

TECH GOLF NOTEBOOK

Georgia Tech's golf team looks to continue its recent successes in the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship when the 11th-ranked Yellow Jackets tee it up Friday through Sunday at the 62nd annual ACC Championship at the Old North State Club in New London, N.C.

Tournament Information

The ACC Championship is a 54-hole collegiate event, with the low four scores out of five counting toward the team score for each round. The 12 teams will play 18 holes Friday, Saturday and Sunday, first group off at 8:30 a.m. All teams will begin the first and second rounds on the first hole, but Sunday's round will be a split-tee start with the top six teams after 36 holes starting on No. 1. First-round pairings Friday are determined by Golfstat rankings, and Tech is paired with topranked Florida State and No. 19 North Carolina. The Old North State Club, home to the ACC Tournament every year since 2002, is a par-72 layout measuring 7,102 yards. Nine of the 12 ACC teams are listed in the top 50 of this week's Golfstat rankings, including Virginia (23), Wake Forest (27), Clemson (36), Virginia Tech (38), Duke (45) and NC State (48).

ACC Championship History

Georgia Tech got back on the winning track in 2014 with a six-stroke victory over Florida State at the 61st annual championship at the Old North State Club. It was Tech's fifth title in the last six years and seventh in the last nine

Ollie Schniederjans won medalist honors with a 12-under-par total of 204, five strokes better than Virgina's Denny McCarthy and teammate Anders Albertson. That came one year after Albertson won with a tournament-record score of 201 (-15), breaking the previous mark of 202 set by Wake Forest's Webb Simpson in 2008.

Schniederjans became Tech's ninth ACC individual champion, joining Bob McDonnell (1985), David Duval (1991, 1993), Mikko Rantanen (1994), Bryce Molder (2000), Cameron Tringale (2006), Chesson Hadley (2010), Paul Haley (2011) and Albertson (2013).

Tech's 15 ACC men's golf titles in history ranks second among conference schools behind Wake Forest (18). Tech has won 10 of its conference titles under current head coach Bruce Heppler, eight of those outright (1999, 2001, 2002, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014) and two shared (2006, 2007).

The Yellow Jackets won five championships (1985, 1991, 1992, 1993, 1994) under previous head coach Puggy Blackmon.

Nine of Tech's ACC titles have occurred at the Old North State Club, the first occurring in 1999 by 10 strokes over North Carolina and Duke. Tech won the 2011 crown with a tournament record score of 831 (-33) and by a record 20 strokes. Tech shared the 2006 title with North Carolina, and the 2007 crown with Virginia Tech.

Yellow Jackets Update

Georgia Tech has moved up to 11th in this week's Golfstat ranking and No. 10 in the Golfweek/Sagarin ratings. The Yellow Jackets won last week's Robert Kepler Intercollegiate at Columbus, Ohio by 16 strokes over No. 28 SMU, and tied No. 25 Alabama for second place the week before at the Mason Rudolph Championship in Nashville, Tenn. This spring, Tech has one win, two runnerup finishes, one fourth-place and one 10th-place showing. All five spring tournaments before the Kepler featured at least eight teams which were ranked among the top 50 in the nation, against whom the Jackets have a 50-26-1 record this year. Tech's schedule is ranked the ninth-most difficult in the nation according to the Golfweek/Sagarin Index.

Yellow Jackets Lineup

Senior All-Americans Ollie Schniederjans (Powder Springs, Ga.) and Anders Albertson (Woodstock, Ga.) anchor the Tech travel squad for the ACC Championship. The four-year teammates won the last two ACC individual crowns and have eight career collegiate titles between them.

Albertson has been particularly strong of late, with four top-10 finishes and two 11th-place ties in his last six events dating back to Tech's last fall event in Hawai'i. Albertson has matched or broken par in 14 of the 18 rounds and averaged 69.67 over that stretch. Schniederjans, a six-time winner in the last two years, has rebounded from a poor finish at the Valspar Collegiate to tie for sixth place at the Mason Rudolph and tie for third at the Robert Kepler, one shot behind co-medalists and teammates Albertson and Vincent Whaley. Schniederjans remains Tech's scoring average leader for the year at an even 70.0.

Whaley (McKinney, Texas), who has played in seven events this year, earned a share of the victory at the Kepler with 5-under-par 208, one week after tying for 11th with scores of 69-73-73, both performances coming on difficult golf courses. He ranks fifth on Tech's team with a 72,57 stroke average.

Freshmen James Clark (Columbus, Ga.) and Chris Petefish (Danville, Calif.), who each have one top-10 finish this year, round out the Tech lineup this weekend. Petefish has been the most consistent of Tech's four-man rookie class, averaging 71.95 to rank third on the team in stroke average. He tied for ninth at the Seminole Intercollegiate and has not finished lower than 29th in a tournament. Clark also tied for ninth at the Seminole, with four other finishes between 23rd and 37th.

Coach Bruce Heppler Says...

"The ACC is the strongest it's been in six or seven years. Obviously you have the nation's topranked team in Florida State, and some of the other teams have had some good years. We've had experience on our side the last couple of years, and now we're taking three guys who have never seen the place before. We'll try to get them up to speed in the practice round and see what happens. Once you have some success somewhere, it's pretty easy to talk the new guys into believing the same thing, and there's some momentum from that."

Tee Shots

• Georgia Tech's victory at the Robert Kepler Intercollegiate was the 81st tournament win in program history and 46th for the team under head coach Bruce Heppler. The Yellow Jackets have won the Carpet Capital Collegiate, the DICK'S Sporting Goods Challenge Cup and the Robert Kepler this year.

• Tech won last year's ACC Championship with three seniors and two juniors in its lineup. This year's lineup has two seniors, a sophomore and two freshmen.

• Tech's five players in this year's ACC Cham-

pionship have collectively played 430 collegiate rounds in their careers, 274 by Ollie Schniederjans and Anders Albertson. Last year's team collectively played 537 career rounds, had 10 victories, 34 top-5 finishes and 61 top-10s. Four of last year's team had more than 100 career rounds each, while while a fifth played 95.

• According to the Golfweek/Sagarin ratings, Tech has faced the ninth-most difficult schedule in Division I – Tech is 15-19-2 vs. the nation's top 25 teams, 50-26-2 vs. the top 50, 83-26-2 vs. the top 100.

• Tech has finished fourth or higher in seven of its 10 events this year, including three victories.

• Tech's team scoring average for the year is 283.6, a stroke and change higher than last year's 282.2, which led the ACC and was 3.3 strokes better per round than second-place Virginia.

• UPDATE All five Tech players ranked among the top 17 in the ACC in individual stroke average - Ollie Schniederjans (1), Seth Reeves (4), Anders Albertson (11), Bo Andrews (15) and Werenski (17).

• Only Schniederjans and Albertson, each with a title to his credit, have played in the ACC Championship. None of the other three starter has logged a round in either the ACC Champiosnhip, NCAA regional or NCAA Championship finals.

• All five starters in Tech's lineup last spring ranked in the top 125 of the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index. Four member of this year's lineup are in the top 150 - Schniederjans at No. 9, Albertson at No. 42, Whaley at No. 124 and Petefish at No. 142.

• Tech's average drop score this year is 76.72, 15th-best in Division I.

• Tech's best score of the year was 809 (-55) at the Warrior Princeville Makai Invitational, which was the second-lowest 54-hole total in Tech history (808 at the 2005 Waikoloa Intercollegiate).

• Georgia Tech has played in the NCAA Championship finals 27 times, and 26 times since 1985.

• Schniederjans career stroke average of 70.89 and Anders Albertson's 71.42 currently rank No. 2 and 3 behind Bryce Molder's 70.69 from 1998-01.

