## OPENING DRIVE

### BACK IN OUR HOUSE

- After back-to-back road games to open the season, Syracuse kicks off a three-game homestand when Georgia Tech visits 'Cuse.
- Syracuse is set to debut \$118 million in renovations to the stadium this weekend after a new roof and other amenities were installed in the building this offseason.
- The COVID-19 pandemic pushing the season back a week, plus two-straight road games to start make this the latest home opener in the history of the building and latest since the Orange hosted Kansas on this date in 1970. The only exception to this is the 1979 season, when Syracuse did not play any home games while the Dome (also known as the Loud House) was being constructed.
- The game will air on ACC Regional Sports Networks, with Tom Werme '91 (PxP), James Bates (analyst) and Lyndsay Rowley (reporter) on the call.

### ORANGE IN HOME OPENERS

- Syracuse is 91-33-4 in home openers – a record that excludes the 1979 season when the Orange played all their games on the road due to the construction of the Dome – and the 1889 season when Syracuse did not play a home game.
- Since the Dome opened in 1980, Syracuse is 16-17 in home starters.
- Syracuse has won six of its last-seven home openers, including a 3-1 mark under **Dino Babers**.
- This is the second-straight season in which Syracuse faces a conference opponent in its home opener. Prior to facing Clemson in the opener last season, Syracuse had not faced a conference foe since beginning the 2005 season vs. then BIG EAST rival West Virginia.

### A NEW STADIUM EXPERIENCE

- Saturday's game will be the first at Syracuse since the University began work on creating a new stadium experience.
- Unfortunately it'll debut in a fan-less stadium due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but Saturday's game will be the debut of a new fixed roof, a vertically hung scoreboard, state-of-the-art sound and lighting systems, improved accessibility and added Wi-Fi capabilities are just a handful of features.
- The new crown truss atop the building consists of over 6-million pounds of structural steel and the center-hung scoreboard is 7,022 square feet, making it the second-largest indoor center-hung system in the United States.
- The first Syracuse football game in the building came 40 years ago this week, when Syracuse defeated Miami (OH) on Sept. 20, 1980.

Seating and sideline access will be limited this season due to social distancing guidelines.

### MEDIA PARKING

Parking for media in the WEST Lots (Standart West and Henry) across the street from the Dome is limited. Passes are issued on a priority basis within the same guidelines as working credentials.

### POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

All postgame media will be virtual this season. Coach Babers and select student-athletes will be made available after the game via Zoom. An off-site moderator will open the Zoom meeting shortly after the conclusion of the game and will field questions from the media.

## GAME #3 MATCHUP: GEORGIA TECH

### SERIES HISTORY

- This will be the fourth all-time meeting between Georgia Tech and Syracuse, with all four meetings coming in the last 20 years.
- The Yellow Jackets lead the series 3-0. Two of the matchups have been played at neutral locations. The teams have met just once as ACC opponents since the Orange joined the ACC in 2013.
- The first meeting in the series was second-to-last Kickoff Classic, the original preseason "bowl" game, in when 10th-ranked Georgia Tech beat unranked Syracuse, 13-7.
- Georgia Tech is Syracuse's least-played opponent within the ACC. Duke is second on the list with a total of four games between the conference opponents, two of which were conference meetings.
- With the 10-game conference slate this season, Syracuse will play four games against ACC Coastal opponents, including Georgia Tech, to start the season. 'Cuse is 4-6 under head coach **Dino Babers** in games vs. the ACC Coastal. Babers is 3-5 vs. this year's slate of teams, having faced North Carolina, Duke and Pitt in his Syracuse tenure.

### LAST TIME VS. GEORGIA TECH

- Georgia Tech defeated the Orange 56-0 on Oct. 19, 2013, in the last meeting between the two programs.
- It was Syracuse's first game vs. Georgia Tech as conference foes in 2013.
- Orange QBs Terrel Hunt and Drew Allen threw for 133 yards.
- Georgia Tech QBs Vad Lee and Justin Thomas were held to 88 yards, including zero yards in the first half.
- RB Prince-Tyson Gulley took the first-quarter kickoff 49 yards for the longest Orange kickoff return of the season.
- LB Marquez Hodge tallied a career high 12 tackles.

