### TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech looks to cap an unbeaten homestand and move to 2-1 on the season when it hosts The Citadel at Bobby Dodd Stadium on Saturday.
- In last Saturday's home opener, Georgia Tech topped USF, 14-10, in **Geoff Collins'** first victory as head coach of the Yellow Jackets.
- Stout defense lifted Georgia Tech to the victory over USF, as the Yellow Jackets limited the Bulls to 10 points and 262 yards of total offense, just one year after the Jackets surrendered 49 points and 426 yards in a 49-38 loss at USF.
- Through two games this season, Georgia Tech has forced five turnovers, which is tied for 14th nationally.
- The Yellow Jackets also rank among the national leaders in tackles for loss with 7.5 per game, good for a tie for 28th nationally. Georgia Tech's 15 tackles for loss and four sacks are its most through the first two games of the season since it had 15 TFL and seven sacks through two contests in 2008.
- Georgia Tech's nine tackles for loss last Saturday at USF were its most against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since it also had nine against Georgia Southern in 2016.
- The Yellow Jackets have also been one of the most disciplined teams in the nation through two games, as their four penalties for 30 yards are the fewest in the ACC and tied for the third-fewest nationally.
- Georgia Tech is 10-0 all-time against The Citadel. The teams first met in 1912 and last squared off on Sept. 1, 2001, when the Yellow Jackets topped the Bulldogs, 35-7. That game was Collins' first as the Jackets' tight ends coach after two seasons as a graduate assistant at Tech.

**GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS**

# 1

Geoff Collins picked up his first win as Georgia Tech head coach with last Saturday's 14-10 win over USF.

# 4

Georgia Tech has committed only four penalties (for 30 yards) through the first two games of the season. The Yellow Jackets are the least-penalized team in the ACC and tied for the third-least penalized team in the nation.

# 5

Georgia Tech has forced five turnovers through two games, good for a tie for 14th nationally.

# 7.5

Georgia Tech is averaging 7.5 tackles for loss per game this season, good for a tie for 28th nationally. Last season, the Yellow Jackets ranked 125th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 4.2 tackles for loss per game.

# 9

Georgia Tech's nine tackles for loss in last Saturday's win over USF were the Yellow Jackets' most TFL against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since a 35-24 win over Georgia Southern on Oct. 15, 2016.

# 10

Georgia Tech is undefeated in 10 all-time games versus The Citadel. The teams, which first met in 1912, last squared off in 2001 (a 35-7 Georgia Tech win on Sept. 1).

# 11

Georgia Tech's roster includes only 11 seniors, the third-fewest seniors on any NCAA Division I FBS roster this season (Texas A&M - 6, Coastal Carolina - 10).

# 14

Georgia Tech completed 14 passes in last Saturday's win over USF, good for its most pass completions in a single game since it also completed 14 against Duke on Oct. 11, 2014.

# 55

Georgia Tech's roster includes 55 freshmen (28 true and 27 redshirt), the 11th-most total freshmen on any NCAA Division I FBS roster this season.

## GEORGIA TECH'S 20TH HEAD COACH — GEOFF COLLINS

Geoff Collins, an Atlanta area native and one of college football's most successful and innovative coaches, was named the 20th football head coach in Georgia Tech history on Dec. 7, 2018.

Born in Decatur, Ga. and raised in Conyers, Ga., Collins took the reins at Georgia Tech after serving as the head coach at Temple University in 2017 and 2018. At Temple, he put together the most successful first two seasons by a head coach in the school's 121-year football history.

Collins compiled 15 wins and led Temple to two bowl games in his two seasons with the Owls, which are both school records for a coach in his first two campaigns at TU.

In his first season at Temple, Collins led the Owls a 28-3 win over Florida International in the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl, which was good for only the third bowl victory in school history and its first since 2011.

He coached the Owls to an 8-4 record and 7-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference in 2018, with Temple's only conference defeat coming at No. 8-ranked and undefeated UCF. The 8-4 campaign earned Temple a berth in the Independence Bowl.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida (2015-16), Mississippi State (2013-14, co-DC: 2011-12), FIU (2010) and his alma mater, Western Carolina (2002-05).

