Cardinals Travel to Atlanta for Friday Night Game Against Georgia Tech

- The University of Louisville football team hits the road for the second of three road games, visiting Georgia Tech for the first time with a Friday night game on ESPN. Kickoff for the ACC contest is set for 7 p.m. on ESPN, with Jason Benetti, Andre Ware and Roddy Jones calling the action.
- The Cardinals lost their second-straight ACC contest for the first time in the Scott Satterfield era, falling to Pittsburgh 23-20 on Sept. 26. The Panthers sacked quarterback **Malik Cunningham** seven times and limited the Cardinals to 223 yards of total offense in the defeat.
- Cunningham completed 9-of-21 passes for 107 yards and tossed a career-high three interceptions. It marked the only time in 25 career contests that he threw more than one interception in a game.
- Running back **Javian Hawkins** provided an offensive spark with a 75-yard run in the second quarter that cut Pitt's lead to 13-7. The redshirt sophomore was limited to three yards on 12 carries, closing with 78 yards on 13 rushes.
- Linebacker **Dorian Etheridge** continued to play in the opposition's backfield, recording 2.0 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss — to remain the national leader with 8.5 tackles for loss this season. He leads the team with 22 total tackles, 13 of which are solo tackles.

Running back **Javian Hawkins** has rushed for a touchdown in five consecutive games dating back to the 2019 season after his 75-yard scoring run in a loss to Pittsburgh.

Linebacker **Dorian Etheridge** ranks third in the nation with 8.5 tackles for loss after the first three games of the season. The senior registered 3.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks in the loss at Pittsburgh.

Quarterback **Malik Cunningham** threw a touchdown pass in the loss at Pitt, improving his streak to nine-straight games with a touchdown pass. He ranks eighth nationally and leads ACC with seven touchdown passes.

Wide receiver **Tutu Atwell** has scored 15 touchdowns in his last 15 games, moving into a tie for eighth all-time at Louisville with 17 receiving touchdowns, tying former tight end Gary Barnidge.

Radio

The broadcast of some UofL games will move to WKRD (790 AM and 101.7 FM) when there is conflicting programming. - ♦ The Cardinals are making their first trip to Atlanta to face Georgia Tech.
- ♦ In the last meeting, TaQuon Marshall ran for 175 yards and two scores to lead Georgia Tech to a 66-31 victory over Louisville on Friday night. The Yellow Jackets ran for a season-high 542 yards, the third-best total in school history and the second most ever yielded by the Cardinals. Tobias Oliver, who relieved Marshall at quarterback late in the third quarter, ran for 108 yards and two scores on eight carries.
- ♦ Head coach Scott Satterfield will make his first appearance against the Yellow Jackets.

LAST TIME VERSUS GEORGIA TECH

- ♦ TaQuon Marshall ran for 175 yards and two scores to lead Georgia Tech to a 66-31 victory over Louisville.
- ♦ The Yellow Jackets ran for a season-high 542 yards, the third-best total in school history and the second most ever yielded by the Cardinals. Tobias Oliver, who relieved Marshall at quarterback late in the third quarter, ran for 108 yards and two scores on eight carries.
- ♦ In their first nine drives, the Yellow Jackets scored eight touchdowns and a field goal. Then they got a 95-yard interception return for a score from Juanyeh Thomas with 2:18 left.
- ♦ Georgia Tech took advantage of a couple Louis-

ville misplays to jump out to a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter. The Cardinals turned the ball over on downs at midfield on their first drive, and five plays later, Marshall's 33-yard score gave Georgia Tech the lead less than five minutes into the game.

- ♦ Outside linebacker **Thurman Geathers** and GT defensive lineman **Curtis Ryans** were at North Cobb High together.
- ♦ Louisville wide receiver coach **Gunter Brewer** and Georgia Tech safeties coach **Nathan Burton** served on the same staff at Oklahoma State in 2009.
- ♦ Louisville quarterbacks coach **Frank Ponce** and Georgia Tech cornerbacks coach **Jeff Popovich** coached together at FIU from 2007-12.

KEY STORYLINES

- ♦ The Cardinals are looking to avoid their first three-game losing streak in the ACC since the 2018 season when the Cardinals went 0-8 in the league that season. With the 23-20 loss to Pittsburgh, the Cardinals are 2-1 in games decided by three points or fewer in the Scott Satterfield era.
- ♦ Known as one of the most explosive offenses in the league, the Cardinals were held to just 223 yards in the loss to Pittsburgh. The Cardinals were limited to 107 yards through the air, while throwing three interceptions in the loss. The Cardinals totaled 106 yards on two plays — a 75-yard run by **Javian Hawkins** and a 31-yard run by **Tabarius Peterson** — and just 117 yards on a total of 49 plays.
- ♦ Running back **Javian Hawkins** leads the ACC with 104.3 yards per game after running for 78 yards in the loss to Pittsburgh. His 75-yard touchdown run in the first quarter was a career long and the longest Louisville touchdown run since Malik Cunningham scored from 75 yards out against Kentucky on Nov. 24, 2018. Hawkins has now rushed for a touchdown in five consecutive games dating back to the 2019 season.
- ♦ Quarterback **Malik Cunningham** was held to 107 yards passing and tossed three picks in the loss to Pittsburgh. It was his lowest passing total since being held to 78 yards passing in a loss to Kentucky last season. Through three games, Cunningham has matched his interception total from all of last season with five.
- ♦ Wide receiver **Tutu Atwell** caught four passes for 37 yards and a touchdown. The native of Miami has three touchdowns on the season and 15 in his last 15 games. Atwell is now tied for eighth all-time at Louisville with 17 receiving touchdowns, tying Gary Barnidge.
- ♦ Having to replace one of the most reliable kickers in the country over the last four years, the Cardinals have found their replacement in **James Turner**, who is one of four kickers nationally who has made four field goals and 10 points-after-touchdown without a miss. He's only the second placekicker in school history to make his first four field goal attempts. John Wallace began his career by hitting five in a row.
- ♦ After allowing 485 yards of offense in a loss to Miami, the Cardinals' defense responded by holding Pitt to 376 yards and 23 points. The Panthers averaged just 4.8 yards per play and just 3.9 yards a rush.
- ♦ Linebacker **Dorian Etheridge** and **C.J. Avery** are the team's top tacklers with 22 and 18 respectively. Etheridge is third in the nation in tackles for loss with an average of 2.83 per game and is tied for the team lead with 2.0 sacks.
- ♦ The Cardinals rank fifth nationally 27.0 tackles for loss after recording 11.0 in the loss to Pittsburgh. Louisville has registered 10 or more tackles for loss in two of the three games this season.