• In three ACC Championships, Albertson has a T2, a T4 and a championshipm averaging 68.78 in nine tournament rounds. In all post-season events, Albertson has compiled five top-10 finishes.

• Ollie Schniederjans has a T7, a T10 and a championship in his three tries in the ACC Championship, averaging 69.78 in nine rounds. In eight ACC and NCAA events, Schniederjans has six top-10s and two top-20 finishes.

Albertson, Schniederjans Named to U.S. Palmer Cup Team

Georgia Tech seniors Ollie Schniederjans and Anders Albertson have been named to represent the United states in the 2015 Palmer Cup, the annual Ryder Cup-style collegiate competition that will be played June 12-14 at Rich Harvest Farms outside Sugar Grove, III.

The Palmer Cup teams for both the United States and Europe were announced live Friday morning on Golf Channel's Morning Drive program. Lee McCoy of Georgia, Stanford's Maverick McNealy, Vanderbilt's Hunter Stewart, Alabama's Robby Shelton, Florida State's Jack Maguire and Beau Hossler of Texas were the six United States players selected by the Palmer Cup Ranking. Schniederjans, Baylor's Kyle Jones and Carr Vernon of CSU Monterey Bay were committee selections. Vernon was the designated non-Division I player.

Anders Albertson of Georgia Tech was coach Bruce Heppler's coach's pick. Maguire and Schniederjans were members of 2014 American team that fell to Europe at Walton Heath.

Albertson becomes the 11th Georgia Tech player to be a part of a United States team for the Palmer Cup, and Schnierderjans becomes the fourth Yellow Jacket to compete in at least two Palmer Cups. They join James White (2012), Cameron Tringale (2009), Chesson Hadley (2008), Roberto Castro (2005, 2006), Kevin Larsen (2006), Bryce Molder (1998. 1999, 2001) and Matt Kuchar (1998, 1999). Tech coach Bruce Heppler served as coach of the U.S. team in 2003, and former assistant coach Christian Newton was an assistant coach for the 2012 USA team.

Schniederjans a Semifinalist for Ben Hogan Award

Ollie Schniederjans is among 10 collegiate golfers named semifinalists for the 2014 Ben Hogan Award, the second straight year he has earned that distinction.

The Ben Hogan Award is presented annually to the top men's NCAA Division I, II or III, NAIA or NJ-CAA college golfer taking into account all collegiate and amateur competitions during the 12-month period dating from the previous award's banquet. The Ben Hogan Award Selection Committee is made up of 25 leaders and experts in amateur, college and professional golf.

In alphabetical order, the semifinalists are: Gavin Green (New Mexico), Beau Hossler (Texas), Kyle Jones (Baylor), Lee McCoy (Georgia), Maverick McNealy (Stanford), Cheng-Tsung Pan (Washington), Jon Rahm (Arizona State), Schniederjans, Robby Shelton (Alabama) and Hunter Stewart (Vanderbilt).

On Wednesday, May 6, the list of 10 semifinalists will be pared down to three finalists. The three finalists will attend a black-tie banquet at Colonial Country Club in Fort Worth, Texas, on Monday, May 18, where the winner will be crowned.

Albertson Receives Byron Nelson Award

Anders Albertson of Georgia Tech has been named recipient of the 2015 Byron Nelson Award presented by Cleveland Golf/Srixon, in cooperation with the Four Seasons Resort and Club Las Colinas, the Salesmanship Club of Dallas and the Golf Coaches Association of America.

Candidates for the Nelson Award must be a graduating senior and the selection committee considers equally a nominee's entire collegiate academic and golf career as well as his character and integrity while in college. Particular consideration is given to a nominee's good citizen¬ship, as portrayed by Mr. Byron Nelson over the course of his life and golf career.

A mainstay in the Georgia Tech lineup, Albertson has never missed a tournament for the Yellow Jackets. He's a two-time All-America selection and earned All-ACC honors three times. Albertson's career stroke-average of 71.47 over 134 rounds is third best in school history. He has 20 top-10 finishes, including victories in the 2013 ACC Championship and the 2015 Robert Kepler Invitational.

Albertson has also found success in the classroom. He is a four-time selection to the ACC Academic Honor Roll. Albertson was named a Cleveland Golf/Srixon All-America Scholar and to the ACC All-Academic team. He was also recipient of Georgia Tech's Bobby Dodd Scholarship for 2013-14. Later this spring Albertson will be honored will be a recipient of the ACC Scholar-Athlete Honorary Award.

Albertson has served as the golf representative to the Georgia Tech student-athlete advisory board since his sophomore year. He has been active in recruiting his teammates to volunteer for Georgia Tech Athletic Association community service projects and ensured they stayed plugged into department events. Albertson was the golf team liaison for the Alexander-Tharpe Fund "Thank-a-Thon" project and implementation of the Annual Michael Isenhour Toy Drive. He has also volunteered with the Georgia Special Olympics Winter Games, Children's Miracle Network's Dance Marathon and Kid on Campus, an organization that brings children to Georgia Tech's campus who have battled or been affected by cancer. Albertson has also been active in Campus Christian Fellowship, including the Campus Christian Fellowship Homeless Outreach Program.

He joins a strong group of former Tech stars to win the Nelson Award, including Troy Matteson (2003), Roberto Castro (2007) and James White (2012).

Tech Signs Two in Class of 2015

Georgia Tech added two more highly-ranked players from the state of Georgia in the November recruiting period with the signing of Tyler Joiner of Leesburg and Tye Waller of Griffin to letters-ofintent.

Joiner is the No. 2-ranked player in the state, No. 23 in the class of 2015 and No. 31 overall according to the Junior Golf Scoreboard. He will join his brother, Jacob, who is a freshman on the current Tech team. Joiner, who is home schooled, earned five top-10 finishes in seven national junior events in 2014, and has won four state or regional junior events in the last five years.

Waller, who attends Spalding High School, is ranked No. 6 in Georgia, No. 55 in his class and No. 93 overall by the Junior Golf Scoreboard. He has posted three top-5 finished in seven events in 2014, and has won seven state or regional junior events in the last four years.

Heppler and associate head coach Brennan Webb successfully recruited four top-50 players last year, three from the state of Georgia, and the current Yellow Jackets' roster has seven Georgians on it.

Tech Advances to NCAA Finals for 27th Time; Match Play for Fourth Time

Georgia Tech advanced to the NCAA Championship finals for the 27th time in program history, last year for the 26th time since 1985 and for the 15th time under head coach Bruce Heppler.

With its most accomplished team since 2001-02 (six team victories, seven individual titles) and its most experienced group ever with three seniors (two of them fifth-year seniors) and two juniors, Tech finished second among the 30 teams competing at Prairie Dunes Country Club in Hutchinson, Kan. The Yellow Jackets finished 54 holes at 1-over-par 841, 14 strokes behind Stanford, while Alabama, LSU and Oklahoma State finished 2-through 4 ahead of Tech.

Ollie Schniederjans came within a whisker of becoming Tech's fourth national collegiate champion, tying Stanford's Cameron Wilson for low 54-hole score (6-under-par 204). But the Cardinal senior outlasted the Tech junior on the third playoff hole to earn medalist honors.

Senior Seth Reeves completed the best sea-

son of his career by tying for sixth place to earn automatic All-America honors, posting a 54-hole score of 206 (-4).

Tech moved into match play for the fourth time in five years, this time as the No. 5 seed against No. 4 Oklahoma State. The Cowboys jumped ahead of the Yellow Jackets early in all five matches, and while Tech rallied to send four of the matches to the final hole, OSU prevailed 4-0-1. Schniederjans earned a half in his match with Ian Davis for Tech's only score.

