- For the second time in as many home games, Georgia Tech welcomes a top-five opponent to Bobby Dodd Stadium when No. 4 Notre Dame visits for an Atlantic Coast Conference matchup on Saturday.
- In 85 seasons since the Associated Press released its first college football rankings in 1936, Georgia Tech is playing top-five opponents in consecutive home games for only the second time when it welcomes No. 4 ND just two weeks after it hosted top-ranked Clemson. The only other time the Yellow Jackets played host to top-five teams in back-to-back home games came in 1983, when it hosted No. 5 North Carolina two weeks before it welcomed No. 5 Auburn to Grant Field.
- Georgia Tech and Notre Dame are renewing their rivalry for the 36th time in a series that dates back to 1922, but are squaring off in a conference matchup for the first time. ND, which is a full-time member of the ACC in all sports but football, is playing a full ACC slate in 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic.
- The Fighting Irish lead the all-time series, 28-6-1. However, the Yellow Jackets have had recent success against the Irish, winning two of the last four games in the series — a 33-3 rout at ND in 2007 and a 35-28 victory in the 1999 Gator Bowl (at the conclusion of the 1998 season). During that 2-2 span, the Jackets' two losses were a 30-22 defeat at No.8 ND in 2015 and a 14-10 home loss to the secondranked Irish in 2006.
- Georgia Tech will pay homage to its famed Black Watch defense of the 1980s on Saturday when it wears throwback uniforms featuring black jerseys that the Yellow Jackets wore under head coach Bill Curry from 1980-86.

GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

Georgia Tech continues to rank first in the ACC in fewest sacks allowed per game this season (1.67). Last season. Tech finished 86th nationally in sacks allowed (2.33/gm).

Georgia Tech Sr. P Pressley Harvin III was named the Ray Guy Award National Punter of the Week for the second time this season after averaging a career-best 52.0 yards per punt last Saturday at Boston College. Harvin, who was also named National Punter of the Week following Georgia Tech's game vs. No. 14/13 UCF on Sept. 19, has been tabbed as one of the Ray Guy Award's "Ray's 4," which honors the college football's top four punters each week, following five of the Yellow Jackets' six games this season. For the season, Harvin ranks fourth nationally in punting (48.5 avg.) and Georgia Tech ranks fifth nationally in net punting (46.09 avg.).

Georgia Tech has two players on its current roster that have a touchdown pass, a touchdown run and a touchdown reception in their careers — So. WR Ahmarean Brown and Jr. DB Tobias Oliver (who previously played QB and WR for the Yellow Jackets before moving to defense this season). Brown has accomplished all three this season — he threw for a TD on Oct. 9 vs. Louisville and had receiving and rushing TDs last Saturday at Boston College. He is the first Yellow Jacket with a TD pass, rush and reception in the same season since Taylor Bennett in 2007 and the first non-quarterback at Tech to accomplish the feat since RB P.J. Daniels in 2004.

Despite not forcing a turnover for the first time all season last Saturday at Boston College, Georgia Tech ranks ninth nationally in turnovers gained this season (11 total - 1.83 per game). Last season, the Yellow Jackets finished 84th nationally with 16 takeaways in 12 games (1.33/gm).

Georgia Tech has a total of 83 "Money Down" (third/fourth down) stops (defense) plus conversions (offense) this season. Head coach Geoff Collins has pledged to donate \$10 to Children's Healthcare of Atlanta for each Georgia Tech Money Down defensive stop and offensive conversion this season, meaning that his season-long donation total through six games is \$930.

With 308 rushing yards, 206 receiving yards and 205 kickoff return yards this season, Georgia Tech true Fr. RB Jahmyr Gibbs is the first player from a Power Five conference to record 300 rushing yards, 200 receiving yards and 200 kickoff return yards in his team's first six games of the season since Penn State's Saquon Barkley in 2017. Gibbs, who has accomplished the feat in only five games due to missing Tech's season opener at Florida State, is the first Yellow Jacket with 300 rushing yards, 200 receiving yards and 200 kickoff return yards in the team's first six games of the season since Orwin Smith in 2011.

GEORGIA TECH SECOND-YEAR HEAD COACH — GEOFF COLLINS

Geoff Collins, an Atlanta area native and one of college football's most successful and innovative coaches, is in his second season as Georgia Tech football's head coach. He was named the 20th football head coach in Georgia Tech history on Dec. 7, 2018.

Born in Decatur, Ga. and raised in Conyers, Ga., Collins took the reins at Georgia Tech after serving as the head coach at Temple University in 2017 and 2018.

Despite the challenges associated with overhauling Georgia Tech's football culture, including the monumental switch from its previous option-based offense to a pro-style, spread attack, highlights from Collins' first year on The Flats included:

- a thrilling 28-21 overtime win at Miami (Fla.), the Yellow Jackets' first-ever win over the Hurricanes at Miami's Hard Rock Stadium;
- four players named all-Atlantic Coast Conference all of which were underclassmen and return to The Flats in 2020;
- Tyler Davis, who Collins recruited to Georgia Tech as a graduate transfer, being selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the sixth round of the 2020 National Football League draft, becoming the highest-selected tight end in program history and the first Yellow Jacket TE taken in the NFL Draft in 28 years;
- a team grade point average of 3.0 at the conclusion of the 2020 spring semester the highest team GPA in program history.

His impact has also been felt in his prowess as a recruiter. Most notably, Georgia Tech's first full recruiting class under Collins, the incoming class of 2020, was ranked No. 24 nationally by Rivals, making it only the second top-25 recruiting class in Tech history and the first since 2007, a class that was compiled when Collins served as the Yellow Jackets' director of player personnel. A total of 12 four- and five-star recruits have joined the Jackets' since Collins' arrival as head coach in December 2018.

Prior to taking the reins at Georgia Tech, Collins put together the most successful first two seasons by a head coach in Temple's 121-year football history. Collins compiled 15 wins and led Temple to two bowl games in his two seasons with the Owls, which are both school records for a coach in his first two campaigns at TU.

In his first season at Temple, Collins led the Owls a 28-3 win over Florida International in the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl, which was good for only the third bowl victory in school history and its first since 2011.

