#### TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech closes its season on Saturday when it hosts archrival Georgia for the 114th edition of Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Georgia Tech comes into the season finale riding the momentum of a 28-26 win over NC State in its final Atlantic Coast Conference game of the season last Thursday night at Bobby Dodd Stadium. The Yellow Jackets raced out to a 21-3 halftime lead and, highlighted by a career-high-tying 141 rushing yards from sophomore running back **Jordan Mason**, racked up a season-high 395 yards of total offense in the victory.
- Two Jackets were named ACC Players of the Week following the triumph over NC State. Redshirt freshman **Jordan Domineck** (10 tackles, 1.5 TFL) was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week and redshirt freshman quarterback **James Graham** (241 yards of total offense, four total touchdowns) was named ACC Co-Rookie of the Week in recognition of their performances in the win.
- The Georgia Tech-Georgia series is one of major college football's oldest and most-played rivalries. Only 12 NCAA Division I FBS rivalries began before Georgia Tech and Georgia played for the first time in 1893 and only 17 FBS rivalries have been played more often than the 113 previous editions of "Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate."
- Saturday is Senior Day for Georgia Tech, as it honors the eight seniors on its active roster (the second-fewest in NCAA Division I FBS) DB **Christian Campbell**, TE **Tyler Cooksey**, RB **Nathan Cottrell**, TE **Tyler Davis**, DL **Brentavious Glanton**, WR **Omahri Jarrett**, DL **Scott Morgan** and OL **Jared Southers**.

#### **GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS**

As a team, Georgia Tech has blocked three kicks this season, all in the last six games (blocked punt on Oct. 12 at Duke, blocked field goal on Oct. 19 at Miami, blocked punt Nov. 2 vs. Pitt). The Yellow Jackets' two blocked punts are tied for fifth in NCAA Division I FBS this season and its three total blocked kicks are tied for 10th nationally.

Georgia Tech Fr. WR Ahmarean Brown has seven touchdown receptions this season, which is tied for the Georgia Tech freshman record, originally set by Calvin Johnson as a true freshman in 2004.

With season-ending injuries to WR Jalen Camp, OL Kenny Cooper and OL/DL Jahaziel Lee, Georgia Tech is down to eight seniors on its active roster. Texas A&M is the only NCAA Division I FBS teams with fewer seniors (6).

Georgia Tech r-Fr. QB **James Graham** has 11 touchdown passes this season, which is just one shy of the Georgia Tech freshman record of 12, set by Shawn Jones in 1989.

Georgia Tech's roster includes 55 freshmen (28 true and 27 redshirt), the 11th-most total freshmen on any NCAA Division I FBS roster this season.

Offensively, Georgia Tech will return 88 percent of its receiving yards, 100 percent of its passing yards and 100.2 percent of

Defensively, Georgia Tech will return 93 percent of its tackles, 93 percent of its tackles for loss, 94 percent of its sacks and 100 percent of its takeaways next season.

Saturday's meeting is the 114th between Georgia Tech and Georgia. Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate is the 13th-oldest and 18th most-played rivalry in NCAA Division I FBS.



#### GEORGIA TECH'S 20TH HEAD COACH — GEOFF COLLINS



Collins compiled 15 wins and led Temple to two bowl games in his two seasons with the Owls, which are both school records for a coach in his first two campaigns at TU.

In his first season at Temple, Collins led the Owls a 28-3 win over Florida International in the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl, which was good for only the third bowl victory in school history and its first since

In his first season at Temple, Collins led the Owls a 28-3 win over Florida International in the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl, which was good for only the third bowl victory in school history and its first since 2011

He coached the Owls to an 8-4 record and 7-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference in 2018, with Temple's only conference defeat coming at No. 8-ranked and undefeated UCF. The 8-4 campaign earned Temple a berth in the Independence Bowl.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida (2015-16), Mississippi State (2013-14, co-DC: 2011-12). FIU (2010) and his alma mater. Western Carolina (2002-05).

Highlights of his career as a coordinator included ranking among the nation's top 10 in total defense in each of his two seasons at Florida (No. 8 in 2015 and No. 5 in 2016), ranking among the top 25 nationally in total defense (18th - 2013) and scoring defense (23rd - 2014) during his two seasons calling plays at Mississippi State and leading the Sun Belt Conference in total defense, scoring defense and turnover margin in his lone campaign at FIU (2010).

He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools (FIU – 2010, Mississippi State – 2014 and Florida – 2015). Collins' 26-year career also includes a pair of prior stints at Georgia Tech. He first came to The Flats as a graduate assistant (1999-2000), then tight ends coach (2001) under head coach George O'Leary from 1999-2001, followed by a year as director of player personnel under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006.

During his initial three seasons at Georgia Tech under O'Leary, the Yellow Jackets were 25-12 with three-consecutive bowl appearances. As the Jackets' director of player personnel in 2006, Collins led the efforts to land a recruiting class that included Derrick Morgan (all-American, first-round NFL Draft pick), Morgan Burnett (all-American, third-round NFL Draft pick), Joshua Nesbitt (quarterbacked GT to two ACC Championship Games) and Jonathan Dwyer (the sixth-leading rusher in GT history).

Collins' coaching career also includes stops at Western Carolina (student assistant – 1993-94), Franklin (N.C.) H.S. (assistant coach – 1995), Fordham (linebackers coach – 1996), Albright (defensive coordinator – 1997-98), Alabama (director of player personnel – 2007) and UCF (linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator – 2008-09).

In all, Collins has recruited and/or coached more than three dozen players that have gone on to play in the National Football League. Among Collins' pupils in the NFL are Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro defensive tackle Fletcher Cox (a consensus All-American at Mississippi State and No. 12 overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft), Tampa Bay Buccaneers cornerback Vernon Hargreaves (a consensus All-American at Florida and No. 11 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft), Atlanta Falcons safety Keanu Neal (the No. 17 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft) and Indianapolis Colts cornerback Rock Ya-Sin (who earned first-team all-American Athletic Conference honors at Temple after transferring from Presbyterian College and went on to be selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft). In addition to being renowned as a coach, strategist and evaluator, Collins is also widely recognized as the nation's top head coach when it comes to branding his football program, particularly when it comes to utilizing social media in branding and recruiting efforts. His expertise in marketing and branding has led to him being a guest lecturer for Georgia Tech's Scheller College of Business executive MBA program and a featured speaker at the 2019 Hashtag Sports conference in New York City.

His innovations in utilizing social media to aid in recruiting efforts not only helped Georgia Tech land the highest-rated recruiting class in program history in 2006-07, but also helped Alabama sign the No. 1 class in the nation in 2007-08. Alabama's 2008 signing class included running back Mark Ingram, who went on to become the first Heisman Trophy winner in Crimson Tide history in 2009. As a student-athlete, Collins totaled 194 career tackles as an outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina (1989-92). He had 68 tackles and six tackles for loss as a junior and helped lead WCIJ to a 7-4 record with 62 stops, including five behind the line of scrimmage, as a senior.

