TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech returns home and begins a stretch of six-straight games against Atlantic Coast Conference Coastal Division opponents this afternoon when it hosts North Carolina.
- Georgia Tech and North Carolina are squaring off on the gridiron for the 40th-straight season and the 55th time overall. The Yellow Jackets lead the all-time series, 30-21-3.
- The GT-UNC series is one that has been punctuated by streaks over the past three decades. Since 1992, the series has gone like this: UNC wins 5-of-6, GT wins 14-of-16 (including six-straight from 1998-2003 and five-straight from 2009-13), UNC wins three-straight, GT wins two-straight.
- The Yellow Jackets are 19-8 at home versus the Tar Heels all-time.
- Georgia Tech's pass defense continues to impress, as the Yellow Jackets have moved up to No. 5 nationally in passing yards allowed per game (136.8 ypg).
- Sophomore defensive back **Kaleb Oliver** recorded his second interception of the season last Saturday at Temple. Oliver is one of only 72 players nationwide with multiple interceptions this season.
- Georgia Tech also leads the ACC and ranks 12th nationally in red zone defense, as it is allowing its opponents to score on only 66.7 percent of its trips inside GT's 20 yard line (10-of-15).
- For the first time in program history, Georgia Tech is wearing gray uniforms for Saturday's game in honor of Children's Healthcare of Atlanta's annual Cape Day. The Onyx Gray Cape Day uniforms are part of adidas' 2019 Strategy Uniform series.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

Despite committing eight turnovers for 80 yards against The Citadel on Sept. 14, Georgia Tech still ranks fourth nationally in fewest penalties per game (4.0) and ninth nationally in fewest penalty yards per game (37.0).

Georgia Tech leads the ACC and ranks sixth nationally in pass defense, allowing just 136.8 yards per game through the air.

Georgia Tech is averaging 5.5 tackles for loss per game this season. Last season, the Yellow Jackets averaged 4.2 tackles for loss per game, which ranked 125th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams.

With season-ending injuries to OL **Kenny Cooper** and OL/DL **Jahaziel Lee**, Georgia Tech is down to nine seniors on its active roster. Texas A&M is the only NCAA Division I FBS teams with fewer seniors (6).

Georgia Tech So. LB **Charlie Thomas** is one of only nine Power Five conference student-athletes (and three underclassmen) that has amassed at least 28 tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks this season.

Georgia Tech's nine tackles for loss in its win over USF on Sept. 7 were the Yellow Jackets' most TFL against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since a 35-24 win over Georgia Southern on Oct. 15, 2016.

Georgia Tech leads the ACC and ranks 12th nationally in red-zone defense. The Yellow Jackets have surrendered points on just 10 of their opponents' 15 trips into the red zone this season (66.7 percent).

Georgia Tech has completed 14 passes in a game twice this season (Sept. 7 vs. USF, Sept. 28 vs. Temple), which is tied for its third-most completions in a game in the last 12 seasons.

GEORGIA TECH'S 20TH HEAD COACH — GEOFF COLLINS

Geoff Collins, an Atlanta area native and one of college football's most successful and innovative coaches, was named the 20th football head coach in Georgia Tech history on Dec. 7, 2018.

Born in Decatur, Ga. and raised in Conyers, Ga., Collins took the reins at Georgia Tech after serving as the head coach at Temple University in 2017 and 2018. At Temple, he put together the most successful first two seasons by a head coach in the school's 121-year football history.

Collins compiled 15 wins and led Temple to two bowl games in his two seasons with the Owls, which are both school records for a coach in his first two campaigns at TU.

In his first season at Temple, Collins led the Owls a 28-3 win over Florida International in the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl, which was good for only the third bowl victory in school history and its first since 2011.

He coached the Owls to an 8-4 record and 7-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference in 2018, with Temple's only conference defeat coming at No. 8-ranked and undefeated UCF. The 8-4 campaign earned Temple a berth in the Independence Bowl.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida (2015-16), Mississippi State (2013-14, co-DC: 2011-12), FIU (2010) and his alma mater, Western Carolina (2002-05).