### SYRACUSE-GT CONNECTIONS

- Syracuse has three players from the state of Georgia: LB Steve Linton (Dublin), DB Kyle Strickland (Roswell) and P/PK James Williams (Watkinsville) are all Georgia-natives.
- Georgia Tech does not have any players who hail from New York.

### A WIN WOULD ...

- Improve **Dino Babers'** record to 24-27 as head coach of the Orange.
- Make five-straight seasons with a victory over an ACC Coastal Division opponent. Usually, the Orange play two per year, but with the revamped format will play four teams from what was the ACC Coastal in 2020.
- Give Syracuse its 736th all-time victory (includes 11 wins from 2004-06 that were vacated by the NCAA). The Orange currently rank 20th on the FBS ledger of winningest programs. Syracuse is one of 28 FBS schools to have accumulated 700+ wins.

- Georgia Tech is coached by Geoff Collins, who is in his second season with the Yellow Jackets. Collins has not coached against the Orange previously as a head coach.
- In last week's non-conference matchup against UCF, QB Dillon Gabriel threw for 417 yards and four scores to lead the Knights to a 49-21 victory over the Yellow Jackets.
- Tech quarterback Jeff Sims became the first true freshman quarterback in Georgia Tech history to win in a season opener when the Yellow Jackets took down Florida State, 16-13. Sims' 23 completions were the most by a Yellow Jacket quarterback since Reggie Ball had 24 completions versus North Carolina in 2005.
- Sims currently ranks second in the ACC and seventh in the nation with 521 total passing yards.
- Tech's rushing offense (194 ypg.) ranks fourth in the ACC and 22nd in the nation.
- The Yellow Jackets have caused five turnovers this season, tied for the most in the ACC.
- Last season, linebacker David Curry ranked eighth in the ACC and 53rd nationally with 8.1 tackles per game (92 total).

## GAME NOTES: TEAM

### HOME-INATION

- Syracuse is 9-3 since the start of 2018 at home, including a 3-3 record in 2019.
- Under **Dino Babers**, Syracuse is 15-10 at home. Home field success has been a staple at all three of his coaching stops, with Babers' teams combining to go 33-15 when defending their home field.
- The Orange were undefeated in the Loud House in 2018, going 6-0 in the building. The 2018 campaign was SU's fourth perfect home season since 1980; the three previous unbeaten campaigns (all 6-0) were in 1987, 1988 and 2001.

### HOME NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

- The Orange will play one non-conference game in 2020, hosting Liberty on Oct. 17. Syracuse went 2-0 in home non-conference games a year ago.
- Syracuse is 7-2 in its nine home non-league games under **Dino Babers**, including five straight victories.
- Under Babers, Syracuse has outscored its non-conference opponents in the Loud House, 373-170.
- The Orange have not lost a non-ACC game at home since Sept. 9, 2017 when they were beaten 30-23 by Middle Tennessee.

### BABERS CROSSES THE CENTURY MARK

- Head coach **Dino Babers** coached the 100th game of his career on Nov. 16, 2019 at Duke. In his eight seasons as a sideline leader at Eastern Illinois, Bowling Green and Syracuse, Babers has worked 103 games and holds an overall record of 60-44 (.583).
- Saturday's game will be Babers' 52nd at Syracuse, moving him into solo possession of the eighth most games coached at SU (Ben Schwartzwalder - 247, Paul Pasqualoni - 167, Dick MacPherson - 116, Frank Maloney - 78, Frank O'Neill - 77, Ossie Solem - 63 and Vic Hanson - 59).

### JONATHAN JOINS ACC SEARCH

- Senior defensive end **Kingsley Jonathan** has been selected to the Atlantic Coast Conference Search Advisory Committee. He's one-of-five student-athletes on the 20-member committee, which also includes Syracuse AD **John Wildhack**.
- Previously, Jonathan was named as one-of-three student-athlete representatives from the ACC to represent his peers on proposed NCAA rule changes under the Division I Autonomy process.
- A Campbell Trophy and Wuerffel Trophy nominee this season, Jonathan was a CoSIDA Academic All-District selection and was picked to the All-ACC Academic Team last year.

### INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

- The Orange roster features 13 players born outside the United States, including six from Canada. Both the total number of foreign-born players and Canadian players leads all FBS schools.
- Temple (9), Colorado (7) and Utah (7) have the next most foreign-born players on their rosters.

