CLEMSON TO OPEN 2019 SEASON THURSDAY AGAINST GEORGIA TECH

Top-ranked Clemson will kick off its 2019 season on Thursday, Aug. 29, when the Tigers play host to the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets. The matchup of conference foes at Memorial Stadium in Clemson is scheduled for 8 p.m. ET.

The contest will be the first live football game broadcast on ACC Network. ESPN and ACCN will air a special edition of College GameDay from the Memorial Stadium concourse from 6-8 p.m., with a simulcast on both ESPN and ACC Network from 6-7 p.m. followed by the final hour being aired exclusively on ACCN. Fans are encouraged to get into their seats at Memorial Stadium early to help showcase Clemson's stadium atmosphere on the prestigious pregame program.

In addition, Clemson will honor its 2018 national championship victory by unveiling championship signage on the south side of Memorial Stadium prior to the game.

Clemson enters the 2019 season ranked No. 1 in both the Associated Press preseason poll and the USA Today preseason coaches poll. It marks the first time in history that Clemson will enter a season bearing that distinction in either poll.

"Somebody asked me at Media Day, 'Oh man, how are you all going to handle it now? Y'all are the hunted.' I'm like, 'That's business as usual,'" Head Coach Dabo Swinney said. "We've had eight 10+ win seasons in a row. Every time we show up to play, that other team wants to beat us. That's not anything new this year."

Though a new season and a new team is at hand, a number of Clemson players will attempt to pick up where they left off at the end of major college football's first 15-0 campaign since 1897. Quarterback Trevor Lawrence is one 300-yard passing performance

on Thursday away from tying the school record for consecutive 300-yard passing games with three, which was accomplished twice by Tajh Boyd in 2013. Lawrence (169) is also 19 attempts shy of breaking Boyd's record of consecutive pass attempts without an interception (187 from 2012-13).

One of Lawrence's top targets, Justyn Ross, is in search of a program-record-tying third consecutive 100-yard receiving game. That record is presently shared by five players: Charlie Waters (1969), Tony Horne (1997), Rod Gardner (2000), DeAndre Hopkins (2012) and Sammy Watkins (2013).

Three items of note in 280 characters or less:

- Clemson kicking off the 2019 season on August 29 will mark the earliest in the calendar year that Clemson has opened a season in its 124-year history. Previously, Clemson's earliest openers had been held on August 30 in 2003, 2008 and 2014.
- Frevor Lawrence (@trevorlawrencee) threw for 300-plus yards in each of his final two games last year. Another 300-yard passing day would tie him with Tajh Boyd (two three-game streaks in 2013) for the longest streak of 300-yard passing games in @ClemsonFB history.
- ** A 100-yard receiving game by Justyn Ross (@_jross8) would be his third consecutive 100-yard effort, dating back to last season, which would tie him for the @ClemsonFB record with Charlie Waters, Tony Horne, Rod Gardner, DeAndre Hopkins and Sammy Watkins.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR THIS SEASON

- Clemson attempting to become the first repeat champion in the College Football Playoff era and the first repeat champion overall since Alabama across the 2011-12 seasons.
- Clemson attempting to win back-to-back national championships for the first time in school history.
- Clemson, which is already the first team in ACC history to win four consecutive outright titles, attempting to become the first team in ACC history to win five consecutive ACC titles outright. (Note: Florida State earned at least a share of nine consecutive ACC titles from 1992-2000 but never earned more than three consecutive titles outright.)
- Clemson attempting to become only the second team ever to earn five consecutive College Football Playoff berths (Alabama, 2014-18).
- Clemson winning 10 games for a school-record ninth consecutive season. Clemson would match Texas (2001-09) for the third-longest streak of 10-win seasons in FBS history.
- Clemson entering the year with 103 wins this decade. With 12 wins, Clemson would join Penn (124 in the 1890s) and Yale (116 in the 1890s) as the only major college football programs to win 115 games in a single decade since 1890. (Note: Alabama can also accomplish the feat for this decade with two wins in 2019). At 103-22 entering the 2019 season, the 2010s are already the winningest decade in school history, outpacing the 87-25-4 mark set in the 1980s.
- Clemson (41 from 2016-18) winning 14 games to tie the 2018 Clemson senior class as the winningest class in school and ACC history while matching the 2018 Clemson and Alabama seniors as the winningest class in major college football history. Fifteen wins in 2019 would secure that title outright.
- Clemson (22 from 2016-18) needing eight regular season ACC wins to match the 2019 seniors (30 from 2015-18) as the winningest class in school history in regular season conference play, one shy of the conference record of 31.
- Clemson (20 from 2016-18) winning all seven home games to allow the 2019 senior class to tie the school record for most home wins by a senior class, matching the mark set by the 2017 and 2018 seniors.
- Clemson winning at least six home games to add to its active eight-year streak of winning at least six games at Memorial Stadium.
- Clemson winning all its home games in three consecutive seasons for the first time under Head Coach Dabo Swinney.
- Clemson going undefeated at home for the fifth time in six years. It would mark the school's first time accomplishing the feat since going undefeated at home in four straight years from 1938-41, when the team played four games at home in 1938 and two games at home in each of the 1939-41 campaigns.
- Clemson winning its first six home games to tie or all seven home games to break the program record for longest home winning streak (21 from 2013-16). Clemson enters 2019 with a 15-game home winning streak, dating back to 2016.
- Clemson hosting home games against head coaches who enter 2019 a combined 1-6 at Memorial Stadium in their careers (Geoff Collins, 0-0; Jimbo Fisher, 1-3; Will Healy, 0-0; Willie Taggart, 0-0; Scott Satterfield, 0-1; Josh Conklin, 0-0; Dave Clawson, 0-2).
- Clemson posting a perfect record in true road games for a second straight season for the second time in school history (2015-16). It would make Clemson undefeated in true road games for the fourth time in five years for the first time in school history.

- Clemson entering the season having won seven straight true road games. If Clemson were to win all five of its true road games in 2019, it would tie the program record for the longest road winning streak of 12, set across the 2015-17 seasons.
- Clemson carrying a 295-144-6 all-time record against ACC opponents, including six appearances in the ACC Championship Game. Five ACC wins this year would make Clemson the first team to win 300 ACC games all-time, including postseason play.
- Head Coach Dabo Swinney entering the season with an .812 winning percentage in ACC regular season play, .001 behind Bobby Bowden (.813) for the winningest mark in conference games in ACC history (minimum three seasons).
- Offensive line coach Robbie Caldwell nearing the 500-game mark for his collegiate coaching career. Clemson's home contest against Boston College on Oct. 26 is scheduled to be Caldwell's 500th career game.
- Clemson fielding an offensive line that features four senior starters (John Simpson, Sean Pollard, Gage Cervenka and Tremayne Anchrum) in a game for the first time since the 2011 South Carolina game (Phillip Price, David Smith, Antoine McClain and Landon Walker with junior Dalton Freeman). The last time Clemson had four senior starters on the offensive line for the majority of a season was 2007, when sophomore Thomas Austin was joined by seniors Barry Richardson, Chris McDuffie, Brandon Pilgrim and Christian Capote.
- Clemson entering 2019 as the only program in the country to return a 3,000-yard passer (Trevor Lawrence), 1,500-yard rusher (Travis Etienne) and 1,000-yard receiver (Justyn Ross) from 2018.
- Running back Travis Etienne (1,658 in 2018) attempting to become the first player in school history to record multiple 1,500-yard rushing seasons. A 1,000-yard rushing season would make him the sixth player in school history to reach 1,000 rushing yards in multiple seasons, joining Raymond Priester (1995-96), Woodrow Dantzler (2000-01), James Davis (2006-07), Andre Ellington (2011-12) and Wayne Gallman (2015-
- Etienne (2,424) entering the season 1,542 rushing yards shy of matching Raymond Priester's school record for career rushing yards (3,966).
- Etienne (2,424) rushing for 576 yards to become only the seventh player in Clemson history to reach 3,000 career rushing yards, joining Raymond Priester (3,966), James Davis (3,881), C.J. Spiller (3,547), Andre Ellington (3,436), Wayne Gallman (3,429) and Travis Zachery (3,058).
- With 1,576 yards, Etienne (2,424) could become the first 4,000-yard rusher in school history and the eighth such performer in ACC history.
- Etienne (nine) needing eight 100-yard rushing games to tie Wayne Gallman (17 from 2014-16) for the most in a career in school history.
- Etienne (37) needing 10 touchdowns to tie or 11 touchdowns to pass James Davis (47 from 2005-08) for the most rushing touchdowns in Clemson history.
- Etienne (37) entering the season 13 rushing touchdowns shy of becoming the third player in ACC history with 50 career rushing touchdowns (52 by James Conner; 50 by Lamar Jackson).
- Etienne (39 total touchdowns) needing 13 touchdowns of any kind to break C.J. Spiller's Clemson record for total career touchdowns (51).
- Etienne (24 in 2018) attempting to be the first player in ACC history to record multiple seasons with 20 or more rushing touchdowns in a single career. Etienne is presently one of only four players in league history with a 20-touchdown rushing season to his credit,