Collins, 48, is married to the former Jennifer Haynes. They have a daughter, Astrid (3).

#### **NOTING LAST THURSDAY'S WIN OVER NC STATE**

- Sophomore Jordan Mason matched a career high with 141 rushing yards, redshirt freshman **James Graham** accounted for 241 yards of offense and four touchdowns and true freshman Ahmarean Brown caught two touchdown passes to lead Georgia Tech to a 28-26 triumph over NC State last Thursday at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Georgia Tech raced out to a 21-3 halftime lead and led 28-10 late in the third guarter, then held off a late NC State rally to earn the hard-fought victory.
- The Yellow Jackets' offense was explosive from the get-go, as they started the game with a 54-yard pass from Graham to sophomore Malachi Carter on the very first play of the game, and took the 18-point halftime advantage on the strength of three touchdown passes by Graham -17- and 11-varders to Brown and a 13-varder to sophomore **Tobias Oliver**.
- Graham added a rushing touchdown with 5:08 to go in the third quarter that extended Georgia Tech's lead back to 18 points at 28-10.
- NC State scored a field goal and two touchdowns on its next three possessions, the final touchdown coming with 5:17 to go in the game to cut the Yellow Jackets' lead to 28-26. On the Wolfpack's ensuing two-point conversion try, Georgia Tech senior defensive back **Christian Campbell** pressured NC State quarterback Devin Leary on a blitz, forcing Leary's pass to sail harmlessly out of the back of the end zone and maintaining Tech's two-point lead.
- On the Jackets' ensuing possession, Mason and Graham combined to rush eight times for 38 yards, converting two third downs along the way to milk the final 5:17 off the clock and seal the victory.
- Georgia Tech's 28 points matched a season high (prev.: 28 at Miami, Oct. 19; at Virginia, Nov. 9).
- Georgia Tech's 395 yards were a season high (prev.: 379 at Duke, Oct. 12).
- Graham's three touchdown passes were the most by a Yellow Jacket since TaQuon Marshall had three vs. Jacksonville State on Sept. 9, 2017, the most by a Jacket against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since Justin Thomas had three vs. Virginia on Nov. 1, 2014 and the most by a Georgia Tech freshman since Reggie Ball had three vs. North Carolina on Nov. 15, 2003.
- Graham's three touchdown passes give him 11 for the season, which moved him within one of the Georgia Tech freshman record of 12 touchdown passes, set by Shawn Jones in 1989.
- Graham accounted for four total touchdowns (three passing, one rushing), the most by a Yellow Jacket since Marshall accounted for four vs. Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, 2017. Graham also rushed for a career-high 112 yards (prev.: 48 vs. North Carolina, Oct. 5).
- Graham is the first Yellow Jacket to pass and rush for 100 yards in the same game since Oliver vs. North Carolina on Oct. 3, 2018 (120 rushing, 104 passing).
- Graham's 129 passing yards gave him 1,124 yards for the season, making him the first Georgia Tech quarterback to throw for 1,000 yards in a single season since Justin Thomas in 2016 (1,559 yds.) and the first Tech freshman to accomplish the feat since Ball in 2003 (1,996 yds.).

- Brown's two touchdown receptions gave him seven for the season, which matches the Georgia Tech freshman record originally set by Calvin Johnson in 2004.
- . Mason's 100-yard game was the third of his career. All three of his 100-yard games have come in the past six games (106 at Duke, Oct. 12; 141 at Miami, Oct. 19).
- Oliver's 13-vard touchdown reception was the first touchdown catch of his career. Just 23 games into his collegiate career, Oliver has accounted for touchdowns by rushing (14), passing (2) and receiving (1).
- Redshirt freshman DE **Jordan Domineck** set career highs with 10 tackles (prev.: 7 at Virginia, Nov. 9) and 1.5 tackles for loss (prev.: 1.0 at Miami, Oct. 19).
- Domineck was named the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week and Graham was named the conference's co-Rookie of the Week.

#### **CLEAN, OLD-FASHIONED HATE**

- Saturday's game marks the 114th edition of the Georgia Tech-Georgia football series — a rivalry dubbed "Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate."
- The series dates back to 1893, Georgia Tech's second season of football. Tech won the first meeting, 28-6, in Athens.
- After a three-year break in the series from 1894-96, the teams have met annually since 1897 with the exception of 1901, 1908 and an eight-year gap from 1917-24.
- The Georgia Tech-Georgia series is one of major college football's oldest and most-played rivalries. Only 12 NCAA Division I FBS rivalries began before Georgia Tech and Georgia played for the first time in 1893 and only 17 FBS rivalries have been played more often than the 112 previous editions of "Clean, Old-Fashioned Hate."

## Brad Chambers' 35-yard field goal in the final seconds snapped Tech's seven-game losing streak to UGA.

# • Nov. 27, 1999: Georgia Tech 51, Georgia 48 (OT) In perhaps the most thrilling game in Bobby Dodd Stadium history, Joe Hamilton's last home game was triumphant. Luke Manget's second-chance, overtime field goal sent Tech fans into euphoria. Many of them carried Hamilton — who finished second in the Heisman Trophy voting — on their shoulders and around the stadium.

#### • Nov. 29, 2008: Georgia Tech 45, Georgia 42

Georgia Tech overcame a 26-12 halftime deficit to break a seven-year skid against a Bulldog team that was ranked No. 1 in the preseason. Freshman Roddy Jones rushed for 214 yards in the victory.

#### • Nov. 29, 2014: Georgia Tech 30, Georgia 24 (OT)

Harrison Butker booted a game-tying, career-long 53-yard field goal as time expired to force overtime after a Malcom Mitchell touchdown catch gave UGA a 24-21 lead with 18 seconds remaining in regulation. Tech's Zach Laskey scored on the first possession in overtime and D.J. White intercepted Hudson Mason to seal the win.

#### • Nov. 26, 2016: Georgia Tech 28, Georgia 27

Georgia Tech rallied from a 27-14 fourth-quarter deficit to claim its second win in three years over the Bulldogs. An interception by Lance Austin with 3:39 left in the game set up Qua Searcy's six-yard run and leap into the end zone for the winning touchdown with 30 seconds to go.

#### **GEOFF COLLINS AND UGA**

- As a youth, Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins**, who was born in Decatur, Ga. and raised in Conyers, Ga., was a regular attendee at the Georgia Tech-Georgia freshman/junior varsity games that were played annually on Thanksgiving at Bobby Dodd Stadium from 1933-93.
- In Collins' first season as a graduate assistant on head coach George O'Leary's staff in 1999, Georgia Tech beat Georgia, 51-48, in an epic overtime battle at Bobby Dodd Stadium. The win remains Georgia Tech's last home win in the series.
- Collins and Georgia head coach Kirby Smart were both on head coach Nick Saban's initial staff at Alabama in 2007.
   Collins served as director of player personnel and Smart was defensive backs coach.

