TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech football makes its much-anticipated home debut under new head coach **Geoff Collins** on Saturday when the Yellow Jackets host USF at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Collins will lead the Yellow Jackets onto historic Grant Field for the first time as the 20th head coach in Georgia Tech football history.
- Saturday's game also marks the first game back on The Flats for four former Georgia Tech stars that Collins brought on his coaching staff — assistant head coach/run game coordinator/offensive line coach **Brent Key** (Georgia Tech OL - 1997-2000), co-defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Nathan Burton** (Georgia Tech DB - 2001-94), running backs coach **Tashard Choice** (Georgia Tech RB - 2005-07) and defensive ends/outside linebackers coach **Marco Coleman** (Georgia Tech OLB 1989-91).
- Georgia Tech is 95-25-4 all-time in home openers (the Yellow Jackets didn't play any home games in 1897 and 1898). The Jackets have won 20 of their last 21 home openers but Saturday's game against USF marks only the eighth time since 1998 — and the first time since 2006 — that they are opening the home portion of their schedule against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent. Tech hasn't won a home opener against an FBS opponent since a 27-21 win over North Carolina in 2005.
- Saturday is Georgia Tech's annual Whiteout game. The tradition began with a nationally televised primetime win over Miami (Fla.) in 2008. The Yellow Jackets have won four of their last five Whiteout games, with three of those triumphs coming over opponents from the state of Florida — a 28-17 win over Miami in 2014, the "Miracle on Techwood Drive" victory over No. 9 Florida State in 2015 and last year's 27-21 win over Miami.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

1

Saturday's game is **Geoff Collins'** first home game as the 20th head coach in Georgia Tech history.

2

Georgia Tech and USF are meeting for the second time in series history. In the only previous meeting between the two schools, USF returned two kickoffs for touchdowns in the first quarter, which proved to be the difference in Georgia Tech's 49-38 loss to the Bulls in Tampa on Sept. 8 of last season.

3

Collins, who is in his third season as a head coach, is squaring off against USF for the third time. As the head coach at Temple, he went 1-1 against the Bulls in American Athletic Conference play — Temple lost at USF, 43-7, on Sept. 21, 2017 and beat the Bulls, 27-17, on Nov. 17 of last season in Philadelphia.

11

Georgia Tech's roster includes only 11 seniors, the third-fewest seniors on any NCAA Division I FBS roster this season (Texas A&M - 6, Coastal Carolina - 10).

22

Highlighting the youth on Georgia Tech's roster, 22 of the 62 student-athletes that saw playing time in the season opener at Clemson (35.5 percent) were freshmen (including nine true freshmen).

28

Highlighting Collins' "Above The Line" philosophy (in which Georgia Tech doesn't set a depth chart but rather lists players who are ready to contribute on gameday as "Above The Line"), 28 different Yellow Jackets were on the field for 10 or more plays on defense in the opener at Clemson.

55

Georgia Tech's roster includes 55 freshmen (28 true and 27 redshirt), the 11th-most total freshmen on any NCAA Division I FBS roster this season.

95

Georgia Tech has won 95 of its previous 124 home openers (95-25-4 - .782), including 20 of its last 21 lid-lifters at Bobby Dodd Stadium. However, this year's home opener marks the first time since 2006 (Notre Dame) and only the eighth time since 1998 that Georgia Tech is opening the home portion of its schedule against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent. The Yellow Jackets haven't beaten an FBS opponent in their home opener since they beat North Carolina, 27-21, in 2005.

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- even its record at 1-1;
- be **Geoff Collins'** first win as the Yellow Jackets' head coach;
- snap a three-game losing streak, dating back to last season;
- even the Jackets' series record against USF at 1-1;
- avenge its 49-38 defeat at USF on Sept. 8 of last season;
- up Collins to 2-1 against USF as a head coach;
- up the Yellow Jackets to 96-25-4 all-time in home openers;
- be its 21st win in its last 22 home openers;
- be its first win over an NCAA Division I FBS opponent in a home opener since a 27-21 triumph over North Carolina on Sept. 10, 2005 (since 2004, Georgia Tech has only opened the home portion of its schedule with an FBS opponent twice — 2005 vs. UNC and 2006 vs. Notre Dame, a 14-10 defeat);
- be its third-straight and fifth win in its last six annual Whiteout games.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- drop it to 0-2 overall for the first time since 1989;
- be its fourth-straight loss, dating back to last season;
- drop it to 0-2 all-time versus USF;
- be its first loss in a home opener since a 14-10 defeat to No. 2 Notre Dame in 2006 (which was the last time prior to this season that the Yellow Jackets opened the home portion of their schedule against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent).

