Went 16-7 in dual singles play and 12-8 in dual doubles action...Combined for a 29-12 overall singles ledger and 20-13 overall doubles mark...Went 11-3 in ACC singles action from the No. 1 position and 8-4 against league opponents in doubles... Picked up a super tiebreak victory over No. 22 Maria Mateas at Duke (3/1) for her second ranked singles win of the season...Downed two top-10 singles opponents to close the regular season... Fall: Went 7-6 in tournament play in singles and 8-5 in doubles...Pocketed her first collegiate singles win at the Duke Invitational to open fall competition, going 2-1 in the tournament...Went 3-1 in singles at the ITA Southeast Regional, falling to teammate Paige Hourigan in the quarterfinals...Captured the consolation doubles title with Nami Otsuka...Posted a 2-1 record in doubles play in the final fall tournament with Otsuka, the Tiger Fall Classic.

SMU, 1983 EIGHTH SEASON AT GEORGIA TECH

Georgia Tech hired Rodney Harmon July 3, 2012, as the seventh head women's tennis coach in school history.

In 2018-19, the Yellow Jackets recorded their 20th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. Tech defeated No. 25 Ohio State in the round of 64, 4-3, before the Jackets fell to No. 8 Vanderbilt in the round of 32. Junior Kenya Jones was tabbed ITA All-American after going 29-12 overall from the No. 1 singles position. Jones rose as high as No. 8 in the national rankings and finished the campaign ranked No. 15. Additionally, Jones was tabbed all-ACC first team.

The 2017-18 women's tennis season was one for the record books as the Yellow Jackets recorded just the second trip in program history to the NCAA Semifinals. The Jackets capped the year with a 25-6 overall record and 12-2 ACC ledger, reaching the semifinals of the ACC Tournament. Tech climbed as high as No. 2 in the national rankings during the season and boasted the No. 1 doubles team in the country, Paige Hourigan and Kenya Jones, for several weeks on the national polls. Three Jackets collected all-ACC honors at the end of the season: Hourigan (first team), Jones (second team) and Johnnise Renaud (third team). Hourigan and Jones also earned the ACC's automatic berth into the NCAA Championships as a doubles tandem. The pair, who were tabbed ITA All-Americans, reached the NCAA quarterfinals after helping the team advance to the semifinals.

After earning their 19th consecutive NCAA Tournament berth, the Jackets defeated Eastern Kentucky and Winthrop in the NCAA Regional to reach the round of 16 where they recorded a comeback win over Pepperdine to clinch a spot in the Elite Eight. In the quarterfinals, Tech posted another comeback win over No. 14 UCLA. After trailing the Bruins, 3-1, Nami Otsuka, Hourigan and Ida Jarlskog lifted the Jackets past the Bruins, 4-3, to the semifinals. Tech fell in the NCAA Semifinals to top-seeded and No. 2 Vanderbilt, 4-2.

In 2016-17, Harmon led the Jackets to a remarkable ledger of 27-5. Tech claimed a share of the ACC regular season championship, going 13-1 in league play and remained undefeated against league opponents until the final match of the regular season. On April 29, the Jackets avenged their only ACC loss of the season at Duke, with a 4-2 win over the Blue Devils in the ACC Championship semifinals. With the win, Tech made its sixth appearance in the ACC Championship match since 1986, but dropped a heartbreaker to UNC, 4-3. Four Jackets earned ACC recognition as Rasheeda McAdoo and Jonnise Renaud were named All-ACC first team, Paige Hourigan was tabbed All-ACC second team and freshman Nami Otsuka was listed on the All-ACC third team. For the second consecutive season, Harmon was named the ACC Coach of the Year, becoming the second coach in program history to earn the honor.

Tech continued its postseason success in 2017, making its 18th straight NCAA Tournament appearance and hosted the first- and second-rounds at the Ken Byers Tennis Complex. The Jackets upended Alabama State and Northwestern to reach the Sweet 16 for the second straight year before falling to Oklahoma State in the Round of 16 in Athens. McAdoo and Renaud both earned individual NCAA singles bids in addition to earning a doubles bid to the NCAA Championships. The Tech duo of Hourigan/Kenya Jones also received a doubles bid and advanced to the second round. At the conclusion of the season, Harmon was named the Wilson/ITA Southeast Region Coach of the Year.

In his fourth season on The Flats, Harmon led the Jackets to a 19-9 overall record and 11-3 ACC ledger. Tech reached the semifinals of the ACC tournament, falling to Miami, but rebounded, earning an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament for the 17th consecutive season. By way of winning the Columbia, S.C. regional, Tech advanced to the round of 16 in Tulsa, Oklahoma where they fell to Ohio State. Harmon was named the ACC Coach of the Year, while Johnnise Renaud was tabbed All-ACC first team and Paige Hourigan was named All-ACC third team. Renaud and Hourigan each earned NCAA singles bids, while the pair of Kendal Woodard/Hourigan earned a doubles bid as well.

