# Year-by-Year Career Guide



## **Freshman Year**

- □ Read the CoB career emails weekly to educate yourself about options and strategies.
- Establish a solid foundation for your GPA. Form healthy study habits.
- □ Join a student organization that interests you. Volunteer to lead an activity or event.
- □ Take a CoB GT1000 section: create a resume and learn job search strategies.
- □ Plan to take intro MGT courses in your strongest interest area first.
- □ Read job descriptions to get an idea of possible positions you'd enjoy.
- □ Attend the GT Career Fair in September and February.
- □ Apply for co-ops or internships during spring semester.
- Consider interning with a small to medium size company as they do not require upper-class status

#### **Sophomore Year**

- □ Read the CoB career emails weekly to educate yourself about opportunities.
- □ Attend the GT Career Fair in September and February.
- □ Narrow your interest areas by comparing MGT classes and reading job descriptions.
- Ask people working in the corporate world to lunch to hear about their career. See Lunch Chat Instructions in Canvas/CoB Careers/Files for step-by-step instructions.
- □ Volunteer to lead an event or activity in a student organization and track your accomplishments.
- □ Work a co-op or internship position and track your accomplishments and results.

### **Junior Year**

- □ Read the CoB career emails weekly to educate yourself about options and strategies.
- Attend the GT Career Fair in September and February.
- □ Take MGT 3599 Career Development. It covers every step of a professional job search.
- Develop more contacts on and off campus. The more people you have in your network, the easier it is to find interesting job opportunities. See Lunch Chat Instructions in Canvas/CoB Careers/Files.
- □ Volunteer for a higher officer position in a student organization and track your accomplishments.
- □ Work a co-op or internship position and track your accomplishments and results.
- Take an extra class or two this year so you can allot time for your job search your senior year.
- Get to know a couple of supervisors and faculty members well enough so they can serve as references for you next year. Visit them and update them on what your goals are.

#### Senior Year

- Take fewer hours if possible to leave time for your job search.
- □ Search for your full time job your last fall and spring semesters.
- □ Read the CoB career emails weekly to educate yourself about options and strategies.
- □ Aggressively conduct your job search at the beginning of your last fall semester on campus. Most companies will not be back until the following fall. Don't miss out.
- □ Conduct at least five lunch chats to make sure you have professionals helping you find your job and to insure you know what you want to do.
- □ Continue building relationships with supervisors and faculty who can serve as references.
- □ Set a few hours aside each week to follow-up on job leads. Landing a job takes time.
- □ Run simultaneous, multiple strategies (i.e. Canvas/Cob Careers, CareerBuzz, and lunch chats) because you never know which one will have the best results for you.