LOUISVILLE IN THE RANKINGS

- ♦ Louisville has played 107 games while being ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 (Top 20 prior to 1989). Louisville is 79-28-0 in those games (.752).
- ♦ The Cardinals have played 22 games in its football history when UofL and the opponent were both ranked in the Top 25. Louisville has a record of 8-14 in those games, including 3-2 at home. The Cardinals are 3-10 in regular season games when both teams are ranked in the Top 25.
- ♦ Head coach Scott Satterfield is 3-11 all-time versus ranked opponents, going 2-7 at Appalachian State and 1-4 at Louisville. In his first season with the Cardinals in 2019, Satterfield fell to No. 9 Notre Dame and No. 2 Clemson, while defeating No. 17 Wake Forest on the road.
- ♦ The Cardinals cracked the Associated Press Poll for the first time since Oct. 1, 2017 before dropping out of the polls after a 39-25 loss to NC State.
- ♦ Louisville's record against teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 (Top 20 prior to 1989) at game time is 17-58-1 (.233). This includes records of 8-16-0 (.333) at home, 4-34-1 (.118) at road sites, 0-2 (.000) at non-bowl game neutral sites, 5-8 (.385) at all neutral sites, and 6-26-1 (.197) against teams ranked in the top 10.

CARDINALS HISTORY IN ACC

- ♦ The Cardinals are now 3-4 all-time in ACC openers after the loss to Miami, including a 1-2 mark at home. Louisville defeated Miami 31-13 in its first league game in 2014, but dropped a game to Clemson to open the 2015 league schedule.
- ♦ The Cardinals are 11-14 on the road since joining the league in 2014. They dropped a road game at Miami last season, but responded the following week with a win over NC State.
- ♦ The Cardinals are 26-25 in their seven years in the ACC.

NOTING THE PITTSBURGH GAME

- ♦ The back-to-back losses to Miami and Pitt mark the first time the Cardinals have lost consecutive games under Scott Satterfield.
- ♦ Louisville finished with just 223 yards of total offense, its lowest total since gaining 217 against Boston College Oct. 13, 2018.
- ♦ The Cardinals were 1-for-11 on third down Saturday, their worst since also going 1-for-11 versus Florida State Oct. 30, 2014.
- ♦ Louisville's defense tallied 11 TFLs in the loss, its second double-digit TFL total of the season after getting 10 against Western Kentucky. UofL forced two turnovers against Pitt (one fumble, one interception). The Cardinals had forced just one turnover through the first two games.
- ♦ RB **Javian Hawkins** rushed for 78 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries. His 75-yard touchdown run in the first quarter was a career long and the longest Louisville touchdown run since Malik Cunningham scored from 75 yards out against Kentucky on Nov. 24, 2018. Hawkins has now rushed for a touchdown in five consecutive games dating back to the 2019 season.
- ♦ WR **Tutu Atwell** caught four passes for 37 yards and a touchdown. Atwell has three touchdowns on the season and 15 in his last 15 games. Atwell is now tied for eighth all-time at Louisville with 17 receiving touchdowns, tying Gary Barnidge.
- ♦ WR **Justin Marshall** made his first career start on Saturday.
- ♦ LB **Yasir Abdullah** filled up the stat sheet with five tackles, three for loss, one sack and a pair of forced fumbles. The three TFLs are a career-high, while it was just the second sack and the first forced fumbles of his career.
- ♦ LB **Dorian Etheridge** totaled seven tackles, 3.5 for loss, two sacks, a quarterback hurry and a forced fumble. The 3.5 TFLs match his career-best mark set in the season opener against Western Kentucky, while his two sacks are a career-high.
- ♦ LB **Dorian Etheridge** totaled seven tackles, 3.5 for loss, two sacks, a quarterback hurry and a forced fumble. The 3.5 TFLs match his career-best mark set in the season opener against Western Kentucky, while his two sacks are a career-high.
- ♦ DB **Marlon Character** was tied for the team lead with seven tackles in the loss, tied for the second-highest total of his career (10 vs. Syracuse, 2019).
- ♦ DL **Tabarius Peterson** converted a fake punt with a 31-yard rush. Peterson also rushed for a first down on a fake punt against Florida State on Sept. 21, 2019.
- ♦ K **James Turner** connected on field goals from 34 and 38 yards. Turner is now 4-for-4 on field goals and 11-of-11 extra points on the season.

CARDINALS IN THE ACC

- ♦ Louisville is 60-73-1 all-time against current Atlantic Coast Conference opponents: Boston College (7-5); Clemson (0-5); Duke (2-0); Florida State (4-16); Georgia Tech (0-1); Miami (3-11-1); North Carolina (5-3); NC State (7-3); Pitt (8-10); Syracuse (11-7); Virginia (5-3); Virginia Tech (2-5); Wake Forest (5-2); Notre Dame (1-1).
- ♦ The Cardinals went 5-3 in the ACC last season and have dropped their first two games this season.

SATTERFIELD FOURTH COACH TO REACH BOWL GAME IN FIRST SEASON

- ♦ Scott Satterfield did a remarkable job turning around the Louisville football program, guiding the Cardinals to a bowl game after taking over a 2-10 team. The first-year coach becomes the fourth coach in school history to lead the program to the postseason in their first season, and first since Charlie Strong guided the Cardinals to the Beef O'Brady's Bowl in 2010.
- ♦ Strong, who took over a 4-8 squad, guided the Cardinals to a 7-6 record, and a 31-28 victory over Southern Mississippi in the 2010 Beef O'Brady's Bowl in Tampa, Fla.
- ♦ Bobby Petrino took over the program in 2003, and led the Cardinals to a 9-4 overall record and a trip to the GMAC Bowl to face Miami (OH). The Redhawks defeated the Cardinals 49-28 in Mobile, Ala.
- ♦ In 1998, John L. Smith took over a 1-10 team and directed the Cardinals to a 7-5 record, which ended with a 48-29 loss to Marshall in the Motor City Bowl in Pontiac, Mich.
- ♦ Satterfield and Strong are the only UofL coaches in their first seasons to win a bowl game in their first seasons as head coach.

- ◆ Head coach Scott Satterfield tabbed captains for the 2020 season, picking three players on offense and a pair on defense. Quarterback **Micale Cunningham**, wide receiver **Dez Fitzpatrick**, and tight end **Marshon Ford** were named on offense.
- ◆ Linebackers **C.J. Avery** and **Dorian Ethridge** were picked as the leaders of the defense.