During his third season on the Flats, Harmon led his team to a 17-10 overall record and a 9-5 mark in ACC play. The Yellow Jackets made their 16th consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the second round, and finished the season ranked #20 in the ITA Rankings. During the ACC Tournament, the Jackets advanced to their fifth

ACC Championship Title Match before falling to Virginia. Georgia Tech finished the ACC season in sixth and both freshmen Johnnise Renaud and Paige Hourigan were named to the All-ACC Second Team.

Harmon's second season at the helm of the Yellow Jackets started off with a bang after sophomores Megan Kurey and Kendal Woodard won the USTA/ITA National Indoor Intercollegiate Championships doubles title. The duo also captured the USTA/ITA Southeast Regional Doubles title during the fall. Kurey and Woodard were ranked as the number one doubles team in the country on February 11, 2014 and received the #6 seed in the 2014 NCAA doubles championships. Woodard garnered conference honors for the second season in a row after being named to the All-ACC First Team while Kurey was named to the All-ACC Second Team.

The Yellow Jackets went 14-10 overall and 9-5 in the ACC during Harmon's second year at the helm of the Jackets. Tech closed out the 2014 regular season with an exciting 4-3 win against No. 1 Duke. The win against the top-ranked team in the country was the first of Harmon's career and fourth in the history of the Yellow Jackets. The Jackets received the six seed in the 2014 ACC Tournament and advanced to the quarter finals before falling to Virginia.

In 2014, Tech received its 15th straight berth in the NCAA Tournament. The Yellow Jackets defeated Purdue in the first round, 4-0, before falling to overall nine seed Vanderbilt, 4-2, in the second round.

Harmon had quite the successful first season on the Flats, leading his team to a 15-10 record and a 7-4 mark in the ACC. The Jackets reached its highest ranking of the season in the ITA rankings at #19 during the week of April 9th. Tech defeated nine ranked teams, including four that were ranked in the top-25. Freshman Kendal Woodard was honored on the 2013 All-ACC Women's Tennis Team while Elizabeth Kilborn, Megan Kurey and Elizabeth Kurey were all named to the All-ACC Academic team during Harmon's first year.

Harmon brings 25 years of player development to the Yellow Jackets with prior experience in both junior and college tennis. Most recently he served as the director of tennis at the Deerwood Country Club in Jacksonville, Fla.

Harmon was the men's tennis head coach at the University of Miami from 1995 until 1997 where he brought in the No. 1 recruiting class in 1996, led by No. 1 recruit Michael Russell. Harmon was the 1996 and 1997 Big East Conference Coach of the Year during his time with the Hurricanes.

Harmon left the Hurricanes to re-join the United States Tennis Association training center headquarters in Boca Raton, Fla., where he advanced to director of men's tennis. During his tenure at the USTA, Harmon served as the head coach of the U.S. men's tennis team at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China.

Before joining Miami, Harmon spent four years as the USTA national coach where he coached future pros including Todd Martin, MallVai Washington and Alex O'Brien. During his first stint with the USTA, Harmon served as the U.S. men's tennis head coach at the 1993 World University Games in Buffalo, N.Y.

Harmon began his collegiate career at the University of Tennessee before transferring to Southern Methodist University where he graduated from with a Bachelor of Arts in

GEORGIA TECH, 2009 SIXTH SEASON AT GEORGIA TECH

Former Yellow Jacket standout Christy Lynch joined the Georgia Tech women's tennis program as assistant coach in 2014-15 and was promoted to associate head coach in September 2018.

In 2018-19, Lynch helped guide the Yellow Jackets to their 20th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. Tech defeated No. 25 Ohio State in the round of 64, 4-3, before the Jackets fell to No. 8 Vanderbilt in the round of 32. Junior Kenya Jones was tabbed ITA All-American after going 29-12 overall from the No. 1 singles position. Jones rose as high as No. 8 in the national rankings and finished the campaign ranked No. 15.

Lynch helped Georgia Tech reach the NCAA semifinals in 2017-18 for just the second time in program history. Tech capped its year with a 25-6 overall record and 12-2 ACC ledger, reaching the semifinals of the ACC tournament. Tech climbed as high as No. 2 in the national rankings and boasted the No. 1 doubles team in the country, Paige Hourigan and Kenya Jones, for several weeks. Three Jackets collected all-ACC honors at the end of the season: Hourigan (first team), Jones (second team) and Johnnise Renaud (third team). Hourigan and Jones were tabbed ITA All-Americans and reached the NCAA quarterfinals.

In 2016-17, Lynch helped the Jackets to a remarkable 27-5 overall record and 13-1 ACC league mark, claiming a share of the regular season title. Tech earned an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Sweet 16 for the second consecutive season and finished the season ranked No. 9 nationally. For her stellar work on the courts, Lynch was named the 2017 ITA Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year, becoming the second assistant coach in program history to earn the honor.

In her second season, Tech posted a 19-9 overall record to go along with an 11-3 ACC mark that earned the Yellow Jackets the No. 3 seed in the ACC Tournament. The Jackets fell in the ACC Semifinals to Miami, but rebounded in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Round of 16. In the NCAA Regionals, Tech defeated Princeton and South Carolina to head to Tulsa, Okla. and face Ohio State, eventually falling 4-2.