GEORGIA TECH'S 20TH HEAD COACH — GEOFF COLLINS

Geoff Collins, an Atlanta area native and one of college football's most successful and innovative coaches, was named the 20th football head coach in Georgia Tech history on Dec. 7, 2018.

Born in Decatur, Ga. and raised in Conyers, Ga., Collins took the reins at Georgia Tech after serving as the head coach at Temple University in 2017 and 2018. At Temple, he put together the most successful first two seasons by a head coach in the school's 121-year football history.

Collins compiled 15 wins and led Temple to two bowl games in his two seasons with the Owls, which are both school records for a coach in his first two campaigns at TU.

In his first season at Temple, Collins led the Owls a 28-3 win over Florida International in the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl, which was good for only the third bowl victory in school history and its first since 2011.

He coached the Owls to an 8-4 record and 7-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference in 2018, with Temple's only conference defeat coming at No. 8-ranked and undefeated UCF. The 8-4 campaign earned Temple a berth in the Independence Bowl.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida (2015-16), Mississippi State (2013-14, co-DC: 2011-12), FIU (2010) and his alma mater, Western Carolina (2002-05).

Highlights of his career as a coordinator included ranking among the nation's top 10 in total defense in each of his two seasons at Florida (No. 8 in 2015 and No. 5 in 2016), ranking among the top 25 nationally in total defense (18th - 2013) and scoring defense (23rd - 2014) during his two seasons calling plays at Mississippi State and leading the Sun Belt Conference in total defense, scoring defense and turnover margin in his lone campaign at FIU (2010).

He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools (FIU – 2010, Mississippi State – 2014 and Florida – 2015).

Collins' 26-year career also includes a pair of prior stints at Georgia Tech. He first came to The Flats as a graduate assistant (1999-2000), then tight ends coach (2001) under head coach George O'Leary from 1999-2001, followed by a year as director of player personnel under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006.

During his initial three seasons at Georgia Tech under O'Leary, the Yellow Jackets were 25-12 with three consecutive bowl appearances. As the Jackets' director of player personnel in 2006, Collins led the efforts to land a recruiting class that included Derrick Morgan (all-American, first-round NFL Draft pick), Morgan Burnett (all-American, third-round NFL Draft pick), Joshua Nesbitt (quarterbacked GT to two ACC Championship Games) and Jonathan Dwyer (the sixth-leading rusher in GT history).

Collins' coaching career also includes stops at Western Carolina (student assistant – 1993-94), Franklin (N.C.) H.S. (assistant coach – 1995), Fordham (linebackers coach – 1996), Albright (defensive coordinator – 1997-98), Alabama (director of player personnel – 2007) and UCF (linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator – 2008-09).

In all, Collins has recruited and/or coached more than three dozen players that have gone on to play in the National Football League. Among Collins' pupils in the NFL are Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro defensive tackle Fletcher Cox (a consensus All-American at Mississippi State and No. 12 overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft), Tampa Bay Buccaneers cornerback Vernon Hargreaves (a consensus All-American at Florida and No. 11 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft), Atlanta Falcons safety Keanu Neal (the No. 17 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft) and Indianapolis Colts cornerback Rock Ya-Sin (who earned first-team all-American Athletic Conference honors at Temple after transferring from Presbyterian College and went on to be selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft).

In addition to being renowned as a coach, strategist and evaluator, Collins is also widely recognized as the nation's top head coach when it comes to branding his football program, particularly when it comes to utilizing social media in branding and recruiting efforts. His expertise in marketing and branding has led to him being a guest lecturer for Georgia Tech's Scheller College of Business executive MBA program and a featured speaker at the 2019 Hashtag Sports conference in New York City.

His innovations in utilizing social media to aid in recruiting efforts not only helped Georgia Tech land the highest-rated recruiting class in program history in 2006-07, but also helped Alabama sign the No. 1 class in the nation in 2007-08. Alabama's 2008 signing class included running back Mark Ingram, who went on to become the first Heisman Trophy winner in Crimson Tide history in 2009.

