About Saturday's Game

Georgia Tech continues Atlantic Coast Conference play Saturday afternoon with a road game against Pittsburgh at the Petersen Events Center. Tip time is 2 p.m. for the first of two scheduled meetings between the teams this season.

Georgia Tech update (11-12, 5-7 ACC) - Tech sits in a five-way tie for eighth place in the ACC standings, a game and a half out of fifth place, and has four games upcoming with teams also in that tie, including two against Pittsburgh. The Jackets have won two of their last three games in conference play, including a 76-57 verdict over Virginia Tech at home Tuesday night. They are 3-3 on the road in ACC games, winning at NC State, North Carolina and Boston College.

Pittsburgh update (14-9, 5-7 ACC) - The Panthers have dropped three of their last four games, all three losses on the road, at Syracuse, Duke and, most recently, at Notre Dame Wednesday night by an 80-72 score (same score as Tech's loss last Saturday in South Bend). Pitt is 4-2 in ACC games at home this season, including a season-opening triumph over Florida State and wins over Boston College, Miami and North Carolina.

The Tipoff

• **Knotted up** - Five teams are tied at 5-7 in the ACC entering the weekend - Georgia Tech, Pittsburgh, Boston College, Clemson and Virginia Tech. The Yellow Jackets have met two of those teams and won both (BC and Virginia Tech), while Pitt has faced one, having beaten Boston College.

• **An easy one** - Georgia Tech's 76-57 win over Virginia Tech Wednesday night featured its largest lead of the season (30 points) and its second-largest margin of victory. Tech's previous five ACC games had been decided by a total of 27 points.

• **Efficient** - Tech has scored at a rate over 100 points per 100 possessions in three straight games, and has exceeded that mark five times in ACC play since the start of January (North Carolina, Boston College, Notre Dame twice, Virginia Tech).

• **Less than a full deck** - Georgia Tech has had its full roster available for only 11 games this season, from Tech's Dec. 22 opener in the Diamond Head Classic, when Jose Alvarado returned from a seven-game injury absence, through Jan. 22 at Louisville. Leading scorer Michael Devoe was sidelined for three games with an injured left foot. Jordan Usher did not play in the season's first seven games, sitting out as a transfer.

• **Six** - The number of different starting lineups Tech has used this season. The most frequent has been Jose Alvarado, Michael Devoe, Jordan Usher, Moses Wright and James Banks III, used 11 times in the last 14 games, interrupted only by Devoe's injury that forced him to miss three games. Moses Wright is the only Jacket to start every game this season.

• **Offense for defense** - Georgia Tech ranks seventh in the ACC in scoring average in conference games (70.17) and 12th in scoring defense (71.67), a reversal of last year's final rankings (15th scoring offense, 7th scoring defense).

• **All-for-ado** - Georgia Tech has averaged 70.1 points and shot 46.2 percent from the floor in the 14 games since Jose Alvarado returned to the court. The Yellow Jackets have shot 50 percent or better in six of those games.

• **Wright stuff** - Moses Wright has scored in double digits in 12 of his last 14 games, averaging 14.1 points and 6.7 rebounds while hitting 53.3 percent of his shots from the floor. The 6-9 junior ranks No. 2 in the ACC in field goal percentage (53.9) and No. 12 in rebound average (7.2).

• **Big miss** - Jose Alvarado has averaged 14.6 points, 4.3 assists and 2.5 steals in 14 games since his return from an ankle injury which sidelined him for seven games. He's averaged 17.2 points over the last 10 games, scoring 20 or more points five times.

• **Brooklyn burglar** - Alvarado's nine steals vs. NC State broke the Tech single-game record of eight set by Kenny Anderson against Duke on Jan. 30, 1991. Only three players in ACC history have had more steals in a game, and only two of those occurred against an ACC opponent. He has averaged 2.5 per game in ACC games, the top figure in the conference.

• **Ushering in** - Jordan Usher made his Tech debut Dec. 18 against Ball State after sitting out the required two semesters after he transferred from Southern California last January. The 6-7 junior guard/forward has averaged 8.3 points and 3.7 rebounds. In Tech's six wins over that stretch, he has averaged 10.1 points (27-48 FG), 4.8 rebounds, 3.0 assists.

• **No ducking** - Georgia Tech's schedule is the 12th-strongest in the nation according to KenPom.com and No. 5 according to the NCAA NET rankings. Tech has played seven games against quad 1 teams and nine against quad 2 teams, five of those 22 against non-conference teams. The Jackets have two remaining games against quad 1 teams (Louisville, Syracuse), three against quad 2 teams (Pitt, Clemson, Wake Forest). The Jackets' non-conference schedule rates 43rd overall by KenPom, 58th in the NET.

Series vs. Pittsburgh

• Pittsburgh won the first three meetings between the two teams after the Panthers became members of the ACC, but the Yellow Jackets have come back to win three of the last five,

including a 73-65 win at McCamish Pavilion in the teams' only meeting of the 2018-19 season.

- Tech's 69-54 win on its last visit to the Petersen Events Center (Jan. 13, 2018) was the widest margin of victory for either team since Pitt joined the ACC. The other meetings between the two teams as ACC brethren have been decided by an average of 5.7 points.

- The teams have played home-and-away only once since the Panthers joined the ACC.

- Tech won the first five games in the series, prior to Pitt's entry into the ACC, all of which took place between 1966 and 1989.

- The two most entertaining games between Tech and the former Big East member played in the same month of the 1989-90 season, when the Yellow Jackets were on the way to their second ACC title and first Final Four appearance. Bobby Cremins and Paul Evans were the respective head coaches at the time.

- Tech overcame an early 26-5 deficit to win the ACC/Big East Challenge game in Hartford in early December, getting 42 points from Dennis Scott, including the game-winner with 8 seconds left. Later in the month, the Panthers came to Atlanta for a Kuppenheimer Classic game at the Omni, and Tech won the game without head coach Bobby Cremins, who was attending his father's funeral. Kenny Anderson recorded a triple-double with 32 points, 12 rebounds and 18 assists.