ATWELL AND HAWKINS EARN PRESEASON ALL-ACC ACCOLADES; CARDS PICKED FOURTH IN PRESEASON POLL

- ◆ Wide receiver **Tutu Atwell** and running back **Javian Hawkins** were named to the 2020 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Preseason Football Team.
- ◆ Preseason honors were determined by a vote of 134 league media members, which also voted the Cardinals to finish four in the league in the preseason poll. Clemson was picked to win the league followed by Notre Dame, which is also playing a 10-game league schedule this season
- ◆ Atwell delivered a standout sophomore campaign in 2019, earning first team All-ACC honors after setting the school record for receiving yards and tying the mark for touchdown receptions in a season. Atwell caught 70 passes for a league-leading 1,276 yards 12 touchdowns. He also knotted the school record with seven 100-yard receiving games and led the nation with four receptions of 70 or more yards. Atwell closed the season with a career high nine receptions for 147 yards in the 2019 Music City Bowl win over Mississippi State and registered a career best 152 receiving yards in a win over Syracuse last season. The 5-foot-9 speedster recorded his first three-touchdown game in a 38-21 win over Western Kentucky last season.
- ◆ Atwell delivered a standout sophomore campaign in 2019, earning first team All-ACC honors after setting the school record for receiving yards and tying the mark for touchdown receptions in a season. Atwell caught 70 passes for a league-leading 1,276 yards 12 touchdowns. He also knotted the school record with seven 100-yard receiving games and led the nation with four receptions of 70 or more yards. The 5-foot-9 speedster recorded his first three-touchdown game in a 38-21 win over Western Kentucky last season.
- ◆ Hawkins finished seventh nationally in rushing with 1,525 yards and nine touchdowns in guiding the Cardinals to an 8-5 record after a 38-28 win over Mississippi State in the Music City Bowl on Dec. 30. The Titusville, Fla., native set the school record for most rushing yards by a running back, breaking Howard Stevens' previous mark of 1,429 yards in 1971. It was the third-most yards in a season at Louisville, behind quarterback Lamar Jackson's 1,601 yards in 2017 and 1,571 in 2016. Hawkins finished third in the league in rushing and tying for the league lead with eight 100-yard rushing games — the most in school history by a running back and second behind Jackson's school record of 10.

THE NUMBER IS 30

- ◆ In his seven seasons as a head coach, Scott Satterfield's teams are 49-4 when scoring 30 or more points after dropping a 47-34 decision to Miami in the ACC opener. This was the first loss when scoring 30 or more points since a 45-38 decision at No. 9 Penn State in 2018. Satterfield's teams have won 37 of the last 40 games when his team's score 30 or more points in a game.
- ◆ The Cardinals are 8-1 when scoring 30 or more points in a game as head coach of the Cardinals.

SEVEN YEARS IN A ROW

- ◆ There's no secret Scott Satterfield loves to run the football, and it's shown in the first 16 games at Louisville. The Cardinals averaged 43.7 attempts per game last season. When running back **Javian Hawkins** reached the 1,000-yard mark, it marked the seventh-straight season — 6th in FBS — that Satterfield produced a 1,000-yard rusher.
- ◆ Including Hawkins in 2019, Satterfield's Appalachian State teams accomplished the feat in consecutive years from 2013-2018. Before taking the Louisville job, Darrynton Evans ran for 1,197 yards in 2018. Jalin Moore did it in back-to-back seasons in 2016 and 2017.

- ♦ Marcus Cox was a four-time 1,000-yard rusher for Satterfield, achieving the feat in 2013-2016. Satterfield produced two 1,000-yard rushers in 2016.
- ♦ Satterfield's six FBS seasons of producing a 1,000-yard rusher is second to Navy's Ken Niumatalolo and is tied with Utah's Kyle Whittingham.
- ♦ In his first five seasons as an FBS head coach, Satterfield's teams ranked in the top 25 in rushing all five seasons — averaging over 200 yards in all five years.
- ♦ In his final season at Appalachian State, the Mountaineers averaged 240.38 yards per game to finish 14th nationally, totaling 31 scores on the ground.

CARDINALS IN THE STATE OF GEORGIA

- ♦ Florida used to be the home of many of the Cardinals, but the state of Georgia has taken over. The Cardinals have 30 players on their roster from the state of Georgia.
- ♦ The Cardinals have six players from Atlanta on the roster in defensive end **YaYa Diaby**, wide receiver **Josh Johnson**, defensive back **Marlon Character**, running back **Hassan Hall**, tight end **Desmond Daniels**, and long snapper **Ford Hayes**.

NEW LINE, WHO DIS

- ♦ After the departure of offensive linemen Mekhi Becton and Tyler Haycraft, the Louisville' offensive line has a new look, but still has some familiar faces. Offensive guard **Robbie Bell** and guard **Caleb Chandler** have started 16-straight games dating back to the 2019 campaign. Bell is the elder statesmen of the unit having started 29 games during his career.
- ♦ Center **Cole Bentley**, who took over during the latter part of the season, has started nine consecutive contests going back to last season. The senior is second on the line with 25 starts.
- ♦ Sophomore **Adonis Boone** started two games in place of Becton last season and opened the season with three starts in 2020. Redshirt freshman **Renato Brown** has been the most consistent player on the offensive line in the first three contests.

SCORING STREAK EXTENDED

- ♦ The Cardinals extended their scoring streak to 253 games with 20 points versus Pittsburgh.
- ♦ Louisville has not been shut out in 253 games, which marks the 12th-longest scoring streak in the country, the shut out coming in a 32-0 defeat at Florida State in 2000. The Cardinals own the second-longest streak in the ACC behind Virginia Tech.

FATHER-SON; FITZPATRICK BROTHERS

- ♦ The Cardinals have kept it in the family, with the signing of **Christian Fitzpatrick** and **Josh Minkins, Jr.** Christian is the younger brother of **Dez Fitzpatrick**, who is one of UofL's top receivers. An early enrollee, Christian played at Southfield A&T High, where he was ranked the No. 71 receiver nationally. Christian caught 33 passes for 611 yards and 10 touchdowns as a senior.
- ♦ Minkins, Jr., was a standout safety at Ballard High School and was the No. 41 safety in the country. An all-district performer, Minkins was the 11th-ranked player in the state of Kentucky. Minkins, Sr., was a star cornerback for the Cardinals from 2000-03. He totaled 61 tackles as a senior in 2003, guiding the Cardinals to a 9-4 record and a berth in the GMAC Bowl.

HISTORY LESSON

- ♦ The 2020 season marks the 102st season of intercollegiate football at Louisville. It is the 75th-consecutive year in which Louisville has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1917-20 and 1943-45. The Cardinals own an all-time record of 521-420-17.