As a student-athlete, Collins totaled 194 career tackles as an outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina (1989-92). He had 68 tackles and six tackles for loss as a junior and helped lead WCU to a 7-4 record with 62 stops, including five behind the line of scrimmage, as a senior.

Collins, 48, is married to the former Jennifer Haynes. They have a daughter, Astrid (3).

GEORGIA TECH-USF SERIES HISTORY

- Georgia Tech and USF are meeting for the second time.
- In the only previous matchup between the two programs, USF defeated Georgia Tech, 49-38, on Sept. 8 of last season at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Fla.
- The Yellow Jackets and Bulls combined for a whopping 1,028 yards of total offense in last season's shootout in Tampa (602 for Georgia Tech, 426 for USF).
- Despite only playing a little more than a quarter, redshirt freshman quarterback **Tobias Oliver**, ran for 97 yards and three touchdowns (5, 1 and 1 yards). It was the 48th time in Georgia Tech history that an individual had three rushing touchdowns in a game (the feat has now been accomplished 50 times, including twice by Oliver, who also had three rushing touchdowns at Virginia Tech on Oct. 25 of last season).
- The difference in last season's wild contest in Tampa was two kickoff returns for touchdowns by USF's Terrence Horne in the first quarter (98 and 97 yards).
- USF's two touchdowns on kickoff returns matched an NCAA record while the Bulls' 266 yards on kickoff returns were the second most that Georgia Tech has ever surrendered in a game (record: 267 by North Carolina – Nov. 10, 2012).
- Despite allowing the two kickoff returns for scores, Georgia Tech took a 38-28 lead on Oliver's third touchdown run of the game with 14:15 to go. However, the Yellow Jackets committed two of their three turnovers in the fourth quarter (one inside USF's 20 yard line and one inside their own 20) and the Bulls scored 21 unanswered points to close the game.

- Georgia Tech had two student-athletes rush for at least 56 yards in the opener at top-ranked Clemson — So. RB **Jordan Mason** (72) and So. QB **Tobias Oliver** (56). Only two teams had two players with at least 56 rushing yards against Clemson last season — Pitt in the ACC Championship Game and Alabama in the College Football Playoff Championship Game.
- Georgia Tech averaged 19.6 yards per completion in the season opener against Clemson (seven completions for 137 yards), which ranks third nationally through the first week of the season behind only Air Force (41.0 ypc) and UTEP (26.8 ypc).

GEORGIA TECH AGAINST THE AAC

- Georgia Tech is 71-27-1 all-time against current members of the American Athletic Conference.
- Fifty of Tech's previous 99 games against current members of the AAC have come against Tulane (the Yellow Jackets are 37-13 all-time against the Green Wave).
- Since the conference began playing under the AAC banner in 2013, Georgia Tech is 2-1 against AAC members. The Yellow Jackets beat Tulane, 38-21 in 2014 and 65-10 in 2015, before suffering last season's 49-38 defeat at USF.

OFFENSE

- The most noticeable change for the majority of observers as **Geoff Collins** takes the reins at Georgia Tech is the transition from the option-based offense that the Yellow Jackets ran under former head coach Paul Johnson for the past 11 seasons to a spread, pro-style offense.
- Leading the transition to Georgia Tech's spread, pro-style offense is offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Dave Patenaude**.
- Patenaude also served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Collins the past two seasons at Temple.
- With Patenaude at the helm of Temple's offense the past two seasons, the Owls amassed two of the three highest single-season passing totals in school history (3,273 yards in 2017, 3,297 yards in 2018).
- In the season opener at No. 1 Clemson, Georgia Tech totaled 294 yards of offense and averaged 4.7 yards per play. The Yellow Jackets' 294 yards of offense were more than nine of Clemson's 15 opponents gained against the Tigers last season and the Jackets' 4.7 yards per play were more than 12-of-15 opponents averaged against Clemson in 2018.

- Georgia Tech had two student-athletes rush for at least 56 yards in the opener at top-ranked Clemson — So. RB **Jordan Mason** (72) and So. QB **Tobias Oliver** (56). Only two teams had two players with at least 56 rushing yards against Clemson last season — Pitt in the ACC Championship Game and Alabama in the College Football Playoff Championship Game.