#### **OFFENSE**

- The most noticable change for the majority of observers as **Geoff Collins** takes the reins at Georgia Tech is the transition from the option-based offense that the Yellow Jackets ran under former head coach Paul Johnson for the past 11 seasons to a spread, pro-style offense.
- Leading the transition to Georgia Tech's spread, pro-style offense is offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Dave Patenaude
- Patenaude also served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Collins the past two seasons at Temple.
- With Patenaude at the helm of Temple's offense the past two seasons, the Owls amassed two of the three highest single-season passing totals in school history (3,273 yards in 2017, 3,297 yards in 2018).
- Making Georgia Tech's transition to the new spread, prostyle offense more challenging has been a slew of injuries across its offensive line. The Yellow Jackets lost their two most experienced offensive linemen seniors Jahaziel Lee and Kenny Cooper to season-ending injuries after just three and four games, respectively. Lee and Cooper have combined for 43 collegiate starts (23 for Cooper, 20 for Lee) while the rest of the offensive linemen on Tech's roster had combined for just 41 career starts before Cooper and Lee were lost for the year.
- Georgia Tech has lost a total of three senior offensive starters for the season due to injury. In addition to Lee and Cooper, WR **Jalen Camp**, who made 17-consecutive starts at wideout, also underwent season-ending injury following the fourth game of the season.
- Due in large part to the slew of injuries, seven of Georgia Tech's 11 primary starters for the past seven games (beginning Oct. 5 vs. North Carolina) have been freshmen or sophomores, including r-Fr. QB **James Graham**, who has made the first seven starts of his career.
- Freshmen and sophomores have accounted for 98 percent of Georgia Tech's passing yards, 95 percent of the Yellow Jackets' rushing yards and 73 percent of the Jackets' receiving yards this season.
- Additionally, 23 of Georgia Tech's 26 touchdowns (89 percent) and 167 of its 193 total points (87 percent) this season have been scored by freshmen and sophomores.
- Below is a breakdown of the offensive statistics accumulated this season by Georgia Tech's freshman, sophomores and juniors (i.e. players returning in 2020) and its freshmen and sophomore (i.e. players returning for the next two seasons).

- Making Georgia Tech's offensive transition even more difficult is the fact that five of the 12 teams on its regularseason schedule currently rank among the nation's top 25 teams in total defense (No. 2 Clemson, No. 5 Georgia, No. 9 Pitt, No. 15 Miami and No. 22 Virginia).
- Last Thursday versus NC State, Georgia Tech racked up a season-high 395 yards of offense in its 28-26 win over the Wolfpack.

- In addition to the 395 total yards, Georgia Tech's offense also recorded season highs with 266 rushing yards (prev.: 207 at Miami, Oct. 19), three passing touchdowns (prev.: 2, three times) and a 46.2 (6-of-13) third-down conversion percentage (prev.: 44.4 pct. at Duke, Oct. 12).
- Perhaps most impressively, holding a 28-26 lead, Georgia Tech's offense ran the final 5:17 off the clock by running eight times for 38 yards on its final possession to seal the victory over NC State.
- On Nov. 9, Georgia Tech racked up 372 yards of offense against Virginia, 20 percent more than the Cavaliers' defense, which came into the game ranked 17th nationally, had been allowing per game (310.1 ypg).
- Georgia Tech's 6.9 yards per play against Virginia were a season high (prev.: 6.1 vs. North Carolina, Oct. 5).
- Georgia Tech threw for a season-high 229 yards at Virginia, which was the Yellow Jackets' most passing yards in a game since they threw for 264 yards against Duke on Oct. 29, 2016 and their most in a road game since they threw for 251 yards at Virginia on Oct. 31, 2015.
- Georgia Tech's 15 pass completions against Virginia matched a season high (prev.: 15 at Duke, Oct. 12) and are tied for its most completions in a game since it also completed 15 passes against Clemson in 2013.
- Four of the Yellow Jackets' seven highest completion totals since 2008 have come in the past nine games.

- On Oct. 19 at Miami, Georgia Tech ran for 207 yards (its second-highest rushing total of the season) against a Hurricanes defense that was ranked No 7 nationally going into the game, having previously allowed just 77.7 rushing yards per contest.
- On Oct. 5 versus North Carolina, Georgia Tech totaled 321 yards of offense despite managing only 92 yards of offense in a scoreless first half. The Yellow Jackets amassed 229 yards and 22 points on just 26 plays (8.8 yards per play) in the second half of the contest.
- On Sept. 28 at Temple, GT had success moving the ball, as it entered Temple territory on six of its 12 offensive possessions and drove inside the 35 yard line five times but came away with no points (three turnovers, two turnovers on downs and a punt on its six possessions in TU territory).
- On Sept. 14 versus The Citadel, Georgia Tech averaged 6.5 yards per play (301 yards of total offense in just 46 snaps) and scored 24 points despite having possession for just 18:10.
- If Georgia Tech's offensive numbers against The Citadel were extrapolated over 30 minutes of possession, the Yellow Jackets would have amassed 497 yards of offense and scored 40 points.

- In the season opener at No. 1 Clemson (Aug. 29), Georgia Tech totaled 294 yards of offense and averaged 4.7 yards per play, which remain the most yards and second-most yards per play allowed by Clemson this season. In Clemson's 26 games since the beginning of last season, the Yellow Jackets are one of only six teams to amass at least 294 yards of offense against Clemson and one of only five teams to average as much as 4.7 yards per play against the Tigers.
- Georgia Tech had two student-athletes rush for at least 56 yards in the opener at top-ranked Clemson So. RB **Jordan Mason** (72) and So. QB **Tobias Oliver** (56). Since the beginning of last season, only two other teams have had two players with at least 56 rushing yards against Clemson Pitt in the 2018 ACC Championship Game and Alabama in the 2019 College Football Playoff Championship Game.
- Georgia Tech averaged 19.6 yards per completion in the season opener against Clemson (seven completions for 137 yards), which was the third-highest yards-per-completion rate in the nation during Week One of the 2019 season, behind only Air Force (41.0 ypc vs. Colgate) and UTEP (26.8 ypc vs. Houston Baptist).
- Three different passers have thrown at least one touchdown pass for Georgia Tech this season QBs James Graham (8) and Lucas Johnson (1) and P Pressley Harvin III (1) marking the first time since 2008 (Calvin Booker, Jaybo Shaw and Joshua Nesbitt) and only the fourth time since 2000 that three different Yellow Jackets have thrown touchdown passes in a single season.

#### **QUARTERBACKS**

- At Georgia Tech, Collins and Patenaude inherited one of the least-experienced corps of passing quarterbacks in all of college football, as the three returners at the position on Tech's roster — sophomores **Lucas Johnson** and **Tobias Oliver** and redshirt freshman **James Graham** — combined to throw just 17 passes coming into this season.
- Georgia Tech's 17 combined pass attempts among the quarterbacks on its roster were the sixth-fewest in the nation heading into the 2019 season.