He coached the Owls to an 8-4 record and 7-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference in 2018, with Temple's only conference defeat coming at No. 8-ranked and undefeated UCF. The 8-4 campaign earned Temple a berth in the Independence Bowl.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida (2015-16), Mississippi State (2013-14, co-DC: 2011-12), FIU (2010) and his alma mater, Western Carolina (2002-05).

Highlights of his career as a coordinator included ranking among the nation's top 10 in total defense in each of his two seasons at Florida (No. 8 in 2015 and No. 5 in 2016), ranking among the top 25 nationally in total defense (18th – 2013) and scoring defense (23rd – 2014) during his two seasons calling plays at Mississippi State and leading the Sun Belt Conference in total defense, scoring defense and turnover margin in his lone campaign at FIU (2010).

He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools (FIU – 2010, Mississippi State – 2014 and Florida – 2015). Collins' 27-year career also includes a pair of prior stints at Georgia Tech. He first came to The Flats as a graduate assistant (1999-2000), then tight ends coach (2001) under head coach George O'Leary from 1999-2001, followed by a year as director of player personnel under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006.

During his initial three seasons at Georgia Tech under O'Leary, the Yellow Jackets were 25-12 with three-consecutive bowl appearances. As the Jackets' director of player personnel in 2006, Collins led the efforts to land a recruiting class that included Derrick Morgan (all-American, first-round NFL Draft pick), Morgan Burnett (all-American, third-round NFL Draft pick), Joshua Nesbitt (quarterbacked GT to two ACC Championship Games) and Jonathan Dwyer (the sixth-leading rusher in GT history).

Collins' coaching career also includes stops at Western Carolina (student assistant – 1993-94), Franklin (N.C.) H.S. (assistant coach – 1995), Fordham (linebackers coach – 1996), Albright (defensive

coordinator — 1997-98), Alabama (director of player personnel — 2007) and UCF (linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator — 2008-09)

In all, Collins has recruited and/or coached more than three dozen players that have gone on to play in the National Football League. Among Collins' pupils in the NFL are Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro defensive tackle Fletcher Cox (a consensus All-American at Mississippi State and No. 12 overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft), Tampa Bay Buccaneers cornerback Vernon Hargreaves (a consensus All-American at Florida and No. 11 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft), Atlanta Falcons safety Keanu Neal (the No. 17 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft) and Indianapolis Colts cornerback Rock Ya-Sin (who earned first-team all-American Athletic Conference honors at Temple after transferring from Presbyterian College and went on to be selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft)

In addition to being renowned as a coach, strategist and evaluator, Collins is also widely recognized as the nation's top head coach when it comes to branding his football program, particularly when it comes to utilizing social media in branding and recruiting efforts. His expertise in marketing and branding has led to him being a guest lecturer for Georgia Tech's Scheller College of Business executive MBA program and a featured speaker at the 2019 Hashtag Sports conference in New York City. Under Collins, Tech became only the second college football program in the nation to partner with renowned creative agency J1S and the first program in the nation to enter into a partnership with best-selling author and branding consultant Jeremy Darlow.

Collins' innovations in utilizing social media to aid in recruiting efforts have not only helped Georgia Tech land the two highest-rated recruiting classes in school history, but also helped Alabama sign the No. 1 class in the nation in 2007-08. Alabama's 2008 signing class included running back Mark Ingram, who went on to become the first Heisman Trophy winner in Crimson Tide history in 2009.

As a student-athlete, Collins totaled 194 career tackles as an outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina (1989-92). He had 68 tackles and six tackles for loss as a junior and helped lead WCU to a 7-4 record with 62 stops, including five behind the line of scrimmage, as a senior.

Collins, 49, is married to the former Jennifer Haynes. They have a daughter, Astrid (4).

Georgia Tech won at Notre Dame for the first time in eight tries. Freshman phenom Clint Castleberry threw a touchdown pass in his only season at Tech, before dying while piloting a plane during World War II.

1976: GEORGIA TECH 23, NOTRE DAME 14

In the "Passless Upset," the Jackets — with freshman QB Gary Lanier (now a member of Georgia Tech's Alexander-Tharpe Fund staff) running Pepper Rodgers' option to perfection — didn't throw a pass in shocking the 11th-ranked Irish.

1980: GEORGIA TECH 3, NOTRE DAME 3

Bill Curry's first team as head coach of the Jackets, which finished 1-9-1 on the season, nearly stunned the unbeaten, No. 1 Irish. Tech led for much of the game before ND hit a game-tying 47-yard field goal with 4:44 remaining to escape with the tie.

1999 GATOR BOWL: GA. TECH 35, NOTRE DAME 28

Dez White (129 receiving yards, two TD) and Joe Hamilton (three TD passes, one TD reception) were co-MVPs, capping Tech's first 10-win season since 1990 and a securing a final national ranking of No. 9.

2007: GEORGIA TECH 33, NOTRE DAME 3

Tashard Choice (now GT's running backs coach) ran for 196 yards and Tech outgained the Fighting Irish by a 386-122 margin to hand ND what remains as the most-lopsided season-opening loss in its program history.

In 2011, the Jackets played No. 6 Clemson (Oct. 29) and No. 10 Virginia Tech (Nov. 10) in back-to-back home games.

- The most noticable change for the majority of observers when head coach **Geoff Collins** took the reins at Georgia Tech prior to last season was the transition from the option-based offense that the Yellow Jackets ran under former head coach Paul Johnson for 11 seasons to a spread, pro-style offense.
- Leading the transition to Georgia Tech's spread, pro-style offense is offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Dave** Patenaude. Patenaude also served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Collins for two seasons at Temple (2017-18).
- With Patenaude at the helm of Temple's offense, the Owls amassed two of the three highest single-season passing totals in school history (3,273 yards in 2017, 3,297 yards in 2018).
- After finishing last in the ACC and 127th out of 130 teams nationally in total offense last season (286.3 ypg), Georgia Tech is averaging 403.2 yards per game this season (40th nationally/eighth ACC).
- Tech had at least 400 yards of total offense in each of its first four games of the season (438 at Florida State, 471 vs. UCF, 453 at Syracuse, 450 vs. Louisville). Coming into this season, the Yellow Jackets had gone 16 games without compiling 400 yards of total offense, with their last 400-yard game coming on Nov. 3, 2018 at North Carolina.
- Prior to this season, the last time that Tech had fourstraight 400-yard games at any point in a season was in 2011, the last time the Yellow Jackets opened a season with four-straight 400-yard games was in 2011 and the last time the Jackets opened a season with 400-yard games against four-straight NCAA Division I-A/FBS opponents was 1999.

