TOMMY PLAXICO

GOLF COACH

Likeable Tommy Plaxico, a former Georgia Tech star of the cinders, has been the Yellow Jackets' golf coach since January of 1956. His Tech teams have won 22 dual matches while losing 25 and being tied once. They are always a contender for the Southeastern Conference title. Plaxico does a good job of instilling his golfers with the same desire to win that he himself demonstrated as an outstanding Tech trackman of the early 1940's.



Coach Plaxico has been on the Georgia Tech campus ever since his undergraduate days. He was a regular on the Tech Track team for three years and was captain of the 1941 squad. After a four-year interlude spent as a Navy fighter pilot in World War II, Plaxico returned to the campus to receive his degree in Industrial Management in 1946. He immediately joined the Tech faculty as a member of the physical training staff, a capacity in which he still serves. Tommy also served as assistant track coach for five years and has been in charge of Georgia Tech's fine intramural program since 1952.

Coach Plaxico was born in York, S. C., on May 17, 1919. He attended Tech High of Atlanta and entered Georgia Tech the fall of 1937. He was married on September 11, 1953, to Frances Perry, of Tifton, Georgia. The Plaxicos have three children: a daughter, Bonnie, 6, and sons Perry, 4, and Blake, 2. Golf has been Tommy's hobby for many years and he shoots in the seventies—he says.

MISCELLANEOUS GOLF INFORMATION

The incomparable Bobby Jones, who graduated from Georgia Tech in 1922 with a degree in Mechanical Engineering, is without doubt the most famous Yellow Jacket golfer. While he was a student at Georgia Tech, Bobby Jones gained many of his honors in golf. Some of the best known included: 1919 runner-up to David Herron for the U. S. National Amateur title; 1920—won the Southern Amateur championship and was medalist at the National Amateur tournament; 1922—won the Southern Amateur title and tied for second in the National Amateur tournament. Of course, Bobby Jones went on to become the most famous golfer in history after he graduated from Georgia Tech.