### TURNOVER TALE

- Syracuse hasn't lost the turnover battle in nine-straight contests and is 18-4-5 in winning the takeaway battle in the last-three seasons.
- 'Cuse has ranked in the top-15 in turnover margin in each of the past two seasons and started 2020 off by going +2 in the category.
- LB **Mikel Jones** leads the Orange with three takeaways on the year (2 INT, 1 FR).
- In 2019, the Orange committed 16 turnovers, while gaining 25 (+9), for an average margin of +0.75. That figure ranked 13th nationally.
- In 2018, Syracuse was even better. Led by a defense that recorded 31 takeaways, including 18 interceptions, the Orange tied Ohio for No. 5 in average turnover margin (+1.0).
- Syracuse and Arizona State are only two FBS programs to rank in the top 15 of the statistic both of the last-two seasons. The Sun Devils tied for 11th in 2018 and ranked No. 6 in 2019.

### THE CARTER I

- Syracuse true freshman safety **Ja'Had Carter** started last week at Pittsburgh.
- He's just the third true freshman safety to earn a start in the last-15 years, joining preseason AP All-American **Andre Cisco** who started every game of his rookie season in 2018 and **Shamarko Thomas**, who started the last-three games of his rookie season in 2009.

## GAME NOTES: OFFENSE

### THE NEED FOR SPEED

- Since head coach **Dino Babers** arrived in 2016, Syracuse has run 4,097 plays in 51 games – an average of 80.3 plays per game.
- Syracuse ran 73 plays in the opener vs. North Carolina and 58 in Week 2 vs. Pittsburgh.
- The Orange have ranked in the top five in the FBS in total plays in two of the past three seasons, including logging a school-record 1,063 plays in 2018.
- In 2019, SU averaged 75.6 plays per contest and tied for 45th nationally with 909 plays. However, among teams that only played 12 games, the Orange tied Ball State for fourth. Tulsa (947), Texas Tech (935) and UCLA (916) were the only teams not to make the postseason that ran more plays than Syracuse.

### POINTS-A-PLenty

- Over the last three seasons, the Orange have seven 50+ points games, the third-most of any ACC team during that span.
- Five of those offensive outbursts came in 2018 as Syracuse established a new school record for 50+ point contests. The previous standard was set by the 1904 team, which achieved the feat four times.
- The Orange logged their only 50-point outing of 2019 on Sept. 21, tallying 52 points versus Western Michigan.

### REUNITED IN COMMAND

- Head coach **Dino Babers** hired **Sterlin Gilbert** as the new offensive coordinator for this season. Babers and Gilbert previously coached together from 2012-14 at Eastern Illinois and Bowling Green.
- While together, they produced one of the most explosive offenses in the country. In their first year together in 2012, Eastern Illinois ranked seventh in the FCS in total offense (470.9), sixth in passing offense (334.9) and fourth in first downs per game (25.3).
- Their second season together was where things broke out, as Eastern Illinois finished first in total offense (589.5), second in passing offense (372.4) and first in first downs per game (39.5) in 2013. In their most recent year together (Bowling Green in 2014), they finished 41st in total offense (432.9) in their first season together at the FBS level with Bowling Green.

### ELITE COMPANY

- Redshirt junior QB **Tommy DeVito** was one of seven Power-Five quarterbacks with 19+ touchdown passes and five or fewer interceptions in 2019.
- DeVito and Louisville signal-caller Micale Cunningham were the only two ACC passers in that elite group and they're the only two who'll suit up this fall.
- DeVito's 19 scoring passes tied Donovan McNabb (1996) and Ryan Nassib (2010) for the most by a sophomore in program history.