During her first season, the Yellow Jackets went 17-10 overall record and had a 9-5 mark in ACC play. The Yellow Jackets made their 16th consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the second round, and finished the season ranked #20 in the ITA Rankings. During the ACC Tournament, the Jackets advanced to their fifth ACC Championship Title Match before falling to Virginia.

Lynch, whose maiden name is Striplin, played for the Yellow Jackets from 2005-09 and was a part of one of the most memorable Georgia Tech teams in the history of the program. During her time on the court for the Jackets, Tech won the 2007 NCAA National Championship, four ACC titles and two team National Indoor titles. Lynch helped the Yellow Jackets win the 2007 National Championship by winning all six of her singles matches in the NCAA Championship.

Lynch's name can be seen throughout the Georgia Tech record book. The Birmingham, Alabama native's 117 career singles matches is second all-time at Georgia Tech and her 68 doubles victories ranks 11th on the career list. Lynch recorded 35 singles wins on the way to the 2007 National Championship, which is the sixth-highest seasonal mark in Tech history. As a senior in 2008-09, she aided the Yellow Jackets' fifth straight NCAA round of 16 appearance, and finished off the year with a 30-14 singles record along with a No. 42 national ranking.

Lynch graduated from Georgia Tech in 2009 with a bachelor's degree in management. Following graduation, Lynch competed as a professional on the Women's Tennis Association (WTA) Tour for a year. Lynch returned to the Flats in 2012, serving as a volunteer assistant coach during Harmon's first season at the helm of the Jackets. Lynch was then hired as the assistant coach of the Emory women's tennis team in August 2013.

During the 2013-14 season, the Emory Eagles won the 2014 NCAA Division III Championship while setting a school record for wins in a year with a 28-2 record. Lynch helped coach the NCAA D-III National Singles Champion, three Division III ITA All-Americans, the ITA Division III Atlantic South Regional Player of the Year, the ITA Division III Senior Player of the Year and the UAA MVP and Rookie of the Year. Both Lynch and Emory head coach Amy Bryant were named the UAA Coaching Staff of the Year. Seven Eagles were also named to the All-UAA First Team this past season.

TODD STANSBURY DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

GEORGIA TECH, 1984

Todd Stansbury, a Georgia Tech alumnus and football letterwinner, was introduced as the Institute's ninth director of athletics on Sept. 22, 2016.

In just his second full year as the A.D. at his alma mater, he oversaw one of Georgia Tech athletics' most successful all-around years in recent memory in 2018-19.

Among the accomplishments in '18-19:

• Georgia Tech leaped 55 spots in the final Learfield IMG Directors' Cup standings, from No. 121 in 2017-18 to No. 66 in 2018-19, Tech's highest finish in the national all-sports standings since 2010-11;

nine teams — football, men's cross country, women's cross country, men's swimming and diving, women's indoor track and field, women's

outdoor track and field, women's tennis, golf and baseball — earned Directors' Cup points for the Yellow Jackets based on NCAA postseason qualification and performance, the most GT teams to earn Directors' Cup points since 2009-10;

 \bullet in the latest Academic Progress Rate (APR) data released by the NCAA, Tech was the only institution from a Power Five conference that had a

multiyear APR higher than the national average in every sport;

 Georgia Tech's NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) came in at 89 percent, the highest mark in school history for the sixth-straight year;

• GT athletics' Jackets Without Borders international service program won the prestigious ACC Game Changers award for community service;

buoyed by contributions to Athletics Initiative 2020, a \$125 million

fundraising initiative introduced by Stansbury in June 2018 (see below for more details), Tech athletics enjoyed a record-breaking fundraising year with more than \$50 million in donations.

Stansbury began setting the stage for these accomplishments as soon as he officially arrived back on The Flats on Nov. 28, 2016. In the first months of his tenure as athletics director, he identified four strategic priorities for Georgia Tech athletics — to define the GT athletics brand, to establish an internal culture, to align the internal structure and to generate new revenue. He has addressed those priorities through a slew of initiatives and accomplishments. Highlights include:

 a significant revenue lift, which can be traced in large part to an innovative overhaul of sales operations that focused on integrating fundraising and ticket sales efforts;

 the establishment of a partnership with adidas to serve as the official apparel provider of Georgia Tech athletics, which was announced on Aug. 22, 2017 and went into affect on July 1, 2018;

 significant facilities upgrades, including a new \$4.5 million football locker room, a \$1.2 million investment in new videoboards at several competition venues (baseball, softball, volleyball and tennis, as well as Bobby Dodd Stadium's Callaway Plaza) and a refresh of the student-athletes' nutrition center and training table;

• a re-emphasis on Georgia Tech athletics iconic Total Person Program, with investments for additional staff and programming for student-athletes, including the department's first three Jackets Without Borders service trips to Costa Rica (2017) and Puerto Rico (2018 and 2019);

 a comprehensive brand refinement that included defining Georgia Tech athletics' official colors, Tech's first-ever athletics wordmark and a simplification of the iconic interlocking GT logo;

 the creation of Georgia Tech's "Gold Code," which outlines the department's core values, brand differentiators, vision, mission and the Everyday Champions ons formula — Winning + The Institute + Total Person Program = Everyday Champions;

• the establishment of two new offices within the athletics department — the office of brand and ideation, which works to identify and tell the story of the Yellow Jackets' brand, and the office of innovation, which oversees Georgia Tech's efforts to build on its status as college athletics' leader in innovation, particularly through collaboration and partnerships with the Institute and innovation hubs throughout Atlanta.