- Three different Jackets (Jalen Camp, Jahmyr Gibbs and Malachi Carter) caught touchdown passes against Louisville (Oct. 9), marking the first time that three different ent Georgia Tech receivers caught touchdown passes in the same game since Sept. 12, 2015 vs. Tulane (TaQuon Marshall, Qua Searcy and Michael Summers).
- Georgia Tech's 59-yard touchdown pass from Fr. QB **Jeff Sims** to Camp in the first quarter of last Saturday's game vs. No. 1 Clemson was the Yellow Jackets' longest offensive play of the season (prev.: 45 Sims to So. WR Marquez Ezzard, Sept. 12 at Florida State).
- The 59-yard strike from Sims to Camp was also the longest offensive play allowed by Clemson this year (prev.: 56 run Oct. 10 vs. Miami). The longest touchdown play that Clemson had previously allowed this season was a 23-yard pass vs. Virginia (Oct. 3).
- Tech's offensive output could be even more impressive if it limits turnovers and improves red-zone production. The Yellow Jackets rank 100th out of 101 teams nationally with 18 turnovers and rank 89th nationally in red-zone offense (.667).
- The Jackets have committed 16 turnovers in their four losses and have just two turnovers in their two wins this season.

- Sims' 277 passing yards versus Florida State were the most by any Georgia Tech quarterback since Justin Thomas threw for 282 yards against Wofford on Aug. 30, 2014 and the most by a GT QB against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since Taylor Bennett threw for 309 against Maryland on Oct. 6, 2007.
- Sims became only the third Georgia Tech quarterback since 2000 to throw for at least 250 yards in a season opener, joining Thomas (282 vs. Wofford, 2014) and Tevin Washington (271 vs. Western Carolina, 2011).

- Mason returned to the lineup last Saturday at Boston College and had 64 yards from scrimmage (37 receiving, 27 rushing) on just seven touches (one reception, six carries 9.1 yards per touch).
- Mason's 37-yard reception at Boston College was a career-long (prev.: 18 at Florida State, Sept. 12).
- Mason's 74.9 rushing yards per game ranked sixth in the ACC and 65th nationally in 2019.
- Mason's 5.23 yards per carry ranked ninth in the ACC and 69th nationally in '19.
- Mason's seven rushing touchdowns ranked ninth in the ACC and 106th nationally last season.
- The first three 100-yard rushing games of Mason's career came in the last seven games of last season (106 at Duke, Oct. 12; 141 at Miami, Oct. 19; 141 vs. NC State, Nov. 21).
- In addition to his three 100-yard games, Mason also ran for 99 yards against USF (Sept. 7) and 94 at Virginia (Nov. 9) last season, giving him five games with at least 90 rushing yards in 2019 and seven in his 26-game career.
- Since the beginning of the 2018 season, Mason is one of only six players that has averaged at least 5.5 yards per rush on a minimum of 13 carries against five-time-defending ACC champion Clemson, and one of only three to accomplish the feat during the regular season.

- During his 106-yard performance at Duke on Oct. 12 of last season, Mason became the 50th student-athlete in Georgia Tech history with 1,000 career rushing yards. He currently ranks 25th in program history with 1,630 rushing yards. He needs just 370 yards to become only the 17th Yellow Jacket with 2,000 career rushing yards.
- Despite Mason being out of the lineup for four games this season, Georgia Tech has not seen a dropoff at the running back position, thanks largely to the impressive collegiate debut of true freshman **Jahmyr Gibbs**.
- In just five games, Gibbs has rushed for 308 yards (4.5 avg.), caught 15 passes for 206 yards (13.7 avg.), returned eight kicks for 205 yards (25.6 avg.) and scored five touchdowns (three receiving, two rushing).

- Gibbs is the first Power Five conference player since Penn State's Saquon Barkley in 2017 to compile at least 300 rushing yards, 200 receiving yards and 200 kickoff return yards in his team's first six games of the season. Making the feat even more impressive is the fact that Gibbs has only played in five of the first six games of the campaign.
- Gibbs is the first Georgia Tech player with 300 rushing yards, 200 receiving yards and 200 kickoff return yards in the Yellow Jackets' first six games of the season since Orwin Smith in 2011.
- Despite playing in only five games, Gibbs is Tech's leading rusher with 308 yards this season.
- Gibbs also leads Georgia Tech with five touchdowns scored, three touchdown receptions, 514 yards from scrimmage and 719 all-purpose yards in just five games.

 Gibbs ranks among the nation's top 25 in three official statistical categories.

- Gibbs' 25.6-yard kickoff return average would be even more impressive had a 98-yard return for a touchdown not been called back due to a holding penalty last Saturday at Boston College.
- Twice in his five games this season, Gibbs has had at least 60 rushing yards, 60 receiving yards, one rushing touchdown and one receiving touchdown (Sept. 19 vs. UCF and Oct. 9 vs. Louisville). It is an accomplishment that has only been achieved seven times this season in NCAA Division I FBS. Gibbs is the only player that has done it multiple times.

- At Syracuse (Sept. 26), Gibbs became Georgia Tech's first 100-yard rusher of the season and the first Tech true freshman in four years to eclipe the 100-yard rushing plateau when he ran for 105 yards on 18 carries 5.8 avg.).
- Gibbs is the first Georgia Tech true freshman to rush for 100 yards in a game since Dedrick Mills ran for 169 yards against Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl (Dec. 31, 2016).
- Gibbs also caught two passes for 26 yards and a touchdown and returned three kickoffs for 44 yards at Syracuse, giving him 131 yards from scrimmage and 175 all-purpose yards.
- In his collegiate debut, Gibbs amassed 219 all-purpose yards, including 126 from scrimmage, against No. 14/13 UCF (Sept. 19).
- On his first collegiate play, Gibbs returned the opening kickoff 75 yards to the UCF 21 yard line, setting up a threeplay touchdown drive that gave the Yellow Jackets a 7-0 lead just 55 seconds into the game.
- Gibbs scored the Jackets' other two touchdowns vs. UCF on a 9-yard reception in the second quarter and an electrifying 33-yard run in the fourth quarter that pulled the Yellow Jackets within seven points at 28-21.
- Gibbs finished with 93 yards on two kickoff returns, 66 rushing yards on 15 carries and a team-high 60 receiving yards on four receptions against UCF.
- Gibbs is only the third ACC player since 2000 to compile at least 60 rushing yards, 60 receiving yards and 90 kickoff return yards in a game, joining Duke's Deon Jackson (Oct. 27, 2018 vs. Pitt) and Clemson's C.J. Spiller (Oct. 24, 2009 vs. Miami).
- For his efforts against UCF, Gibbs was named the ACC Rookie of the Week and to the Hornung Award Honor Roll, which honors the nation's three most versatile players of the week

