QUICK HITS

- Georgia Tech ranked No. 8 in the latest AVCA Coaches Poll (Oct. 21) and sits atop the ACC standings at 5-1.
- Georgia Tech leads the ACC and is third in the country with a .329 hitting percentage.
- Julia Bergmann is second in the ACC with 12 service aces and fourth in the ACC (13th in the country) with 4.09 kills/set.
- Mariana Brambilla recorded double-doubles in five of six matches this season, ranking fifth in the ACC (14th in the country) in kills/set (4.05) and ninth in hitting percentage (.356).
- Matti McKissock ranks third in the ACC and 11th in the country with 10.68 assists/set.
- The Jackets won both meetings with the Tigers last season, once at home and once on the road.
- Tech has won the last seven in a row in the series, and nine of the last 10.
- Dating back to last season, Tech has won 13 straight at home, including 19 of the last 20.

2019 AWARDS SEASON

Georgia Tech volleyball led the way in the annual Atlantic Coast Conference honors last season as head volleyball coach Michelle Collier was named the ACC and AVCA RegionCoach of the Year. Also honored were Julia Bergmann as ACC and AVCA Region Freshman of the Year, Matti McKissock as ACC Setter of the Year, and a program-record six Jackets earned all-conference honors.

Collier was recognized by the conference for leading the Jackets to a second-place finish in the ACC after a 11th-place projected finish in preseason. It marked the Jackets' highest finish in conference play since 2004 when they went undefeated to claim the regular season title. The Yellow Jackets finished the regular season with a 21-8 record, its first 20-win season since 2016 when the Jackets went 24-8. Collier is only the third Georgia Tech head coach to earn the honor.

THE OUTSIDERS

Bergmann, a preseason all-ACC selection this season, was named ACC Co-Player of the Week after two exceptional performances against Florida State (Oct. 7 & 8), with a combined 30 kills, 18 digs, three aces and a .456 hitting percentage She is coming off an outstanding freshman campaign with the Jackets, becoming the program's fourth ACC Freshman of the Year and second AVCA Region Freshman of the Year, in addition to earning first team all-ACC honors and an all-freshman team selection. The native of Munich, Germany, was tabbed ACC Freshman of the Week twice during the regular season (Oct. 14 and Nov. 25). Bergman led the ACC in service aces, and led the team with 427 kills.

Brambilla, who was voted preseason all-ACC this year, earned first-team all-ACC and first-team all-region honors in 2019. She was named ACC Player of the Week on Nov. 25, following her performances in Tech's wins over Clemson and Notre Dame. The outside hitter from Porto Alegre, Brazil, performed consistently during conference play and was critical to Tech's final 13-1 run to finish the regular season. She recorded a career-best 25 kills against TCU in the NIVC semifinal match and went on to be crowned NIVC MVP while helping lead the Jackets to their first NIVC Championship.

Mikaila Dowd earned her second-straight second team all-ACC selection in 2019. Dowd is a six-rotation outside hitter out of Naperville, III. In 2019, Dowd was named to the Hyatt Regency Invitational all-tournament team. She hit at a career-high clip of .619 in Tech's win against Syracuse to kick off conference play.

SETTING A HIGH BAR

McKissock, a preseason all-ACC honoree heading into the year, became the program's first ACC Setter of the Year in 2019, while also earning first team all-ACC and first team all-region honors. She recorded a careerhigh 63 assists against Boston College (Sept. 29), and helped put Tech in the top 15 of the NCAA for hitting percentage (.282), ranking fourth in program history, while also surpassing the 2,000 career assist mark during the 2019 season.

With 2,384 career assists as of Sept. 25, McKissock

now ranks No. 10 on the program's all-time career top-10 list. Her 1,387 assists in 2019 ranks 10th in program history for assists in a season.

MIDDLE BLOCK PARTY

Kayla Kaiser was tabbed second team all-ACC in 2019, her first conference honors. The middle blocker out of Louisville, Ky., finished last season ranked second in the conference for hitting percentage. She posted a careerhigh 16 kills against Arizona State, with a .619 hitting percentage, on her way to being named to the OU Nike Invitational all-tournament team. She hit a career-best .636 against TCU in the NIVC semifinal match (Dec. 14).

RECORD BREAKERS

It was a season of broken records for the Yellow Jackets in 2019. A program-record six Yellow Jackets earned all-ACC honors, in addition to McKissock being named the program's first ACC Setter of the Year. Georgia Tech also set a program record with six straight sweeps, from Oct. 9-Oct. 27.

In her final season on The Flats, Kodie Comby set the Georgia Tech record for season hitting percentage, hitting at a .437 clip for the season, leading the ACC in finishing fifth in the nation. She finished her career fifth all-time in program history, hitting a clip of .335 in her four seasons at Tech.

MEET THE NEWBIES

Georgia Tech volleyball welcomes three freshmen: setter Isabelle D'Amico, outside hitter Savannah Ogle, and setter/defensive specialist Elizabeth Patterson.

D'Amico lettered for four seasons as a setter in high school, serving two years as team captain. She was a conference champion for four-straight seasons (2016-19). For three of those four seasons, D'Amico led her team to district championship titles (2016, '17, '19). In her final season, she led her team to the D1 state championship title, earning first team all-CCL, all-district and all-state. She was also named Central District Player of the Year. Not just a standout on the court, D'Amico spent four years on the honor roll and served as the secretary of National Honor Society.

Ogle, a right-handed outside hitter, lettered for three seasons at Columbus High School before lettering at Northside for the 2019 season. With Columbus, Ogle won two district championship titles (2016 and 2018). She earned first team all-area and all-region in 2017 and 2018 at Columbus and first-team all-state in 2018. In 2019 at Northside, she earned first team all-area, all-region and all-state. Ogle enrolled at Tech in the spring 2020 semester.

Hailiing from Birmingham, Ala., Patterson was a letterwinner in volleyball, cross country and track & field in high school. She was named 2020 SPVB President's Day Tournament MVP, and earned AAU All-American recognition in 2018. The setter and defensive specialist was named also AAU Academic All-American and JVA Athleader Award recipient in 2017, As a track and field athlete, she helped her school to AHSAA Women's Outdoor Track and Field State Championships (2016, 2017) and District Championships (2015-17). She was named a JVA Academic All-American (2018) and National Honor Society member.