In June 2018, Stansbury unveiled the most significant undertaking of his tenure as

Georgia Tech's A.D. — Athletics Initiative 2020. AI 2020 aims to raise \$125 million for athletics facilities, endowments and operations by

Dec. 31, 2020 with three priorities in mind — recruiting (putting GT in position to attract the special type of student-athlete that can excel both athletically and academically at Tech), building a better student-athlete (equipping them with the tools they need to excel in their sport, while also developing each as a Total Person that succeeds in academics and life) and winning (being true to the great tradition of excellence at Georgia Tech by competing for ACC and national championships).

The crown jewel of Al 2020 is a \$70 million renovation of Georgia Tech's Edge Center. The new Edge Center will serve as a sleek and innovative home base for Georgia Tech athletics' teams and administration, a one-stop shop for key student-athlete services, an anchor for recruiting efforts and a showcase for the Institute's commitment to student-athlete success and fan engagement.

In the first year since the public unveil, Georgia Tech raised more than \$90 million towards AI 2020's \$125 million goal.

A native of Oakville, Ontario, Stansbury was initially drawn to Georgia Tech when he befriended several Tech football student-athletes while on a family vacation in Florida as a youngster. The student-athletes invited

Stansbury and his family to attend a practice on their way back through Atlanta. They accepted and, after visiting campus, Stansbury was determined to attend and play football at Tech.

Several years later, he was offered and accepted a football scholarship to attend Tech. He enrolled in 1980 and played linebacker and special teams for the Yellow Jackets under head coach Bill Curry. He went on to be

selected in the third round of the Canadian Football League draft by the Saskatchewan Roughriders in 1984 but after a brief CFL career, returned to Atlanta to begin a banking career.

In 1988, he left banking and returned to The Flats to become an academic advisor for Georgia Tech's football program. In 1991, he was promoted to assistant athletics director for academics by legendary A.D. Homer Rice.

After leaving Tech in 1995, Stansbury's career included stops at Houston (associate A.D. - 1997-2000) and Oregon State (executive associate A.D. - 2003-12), as well as three stints as an athletics director at East Tennessee State (2000-03), UCF (2012-15) and Oregon State (2015-16).

Stansbury and his wife, Karen, who were married inside Georgia Tech's Arthur B. Edge Intercollegiate Athletics Center, reside in Atlanta. After they were married in 1995, the couple traveled the world for 18 months before returning to the United States.

ÁNGEL CABRERA **INSTITUTE PRESIDENT**

The Georgia Institute of Technology welcomes a new president this September. After serving for almost seven years as president of George Mason University (GMU) in Fairfax, Virginia, Dr. Ángel Cabrera was named June 13, 2019, by the University System of Georgia Board of Regents as Georgia Tech's 12th president. He succeeds Dr. G.P. "Bud" Peterson, who has served since April 1, 2009. Peterson will continue in his role as Georgia Tech's president until Cabrera arrives in September. When Peterson announced his pending retirement in January 2019, he shared his plans to continue his research and return to teaching at Georgia Tech.

Under President Peterson's leadership, Georgia Tech exceeded the \$1.5 billion goal for Campaign Georgia Tech by 20%, grew innovative collaborations and strategic partnerships, expanded the campus infrastructure, and elevated its national and global visibility. In the past decade, total research expenditures and other sponsored activities increased by 78% to \$908 million. Enrollment increased by 69%. The number of women in the first-year class increased from 32 to 40%. Georgia Tech's first-to-second-year retention is 97%, a historic high.

Cabrera is a Georgia Tech alumnus, the second in the Institute's 134-year history to serve as president. Peterson's predecessor, Dr. G. Wayne Clough (1994 – 2008), earned bachelor's and master's degrees in civil engineering from Georgia Tech.

Cabrera holds an M.S. and Ph.D. in cognitive psychology from Georgia Tech, which he attended as a Fulbright Scholar. He also holds a telecommunications engineering degree from Universidad Politécnica de Madrid (B.S. and M.S. in computer and electrical engineering). For the past decade, he has served as a member of the Georgia Tech Advisory Board, including a stint as its chair.

Cabrera met his wife, Beth, while both were graduate students at Georgia Tech. Dr. Beth Fraser Cabrera was a management professor at Carlos III University in Madrid and Arizona State University, and currently delivers leadership development programs for business executives. Their son Alex, who recently received his undergraduate degree from the Institute, is continuing his studies this fall at Carnegie Mellon University. Daughter Emilia is a rising junior at Harvard University.

George Mason is the largest, fastest growing, and most diverse public university in Virginia. Listed among the top 300 research universities in the world by the Academic Ranking of World Universities, GMU reached the top tier among research universities in the Carnegie Classification and accounted for more than half of all public university enrollment growth in Virginia under Cabrera's leadership. In 2018, it was named by Forbes as one of America's best midsize employers.