Tech's NCAA Championship History

Georgia Tech has reached the NCAA Championship finals 26 times since 1985, a number surpassed by only three schools in that period, and has posted nine top-8 finishes in the last 13 tries. The Yellow Jackets tied for 10th in 2009, the firstyear of the 54-hole stroke-play/match-play format, but qualified for match play each of the last four times they have advanced to the NCAA Championship (third in 2010, second in 2011, second in 2013, fifth in 2014). Tech did not advance out of its regional in 2012.

Tech has lost to the eventual champion three times in its four forays into match play - Augusta State by the score of 3-2 in the quarterfinals in 2010 and 2011 and to Alabama (3-0-2) in 2013.

Tech has been the runner-up in the NCAA Championship four times (1993, 2000, 2002 and 2005), more than any team in the history of the championship except Houston, Michigan, Texas and Wake Forest, who also have four, and Oklahoma State, which has five.

In 1993 and 2002, the Yellow Jackets led after 54 holes, but finished second by one shot to Florida in 1993, and by four shots to Minnesota in 2002.

In 2000, the Yellow Jackets rallied to tie Oklahoma State after 72 holes, but lost to the Cowboys on the first hole of a playoff. Tech and OSU matched the lowest 72-hole team score in NCAA Championship history (36-under-par 1,116) at the Grand National Lake Course in Opelika, Ala. In 2005, Tech finished 11 shots behind Georgia, and seven shots ahead of third-place Washington.

Since Bruce Heppler became Tech's coach, the Jackets have finished in the top 8 11 times, with one 10th-place and one 11th-place finish.

Three Tech players have won national collegiate championships. Troy Matteson did it most recently in 2002 at Ohio State. Watts Gunn (1927) and Charlie Yates (1934) won national titles under a match play format before the NCAA took sponsorship of the championship in 1939.

Other top-10 finishers for Tech include David Duval (runner-up in 1991 and 1993, T-8 in 1990), Bill McDonald (T-2 in 1988), Bunky Henry (2nd in 1967), Roberto Castro (3rd in 2005), Nacho Gervas (T-3 in 1986), Paul Haley (T9 in 2010), Kris Mikkelsen (T-4 in 2001), Stewart Cink (T-5 in 1994), Bryce Molder (6th in 1998), Matt Weibring (6th in 2000), James White (T8 in 2011) and Ollie Schniederjans (T8 in 2013).

Tech and NCAA Match Play

The 2009 NCAA Championship featured a new twist with the team champion determined via match play. The top eight teams after 54 holes of stroke play advance to a match play tournament format.

During the match-play portion of the championships, each match is worth one point with all five players participating. The first team to win three points within the team match advances or, in the case of the championship match, is declared the national champion.

It is a format that Bruce Heppler has supported vigorously. Under Heppler, Georgia Tech finished in the top eight of the NCAA Finals seven times in 10 tries under the 72-hole, stroke-play format. Tech is one of only two teams (Oklahoma State is the other) to have advanced to match play four times in the six years the current format has been in effect.

In the stroke-play/match play era, the Yellow Jackets have finished 10th, third, second, second and fifth, respectively, in the stroke-play portion the NCAA Championship in five tries (Tech did not advance out of its regional in 2012). Tech has lost to the eventual national champion three of the four times has qualified for match play (Augusta State in the 2010 and 2011 quarterfinals, Alabama in the 2013 semifinals).

Tech has had success in other match-play events in recent years, reaching the finals of the Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championship four times in six appearances.

Georgia Tech Match Play History

While match play in college golf may be infrequent, Georgia Tech is no stranger to it, having participated in six regular season match play events since 2001, as well as three times in the five years the NCAA has utilized match play to determine its champion. Here is a history of Tech's participation.

Tech in NCAA Regional Competition

Georgia Tech has failed to advance through an NCAA regional only twice in 24 tries, and only once since the NCAA went to a six-regional qualifying format in 2009. Heppler's teams have won four regional tournaments outright and tied for one title, most recently in 2002.

The NCAA began using regional qualifying tournaments in 1989, first with the 81 teams split among three sites (27 teams each), then with six sites with either 13 or 14 teams each beginning in 2009.

Since the NCAA went to six regional sites in 2009, Tech has finished third (Bowling Green, Ky.), third (Milton, Ga.), tied for third (Radford, Va.), sixth/did not advance (Norman, Okla.), fourth (Tallahassee, Fla.) and first (Raleigh, N.C.).

Tech's first four victories all occurred in 27team regionals in 1991 (New Haven, Conn.), 1998 (Daufuskie Island, S.C.), 1999 (Providence, R.I.) and 2002 (Roswell, Ga., tied with Clemson). Only the 2014 win occurred in a 13-team field.

Administration

DR. G.P. "BUD" PETERSON President

Since assuming the role of Georgia Tech's 11thpresident, Dr. G. P. "Bud" Peterson has championed efforts to strengthen the Institute's national leadership position in innovation, expanded strategic partnerships, and worked to maximize Georgia Tech's impact in the state, region, nation, and the world.

Upon his arrival in April of 2009, Peterson engaged the Georgia Tech community in developing and implementing a 25-year strategic plan, Designing the Future, and launched the public phase of Campaign Georgia Tech. Through the generosity of Georgia Tech alumni and many other



supporters, more than \$1.4 billion has been raised to provide resources to support endowed chairs and professorships, support construction of new and renovation of existing facilities, and provide scholarships and fellowships for undergraduate and graduate students.

In the past five years, new facilities on campus include the Marcus Nanotechnology Building, the Zelnak Basketball Center, the Clough Undergraduate Learning Commons, the John and Mary Brock Football Practice Facility, McCamish Pavilion, the Carbon-Neutral Energy Solutions Laboratory and the Ken Byers Tennis Complex. In addition, major renovations have been completed to the Stephen Hall Building, the Mason Building and the Chapin Building. Construction is well underway on the Engineered Biosystems Building, which is slated for completion in spring 2015. This new facility will extend Tech's vision for interdisciplinary research, allowing our faculty, researchers and students to address many of today's greatest challenges in biomedical science and human health.

Georgia Tech's research strategy focuses on creating transformative opportunities, strengthening collaboration, and maximizing economic and societal impact. With more than \$730 million in research expenditures this past year, Georgia Tech is among the top 10 research universities without a medical school.

Peterson has championed the G. Wayne Clough Georgia Tech Promise program, working to increase corporate and individual support. The Tech Promise provides a full scholarship for Georgia residents, whose family income is less than \$33,000/year, placing Tech education within reach of nearly every qualified Georgia resident. More than 600 students have benefited from the program and graduated essentially debt free, since its inception in 2007.

Peterson came to Georgia Tech from the University of Colorado at Boulder, where he served as chancellor. Prior to that, he served as provost at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in New York; on the faculty and in leadership positions at Texas A&M University for 19 years; and at both NASA and the National Science Foundation (NSF). He earned a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering, a second bachelor's degree in mathematics, and a master's degree in engineering, all from Kansas State University, and a Ph.D. in mechanical engineering from Texas A&M University. While at Kansas State he lettered three years as a tight end/wide receiver for the Wildcats football team.

President Peterson and Georgia Tech's first lady, Val Peterson, are tireless ambassadors for Georgia Tech. He regularly speaks to government, business and industry, and community leaders, as well as to civic and community groups, faculty, staff, students, and alumni.

The Petersons have four adult children, two of whom are Tech alumni, and were foster parents to nine children.

MIKE BOBINSKI Director of Athletics

Mike Bobinski, who successfully directed athletic departments at Akron and Xavier for a combined 20 years and has worked as a collegiate athletics administrator for 30 years, is in his second year as director of athletics at the Georgia Institute of Technology.

Bobinski oversees an athletic department that includes 17 NCAA Division I varsity sports and is rich with athletic tradition and success. Just the eighth Georgia Tech director of athletics over the past 110 years, Bobinski joins the likes of John Heisman, William Alexander, Bobby Dodd and Homer Rice who have served in the role previously.