- Georgia Tech averaged 19.6 yards per completion in the season opener against Clemson (seven completions for 137 yards), which ranks third nationally through the first week of the season behind only Air Force (41.0 ypc) and UTEP (26.8 ypc).

QUARTERBACKS

- At Georgia Tech, Collins and Patenaude inherited one of the least-experienced corps of passing quarterbacks in all of college football, as the three returners at the position on Tech's roster — sophomores **Lucas Johnson** and **Tobias Oliver** and redshirt freshman **James Graham** — combined to throw just 17 passes coming into this season.

- Georgia Tech's 17 combined pass attempts among the quarterbacks on its roster were the sixth-fewest in the nation heading into the 2019 season.

- Oliver boasts the most game experience of Georgia Tech's signal-callers, as he appeared in 12 games and made one start as a redshirt freshman in 2018 and was the starter for this season's opener at No. 1 Clemson (Aug. 29).

- Oliver quarterbacked 10 of Georgia Tech's 14 offensive series in the opener at Clemson and accounted for 121 yards of total offense (65 passing, 56 rushing). He engineered one of the Yellow Jackets' two touchdown drives, a three-play, 75-yard drive that was highlighted by a 54-yard pass to Jr. RB **Jerry Howard Jr.**

- Oliver's 56 rushing yards at Clemson led the ACC and ranked 22nd nationally among quarterbacks during the first week of the season.

- Despite only making one start as a redshirt freshman in 2018, Oliver ranked second on the team, 10th in the ACC and 75th nationally with 876 rushing yards (73.0 per game) in 2018.

- His 876 rushing yards were good for the sixth-highest rushing total by a quarterback in Georgia Tech history.

- Oliver also led Georgia Tech, ranked fourth in the ACC and 34th nationally with 12 rushing touchdowns last season.

- His 12 touchdown runs were the fifth-most by a QB and tied for the 10th-most overall in a single-season in Georgia Tech history.

- Additionally, Oliver led the team, ranked fifth in the ACC and 43rd nationally (min. 10 carries per game) with a 5.76 yards-per-rush average last year.

- In just three series behind center, Graham completed 4-of-7 passes for 72 yards and a touchdown in the season opener at No. 1 Clemson.

- Graham also ran four times for 15 yards at Clemson.

RUNNING BACKS

- Georgia Tech returned seven student-athletes that played running back a season ago and combined for 1,675 rushing yards and 16 touchdowns in 2018.

- Headlining the returners are a pair of 2019 Doak Walker Award candidates in sophomore **Jordan Mason** (659 rushing yards, seven touchdowns in 2018) and junior **Jerry Howard Jr.** (564 rushing yards and five touchdowns in 2018).

- Georgia Tech is one of only eight teams nationally with multiple student-athletes among the 71 running backs on the official 2019 Doak Walker Award watch list (joining Arkansas, Duke, Louisiana-Lafayette, Minnesota, Notre Dame, Oregon and Tulsa).

- Mason carried the ball 13 times for 72 yards (5.5 avg.) and a touchdown in the season opener at No. 1 Clemson.

- Last season, only one ball-carrier averaged at least 5.5 yards per carry on a minimum of 13 carries against Clemson — Pitt's Darin Hall, who averaged 6.1 yards per carry in the ACC Championship Game.

- In 121 career carries, Mason has had been held to negative yardage only once — a one-yard loss at USF in the second game of his redshirt freshman campaign (Sept. 8, 2018)

- Mason's 6.1 yards per carry ranked fourth among all freshmen nationally and t-29th in the nation overall in 2018.

- Mason's 50.7 rushing yards per game ranked 23rd nationally among freshmen in '18.

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Georgia Tech returned only three wide receivers that caught a pass in 2018 — senior **Jalen Camp**, sophomore **Malachi Carter** and junior **Stephen Dolphus**.

- The trio of Camp, Carter and Dolphus had combined for just 16 receptions for 330 yards and one touchdown in the careers coming into 2019.

- Of the three returning wideouts, only Carter had a reception in the 2019 season opener at Clemson (one rec. for 11 yards). Camp did not have a catch and Dolphus did not play.

- On the flip side, Georgia Tech had three true freshman see action at the wideout position during the season opener at top-ranked Clemson — **Ahmarean Brown**, **Nazir Burnett** and **Kalani Norris**.