## GAME NOTES: OFFENSE

### ORANGE DIG THE LONG BALL

- A good portion of Syracuse's scoring since the start of 2019 has come by virtue of big plays in the passing game.
- The Orange continued the trend vs. Pittsburgh after QB **Rex Culpepper** connected with WR **Taj Harris** on a 69-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter.
- In all, 34.8 percent (8-of-23) of Syracuse's passing touchdowns were from 40+ yards out and six covered more than 50 yards.
- The average length of the Orange's receiving touchdowns since the start of 2019 is 35.1 yards.
- According to Pro Football Focus, QB **Tommy DeVito** accounted for the longest downfield TD pass in 2019 (line of scrimmage to where the reception occurs) with his 53-yard TD pass at Western Michigan. He led Ohio State's Justin Fields (52) and Clemson's Trevor Lawrence (52) in the category.
- WR **Taj Harris** (94, 69, 47), TE **Luke Benson** (70) and WR **Trishton Jackson** (85, 59, 52, 46) were the recipients of Syracuse's long-distance passing scores.
- Including rushing touchdowns, 16 of Syracuse's 40 (40 pct.) total offensive TDs since 2019 have been scored from outside the red zone.

### I AM IRON MAN

- Redshirt-senior offensive lineman **Airon Servais** enters Saturday's game with 39-straight starts.
- Among offensive linemen in the last decade, only Evan Adams (45) and Rob Trudo (44) have more starts in their careers than Servais currently has. Servais is now tied with Sean Hickey (39) for the third-most offensive line starts in the last-10 years.
- Hickey is the only other player of the aforementioned bunch to make all of their starts consecutively.

### TARGETING TAJ

- WR **Taj Harris** appears to be the next receiver to benefit with big numbers in the Orange offense.
- Harris ranks fourth in the ACC at 17.0 yards per catch.
- His 68.0 yards per game ranks eighth in the ACC through two contests.
- With eight receptions thus far, he leads all Orange receivers.

### ELMORE DOES IT ALL

- TE/FB/OL **Chris Elmore**, who has played in all 39 games the past four seasons on offense and has started.
- Elmore also saw field time as a reserve nose tackle in seven games in 2019. It wasn't a new position for Elmore, who set the Illinois state record with 44 career sacks as a standout defensive lineman at Chicago's Phillips Academy.
- In his Syracuse career, he's started at offensive line, played 76 defensive snaps and scored three rushing touchdowns as a fullback.

### RE-TOOLED LINE

- OL **Carlos Vettorello** and OL **Airon Servais** swapped positions for the final three games of last season, leading to immediate results in the running game as well as in pass protection. Vettorello moved from left tackle to center and Servais went from center out to left tackle.
- Syracuse averaged 242.3 yards rushing following the switch, an increase of 88.3 yards per game more than its season average (154.0). The Orange's sacks allowed per game dropped as well, going from 4.9 to 1.7.
- Two of the Orange's three 200+ rushing performances came during the stretch, including a season-best 286 yards and four TDs on the ground at Duke in the first game after the lineup shuffle.
- That duo plus OL **Matthew Bergeron** and OL **Dakota Davis** all return from the 2019 starting lineup along the line, although Davis missed the first two contests of this season. Darius Tisdale and Chris Elmore have filled in the guard spots in replace of Davis and Evan Adams, who graduated last spring.

## GAME NOTES: DEFENSE

### PICK-CISCO

- With his interception in the season opener, DB **Andre Cisco** moved into a tie for fourth all-time at Syracuse with 13 career interceptions.
- Markus Paul (1985-88) leads the group with 19, followed by Tommy Myers (1969-71) with 18. Anthony Smith (2002-05) is the only player with more than Cisco in the last-30 years with 14, followed by Cisco and Walt Slovenski (1946-48) in a tie with 13.
- Perhaps more impressive than the total is the speed at which he's climbed the ranks. The North Carolina game was Cisco's 23rd game played at Syracuse. For comparison, Paul amassed his 19 INTs over 44 career games.
- Cisco also moved into a tie for 10th in program history with 29 passes defended after his interception in the opener.
- The AP Preseason First Team All-American S **Andre Cisco** led the conference in interceptions (5) for the second year in a row in 2019 and ranked fourth nationally in interceptions per game (0.6).
- He enters Saturday's game vs. Pittsburgh with an interception in four-straight games dating back to last season.
- Cisco is the FBS active leader with 13 interceptions and is No. 2 in passes defended per game (1.26) behind Stanford's Paulson Adebo (1.73), although Stanford is not playing this fall.