Bobinski, whose tenure officially began April 1,2013, served as chair of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee for the 2012-13 season. That successful role concluded with the 2013 Final Four, which was held in Atlanta.

Bobinski came to Georgia Tech after serving 12 years as director of athletics at Cincinnati's Xavier University, where he also served as associate vice president. He was hired as the Musketeers' director of athletics in 1998 and remained in the role until 2004, when he was named associate vice president for development and oversaw all of the university's fundraising efforts, including major gifts, grant services and annual and planned giving. He returned as athletic director in 2006.

At Xavier, Bobinski headed an athletic program that strived to excel in the classroom as well as on the playing fields and courts. In 2012, Xavier ranked 11th nationally in Division I Graduation Success Rates at 97 percent. In June of 2012, the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics named Bobinski the Under Armour Division I Northeast Athletic Director of the Year.

During his tenure, nine of Xavier's teams and numerous individuals competed in NCAA championship competitions. That includes men's basketball, which reached at least the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 in four of the last six years. In the same time span, 25 Xavier teams captured Atlantic 10 Conference championships.

In men's basketball, Xavier averaged 25 wins over Bobinski's 12 years, and earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament 10 times. The Musketeers advanced to the Elite Eight in 2004 and 2008. In addition, men's basketball extended its streak to 88 straight seniors that graduated. Women's basketball made runs to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2001 and again in 2010 and in 2011 achieved its highest national ranking in program history at No. 4.

In 2009, Bobinski hired Chris Mack as men's basketball head coach. He also hired Thad Matta (now at Ohio State) as head men's basketball coach in 2001 and Sean Miller (now at Arizona) as Xavier's first associate head coach.

Prior to joining Xavier, Bobinski served as the University of Akron's athletic director from 1994 to 1998. From 1989 to 1994, he was the associate director of athletics at the U.S. Naval Academy. Bobinski served as the associate and assistant business manager at the University of Notre Dame from 1984 to 1989.

As a licensed certified public accountant, he first went into accounting with Deloitte, Haskins and Sell and Arthur Young & Company from 1979-82. He also worked for the Walt Disney Company in Orlando from 1982-84 before moving into college athletics at UND in 1984.

A native of Yaphank on Long Island, N.Y., Bobinski received his bachelor of business administration from Notre Dame in 1979, graduating magna cum laude, while playing four years for the Fighting Irish baseball team.

Bobinski has two children, Melissa, a 2009 Xavier graduate, and Brian, a 2012 Ohio State graduate.

f a consistently high level of success over a long period of time is the measure of a great program, then Georgia Tech's golf program under Bruce Heppler would certainly meet the standard. His peers recognized this in 2013 when they inducted him into the Golf Coaches Association of America Hall of Fame.

Tech is currently on a run unprecedented in school history and perhaps unmatched by any other in Division I - seven Atlantic Coast Conference titles in the last nine years and four trips to match play at the NCAA Championship in the last five.



Heppler has guided the Yellow Jackets to the NCAA Championship every year since 1998, and helped author 11 top-8 finishes in the Finals, including three runner-up showings.

In 2014, Tech advanced to match play at the NCAA Championship for the fourth time in the six years the format has been used, and is one of only two programs that have advanced to match play four times.

During his tenure, Tech has won or shared 10 Atlantic Coast Conference titles. Only two ACC coaches have led their teams to more ACC titles than has Heppler. The Yellow Jackets have captured or shared 44 team titles overall.

He was named ACC Coach of the Year in 2014 for the eighth time, more than any coach in ACC history except one, and was a finalist for the GCAA's Dave Williams national coach of the year award.

Since 2000, the Yellow Jackets have finished in the top 10 of the final Golfstat rankings 11 times, and in the final Golfweek/Sagarin top 10 twelve times. Tech has not finished lower than 14th in either ranking in any year.

Heppler has recruited and developed his share of star players as well. The Yellow Jackets have had at least a pair of All-Atlantic Coast Conference honorees in 16 of the last 17 years, and landed four members of the team on the squad twice (2005, 2011). Tech has had at least two players earn All-America honors 14 of the last 16 years, and Ollie Schniederjans became the Jackets' 20th first-team selection in 2014. Three of his players, Matt Kuchar, Bryce Molder and Troy Matteson, have been named national players of the year.

Seven of his Tech players are members of the PGA Tour, including Roberto Castro, Chesson Hadley, Matt Kuchar, Troy Matteson, Bryce Molder, Nicholas Thompson and Cameron Tringale, while Paul Haley and Matt Weibring, have status on the Web.com Tour. Several others are playing professionally either in the United States, Canada or abroad.

During the summer of 2003, Heppler served as the head coach of the United States' Palmer Cup team, and has been named to coach the U.S. team again in the summer of 2015. Kuchar, Molder, Castro, Hadley, Tringale, White and Ollie Schniederjans have all played for the USA in Palmer Cup competition.

Kuchar, Molder, Thompson and Tringale have represented the United States in the Walker Cup matches. Twice, in 1998 and 2013, five or more of the Heppler's active Tech players have qualified to play in the U.S. Amateur. Six of Tech's seven returning players this year competed in the 2013 Amateur in Brookline, Mass., an unprecedented feat.

On the conference level since 1985, when the Yellow Jackets won their first ACC Championship, Tech has earned more NCAA Championship berths than any team except Clemson. The Jackets have earned more top-10, more top-5 and more top-2 finishes in NCAA Championship competition than any other ACC team. Tech also has had more All-America selections (58) than any other ACC team during the same period except the Tigers.

His players have been just as successful in the classroom. Tech's golf program has been recognized with a perfect Academic Progress Report score of 1000 for eight straight years, and every senior has graduated.

Twelve different players under Heppler have been named All-America Scholars by the Golf Coaches Association of America, which requires a minimum 3.2 GPA and participation in at least 75 percent of a team's events. Two, All-Americans Bryce Molder and Roberto Castro, have received the NCAA's Top VIII Award, an honor given to eight student-athletes from all sports each year and recognizes those who excel in their sport and in the classroom, and exhibit high character, leadership and service to others.

It didn't take long for Heppler to restore the glory to Tech's golf program

following a couple of lean years in the mid-1990s. After recruiting future All-Americans Kuchar and Molder, Heppler had the Yellow Jackets back in the NCAA Tournament in his third season, where they finished third, just four shots off the lead. Tech also was ranked No. 1 in the nation during the course of the year and won the NCAA East Regional.

Even better things were to come as Tech captured the first of its ACC titles under Heppler in 1999. In 2000 the Yellow Jackets came the closest to an NCAA Championship in their history, tying for first after 72 holes with Oklahoma State before losing a one-hole playoff. On the year, Tech captured four team titles and finished in the top four in each event it entered.

During the 2001 campaign, the Jackets won their second ACC crown in three years, the second under Heppler, captured a school-record-tying five tournament wins during the year and finished fourth in the NCAA Championship. For his efforts, Heppler was named ACC Coach of the Year and guided three All-Americans in Molder, who was also the consensus National Player of the Year, Matteson and Kris Mikkelsen.

In 2002, Heppler led the Yellow Jackets to arguably the best season in school history, as Tech captured seven team titles and finished second at the NCAA Championship. In the process, Heppler earned National and ACC Coach of the Year honors. During the year, the Jackets won the school's eighth ACC title, while placing all five starters on GCAA All-America teams. Under Heppler's tutelage, Matteson became the third Tech player to win the national individual title.

Tech has dominated the Atlantic Coast Conference in recent years, winning five of the last six titles and the last three in a row. The Yellow Jackets have been to the NCAA Tournament every year since 1998, and only once in that time failed to advance out of a regional. In the three years the NCAA has conducted the current medal/match play format for the championship, Tech has advanced to match play twice.