Highlights of his career as a coordinator included ranking among the nation's top 10 in total defense in each of his two seasons at Florida (No. 8 in 2015 and No. 5 in 2016), ranking among the top 25 nationally in total defense (18th - 2013) and scoring defense (23rd - 2014) during his two seasons calling plays at Mississippi State and leading the Sun Belt Conference in total defense, scoring defense and turnover margin in his lone campaign at FIU (2010).

He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools (FIU – 2010, Mississippi State – 2014 and Florida – 2015).

Collins' 26-year career also includes a pair of prior stints at Georgia Tech. He first came to The Flats as a graduate assistant (1999-2000), then tight ends coach (2001) under head coach George O'Leary from 1999-2001, followed by a year as director of player personnel under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006.

During his initial three seasons at Georgia Tech under O'Leary, the Yellow Jackets were 25-12 with three consecutive bowl appearances. As the Jackets' director of player personnel in 2006, Collins led the efforts to land a recruiting class that included Derrick Morgan (all-American, first-round NFL Draft pick), Morgan Burnett (all-American, third-round NFL Draft pick), Joshua Nesbitt (quarterbacked GT to two ACC Championship Games) and Jonathan Dwyer (the sixth-leading rusher in GT history).

Collins' coaching career also includes stops at Western Carolina (student assistant – 1993-94), Franklin (N.C.) H.S. (assistant coach – 1995), Fordham (linebackers coach – 1996), Albright (defensive coordinator – 1997-98), Alabama (director of player personnel – 2007) and UCF (linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator – 2008-09).

In all, Collins has recruited and/or coached more than three dozen players that have gone on to play in the National Football League. Among Collins' pupils in the NFL are Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro defensive tackle Fletcher Cox (a consensus All-American at Mississippi State and No. 12 overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft), Tampa Bay Buccaneers cornerback Vernon Hargreaves (a consensus All-American at Florida and No. 11 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft), Atlanta Falcons safety Keanu Neal (the No. 17 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft) and Indianapolis Colts cornerback Rock Ya-Sin (who earned first-team all-American Athletic Conference honors at Temple after transferring from Presbyterian College and went on to be selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft).

In addition to being renowned as a coach, strategist and evaluator, Collins is also widely recognized as the nation's top head coach when it comes to branding his football program, particularly when it comes to utilizing social media in branding and recruiting efforts. His expertise in marketing and branding has led to him being a guest lecturer for Georgia Tech's Scheller College of Business executive MBA program and a featured speaker at the 2019 Hashtag Sports conference in New York City.

His innovations in utilizing social media to aid in recruiting efforts not only helped Georgia Tech land the highest-rated recruiting class in program history in 2006-07, but also helped Alabama sign the No. 1 class in the nation in 2007-08. Alabama's 2008 signing class included running back Mark Ingram, who went on to become the first Heisman Trophy winner in Crimson Tide history in 2009.

As a student-athlete, Collins totaled 194 career tackles as an outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina (1989-92). He had 68 tackles and six tackles for loss as a junior and helped lead WCU to a 7-4 record with 62 stops, including five behind the line of scrimmage, as a senior.

Collins, 48, is married to the former Jennifer Haynes. They have a daughter, Astrid (3).

OFFENSE

- The most noticeable change for the majority of observers as **Geoff Collins** takes the reins at Georgia Tech is the transition from the option-based offense that the Yellow Jackets ran under former head coach Paul Johnson for the past 11 seasons to a spread, pro-style offense.

- Leading the transition to Georgia Tech's spread, pro-style offense is offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Dave Patenaude**.

- Patenaude also served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Collins the past two seasons at Temple.

- With Patenaude at the helm of Temple's offense the past two seasons, the Owls amassed two of the three highest single-season passing totals in school history (3,273 yards in 2017, 3,297 yards in 2018).