Before becoming GMU's president, Cabrera served as dean of IE Business School in Madrid and president of Thunderbird School of Global Management (now part of Arizona State University). As a business educator, Cabrera played a key role in advancing professional ethics, internationalization, and corporate social responsibility. As a senior advisor to the United Nations Global Compact, in 2007 he was the lead author of the "Principles for Responsible Management Education," now adopted by more than 700 schools around the world.

Cabrera's research has been published in leading academic journals. He has been quoted by leading global media, including The Economist, BBC, CNN, CNBC, El País, Forbes, the International Herald Tribune, and The New York Times. His op-eds have been published by The Washington Post and the international press, and he has appeared on NPR programs and PBS NewsHour.

He's been named a "Young Global Leader" by the World Economic Forum, a "Star of Europe" by Businessweek, "Henry Crown Fellow" by the Aspen Institute, and "Great Immigrant" by the Carnegie Corporation of New York. He has received honorary degrees from Miami Dade College and Universidad Politécnica of Madrid. He is the first native of Spain to serve as president of an American university.

CCharles Isbell, executive associate dean and professor in the College of Computing, was named faculty athletics representative (FAR) to the Georgia Tech Athletic Association on June 6, 2017. His three-year term as FAR began July 1, 2017. The FAR serves as the liaison between the Institute and the Athletic Association on issues regarding rules compliance, developments at the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), and activities related to Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) membership.

His first institutional service role at Tech was with the Institute Undergraduate Curriculum Committee, where he worked with student-athletes returning to finish their degrees. "Since the very beginning of being here as a faculty member, I've been interested in the way student-athletes interact with the rest of the institution," he said.

For Isbell, understanding the experience of student-athletes is paramount to success in higher education. Athletic achievements can elevate a university's profile to prospective students, and student-athletes' relationship to the university is one that can be used as a model for the broader campus community.

"Anyone interested in higher education and how it has to grow and change has to understand how Division I athletics works at a university," he said. "As higher education changes, we have to think of ourselves more as a community and consider what lets people build connections and keep coming back. It's going to have to happen with all students, faculty, and staff, and athletics can be an example of how to do that well."

While Isbell is a fan and frequent attendee of Georgia Tech athletic events, his support for student-athletes extends beyond the stands.

"I want the student-athletes to know I am here for them, and I intend to talk with them and be a resource for them," he said. "I want them to know that and believe it, and know that I take it very seriously."

Isbell's research passion is artificial intelligence. In particular, he focuses on applying statistical machine learning to building autonomous agents that must live and interact with large numbers of other intelligent agents, some of whom may be human.

Isbell received his B.S. in computer science in 1990 from Georgia Tech and his Ph.D. in computer science from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1998. After four years at AT&T Labs/Research, he returned to Georgia Tech in 2002 to join the faculty of the College of Computing. His research interests are varied, but recently he has been building autonomous agents that engage in lifelong learning when in the presence of thousands of other intelligent agents, including humans.

His work has been featured in the popular media, including *The New York Times* and T*he Washington Post*, as well as in technical collections. He also pursues reform in computing education. He was a developer of Threads, Georgia Tech's new structuring principle for computing curricula, and one of the key developers in Georgia Tech's new MOOC-supported Master of Science in Computer Science, the first of its kind in the world. He teaches several courses both to on-campus students and to students around the world in Tech's Online master of science in computer science program.

GEORGIA TECH WINS NCAA WOMEN'S TENNIS TITLE

Jackets Defeat UCLA 4-2 in Championship Match

Athens, Ga. -- Kristi Miller, Amanda McDowell and Christy Striplin won singles matches and then senior Alison Silverio provided the clinching victory at No. 2 singles to give Georgia Tech a 4-2 victory over UCLA in the NCAA championship match Tuesday at Henry Feild Stadium. The championship is the first NCAA title in any sport for Georgia Tech, which has also won four national championships in football via wire service polls.

"I just couldn't be happier," said Tech head coach Bryan Shelton, whose team won its 21st straight match to finish the season at 29-4. "We fought our tails off. For Ali (Silverio) to come through in the clutch one more time for us in the final match of her career is just unbelievable."

Tech fell behind by losing the doubles point and then trailed 2-1 before Miller and Striplin put the Jackets back on top 3-2 with Silverio just beginning her third set. Tech trailed in the remaining match on court six when Silverio finished off 40th-ranked Tracy Lin with a dominating 6-1 win in the third. Silverio had won the first 7-5 but dropped the second, also 7-5. Silverio, who also clinched the Jackets' quarterfinal win over Fresno State, was named the Most Valuable Player of the NCAA Tournament.

McDowell earned Tech's first singles win with a 6-1, 6-0 blitzing of Ashley Joelson at No. 4 singles. The freshman from Atlanta won her 10th straight match and her team-leading 39th of the season. She was undefeated in the NCAA matches to earn a spot on the all-tournament team.

One day after clinching Tech's semifinal win over California, Striplin again provided a key victory as she rallied for a three-set win over Alex McGoodwin at No. 5 singles. After losing the first set, Striplin won 12 of the final 14 games for a 4-6, 6-1, 6-2 victory and was also named to the all-tournament team.