SATTERFIELD DOESN'T LIKE TWO-GAME LOSING STREAKS

- ♦ Head coach Scott Satterfield hasn't lost much, but when he does lose, he usually doesn't drop consecutive games. Satterfield hasn't lost consecutive games since 2017 when he served as the head coach at Appalachian State. In his eight-year career, Satterfield's teams have dropped consecutive contests seven times.
- ♦ In his first season at Louisville, Satterfield's rebounded after dropping a game. Opening the season with a loss to Notre Dame, the Cardinals responded with a win over Eastern Kentucky. Losing on the road to Florida State, Louisville came back to win two-straight contests over Boston College and Wake Forest. Losses to Clemson and Miami were also sandwiched by wins, while the loss to Kentucky was followed up with a bowl win over Mississippi State.

CARDINALS PLACE TWO ON REESE'S SENIOR BOWL TOP 250

- ♦ Wide receiver **Dez Fitzpatrick** and outside linebacker **Rodjay Burns** have all been named to the 2021 Reese's Senior Bowl Top 250 watch list.
- ♦ Fitzpatrick, a redshirt senior, enters his final season looking to build upon numbers that are approaching UofL's career top-10 lists. The native of Farmington, Hills, Mich., has caught 111 passes for 1,756 yards and 18 touchdowns, which is tied for sixth all-time.
- ♦ The 6-foot-2 receiver caught 35 passes for 635 yards and six touchdowns last season, recording a season high 133 yards and a touchdown versus Florida State. As a redshirt freshman in 2017, Fitzpatrick caught 45 passes for 699 yards and nine touchdowns.
- ♦ A Louisville native, Burns made a successful switch to linebacker after starting as a cornerback in 2018. Last season, Burns finished second on the team with 83 tackles and returned a fumble for a touchdown in a win over Western Kentucky.
- ♦ The former transfer from Ohio State recorded a career high 16 tackles and added an interception in a win over Wake Forest. Burns also registered a pair of sacks and led the team with 11.0 tackles for loss.

CARDINAL DEBUTS

- ♦ After three games, 15 Cardinals have played in their first games at Louisville. Here are the players who have made their debuts with the Cardinals: **Yaya Diaby**, **Kei'Trel Clark**, **Jamel Starks**, **Brock Travelstead**, **K.J. Cloyd**, **Logan Lupo**, **Cameron DeGeorge**, **Jordan Watkins**, **Dez Melton**, **Ja'Darien Boykin**, **Lovie Jenkins**, **Roscoe Johnson**, **Josh Lifson**, **Greedy Vance** and **Kameron Wilson**.
- ♦ The Cardinals have had eight true freshmen play this season after the first two contests in Starks, Travelstead, Watkins, Boykin, Jenkins, Lifson, Vance, and Wilson.
- ♦ Among the 15 newcomers, two made their first starts in defensive end **YaYa Diaby** and cornerback **Kei-Trel Clark**.
- ♦ Three different Cardinals have made their first starts this season in Diaby, **Renato Brown** and **Justin Marshall**.

NEED TO TURN THIS NEGATIVE TREND

- ♦ If the Cardinals are going to stop this current two-game losing streak, they must get better on third down. In those last two losses, the Cardinals are a combined 5-for-25 (.200) on third down, going 4-of-14 against Miami and a disappointing 1-of-11 against Pittsburgh. On the season, the Cardinals are just 14-of-41 on third down, which translates to just a 34.1 conversion rate.
- ♦ In 2019 when the Cardinals were one of the most explosive offenses in the league, they finished at 44.1 percent.
- ♦ In the 23-20 loss to Pitt, the Cardinals faced six third-and-long situations, missing on all six opportunities. The average distance to gain during the loss was 9.5 yards, while the Cardinals were only able to muster an average of 2.4 yards per play on third down.
- ♦ In the loss to the Hurricanes, the Cardinals were just 3-of-9 on third down and less than five yards to go, while the average third-down distance was 5.9. Louisville was also 0-3 on third and over nine yards.
- ♦ Quarterback **Malik Cunningham** was 3-of-5 for just 19 yards on third down against Pitt and was 5-of-8 for just 26 yards against Miami — an average of just 5.2 yards per completion.
- ♦ In comparison, Louisville averaged 18.2 yards a completion on third down against Western Kentucky.
- ♦ The Cardinals rank 64th in the country on third down, converting 34.1 percent of their opportunities.
- ♦ Louisville held the ball for 32:33 versus Western Kentucky and 38:01 against Miami, but lost the time of possession battle 35:16 to 24:44 in the loss at Pittsburgh.

BRADEN SMITH LEADS ACC

- ♦ Wide receiver **Braden Smith**, a transfer from Northwest Mississippi Community College, has made an immediate impact in his first three games with the Cardinals. He's third on the team with six receptions for 173 yards — an average of 28.8 yards a reception, which ranks fourth nationally and leads the ACC.
- ♦ He ranks fifth with three receptions of over 30 yards, recording two receptions of over 40 yards in the opener against Western Kentucky and a 36-yard catch against Miami. In his first Division I football game versus Western Kentucky, Smith finished with four catches for 110 yards, becoming the first Cardinal to record 100 receiving yards in his UofL debut since Deion Branch tallied 123 yards against Kentucky in the 2000 season opener.
- ♦ In three games, four of Smith's six receptions have gone for 20 or more yards, which ranks 19th in the country.

- ♦ Smith got his Louisville career off on the right foot when he caught his first pass in the first quarter — a 63-yard reception on third down.
- ♦ Prior to Braden Smith, the only two players to have 100-yard receiving games in their Louisville debut went on to play a combined 21 seasons in the NFL: Ernest Givins had 100 yards receiving vs. Murray State in 1984 and Deion Branch had 123 yards receiving vs. Kentucky in 2000.

1,000-YARDS

- ♦ Running back **Javian Hawkins** and wide receiver **Tutu Atwell** each went over the 1,000-yards last season, giving the Cardinals a 1,000-yard rusher and receiver for the first time since 1999. Hawkins became the first running back since 2010 to rush for over 1,000 yards when he totaled 1,525 yards last year. Lamar Jackson was the last player to record back 1,000-yard rushing seasons. The last running back to accomplish the feat was Calvin Prince in 1976 and 1977.
- ♦ Atwell set the school's single-season receiving yard mark with 1,276 yards — the first receiver to reach 1,000-yards since Harry Douglas totaled 1,159 in 2007. Atwell is looking to become the first wideout to record back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons since Douglas did it in 2006 and 2007.
- ♦ The Cardinals have only had 1,000-yard rushers and receivers in consecutive seasons once in school history, which came in 1998 and 1999. Arnold Jackson was a 1,000-yard receiver in 1998 and 1999, while Frank Moreau ran for 1,289 yards in 1999 and Leroy Collins rushed for 1,134 yards in 1998.