- Making Georgia Tech's transition to the new spread, pro-style offense more challenging has been a slew of injuries across its offensive line. The Yellow Jackets have lost their two most experienced offensive linemen — seniors **Kenny Cooper** and **Jahaziel Lee** — to season-ending injuries. Cooper and Lee have combined to start 43 collegiate starts (23 for Cooper, 20 for Lee) while the rest of the offensive linemen on Tech's roster have combined for 41 career starts.

- Last Saturday at Temple, Georgia Tech had success moving the ball, as it entered Temple territory on six of its 12 offensive possessions and drove inside the 35 yard line five times but came away with no points (three turnovers, two turnovers on downs and a punt on its six possessions in TU territory).

- On Sept. 14 versus The Citadel, Georgia Tech averaged 6.5 yards per play (301 yards of total offense in just 46 snaps) and scored 24 points despite having possession for just 18:10.

- If Georgia Tech's offensive numbers against The Citadel were extrapolated over 30 minutes of possession, the Yellow Jackets would have amassed 497 yards of offense and scored 40 points.

- Twice in four games this season, Georgia Tech has completed 14 passes (Sept. 7 vs. USF, last Saturday vs. Temple), matching the Yellow Jackets' most completions in a single game since they also completed 14 in a 31-25 loss to Duke in 2014.

- The 14 pass completions are tied for Georgia Tech's third-most in any games over the past 12 seasons (2008-pres.).

- The Yellow Jackets' 14 pass completions against USF were their most in a win since they completed 15 passes in a 27-25 win over North Carolina on Nov. 17, 2007.

- In the season opener at No. 1 Clemson (Aug. 29), Georgia Tech totaled 294 yards of offense and averaged 4.7 yards per play. In Clemson's 17 games since the beginning of last season, the Yellow Jackets are one of only six teams to amass at least 294 yards of offense against Clemson and one of only three teams to average as much as 4.7 yards per play against the Tigers.

- Georgia Tech had two student-athletes rush for at least 56 yards in the opener at top-ranked Clemson — So. RB **Jordan Mason** (72) and So. QB **Tobias Oliver** (56). Since the beginning of last season, only two other teams have had two players with at least 56 rushing yards against Clemson — Pitt in the 2018 ACC Championship Game and Alabama in the 2019 College Football Playoff Championship Game.

- Georgia Tech averaged 19.6 yards per completion in the season opener against Clemson (seven completions for 137 yards), which was the third-highest yards-per-completion rate in the nation during Week One of the 2019 season, behind only Air Force (41.0 ypc vs. Colgate) and UTEP (26.8 ypc vs. Houston Baptist).

- Georgia Tech has played 278-consecutive games without being shut out, good for the seventh-longest active streak in NCAA Division I FBS.

- The Yellow Jackets have not been held scoreless since a 38-0 loss at No. 3 Florida State on Oct. 18, 1997.

- Even more impressively, Georgia Tech has not been blanked at home since a 7-0 loss to Georgia on Nov. 30, 1957 — good for a streak of 380-straight games played at Bobby Dodd Stadium without being shut out.

QUARTERBACKS

- At Georgia Tech, Collins and Patenaude inherited one of the least-experienced corps of passing quarterbacks in all of college football, as the three returners at the position on Tech's roster — sophomores **Lucas Johnson** and **Tobias Oliver** and redshirt freshman **James Graham** — combined to throw just 17 passes coming into this season.

- Georgia Tech's 17 combined pass attempts among the quarterbacks on its roster were the sixth-fewest in the nation heading into the 2019 season.

- Oliver boasts the most game experience of Georgia Tech's signal-callers, as he appeared in 12 games and made one start as a redshirt freshman in 2018 and has seen extensive action behind center this season, including two starts (Aug. 29 at Clemson, Sept. 28 at Temple).

- Oliver has been on the field for five of Georgia Tech's seven touchdown drives this season.

- Oliver's 66.0 rushing yards per game rank second in the ACC and 10th nationally among quarterbacks this season.

- Oliver also ranks second in the ACC and 11th nationally among quarterbacks this season with 5.18 yards per rush.