including Pitt's James Conner (26 in 2014), Virginia Tech's Ryan Williams (21 in 2009) and Louisville's Lamar Jackson (21 in 2016).

- Etienne attempting to become the first Clemson player to lead the ACC in rushing yards in consecutive years since Terry Allen in 1987-88. Beyond Allen, the only other Clemson player to accomplish the feat was Buddy Gore in 1966-67.
- Etienne (156 in 2018) attempting to become the first player in ACC history with multiple 150-point seasons. Last year, his 156 points tied Pitt's James Conner (2014) for second-most in a season in conference history, one point shy of the record set by Florida State's Roberto Aguayo (157) in 2013. (Note: Syracuse's Andre Szmyt can also accomplish the feat this season.)
- Quarterback Trevor Lawrence (3,280 in 2018) attempting to become the third quarterback in Clemson history to post multiple 3,000-yard passing seasons, joining Tajh Boyd (three from 2011-13) and Deshaun Watson (two from 2015-16). Lawrence would be the first to accomplish the feat across his freshman and sophomore seasons.
- Lawrence (3,280) needing only 2,842 more passing yards to enter the Top 5 in school history in career passing yardage. Cullen Harper currently sits fifth with 5,762 passing yards from 2005-08.
- Lawrence attempting to join Boyd and Watson as the only players in Clemson history to throw 30 or more touchdowns in multiple seasons.
- Lawrence (30) needing only 20 touchdown passes to move past Charlie Whitehurst (49 from 2002-05) for the third-most touchdown passes in school history.
- Lawrence entering the season as Clemson's career leader in passing efficiency (157.6) and interception percentage (1.01).
- Wide receiver Tee Higgins (12 in 2018) attempting to become the first player in school history to post double-digit touchdown receptions in consecutive seasons. He would join Sammy Watkins (2011 and 2013) as the only players in school history to post 10 or more touchdown receptions in multiple seasons in a single career.
- Higgins (14) entering the season two touchdowns shy of entering the Top 10 in school history in career receiving touchdowns. The current school record is shared by DeAndre Hopkins and Sammy Watkins (27 each).
- Wide receiver Justyn Ross (1,000 in 2018) attempting to become only the second player in school history to record back-to-back 1,000-yard receiving seasons (Rod Gardner, 1999-2000). Ross would become the first Clemson player to accomplish the feat across his freshman and sophomore seasons.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR THIS WEEK

- Clemson opening the season on the earliest date in program history. The Aug. 29 kickoff is Clemson's earliest all-time, surpassing the 2003, 2008 and 2014 season openers held on Aug. 30 of their respective years.
- Clemson opening a season on a Thursday for the first time in school history.
- Clemson hosting a Thursday game for the first time since Nov. 14, 2013, a 55-31 win against Georgia Tech. The game will be only the 14th Thursday home game in Clemson history and only the fifth since the opening of Memorial Stadium in 1942. Clemson is 2-2 on Thursdays at Memorial Stadium all-time.
- Clemson attempting to earn its eighth consecutive Thursday win. The Tigers have won seven consecutive Thursday games dating back to a 42-13 road win

against Wake Forest in 2012. The current Thursday streak is tied for the longest in program history with seven straight Thursday wins across the 1898-1900 seasons under coaches John Penton, Walter Riggs and John Heisman.

- Clemson attempting to win its 60th Thursday game all-time. The Tigers are 59-61-10 in Thursday games all-time.
- Clemson opening the season against a conference opponent for the first time since 2007, when the Tigers earned a 24-18 win against Florida State on a Monday night in the final "Bowden Bowl."
- Clemson opening a season against an ACC foe for the 13th time in school history. Clemson is 9-2-1 in the previous 12 season openers against ACC teams.
- Clemson opening ACC play at home for the first time since 2011, snapping a seven-season streak in which Clemson opened ACC play on the road.
- Clemson attempting to open ACC play with a win for a fifth consecutive season. The Tigers won their conference opener in each of the last four seasons. A fifth straight victory in their conference opener would tie the program's longest such winning streak from 1980-84
- Clemson attempting to win its first ACC home game of the season for a ninth consecutive year. Clemson has won every ACC home opener dating back to 2011. A ninth straight victory by Clemson in its ACC home opener would break the longest streak in program history, set across the 1964-71 seasons under head coaches Frank Howard and Cecil Ingram.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 12-1 against ACC Coastal Division opponents since 2015. Clemson's 11-1 mark against the Coastal in the last four seasons includes victories in their last seven interdivisional matchups, including ACC Championship appearances.
- Clemson attempting to earn its 32nd all-time victory against Georgia Tech. Georgia Tech is one of 11 schools against whom Clemson has earned at least 30 all-time victories (South Carolina, Wake Forest, North Carolina State, Furman, Virginia, North Carolina, Duke, Maryland, Presbyterian and The Citadel).
- Clemson attempting to win its fifth consecutive game against Georgia Tech, dating back to a 43-24 home win in 2015. It would break Clemson's longest winning streak in the all-time series, surpassing fourgame winning streaks across the 1898-1903 seasons and the 1993-96 campaigns.
- Clemson attempting to win a sixth straight home contest against Georgia Tech, dating back to 2010. The current five-game home winning streak against the Yellow Jackets is already Clemson's longest such streak in the series history.
- Clemson attempting to record its 16th all-time home win against Georgia Tech.
- Dabo Swinney attempting to improve to 8-5 all-time against Georgia Tech, including postseason play.
- Swinney attempting to improve to 11-6 as a head coach all-time in games against schools from the state of Georgia. He enters the game with a 7-5 mark against Georgia Tech, a 1-1 record against Georgia and a 1-0 mark against both Georgia State and Georgia Southern.
- Clemson attempting to win its 16th consecutive game at Memorial Stadium, dating back to a 56-7 win against South Carolina on Nov. 25, 2016. The current 15-game streak is tied for the second-longest home winning streak in Clemson history, trailing only a 21-game Memorial Stadium winning streak from 2013-16.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 93-23-8 all-time in season openers.
- Swinney attempting to extend his record in season openers as head coach to 10-1.