CUNNINGHAM EXTENDS STREAKS

- ♦ Quarterback **Malik Cunningham** continues to get the ball into the end zone through the air. Dating back to last season, Cunningham has tossed a touchdown pass in nine-straight games, throwing for 22 touchdowns during that span.
- ♦ The redshirt junior ranks eighth in the nation and leads the ACC in touchdown passes with seven after throwing a touchdown pass in the loss to Pittsburgh.
- ♦ With 300-yard passing games versus Western Kentucky and Miami, Cunningham became the first Louisville quarterback with consecutive 300-yard passing games since Lamar Jackson did it against NC State and Boston College in 2017. Cunningham threw for 343 yards in the opener against Western Kentucky and 307 versus Miami.
- ♦ Cunningham recorded the ninth multi-passing touchdown game of his career and his fourth with at least three touchdown passes after the loss to Miami. The 6-foot-1 signal caller has thrown 30 career touchdown passes, needing only two more to tie Browning Nagle for 10th place on the school's list.
- ♦ The native of Montgomery, Ala., ranks 15th in the country with 31 completions of 10 or more yards and 12th with 12 completions of over 20 yards. He is tied for fifth in the country with two completions of better than 60 yards.
- ♦ Set to make his 18th career start, Cunningham is tied for 27th in the nation in total offense with 263.0 yards per game and is 15th with 757 passing yards.
- ♦ Since taking over as the starter against Western Kentucky in 2019, Cunningham has thrown for 2,798 and 29 touchdowns in a span of 14 games.
- ♦ As a starter under Scott Satterfield, Cunningham owns an 8-6 record and is 8-9 overall.

- ◆ Last season, Cunningham led the country in passing yards per completion in 2019 at 18.4 yards per reception.
- ◆ The native of Montgomery, Ala., set the school record for passing efficiency at 194.45 and would have finished second nationally, but didn't have enough passing attempts to meet NCAA standards. He led the nation in passing yards per completion at 18.44 yards and was tops in passing completions of 70 and 80 yards.
- ◆ The sophomore has recorded two 100-yard games, both coming in 2018.

- ◆ In 25 career games, Cunningham stands second in school history for rushing yards by a quarterback with 1,013 yards and is second in the school's record book with 12 rushing touchdowns. He led the Cardinals in rushing during the 2018 campaign with 497, which is the fourth-highest total by a quarterback in school history. In 2019, Cunningham finished as the team's third-leading rusher with 482 yards and six touchdowns. His 487 yards were the fifth most in a season, and his six scores were tied for sixth for the most rushing scores by a quarterback in a season.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

- ◆ The Cardinals will be making their 83rd appearance on Friday night when the Cardinals take on Georgia Tech on Friday night. Louisville owns a 50-31-1 overall mark, including an 18-14-1 mark on the road. The Friday night contest is the first since Cardinals dropped a 54-23 decision at Syracuse in 2018. During that same season, the Cardinals dropped their first meeting versus the Yellow Jackets 66-31 on a Friday night.
- ◆ Louisville is 12-10 in televised Friday night games on ESPN/ESPN2, including a 5-2 mark on the road. Louisville had won five in a row in televised Friday night games before dropping those two games to Syracuse and Georgia Tech.

MAKING A CASE

- ◆ Wide receiver **Tutu Atwell** might be small in stature, but he's making a case to be one of the most productive wide receivers in school history. In three seasons, Atwell has caught 113 passes for 1,911 yards and 17 touchdowns. He moved passed Lavell Boyd and Zek Parker into 15th place on the school's receiving list and is tied for eighth with 17 touchdown receptions. Atwell needs 89 yards to become the 14th receiver to record 2,000 yards receiving in a career. Atwell is also 44 yards short of moving past teammate Dez Fitzpatrick for 14th on the school's all-time receiving list.
- ◆ The 5-foot-9, 165-pound receiver opened up his junior season with a seven-catch performance for 78 yards in the win over Western Kentucky and came back with eight catches for 114 yards and two scores against Miami. He's caught five or more passes in a game 13 times in 28 games, and the fourth time of eight or more receptions.
- ◆ Atwell leads the team with 19 catches for 229 yards and three scores through three games. The speedster is tied for 18th nationally in receptions per game and 37th in receiving yards. The native of Miami is tied for 15th in the country with 10 receptions of 10 or more yards.
- ◆ With 114 yards against Miami, Atwell became the ninth UofL player with nine or more 100-yard receiving games in a career, and is one away from tying DeVante Parker and Harry Douglas for fourth-place all-time in school history.
- ◆ Last season, Atwell led the Atlantic Coast Conference in receiving yards with a school record 1,276 yards and was second with 12 touchdown receptions.
- ◆ The native of Miami, Fla., also knotted the school record with seven 100-yard receiving games and led the nation with four receptions of 70 or more yards — all resulting in touchdowns. He scored from 90 yards versus Syracuse, and added touchdown receptions of 80, 77 and 74 yards last year.
- ◆ A first-team All-American, Atwell closed the season with a career high nine receptions for 147 yards in the 2019 Music City Bowl win over Mississippi State and registered a career best 152 receiving yards in a win over Syracuse last season. The speedster recorded his first three-touchdown game in a 38-21 win over Western Kentucky last year.

REACHING A 100 AND BEYOND

- ◆ Running back **Javian Hawkins** set the school's single-season mark for rushing yards by a running back by totaling 1,525 yards in his first full season, and is continuing to add to those numbers.
- ◆ Hawkins rushed for 78 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries. His 75-yard touchdown run in the first quarter was a career long and the longest Louisville touchdown run since Malik Cunningham scored from 75 yards out against Kentucky on Nov. 24, 2018. The sophomore has rushed for a touchdown in five consecutive games dating back to the 2019 season.
- ◆ Hawkins rushed for 164 yards on 27 carries versus Miami, becoming the ninth player in UofL history to record three games of at least 150 rushing yards. It was the ninth 100-yard rushing game of his career,

tying him for seventh on the Louisville career list. The 164 rushing yards were the third-highest total in his 19 career games and his 27 carries were one shy of his career high of 28 set against Virginia last year.