- Tech scored easy wins over Pitt in the first three games of the series, all under head coach Whack Hyder, two of which were played at Alexander Memorial Coliseum on the Tech campus.

- Tech is 2-0 against the Panthers' current head coach, Jeff Capel, having scored an 86-65 victory over VCU during the 2003-04 season when Capel was the Rams' head coach.

Last Time Out: Jackets Down Hokies

Junior Jose Alvarado made eight of his first nine shots from the floor and outscored Virginia Tech himself 19-18 in the first half, sparking Georgia Tech to a decisive 76-57 victory on Tuesday night at McCamish Pavilion.

In a game of runs for the Yellow Jackets (11-12, 5-7 ACC), they finished the first half on a 12-2 run including six-straight points to close for a 38-18 cushion at intermission, before pushing the lead to 30 with a 13-2 run to kick things off in the second half.

The Hokies (14-9, 5-7 ACC) struggled offensively at times, getting held to just 38.9 percent shooting, and the ACC's leading three-point shooting team could convert only an icy 17.4 percent from downtown (4-for-23).

Georgia Tech on the other hand, shot 52.7 percent from the floor, its second-highest rate of the season, and a season-best 44.4 percent from three-point land en route to the win. Alvarado finished with 20 total points on the night, adding six assists, two steals and just one turnover in just over 29 minutes on the floor. Michael Devoe finished with 12 points and five rebounds, while Moses Wright (14) and Bubba Parham (10) also finished in double-figures. Wright also pulled in seven rebounds.

Leading Virginia Tech offensively was Tyrece Radford, who finished with 12 points, while Landers Nolley II recorded 10 points and seven rebounds for the game..

What's Trending

- Against ACC teams (according to KenPom.com), Tech ranks No. 5 in effective field goal percentage (51.0) against the league, the Yellow Jackets' highest ranking in that category since they were No. 2 in 2010 (49.0). They also are sixth in offensive efficiency (100.1).

- The Jackets rank No. 1 in percentage of points scored on two-point field goals (60.3), and have been the No. 1 team in the ACC in that category all four years under Josh Pastner. Tech ranks fifth nationally in all games.

Led by a career-high 29 points from by resurgent point guard Jose Alvarado, Georgia Tech men's basketball pulled away late for a 73-65 victory over Pittsburgh on Wednesday night at McCamish Pavilion.

Georgia Tech (12-15, 4-10 ACC) trailed for only 20 seconds early in the first half and led by as many as 18 points en route to snapping a seven-game losing streak. Pitt (12-15, 2-12 ACC) pulled within a point in the second half but buoyed by making 50 percent of its shots from the field for the game (24-of-48 -- its highest field-goal percentage in 11 contests), the Yellow Jackets pulled away for the victory.

After scoring in single-digits and shooting less than 30 percent from the field in each of the previous six games, Alvarado has scored 46 points on 62.5-percent shooting (15-of-24) over the past two contests. He made 9-of-13 field goals and 9-of-10 free throws to account for Wednesday's career-best 27 points.

Defensively, Georgia Tech recorded a season-high 12 blocked shots while limiting Pitt to 34.5-percent shooting from the field..

Carolina, which was the Jackets' highest efficiency rating of the season (13.2). Tech exceeded 100 in each of its last two games against Notre Dame and Virginia Tech.

- Georgia Tech ranks No. 33 in defensive efficiency according to KenPom.com (92.8 points per 100 possessions), No. 35 nationally in effective defensive field goal percentage (45.5) and 43rd in three-point field goal defense (30.1).

- Tech has held 11 opponents this season under 40 percent from the floor (four ACC opponents, Virginia Tech hit 38.2 percent), and eight under 30 percent from three-point range (three ACC opponents, Hokies hit 17.4 percent after coming in at 36.6 percent for the season).

- Tech has held five opponents to their lowest offensive efficiency of the season, including two of its foes in Hawai'i - Elon, Arkansas, Nebraska, Boise State and Hawai'i. Six other teams, including NC State (both meetings), Kentucky, Duke and Boston College, posted one of their eight lowest offensive efficiency ratings against the Yellow Jackets.

- Georgia Tech's adjusted tempo is 69.2 possessions per game according to KenPom.com (No. 124 in the nation), its best rate and ranking in Josh Pastner's four years at Tech. Tech has played in the mid-60s in each of its last five ACC games, but the Yellow Jackets' tempo in league play (69.3) is the fourth-highest.

- Tech has reached 70 possessions per game over the course of a full season only four times since 1997, the first year KenPom kept track - 1997-98 (72.3), 2000-01 (72.1), 2001-02 (70.5) and 2008-09 (70.5).

- Two fouls in the first half? No problem. Georgia Tech ranks No. 1 in the nation, according to KenPom.com, in 2-foul participation, a measure of percentage of available minutes played by players with two fouls (68.0 pct. for Tech). The Jackets led the nation in this category in 2018-19, was fourth in 2017-18 and 35th in 2016-17.

- Tech has averaged 70.5 points per game away from home this season (73.8 in its six ACC road games), and averaged 66.2 at McCamish Pavilion.

- Georgia Tech built a 20-point halftime lead for the second time this season, its largest since leading North Carolina 47-27 at intermission in Chapel Hill, a game the Yellow Jackets won, 96-83. Those are Tech's largest leads at halftime this season.

- The Jackets are 6-1 this season when leading at the half, 5-11 when trailing.

- Virginia Tech's 18 points at the half were the fewest by an ACC team against Georgia Tech this season. The fewest by any opponent was 13 by Elon in the season's second game.

- Tech's 19-point margin of victory against Virginia Tech was the second highest against an ACC team under coach Josh Pastner, behind the Jackets' 78-56 win over Florida State during the 2016-17 season.

- None of Georgia Tech's starters played as many as 32 minutes (Moses Wright played 31:56), and the Yellow Jacket reserves played nearly 50 minutes of the game.

- Georgia Tech hit the 50-percent mark from the floor (52.7 percent vs. Virginia Tech) for the seventh time this season and for the fifth time in ACC play (all since Jan. 4). It's 52.7 percent rate from the floor was its second highest of the season behind the 59 percent night at North Carolina.