- Swinney moving out of a tie with Danny Ford (nine each) for the second-most season-opening victories in Clemson history, trailing only Frank Howard (25) in program annals.
- Swinney pushing his all-time record in nonconference play as a head coach to 42-13, which would give him a 34-8 all-time record against non-conference opponents in regular season play.
- Clemson entering a game against an ACC foe having won its most recent meeting against all 13 ACC member institutions.
- Clemson attempting to finish with a positive turnover margin in a fourth straight game, dating back to last season, for the first time since a five-game streak to open the 2013 season.
- Clemson attempting to win its 11th consecutive game by 20 or more points for the first time in school history. The current 10-game streak of 20-point wins is already a

- Clemson attempting to score 27 or more points in a 16th straight game for the first time in school history. Clemson's current 15-game streak is already a school record.
- Running back Travis Etienne (2,424) needing 76 rushing yards to become only the 11th player in school history with 2,500 career rushing yards. With 148 yards, he can pass Buddy Gore (2,571 from 1966-68) to enter the Top 10 in career rushing yards in school history.
- Etienne looking to score a rushing touchdown in a sixth consecutive game, dating back to last season. It would tie Woody Dantzler (six in 2000) for the seventh-longest streak of consecutive games with a rushing touchdown in school history and pull Etienne within one of his personal best (seven straight games to open the 2018 season).
- Etienne (37) entering the game four rushing touchdowns shy of tying Travis Zachery (41 from 1999-2001) for the second-most career rushing touchdowns in school history. With three rushing touchdowns, Etienne would be only the third player in school history with 40 career rushing touchdowns, joining Zachary and James Davis (47).
- Etienne (39) scoring a touchdown of any kind to give him 40 career total touchdowns. He would be only the fourth player in school history to accomplish the feat, joining C.J. Spiller (51), Travis Zachery (50) and James Davis (49).
- Etienne (234) needing 16 points to become the 11th Clemson player in history to score 250 career points and tie Jad Dean for 10th in school annals.
- Wide receiver Tee Higgins attempting to add to his career-long streak of four consecutive games with a receiving touchdown, dating back to last season. A fifth straight game would tie him with Derrick Hamilton (2003), Aaron Kelly (2007) and Deon Cain (2015) for the second-longest streak in school history, trailing DeAndre Hopkins' school record of 10 from 2012.
- Quarterback Trevor Lawrence riding a streak of 169 consecutive pass attempts without an interception, already the longest single-season streak in school history. He is 18 attempts shy of tying or 19 attempts shy of passing the multi-season record held by Tajh Boyd (187, 2012-13). NC State's Russell Wilson holds the ACC record with 379 from 2008-09.
- Lawrence attempting to throw for 300+ yards in a third consecutive game to tie Tajh Boyd's school record for consecutive 300-yard games. Boyd produced two three-game streaks in 2013.
- Wide receiver Justyn Ross attempting to record a third consecutive 100-yard receiving performance, dating back to last season, for the first time in his career. It would tie the school record presently shared by Charlie Waters (1969), Tony Horne (1997), Rod Gardner (2000), DeAndre Hopkins (2012) and Sammy Watkins (2013). Ross would be the youngest Clemson player to accomplish the feat, as no other player's streak included contests from his freshman season.

SEASON OPENERS

Clemson has won 27 of its last 34 season openers. Head Coach Dabo Swinney is 9-1 in his career in season opening games with the only loss coming at Georgia to open the 2014 season. A win this week would give Swinney his 10th season-opening victory to pass Danny Ford for the second-most by a head coach in school history.

Swinney's opening wins include two over Auburn and one over Georgia. The season opening victory over

Georgia came at home in 2013 when the Bulldogs were ranked fifth in the nation.

Clemson has played eight openers against top 25 teams in the last 19 years after having played just five top 25 teams in opening games between 1936 (first year of the AP poll) and 1999.

Clemson has been no stranger to exciting season openers since the turn of the century. In 2004, against Wake Forest, Clemson won a 37-30 overtime thriller on ABC. Clemson won at home in 2005, a 25-24 win over No. 17 Texas A&M on a 42-yard field goal by Jad Dean with two seconds left. Clemson also beat No. 19 Florida State in the 2007 season opener.

The Tigers are 92-23-8 (.780), regardless of site, in their first game in their previous 123 seasons.

HOME OPENERS

Even though 2019 represents the 124th season of Clemson football, Clemson has had just 118 home openers in its history as a function of the five seasons in which Clemson did not play a game at home. In 118 home openers, Clemson has a 93-17-8 record (.822) against 38 different opponents. Clemson has won 15 straight home openers with the last loss coming in Dabo Swinney's first year as an assistant coach, a 30-0 loss to Georgia in 2003.

CLEMSON IN ACC OPENERS

The 2019 season marks Clemson's 67th year of membership in the ACC, dating back to the conference's first year of play in 1953. In its previous 66 seasons of ACC membership, Clemson has posted a 40-25-1 record in conference openers.

Clemson has won its last four ACC openers, including road victories at Louisville in 2015 and 2017 and a road wins at Georgia Tech in 2016 and 2018. The 2019 season breaks a streak of seven consecutive years that Clemson had to travel to open ACC play.

Head Coach Dabo Swinney is 6-4 in ACC openers at Clemson, with all four losses coming to Top 20 opponents, including No. 15 Georgia Tech in 2009, No. 16 Miami (Fla.) in 2010, No. 4 Florida State in 2012 and No. 1 Florida State in 2014. Three of those four contests were on the road.

The Tigers are seeking a fifth consecutive victory in conference openers, which would tie the 1980-84

squads for the longest streak in school history. With a win on Thursday, the 2019 senior class would become the sixth senior class in Clemson history to win all four of its ACC openers, joining 4-0 records posted by the 1983, 1984, 1989, 2005 and 2018 senior classes in ACC debuts.

against Clemson, but Clemson has a 20-17 lead since Georgia Tech joined the ACC prior to the 1983 football season

Clemson has won four in a row against Georgia Tech. If the Tigers earn a victory on Thursday, it would give Clemson five wins in a row over the Yellow Jackets for the first time in program history. Clemson has won four in a row over the Yellow Jackets just three times, including the first four games of the series in 1898-1903 as well as stretches in 1993-96 and 2015-18.

Dabo Swinney is already the first Clemson coach to beat Georgia Tech four consecutive times and will attempt to push that streak to five. Clemson had multiple coaches in the two Clemson four-game winning streaks in the series predating the current streak.

The home team has won eight of the last 10 games in the series, with the only road wins taking place in Atlanta during Clemson's national championship seasons in 2016 and 2018. The 2016 victory was Clemson's first win over Tech in Atlanta since a 2003 win in which current Co-Offensive Coordinator Tony Elliott caught a touchdown pass for the Tigers.

Twelve of the last 23 games in the series have been decided by five points or less, including a six-game streak between 1996-01 in which every game was decided by exactly three points. Eleven of Georgia Tech's last 14 wins in the series have been decided by a touchdown or less.

The series dates to a 23-0 Clemson win in Augusta, Ga., in 1898, just the 11th game in Clemson football history. Clemson won the first four games of the series, including games in 1902 and 1903 when John Heisman was at the helm. Clemson defeated Georgia Tech, 73-0, in Atlanta in 1903 with Heisman as head coach. Heisman then left Clemson to become Georgia Tech's head coach.

SERIES HIGHLIGHTS

- Every game between the two teams between 1907-74 was held in Atlanta. Clemson's only wins in those 36 meetings came in 1907, 1936, 1945 and 1969, the last of which was Frank Howard's final season as head coach. Howard won just twice (1945 and 1969) in his career in Atlanta, but Clemson made the trip every year to help balance the athletic department budget. Howard was also athletic director his entire time as head coach (1940-69).

- The two teams have played on a neutral site just three times. Clemson won a 23-0 victory in 1898 in Augusta, Ga., and a 41-5 win in Greenville, S.C. in 1899. Georgia Tech won the ACC title game in Tampa in 2009, 39-34.

- The first time Georgia Tech played at Memorial Stadium in Clemson was 1974, a 21-17 Clemson victory. Clemson won that game on a three-yard touchdown pass from Mike O'Cain (later a head coach at NC State) to All-America tight end Bennie Cunningham with 8:26 left.

- Woodrow Dantzler had one of the best all-around games of his career with 164 yards rushing and 254 yards passing in Clemson's victory in Atlanta in 2001. He threw for two scores and ran for two, including a 38-yard "Hail Mary Run" on the last play of the first half to cut Tech's lead to 19-14 at intermission. His 63-yard scoring pass to J.J. McKelvey with 1:58 left put Clemson ahead by three, but Tech tied the count with a 20-yard field goal with just six seconds left. Dantzler's "walk-off" 11-yard touchdown in overtime

gave Clemson the win.