OFFENSE

• Last Saturday at Temple, Oliver was Georgia Tech's leading rusher (68 yards on 11 carries - 6.2 avg.) and also completed four passes for 74 yards.

• Against The Citadel (Sept. 14), Oliver ran for 92 yards on just 11 carries (8.4 avg.).

• With a 19-yard run to The Citadel 6-yard line during Georgia Tech's first touchdown drive of the game, Oliver became the eighth quarterback and the 50th overall player in GT history with 1,000 career rushing yards.

• Oliver reached the 1,000-yard rushing plateau in just the 15th game of his career.

• Only a sophomore, Oliver has already etched his name in Georgia Tech's record book several times.

• Johnson accounted for 81 yards of total offense in the win over USF (45 passing, 36 rushing).

• Johnson has been on the field for three of Georgia Tech's seven touchdown drives this season.

• Despite seeing the least action among Georgia Tech's three quarterbacks this season, the Yellow Jackets' leading passer is Graham. In limited action, the redshirt freshman has completed 15-of-32 passes for a team-high 192 yards this season.

• Graham saw the most extensive action of his young career last Saturday at Temple, when he completed 10 passes for 100 yards. He is the first GT QB to crack the 100-yard barrier in a single game this season.

• In just three series behind center at Clemson (Aug. 29), Graham completed 4-of-7 passes for 72 yards and a touchdown.

RUNNING BACKS

• Georgia Tech returned seven student-athletes that played running back a season ago and combined for 1,675 rushing yards and 16 touchdowns in 2018.

• Headlining the returners are a pair of 2019 Doak Walker Award candidates in sophomore **Jordan Mason** (659 rushing yards, seven touchdowns in 2018) and junior **Jerry Howard Jr.** (564 rushing yards and five touchdowns in 2018).

• Georgia Tech is one of only eight teams nationally with multiple student-athletes among the 71 running backs on the official 2019 Doak Walker Award watch list (joining Arkansas, Duke, Louisiana-Lafayette, Minnesota, Notre Dame, Oregon and Tulsa).

• Despite only having five carries for 8 yards last Saturday at Temple, Mason is Georgia Tech's second-leading rusher through four games (behind only QB **Tobias Oliver**) with 257 yards and four touchdowns on 49 carries (5.2 avg.).

• Mason's four rushing touchdowns lead the team and are tied for 33rd nationally.

• Against The Citadel, Mason ran for 78 yards and two touchdowns on just 11 carries (7.1 avg.).

• Mason ran for a career-high 99 yards and a score on 20 attempts (5.0 avg.) in Georgia Tech's 14-10 win over USF on Sept. 7 (prev. career high: 95 yds. at USF - Sept. 8, 2018).

• Mason had 101 yards after 19 rushes against USF but lost two yards on his final carry of the afternoon as he was trying to help Georgia Tech melt the final minutes off the clock.

• Mason carried the ball 13 times for 72 yards (5.5 avg.) and a touchdown in the season opener at No. 1 Clemson (Aug. 29).

• Since the beginning of last season, Mason is one of only two ball-carriers that has averaged at least 5.5 yards per rush on a minimum of 13 carries against Clemson (Pitt's Darrin Hall averaged 6.1 yards per carry in the 2018 ACC Championship Game).

• In 190 career carries, Mason has been held to negative yardage only seven times.

• Mason's 6.1 yards per carry ranked fourth among all freshmen nationally and t-29th in the nation overall in 2018.

• Mason's 50.7 rushing yards per game ranked 23rd nationally among freshmen in '18.

- Freshmen **Dontae Smith** and **Jamious Griffin** saw the most extensive action of their young careers last Saturday at Temple.

- Smith, a redshirt freshman who had one career carry for minus-two yards going into last Saturday's game at Temple, rushed seven times for 35 yards against TU.

- Griffin, a true freshman who had two career carries for one yard going into the Temple game, rushed six times for 20 yards against the Owls.