- Graham became the third member of the trio to start a game this season when he made his first-career start against North Carolina on Oct. 5. He has made each of the last seven starts at QB (Oct. 5 vs. UNC, Oct. 12 at Duke, Oct. 19 at Miami, Nov. 2 vs. Pitt, Nov. 9 at Virginia, Nov. 16 vs. Virginia Tech and last Thursday vs. NC State).
- Graham's 11 touchdown passes this season are just one shy of the Georgia Tech freshman record of 12, set by Shawn Jones in 1989.
- Despite only making seven starts, Graham's 11 touchdown passes are tied for 11th nationally among freshmen.

- Graham is the first Georgia Tech freshman to throw multiple touchdown passes in a game since Reggie Ball threw for three TDs against North Carolina on Nov. 15, 2003.
- In addition to his three touchdown passes, Graham also had a career-high 112 rushing yards against NC State last Thursday (prev.: 48 vs. North Carolina, Oct. 5).

- Oliver boasts the most game experience of Georgia Tech's signal-callers, as he appeared in 12 games and made one start as a redshirt freshman in 2018 and has seen extensive action behind center this season, including two starts (Aug. 29 at Clemson, Sept. 28 at Temple).
- On Sept. 28 at Temple, Oliver was Georgia Tech's leading rusher (68 yards on 11 carries 6.2 avg.) and also completed four passes for 74 yards.
- Against The Citadel (Sept. 14), Oliver ran for 92 yards on just 11 carries (8.4 avg.).
- One of the nation's most dynamic weapons, Oliver ranks second on the team with 660 all-purpose yards this season (279 rushing, 93 receiving, 288 kick return).
- Since Graham moved into the starting lineup at QB versus North Carolina (Oct. 5), Oliver has continued to be a big part of Georgia Tech's offense, having caught at least one pass in each of the last seven games. He is one of only two Georgia Tech receivers that has a reception in each of the last seven games, joining freshman **Ahmarean Brown**.
- With his first-career touchdown reception last Thursday versus NC State, Oliver has accounted for touchdowns by rushing (14), passing (2) and receiving (1) in just 23-career games.
- Oliver is only the third Georgia Tech player since 2005 to account for touchdowns by passing, rushing and receiving in his career, joining TaQuon Marshall (2015-18) and Taylor Bennett (2005-07).

- Johnson made his first two starts and saw the most extensive action of his career over the Yellow Jackets' second and third games of this season Sept. 7 vs. USF and Sept. 14 vs. The Citadel.
- Splitting action with Oliver, Johnson threw for a careerhigh 91 yards against The Citadel. His 91 yards included his first-career touchdown pass, a 33-yard strike to senior wide receiver **Jalen Camp**.
- Johnson, who missed three games due to injury (Sept. 28 at Temple, Oct. 5 vs. North Carolina, Oct. 12 at Duke), saw his first action at quarterback since Sept. 14 against The Citadel when he was behind center for the third quarter versus Pitt on Nov. 2. In just one quarter of action, he completed 5-of-8 passes for 51 yards, which was the second-highest passing yardage of his career and tied for the second-most completions.

- True freshman Jordan Yates saw the first extensive playing time of his young career against Virginia Tech (Nov. 16).
- Yates entered the game at the beginning of the Yellow Jackets' second possession of the second half and quarterbacked the Jackets' final three drives. He completed 4-of-11 passes for 38 yards.

 Yates, the 2018 Georgia 7A Offensive Player of the Year, saw his only other playing action of the season come against Duke (Oct. 12), when he quarterbacked Georgia Tech for a two-point conversion attempt after Graham sustained a minor injury on the touchdown play.

#### **RUNNING BACKS**

- So. Jordan Mason is Georgia Tech's leading rusher this season with 862 yards and seven touchdowns on 156 carries (5.5 avg.).
- Mason's 78.4 rushing yards per game rank fifth in the ACC and 56th nationally.
- Mason's 5.53 yards per carry rank seventh in the ACC and 54th nationally.
- Mason's seven rushing touchdowns are tied for seventh in the ACC and 80th nationally.
- Mason rushed for a career-high-tying 141 yards last Thursday against NC State, good for the third 100-yard running game of his career. All three of his 100-yard games have come in the past six games (106 at Duke, Oct. 12; 141 at Miami, Oct. 19).
- Mason's 48-yard run in the first quarter against NC State was the longest run of his career (prev.: 46 at USF, Sept. 8, 2018) and Georgia Tech's longest running play of the season (prev.: 43 by Mason vs. North Carolina, Oct. 5).
- Mason was particularly impressive during Georgia Tech's final possession against NC State. With the Yellow Jackets holding a 28-26 lead, Mason carried the ball on 7-of-8 plays, running for 31 yards and converting a pivotal thirdand-1 that helped the Jackets' milk the final 5:17 off the clock and seal the two-point victory.
- In addition to his three 100-yard games, Mason also ran for 99 yards against USF (Sept. 7) and 94 at Virginia (Nov. 9), giving him five games with at least 90 rushing yards this season and seven in his 24-game career.
- Against USF (Sept. 7), Mason had 101 rushing yards after 19 carries but lost two yards on his final rush of the afternoon as he was trying to help Georgia Tech melt the final minutes off the clock and finished with 99 yards.
- Mason was especially impressive after halftime in Georgia Tech's 28-21 overtime win at Miami. He gained 91 of his 141 yards after halftime, including all 25 of the Yellow Jackets' yards in their lone OT possession, when he ran for 2, 22 and 1 yards. The 1-yard touchdown drive proved to be the game-winning points in the Jackets' 28-21 victory.
- After being limited to just five carries due to injury at Temple (Sept. 28), Mason bounced back for 62 yards and a touchdown on eight carries (7.8 avg.) against North Carolina (Oct. 5).
- Against The Citadel (Sept. 14), Mason ran for 78 yards and two touchdowns on just 11 carries (7.1 avg.).
- Mason ran for a then-career-high 99 yards and a score on 20 attempts (5.0 avg.) in Georgia Tech's 14-10 win over USF.
- Mason carried the ball 13 times for 72 yards (5.5 avg.) and a touchdown in the season opener at No. 1 Clemson (Aug. 29).

- Since the beginning of last season, Mason is one of only two ball-carriers that has averaged at least 5.5 yards per rush on a minimum of 13 carries against Clemson (Pitt's Darrin Hall averaged 6.1 yards per carry in the 2018 ACC Championship Game).
- In 297 career carries, Mason has been held to negative yardage only 20 times.