- Clemson has had just five games in its history in which both teams scored in the 40s. The first two took place at Georgia Tech. Tech won, 45-42, in 1999 and Clemson won, 47-44, in overtime in 2001 in Atlanta.
- One of the most unusual statistical occurrences in Clemson history took place during Clemson's 33-12 victory over Georgia Tech in 1987 at Clemson. Clemson entered the game with a streak of 999 consecutive combined punt returns and kickoff returns without a touchdown dating to 1970. Then, on the 1,000th return, Donnell Woolford raced 78 yards with a punt return for a touchdown. Then, later in the game Joe Henderson returned a kickoff return 95 yards for a touchdown. It is one of just two games in Clemson history that the Tigers have returned a punt return for a touchdown and a kickoff return for a touchdown. The other took place in 2009 when Clemson defeated Middle Tennessee State.
- C.J. Spiller had arguably the best game of his Clemson career against Georgia Tech in the 2009 ACC Championship Game. The unanimous All-American had a career-high 233 yards rushing in 20 attempts and scored four touchdowns. He had 301 all-purpose yards and was named the MVP of the game even though Clemson lost 39-34. It is the only time a player on the losing team has been named the MVP of any conference championship game.

LAST MEETING VS. GEORGIA TECH

Clemson 49, Georgia Tech 21

(Sept. 22, 2018, Atlanta, Ga.)

ATLANTA — No. 3/2 Clemson opened 2018 ACC play with a 49-21 win over the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta. The win marked Clemson's fourth straight victory over Georgia Tech for just the third time in program history.

Offensively, Clemson was powered by Trevor Lawrence and his receiving corps, as the freshman quarter-back completed 13-18 passes for 176 yards and four touchdowns to four different receivers. Lawrence's superlative performance resulted in the Clemson coaching staff naming him the team's starting quarterback the following week after entering in reserve for the team's first four games of the season.

Defensively, Clemson held Georgia Tech to 203 total yards, including only 57 passing yards. Clemson did not allow a Yellow Jacket pass completion until late in the third quarter. The group also limited Georgia Tech's prominent rushing offense to 146 yards on 56 carries, as the Tigers outrushed the Yellow Jackets for the fourth year in a row.

The Tigers scored the only points of the first quarter when Clelin Ferrell recovered a Yellow Jacket fumble in the end zone to give Clemson a 7-0 advantage. The second quarter saw Clemson score three times, with all three coming in the form of passing touchdowns by Lawrence.

Georgia Tech got on the board with just two minutes left in the opening half on an 11-yard rush by TaQuon Marshall. However, Clemson quickly got the score back on its third touchdown of the quarter, a three-yard pass from Lawrence to Travis Etienne, who pushed his way into the end zone in the final seconds of the half to bring the score to 28-7 at the break.

Clemson scored three times during the second half, with two coming courtesy of Tavien Feaster and Etienne on the ground, and the third when Tee Higgins hauled in a 30-yard scoring pass from Lawrence.

LAST MEETING IN CLEMSON

Clemson 24, Georgia Tech 10

(Oct. 28, 2017, Clemson, S.C.)

No. 7 Clemson won its 300th game in Memorial Stadium, defeating Georgia Tech, 24-10, on Oct. 28, 2017

Clemson was led by Kelly Bryant, who had 67 yards rushing on 12 attempts and threw for 207 yards and two touchdowns on 22 completions. The Clemson defense held Georgia Tech to negative yards passing until the fourth quarter and had 11 tackles for loss by eight different players.

Clemson jumped out to a 7-0 lead two minutes into the game when Van Smith recovered a fumble on Tech's opening possession and Kelly Bryant connected with Deon Cain on a 38-yard scoring pass two plays later.

After a Tech field goal, Milan Richard hauled in a 20yard scoring pass from Bryant to put the Tigers up 14-3. It was Richard's first career touchdown reception, one scored with his uncle, former Georgia great Herschel Walker, in attendance.

Clemson took a 21-3 lead in the second quarter when Travis Etienne scored on a two-yard run. Clemson added three points in the second half on a 29-yard field goal by Alex Spence. Georgia Tech scored its only touchdown of the game with 4:43 left on a 22-yard run by TaQuon Marshall.

Clemson finished with 428 yards of total offense (221 rushing, 207 passing) on 78 plays.

10-WIN SEASONS

Clemson enters 2019 riding a streak of eight consecutive seasons with 10+ wins. The program's eighth consecutive 10-win season in 2018 tied the Tigers with the 1985-92 Miami Hurricanes and the 2004-11 Virginia Tech Hokies for the fourth-longest streak in FBS history and made Clemson one of only six programs to accomplish the feat.

The record for consecutive 10-win seasons is 14, set by Florida State (1987-2000). Alabama is the only other program with an active streak of at least eight straight 10-win seasons.

The Tigers have 15 10-win seasons in school history, with more than half coming in the last eight years under head coach Dabo Swinney. The 2018 season was Clemson's fifth with at least 12 wins, with Swinney sitting at the helm for four of them.

A CENTURY MARK FOR THE DECADE

Head Coach Dabo Swinney can vividly recall the looks he received when he said Clemson was on the cusp of the winningest decade in program history following a 2010 campaign in which the Tigers finished 6-7. In 2017, that vision became a reality with two seasons to spare when Clemson collected its 88th win of the decade in the ACC Championship Game against Miami (Fla.) to surpass the Tigers of the 1980s (87) for most wins in any decade in school history.

With a rivalry win against South Carolina to close the 2018 regular season, Clemson reached triple digits in wins in a decade for the first time in program history. Included below are the schools that have accomplished that feat.

Clemson has a 103-22 record in the decade of the 2010s. That computes to an 82.4 winning percentage, the best for any decade in school history and the first time Clemson has won more than 80 percent in a single decade.

In the 1980s, Clemson had a 76.7 winning percentage (87-25-4), the nation's fifth-best winning percentage. Clemson did not have a losing season in any year in the 1980s under Danny Ford, who coached every game in that decade. Dabo Swinney has coached every game in the decade of the 2010s and has eight winning seasons and one losing season (6-7 in 2010).

SENIORS CHASING HISTORY

The 2018 Clemson seniors left their legacy not only in program history but also in the annals of the sport, recording 55 wins to tie for the most wins by any senior class in FBS history.

Throughout the 2018 season, Head Coach Dabo Swinney reminded his players that anything Clemson had done once, they'd done again. The 2019 senior class will have the opportunity for that maxim to once again ring true.

The 2019 Clemson seniors are 41-3 since 2016, tied with Alabama for the best mark in the country. The group can tie the 2018 seniors for the best four-

year mark in school, conference and Football Bowl Subdivision history with 14 wins in 2019 and can own the record outright if it were to repeat with another 15-0 campaign.

From 2015-18, Clemson became the first ACC school to win four outright titles in a row. Florida State was a champion or co-champion nine years in a row from 1992-00, but never won more than three outright in a row.

Clemson's victory in the 2018 ACC Championship Game made Clemson only the second Power Five Conference school since the inception of league championship games in 1992 to win four straight conference championship games, joining the Florida Gators, who won four straight SEC Championship Games in a row from 1993-96. Clemson can become the first school to win five straight with a victory in the 2019 ACC Championship Game.

Early in his head coaching tenure, Dabo Swinney laid out his belief to then-Clemson athletic director Terry Don Phillips that the Tigers needed to add tough non-conference challenges on top of their tests in ACC play to serve as a foundation for the program's growth.

"I had a conversation with Terry Don and said, 'Terry Don, I know we are not very good right now, but we need to play people because that is going to help me teach and help me develop the culture and the mindset that you have to have to win at the highest level," recounted Swinney. "I didn't think we had that, and that's what we committed to. That's what we've done."

That scheduling philosophy and culture change has resonated in the Clemson program, and since 2013, no team can claim more wins against Power Five Conference opponents than the Tigers.