- The trio of Brown, Burnett and Norris combined to play 60 snaps in the opener at Clemson.

- Brown's first-career reception was a 28-yard touchdown catch from redshirt freshman QB **James Graham** in the fourth quarter of the season opener at Clemson. With the touchdown catch, Brown became the first true freshman receiver at Georgia Tech to haul in a touchdown in his first-career game since Kerry Watkins caught a 6-yard TD pass from Joe Hamilton in the 1999 season opener at Navy (Sept. 4, 1999).

TIGHT ENDS

- Georgia Tech's game experience at wide receiver looks deep compared to the tight end position.

- The Yellow Jackets are reintroducing the tight end position to their offense for the first time since 2007, as former head coach Paul Johnson's double-slot option-based offense did not utilize tight ends.

- The only tight end on Georgia Tech's roster that had any collegiate game experience at the position coming into the season is **Tyler Davis**, a graduate transfer from UConn.

- With a 7-yard reception in the fourth quarter of the season opener at Clemson, Davis became the first Georgia Tech tight end to catch a pass in a game since Collin Peek's 4-yard catch in the third quarter vs. Georgia on Nov. 24, 2007.

- Davis, a converted quarterback, caught 47 passes for 500 yards and seven touchdowns in three seasons at UConn, including 22 receptions for 237 yards and six scores in 2018.

- Davis is on the official watch list for the 2019 Mackey Award, presented annually to college football's top tight end.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Albeit in a wildly different offensive scheme, Georgia Tech did return a total of five offensive linemen with starting experience at the collegiate level in 2019.

- With two more offensive linemen making their first-career starts in the season opener at Clemson — junior RT **Jack DeFoor** sophomore LG **Mikey Minihan** (left guard) — Georgia Tech now boasts seven offensive linemen with starting experience on its roster.

- Cooper is on the official watch list for the Rimington Trophy, awarded annually to college football's top center.

DEFENSE

• Dubbed the "Minister of Mayhem," Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has been known for putting together some of college football's top defenses over the past eight seasons — first as defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2011-14) and Florida (2015-16), then as head coach at Temple (2017-18).

- Over the past eight seasons, Collins' defenses have:
 - ranked in top 20 nationally in total defense three times (twice in top 8)
 - ranked in top 25 in scoring defense four times (twice in top 12)
 - ranked in top 30 in passing defense five times (twice in top 13)
 - ranked in top 45 in pass efficiency defense seven times (four times in top 22)
 - ranked in top 35 in turnovers gained five times (twice in top 6)
 - ranked in top 15 in interceptions four times (twice in top 10)
 - ranked in top 25 in sacks four times (twice in top 15)

• This season, Georgia Tech returned just three starters from last year's defense — junior linebacker **David Curry**, junior safety **Tariq Carpenter** and sophomore cornerback **Tre Swilling**.

• Seven defensive players — Jr. DE **Jaquan Henderson**, Jr. DE **Antwan Owens**, Jr. DT **Chris Martin**, Sr. DT **Brentavious Glanton**, r-Fr. CB **Zamari Walton**, So. S **Juanyeh Thomas** and So. NB **Kaleb Oliver** — made their first-career starts in Georgia Tech's season opener at Clemson.

• Highlighting Collins' "Above The Line" philosophy (in which Georgia Tech doesn't set a depth chart but rather lists players who are ready to contribute on gameday as "Above The Line"), 28 different Yellow Jackets were on the field for 10 or more plays on defense in the opener at Clemson.

• Outside of a handful of big plays, Georgia Tech more than held its own against Clemson's high-powered offense in the season opener. Clemson gained 15 or more yards nine times, amassing 320 yards in those nine plays. In Clemson's remaining 70 offensive snaps, Georgia Tech limited the Tigers to 312 yards, an average of just 4.45 yards per play.

• Georgia Tech intercepted Clemson all-America candidate QB Trevor Lawrence twice in the season opener, with sophomores **Tre Swilling** and **Kaleb Oliver** each recording the second interceptions of their careers.

• The two interceptions against Clemson marked the first time since 2013 and only the sixth time in its last 18 season openers (dating back to 2002) that Georgia Tech has picked off multiple passes in an opener.