- During his 106-yard performance at Duke on Oct. 12, Mason became the 50th student-athlete in Georgia Tech history with 1,000 career rushing yards. He currently ranks 34th in program history with 1,380 rushing yards. He needs just 120 yards to become only the 29th Yellow Jacket with 1,500 career rushing yards.
- Mason's 6.1 yards per carry ranked fourth among all freshmen nationally and t-29th in the nation overall in 2018.
- Mason's 50.7 rushing yards per game ranked 23rd nationally among freshmen in '18.
- Jr. **Jerry Howard Jr.** has become one of Georgia Tech's most valuable weapons as a runner, pass-catcher and special-teams stalwart.
- Howard ranks fourth on the team in rushing (102 yards), seventh on the team in receiving (92 yards) and has five tackles and two punt blocks on special teams.
- Howard made his first start of the season in a two-back set with Mason and carried the ball a season-high five times for 22 yards at Miami (Oct. 19).
- Howard put together one of the best all-around performances of his career at Duke (Oct. 12), finishing with 31 yards on two receptions (including a 19-yard touchdown catch on Georgia Tech's opening drive), 16 yards on four rushes, three special teams tackles and a blocked punt.
- Howard ran for a season-high 31 yards on just three carries (10.3 avg.) the previous Saturday vs. North Carolina (Oct. 5). The 10.3 yards-per-rush average was the second-highest of his career (career high: 13.7 in his collegiate debut vs. Jacksonville State, Sept. 9, 2017).



• Howard caught two passes for 57 yards, including a 54-yarder that set up a Georgia Tech touchdown, in the season opener at Clemson (Aug. 29). The two receptions, 57 receiving yards and 54-yard catch were all career highs for the junior.

- Freshmen Jamious Griffin and Dontae Smith have combined for 157 yards on 41 carries in reserve roles behind Mason and Howard this season.
- Griffin, a true freshman who was Georgia's Gatorade Player of the Year last year at Rome H.S., saw the most extensive action of his career at Miami (Oct. 19), with eight carries for 21 yards (both career highs).
- Griffin matched his career high with 21 rushing yards vs. Virginia Tech (Nov. 16).
- Smith, a redshirt freshman who had one career carry for minus-two yards prior to the Yellow Jackets' fourth game of the season at Temple (Sept. 28), rushed seven times for 35 yards against the Owls (both career highs).
- Mason and Howard Jr. are both on the official watch list for the 2019 Doak Walker Award (nation's top RB). Georgia Tech is one of only eight teams nationally with multiple student-athletes among the 71 running backs on the official Doak Walker watch list (joining Arkansas, Duke, Louisiana-Lafayette, Minnesota, Notre Dame, Oregon and Tulsa).

#### **WIDE RECEIVERS**

- One of college football's most dynamic true freshmen, Ahmarean Brown leads Georgia Tech in receiving yards (393), receptions (20), yards per reception (19.6 - min. 8 rec.) and touchdown catches (7) this season.
- With seven touchdown receptions, Brown has tied the Georgia Tech freshman record set by Calvin Johnson as a true freshman in 2004.
- · Brown leads all true freshmen nationally and ranks second overall among freshmen in touchdown receptions this season.

- . Brown has caught a touchdown pass in four of the last five and five of the last seven games (Oct. 5 vs. North Carolina, Oct. 19 at Miami, Nov. 2 vs. Pitt, Nov. 9 at Virginia, last Thursday vs. NC State).
- Brown's seven touchdown receptions this season have gone for 28 (Aug. 29 at Clemson), 32 (Oct. 5 vs. North Carolina), 35 yards (Oct. 19 at Miami), 51 (Nov. 2 vs. Pitt), and 59 (Nov. 9 at Virginia), 17 and 11 (Nov. 21 vs. NC State) yards.
- · Overall, seven of Brown's 20 receptions this season have gained at least 20 yards, 6-of-20 have gained 30 or more yards and 4-of-20 have gained 40 or more yards.
- Brown's 59-yard touchdown catch against Virginia (Nov. 9) was the longest reception of his career (prev.: 51-yard TD vs. Pitt, Nov. 2).

· With his touchdown catch in the season opener at Clemson, Brown became the first true freshman receiver at Georgia Tech to haul in a touchdown in his first-career game since Kerry Watkins caught a 6-yard TD pass from Joe Hamilton in the 1999 season opener at Navy (Sept. 4, 1999).

- Following a season-ending injury to senior Jalen Camp, r-So. Adonicas Sanders has been a primary starter for the Yellow Jackets, beginning vs. North Carolina (Oct. 5).
- Since moving into the starting lineup seven games ago, Sanders has amassed 16 receptions for 224 yards. He led Georgia Tech in receiving yardage against UNC (67 - Oct. 5), Duke (69 - Oct. 12) and Virginia Tech (22 - Nov. 16).
- Prior to catching 16 passes for 224 yards over the past four games, Sanders had just three receptions for 25 yards in his entire career (all this season).
- Despite only seeing significant playing time the past seven games, Sanders ranks second on the team with 249 receiving yards.
- Sophomore Malachi Carter ranks third on the team with 15 receptions and 217 receiving yards this season.
- · Carter's two touchdown receptions are good for second on the squad.
- Carter had a career-high 74 receiving vards on just two receptions last Thursday versus NC State (prev.: 45 vs. North Carolina, Oct. 5).
- Carter's career-best 74 receiving yards against NC State included a 54-yard gain on the first play of the game, which as the longest reception of his career (prev.: 32 vs. Duke, Oct. 13, 2018).
- · Carter hauled in his second touchdown catch of the season and third of his career on an acrobatic 25-yard reception late in the first half at Virginia (Nov. 9).
- · Carter's first touchdown reception of the season was a 28-yarder against North Carolina (Oct. 5).
- Since moving to wideout for the fifth game of the season (Oct. 5 vs. North Carolina), So. Tobias Oliver has caught at least one pass in every game. Oliver joins Brown as the only Yellow Jackets with at least one reception in each of the last seven games.
- · Oliver hauled in the first touchdown reception of his career last Thursday versus NC State, a 13-yarder.
- With the touchdown reception against NC State, Oliver has accounted for touchdowns by rushing (14), passing (2) and receiving (1) in just 23-career games.
- Oliver is only the third Georgia Tech player since 2005 to account for touchdowns by passing, rushing and receiving in his career, joining TaQuon Marshall (2015-18) and Taylor Bennett (2005-07).
- Oliver's four receptions and 57 receiving yards against Virginia (Nov. 9) were both career highs.
- · Georgia Tech's wide receivers corps took a hit prior to the Jackets' fifth game of the season vs. North Carolina (Oct. 5) when senior **Jalen Camp** underwent season-ending surgery.
- · After going without a reception over the first two games of the season, Camp had broken out with seven receptions for 134 yards over his final two games of the season — three catches for 71 yards and a touchdown against The Citadel (Sept. 14) and four catches for 64 yards at Temple (Sept. 28).