ESTEEMED COMPANY

Head Coach Dabo Swinney's run of excellence in his decade-plus at Clemson has placed him in the company of college football legends.

Swinney enters the 2019 campaign with a winning percentage of .795, the 18th-best among any major college football head coaches in history with at least 10 seasons of head coaching experience. He passed a number of legends in the midst of Clemson's 15-0 campaign in 2018, including College Football Hall of Famers Bo Schembechler (.775), Bear Bryant (.780) and Henry Williams (.785), as well as Nick Saban (.789), whose Crimson Tide were defeated by Swinney and the Tigers in the most recent College Football Playoff National Championship.

Swinney (116) enters 2019 nine wins away from reaching 125 career victories as a head coach. Presently, only 96 coaches in major college football history have reached that mark. Other active coaches in striking distance of joining that club this season include Mike Gundy (121), Kyle Whittingham (120) and Bronco Mendendall (115). Swinney is five wins from matching the career total of Danny Ford, who won 121 combined games at Clemson (96) and Arkansas (25).

EXCEEDING EXPECTATIONS

Entering 2019, Clemson has equaled or exceeded its postseason AP and USA Today rankings in comparison to its preseason rankings each of the last eight years. That included quite an accomplishment in both 2016 and 2018, as it finished No. 1 by winning the national championship to exceed the school's No. 2 preseason ranking both times.

Clemson exceeded its preseason ranking each of the last eight years in the coaches poll, a streak that will come to an end in 2019 by simple virtue of Clemson opening the season atop the 2019 poll.

With regard to Associated Press voting, Clemson has exceeded its preseason ranking in the AP poll in seven of the last eight years. The lone exception came in 2013, when Clemson was picked No. 8 in the AP preseason poll and finished No. 8.

CHAMPIONSHIP HERITAGE

After being named Clemson's full-time coach in December of 2008, Head Coach Dabo Swinney set about securing his first signing class in 2009.

His first class, which he tabbed the "Dandy Dozen," brought home Clemson's first ACC title since 1991 during their junior campaign in 2011. Excluding the 2019 signing class set to debut this season, all 10 of Clemson's signing classes under Swinney have at least

one ACC and/or national title to their credit in their four years at Clemson

Clemson enters 2019 riding a 15-game winning streak, with all 15 coming during the team's undefeated campaign in 2018. No other FBS program enters the year with a double-digit winning streak, as the next best streaks are held by Army (nine), Appalachian State and Ohio State (six each).

Clemson's current 15-game winning streak marks the program's 10th all-time winning streak of at least 10 games. Recently, Clemson had a 17-game winning streak from 2014-15 that currently stands as the longest in school history. A win against Alabama in the College Football Playoff National Championship was Clemson's 15th straight of its active streak, which tied a streak from 1947-49 as the second-longest in school history. The current group can take sole possession of the second-longest streak in program history with a win this week.

The current streak marks the third time Dabo Swinney has had a winning streak of at least 10 games. Danny Ford had three separate streaks of at least 10 games, including a 13-game streak from 1980 through the last game of the 1981 season.

Frank Howard had a 15-game winning streak from 1947-49 and was part of a 13-game streak from 1939-40. The school's first 10-game winning streak took place under John Heisman from 1899 to 1901.

POLL STREAKS

Clemson has been ranked in the top 25 of 69 consecutive AP polls dating to the 2014 season, the third-longest active streak in the nation. That includes a streak of 60 straight top-10 rankings, tied for first in the country with Alabama.

As far as total top-25 rankings since 2011, Clemson has appeared in 124 of a possible 131 polls (94.7 percent). That is the third-most in the nation, trailing only Alabama (131) and Oklahoma (127).

SATURDAYS ARE FOR THE TIGERS

Clemson enters this week having won each of its last 30 Saturday games, a streak that will remain intact in advance of Thursday night's game regardless of outcome. Clemson went 12-2 during the 2017 campaign, with its only losses coming on a Friday at Syracuse and a Monday on New Year's Day in the Sugar Bowl.

You have to travel back to Nov. 12, 2016, a total of 1,020 days prior to this week's contest, for Clemson's most recent loss on a Saturday.

Clemson's 30-game Saturday winning streak is the longest active streak in the FBS. In total, Clemson has won 51 of its last 52 Saturday games. The Tigers' current 30-game streak started following a 2016 loss to Pitt that was preceded by a 21-game Saturday winning streak across the 2014-16 seasons, previously the longest such streak in program history.

THE CLEMSON EFFECT?

Whether the margin of defeat was two points in early September or 61 points in early November, all 15 of Clemson's contests meant the same result for its opponents. But Clemson's effect on its ACC opponents in 2018 may have extended beyond the 60-minute battle with the Tigers.

After losing to Clemson, those nine opponents (six of whom had won prior to facing Clemson) combined for a 1-8 record in their first game after being dealt a loss by Clemson.

The approach to creating functional depth and rewarding players ready to play has been a key philosophy for Head Coach Dabo Swinney, whose own collegiate playing career was hatched as a walk-on fighting for playing time in Alabama's receiving corps.

"We're fully committed to playing guys who deserve to play," Swinney said. "You commit to a guy early in the season, and even if a guy's only played 10 percent of the snaps, when you get to game eight or nine, they've got some good experience."

YOUTH MOVEMENT

One year after Clemson returned a school-record 61 lettermen for the 2018 season, Clemson enters the 2019 campaign with a roster that includes 80 freshmen and sophomores.

However, despite the roster featuring the largest freshman class in Dabo Swinney's tenure at Clemson, the Tigers' youth is not devoid of experience. Last season, the first year of new redshirt regulations allowed Clemson to play a school-record 20 true freshmen in 2018. Clemson could stand to challenge that number in 2019 with a freshman class that includes 29 signees.

BEHIND THE NUMBERS

Clemson's success in 2018 helped rewrite portions of its school and conference record books, and included in the cumulative figures were a number of telling statistics. According to figures tracked by SportSource Analytics:

- Clemson owned the "middle eight" in 2018, the section of the game defined as the final four minutes of the first half and the first four minutes of the second half. Clemson outscored opponents 132-10 in the middle eight in 2018, an average margin of +8.1 points per game. That per-game differential was the largest by any program in the country since 2013.
 - Clemson averaged 10.0 yards per play on more than

a quarter of drives in 2018 (25.15 percent), nearly doubling the national average of 12.9 percent and far exceeding the 7.73 percent allowed by the Clemson defense in 2018.

- Clemson gained 56.6 percent of all of its available yards in 2018 and allowed opponents to gain only 27.9 percent of their available yards. The national average for the season was 44.0 percent.

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

"The explosive play is alive and well in our offense."

That was Head Coach Dabo Swinney's exact quote three games into the 2018 season. Supporting evidence for his claim was found easily in both national rankings and historical context as the season progressed.

RETURNING FIREPOWER

Clemson's eye-popping, record-setting offensive campaign in 2018 was authored at the skill positions in large part by underclassmen. The group was led in passing by true freshman Trevor Lawrence (3,280 yards), in rushing by sophomore Travis Etienne (1,658) and in receiving by sophomore Tee Higgins (59 receptions, 12 touchdowns) and freshman Justyn Ross (1,000 receiving yards).

Clemson was one of only three FBS programs to produce a 3,000-yard passer, 1,500-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver in 2018 and one of only 20 teams (including only nine Power Five teams) to accomplish the feat this decade. If Clemson repeats the feat, it would become the first program this decade to produce a player in all three categories in back-to-back seasons.

Clemson is the first Power Five program this decade to return a 3,000-yard passer, 1,500-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver from the year before. The only other FBS program to return such a trio was Western Michigan after the 2014 season.

As noted by ESPN, the 2019 Tigers are the first team to return its leading passer, rusher and receiver from a national championship squad since 2010, when Alabama returned leading passer Greg McElroy, leading rusher Mark Ingram and leading receiver Julio Jones from its 2009 championship squad.