### TAKETH AWAY

- Since the 2017 season finale against Boston College, the Orange have registered at least one takeaway in 27 out of 28 games.
- In all, Syracuse has gained 62 turnovers (28 fumble recoveries, 34 INTs) during that time, an average of 2.2 per contest.
- From Nov. 25, 2017 versus Boston College to Oct. 18, 2019 against Pittsburgh, Syracuse gained at least one turnover in 21 consecutive games, including all 13 contests during the 2018 season. The streak was the longest in FBS football before it was snapped on Oct. 26 at Florida State.
- Twenty different players had at least one turnover gained during the streak.
- In 2019, the Orange tied for 12th nationally and second in the ACC with 25 takeaways.

### HEY ROOKIE

- True freshman **Stefon Thompson** earned the start at linebacker at North Carolina. He's the first true freshman to start the first game of the year at the position for Syracuse since Dyshawn Davis in 2011.
- Thompson is the fourth Orange rookie to start the opener on defense since 2011, joining DB **Andre Cisco**, DL Kendall Coleman and Davis.
- Thompson was third on the team with seven tackles in his first career start.
- DB **Ja'Had Carter** added to the youth of the defensive unit, as the true freshman started at safety vs. Pittsburgh.

### YOUTH MOVEMENT

- The Orange linebacking corps features more young talent than any other position group.
- The starting lineup vs. North Carolina and Pitt featured sophomores **Mikel Jones** and **Geoff Cantin-Arku**, and true freshman **Stefon Thompson**.
- The next trio on the depth chart has the same youth, with sophomore **Lee Kpogba**, redshirt-freshman **Steve Linton** and true freshman **Marlowe Wax** spelling the first unit. Redshirt-junior **Tyrell Richards** returned to the lineup at Pitt as the group's elder statesman with 24 career games played.
- Jones' 14 games is the next-most tangible experience of the unit, followed by Kpogba (13), Cantin-Arku (11) and Linton (4).

### THE HEARTBREAK KIDS

- Nicknamed the 'Heartbreak Kids' or 'Wonder Twins' the DB combination of **Andre Cisco** and **Trill Williams** has garnered much-deserved recognition this offseason.
- Cisco (25) and Williams (16) were both picked in the top-25 of Bruce Feldman's annual 'Freaks List' honoring the most freakishly athletic players in college football.
- Cisco is the nation's leader active leader in interceptions with 13.

### SECOND-HALF SURGE

- The Orange defense allowed 12.6 points per game after halftime compared to 18.1 prior to intermission in 2019. After allowing three fourth-quarter TDs against North Carolina, 'Cuse returned to that form at Pitt, surrendering just one scoring drive after halftime.
- Over the last eight games of last season, the unit limited the opposition to an average of 10.8 points an outing following the break.
- Syracuse did not allow a second-half touchdown in four out of its last eight games in 2019 (vs. Holy Cross, at NC State, vs. Pittsburgh, at Duke).

### NO FLY ZONE

- Interceptions have been the hallmark of the Syracuse secondary since the start of 2018. The Orange had intercepted a pass in 17 consecutive games before their streak was snapped on Sept. 28 last season against Holy Cross, tied for the third-longest streak since the start of the 2004 college football season.
- Orange defenders have picked off 34 passes (1.27 per game) since the 2018 campaign starter at Western Michigan.
- Syracuse has nine games with at least two picks during that time. Against Wagner in 2018 and Wake Forest in 2019, the Orange intercepted three passes, the most in one game under **Dino Babers**.
- In 2018, the Orange ranked fifth nationally with 18 interceptions, more than quadrupling their 2017 total (4). Syracuse was 25th in 2019 with 13 picks and has started

- Along the same lines, the Orange defense had 68 passes defended (13 INT, 55 PBU) in 2019, which tied for 15th nationally.
- Syracuse averaged 5.67 passes defended per game, which was fifth. It marked the first time since 2005, the Orange averaged better than 5.0 passes defended per game.
- CB **Ifeatu Melifonwu** (2 INT, 8 PBU) and S **Andre Cisco** (5 INT, 5 PBU) led the way with 10 each among returners.

## GAME NOTES: SPECIAL TEAMS

### COVER ME

- Syracuse led the ACC and tied Penn State for fifth nationally in punt return defense in 2019. The Orange surrendered 17 yards on 10 returns (1.7 avg.), eclipsing the previous school record for fewest opponent punt return yards allowed (24 in 2017).
- The longest opponent punt return was a 5-yard runback by Holy Cross' Jon Jon Roberts, who fumbled on the play.
- 2019 was the third year in a row that Syracuse topped the ACC in net punting average at 43.03 yards per kick. It was a figure that ranked No. 3 in the FBS. Through two weeks, 'Cuse is on pace to do so again.
- Nolan Cooney is second nationally in punting, with an average of 46.2.