A 55-year-old native of St. George, Utah, Heppler has demonstrated his strength as a recruiter by attracting both National Players of the Year during 1997-98 and the ACC Players of the Year for 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2001. His first recruit at Tech was Kuchar, who won the 1997 U.S. Amateur Championship and was named the ACC Player of the Year and the Fred Haskins National Player of the Year in 1998. Molder was the Jack Nicklaus Player of the Year in 1998 and in 2001, along with being named the ACC Player of the Year in 1999, 2000 and 2001.

Heppler, a dean's list student at Brigham Young, earned his bachelor's degree in accounting from BYU in 1985, and later received his master's degree in sport management from Massachusetts in 1988. He played golf for one year at Dixie Junior College in St. George before transferring to Brigham Young.

He became a certified public accountant in 1985 and spent one year in the firm of Huber and Associates in Salt Lake City, then began his collegiate coaching career in 1987 as the men and women's golf coach at Amherst. He then spent two years as an administrative assistant at UNLV, becoming the assistant men's golf coach at UNLV in 1989. He spent two years in that role before moving to Oklahoma State in 1991.

"Georgia Tech is a great fit for me," said Heppler. "This is one of the five or six best programs right now if you look around at college golf's successful teams since the '90s. We have a lot of alumni on the PGA Tour, which is great for the school. Young people can see they have a chance to be player of the year or win a national championship here. It's a great school academically, which is a real draw with the general pool of talent out there interested in playing college golf."

Heppler is married to the former Traci Schull of Southbury, Conn., and they have a son, Zakary, and a daughter, Moriah. Heppler is actively involved with Atlanta Alliance for Children and is a member of the Golf Coaches Association of America.

BRENNAN WEBB

After a year and a half as assistant coach at one of the nation's fastest-growing collegiate golf programs, Brennan Webb joined the Georgia Tech staff as assistant coach in December of 2012, and he was promoted to associate head coach during the summer of 2014.

He helped guide Tech to the ACC Championship last spring and to the match play bracket of the NCAA Championship both of his years with the Yellow Jackets.

Webb came to Tech from the University of South Florida, whose men's golf program posted seven top-10 finishes, including three in the top 5,

during the 2011-12 season. He also helped mentor Trey Valentine, who was named BIG EAST Freshman of the Year, assisted with fund-raising efforts, recruiting and scheduling, helped manage the team facility and directed the USF Invitational Tournament.

During his time with the Bulls, he signed two of the top five players in Florida for the program in his first recruiting class, and helped USF rise to a national ranking of No. 51 from one that had been 191st in the pre-season.

"In a sport where you have only two coaches, it's imperative that you have someone who can assist in all aspects of the program, which includes fund-raising, recruiting, player development and managing the team day-to-day," said Heppler, who has been at the helm of the Tech program since 1995. "His skill set from day one was exceptional in all these areas, which has led him to have a significant impact on this program and its success. We certainly realize that opportunities are going to come his way, and this is our way of demonstrating to him our appreciation for what he brings each day, and that he plays a critical role in our success. This will ensure continuity in our recruiting and the development of our current players."

Webb took the assistant coaching position at USF after playing several years on various professional circuits and in 11 different countries. He was a fully exempt member on the PGA Web.com Tour in 2009, logging three top 25 finishes. In 2010, he competed in the Zurich Classic on the PGA Tour. He reached the second stage of the PGA Tour Qualifying School eight times in nine attempts. His wins as a pro include the 2010 Coors Light Open in Fort Myers, as well as victories on the Hooters Tour and in Canada.

"I am very honored to be involved with what I believe is the best golf program in the country," said Webb. "The last two seasons working with and learning from Coach Heppler has been an invaluable experience, and I look forward to many more. Getting to be around the finest student athletes in the country, day in a day out ,is the most rewarding experience a coach can hope for. I feel beyond fortunate that I get to continue to do that at Georgia Tech for the foreseeable future."

A native of Ontario, Webb represented Canada in several international amateur tournaments, including appearances in the U.S., British, Canadian and Western amateur championships. He also represented Canada in the World Junior Championship.

Additionally, Webb has been a part-time PGA Tour caddy for Garrett Willis, John Huston and Robert Damron between 2002-11, and was owneroperator of DSP Golf Academy at the South Muskoka Golf and Country Club in his hometown of Bracebridge, Ontario from 1998-2001.

Webb played collegiately at East Tennessee State, whose team was ranked No. 1 in the nation and finished third in the NCAA Championship during his junior year and won three Southern Conference titles. He earned his bachelor's degree in finance from East Tennessee State in December of 1997.

Webb and his wife, Carrie, have two daughters, Nalla and Skye.

Dellinger Golf Center

The Dellinger Golf Center, housed on the ground level of the Northwest stands of Bobby Dodd Stadium, was originally dedicated on Oct. 13, 1990, and reopened after renovation in the fall of 2003. It was named for Tech golf enthusiast James Dellinger, and is the perfect spot for studying, relaxing, watching television, playing pool or browsing the internet. It also is a glorious reminder of Georgia Tech's great golf tradition.

The Dellinger Center houses a lounge with a large-screen television, stereo system, DVD player, video game console and comfortable couches for the enjoyment of Tech's golfers. Additionally, there are offices for the Tech coaching staff and a golf club-style locker room. The center also includes a study hall with computer stations with internet access, along with a recreation room that includes table tennis, shuffleboard and billiards as well as exercise equipment.

The carpeted lounge area is named for Charles R. Brown, the catalyst responsible for the modern success of Tech golf.

On the walls, you'll find portraits of each of Tech's All-America golfers, from Watts Gunn in 1927 to current All-Americas Anders Albertson, Seth Reeves and Ollie Schniederjans, plus photos of Tech teams past and memorabilia of alumni accomplishments in professional golf.


On display in trophy cases is memorabilia from the days of Watts Gunn, Bobby Jones and Charlie Yates. Encased in the center are Tech's National Player of the Year trophies honoring David Duval, Stewart Cink, Matt Kuchar and Bryce Molder. Also on display are Tech's NCAA Regional individual championship trophies, and all 14 ACC championship trophies. Prominent displays of Tech's GCAA All-America honorees are in both the locker room and television lounge.

Tech's three team trophies, the Robert Tyre Jones Award for the team's outstanding player, the Watts Gunn Trophy for the team's most improved and dedicated player, and the Charles Yates Cup for academic achievement, are also displayed here.

As part of Tech's renovation of Bobby Dodd Stadium, the renovated golf center was completed in the fall of 2003 along with the expanded north end zone of the stadium.

"We really needed to have our own place to practice, and Jim Dellinger, Julian Saul, Gene Brooks and Dan Yates were willing to make that happen for us," said head coach Bruce Heppler, referring to the four donors for the facility, which will be expanded and updated within the next couple of years.

A tremendous asset for the team, the facility allows the Yellow Jackets to practice a wide array of shots and skills. Covering eight acres of land and more than 320 yards in length from one end to the other, the range includes two bent grass greens, one for chipping and one for putting.

Tee boxes are located at both ends, as well as several fairway bunkers from which players can hit iron shots, and there are designed wedge areas to work on the short game. There is no shot in golf that Tech's players are not able to work on.

"Plus, they are able to practice with the balls they play with in competition rather than range balls, so they can find out more about distance, control and accuracy," says Heppler. "When you have your own place and you can throw down your own balls and practice anywhere you want, that's a much better situation than going to a driving range.

"It's four blocks from campus. It makes practicing more convenient and allows our players to use their time better. And, of course, it's still backed up by our ability to play on some of the best golf courses in the Southeast."

UNITED STATES COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIP

When the Golf Club of Georgia and Georgia Tech joined forces with the idea of hosting one of the nation's premier collegiate golf events in 2005, the idea was to bring together the nation's top golf programs to play one of the top golf facilities in the state of Georgia and enjoy a first-class golf experience.