- Georgia Tech's eight three-point field goals (in 18 attempts) against Virginia Tech matched a season high accomplished four other times, including against Syracuse and Florida State, and its 44.4-percent success rate was season best.

- Georgia Tech has averaged 39.8 points in the paint over its last 10 games (34 vs. Virginia Tech), compared to 27.6 for its opponents. Only Duke (38-36) and Louisville (32-30) have scored more than Tech in that stretch.

- Georgia Tech has averaged just 10 turnovers in its last four games (13 each vs. NC State and Morehouse, five at Notre Dame, 10 vs. Virginia Tech), and just 14.1 in the 14 games since the return of Jose Alvarado to the Yellow Jackets' lineup,

compared to 17.4 per game prior to that.

- Tech's turnover rate in ACC games is 14.8 per game, and the Jackets are on the plus side of the assist/turnover ratio for the first time this season (181/178). The Jackets have been on the plus side of that ledger in six of the last 10 games, including the last three in a row.

- Tech has won the rebounding battle five times and held even twice in 11 games since the beginning of January. The Jackets are plus-17 on the boards in ACC games for the season, averaging around one per game more than their opponents.

Personnel Trends

- Jose Alvarado scored 20 points to lead the Jackets against Virginia Tech, his fifth 20-point game this season, all since Jan. 4 at North Carolina, and has 16 in his career. He went 8-of-14 from the floor, 3-of-6 from three, with six assists and just one turnover in 29:14. The ACC's steal leader in conference games had two of those.

- Alvarado's performance against Virginia Tech elevated him above 900 points for this career. He began the night with 886.

- Alvarado has hit 22-of-55 shots (40 pct.) from three-point range in his last 10 games (3-6 vs. Virginia Tech) and is 56-of-113 overall (49.6 pct.) during that stretch. In his last two games - 18-of-33 from the floor, 6-of-13 from three-point range.

- Michael Devoe returned to the court and to the starting lineup for the first time since Jan. 22 at Louisville. He missed the last three games with a bruised left foot. The sophomore guard scored 12 points, his 15th double-digit game this season. He went 5-of-9 from the floor with a pair of threes, had four assists and just one turnover in 32 minutes.

- Moses Wright scored 14 points (5-10 FG) with seven rebounds against Virginia Tech, his fourth double-digit scoring game in the last six after a streak of eight straight with 10 or more. The 6-9 junior has failed to reach double figures just five times this season.

- Wright has connected on 62.7 percent of his free throws (32-of-51) over Tech's last 14 games after going just 4-of-14 in the first nine games of the season.

- Bubba Parham scored 10 points against Virginia Tech to notch his sixth double-digit game this season. All of them have come against power conference teams, three of them in ACC games. He went 2-for-4 from three-point range and has connected on 13-of-36 in conference games this season.

Pastner's Key Metrics

- **Assists to made field goals:** Tech has assisted on 52.4 percent of its field goals this season. The Jackets had 15 assists on 29 made field goals against Virginia Tech, missing their nightly goal of 60 percent for the 10th time this season. Tech has assisted on 56.3 percent of its field goals vs. ACC

teams this season, fifth-best rate in the conference.

- **Free throws made to opponents' attempts:** Tech went 10-of-21 from the free throw line against Virginia Tech, while the Hokies were 11-of-18, missing on its nightly mission of making more free throws than the opponent attempts. The Jackets are 44-19 under Josh Pastner when attempting more free throws than the opponent. Tech has connected on 65.5 percent of its free throws this season and has averaged just 11.7 points per game from the charity stripe. Against ACC foes, the Jackets have hit 65.5 percent and scored 11.1 points per game from the line, and rank sixth in the conference in ratio of free throw attempts to field goal attempts (29 percent).

- **Turnovers:** Tech committed 10 to Virginia Tech's 10. The Yellow Jackets have turned the ball over more than their opponent in 15 of 23 games this season. The Jackets have averaged 15.7 on the season, forcing 14.0. Target each night is to commit 11 or fewer, which Tech has met three times this season. More telling for Tech under Josh Pastner is that when Tech has committed fewer turnovers than its opponent, it is 27-17. When it has committed more, it is 28-39.

- **Guard rebounding:** Tech's players outside of Banks, Cole and Wright collected 19 of the Jackets' 29 defensive rebounds against Virginia Tech, 80 of 143 in Tech's last four games. For the season, they have 324 of the Jackets' 611 defensive rebounds (53.1 percent).

Build the Wall

Due to its ability to play both zone and man-to-man and keep opponents off-balance, Georgia Tech has been able to rely on its mixture of defenses to win games over Josh Pastner's first three seasons at Georgia Tech.

According to KenPom.com, Georgia Tech ranks No. 34 nationally in defensive efficiency (93.3 points per 100 possessions), ahead of last season, when the Jackets ranked No. 43.

Broken down, Tech ranks No. 37 in effective defensive field goal percentage (45.5), No. 49 in two-point field goal defense (45.0) and No. 70 in three-point defense (30.9).

Tech has held five opponents to their lowest offensive efficiency of the season, including two of its foes in Hawaii - Elon, Arkansas, Nebraska, Boise State and Hawaii. Six other foes, including NC State (both meetings), Kentucky, Duke and Boston College, has posted one of their six lowest ratings against the Jackets.

- **Said Nebraska coach Fred Hoiberg:** *"They do a good job with that. It is a zone you don't see very often. It's a lot like when I was in the Big 12, like Baylor and their zone with their wings outside. It starts in a 1-3-1 and kind of morphs back into a 2-3. Then when you do get it inside you have to shoot it over the big fella, which is tough to do. I thought the movement for the most part in the second half was really good, especially seeing the zone for the first time. You try to simulate in practice, but it's impossible to do."*

Balancing Act

Georgia Tech has lived and succeeded by playing excellent defense during its four years under Josh Pastner, but since the Yellow Jackets have had their entire roster available this season, they have demonstrated efficient and sometimes powerful offense as well.