Highlights of his career as a coordinator included ranking among the nation's top 10 in total defense in each of his two seasons at Florida (No. 8 in 2015 and No. 5 in 2016), ranking among the top 25 nationally in total defense (18th - 2013) and scoring defense (23rd - 2014) during his two seasons calling plays at Mississippi State and leading the Sun Belt Conference in total defense, scoring defense and turnover margin in his lone campaign at FIU (2010).

He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools (FIU – 2010, Mississippi State – 2014 and Florida – 2015).

Collins' 26-year career also includes a pair of prior stints at Georgia Tech. He first came to The Flats as a graduate assistant (1999-2000), then tight ends coach (2001) under head coach George O'Leary from 1999-2001, followed by a year as director of player personnel under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006.

During his initial three seasons at Georgia Tech under O'Leary, the Yellow Jackets were 25-12 with three consecutive bowl appearances. As the Jackets' director of player personnel in 2006, Collins led the efforts to land a recruiting class that included Derrick Morgan (all-American, first-round NFL Draft pick), Morgan Burnett (all-American, third-round NFL Draft pick), Joshua Nesbitt (quarterbacked GT to two ACC Championship Games) and Jonathan Dwyer (the sixth-leading rusher in GT history).

Collins' coaching career also includes stops at Western Carolina (student assistant – 1993-94), Franklin (N.C.) H.S. (assistant coach – 1995), Fordham (linebackers coach – 1996), Albright (defensive coordinator – 1997-98), Alabama (director of player personnel – 2007) and UCF (linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator – 2008-09).

In all, Collins has recruited and/or coached more than three dozen players that have gone on to play in the National Football League. Among Collins' pupils in the NFL are Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro defensive tackle Fletcher Cox (a consensus All-American at Mississippi State and No. 12 overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft), Tampa Bay Buccaneers cornerback Vernon Hargreaves (a consensus All-American at Florida and No. 11 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft), Atlanta Falcons safety Keanu Neal (the No. 17 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft) and Indianapolis Colts cornerback Rock Ya-Sin (who earned first-team all-American Athletic Conference honors at Temple after transferring from Presbyterian College and went on to be selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft).

In addition to being renowned as a coach, strategist and evaluator, Collins is also widely recognized as the nation's top head coach when it comes to branding his football program, particularly when it comes to utilizing social media in branding and recruiting efforts. His expertise in marketing and branding has led to him being a guest lecturer for Georgia Tech's Scheller College of Business executive MBA program and a featured speaker at the 2019 Hashtag Sports conference in New York City.

His innovations in utilizing social media to aid in recruiting efforts not only helped Georgia Tech land the highest-rated recruiting class in program history in 2006-07, but also helped Alabama sign the No. 1 class in the nation in 2007-08. Alabama's 2008 signing class included running back Mark Ingram, who went on to become the first Heisman Trophy winner in Crimson Tide history in 2009.

As a student-athlete, Collins totaled 194 career tackles as an outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina (1989-92). He had 68 tackles and six tackles for loss as a junior and helped lead WCU to a 7-4 record with 62 stops, including five behind the line of scrimmage, as a senior.

Collins, 48, is married to the former Jennifer Haynes. They have a daughter, Astrid (3).

• Georgia Tech has outscored The Citadel by a combined 411-45 in its 10 previous meetings (avg. score of 41-5).

• The teams have met only once since 1987 — a 35-7 Georgia Tech win on Sept. 1, 2001.

• The last meeting between the Yellow Jackets and Bulldogs was current Georgia Tech head coach Geoff Collins' first game as the Jackets' tight ends coach. He spent the previous two seasons (1999-2000) as a graduate assistant at Tech.

• After the first two games between Georgia Tech and The Citadel were played at The Citadel (Charleston, S.C.), the last eight matchups have all occurred at Georgia Tech's Grant Field/Bobby Dodd Stadium.

• VMI, which joined the SoCon in 1924, is the only current SoCon member that was in the conference at the same time as Georgia Tech.

**GEORGIA TECH AGAINST FCS OPPONENTS**

• Georgia Tech is 33-1-1 against Division I-AA/FCS opponents since NCAA Division I football split into two subdivisions in 1978.

• Georgia Tech has won 29-straight games over I-AA/FCS opponents since a 17-17 tie versus Furman on Sept. 13, 1986.

• The Yellow Jackets' only loss to a I-AA/FCS opponent was a 17-14 defeat at the hands of Furman on Sept. 17, 1983. Furman finished 10-2-1 that season, losing to Western Carolina in the semifinals of the I-AA playoffs, 14-7.