- Sophomores **Jamious Griffin** and **Dontae Smith** round out three Georgia Tech running backs (and four rushers overall) with at least 100 yards on the ground this season (a list that doesn't even include Mason).
- Griffin has rushed for 161 yards (fourth on the team) and two touchdowns this season.
- Smith ranks third on the team with 193 rushing yards and a touchdown but leads the team with 6.9 yards per carry.
- On Sept. 26 at Syracuse, Smith ran for a career-high 84 yards on just eight carries (9.4 avg.). His first two carries of the game went for 46 yards (a 16-yarder and a 30-yarder on back-to-back plays in the second quarter), surpassing his previous career high for rushing yards in a game (35 twice, last vs. UCF on Sept. 19).

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Five different wide receivers So. Ahmarean Brown, Sr. Jalen Camp, Jr. Malachi Carter and So. Marquez Ezzard and Jr. Adonicas Sanders have caught passes in at least four of Georgia Tech's first six games this season. Brown and Camp have a reception in every game, Carter in 5-of-6 and Ezzard and Sanders in 4-of-6.
- By comparison, as recently as two seasons ago (2018), Georgia Tech only had four different wideouts catch a pass all season.
- Camp, a fifth-year senior, leads the team with 17 receptions and 226 receiving yards. His 17 receptions and 226 receiving yards are both career highs (prev.: 11 receptions for 186 yards in 2018).
- Camp has two touchdown receptions this season, which is tied with Carter for the team lead among wide receivers (RB **Jahmyr Gibbs** leads the team with three touchdown catches). Both of Camp's two touchdown catches this season have come in the past three games (9 yards from Brown on Oct. 9 vs. Louisville and 59 yards from Fr. QB **Jeff Sims** last Saturday vs. Clemson).
- Camp's 59-yard touchdown catch against Clemson was the longest reception of the senior's career (prev.: 49 at Virginia, Nov. 4, 2017).
- Camp's five receptions in the season opener at Florida State (Sept. 12) were a career high (prev.: 4 at Temple, 2019).
- Despite playing his first three seasons in Georgia Tech's previous option-based offense, Camp has caught 36 passes for 595 yards in his career, both team highs.
- Camp played in four games as a senior in 2019 before
 his season came to an end due to injury and he received a
 medial redshirt. His 2019 season came to a close with 134
 receiving yards (first on team through four games) on seven
 receptions (t-2nd), good for a 19.1-yards-per-catch average
 (1st). His one touchdown catch was also tied for the team
 lead through four contests.
- Carter ranks second on the team with 218 receiving yards and 15 receptions. His two touchdown receptions are tied with Camp for the team lead among wide receivers.
- Carter set a new career high with 89 receiving yards vs. Louisville on Oct. 9 (prev. 74 vs. NC State Nov. 21, 2019).



- · Carter's 89 receiving yards vs. Louisville were the most by Yellow Jacket since slot back Clinton Lynch had 111 at USF in 2018 and the most by a Tech wide receiver since Ricky Jeune had 96 at Virginia in 2017.
- Carter set a career high with six receptions in the Yellow Jackets' Sept. 12 season opener at FSU (prev.: 3, three times - last vs. North Carolina, 2019), including the 15-yard touchdown that pulled the Jackets even at 13-13 early in the fourth quarter.
- One of college football's most dynamic true freshmen last season, Brown ranks fourth on the team (third among wide receiveres) with 183 receiving yards and 11 receptions this season.
- . Brown turned in the best single-game performance of his 18-game career last Saturday at Boston College with a career-high 75 receiving yards and a career-high-tying four receptions.
- Brown caught his first touchdown pass of the season (32 yards) and also scored on a 2-yard run at BC.
- Against Louisville (Oct. 9), Brown threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to Camp to cut the Yellow Jackets' 21-7 deficit to 21-14 with just 43 seconds to go in the first half. The touchdown pass was the first of Brown's career, the first touchdown pass by a Georgia Tech non-quarterback since P Pressley Harvin III's 41-yarder at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 19, 2019, the first touchdown pass by a Georgia Tech non-QB skill position player since RB **Tashard Choice** (now GT's running backs coach) 17-yarder vs. North Carolina on Nov. 17, 2007 and the first touchdown pass by a Georgia Tech wide receiver since Jonathan Smith's 26-yarder vs. UNC on Nov. 15, 2003.
- Brown is the only NCAA Division I FBS player with a passing touchdown, rushing touchdown and receiving touchdown this season.
- Brown is the first Yellow Jacket with a passing TD, rushing TD and receiving TD in the same season since QB Taylor Bennett in 2007.
- Brown is Georgia Tech's first non-QB with a passing TD, rushing TD and receiving TD in the same season since RB P.J. Daniels in 2004.
- Brown is one of two current Georgia Tech players with a passing touchdown, rushing touchdown and receiving touchdown in his career, joining Jr. DB Tobias Oliver, who previously played QB and WR for the Yellow Jackets before moving to defense this season.
- Brown led Georgia Tech in receiving yards (396), receptions (21), yards per reception (18.9 - min. 8 rec.) and touchdown catches (7) as a true freshman last season.
- With seven touchdown receptions last season, Brown matched the Georgia Tech freshman record set by Calvin Johnson as a true freshman in 2004.
- Brown ranked second among true freshman and was tied for third among all freshmen in touchdown receptions last season.

- Despite having just 18 collegiate games under his belt, Brown ranks third on the team with 32 career receptions (just four behind Camp's team-leading 36) and 579 career receiving yards (just 66 behind Camp's team-leading 595).
- Ezzard, a sophomore transfer from Miami (Fla.), ranks fifth on the team with eight receptions and 111 receiving yards in his first six games after sitting out the entire 2019 season due to NCAA transfer regulations.
- Despite only seeing significant playing time in 14 career games (the final eight of last season and the first six of this season), Sanders has become one of Georgia Tech's most reliable receivers with 21 receptions for 297 yards over those 13 contests. Prior to the current 14-game stretch, Sanders had just three receptions for 25 yards in his entire career.