Without relying much on three-point shooting, Tech has increased its temp this season to a four-year high under Pastner, 69.2 possessions per game according to KenPom.com (No. 124 in the nation). Tech has played in the mid-60s in each of its last five ACC games, but the Yellow Jackets' tempo in league play (69.3) is the fourth-highest.

Against ACC teams (according to KenPom.com), Tech ranks No. 5 in effective field goal percentage (51.0) against the league, the Yellow Jackets' highest ranking in that category since they were No. 2 in 2010 (49.0). They also are sixth in offensive efficiency (100.1) against the conference.

Though the Jackets rely heavily on their starting guards Jose Alvarado and Michael Devoe for scoring, they do the majority of it inside the three-point line along with post players James Banks III and Moses Wright, Tech ranks No. 1 in conference games in percentage of points scored on two-point

field goals (60.3), and have been the No. 1 team in the ACC in that category all four years under Josh Pastner. Tech ranks fifth nationally in all games (60.7 percent).

Tech has exceeded 100 points per 100 possessions nine times, six of those games coming since Jan. 4 at North Carolina, which was the Jackets' highest efficiency rating of the season (13.2). Tech exceeded 100 in each of its last two games against Notre Dame and Virginia Tech.

Assisted Living

Georgia Tech coach Josh Pastner preached and prodded his Yellow Jackets on ball and player movement and hard cutting from the first time he got his team on the practice court. His primary measuring stick on how well the Jackets perform offensively is their ratio of assists to made field goals, and the Jackets' struggle to score last season was not for lack of ball movement.

Tech currently ranks No. 203 nationally in assists to made field goals (50.7 pct.). In ACC games, Tech has assisted on 56.4 percent, the fifth-best figure in the conference.

Pastner's nightly goal is 60 percent. The national average is 51.6 percent.

Tech finished last season No. 49 in 2018-19 at 57.6 percent (56.4 pct. in ACC games), well above the national average (52.1 pct.) in that category. In Pastner's first season, the Yellow Jackets ranked 13th nationally at 62.6 percent, the team's highest rate since the 2000-01 season. Tech's number was 63.2 percent in ACC games.

Getting it Wright

The best player development story in Georgia Tech's program is that of sophomore forward Moses Wright, who played only one year of high school basketball and was not rated at all coming out of high school.

The 6-9 Raleigh, N.C., native has continued where he left off at the end of the 2018-19 season, starting every game this season and sitting No. 3 on Tech's scoring (13.0 ppg) and rebounding (7.2 rpg) charts, while connecting on 53.8 percent of his shots from the floor. He ranks No. 2 in the ACC in field goal percentage, and No. 12 in rebound average.

In ACC games, he is Tech's No. 2 scorer at 13.6 points per game with 7.2 rebounds per game and a 50-percent shooting rate from the floor.

Wright has six double-doubles this season, three of them in Tech's last five ACC games against Florida State, Duke and Boston College. He also posted double-doubles against Houston and Kentucky. Remarkably consistent, he has failed to reach double figure in scoring only five times, and never in back-to-back games.

He made the all-tournament team at the Diamond Head Classic, averaging 17.7 points and 7.3 rebounds while connecting on 63.6 percent of his field goal tries, earning him ACC Player of the Week honors.

Wright started the Yellow Jackets' last seven games of 2018-19 and blossomed in the last four, averaging 15.6 points and 6.2 rebounds while connecting on 36-of-58 field goals. He finished off the season with a career-high 25 points (12-of-18 FG) in the ACC Tournament against Notre Dame.

Sophomore Surge

Sophomore guard Michael Devoe, the highest-rated high school prospect Georgia Tech has recruited under Josh Pastner, steadily improved over the course of his freshman season and has made a quantum leap for the Yellow Jackets this season.

The Orlando, Fla., sophomore led the ACC in scoring through the month of November, and is currently No. 7 at 16.0 points per game and No. 6 in field goal percentage (46.3).

Devoe has scored 20 or more points in seven games this season, including a career-best 34 in a loss to Georgia that earned him ACC Player of the Week honors, and has reached double figures in all but four games.

He topped the NCAA rankings in three-point shooting earlier in the season (currently at 40.7), and has hit 40.9 percent in ACC games. He came out of a shooting slump in Hawaii, hitting 17 of 35 shots from the floor in three games, and has hit 16-of-39 shots from three-point range in Tech's last nine games after going 2-for-19 in the four games prior.

As a freshman, the Orlando, Fla., native began the season slowly after missing significant practice time with a toe injury, but steadily played more minutes and improved his production. He connected on 43.8 percent of his three-point tries in ACC games and averaged 35.4 minutes (10th-most). He hit 32-of-68 (47.1 pct.) three-point tries in his last 15 games.

Jose Can You See

Point guard Jose Alvarado, recruited to Georgia Tech primarily for his winning attitude and determination, was given the green light by head coach Josh Pastner to handle the position as a freshman, sink or swim.

The Brooklyn native, the first Tech player from the New York area in nearly 20 years, has made a huge difference for the Yellow Jackets since his return to the court in Hawaii, playing an average of 33.5 minutes per game and 14.2 points.

He is Tech's leading scorer in ACC games at 16.1 points per game (10th in the ACC) while converting on 47.4 percent of his shots from the floor (6th ACC) and 35.9 percent from three-point range. The 6-foot junior has exceeded 20 points five times over his last 10 games, including 26 in a win over NC State and 25 each against North Carolina and Notre Dame (Feb. 1). He leads the ACC in steals and ranks fifth in assists in conference games.

Since returning from Hawaii, the Jackets have exceeded 100 points per 100 possessions six times in 11 games.

The 6-foot junior had missed seven full games and most of an eighth before that trip with a right ankle sprain suffered before the Jackets' played their second game of the season against Elon. Since his return, Tech has averaged 70.1 points per game and shot 46.2 percent from the floor.

In Tech's last 10 games, he has averaged 17.2 points, connecting on 22-of-55 shots (40 pct.) from three-point range and 56-of-113 overall (49.6 pct.) during that stretch. In his last two games, he is 18-of-33 from the floor, 6-of-13 from three-point range.