#### OFFENSI

- Camp's season came to a close with 134 receiving yards (first on team through four games) on seven receptions (t-2nd), good for a 19.1-yards-per-catch average (1st). His one touchdown catch was also tied for the team lead through four contests.
- Camp's four receptions at Temple (Sept. 28) were a career high (prev.: vs. The Citadel, Sept. 14 and vs. Minnesota, 2018 Quick Lane Bowl).
- Camp's 71 yards against The Citadel (Sept. 14) set a new career high (prev.: 70 vs. Minnesota, 2018 Quick Lane Bowl).
- Camp's touchdown against The Citadel, a 33-yarder from QB **Lucas Johnson**, was the first touchdown reception of his career.
- Entering this season, Georgia Tech returned only three wide receivers that caught a pass in 2018 Camp (who is out for the season), Carter and junior **Stephen Dolphus**, who has not played this season due to injury.
- The trio of Camp, Carter and Dolphus had combined for just 16 receptions for 330 yards and one touchdown in the careers coming into 2019.

#### **TIGHT ENDS**

- Georgia Tech's game experience at wide receiver looks deep compared to the tight end position.
- The Yellow Jackets have reintroduced the tight end position to their offense for the first time since 2007, as former head coach Paul Johnson's double-slot option-based offense did not utilize tight ends.
- The only tight end on Georgia Tech's roster that had any collegiate game experience at the position coming into the season is **Tyler Davis**, a graduate transfer from UConn.
- Davis leads Georgia Tech's tight ends and ranks third among all GT pass-catchers with 15 receptions this season.
- Davis' 54 receiving yards at Virginia (Nov. 9) were a season high (prev.: 29 at Duke, Oct. 12).
- Davis led all Georgia Tech pass-catchers with a seasonhigh four receptions at Duke (Oct. 12).
- With a 7-yard reception in the fourth quarter of the season opener at Clemson (Aug. 29), Davis became the first Georgia Tech tight end to catch a pass in a game since Collin Peek's 4-yard catch in the third quarter vs. Georgia on Nov. 24, 2007.
- Davis hauled in a two-point conversion pass versus North Carolina (Oct. 5), becoming the first Georgia Tech tight end to score in a game since Peek hauled in a 17-yard touchdown pass against Georgia in '07.
- Davis, a converted quarterback, caught 47 passes for 500 yards and seven touchdowns in three seasons at UConn, including 22 receptions for 237 yards and six scores in 2018.
- Davis is on the official watch list for the 2019 Mackey Award, presented annually to college football's top tight end.

#### **OFFENSIVE LINE**

- Considered the position making the most radical transition in playing style as Georgia Tech transforms to a spread, prostyle offense this season, the Yellow Jackets' offensive line has been decimated by injuries this season.
- Despite the rash of injuries, the Jackets' offensive front has settled in during the second half of the season. Most notably, during a three-game stretch from Oct. 19-Nov. 9, Georgia Tech faced the teams that currently rank first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks, with those teams averaging a total of 11.5 sacks per game. The Yellow Jackets' offensive front allowed a total of just five sacks in those three contests, including none at Virginia (Nov. 9).
- For the second time in three games, Georgia Tech did not surrender a sack against NC State last Thursday.
- Seniors **Jahaziel Lee** (LT) and **Kenny Cooper** (C) were both lost for the season due to injuries after appearing in just three and four games, respectively.
- Tech's most experienced linemen, Cooper and Lee have combined to start 43 collegiate starts (23 for Cooper, 20 for Lee) while the rest of the offensive linemen on Tech's entire roster have still only combined for 76 career starts.

- Additionally, Georgia Tech was without the services of So. Mikey Minihan (the starting left guard for the first two games of the season) for four games before before he returned to action in a reserve role for two games (Oct. 19 at Miami, Nov. 2 vs. Pitt). He made his first start since Sept. 7 when he started at right guard at Virginia (Nov. 9).
- The Yellow Jackets were also without guard **Connor Hansen** for the majority of spring practice, all of fall camp and the first three games of the season before the junior made his 2019 debut at Temple (Sept. 28).
- Due to the rash of injuries across the offensive front, three walk-on offensive linemen have seen significant action over this season, highlighted by r-So. **William Lay III**, who played the majority of the snaps at center against USF (Sept. 7) and Temple (Sept. 28) before moving into the starting lineup in place of Cooper vs. North Carolina (Oct. 5). Lay III has started each of the past seven games.
- Lay III is one of 82 nominees for the 10th-annual Burlsworth Trophy. The award is given annually to college football's most outstanding player who began his career as a walk-on.
- Ironically, the first winner of the Burlsworth Trophy was Georgia Tech's Sean Bedford. Like Lay III, Bedford (who is now the analyst on Georgia Tech football radio broadcasts), was a center who wore uniform No. 79.
- Walk-ons r-So. **Hamp Gibbs** also played significant snaps at right guard against The Citadel (Sept. 14), and r-Jr. **Chet Lagod** saw significant action at Temple (Sept. 28).

 Cooper was on the official preseason watch list for the Rimington Trophy, awarded annually to college football's top center



#### **DEFENSE**

#### **TEAM**

- Dubbed the "Minister of Mayhem," Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has been known for putting together some of college football's top defenses over the past eight seasons first as defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2011-14) and Florida (2015-16), then as head coach at Temple (2017-18).
- Over the past eight seasons, Collins' defenses have:
  - ranked in top 20 nationally in total defense three times (twice in top 8)
  - ranked in top 25 in scoring defense four times (twice in top 12)
  - ranked in top 30 in passing defense five times (twice in top 13)
  - ranked in top 45 in pass efficiency defense seven times (four times in top 22)
  - ranked in top 35 in turnovers gained five times (twice in top 6)
  - ranked in top 15 in interceptions four times (twice in top 10)
  - ranked in top 25 in sacks four times (twice in top 15)
- In its first season under Collins and defensive coordinator **Andrew Thacker**, Georgia Tech ranks second in the ACC and 32nd nationally in pass defense, allowing just 201.0 yards per game through the air.
- Georgia Tech has held five of its 11 opponents to less than 200 passing yards or less this season (169 vs. USF, Sept. 7; 30 vs. The Citadel, Sept. 14; 124 at Temple, Sept. 28; 176 at Duke, Oct. 12; 200 at Miami, Oct. 19).
- The Yellow Jackets also rank third in the ACC and 25th nationally in red zone defense, as their opponents have come away with points on just 43-of-56 trips inside the Jackets' 20-yard line (.768).
- Tech's opponents have scored touchdowns on just 55 percent of their trips into the red zone (31-of-56).
- During a two-game stretch versus Miami (Oct. 19) and Pitt (Nov. 2), Georgia Tech surrendered points on just four of its opponents' nine trips in the red zone (3-of-7 vs. Miami, 1-of-2 vs. Pitt).
- Living up to Collins' "Minister of Mayhem" moniker, Georgia Tech has also seen a significant uptick in negative plays through 11 games this season.
- The Yellow Jackets have recorded 57 tackles for loss through 11 games this season (5.2 per game). Last season, the Jackets ranked 125th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 4.2 tackles for loss per game. The Yellow Jackets' 57 TFL this season are their most since 2014.
- In addition to the 57 tackles for loss, Georgia Tech has also registered 16 sacks through the first 11 games of this season, marking the first time since 2013 that the Yellow Jackets have had at least 57 TFL and 16 sacks through the first 11 contests of a campaign.
- Georgia Tech's defense has been especially stout in the second halves of games, particularly of late. Over the past six contests, the Yellow Jackets have allowed a total of 984 yards and 28 points in second halves of those games (164 yards, 8.5 points per game).
- On Nov. 9, Virginia managed just nine points after halftime in its 33-28 win over Georgia Tech.