-- NO. 16 QB TREVOR LAWRENCE --

UNPRECEDENTED DEBUT

In a June article examining the statistical context of quarterback Trevor Lawrence's freshman campaign, 247Sports' Chris Hummer noted, "there is no historical comparison for what Lawrence accomplished as a

freshman."

In 2018, despite not starting four games, Lawrence posted the 10th season of 3,000 passing yards, 30-plus passing touchdowns, five or fewer interceptions and a 65.0 or better completion percentage by an FBS quarterback since 2000. It was only the fifth such season by a Power Five quarterback in the time frame, and the first by a freshman.

INTERCEPTION AVOIDANCE

The ascendance of Lawrence was key in Clemson's record-setting explosiveness in 2018. But often lost amid the barrage of big plays was Lawrence's ability to keep the ball in Clemson's hands.

Lawrence set a single-season Clemson record by closing the 2018 season with 169 consecutive pass attempts without an interception. He enters the 2019 season 18 attempts shy of tying or 19 attempts shy of passing Clemson's multi-season record held by Tajh Boyd (187, 2012-13).

His active interception-less streak is the longest active streak in the FBS, and his 1.01 percent interception rate is the best in Clemson history among qualified passers.

TOUCHDOWN STREAKS

Running back Travis Etienne concluded the 2018 season having scored at least one rushing touchdown in each of Clemson's final five games of the season. He totaled nine rushing touchdowns (plus one receiving touchdown) in those final five contests.

With a touchdown this week, Etienne can post the second six-game streak of rushing touchdowns in his career and tie Woody Dantzler (six in 2000) for the seventh-longest streak in school history. It would pull Etienne one touchdown shy of his career-best streak of seven games, which he set in the first seven games of 2018.

100-YARD RUSHING GAMES

Etienne posted his first career 100-yard rushing performance in Clemson's third game of the season in 2018, rushing for 162 yards in a victory against Georgia Southern. It was his first of eight 100-yard rushing games that season, one shy of Wayne Gallman's single-season school record of nine from 2015.

Etienne needs four 100-yard rushing games in 2018 to enter the Top 5 in school history in the category. He sits nine games shy of Gallman's school career record of 17 from 2014-16.

DOING MORE WITH LESS

Etienne posted school records in rushing yards (1,658) and rushing touchdowns (24) in 2018 despite recording only 204 carries. His record-setting campaign in 2018 resulted in his selection as a Doak Walker Award finalist, as he joined C.J. Spiller (2009) as only the players in Clemson history to be named as a finalist for the honor.

The award eventually went to Wisconsin's Jonathan Taylor, who turned in a superb season of his own with 2,194 yards and 16 touchdowns on 307 attempts. Taylor averaged 7.15 yards per carry and averaged a touchdown every 19.1 carries; on 104 fewer carries, Etienne averaged 8.13 yards per carry and a touchdown every 8.5 carries.

If Etienne had received the same number of carries as Taylor and maintained his per-carry averages for rushing yards and rushing touchdowns, the resulting pace would total 2,495 yards and 36 rushing touchdowns, higher totals than every Heisman running back since Barry Sanders in 1988.

academic semesters in the program's history. The squad posted a team records in average GPA and number of players earning a 3.0 or better, all while collecting the AFCA Academic Achievement Award for the first time in Clemson history.

In the spring of 2019, the NCAA announced APR metrics for the 2017-18 academic year as well as public recognition awards for the Top 10 percent of programs in each sport at every level. Clemson set a program record with a 992 APR for the 2017-18 academic year, third-best in the FBS, earning NCAA recognition for the eighth time in the last nine years.

Clemson is one of only 34 of the 130 FBS programs to earn at least one APR recognition since the 2009-10 academic year, one of only 28 to earn it multiple times, and one of only three programs to earn the award eight-plus times in that span.

ACC: WE DO THIS

Arguments about conference strength were once again en vogue during the 2019 offseason, with various pundits and commentators offering opinions on the state of the ACC and the national landscape.

Head Coach Dabo Swinney has repeatedly contended that the quality of Clemson's conference competition has been central to its postseason success.

"This league doesn't take a back seat to anyone. It's a very competitive league," Swinney said at ACC Kickoff in July. "At the end of the day, I think the credit goes to this conference; I think that's why we've been so successful in the postseason."

Entering the 2019 season, the ACC:

- Has won more football national titles than any other conference since 2013 (three of the last six).
- Has had a team in either the College Football Playoff or the BCS National Championship Game in each of the past six years.
- Matched its league record with 11 bowl teams in 2018, including Boston College, Clemson, Duke, Georgia Tech, Miami, NC State, Pitt, Syracuse, Virginia, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest. The 11 bowl teams tied for the most among any conference.
- Is the only conference to send every team to at least one bowl game over the last three seasons. In addition, the ACC is tied for the most bowl teams (32) among all conferences over the last three years (11 in 2016, 10 in 2017, 11 in 2018)
- Has produced 19 postseason wins since the 2016 season, the most of any conference.

Those facts aren't lost on Swinney, who has actively contested narratives questioning the ACC's strength.

"The rhetoric used to be, 'Well, an ACC team's never going to win the national championship because they don't play anybody. So when they get to the postseason and they've gotta play the big bad boys, they can't beat them,'" Swinney said. "Well, now we win, and [they say] the only reason we win is because we don't play anybody. So you can't have it both ways."

SCHEDULE STRENGTH

On the discussion of schedule strength, Clemson's slate in 2018 ranked among the toughest in the nation by a multitude of metrics.

- Clemson's 2018 opponents won a combined 120 games, the most in the country.
- Clemson's 2016 title team faced opponents with a combined record of 107-51 (.677), the toughest schedule in the country. Clemson's 2018 title team faced a tougher schedule by percentage (120-57, .678), the second-toughest schedule in the country by percentage that season, trailing only Texas A&M (.678).
- Clemson defeated seven undefeated teams in 2018. Clemson won the first matchup of undefeated teams in College Football Playoff history when the 13-0 Tigers defeated 12-0 Notre Dame and then repeated the feat a week later when the 14-0 Tigers defeated 14-0 Alabama. Clemson's slate included wins against teams with the two of the largest year-over-year improvements in win totals in the country from 2017 to 2018, including Georgia Southern (+8 win difference from 2017) and Syracuse (+6).

- SportSource Analytics produces a "Strength of Record" (SoR) Rating for FBS games, which is a measurement of a team's performance against the average margin of victory of the opponent. For example, if a team plays an opponent that wins by seven points on average and it beats that team by 10 points, then it would have SoR Rating of +17 for that game. Clemson led the country in SoR in 2018 with a +32.1 rating.

CLEMSON, S.C. — No. 2 Clemson opened its 2018 campaign in dominant fashion, defeating the Furman Paladins by a score of 48-7 at Memorial Stadium.

Offensively, the Tigers amassed 531 yards, leading a balanced attack that eclipsed 250 passing yards and 250 rushing yards on the day. On the defensive side of the ball, the Tigers limited the Paladins to just 2.6 yards per play and 163 total yards.

The Tigers opened the scoring midway through the first quarter on a Kelly Bryant 40-yard touchdown pass to Amari Rodgers, marking the first career score for the sophomore wideout. Bryant would later add a 35-yard rushing touchdown as well, while Rodgers would finish the contest with a career-high 141 all-purpose yards, including 87 yards on two punt returns.

Freshman quarterback Trevor Lawrence threw three touchdown passes in his debut, hitting Diondre Overton, Justyn Ross and Braden Galloway for touchdowns in the second, third and fourth quarters, respectively.

Clemson's shutout bid was denied with just over a minute remaining in the game, when Furman scored on a 16-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Darren Grainger to Ryan DeLuca.

Clemson kicker Greg Huegel recorded 11 points in his return from a knee injury, connecting on two field goals (including a career-high-tying 49-yarder) and five of the team's six PATs on the day.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas — No. 2 Clemson hung on through a back-and-forth second half for a 28-26 victory over the Texas A&M Aggies at Kyle Field.