He developed into the Yellow Jackets' engine on the floor as a sophomore, leading the Jackets in scoring (12.5 ppg), assists (3.6 apg), steals (1.8 pg) and free throw percentage (76.9 pct.) in ACC games.

Alvarado has posted 45 double-figure scoring games in his career, 16 times scoring 20 or more. And the playmaker has averaged more than 34 minutes per game, with 14 complete 40-minute games.

• Said Pittsburgh coach Jeff Capel last season:

"Jose Alvarado is a big-time competitor. We told our guys coming into this game, I know that kid and I know his spirit. With his team struggling, I knew that he would try to take it upon himself to be aggressive and have a great game. He was sensational."

Media Guidelines

Georgia Tech's practices are closed to the public and the media, but coaches and student-athletes are made available prior to each game before one of the team's practices. Notices will be distributed weekly to confirm the schedule.

TV stations will be allowed to shoot B-roll of practice on occasion.

Media are asked to notify Mike Stamus *the day before* of their need to attend and to make specific student-athlete requests.

Interview requests with student-athletes that need to be conducted at other times must be arranged through the Georgia Tech communications office at least 24 hours in advance. These interviews will be conducted at a time and place convenient to the student-athletes' availability and class schedule.

Media are asked not to contact student-athletes directly either by phone, e-mail, text or social media. They are instructed not to respond. Every effort will be made to make them available.

Interviewing Coach Pastner

Media wishing to speak with Coach Pastner at times other than scheduled media availabilities must notify Mike Stamus in the communications office in advance to make or confirm arrangements. He also is available each Monday on the ACC Teleconference (10:50 a.m.) beginning January 6.

Post-Game Protocol

Each head coach will hold a post-game press conference in the designated interview room (Shah Media Room at McCamish Pavilion).

Student-athletes requested by the media will be brought to the interview room following the coaches press conferences, when the team is at home, outside the team's locker room when the team is on the road.

Josh Pastner Radio Show

Head coach Josh Pastner's weekly radio show airs each Monday from 7-8 p.m. on "680 the Fan" and 93.7 FM, beginning in December.

ACC Coaches Weekly Teleconference

The 15 ACC head basketball coaches will be featured on nine Monday teleconferences during the 2019-20 season, beginning on January 6, and continuing through March 2. Each coach will have 10 minutes to make an opening statement and answer questions. There will be an instant replay of each teleconference on the Conference's internet site TheACC.com each Monday afternoon.

Coach Josh Pastner's regular time will be 10:50 a.m. Coaches whose teams play on Monday in January and February are not required to participate in that day's call. Coaches who do not have a Monday game - Georgia Tech is one - will be on every Monday at the same time. The teleconference schedule for each Monday will differ for the other head coaches, depending on what teams play that Monday night.

Banking Hours

The most significant development in the direction of last year's Georgia Tech team may have occurred Nov. 13, when the NCAA granted James Banks III immediate eligibility after his transfer from Texas.

Tech received that news while conducting its shootaround for its second game of the season, at Tennessee. Arrangements were made to get Banks to Knoxville (transfers do not travel with the team), where he contributed five points and seven rebounds in a 66-53 loss.

The personable 6-9 post player progressed rapidly after that modest start. He logged seven double-doubles, finished the season as Tech's No. 2 scorer and top rebounder, and finished 11th in the nation in blocked shots anchoring Tech's defense.

This season, he has added five more double-doubles, ranks No. 18 in the nation in blocked shots and No. 2 in the ACC at a rate of 2.65 per game), and ranks eighth in the ACC in rebound average (7.65). In ACC games, he has averaged 11.0 points, 7.9 rebounds while hitting 57.4 percent of his shots from the floor.

Banks on 3x3U Watch List

James Banks III is one of 10 ACC seniors under consideration to represent the conference in the 2020 Dos Equis 3X3U National Championship which will take place at Atlantic Station during the NCAA Final Four weekend.

The event will feature 128 graduating Division I college basketball seniors competing for \$150,000. The 3x3 event will take place April 3-5 at Atlantic Station in Midtown Atlanta, close to the Tech campus, and will feature musical acts, food trucks, interactive experiences and more for fans in attendance.

The event is free and open to the public, giving fans the chance to see some of the best college basketball players in the nation during the sport's ultimate weekend in Atlanta.

Banks was one of 320 seniors across all 32 Division I conferences named to a mid-season watch list that was revealed Feb. 4.

Pre-Season Storylines

- **Rise above** - The Yellow Jackets finished last season 10th in the ACC after being projected to finish no higher than 13th in the preseason. It was Tech's highest finish since tying for ninth in 2013. Tech also outperformed projections in 2016-17, finishing 11th after being picked to finish 14th in Josh Pastner's first season. The Jackets were projected to finish 12th this season in the official preseason poll of ACC media.

- **Core group returns** - Georgia Tech returned all five players who started its final two games of the season, and eight players who started a total of 123 games.

- **Firepower returning** - Tech returned its top three scorers from the 2018-19 season - Jose Alvarado, James Banks III and Michael Devoe - who accounted for 48.4 percent of its points, 41.6 percent of its rebounds and 47.2 percent of its minutes. Altogether, Tech returned eight of its top 11 players, who combined for 73.2 percent of its points, 66.4 percent of its points and 73.7 percent of its minutes. Those eight players combined to start 123 games.

- **Get old and stay old** - Tech's core eight returning players include two seniors, three juniors and three sophomores.

- **Reinforcements** - Tech added two high-level transfers in 6-7 forward Jordan Usher from Southern California and 5-11 guard Bubba Parham from VMI, both of whom hail from the Atlanta area and were successful with their former schools. Usher, a former 4-star high school prospect, averaged more than eight points a game last year at USC, while Parham, an All-Southern Conference selection, led the SoCon in scoring at 21.4 points per game. Parham was granted immediate eligibility by the NCAA. Usher, who enrolled at Tech last January, becomes eligible for the Jackets' Dec. 18 game against Ball State. The Jackets also signed an all-state high school guard from South Carolina in 6-5 Asanti Price.