- ♦ Hawkins sits ninth in the nation in rushing with 313 yards and 13th with an average of 104.3 yards per game. He's averaging 19.7 attempts per game, which ranks ninth nationally, and also is 15th in the country with eight rushes of 10 or more yards. He is only one of seven players in the country with a rush of 70 yards or more this season after his 75-yard scamper against Pitt.
- ♦ Of the nine 100-yard games in Hawkins' career, seven have come at Cardinal Stadium. He's only had one 100-yard rushing game on the road — 142 yards in a loss to Kentucky.
- ♦ The native of Titusville, Fla., has rushed for more than 100 yards in three of his five career games against ranked opponents, also doing so in 2019 against No. 9 Notre Dame (122 yards) and No. 3 Clemson (129 yards).
- ♦ With his 78 yards, Hawkins moved into 17th on Louisville's career rushing list with 1,846 yards passing Bill Gatti, George Cain, Eric Shelton and Don Craft. He needs 154 yards to become just the 16th player to rush for more than 2,000 yards in a career.
- ♦ Last season, Hawkins totaled the most yards by a running back since 2010 when Bilal Powell closed the year with 1,405. Howard Stevens rushed for 1,42 yards in 1971, which is the second-most yards by a running in UoFL history.
- ♦ Hawkins finished third in the ACC in rushing and tying for the league lead with eight 100-yard rushing games — the most in school history by a running back and second behind Jackson's school record of 10.
- ♦ The 5-foot-9 running back started 12 games and grabbed ACC Rookie and Running Back of the Week honors twice during his first full season. He rushed for 233 yards — the second most in the ACC this season — in a win over Syracuse. It was the first 200-yard rushing game by a Cardinal since Lamar Jackson had 226 against Texas A&M on Dec. 30, 2015 and the most rushing yards by a Cardinal since Anthony Allen rushed for 275 against Middle Tennessee on Sept. 6, 2007.
- ♦ Hawkins finished eighth in the country in rushing yards and was one of only eight players with 1,500 rushing yards last season. He averaged 117.3 yards per game, which ranked seventh in the country.

FITZPATRICK GETTING HIS TOUCHES

- ♦ Wide receiver **Dez Fitzpatrick** came back to school for a number of reasons, but one was to improve his overall production. Through three games, the senior is achieving his goal. Fitzpatrick is second on the team with 12 receptions for 198 yards and one touchdown after catching seven passes for 74 yards in the loss to Miami — his highest reception total since pulling in seven against Florida State last September.
- ♦ Fitzpatrick got his senior season started on the right foot against Western Kentucky. The fifth-year senior caught four passes for 110 yards, including a 70-yard touchdown score in the third quarter — his 19th career scores, which ties him for fifth on the school's all-time list.
- ♦ Fitzpatrick owns nine catches of 10 or more yards, and is 46th in the nation with 198 receiving yards.
- ♦ Last season, Fitzpatrick finished second on the team with 35 receptions for 635 yards and six scores. He averaged 18.1 yards a reception (33rd in the nation), which includes the 74-yard touchdown reception versus Florida State on Sept. 21.
- ♦ The 110 yards receiving was the sixth 100-yard game of his career, the fourth time in the last 11 games. He needs two more to tie for ninth in school history.
- ♦ Last season, Fitzpatrick finished second on the team with 35 receptions for 635 yards and six scores. He averaged 18.1 yards a reception (33rd in the nation), which includes the 74-yard touchdown reception versus Florida State on Sept. 21.
- ♦ In a three-game streak of recording 100 yards receiving last year, Fitzpatrick caught seven passes for 133 yards and one score against Florida State on Sept. 21, which was just one yard short of tying his career high of 134 yards receiving, which occurred in a loss to NC State during the 2017 season. In the win over Boston College on Oct. 5, Fitzpatrick caught five passes for 108 yards and a score in the 41-39 win. He went over the century mark versus Wake Forest on Oct. 12, catching five passes for 125 yards and two scores. Fitzpatrick was the first Louisville player with three straight 100-yard receiving games since DeVante Parker did it vs. NC State, Florida State, and Boston College in 2014.
- ♦ With a touchdown reception versus NC State, Fitzpatrick moved into a tie for sixth place in school history with 18 touchdown receptions - tying Deion Branch (2000-01).
- ♦ In his four seasons, Fitzpatrick has caught 123 passes for 1,954 yards and 19 touchdowns in his career — becoming the 23rd player in school history with 100 receptions. He needs 242 yards and 30 receptions to crack the school's top-10 list for career receiving yards and receptions.

FORD PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- ♦ Tight end **Marshon Ford** picked up where he left off, catching touchdown passes. The Louisville native recorded his ninth career touchdown — the third in consecutive games — in the loss to Miami. Ford owns only 26 career receptions, and nine have reached the end zone. He scored late in the game on a four-yard reception versus Miami and put the Cardinals up 28-7 when he scored from two yard out against Western Kentucky.
- ♦ The Louisville native equaled his career high with three receptions for 14 yards and a score against Miami. He's fourth on the team with five catches for 17 yards and is tied for the team lead with a pair of touchdowns.
- ♦ The tight end made the most of his receptions last season, scoring seven touchdowns on only 20 receptions. Ford, a local product from Ballard High, caught 20 passes for 292 yards. He led the ACC in receiving touchdowns by a tight end, besting Syracuse's Aaron Hackett, who had six touchdown receptions.
- ♦ Ford closed his first season in dramatic fashion, catching three passes for 53 yards and a pair of touchdowns in a 38-28 win over Mississippi State in the 2019 Music City Bowl. It was his third multiple touchdown game of the season.
- ♦ In the win over NC State on Nov. 16 last season, Ford caught three passes for 52 yards and two touchdowns — the second multiple touchdown game this season. He also scored twice versus Eastern Kentucky.

UNDER SATTERFIELD

- ♦ In 16 games under Scott Satterfield, Louisville has scored over 40 points four times and has posted an 4-0 record when doing so.
- ♦ Louisville has gone over 500 yards of total offense in six games under Satterfield and over 600 yards twice.
- ♦ Louisville has two 300+ yard rushing games in the Satterfield era, both coming in 2019.
- ♦ Louisville has had a player rush for over 100 yards nine times under Satterfield, going 5-4 in those contests.
- ♦ Louisville has had five 300+-yard passing games during the Satterfield era.