Texas A&M still got on the board first, when kicker Daniel LaCamera hit a 40-yarder to give his squad a 3-0 lead 10 minutes into the game. However, the Tigers answered on the ensuing drive, with Bryant scoring on a one-yard run.

Clemson upped its lead to 14-3 with less than a minute gone in the second quarter, when Tee Higgins hauled in a 64-yard touchdown pass from Trevor Lawrence on the freshman quarterback's first play of the night behind center. The Clemson defense blocked Texas A&M 50-yard field goal attempt with just over five minutes left in the first half to take a 14-3 lead into the break.

Clemson led 21-6 following an eight-yard Bryant scoring pass to Diondre Overton, but the teams traded touchdowns to enter the fourth quarter at 28-13 in favor of Clemson. The rest of the game saw Texas A&M bookend the fourth quarter with a pair of touchdowns, with the latter one coming with just 46 seconds remaining in the matchup and cutting the Clemson lead to just two points. However, safety K'Von Wallace intercepted the Aggie two-point conversion attempt and wide receiver Hunter Renfrow recovered an onside kick attempt to secure the 28-26 victory in front of the largest crowd ever to witness a game in Clemson history.

CLEMSON, S.C. — No. 2 Clemson improved to 3-0 with a 38-7 win against the Georgia Southern Eagles at Memorial Stadium. The game was played in front of an announced crowd of 79,844 people despite kickoff being moved up three-and-a-half hours because of complications with Hurricane Florence in the mid-Atlantic region.

The teams played to a scoreless tie in the first quarter, as Clemson drives of eight plays, 13 plays and five plays ended in an interception, missed field goal and fumble, respectively. However, Clemson's offense got going in the second quarter, with a pair of one-yard touchdown runs by Travis Etienne and Tavien Feaster bookending a 57-yard touchdown pass from Trevor Lawrence to Justyn Ross to give Clemson a 21-0 lead at halftime.

Clemson added a 37-yard field goal and surrendered its only touchdown in the third quarter before touchdown runs by Etienne (40 yards) and Adam Choice (10 yards) pushed the final score to 38-7.

Etienne finished the contest with a career-high 163 yards on 16 carries. The Clemson offense totaled a season-high 595 yards, including 309 rushing yards and 286 passing yards.

Clemson's offensive balance was on display, as the Tigers rushed for 309 yards and threw for 286 yards, It marked the 36th time that Clemson had gained 200 rushing yards and 200 passing yards under Head Coach Dabo Swinney, with the Tigers remaining undefeated in such contests.

ATLANTA — No. 3/2 Clemson opened 2018 ACC play with a 49-21 win over the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta. The win marked Clemson's fourth straight victory over Georgia Tech for just the third time in program history.

Offensively, Clemson was powered by Trevor Lawrence and his receiving corps, as the freshman quarterback completed 13-18 passes for 176 yards and four touchdowns to four different receivers. The Tiger defense did not allow a Yellow Jacket pass completion until late in the third quarter.

The Tigers scored the only points of the first quarter when Clelin Ferrell recovered a Yellow Jacket fumble in the end zone to give Clemson a 7-0 advantage. The second quarter saw Clemson score three times, with all three coming in the form of passing touchdowns by Lawrence

Georgia Tech got on the board with just two minutes left in the opening half on an 11-yard rush by TaQuon Marshall. However, Clemson quickly got the score back on its third touchdown of the quarter, a three-yard pass from Lawrence to Travis Etienne, who pushed his way into the end zone in the final seconds of the half to bring the score to 28-7 at the break.

Clemson scored three times during the second half, with two coming courtesy of Tavien Feaster and Etienne on the ground, and the third when Tee Higgins hauled in a 30-yard scoring pass from Lawrence.

CLEMSON, S.C. — A Travis Etienne two-yard rushing score with 41 seconds remaining in the game proved to be the difference in the No. 3/2 Clemson's 27-23 win over the previously undefeated Syracuse Orange at Memorial Stadium.

Etienne's touchdown was the culmination of a 13-play, 94-yard drive led by redshirt freshman Chase Brice, who entered the game after quarterback Trevor Lawrence left with an injury in the second quarter. It was the longest drive authored by Clemson for a gamewinning touchdown in the final minute in records dating back to 1958. It also came as part of Etienne's career-high 203-yard day on 27 carries with three rushing touchdowns.

After trailing 16-7 at the break on the strength of three field goals by Syracuse's Andre Szmyt and a touchdown run by Syracuse quarterback Eric Dungey, Clemson overcame a halftime deficit in a win for the first time since overcoming a 27-17 halftime deficit in a 38-31 win against NC State on Nov. 4, 2017. The Tigers also recorded their first victory when trailing after three quarters, Clemson's first since the National Championship game against Alabama during the 2016 season in which Clemson overcame a 24-14 fourthquarter deficit in a 35-31 win.

The game marked only the fourth time in Memorial Stadium history that two undefeated teams had met four or more games into a season.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — Travis Etienne, Lyn-J Dixon and Adam Choice all eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark as the No. 4/4 Clemson Tigers amassed 698 total offensive yards en route to a 63-3 defeat of the Wake Forest Demon Deacons at BB&T Field.

Between Etienne, Dixon, Choice and three other rushers, Clemson ran for 471 yards, the team's most in a single game under head coach Dabo Swinney. Through the air, a balanced effort quarterbacked by Trevor Lawrence powered the Tigers. Lawrence completed 18 of his 21 pass attempts in the first half alone, connecting with nine different receivers to amass 173 yards and two touchdowns in the first 30 minutes.

The Tigers held a 7-0 advantage at the end of the first quarter courtesy of a 59-yard scoring run by Etienne. It was the first of six touchdowns of 50 yards or more by Clemson during the contest, including two by Etienne, two by Dixon, one by Choice and one by receiver Justyn Ross.

Clemson's 60-point win marked the largest margin of victory in an ACC game in school history. It also represented the second straight ACC road game in which Clemson played all 72 dressed players. Four different players appeared at quarterback for the Tigers, including starter Trevor Lawrence, quarterbacks Chase Brice and Ben Batson and wide receiver Hunter Renfrow.

CLEMSON, S.C. - No. 3 Clemson emerged victorious in a battle of unbeatens at Memorial Stadium, defeating the No. 16/15 NC State Wolfpack by a score of 41-7.

Offensively, Clemson was powered by Trevor Lawrence, who was 26-39 for 308 yards and one touchdown. Travis Etienne rushed for three touchdowns for the third straight game, a school first. The Tiger defense, led by Isaiah Simmons' 11 total tackles, held a Wolfpack offense that had been averaging 33 points per game to just the seven points.

The Tigers turned a 14-0 first quarter lead into a 24-0 halftime advantage after converting a Dexter Lawrence fumble recovery into an Etienne touchdown run and a K'Von Wallace interception into a Greg Huegel field goal.

The third quarter scoring opened with just under four minutes left in it, when Etienne ran for his third touchdown of the day, a one-yard rush that put the Tigers up 31-0. The Wolfpack got on the board on the first play of the fourth quarter, when a Reggie Gallaspy Jr. nine-yard rush cut the Tigers' lead to 31-7.

Huegel hit his second field goal of the day and 50thof his career, a 27-yarder, a few minutes later. A two-yard rushing touchdown for Lyn-J Dixon with eight minutes left in the game rounded out the scoring, bringing the final score to 41-7, tied for the second-largest margin of victory over an AP Top 25 team in school history.

Lawrence finished the game with a career-high 314 passing yards, connecting on 20-37 passes. The receiving duo of Amari Rodgers and Tee Higgins combined for four touchdowns and 218 yards, including a careerhigh 165 receiving yards by Rodgers. On the other side of the ball, the Clemson defense forced seven threeand-outs by Florida State and totaled 14 tackles for loss, including five sacks.

Clemson took a 14-0 lead on touchdown passes of seven and three yards from Lawrence to Higgins. CLEMSON, S.C. — No. 2/2 Clemson produced a season-high 77 points as the Tigers handled the Louisville Cardinals in a 77-16 win at Memorial Stadium. The 61-point margin of victory was the Tigers' largest in school history in conference play, surpassing a 60-point win at Wake Forest earlier in the season.