- **Beefing up** - With a more veteran team in 2019-20, Tech made an effort to strengthen its non-conference schedule, beginning a two-game series with Kentucky and finishing another two-game set with Arkansas, while accepting an invitation to play in the Diamond Head Classic, in which the Jackets faced a 2019 NCAA Tournament team in Houston. Tech also played its annual meeting against Georgia and the Big Ten/ACC matchup against Nebraska.

- **First time** - Georgia Tech's roster is composed entirely of student-athletes recruited by head coach Josh Pastner and his staff for the first time in Pastner's tenure.

- **Peachy** - All four of the transfers on Georgia Tech's roster are from the Atlanta metropolitan area and went to high school here - James Banks III (Decatur/Mount Vernon Presbyterian School), Bubba Parham (Snellville/Brookwood HS), Shembari Phillips (Atlanta/Wheeler HS) and Jordan Usher (Canton/Wheeler HS).

- **105th season** - Georgia Tech is playing its 105th season of basketball in 2019-20 and has an all-time record of 1,387-1,257 (22 wins and one loss were vacated by the NCAA Committee on Infractions).

- **55** - Total years of full-time experience on Division I staffs for Tech's coaching staff.

Building Depth

The upward progress of Georgia Tech's program is evident in the development of its last two classes, each of whom has played significant minutes and made significant contributions on the ACC level. Though not highly-rated in terms of rankings, the players have a wide range of skills and are developing into consistent conference-level performers for the next couple of years.

- The 2017-18 class of Jose Alvarado, Evan Cole and Moses Wright combined to start 54 games last season, contributing 20.7 points, 8.7 rebounds and 57.5 minutes per game.

- The 2018-19 class of Michael Devoe, Khalid Moore and Kristian Sjolund combined to start 37 games last season, contributing 15.7 points, 5.4 rebounds and 54.4 minutes.

- James Banks III, who transferred from Texas, took just 23 games to eclipse his two-year totals at Texas, averaging 10.5 points and 7.7 rebounds and leading the ACC in blocked shots (2.52 per game).

Five-Star Player Development

Notable player development successes over the past three seasons include Josh Okogie, Ben Lammers, Tadic Jackson, Abdoulaye Gueye, James Banks III and Moses Wright, who maximized their skill sets and their production under the current coaching staff.

Okogie went from being ranked 11th in the state as a HS senior to a first-round NBA draft pick. In the last two seasons, Gueye, a 6-9 forward, developed from a project player into an ACC-level contributor. Banks, a 6-9 center, exceeded his two-year totals at Texas in just 23 games and led the ACC in blocked shots. Graduate transfer Brandon Alston had similar statistical numbers at the ACC level as he compiled in two seasons at Lehigh. Wright blossomed at the end of the 2018-19 season and averaged more than 15 points and six rebounds, tripling his season scoring average and doubling his rebound norm.

Jackets' Newcomer Class

• **David Didenko**, a 6-9, 232-pound forward originally from Yakutsk, Russia, attended Boca Raton Community High School before enrolling at Palm Beach State, a junior college in Boca Raton, for the 2018-19 academic year. A full academic qualifier in high school, Didenko enrolled at Tech in the summer and has three years of eligibility with the Yellow Jackets. Didenko moved to the United States in 2010, at the age of 11. Prior to his enrollment at Boca Raton, Didenko attended Northeast High School as a junior, and Montverde Academy for his ninth- and 10th-grade years.

• **Bubba Parham**, a 5-10 transfer from VMI, received NCAA approval waiving his required year of residency on Sept. 11 and has two seasons of eligibility at Georgia Tech. A native of Snellville, Ga., Parham attended Brookwood High School, transferred to Tech in June after two standout seasons at VMI in Lexington, Va., where he earned second-team All-South Conference honors in 2018-19 and was named the conference's Freshman of the Year in 2017-18. Last season, Parham led the Southern Conference with 21.4 points per game, scoring 30 points or more nine times.

• **Asanti Price**, a 6-5, 177-pound guard from Columbia, S.C., and W.J. Keenan High School, signed with Tech in the spring. Rated a three-star prospect and ranked No. 74 among shooting guards nationally in the 247Sports composite rankings, Price led W.J. Keenan High school with 17.9 points per game and was considered one of the top shooters in the area during the 2018-19 season.

• **Jordan Usher**, a 6-7, 225-pound forward, transferred from Southern California and enrolled at Tech last January after playing a season and a half for the Trojans. A former 4-star prospect from Canton, Ga., Usher played in all 36 games with two starts for the Trojans as a freshman in 2017-18, averaging 4.8 points and 2.0 rebounds per game while connecting on 40.9 percent of his three-point field goal attempts. In 2018-19, Usher played in 12 games and made two starts, averaging 8.6 points and 3.7 rebounds.

Wire-to-Wire

Though he has expanded his bench to reflect the growing level of talent within the program, head coach Josh Pastner remains committed to a tight playing rotation, reminiscent of the way Bobby Cremins coached the Yellow Jackets over his 19 seasons.

This season, Tech's reserves have played 27.9 percent of the minutes (No. 252 in the nation), up from the 23.6 percent they played during ACC games last season.

Michael Devoe (35.26) ranks No. 4 in the ACC in most average minutes played this season, and had ranked No. 57 nationally in percentage of minutes used (87.7 pct., KenPom.com) before missing three games recently with a foot injury. Jose Alvarado has averaged 33.5 minutes since his return from an ankle injury. Devoe and Alvarado rank No. 12 and 14, respectively, in the ACC in minutes in conference games.

Last season, Alvarado and Devoe both ranked among the ACC's top 10 and combined for eight 40-minute games. Alvarado has posted 14 40-minute games in his career.

Tech 4-0 in Summer Tour of Spain

Georgia Tech went 4-0 in its seven-day August tour of Spain, winning two games each in Barcelona and Madrid against a collection of players from Spanish professional leagues.