- On Nov. 2, Georgia Tech limited Pitt to just 71 yards and three points after the break. The Panthers' three points came on a field goal after they took possession on the Yellow Jackets' 29 yard line following a turnover (Pitt actually lost 10 yards on the series but made a 49-yard field goal for its only points of the second half).
- Georgia Tech held Miami scoreless after halftime of its 28-21 overtime win on Oct. 19, marking the first time since it did not allow any points to an NCAA Division I FBS opponent in any half since North Carolina was shut out in the first half of the Yellow Jackets' 33-7 win over the Tar Heels on Sept. 30, 2017. It marked the first time GT held any opponent scoreless in a half since its 41-0 win over Alcorn State in the 2018 season opener (Sept. 1, 2018).
- After surrendering 31 points and 268 yards of offense in the first half of its Oct. 12 game at Duke, Georgia Tech's defense surrendered just three points and 105 yards in the second half of the contest.
- The previous Saturday versus North Carolina (Oct. 5), Georgia Tech limited UNC to 5.9 yards per play on first and second downs but allowed 6.6 yards per play on third and fourth downs, as UNC converted 12-of-20 third and fourth downs. The third- and fourth-down conversions played a big part in UNC running 97 plays, 44 more than the Yellow Jackets' 53 (the teams' yards per play were even at 6.1).
- On Sept. 28, Georgia Tech limited Temple to just 322 yards of total offense, nearly 150 yards less than the Owls' season average of 470.3 yards per game going into the contest.
- The Yellow Jackets also surrendered just 127 yards on 9-of-22 passing against Temple. The Owls ranked ninth nationally with 347.3 passing yards per game going into the contest
- A year after surrendering 426 yards in a 49-38 loss to USF, Georgia Tech's defense limited the Bulls to just 261 yards and 10 points in a 14-10 win on Sept. 7.
- USF's 10 points were the fewest that Georgia Tech has surrendered to an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since its 33-7 win over UNC on Sept. 30, 2017.
- USF's 261 yards of total offense were the fewest that Georgia Tech surrendered against an FBS opponent since it allowed 258 yards in a 28-22 win over Virginia Tech on Nov. 11, 2017.
- Outside of a handful of big plays, Georgia Tech more than held its own against Clemson's high-powered offense in the season opener (Aug. 29). Clemson gained 15 or more yards nine times, amassing 320 yards in those nine plays. In Clemson's remaining 70 offensive snaps, Georgia Tech limited the Tigers to 312 yards, an average of just 4.45 yards per play.
- Twice this season, Georgia Tech has forced three turnovers in a game — at Clemson (Aug. 29) and vs. Pitt (Nov. 2).
- Yellow Jackets that record takeaways have the opportunity to sign the "Get The Ball Board" on Georgia Tech's sideline. Introduced by head coach **Geoff Collins** when he was the defensive coordinator at Western Carolina in 2002, the "Get The Ball Board" has evolved from players simply adorning the board with their signatures to signing with their social media handles

- Curry has four games with double-digit tackles this season (14 vs. The Citadel, Sept. 14; 16 vs. North Carolina, Oct. 5; 10 vs. Pitt, Nov. 2 and 11 vs. NC State, last Thursday). He is one of only eight ACC players with at least four games with double-digit tackles this season.

- Curry turned in one of the most impressive performances in recent memory by a collegiate defender when he recorded a sack and an interception to go along with his then-career-high 14 tackles against The Citadel (Sept. 14).
- Curry's performance against The Citadel marked only the 13th time since 2015 that an NCAA Division I FBS student-athlete recorded at least 14 tackles, a sack and an interception in a game. Michigan State's Joe Bachie is the only other FBS player to accomplish the feat this season (Sept. 21 vs. Northwestern).
- Curry has 58 tackles in the Yellow Jackets' last five home games (14 vs. The Citadel on Sept. 14, 16 vs. UNC on Oct. 5, 10 vs. Pitt on Nov. 2, seven vs. Virginia Tech and 11 vs. NC State last Thursday).
- Leading the way for Georgia Tech in tackles on the season are Curry (92), So. LB **Charlie Thomas** (64) and Jr. S **Tariq Carpenter** (62).
- Curry, Thomas and Carpenter are the first Georgia Tech trio to have more than 60 tackles apiece through 11 games since 2012.

- Charlie Thomas was responsible for Georgia Tech's lone points at Temple (Sept. 28) when he teamed up with Jr. DL Antwan Owens to tackle Temple RB Re'Mahn Davis in the end zone for a safety.
- Charlie Thomas stuffed the stat sheet with nine tackles, two tackles for loss, two sacks and a forced fumble (all career highs) against USF (Sept. 7).
- With his performance against USF, Charlie Thomas became the first Yellow Jacket with at least nine tackles and two sacks in a game since Jeremiah Attaochu accomplished the feat against Florida State in the 2012 ACC Championship Game (Dec. 1, 2012).
- For his efforts against USF, Charlie Thomas was named ACC Linebacker of the Week.

- Making So. DB **Kaleb Oliver's** team-leading two interceptions even more impressive is the fact that they came against two of the nation's top quarterbacks in Clemson's Trevor Lawrence (Aug. 29) and Temple's Anthony Russo (Sept. 28).
- R-Fr. DL **Ja'Quon Griffin's** recovery of a fumble forced by **Fr. LB Demetrius Knight II** for a touchdown in the first quarter at Miami (Oct. 19) was the first defensive touchdown of the season by a Yellow Jacket. The Yellow Jackets had not scored a defensive touchdown since **Juanyeh Thomas'** 95-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. Louisville on Oct. 5, 2018 and had not scored on a fumble recovery since **David Curry's** 15-yard fumble return for a touchdown vs. Alcorn State on Sept. 1, 2018.
- Entering this season, Georgia Tech returned just three starters from last year's defense Curry, Carpenter and sophomore cornerback **Tre Swilling**.
- There are only two seniors on the defensive side of the ball on Georgia Tech's entire roster — DL Brentavious Glanton and DB Christian Campbell. The duo has combined to make just eight starts this season (five for Glanton and three for Campbell).
- Fourteen different defensive players have made their firstcareer starts this season — r-Jr. DT **Djimon Brooks**, r-Fr. **T.K. Chimedza**, r-So. **Kelton Dawson**, r-Fr. DE **Jordan Domineck**, Sr. DT **Brentavious Glanton**, Jr. DE **Jaquan Henderson**, Jr. DT **Chris Martin**, So. NB **Kaleb Oliver**, Jr. DE **Antwan Owens**, r-Fr. - In honor of teammate **Brandon Adams**, a would-be senior defensive lineman who died on March 23, Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has announced that a different Yellow Jacket will wear Adams' jersey number 90 for each game this season.
- Junior DL Chris Martin wore the No. 90 for the Yellow Jackets' season opener vs. Clemson on Aug. 29. Martin, who normally wears No. 96, was Adams' best friend on the team and has dedicated the rest of his football playing career in Adams' memory.