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Georgia Tech's wide receivers corps took a hit this week when it was learned that senior **Jalen Camp** would undergo season-ending surgery.

- After going without a reception over the first two games of the season, Camp had broken out with seven receptions for 134 yards over the past two games — three catches for 71 yards and a touchdown against The Citadel (Sept. 14) and four catches for 64 yards at Temple (Sept. 28).

- Camp's season came to a close with 134 receiving yards (first on team) on seven receptions (t-2nd), good for a 19.1-yards-per-catch average (1st). His one touchdown catch is also tied for the team lead.

- Camp's four receptions at Temple last Saturday were a career high (prev.: vs. The Citadel, Sept. 14 and vs. Minnesota, 2018 Quick Lane Bowl).

- Camp's 71 yards against The Citadel (Sept. 14) set a new career high (prev.: 70 vs. Minnesota, 2018 Quick Lane Bowl).

- Camp's touchdown against The Citadel, a 33-yarder from QB Lucas Johnson, was the first touchdown reception of his career.

- Sophomore **Malachi Carter** leads Georgia Tech with eight receptions (56 yards) this season.

- True freshman **Ahmearn Brown** ranks second on the team (behind Camp) with 128 receiving yards and is tied for second on the squad with seven receptions this season.

- Last Saturday at Temple, Brown set career highs with three receptions for 64 yards.

- Brown's first-career reception was a 28-yard touchdown catch from redshirt freshman QB **James Graham** in the fourth quarter of the opener at Clemson. With the touchdown catch, Brown became the first true freshman receiver at Georgia Tech to haul in a touchdown in his first-career game since Kerry Watkins caught a 6-yard TD pass from Joe Hamilton in the 1999 season opener at Navy (Sept. 4, 1999).

- Entering this season, Georgia Tech returned only three wide receivers that caught a pass in 2018 — Camp, Carter and junior **Stephen Dolphus**, who has not played this season.

- The trio of Camp, Carter and Dolphus combined for just 16 receptions for 330 yards and one touchdown in the careers coming into 2019.

TIGHT ENDS

- Georgia Tech's game experience at wide receiver looks deep compared to the tight end position.

- The Yellow Jackets have reintroduced the tight end position to their offense for the first time since 2007, as former head coach Paul Johnson's double-slot option-based offense did not utilize tight ends.

- The only tight end on Georgia Tech's roster that had any collegiate game experience at the position coming into the season is **Tyler Davis**, a graduate transfer from UConn.

- With a 7-yard reception in the fourth quarter of the season opener at Clemson, Davis became the first Georgia Tech tight end to catch a pass in a game since Collin Peek's 4-yard catch in the third quarter vs. Georgia on Nov. 24, 2007.

- Davis, a converted quarterback, caught 47 passes for 500 yards and seven touchdowns in three seasons at UConn, including 22 receptions for 237 yards and six scores in 2018.

- Davis is on the official watch list for the 2019 Mackey Award, presented annually to college football's top tight end.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Considered the position making the most radical transition in playing style as Georgia Tech transforms to a spread, pro-style offense this season, the Yellow Jackets' offensive line has been decimated by injuries this season.

- Seniors **Jahaziel Lee** (LT) and **Kenny Cooper** (C) have both been lost for the season due to injuries after appearing in just three and four games, respectively.

- Tech's most experienced linemen, Cooper and Lee have combined to start 43 collegiate starts (23 for Cooper, 20 for Lee) while the rest of the offensive linemen on Tech's roster have combined for 41 career starts.

- Additionally, Georgia Tech has been without the services of So. **Mikey Minihan** (the starting left guard for the first two games of the season) for the past two games.

- The Yellow Jackets were also without right guard **Connor Hansen** for the majority of spring practice, all of fall camp and the first three games of the season before the junior made his 2019 debut last Saturday at Temple.

- Due to the rash of injuries across the offensive front, three walk-on offensive linemen have seen significant action over the past three games — r-So. **William Lay III**, who played the majority of the snaps at center against USF (Sept. 7) and last Saturday at Temple, r-So. **Hamp Gibbs**, who played significant snaps at right guard against The Citadel (Sept. 14), and r-Jr. **Chet Lagod**, who saw significant action last Saturday at Temple.