**OFFENSE**

• The most noticeable change for the majority of observers as **Geoff Collins** takes the reins at Georgia Tech is the transition from the option-based offense that the Yellow Jackets ran under former head coach Paul Johnson for the past 11 seasons to a spread, pro-style offense.

• Leading the transition to Georgia Tech's spread, pro-style offense is offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Dave Patenaude**.

• Patenaude also served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Collins the past two seasons at Temple.

• With Patenaude at the helm of Temple's offense the past two seasons, the Owls amassed two of the three highest single-season passing totals in school history (3,273 yards in 2017, 3,297 yards in 2018).

• Last Saturday versus USF, Georgia Tech completed 14 passes, its most completions in a single game since it also completed 14 in a 31-25 loss to Duke in 2014.

• Last Saturday's 14 pass completions were Georgia Tech's third-most in a game over the past 12 seasons (2008-pres.).

• The Yellow Jackets' 14 pass completions against USF were their most in a win since they completed 15 passes in a 27-25 win over North Carolina on Nov. 17, 2007.

• In the season opener at No. 1 Clemson (Aug. 29), Georgia Tech totaled 294 yards of offense and averaged 4.7 yards per play. In Clemson's 17 games since the beginning of last season, the Yellow Jackets are one of only six teams to amass at least 294 yards of offense against Clemson and one of only three teams to average as much as 4.7 yards per play against the Tigers.

• Georgia Tech had two student-athletes rush for at least 56 yards in the opener at top-ranked Clemson — So. RB **Jordan Mason** (72) and So. QB **Tobias Oliver** (56). Since the beginning of last season, only two other teams have had two players with at least 56 rushing yards against Clemson — Pitt in the 2018 ACC Championship Game and Alabama in the 2019 College Football Playoff Championship Game.

• Georgia Tech averaged 19.6 yards per completion in the season opener against Clemson (seven completions for 137 yards), which was the third-highest yards-per-completion rate in the nation during Week One of the 2019 season, behind only Air Force (41.0 ypc vs. Colgate) and UTEP (26.8 ypc vs. Houston Baptist).

**QUARTERBACKS**

• At Georgia Tech, Collins and Patenaude inherited one of the least-experienced corps of passing quarterbacks in all of college football, as the three returners at the position on Tech's roster — sophomores **Lucas Johnson** and **Tobias Oliver** and redshirt freshman **James Graham** — combined to throw just 17 passes coming into this season.

• Georgia Tech's 17 combined pass attempts among the quarterbacks on its roster were the sixth-fewest in the nation heading into the 2019 season.

• Last Saturday, sophomore **Lucas Johnson** made his first-career start and saw the most extensive action of his career.

• Johnson completed 11 passes against USF, which were the most completions by a Georgia Tech quarterback since Justin Thomas also completed 11 in a 38-35 win over Duke.

• Johnson accounted for 81 yards of total offense in the win over USF (45 passing, 36 rushing).

• Oliver boasts the most game experience of Georgia Tech's signal-callers, as he appeared in 12 games and made one start as a redshirt freshman in 2018 and was the starter for this season's opener at No. 1 Clemson (Aug. 29).

• Oliver has been on the field for three of Georgia Tech's four touchdown drives this season. He was the lone quarterback for Tech's first scoring drives in the season opener at Clemson (which was highlighted by his 54-yard pass to RB **Jerry Howard Jr.**) and for last Saturday's second scoring drive against USF (which he capped with a seven-yard touchdown run). He split time with Johnson during the Jackets' first touchdown drive against USF.

• Oliver quarterbacked 10 of Georgia Tech's 14 offensive series in the opener at Clemson and accounted for 121 yards of total offense (65 passing, 56 rushing).

• Oliver's 52.0 rushing yards per game are tied for second in the ACC and 20th nationally among quarterbacks this season.

• Despite only making one start as a redshirt freshman in 2018, Oliver ranked second on the team, 10th in the ACC and 75th nationally with 876 rushing yards (73.0 per game) in 2018.

• His 876 rushing yards were good for the sixth-highest rushing total by a quarterback in Georgia Tech history.

• Oliver also led Georgia Tech, ranked fourth in the ACC and 34th nationally with 12 rushing touchdowns last season.