Miller, ranked sixth in the nation, defeated No. 15 Riza Zalameda at No. 1 singles, 6-3, 7-6.

UCLA dominated in doubles winning 8-3 at both No. 1 and No. 2, although the Jackets led on court three when doubles ended. Zalameda and Yasmin Schnack defeated Tech's third-raked duo of Miller and Whitney McCray, and Joelson and Goodwin downed Silverio and Amanda Craddock.

The Bruins earned a singles win from Schnack, who defeated Craddock at No. 3, and Lumpkin was leading for UCLA at No. 6.

CARY, N.C. - Tournament MVP Alison Silverio came back after dropping her first set to win at No. 4 singles and lift sixth-ranked Georgia Tech to a 4-3 victory over No. 12 Miami in the finals of the ACC Championship.

It marks the first ACC Championship in Georgia Tech tennis history.

"I think it's so hard to win an ACC title and it's hard enough to get into the finals, much less complete the task by winning the tournament," said head coach Bryan Shelton. "In 1988, we [the men's team] came so close, just one match away from winning. Kenny [Thome, head coach for Georgia Tech men's tennis] and I were out there in the end and couldn't quite get it done, so it has been a long time coming to have this opportunity again. It doesn't feel much different, being a coach or player, as it is just as satisfying to win now as a coach. The girls on the court are the ones that got it done though, they deserve all of the credit."

In the tournament, the Yellow Jackets went 11-4 in singles matches, including a perfect 3-0 mark by Silverio. She also teamed with Kristi Miller to clinch the doubles point against the Hurricanes earlier in the day.

The Yellow Jackets carried a 1-0 lead into singles play by earning wins at the No. 1 and 3 doubles positions. After the Hurricane duo of Megan Bradley and Staci Stevens defeated Lyndsay Shosho and Dasha Potapova, 8-5, at the No. 2 slot, the Yellow Jacket duo of Whitney McCray and Kelly Anderson downed Patricia Starzyk and Caren Seenauth, 8-5 at No. 3, setting up the top doubles slot for the clinching point.

No. 18 Miller and Silverio then stopped a comeback by Audrey Banada and Melissa Applebaum to clinch the doubles point for the Yellow Jackets with a 9-7 score at the No. 1 position.

Banada tied the match at 1-1 when she defeated Shosho, 6-1, 6-1, at the No. 5 singles position, and Miami took a 2-1 lead in the match when No. 99 Emily Mowery downed Tech's Kacie Anson, 6-2, 6-0, at the No. 6 position.

After Miami went up 3-1 with a 6-3, 6-4 win by the nation's top-ranked Bradley at No. 1 singles, the Yellow Jackets battled back with wins at the Nos. 2 and 3 positions.

At No. 2, Potapova battled the Hurricane's Stevens, winning 6-2, 7-5, and the Jackets' Anderson came back after winning a tiebreaker in the first set to defeat Apolebaum, 7-6 (6), 6-1.

Silverio then came back to win her second set 6-4 after dropping the first by a 5-7 mark and then breezed through the final set, 6-2 against Starzyk, to give the Yellow Jackets their first ACC Championship.

CARY, N.C. - With singles wins by Kelly Anderson, Kristi Miller and Christy Striplin, the 10th-ranked Georgia Tech women's tennis team captured its second ACC Championship in as many years with a 4-1 victory over No. 9 Miami Sunday afternoon at the Cary Tennis Center in Cary, NC.

With the win, the Yellow Jackets tied their previous season-high with their 21st win, moving to 21-5 on the season, while Miami dropped to 19-6.

"Our goal from the first day of practice in the fall was to come back and win the ACC Championship," said Georgia Tech head coach Bryan Shelton. "The girls have kept that goal in front of them all year, and for them to come out and keep that against a great Miami team is just a credit to the heart and discipline that they show every day."

Tech improved to 5-3 against the Hurricanes, and are a perfect 5-0 against Miami since Shelton began coaching on the Flats in 2000. After earning the first ACC Tennis Championship in school history a year ago, the Jackets are now back-to-back champions for the first time in history.

The Jackets took a 1-0 lead in the match with quick victories at the Nos. 2 and 3 doubles slots. The Tech duo of Kacie Anson and Alison Silverio dropped Caren Seenauth and Patricia Starzyk, 8-3, on court three before Anderson and Whitney McCray captured the deciding point with an 8-4 victory over Monika Dancevic and Audrey Banada at the No. 2 position.

"I think that our team stepped up in so many spots today," said Shelton. "It started with our best doubles effort of the year, and it culminated with players stepping up in singles."

Anderson, ranked No. 111 in singles, gave the Jackets a 2-0 edge with a 6-0, 6-3 victory over Starzyk on court five before No. 83 Melissa Applebaum pulled the 'Canes within one point with a 6-2, 6-4 win over No. 60 Lyndsay Shosho at No. 2 singles.

ACC Tournament MVP Kristi Miller, the top-ranked singles player in the nation, then pushed the score to 3-0 with a hard-fought 6-4, 6-3 victory over the nation's No. 2 singles player, ACC Player of the Year Audra Cohen, before Striplin clinched the championship for the Jackets with a 6-1, 7-5 win against Seenauth at the No. 6 slot in the lineup. "Up and down the lineup, I saw quality tennis all day long," added Shelton, "and at the end of the day, we were

holding the trophy. I'm just really proud of this group of players."