NOT THE NORM

- ♦ Head coach Scott Satterfield has brought an explosive offense to Louisville in short period of time that's why the loss at Pitt was so puzzling. The Cardinals were held to 223 yards of total offense — a low in the Satterfield era. It was only the second time in 16 games that the Cardinals were held to less than 300 yards of offense in a game.
- ♦ Since taking the reins of the program in 2019, the Cardinals have been limited to less than 400 yards of offense just six times and less than 350 yards on four occasions.
- ♦ Under Satterfield's guidance, the Cardinals have averaged 32.4 points per game and 440.1 yards of total offense during that 16-game time period.
- ♦ The 107 yards passing in the loss to Pittsburgh equaled the total the Cardinals had in a loss versus No. 3 Clemson last season.

RUN THE ROCK

- ♦ Satterfield brings a run first attitude to the UofL program, and the stats have shown that to be the case in the first two seasons. Satterfield's rushing prowess has been evident through 16 games as the Cardinals have averaged 202.3 yards per ground per game. In the loss to Pitt on Sept. 26, the Cardinals were held to a season-low 116 yards — the second-lowest total during the Satterfield era.
- ♦ The 116 yards on the ground were the second-lowest mark in the Satterfield's tenure, just above the 77 yards they were held to in a win over NC State last season.
- ♦ The Cardinals have rushed for at least 110 yards in 15 of the 16 games since Satterfield took over the offense.

TURNER TAKES OVER

- ♦ The Cardinals have been blessed with many great kickers, and a void was left with the graduation of Blanton Creque. Walk-on **James Turner** has stepped in after two games to pick up the slack. A native of Saline, Mich., is a perfect 11-for-11 on points-after-touchdowns and is a perfect 4-for-4 on field-goal attempts — one of 27 kickers in the nation to be perfect. He's one of 10 kickers in the nation to remain perfect on field goals and extra points.
- ♦ The sophomore booted a pair of field goals for the second-straight game in the loss to Pitt, hitting from 38 and 34 yards.

- ♦ He opened the scoring against Miami when he booted a 40-yard field goal to put the Cardinals up 3-0. He added a 22-yard field goal in the second quarter to trim the Hurricanes' lead to 14-6.
- ♦ Entering the Georgia Tech game, Turner is 22nd in the nation in most extra points made without a miss and 10th in field goals made.
- ♦ He also executed Louisville's first on-side kick recovery since the Belk Bowl loss to NC State in 2011.

MONTY THE PLAYMAKER

- ♦ Inside linebacker **Monty Montgomery** just makes plays. In two seasons, Montgomery has registered 7.0 sacks in 16 games with the Cardinals. He led the team last season with 5.0 sacks, and started the 2020 campaign in impressive fashion.
- ♦ Coming off the bench, Montgomery led the Cardinals with a pair of sacks and had 3.0 tackles for loss in the 35-21 win over Western Kentucky. He added five tackles and one tackle for loss in the Miami game.
- ♦ The junior ranks 58th in nation in sacks with 0.67 per game and is 43rd with 1.3 tackles for loss.
- ♦ In his 16 career games, Montgomery has totaled 39 tackles and 9.0 tackles for loss.

ETHERIDGE SAVING BEST FOR LAST

- ♦ **Dorian Etheridge** has been the leader of the defense over the last four seasons, and he's off to a good start for the 2020 campaign. The senior is the leader on the team with 22 tackles, which ranks 12th in the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- ♦ Etheridge has recorded at least seven tackles in the first three games, tallying a season best eight tackles in the season opener versus Western Kentucky.
- ♦ After the first three weeks, Etheridge is eighth in the country in tackles for loss with an average of 2.5 per game and is tied for 59th with an average of 7.5 tackles per game. He recorded a career high 3.5 tackles for loss against Western Kentucky in the season opener and matched that in the loss at Pittsburgh.
- ♦ In the loss to Miami, Etheridge recorded seven tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss.
- ♦ After the first three weeks, Etheridge is eighth in the country in tackles for loss with an average of 2.5 per game and is tied for 59th with an average of 7.5 tackles per game.
- ♦ The native of Charleston, W. Va., has registered 230 tackles in 37 games. He closed 2019 with 70 tackles and also has 8.0 tackles for loss.
- ♦ In the last four games of the 2019 season, Etheridge posted double-digit tackle totals in back-to-back games for the first time in his career, recording 30 stops in the last four games. He recorded a season high 12 tackles versus Syracuse on Nov. 23 after being credited with 11 tackles and his first career interception in the win over NC State on Nov. 16.
- ♦ Etheridge had five games of seven or more tackles during his junior season.
- ♦ He opened the 2019 season with three tackles and recovered a fumble in the loss to the Irish, while being credited with seven tackles and one for a loss in the win over Eastern Kentucky.
- ♦ The 2018 campaign saw him miss a pair of games, totaling 55 tackles and 4.0 tackles for loss. As a true freshman in 2017, Etheridge was named a freshman All-American after leading the team with 83 tackles, including a career best 14 stops versus Boston College.
- ♦ In his career, Etheridge has recorded five games of 10 or more tackles.

EVERY FIND THE FOOTBALL

- ♦ Not only has linebacker **C.J. Avery** been one of the team's top tackler's over the last couple seasons, he's been the one who has recorded the most interceptions. Avery recorded his third career interception in the loss to Pitt on Sept. 26. It was the first pick for the Cardinals during the 2020 campaign. The native of Grenada, Miss., led the team with a pair of interceptions during the 2018 season.
- ♦ The 2019 season showed what Avery is capable of after leading the team in tackles with a career best 93 stops in 13 games as a starter. He opened the year with three tackles in the win over Western Kentucky and followed with a team high 10 stops against Miami. It was the third double-digit tackle game of his career.
- ♦ Avery registered six or more tackles in 10 of the 13 games after closing the season with nine tackles in two of the three final games of the season. He recorded a season high 13 tackles and a pass break-up in the win over Wake Forest and had nine stops on Sept. 21 in a loss at Florida State.
- ♦ In 2018, Avery finished second on the team in tackles last year despite missing three games. He recorded a career high 15 tackles in a loss to Boston College and seven against Wake Forest.
- ♦ The native of Grenada, Miss., has recorded 189 tackles and 3.5 sacks in 38 career contests.

YEAST REBOUNDS FROM SEASON-ENDING INJURY

- ♦ Safety **Russ Yeast** was having a career season before a severe leg injury sidelined him for the final two games of the season. The senior recorded a career high 61 tackles and totaled his first interception last season.
- ♦ His senior season was in question after his long recovery process, but the fourth-year senior is off to a solid start. He is third on the team in tackles with 15 and has forced and recovered a fumble in three starts at safety. He recorded a season high seven tackles in the 23-20 loss at Pittsburgh on Sept. 26.
- ♦ He opened up his final season by making a couple of keys plays in the win over Western Kentucky. Yeast recorded three tackles, but forced and recovered a fumble deep Louisville territory that stopped a potential scoring drive. He registered five more stops in the loss to Miami last Saturday.
- ♦ Yeast, who transitioned from cornerback last season, recorded three games with seven or more tackles and picked off Trevor Lawrence last season to stop a potential scoring drive. Yeast was credited with a career high 11 tackles in a win over Boston College and had eight stops in a loss at Florida State.
- ♦ The product of Center Grove High totaled 23 tackles in 12 games as a freshman in 2017.