• His 12 touchdown runs were the fifth-most by a QB and tied for the 10th-most overall in a single-season in Georgia Tech history.

• Additionally, Oliver led the team, ranked fifth in the ACC and 43rd nationally (min. 10 carries per game) with a 5.76 yards-per-rush average last year.



**OFFENSE**

- Of the three returning wideouts, only Carter has any receptions this season (he is tied for the team lead with four receptions). Camp has not yet made a catch this season and Dolphus has not played.

- On the flip side, Georgia Tech had three true freshman that have seen action at the wideout position so far this season — **Ahmarean Brown**, **Nazir Burnett** and **Kalani Norris**.

- The trio of Brown, Burnett and Norris combined to play 60 snaps in the season opener at Clemson (Aug. 29).

- Brown's first-career reception was a 28-yard touchdown catch from redshirt freshman QB **James Graham** in the fourth quarter of the opener at Clemson. With the touchdown catch, Brown became the first true freshman receiver at Georgia Tech to haul in a touchdown in his first-career game since Kerry Watkins caught a 6-yard TD pass from Joe Hamilton in the 1999 season opener at Navy (Sept. 4, 1999).

**TIGHT ENDS**

- Georgia Tech's game experience at wide receiver looks deep compared to the tight end position.

- The Yellow Jackets have reintroduced the tight end position to their offense for the first time since 2007, as former head coach Paul Johnson's double-slot option-based offense did not utilize tight ends.

- The only tight end on Georgia Tech's roster that had any collegiate game experience at the position coming into the season is **Tyler Davis**, a graduate transfer from UConn.

- With a 7-yard reception in the fourth quarter of the season opener at Clemson, Davis became the first Georgia Tech tight end to catch a pass in a game since Collin Peek's 4-yard catch in the third quarter vs. Georgia on Nov. 24, 2007.

- Davis, a converted quarterback, caught 47 passes for 500 yards and seven touchdowns in three seasons at UConn, including 22 receptions for 237 yards and six scores in 2018.

- Davis is on the official watch list for the 2019 Mackey Award, presented annually to college football's top tight end.

**OFFENSIVE LINE**

- Albeit in a wildly different offensive scheme, Georgia Tech did return a total of five offensive linemen with starting experience at the collegiate level in 2019.

- With two more offensive linemen making their first-career starts this season — junior RT **Jack DeFoor** and sophomore LG **Mikey Minihan** (left guard) — Georgia Tech now boasts seven offensive linemen with starting experience on its roster.

- A poster child for head coach **Geoff Collins'** emphasis on position flexibility, Lee is a rare two-way player in the current college football landscape, as he has seen significant action on both the offensive line and defensive line this season.

- Lee made his 19th-career start on the offensive line last Saturday vs. USF when he was the first left tackle on the field for the Yellow Jackets.

- Cooper is on the official watch list for the Rimington Trophy, awarded annually to college football's top center.

**DEFENSE**
**TEAM**

- Dubbed the "Minister of Mayhem," Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has been known for putting together some of college football's top defenses over the past eight seasons — first as defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2011-14) and Florida (2015-16), then as head coach at Temple (2017-18).

- Over the past eight seasons, Collins' defenses have:
  - ranked in top 20 nationally in total defense three times (twice in top 8)
  - ranked in top 25 in scoring defense four times (twice in top 12)
  - ranked in top 30 in passing defense five times (twice in top 13)
  - ranked in top 45 in pass efficiency defense seven times (four times in top 22)
  - ranked in top 35 in turnovers gained five times (twice in top 6)
  - ranked in top 15 in interceptions four times (twice in top 10)
  - ranked in top 25 in sacks four times (twice in top 15)

- Living up to Collins' "Minister of Mayhem" moniker, Georgia Tech ranks among the national leaders in takeaways and tackles for loss through two games this season.

- Georgia Tech has forced five turnovers through two games this season, which is tied for 14th nationally.

- The Yellow Jackets have also recorded 15 tackles for loss through two games this season (7.5 per game), which is tied for 28th nationally.

- Last season, the Yellow Jackets ranked 125th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 4.2 tackles for loss per game. They did not get their 15th TFL of last season until the fifth game of the year.

- In addition to the 15 tackles for loss, Georgia Tech has also registered four sacks through the first two games of this season. The last time that the Yellow Jackets had at least 15 TFL and four sacks through two contests was in 2008.