- Cooper is on the official watch list for the Rimington Trophy, awarded annually to college football's top center.



DEFENSE

TEAM

• Dubbed the "Minister of Mayhem," Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has been known for putting together some of college football's top defenses over the past eight seasons — first as defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2011-14) and Florida (2015-16), then as head coach at Temple (2017-18).

- Over the past eight seasons, Collins' defenses have:
 - ranked in top 20 nationally in total defense three times (twice in top 8)
 - ranked in top 25 in scoring defense four times (twice in top 12)
 - ranked in top 30 in passing defense five times (twice in top 13)
 - ranked in top 45 in pass efficiency defense seven times (four times in top 22)
 - ranked in top 35 in turnovers gained five times (twice in top 6)
 - ranked in top 15 in interceptions four times (twice in top 10)
 - ranked in top 25 in sacks four times (twice in top 15)

• In its first season under Collins and defensive coordinator **Andrew Thacker**, Georgia Tech leads the ACC and ranks fifth nationally in pass defense, allowing just 136.8 yards per game through the air.

• The Yellow Jackets also rank 12th nationally in red zone defense, as their opponents have come away with points on just 10-of-15 trips inside the Jackets' 20 yard line (.667).

• Living up to Collins' "Minister of Mayhem" moniker, Georgia Tech has also seen a significant uptick in negative plays through four games this season.

• The Yellow Jackets have recorded 22 tackles for loss through four games this season (5.5 per game). Last season, the Jackets ranked 125th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 4.2 tackles for loss per game. They did not record their 22nd TFL of last season until the sixth game of the year.

• In addition to the 22 tackles for loss, Georgia Tech has also registered five sacks through the first three games of this season. Over the past 11 seasons (2009-pres.), the Yellow Jackets have had at least 22 TFL and six sacks through four contests only one other time (2015).

• Last Saturday, Georgia Tech limited Temple to just 322 yards of total offense, nearly 150 yards less than the Owls' season average of 470.3 yards per game going into the contest.

• The Yellow Jackets also surrendered just 127 yards on 9-of-22 passing against Temple. The Owls ranked ninth nationally with 347.3 passing yards per game going into the contest.

• A year after surrendering 426 yards in a 49-38 loss to USF, Georgia Tech's defense limited USF to just 261 yards and 10 points in a 14-10 win on Sept. 7.

• USF's 10 points were the fewest that Georgia Tech has surrendered to an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since a 33-7 win over North Carolina on Sept. 30, 2017.

• USF's 261 yards of total offense were the fewest that Georgia Tech surrendered against an FBS opponent since it allowed 258 yards in a 28-22 win over Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, 2017.

• Outside of a handful of big plays, Georgia Tech more than held its own against Clemson's high-powered offense in the season opener (Aug. 29). Clemson gained 15 or more yards nine times, amassing 320 yards in those nine plays. In Clemson's remaining 70 offensive snaps, Georgia Tech limited the Tigers to 312 yards, an average of just 4.45 yards per play.

• Yellow Jackets that record takeaways have the opportunity to sign the "Get The Ball Board" on Georgia Tech's sideline. Introduced by head coach **Geoff Collins** when he was the defensive coordinator at Western Carolina in 2002, the "Get The Ball Board" has evolved from players simply adorning the board with their signatures to signing with their social media handles.

• So. DB **Kaleb Oliver**, who recorded his second interception of the season last Saturday at Temple, is one of only 72 players in NCAA Division I FBS with multiple interceptions this season.

• Making Oliver's team-leading two interceptions even more impressive is the fact that they came against two of the nation's top quarterbacks in Clemson's Trevor Lawrence (Aug. 29) and Temple's Anthony Russo (Sept. 28).

• Linebackers **David Curry** and **Charlie Thomas** lead Georgia Tech in tackles this season with 29 and 28, respectively.