TIGHT ENDS

- Last season, Georgia Tech reintroduced the tight end position to its offense for the first time since 2007, as former head coach Paul Johnson's double-slot option-based offense did not utilize tight ends.
- The only tight end on Georgia Tech's roster that had any collegiate game experience at the position going into last season was Tyler Davis, a graduate transfer from UConn, who wound up catching 17 passes for 148 yards and a touchdown for Tech in 2019.
- Davis went on to become the first Georgia Tech tight end selected in the NFL Draft in 28 years (since Tom Covington San Francisco 49ers, 1992) when the Jacksonville Jaguars took him with their sixth-round pick (No. 206 overall) in the 2020 draft. No Tech tight end has ever been selected higher in the NFL Draft than Davis.
- With Davis' departure, the only two tight ends on Georgia Tech's roster with any game experience at the position are true sophomores **Dylan Deveney** and **Dylan Leonard**. Deveney (6-48) and Leonard (2-6) combined for eight receptions for 54 yards as true freshmen last season.

- Deveney hauled in two catches for 15 yards in Georgia Tech's season opener at Florida State (Sept. 12). The two receptions matched a career high while the 15 yards were a new career high (prev.: 14 at Virginia Tech, 2019).
- Leonard's 15-yard reception against Louisville (Oct. 9) gave him a career high for receiving yards in a game (prev.
- Both Deveney and Leonard were unavailable for Georgia Tech's losses to UCF (Sept. 19) and Syracuse (Sept. 26), which left Georgia Tech with just two Above The Line tight ends for both contests — walk-on **Jack Coco**, who lost 40 pounds in the offseason to transition from offensive line to tight end and also serves as the Jackets' snapper on field goals and PATs, and true freshman Billy Ward.
- Deveney also missed last Saturday's game at Boston
- Tech is 2-1 this season with both Deveney and Leonard in the lineup and 0-3 without one or both of them.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Georgia Tech's offensive line has paved the way for an offensive resurgence that has seen the Yellow Jackets post the four highest vardage totals of the Geoff Collins era this season.
- . Most notably, Tech's offensive front has surrendered just 10 sacks in six games this season (1.67/gm), which is best in the ACC. The Yellow Jackets are the only Power Five conference team in the nation that has played at least six games and allowed 10 sacks or less. The only other FBS teams with at least six games and 10 or fewer sacks allowed this season are UTEP (8), Army (7), BYU (4), UAB (3).
- Tech did not surrender any sacks against UCF (Sept. 19) or Louisville (Oct. 9).
- Led by junior left tackle Zach Quinney (93% grade, no sacks allowed, no pressures allowed, six extra efforts), Georgia Tech surrendered just one sack against Florida State and its vaunted defensive front in the season opener (Sept. 12).
- Tech surrendered only one sack again at Syracuse (Sept.
- The Jackets have made a huge leap in the national rankings from 86th nationally in sacks allowed (2.33 per game) last season to 31st this season (1.67 per game).
- The offensive linemen on Georgia Tech's 2020 roster have combined for 102 career starts at Tech.

• Georgia Tech added starting experience on the offensive front with the addition of graduate transfer **Ryan Johnson**. Johnson appeared in 36 games over three seasons at Tennessee (2017-19) and made 19 starts, including 18-straight spanning his sophomore and junior seasons.

- Fr. **Jordan Williams** was one of only 23 student-athletes from across the nation included on *247Sports*' 2020 preseason true freshman all-America team. Williams was one of only seven ACC representatives on the 23-player list and the only ACC rep among its five offensive linemen.
- Considered the position making the most radical transition in playing style as Georgia Tech transformed to a spread, pro-style offense last season, the Yellow Jackets' offensive line was decimated by injuries in 2019.
- Most notably, seniors Jahaziel Lee (LT) and Kenny
 Cooper (C) were both lost for the season due to injuries after appearing in just three and four games, respectively. Both redshirted and return to the Jackets this season, although Lee moved exclusively to defensive line after playing both ways in 2019.
- Additionally, Georgia Tech was without the services of Mikey Minihan (the starting left guard for the first two games of the season) for four games before before he returned to action in a reserve role for two games (Oct. 19 at Miami, Nov. 2 vs. Pitt). He made his first start since Sept. 7 when he started at right guard at Virginia (Nov. 9).
- Despite the rash of injuries, the Jackets' offensive front settled in during the second half of last season. Most notably, during a three-game stretch from Oct. 19-Nov. 9, Georgia Tech faced the teams that ranked first (Pitt), fourth (Miami) and eighth (Virginia) nationally in sacks, with those teams averaging a total of 11.5 sacks per game. The Yellow Jackets' offensive front allowed a total of just five sacks in those three contests, including none at Virginia (Nov. 9).
- Tech did not surrender a sack twice in its final four games of last season (Nov. 9 at Virginia and Nov. 21 vs. NC State).
- Due to the rash of injuries across the offensive front last season, three walk-on offensive linemen saw significant action, highlighted by r-Jr. **William Lay III**, who played the majority of the snaps at center against USF (Sept. 7) and Temple (Sept. 28) before moving into the starting lineup in place of Cooper vs. North Carolina (Oct. 5). Lay III started the final eight games of last season. Walk-ons Hamp Gibbs and Chet Lagod, who both graduated and do not return to the roster this season, also played significant snaps against The Citadel (Sept. 14) and at Temple (Sept. 28), respectively.