CARY, N.C. - Christy Striplin won 12 of her last 13 games en route to a 2-6, 6-0, 6-1 victory at No. 5 singles to clinch match point as the fifth-ranked Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets (23-4) captured their third-straight ACC Women's Tennis Championship with a 4-1 win over No. 11 Miami in the title match Sunday afternoon at the Cary Tennis Complex. "It never gets old," said an elated Bryan Shelton, head coach of the three-time ACC Champion women's tennis

team.

For the third-straight day, the Yellow Jackets were led by freshman Amanda Craddock, who ended the tournament with a 3-0 record in singles and a 2-0 mark in doubles to earn MVP honors. Craddock posted a 6-3, 6-2 win over Miami's 50th-ranked Audrey Banada to tie the match at 1-1 after the Hurricanes won the doubles point to start the day.

"A.C. is well deserving (of MVP honors) after her play this weekend," said Shelton. "Not only did she win, but she won convincingly in all of her matches. She was the catalyst for this team all weekend, and the honor is just a tribute to what she's done all season. She has gotten better and better as the season has gone on."

Freshman Amanda McDowell gave the Yellow Jackets a 2-1 lead with a 6-1, 6-1 victory over Romy Farah at the No. 4 singles spot before Tech's eighth-ranked Kristi Miller stunned top-ranked Audra Cohen, 7-5, 6-2, at the top singles spot to push the score to 3-1. It was the second time in as many ACC Championship matches that Miller has bested Cohen.

"Kristi's win was huge," said Shelton. "Last year she got over the hump, beating Audra at ACC's, and she made shockwaves throughout the rankings. I think the same happened again today. She fell behind early (to Cohen), but got gritty and stuck in there. Once (Miller) got on top, she didn't relinquish the lead. I'm so proud of her effort, especially after losing doubles. She came back strong to lead this team to victory."

Miami began singles play with a 1-0 lead after winning at the Nos. 1 and 3 doubles positions. Banada and Gina Sabatino stopped the Yellow Jacket tandem of Tarryn Rudman and Kirsten Flower, 8-3, at the third doubles spot before Tech's 51st-ranked duo of Alison Silverio and Craddock handed Caren Seenauth and Farah an 8-6 loss at the second doubles position, setting up the top doubles line as the deciding match.

Miami's 33rd-ranked Cohen and Laura Vallverdu then outlasted Miller and Whitney McCray, the nation's thirdranked doubles team, 8-6, to give the Hurricanes the first point of the match.

CARY, N.C. - Sophomore Irina Falconi pulled off a dramatic three-set victory to clinch seventh-seeded Georgia Tech team's 4-3 win over top-seeded and No. 1 ranked North Carolina in the finals of the 2010 ACC Tournament at the Cary Tennis Center.

. The Yellow Jackets captured their fourth ACC Tournament title under head Bryan Shelton and first since 2007. "What an incredible weekend," Shelton said. "It is certainly one of the biggest highlights in our program's history.

It was a really special weekend to be able to see our players believe and execute the game plans. We fought through a lot of adversity this weekend physically but just remained so mentally tough."

Falconi, the tournament MVP, split the first two sets with No. 22 Sanaz Marand before winning the match in the third set, 6-1, 3-6, 6-4.

"That was one of the gutsiest performances that I have seen," said Shelton about Falconi. "For her to be able to steady herself and get to the net on two of the biggest points of the match to clinch it for us was incredible for us."

The Yellow Jackets opened the day by taking two of three doubles matches to open up an early 1-0 lead over the Tar Heels. After Elizabeth Kilborn and Viet Ha Ngo fell on court three, the Jackets tandem of Hillary Davis and Lynn Blau picked up their teammates with an 8-6 victory over Sophie Grabinski and Jelena Durisic. With the point on the line, Tech's No. 1 duo of Falconi and Sasha Krupina came through with an 8-5 win over Marand and Katrina Tsang.

North Carolina pulled even with the Jackets when Jelena Durisic upended Krupina, 6-3, 6-2, at No. 3 singles. The Tar Heels Shinann Featherston followed with a 6-0, 6-2 win over Davis at the sixth position in the lineup to open a 2-1 advantage on Tech.

Kilborn evened the score at 2-2 with a 6-2, 7-5 victory over Grabinski on court five but the Tar Heels would answer right back when No. 51 Tsang finished off Ngo, 6-2, 6-4 at No. 2 singles.

Down 3-2, the Jackets Lynn Blau came from behind to win a huge 1-6, 6-3, 6-3 win over Gina Suarez-Malaguti on court four.

The match came down to Falconi, the nation's top-ranked player, and she did not disappoint. Falconi captured her school-record 26th dual-match victory of the season and has now won 20 straight matches to lead Tech to the title. "We could not have done this without everyone on the team contributing," Shelton said. "This was truly a team

effort this weekend. We got a lift from everyone on the team and it led us to this win."