### POINT SZMYT

- PK **Andre Szmyt** remains the active FBS leader in career points scored per game at 9.3. His scoring average is slightly less than a point better than Wake Forest PK Nick Sciba, Memphis PK Riley Patterson and NC State PK Christopher Dunn, who are all tied for second with 8.5 points per game.
- In the Syracuse record book, Szmyt is No. 5 in career kicking points (251).
- Szmyt has at least one made field goal in 24 out of his 27 career games and has booted multiple field goals on 17 occasions.
- A 2019 All-ACC Third Team selection, Szmyt made 17 out of 20 (.850) field goals and hit 39-of-40 (.975) PATs to lead the Orange with 90 points. He ended the season by making eight consecutive field goals.

### NEXT IN LINE

- Syracuse has to replace Ray Guy Award finalist **Sterling Hofrichter** who was drafted in the seventh round by the Atlanta Falcons. That job will go to **Nolan Cooney**, who was the Orange's backup for the past-four seasons.
- Cooney ranks second in FBS football among eligible punters (min. 3.6 punts per game) in punting, with an average of 46.2 yards per punt.
- Hofrichter is the third Syracuse punter drafted and second in the last-five years after current Giants' punter Riley Dixon was selected by the Broncos in the seventh round in 2016.
- Syracuse and Texas A&M are the only two schools to have multiple punters selected in the NFL Draft in the last 15 years.

### SZMYT AMONG FG LEADERS

- Junior PK **Andre Szmyt** enters Saturday's game tied for second among active players in career field goals made.
- Miami's Jose Borregales leads all active players with 55 made field goals, while Szmyt and Memphis' Riley Patterson tie in the second spot at 50.
- Szmyt is currently in sole possession of fourth in Syracuse history with 50 made field goals. He passed Nate Trout (2010-13) and Ross Krautman (2010-13) vs. Pittsburgh. Cole Murphy (2014-17) leads all Syracuse players with 59 career made field goals.

### FINDING THE END ZONE

## OUR HOUSE- THE LOUD HOUSE



• Built between April 1979 and September 1980, the Dome was the fifth-largest stadium of its kind in the U.S. at the time and the first in the Northeast. The building covers 7.7 acres and has 527,320 square feet of floor space. It is 570 feet long and 497 feet wide, and the top of the Dome is 165 feet above the playing surface.

• In May 2018, the University Board of Trustees authorized a \$118 million investment for new stadium improvements. Renovations began in March of 2020 with the installation of a new fixed roof. Additional upgrades include a center-hung scoreboard, state-of-the-art sound and lighting systems, improved accessibility and added Wi-Fi capabilities. Air conditioning, new accessible restrooms and new concessions space are elements expected to be ready by fall of 2022.

• The new roof features over 3,000 tons of steel fixed to the structure and the center-hung scoreboard is the second-largest center-hung indoor system in the United States.

**CHAPEL HILL, N.C.** – The Orange opened the 2020 campaign hanging tight in a defensive battle with No. 18 North Carolina on Saturday, before the Tar Heels pulled away in the fourth and won 31-6 in a fan-less Kenan Memorial Stadium due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Syracuse trailed by four at halftime, 7-3, due to a strong defensive effort but the Tar Heels scored touchdowns on three-straight possessions to lead 31-6, a score that would hold until the final whistle. Orange quarterback **Tommy DeVito** broke the school record for consecutive passes without an interception, previously set by R.J. Anderson (190 from 2002-03), extending his streak to 201 attempts.

On the defensive side the Orange forced three Carolina turnovers including a pair of interceptions by linebacker **Mikel Jones** and defensive back **Andre Cisco**. Cisco's third-quarter interception was the 13th of his career and put him into fourth-place (tied with Walt Slovenski (1946-48) on the Syracuse all-time list and now leads all active FBS players. **Garrett Williams** led 'Cuse with nine total tackles in his first collegiate appearance, while **Stefon Thompson** and **Geoff Cantin-Arku** each had eight total tackles in their first career starts.
