus (7.0 IP) struck out a team-high six in their appearances.

at UNCG – GREENSBORO, N.C. – MARCH 29-31:

• Western Carolina took 2-of-3 from UNCG on the road, dropping the series-opener, 7-5, as the Spartans scored two in the eighth inning to break the 5-5 tie ... WCU rebounded by throttling the Spartans, 24-4, setting a season high for runs (24) and base hits (22) ... Sunday's rubber match was a pitcher's duel with the Catamounts loading the bases and scoring the go-ahead run in the top of the eighth before stranding the would-be tying run at third in the bottom of the frame ... Chase Walter then struck out the side in the ninth to secure the game and series win;

• WCU batted .353 collective as a team against one of the better pitching staffs in the SoCon, collecting 41 hits in three games including 16 extra base hits – 11 doubles, a triple, and four home runs ... Four individuals batted .400-or-better led by Immanuel Wilder (7-of-11, .636);

• RHP Chase Walter struck out a season-high tying eight batters in a seven-inning relief effort, limiting UNCG to one run on six singles, while Taylor Purus fanned six over

a six-inning outing, giving up two runs – only one of which was earned – on seven hits including five singles and two doubles ... WCU's pitching staff posted a 3.46 collective ERA with 24 strikeouts against 12 walks on the weekend.

at MARSHALL – HUNTINGTON, W.VA. – APRIL 3:

• Matthew Koehler belted three home runs and accounted for a career-high six RBI on Wednesday afternoon, but three unanswered runs between the seventh and eighth innings allowed the Marshall Thundering Herd to rally past Western Carolina, 10-9, in nonconference action at the Kennedy Center YMCA Baseball Field;

• Marshall has won three-straight over the Catamounts, out-hitting WCU, 15-9, in the most recent meeting despite WCU hitting four homers – three by Koehler and a solo shot by Immanuel Wilder.

WOFFORD – CULLOWHEE – APRIL 5-7:

• Western Carolina suffered a 20-5 lopsided loss in the series opener before rallying back to win game two, 4-3, to force a Sunday rubber match ... the Catamounts tied Sunday's game at four in the home half of the eighth only to surrender three runs in the top of the ninth in falling, 7-4, to drop the series to the Terriers for a second-straight season;

• Justice Bigbie led WCU with a .583 (7-for-13) average with a double and a home run, while also scoring the game-winning run in Saturday's walk-off victory on a single by Colin Bertsch (2-for-7);

• Chase Walter was impressive in tossing 7.0 innings in Saturday's win, factoring in a no-decision, but struck out seven while limiting Wofford to three runs – only one of which was earned ... WCU's pitching staff issued an alarming 31 walks, four hit batters, and threw 15 wild pitches – the bulk coming in Friday's lopsided series-opening loss.

APPALACHIAN STATE – CULLOWHEE – APRIL 9:

• For a second-time this season, weather prevented mountain-rivals Western Carolina and Appalachian State from meeting in nonconference play ...the first meeting came in a weather-altered tournament at Michigan State's First Pitch Invitational with the WCU-App game shuffled out due to rain changing the schedule ... Lightning delays and later a rain cell that soaked the playing surface at Childress Field / Hennon Stadium ended up in the cancellation.

GARDNER-WEBB – SHELBY, N.C. – APRIL 10:

• Western Carolina used an Immanuel Wilder solo home run and run-scoring doubles by Daylan Nanny and Andrew Bullock to build a four-run lead on Wednesday before holding off Gardner-Webb in the bottom of the ninth, earning a 4-3 nonconference victory over the Runnin' Bulldogs at Keeter Stadium, home of the American Legion World Series;

• Colin Bertsch paced the Catamount offense with a career-high tying three base hits, while the remaining seven of WCU's 10 base knocks were scattered between seven different players ... Wilder hit his fourth homer of the season while Nanny and Bullock both doubled in runs – the latter coming as a pinch hitter ... Matthew Koehler also collected a double in Wednesday's road victory;

• Blake Therrian (2-1) struck out a season-high three in tossing a career-long 7.0 innings in the starting role ... He worked around four walks, stranding eight of the 11 Runnin' Bulldogs runners that were left on base ... Jack Snyder struck out one in an inning of one-hit, scoreless relief while Jacob Corn pitched the ninth, allowing three runs – two of which were earned – on four base hits and inducing the game-ending double-play ball.