DEFENSE

TEAM

- Dubbed the "Minister of Mayhem," Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has been known for putting together some of college football's top defenses over the past nine seasons — first as defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2011-14) and Florida (2015-16), then as head coach at Temple (2017-18) and Georgia Tech.
- Over the past nine seasons, Collins' defenses have:
 - ranked in top 20 nationally in total defense three times (twice in top 8)
 - ranked in top 25 in scoring defense four times (twice in top 12)
 - ranked in top 30 in passing defense five times (twice in top 13)
 - ranked in top 45 in pass efficiency defense seven times (four times in top 22)
 - \bullet ranked in top 35 in turnovers gained five times (twice in top 6)
 - ranked in top 15 in interceptions four times (twice in top 10)
 - ranked in top 25 in sacks four times (twice in top 15)
- Collins' and defensive coordinator Andrew Thacker's aggressive, attacking style of defense has been on display this season, as Georgia Tech ranks among the national leaders in turnovers gained (11 - ninth nationally), fumble recoveries (7 - third nationally) and interceptions (4).
- For the season, Georgia Tech has forced six turnovers in its two wins (Sept. 12 at FSU, Oct. 9 vs. Louisville) and just five in its three losses (Sept. 19 vs. UCF, Sept. 26 at Syracuse, Oct. 17 vs. Clemson and last Saturday at Boston College).
- Against Louisville (Oct. 9), Georgia Tech forced three turnovers (all fumble recoveries). The three takeaways led directly to 19 points, which proved to be the difference in the Yellow Jackets' 46-27 win.
- The Jackets' three takeaways against Louisville matched their season high, originally set in their season-opening win at Florida State (Sept. 12).
- Yellow Jackets that record takeaways have the opportunity
 to sign the "Get The Ball Board" on Georgia Tech's sideline.
 Introduced by Collins when he was the defensive coordinator
 at Western Carolina in 2002, the "Get The Ball Board" has
 evolved from players simply adorning the board with their

- Georgia Tech has also seen a significant uptick in negative plays since Collins' and Thacker's arrival last season.
- Tech has 35 tackles for loss through six games this season (5.8 per game). Last year, the Yellow Jackets averaged 5.1 TFL per game (61 total). The previous season (2018), the Jackets ranked 125th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 4.2 TFL per game.

- Tech's 35 tackles for loss this season are its most through six games since 2010 (35) and mark only the sixth time since 2000 that it has had 35 TFL or more through six contests (2008 56; 2007 62; 2006 35; 2005 45).
- DB **Charlie Thomas**, LB **David Curry** and DL **Jordan Domineck** are the first Georgia Tech trio to each have at least 4.0 tackles for loss through the first six games since 2015 (P.J. Davis, Adam Gotsis and Tyler Marcordes).
- Seven different Yellow Jackets have at least 2.5 tackles for loss apiece through six games this season (Charlie Thomas 4.0, Curry 4.0, Domineck 4.0, DL **Antonneous Clayton** 2.5, LB **Quez Jackson** 3.5, DL **Curtis Ryans** 2.5 and DL **Sylvain Yondjouen** 2.5). Prior to this season, the last time that as many as seven different Jackets had at least 2.5 TFL through six games was in 2008 (Michael Johnson, Mario Butler, Tony Clark, Sedric Griffin, Derrick Morgan, Jason Peters, Darryl Richard, Vance Walker and Jahi Word-Daniels). Five of those nine (Johnson, Butler, Morgan, Richard and Walker) went on to play in the NFL.
- Tech also has 11 sacks through six games this season (1.8 per game). Last year, the Yellow Jackets averaged 1.4 sacks per game (17 total). The previous season (2018), the Jackets ranked 116th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 1.3 sacks per game.
- The Yellow Jackets' 35 tackles for loss and 11 sacks are their most through six games of the season since 2010 (35 TFL, 12 sacks).
- On the analytics front, Georgia Tech ranks 33rd nationally in pressure rate at 30.7%. Last season (2019), the Yellow Jackets finished 107th nationally with a 25.8% pressure rate (credit: ESPN Stats & Info).
- Tech's defensive line is leading the charge, as the Jackets rank 23rd nationally in non-blitz pressure rate (four rushers or less) at 28.5% (credit: ESPN Stats & Info).
- In the season opener at Florida State (Sept. 12), Georgia Tech's defense put together its finest performance of the Collins era in a 16-13 triumph.
- Tech's defense limited Florida State to just 307 yards of total offense (3.8 yards per play).
- The Yellow Jackets forced three turnovers in the win at FSU (an interception and two fumbles).
- Perhaps most notably, after the Seminoles racked up 113 yards and 10 points in their first two possessions, Tech's defense surrendered just 194 yards and three points the rest of the way.
- Following the impressive defensive effort at Florida State, Thacker was named the National Coordinator of the Week by Pick Six Previews
- In its first season under Collins and Thacker in 2019, Georgia Tech ranked 32nd nationally and fifth in the ACC in pass defense last season, allowing just 207.7 yards per game through the air.
- Since the beginning of last season, Georgia Tech has held eight of its 18 opponents to less than 200 passing yards or less (169 vs. USF, Sept. 7, 2019; 30 vs. The Citadel, Sept. 14, 2019; 124 at Temple, Sept. 28, 2019; 176 at Duke, Oct. 12, 2019; 200 at Miami, Oct. 19, 2019; 198 at Florida State, Sept. 12, 2020; 194 at Syracuse, Sept. 26, 2020; 145 last Saturday at Boston College).

- Jr. LB **Quez Jackson** has led Georgia Tech in tackles in four of its six games this season (nine at Florida State on Sept. 12, nine on Sept. 19 vs. UCF, nine on Oct. 9 vs. Louisville and nine last Saturday at BC).
- Jackson ranks ninth in the ACC with 7.7 tackles per game this season (46 total).
- Jackson's four games with at least nine tackles this season lead the ACC.

- Jackson is one of only two NCAA FBS Division I players with at least 45 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss, one interception and one fumble recovery this season (joining Army LB Jon Rhattigan).
- Jackson is one of only four Yellow Jackets since 2000 to record at least 46 tackles through the first six games of a season, joining teammate **David Curry** (50 2019), Isaiah Johnson (46 2012) and Julian Burnett (58 2011).
- In addition to the team-leading 46 tackles through six games, Jackson has had a hand in two of the Jackets' 11 takeaways this season, with an interception in the Sept. 12 season opener at Florida State (the first of his career) and a fumble recovery on Oct. 9 vs. Louisville.
- Curry, a sixth-year senior LB, is the only returner of Georgia Tech's four team captains from a season ago.
- Curry ranks second on the team this season with 40 tackles and 4.0 tackles for loss through six games.
- Jackson and Curry are one of only three sets of ACC teammates with at least 40 tackles and 3.5 TFL apiece this season (joining NC State's Isaiah Moore, Drake Thomas and Payton Wilson and Boston College's Isaiah McDuffie and Max Richardson).
- Curry had four games with double-digit tackles last season (14 vs. The Citadel, Sept. 14; 16 vs. North Carolina, Oct. 5; 10 vs. Pitt, Nov. 2 and 11 vs. NC State, Nov. 21). He was one of only 10 ACC players with at least four games with double-digit tackles in 2019.