Kristi Miller became Georgia Tech's first women's tennis All-American when she earned All-American honors in singles as a freshman. The Marysville, Mich., native went on to become the most decorated student-athlete in school history, as she own's Tech's career marks in singles victories (152) and doubles wins (110). A six-time All-American (four-times singles, two-times doubles), Miller has also earned the prestigious Honda Award for Women's Tennis (2006) and is a four-time all-Atlantic Coast Conference honoree. Miller's accolades include being named the 2008 ACC Player of the Year, the ITA National Player to Watch and ACC Tournament MVP in 2006 and the ACC Rookie of the Year in 2005. Miller is a three-time CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American and finished her four-year degree with a perfect 4.0 grade point average at Georgia Tech.

LYNDSAY SHOSHO 2006 - DOUBLES



Lyndsay Shosho became the Yellow Jackets' second women's tennis All-American when she teamed with Kristi Miller to advance to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championships in her senior season (2006). The same year, Shosho set the then school record for singles wins in a season with 35 while breaking the mark for doubles victories at Tech. She currently stands fourth in Tech's record books with 83 career doubles wins and eight with 84 career singles wins. In addition to earning All-America honors, Shosho was twice named All-Atlantic Coast Conference Championships.

WHITNEY MCCRAY 2007 - Doubles



Whitney McCray earned All-American accolades in doubles during the 2007 season when she teamed with Kristi Miller to earn the No. 3 seed in the NCAA Doubles Championships. The Yellow Jacket duo, which reached as high as No. 3 before finishing the season at No. 7 in the national rankings, were ranked in the top-10 for the last three months of the season. McCray ranks second all-time in the Yellow Jacket record books with 101 career doubles wins. She was part of all three ACC Championships and was a key member of Tech's NCAA Championship team in 2007.

AMANDA MCDOWELL 2008 - SINGLES



Amanda McDowell became the first Georgia Tech women's tennis player to win an individual national title when she captured the 2008 NCAA Singles Championship. Only the second Yellow Jacket to earn All-America accolades in singles, McDowell finished her sophomore season with a school record 45 singles wins. She was named the 2008 ITA National Player of the Year and was the 2008 Honda Award recipient for women's tennis.

Irina Falconi became the fifth Yellow Jacket women to earn All-America honors and just the second freshman to be nationally recognized. Falconi won 30 matches including 18 over nationally-ranked players. She closed out her rookie campaign ranked No. 12 in the nation. In her sophomore, and final campaign on The Flats, by setting a school record for dual match wins, finishing 26-1. She posted a 40-3 overall singles mark, good for fourth all-time in the Tech annals. She posted a 30-3 mark against ranked foes and her .930 winning percentage is by far the best in school history. Falconi was the No. 1 seed in the 2010 NCAA Singles Tournament and advanced to the quarterfinals.

JILLIAN O'NEILL 2012 - SINGLES



Jillian O'Neill became the sixth Jacket to earn All-America honors when she finished the season ranked No. 12 in the ITA rankings. The Montreal, Quebec, native finished the year with a team-best 30 singles wins and a 17-9 mark from the No. 1 spot in Tech's dual lineup. O'Neill claimed 16 wins over ranked foes. She advanced to the NCAA Singles Championship for the second time in 2012 and finished her two-year Tech career with a 54-29 singles record.

Megan Kurey earned All-American accolades in doubles during the 2014 season when she teamed with Kendal Woodard to earn a 5-8 seed in the NCAA Doubles Championships. The tandem won the 2013 ITA/USTA Southeast Doubles Title and the 2013 USTA/ITA National Indoor Intercollegiate Championships doubles title. Kurey was named to the All-ACC second team in 2014.

KENDAL WOODARD 2014 - DOUBLES





Paige Hourigan earned All-American accolades in both singles and doubles her senior season on The Flats. In singles play, Hourigan posted a 24-13 overall recordand went 16-10 in dual action. A four-time all-ACC selection, Hourigan was named to the first team to cap her collegiate career. Ranked as high as No. 12 in the ITA rankings during the season where she finished the year, Hourigan reached the NCAA Tournament round of 16 in singles action before fallling to eventual national champion Arianne Hartono of Ole Miss. Hourigan received at-large bids to the NCAA Singles Championship all four years as a Yellow Jacket. With doubles partner, Kenya Jones, the tandem finished the season ranked No. 1 in the country in the final ITA rankings. The pair went 27-8 overall and 18-5 in dual competition. Earning the ACC's automatic NCAA Tournament bid, the tandem capped their season in the NCAA quarterfinals. They spent the entire season ranked in the top five in the country and both were named all-ACC.

KENYA JONES 2018 - DOUBLES 2019 - SINGLE



Kenya Jones earned All-American accolades with doubles partner Paige Hourigan in 2017-18. The tandem finished the season ranked No. 1 in the country in the final ITA rankings. The pair went 27-8 overall and 18-5 in dual competition. Earning the ACC's automatic NCAA Tournament bid, the tandem capped their season in the NCAA guarterfinals. They spent the entire season ranked in the top five in the country and both were named all-ACC. Jones was then tabbed an All-American in singles her junior season, in 2018-19. She finished with a 29-12 overall mark and rose as high as No. 8 in the national rankings. She capped the campaign ranked No. 15 nationally.