The United States Collegiate Championship was the result, and the event has been a rousing success, drawing rave reviews from coaches and players alike. The first four events were played during the spring, but due to scheduling conflicts, the tournament was not played during the 2009-10 academic year. It then became a major event on the collegiate fall schedule in 2010.

The 2008 event, in which Clemson captured its second title in four years, attracted the nation's top 11 teams according to the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index, making it the strong field of any regular-season collegiate event.

"This event is in a class by itself in college golf," said East Tennessee State coach Fred Warren. "Everything associated with the tournament was first-class in every sense of the word."

"Without a doubt," said Georgia Coach Chris Haack, "(the USCC) is a Major on the college cir-

cuit."

"It really does kind of give you a feel of Augusta," said Wake Forest alumnus Webb Simpson, the 2005 Southern Amateur champion who had a first- and second-place finish in the event.

"To have a tournament of this magnitude at a facility we feel is the best in the country is very exciting," said Georgia Tech coach Bruce Heppler, whose program has enjoyed a long-standing relationship with The Golf Club of Georgia. "Knowing and appreciating the commitment and enthusiasm the staff and the members hold toward the event, it makes us feel very comfortable that it will become a very special tournament."

The competition and golf experience of United States Collegiate Championship are as first-class as the quality of its teams.

Players wear long pants and have caddies. The course is not roped, allowing galleries an intimate opportunity to walk with the competitors, as is the case with the club's annual Georgia Cup match between the United States and British Amateur champions.

Rules officials and scoring volunteers also accompany each group, giving the competitors the feel of a championship event.

"As far as college tournaments go, the U.S. Collegiate Championship did, in fact, raise the bar," wrote Ron Balicki in Golfweek magazine. "Providing a great golf course is one thing. Providing all the extras and the unsurpassed hospitality is another, and is what pushed the bar to new heights of what a college tournament could be."

The Golf Club of Georgia, a 36-hole Arthur Hills facility north of Atlanta named "Best New Private Course in America" in 1991 by Golf Digest, also served as the host site for the 2007 NCAA East Regional Championship, with Georgia Tech as the host institution. The Lakeside Course, on which both tournaments have been played, measures 7,020 yards and plays to a par of 72.

CARPET CAPITAL COLLEGIATE

The annual Carpet Capital Collegiate, a staple of the fall collegiate golf schedule for many of the nation's top golf programs for more than 20 years, annually hosts one of the toughest fields on one of the most challenging golf courses that stage college events.

"With the excellent ACC and SEC teams in the tournament, outcome plays a significant role in which teams are selected for postseason competition," said Tech head coach Bruce Heppler.

Georgia Tech has won the event six times, including three in a row most recently between 1999 and 2001, and has been the runner-up five other times.

Future PGA stars such as Tech's Stewart Cink and Troy Matteson, Clemson's Lucas Glover, Kyle Stanley and D.J. Trahan, and NC State's Tim Clark have won medalist honors. But former Yellow Jacket Bryce Molder captured the event three consecutive times between 1998 and 1999.

Three different formats have been used for the event. In the inaugural 1989 event, the low five of six scores by round were used for team totals, while the four low scores on each hole were used in 1991. All others have used the standard low four-of-five rounds each day counting toward the team score.

The Carpet Capital Collegiate is played at The Farm Golf Club, the 6,896-yard, par-72 course designed by Tom Fazio, located in Rocky Face, Ga., just outside the city of Dalton in Northwest Georgia. The tournament takes its name from the city, which is home to some of the largest carpet manufacturers in the world. The Farm has been recognized as

one of the nation's premier modern facilities.

The original idea for the tournament, conceived by former Tech coach Puggy Blackmon and born with the help of many Tech alumni in the Dalton area, was to pit the six best teams each from the Atlantic Coast Conference and the Southeastern Conference, with the winner claiming bragging rights. The event was envisioned as a tribute to amateur and collegiate golf in the South, particularly Georgia, where Bobby Jones and The Masters have contributed to the heritage of the sport. The event has grown to include many nationally prominent programs outside the ACC and SEC area, and better than half of the tournament participants each year are ranked among the nation's top 25 teams.

The permanent Carpet Capital Collegiate champions trophy is named for Lowell Fritz, golf professional at Dalton Golf and Country Club. Fritz has long been dedicated to junior golf and the youth of the Dalton area. Boys or girls, members or non-members, Fritz has taken many hours of his personal time to teach the game of golf.



TECH COACHING HISTORY

H.E. DENNISON • 1931-55

A professor of economics and social science, as well as the director of industrial management, H.E. Dennison served as Georgia Tech's first golf coach from 1931-55. He shepherded a program which had already earned success on the national stage when Watts Gunn won the national collegiate championship in 1927. Collegiate golf was strictly a dual match sport in Dennison's time, and Tech went three straight years from 1933-35 without losing a match.


Dennison had the distinction of coaching such standouts as Charlie Yates, the 1934 national collegiate champion, 1938 British Amateur champion and three-time Walker Cup team member, as well as the 1938 Southern Intercollegiate champion Tommy Barnes and 1948 Southeastern Conference champion Albert Swann. He also led the Yellow Jackets to their first NCAA Championship appearance as a team in 1947.



TOMMY PLAXICO • 1956-82

Likeable Tommy Plaxico, a former Georgia Tech star of the cinders in the 1940s, served as the Yellow Jackets' golf coach from January of 1956 until he retired in 1982, an era which saw the landscape of college golf evolve from schools playing dual matches exclusively to playing stroke-play tournaments. Among his players were future PGA Tour star Larry Mize, 1967 NCAA runner-up Bunky Henry and 1999 U.S. Senior Amateur champion Bill Ploeger.

Plaxico, a contemporary of such Tech coaching luminaries as Bobby Dodd, Whack Hyder and Jim Luck, was a regular on the Tech track team for three years and was captain of the 1941 squad. After serving four years as a Navy fighter pilot in World War II, Plaxico returned to campus to receive his degree in industrial management in 1946. He immediately joined the Tech faculty as a member of the Physical Training staff, a capacity in which he served until he retired. Plaxico, also an avid tennis player, served as an assistant track coach for five years and was in charge of Georgia Tech's intramural program.



PUGGY BLACKMON • 1982-95

The arrival of Puggy Blackmon signaled a new era in golf at Georgia Tech, keeping the Yellow Jackets in line with the way college golf was growing. The South Carolina native came from a teaching and professional golf background, and laid the foundation for the stature of the program today. Heavily involved in junior golf, Blackmon immediately began recruiting top junior players, set about raising money for the program and started the booster club which continues to support Tech golf today.

Within three years, he guided the Yellow Jackets to their first Atlantic Coast Conference championship, and Tech became a perennial top-25 program. That led to the program being invited to compete in bigger and better events, and the Jackets would go on to win five ACC titles, compete in 11 NCAA Championships and win 33 tournaments overall during his tenure. He recruited and coached PGA Tour players Stewart Cink, Michael Clark II, David Duval and Tripp Isenhour.



All-Time Greats

Bobby Jones • Atlanta, Ga.

On Sept. 27, 1930, Robert Tyre Jones, Jr., of Atlanta walked off the 11th green at the Merion Cricket Club and into history. No one before him had won golf's four major championships in a single year. No one has done it since.

No one might ever do it again.

"It may be 60 years, if then, before we see another Grand Slam," said Joe Dey, former commissioner of the PGA Tour and former executive director of the United States Golf Association.

"You never say never," said Ben Hogan, who was 18 when Jones won the Slam and remains the only golfer to win three professional majors in one year. "But considering the times — there are so many more good players — it's improbable that any player will win all four."