The tour took place from August 8-16, coinciding with the break between summer and fall academic terms. The Yellow Jackets spent the first three days in Barcelona, took a high-speed train to Madrid, where they stayed three more days.

The Yellow Jackets won their four games by an average of 19.8 points, the closest game being an 87-83 win in the final contest, and averaged 93 points per game while working to play an up-tempo style.

Tech shot 55.8 percent from the floor overall, 34.5

percent from three-point range while hitting an average of 10.5 three-pointers per game.

The Jackets' top three-point shooters in the tour were Jose Alvarado (8-of-16), Shembari Phillips (6-of-12) and Michael Devoe (8-of-19).

Along with the basketball competition, the Yellow Jackets visited the professional soccer facilities of FC Barcelona and Real Madrid, and the La Sagrada Familia basilica in Barcelona among other activities.

Tech has made summer international tours twice previously, most recently to The Bahamas in 2015. The Jackets traveled to France in August of 1991.

Winning Starts at Home

Georgia Tech and head coach Josh Pastner have made a priority of making McCamish Pavilion a real homecourt advantage for the program, and the Yellow Jackets made a good start on that by setting a program record for wins at home (17) in 2017-18, which included a 7-2 ACC record and two NIT victories.

Tech is 16-14 against ACC teams at home under Pastner, and that includes a 5-6 mark against ranked opponents.

Tech is 45-24 at McCamish Pavilion under Pastner, 88-50 since the building opened for the 2012-13 season.

Jackets Sign Three in Early Period

Georgia Tech filled all three of its available scholarships during the early signing period, signing four-star 7-1 center **Saba Gigiberia**, three-star 6-2 guard **Tristan Maxwell** and four-star 6-9 forward **Jordan Meka**.

Gigiberia, originally from Tbilisi in the Republic of Georgia, attended Prolific Preparatory School in Napa, Calif., after a year at Findlay Prep in Las Vegas, Nev. He has represented Georgia in the FIBA U16 and U18 European Championships.

Meka, originally from Yaounde, Cameroon, has attended Mt. Bethel Christian Academy in Marietta, Ga., since ninth grade, and has made all-state teams the last three years and is the school's all-time leading scorer, rebounder and shot-blocker.

Maxwell, the son of 13-year NBA veteran Vernon Maxwell, led class 4A in three-point shooting last season at North Mecklenburg High School in Huntersville, N.C. He is the school's all-time leading three-point shooter and is nearing the school's all-time scoring record.

20-Game ACC Schedule Rotation

Beginning this season, the Atlantic Coast Conference has implemented a 20-game schedule for all its teams and announced a rotation that will carry the league through the next three seasons (through the 2021-22 season).

Each team plays its two primary rivals every season both home and away (four games - Clemson and Notre Dame remain Georgia Tech's primary home-and-away opponents) and four rotating opponents both home and away (eight games). The remaining eight opponents will be single games, four at home and four on the road. The full cycle of repeat opponents will be complete following the third year.

Under the former 18-game schedule, each team played four opponents both home and away each season, four at home and four away.

In 2019-20, Georgia Tech is playing Louisville, NC State, Pittsburgh and Syracuse both home and away in addition to Clemson and Notre Dame, with Duke, Miami, Virginia and Virginia Tech visiting McCamish Pavilion.

In 2020-21, Tech's home-and-away opponents will be Clemson, Notre Dame, Duke, Florida State, Virginia and Wake Forest, with home games against Boston, North Carolina, Pittsburgh and Syracuse.

In 2021-22, the Yellow Jackets play Clemson, Notre Dame, Boston College, Miami, North Carolina and Virginia Tech both home and on the road, and will host Florida State, Louisville, NC State and Wake Forest.

Three Tech Alumni on NBA Rosters

Since 1982, Georgia Tech has produced 19 first-round NBA draft picks and 46 draft picks overall. A total of 38 Georgia Tech alumni have played in the NBA.

Four former Georgia Tech basketball stars are currently on NBA rosters, including guard **Josh Okogie**, who was drafted 20th overall by for the Minnesota Timberwolves in 2018 and is in his second season with the team.

Thaddeus Young, a 12-year NBA veteran, finished three full seasons with the Indiana Pacers in 2019 after playing seven seasons in Philadelphia, one in Minnesota and two in Brooklyn. He signed with the Chicago Bulls during the off-season.

Derrick Favors emerged as a key figure in his nine seasons with the Utah Jazz, but became a free agent after the 2018-19 season and signed with the New Orleans Pelicans.

Iman Shumpert, an eight-year NBA veteran who went in the first round of the NBA draft to New York in 2011, signed with his fifth team, the Brooklyn Nets, last month, but was released on Dec. 11.

Arts and Letters

Beginning with Moe Miller and Lance Storrs in the summer of 2011, every four-year senior in the Georgia Tech program has graduated, with the exception of the Yellow Jackets' 2018 two seniors, who are both expected to return and complete their degrees this summer after a year of pro ball overseas.

Graduate student Brandon Alston (economics), fifth-year senior Abdoulaye Gueye (business administration) and fourth-year junior Sylvester Ogbonda (business administration) all will complete their course work this semester and receive their degrees in May.

Georges-Hunt and Jackson made the Academic All-ACC team twice, and the Yellow Jackets have had at least one player named to that team since it was instituted for the 2010-11 season.

Tech's men's basketball team has recorded the highest Academic Progress Report scores the last five years since the NCAA began tracking academic performance in 2004-05. The Jackets scored a perfect team single year APR score of 1000 three straight years from 2011-13.

BIO UPDATES

Head Coach Josh Pastner • 4th season

After guiding Memphis to five post-season berths in seven seasons as the Tigers' head coach, Josh Pastner became Georgia Tech's 14th head basketball coach on April 8, 2016.

Implementing a high-energy style of play and creative offensive and defensive schemes, and building the Jackets' talent base for the future, Pastner has tirelessly promoted the program on campus and throughout the city of Atlanta in an effort to re-create the major homecourt atmosphere that surrounded the Yellow Jackets throughout the 1980s, 1990s and into the middle of the 2000s. The result has been numerous wins, high excitement and 12 sellouts in three seasons at McCamish Pavilion.