- Since 2005, the only Yellow Jacket to record more games with double-digit tackles in a season than Curry's four in 2019 was Julian Burnett, who had five in both 2010 and 2011
- Curry is one of only three Yellow Jackets to record at least 90 tackles in a season over the last decade (2010-19), joining Julian Burnett (120 2011), P.J. Davis (119 2014) and Quayshawn Nealy (92 2014).
- Curry registered a career-high 16 tackles vs. North Carolina last season (Oct. 5, 2019), which is tied for the most tackles by a Yellow Jacket in a single game since Morgan Burnett made 16 stops against Georgia on Nov. 28, 2009.
- Curry turned in one of the most impressive performances in recent memory by a collegiate defender when he recorded a sack and an interception to go along with a then-careerhigh 14 tackles against The Citadel last season (Sept. 14, 2019).
- Curry's performance against The Citadel last season marked only the 13th time since 2015 that an NCAA Division I FBS student-athlete recorded at least 14 tackles, a sack and an interception in a game.
- Jr. DL **Jordan Domineck** has become a force for the Yellow Jackets with 23 tackles, four tackles for loss, two sacks, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in six games this season.
- Domineck was especially disruptive over a two-game stretch versus Syracuse (Sept. 26) and Louisville (Oct. 9).
 Ten of his 23 tackles, three of his four TFL, both of his sacks, one of his two forced fumbles and his lone fumble recovery came in the two-game stretch against the Orange and Cardinals.
- Domineck's second forced fumble of the season and first fumble recovery of his career came on the same pivotal play early in the fourth quarter of Georgia Tech's win over Louisville. Trailing 27-26, Domineck forced and recovered a fumble by Louisville RB Javian Hawkins to not only stall a promising possession for the Cardinals, but also set up a four-play, 51-yard touchdown drive for the Yellow Jackets that proved to be the winning points in the Jackets' 47-26 victory.
- Domineck is off the charts in terms of analytics, as he ranked No. 1 nationally in pressure rate (19.6% - 18 pressures on 92 pass-rush snaps) going into last Saturday's game at Boston College (credit: ESPN Stats & Info).
- So. DL **Curtis Ryans** had a breakout performance in Georgia Tech's season-opening 16-13 win at Florida State (Sept. 12).
- Ryans recorded two sacks, two tackles for loss and two forced fumbles in the triumph at FSU, all coming at pivotal times.
- Ryans' first two career sacks came on consecutive plays early in the fourth quarter at FSU. On the second sack, he forced a fumble that was recovered by Curry and returned to the FSU 11 yard line, which set up Fr. PK **Jude Kelley's** 32-yard field goal that gave Georgia Tech a 16-13 lead with 8:56 to go in the fourth quarter.
- Ryans' second forced fumble of the game and his career came on FSU's ensuing possesion following Kelley's go-ahead field goal. It was recovered by Sr. DL **Djimon Brooks** at the FSU 35 yard line to thwart the Seminoles last true scoring threat.

• Ryans is one of only nine players nationally to force two fumbles in a single game this season.

- In recognition of the breakout performance, Ryans was named the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week following the win at FSU.
- Ryans forced his third fumble of the season on Oct. 17 versus Clemson. He leads the ACC with .60 forced fumbles per game.
- Domineck also ranks among the ACC leaders with two forced fumbles this season (.33/qm t-third).
- In just four games as a Yellow Jacket after sitting out all of last season due to NCAA transfer regulations and being unavailable for the first two games of this season, Sr. DE **Antonneous Clayton** is already tied for the team lead with two sacks (joining Domineck, Ryans and Charlie Thomas atop the team's leaderboard).
- In addition to being tied for the team lead with two sacks this season, Thomas, who moved from linebacker to nickel back this season, is also tied for the team lead with four tackles for loss.
- Georgia Tech's three leading tacklers in 2019 were Curry (97), Charlie Thomas (65) and S **Tariq Carpenter** (62). Their totals marked the only the second time in the decade (2010-19) that a Georgia Tech team had a player with 90 or more tackles and at least two others with 60 or more (2014 being the other year that GT accomplished the feat).

SPECIALISTS

- Senior punter **Pressley Harvin III** is living up to his reputation as one of the nation's top punters this season.
- Harvin leads the ACC and ranks No. 4 nationally in punting with a 48.5-yard average (No. 2 nationally among punters whose teams have played more than one game).
- Of Harvin's 32 punts this season, 16 have traveled 50 yards or more, 15 have pinned the opponent inside its 20 yard line, 16 have been fair caught and only four have been returned, which plays a big part in Georgia Tech ranking fifth nationally in net punting with a 46.09-yard net average (second nationally among teams that have played more than one game).
- For the second time this season, Harvin has been named the Ray Guy Award National Punter of the Week following last week's performance at Boston College. Harvin averaged 51.0 yards per punt at BC, with three of the four kicks traveling at least 50 yards, three pinning the Eagles inside their 20 yard line and none being returned.
- Harvin was also named the Ray Guy Award National Punter of the Week following his performance against No. 14/13 UCF (Sept. 19), when he averaged 51.2 yards over four punts, three of which pinned the Knights inside their own 20 yard line.
- Harvin's career day against UCF included a 70-yard punt in the third quarter that flipped the field from Georgia Tech's own 18 yard line to the UCF 12. The 70-yard punt was the longest of Harvin's career (prev.: 62 – twice, last vs. USF on Sept. 19, 2019), the longest by a Yellow Jacket since Durant Brooks' 77-yarder versus North Carolina on Nov. 17, 2007 and is tied for the ninth-longest in Georgia Tech history. It was only the 12th punt in Tech history to ever travel 70 yards or more.
- Following five of Georgia Tech's six games this season, Harvin has been named to the Ray Guy Award's "Ray's 4" list, which recognizes the nation's top four punters each week.
- In addition to the two weeks that he has been named the National Punter of the Week, Harvin's other "Ray's 4" performances this season include:
 - Florida State (Sept. 12): punted three times for an average of 41.7 yards, with a long of 53 yards and two kicks that were downed inside the 20 yard line in the win at FSII
 - Syracuse (Sept. 26): averaged 49.3 yards over seven punts, with three that traveled 50-plus vards, three that were downed inside the SU 20 and only one that was returned; 64-yard punt near the end of the first half bounced out of bounds at the 4 yard line — the 64-yard punt was the second-longest of his career, behind only his 70-yarder the previous week vs. UCF.
 - Clemson (Oct. 17): averaged 48.3 yards over nine punts, with five that traveled 50-plus yards, three that were downed inside the CU 20 and only one that was returned; From Tech's own 24, boomed a gamelong 56-yard punt to pin Clemson at their own 20 in the second quarter.