Of all the single-season sustained records of excellence in major sports, Jones' mark has stood the longest. Longer than Babe Ruth's 60 home runs, a record that last 34 years after he set it in 1927; longer than Joe DiMaggio's 1941 hitting streak of 56 games, which is still alive after 49 years; longer than Wilt Chamberlain's 50.4 points-per-game average, set in 1961-62; longer than Bryon Nelson's PGA Tour streak of 11 straight victories and 18 overall in 1945.

The four tournaments Jones won —the national Open and amateur championships of the United States and Britain—originally were known as the "Impregnable Quadrilateral." That term eventually evolved into the Grand Slam, a term that stuck even when the PGA Championship and the Masters replaced the two amateur tournaments in the mythical foursome.

To understand the magnitude of Jones' deed, consider that in the ensuing 60 years only four players—Hogan, Gene Sarazen, Gary Player and Jack Nicklaus—in their careers have won each of the four events that make up the modern Slam.

In golf's record books, Hogan comes across as the most serious challenger to Jones record when in 1953 the Texan won the Masters, U.S. Open and British Open. But because there was some overlap in dates of the British Open and the PGA Championship, the possibility of Hogan completing the Slam never existed.

Perhaps the most incredible thing about Jones' Slam is that he planned it. He didn't have a name for it, nor was he glory-seeking. His reasons were purely personal. Being an amateur golfer, his finances and family obligations would not allow him to play in all four tournaments after 1930. As it turned out, he didn't have to. He announced his retirement from competitive golf a few weeks after winning the U.S. Amateur. He was 28.

Dey, then a 23-year-old sportswriter for The Philadelphia Evening Bulletin, was there at Merion in Ardmore, Pa., when Jones completed the Grand Slam. Now 83, Dey said Jones' performance was "simply unbelievable.

"I saw every shot, and I haven't seen anyone since as dominant as Jones was in that Amateur," Dey said. "None of his matches went past the 14th hole. He cruised along. Considering the pressure and the crowds—you have to remember in those days the fairways weren't roped—it was a remarkable performance by a remarkable player."

Dey has seen all the great players and says only Hogan and Nicklaus equaled Jones in figuring out a way to win.

"If Nicklaus couldn't do it, I don't think it could be done. Maybe Hogan could have, but there wasn't that much emphasis on the Grand Slam during his day. I don't see anyone out there today who knows how to win like they did and like Jones did.

"Also, it's just too hard now because there are too many good players to expect one to win all four, and too, I believe the intense media attention given to the majors creates tremendous pressure that begins to build when someone wins the first two."

Hogan, now 78, agrees about the media pressure. "It's incredible," he said, "much more so than when I played. Because it was impossible for me to play in all four in 1953, there was none of that."

Dey credits Jones with the Grand Slam transformation from two amateurs and two Opens to today's four pro majors. "When Jones retired, there was not another amateur of his ability, and after he started Augusta National, and the Masters took hold, the attention turned away from the amateurs to the professionals," he said.

"What Jones did was win the Grand Slam, then without realizing it, created another one."

How good was Jones? From 1923 through 1930, Jones won 13 major



national titles in the U.S. and Great Britain, 62 percent of the championships he entered.

In the last 11 British and U.S. Opens in which he played, he finished no worse than second in 10, winning seven times. And from the time he was 14 to the time he was 28, no player ever beat him twice in championship match play.

It also must be noted that Jones was hardly a full-time golfer. Often he would go months without picking up a club. Instead, he studied mechanical engineering at Georgia Tech, got a degree in English literature at Harvard, dabbled in real estate and then attended law school at Emory. In his 13 years in major championship competition, he was a student, high school or college, in nine of them. He played only 52 tournaments in that span, an average of four a year, and won 23.

Though Jones was born and raised in Atlanta, there is no public display of his memorabilia. His old locker remains at East Lake Country Club men's locker room and several pictures hang on the walls of the grill room. Most of his trophies and his famous putter, Calamity Jane, are on display in a showcase in the Jones Room at the Atlanta Athletic Club.

Jones died in the early evening of Dec. 18, 1971. He played his last round of golf in 1948, the year he was stricken with syringomyeliam, a disease that attacks the central nervous system. His burial is in Atlanta's Oakland Cemetery. His tombstone reads:

Robert Tyre Jones, Jr. Born 1902 Died 1971 No other words were thought necessary.

All-TIME GREATS

Watts Gunn • Macon, Ga.

Watts Gunn was born in Macon, Ga., on January 11, 1905. He made golf history in 1925 in the U.S. Amateur at Oakmont Country Club, setting the world record for international championship golf by winning 15 straight holes in the first round of the 36-hole match. In that tournament, he went to the finals against friend and rival Bobby Jones, marking the only time two players from the same city ever met for the U.S. Amateur crown.

Gunn's first major tournament win was in the 1923 Georgia Amateur. In 1927, he won the Southern and National Intercollegiate tournaments, and the following year he won the Southern Amateur and Southern Open Championships. In 1926 and 1928, he played on the Walker Cup teams with Jones, defeating the British team both years. He played many benefit tournaments, including several exhibitions with Jones in 1927 and 1928. He took the Georgia State Amateur title in 1927 and 1928. At Lanier High School, he captained golf teams that never lost a match.

Watts Gunn was inducted into the Georgia Golf Hall of Fame on January 14, 1989.

From a Time Magazine account dated July 11, 1927

Last week, Watts Gunn of Georgia Tech, playmate of Robert Tyre Jones Jr., went four times around the Garden City (L. l.) Golf Club course in a total of 302 strokes. Had he been alive to do this in 1902, he would have won the U. S. Open Championship by five strokes.* But, at 22, his reward was the qualifying medal of the national intercollegiate golf tournament.

Consistently but not brilliantly, Golfer Gunn battered his way to the finals where he found the other favorite, Roland Mackenzie of Brown University, his good friend, with nerves set for a 36-hole struggle.

Beginning at the fifth hole of their first round, Golfer Gunn went stark, staring golf-mad, made six birdies, used only nine putts on seven consecutive holes—putts varying between 35 and 12 feet—sunk with a borrowed putter. His score for the first 18 holes was 69, breaking the course record by two strokes. After that it was only a matter of time before Mr. Gunn won match and championship, 10 up, 9 to go.

Another figure in the tournament was John D. Ames, blond son of Knowlton L. ("Snake") Ames (sinuous Princeton quarterback of the strenuous '90s), who lost to Watts Gunn in the second round but was elected president of the Intercollegiate Golf Association.



Charlie Yates • Atlanta, Ga.

Charlie Yates, a link to Atlanta's vast golf history who later shepherded the city's arts community into the future, was once heralded by Life magazine as owning "the best grin in golf."

He didn't mind using it either, whether to woo the English crowds while he was winning the 1938 British Amateur championship or while heading the effort to raise the \$20 million that built the High Museum. A participant in the city's history for much of the 20th century, it is not inappropriate he be remembered first for that smile and a benevolent demeanor that underscored his life.

Yates, 92, died October 17, 2005 at his home in Buckhead.

Mentored by Bobby Jones - he in fact played with Jones in his final round in 1948 at East Lake Golf Club - Yates was national college champion while at Georgia Tech (1934), a two-time Walker Cup competitor (1936 and 1938) and was captain of the U.S. Walker team in 1953.



He seized the international limelight at the 1938 British Amateur at Royal Troon. Beating two U.S. and British Amateur champions along his eight-match campaign, he struck a tone with the British galleries who were not then so easily charmed by foreigners taking away their titles. Afterward, the legendary British golf author Bernard Darwin wrote, "There has been no invading Champion more popular than Charlie Yates, whose cheerfulness and humor, of his own particular brand, made everybody like him."

Yates played 11 times in the Masters, including the inaugural tournament in 1934.