- A year after surrendering 426 yards in a 49-38 loss to USF, Georgia Tech's defense limited USF to just 261 yards and 10 points in last Saturday's 14-10 win.

- USF's 10 points were the fewest that Georgia Tech has surrendered to an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since a 33-7 win over North Carolina on Sept. 30, 2017.

- USF's 261 yards of total offense were the fewest that Georgia Tech surrendered against an FBS opponent since it allowed 258 yards in a 28-22 win over Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, 2017.

- Outside of a handful of big plays, Georgia Tech more than held its own against Clemson's high-powered offense in the season opener (Aug. 29). Clemson gained 15 or more yards nine times, amassing 320 yards in those nine plays. In Clemson's remaining 70 offensive snaps, Georgia Tech limited the Tigers to 312 yards, an average of just 4.45 yards per play.

- Georgia Tech intercepted Clemson all-America candidate QB Trevor Lawrence twice in the season opener, with sophomores **Tre Swilling** and **Kaleb Oliver** each recording the second interceptions of their careers.

**DEFENSE**

• The two interceptions against Clemson marked the first time since 2013 and only the sixth time in its last 18 season openers (dating back to 2002) that Georgia Tech has picked off multiple passes in an opener.

• Coincidentally, one of the Yellow Jackets' INTs in the 2002 opener against Vanderbilt was recorded by current Georgia Tech co-defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Nathan Burton**.

**INDIVIDUAL**

• This season, Georgia Tech returned just three starters from last year's defense — junior linebacker **David Curry**, junior safety **Tariq Carpenter** and sophomore cornerback **Tre Swilling**.

• Seven defensive players — Jr. DE **Jaquan Henderson**, Jr. DE **Antwan Owens**, Jr. DT **Chris Martin**, Sr. DT **Brentavious Glanton**, r-Fr. CB **Zamari Walton**, So. S **Juanyeh Thomas** and So. NB **Kaleb Oliver** — made their first-career starts this season.

• Highlighting Collins' "Above The Line" philosophy (in which Georgia Tech doesn't set a depth chart but rather lists players who are ready to contribute on gameday as "Above The Line"), 28 different Yellow Jackets were on the field for 10 or more plays on defense in the season opener at Clemson (Aug. 29) and 27 different Jackets saw time on defense last Saturday against USF.

• Although not officially a returning starter, linebacker **Charlie Thomas** saw extensive playing time as a true freshman in 2018, including six starts and has been one of the Yellow Jackets' top defensive standouts through two games this season.

• Last Saturday versus USF, Thomas stuffed the stat sheet with nine tackles, two tackles for loss, two sacks and a forced fumble, all career highs.

• Thomas is the first Yellow Jacket with at least nine tackles and two sacks in a game since Jeremiah Attaochu accomplished the feat against Florida State in the 2012 ACC Championship Game (Dec. 1, 2012).

• For his efforts against USF, Thomas was named ACC Linebacker of the Week.

• Through two games, Thomas leads the team in tackles (15), tackles for loss (2.5) and sacks (2.0).

• Thomas is the first Yellow Jacket with at least 15 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss through two games since Julian Burnett had 20 tackles and 3.0 tackles for loss through the first two games of 2011.

• As a true freshman last season, Thomas' three fumble recoveries last season were the most by a Yellow Jacket since Quayshawn Nealy in 2014 (3).

• Thomas became only the third Yellow Jacket in the past decade with as many as three fumble recoveries in a season (Jerrard Terrant – 3, 2010; Nealy – 3, 2014).

• Thomas tied a single-game school record by recovering two fumbles in the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville on Oct. 5 of last season (both of which led to Georgia Tech touchdowns). He is the 18th Yellow Jacket to recover two fumbles in a game.

• Also a true freshman last season, **Juanyeh Thomas** capped the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville (Oct. 5) by returning his first-career interception 95 yards for a touchdown.

• Thomas' 95-yard interception return is tied for the fifth-longest in school history and the longest by a Yellow Jacket in an ACC game (tied with Ken Swilling - 95 yds. vs. NC State, Sept. 9, 1989). It's also the longest INT return by a Jacket since Tyler Marcordes had a 95-yarder against Elon on Aug. 31, 2013.