#### **SPECIALISTS**

- Head coach Geoff Collins states repeatedly that special teams are the No. 1 priority within Georgia Tech's program, a philosophy that is highlighted by the fact that a student-athlete cannot earn playing time on offense or defense if they aren't able to contribute on special teams.
- The emphasis on special teams has paid dividends, most notably in blocked kicks. Georgia Tech has blocked three kicks in the last six games (punt blocks vs. Duke on Oct. 12 and Pitt on Nov. 2 and a field goal block vs. Miami on Oct. 19).
- Georgia Tech is tied for fifth nationally in punt blocks (2) and tied for 10th nationally in total kick blocks (3).

- Jr. RB **Jerry Howard Jr.** has been responsible for both punt blocks this season. He is the first Yellow Jacket to block two kicks in a season since Chris Milton also blocked a pair of punts in 2015.
- Jr. DL **Antwan Owens** blocked a would-be gamewinning 25-yard field goal attempt by Miami with just 26 seconds to go in regulation of Georgia Tech's 28-21 overtime win at Miami. It was the Yellow Jackets' first field goal block since GT blocked a field goal at Virginia Tech on Nov. 12, 2016.
- Georgia Tech has blocked 22 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the 10th-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.
- However, Georgia Tech's three kick blocks this season are its first since 2017. The Yellow Jackets went 21 games between blocking kicks at Virginia on Nov. 4, 2017 and at Duke on Oct. 12, 2019.

 The nation's most blocked kicks over the past seven seasons belong to Temple (27). Six of those came the last two seasons (2017-18), when current Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** was at the helm of the Owls. Temple blocked five kicks in 2018 alone, which was good for a tie for fifth nationally.

- Jr. P **Pressley Harvin III** has punted 67 times for a 44.7-yard average this season.
- Despite being somewhat limited due to a number of opportunities to pin opponents deep inside their territory, Harvin's 44.7-yard punting average ranks 19th nationally this season
- Harvin is on pace to become one of only two Georgia
  Tech punters with two single-season averages among the
  school's all-time top 10, joining 2007 Ray Guy Award winner
  Durant Brooks, who recorded the school's second- and
  fourth-highest all-time averages in 2006 and '07.

- Perhaps more impressively, 17 of Harvin's 67 punts have been downed inside the 20-yard line and eight have been downed inside the 10-yard line. Harvin's 17 punts downed inside the 20 rank seventh in the ACC.
- Twenty-one of Harvin's 67 punts this season have traveled 50 yards or more. He has had at least one punt travel 50 yards or more in every game this season.
- Harvin has 13 punts of 50 yards or more over the past five games, including a season-long 58-yarder and a careerhigh-tying five punts that traveled at least 50 yards last Saturday vs. Virginia Tech.
- Harvin averaged at least 50 yards per punt in two games this season — 51.4 at Duke (Oct. 12) and 50.5 vs. NC State (last Thursday).
- Harvin displayed another weapon in his arsenal at Miami, when he threw a 41-yard touchdown pass to Sr. gunner
   Nathan Cottrell in the first quarter of the Yellow Jackets' 28-21 overtime victory.
- Harvin's completion was the first of his career. He was previously 0-for-1 as a passer, with his only attempt coming as a true freshman at Duke in 2017.

- Harvin has a 774.4 pass-efficiency rating this season and a 387.2 rating for his career.
- The touchdown reception was the first touchdown catch and the longest reception of Cottrell's career. Prior to the 41-yard catch, he had three career receptions for 12 yards.
- After averaging 45.5 yards per punt to go along with the touchdown pass at Miami, Harvin was named the ACC co-Specialist of the Week. It was the first weekly ACC honor of the junior's career.
- One of the nation's least-utilized weapons a season ago, Harvin would've led the ACC and ranked 16th nationally through the 2018 regular season with a 44.3-yard punting average (he did not qualify for official NCAA/ACC statistical rankings because he fell far short of the minimum 3.6 attempts per game).
- Harvin III's season average fell to 41.3 yards per punt after he uncharacteristically punted four times for 75 yards (18.8 avg.) in the Quick Lane Bowl vs. MInnesota.
- As a true freshman in 2017, Harvin III set a Georgia Tech freshman record by averaging 44.1 yards per punt.
- Despite the limited opportunities, Harvin was named second-team all-ACC as a sophomore in 2018.
- With Juanyeh Thomas, a true-freshman all-American as a kick returner last season, limited to just six returns this season, Georgia Tech So. WR/QB **Tobias Oliver** has stolen the spotlight as a kick returner. Oliver ranks sixth in the ACC and 41st nationally with a 22.2-yard average (13 returns for 288 vards).
- After ranking 126th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams in kickoff coverage last season (26.27 yards per return), Georgia Tech is allowing just 20.86 yards per return this season, an improvement of nearly 5.5 yards per return.

- With Lee, Cooper and Camp out of the lineup, there are only four seniors remaining on Georgia Tech's roster that have started games this season: TE Tyler Davis and OL Jared Southers (graduate transfers from UConn and Vanderbilt, respectively), DL Brentavious Glanton and DB **Christian Campbell**.
- In five games since Camp and Cooper underwent seasonending surgeries prior to the North Carolina game (Oct. 5), freshmen and sophomores have played more than 70 percent of Georgia Tech's total snaps in each game.
- During a two-game stretch earlier this month (Nov. 9 at Virginia, Nov. 16 vs. Virginia Tech), Georgia Tech was without 13 student-athletes that have been listed Above The Line this season.
- The 13 Above The Line players unavailable against Virginia Tech included four defensive linemen (Fr. Chico Bennett Jr., r-So. Kelton Dawson, r-Jr. Chris Martin and Jr. Antwan Owens) that have been primary contributors for the Yellow Jackets this season. Dawson, Martin and Owens have combined to make 20 starts.
- For the Virginia game, 14 of the 72 student-athletes that were on Georgia Tech's travel roster are walk-ons.

• Highlighting Collins' "Above The Line" philosophy and Georgia Tech's injury situation, 44 different student-athletes have started for the Yellow Jackets on offense or defense this season, which is tied for the fifth-highest total in the nation and ranks second among Power Five programs.