• Coincidentally, one of the Yellow Jackets' INTs in the 2002 opener against Vanderbilt was recorded by current Georgia Tech co-defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Nathan Burton**.

• Although not officially a returning starter, linebacker **Charlie Thomas** saw extensive playing time as a true freshman in 2018, including six starts.

• Thomas' three fumble recoveries last season were the most by a Yellow Jacket since Quayshawn Nealy in 2014 (3).

• Thomas became only the third Yellow Jacket in the past decade with as many as three fumble recoveries in a season (Jerrard Terrant – 3, 2010; Nealy – 3, 2014).

• Thomas tied a single-game school record by recovering two fumbles in the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville on Oct. 5 of last season (both of which led to Georgia Tech touchdowns). He is the 18th Yellow Jacket to recover two fumbles in a game.

SPECIALISTS

• Two of Georgia Tech's three postseason honorees in 2018 earned the recognition on special teams — So. P **Pressley Harvin III** and Fr. KR **Juanyeh Thomas**.

• In the first game of his junior campaign, Harvin punted eight times for a 43.1-yard average, booming a 51-yard long punt and two inside the 20. Only one of his eight punts was returned and one barely went into the end zone for a touchback (hitting the front pylon), giving Harvin a net average of 39.6 yards per punt through one game.

• One of the nation's least-utilized weapons a season ago, Harvin would've led the ACC and ranked 16th nationally through the 2018 regular season with a 44.3-yard punting average (*he did not qualify for official NCAA/ACC statistical rankings because he fell far short of the minimum 3.6 attempts per game*).

• Harvin was named second-team all-ACC while Thomas was named a true freshman all-American by *247Sports*.

• Harvin III's season average fell to 41.3 yards per punt after he uncharacteristically punted four times for 75 yards (18.8 avg.) in the Quick Lane Bowl vs. Minnesota.

• Harvin III averaged a whopping 47.7 yards per punt in six home games but just 34.6 yards per punt in six games away from home in 2018.

• As a true freshman in 2017, Harvin III set a Georgia Tech freshman record by averaging 44.1 yards per punt.

• Thomas earned true freshman all-America recognition in 2018 on the strength of returning two kickoffs for touchdowns this season, with both coming in the final two games of the regular season — a 77-yard return vs. Virginia (Nov. 17) and a 100-yarder at No. 5 Georgia (Nov. 24).

• With his two kickoff returns for touchdowns last season, Thomas set or matched five school records.

JUANYEH THOMAS SCHOOL RECORDS

1) His 100-yard kickoff return vs. Georgia is tied for the longest in school history. Thomas became the fourth Yellow Jacket to achieve the feat, joining Drew Hill (vs. Georgia, 1978) Dez White (vs. Maryland, 1998) and Jamal Golden (vs. North Carolina, 2012).

2) He is the third player in school history with two kickoff returns for touchdowns in a single season, joining Hill (1978) and Golden (2012).

3) He is the first Georgia Tech freshman with two kickoff returns for touchdowns and one of only two Tech freshmen with even one kickoff return for a TD (joining White, 1997).

4) He is the fifth player in school history with two kickoff returns for touchdowns in a career, joining Hill (1975-78), Gary Lee (1983-86), White (1997-99) and Golden (2011-15).

5) He is the only player in school history to return kickoffs for touchdowns in consecutive games.

• By making good on two extra-point attempts in the season opener at Clemson, sophomore **Wesley Wells** is now a perfect 50-for-50 in his career on place-kick attempts (41-of-41 PATs, 9-of-9 field goals).

• Wells took over the place-kicking duties last season after winning an in-practice competition for the job in the week leading up to the fifth game of the season vs. Bowling Green. He went on to make all 48 of his attempts as a true freshman — 9-of-9 field goals and 39-of-39 PATs.

• Wells made four field goals (28, 28, 48 and 40 yards) in Georgia Tech's 30-27 overtime win against Virginia on Nov. 17 of last season, becoming the eighth individual and first true freshman in Georgia Tech history to make four field goals in a single game.

• Georgia Tech has blocked 19 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the seventh-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• The nation's most blocked kicks over the past seven seasons belong to Temple (25). Six of those came over the past two seasons (2017-18), when current Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** was at the helm of the Owls. Temple blocked five kicks in 2018 alone, which was good for a tie for fifth nationally.