BROWN'S DEFENSE GETS MORE PRESSURE

- ♦ The Cardinals know they must get more pressure on the quarterback, but they made strides last season under the guidance of defensive coordinator Bryan Brown. After registering just 11 sacks in 2018, the Cardinals more than doubled that output with 27 in 2019.
- ♦ After the first three games, the Cardinals have recorded 7.0 sacks and 27 tackles for loss — an average of 9.0 per game. Twelve different players have registered tackles for loss and five have combined for those sacks. **Dorian Etheridge** leads the team with 8.5 tackles for loss, while **Monty Montgomery** has added 4.0 and **Yasir Abdullah** has totaled 3.0.
- ♦ The Cardinals, who ranked 125th in 2018 with an average of 0.92 sacks per game, finished 69th in the country and 12th in the ACC with an average of 2.08 sacks per game. After three games, the Cardinals rank 34th nationally with an average of 2.33 sacks per game.
- ♦ The Cardinals have recorded at least 3.0 sacks in two of the three games this year.

BEHIND ENEMY LINES

- ♦ The Cardinals have done a good job of getting into the opposition's backfield and putting them behind the sticks. The Cardinals have totaled 10 or more tackles for loss in two of the three games, including a season high 11 versus Pittsburgh. The Cardinals rank eighth in the country and third in the ACC with an average of 9.0 tackles for loss per game.
- ♦ Louisville played the entire game in Western Kentucky's backfield on Sept. 12 in the 35-21 win. The Cardinals registered 10.0 tackles for loss. In the last four games, the Cardinals have registered 37.0 tackles for loss. The Cardinals totaled 10.0 in the Music City Bowl win over Mississippi State in the final game of 2019.
- ♦ Linebackers **Dorian Etheridge** and **Yasir Abdullah** had 3.5 and 3.0 tackles for loss, respectively, against Pitt. Five different players recorded tackles for loss in the win over Western Kentucky, with Etheridge leading the way with 3.5 and **Monty Montgomery** with 3.0. Outside linebacker **Rodjay Burns** totaled 2.0 tackles for loss and newcomer **YaYa Diaby** netted 1.0 in the win.

STABILITY AT THE DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR POSITION

- ♦ The Cardinals finally have some stability at the defensive coordinator position. For the first time since 2015 and 2016, the Cardinals will have the same defensive coordinator as Bryan Brown begins his second season. The Cardinals improved by 10.7 points per game under Brown's tutelage.
- ♦ When hired in 2019, Brown became the fourth defensive coordinator since the 2016. Todd Grantham took the reins from 2014-16; Peter Sirmon 2017; and Brian VanGorder 2018.
- ♦ In his first season in 2020, Brown led a defense to an improvement, but it's still not up to Brown's expectations, who put together top 25 defenses at Appalachian State. The Cardinals improved by 10.4 points per game, allowing 21 or fewer points four times.

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- ♦ Scott Satterfield was named the 23rd head coach at the University of Louisville on Dec. 4, 2018.
- ♦ Satterfield is in his ninth year as a head coach, guiding his teams to bowl games in five seasons.
- ♦ He owns a 60-31 career record, registering six straight winning seasons.
- ♦ Taking over a program that finished 2-10 in 2018, Satterfield orchestrated the top turnaround by a Power 5 program in 2019 by improving by six games.
- ♦ In his first season as a Power 5 coach, Satterfield produced a Top 15 NFL draft selection in offensive tackle Mekhi Becton — the No. 11 pick of the New York Jets in the 2020 Draft.

CARDINALS ON THE FIELD

- ♦ Satterfield's six-game turnaround in his first season at Louisville was tops among Power 5 programs. He also became only the second ACC coach to take a winless team in the league and win five games the following year. He was named the school's first ACC Coach of the Year for his efforts, and became only the school's second first-year coach to win eight or more games. Taking over a team that won two games the previous year, Satterfield led the Cardinals to an 8-5 record that culminated with a win over Mississippi State in the Music City Bowl.
- ♦ On the field, the Cardinals snapped a nine-game league losing streak with a win over Boston College and won on the road versus a ranked opponent for the first time since 2011 with a 62-59 win over Boston College.
- ♦ Known as one of the nation's top offensive minds, Satterfield's presence saw the Cardinals go from being one of the worst offensive teams in the nation to ranking 24th in both total offense and rushing offense.
- ♦ Individually, a pair of Cardinals posted the best statistical seasons in school history in running back Javian Hawkins and wide receiver Tutu Atwell. The duo became only the third players to record 1,000-yard rushing and receiving seasons in the same year. Hawkins broke the school record for rushing yards by a running back and a freshman in school history with 1,525 yards, which included eight 100-yard rushing games.
- ♦ Atwell set the school record for receiving yards in a year with 1,276 yards and equaled the school mark with 12 touchdown receptions. The 5-foot-9 speedster led the ACC in receiving yards and was second in touchdown receptions as a sophomore. He totaled seven 100-yard receiving games and averaged a solid 18.2 yards a reception.

CARDINALS IN THE CLASSROOM

- ♦ The Cardinals achieved a collective 3.2 grade-point average for the 2020 spring semester and 85 student-athletes made the Athletic Director's Honor Roll earning a 3.0 GPA or better for the semester.
- ♦ There were eight student-athletes who earned a 4.0 grade point average for the semester and 10 student-athletes were able to receive their degrees in May.
- ♦ When the Cardinals take the field in September, a total of 14 student-athletes will be playing with their degrees in hand. The following players have earned their degrees heading into the 2020 season: C.J. Avery, Robbie Bell, Cole Bentley, Maurice Burkley, Rodjay Burns, Marlon Character, Cameron DeGeorge, Derek Dorsey, Jared Goldwire, Isaiah Hayes, Jawon Pass, Tabarius Peterson, Ean Pfeifer, Russ Yeast.
- ♦ The Cardinals finished the fall with 46 student-athletes earning a 3.0 grade point average or better, and had 32 players participate in the Music City Bowl with their degrees in hand. A total of 13 student-athletes graduated during the fall semester. The team finished with a 2.74 GPA during the fall semester, and had two players earn a perfect 4.0 GPA.