• In honor of teammate **Brandon Adams**, a would-be senior defensive lineman who died on March 23, Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has announced that a different Yellow Jacket will wear Adams' jersey number 90 for each game this season.

• Junior DL **Chris Martin** wore the No. 90 for the Yellow Jackets' season opener vs. Clemson on Aug. 29. Martin, who normally wears No. 96, was Adams' best friend on the team and has dedicated the rest of his football playing career in Adams' memory.

**SPECIALISTS**

• Two of Georgia Tech's three postseason honorees in 2018 earned the recognition on special teams — So. P **Pressley Harvin III** and Fr. KR **Juanyeh Thomas**.

• Through the first two games of his junior campaign, Harvin has punted 14 times for a 42.4-yard average, an average that has been somewhat limited due to a number of opportunities to pin opponents deep inside their territory.

• Most impressively, six of Harvin's 14 punts have been downed inside the 20 yard line and four have been downed inside the 10 yard line. Harvin's six punts downed inside the 20 rank second in the ACC.

• Three of Harvin's 14 punts this season have traveled 50 yards or more, including a pair of 55-yarders last Saturday vs. USF.

• One of the nation's least-utilized weapons a season ago, Harvin would've led the ACC and ranked 16th nationally through the 2018 regular season with a 44.3-yard punting average (*he did not qualify for official NCAA/ACC statistical rankings because he fell far short of the minimum 3.6 attempts per game*).

• Harvin III's season average fell to 41.3 yards per punt after he uncharacteristically punted four times for 75 yards (18.8 avg.) in the Quick Lane Bowl vs. Minnesota.

• Harvin III averaged a whopping 47.7 yards per punt in six home games but just 34.6 yards per punt in six games away from home in 2018.

• As a true freshman in 2017, Harvin III set a Georgia Tech freshman record by averaging 44.1 yards per punt.

• Despite the limited opportunities, Harvin was named second-team all-ACC as a sophomore in 2018.

• Thomas earned true freshman all-America recognition in 2018 on the strength of returning two kickoffs for touchdowns this season, with both coming in the final two games of the regular season — a 77-yard return vs. Virginia (Nov. 17) and a 100-yarder at No. 5 Georgia (Nov. 24).

• With his two kickoff returns for touchdowns last season, Thomas set or matched five school records.

**JUANYEH THOMAS SCHOOL RECORDS**

1) His 100-yard kickoff return vs. Georgia is tied for the longest in school history. Thomas became the fourth Yellow Jacket to achieve the feat, joining Drew Hill (vs. Georgia, 1978) Dez White (vs. Maryland, 1998) and Jamal Golden (vs. North Carolina, 2012).

2) He is the third player in school history with two kickoff returns for touchdowns in a single season, joining Hill (1978) and Golden (2012).

3) He is the first Georgia Tech freshman with two kickoff returns for touchdowns and one of only two Tech freshmen with even one kickoff return for a TD (joining White, 1997).

4) He is the fifth player in school history with two kickoff returns for touchdowns in a career, joining Hill (1975-78), Gary Lee (1983-86), White (1997-99) and Golden (2011-15).

5) He is the only player in school history to return kickoffs for touchdowns in consecutive games.

• By making good on two extra-point attempts in the season opener at Clemson (Aug. 29), sophomore **Wesley Wells** is now a perfect 50-for-50 in his career on place-kick attempts (41-of-41 PATs, 9-of-9 field goals).

• Wells took over the place-kicking duties last season after winning an in-practice competition for the job in the week leading up to the fifth game of the season vs. Bowling Green. He went on to make all 48 of his attempts as a true freshman — 9-of-9 field goals and 39-of-39 PATs.

• Wells made four field goals (28, 28, 48 and 40 yards) in Georgia Tech's 30-27 overtime win against Virginia on Nov. 17 of last season, becoming the eighth individual and first true freshman in Georgia Tech history to make four field goals in a single game.

• Georgia Tech has blocked 19 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the eighth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• The nation's most blocked kicks over the past seven seasons belong to Temple (25). Six of those came the last two seasons (2017-18), when current Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** was at the helm of the Owls. Temple blocked five kicks in 2018 alone, which was good for a tie for fifth nationally.

**MISCELLANEOUS**

• New head coach **Geoff Collins** inherited one of college football's youngest teams when he took the reins at Georgia Tech.