Two of his players - guard Josh Okogie and Ben Lammers - have earned All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors before moving on to the professional ranks. Okogie, in particular, developed from an under-the-radar high school prospect into a highly-regarded NBA rookie, having been selected 20th in the 2018 NBA Draft.

In his first season at the helm, his Yellow Jacket team defied all pre-season expectations by reaching the post-season and advancing to the finals of the National Invitation Tournament. Tech earned victories over No. 9 North Carolina, No. 6 Florida State and No. 14 Notre Dame (later vacated by the NCAA Committee on Infractions), who all finished among the top four in the ACC regular season. He was named Coach of the Year in the ACC and in NABC District 2.

Two of his players earned all-Atlantic Coast Conference honors; junior center Ben Lammers was named second-team All-ACC and ACC Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman guard Josh Okogie was named to the ACC All-Freshman team.

Though hampered by several significant injuries and other issues in 2017-18, Tech still was able to knock off a pair of top-25 teams while Lammers and Okogie again earned conference honors, and Okogie developed into an NBA first-round draft choice. In 2018-19, the Yellow jackets picked up three significant road wins - at Arkansas, Syracuse and NC State, each of whom made post-season play - and center James Banks III was named to the ACC's All-Defensive team.

Pastner, 43, compiled a 167-73 record over seven seasons as the head coach at Memphis, where the Tigers earned bids to the NCAA Tournament four times. He tied for the 10th most wins for a head coach in his first seven seasons in Division I basketball history, and was the second winningest active coach under the age of 40 in NCAA Division I at the time.

Despite his young age, Pastner has been involved in basketball at the Division I level for 21 years, as a player and an assistant coach at Arizona, and as an assistant coach and the head coach at Memphis. He has been a part of teams that have won 524 games, played in 17 NCAA Tournaments and 19 total post-season events. Teams he has been involved with have won 12 conference tournament or regular-season championships, advanced to seven Sweet Sixteens, five Elite Eights, two Final Fours and two NCAA championship games.

As an NCAA head or assistant coach and an AAU head coach, he has coached nearly 25 NBA draft selections.

Pastner's Memphis teams averaged 23.9 wins per season and compiled a conference regular-season record of 82-36, including a conference winning streak of 28 games. The Tigers went 11-4 in Conference USA and American Athletic Conference tournaments, including three championships.

He guided Memphis to five post-season berths, the NIT in 2010 and the NCAA Tournament in 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. Pastner twice won Conference USA Coach of the Year honors (2010, 2013) by various organizations and news media.

Pastner was born in Glen Dale, W.Va., and grew up in Kingwood, Texas. He earned his bachelor's degree in family studies in December of 1998, in just two and a half years, from Arizona and his master's degree in teaching and teacher education from Arizona in December of 1999, all while lettering four years in basketball under head coach Lute Olson.

He married the former Kerri Lamas of Sierra Vista, Ariz., in 2009. He has a stepson (Ethan) and three daughters, Payten, Kamryn and Harper.

Eric Reveno, who served 10 years as the head coach at the University of Portland, joined Josh Pastner's men's basketball staff in May, 2016. He was promoted to associate head coach on Nov. 1, 2019.

The former post player oversaw one of the Yellow Jackets' great successes in 2016-17 in the development of 6-10 center Ben Lammers, who became a second-team All-ACC performer and the conference's Defensive Player of the Year. He also helped develop another former reserve forward, Abdoulaye Gueye, into a significant contributor for the Yellow Jackets in his final two seasons, and helped transfer James Banks III develop into one of the ACC's top defensive players in 2018-19, making the ACC's All-Defensive team.

Reveno's penchant for analytics has led to partnering the Jackets with advance technology systems to help the team's performance, such as the Noah shot-tracking system which was installed in both the Zelnak Practice Facility and the main floor at McCamish Pavilion. In addition to recruiting and on-court coaching, Reveno also handles budget management and game scheduling for the program.

Reveno and his wife, Amanda, have two children: Katie (16) and Andrew (13).

JULIAN SWARTZ**Assistant Coach • 4th year at Tech**

A 16-year coaching veteran, including 10 years on the NCAA Division I level, Julian Swartz was named an assistant coach on Josh Pastner's staff in August of 2018.

Swartz, 39, is responsible for on-court development of Tech players and focuses his efforts on the Yellow Jackets' defensive schemes as well as handle recruiting responsibilities. He helped guide Tech's defense to a national ranking of No. 37 in efficiency in 2018-19, according to KenPom.com, and the Yellow Jackets also ranked among the top 15 in effective field goal percentage and three-point defense.

One of two members of head coach Pastner's staff at Memphis to follow him to Georgia Tech, Swartz came to The Flats in May, 2016, after four years with Pastner at Memphis, where he served stints as assistant director of operations, director of player development and interim assistant coach. He served his first two years at Tech as director of recruiting and compliance, which included serving as the staff liaison with compliance, coordinating on-campus recruiting operations and summer camps.

ANTHONY WILKINS**Assistant Coach • 2nd year at Tech**

Anthony Wilkins, an Atlanta native who spent the past five seasons on the coaching staff at Tulane University, joined Georgia Tech's basketball staff in June of 2018.

Wilkins, 39, served as an assistant coach for four seasons at Tulane under two head coaches -- Ed Conroy and Mike Dunleavy - after serving as director of basketball operations during his first year with the Green Wave. At Tulane, Wilkins handled game strategy and scout prep responsibilities along with player development and recruiting duties. He also had six years of professional playing experience prior to entering the coaching world.

Focusing his on-court efforts with Tech's offense, the Yellow Jackets made significant strides toward the end of his first season on The Flats, and he is credited with the development of sophomore forward Moses Wright, who averaged more than 15 points and shot 62 percent from the floor over his last five games.

Born in Atlanta, Wilkins lived in the city for much of his childhood and attended Therrell High School for two years before finishing his high school studies at Glenville High School in Cleveland, Ohio.