The run game powered Clemson offensively, accounting for 492 of its 661 total yards, as Travis Etienne, Lyn-J Dixon and Tavien Feaster each eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark. On the defensive side of the ball, Kendall Joseph led the Tigers with 10 total tackles and 1.5 of Clemson's six sacks. Isaiah Simmons and Tanner Muse each intercepted a Cardinal pass, and Simmons returned his for a pick-six.

Ten different players accounted for Clemson's 11 touchdowns on the day. Clemson averaged a schoolrecord 11.6 yards per play, breaking a record that had stood since 1903 (11.2 vs. Georgia Tech). Clemson also set a school record in yards per carry for the second time in 2018. The Tigers rushed for 13.3 yards per carry, surpassing the program record of 11.8, set earlier in the season at Wake Forest.

On his 19th snap of the game, left tackle Mitch Hyatt broke the Clemson record for career snaps from scrimmage, held previously by center Dalton Freeman.

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. — No. 2 Clemson clinched the ACC Atlantic Division crown for the fourth consecutive season, defeating the No. 17/14 Boston College Eagles, 27-7.

Offensively, Trevor Lawrence quarterbacked a balanced effort, hitting 10 different receivers, including himself. Hunter Renfrow led the receiving corps with 80 yards on eight catches, both season highs. Defensively, the Tigers held the Boston College offense to just 113 years, including holding the Eagles 216 yards below their season rushing average.

Clemson opened the scoring on a 30-yard Greg Huegel field goal just under three minutes into the matchup, and it was Boston College that scored next when Michael Walker returned a Tiger punt 74 yards for a score. However, Lawrence connected with Milan Richard on a fourth-and-goal play to retake the lead for the Tigers before the quarter expired.

The second and third quarters saw Clemson add 10 points to its lead, with Huegel hitting his second field goal of the night, a 23-yarder, just over three minutes into the second quarter, and Lawrence finding the end zone with his feet on a six-yard touchdown run just over three minutes into the third quarter.

The Tigers took a 27-7 lead on an Amari Rodgers 53-yard punt return score with 11 minutes remaining in the game. CLEMSON, S.C. - In the teams' first meeting since 2012, No. 2 Clemson defeated Duke, 35-6, on Senior Day and Military Appreciation Day at Memorial Stadium. The win was the 2018 senior class' ACC-record 51st win in the last four seasons.

Trevor Lawrence completed 21-38 pass attempts for 251 yards and two touchdowns, and his top target was Justyn Ross, who amassed 76 yards with a score on four receptions. Travis Etienne added 81 yards and two touchdowns in nine carries on the ground. Clelin Ferrell had a team-high two-and-a-half tackles for loss and two of the Tigers' four sacks.

Neither team found the end zone for the first 11 minutes of the game, and it was Duke that got on the board first on a 34-yard field goal. A second field goal, this one from 32 yards, gave the Blue Devils a 6-0 lead as the first quarter was expiring, but that ultimately proved to be the last of Duke's scoring for the night.

Clemson took a 7-6 lead in the second quarter, when Tavien Feaster rushed for a two-yard score. Ross hauled in a 19-yard touchdown pass from Lawrence with a minute left in the first half, bringing the score to 14-6 at the break.

Etienne broke away for both of the third quarter's touchdowns, scoring on runs of 27 and 29 yards in the third quarter. The fourth quarter saw Lawrence connect with T.J. Chase on a 10-yard scoring pass, bringing the score to the final of 35-6.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Clemson completed its seventh undefeated regular season in school history by defeating South Carolina, 56-35, on a cold and foggy night at Memorial Stadium.

The Tigers posted a season-high 744 yards of offense against the Gamecocks, the third-highest total in school history. The teams combined for 1,344 yards, the second-largest combined yardage total in Clemson history behind the 1,351 yards combined for by Clemson and NC State in 2012. Clemson recorded a seasonhigh 38 first downs, the second-most in school history and only two shy of the school record of 40 set against South Carolina in 2016.

Trevor Lawrence amassed a career-high 393 passing yards on 27 completions in 36 attempts and helped engineer touchdown drives of 95, 97 and 98 yards among others. His top target was Tee Higgins, who totaled 142 yards with a score in six receptions.

On the ground, Travis Etienne added 150 yards and two touchdowns on 28 carries, and Adam Choice ran for three scores in just seven carries. Defensively, J.D. Davis hauled in his first career interception.

The game marked Clemson's first time posting both 300 passing yards and 300 rushing yards against South Carolina in series history. The victory was also Clemson's 100th of the decade, making the Tigers one of three FBS programs with 100 wins in the 2010s.

CHARLOTTE – No. 2 Clemson became the first team in ACC history to win four consecutive conference titles outright on a rainy Saturday night at Bank of America Stadium, defeating the Coastal champion Pittsburgh Panthers by a score of 42-10.

Quarterback Trevor Lawrence completed 12-24 pass attempts for 118 yards with a pair of touchdown tosses to Tee Higgins. Travis Etienne added 156 yards with two touchdowns on 12 carries en route to game MVP honors.

On the defensive side of the ball, Clemson held the Pitt offense to negative yardage for the first nine minutes of the game and also limited the Panthers to just eight passing yards for the whole game, setting ACC Championship Game records for the fewest total yards and fewest passing yards allowed. Linebacker Tre Lamar topped the stat sheet with nine total tackles.

Clemson found the end zone on the night's first play from scrimmage, as Etienne exploded for a 75-yard scoring run that gave the Tigers a 7-0 lead just 13 seconds into the matchup, the fastest score in ACC Championship history.

Pitt scored the second quarter's first touchdown, with Qadree Ollison cutting the Clemson lead to just four points on a one-yard scoring rush. But a five-yard scoring pass from Lawrence to Higgins put the Tigers' advantage back at 10 points. An A.J. Terrell interception returned 31 yards to the Pitt 10-yard line then set up Higgins' second touchdown reception of the night.

After a scoreless third quarter, rushing touchdowns by Adam Choice and Lyn-J Dixon in the final frame brought the final score to 42-10.

ARLINGTON, Texas – No. 2 Clemson advanced to its third College Football Playoff National Championship in four years by defeating the No. 3 Notre Dame Fighting Irish, 30-3, on in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic at AT&T Stadium.

Quarterback Trevor Lawrence, the game's Most Outstanding Offensive Player, completed 27-39 pass attempts for 327 yards and three touchdowns, including 19-26 for 264 yards and a pair of touchdown passes to Justyn Ross in the first half alone. Travis Etienne ran for 109 yards on 14 carries, including a 62-yard touchdown run that pushed him past Wayne Gallman's 2015 school mark for the most rushing yards in a single season. Austin Bryant added two sacks and six total tackles en route to Most Outstanding Defensive Player honors.

Both defenses proved stout in the first quarter, as the team's traded field goals by Clemson's Greg Huegel and Notre Dame's Justin Yoon. Yoon's field goal proved to be the only scoring Clemson allowed all game.

The Tigers first found the end zone on a 52-yard scoring connection from Lawrence to Ross that put Clemson at a 9-3 advantage. Ross also hauled in a 42-yard pass from Lawrence for his second touchdown of the day 11 minutes later. Tee Higgins then sealed the quarter with an acrobatic, juggling 19-yard touchdown reception that gave Clemson a 23-3 lead with two seconds remaining in the half.

The first score of the third quarter — which would ultimately be the final score of the game — came with two minutes remaining in the quarter, when Etienne broke away for the 62-yard touchdown rush that was set up by a Nolan Turner interception three plays earlier. A scoreless fourth quarter left the final score at 30-3.

The Tiger offense, in turn, posted 13 third-quarter points via a 74-yard scoring connection from Lawrence to Ross and a five-yard touchdown reception by Tee Higgins, with the latter set up by a pair of acrobatic catches by Ross.