• Curry (29) and Thomas (28) are the first pair of Georgia Tech teammates to each have at least 28 tackles through four games since Gerris Wilkinson (34) and Dawan Landry (29) accomplished the feat in 2005.

• Curry turned in one of the most impressive performances in recent memory by a collegiate defender when he registered a career-high 14 tackles, a sack and an interception against The Citadel (Sept. 14).

• Curry's performance against The Citadel marked only the 13th time since 2015 that an NCAA Division I FBS student-athlete recorded at least 14 tackles, a sack and an interception in a game. Michigan State's Joe Bachie is the only other FBS player to accomplish the feat this season (Sept. 21 vs. Northwestern).

• Since 2005, only two Yellow Jackets have recorded more tackles in a game than Curry's 14 against The Citadel — Morgan Burnett (16 vs. Georgia, 2009) and Jemea Thomas (15 vs. Virginia and Ole Miss, 2013).

• Thomas is one of only nine Power Five conference student-athletes that has amassed at least 28 tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks this season.

• Thomas was responsible for Georgia Tech's lone points last Saturday at Temple when he teamed up with Jr. DL **Antwan Owens** to tackle TU RB Re'Mahn Davis in the end zone for a safety.

• Thomas stuffed the stat sheet with nine tackles, two tackles for loss, two sacks and a forced fumble (all career highs) against USF (Sept. 7).

• With his performance against USF, Thomas became the first Yellow Jacket with at least nine tackles and two sacks in a game since Jeremiah Attaochu accomplished the feat against Florida State in the 2012 ACC Championship Game (Dec. 1, 2012).

• For his efforts against USF, Thomas was named ACC Linebacker of the Week.

DEFENSE

- As a true freshman last season, Thomas' three fumble recoveries last season were the most by a Yellow Jacket since Quayshawn Nealy in 2014 (3).
- Thomas became only the third Yellow Jacket in the past decade with as many as three fumble recoveries in a season (Jerrard Terrant – 3, 2010; Nealy – 3, 2014).
- Thomas tied a single-game school record by recovering two fumbles in the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville on Oct. 5 of last season (both of which led to Georgia Tech touchdowns). He is the 18th Yellow Jacket to recover two fumbles in a game.

- Entering this season, Georgia Tech returned just three starters from last year's defense — Curry, Carpenter and sophomore cornerback **Tre Swilling**.
- Ten different defensive players have made their first-career starts this season — r-Fr. **T.K. Chimedza**, r-So. **Kelton Dawson**, Sr. DT **Brentavious Glanton**, Jr. DE **Jaquan Henderson**, Jr. DT **Chris Martin**, So. NB **Kaleb Oliver**, Jr. DE **Antwan Owens**, r-So. **Avery Showell**, So. S **Juanyeh Thomas** and r-Fr. CB **Zamari Walton**.

- Highlighting Collins' "Above The Line" philosophy (in which Georgia Tech doesn't set a depth chart but rather lists players who are ready to contribute on gameday as "Above The Line"), Georgia Tech set the tone by having 28 different Yellow Jackets were on the field for 10 or more plays on defense in the season opener at Clemson (Aug. 29).

- In honor of teammate **Brandon Adams**, a would-be senior defensive lineman who died on March 23, Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has announced that a different Yellow Jacket will wear Adams' jersey number 90 for each game this season.
- Junior DL **Chris Martin** wore the No. 90 for the Yellow Jackets' season opener vs. Clemson on Aug. 29. Martin, who normally wears No. 96, was Adams' best friend on the team and has dedicated the rest of his football playing career in Adams' memory.