"There wasn't any strict rule about who was eligible to play in the Masters then," he once told The Augusta Chronicle. "Bob invited some of his friends, such as myself."

He tied for 21st that year and twice was low amateur, but his most memorable Masters came in 1935. Yates was playing in the group ahead when Gene Sarazen made double eagle on the par-5 15th to force a playoff he won the next day. That shot put the Masters on the map.

Yates' amateur career, except for playing the Masters, ended with World War II when he was drafted into the Army. He transferred to the Navy and spent 30 months as a lieutenant on the destroyer USS Mayo, which was struck by enemy fire during the invasion of Italy.

For nearly 50 years, he served on the Masters' Press Committee, a constant presence in the media quarters and, to many who returned to Augusta National year after year, a Masters tradition in himself.

"I am deeply saddened by the passing of Charlie Yates," Augusta National chairman Hootie Johnson said. "Charlie was an outstanding amateur golfer and a member who was linked to Bobby Jones and the club's history, attending every Masters through 2003. He will be greatly missed."

But it was in 1973 that Yates began some of his most lasting work. He accepted Mayor Ivan Allen's suggestion to retire at age 60 and head up the Atlanta Arts Alliance (which later became the Woodruff Arts Center).

Yates already had served as president of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra (1962-65) and helped recruit Robert Shaw to be its conductor.

"When you look at who had a heavy influence on the thinking of people like the late Ivan Allen, of Robert W. Woodruff, Charlie was an effective leader in getting those people to see how Atlanta's strategy should include the development of world class arts and organizations," said Beauchamp Carr, executive vice president of the Woodruff Arts Center.

Originally drawn to the arts when his wife Dorothy recruited him for nights at the symphony, Yates ushered the city into a new age. Besides overseeing the effort to build the High, he helped raise the \$5.4 million for the center's endowment. In his 10 years as president (1973-83) of what became the Woodruff Arts Center, the overall budget rocketed from \$3.8 million to \$16.3 million.

"I don't think of it as reaching into their pockets," he once said of his fund-raising ethic. "I think of it as their doing something for their own benefit." The smile didn't hurt much either.





The Golf Coaches Association of America selects a 60-man All-America team each year following the NCAA Division I Championship. The first, second and third teams each honor 10 golfers, with the remainder named honorable mention. Golfers not initially named to the 60-man team but who finish in the top 15 of the NCAA Championship are automatically added to the honorable mention unit. The GCAA has been selecting All-America teams since 1958.

Bryce Molder (1998-2001) and David Duval (1990-93), pictured above, are two of only four Division I players ever to be named first-team All-American four times. The others are Gary Hallberg of Wake Forest (1975-78) and Phil Mickelson of Arizona State (1989-92). Nicholas Thompson and Roberto Castro earned All-America recognition each of their four years at Tech, though not first-team honors each time.

NCAA TODAY'S TOP VIII AWARD

The NCAA honors eight studentathletes each year out of nominees from every sport, recognizing those who excel in their sport, in the classroom, and exhibit high character, leadership and service to others.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

Troy Matteson

NCAA Champion in 2002

Troy Matteson capped an outstanding junior season by winning the biggest tournament of the year, the NCAA Championships in Columbus, Ohio. The victory was his fourth of the year, tying the school record held by David Duval and marked the first time since 1934 that a Yellow Jacket was crowned National Collegiate Champion.

Matteson's run to the title began inauspiciously as he opened with a 2-over-par score of 73 to stand tied for 88th place, seven shots off the tournament lead. That would change quickly, as he found his scoring groove over the next 54 holes of play.

Day two saw the first significant move, as Matteson carded a 5-under-par round of 66 to move into a tie for 12th place at 73-66–139. The steady play continued over the final two rounds, as Matteson finished with sub-par rounds of 70 and 67 respectively to take over the individual lead as the final round came to an end.

The victory marked the fourth individual title of the year for Matteson, tying the school record previously held by David Duval, along with being the third time in school history that a Yellow Jacket had been the individual national champion.

For his efforts, Matteson was named the recipient of the Arnold Palmer National Player of the Year award and earned first-team All-America honors for the first time in his career.





Watts Gunn

National Collegiate Champion in 1927

The Rambling Wreck and the name of Watts Gunn rose to supreme heights in 1927.

Becoming the first Georgia Tech golfer to win the National Collegiate Championship, Gunn shot a total of 302 over the 72-hole event at the Garden City Country Club to win the medal competition. He went on to dispatch Walker Cup teammate Roland McKenzie, 10-9, to win the individual title, and his 69 in the final round broke the course record. He also helped Tech win the Southern Intercollegiate title the same year.

Along with winning the collegiate championship, Gunn was a two-time U.S. Walker Cup team member, joining the squad in both 1926 and 1928. In those two events, he compiled a combined 4-0 record, posting a pair of victories in each.

Gunn was inducted into the Georgia Tech Hall of Fame in 1961. The annual Yellow Jacket men's golf team award for the season's most improved player is named in Gunn's honor.

Charlie Yates

National Collegiate Champion in 1934

Yates, who won the British Amateur in 1938 and the Western Amateur in 1935, won the Georgia state championship in 1931 and 1935, advanced to the second round of match play in the U.S. Amateur and was the low amateur in the first Masters tournament in 1934.

He culminated a fine college career by winning the 1934 National Collegiate Championship in Cleveland, Ohio, joining Watts Gunn as the only two Tech golfers ever to do so. Yates is one of eight Yellow Jackets to have competed in the Walker Cup, as he was a team member in both 1936 and '38, compiling a 3-0-1 record in those matches. In 1953, he was named the captain of the Walker Cup team and was an honorary captain in 1985

Yates played in the first 11 Masters tournaments, five times finishing as low amateur and three times finishing in the top 24.

He was inducted into the Georgia Tech Hall of Fame in 1959 and an award named in his honor has been given annually to the member of the Yellow Jacket golf team displaying the most outstanding academic achievement.



NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP TIMELINE

The national collegiate championships were conducted by the United States Golf Association through 1938, and consisted of a medal competition and a match play bracket similar to today's U.S. Amateur.

The NCAA began conducting the championship in 1939, using a match play format through 1965, when it became a 72-hole, stroke-play event.

The NCAA instituted a 54-hole cut from 1979-88. A 36-hole cut was used in 1989, and again from 1992-2001. No cuts were made in 1990, 1991 or 2002.

Regional qualifying tournaments were instituted in 1989, expanding the championship field to 81 teams, 27 in each of three regionals, with 30 teams advancing to the 72-hole finals. In 2009, the format was changed to include a total of six regional tournaments (13 teams in three, 14 teams in the other three). Thirty teams (five from each regional) advanced to the finals.

The finals structure also changed in 2009, with 30 teams playing 54 holes of stroke play. The individual national champion is crowned after 54 holes, and the top eight teams advance to a match play bracket to decide the team champion.

C eorgia Tech fielded its first intercollegiate golf team in 1918, "and it was met with marked success in the matches with the Eastern colleges," reads the 1918 edition of the Blueprint, the Georgia Tech yearbook.

"To get to the personnel and work of the team. Very little time was had by the men to practice, but they went to it with a will and when the time for the first match with Columbia came around, a formidable quartet was on hand. Perry Adair, one of the foremost golfers in the South, was number one man. Adair has been playing golf around Atlanta since twelve years old and holds many of the course records in the South. Fred Howden of Savannah, was elected manager. Howden had a score of notable records to his credit there. Ewing Watkins, one of the best golfers in Tennessee and said to be the longest driver in the South, and Tom Prescott of Atlanta golf fame, comprised the other two members of the team."

Scoring for matches that year, and in years beyond, "was kept on the Nassau system, the winners on the first nine being awarded one point, the same being true for the second nine holes, and an additional point being awarded for the best ball of the match."