- Since the beginning of the 2019 season, there have been only 18 games in which an NCAA Division I FBS punter has had a net average of 50 or more yards with a minimum of four punts. Harvin is the only punter that has accomplished the feat three times (Nov. 21 of last season vs. NC State. Sept. 19 vs. UCF and last Saturday at Boston College).
- Harvin's 44.61 career punting average ranks second in Georgia Tech history, behind only 2007 Ray Guy Award winner Durant Brooks.

- Fr. Jahmyr Gibbs ranks 14th nationally in kickoff return average at 25.6 yards per return
- Gibbs returned the opening kickoff vs. UCF (Sept. 19) 75 yards on the first play of his collegiate career. The 75-yard return was the longest kickoff return by a Yellow Jacket since Juanyeh Thomas (then a true freshman himself) returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown at Georgia on Nov. 24, 2018.
- Gibbs had what would have been a 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown erased by a holding penalty last Saturday at Boston College.
- · After ranking 126th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams in kickoff coverage in 2018 (26.27 yards per return), Georgia Tech is allowing 20.33 yards per return this season, an improvement of nearly six yards per return in less than two seasons.
- Head coach **Geoff Collins** states repeatedly that special teams are the No. 1 priority within Georgia Tech's program, a philosophy that is highlighted by the fact that a studentathlete cannot earn playing time on offense or defense if they aren't able to contribute on special teams.
- The emphasis on special teams paid dividends last season, most notably in blocked kicks. Georgia Tech blocked three kicks in 2019, all in the final seven games of the season (punt blocks vs. Duke on Oct. 12 and Pitt on Nov. 2 and a field goal block vs. Miami on Oct. 19).
- . Georgia Tech tied for sixth nationally in punt blocks (2) and tied for 14th nationally in total kick blocks (3) last season.

- Jerry Howard Jr. was responsible for both of Georgia Tech's punt blocks last season, becoming the first Yellow Jacket to block two kicks in a season since Chris Milton also blocked a pair of punts in 2015.
- Howard's two blocked kicks were tied for first in the ACC and second nationally in 2019.
- DL Antwan Owens blocked a would-be game-winning 25-yard field goal attempt with just 26 seconds to go in regulation of Georgia Tech's 28-21 overtime win at Miami (Oct. 19). It was the Yellow Jackets' first field goal block since GT blocked a field goal at Virginia Tech on Nov. 12, 2016.
- Georgia Tech's three kick blocks last season were its first since 2017. The Yellow Jackets went 21 games between blocking kicks at Virginia on Nov. 4, 2017 and at Duke on Oct. 12, 2019.
- The Yellow Jackets got their first block of 2020 season at Syracuse (Sept. 26) when Fr. DL D'Quan Douse blocked a PAT attempt.
- Georgia Tech has blocked 23 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the eighth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.
- The nation's most blocked kicks over the past eight seasons (since 2013) belong to Temple (27). Six of those came in the last two seasons of Collins' tenure as the Owls' head coach (2017-18). Temple blocked five kicks in 2018 alone, which was good for a tie for fifth nationally.

- The tables have been turned on Georgia Tech this season, as it has had six kicks blocked through five games (four field goals and two extra points). Florida State blocked three Tech kicks (two FB and a PAT) in the season opener (Sept. 12), marking the first time in Georgia Tech historixy that the Yellow Jackets had three kicks blocked in one game and only the sixth time in program history that the Jackets had multiple kicks blocked in a game.
- Prior to the opener at FSU, Tech had not had multiple kicks blocked in a game since Western Carolina blocked two field goals against the Yellow Jackets on Nov. 4, 1989. Ironically, Collins, a walk-on freshman, suited up for WCU in that game (a 34-7 Georgia Tech win).
- Despite having three of the first four kicks of his career blocked, true Fr. PK **Jude Kelley** drilled a 32-yard field goal with 8:56 remaining in the game that proved to be the winning points in Georgia Tech's 16-13 win at Florida State.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses this season. The Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in both of its victories this season and are plus-four in turnover margin in those wins. On the flip side, Tech has lost the turnover battle in each of its four defeats this season and is minus-11 in turnover margin in those losses.
- As part of Georgia Tech athletics' ongoing partnership with Children's Healthcare of Atlanta, the organizations have teamed up to have the Yellow Jackets' success on "Money Down" — head coach **Geoff Collins'** term for third and fourth downs — benefit Children's this season.
- Fans are encouraged to make pledges to Children's based on the Jackets' success on "Money Down." To lead the way, Collins' had pledged to donate \$10 to Children's for every "Money Down" stop that the Yellow Jackets make on defense and each "Money Down" that the Jackets convert into a first down on offense this season.
- Georgia Tech has combined for 93 third/fourth down stops and conversions through four games this season (52 stops on defense, 41 conversions on offense), including a seasonhigh total of 22 in the season opener at Florida State (13 on offense, nine on defense).
- Fans can pledge at *buzz.gt/MoneyDown2020*. As of Monday, Oct. 26, \$9,134 had been pledged to the Children's through the Money Down benefit, including Collins' \$930 pledge to date.
- While Georgia Tech certainly boasts a more experienced team in 2020 than it did in 2019, when the Yellow Jackets had the second-fewest seniors in NCAA Division I FBS (8), the Jackets are still quite young. Of the 62 student-athletes listed as Above The Line for last Saturday's game versus Boston College, 33 were freshmen (14) and sophomores (19).
- Saturday's game versus Notre Dame will be televised nationally on ABC, marking the fourth time in seven games this season that Georgia Tech will appear on ABC (Sept. 12 at Florida State, Sept. 19 vs. UCF, Oct. 17 vs. Clemson).