SPECIALISTS

- Two of Georgia Tech's three postseason honorees in 2018 earned the recognition on special teams — So. P **Pressley Harvin III** and Fr. KR **Juanyeh Thomas**.
- Through the first four games of his junior campaign, Harvin has punted 24 times for a 42.2-yard average, an average that has been somewhat limited due to a number of opportunities to pin opponents deep inside their territory.
- Most impressively, 10 of Harvin's 24 punts have been downed inside the 20-yard line and five have been downed inside the 10-yard line. Harvin's eight punts downed inside the 20 rank third in the ACC.
- Six of Harvin's 24 punts this season have traveled 50 yards or more, including a 53- and a 50-yarder last Saturday at Temple and a pair of 55-yarders vs. USF (Sept. 7).
- One of the nation's least-utilized weapons a season ago, Harvin would've led the ACC and ranked 16th nationally through the 2018 regular season with a 44.3-yard punting average (*he did not qualify for official NCAA/ACC statistical rankings because he fell far short of the minimum 3.6 attempts per game*).
- Harvin III's season average fell to 41.3 yards per punt after he uncharacteristically punted four times for 75 yards (18.8 avg.) in the Quick Lane Bowl vs. Minnesota.
- Harvin III averaged a whopping 47.7 yards per punt in six home games but just 34.6 yards per punt in six games away from home in 2018.
- As a true freshman in 2017, Harvin III set a Georgia Tech freshman record by averaging 44.1 yards per punt.
- Despite the limited opportunities, Harvin was named second-team all-ACC as a sophomore in 2018.
- Thomas earned true freshman all-America recognition in 2018 on the strength of returning two kickoffs for touchdowns this season, with both coming in the final two games of the regular season — a 77-yard return vs. Virginia (Nov. 17) and a 100-yarder at No. 5 Georgia (Nov. 24).
- With his two kickoff returns for touchdowns last season, Thomas set or matched five school records.

- Georgia Tech sophomore quarterback **Tobias Oliver** has returned four kickoffs for 133 yards this season (33.2 avg.).
- Oliver is one of only seven FBS student-athletes that has two kickoff returns of at least 40 yards this season.
- Oliver is the only FBS QB this decade (2010-pres.) who has a kickoff return of at least 30 yards.
- For the first time in his career, sophomore **Wesley Wells** missed a kick attempt when his lone PAT attempt against The Citadel (Sept. 14) was no good. Wells had been a perfect 50-for-50 in his career on place-kick attempts (41-of-41 PATs, 9-of-9 field goals) before the miss against The Citadel.
- Wells took over the place-kicking duties last season after winning an in-practice competition for the job in the week leading up to the fifth game of the season vs. Bowling Green. He went on to make all 48 of his attempts as a true freshman — 9-of-9 field goals and 39-of-39 PATs.
- Wells made four field goals (28, 28, 48 and 40 yards) in Georgia Tech's 30-27 overtime win against Virginia on Nov. 17 of last season, becoming the eighth individual and first true freshman in Georgia Tech history to make four field goals in a single game.

- Georgia Tech has blocked 19 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the ninth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• Of the 11 seniors on Georgia Tech's roster, three of the most significant contributors — OL **Kenny Cooper** and **Jahaziel Lee** and WR **Jalen Camp** — are out for the remainder of the season due to injury.

• With Lee and Cooper out of the lineup, there are only three seniors remaining on Georgia Tech's roster that have started games this season: TE **Tyler Davis** and OL **Jared Southers** (graduate transfers from UConn and Vanderbilt, respectively) and DL **Brentavious Glanton**.

• Of the Yellow Jackets' 1,847 total snaps at Temple last Saturday, seniors only accounted for 191 of them (and that was with Camp and Cooper still in action).

• Twenty-three total freshmen, including 11 true freshmen, have seen action for the Yellow Jackets this season.

• Despite its youth, Georgia Tech has one of the nation's most disciplined teams through four games this season. Even with an uncharacteristic eight penalties for 80 yards against The Citadel (Sept. 14), the Yellow Jackets have still committed the fourth-fewest penalties in the nation this season (4.0 per game) and have been penalized for the ninth-fewest yards (37.00 ypg).

In place of a traditional depth chart that often omits some student-athletes who see game action and lists others who seldom enter the game, Georgia Tech will list student-athletes who are above the line, in numerical order by position (student-athletes that started the previous game are printed in **bold**).
